








Lesson Five Riffs

Riffs are repeated patterns of notes. This next bass line is a riff that uses three notes on the E string: open E, G first dot (third fret), and A second dot (fifth fret).




Duck's Riff

23 1. Listen

Follow the music as you listen to this tune. The bass plays *quarter notes*. Quarter notes (\downarrow) get one beat.


24 2. Play

Stax Riff




This tune uses the same riff.


28 2. Play
