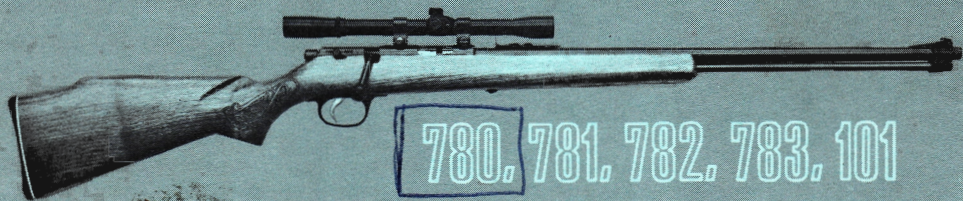

*This manual contains operating, care and maintenance instructions. Please read it carefully and keep it handy. To insure warranty protection for your rifle, the warranty card attached to the cover should be filled out and mailed within 10 days of purchase.*



## Marlin's Guide to Gun Safety

1. Treat every gun with the respect due a loaded gun.
2. Keep the safety ON SAFE until you are ready to shoot.
3. Be sure of your target before you pull the trigger.
4. Use only clean, dry, factory-loaded ammunition of the proper size and caliber.
5. Don't use modified or mutilated ammunition.
6. When carrying your gun, never point it at anything you do not want to shoot.
7. Be sure to keep the barrel and mechanism clean and free of obstructions.
8. Before cleaning, be sure your rifle is completely empty.
9. Never climb a tree, a fence, or jump over an object with a loaded gun.
10. Never pull a gun toward you by the muzzle.
11. When shooting, always wear protective shooting glasses.
12. Avoid ricochets by never shooting a bullet at a flat, hard surface; or water.
13. Be sure your backstop is adequate before beginning target practice.
14. Be sure no one is standing in the path of ejecting shells.
15. Store guns and ammunition separately; beyond the reach of children.
16. Avoid alcoholic beverages before and during shooting.
17. Completely unload your gun before storing, traveling, standing it against an object, laying it down or handing it to someone.
18. Never use a gun that fails to function properly or force a jammed action.

## Marlin Warranty

This rifle is warranted to the original registered owner for a period of two years from date of purchase against defects in material and workmanship, excepting, however, such conditions as normal wear or damage resulting from neglect, abuse or repairs not made or authorized by Marlin.

## Its Purpose

Your Marlin bolt action rifle has been designed to meet the demands of the experienced shooter yet light weight and ease of handling, so important to the beginner, were also considered in its manufacture. Large capacity tubular magazine or convenient clip loading make it an ideal rifle for plinking, informal target shooting, or small game hunting.

## 1 Your Marlin Bolt Action Rifle

Your Marlin bolt action models 780, 781, and 101 use .22 caliber Short, Long and Long Rifle ammunition. The models 782 and 783 use .22 Win. Magnum Rimfire ammunition only. They are shipped completely assembled and should not be used or disassembled without fully reading and understanding the instructions in this manual.

### 3 How to Operate the Safety

#### A. (Models 780, 781, 782, 783 only)

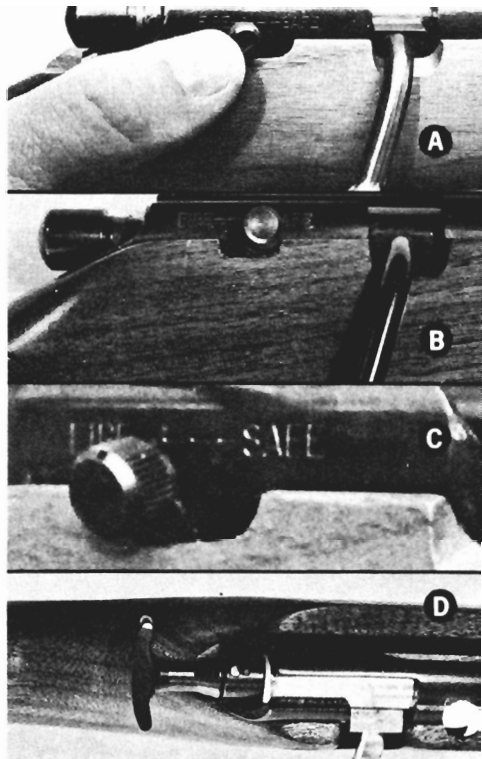
The safety mechanism is a round button located on the rear right side of the receiver directly behind the bolt handle. The words "safe" and "fire" are engraved ahead and to the rear of the safety button. To put your rifle ON SAFE, (gun must be cocked-red band on striker knob visible) push the safety button forward (photo A), as far as it will go. The safety is now ON SAFE (photo B).

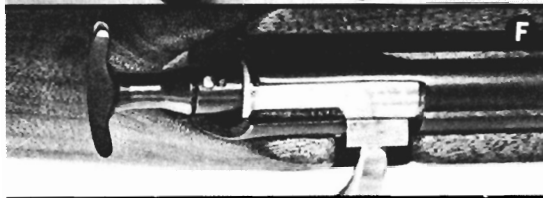
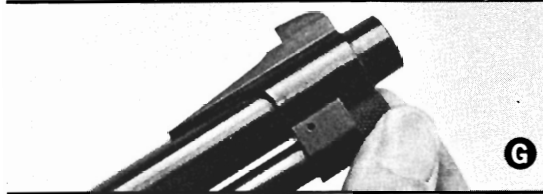
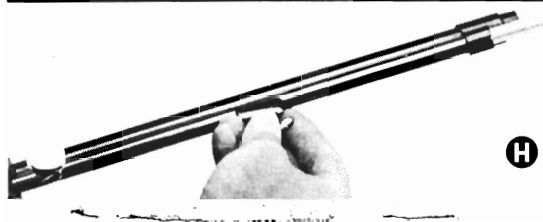
To move your safety to the OFF SAFE position, pull the safety button back to the "fire" position as far as it will go. The safety is now in the OFF SAFE position (photo C).

Never disassemble the safety. It has been correctly designed, fitted and tested. Any mechanical device can fail, however, so never rely on the safety to justify careless handling.

#### B. (Model 101 only)

The Model 101 is not equipped with a conventional safety button, however it is equipped with a T-shaped cocking knob which must be pulled to the rear (cocked) prior to firing. When the cocking knob is

in its forward position (photo D), the rifle is ON SAFE. The 101 may be put ON SAFE from the cocked position (photo E) by (1) firmly grasping and pulling the cocking knob to the rear (2) maintaining a firm grip on the cocking knob, and pulling the trigger; (3) letting the cocking knob go forward SLOWLY, removing your finger from the trigger at the same time, until it rests in the ON SAFE position (photo F).

#### **4** How to Load Your Bolt Action Rifle

- A. Tubular Magazine (Models 781 and 783 only).** Be sure the chamber is empty, bolt is closed and the safety is ON SAFE. To load the magazine turn your rifle over and unlock the inner magazine tube by turning the knurled locking end plug (photo G). Keeping your fingers away from the muzzle, extract the inner tube from the outer tube until the loading port is exposed. Insert the cartridges as shown, bullet end towards the muzzle (photo H).

When you have loaded up to the stated magazine capacity shown on page (3) for your particular model, slide the tube back in place, turning it slightly to ease passage over the loaded rounds. Then rotate the knurled locking end plug to the locked position.

The inner tube will not lock in place if the number of cartridges loaded exceeds the stated magazine capacity.

**B. Clip Magazine (Models 780 and 782)**

Remove the clip magazine of model 782 by pressing release button shown in photo I. Release button on 780 is located at the rear and bottom of the clip itself. Insert up to seven cartridges (photo J). Replace loaded clip being sure it locks in place.

**C. Single Shot (Model 101 only)**

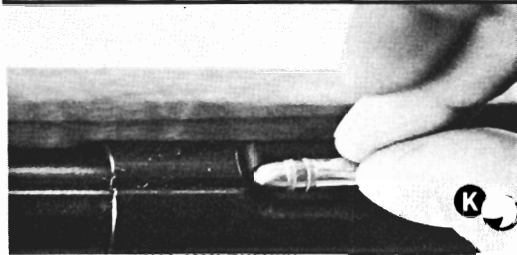
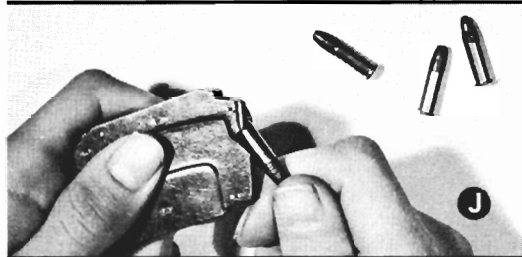
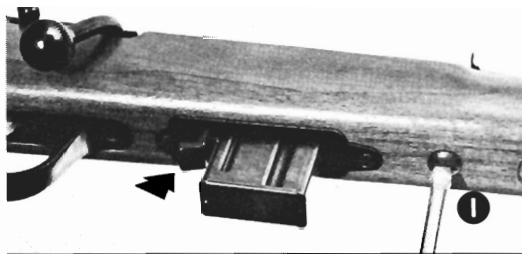
This model holds only one cartridge. Simply place the cartridge directly into the loading port, bullet end towards the muzzle, and close the bolt (photo K).

**5 Loading A Single Cartridge (all models)**

All clip and tubular magazine models may be loaded with a single cartridge, provided the feed mechanism and magazine are empty, by opening the bolt and placing the cartridge, bullet end toward the muzzle, directly into the chamber.

**6 Cocked and Ready**

To cock your Model 780, 781, 782 and 783, completely open and close the bolt one time. CAUTION. Your rifle is now cocked and ready to fire.



The Model 101 is cocked and ready to fire when the cocking knob is pulled rearward.

## 7 To Fire

### A. Models 780, 781, 782 and 783

Move the safety to the OFF SAFE or fire position and with the gun pointed at the target squeeze the trigger. If you have not fired all cartridges at the target, be sure to put the safety ON SAFE until you are ready to shoot again.

### B. Model 101 only

Grasp the cocking knob and with your finger off the trigger, pull it rearward until it locks. A broad red mark on the stem of the cocking knob will be exposed to signify that the gun is cocked and ready to fire. Point the gun at the target and squeeze the trigger.

## 8 How to Unload

For all clip or tube loading models the following procedure is recommended: (1) with the safety ON SAFE and the gun pointed in a safe direction, open the bolt and eject the loaded cartridge present in the chamber; (2) with the bolt open, remove the clip or for tubular magazine, unlock and remove the inner magazine tube and empty all cartridges. Replace

and lock inner magazine tube back in position; (3) completely open and fully close the bolt several more times to eject the cartridge in the feed mechanism. Finally, inspect interior of receiver visually.

With the rifle in the ON SAFE position, the model 101 single shot may be unloaded by simply opening the bolt and ejecting the cartridge in the chamber. Important, this model can only be unloaded with the rifle ON SAFE.

## 9 What to Do If Your Rifle Fails to Fire

### A. Misfires:

If you squeeze the trigger and nothing happens, remain in the shooting position, pointing the gun in a safe direction. Count to 10, then operate the bolt to eject the misfired cartridge from the gun.

### B. Underpowered Shot:

A "squib" or underpowered shot should not occur if the ammunition is clean, dry and factory loaded. You can tell if a shot is underpowered by the unusual low report it makes. Because the bullet may actually still be in the barrel, you must unload completely and with the bolt to the rear, look through the barrel to see if there is any obstruction. If there is, it should be removed by a Marlin Recommended Gunsmith.

## 10 Sighting

All Marlin rifles are pre-sighted at the factory, however, due to individual sighting characteristics minor adjustments may be necessary.

### A. Vertical Correction:

To raise the point of impact, raise the rear sight. To lower the point of impact, lower the rear sight.

### B. Horizontal Correction:

To move the point of impact to the left, move the rear sight to the left. To move the point of impact to the right move the rear sight to the right.

Windage adjustments to the rear sight can be accomplished by gently tapping the dovetail portion of the rear sight in the desired direction. Elevation adjustments to the rear sight may be accomplished by moving the elevator to the desired height.

## 11 Cleaning Your Rifle

Before cleaning your rifle be certain it is completely unloaded. With normal use it is not necessary to clean the bore of your rifle. However, if the rifle gets wet or if foreign material gets into the action or barrel, cleaning as described below is recommended.

Being sure your rifle is unloaded, unlock the bolt, pull the trigger fully to the rear and completely withdraw the bolt from the rear of the receiver, as shown in photo L.

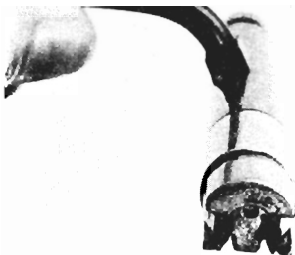
Clean the bore and barrel by using any standard .22 caliber commercial cleaning rod and cleaning patches. Clean the barrel with powder solvent and wipe lightly with gun oil after cleaning.

To replace the bolt assembly, align the forward portion of the bolt to the bolt handle by rotating to the position shown in photo M. With trigger pulled, insert bolt into rear of receiver. **Never force the breech bolt into the receiver as serious damage may result. If you encounter difficulty, remove the bolt and re-check alignment.**

Caution: Further disassembly of the action is not recommended and should only be attempted by a Marlin Recommended Gunsmith.

## 12 Maintenance

Avoid the use of oil during below freezing conditions. A dry graphite used sparingly is recommended for cold weather lubrication. Condensation droplets may form soon after the rifle is brought into a warm room or the rifle may become wet during inclement weather. In any case, all moisture should be removed from the affected areas. Exterior metal finishes may be wiped down with a slightly oiled cloth. For long term storage, lightly oil bore, barrel and action with gun oil. Your rifle should be completely unloaded and stored in a dry area.

## Instructions for Factory Maintenance

Part 178.147 of the Internal Revenue Service, **Rules & Regulations Governing Commerce in Firearms and Ammunition**, entitled **Repair of Firearm**, states, "A person not otherwise prohibited by Federal, State or local law", (such as a convicted felon, drug addict, or mental incompetent) "may ship a firearm to a licensed importer, licensed manufacturer, or licensed dealer for the sole purpose of repair or customizing and notwithstanding any other provision of this part, the licensed importer, licensed manufacturer, or licensed dealer may return in interstate or foreign commerce to that person the repaired firearm or a replacement firearm of the same kind and type."

- A. Questions regarding the performance of your firearms should be addressed to our Gun Service Division. You should include the Serial Number, Model Number and a full description of the conditions and problems involved.

B. If you wish to return your firearm for repair, follow these instructions:

1. Be absolutely certain that your firearm is empty of all cartridges prior to mailing.
2. Pack your rifle carefully, with plenty of cushioning material, and a sturdy outer cardboard box. Do not ship in a gun case or special container that you wish returned.
3. Clearly mark on the outside of the package should be your return address.
4. Affix a complete letter of information to the outside of the package. The letter should describe the contents; e.g., whether it's a complete gun, or part; the model number and serial number; description of the damage or problem,

including under what conditions they occurred; what you wish corrected or changed, and any new parts desired.

5. If not covered by warranty, and you wish an estimate, please advise. Otherwise, we will perform the necessary repairs.
6. Do not ship live ammunition to the factory.
7. Ship your firearm via Insured Parcel Post. Shipment must be **prepaid** and addressed to Marlin Firearms Co., Gun Service Division, 100 Kenna Drive, North Haven, Conn. 06473, or your nearest Recommended Marlin Service Center.
