


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
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Cover: Winslow Homer, Breezing Up (detail), 1876 Frontispiece: Eastman Johnson, The Brown Family, 1869

Foreword

The previous catalogue of the American paintings in the National Gallery of Art, published a decade ago, has been out of print for some time, and the opportunity to update our information has made us freshly aware of the notable expansion in the American collection over the last ten years.

Under David Finley, the first director of the National Gallery, John Walker served as chief curator, until he succeeded to the directorship in 1956. At the same time Perry Cott was appointed chief curator, and William P. Campbell assumed the duties of curator of paintings. Through the Gallery's first decades the different national schools were cared for in this centralized way. Mr. Campbell's particular interests and training were in the American field, though he continued to serve as assistant chief curator during the years preceding his death in 1976. Under the tenure of the present assistant director and chief curator, Charles Parkhurst, who joined the Gallery in 1971, curators responsible for the various national schools of painting, as well as for the areas of sculpture and graphic arts, have been appointed.

Succeeding Mr. Campbell in 1977 with the specific responsibilities as curator of American art and senior curator was the scholar and historian of American art, John Wilmerding. Among his activities has been the initiation of an active program of major exhibitions. Concurrently, we have reinstalled all of the American galleries, highlighting the several major acquisitions in this field to come to the Gallery in recent years. Also underway is work on a full catalogue raisonné of all American paintings in the National Gallery. We are grateful to Mr. Wilmerding for supervising the preparation of this present volume, and to Linda Ayres, assistant curator of American art, who compiled all of the technical data.

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In an institution devoted to collecting and exhibiting great works from the whole Western tradition, it is appropriate that our nation's art receive thoughtful attention. This new illustrated summary catalogue is intended as a source of both pleasure and edification for all who consult it.

Preface

As befits a democracy, the great examples of America's native art are housed in many collections across the country. Important concentrations are to be found in several locations, and appropriately one of the premier cities with a broad and rich coverage of American art is the nation's capital. From the time of its opening, the National Gallery of Art has included among its obligations to the public the collection and display of many of the best examples of American painting. This objective has been increasingly realized over the decades by the acquisition of outstanding American paintings through many generous gifts and occasional purchases. These represent the high points of the nation's cultural achievements from the colonial period to contemporary times. It has traditionally been the National Gallery's policy to collect, where possible, the supreme examples by the major artists in a national school rather than to assemble a survey of representative pieces. The Gallery's holdings are strongly complemented by the other major concentrations of American art in Washington, namely, the distinguished personal collections of the Corcoran, Freer, and Phillips galleries, and the broader surveys assembled at the Hirshhorn Museum, National Collection of Fine Arts, and National Portrait Gallery. These, together with the supporting resources in other sections of the Smithsonian Institution (for example, American Indian and Afro-American art) and in the Library of Congress and the National Archives, make Washington a preeminent location for the study of American art.

The present summary catalogue succeeds one published in 1970 and now out of print. It documents the growth in the American collections over the last decade in two significant areas: the addition of several nineteenth-century masterpieces and, concurrent with the completion of the Gallery's new East Building in 1978, the dynamic expansion in the area of twentieth-century modernism. This new handbook illustrates all of the paintings in the American collection, providing an updated reference resource and demonstrating the special strengths and qualities of these holdings for our public. This catalogue is intended as a step in the continuing process of scholarly research on the collections, to culminate in the coming years with publication of a full catalogue raisonné of American paintings in the National Gallery. When the Gallery opened in 1941, it owned only eleven American pictures given by Andrew W. Mellon. (Another thirteen were on view as loans.) By 1970 the summary catalogue could list 827 paintings (and five pieces of American sculpture). As of January 1, 1980, the works documented here number just over a thousand objects. All American sculpture is to be listed with European objects in a separate handbook devoted to three-dimensional works owned by the Gallery. Graphic works of art on paper are the subject of a separate series of catalogues.

The American collection has come to its present distinction in part through its shaping and nurturing by William P. Campbell, who was for many years the Gallery's curator of American painting and assistant chief curator until his untimely death in 1976. The Gallery's holdings have also been immeasurably enriched by the many gifts to the nation from dozens of thoughtful, public-spirited donors. Their names are gratefully recorded on the pages following this preface.

A brief summary of some of the most notable donations will give a revealing indication of both the remarkable generosity of individual collectors as well as particular areas of depth within the American collection. Among the first Andrew W. Mellon pictures to come to the Gallery in 1941 were such now-familiar images as Edward Savage's Washington Family of 1796, Gilbert Stuart's Mrs. Richard Yates of c.1794, and Benjamin West's Colonel Guy Johnson of 1776. From the outset, these superb examples by three of America's "old masters" assured the Gallery's commitment to high quality in the American school. They are quite different from one another-the Savage endures as a great national document, the Stuart as an unsurpassed individual study, and the West as an impressive academic accomplishment. Together they established a central concentration in portraiture, which would be reinforced over the following

years by the addition of nearly a dozen works by John Singleton Copley; three times that number of other Stuart portraits; a group of figural pieces by John Singer Sargent, Thomas Eakins, and James McNeill Whistler; and several strong portraits by the Ash Can painters: George Bellows, Robert Henri, and George Luks.

The early forties saw the further strengthening of the American collection with such additional major works as Copley's Red Cross Knight, 1793, the gift of Mrs. Gordon Dexter; Whistler's White Girl, 1862, which came from the Harris Whittemore Collection; and Winslow Homer's Breezing Up, 1876, a purchase in 1943 through the W.L. and May T. Mellon Foundation. The Homer was the first of several of his great oils to come to the National Gallery over the years, a group significantly enhanced in the 1970s by the bequest of seventeen of his watercolors from Mrs. Charles Henschel and the gift of a half dozen drawings by him from John Davis Hatch. The Gallery also benefited from the early and continuing generosity of Chester Dale, perhaps most familiarly in the French area, though notably in the American school as well. With a taste sensitive foremost to the impressionist style, he gave William Merritt Chase's A Friendly Call in 1943 and two decades later a large still life Chrysanthemums by the artist. In this 1962 gift also were no less than seven works by Mary Cassatt, including the wellknown Boating Party of c.1894.

The decade of the fifties brought broad new support, especially from three collectors who were to enlarge the Gallery's American holdings markedly. Ailsa Mellon Bruce provided funds through the Avalon Foundation to make possible the acquisition in 1951 of *Right and Left*, the culminating achievement of Homer's career and certainly one of the most important American works in the National Gallery. In this period, too, Edgar William and Bernice Chrysler Garbisch initiated a gift of magnanimous and ongoing generosity with their donation of over two hundred and fifty American naive paintings. In addition to the marvelous variety of subjects by unknown artists in this group are Joshua Johnston's Westwood Children, a pair of Winthrop Chandler portraits, eight landscapes by Thomas Chambers, fourteen works by Erastus Salisbury Field, and Edward Hicks' singular panorama The Cornell Farm of 1848. At the same time the Andrew W. Mellon Foundation continued to provide important funds and added to the

growing Stuart holdings the artist's full-length tour de force, *The Skater*.

During the 1960s imposing portrait and figure paintings came into the Gallery's collection from various donors: John Trumbull's Patrick Tracy, Charles Willson Peale's double portrait Benjamin and Eleanor Ridgely Laming, Sargent's Mrs. Adrian Iselin, and Copley's first major subject of his English period, Watson and the Shark. But these gains in portraiture were being matched with the acquisition in the mid-sixties of such key Hudson River School landscapes as Thomas Cole's Crawford Notch and Frederic Edwin Church's Morning in the Tropics. Another sizable gift was the collection of George Catlin cartoons, given by Paul Mellon in 1965. Numbering more than three hundred and fifty, this remarkable group of finished oil sketches includes powerful Indian portraits as well as numerous renderings of Indian life-ceremonies, hunting, and other daily activities. With the incorporation of this group into the American collections, the National Gallery was the beneficiary of another solid underpinning to its singular and representative works of native art. Indeed, as William Campbell pointed out in his preface to the 1970 illustrated catalogue, more than threequarters of the National Gallery's American paintings are associated with three donor names: Andrew W. Mellon, Colonel and Mrs. Garbisch, and Paul Mellon.

The Garbisch collection continued to grow throughout this period, and by the end of the sixties its shape and dimensions were clear. It contained subjects of all typesportraits, landscapes, genre, signboards. Most of these paintings were by anonymous, self-taught craftsmen. Joined with the Catlin collection, the Garbisch gifts assured that the American school at the National Gallery would have a rich and broad variety, spanning the full spectrum from selftrained to academic styles. Selections from the Garbisch and Catlin groups are periodically on exhibit in the galleries, while dozens of other works from these gifts go out on loan to other institutions and museums across the country or abroad. Thus, we have seen in summary form how the Gallery's American holdings emerged over only three decades with both great single works of art and several broad areas of strength, to give the visitor an overview of America's evolving visual heritage.

With this broad foundation of distinction to build on, the Gallery continued to acquire during the 1970s additional

American paintings of particular interest and quality. At the beginning of the decade, and at the start of J. Carter Brown's directorship, Thomas Cole's major late series The *Voyage of Life* came to light and was purchased through the Ailsa Mellon Bruce Fund. A large allegorical painting, The Spirit of War, by Jasper Cropsey was another rediscovery after many years, and in 1978 the Avalon Foundation made possible this acquisition. By happy coincidence, in the same year the bequest of Frederick Sturges, Jr., brought to the Gallery five beautiful Hudson River School paintings, among them an unsurpassed Newport view by John F. Kensett and works by Francis W. Edmonds, Asher B. Durand, and John W. Casilear, three artists who up to this point had been unrepresented in the collection. Purchased shortly after, in memory of former National Gallery director, David Finley, and his wife, was The Brown Family, one of Eastman Johnson's finest group portraits.

The culminating acquisition of the 1970s was the group of five portraits by Gilbert Stuart of the first five American presidents, which came from the T. Jefferson Coolidge family of Boston. Known as the Gibbs-Coolidge portraits because they were originally painted for Colonel Gibbs of Rhode Island between 1810 and 1825, they passed after his death into the Coolidge family, in which they descended until coming to the National Gallery. Although other portraits of these presidents exist, these have special importance as the only surviving group. (Stuart painted one other set, which was partially destroyed by fire in the Library of Congress in the middle of the nineteenth century.) Aside from their obvious historical and documentary significance, they also possess an impressive artistic power, deriving from their vitality as well as sense of humane and accessible presence. By joining the already strong and varied number of Stuart paintings in the Gallery, this singular group of great American images now establishes a preeminent concentration of this early American master's art in Washington.

If the major American works have come to the National Gallery through no particular plan, but rather by the exemplary generosity of donors and the careful purchasing by several directors and curators, the cumulative result now offers an outstanding overview of our nation's achievements in the visual arts.



Explanation

The term "attributed to" preceding an artist's name indicates that the painting is probably by that artist. A question mark, (?), following an artist's name is used to indicate less conviction than "attributed to."

Paintings are in oil unless otherwise specified. Dimensions are meters followed by inches, height preceding width.

Dates assigned to works of art follow this system:

1775 painted in 1775

1775-1780 begun in 1775 and finished in 1780

1775/1780 painted at some time between 1775 and 1780, inclusive

c.1775/1780 painted at some time between approximately 1775 and 1780

Only inscriptions from the face of a picture are given. The term "falsely inscribed" preceding an inscription indicates that, in our opinion, it was added with intent to deceive.

Three periods within brackets, [. . .], indicates that a part of the inscription is missing or illegible. When the missing or illegible part can be deduced, it is reconstructed in brackets. A diagonal line or slash, /, is used to mark the end of a line in the inscription.

The number to the right of each title is the National Gallery accession number.


















































































American Paintings Transferred in 1962 to the National Portrait Gallery by the National Gallery of Art

In addition to a National Gallery of Art, Andrew W. Mellon believed that this country should also have its own National Portrait Gallery. Among the American paintings in the Andrew W. Mellon Collection given to the National Gallery of Art were twenty portraits of important Americans. These the National Gallery held for a future National Portrait Gallery. Other collectors made donations for the same purpose.

While in the custody of the National Gallery these portraits were treated as part of its collection. Accordingly, whenever they were published during this period, they were identified as the property of the National Gallery of Art. It is because of this association that they are listed in this catalogue. They are given their traditional attributions and titles, which may not agree with the present designations of the National Portrait Gallery.
