This firearm warranty is good only to the ORIGINAL OWNER who has registered his ownership with The Marlin Firearms Company at 100 Kenna Drive, North Haven, Connecticut.

WARRANTY and CERTIFICATE OF OWNERSHIP card must be completed and mailed to The Marlin Firearms Company at the above address WITHIN TEN (10) DAYS of purchase to insure the protection of the warranty. NOTICE of defect in materials and/or workmanship must be received by the company WITHIN TWO (2) YEARS from the date of purchase.

Normal wear, or damage resulting from neglect, abuse, or repairs not made or authorized by The Marlin Firearms Company are not covered by the warranty.

THIS WARRANTY GIVES YOU SPECIFIC LEGAL RIGHTS. AND YOU MAY ALSO HAVE OTHER RIGHTS WHICH VARY FROM STATE TO STATE.

#### MARLIN'S PERFORMANCE UNDER THE ABOVE WARRANTY

- 1. After notice of defect in material and/or workmanship is received by The Marlin Firearms Company. Marlin shall send instructions for shipment of the firearm; and repairs will be made and the firearm returned within a reasonable time after the firearm is received. Cost of shipping, insurance charges, etc. involved in returning the firearm to the company shall be prepaid by the original owner.
- Cost of parts and labor performed shall be provided without charge by The Marlin Firearms Company, or one of its authorized repairers.
- 3. If The Marlin Firearms Company, after receipt of the firearm, determines that the defects in material and/or workmanship were the result of abuse and/or neglect, or otherwise not covered by the warranty set forth above. Marlin shall notify such owner to that effect and give an estimate for repair. In such cases, repair, return shipping and insurance charges, etc. shall be paid by such owner.
- I. In the event that The Marlin Firearms Company is unable to make warranty repairs to the firearm, it shall, within a reasonable time after its receipt, notify the owner to that effect and give him the option either to receive a replacement of the same model, if then available in its inventory, or to receive a refund, either of which, if feasible, will be made through the store of purchase.





### "Full Cock" and "Half Cock" Hammer Positions

Half Cock

- 1. The Full Cock position of the hammer is when it is at its furthest point from the firing pin (See A). If the trigger is pulled with the hammer in this position, the gun will fire.
- 2. The Half Cock position of the hammer is between the Full Cock position and the firing pin (See B).

The Half Cock position serves as the *safety* and should be used whenever you are not firing. The hammer may be brought from Full Cock to the Half Cock position by firmly holding the hammer in the Full Cock position with your thumb. Keep your thumb on the hammer as you pull the trigger. As soon as you feel the hammer exerting forward pressure against your thumb, remove your finger from the trigger and ease the hammer slowly forward to the Half Cock position (See C & D). The rifle is now in the Safety position and will not fire.

- WARNING: Any mechanical device can fail, so never rely on the Half Cock (safety position) to justify careless handling.
- To resume the Full Cock position, simply pull the hammer all the way to the rear (See A).
- WARNING: Never allow the hammer to rest on the firing pin (hammer in full forward position) while the gun is loaded. Should the hammer inadvertently be struck in the full forward position, the rifle will fire.
- WARNING: Become thoroughly familiar with the two hammer positions before loading the
  rifle with ammunition. Failure to follow the instructions in sections 1 and 2 may result in
  "talse half cock", a condition that allows the hammer to strike the firing pin if the trigger is
  pulled.

# **Before You Use This Firearm**

It is very important that you read and understand this manual before using your firearm. Warnings are highlighted in red, and should be read and heeded carefully. Also follow the safety rules listed in "Marlin's Guide to Gun Safety", printed on the inside back cover of this manual.

#### Your New Rifle

#### Centerfire Rifles

All of our centerfires are built around our classic, exposed-hammer lever action system. They feature tubular magazines and side-ejecting receivers. Specifications for your model are printed inside the back cover of this manual.


# **Scope Mounting**


Because of its solid top, side-ejecting receiver, your rifle is ideally suited for use with a scope. The receiver top is drilled and tapped for mounting a scope base. A detachable offset spur is affixed to the hammer allowing ease of operation when using a scope.

WARNING: If you use the hammer spur, be sure to make periodic checks to make certain
that the set screw joining the spur to the hammer is tight.

We recommend that you remove the hammer spur when not using a scope. Loosen the set screw with a 1/16" hexagonal wrench.

### "Full Cock" and "Half Cock" Hammer Positions

- 1. The Full Cock position of the hammer is when it is at its furthest point from the firing pin (See A). If the trigger is pulled with the hammer in this position, the gun will fire.
- 2. The Half Cock position of the hammer is between the Full Cock position and the firing pin (See B).

The Half Cock position serves as the safety and should be used whenever you are not firing. The hammer may be brought from Full Cock to the Half Cock position by firmly holding the hammer in the Full Cock position with your thumb. Keep your thumb on the hammer as you pull the trigger. As soon as you feel the hammer exerting forward pressure against your thumb, remove your finger from the trigger and ease the hammer slowly forward to the Half Cock position (See C & D). The rifle is now in the Safety position and will not fire.

 WARNING: Any mechanical device can fail, so never rely on the Half Cock (safety position) to justify careless handling.

To resume the Full Cock position, simply pull the hammer all the way to the rear (See A).

- WARNING: Never allow the hammer to rest on the firing pin (hammer in full forward position) while the gun is loaded. Should the hammer inadvertently be struck in the full forward position, the rifle will fire.
- WARNING: Become thoroughly familiar with the two hammer positions before loading the
  rifle with ammunition. Failure to follow the instructions in sections 1 and 2 may result in
  "talse half cock", a condition that allows the hammer to strike the firing pin if the trigger is
  pulled.

#### How to Load\*

- WARNING: Before loading or firing, always check the bore to be sure it is free of grease, oil, or any other obstruction. Be sure the bolt is closed (lever to the rear) and the hammer in the Half Cock position (See B), and the gun pointed in a safe direction.
- 1. Loading the magazine. Insert the cartridges, bullet end first, into the loading port. As the cartridge enters the loading port, push it forward into the magazine tube (See E). Be sure that the last cartridge is *completely inside* the loading port before preparing to fire, or a jammed action may result.
- 2. Preparing to fire. With the rifle pointed in a safe direction, completely open and close the lever one time. Your rifle is loaded, cocked, and ready to fire.

 WARNING: If you do not want to fire at this point, return the hammer to the Half-Cock position, as described above

- 3. Loading a Single Cartridge. With the rifle empty, and the lever forward (bolt open), place a single cartridge, with the bullet forward, in the ejection port, onto the carrier (See F). Return the lever to the rear position (bolt closed). The cartridge will be fed directly into the chamber and the rifle will be cocked and ready to fire.
- WARNING: Never attempt to load your rifle with ammunition that does not meet the cartridge specifications stamped on the barrel. Use only ammunition suitable for a tubular magazine rifle. We recommend clean, dry, factory-loaded ammunition.
- Warning to Handloaders: Some pointed and full-metal jacket round nose bullets are on the market which can chainfire other cartridges in a tubular magazine during recoil. If you are uncertain about the safety of using a particular bullet in your Marlin, contact the ammunition or bullet manufacturer.

#### **How to Fire**

With the hammer in the Full Cock position, and with the gun pointed at the target, squeeze the trigger. Work the lever fully forward and back for each repeat shot. If you do not fire all the cartridges in the magazine, be sure to put the hammer in the Half Cock position until you are ready to shoot again.

 WARNING: Remember, until a visual check has been made, you should assume that a live round remains in the chamber.

#### **How to Unload**

Keeping your fingers away from the trigger, and with the gun pointed in a safe direction, manually eject all cartridges by operating the lever back and forth, until you are sure the chamber and magazine are empty (See G). The lever must be completely closed and then fully opened to insure proper feeding and ejecting of all cartridges. Then, with the lever in the forward position (bolt to the rear), inspect the chamber, carrier and magazine carefully to be sure there are no cartridges left in the gun.

 WARNING: During the unloading process, each time the lever is completely closed (all the way to the rear), your rifle is cocked and ready to fire. Keep your fingers away from the trigger and be sure the gun is pointed in a safe direction during unloading.

#### What to do if rifle fails to fire

- 1. **Misfire.** If you have squeezed the trigger and nothing happens, remain in shooting position, pointing the gun in a safe direction. Count to 10, then open the action.
- 2. **Underpowered shot.** A "squib", or underpowered shot can be detected by the unusually low report it makes. Because the bullet may actually still be in the barrel, you must unload

completely, clear the action, and look through the barrel to see if there is any obstruction. If there is, it should be removed by a Marlin Recommended Service Center.


# Sighting

Your rifle has been sighted-in and test-fired at the factory. However, due to individual shooting characteristics, sighting should be range verified.

- 1. Vertical Correction. To raise the point of impact, raise the rear sight by moving the elevator. To lower the point of impact, lower the rear sight.
- 2. Horizontal Correction. To move the point of impact to the left, tap the rear sight base to the left. To move the point of impact to the right, tap the rear sight base to the right.
- WARNING: Never attempt to wipe down or clean a loaded aun.

# How to clean your rifle

- 1. Remove all cartridges from the action. chamber and magazine before you begin cleaning or inspecting your rifle.
- 2. To clean the bore from the breech end (recommended), open the lever half way,




Removing lever screw

remove the lever screw (See H) and then the lever. Then remove the breech bolt from the receiver (See I). (This will cause the ejector to be loose inside the receiver - be careful not to lose it.) Next, remove the ejector from the slot in the left side of the receiver (See J). (Although the 1894 and 1894C have a square bolt, takedown procedure is the same as above).

3. The action may be cleaned and oiled while the gun is in the state of disassembly described above.




Removing ejector

4. To reassemble, simply reverse the above steps. Make sure the ejector is positioned properly prior to alignment and insertion of the breech bolt. See K for the relationship of the bolt and ejector for correct alignment. Push the breech bolt into the receiver until within approximately 1" of the fully closed position (See L). The lever may now be inserted as shown in M.

 WARNING: Never attempt to wipe down or clean a loaded gun.

Avoid the use of oil during below freezing conditions. A dry graphite used sparingly is recommended for cold weather lubrication. Condensation droplets may form soon after the gun is brought into a warm room, or it may become wet during inclement weather. In any case, all moisture should be removed. Exterior metal finishes may be wiped down with a slightly oiled cloth. For long term storage, lightly oil the bore, barrel and action with gun oil. Your gun should be completely unloaded and stored in a dry area. Never store your gun in a carrying case.

# **Repair Instructions**

Your firearm has been designed, engineered and manufactured in accordance with Marlin's rigid quality control standards. However, any mechanical device may occasionally require adjustment or repair. Questions regarding the performance and serviceability of your firearm should be addressed to our Gun Service Division. You should include the Serial Number, Model Number and a full description of the conditions and problems involved.

## **Warranty Repairs**

Our Warranty policy covers all our firearms against defects in workmanship or material for a period of two years from the date of purchase to the original owner. See the inside front cover of this manual for warranty details. Guns requiring warranty repairs should be returned to the factory. (You also have the option of sending your gun to one of our Recommended Service Centers, listed on the back of this manual.) Be sure to follow the "Shipping and Handling" instructions on this page.

# **Non-Warranty Repairs**

Your local gunsmith, or one of our Service Centers (see back cover of this manual) may be able to re-

pair your gun. If not, ship it to the factory, following the Shipping and Handling instructions on this page.

After receiving your firearm, we will send you an estimate of the repair cost. Repairs will begin upon receipt of your check or money order. If repairs are not possible, your gun will be returned.

# **Shipping and Handling**

When sending your firearm to the factory or to a Service Center, you must follow these instructions:

- Be absolutely certain your firearm is not loaded prior to mailing.
- Pack your gun carefully. Use ample cushioning material and a sturdy outer cardboard box. Do not ship in a special container which you want returned.
- Accessories such as scopes, scope mounts, gun case, quick detach type swivels, sling straps and other special appointments should be removed prior to returning the firearm.
- Inside the box, include a sheet with the following information: model number, serial number, description of damage or problem, and under what conditions difficulty occurs.
- Clearly mark your return address on the outside of the box and on your instruction sheet.
- Do not ship live ammunition under any circumstances.
- Ship your firearm via insured Parcel Post or U.P.S. Shipment must be prepaid and addressed to:





- 1. Handle every gun as you would a cocked and loaded gun.
- 2. Keep the safety ON SAFE until you are ready to shoot.
- 3. Be sure of your target before you shoot.
- Before target shooting, be sure you have an adequate backstop. Remember, all rifle ammunition is dangerous at ranges up to, and in excess of a mile.
- 5. Never point a gun at anything you don't want to shoot.
- 6. Always wear protective glasses when shooting.
- 7. Wear hearing protectors when target shooting
- 8. Do not use modified or damaged ammunition.
- 9. Use only ammunition of the correct caliber, size and bullet shape
- Cartridges that have been improperly handloaded can damage the gun and cause personal injury.
- 11. Avoid ricochets by never shooting at water, or any hard, flat surface.
- 12. Be sure no one is in path of ejecting shells
- 13. Never climb or jump over an obstacle with a loaded gun.
- 14. Never pull a gun toward you by the muzzle.
- 15. Avoid alcoholic beverages before and during shooting.
- 16. Never use a gun that fails to function properly. Do not try to force a jammed action.
- 17. Be sure to keep the barrel and mechanism free of obstructions
- 18. Before cleaning, be sure the chamber, action and magazine are completely unloaded.
- 19. Always unload a gun before storing, transporting, or leaving unattended.
- 20. Never enter a motor vehicle with a loaded gun.
- 21. Store guns and ammunition separately, beyond the reach of children.

Failure to follow these rules, or other instructions in this manual, can result in personal injury.
