Writhing Ribbon of Living Flame, Twenty Feet in Length, Created When More Than Two Million Volts of Electricity Were Released in the Greatest Man-Made Lightning Flash

Man-Made Lightning Leaps Twenty-Foot Gap

Crash of Artificial Thunder Inaugurates Laboratory That Uses over Two Million Volts to Solve Power-Line Troubles

A DAZZLING flash of flame, twenty feet long, marked the opening of a high-voltage laboratory at Stanford University. Two million and a hundred thousand volts were condensed in the initial man-made lightning. The exhibition was the first test of apparatus with which Dr. Harris J. Ryan, in whose honor the laboratory has been named, expects to solve the pressing problems of long-distance, yet economical, transportation of electric power.

The development of the water-power resources of the Pacific coast, which embrace sixty per cent of all the available water power in the United States, has been handicapped by the fact that the falls where power is generated are mainly far back in the mountains, 200 miles or more from the cities where the power is needed. Electricity at moderate voltages cannot be sent over long distances without tremendous losses, due to the resistance of the power lines, while development of high-

tension lines has been hindered by the inability of engineers to control the current and prevent its breaking down the insulators used. The highest power handled so far has been 220,000 volts, over a line designed by Dr. Ryan.

In the new laboratory, he plans to study the action of high voltages and design insulators and equipment strong enough to carry the enormous pressures. The initial experiment showed that 2,100,000 volts would leap through twenty feet and one inch of air space, but if no grounded substance is within that distance of the high-tension line then the current cannot escape.

Six giant transformers, each of 350,000 volts' capacity, compose the main equipment of the Ryan laboratory, which is housed in a large building resembling the hangar of a dirigible. Painted a dead black in the interior, and with every crack sealed against light, it can be turned into a cavern of gloom, so that the investiga-

tors may observe the first faint hint of corona light around the insulators and watch it grow until the danger point is reached and the bolt leaps through space.

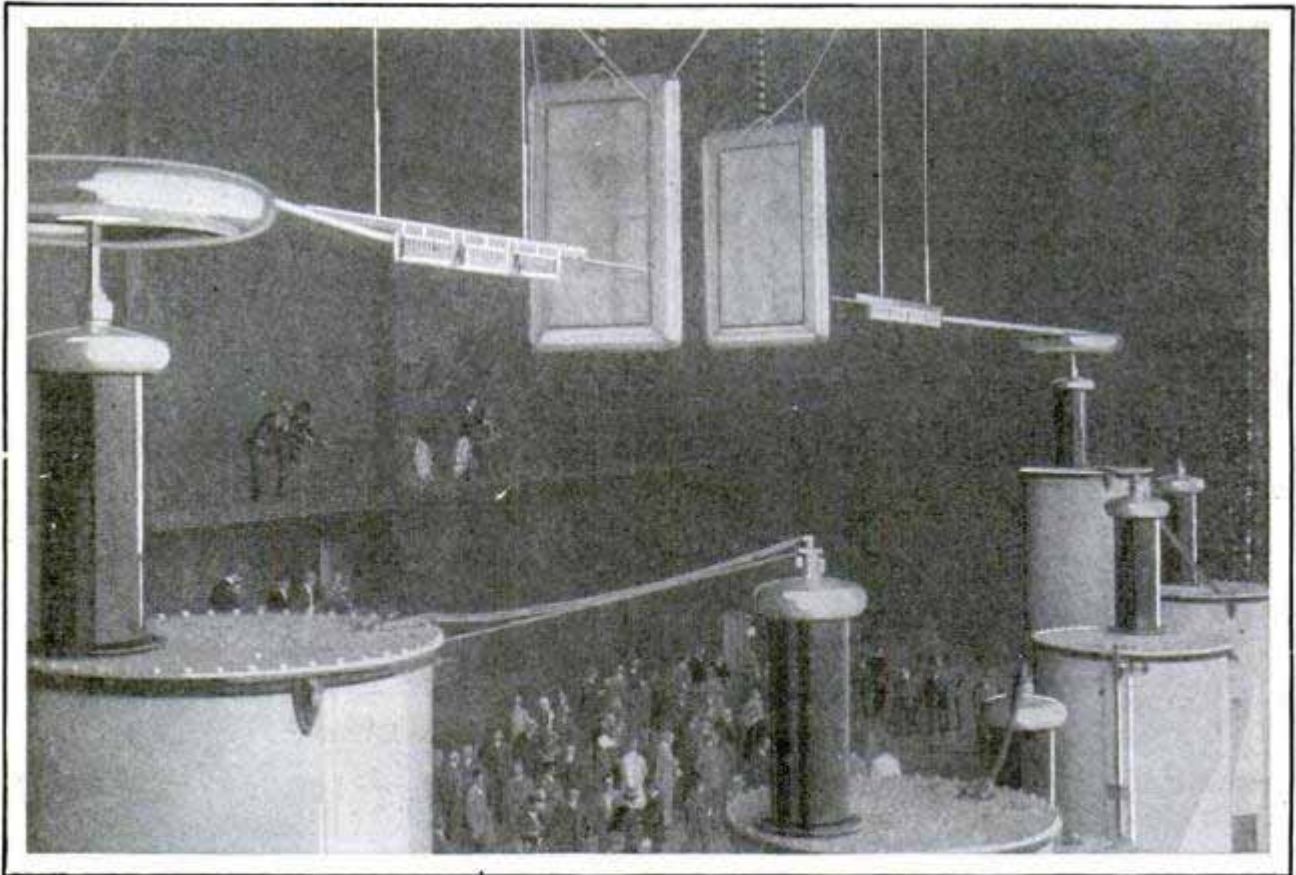
Outside, the university has set aside right of way for an experimental high-tension line that will be seven miles long when all sections are completed. Here the theories worked out in the laboratory will be put to actual test by sending the output of the six big transformers through special lines supported by insulators designed to meet the requirements shown in the laboratory tests. With twenty feet of clear space needed to keep the electricity from escaping, three doors, forty-seven feet high and forty feet wide, are provided in one side of the building, and when they are rolled back, the connecting wires to the high-tension line will run through the center of the openings.

In his opening-day demonstration Dr. Ryan performed two experiments to show the capacity of the laboratory to generate the greatest man-made lightning bolts ever attempted. In the first, two huge electrodes, six by eight feet in size, were suspended more than eighteen feet apart,

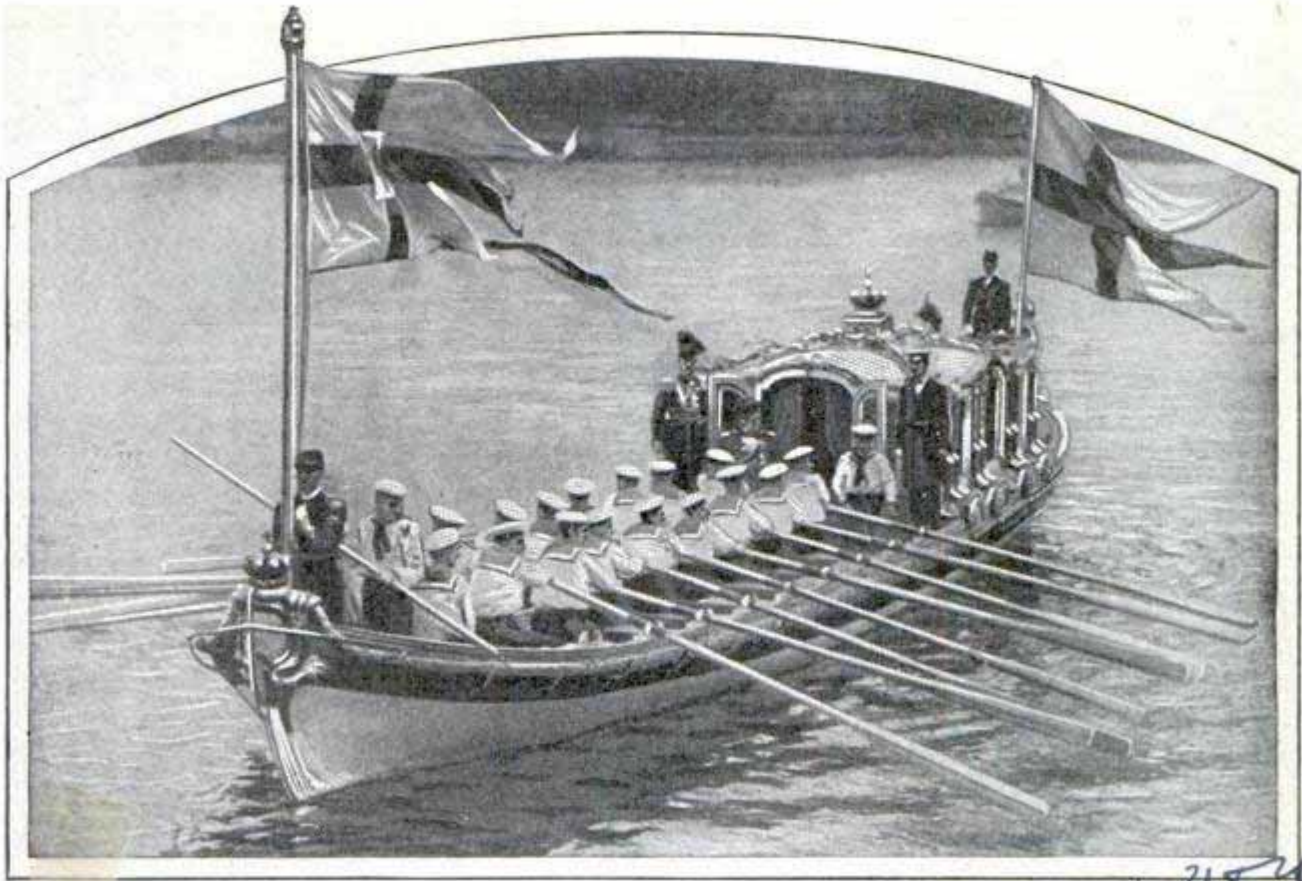
the massive doors closed, and the switch thrown that awakened the transformers to life. In a moment, a purplish haze began to glow about the corners of the electrodes as Dr. Ryan moved the control switch up to 500,000 volts. As he advanced it farther, darting tongues of flames began to appear. They twisted and writhed like fiery snakes, shooting here and there, feeling their way through the air in search of some path to the ground. The flames grew longer and longer as Dr. Ryan called out "a million volts." Above the huge electrodes, suspending them from the ceiling, mounted tier on tier of enormous insulators.

Up these the flames climbed, until it seemed they would reach the ceiling and escape. At two million volts the boldest tongues were almost to the rafters, and the hissing uproar was almost deafening. Then with a tremendous thunder clap the current jumped the gap in a blinding sheet.

The second experiment was made with brass rods as electrodes, each sharpened to a needle point. The points were placed just over twenty feet apart, and again the bolt leaped the gap.

PEAT FIBER USED FOR CARPETS AND WOOD SUBSTITUTE

Peat as fuel is widely used in many countries and often proves a reliable source of warmth during coal shortages, but recent experiments with the substance show that its serviceability is not limited to stoves. German investigators have found that its fibers can be dyed, bleached and woven into carpets, drapes and even clothing, while experiments at Hamburg and Dresden indicate that it may prove

an excellent substitute for wood. The peat is subjected to great pressure and, at the same time, combined with wax. The resulting material is said to resist water, fire and variations of temperature and costs about three-fourths as much as oak of commercial grades. It is so hard that it can be employed for paving material and for railroad ties. Peat filling for mattresses and cushions is also in demand.

METAL RULE FOR FITTING CORKS SAVES DRUGGIST TIME



To measure the mouths of bottles, a graduated metal rule quickly tells the size of the cork that will fit. Readings are plainly legible on the side of the gauge. The measure is tapered to fit bottles of many different capacities and is specially serviceable in drugstores and laboratories where corks are constantly used.

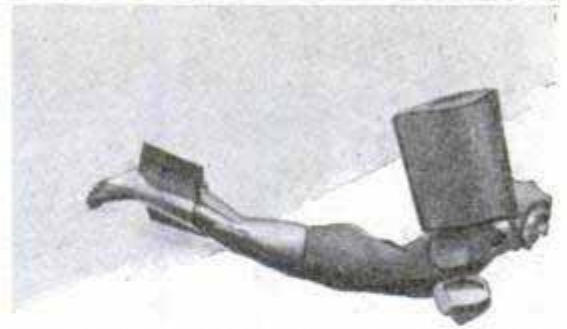

RED OR WHITE COOLEST COLOR FOR HOT CLIMATES

Red is a satisfactory color for clothing in hot weather as it absorbs less of the sun's rays than other shades. Black is the worst and white ranks close to red. Fabrics that reflect light are preferable to those that absorb it. Artificial silk is an excellent material, although it is said not to exclude the rays that tan the skin. Dark clothing is warmer, hence to be preferred in winter, and undergarments that fit snugly but not too tight help keep the body warm if made of the right materials.

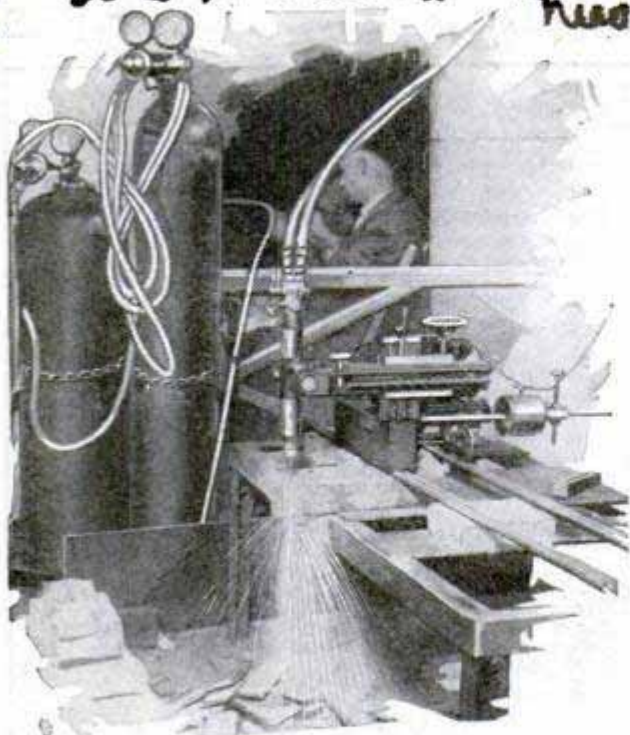

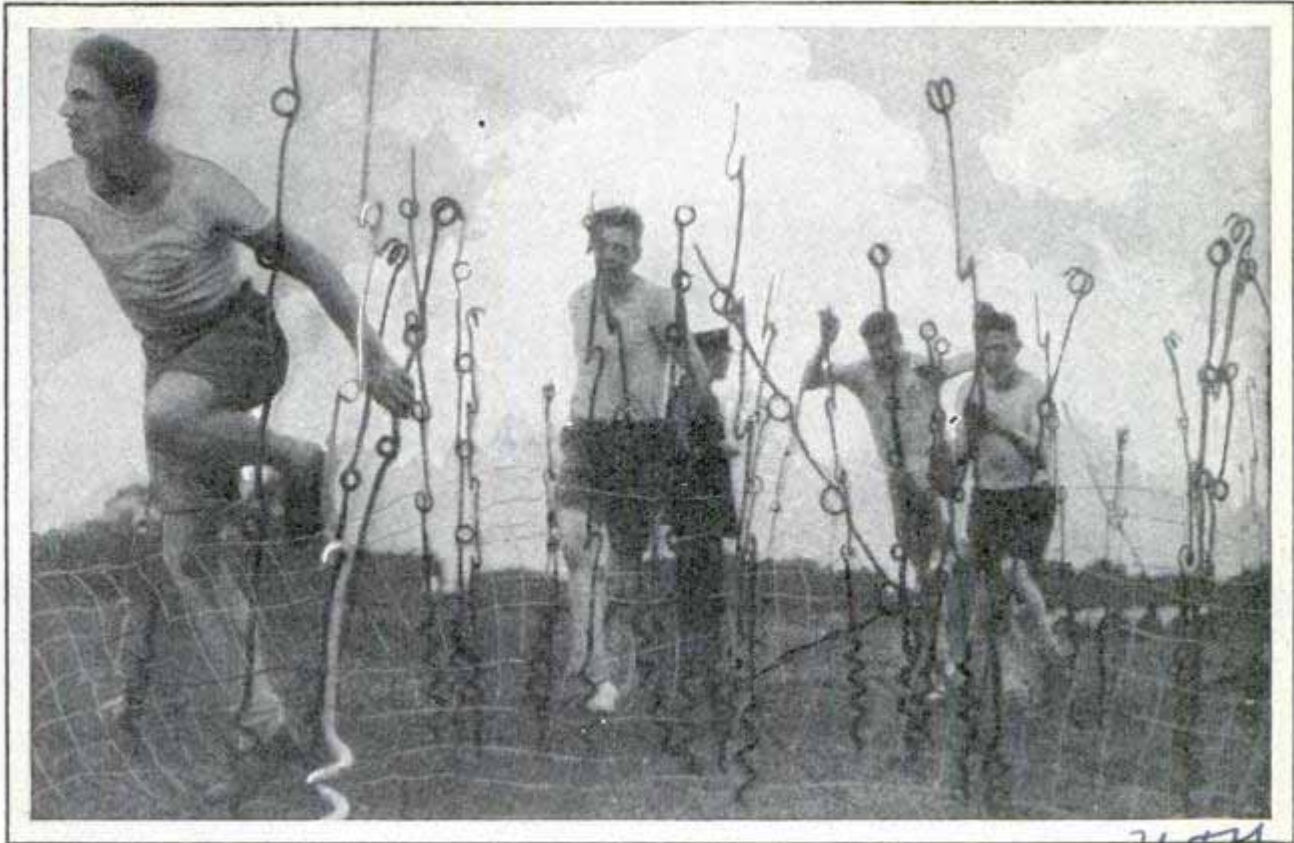

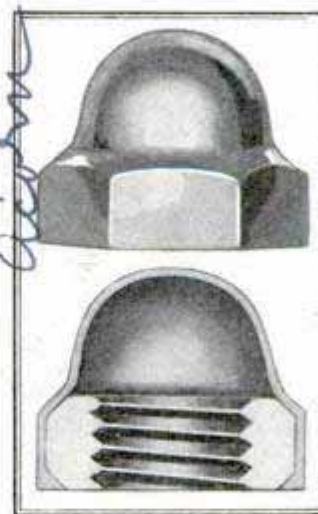

RADIO TEST OF AUTO FINISH REVEALS FLAWS

Elementary principles of radio amplification are being used in an automobile factory to inspect surface finishes. Light is directed on the area to be examined and the intensity of that which is reflected is determined as it strikes a photoelectric cell. An amplifier and measuring instruments enable the examiners to tell accurately the degree of polish on the surface. An advantage of this process is that it removes much guesswork and eliminates errors that often are made when reliance is placed wholly on a workman's judgment. In order to find cracks

in ground surfaces, too small to be seen even with a microscope, the parts are magnetized and immersed in a solution of kerosene oil having suspended in it very fine iron dust. A magnetic field surrounds the crack and the particles adhere in a peculiar way on a hardened surface which has such a defect.

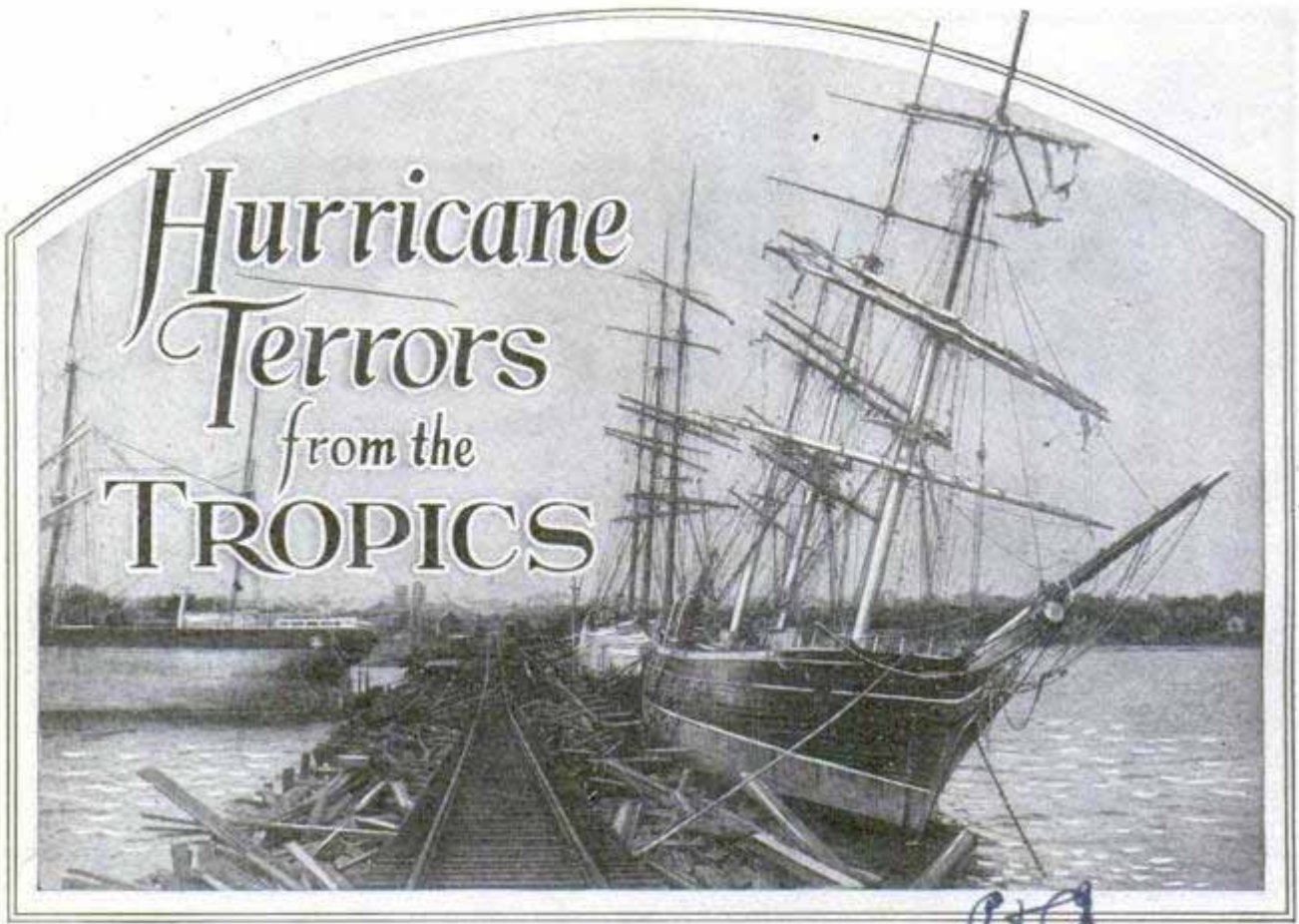

Cyclones of the Sea That Occasionally Sweep Inland and Take a Terrific Toll in Southern States Are All Born near Equator

A TERRIFIC gale blew out of the sea all night long, rain fell in solid walls and giant waves washed ships high and dry on the land, eyewitnesses said in describing the recent Florida hurricane. Then, at dawn, the gale suddenly ceased and householders, in bathing suits, waded out to inspect the damage, thinking all danger was over. But within an hour the gale sprang up again, this time blowing in the opposite direction!

The terror-stricken survivors did not realize it, but they had just lived through the passage of the central vortex of the worst terror of the seas, a tropical hurricane. During that hour of deceptive calm they were in the exact center of a vast bowl of raging winds, a bowl that probably measured between 200 and 300 miles across, with winds whirling round its rim in a counterclockwise direction at a speed ranging from sixty miles or so an hour near the edge to 100 to 120 miles an hour near the center.

This bowl, moving slowly toward the northwest, was advancing at a speed of

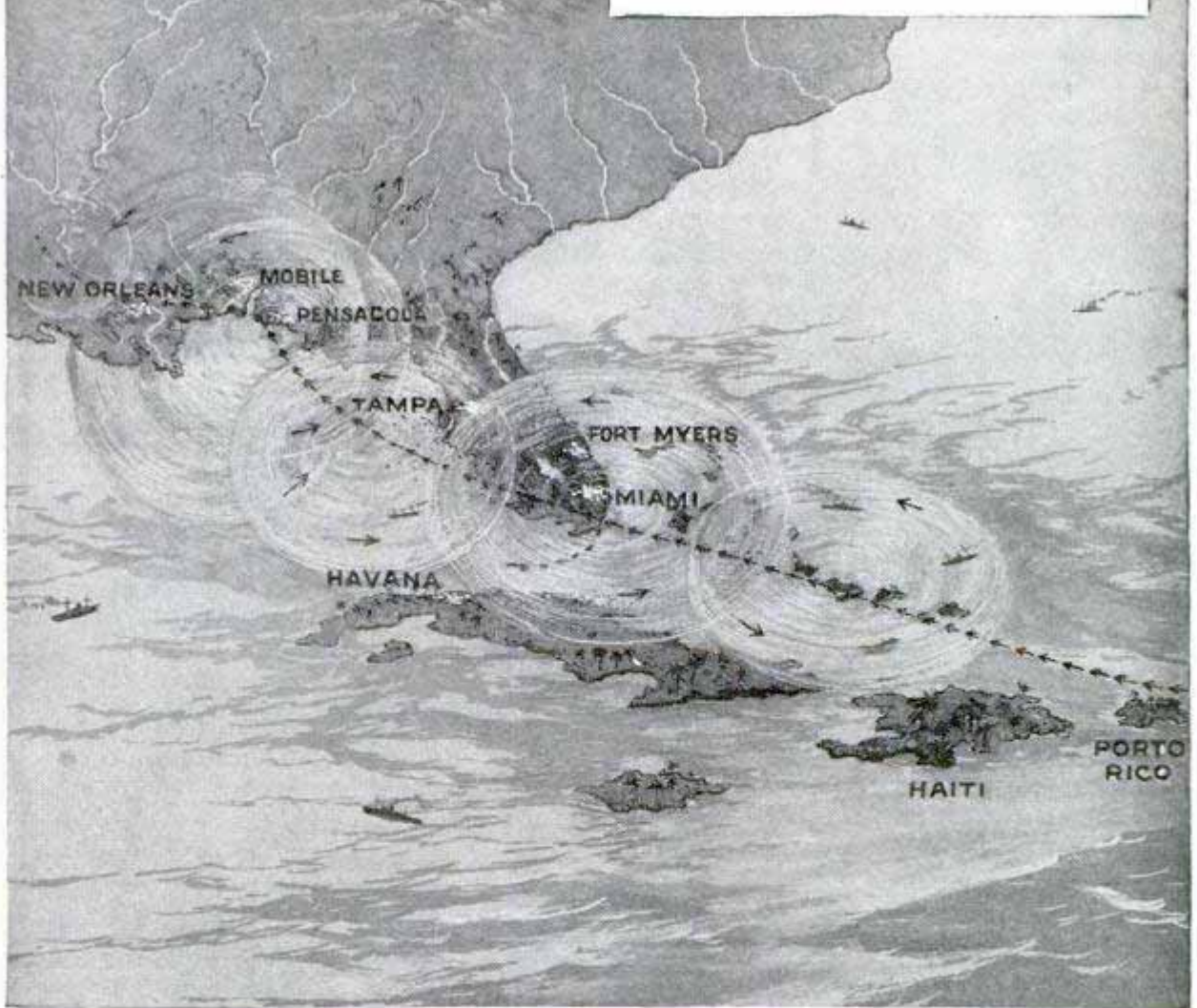
between fifteen and twenty miles an hour, and since the calm of the vortex lasted just about an hour at Miami, it follows that the vortex was some fifteen to twenty miles across. Because the storm approached from the southeast, Miami and southern Florida first felt its northern side, and, since hurricanes in the northern hemisphere always revolve in a counterclockwise direction, the gale blew in from the sea. Then came the center of the storm, with its hour of calm, and again the stricken district was plunged into the gale, but this time the southern side was passing over, so the wind came out of the west.

Some five or six days before the storm, a true cyclone had been born far out at sea, southeast of Porto Rico, probably halfway to the African coast, and in that region that mariners call the doldrums, a belt of calms which stretches for ten to twelve degrees north from the equator. It probably was born somewhere between nine and thirteen degrees north latitude, for, in forty years of observation, a hur-

swept up the sea lanes, taking a heavy toll of shipping, as November hurricanes always do, but missing the land. It might have followed the coast, as often happens, as far north as the vicinity of Boston, and then swept across the Atlantic.

Few people realize the exactitude with which such storms can be plotted, their course foretold, and warnings issued. The weather bureau had this one marked down two or three days before it struck Florida, figured where it would strike, and issued storm warnings. While a hurricane is rivaled only by a tornado in its force and the

ricane has never formed closer to the equator, because the deflective force of the earth's rotation cannot originate a wind vortex at or near the equator.

North of the new-born storm lay a vast island of heavy air, stretching from the region of the Azores west and south over the sea and over the eastern states, reaching as far south as northern Florida. This high-pressure area is found over the north Atlantic each summer, sometimes falling short of the American coast and sometimes reaching far inland. The cyclones of the tropics cannot break through it, and, since the area moves too slowly to pass in front of them, the hurricanes always sweep northwestward until they can round the heavy air, when they turn northeastward again and continue on their way, often as far as Iceland.

This time—and it proved fatal to hundreds of people and millions of dollars' worth of property—the high-pressure island reached so far inland that the cyclone was driven westward across Florida, over the eastern arm of the Gulf of Mexico, and across southern Alabama, until it finally blew itself out somewhere north of New Orleans. Had the area been smaller, as it will be in late October and November, the storm would have swung northeast before reaching the coast and

damage it can do, its actual forward movement is quite slow, only fifteen or twenty miles an hour, as a rule, so that frequently several days will elapse between the first warning and its arrival at a point where it can do great harm.

Two things are necessary to start a tropical cyclone on its way. One is high temperature and the other high humidity, both common in the doldrums. Into the area of expanded, low-pressure air, the winds begin to rush, and then the earth's rotation starts them swirling about a rapidly forming vortex. They swirl faster and faster, and drag more and more air into the motion. Stick your finger into a basin of water and twirl it round and round to form a miniature whirlpool. As the speed increases the whirling water overcomes more and more of the inertia of the water outside itself, until soon you will have the whole basinful swirling around. That is just what happens when a cyclone is born.

The first half of September is the worst period of the year for tropical hurricanes, and the first half of October second. For some strange reason there is a lull during the latter fifteen days of September. Charles L. Mitchell, a weather bureau scientist, who has tabulated and plotted the paths of every hurricane reported

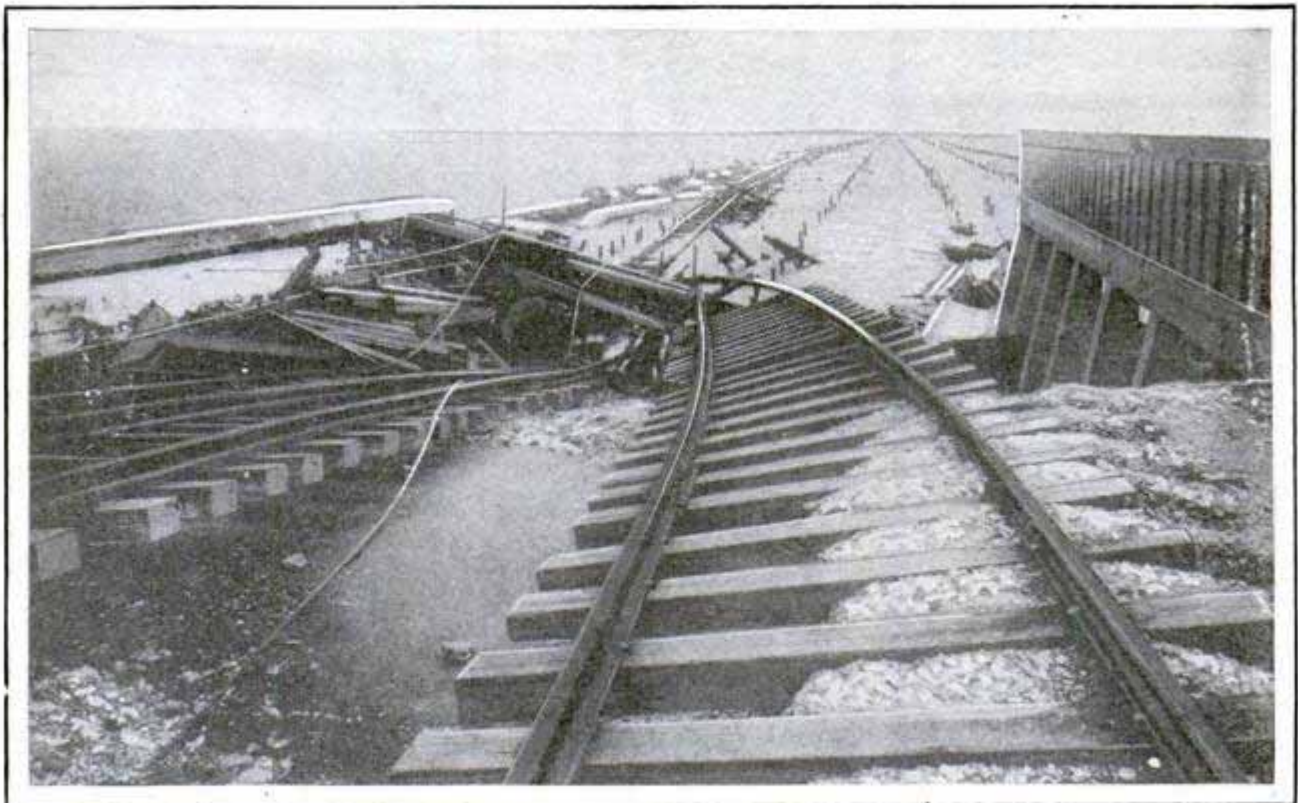
from 1887, when daily weather maps of the North Atlantic first appeared, down to the end of 1924, discovered there were 239 such tropical storms in those thirty-seven years, and that 149, or sixty-two per cent of them, occurred during the two months of September and October, while seventy-eight per cent were catalogued in the three-month period including August. Not all of these, by any means, reached hurricane strength of sixty miles an hour or more. In fact, the chances are only six to nine that a September tropical cyclone will attain hurricane strength, while in November, when the last of them occur each year, the chances are only one in nine.

They are always accompanied, however, by storm tides, which far outrun the slow-moving storm and tell, sometimes many hours in advance, just where the storm will strike, and by their size give a clew as to its intensity. I. M. Cline, who made an exhaustive survey of tropical storm tides for the weather bureau several years ago, reported that the waves and swells of the greatest strength originated in the rear right-hand sector of the storm and advanced through the smaller waves in front of it, racing ahead in the same di-

rection in which the storm was traveling at the time they started. Because of the tremendous wind velocity where they originated, the waves frequently attain a speed of forty-five miles an hour.

He found also that waves from a hurricane that struck Texas in September, 1919, traveled 800 miles in between fifteen and twenty hours, and arrived well in advance of the storm. The highest water is always a few miles to the right of the point where the center of the hurricane will pass, and high water often extends for 100 to 200 miles to the right of the vortex, while it will be felt for only a few miles to the left.

The paths of the storms are always controlled by the high-pressure area which they are trying to pass, and as this sometimes shifts they often follow strange and erratic courses, occasionally even performing a loop and going back over ground they have already covered. When that happens, though, the loop is always to the left. Most of those charted since 1887 have followed roughly a great horse-shoe-shaped course, starting east of South America, coming up toward southern United States, then swinging back north-eastward to Iceland and Scotland.

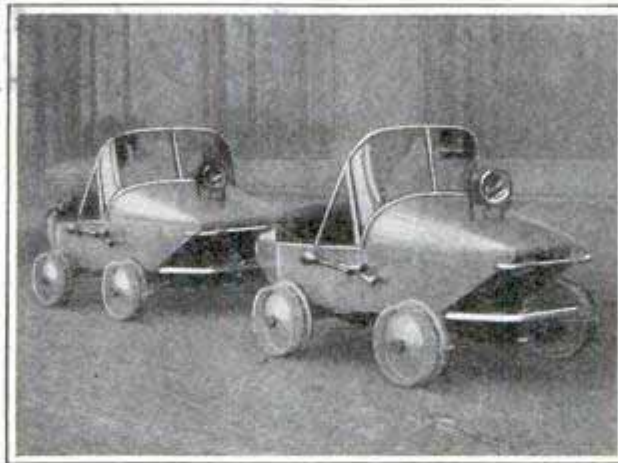

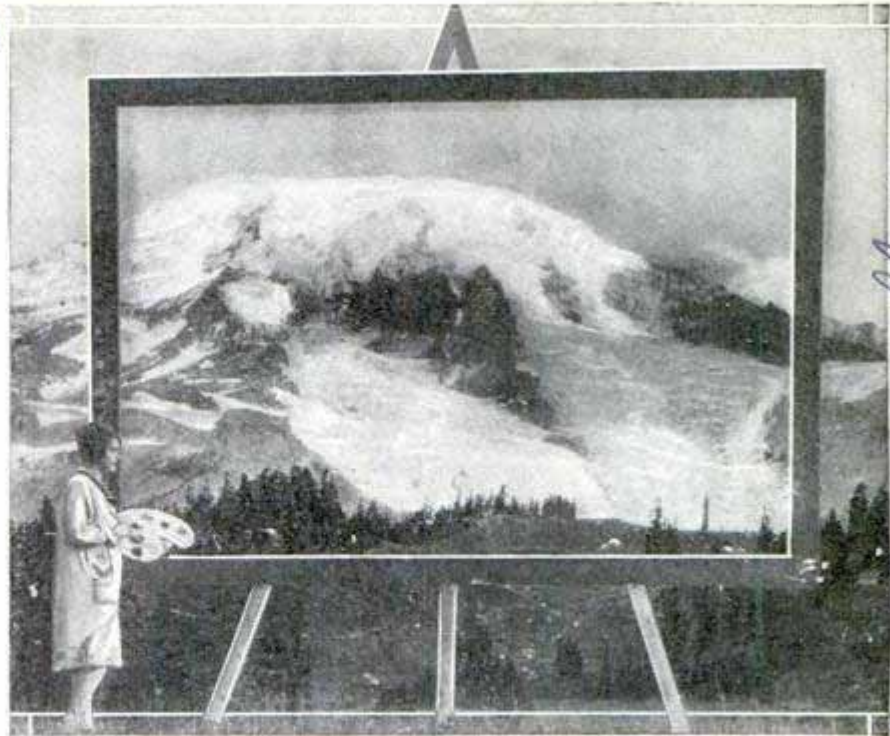

Cleaning rifle barrels after firing is said to be unnecessary if cartridges containing a special, lately introduced priming mixture are used. The substance is said to make the inside of the barrel proof against rust, stain and corrosion. Millions of .22-caliber cartridges were fired to test the mixture and none of the rifle barrels showed any signs of rusting or pitting, it is said.

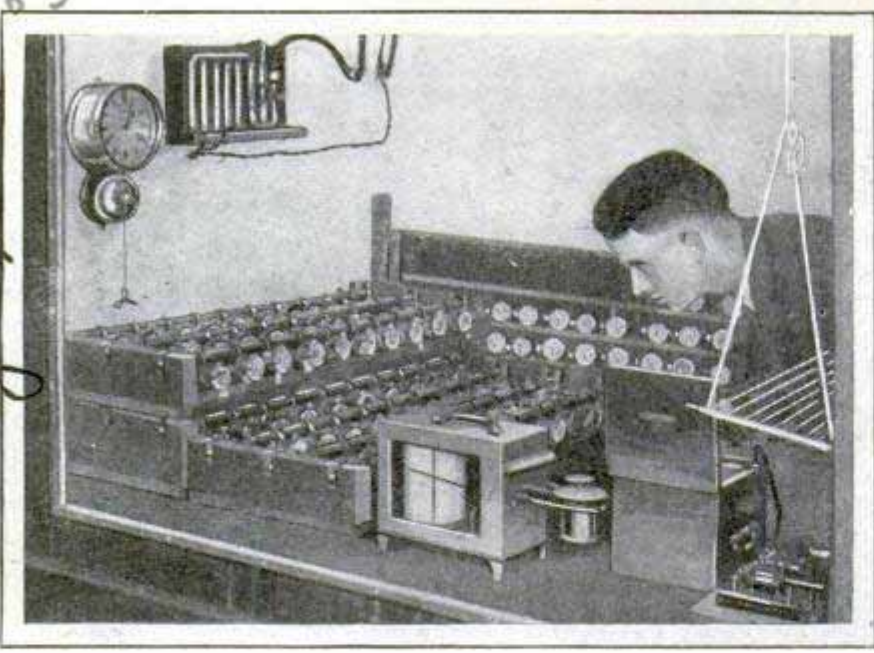

Watches under Test at Bureau of Standards after Being Repaired by Candidates for Certificates as Experts with Timepieces

TEST WATCHES NINETEEN DAYS TO PROVE REPAIRERS' SKILL

Watches which have been repaired and adjusted by candidates for certificates as experts with timepieces are subjected to rigorous tests at the bureau of standards. For nineteen days they are put through a variety of examinations while any discrepancies in time recorded are noted. The ordeal involves numerous changes of position, subjection to heat and cold and other severe trials.

LOCOMOTIVE RUN BY TURBINE DEVELOPS HIGH SPEED

Calculated to haul heavy trains for long distances at more than seventy-four miles an hour, an express turbine locomotive

has been built for the German state railways. Economy of fuel at high speeds, keeping oil from exhaust steam, so that the life of the engine will not be so greatly impaired in reusing water by condensation, and simplicity of operation are claimed for it. A feature of the locomotive is that the tender, besides carrying coal and a store of water to make up for losses by evaporation, is also a cooler to reduce the heat of the water, which is used again in the condensers. The liquid flows through a flexible tube below the engineer's cab into a system of distributing pipes on the roof where it goes to a large number of vertical copper sheets. As it trickles down these, it comes in contact with cool air currents.

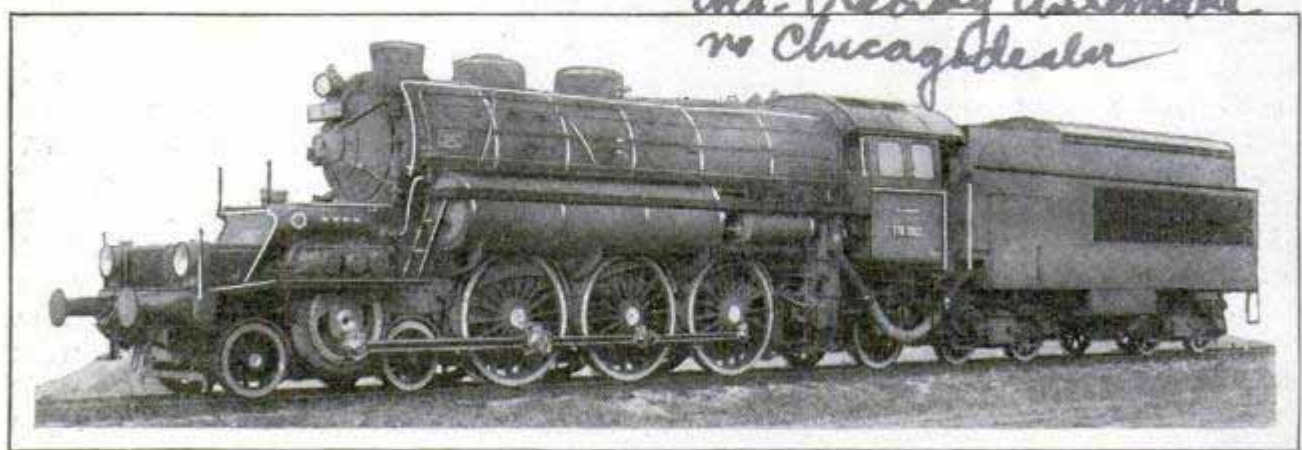
AUTO OILER WITH SIGNAL LIGHT LENGTHENS MOTOR'S LIFE

When the oil supply gets too low, a red light flashes on the instrument board in an automatic lubricating system devised for a popular make of small cars. It is so arranged that the oil is kept midway between the upper and lower petcocks, the level found to give the best results. The system is said to insure proper circulation of oil in the crankcase, thus prolonging the life of the motor, and to eliminate smoke from the exhaust.

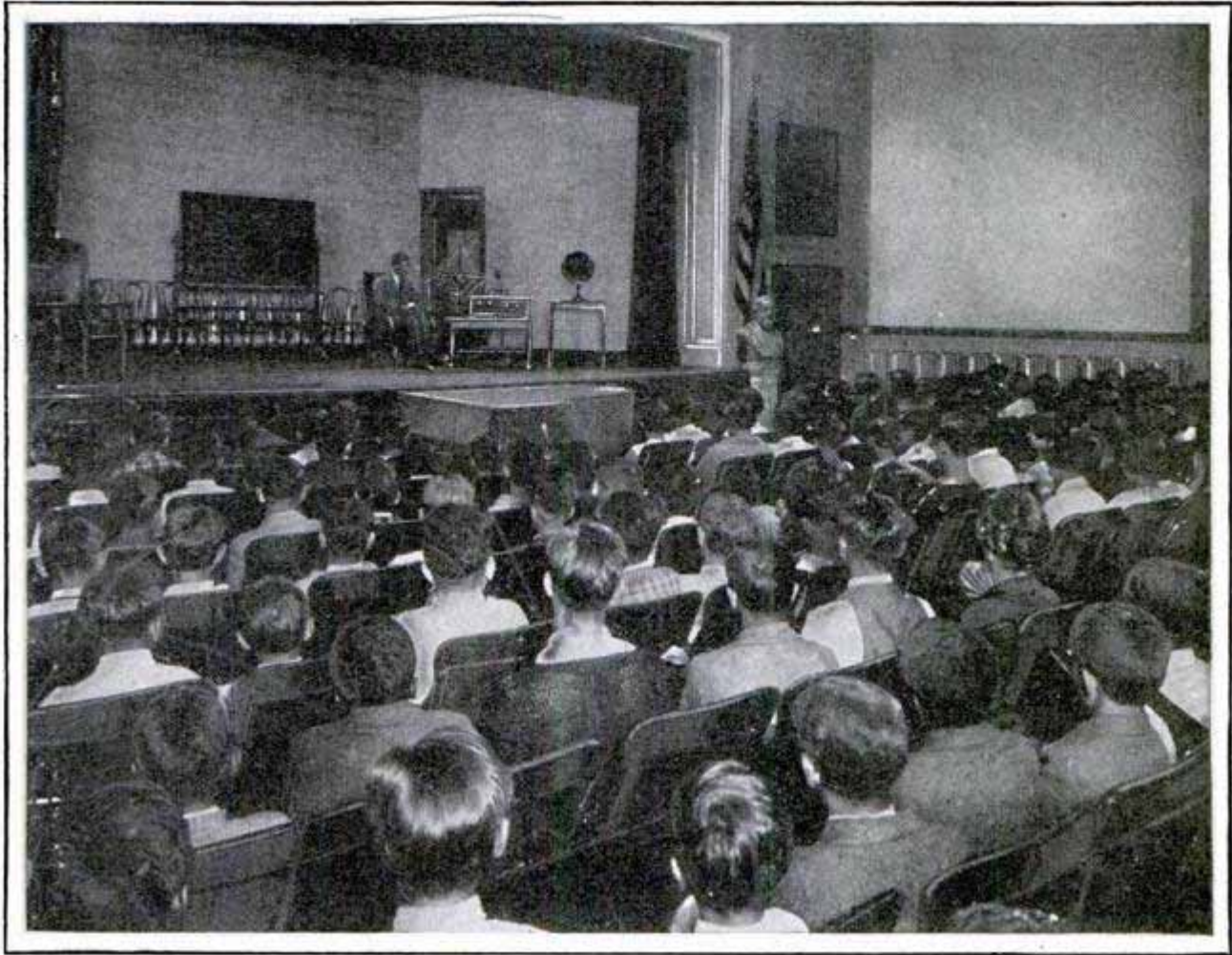

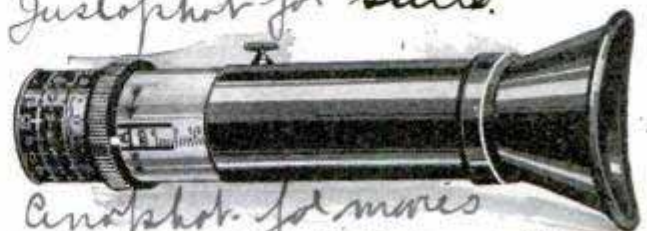


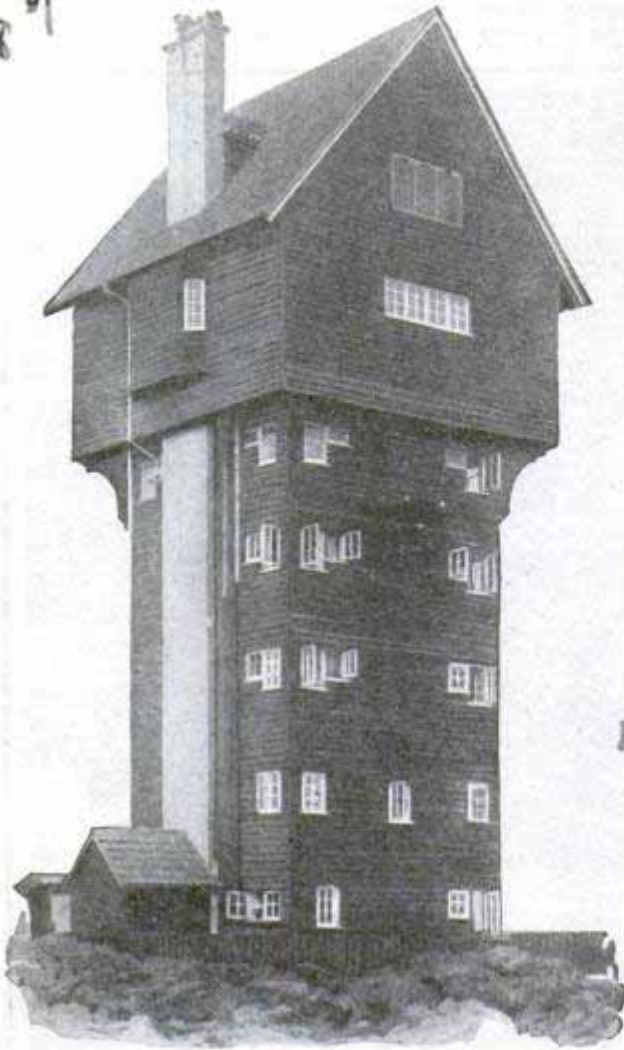
Photo-Exposure Meter with Eyepiece at Right and Turning Gauge at the Other End

EIGHTY-THREE DIE IN AIR ACCIDENTS THE PAST YEAR

Poor planes, lack of training on the part of the pilots and stunt flying were responsible for about seventy per cent of the aviation accidents that occurred in the

United States in 1925, according to a survey by the Aeronautical Chamber of Commerce of America. There were 112 mishaps. Eighty-three persons were killed and 112 injured. Errors in piloting caused thirty-four of the accidents; lack of landing field facilities, eight; faulty craft, eighteen; stunting, twenty-five; carelessness, six, and unknown causes, twenty-one. Significance is attached to the fact that not a single accident was attributable to lack of weather data. The report states that a majority of the small operators of planes at this time own war-time material, and it is suggested that a strict inspection would result in the discarding of much of the apparatus.

SHOES MEAN LIFE OR DEATH TO MOUNTAIN CLIMBERS

Being well shod is one of the most important factors in climbing mountains, and frequently the wearer's life depends upon the sharpness of the cleats in the soles and the strength of the entire foot support. Fully as important to the careful mountaineer is the fit of the shoes. Foot examinations, following the draft for the World war, showed that proportionately more men in the mountain regions of the west were disqualified on account of pedal ailments than in other sections of the country. This was partly explained on the ground that a combination of rough territory and ill-fitting shoes is doubly injurious to the feet.

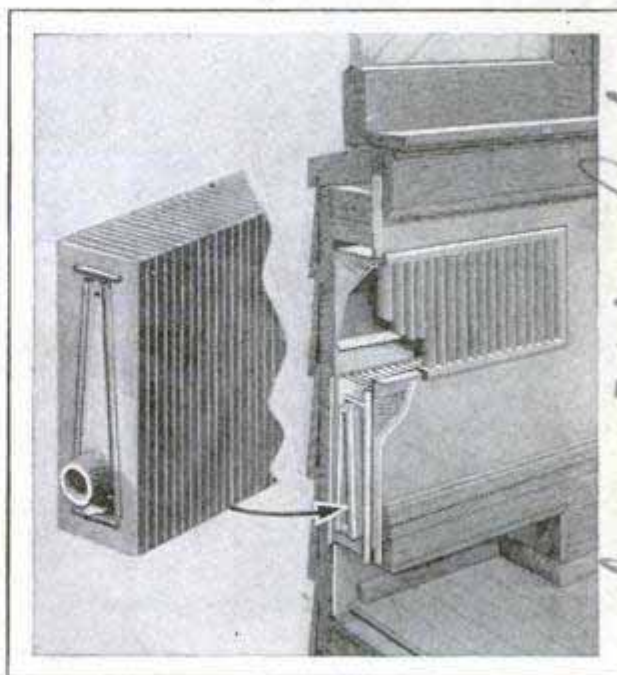

**RADIATORS HIDDEN IN WALLS
 SAVE ROOM SPACE**

Attachable to either a steam or hot-water system, radiator units that may be safely built into the wall and, when installed, are completely hidden from view, have been introduced to save space and to promote better heating. They consist of an outlet grill above and have an inlet opening below. The grill is fitted with a control damper to shut off the heat when desired. The entire unit may be set in a wall or partition only four inches thick. The core of the radiator itself is

made of a special metal to which are attached a large number of copper fins. There are no brazed, soldered or welded joints, so that expansion and strain cannot cause leakage. Tests have shown that it safely holds as much as 220 pounds of steam pressure when thawed out with boiling water after it had been frozen for several hours at a temperature of five degrees below zero.

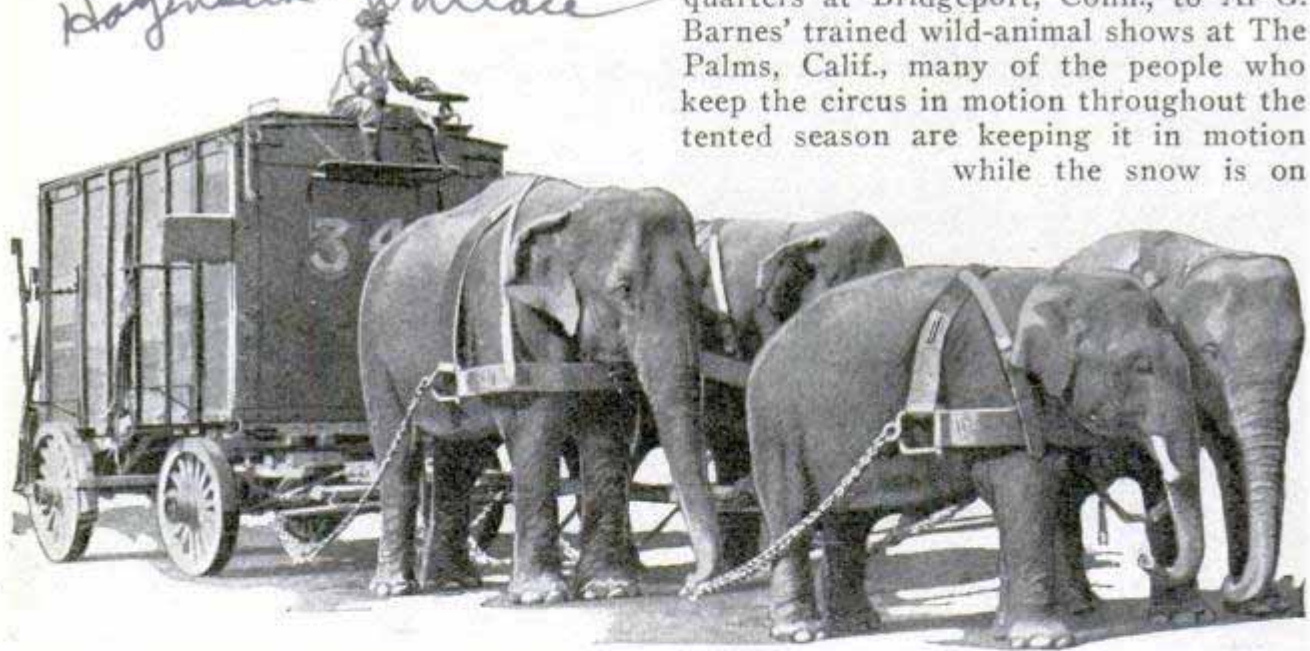
Winter Quarters Mean Months of Hard Work Training Animals, Practicing New Stunts and Repairing Circus Equipment

THE world's greatest show, like others advertising themselves as such, has reached the end of its tented journey. The official route book, issued annually, relates, among other facts, that it has traveled 14,000 miles between May 1 and November 1. The route has taken the tented city from the Atlantic to the Pacific. The magic canvas city has risen, throbbed, been torn down and moved nearly 200 times.

The boss canvasman and his rough-necks are tearing her down and rolling her up for the last time. The circus band is not playing "Home, Sweet Home," for all showmen know, from experience, it

ed circus train is about to pull out for winter headquarters.

"Season's closed!" all cry. And the wistful small boy, saying his own farewell to life's greatest joy, wonders audibly, "Where do the circuses go in winter?" For the small boy's information, the fact is here set down that circuses go on forever. The train that takes the circus to winter quarters also takes most of the circus, whether it be man, woman, animal or inanimate material, into intensive winter training.

This training is of diverse kinds. From the Ringling Brothers and Barnum and Bailey's combined shows in their winter quarters at Bridgeport, Conn., to Al G. Barnes' trained wild-animal shows at The Palms, Calif., many of the people who keep the circus in motion throughout the tented season are keeping it in motion while the snow is on

brings bad luck to play "Home, Sweet Home" on the circus lot. But the thousand or more managers, performers, hostlers, cooks, waiters, ticket sellers, musicians, freaks, property men, and what not of the modern gypsy city, are saying farewell to each other and the road. The load-

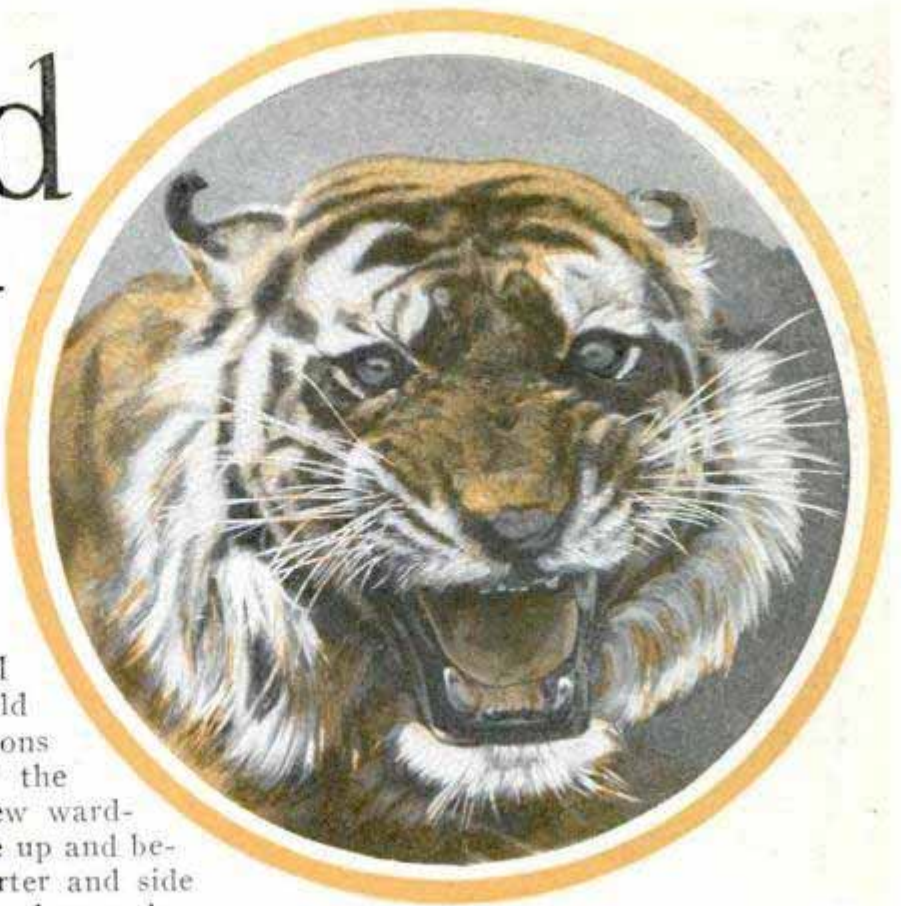
the ground. From Peru, Ind., where the Sells Floto and Hagenbeck-Wallace circuses are installed in their acres of steel, brick and wooden buildings, to Beaumont, Tex., where the Christie and Lee Brothers make their winter stand, skilled hands are repairing the ravages of a long season.

are Said Away

Wagons are being retired, and repainted. Tents are being built or rebuilt. Baggage horses are being turned out to pasture. Ring stock are being groomed and tested out for new acts. Wild animals are taking new lessons in the art of entertaining the great American public. New wardrobe is being designed, made up and be-spangled. New center, quarter and side poles are being trimmed for the coming battle with the elements; new blue seats, jacks and stringers are being sawed and hammered into shape. Each winter quarters is a humming factory.

The cash replacement value of the twenty circuses that annually tour this country is close to \$15,000,000. It costs more than \$5,000,000 to winter, repair and generally renew these circuses. So much for the physical side of the circus business. The horse and animal trainers and the men and women artists who thrill the millions that pay their way into the white tents, have their own methods of training during the winter.

In and around Bridgeport, Mable Stark, if she is scheduled to wrestle her tigers during the season to come, keeps two of her baby pets in her comfortable apartment, where, in off-hours, they snooze in her lap. Mr. and Mrs. Emil Pallenberg, premier bear trainers of the world, are at home in a Connecticut village—at home with their bears, which have apartments of their own. When not mastering the roller skates or two-storied bicycles, the Pallenberg bears are as comfortably ensconced as any fancy thoroughbreds. George Denman, dean of elephant trainers, is also at home, in his great elephant barn where, with block and tackle and



wise words of command, he teaches forty pachyderms to stand on their heads or hind feet in ponderous unison.

Down in Central City park, Macon, Ga., Steve Batty is practicing, in the steel training arena, a thrilling fight with "Wallace, the Untamable Lion" of the Sparks' circus, while Franz Woska rehearses his tigers or leads one into the open where Mrs. Clifton Sparks and Clifton Sparks, Jr., pal with the royal Bengal pet and M. Burns is training Bibb county pigs.

In the ring barn at West Baden, Ind., Robert Thornton or Carlos Carreon, assisted by Mrs. Thornton and Mrs. Carreon, are breaking in new liberty and menage horses for the John Robinson show, soon to go on tour for the one hundred and second consecutive year.

There is no rest for circus people winter or summer. But all the winter work is done without the stimulus of crashing circus bands, without the color of silken tights, without the excitement engendered by thousands of towners, craning their necks from tiers of blue seats. Circus training, in the winter time, is an unemotional affair.

If you happen into the famous Davenport ring barn in Cicero, a western suburb of Chicago, you may find a man in

overalls methodically cracking his long whip, while a broad, sleek "rosin back" lopes gently around the forty-two-foot ring. On the back of that fat horse may stand a young woman in sweater and bloomers, tripping the light fantastic or even attempting back somersaults. Her hair is done up tight. Her expression is tense. Her horse discloses a most annoying tendency to hump just before the lady wants to take off for another backward mid-air turn. "Drat the beast!" she exclaims, or phrases her remarks more vigorously. For when a horse humps it elevates its hind parts to most prodigious heights. A hump may spell disaster to the most experienced equestrian. Humping is a bad habit, difficult to cure. So our young lady does not kiss her hands or flaunt her tarlatan skirts at admiring throngs. She says, "drat the horse!" or some other unconventional thing.

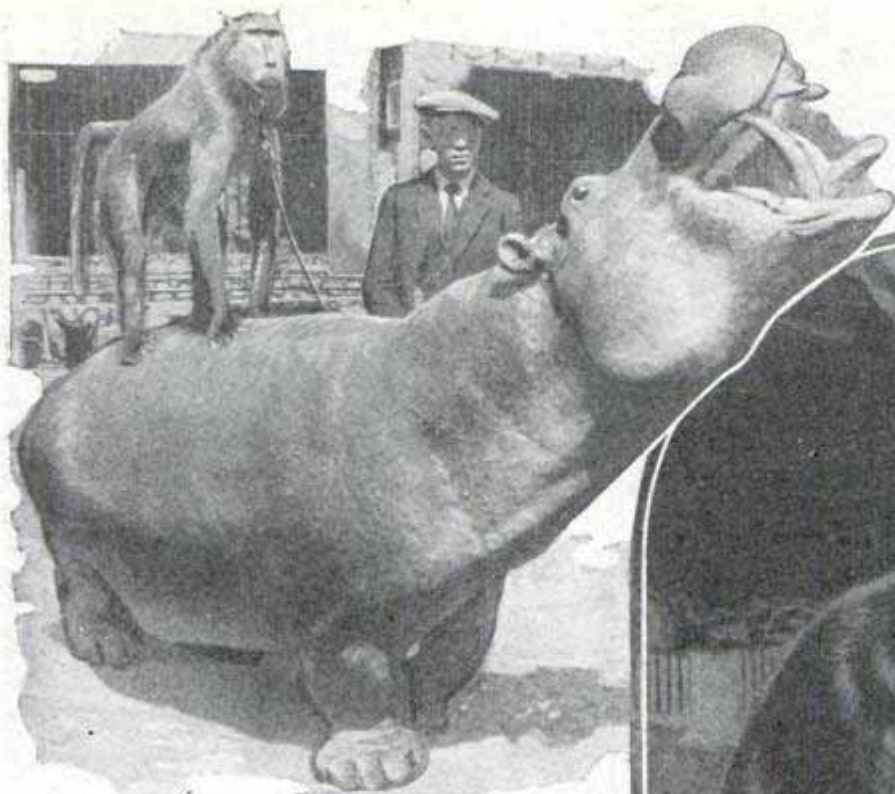
A rather dispiriting inclosure is a ring barn. Of wood or brick, with windows

not too well cleaned, and, perhaps, no heat but from an ancient stove in one far corner—near which the shivering artist must change her clothes—the ring barn is undeniably a place to work. There's nothing to inspire the equestrian but a grim determination to be the greatest of her kind.

Or, perhaps, one wanders to Bloomington, in central Illinois, and on its outskirts finds a great, wooden structure known as Eddie Ward's training barn. There, amid a maze of rigging, ropes, trapeze bars and nets, boys and girls in rompers or faded, threadbare tights learn to fall into the net or execute the "hock, and one-and-a-half, with pirouette and half return" far above good Mother Earth. Eddie is training his flyers for another season under canvas. But in that high-arched, gloomy barn the crowded tents, smell of tanbark, and lilting music of the circus waltz all seem years and millions of miles away.

The towners who view the big show with varying degrees of interest know nothing of the "mechanic" without which no circus would be such. For riding acts the mechanic is a belt around the rider's waist. This belt is swiveled to a small iron ring, which, in turn, is fastened to a rope. This rope runs upward through a pulley at the end of a crane. This crane revolves around a pole, standing in the center of the training ring. The other end of the rope is held in the riding master's hand. When the beginner leaps into the air to turn a somersault the trainer pulls upon the rope. And when the rider, coming down, misses her uncertain footing upon the rosin back, the trainer gently lowers her to safety on the ground, or on her charger when it comes around the ring once more. Fine training for the stomach muscles is the mechanic, used ever since circuses began.

In Eddie Ward's training barn the mechanic serves a loftier purpose, although it also serves a similar end. The begin-

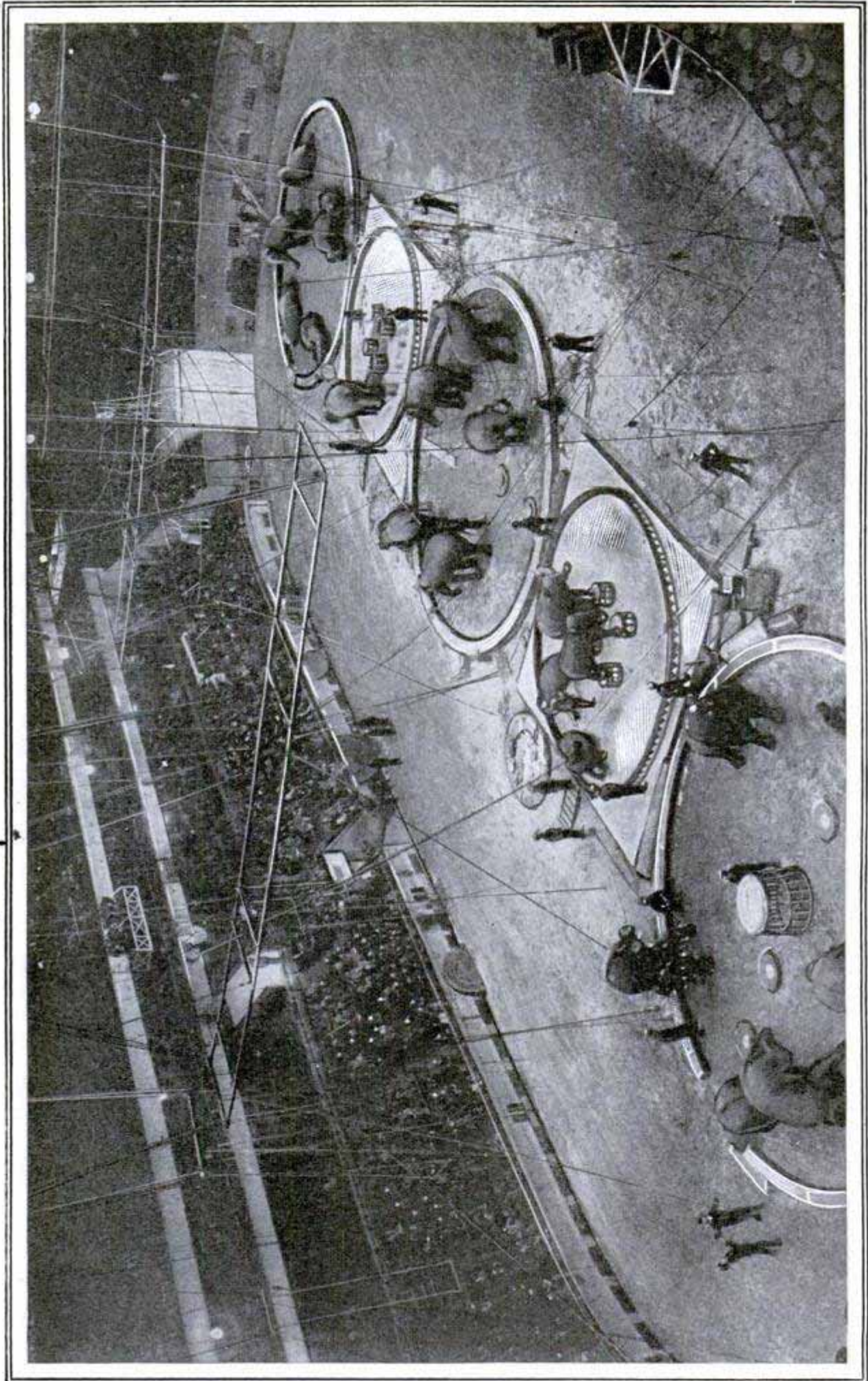

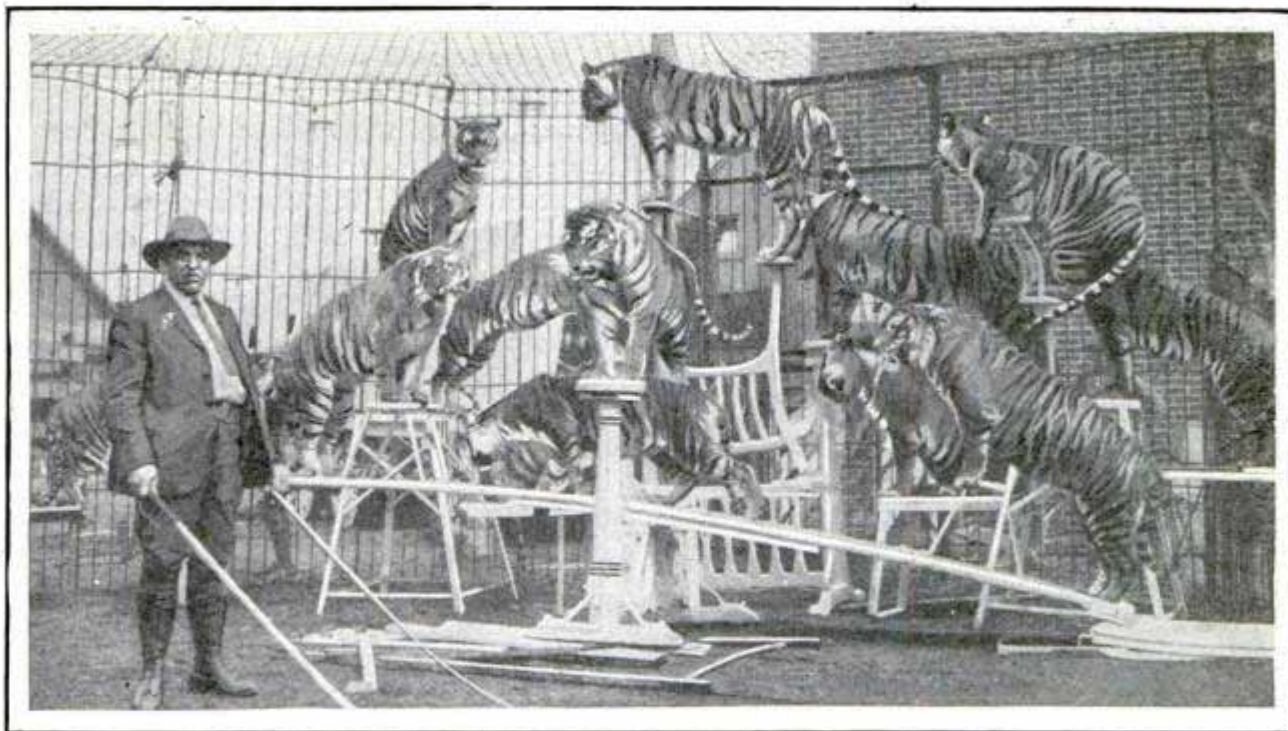

ner who essays to do a double somersault from a trapeze to the catcher's hands flies through space, but as the beginner flies, Eddie and some trusty lieutenant, each holding a rope running over a pulley in the great barn's roof, pull on a belt around the budding flyer's waist. And if that flyer misses his catch, he comes down gently, as Eddie and his lieutenant slowly release the rope. Thus are the necks of young flyers saved for the future show.

All the world's a ring to circus people and all people, of worth, merely performers. The greatest danger that faced the circus performer of the olden days—the danger of going stale from lack of public appearance—passed with the last decade. The growth of vaudeville and the increase in winter circuses, especially those played "under auspices," have opened a new field of endeavor for the men and women of tights and spangles.

Training barns must always exist for beginners. But once the performer has attained unusual excellence he or she works both winter and summer. Stars are always in demand. Lillian Leitzel—as a feature with the Ringling Brothers and Barnum and Bailey combined shows, she throws her body over her shoulder a hundred times with one wrist in a rope loop—plays metropolitan vaudeville theaters from December to March, then goes

directly to the spring opening of the big show in Madison Square garden.

So great has been the development of the indoor or winter-circus idea during the past few years that riding acts and even big flying acts are in demand through the winter months. The erection of such buildings as the Cleveland auditorium, and the eleventh-hour discovery that most of our national-guard armories are big enough to house a three-ringed snow-time show, have materially increased Christmas cheer for thousands of circus performers. The lot of the kinker, as the circus performer is sometimes called, is far from a hard one.

There is still required during the period between fall and spring a vast amount of patience and persistence upon the part of Roy Rush, for example. Roy teaches horses and dogs to remain motionless during the "statuary acts" in the Big Show. He does this by tenderly manhandling his animals, then rewarding them with apples or sugar or petting.

The trained-seal act is the stand-by of many a traveling circus, because the seal is a natural-born actor. It loves the lime-light and dotes on applause. By precept and example and judicious distribution of fresh fish, a trainer can make a troupe of amateur seals qualify as professionals in about three months.

 A good elephant trainer can break in a herd of young bulls fresh from Asia in about three months, depending upon the individual elephant's temperament, for elephants are highly individualized. But most are keen about showing off and once a bull has learned its routine it is apt to go through a performance without the trainer's cue. All trainers as well as all performers are constantly on the alert for new business. The Charleston had hardly got under way before Bob Stickey IV, scion of one of the oldest circus-riding families, perfected a Charleston on twelve-foot stilts. Bob has been working steadily in theaters ever since. He could get a handsome salary with a circus if he cared to troupe under canvas again.

This matter of originating new business is of paramount importance to all circus performers, save and excepting only those who are so pre-eminent in their particular feats that the public demands their annual repetition. Clowns are everlastingly driven to think up new and funny stunts. That is how Buck Baker came to originate the trick automobile that goes backward and forward at word of command without the touch of human hands; why Pete Mardo comes out every year with new "walk-arounds," and other funny business—and why there are lines in his face. Clowns put more gray matter into their work than any other class of circus per-

former. But all of them do a lot of studying winter and summer. A new style of somersault; a new head balance on trapeze; a new method of sliding down a wire upside down—all these are literally meat and drink for the "kinkers."

And first, last and all the time, circus people must keep in condition and keep down their weight. This is a more serious matter than the layman suspects. The average star circus performer actually appears in the ring less than twenty minutes a day. He does a deal of limbering up, before he goes on, summer or winter. But outside of that he takes little exercise.

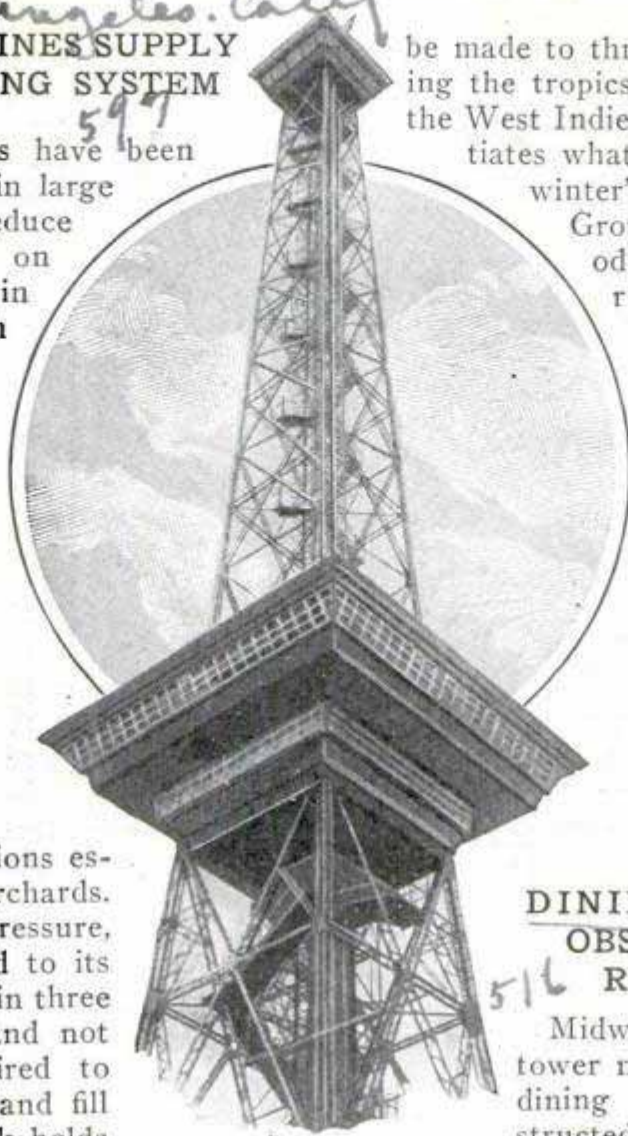
Contrary to most non-professional opinion, circus performers have vision and imagination. Otherwise, they would not be up in their profession. If you happen to see in some circus a pretty and graceful young lady billed as Naida Miller, and note her in silks and satins waltzing on the light wire to the tune of "Over the Waves," just remember that it took the better part of six years in some cold training barn or an equally uninspiring gymnasium to perfect an artistic act which lasts less than six minutes. That's the difference between practice and performance in the circus business.

**ORCHARD PIPE LINES SUPPLY
OIL FOR HEATING SYSTEM**

Oil-burning heaters have been used for some time in large fruit orchards to reduce damage from frosts on chilly nights, but in large groves so much time is consumed in filling the firepots that extensive harm is often done before the heaters can be replenished. This difficulty has been surmounted in a large California orange district by installing a 600,000-gallon reservoir for each 1,000 acres and piping the oil to various filling stations established in the orchards. Because of the high pressure, a wagon can be filled to its capacity, 600 gallons, in three minutes, it is said, and not much time is required to drive to the heaters and fill them. The main tank holds sufficient oil to last three nights. During the frost season, night riders patrol the groves and sound an alarm when the temperature descends to the danger point. The big reservoir is refilled from a railroad siding, two miles distant.

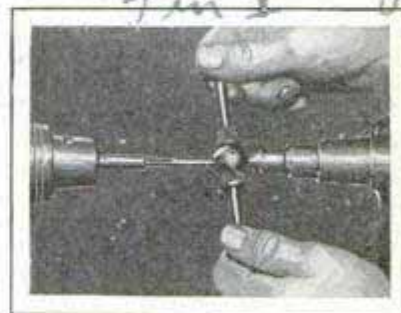

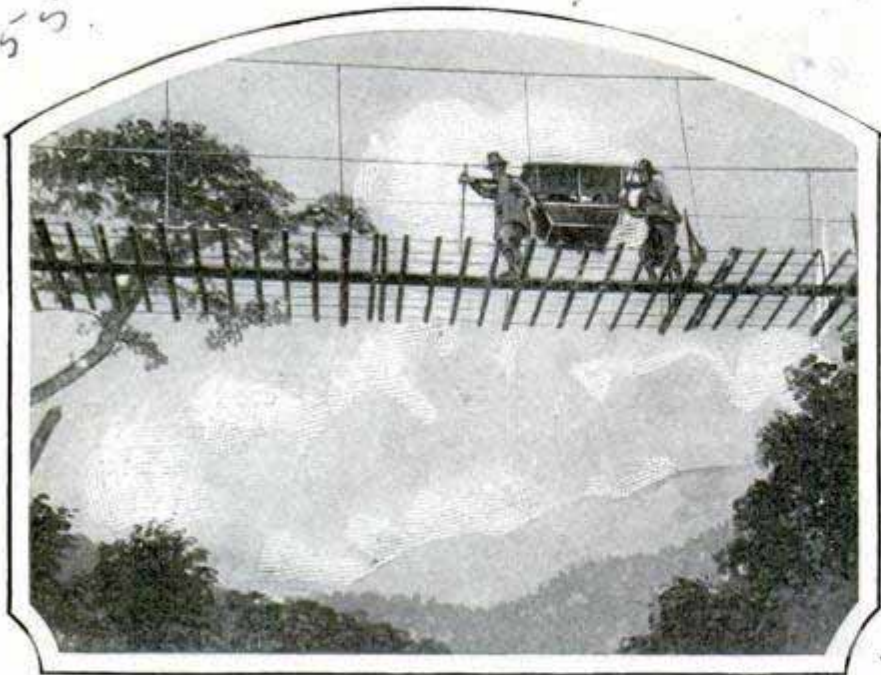

WONDERFUL TRAITS OF BIRDS TOLD BY SCIENTIST

A species of bush turkey knows how to ventilate its nest; the male of the satin bower bird seems to have an artistic sense, for it throws out flowers that do not appear to harmonize with the color scheme of its home, and others play, apparently make plans for the future and indulge in war dances. These are some of the marvelous traits of birds as described by Dr. Lucius C. Pardee, a Field Museum of natural history lecturer. He asserts that many of the feathered

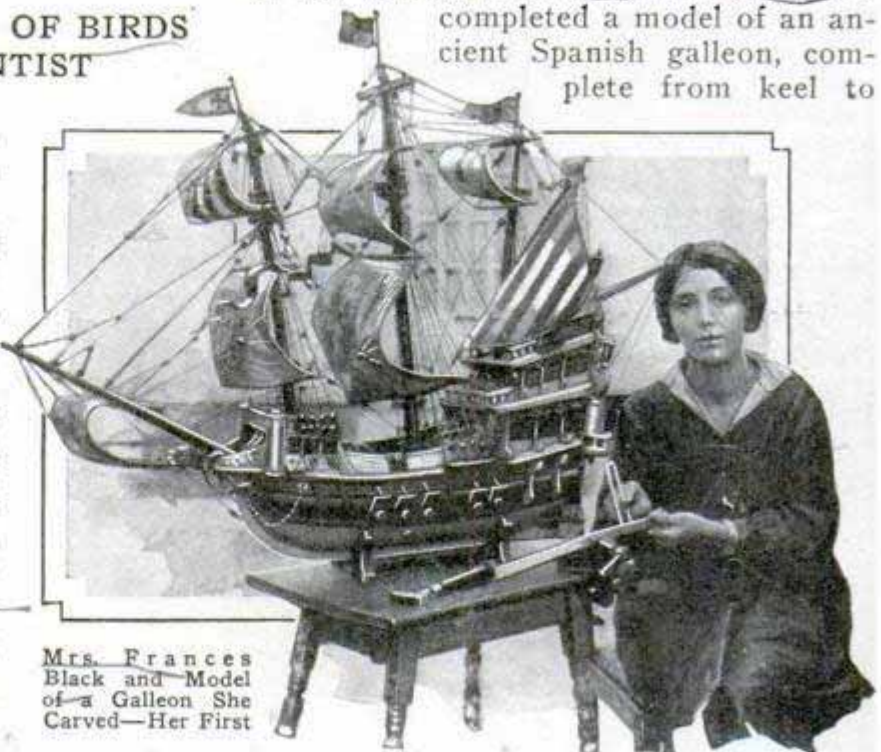
tribes are big-brained and learn quickly. One of the smartest is the honey guide, a species from Africa. It is fond of the sweet but unable to get it from the bees' nests. It therefore leads a man, usually a porter from some traveler's caravan, to the bees by making a great disturbance to attract attention, or it enlists the help of the ratel, a little animal with a skin so thick that bee stings do not penetrate it. In the confusion that follows the robbing, the bird usually gets its share of the honey. A kind of plover

hops into alligators' mouths and robs food from the reptiles without apparent fear of being bitten. One group of birds punishes theft, crows hold "trials" and sentence culprits to death, and others have elaborate courting ceremonies.

masthead. The builder had never been interested in ships until she saw models pictured in a book her young son was reading. Her model is forty-eight inches long from bowsprit tip to stern and stands thirty-six inches high. All the material that went into it cost less than five dollars.

NEW USES FOR SULPHUR

From his research and study of sulphur, started as a hobby, an eastern chemical engineer has found many new uses for the mineral. By mixing in an alloy, he molds it into vases and urns that closely resemble bronze but are much lighter. Soft wood is made hard and durable after immersion in a bath of molten sulphur and the substance is used to coat a base of flannel cloth in molding horns for radio sets and phonographs. Cheap toys of paper and wood pulp become stronger after treatment in a bath of sulphur, and the mineral has been found to add great strength to concrete products. One of its most important uses is for covering underground pipe. Tests have shown that a jacket of cloth and sulphur, about one-eighth of an inch thick, wrapped around a pipe, shields it from rust, while other sections, not so protected, become pitted and worn. This has been determined by examination, once a year, of some twenty pipes laid in different parts of the country from Maine to California. Sulphur resists acid and water and, although it burns, is not easily ignited.

TOY BALLOONS AID DIVER IN PROLONGING THRILL

Holding a huge bunch of toy balloons, which slightly decreased the rate of his descent, a diver in an eastern water carnival introduced a novelty in leaping from a 100-foot tower. The slow fall prolonged the thrill of the spectators.

EQUINOX NOT CAUSE OF STORMS

Stormy weather and the equinox, the time when the sun crosses the equator on its journey northward or southward, are closely associated in many minds, but examination of records show that there is no connection, and weather authorities declare that the sun's movement at that period has nothing to do with storms. An unusual amount of rain and some wind in the region around Chicago during the five days from September 20-24 were cited as evidence of the effects of the equinox last fall, but Prof. Henry J. Cox, senior observer of the weather bureau, explained that there

was no relationship between the storms and the sun's position. The records since 1872 showed that there was no rain at all during most of the five-day period each year, and on only four days during the interval was there more than an inch of rainfall in any one twenty-four hours. The highest wind velocity recorded during the period, over ten years, did not exceed twenty-three miles an hour. "There is no more likelihood of a storm just at the equinox than a few days earlier or later," Prof. Cox declares.

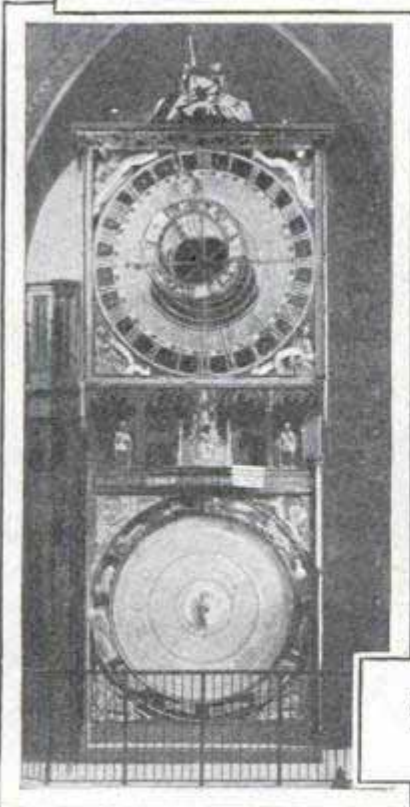


Austrian Clock That Tells Year, Month, Day and Time Everywhere on the Globe

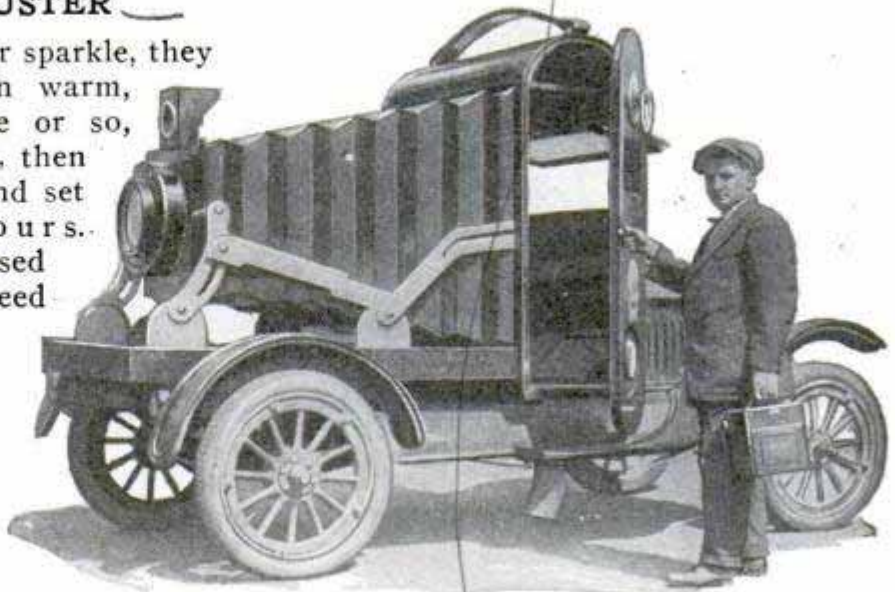
HOW TO CLEAN PRECIOUS GEMS TO PRESERVE LUSTER

When diamonds lose their sparkle, they should be first washed in warm, soapy water for a minute or so, dried on clean soft flannel, then rubbed with toilet water and set aside for forty-eight hours. Water should never be used on turquoises. All they need is application of a methylated spirit, with a soft cloth, and a brisk rubbing. This treatment is also good for pearls, which rarely should be cleaned with water. A little whitening on a long camel's-hair brush, followed by a polish with chamois leather, is

also effective. Great care should be used in cleaning opals, as they are easily cracked if in too close contact with heat. Several preparations are on the market for renovating them, and directions in applying these materials should be followed strictly. Jet is cleaned with a little good olive oil applied with a soft cloth. Plain jewelry can be brightened in warm, soapy water and polished with chamois after being wiped dry. A bright day should be chosen for cleaning gems, because dampness and lack of light make them appear at their worst, so that their defects are not so easily determined. When rubies, pearls and other precious stones seem to have lost their beauty to such an extent that cleaning appears to do no good, renovation by experts will often restore their original life and color. Sapphires, for instance, are sometimes restored by chemical baths and exposure to sunshine. When turquoises change from a beautiful blue to a sea-green, the original hue is often regained by "skinning" and repolishing them.

Durable fibrous material, said to be stronger than real silk and fully as lustrous, has been prepared from insects and shellfish, according to reports from Germany. The basic substance used is "chitin," a white horny material found in the outer covering of various insects, crustacea and other invertebrates. In the bodies of these creatures it gives a certain resisting power in the absence of skeletons, and its durability is evidenced by the fact that specimens are preserved for a long time without artificial means after they have been pinned to cases and display cards. Two scientists of a German institution made a preparation from chitin and finally succeeded in spinning it into fine, shining threads which can be woven into many fabrics.

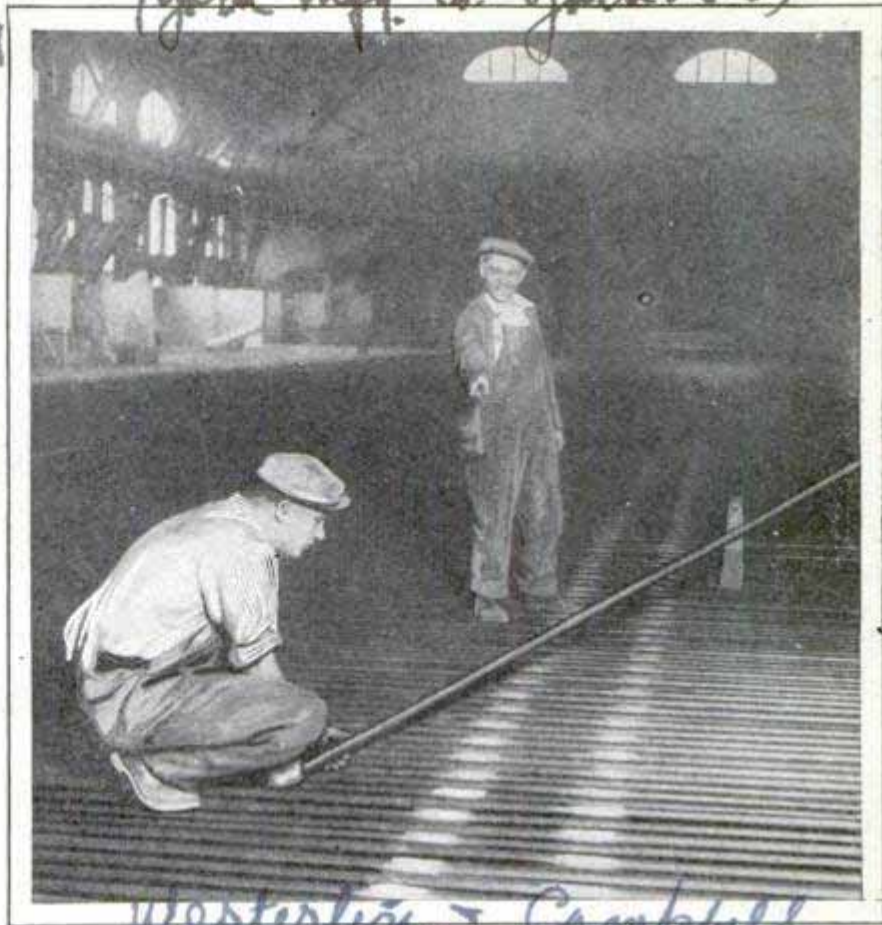
SNOWPLOW ON MOTOR TRUCK THROWS TO BOTH SIDES

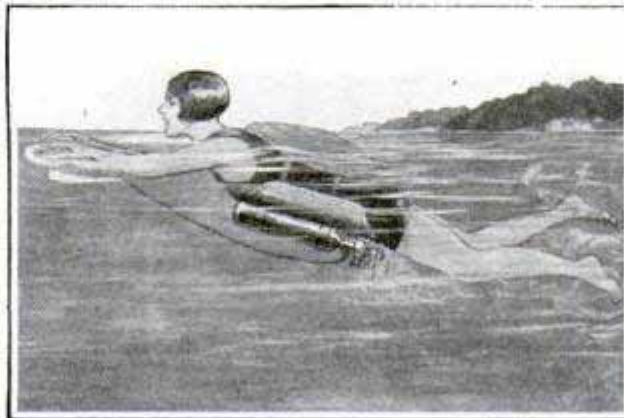

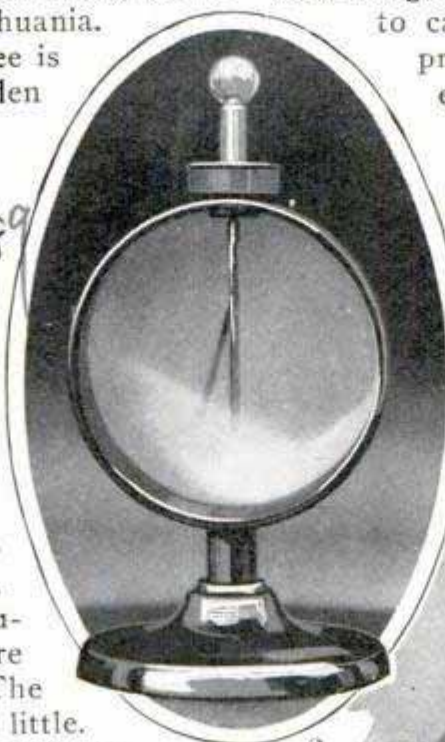

ENERGY EXPENDED BY MUSICIANS MEASURED

Tests in Vienna are said to show that the amount of energy expended in whistling, speaking, singing and in the playing of brass instruments is comparatively slight. 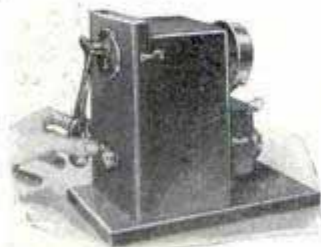

for these missing needles. With the aid of it, a southern professor has won fame as a "radium detective" and has recovered more than \$20,000 worth of the substance. The detector is essentially a small glass box containing an amber rod to which gold leaf is attached. When a hunt is on, the knob at the top of the rod is electrically charged simply by rubbing it. This causes the leaf to stand out. But if the instrument is brought close to radium, the gold quickly moves back to its original position, due to the action of the radium emanations, in breaking down the electrical charge. After the searcher has picked up a clue to the lost needle, he rubs the rod and watches the leaf closely while moving the finder about. In one instance, a radium needle was discovered in a pile of ashes.

DOOR KNOCKER RINGS BELL AND LIGHTS LAMP

A door knocker that not only knocks but rings an electric bell and lights a small lamp, which remains burning until it is switched off by the opening of the door, solves the problem of utilizing an attractive old-style knocker, and yet being able to hear it all over the house. 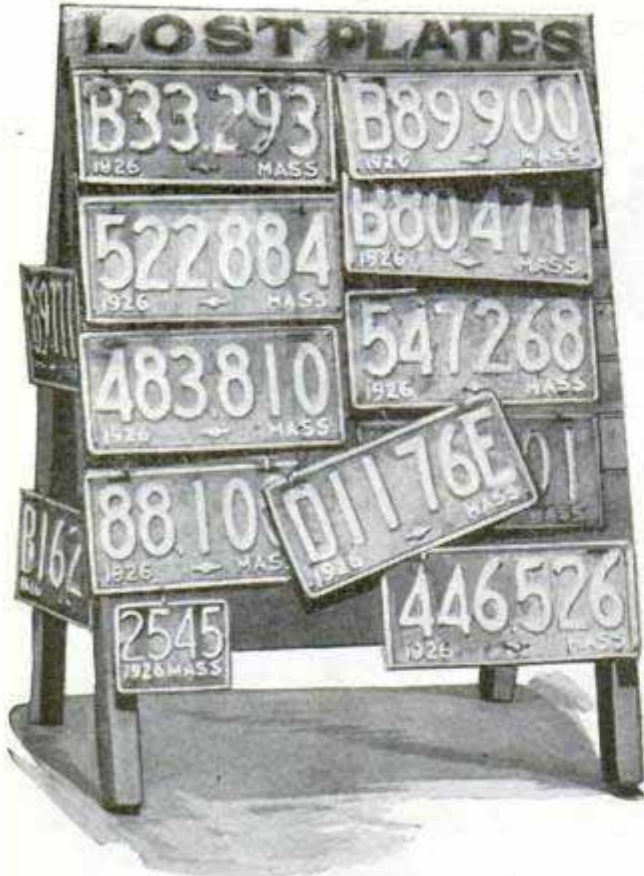

HALF OF DEATHS FROM FIRE OCCUR IN HOMES

498

There is a cry of "fire" in somebody's home every three minutes, investigators report. Sometimes the damage is slight, but often the results are serious and, each year, millions of dollars' worth of property are destroyed and more than half of the 15,000 annual human toll of fire in this country is taken in the homes. Defective chimneys and flues are the chief cause, reports of the national board of fire underwriters show, being responsible for eleven per cent of the total. Sparks on wood-shingle roofs cause nine per cent. Next come stoves, furnaces, boilers and their pipes. More than 700,000,000 matches are struck every day in the United States or about 500,000 a minute. Carelessly tossed aside, these and tobacco stubs prove costly hazards. About five per cent of the household fires are caused by petroleum and its products. Oil stoves are improperly operated or are knocked over, but the garage is held the chief offender. If the total annual fire loss were averaged among all the dwelling-house fires, it would be sufficient to provide enough \$10,000 homes to take care of the population of Bridgeport, Dayton, or Dallas, statisticians assert.

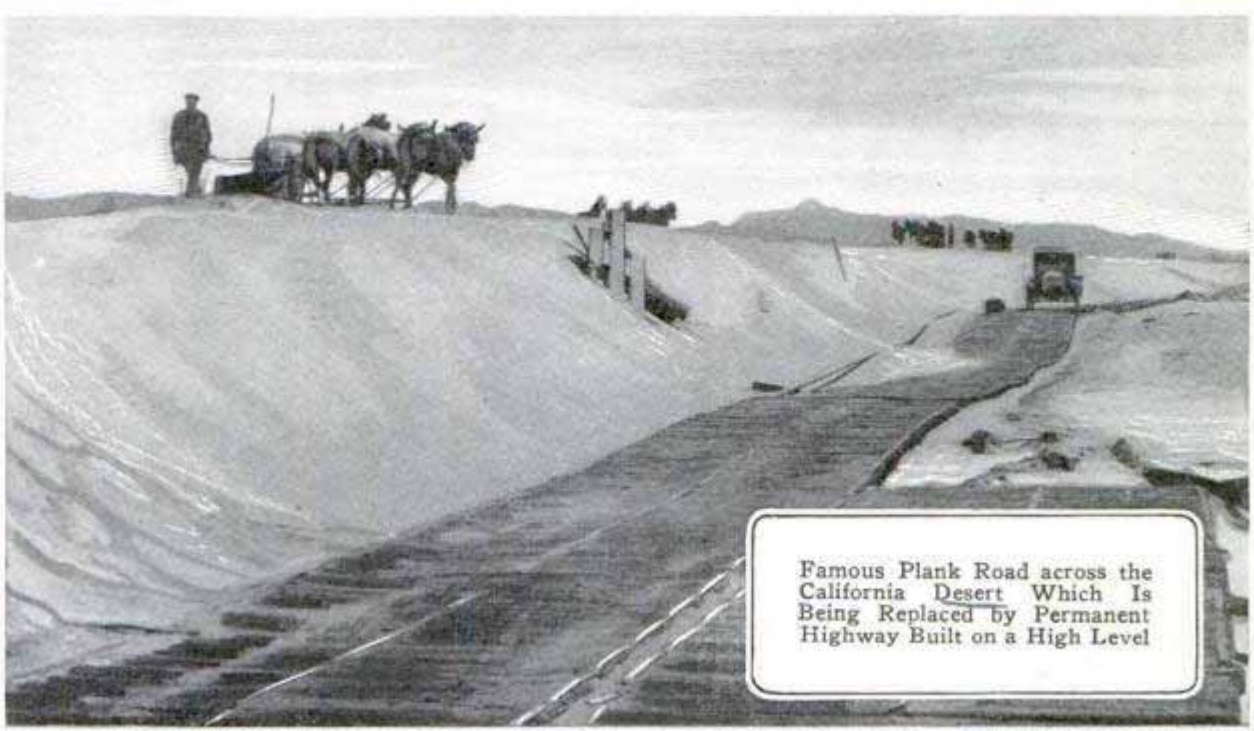

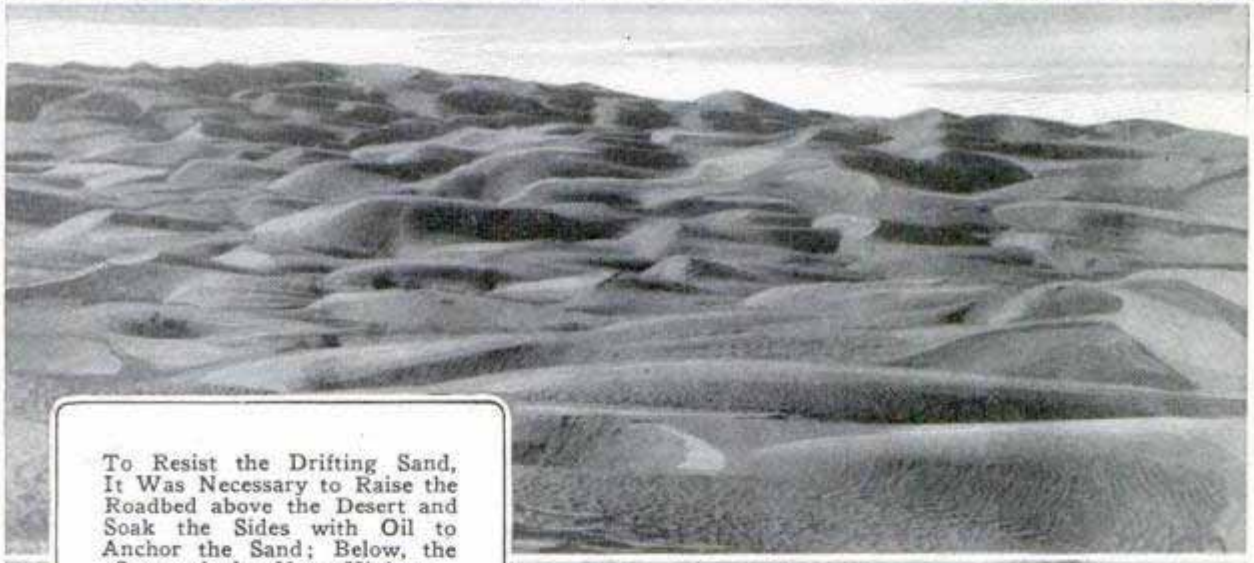

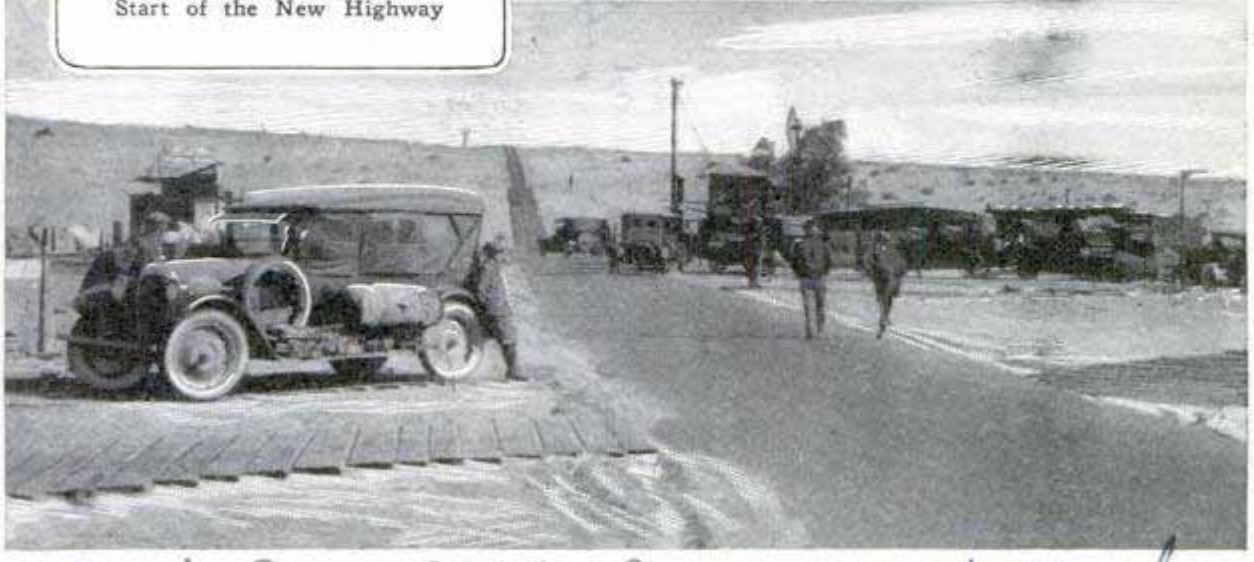
SANDS OF AMERICA'S SAHARA BRIDGED BY CONCRETE



Famous Plank Road across the California Desert Which Is Being Replaced by Permanent Highway Built on a High Level



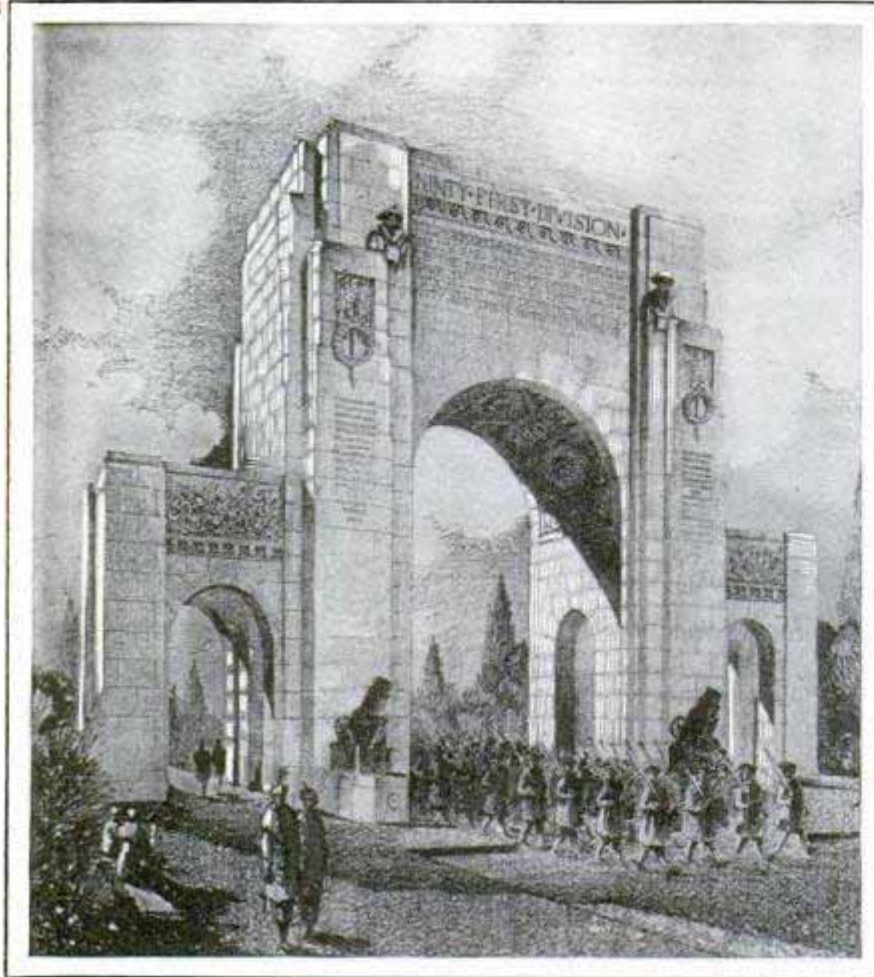

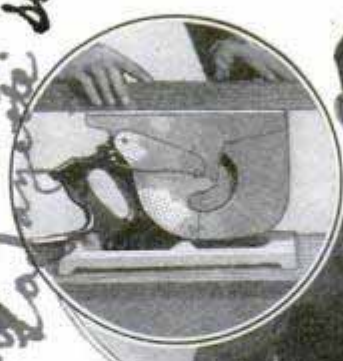
MUSIC FROM PLANE IS HEARD WITHOUT RECEIVERS

SALTNESS OF SEA IS TESTED TO TRACE ICEBERGS

484

How salty is the ocean? To members of the ice patrol, the question is not an idle one, for its answer may give them a clue as to the movements of ocean currents and hence the presence of bergs that may drift down into the shipping paths, menacing life and property. Just recently, an instrument has been devised for making rapid and accurate measurements of the salt content of samples of sea water on ship board. It operates on the principle that the resistance in an electrical circuit varies with the salt content of the water. By means of current supplied by a microphone hummer, and a set of head telephones with the instrument, the investigator is able to detect the difference in resistance offered by samples of water placed in the tester. Two ice-patrol cutters, the "Modoc" and the "Tampa," have been equipped with these instruments and 622 tests were made on board the latter vessel during the season just past. The method has proved much more rapid and accurate than the chemical process of treating the water with silver nitrate.

AUTO AWNING KEEPS OUT SUN AND DIVERTS RAIN

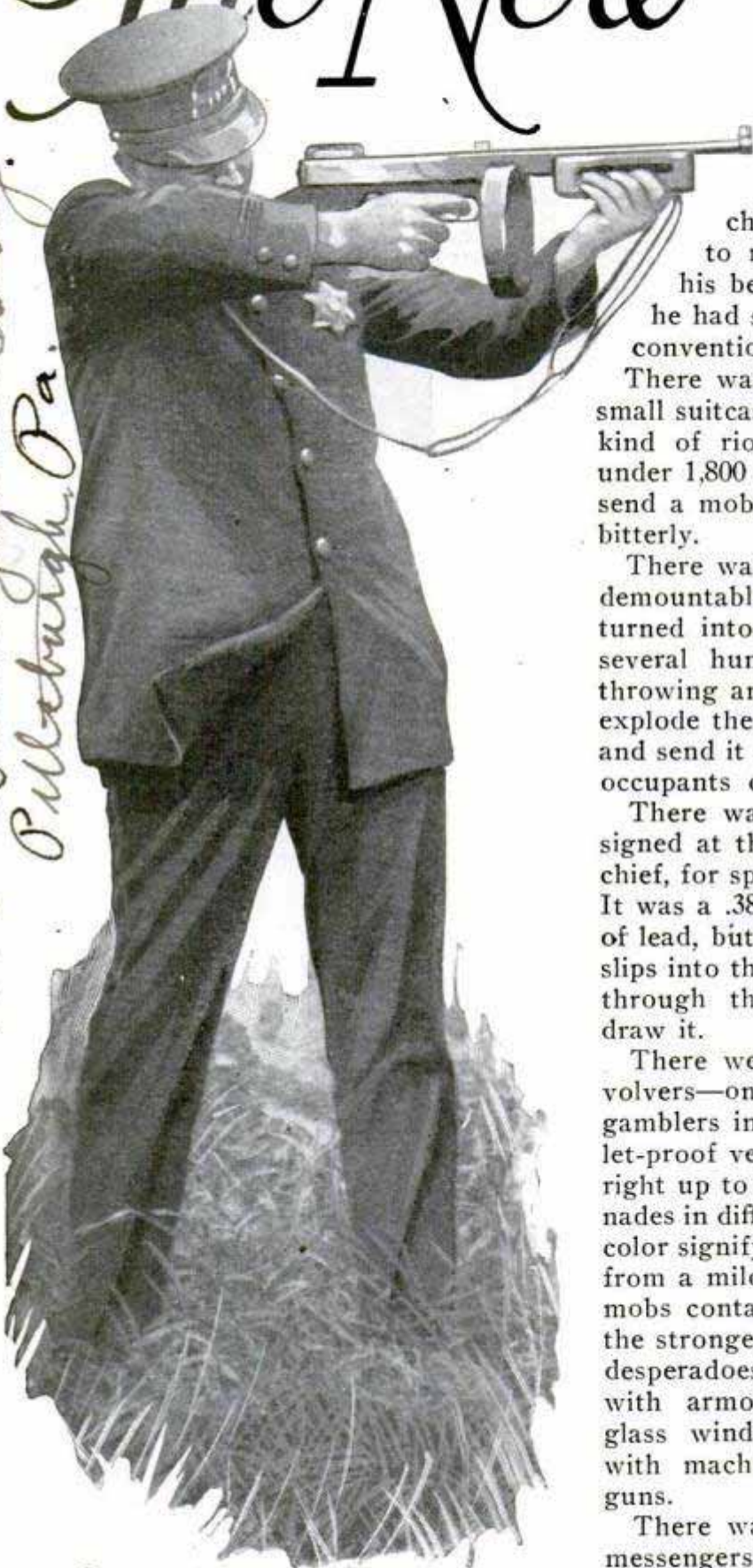

THE old-fashioned policeman, who relied chiefly on a locust night stick to maintain peace and order on his beat, would have been dazed if he had seen the exhibits at the recent convention of American police chiefs. There was an affair that looked like a small suitcase, but turned out to be a new kind of riot gun, loaded with tear gas under 1,800 pounds' pressure, sufficient to send a mob of 2,000 men home, weeping bitterly.

There was a light machine gun with a demountable stock, so that it could be turned into a revolver, capable of firing several hundred shots in a minute, or throwing an incendiary bullet that would explode the gasoline tank of a bandit car and send it up in flames almost before the occupants could tumble out.

There was a new model revolver, designed at the request of Chicago's police chief, for special use of plain-clothes men. It was a .38-caliber gun, firing 200 grains of lead, but with a barrel so short that it slips into the coat pocket and can be fired through the coat without stopping to draw it.

There were tear-gas cartridges for revolvers—one of them stopped 150 angry gamblers in a single raid one night—bullet-proof vests that enable a man to walk right up to a spitting revolver; hand grenades in different colors, four of them, each color signifying the contents, which ranges from a mild little sneezing gas for mixed mobs containing women and children, to the strongest of tear gases for barricaded desperadoes. There were motorcycles with armored shields and bullet-proof glass windows, their sidecars equipped with machine guns and sawed-off riot guns.

There was a suitcase handle for bank messengers' bags, harmless so long as the

owner holds it, but throwing out clouds of tear gas if any unlucky bandit should force the messenger to drop the bag, and a briefcase for bond messengers that worked the same way.

A pretty little desk ornament, sometimes in the form of a lizard or modeled after a racing greyhound, turned out to be a gas bomb. Connected to a radio C-battery, with wires and switches at each door and window, it is designed to protect your house from burglars, or, placed on the cashier's counter, with a foot button on the floor, it will guard against holdup men.

Two neat little nickelplated devices, which might be mistaken for some new kind of automobile ventilator, were screwed on a car in place of the cowl lights. A button on the floor connects them to a tank of gas and, when pressed, distributes blinding tears among all within a twenty-foot range on either side of the automobile.

There were innocent-looking devices that can be distributed around the factory paymaster's office to cover it with a screen of smoke and gas; gas bombs to be installed in the safe, and even one of those oversized bright-red fountain pens that turned out to be the latest thing in personal weapons, shooting a .38-caliber tear-gas cartridge through a false plug in the end.

In the armament line, there were guns that ranged all the way from the short-barreled revolver for detectives to the old-fashioned frontier model Colt of 1878, the single-action gun that won the west, and is still sold in quantities out there. An expert pistol shot demonstrated the latest things in quick draws and rapid firing. The feature was an upside-down shot. He advised the policemen to carry an extra gun, worn butt forward on the left hip, and to be drawn with the left hand, flipped forward and fired upside down by

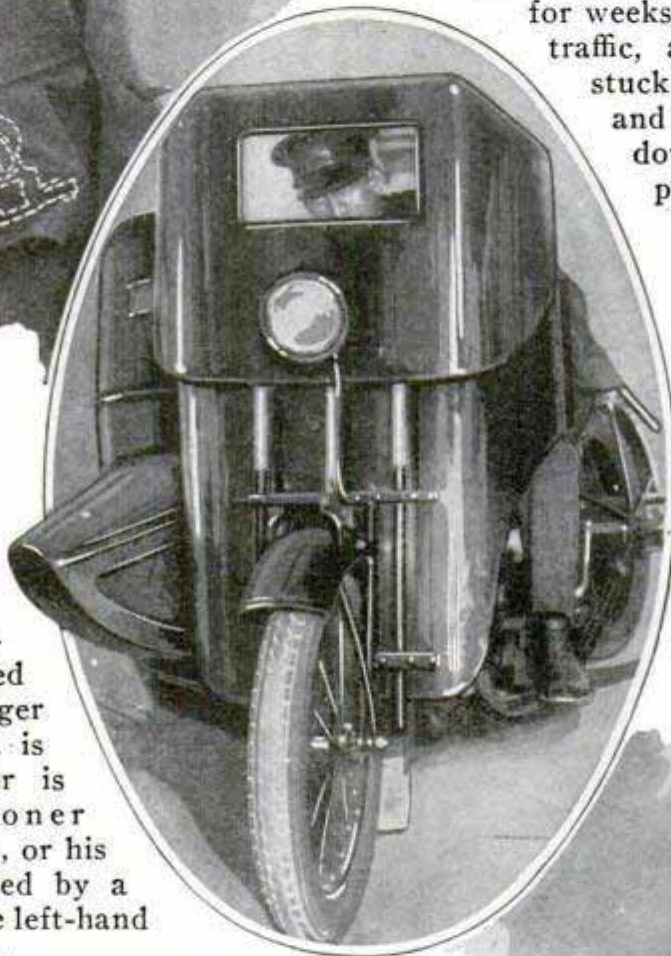
the little finger, or any other finger that happened to fall in the trigger guard. The idea is that, if the officer is holding one prisoner with his right hand, or his right arm is injured by a shot, he still has the left-hand gun to fall back on.

Most policemen carry .38-caliber double-action revolvers. Few put their trust in automatic pistols, and few carry anything smaller than a .38, as the lighter arms lack stopping power. To increase the latter, one of the arms companies exhibited a new type of police ammunition, with a 200-grain lead bullet without any jacket. Steel and copper-jacketed bullets make neat holes for the surgeon to patch up, but don't always put the bandit down for the count. The new ammunition is almost a dum-dum, making an enormous hole. Fired through a telephone book

two inches thick, the lead pellet cut out perfect cones, small at the front and two inches or more across where it came out at the back.

The exhibits of devices for fighting crime were many and varied, but even more space was devoted to traffic-control equipment—something the old-fashioned policeman with his locust stick never heard of. There were automatic lights of a dozen varied kinds; metal markers that can be driven into the pavement and will last for years; new kinds of paints for traffic signs, guaranteed to stand up for weeks under constant heavy traffic, and signs that come stuck together like fly paper and are unrolled, slapped down, and left for the passing auto tires to iron into place.

And for the old-fashioned policeman, one exhibitor—and only one—showed the new styles in locust night clubs, but another whose

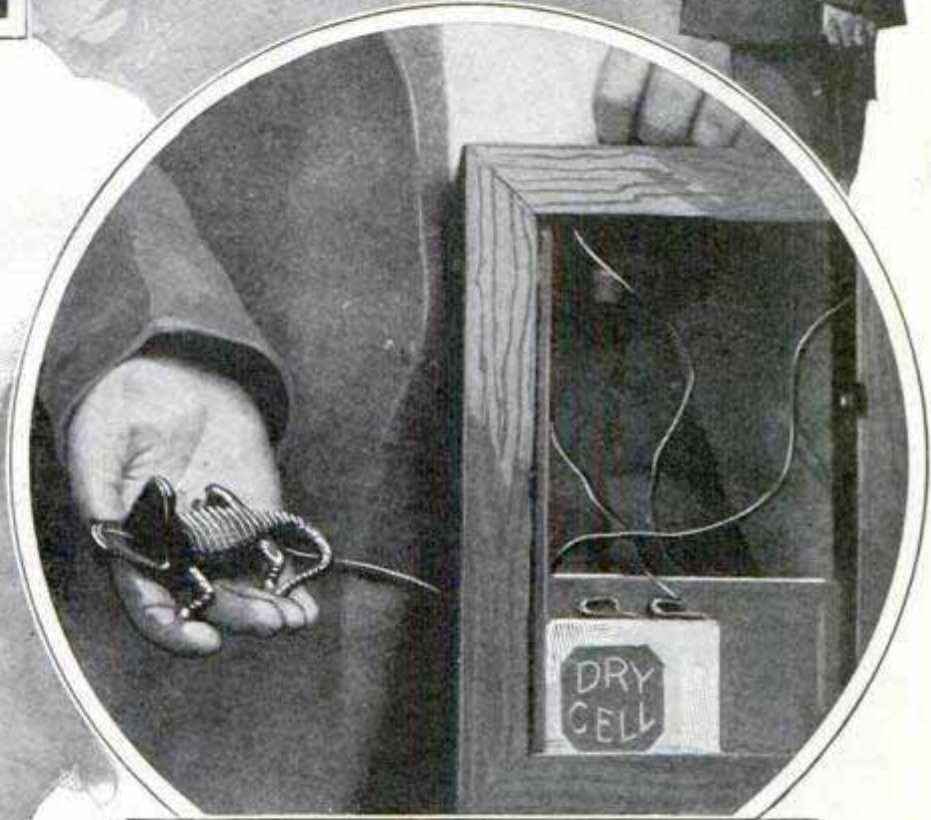




Full-Sized Human Target, with a System of Scoring for Disabling or Fatal Wounds, Is Used by Policemen on Their Revolver-Practice Ranges



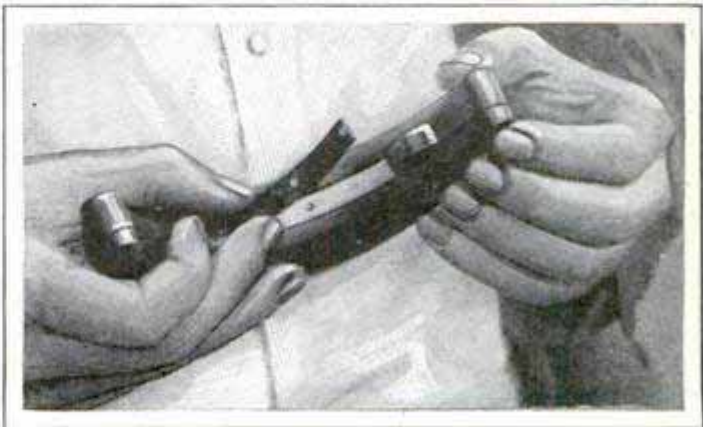

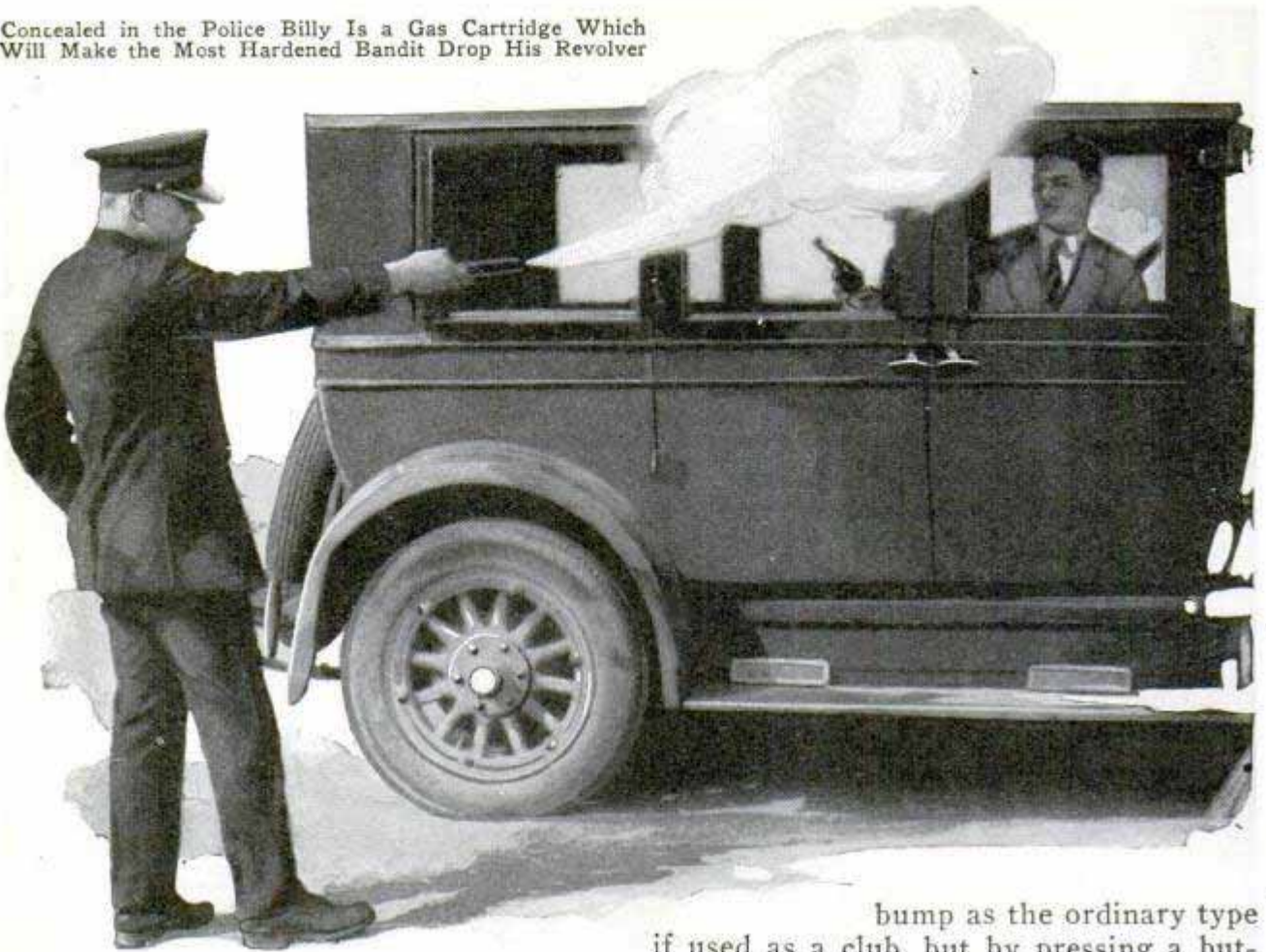

MACMILLAN FINDS NORSE RUINS NEAR AMERICAN SHORES

Norse legends reciting that vikings settled in America more than 400 years before Columbus discovered the land were further substantiated recently when Donald MacMillan, arctic explorer, returned from Labrador and Greenland with word that ancient ruins on Sculpin island, twenty miles off the coast of Labrador, bore close resemblance to Norse ruins he explored in 1925 in Greenland. No inscriptions were uncovered in the first examination, but the ruins were so like the viking relics in Greenland as to furnish almost positive proof of their similarity of origin. SHRUB MAY SOLVE RUBBER PROBLEM ⁴²⁸

America may become independent of foreign-grown rubber by cultivating the guayule shrub, which is found in northern Mexico and parts of Texas, and is now being grown in California, according to announcement at a recent scientific congress. Improvement of the plant under cultivation and better methods of extracting the rubber have solved the major difficulties, it was said. A rubber-company president, who made the announcement, explained that the billion pounds of rubber consumed each year in the United States required the labor of 600,000 plantation workers, whereas the same amount of guayule rubber could be grown on American farms with about 40,000 workers.

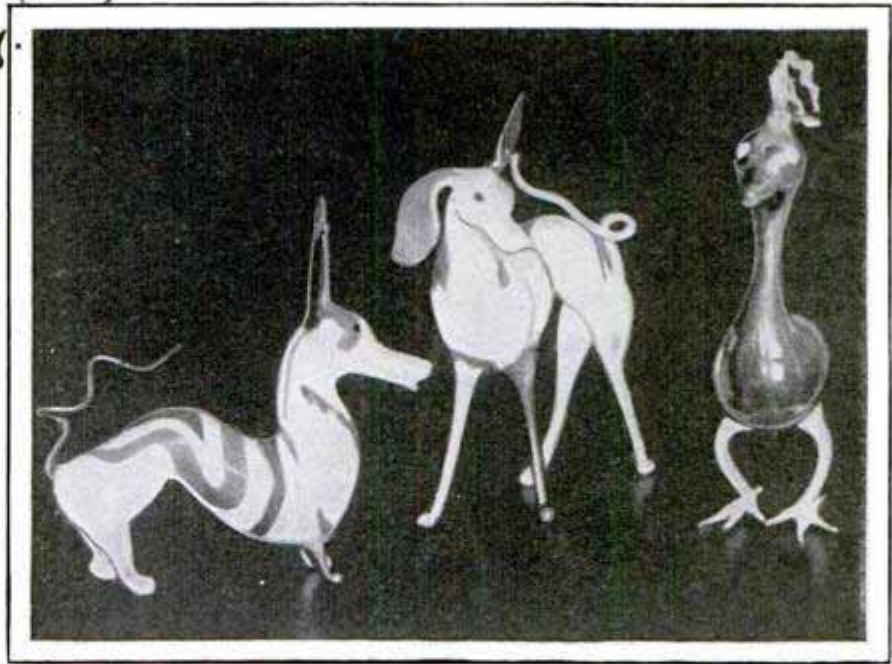

CABLE ROAD UP ALPINE PEAK BUILT FOR TOURISTS

Travelers are hauled to the top of the Zugspitze, an 11,000-foot peak in the German Alps, in cars suspended from a strong steel cable. Twenty persons can ride at once in the passenger cars.

SEARCH FOR FREAK STAMPS YIELDS FORTUNES

When an absent-minded engraver put "post office" instead of "post paid" on a plate to print some stamps for the wife of the governor of Mauritius back in the middle of the last century, he unwittingly

laid the basis for several small fortunes. Two of the stamps, still pasted on an envelope, were sold not long ago, for \$86,000. The plate was destroyed and only a few stamps made.

They had been ordered for invitations to a ball given by the governor's wife. Stamps were then an innovation. Hardly a year passes without some country blundering in one of its issues. The resulting "freaks" are eagerly sought and prized by collectors throughout the world. Shortly after the air mail was started in the United States, a young man purchased 100 twenty-four cent stamps and received a thrill when he looked at the sheet, for the aeroplane on the design was printed upside down. He went back to the window for another 100. The clerk explained the mistake and asked to have the first sheet back in return for others, but the young man refused. He took it to a stamp expert and received \$10,000. It is now in the collection of Col. E. H. R. Green, son of the late Hetty Green, and is valued at \$20,000. The

Columbian exposition in Chicago yielded another odd mistake. On one issue of special stamps made for the occasion, Columbus, smooth-shaven, was seen sighting land and on the other, actually landing but wearing a full beard. Another highly prized freak stamp was issued from the island of St. Kitts in the British West Indies. It shows Columbus using a telescope, an instrument that did not appear until many years after the great explorer. Early "provisional" stamps issued by individual post offices before the federal government had authorized stamps are also highly valued. One from Boscawen, N. H., brought \$12,000 recently. The same price was paid for a provisional stamp

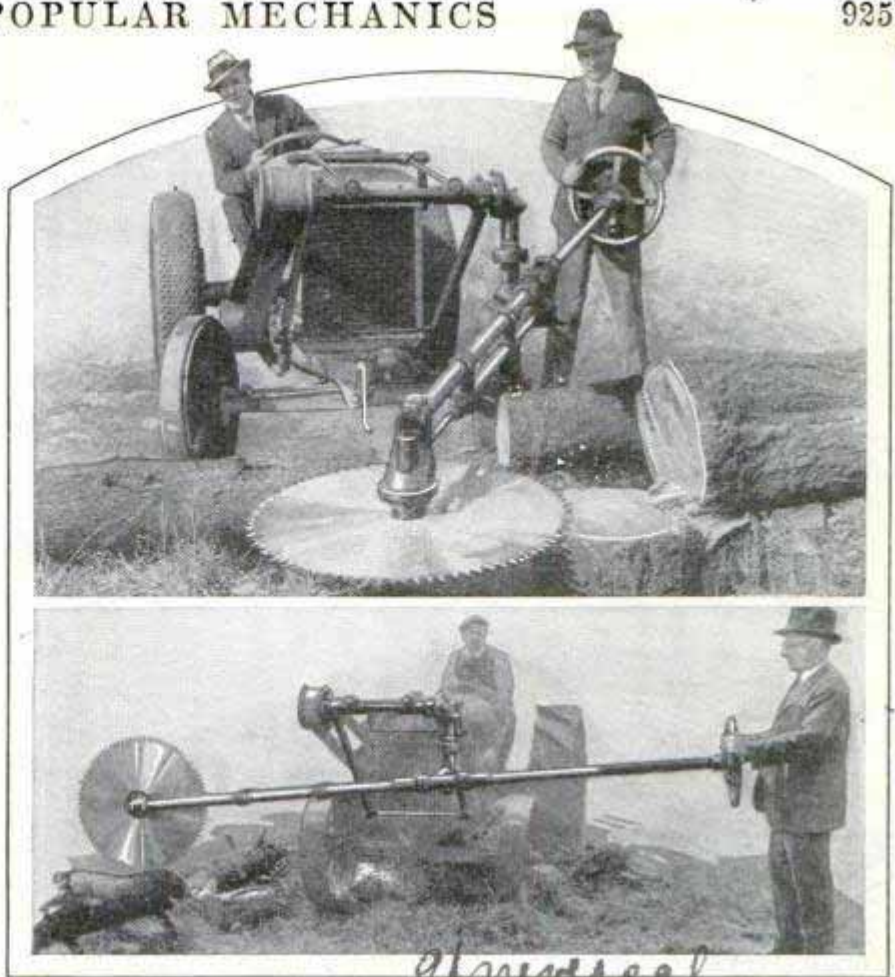

SILENT RADIO REPLACES FOG GUN 460

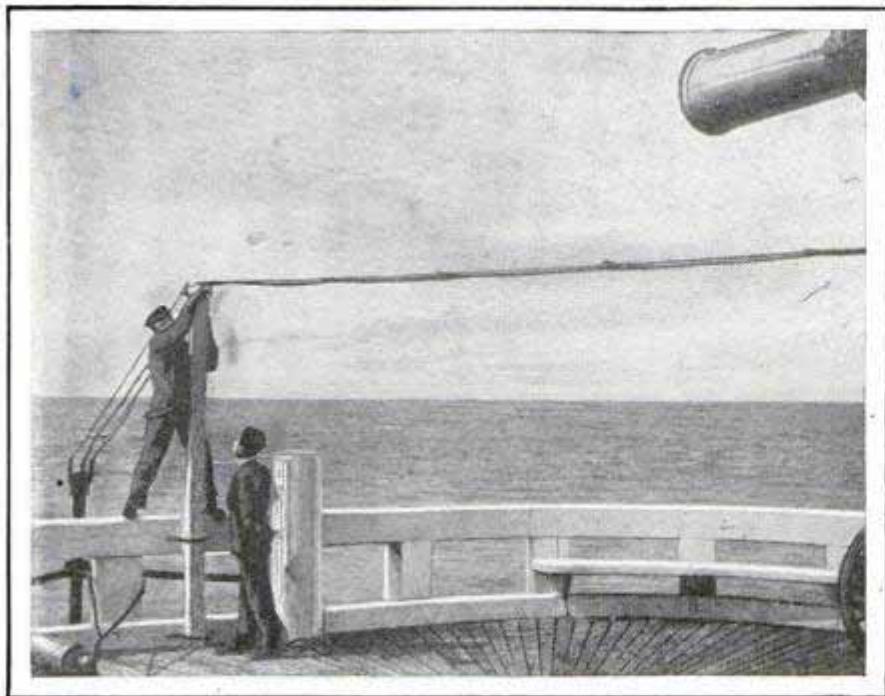

Reversing the usual method, the sawmill can now be taken to the tree in a rigging for the farm tractor. It can be attached in a few minutes, the makers assert, folds close to the machine, when passing through brush, and can be swung about to cut at various angles, as may be required to suit different jobs. The outfit is especially adapted to clearing land, sawing cordwood, logs or stumps, and auxiliary attachments are being developed for drilling wood or post holes and for cutting threads on gas or water pipe. According to reports, the rig has actually felled and sawed up to twenty cords of oak in one day.



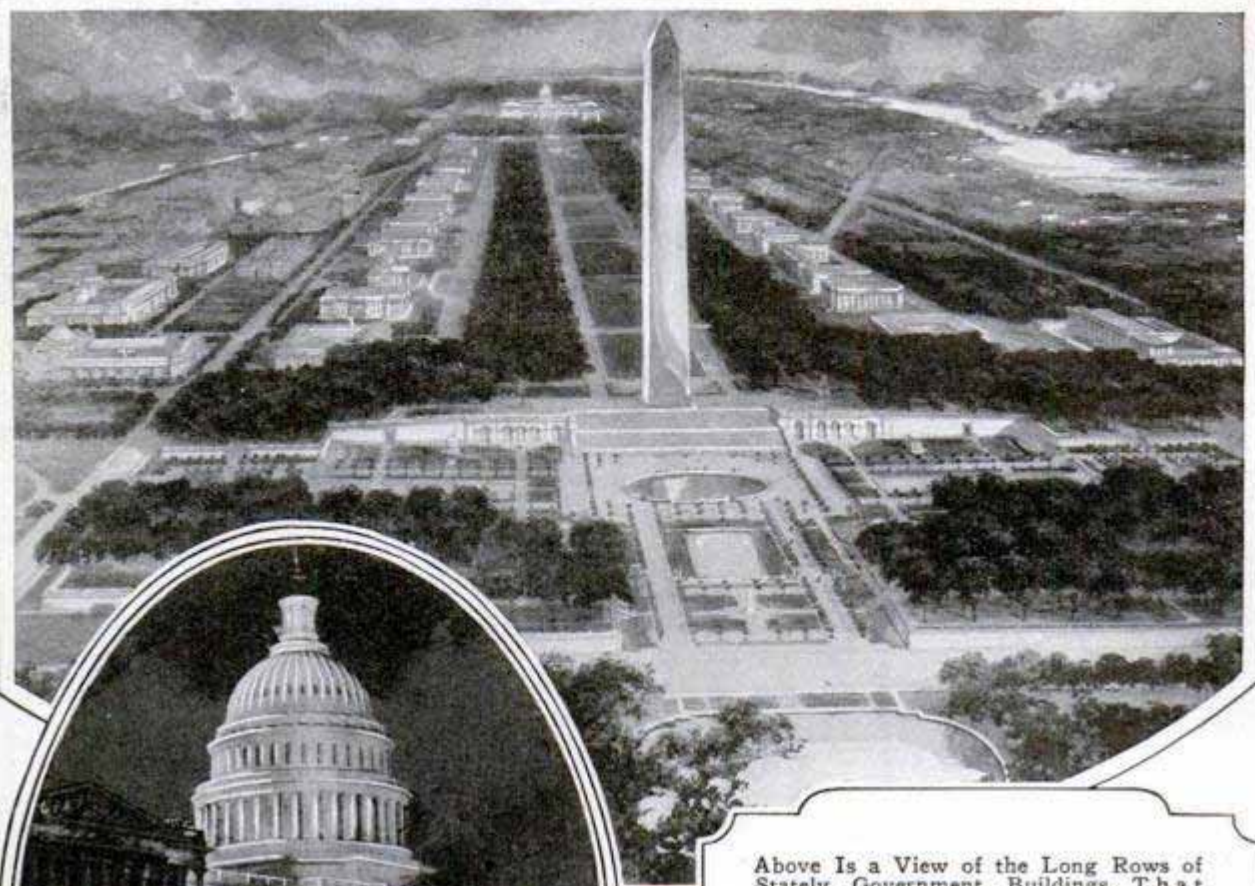

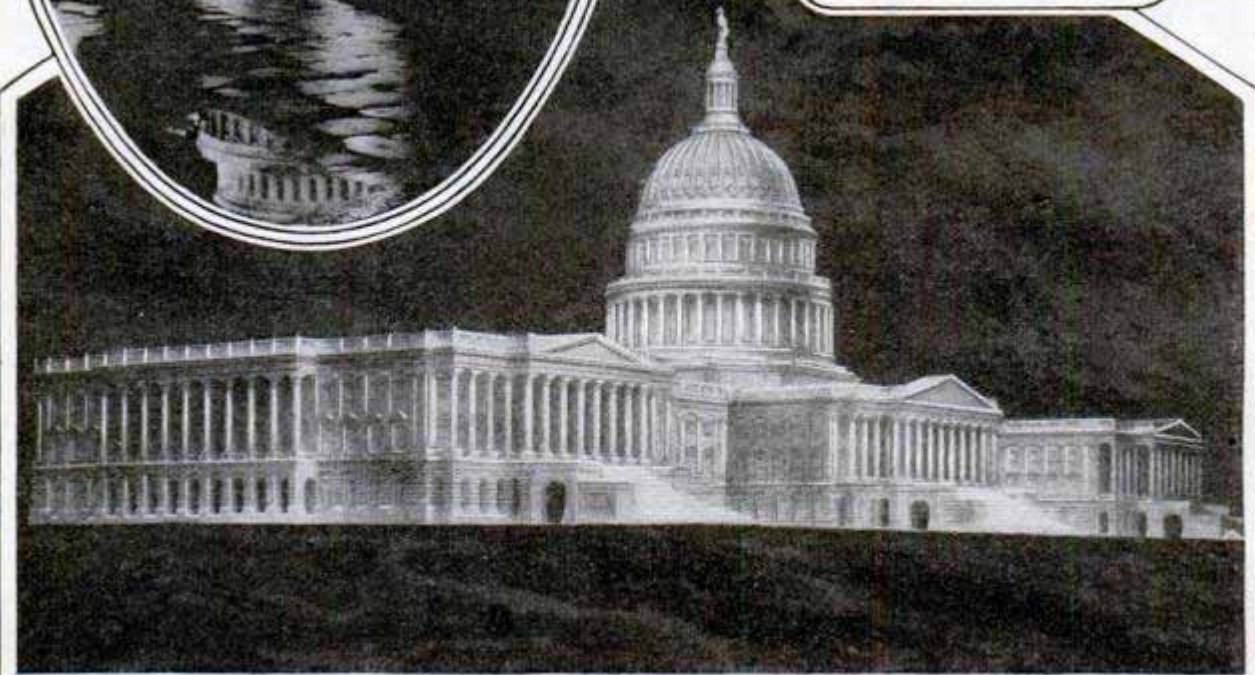

Plans for the completion of the capitol building at Washington, in accordance with the design of Thomas U. Walter, prior to the Civil war, will be presented to congress this winter as the result of the appropriation of \$165,000,000 last session for public buildings in the capital, and for post offices and other structures in other cities. The plans call for removal of the old east portico and the substitution of a central wing to extend out in line with the senate and house wings, and for the renovation of the rotunda to the original design. The central portion was fostered by Washington, but was not completed until 1830. The two wings, housing the house and senate, were begun in 1851 and completed in 1859, and since that time successive congresses have turned a deaf ear to appeals for funds to complete the building. The program authorized by the last congress includes permanent buildings for the departments of commerce, justice, labor, state and agriculture, a monumental home for the supreme court, and buildings for the internal-revenue department, liberty-loan annex, additions to the government printing office, etc. Practically all the new buildings will be in the Mall area, lining the long vista from the Washington monument to Capitol hill.

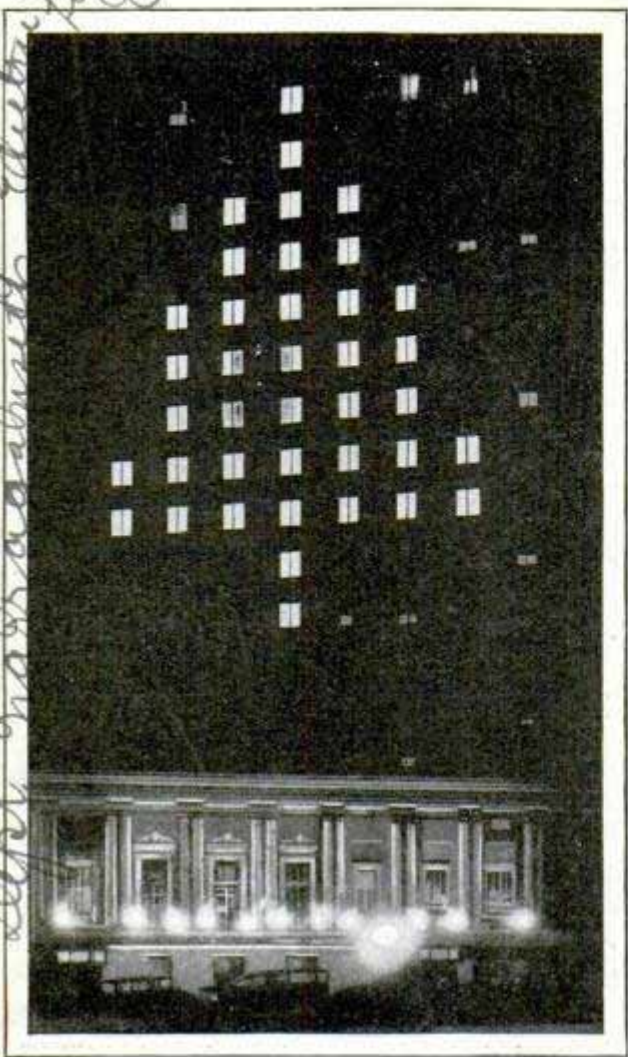

HEAD, NOT BAD EYES, TO BLAME FOR MOST AUTO ACCIDENTS

Defective eyesight is less to blame for auto accidents than deficient mentality, in the opinion of Dr. Harold D. Judd, of Detroit, Mich., who recently made an analysis of 100 motor mishaps. He concluded that a man with but fifty-per-cent visual efficiency and a nearly 100-per-cent mentality would make a more careful

driver than one with perfect eyes and poor judgment. Observation also showed that a combination of good eyes and full intelligence often makes a man more careless than the one who knows his eyesight is not good, but who is normal mentally. To make his study, Dr. Judd devised a way of testing the vision and alertness of the drivers at the same time. The subjects were seated before a screen and instructed to tell what they saw and what action they would take as soon as they were certain of the sign being projected on the curtain. A slide with the word "Stop" was first shown. The letters were too small to be distinguished at the beginning, but were gradually increased in size until the subject could identify them. The quickness of the response was considered a measure of eyesight efficiency and alertness as well. The use of the slide was based on the theory that objects are really recognized by their form long before they reach the size at which they are actually distinguished.

**RADIO VOICE PUTS OUT FLAME
TWELVE MILES AWAY**

Radio reproduction of a high-pitched male voice extinguished a sensitive flame about twelve miles from the broadcasting station during a test from KGO recently. The experiment was witnessed by a number of scientists and students. A shrill note was sounded by a man whose voice resembles that of a bird. As the vibrations were reproduced at the receiving end, they caused the flame to flicker and go out. This effect of a strong, high-pitched voice on fire has been known for a number of years, but is said never before to have been demonstrated by radio.

LIGHTNING STRIKES ROAD

Instances of lightning striking concrete roads and traveling along the reinforcing have aroused the interest of engineers and inspired the question as to whether highways of this sort should not be "reinforced" against bolts as well as against cracking and load. Not long ago, a road in Florida was struck, the lightning splitting and going about 720 feet in each direction through the reinforcing before it

entered the ground. In searching for the path of least resistance, the current jumped across the pavement often, generally at the joints. In arcking across the interrupted mesh, it caused enough heat to break out pieces of concrete about a square foot in area. Other instances of lightning's effect on concrete roads are on record. A bridge pavement and railing were destroyed during one storm and a road slab in another.

THAN BOILING WATER?**

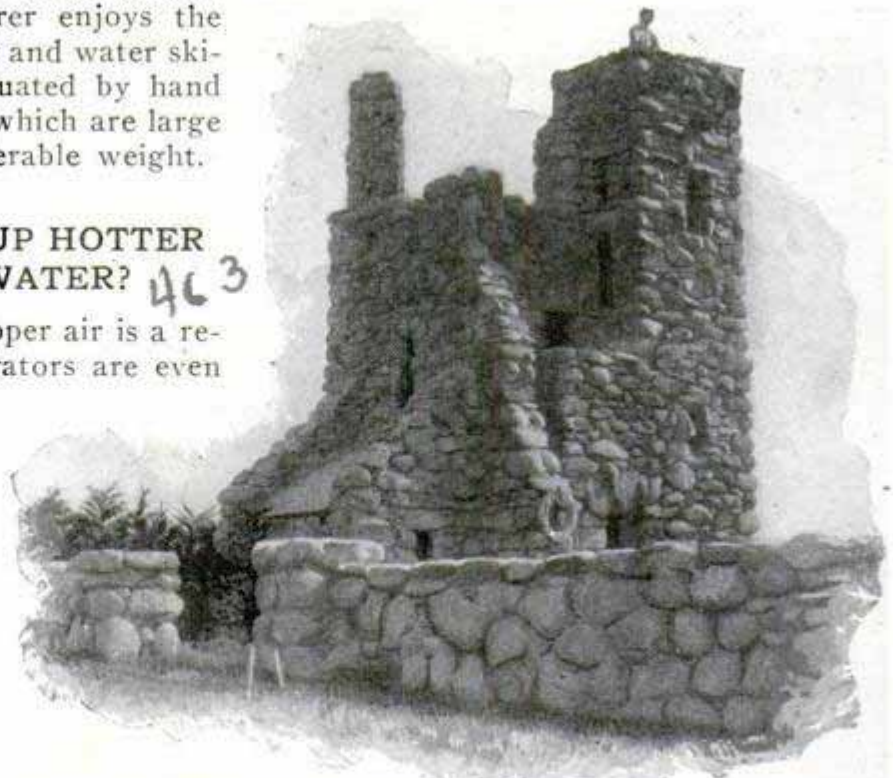
Like the deep sea, the upper air is a region of mystery. Investigators are even divided on the question as to whether it is hot or cold. Some believe that it exceeds 220 degrees Fahrenheit, others hold that it reaches a temperature as low as seventy-five degrees below zero. The problem was studied with new interest recently following a series of sound tests in France. Several tons of explosives

were set off at a place about midway between Paris and the Pyrenees. Observers, stationed at various points, were notified as to the exact time the explosions were to take place, and then made notes as to the instant the sound arrived. Wind conditions, temperature and other factors were taken into account, and the records, several hundred of them, were compared. From these data, various deductions were made as to the state of the upper air. Prof. Charles Maurain, a Paris scholar, concluded that the air has a uniform temperature up to over thirty miles. J. F. Whipple, a British weather expert, decided that the results indicated that the temperature begins to rise at about twenty miles and, at thirty, may reach 220 degrees Fahrenheit. While the cold theory seems to be supported by the findings of aviators, scientific opinion elsewhere, so far as expressed, is divided on the subject.

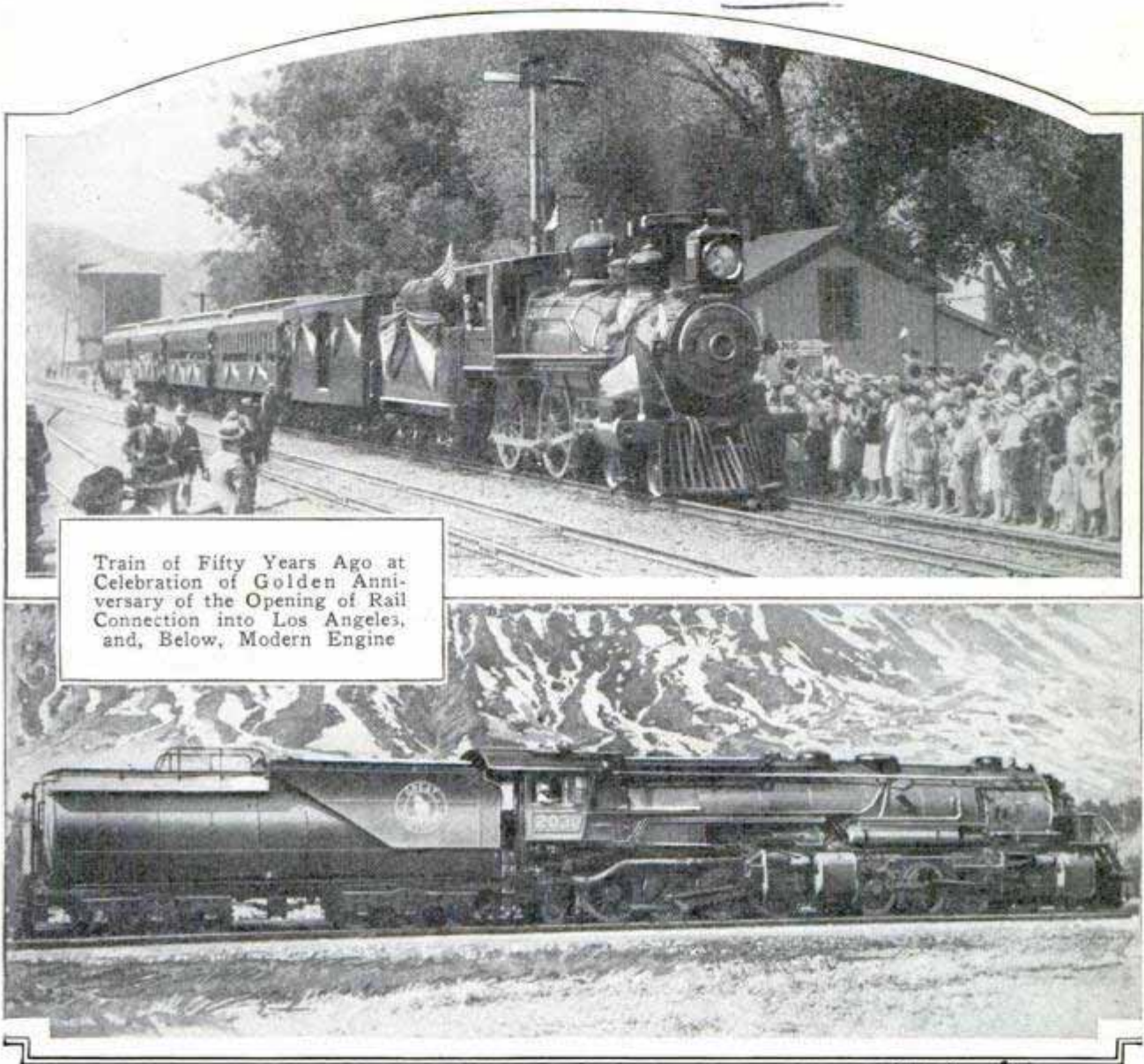

How To Climb Mountains

DRIVING an automobile over ordinary highways and city streets is one thing, but driving in mountainous country is quite another. A person may be the most

roads. The motorist who goes into such country for the first time has a multitude of things to consider which do not play such an important part in ordinary highway driving. The first thing to be looked after is the car itself. Some automobiles are good mountain cars and others are not. A powerful motor, of course, is always desirable. The power of the motor, however, is not so important as the size and wheelbase of the vehicle, and the weight of the load that the motor is called upon to pull over steep grades.

Any monstrously big automobile with a long wheelbase is a menace to life on steep and tortuous mountain roads. No matter how powerful it is, it cannot be handled on the turns satisfactorily and safely. It is clumsy and awkward to drive on roads that may be only a foot wider than the car itself—and particularly, when that foot of spare road is at the edge of a 2,000-foot cliff. And, just as the medium-sized car is better than the large one, the smallest of automobiles, if slightly altered for mountain use, is still better.

The Ford that is to be subjected to such use should have a variable gear transmission, adding two more speeds to those supplied by the manufacturers. It should be

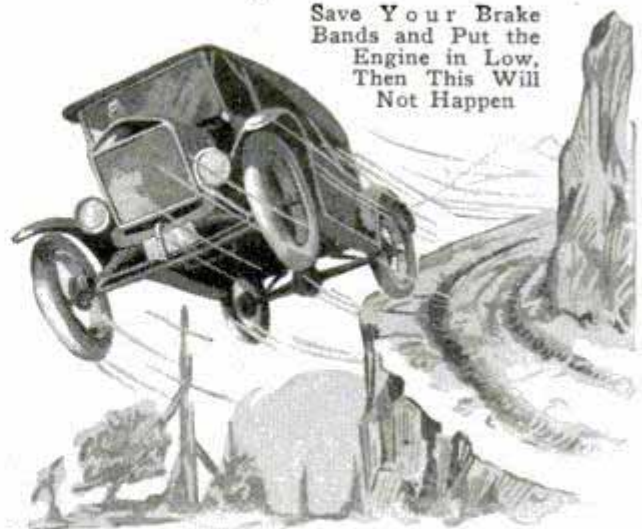


proficient of drivers under average road conditions, but literally a babe in the woods when he finds himself on a steep and narrow trail that goes wiggling up and over some titanic range of precipitous mountains.

The motor tourist from the level country meeting the hills for the first time is usually terrified. Some lose their heads completely. Others become violently ill from nerve strain. Mountain sickness, a near relative of seasickness, afflicts persons who are sensitive to changes of altitude. Automobiles become weak and languid trying to digest the rarefied atmosphere of high elevations. Radiators boil like teakettles where water boils at such low temperatures that food cannot be cooked in it.

People lacking previous experience in mountain driving make many mistakes that knowledge would enable them to avoid. Disastrous accidents are often the result. The purpose of this article, therefore, is an attempt to convey information that should be of value to the motor tourist inexperienced in mountain driving. No driver who has not had sufficient experience to handle his car by purely mechanical movements of the hands and feet has any business venturing onto mountain

out overheating or burning out. These accessories can be obtained at a cost of about \$100, and they are worth many times the price.

It goes without saying that the conditions of mountain service make it imperative that a motor car should be put in good mechanical condition before it is taken into the hills. No single part of the car should have more careful attention than the brakes. Brakes may mean life or death. If the brake bands show any appreciable wear, they should be replaced. The valves in the motor should be ground in, and the motor itself should receive every attention that will give it the last possible ounce of power.

Brakes are important for ordinary traffic driving, but a thousand times more important in the mountains. Yet the driver who attempts to come down off a mountain by pushing out the clutch and checking speed with the brakes, is literally playing hookey from the graveyard. No automobile brake that was ever built will stand such use for a single hour without going out of business entirely. The engine that drives the car up the hill is the brake to use for getting down. You can't hurt the engine by properly using it to check the speed of descending a slope. Come down in second gear or, if the hill appears to be particularly steep and dangerous, get into low before you start down. If you try to shift into low after the car has developed excessive speed in second, you may find yourself coasting down the hill in neutral.

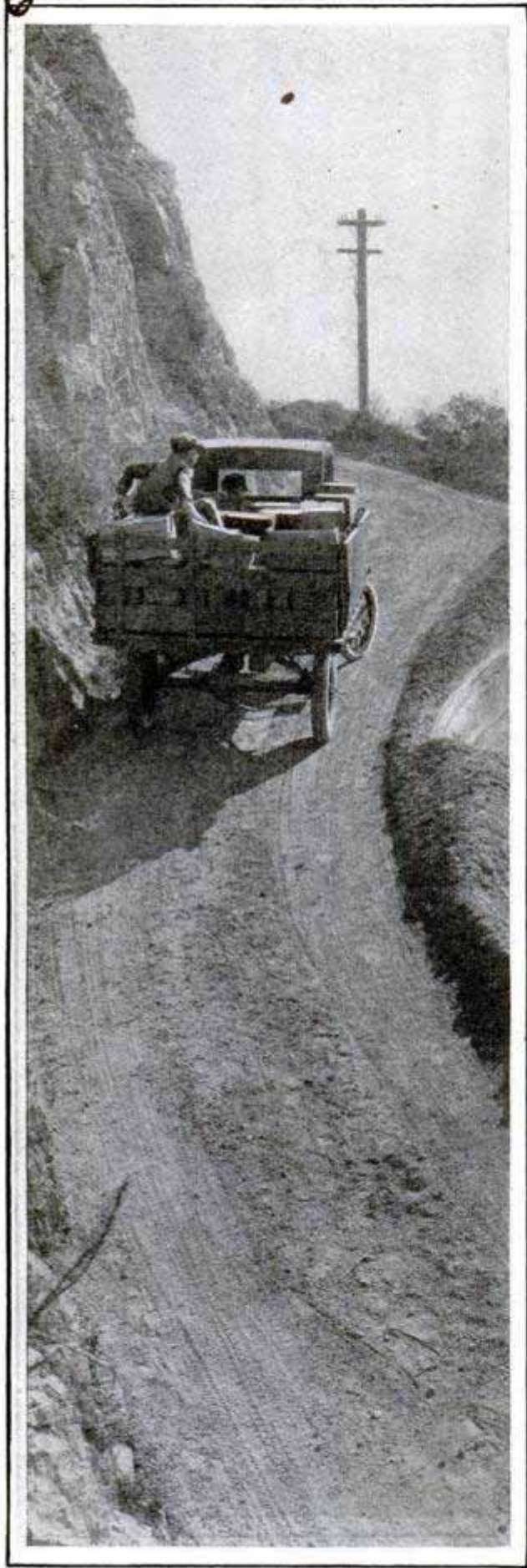
No car can gain dangerous speed on any road grade when coming down in low gear with a closed throttle. If, however, the grade is so steep that too much speed is gained in either second or low gear, the foot brake should be used occasionally without releasing the clutch. In many mountain states road signs now tell the driver when the low gear should be used. But, if no such sign is seen, he must rely upon his own judgment. In these states, the motor laws usually stipulate that gears must be kept constantly in mesh while

traveling mountain roads, except when it is necessary to shift from one gear to

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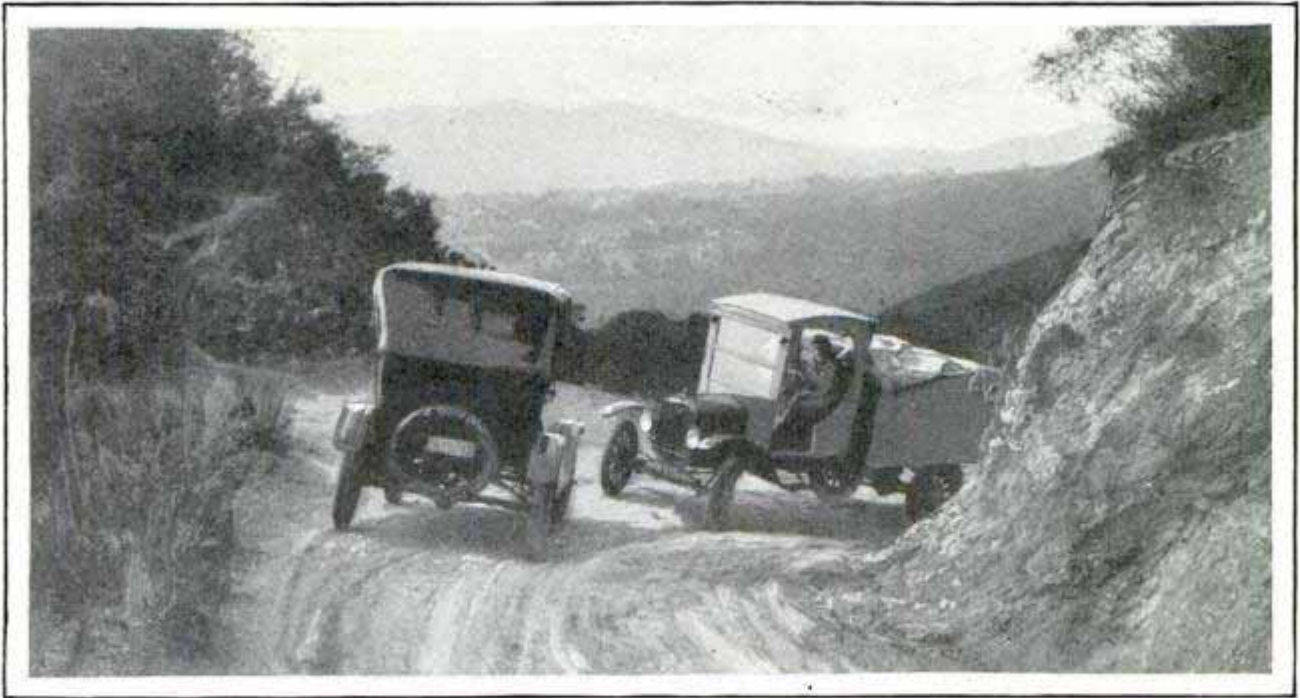

another. Inexperienced drivers frequently make the mistake of switching off the ignition when coming down a long steep grade in second or low gear. This is bad for the motor, because fuel that is not exploded is being constantly pumped into the cylinders. It cuts the oil off the cylinder walls and may do serious damage. A much better method is to leave the ignition on, closing the throttle as far as it will go.

In going up a grade and around innumerable blind hairpin turns, the driver must use his judgment to decide what gear he is going to need to make the grade. It is better to start up the hill in low gear than to have to shift from second to low in the middle of the grade with the attending danger of stalling the engine, and possibly backing down out of control. When a car is unintentionally stalled in the middle of a steep grade, someone should be assigned to the task of blocking the wheels before the driver attempts to start the car or leave his seat. Stones are usually available for this purpose. If stones are used for wheel blocks, it is only courtesy to other travelers of the road that they be removed before you go on.

The courts of all the mountainous states have ruled that responsibility for a collision between two vehicles on a mountain road always rests upon the driver who is coming down the grade. This is logical and as it should be, for it is almost impossible for the driver coming up to cause an accident to any vehicle other than his own. The fellow who is roaring up the grade in low gear with his foot hard and heavy on the gas can bring his car to an almost instant stop. He has but to take his foot off the accelerator—and the law of gravity stops him. On mountain grades that are wide enough to permit vehicles going in opposite directions to pass each other, it is customary, in tight places, for the descending machine to take the outside of the road. This is precisely the reverse of the American rule by which all traffic keeps to the right-hand side of the road. In the mountains one goes to the right or left according to the circumstances. If there is any question of doubt or misunderstanding of signals between drivers of machines approaching each other from opposite directions, it is the

duty of the driver of the descending machine to come to a stop. The up-bound car always has the right of way.

Next to good brakes, an electric horn, or some sort of device that will make the greatest possible noise, is the best kind of insurance against accidents. Horns for mountain use are valued according to the volume of racket they can make. A horn that would be loud enough in the city could not be heard around a hairpin curve in the mountains where motor cars roar

up the grades with wide-open throttles, and usually with mufflers, and even exhaust pipes, removed. Safety in the mountains is thus reckoned largely in terms of noise. The more noise you can make the safer you are.

The volume of noise is also important

because many autoists go temporarily deaf from sudden changes of altitude. Deafness is caused by the fluctuation of atmospheric pressure at varying altitudes. When such deafness occurs, it can be relieved instantly by the mountain driver who knows the trick. Hold the nostrils shut with the fingers, and then blow hard. You'll hear a noise inside your head like an exploding firecracker, and—presto!—you've got your normal hearing back.

Very few persons besides those suffering from heart disease, high blood pressure, or other similar infirmity, suffer any inconvenience other than temporary deafness from altitudes below 5,000 feet. Above 5,000 feet, however, and on some western roads where altitudes of from 10,000 to 14,000 feet are encountered, the conditions met in mountain motoring are almost identical with those experienced by aviators. In other words, the motorist, to withstand these very high elevations, must be of sound physique. If one is contemplating a trip into high altitudes, especially if he expects to drive, it is advisable to call on the family physician for an examination before starting. If the doctor says your heart action or blood pressure is abnormal in some way, there is only one recourse. That is not to go.

Altitude also affects the automobile motor somewhat as it does the human body. Few cars begin "to feel it" below

5,000 feet, but from there on, engines rapidly lose power for each 1,000 feet of altitude gained. A car that would romp up a grade in second gear at 5,000 feet would have to get into low gear to make the same grade at 10,000 feet. Above 10,000 feet many perfectly good automobiles cannot even pull themselves along in high gear on level ground.

In high altitudes motorists will also find the radiators boiling violently for no apparent reason. That is nothing to get excited about. Water boils at 212 degrees at sea level. At an elevation of 10,000 feet it boils at a so much lower temperature that potatoes can be kept in it for a week without ever cooking them to a point where they would be fit to eat. So, if the radiator of your car sizzles and roars like an overheated teakettle, let it boil. It won't hurt anything unless it actually boils dry. To offset this condition of violent boiling at low temperatures it is advisable to refill the radiator frequently.

When you go into the mountains, leave all your speed schedules at home. Too much speed is the cause of almost all mountain-road accidents. Any attempt to make fast time over mountain roads is not only dangerous but utterly futile. The wildest kind of driver cannot hope to gain

more than a few minutes over a sane and conservative driver in traveling over a distance of fifty miles. No possible saving of time that might be effected by wild driving in the mountains can offset the risk it involves.

One highly important thing that every motorist in the mountains should know is how to bring his car back under control after he has lost it on a grade. On such roads there are usually just two places for a derelict car to go. One is off the cliff, and the other is into the sidewalls of the grade. Obviously, the wall is the choice, but there's a knack in bringing the car to a stop without upsetting. The inexperienced driver who finds himself heading down a grade through "losing his gears" or brake failure, usually takes a death grip on the steering wheel and hangs on for the inevitable. When this happens to the trained driver, he gently pulls the steering wheel over toward the wall. Fenders and running board gradually begin to scrape and dig in. The car seldom goes more than a few feet before friction overcomes gravity, and the vehicle is brought to a stop with no damage greater than the loss of a little paint.

Of course, when a car goes out of control while ascending a grade, and starts to

back down, the steering wheel is manipulated very gently in the opposite direction from the way it would be moved if the car were going forward. Quick use of the brakes, however, is the best method of checking a car which has begun to back down. Edging into the wall is merely an alternative in case of brake failure.

I have known many mountain drivers who have fitted their automobiles with a heavy metal sprag, as shown in one of the accompanying illustrations. This device, which works like the stiff quills of a woodpecker's tail in keeping him from sliding down the trunk of a tree, is an absolute safeguard against a motor car going out of control and backing down a grade.

When coming down steep grades that are often many miles in length, motorists can save their brakes, and the strain of holding the car in check, by dragging a small tree tied to the rear of the vehicle.

ANNUAL LOSS FROM ACCIDENTS FIVE BILLION DOLLARS

Upward of 12,000,000 accidents occur in the United States every year, according to a survey made by officials of a New York hospital. Of these, between 2,500,000 and 3,000,000 are industrial. The economic loss computed on the basis of a day's wage of \$4, if applied at the same ratio to all accidents in the country, would show a loss of nearly \$5,000,000,000, not considering destruction of property. One person in every nine meets with a mishap every year, the survey showed, and one out of every ten deaths is due to accidental causes. An average of more than 100,000 persons lose arms, feet or hands as a result of accidents in the space of a year.

AIR FROM WELL IS HARNESSSED TO AID DIGGERS

Oil-well diggers in a Texas field received a surprise not long ago when they struck a cold current of what at first was believed to be a mysterious gas. Investigation showed that it was air. Adopting the suggestion of one of the workers, the flow was harnessed to the drilling machinery, which had been put out of commission by the failure of the steam supply, and, in a short time, the rigging was working smoothly. Gauges showed a pressure of 120 pounds to the square inch. Ice-machine oil was substituted for the regular steam-engine variety, which would have been unfit for use under the circumstances, and the power plant was found to perform as well under the frigid air as it had done under steam. The current had an initial pressure of about 400 pounds and about ninety-three per cent of it was nitrogen. Pipes through which it was conducted soon became coated with a heavy layer of frost. The flow is still being used to continue the drilling down to the oil level below the depth of 1,100 feet where the air was encountered.

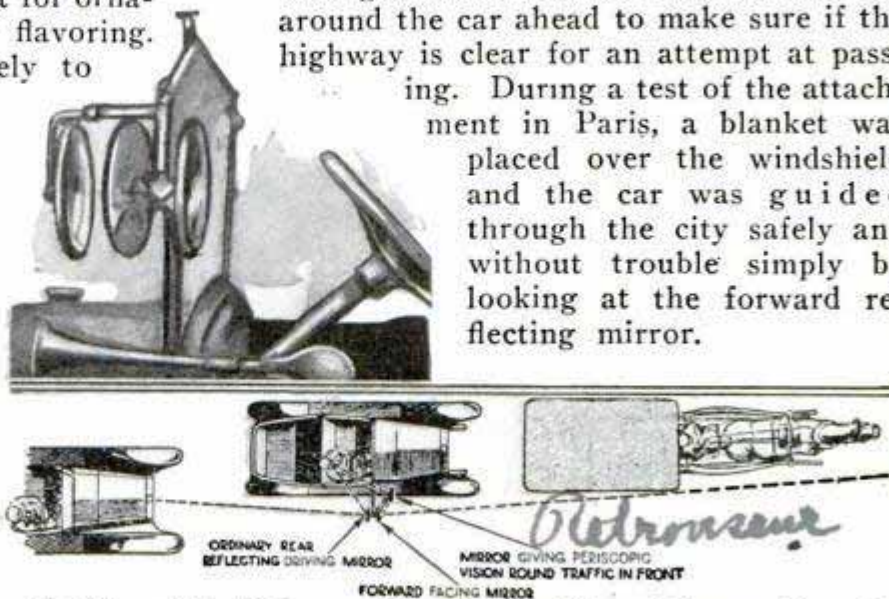
**CHINESE USE ROSES TO FLAVOR

They are used extensively to scent tea leaves; pounded into a pulpy mass, they are added to other ingredients in making candy and are also employed to impart a pleasing taste to homemade wine. Some confectioners use them to scent melon seeds. The rose trade forms a large part of the business of one of the guilds of China. The blossoms are often dried and stored in large receptacles, covered with oil

paper, for later use. The drying reduces their weight by about half and is done by applying gentle heat or in sunlight. In some parts of China, roses retail at about \$1 for 450 flowers. The dried blossoms command a slightly higher price.

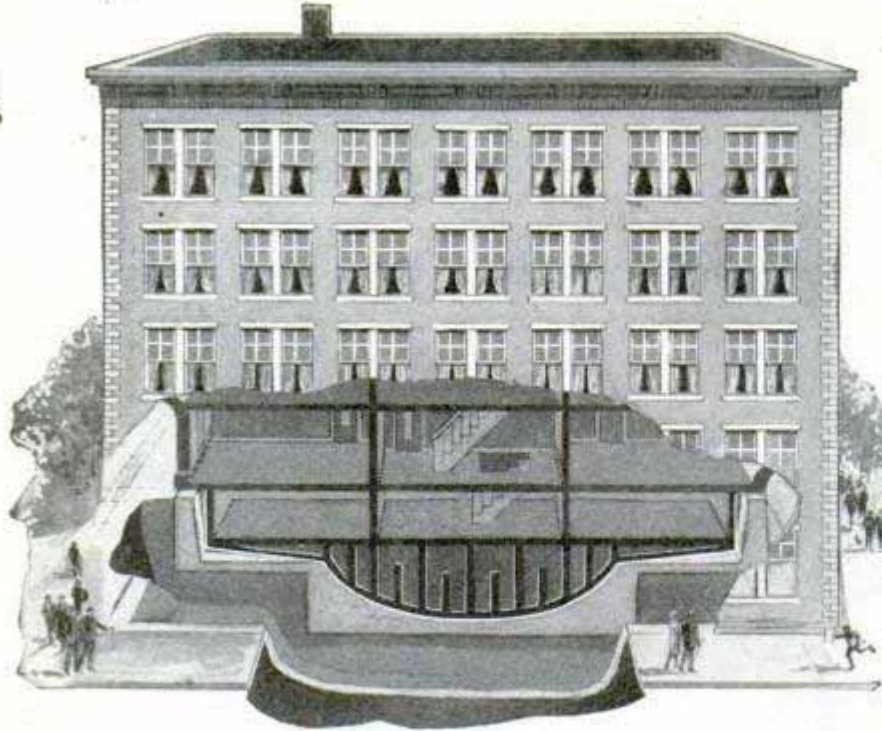
Close View of the Periscope at Side of Automobile, and Diagram Illustrating Vision It Affords

QUAKE-PROOF BUILDING SWINGS ON FLOATING FOUNDATION

**USE OF VOLCANIC ENERGY
URGED BY CHEMIST** 468

Harnessing Vesuvius itself is beyond actual possibility, according to Prince Giñori-Conti, president of the Italian society of general and industrial chemistry, but he believes that the natural reservoirs of heat lying near by may be utilized, and cites development of this sort that already has been accomplished in other parts of Italy. In the Soffioni district, for instance, where generation of power from the steam springs was a secondary objective, a number of valuable industrial products have been obtained, such as boron and its derivatives, borax, perborate of soda and other boron salts. Carbon dioxide, helium, argon and other gases have been found, he reports, and from the steam spouts of Tuscany, ammonia is separated for the production of carbonate of ammonia. Borax is also obtained, and special plants which depend upon heat and gases from the springs have been erected at Lardello in Tuscany. The steam flow under the earth is being tapped by means of wells drilled to depths ranging from 180 to 750 feet and sixteen inches in diameter. Steam appears in many instances at forty-five or fifty feet. Rotary drills of the latest type are used for the work, and the bore is sunk until skilled engineers decide that no further advantage will be gained. From two to six months were required to drill a well, but the operation is now conducted more rapidly. The prince declared that the geysers in this country may afford a valuable source of industrial power by proper development.

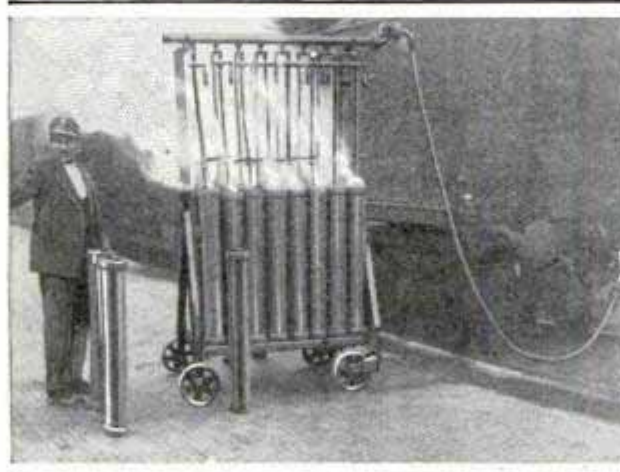

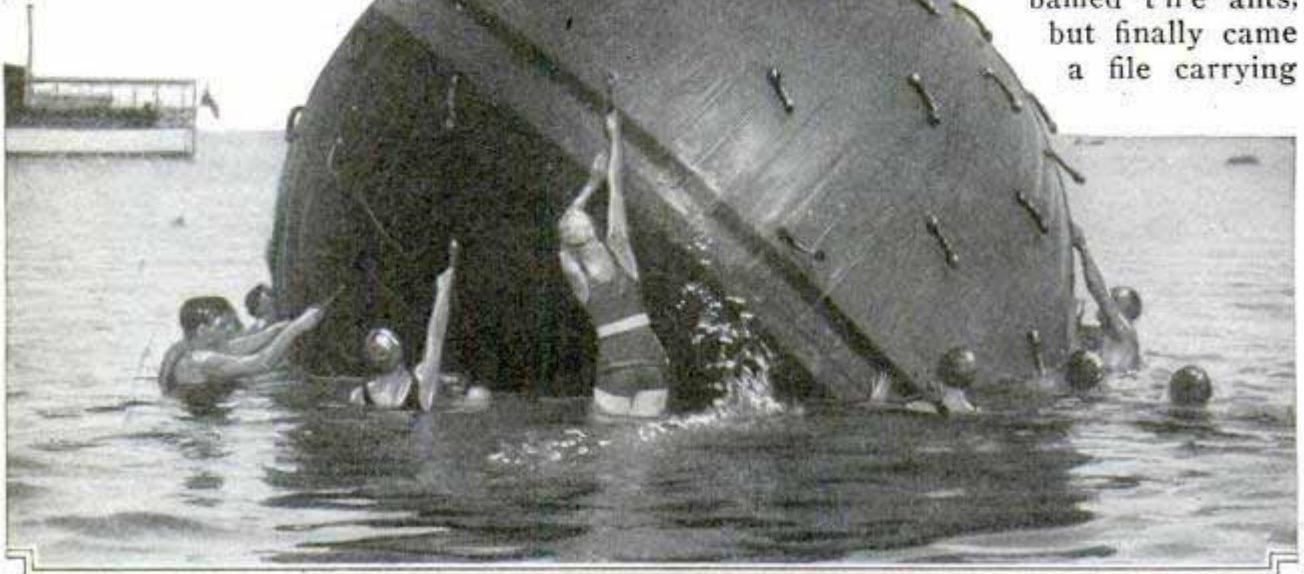

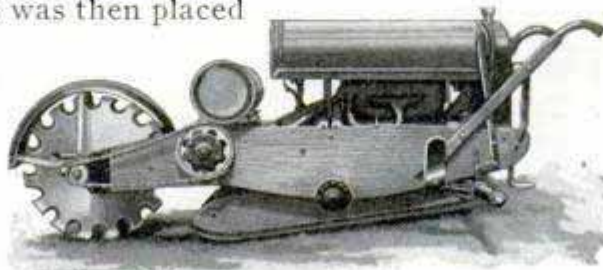
ANTS DISPLAY BRAIN POWER BUILDING PONTOONS

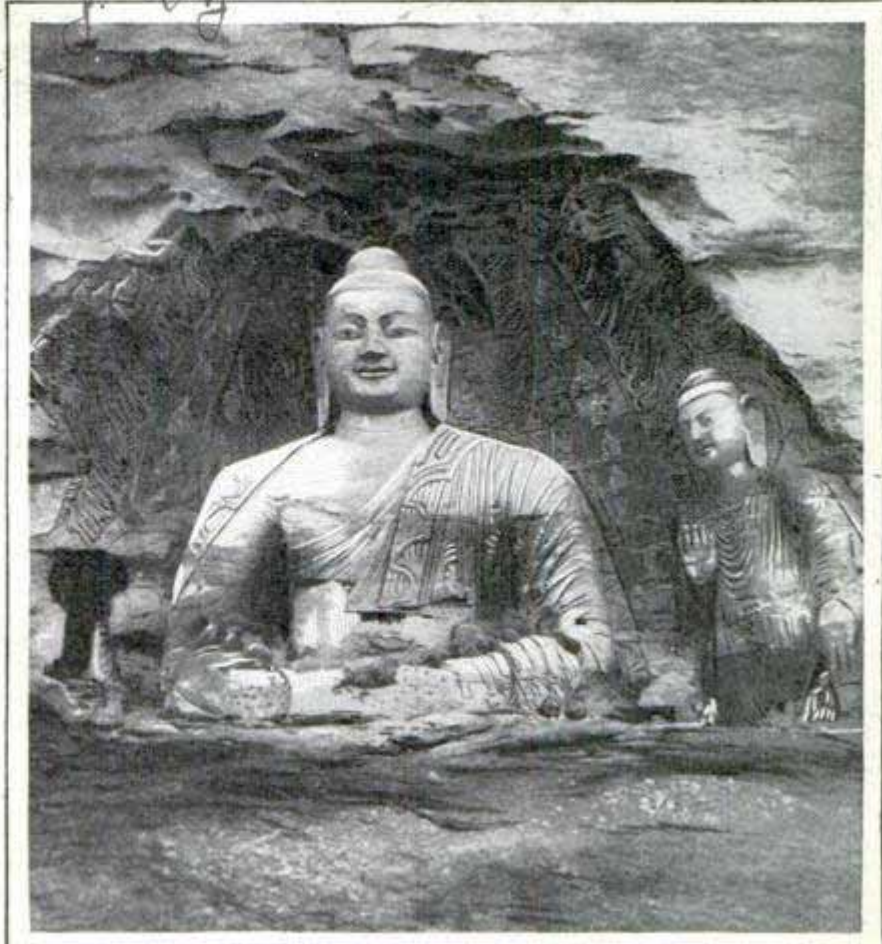

HOTTER FLAME FOR WELDING IS FOUND

435

Industrial benefits are predicted from a process for producing a flame said to be much hotter than any hitherto known. Its temperature is estimated at 7,000 degrees Fahrenheit. Tungsten wire melted in it like an icicle in a gas jet; a tube of sheet steel was welded at the seam without solder, and when the flame was played on a plate of chrome steel, it left a string of puddles in its wake. It is produced in a blowpipe outfit similar to that used in welding or cutting steel on street-car tracks. An essential feature of the process is that the hydrogen used is handled in such a way that metals do not oxidize under the flame since they are surrounded by hydrogen gas at the heating spot. This is said to make possible the welding of such metals as aluminum and magnesium. They ordinarily fall into white powder when they are heated in air.

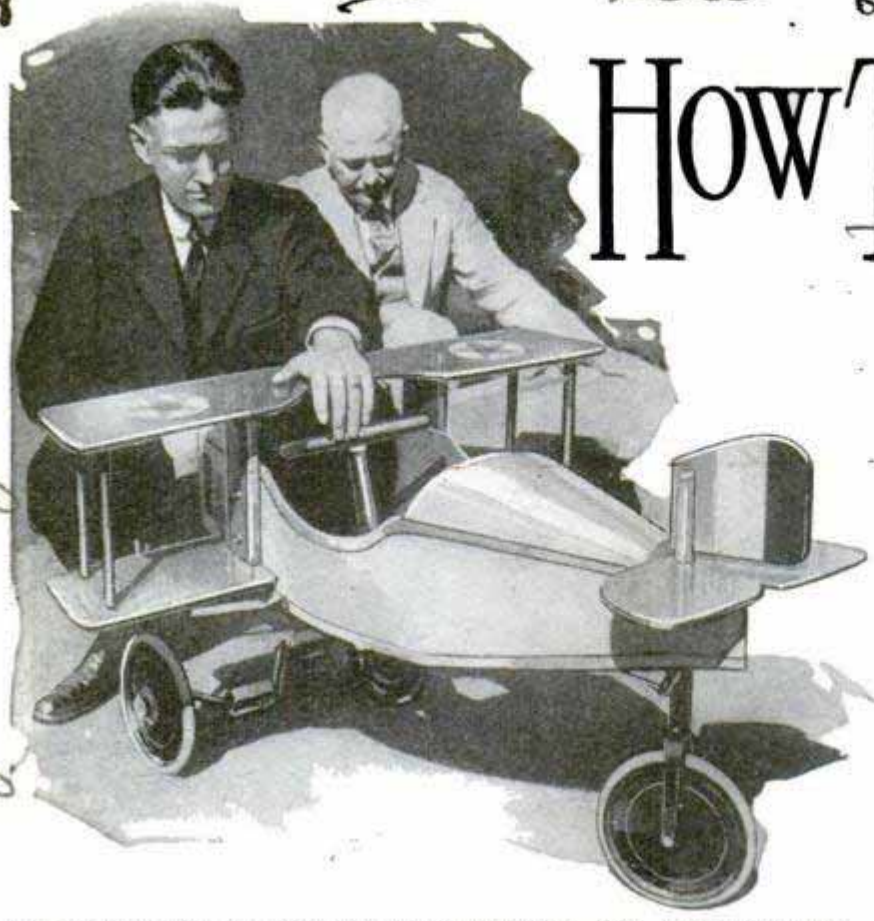

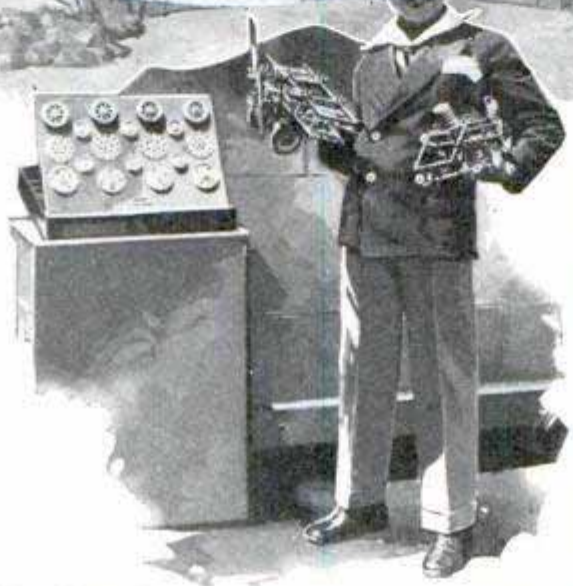
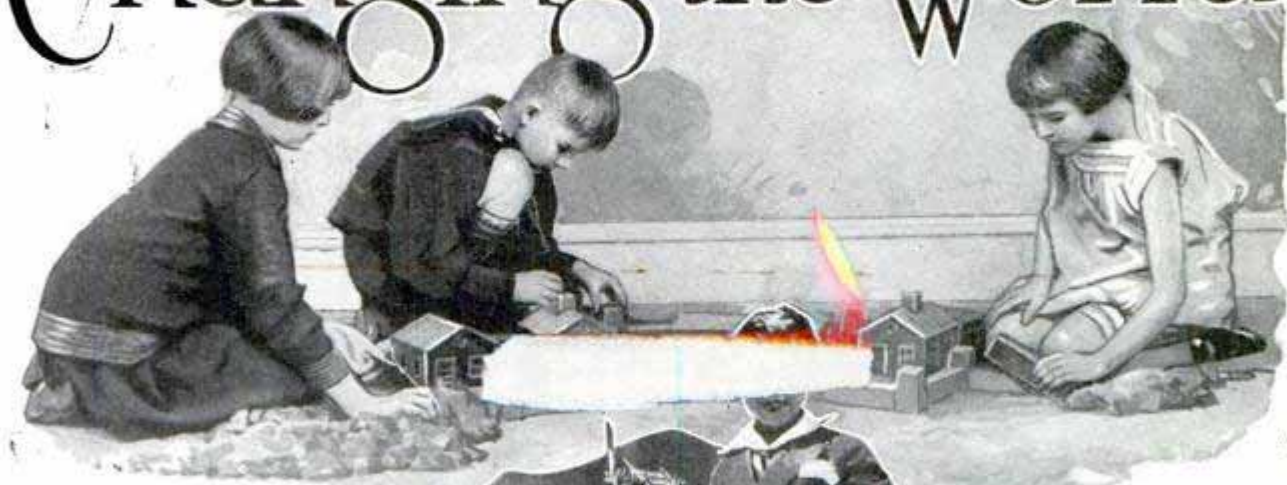

to a marvelously intricate piece of machinery; by laboratory outfits that enable the young chemist to perform surprising experiments at home, and by dozens of others, all calculated to help shape the child's mind for success in after life.

Instead of the little red wagon of twenty years ago, there are automobiles that are accurate scale models of real cars, with all the accessories from balloon tires to the windshield wiper. The supremacy of the toy automobile, however, is now being challenged by a similar foot-driven vehicle which has airplane wings and a revolving propeller. In the search for realistic toys, even the expressionless doll of the past is being displaced by models designed from famous cartoons and comic strip characters.

The demand of the American boy for toys "that will work" has been the biggest factor in building up the new toy industry. A generation ago a cast-iron fire engine, hitched to cast-iron horses and pulled along by a string, provided plenty of thrills, but the modern fire engine is an exact model of the latest motor-driven apparatus, is run by its own motor and has

a pump that draws water and throws a stream six feet or so from a length of real rubber hose.

For the boy who has outgrown the foot-propelled automobile, there is now a car on the market driven by an electric motor, taking power from a storage battery. It has a speed of five miles an hour and will run ten miles on each charge.

The old-fashioned sand pile has even come in for modernization, with a set of metal forms which can be clipped together, packed full of sand, then taken down, leaving a complete sand village of houses and stores.

The modern boy of six or eight learns more about electricity than grown men knew a generation ago, for many of his toys utilize it. Even the toy steam engine is abandoning the alcohol lamp as a heating element, and is now operated by an electrically fired boiler that plugs in on the house-wiring circuit like a toaster or a curling iron.

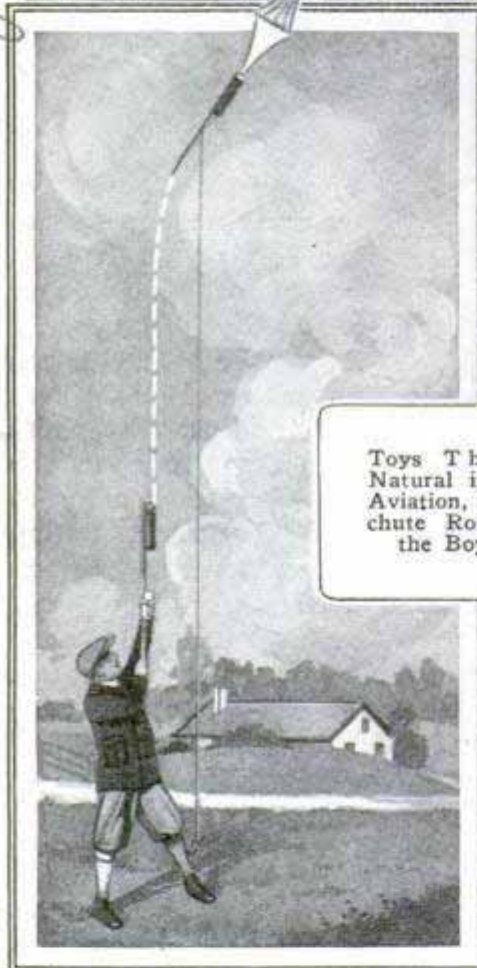
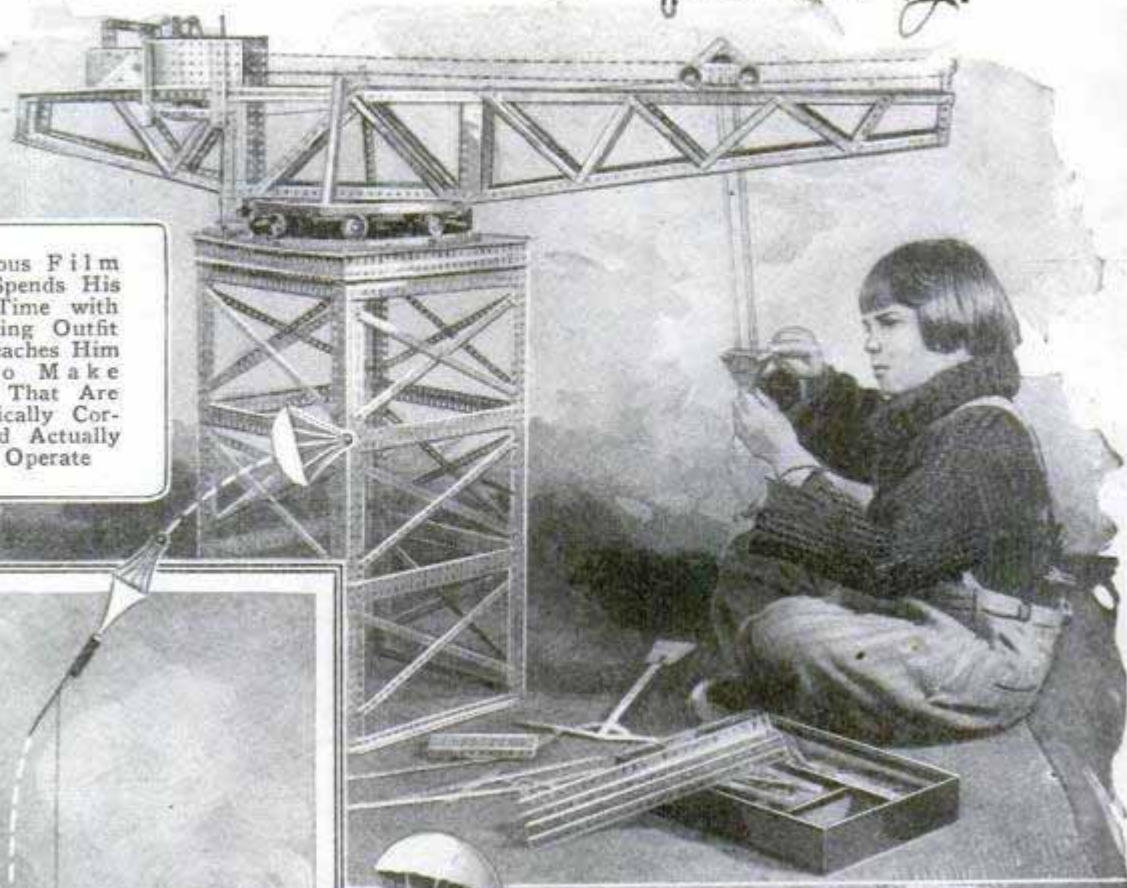

Their elders, too, are building more models, for home decoration or industry, than ever before. Several of the large automobile factories produce all new-car designs in model form before undertaking production. The models are studied from every angle to make sure that the lines are harmonious, that tops are in the right proportion, fenders correctly designed, and that the car looks its worth. Some of the model automobiles are put to strange uses. Courts have turned to them to reconstruct the scene at traffic accidents and fix the blame. Window decorators employ many of them.

Out in California two boys who built model ships as youngsters kept on as they grew up and now, though barely in their twenties, have one of the largest model factories in the country. They produce complicated and exact ship models for steamship lines, plant models for many industries, and out of their profits have organized a company which owns a large seagoing yacht, to be employed in taking select parties on round-the-world cruises.

Building of toy models as a pastime for grown folks has never reached the propor-

tions in this country that it has attained in England, but there is a constantly increasing demand for model parts and plans. Toy trains that actually work are the favorites abroad. Hundreds of amateurs in England build them as a hobby, complete in every detail and reproducing such famous engines as the one that pulls the crack "Flying Scotsman" from London to Edinburgh. Many of the model builders have home workshops and make every tiny piece that goes into their locomotives, while others buy rough castings, machining them on their home lathes, and still more get the finished castings from model makers and assemble them.

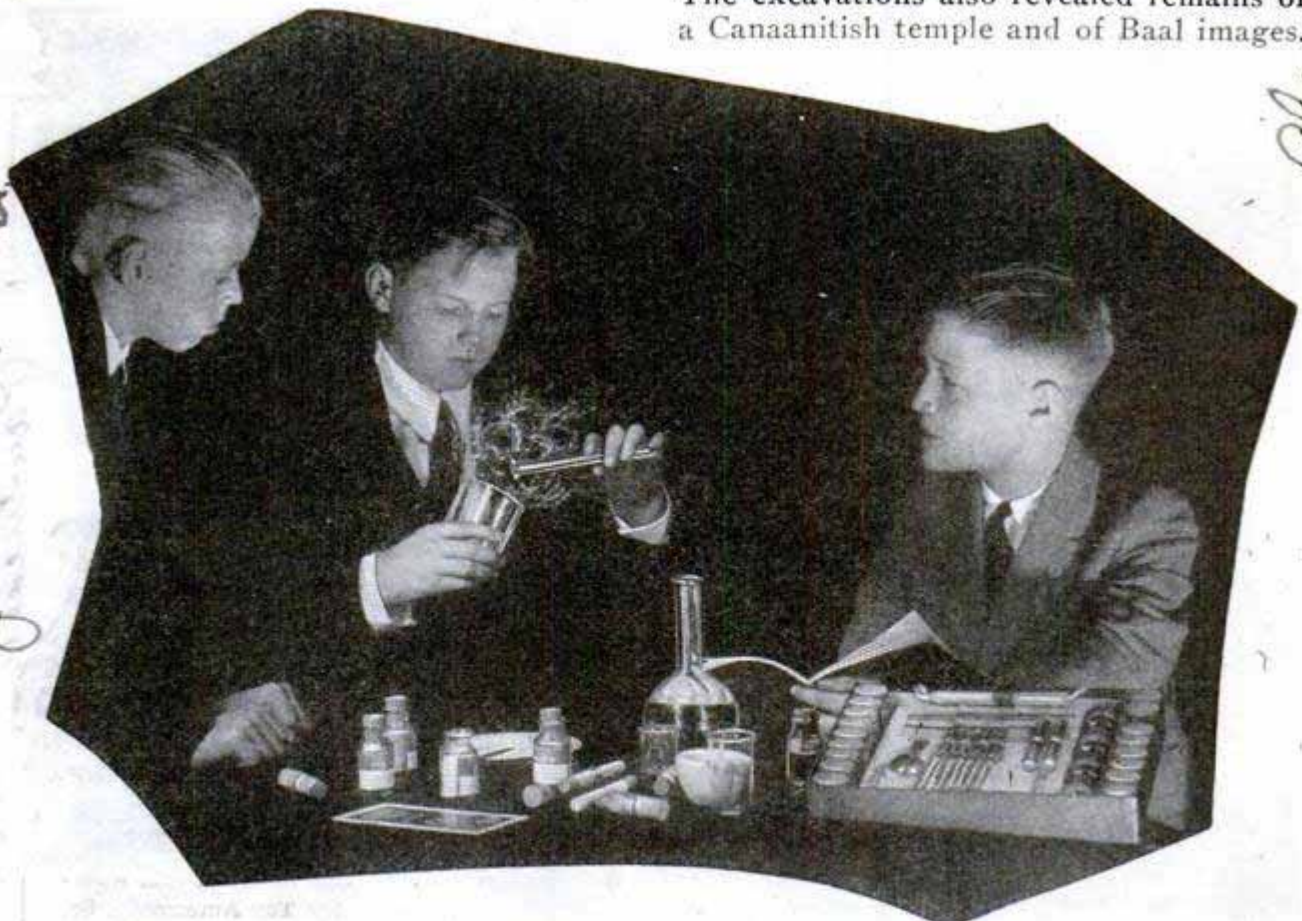

BIG COAL STRIKE IN ENGLAND HELPED CLEAR AIR 530

Decrease in smoke and the consequent brightening of the skies incident to the coal strike in England have shown persons there the advantages of clean air and will aid in the adoption of fuels that do not defile the atmosphere, it is believed. The effect was in direct contrast to that which was produced by the hard-coal strike in the United States, when much more soft coal was burned in eastern cities, increasing the amount of smoke. Measurements have been made in this country of the quantities of dust and soot that fall in one year. In the dirtiest of the ten centers examined, it was found that 794 tons accumulated to the square mile in 1924 and, in the cleanest, the deposit was 101 tons. Much of the refuse from industrial chimneys is gritty ash, while smoke from domestic flues contains a high percentage of tarry matter which is injurious to plant life as it clogs the pores of the leaves and often kills the growth.

REAR WHEEL RUNS AUTO PUMP SAVING HAND LABOR 499

Rapid operation and ease of adjustment are claimed for a patented automobile tire pump that may be run either by power from the rear wheel or by the crankshaft of some autos through the starting-crank hole. For the wheel drive, permanent attachments are fixed on each of the rear pair and the pump is slipped into a clutch. Its driving gear is engaged as the wheel rotates after being jacked up. The rear tire of a small automobile was inflated to a pressure of sixty pounds in one and one-half minutes with this pump, the inventor declares. It folds into small space when not in use.

It avoids the icing of a shipping tub, and the sloppy mess the latter makes when the ice begins to melt. Heavy express charges on the return of water-soaked wooden containers to the manufacturer are also saved.

MUSICAL WHISTLE ON ENGINE WON'T DISTURB SLEEPERS 480

Locomotives of a western railroad are being equipped with an improved "chime" whistle, sounds from which are described as "soft as the wood winds of a symphony orchestra." While the mellow tones can be heard as far as the screech of the usual type, experts declare, they are not likely to rouse residents along the right of way from their slumbers.

It can be used in connection with various styles of furnaces in which coal of the smaller sizes is burned.

WHERE OUR CHRISTMAS TREES GET THEIR NAMES

The Douglas fir, a native of the northwest but now being planted extensively in the east, is becoming a popular Christmas tree, according to the American Forestry association. The Douglas fir was named for a Scotch botanist who discovered it on an exploration trip in 1825, but its scientific name is *pseudotsuga*, meaning "false hemlock." As a matter of fact, it is neither a hem-

lock nor a fir, and, though it is sometimes called a spruce, it isn't that either. The tree belongs to an entirely distinct species. The tree most commonly used for Christmas trees is a real fir—the balsam, so called because its blisterlike pockets yield the resinous liquid known as Canada balsam, which is used, among other things, for attaching cover plates to microscopic slides.

4/11. Dragons such as adorn the Chinese flag have been brought nearer to reality in the capture of two huge lizards on the island of Komodo in the Malay archipelago. Each is eight feet long, weighs

200 pounds and has a body as thick as a man's, covered with a protective armor. Like the legendary dragon, they have red, forked tongues and sometimes make a loud hissing noise resembling escaping steam. Their legs are short and stubby and each foot has four claws. The tails are spiked. Scholars believe that the lizards, which were brought to the United States, may be descendants of an ancient species that inspired early belief in fiery dragons. They were captured by Douglas Burden, a trustee of the American Museum of Natural History, after a British aviator had sighted them from an airplane.

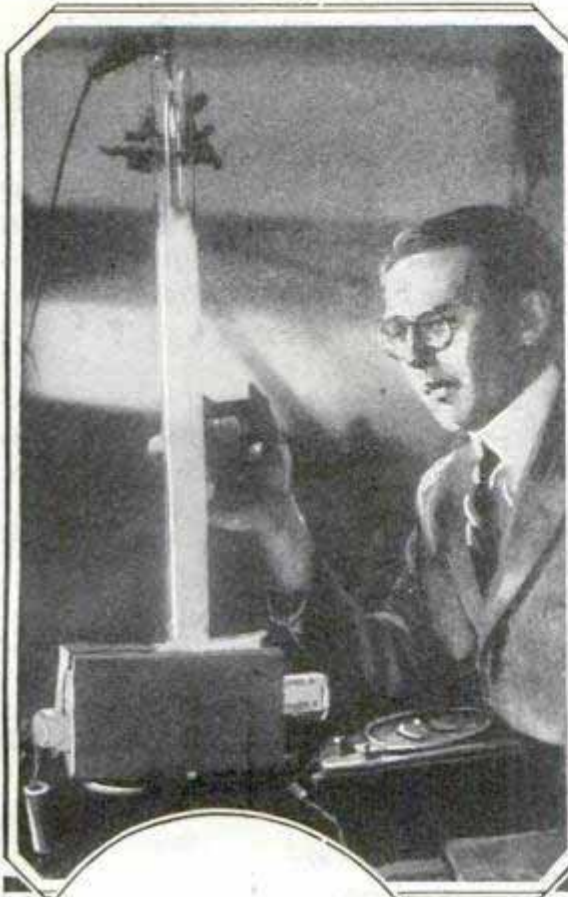

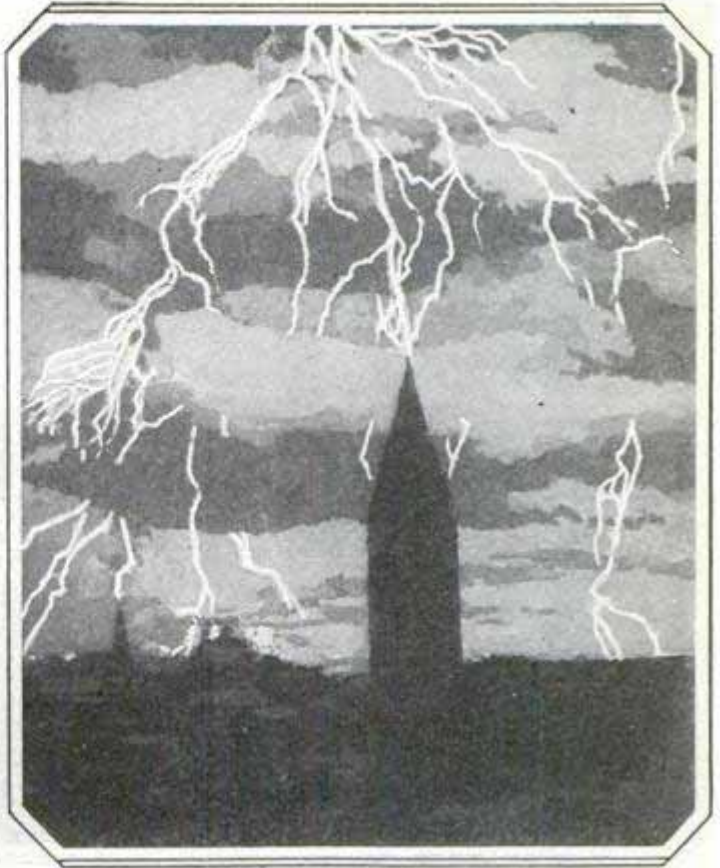

Lightning Rods Have Proved Effective as Protectors against the Ordinary Variety, but the Freaks Often Cause Damage in Spite of Conductors; Each of the Streaks at Left Has Voltage a Million Times That of House Current

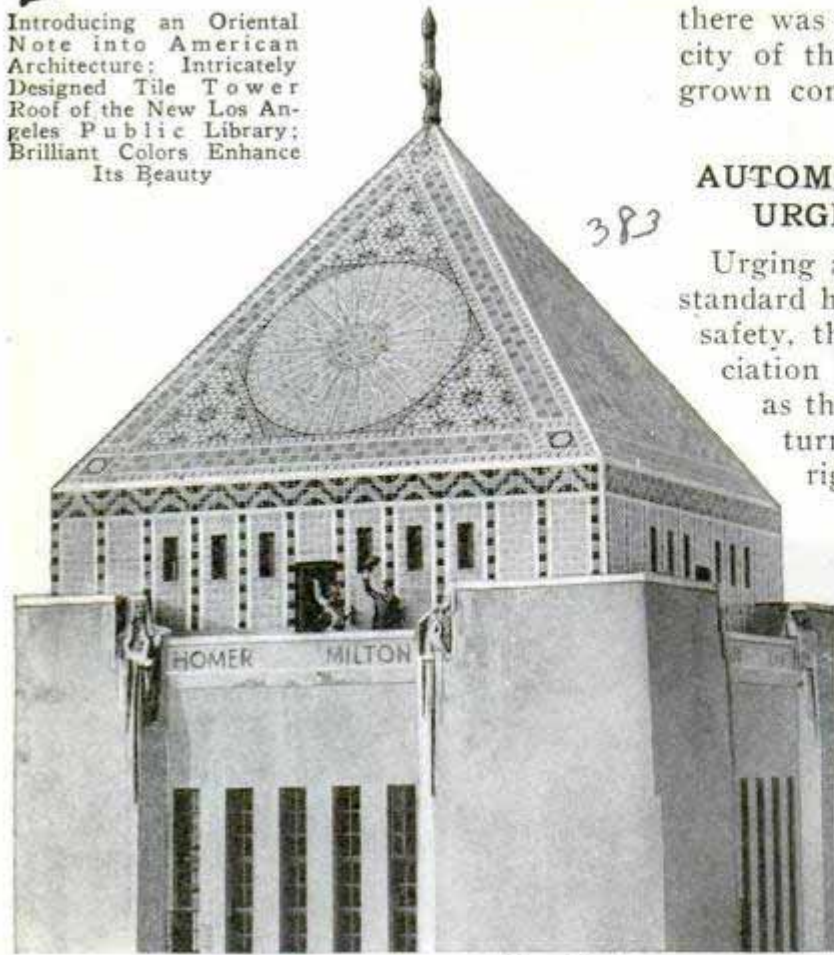
What is lightning? Dr. D. E. Dorsey, of the National Research Council, has attempted to answer this question, declaring that lightning is of two kinds. One variety follows the normal laws governing electricity. The other variety, by far the most dangerous in the havoc it may work, originates not in electric sparks and flashes but is a self-contained body of material and electrical particles which catapults toward the earth obeying no natural laws at present known to men of science. Dur-

wires and power-plant equipment, it was discovered that the voltage, the force behind an ordinary lightning bolt, is nearly a million times as strong as the force behind the current in the socket at home. No less wonderful is Mr. Peck's estimate that a single flash of lightning may carry power at the rate of 50,000,000 kilowatts, twice that which would be generated throughout the United States if all dynamos and power plants in the country were working simultaneously.

The city of Philadelphia rests on a fortune in gold, according to old records of assays made in 1861, but the metal does not appear in sufficient quantities to make recovery worth while. In fact, the assays showed values of three cents to each 120 pounds of clay. With only one part of gold in 1,000,000, even modern mining methods would not make the recovery pay. The investigators who made the old survey, however, and whose report has recently been uncovered, estimated that

there was \$126,000,000 in gold under the city of their day—and Philadelphia has grown considerably since then.

AUTOMOBILE SAFETY SIGNALS URGED FOR ALL DRIVERS

Urging all automobile drivers to adopt standard hand signals as one step toward safety, the American Automobile association has compiled the following list as the best and simplest: For a left turn, extend the arm horizontally; right turn, extend the arm upward above horizontal; to indicate a stop, extend the arm below the horizontal line. The suggestions concentrate on just the three positions of the arm which are easily remembered and clear at a distance.

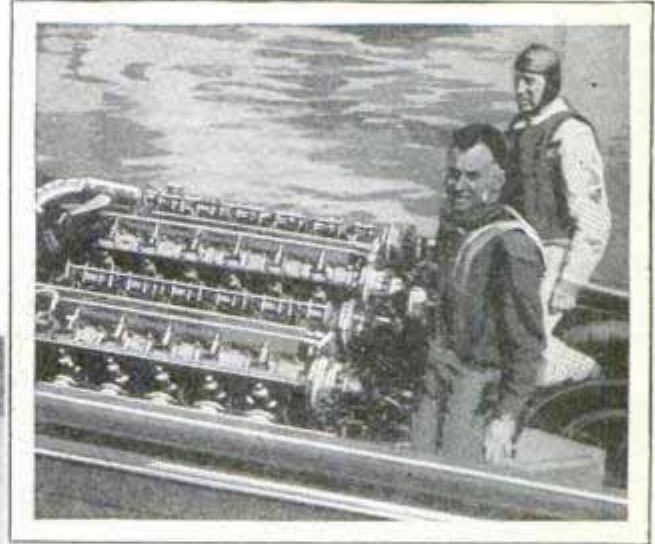

LONG LINE OF CONCRETE EARS 427 IS AIRPLANE DEFENSE

England's southeast coast is being equipped with a new form of airplane detector, built of concrete. The detector consists of a series of disks, like huge plates, eighteen to twenty feet in diameter and supported on short legs a foot or so above the ground. A length of

pipe, to contain a delicate microphone, sticks up from the center, while each disk is surrounded by a concrete protecting wall, a foot outside its outer rim. The disk catches the sound waves striking its entire surface and transmits them to the microphone, which is connected electrically to a distant observatory, where the plane's direction and speed are estimated.

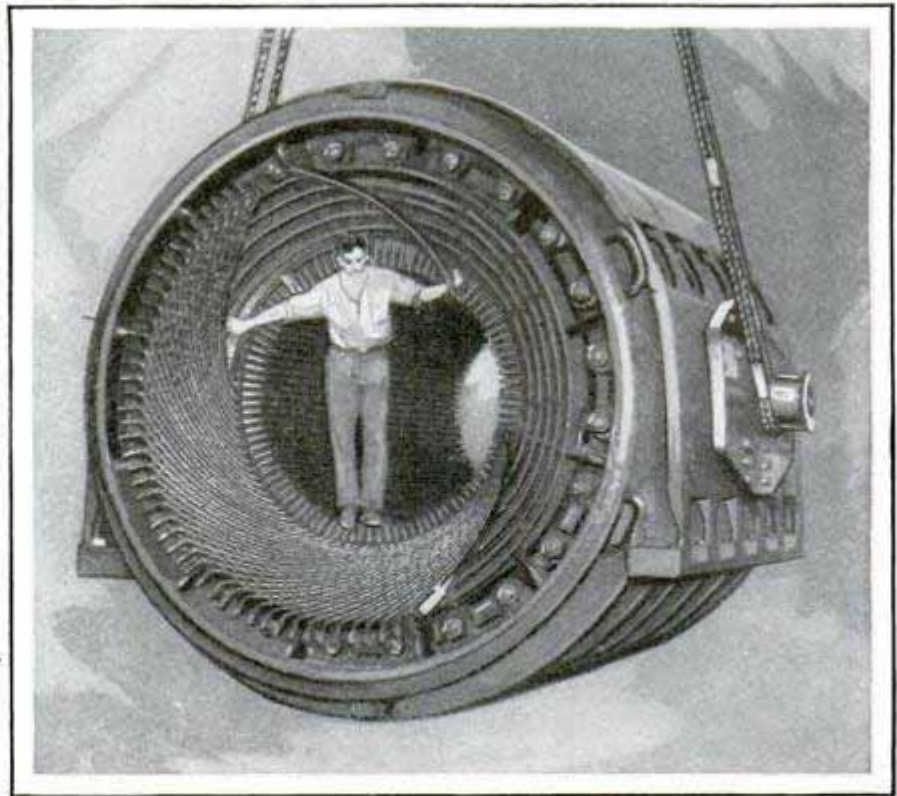
India and China absorbed seventy per cent of all the silver produced in the world last year, while India alone took more than half of the total gold production, according to official reports. These facts have been overlooked in the westward rush of gold across the Atlantic since the war. Thirty-four per cent of the amount of gold imported by India last year came from the United States. That country also is the greatest market for American silver, buying all but about 2,700,000 ounces of the total amount produced here in 1925. The value of India's gold imports last year was three

times that of the silver. Almost all the metal is hoarded or used for ornaments, and the wide demand for it has caused economists to speculate as to the possible effect that may be produced on world supplies. In 1925, while silver production declined over the previous year, gold barely held its own. Further troubles are expected in the silver industry if India's trend toward gold continues. The chief difficulty in the silver question is said to be to find markets, not the curtailed supply. Eighty per cent of it comes as a by-product in the smelting of lead, zinc and copper, large amounts of which have been produced in the last few years.

GENERATOR THAT COULD LIGHT HOMES OF A MILLION

Capable of supplying 80,000 horsepower of electrical energy, a huge generator at an eastern plant, could light 300,000 six-room homes, sufficient to house 1,000,000 persons. 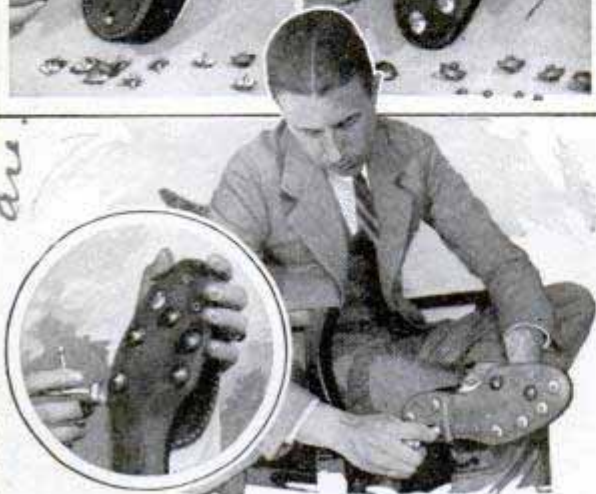
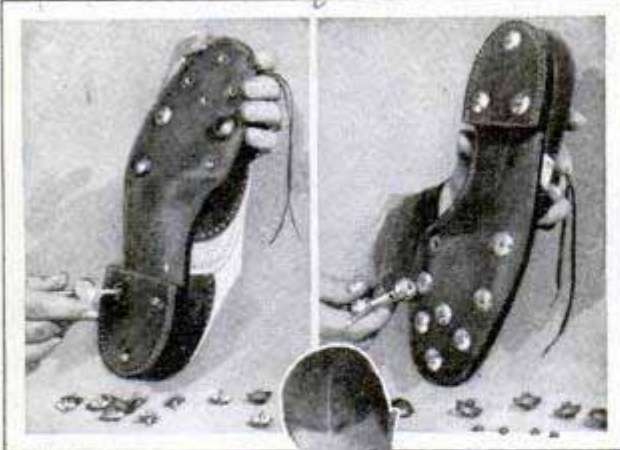

But it will not go uncharted, say the explorers, and plans are now under way for an air conquest of the rocky spire, using a flying boat from which to take photographs and records for surveyors. The peak is believed to have first been sighted in the '80's, when a route was being sought for a transcontinental railroad. Calculations showed that its height was in excess of 13,000 feet and it may even challenge Mt. Rainier's 14,400 feet, engineers believe. The difficult barriers that lie about it have taxed the hardihood of experienced mountaineers. One of the few ways of entrance is by the Homalko river, the "Terror of the North." Its muddy eddies have trapped many boatloads of equipment sent in to establish a base for expeditions that hoped to reach the top of the peak. It is proposed to name the mountain after George Dawson, a pioneer geologist.

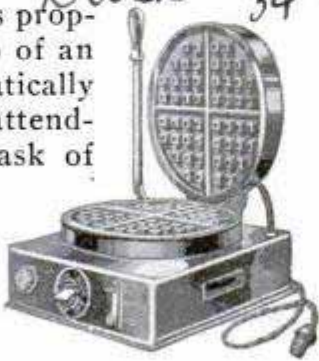

The silk special made the run from Seattle to Chicago in fifty-nine hours thirty-six minutes, slightly more than half a day under the limited schedule of seventy-two hours. The silk specials are used to get the raw material from the Pacific coast docks to eastern factories to cut down the high interest charges, which in this case amounted to \$900 daily on the 5,200 bales.

WINKER FOR AUTO STOP LIGHTS HELPS PREVENT ACCIDENTS

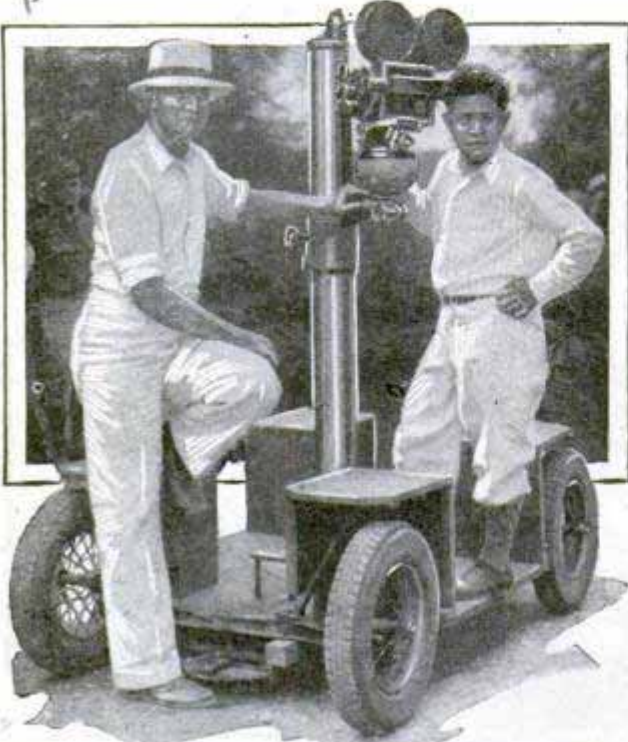

VERTICAL BLADES ON WINDMILL TO GENERATE POWER

Individual fans are set in perpendicular fashion instead of radiating from a center in a windmill a western inventor has constructed. He intends to use it for generating electric current and for irrigation purposes. An extensive surface is exposed to the wind in all directions.

CORNSTALK AS PAPER SOURCE TO HELP SAVE TIMBER

Experiments in preparing several satisfactory grades of paper from cornstalks, at Iowa state college, are held to indicate that a way may have been found to reduce the inroads on timber and to afford the farmer an income from what is now chiefly a troublesome waste and the winter abode of a destructive pest, the corn borer. The cornstalk product has been made in different

qualities from a coarse box kind up to the finer grades for writing purposes. Cooked liquors from the stalks furnish a strong adhesive material which can be used in the making of box board, in billposting and for other purposes, it is reported. It is also pointed out that the stalks require only eleven days for seasoning, whereas wood needs nine months to two years, and only one hour of cooking is necessary for corn pulp against forty-eight for wood. The stalk paper also takes ink satisfactorily without calendering and sizing.

TRACTOR OUTFIT UNLOADS CARS SAVING HAND SHOVELING

From six to eighteen cars of sand, gravel or other loose material may be unloaded in one day with a combination tractor and scraper outfit, it is claimed. The capacity depends upon the number of men in the crew and the size of the apparatus. The rigging consists principally of a frame support clamped to the side of the car and a tractor to pull the scrapers which are dragged through the car and dumped in a chute that empties into a truck at the side. When a car is unloaded, the outfit is quickly moved to another with the tractor and made ready for work in a few minutes. Only one man is required to do this. A farm tractor of common type, with simple attachments, may be used. The scrapers are so designed that they are said to pick up all the material, making it unnecessary to do any hand shoveling.

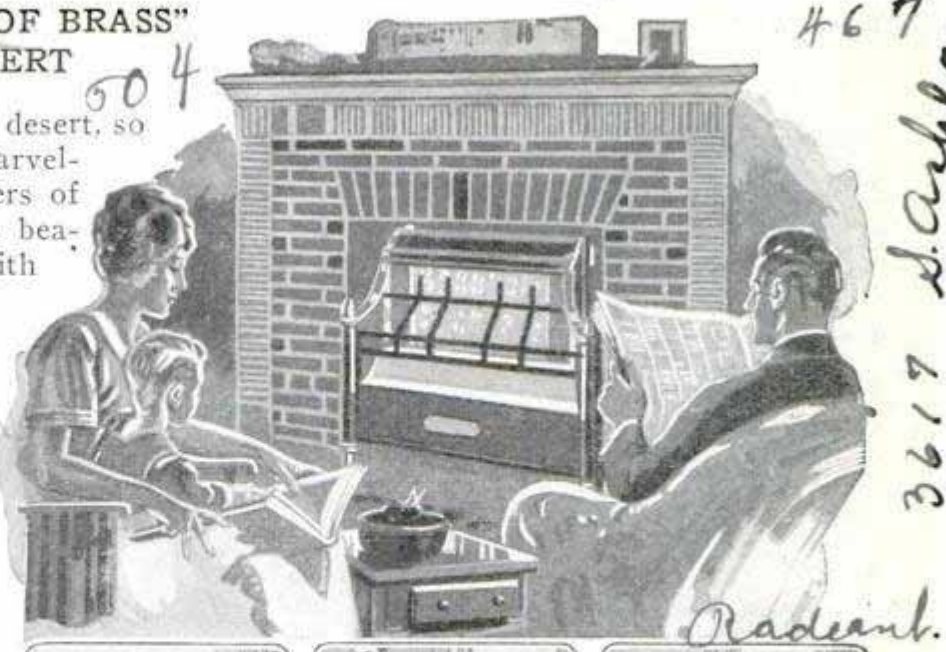

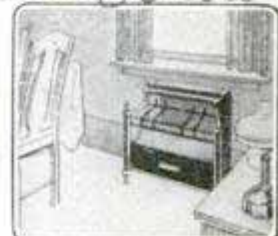
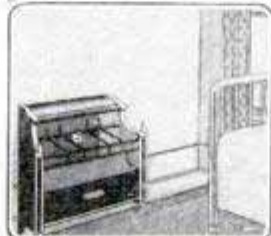
SEEK FABLED "CITY OF BRASS" IN SAHARA DESERT

Somewhere in the Sahara desert, so runs the Arab legend, is a marvelous city with two tall towers of brass that gleam like twin beacon fires in the sunshine, with walls so long that it takes a camel two days to walk around them and with twenty-five hidden entrances. The bodies of soldiers and merchantmen lie shriveled in the silent streets, for the city's residents were starved by a seven-year drought, and the drifting sands have all but covered the dwelling places. Bent on finding it, if there is such a city, a French expedition has been sent to traverse some 2,000 miles of desert paths from Tugurt to Timbuktu. Explorers believe that if this "City of Brass" is not found, others will be discovered, for the sand drifts are known to hide many a settlement whose inhabitants probably starved to death during long rainless periods, were killed by invaders or abandoned their towns for others where there was water. Many of the old tales of this kind, when sifted down, have been supported, to a degree at least, by fact. The city of Troy is no longer regarded as a myth and the cave that doubtless inspired the legend of the Minotaur has been explored. Recently, an expedition from the University of Chicago visited the "Nameless City" of the Syrian desert and photographed paintings on the walls just in time to preserve the record, for the ancient murals were obliterated by the Arabs as soon as the British troops had been withdrawn.

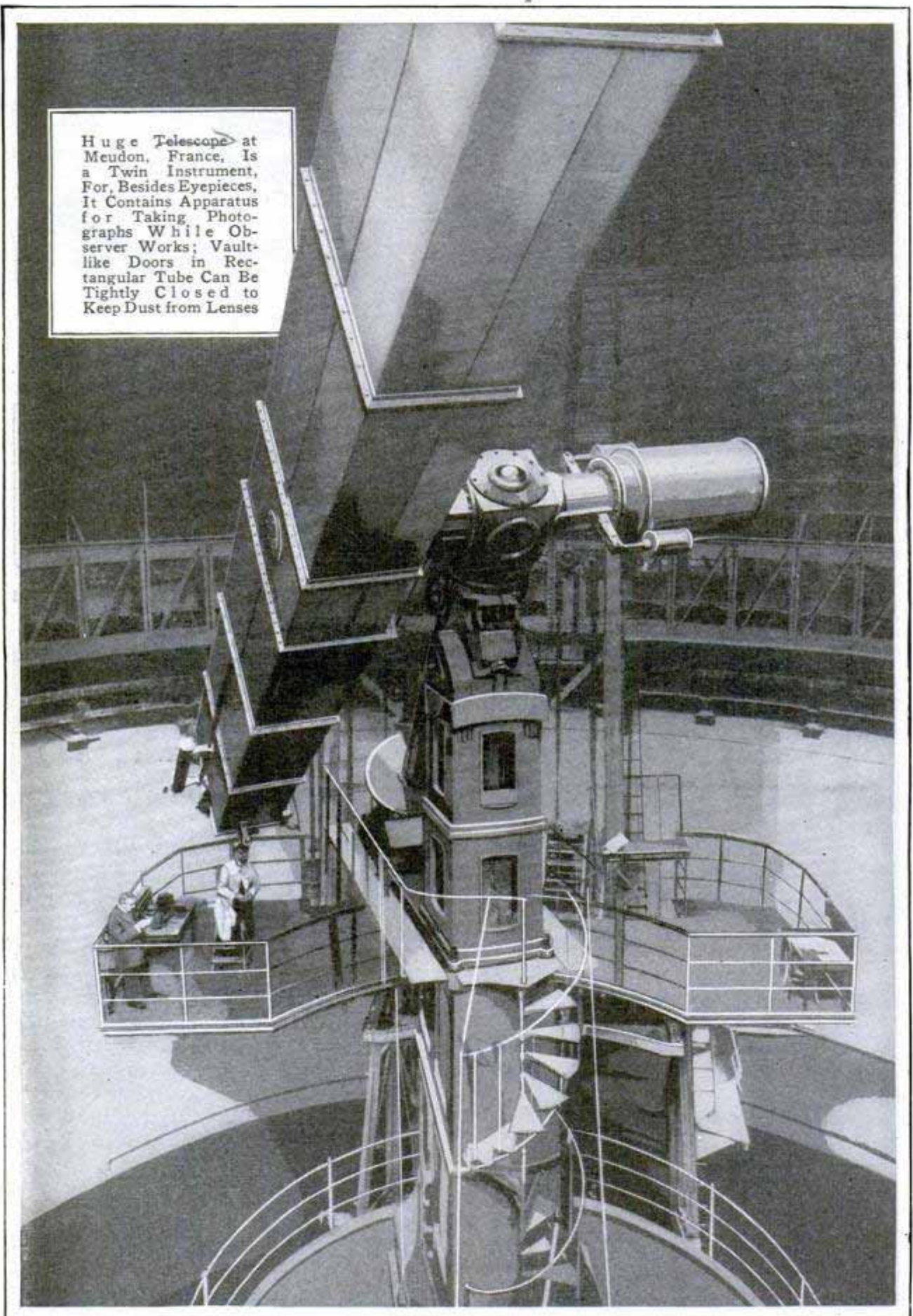

GUN HARPOONS DRIVE WHALES TO NEW HAUNTS 497

Only seventy whales were killed by a fishing company off the coasts of Mexico and Alaska this year, whereas the usual number has been around 350. The reason, experts declare, is that harpoon guns, which have reduced whaling from a romance to a business, have driven the monsters from their old haunts. Plans are being made for invasion of the new resorts next year and a floating factory has been constructed from an old ship to save time. Instead of towing the mammals to shore after capture, they will be brought back as barrels of oil, and bags of bone dust and fertilizer prepared on the traveling reduction plant.

AUTOMOBILE COTTON PICKER PROTECTS THE PLANTS 382

An automatic cotton picker which, it is claimed, will pick matured cotton without damaging the plant or the unopened bolls, has recently been placed in production. The machine is said to be the first practical cotton picker of its type. It consists of an automobile with pneumatic tires and an arched frame, from which is suspended two revolving cylinders studded with needlelike steel fingers. The cylinders are turned by the same motor that drives the machine, and timed to revolve at the same rate as that at which the outfit moves forward. In operation, the machine straddles the cotton row, with the plants passing between the two cylinders. The fingers catch and extract the fully matured cotton, revolving as they do so at a high speed on their own axles, and then, as they are withdrawn from the blooms, stripper bars remove the cotton and a suction pipe carries it to a storage compartment. The difficulty in building a picker is that it must not damage unripe bolls, since cotton matures over a period of weeks.

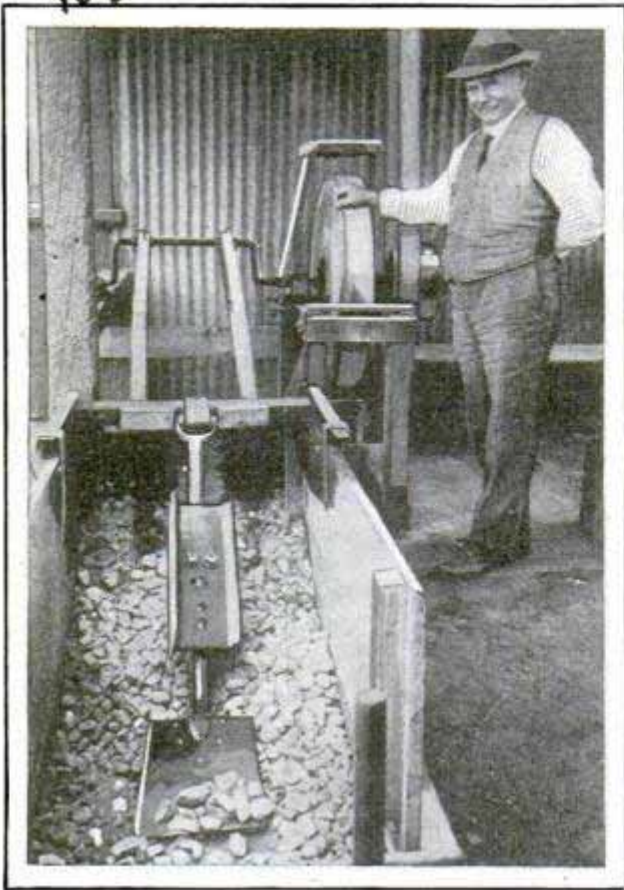

"MECHANICAL MAN" TESTS LIFE OF RAILWAY SHOVELS

To determine how long shovels used by laborers in handling rock ballast will stand up under the constant wear, the Los Angeles street railways have constructed a "mechanical man" which automatically shovels rock until the shovel is worn out. Samples, heavily weighted with railroad iron to make them dig in, are connected to a support operated by an extension of the shop grindstone shaft.

Shaped so that nails can be pulled straight up and thus kept from bending, a one-piece hammer is especially useful in opening boxes and in performing other odd jobs. To aid in this, the opposite end is shaped like a pry bar. The handle and head are made of solid steel.

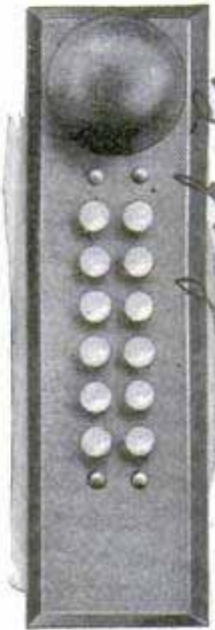

Gold is not yellow in reality, but a deep orange color, according to metallurgists. White light reflected from it gives it the familiar yellowish hue as the true color is diluted. The precious metal assumes other shades besides yellow and orange. Ground into a fine powder, pure gold becomes ruby-red. This rich color is commonly seen in the special glass used for photographic dark-room lamps.

NEW MOTORIST MORE CAREFUL THAN EXPERIENCED ONE

No matter how long a man has operated a car, he always has something to learn about careful driving, according to Thomas P. Henry, president of the American automobile association. He cites accident reports to show that the experienced driver is often a greater offender than the beginner, and that a motor pilot with ten or twelve years' training frequently develops a careless attitude, takes too great risks and, consequently, is a greater menace to public safety than the driver who is just beginning. As an example, one large city reported only twenty-three accidents that involved persons who had been driving three months or less, during the first quarter of this year, while sixty-four were registered against motorists whose experience varied from three months to a year. Those who had

driven from two to five years, and who had accidents during that first quarter period, numbered 405, while 688 were practiced operators with records of five and more years' standing. Mr. Henry made allowance for the fact that the experienced drivers are in the majority and therefore more of them would be involved in accidents, but concludes that "the preponderance of mishaps caused by the more practiced persons has but one explanation and that is simply carelessness and a tendency to take chances. The lesson for motorists is plain—'never too old to learn'."

LIGHTED ARMBAND FOR BLIND GIVES NIGHT PROTECTION

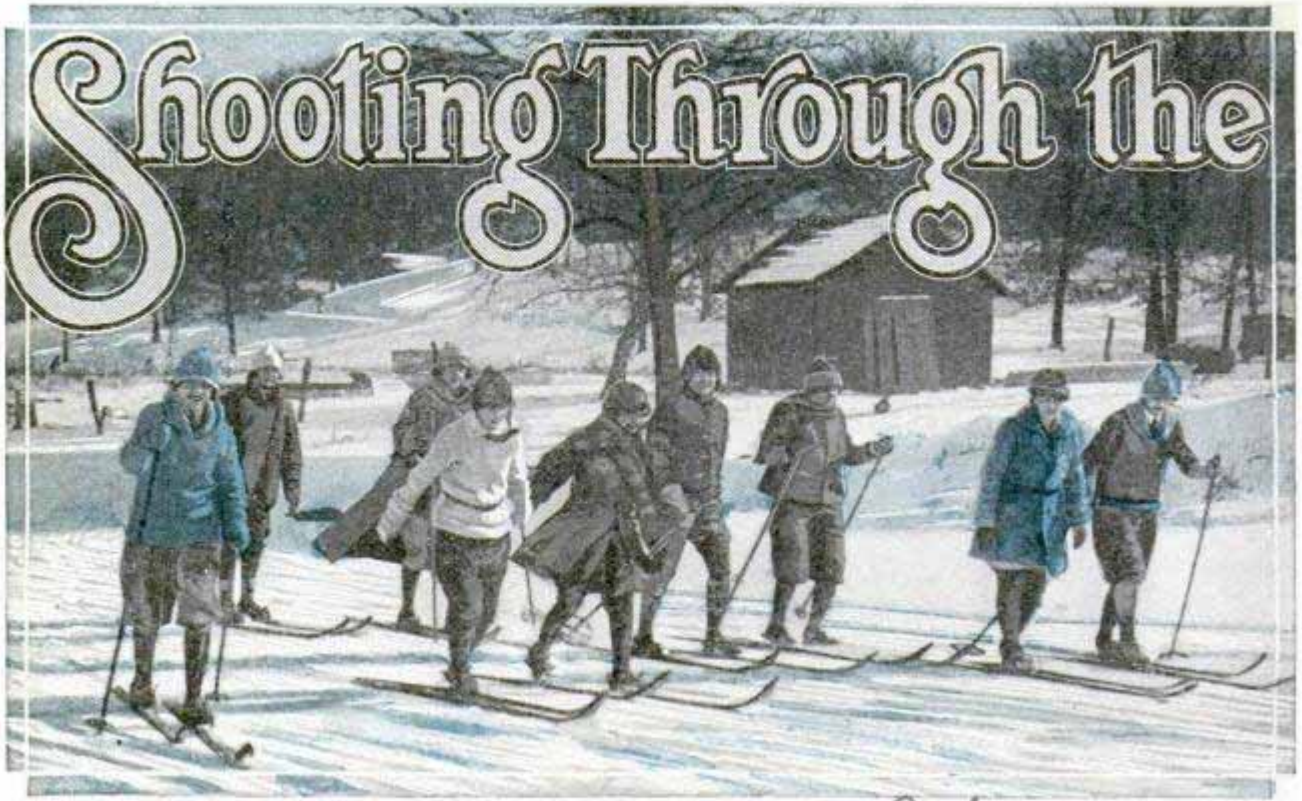

SKIING—flying through the air on a pair of wooden wings—that's the zenith of winter sports. "It's great sport—for the fellow who looks on," is the testimony of the conservative, but to the man who doesn't mind burying his nose in a ten-foot drift today, provided that he can take a ninety-foot leap into the blue air tomorrow, skiing is the king of all snow pastimes.

And if the thrills of plain skiing fail to register, why, there's ski jumping and ski kjouring. And it is most simple, safe and healthful sport, this sailing around the snow lands on a pair of wooden runners that seem to compete with the airplane for speed and thrills. It's easy to learn, and, anyway, the snow is soft!

For a moment you are poised at a giddy height, with two slender wooden runners attached to your feet. Then you let go and start gliding down the steep hillside pitched by nature at an angle of thirty or forty degrees. Faster, faster—yet faster you go until you are skimming along at airplane speed. This is rare exhilaration, flashing down the blue-white slope.

Then you come to the gentle acclivity, or take-off, which ends abruptly. Beyond that—nothing but just air. For the fraction of a second you experience a terrific upward rush as you clear the take-off that lifts you whistling through the air, hurling you for a hundred feet or more to the featherdown landing.

For the fraction of a minute you seem to hang suspended with a great white panorama of snow, blackly dotted with human beings, seemingly miles below.

Then down, down you swoop like a frightened barn swallow. A single second more, and you have landed with an impact that fairly shakes your teeth loose, drives the breath from your lungs, and you are enveloped in a great cloud of swirling powdery snow. If you are not a professional, over and over you roll, since only the skillful are able to make the landing without a fall.

No pastime has so taken the New World as skiing. Its devotees have increased by leaps and bounds in the past few years, since Nels Nelson sailed from his white Norwegian hillside clear into the hearts of Americans on his trusty skis. Everything, from the wee hill for the greenhorn to the towering featherlike snowslide for the skilled, holds forth a challenge and an invitation to come and conquer.

This is the oldest known form of all winter sports. The "gliding Finns" let their neighbors, the Norwegians and the Swedes, copy their early models, but the idea went no farther for many years, and skiing seems to have been confined to the northern lands for centuries. The opening of the Middle Ages brought warfare and fierce battles, and armies were fitted with slender wooden runners and made able to travel in all kinds of weather.

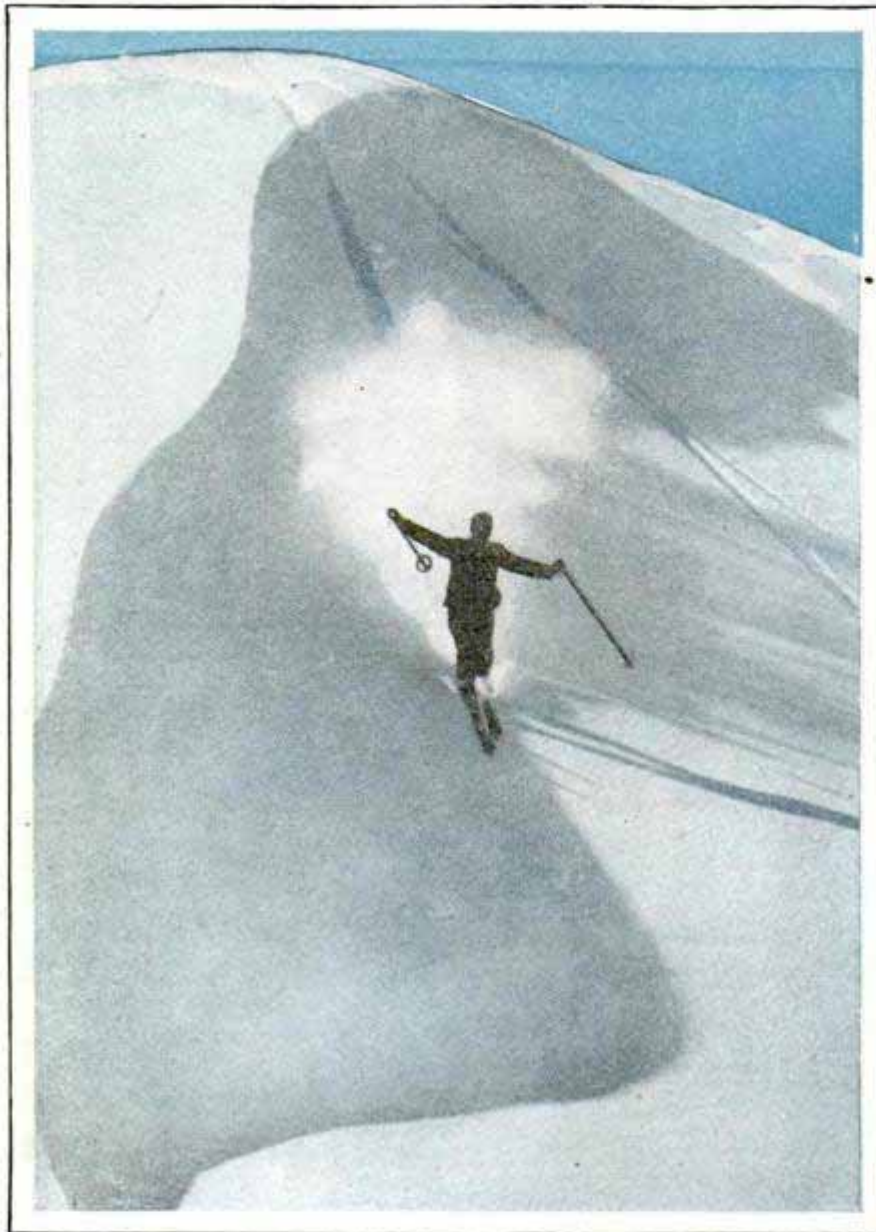
Less than a generation ago skiing was confined to the Scandinavian countries and Russia. Early in the 90's, the French consul at Kolmar appeared in front of the Feldbergerhof, at Feldberg, Germany, with a pair of skis over his shoulder and orthodox Norwegian skiing took root in the Black forest. A little later Herr Zdarsky of Lilienfeld, Austria, invented a ski and a theory of skiing all his own, and thus attracted so much attention that special trains from Vienna started, carrying devotees of the sport into the country for winter holidays. Then Paulcke introduced skiing in Switzerland and created a sensation that still persists.

Although ski contests are held in America, all the way from Revelstoke, B. C., to old Vermont, it is in Switzerland that



all kinds of the sweeping wooden slippers meet to pull off the great International Championship ski jump, in the heart of the high Alps. Henry Hall, of Detroit, made the world's record jump at Revelstoke, 229 feet, which hasn't been beaten, but he has two brothers, Carl and Clarence, who are making it hot for him to keep that title. "Bing" Anderson, of Berlin, N. H., holds the eastern-states record of 172 feet, and is rated as one of the best jumpers in that part of the country.

The skis appear to be about the most awkward of footgear, but those who have mastered the strips tell us that they are about as playful as a pair of kittens. It is the custom, when donning them for the first time, to intrust yourself to the professional teacher who takes you out to some lonely slope, far away from maddening civilization, and advises you in falling to relax every muscle in your body and let yourself go; that only by making no attempt to save yourself will you be quite safe from straining a muscle. Not quite so easy as it sounds! After you have reached the stage where you can

negotiate such little things as stone fences and tree stumps, it is time to learn the "Christiania swing," "stem turn," "Telemark turn," "herringboning," "swings," "stops," and a few other little tricks, all of which combined make a finished artist.

The knack of getting over the snow on these long runners is so easy to acquire, if the right principles are caught at first, that, at the end of a sunny afternoon's running, the ordinary person will be able to manage his skis fairly well.

The novice should start running wee slopes. The Telemark position is most popular with professionals, and is a good one to learn. One ski is held slightly in advance of the other, rear knee bent. Hold the skis closely together, and make

but one track. Carry poles with points to the rear to avoid accident.

In climbing the hill, use the herringbone method, and you will be able to travel much faster than you could walk. Turn the points of the skis outward and tips of inside edges downward. One ski should be slightly above the other. The wider the angle formed by the two diverging skis, the firmer the grip. By lifting each ski in turn over the other, the runner can move straight up the slope as fast as his energy permits. Lean toward the hill and plant the skis firmly.

In climbing steep slopes, use the "traversing" method. Heading diagonally up the hill, lift the upper ski forward and upward, then bring the other up beside it.

Complete control of skis means mastery of two methods of turning or swinging at full speed, either the Telemark or the Christiania. The first is usually found easiest in right-hand swings.

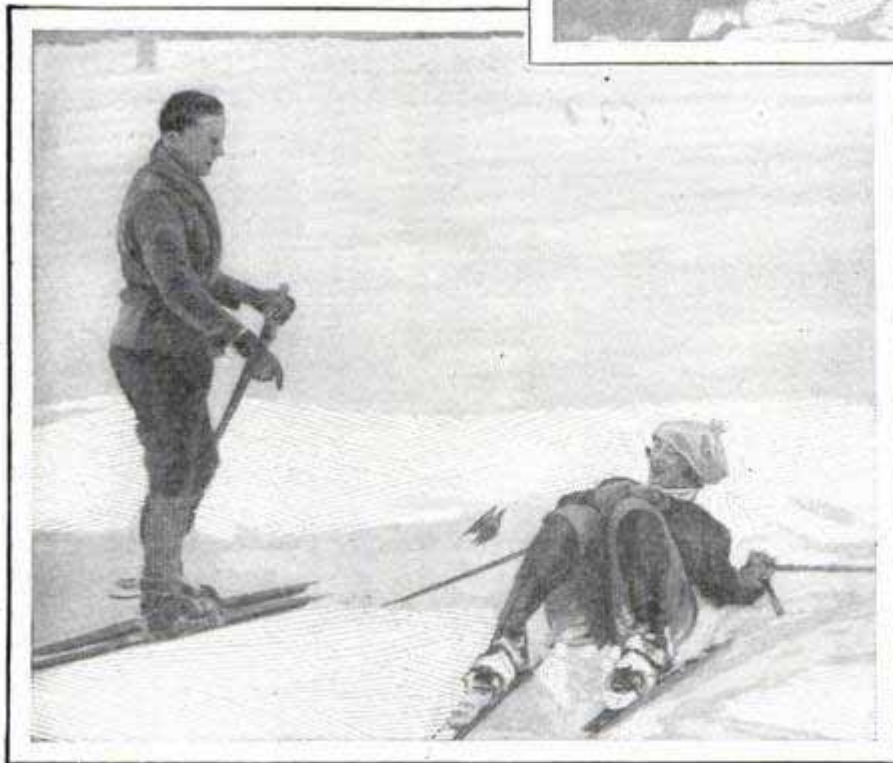
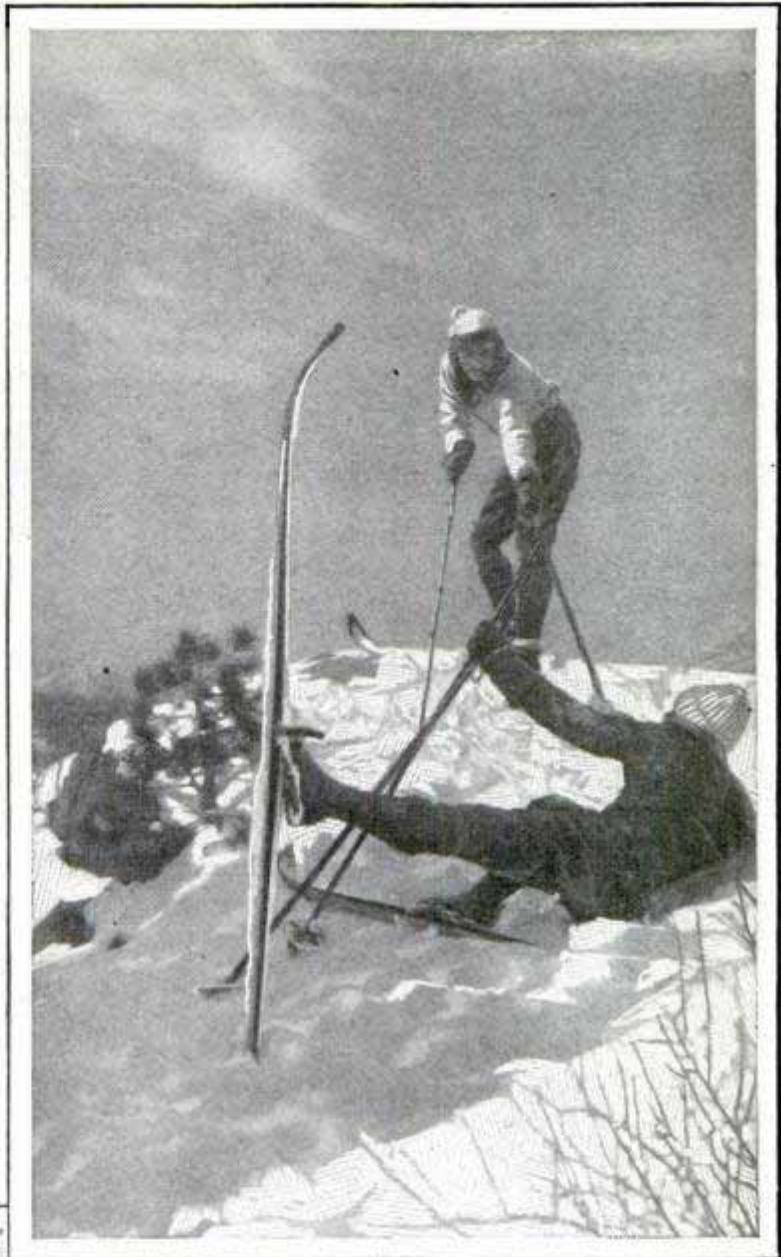
The outer ski leads in making the right turn; to turn to left, the right ski is pushed forward until the foot is opposite the point of the left ski. Place weight on the forward ski, with body inclined forward and left knee bent deeply. Turn the right or leading ski inward, or "edge" it, and press sharply outward on right heel. The leading ski will swerve to the left, followed by the unweighted left ski. Continued pressure brings the skier to a full stop, facing uphill.

In the Christiania swing, the inner ski leads. Headed down the slope, advance the right ski slightly. When you wish to turn, shift the weight quickly to the right ski, edge it and twist sharply to the right, leaning toward the hill, somewhat in the

manner of making a sudden stop in skating. Put the pressure on the heel of the ski. This turn is valuable for a quick swing on snow too smooth or hard-packed for the Telemark.

The principal braking movements used to reduce speed on steep and uncertain descents are the "snowplow" and the Telemark. The first is done by placing the skis with points together and heels separated as far as possible. Both skis are edged inward, and the degree to which they are edged determines the braking effect. This leads to a turn, for, by shifting the weight to either ski, the skier is bound to follow that ski into a turn in the opposite direction. The right ski, being pointed inward, will run to the left if weighted; the other is sure to follow.

The Telemark brake is used for very steep slopes, and consists in placing one ski, edged inward, across in front of the other at right angles. The skier runs on the second ski with knee deeply bent and brakes himself with the first ski.

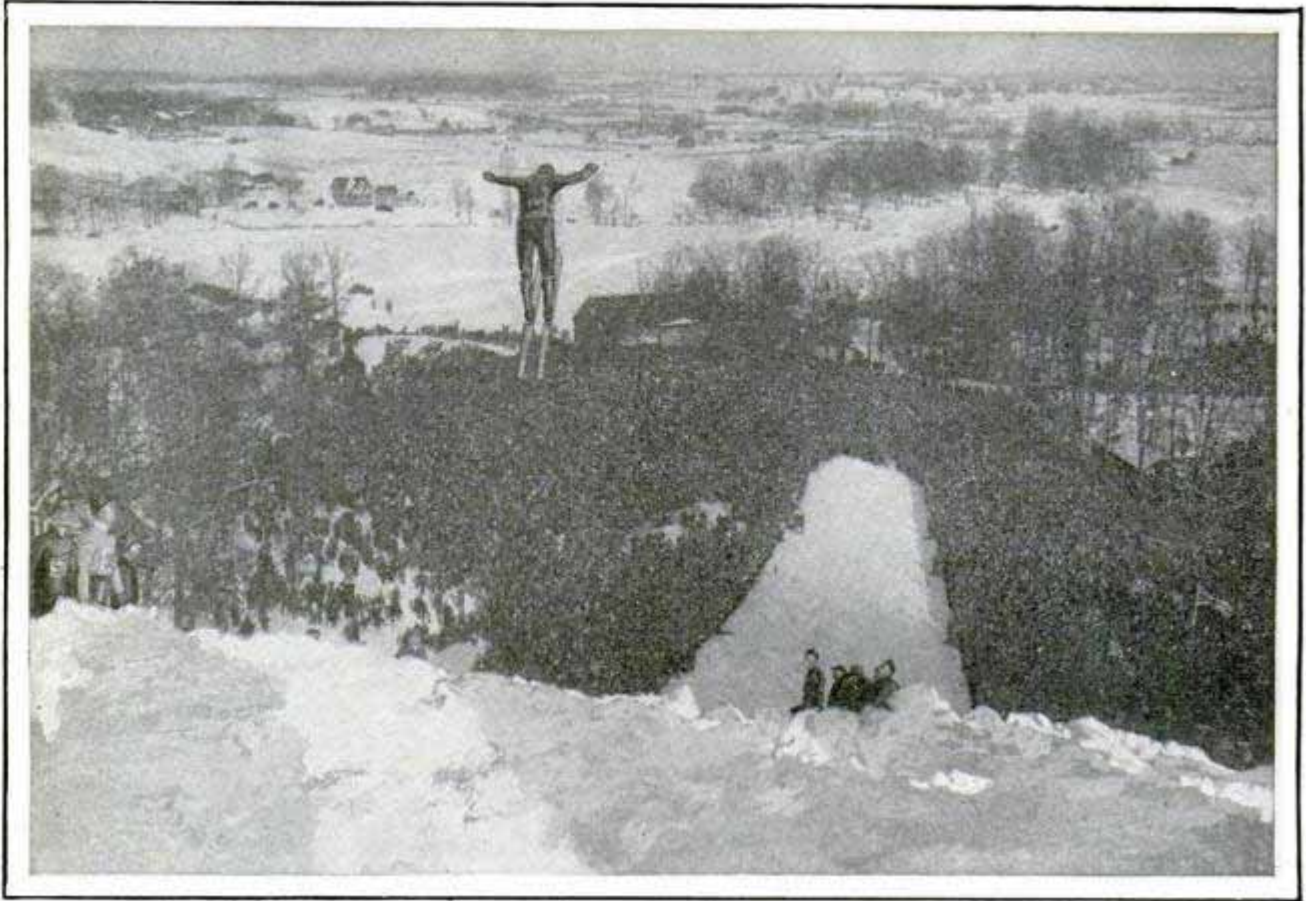

Jumping consists of two very important elements—spring and balance—each of which governs the form so prized by professionals. Judges rate form equally with distance in jumping contests.

Running in the Telemark position, the jumper bends quickly when a few yards from the take-off, pressing the knees firmly to-

gether with his hands extended at the level of his ankles. Just before reaching the lip of the take-off, he makes his "satz" or leap by snapping stiffly erect and a little forward, at the same time swinging his arms up sharply. Heels should not leave the skis, toes are pressed downward, skis held parallel and body inclined forward as the jumper takes to the air.

During flight, the skier should move his body constantly forward to conform to the angle of the slope below. In landing, the skis should be held together and the knees bent slightly. Upon feeling the snow, the jumper should push one ski ahead slightly, and run in the Telemark position, rising to an erect position as soon as his balance is assured.

Successful ski jumping calls for a fair degree of muscular co-ordination, joined with abundant spirit and nerve, and the many points which every skier will pick up only after exercise.

A spectacular pastime is ski kjoing. This is performed on a frozen lake covered with a few inches of snow. A trained horse fitted with a specially constructed light harness is driven by an expert skier,

who stands a few feet behind. He holds the whiffletree with one hand and with the other guides the horse by the reins. Very exciting races are run, usually against time, which are as thrilling to the skier as to the spectators.

**NERVE-RACKING NOISE ENDED
522 WITH GUN SILENCER**

Originally devised to muffle the explosions of firearms, the Maxim silencer has been adapted to oil-electric locomotives to help eliminate some of the nerve-racking din of peace-time industry. It is now in use on eight American railroads and is said to have been developed to such a high degree of efficiency that the noise of the exhaust may be heard only faintly within a dozen feet of the engine. The silencer was greatly modified for this service, and several months were required to adapt it. The attachment is on top of the locomotive and traps the exhaust in such a way that the energy of the sound waves is absorbed before they reach the outlet, but there is said to be no interference with the release of gases to the atmosphere.

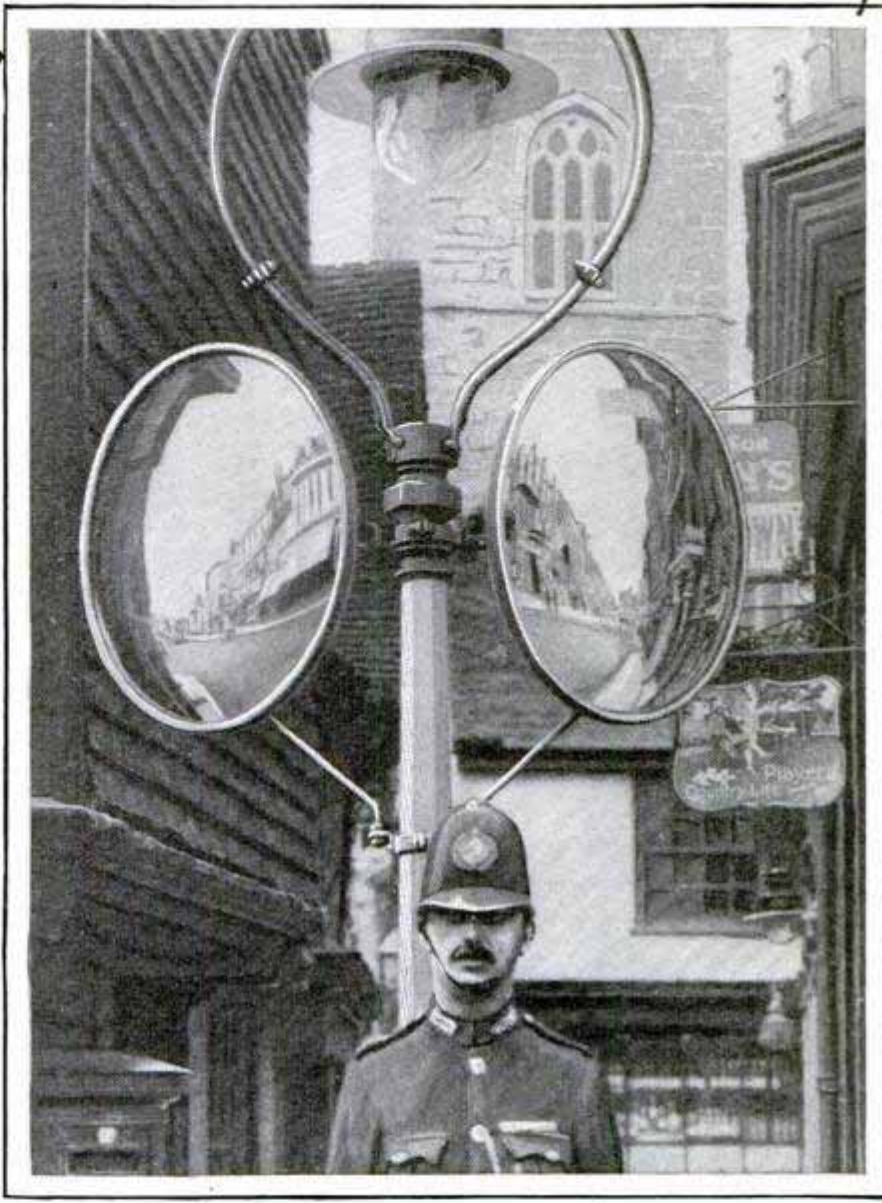

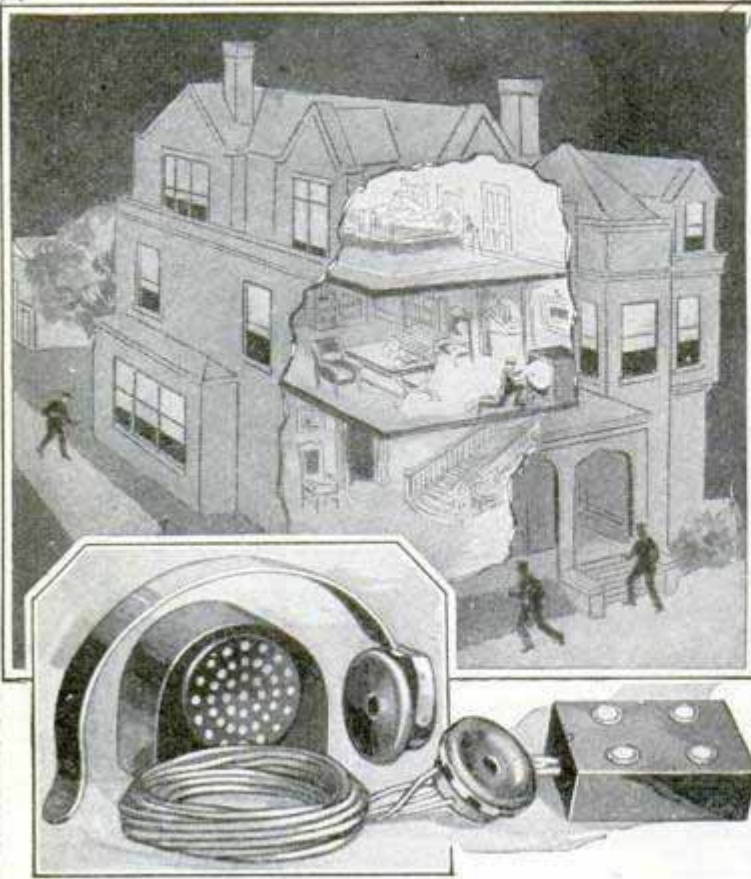

MICROPHONE GUARD FOR HOME DETECTS THIEVES

For houses, factory grounds, farms or large buildings, a set of sensitive sound detectors, connected to a central listening unit, enables the proprietor or watchman to locate almost instantly any intrusion. Each microphone is incased in a pressed-steel receptacle and may be concealed about the rooms. Wires connect with a central key box. By pressing one button after another, the entire premises may be patrolled. In case of a burglar's visit, for instance, he could be located and every movement plainly detected even to footsteps on a carpeted floor, it is said.

WHITE ANTS MENACE WOOD IN BUILDINGS

White ants, or termites, annually cause enormous damage to buildings throughout the United States as the result of placing untreated wood in contact with the ground. A large Catholic church in Illinois was closed last year when it was discovered that four carved wooden pillars, supporting the roof, had been eaten

out from the inside until a mere shell was left. Only the absence of heavy snows during the previous winter had prevented collapse of the roof. The ants can only enter and live in a building where wood which has not been treated is in contact with moist soil. If the sills are impregnated with creosote the ants will not gnaw their way in, while cement, brick or stone foundations under the sills offer even better protection. If present, the termites soon dry up and die.

AIR-VALVE GEAR SHIFT FOR MOTOR CARS

Auto gears are shifted by pressing a little attachment on the steering column instead of by the usual lever in an arrangement developed by eastern inventors. It utilizes suction from the motor intake manifold, creating a vacuum in two small cylinders attached to the top of the gear box. Air valves are so adjusted that the desired speed shift is made the instant the driver presses down the clutch pedal. Successful tests have been made with the installation on 600 cars of twenty-six makes, according to reports. It is said that the gears cannot be stripped when using this attachment.

SMALL MODELS GROW INTO GRAND OPERA SCENES

Weeks before an audience witnesses a new performance of the Chicago Civic Opera company, the scenes have been critically inspected in miniature settings fashioned by Julian Dove, art director, in the

cars from all over the country. No one railroad has enough of the long cars to carry all the property. Besides the collection of model stages, the studio building houses most of the company's \$7,000,000

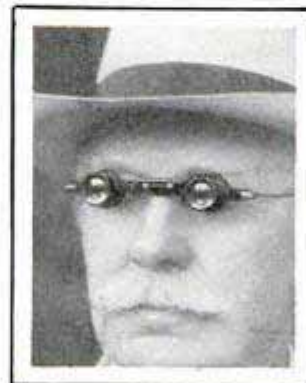

company's huge studio and property building. Each model is constructed on a scale of a quarter of an inch to the foot and is complete in details even to coloring and the arrangement and costuming of the actors, who are represented by realistic little dolls. These tiny originals are the real beginnings of the elaborate productions on the big stage, for they serve as guides for the carpenters and other craftsmen who simply enlarge upon these first patterns. A miniature stage and its setting costs \$200 or more, depending upon its character, so that \$1,000 is not an unusual sum to pay for first casting an opera in these diminutive molds. The expense is considered justified because it saves later errors that would be far more costly to correct. Each model can be lighted so that the actual effect of the finished scene can be studied. In fashioning the sets, the artists must also keep in mind that the drops and other pieces will have to be moved quickly by scene shifters and that they must be collapsible so that they can be packed away when the company goes on tour. To hold the huge drop curtains and other equipment, the longest baggage cars in the country are pressed into service and the making up of a train for the opera requires a special call for

worth of equipment, the electrical, carpenter, wig-making and metal-plating shops where the armor and other trappings are made, besides a vast studio where the scenes are painted. A big rehearsal room that can quickly be converted into a working stage also occupies the structure. Not many persons realize that a small menagerie is a necessary part of the opera company's equipment. A meek and lowly donkey is a feature of "Pagliacci," geese are needed in "Koenigs-kinder" and a goat performs in "Dinorah."

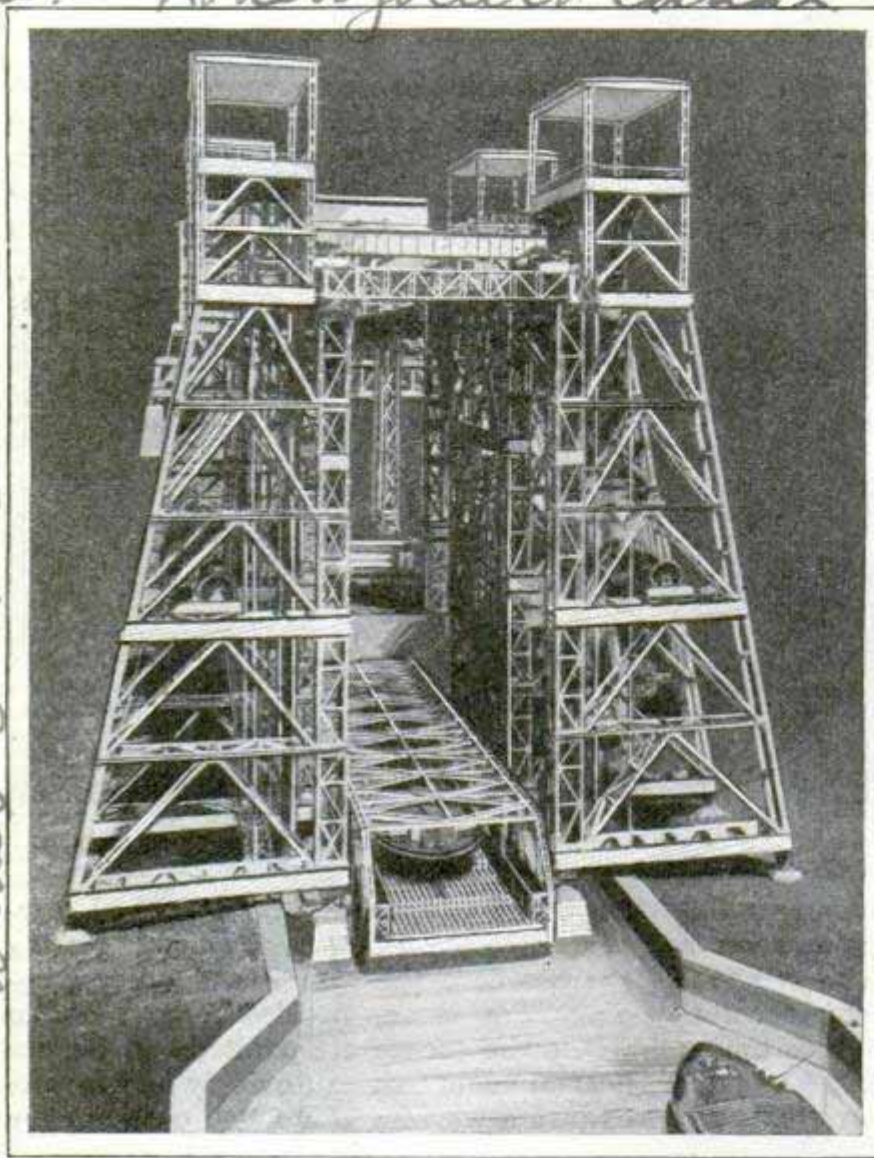

ELEPHANT MARKET FEELS HIGH COST OF LIVING

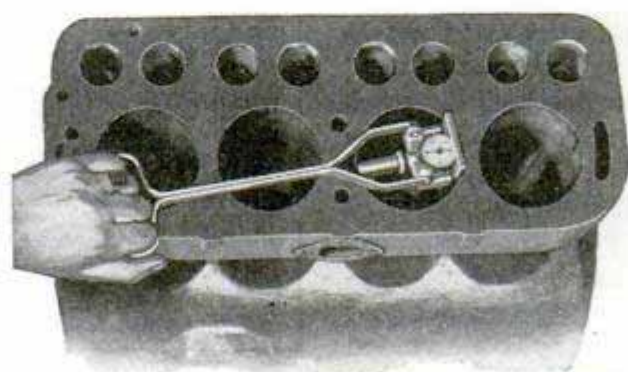

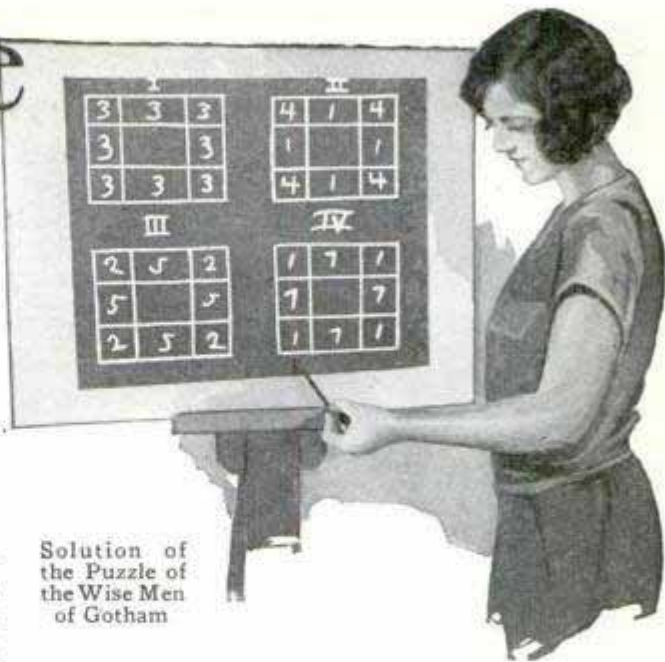

The Magic Lure of Numbers

THERE is a story told about the "Wise Men of Gotham," who had a school with twenty-four pupils. They built a schoolhouse in the form of a hollow square, with eight classrooms surrounding a playground. In each of the eight rooms they placed three of the twenty-four pupils, and it was a simple matter then to check up and see that all the boys were studying, for the wise men had only to count and make sure there were nine boys in the three rooms on each side of the school.

But four of the pupils slipped out just after a check, and on the next round the wise men still found nine boys on each side! And then the four came back and brought four friends, and still there were nine on each side. Soon four more friends dropped in—and yet there were only nine on each side, though now there were actually thirty-two instead of twenty-four boys in the school.

Figures, some one once said, do not lie, but they apparently tell some pretty large untruths, as you can see when you examine the photographic solution of this puzzler.

There is no end to the marvels that can be performed with numbers, to the amusement and mystification of your friends. From the simple proof, by algebra, that two is equal to one, to an equally simple method of becoming a multimillionaire in one month by saving your money, you can furnish an entire evening of amusement.

The problem of getting rich in thirty days requires only that you save one cent the first day, two the second, four the third, and so on, doubling the amount each day during the month. The saving gets a bit hard toward the end of the thirty days—particularly on the thirtieth, when the amount to be saved will be more than \$5,000,000—but your total wealth at the end of the month will be more than ten and three-quarter million dollars.

Another equally famous demonstration of the enormous totals reached by geometrical progressions is to ask for a position for one year, offering to work the first week for one cent, the second for two, the third for four, and so on for fifty-two weeks. Most any employer, who hasn't previously fallen for the same offer, would



With Fifteen Checkers, Can You Force an Opponent to Take the Last One by Drawing One, Two or Three?



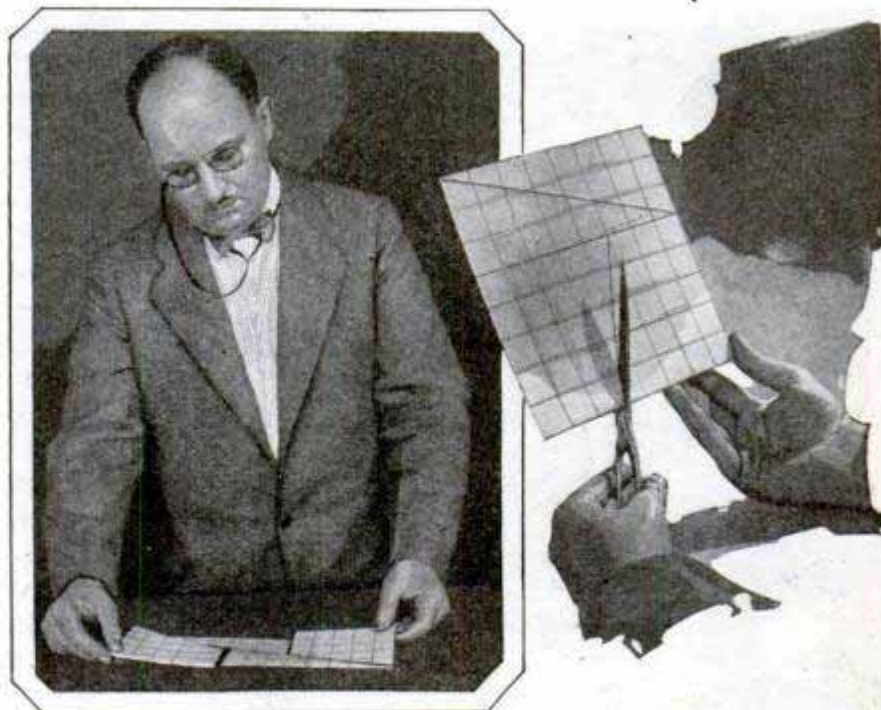
Here Is a Rectangle of Paper Whose Apparent Surface Increases Several Square Inches as the Parts Are Moved

be willing to accept such a seemingly reasonable proposition. If he does, however, be sure and insist on a bond for the final week's salary, for your pay for that one week alone would be some 1,500 times the total of all the money in the world, while the grand total for the year would be more than 40,000 billion dollars. There is a simple method, by the way, of obtaining the total of a column of such progressions, without the bother of adding the long list of figures. Simply multiply the last number by two and subtract the first. For example, the

progression, starting from 1, would be 2, 4, 8, 16, 32, 64, 128, etc. Adding the figures given makes a total of 255, whereas if you multiply the final number by 2, you get 256, and subtracting the first number gives 255, the actual total of the series.

There are a number of interesting arithmetic puzzles. One can be performed with fifteen counters—checkers, poker chips, matches or any small articles that are available. Announce to a friend that you will each withdraw one, two or three at a time, and that you will force him to take the last counter. You start the game by withdrawing one or more—the number is not important; then your opponent does the same, and so on, alternating draws. The only thing necessary is to see that on your next to the last draw you leave five counters, then, no matter what he draws, you can take away enough the next time to leave only one.

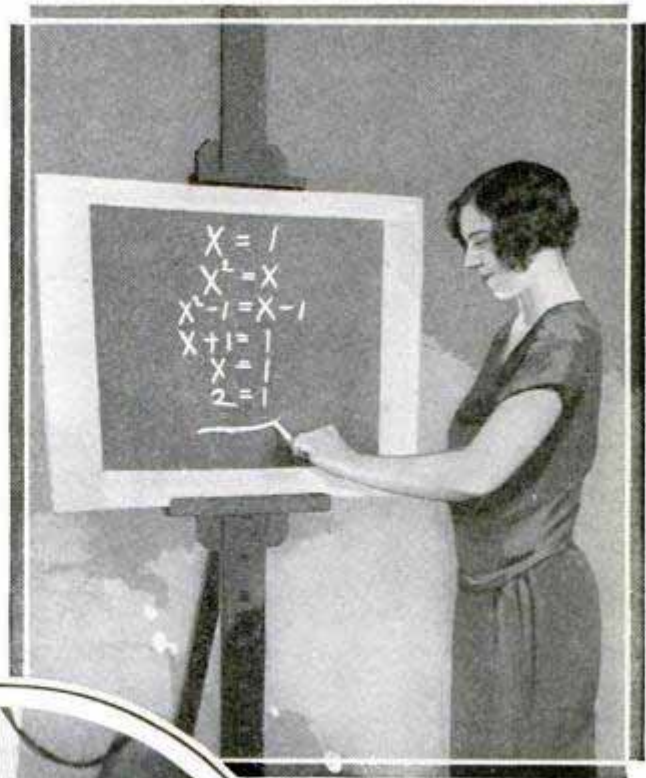
Another puzzle, which has several variations, is performed with thirty counters. The story connected with the puzzle is that there were fifteen Christians and



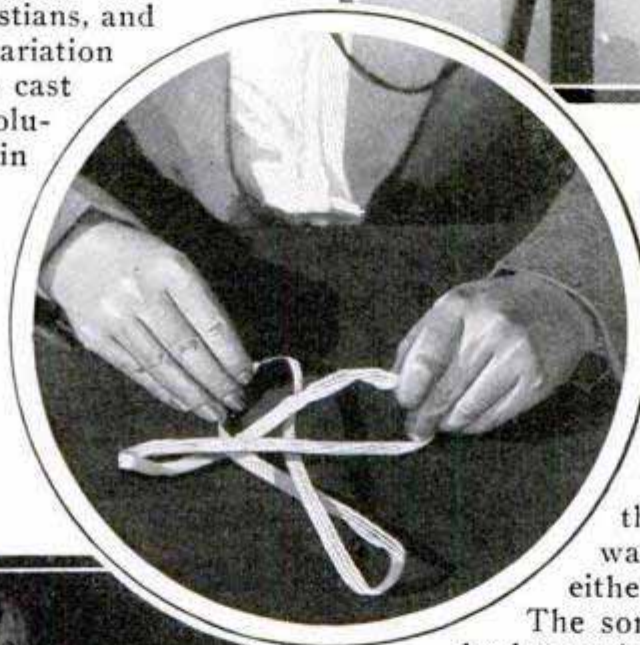
This Shows How to Cut a Square of Paper So That Sixty-Four Square Inches Can Be Rearranged to Cover a Space One Inch Larger

fifteen Turks on a ship at sea when a storm arose and the captain announced that half the passengers would have to be thrown overboard. It was agreed that all should form a ring and, starting from a designated spot, every ninth man should be cast into the sea. When the work was over it was found that the fifteen Christians were left and all the Turks had been counted out. The puzzle, and this is where the checkers come in, is to find in what order the thirty were placed. It can be determined by laying the thirty pieces in a ring, picking a starting point, and then counting to the ninth piece, marking it with a "T" for Turk, and so on until fifteen have been marked. The other fifteen will be the Christians. The solution will be found to be four Christians, five Turks, then two Christians, and so on. In another variation every tenth man was cast overboard, and the solution can be reached in the same way.

The puzzle of the Arab, his three sons and his seventeen camels dates back in history as far as that of the thirty passengers at sea. According to the story, the Arab died and left a



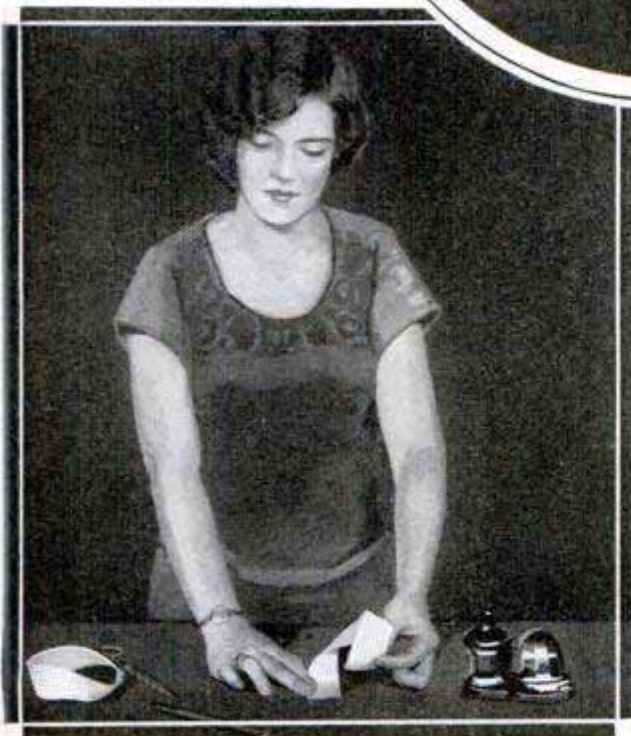
Above Is the Apparent Proof, by Algebra, That Two Equals One, While at the Left and Below Is an Interesting Trick Performed with Paper



will stating the eldest son should have half his camels, the second son one-third and the third one-ninth—but the number seventeen was not divisible by either two, three or nine.

The sons solved the problem by borrowing another camel from a neighbor. That made eighteen, and the eldest son took nine as his half, the next took six as his third, and the youngest took two as his ninth—a total of seventeen—and the borrowed camel was returned to the neighbor. The secret of the puzzle lies in the fact that one-half, one-third and one-ninth, when added make seventeen-eighteenths, instead of the whole of the father's wealth.

Mathematicians have been able to prove most of the problems submitted to them, but there is one for which no mathematical proof has ever been devised, and that is why a map maker need use but four colors to print his maps. The fact has been known for centuries, but no one has ever determined a method by which it could

 be proved. If you try drawing you will soon find that it is impossible to draw any figure of five districts each of which touches the other four, the only circumstance under which more than four colors would be necessary to mark the divisions.

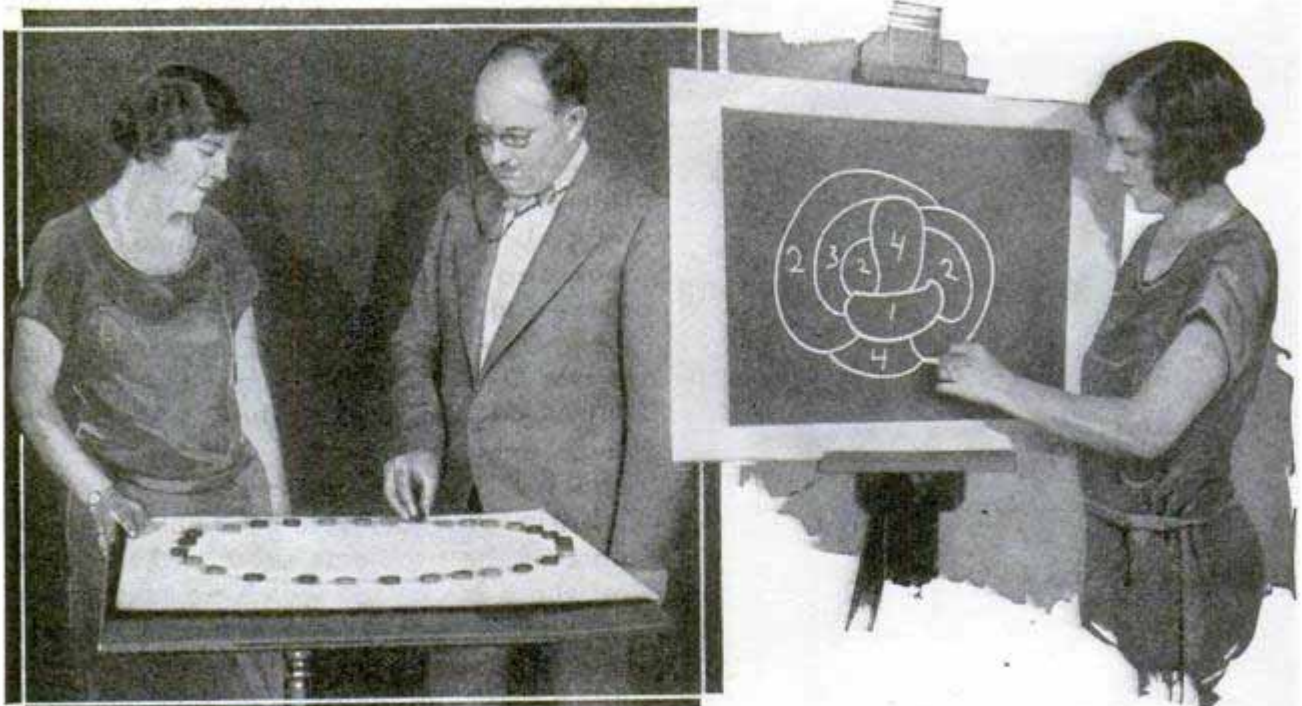
While you are practicing drawing, there is an equally old catch problem that can be tried. The story with it is that a ship had a five-by-thirteen-inch hole in its bottom, and the only board the ship's carpenter could find with which to make repairs measured eight by eight inches. The hole was sixty-five square inches in area and the board only sixty-four, but the carpenter knew how to saw it up to add a square inch to its surface.

It seems impossible, but if you will lay out a square of eight units to a side—quarter or half inches will do as well as inches—and then cut it in four pieces you will find you can reassemble the parts in a five-by-thirteen-inch rectangle. Measure down three units from the top, and cut across on that line. Next draw a diagonal from corner to corner of this three-by-eight piece and cut it into two triangles. Now measure three units from the corner along the top of the larger piece, and three units from the opposite corner along the bottom edge, connect the two points with a line and cut. Finally reassemble the four pieces, as shown in one of the

illustrations, and you have your sixty-five-unit rectangle made out of sixty-four square units of paper.

What actually happens, of course, is that the parts do not fit together, but the variation is so slight that it is almost unnoticeable.

Another equally interesting mathematical untruth can be told with a paper eleven by thirteen inches—or smaller units, if desired—in size. Draw a diagonal from one corner to the other, cut the paper into two triangles and lay them down, in their original position. Now shift the top one one unit up. The original paper contained 143 square inches, but you now have—apparently—a square twelve by twelve inches, plus two triangles, each of one half unit, or a total of 145 square inches. Shift the top triangle another unit, and you have a square of 143 inches, plus two whole and four half squares, or 147 square inches in all. Shift it another unit and you have a square—apparently—of ten by fourteen inches, plus six whole and six half squares—or a total of 149 square inches. By this time you will have discovered what is wrong—the original paper not being a square, the diagonal on which it was cut did not form a forty-five-degree angle, and so, after you have progressed a couple of squares you discover the lines don't match, and that your seem-

ing square is not a perfect one.

The old trick of finding a secret number, is one of the many puzzles of arithmetic that appear hard, but are really easy. Ask someone to fix on a number, tell him to double it, add four to that sum, multiply the whole by five, add twelve to that product, and multiply the whole by ten. Then have him deduct 320 from the final figure, and tell you the remainder, and immediately you tell him his original number. To get it you simply cut off the last two figures of the total he told you, and the number remaining is the one he started with.

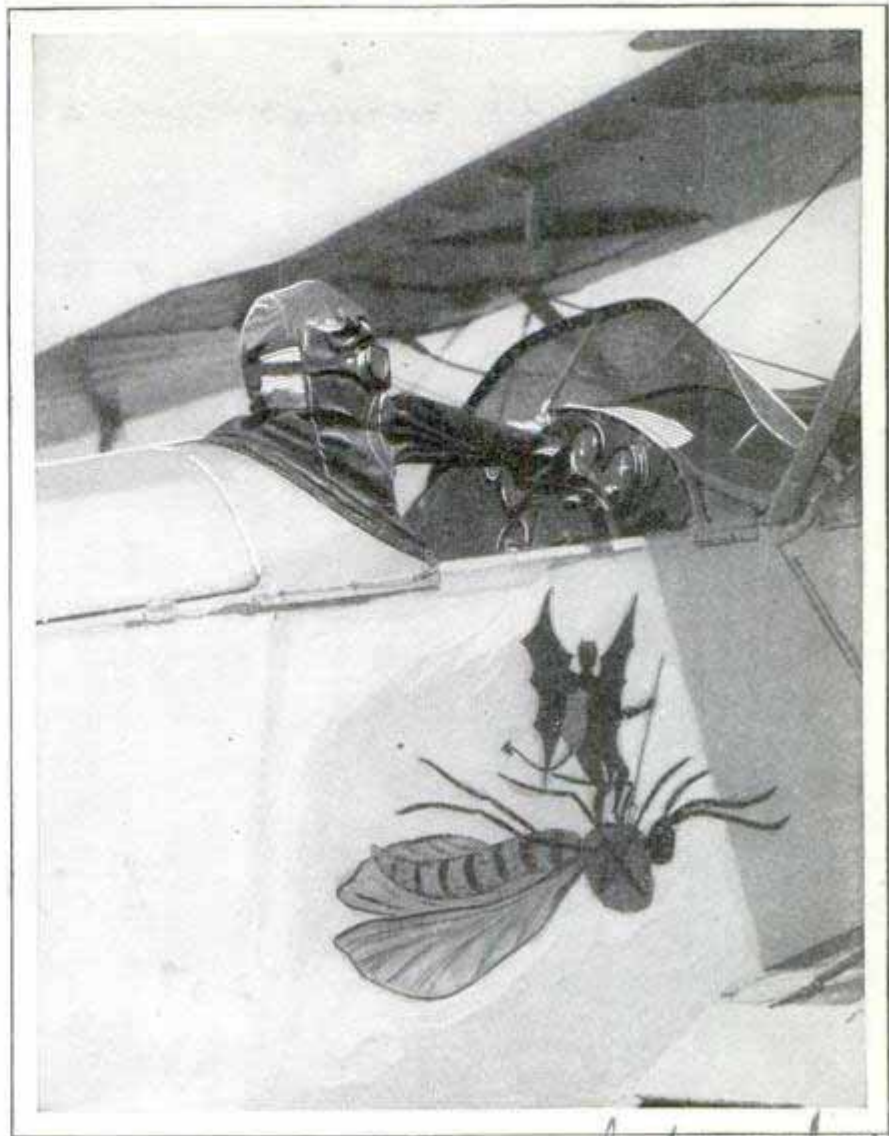
Another puzzle with a mathematical twist can be performed with a strip of paper and a pair of shears. Cut a strip, say two inches wide, from the side of a sheet of paper and paste the ends together, first twisting the paper once, as shown in one of the illustrations. Then start cutting down the center of the strip, and ask someone, as you proceed, how many pieces of paper you will have at the finish. The natural answer would be two, but as a matter of fact, because of the twist, you will have but one. Then start cutting again and repeat the question. When you finish the cut you may be surprised yourself at the result, for there will be two rings, but linked together.

AIRPLANE WAR ON MOSQUITOES WAGED BY MARINES

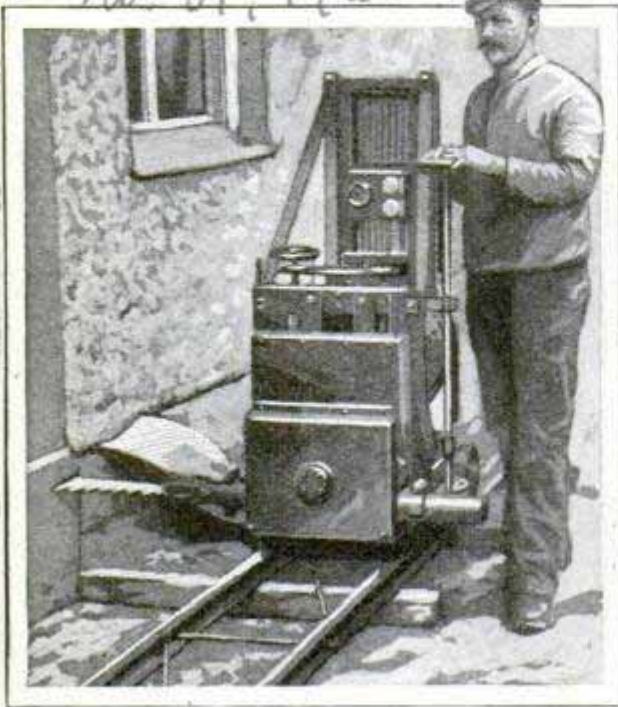

Motor-Driven Saw That Cuts Stone Buildings to Make Room for an Insulating Line against Dampness

In order to save old stone or brick buildings threatened with ruin by dampness, a new method of drying them permanently has been developed in Germany. Use is made of a special electrically driven saw which can be set to cut the walls a suitable distance from the ground but below the flooring. The cuts are made at intervals of one and one-half to two feet. The slits, about one-half inch wide, are cleaned thoroughly and an "insulation plate" put in, the free-hanging part of the walls being supported by steel wedges while this is done. The still remaining interstices are filled with neat-cement grout. The rest of the wall is then treated in the same manner until there is a continuous layer all around the building which no dampness from the ground can penetrate. As in ordinary construction, the upper part is dried out by the usual means. Even mold is removed entirely by this method, it is reported. The success of the plan indicates that it will no longer be necessary to

condemn old buildings that are beginning to fall apart largely because of moisture. The Holy Ghost church in Munich was saved by this means, as was an ancient hunting lodge not far from the city.

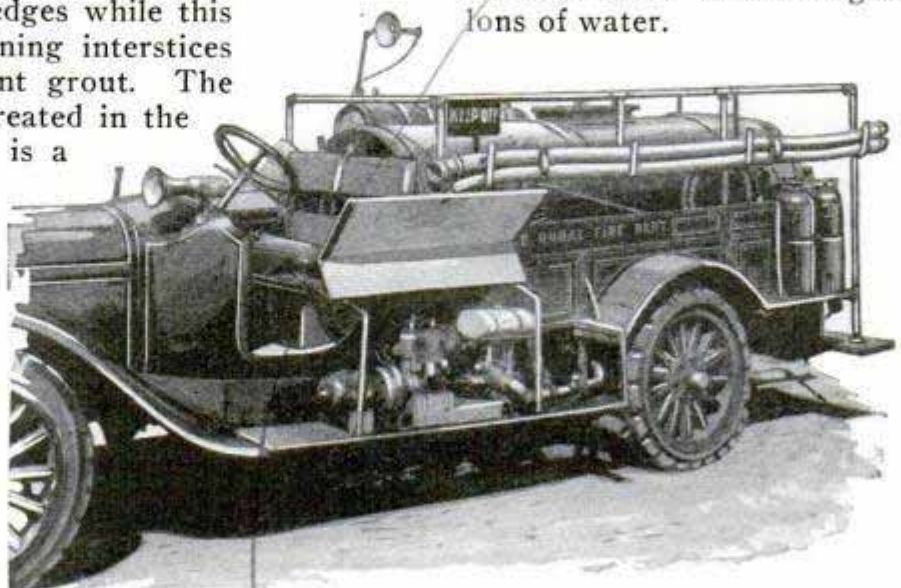
Like many other sections, the northern part of Europe passed through an unusually severe winter last season. From October until late in the spring, extremely low temperatures prevailed over the Baltic and the gulfs of Bothnia and Finland were frozen over, taking on the appearance of polar regions. Varying winds broke the solid ice and formed the floes into hummocks of enormous size. At one time, some fifteen steamers bound for Leningrad, were firmly locked in the Gulf of Finland, and others were bound along the eastern shore of the Baltic, off Esthonia. An ice breaker had to open several channels to release the vessels.

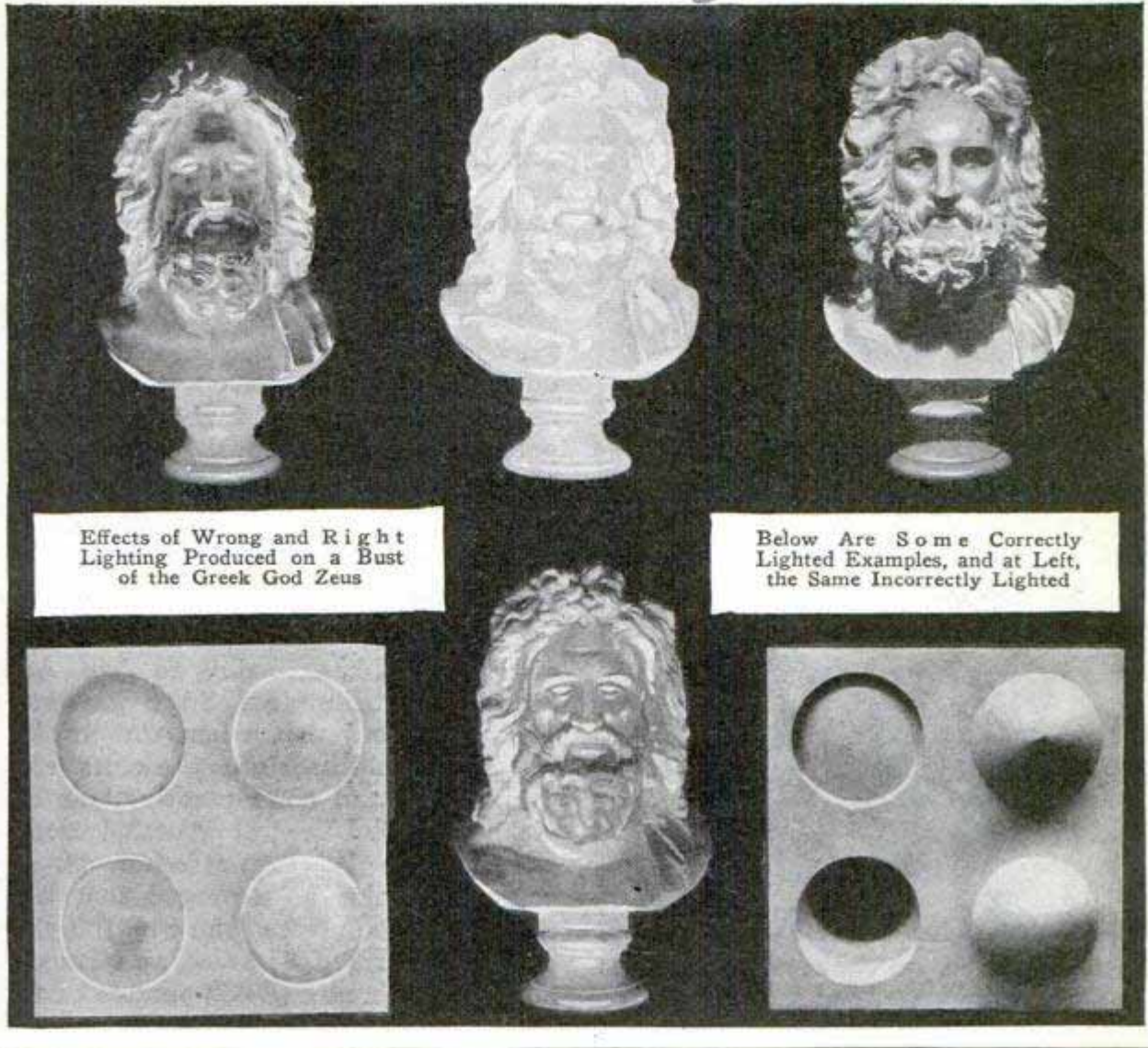


Fire Truck Used to Extinguish Fires in Rural Districts

Correct placing of lights to bring out the best effects of your furniture and ornaments is being given considerable study by lighting engineers. The wide range of results that can be obtained by incorrectly and correctly placed lights is demonstrated by photographs of such deeply carved figures as the famous Zeus of Otricoli. With every moving of the light the camera records a different impression of the face. Strong glare lights cause it to lose detail; lighting from below puts shadows where they shouldn't be, with consequent alteration of the features, and cross lighting robs the bust of its best lines. Only when lighted at a certain angle from above do the shadows of the eyes, nose and beard fall naturally to bring out the beauty of the carving. A similar test can be made by photographing panels of recesses and

projecting ornaments. Correct shadowing is necessary to bring out their shape, and when the lights and shadows are wrong, the camera, and the eye too, get an entirely erroneous impression. Generally paintings, busts and other ornaments on the walls and mantelpiece appear to best advantage when lighted from in front and above. This is particularly true in paintings and sculpture where the artist worked by sunlight, since his shadow effects naturally follow those laid by the sun. If the artificial light is placed to duplicate the location of the sun you bring out the high lights and shadows the artist saw in the original. Busts and other objects placed on top of bookcases or mantelpieces and lighted from in front or below by floor lamps seldom appear to good advantage.

HELMET FOR SHALLOW DIVING AIDS IN SHIP REPAIRS

Explorations on the sea bottom to a depth of 100 feet are within the reach of amateur divers by means of a helmet and simple air-pump apparatus specially devised for emergency repairs on small ships. The headpiece is weighted, fits snugly but

comfortably on the shoulders and can be removed while the person is under water, in case of accident. No suit is needed. As the air rushes in, it forces the water out of the helmet, keeping the head and neck dry. Vents permit the surplus to escape so that there is never too much air in the breathing compartment. There are two removable windows, permitting an almost unobstructed view. The helmet remains adjusted regardless of the position assumed by the wearer who can work in any posture except standing on his head. Besides proving of great aid to mariners, the outfit is reported to have become popular among pleasure seekers who desire to experience the sensations of diving and see the wonders of the submarine world.

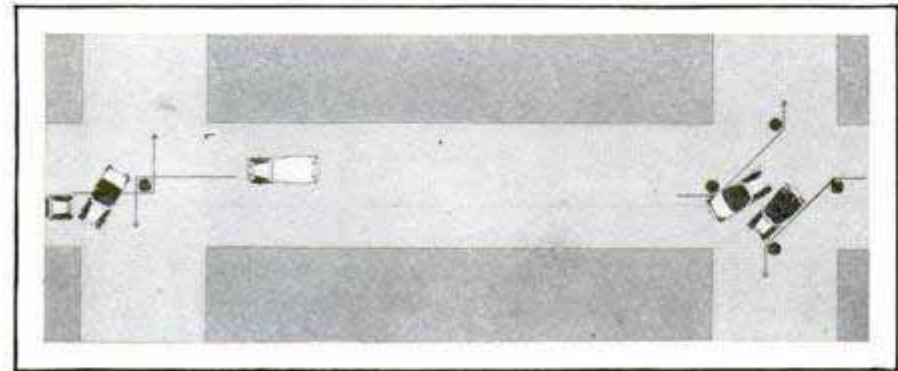
Electricity is being used to make cows give more milk, according to Prof. A. E. Stewart of Minnesota State university. Farmers found that when the drinking water was cold in winter the cows would drink little, and consequently their milk yield fell off. Several installed electric pumps with heating attachments, and water fountains so arranged that when the cow's nose pressed the cup, the pump delivered warmed water. One farmer reported an increase of 430 pounds of milk a week, giving him an extra \$35 a month revenue. The installation cost \$140 and in five months he made \$175 from it.

The engineers plan to continue drilling so long as the drills, which are electrically driven, can be kept operating. Extremely high temperatures have been met below 7,000 feet. The well tapped an oil-bearing sand at 3,600 feet, and good oil and gas flow at 5,375 feet, while extremely heavy gas pressure was encountered at 5,480 feet. Oil was also found between 5,620 and 5,900 feet.

GROWING OF DWARFED TREES ENCOURAGED IN JAPAN

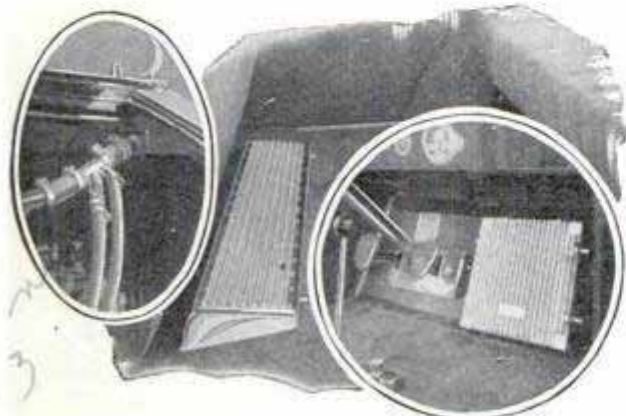

PARACHUTES TO LAND MAIL ON NON-STOP FLIGHTS 397

Wayside stations where air-mail ships can drop bags without the necessity of landing are to be introduced on airways in Europe. Experiments with small parachutes have shown that the mail bags can be dropped 5,000 feet without damage to the contents. The details of the device have been kept secret, but it is understood to embrace a clockwork arrangement by which the bags can be dropped like a plummet until within a short distance from the ground, when the parachute opens and checks the descent. The long drop before the chute opens enables the pilot to aim the bag at the landing field, and keeps it from drifting several miles away before the wind.

PHILIPPINE MAHOGANY UNDER BAN 388.

Orders barring the use of the term "Philippine mahogany" were issued recently by the Federal Trade commission against three lumber companies which had been importing the wood from the islands for use in furniture making, and other industries where a substitute for real mahogany could be employed. The board ruled that the wood

did not belong to the same family as true mahogany, that it was much more porous than the genuine lumber, and that the practice of passing it off as mahogany by filling the pores was unfair. The filling later shrinks into the pores and the appearance of the wood deteriorates with age instead of improving, which is one of the characteristics of true mahogany that makes it particularly valuable.

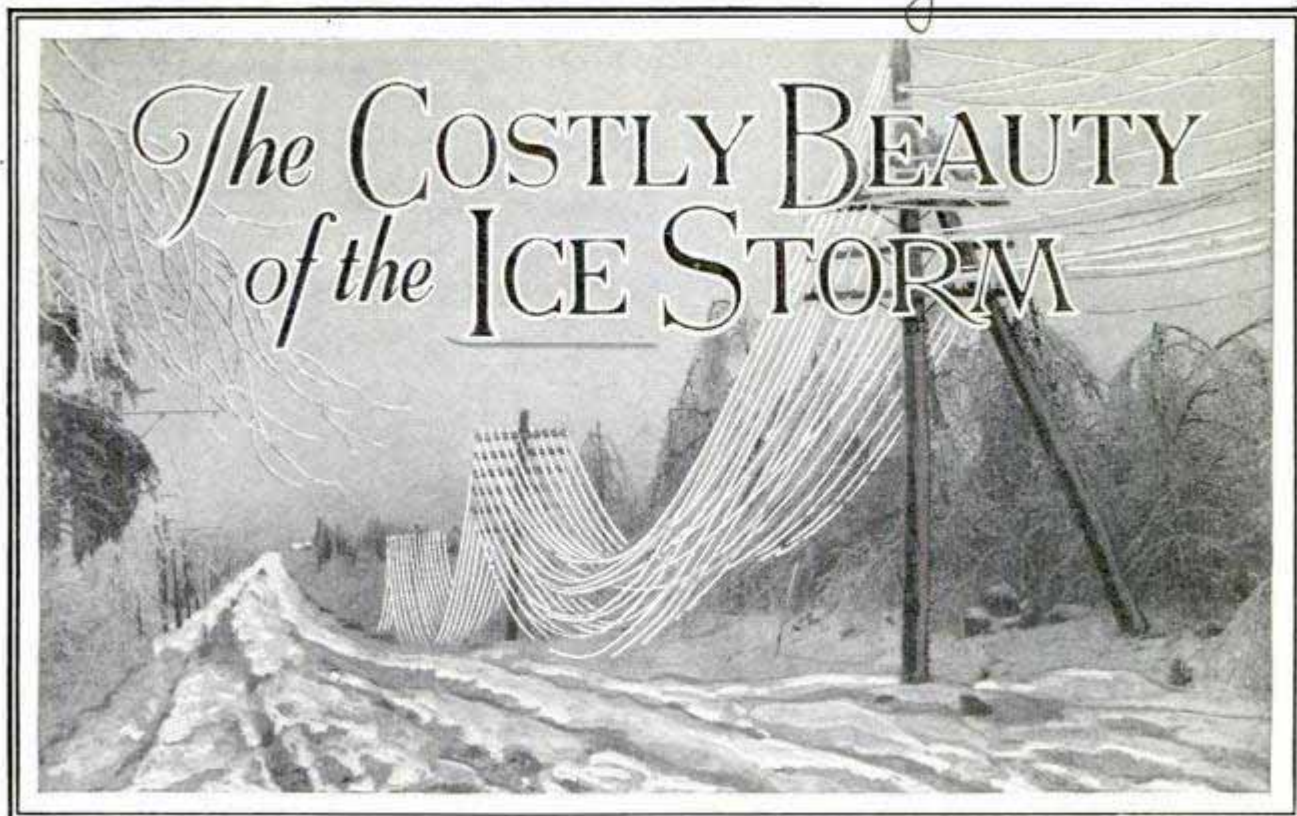

Dazzling Spectacles of Nature for Which We Pay Millions Every Winter in Damage to Wires and Stoppage of Communication

By CALVIN FRAZER

A SPECTACULAR product of Hollywood may extract millions of dollars from American pocketbooks, but the mulcting process is generally spread over two or three years and the audience is nation-wide. Nature now and then taxes us just as much for a show that lasts but one or a few days and is seen only in a limited section of the country.

Ice storms occur when, with the temperature of the air at the earth's surface below the freezing point, rain falls from warmer air aloft. The drops turn to ice on striking the chilled surface of terrestrial objects, and continued rainfall steadily increases the accumulation. The typical deposit is clear ice, though it is sometimes mixed with previous deposits of ordinary snow.

Many ice storms do no damage. It is only when the ice coating becomes heavy enough to break the branches of trees and the wires and poles of telephone, telegraph and power systems that Nature begins to pile up a bill for her services as a scenic artist. Transmission lines are usually designed to carry a deposit of half an inch of ice on the wires in calm weather,

though with high winds a considerably lighter load is destructive. Roughly speaking, only about one-third of the ice storms occurring in the northeastern United States reach the danger point of ice and wind.

Of the wire services the telephone companies are the greatest sufferers, as their overhead wires greatly exceed in mileage those of the telegraph and light-and-power companies combined. Heavy losses from ice storms are expected every winter, and in order to ease the strain on a company's resources they are met from a special reserve fund accumulated through the year and charged monthly to operating expenses. A single storm a few years ago entailed an outlay of \$7,500,000 for repairs and reconstruction.

In the course of a few hours a single telephone wire may acquire a solid ice coating three inches in diameter and accompanied by even longer icicles. Whereas the weight of wires in the normal span between two poles in a forty-wire lead is less than 200 pounds, such an ice coating may add a weight of about 15,000 pounds to the load supported by each pole. If a

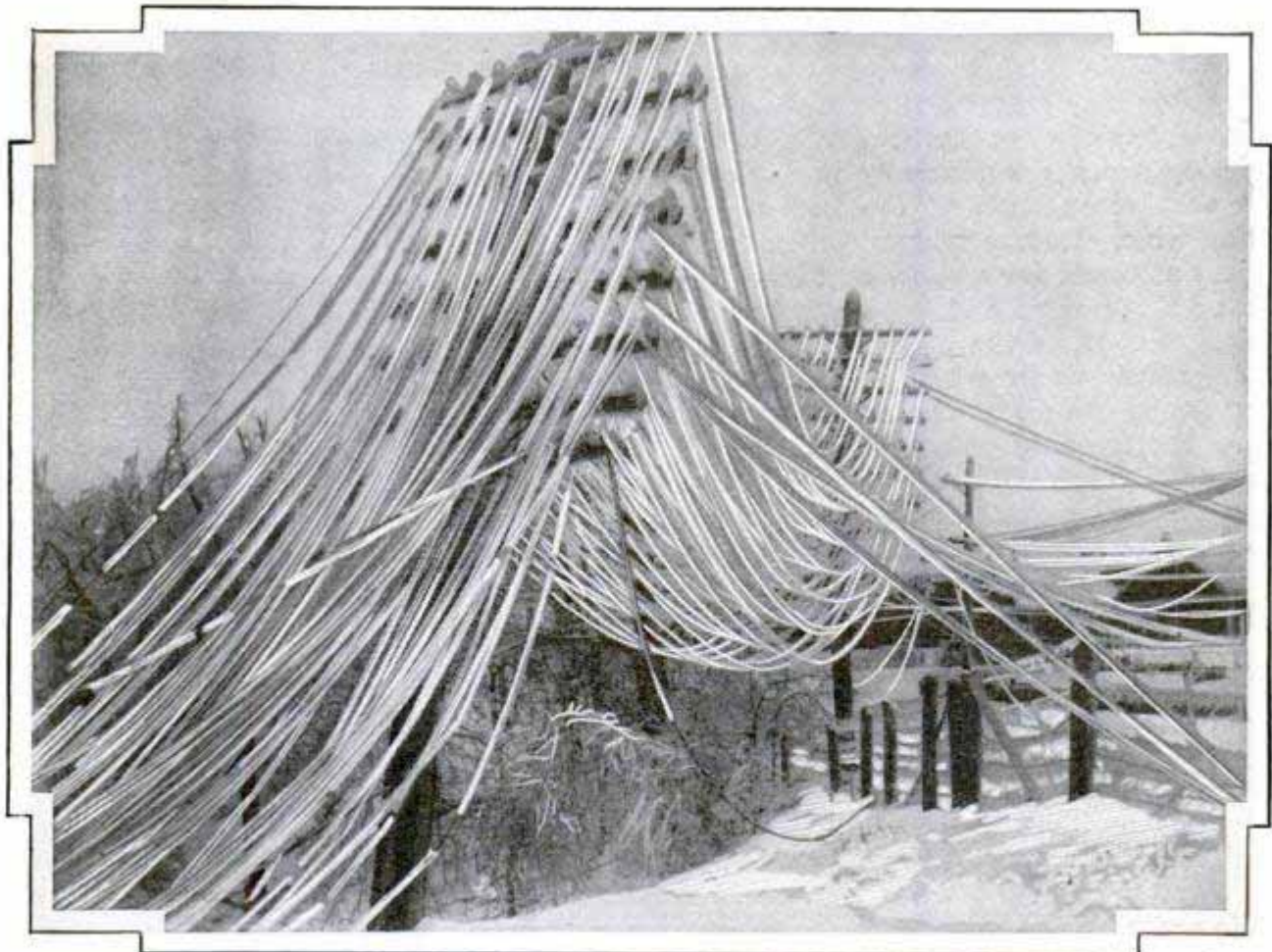
47 heavy gale is blowing, the pole is further subjected to a bending force due to the wind pressure on the ice-covered wires. Exposed to such stresses, the lines frequently fail, and even if they do not from this cause, they are often brought down by trees falling across the span.

Damage to trees sometimes constitutes a heavy item of loss in an ice storm. In February, 1922, the worst of these storms that has ever visited Michigan destroyed hundreds of thousands of trees in that state. Many fine orchards lost from fifty to seventy-five per cent of their trees. The deposit of ice was enormous. At one place a twig weighing only an ounce was found to be coated with two pounds of ice. Another, the size of a lead pencil, supported an ice column nine inches in circumference. In the great New England ice storm of Nov. 25-29, 1921, the city of Worcester, Mass., alone lost 8,000 shade trees. In this storm it was estimated that a tree fifty feet high, with an average width of twenty feet, carried a load of five tons of ice. In the New Eng-

land woods, after the storm, the trees lay prostrate in windrows.

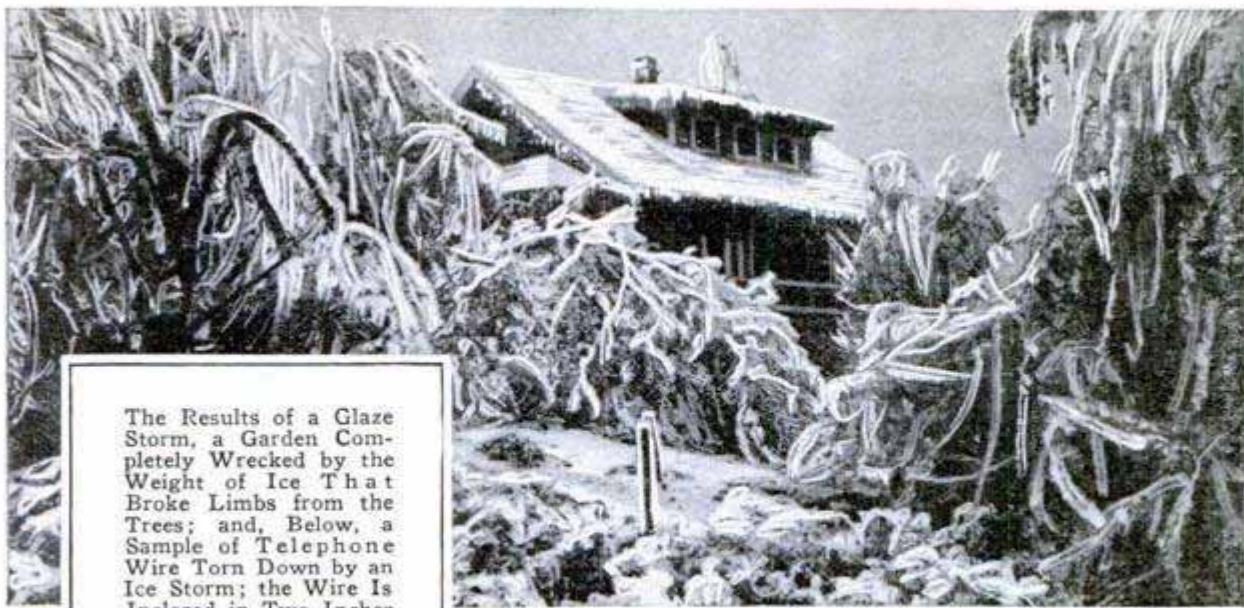
In December, 1924, one of the most disastrous ice storms in American history tore down 34,000 poles of the utility companies in Missouri, Oklahoma and Texas, putting out of service more than 25,000 miles of open wire. The focus of destruction was St. Louis, which, on the morning of the nineteenth, found itself almost totally cut off from the rest of the world. With wires and cables prostrate, or grounded by tons of ice, long-distance communication whether by telephone or telegraph was practically impossible. Every line leading west was partially or totally crippled. Ten thousand city telephones were out of order, while almost every station in St. Louis county was dead.

In an emergency of this kind, a veritable army of repairmen must be mobilized. The telephone company drafted linemen and foremen from surrounding states, and for weeks following the storm 3,000 men were at work in eastern Missouri alone.

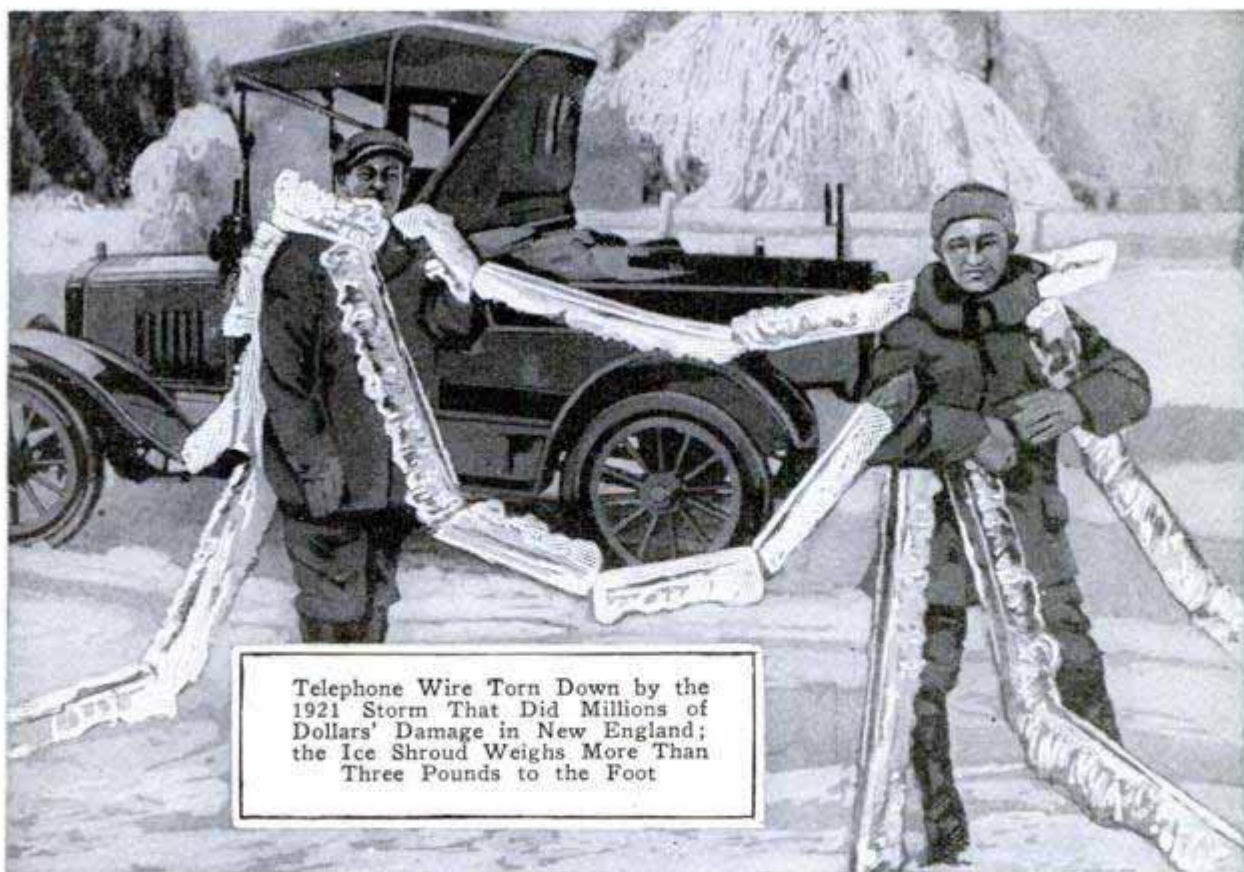
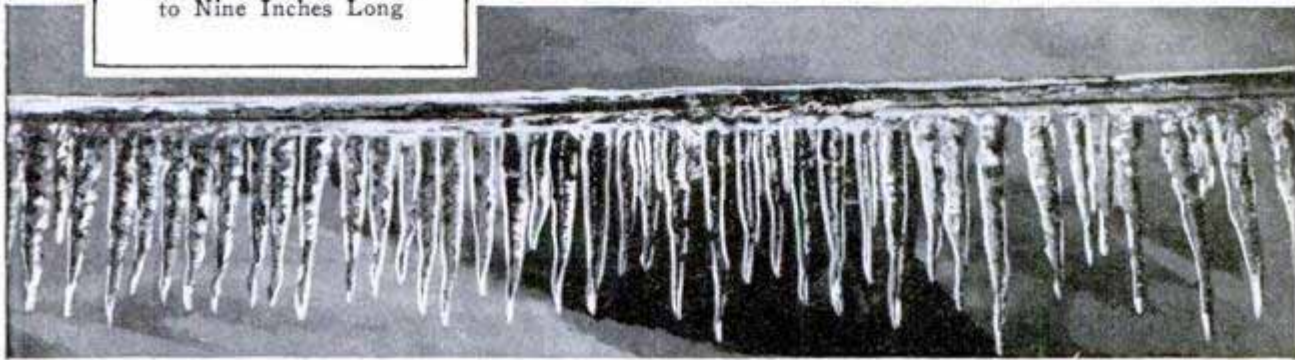

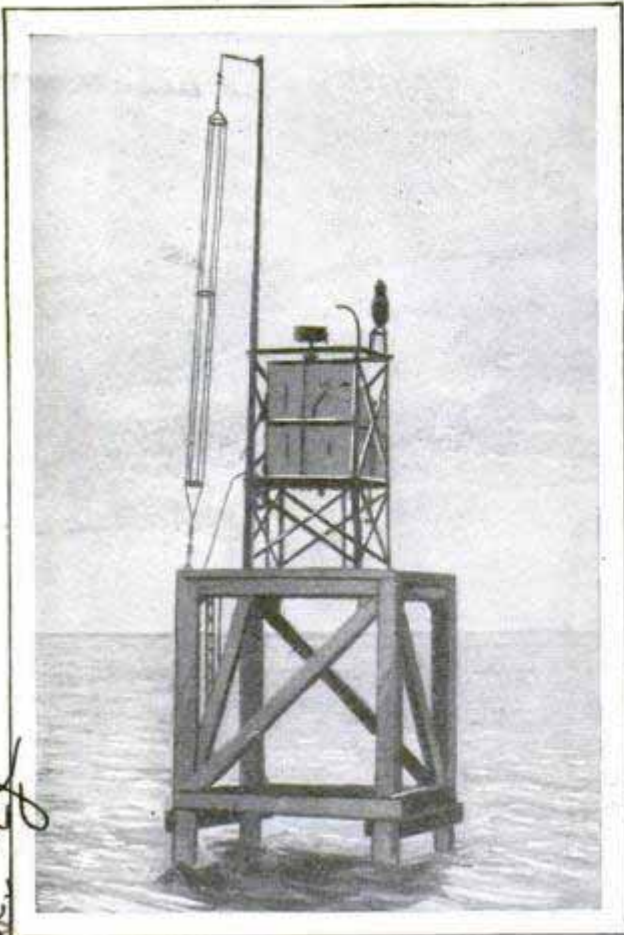

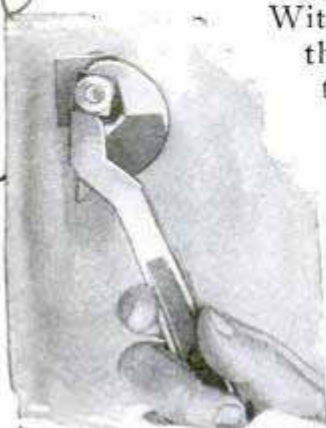

500 PLAINS ONCE FOREST-COVERED FOSSIL NUTS INDICATE

Dense forests of a species of walnut tree grew on what are now the open plains and sand drifts of western Nebraska, in the opinion of scholars who have studied collections of fossil nuts found in that region. They were discovered along with remains of prehistoric animals and were first believed to be hickory nuts, but comparison with all existing species of the hickory and walnut led to the conclusion that they were more closely related to the latter. From these fossils, it is held probable that the climate of the region was very different from present conditions, for the trees demand much rainfall and a deep, rich soil. The abundance and character of the associated animal life, as shown by other fossils, indicate that the forests were not confined to narrow areas along the banks of watercourses but that they covered considerable space, the investigators believe.

STREET-CAR STRAPS CARRY ADS TO INCREASE REVENUE

1429. Straps in street cars and other public vehicles in London are being put to a double use by the addition of small display cards to the portion just above the grip. 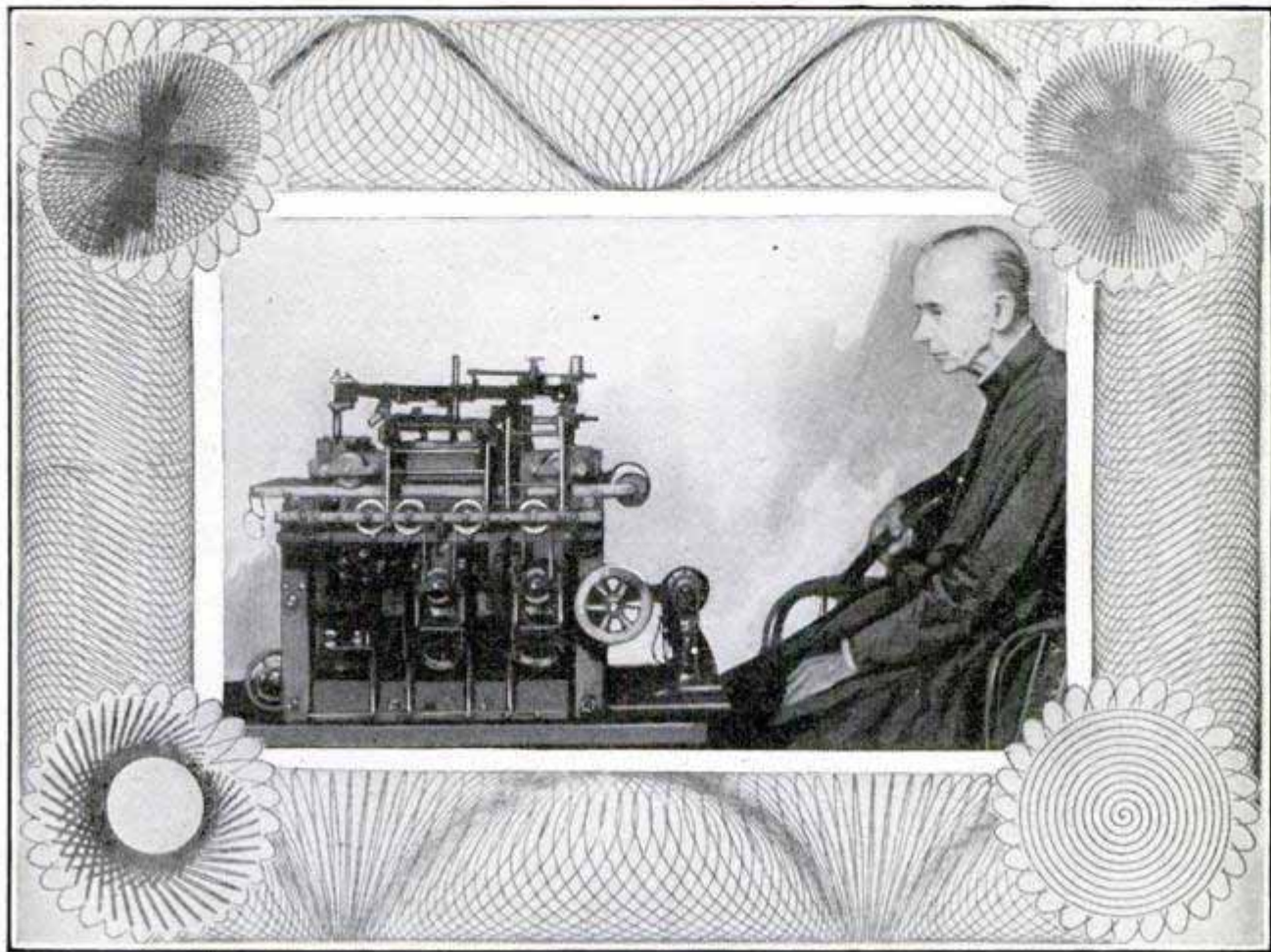

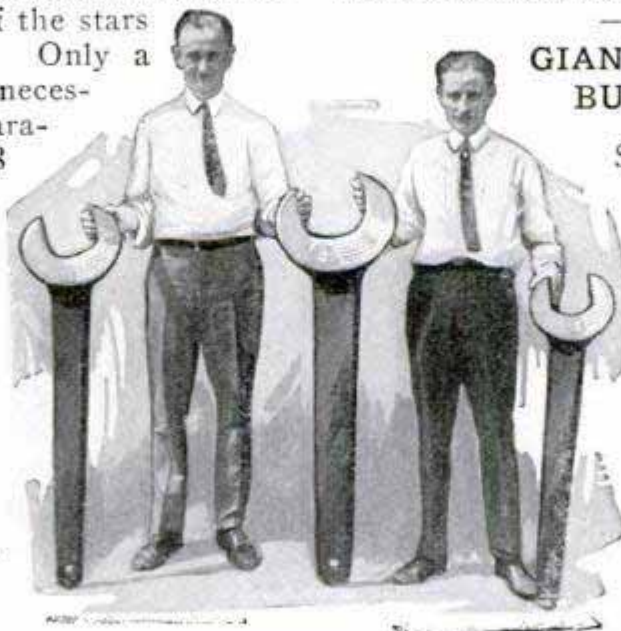
MACHINE IS MADE TO DRAW BILLIONS OF CURVES

From simple parts which he purchased at small cost, the Rev. William F. Rigge, of Creighton university, internationally known astronomer, has fashioned a remarkable drawing instrument in connection with his study of the stars and of mathematics. Only a few adjustments are necessary to have the apparatus trace 7,618,782,498 curves. All are made with exceeding accuracy and the variety of design not only illustrates the scientific features of curved lines, but their beauty as well. The work is done chiefly by the action of a series of geared wheels. The paper is made to move under the pen, and, by set-

ting the instrument properly, pairs of curves are traced in stereoscopic effect so that the finished pattern seems to have three dimensions, like a wire basket for instance, standing out distinctly in space.

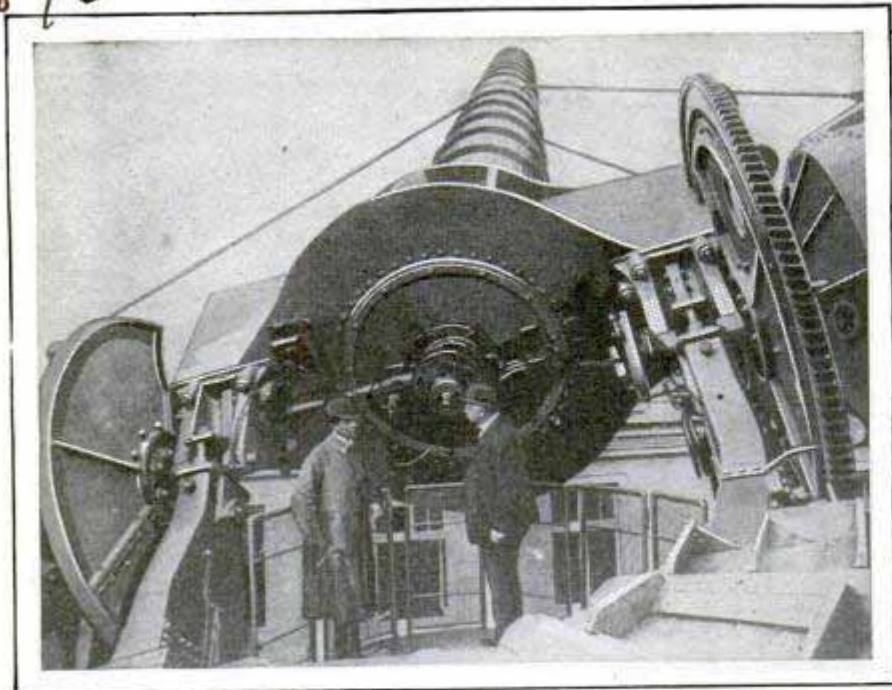

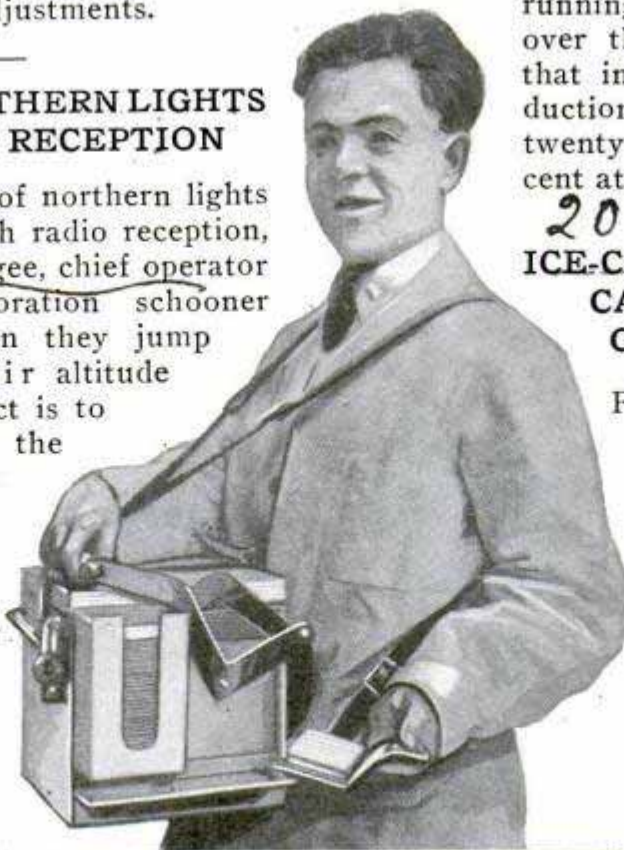

Certain types of gears and speed and open windows contribute to unpleasant noises in street cars, while insulated wheels, flooring in one piece and rubber cushions under the center plates help reduce them. Investigators at the university of Wisconsin have found. It was determined that leaving the windows open increases the noise about thirty-three per cent in cars running at the same speed over the same track, and that insulation caused a reduction in noise of about twenty to twenty-five per cent at twenty miles an hour.

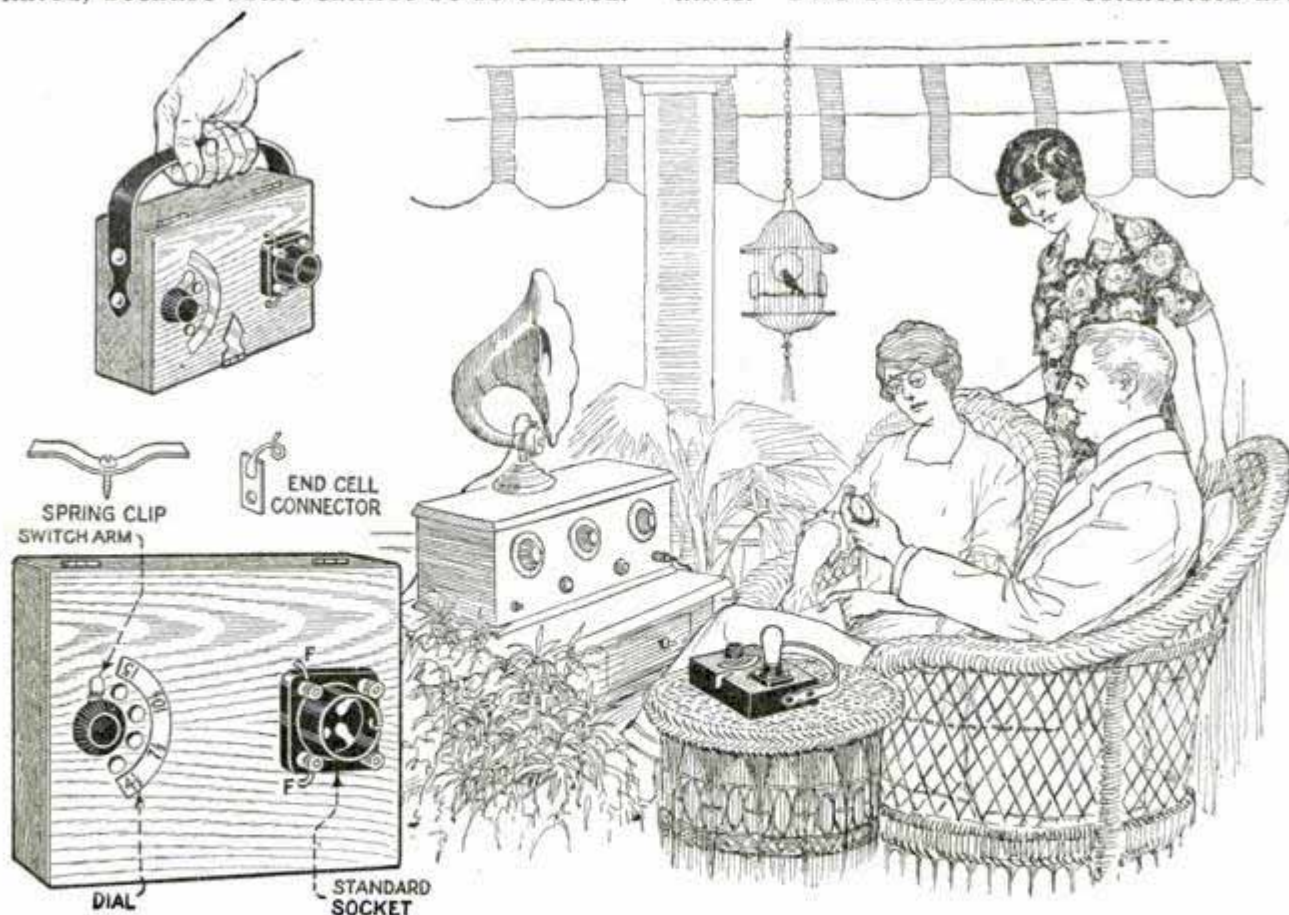
How to Build a Portable Tube Booster

By L. B. ROBBINS

AFTER the apparent death of seven UV-199 tubes, I began to look around for some means of reviving them for further use. Rejuvenators of various types are on the market, but all require a 110-volt lighting circuit and this was not available.

The problem was solved at small expense by the simple apparatus described in this article. It operates from ten flashlight cells, may be easily carried in the hand or slipped into an overcoat pocket and will restore to efficiency a tube of either the 199 or the 201-A type. Tubes with shorted grids and filaments, of course, are beyond recall, but where they have lost their original "pep" they may be restored to usefulness in a short time. The instrument is provided with a standard socket and adapter so that either the large or small tubes may be handled; if the tubes are of the new X-type, the X socket should be used. Make sure that your tubes are of the type that may be rejuvenated, because some cannot be so treated.

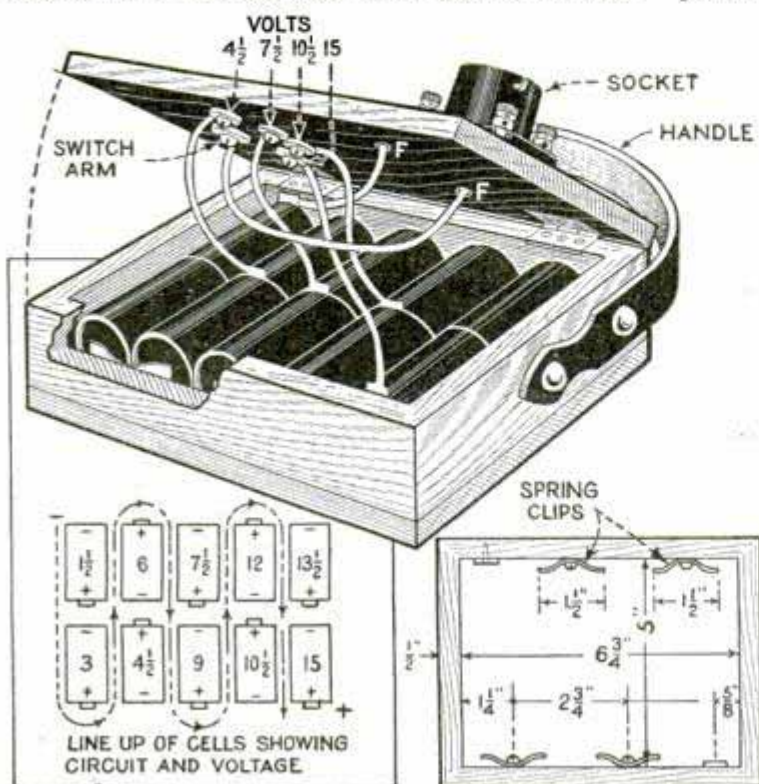
The construction of the booster is very simple. A shallow tray or box of clear-grained $\frac{1}{2}$ -in. soft wood, measuring $6\frac{3}{4}$ in. long by 5 in. wide and $1\frac{5}{8}$ in. high, inside measurements, provides the container for the ten flashlight cells. The corners must be square and there should be no metal projections of any kind inside. The over-all dimensions of the cover are $7\frac{3}{4}$ by 6 in.; four pieces of stiff spring brass, $1\frac{1}{2}$ in. long by $\frac{1}{2}$ in. wide, are cut and bent in the shape shown in the detail. A hole is drilled in the center of each and they are then screwed into the sides of the tray in the positions indicated in the layout, the first clip $1\frac{1}{4}$ in. from the end and the second one $2\frac{3}{4}$ in. from the first. The clips on the opposite side of the tray are mounted the same distance apart, but the start is made from the opposite end of the tray. Use short brass wood screws that will not pierce the wood, and arrange the clips horizontally so that they will make the necessary connections for the dry-cell units. Two brass end-cell connectors are

then cut from the same stock, $\frac{1}{2}$ in. wide and 1 in. long, and a short length of flexible wire is soldered to each connector, as

to the terminals. This line-up will bring one end connector against the negative pole of the first cell, and the other against the positive terminal of the end, or tenth, cell. Three thin brass connectors, 1 in. long and $\frac{1}{2}$ in. wide, with a short piece of flexible wire soldered to each, are slipped between the cells for the voltage taps to the switch points, at $4\frac{1}{2}$, $7\frac{1}{2}$ and $10\frac{1}{2}$ volts, the 15-volt tap being the lead from the positive end terminal. The three voltage connectors are placed between the third and fourth, fifth and sixth and seventh and eighth cells, respectively. The switch arm is mounted 1 in. from the end of the cover, and the four switch contacts as shown in the view of the top of the finished instrument. Care should be taken to let them project as little as possible on the underside of the lid. Glue a small arc of white bristol board or celluloid close to the taps, and mark the various voltages as shown.

shown. These terminal connectors are then screwed to the inside of the tray about $\frac{5}{8}$ in. from each end in the positions shown in the layout.

Ten flashlight cells, of the round $1\frac{1}{2}$ -volt type, are then inserted in the tray in the manner shown in the line-up diagram. The base of the zinc shell being the negative terminal of each, and the small brass terminal at the opposite end the carbon or positive, two cells are laid end to end, positive to negative, and will just squeeze into the width of the tray; the direction of every other pair is reversed as shown in the diagram, the voltage being progressively indicated on each cell. Spring the brass clips out so that the cells are held firmly in place, making tight connections

the other end of the lid and two small holes are drilled near the filament posts for the flexible leads, one to the negative end connector at the first cell and the other to the switch arm. The voltage leads are then soldered to their contact points on the underside of the lid, the 15-volt tap going to the positive end connector at the tenth cell. If flexible rubber-covered wire is not available, use No. 18 magnet wire and cover each lead with thin spaghetti tubing. Bend the ends of the brass strips over flat and fill any spaces between the cells with cardboard to keep them rigidly in place. Hinge the cover on one side and provide two small hooks, one at each end of the tray; arrange the hooks to engage with two pins driven in

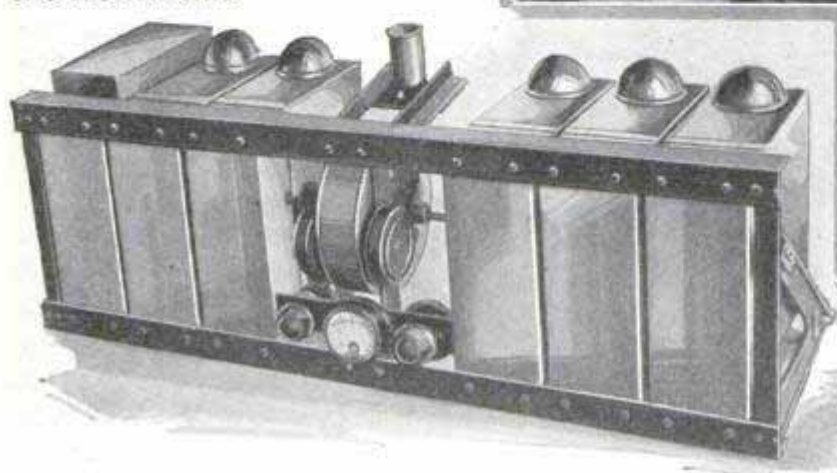

the ends of the cover so as to hold the lid tight down on the tray when closed. A small, hinged hasp may be substituted if desired. If there is any play between the lid and the cells use felt or cardboard to pack the cells firmly. The leather carrying strap may be made from an old belt and is fastened with short wood screws in the manner shown in the illustration, thus completing the instrument.

To rejuvenate a tube, place it in the socket with the switch arm off; then with your watch in hand, flash the tube by placing the switch arm on the voltage indicated for that particular tube. For the UV-199 or C-299 tube, the flash should be on $10\frac{1}{2}$ volts for 45 seconds. At the end of this period bring the switch arm back to the $4\frac{1}{2}$ -volt tap and leave it there for 10 minutes. Replace the tube in the set and, if the tube does not show the required improvement, repeat the process. The UV-201A and C-301A tubes should be flashed at 15 volts for 45 seconds and then burned at $7\frac{1}{2}$ volts for 10 minutes. While the life of the small dry cells composing this unit is not long enough for use in a commercial way for tube boosting, the amateur who has only a few tubes to rejuvenate occasionally will be well served by the instrument. When the cells go dead, they should be removed quickly and fresh ones inserted.

This eight-tube receiver of the neutrodyne type may be operated with one hand, through a precision single-control mechanism in the form of a bakelite disk which, by means of a vernier gear, turns a rotary drum bearing a wavelength scale. This one tuning control takes the place of ten ordinary adjustments and eliminates the necessity of expert knowledge in the operation of an elaborate receiver of this design. The set will work with either a loop, indoor or outdoor antenna. Copper shielding is used for the r.f. stages and the detector tube, and a steel compartment is provided for the a.f. stages. Metal caps above the assembly are removable for the purpose of inserting various tubes in their proper sockets. A double-range voltmeter is located below the control unit, and an eight-position switch permits the operator to note instantly the A, B, and C-voltages applied to the various parts of the circuit. New engineering features are claimed to eliminate distortion, insuring great volume combined with excellent tone and selectivity and ease of operation.

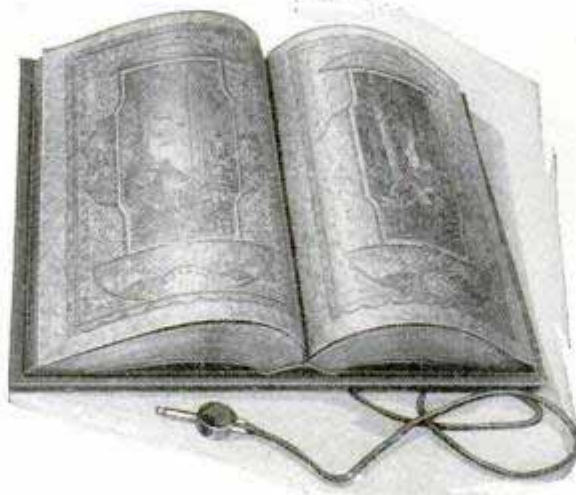
The instrument is connected to the tone arm of the phonograph and a flexible cable, terminating in a specially designed plug, is inserted in the radio set. The record is played in the usual manner and amplified by the radio set, and the combination is claimed to give exceptionally good results. It has the advantage that favorite tunes can be played at any time with the full tonal value of the radio, and can be regulated fast or slow to suit the listener. Actually, the phonograph becomes the broadcasting station, so that all the advantages of radio tone are obtained without interference from static or other atmospheric disturbances.

Length of Aerial Important

In a large measure the performance of the set depends on the length of the aerial. The time has passed when the 100-ft. aerial was advised for all sets. As a general rule, the longer the aerial, the greater the signal strength, although the interference is amplified in the same ratio, and the set becomes sluggish. Also, the long aerial tends to absorb energy from the set, and has the effect of loading the circuit, preventing oscillation. The good results that are obtained by the long aerial are discounted by preventing the tuning of the modern set to the very low wavelengths, now in general use. For these waves a short aerial is required, and has the effect of adding energy to the set, also increasing selectivity. The aerial must not be too short, however, or the set will not operate. The proper length will be found by experiment. The height of the aerial depends on the location, and should be at least 20 or 30 ft. above the ground, the higher the better. For receiving purposes a single-strand aerial is just as efficient as the multiple-strand type. A good suggestion for the average set is to use three different aerials; a short one of about 40 ft.

Loud Speaker Shaped like Book

A new loud speaker of unusual design is made in the form of an open book. It has tinted pages done in sepia, is finished in gold and brown-morocco leatherette and has an artistic appearance. It rests on a small easel but may be hung on the wall if desired. It employs an electromagnetic unit applied tangentially to the edge of

Three-Tube Set Works on Loop

Ideal City Set Is Selective, Operates Loud Speaker and Gets Rid of Aerial Nuisance

THIS little receiver is designed to fill a particular need and, for good performance at low cost, is in a class by itself. One often overhears a remark that runs something like this, "I would like to build a small set that would be selective enough to separate the powerful local stations, work on a loop, and have good loud-speaker volume; I am not interested in distance, as the local stations have excellent programs."

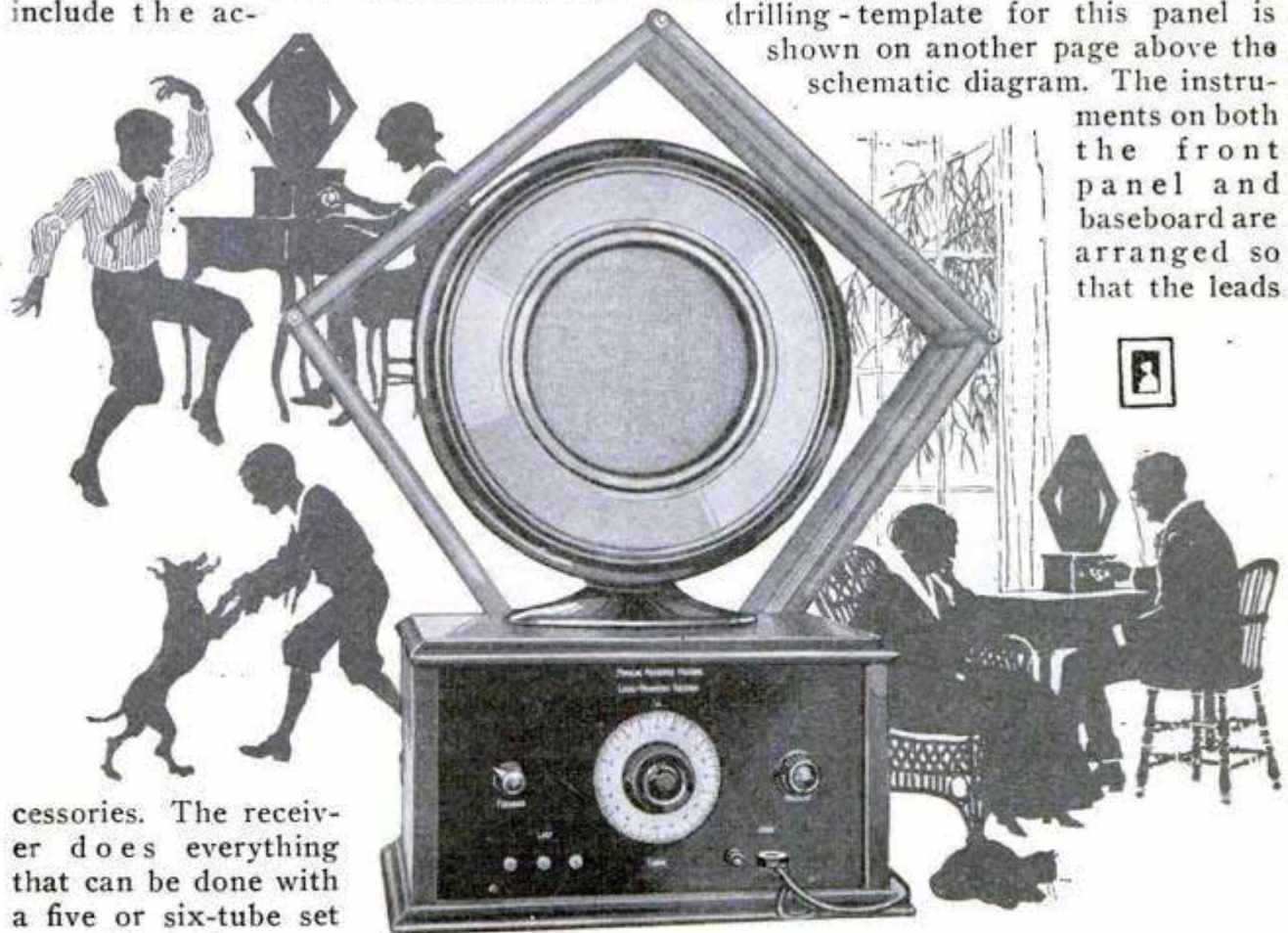
At first thought this seems like a rather large order, but Popular Mechanics radio laboratory now offers just such a set, thoroughly tested, that has excellent tone and good loud-speaker volume. The standard parts, shown in the layout, cost but \$28.80; this cost, however, does not include the ac-

usual outside aerial; no ground wire is required, and it is extremely simple to tune.

Although it is always best to follow material specifications closely for maximum results, this is one set where some latitude is permitted; with the one exception that the variable condenser must be of the type specified or similar type that has not a "live" shaft. 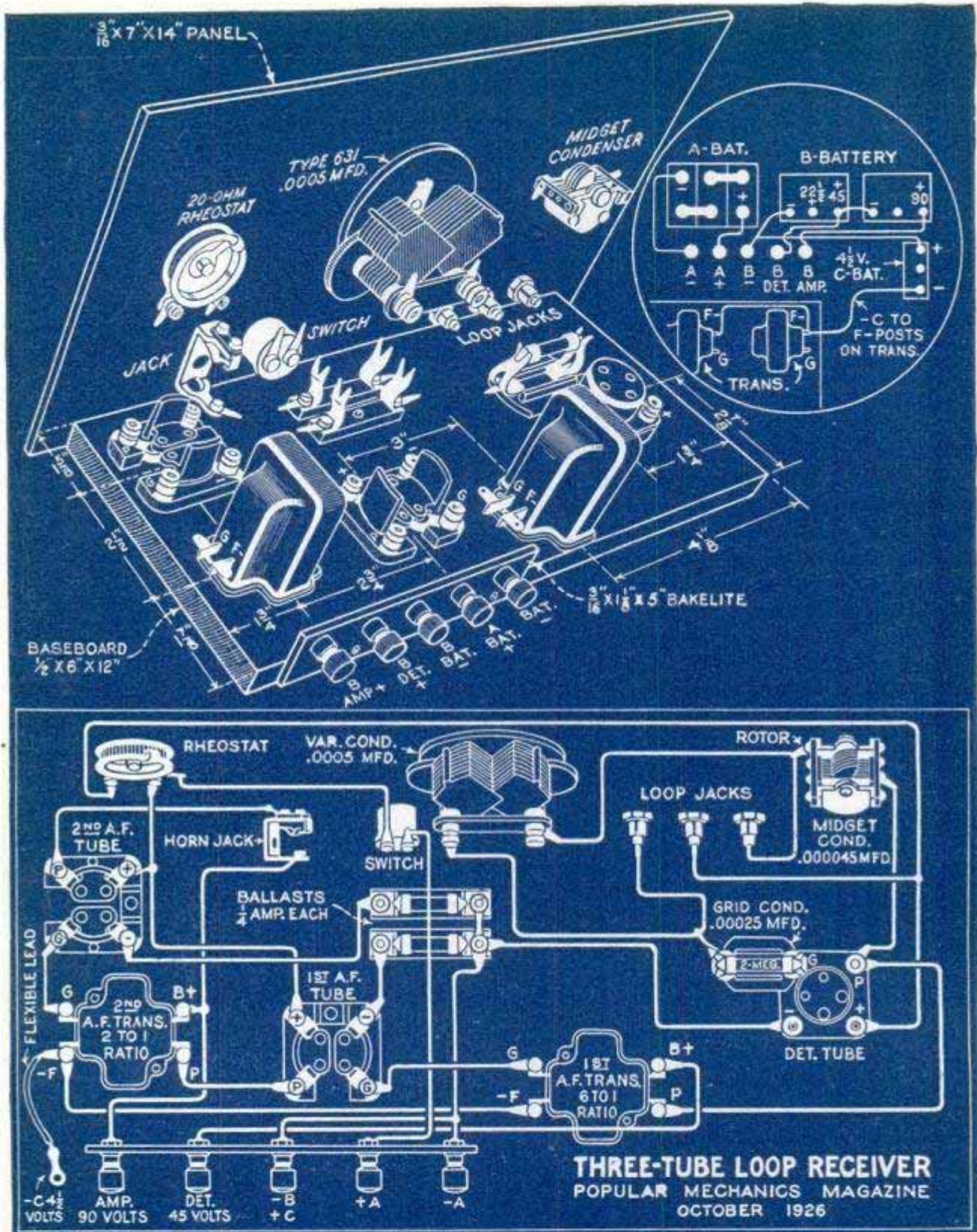

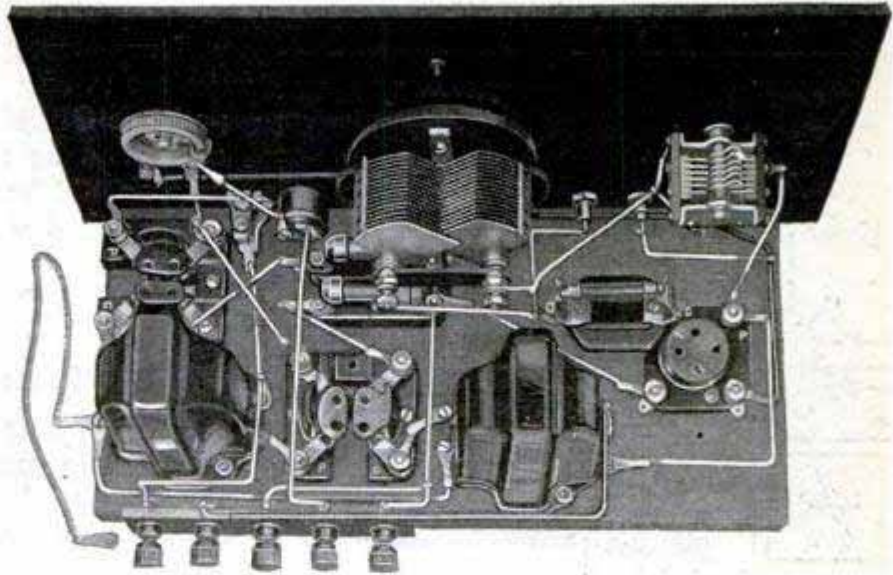

The battery binding posts are arranged on a strip of bakelite, $\frac{3}{16}$ by $1\frac{1}{8}$ by 5 in., this strip being screwed to the rear edge of the baseboard as shown in the layout

diagram. Place soldering lugs of the long round-hole type under all terminals before starting the wiring.

The wiring diagram is given below the instrument layout and is so simple that little instruction is necessary. Follow the point-to-point connections carefully, and be sure that the rotor plates of the midget condenser are connected just as shown. It will be noted that the two $\frac{1}{4}$ -amp. ballasts are connected together at one end and the lead taken to the negative-A post and to the negative post on the detector-tube socket. One ballast controls the filament of the first a.f. tube and the other the second a.f. tube, the detector tube being controlled by the 20-ohm rheostat. Use round tinned-copper busbar wire for the circuit and spaghetti tubing only where necessary to prevent shorts. The F-posts on the a.f. transformers are connected together, and the flexible lead, shown in the wiring diagram, is taken to the negative terminal of a $4\frac{1}{2}$ -volt C-battery, the positive lead from this C-battery running to the negative-B post that is common with the A-negative in the wiring diagram. This small C-battery takes up little room and may be placed in the cabinet with the set. The grid condenser and gridleak are mounted directly on the G-post of the detector-tube socket.

Check the wiring carefully and when completed, connect the A-battery and turn on the filament switch. Place one tube successively in each socket to test



Rear View of the Completed Set

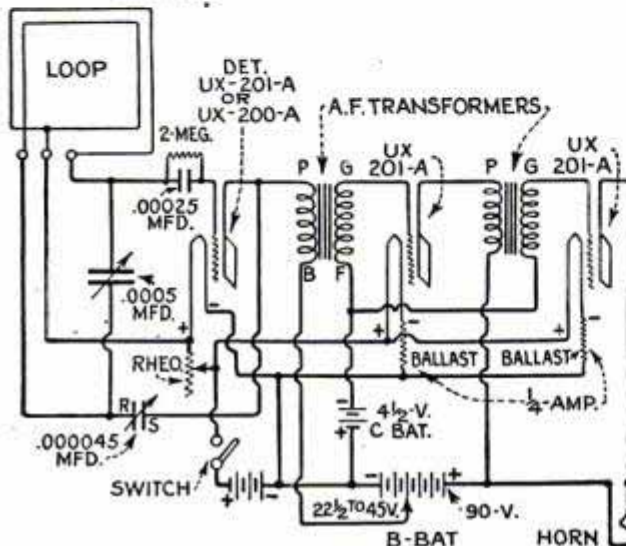
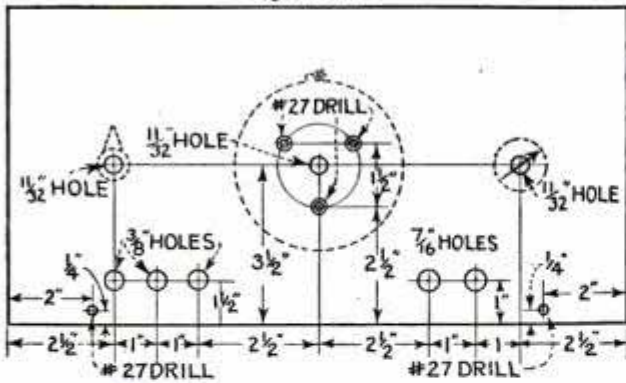
this circuit; if OK, turn off the switch and remove the tube. Now connect the B and C-batteries and place all three tubes in their respective sockets. The loop plugs are then inserted in the small jacks, taking care that the center loop lead goes into the central jack. Finally, plug in the loud speaker and the set is ready. Turn on the filament switch and slowly rotate the large condenser dial; if a station squeal is heard, adjust the midget condenser until this squeal is eliminated, bringing in the station clear with the large condenser. The detector-tube rheostat is then adjusted for best results, and one station after another can be brought in by slowly rotating the large condenser. After the correct setting of the midget condenser has been found, it will not be necessary to readjust it for every station. The loop will be found directional and usually gives best results when turned toward the transmitting station. This is not always the case, due to deflection from near-by metallic bodies.

This is a set that any child can tune and

the results are really remarkable for a loop set employing but three tubes. The razor-edge sharpness of tuning makes it an excellent auxiliary set for the big-city listener who may have a much larger set for the DX-programs. A large set, unless it be a superheterodyne, is not necessarily one that tunes sharply; in fact, very few large sets even of the tuned r.f. type are selective enough to separate the high-powered locals under all conditions.

Alcohol for Cleaning Panels

Avoid water when cleaning radio panels or any part of a radio receiver. If the panel gets dirty or greasy, dampen a soft cloth with alcohol and rub it lightly over the surface to be cleaned. This will remove the dirt and grease, then dry the

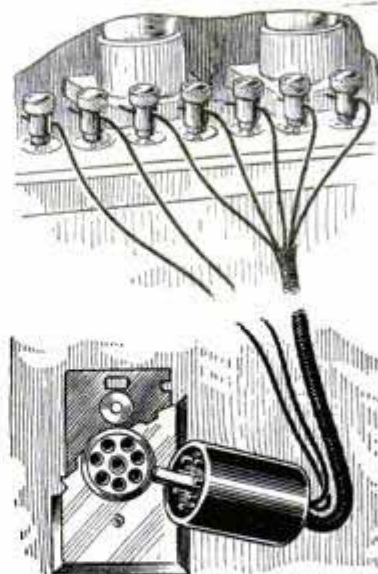
panel with another cloth. The alcohol will evaporate quickly without damaging the set in any way, and will leave a high polish. Ordinary household rubbing alcohol can be used for this purpose, but care should be taken not to spill any on the polished woodwork of the cabinet or console, as it will ruin the varnish unless immediately removed.

Some Radio Troubles

Clicking noises, heard when one presses against the panel or subpanel of a radio set, usually indicate a loose connection somewhere, or a faulty contact of tube prongs in the sockets. A loose or faulty grid connection usually betrays itself by a peculiar peanut-wagon whistle, which may also be due to leaky by-pass condensers, faulty transformers or loud-speaker cords. Grating noises, heard when turning the condensers, are often caused by touching condenser plates, which should be adjusted. In manufactured sets having sockets riveted firmly to the sub-panel, the shells are sometimes a little too large for the tube base and the tube prongs do not make a good contact with the spring prongs in the sockets. Bend the latter up with a piece of wood and insert the tube carefully.

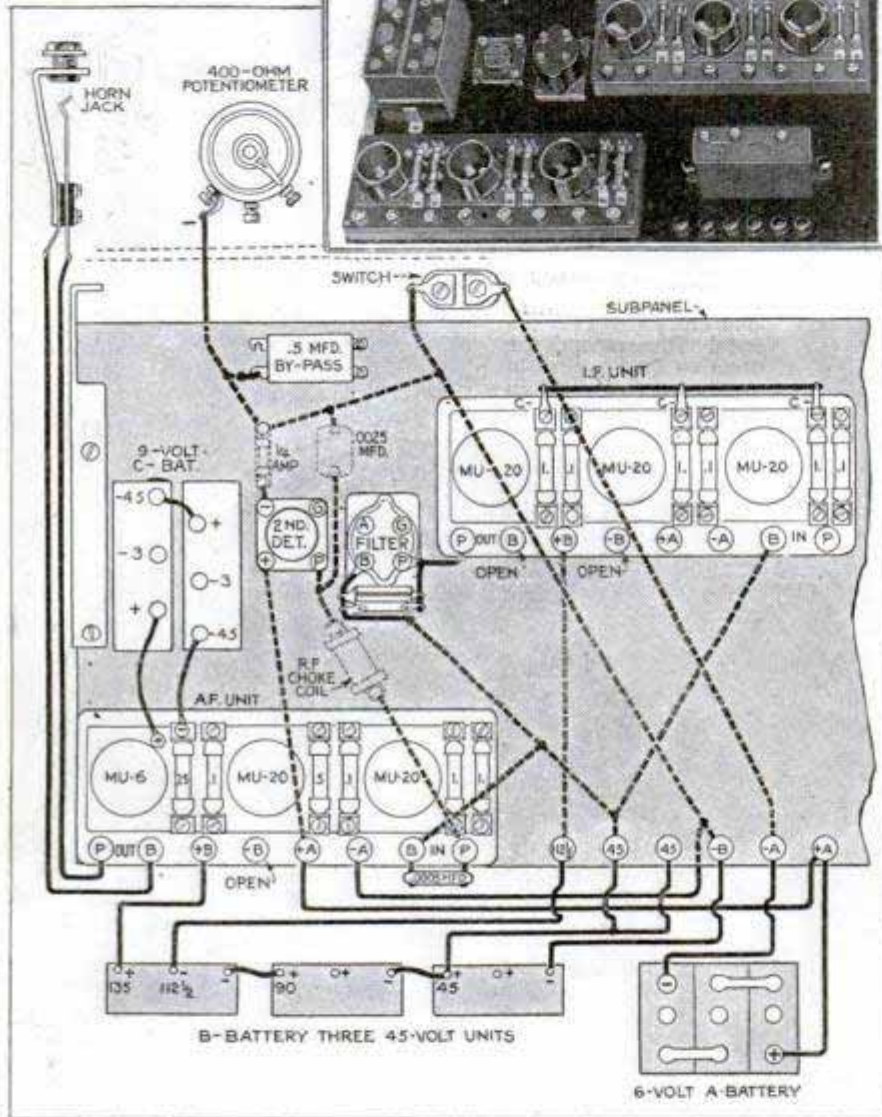

Using Resistance-Coupled A.F. Amplifier in 1927-Model Superhet

If desired, resistance-coupled a.f. amplification may be employed in the 1927-model of Popular Mechanics superheterodyne, described in the

panel, being dotted in to show their location and facilitate the work.

The two 4½-volt C-batteries are connected in series for the necessary 9-volt C-battery required for the MU-6 power tube in the last stage. These C-batteries are located directly in front of the unit and are held in position with two short brass brackets, and a small strip of wood or bakelite is employed to wedge them in position. It will be noted that the A-battery connections to the a.f. unit are taken direct, as the MU-tubes have 6-volt filaments and are lighted directly from the 6-volt A-battery; the A-battery circuit being completed through the switch to the B-negative post that is common with the negative-A. A 1-meg. resistor is substituted for the usual .1-meg. in the first input clip of the a.f. unit. In some cases it will be advisable to use 2 meg. but greater volume is obtained with the smaller value. Before connecting the 9-volt C-battery to the unit, be sure to remove the connector strip between the small binding posts on the front edge of the unit. The various B-battery volt-

Tips on Jacks

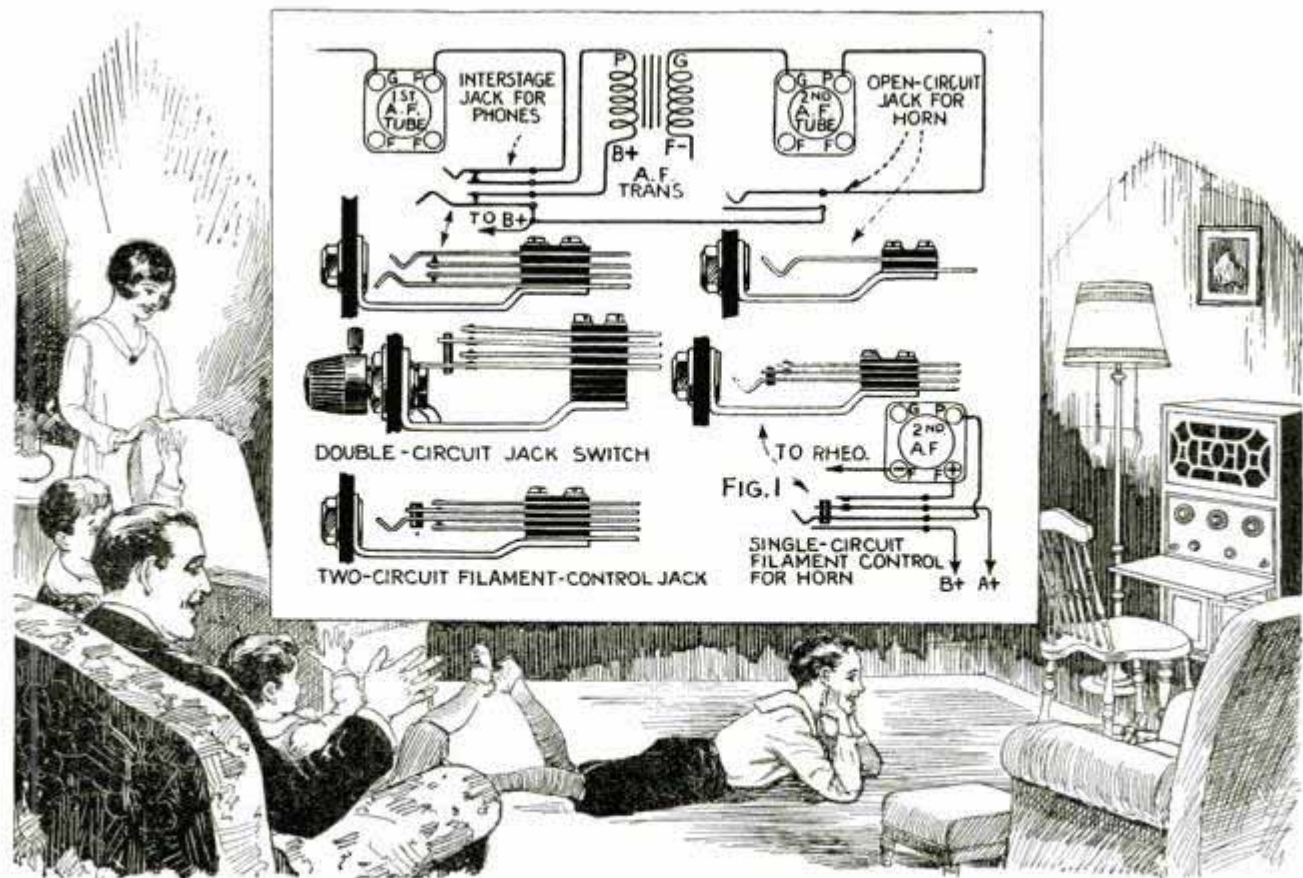

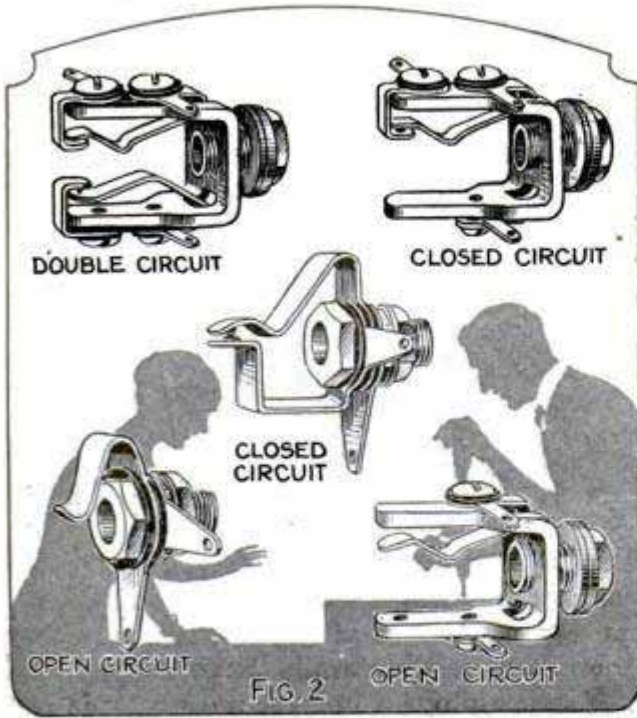
JACKS are a small but important part of all radio receivers, every set having one or more of these switching devices. They are made in many types, and differ very little from those of the standard telephone switchboard. The types in common use are shown in Figs. 1 and 2. Those in Fig. 2 are of the new short type, desirable where compact wiring is necessary, as in portable sets, or wherever space is at a premium.

A little knowledge of jacks and their uses is of value to all radio owners and builders as they furnish an easy method of adjusting the set to suit individual

needs. For example, one often wishes to use headphones instead of the loud speaker, especially late at night after the other members of the family have retired. If the set employs a horn jack only, it is not practical to detune or choke the set down for the phones. Also, phones are often necessary when locating distant stations which, when once located, may be tuned in at loud-speaker volume.

The insertion of an interstage jack in the first a.f. stage is a simple matter, the wiring diagram and illustration of the type of jack used being given in Fig. 1. If desired, the phone jack may be placed at the out-

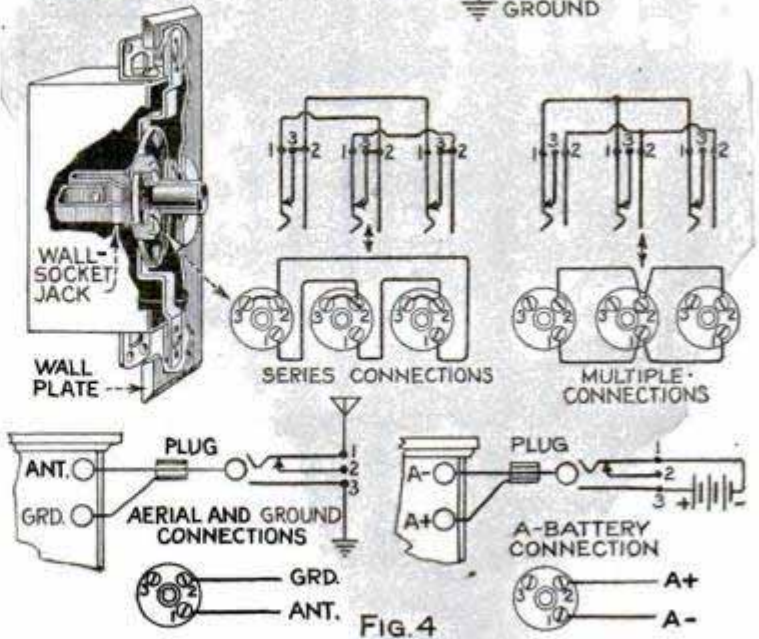
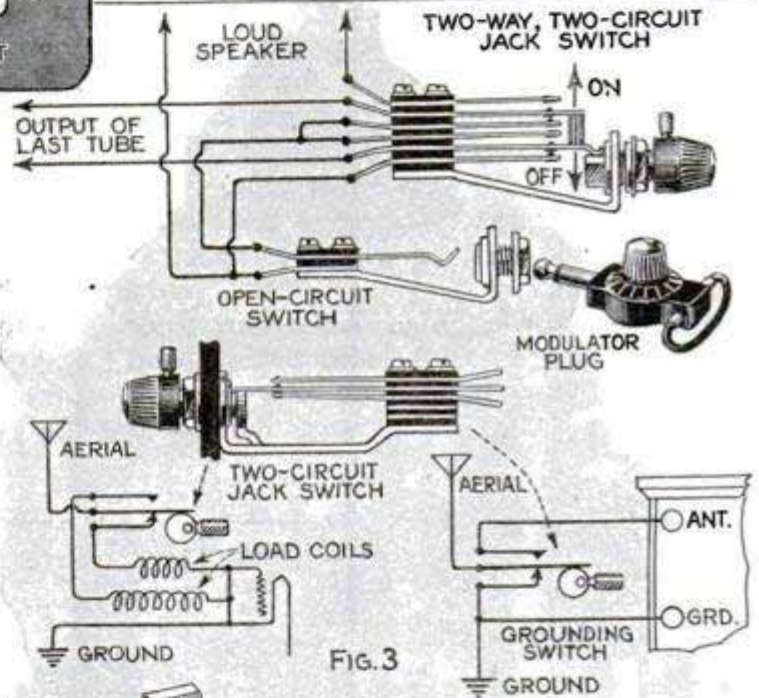




put of the detector tube, but better DX results are obtained if one stage of a.f. amplification is used.

The diagram at the lower right, Fig. 1, shows a jack of the filament-control type applied to the last or horn stage. When the horn or loud speaker is plugged into this stage, the filament of the tube is automatically lighted. If an interstage jack is used for the phones, the horn plug is removed and the last tube is cut out, resulting in more economical operation. A two-circuit filament-control type is shown at the lower left in the same illustration, making possible the same kind of filament-control at any interstage point. The double-circuit jack switch shown above is an improvement of the standard jack in that no plug is required since it is operated by the small knurled knob at front. This type, which is available in several forms, is handy for cutting in various external devices, switching from phones to loud speaker, or from one speaker to another. Eliminating the plugs, the speaker and phone connections are made permanently in the set, and these jacks are commonly used in receivers of the console type

where external leads are to be avoided. A plug combined with an adjustable resistance unit offers a convenient method of controlling the output volume without resorting to detuning or changing the set from its most efficient operating point. This is a simple matter for those using the standard jack and external plug for the loud speaker, but presents a problem where the switch jack is connected in the set itself. Fig. 3 shows the solution of this problem by rewiring the loud-speaker circuit and placing an open-circuit jack near the jack switch, so that the modulator plug can be used to control the volume. The modulator plug is shorted with a small loop of wire, with phone-cord tips at



either end, to complete the circuit through the plug. When the jack switch is in the on-position and the plug shorted with the wire, the loud-speaker volume is controlled by varying the small knurled knob on the plug. The wire across the plug may be removed and replaced with headphones, connecting the phones and speaker in series if desired. A second loud speaker located in an adjoining room can be plugged in instead of the phones for two-speaker operation if required. When the jack switch is thrown to the off-position the external speaker or phones can be operated independently of the loud speaker in the set. The two-circuit jack switch, Fig. 3, is useful for cutting in load coils

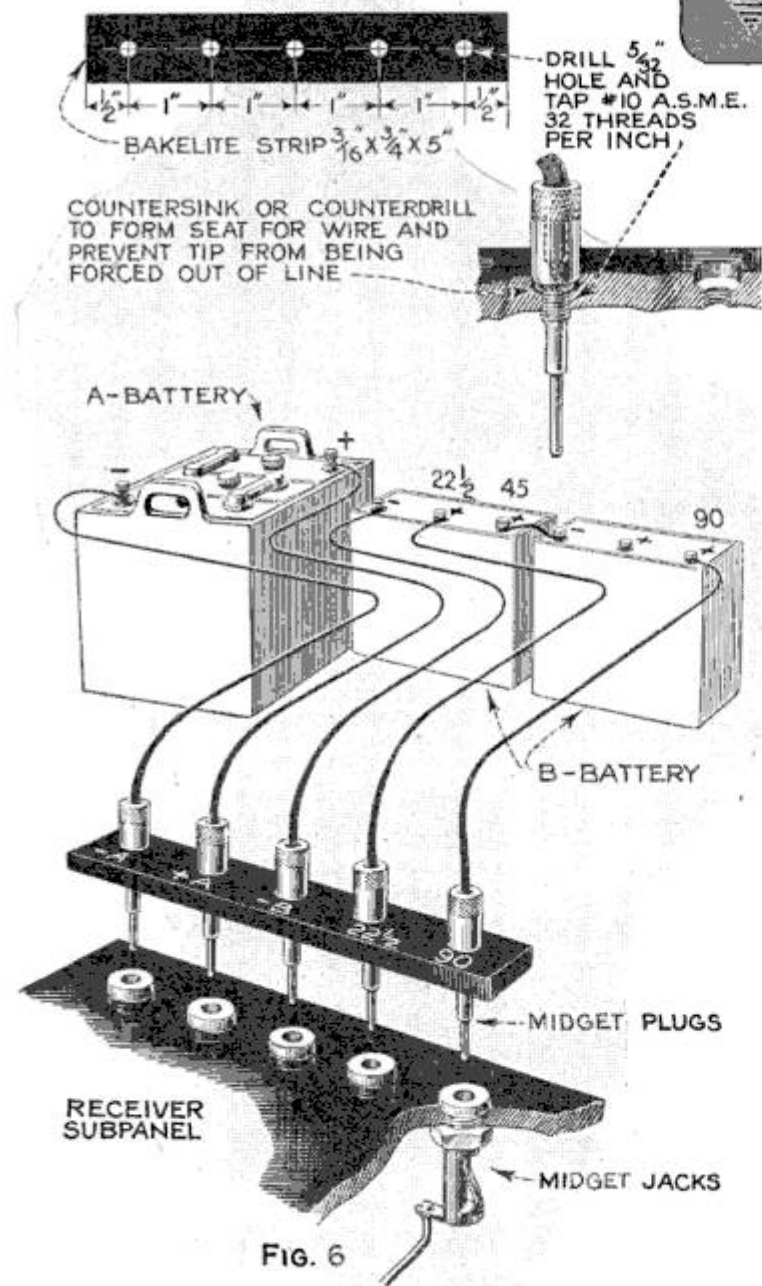
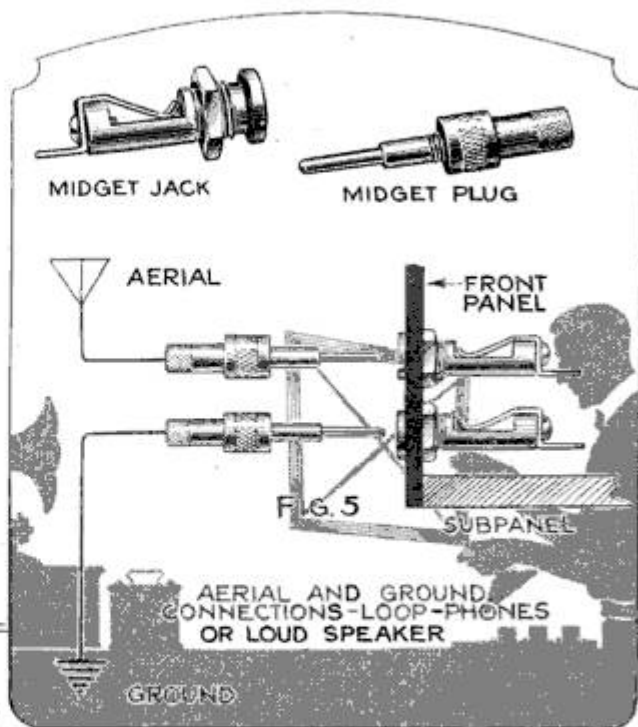

as shown in the diagram below, or for an aerial-grounding switch, that may be thrown when the set is not in use, as shown at right.

Wall-socket jacks are now coming into general use and it is practical to install an outlet in every room. A jack of this type is shown in Fig. 4 and is easily wired as shown in the diagram. It fits in the smallest-size outlet box, and a neat brass wall plate is supplied with it. The wires are connected to the screw terminals, and the jack is fastened to the outlet box with two screws; the plate is then attached. In addition to serving as a convenient outlet for connecting phones or loud speakers, this type of jack may also be used for connecting ground and aerial wires to the set, and for battery connections. Batteries may be placed in the basement, or elsewhere, and the wires brought to the wall-socket jack located at a point near the set.

Handy plugs and jacks, known as the midget type and shown in Fig. 5, are in great favor with the experimenter. The aerial and ground diagram shows one of many applications. They are also used extensively for loop connections and to take the place of

battery binding posts, as shown in Fig. 6, which illustrates an arrangement made in the form of a block for all the battery connections. The jacks are mounted at the rear of the subpanel and centered exactly 1 in. apart. The plugs are set in the strip of bakelite shown in the diagram, so that all connections are made or broken at the same time. The mounting strip is, of course, subject to variation for the number of connections necessary. Spot the location of the plugs along the strip, carefully spacing the plugs as indicated. When the connector strip has been laid out, clamp it to the subpanel in the position it is to occupy in the finished set, and using a $\frac{5}{32}$ -in. drill, perforate the strip and subpanel. The holes in the latter will serve as centers through which the somewhat larger drill required to make the holes for fitting the jacks are drilled. This will insure an accurate line-up of the plugs. The holes are now tapped for the plugs in the connecting strip. For this purpose use a No. 10 A.S.M.E tap having 32 threads per inch. After the holes are tapped, they are countersunk or counter-drilled slightly, to form a seat for the wire and prevent the tips from being forced out of line. The threaded sleeve that is a part of the plug, and which is required when the plugs are used individually, is removed and discarded. Insert the wire in the hollow end of the tip, bringing the bare end out through the hole provided for this purpose, and bend it around under the shoulder above the threads; the plug is then screwed into the bakelite strip.

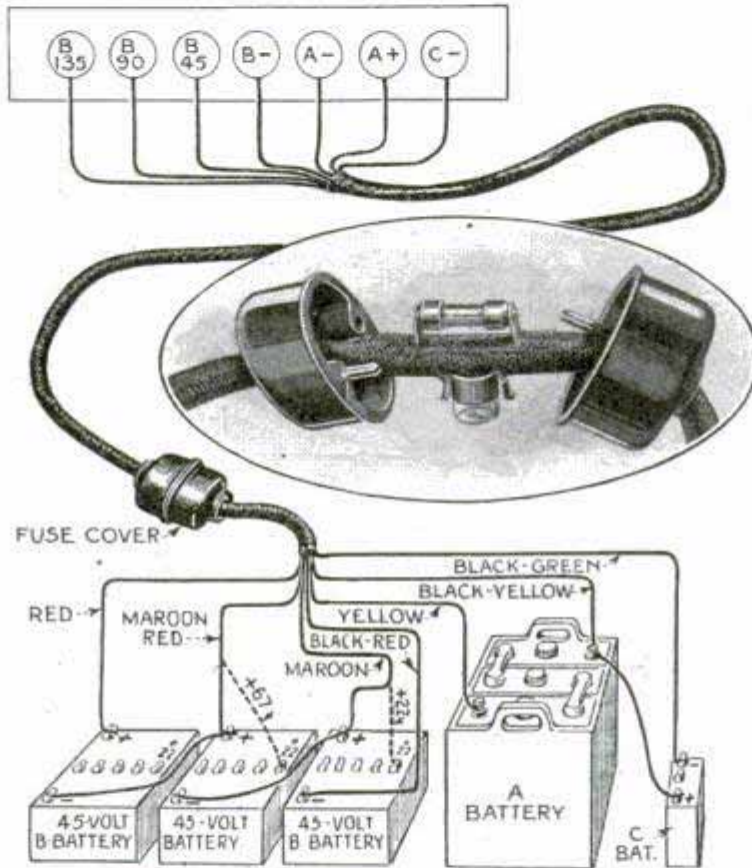
Flexible, rubber-covered wire is rec-

ommended for the battery connections. The jacks are mounted on the subpanel and the set leads soldered to the lugs. The contact springs are held in place by small screws with lock washers under them, to secure a good permanent contact.

Fused Battery Cable Protects Tubes

A new battery cable is provided with fuses designed to protect the tubes, wiring and rheostats in a radio set from short circuits. A small capacity fuse is inserted in the B-negative battery lead, indicated by the black-red wire, and a 2-amp. cartridge fuse is placed in the positive A-battery lead, indicated by the yellow wire. The fuses are removable and are protected from breakage by a bakelite cover held together by two friction pins. These cables are available in five and seven-conductor types, but the position of the fuses is the same in both

types. The B-battery fuse is designed to protect the tube filament from high B-voltage should it be applied through error or accident. It will protect a single tube of the 201-A or WD-12 type, which have a current consumption of .25 amp. or three tubes of the UV-199 type, which consume .06 amp. each.

Side-cutting pliers look very much like other pliers, although in reality they are not pliers at all, and in radio work are far superior to the regular kind with the cutter below the nose; they are especially handy in cutting off wires in difficult places when wiring complicated circuits.

Build a Winter Toboggan Slide

By EARLE W. GAGE

ALTHOUGH making a toboggan chute is a very simple matter, it must not be slighted in the least. As much atten-

tion should be paid to its building as the engineer pays to providing a track for an express train. In fact, few trains travel

at the speed of the average toboggan. A slight miscalculation in a curve will make the swiftly moving toboggan turn turtle; a small deficiency in the edging of the track may turn the swooping thing loose in the unpacked snow and send its passengers to the hospital.

Tobogganing carried on in soft snows on hillsides is great fun, but the iced slides, where high speed can be attained, are the real sport. Such a slide usually crowns the summit of some slight elevation, and the depth of

the drop is made gradual by supporting trestlework, the width of which varies according to the number of chutes desired. These chutes are virtually troughs, flooded and frozen, one separated from the other by means of a ridge of boards and ice at the starting plat-

form, and by frozen-snow sides from that point on. Each groove is the width of a toboggan, so that steering is unnecessary, and the risk of upset and accident is reduced to a minimum.

A very satisfactory slide may be built of planed spruce boards in sections 12 ft. long, each being in the shape of a trough. The inside width of the trough should be 22 in. at the lower and 24 in. at the upper end, the sides being 12 in. high with a flare of 4 in. Four 4 by 4-in. crossbars are used to tie the boards together, each bar extending 4 in. beyond the bottom boards, and carrying a bracket cut from the same size of wood to hold the sides in place.

The crossbar on the upper end of the trough is exactly at the end of the boards; at the lower end it is 4 in. from the end. This allows one trough to lap 4 in. into the other. The bars should be so placed as to butt tightly against each other. The distance between them is divided to equalize the strength of the trough. All edges

and corners are planed off to prevent splinters, and a sharp lookout must be kept on the edges.

The individual troughs are thoroughly nailed, but no nailing is done in putting the slide together. The troughs are simply placed in position on the ground, beginning at the lower end and fitting in each toward the top, leveling under the bars as the ground may require. This chute will be found a very convenient size. The sections are easily handled and packed

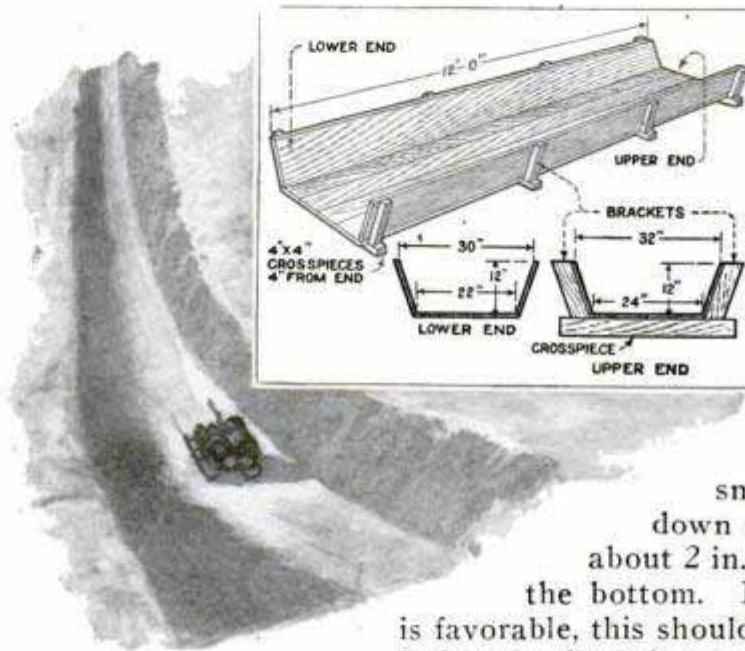
away, and they will last for many years if they are given proper care.

In order to have the chute in good running order, the ice in it must be smooth and keen. It is best prepared by fill-

ing the chute with snow and beating it down firmly until a layer about 2 in. thick is formed in the bottom. If the temperature is favorable, this should be sprinkled until it forms a keen icy surface. After a few days' care and cold weather, the condition of the chute will improve. Should holes form in the ice, they may be patched with snow, sprinkled until it forms a slush and beaten smoothly into the holes.

A line should be drawn from the point in the field where the run is to end, straight to the bottom end of the toboggan slide, and the runs built from the bottom upward, so that the lower sections can be used while the construction of the upper part is still in progress. Sprinkle the snow that has been packed into a groove to provide an icy coat. Never use the run when there is the slightest chance of the runners cutting through, for this will ruin the slide.

The larger runs, where winter sports are the fashion, average anywhere from a quarter to a mile in length, and they have a drop of from a few feet up to several hundred feet. They may have every variety of turn, from the sharp corner to the most gentle curve. There is a 2,100-foot chute on the Hudson river, New York,



where the start is down a slope of not more than 30° , yet the speed attained at once is breathless. The all-wooden toboggans do the chute in from 20 to 26 seconds, and the steel-shod type in from 12 to 17 seconds.

The modern toboggan, described as a skeleton, consists of a light, but exceptionally strong, steel framework with a yard-long padded seat, on which the rider lies flat, steering the craft with hands and feet. In order to secure both strength and lightness, it is built narrow, of well-seasoned, straight-grained wood, fastened together by light crosspieces, usually of steel; the front end is bent up and over to form the hood, and fastened securely by means of wire or leather thongs. Toboggans are 4 to 9 ft. long, about 18 in. wide and hold from one to five passengers.

Emergency Gluepot

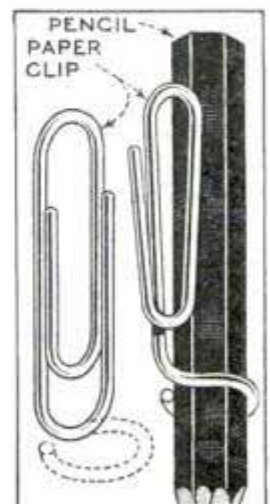
When a large quantity of glue has to be heated and no pot is available, a good one can be made in a few moments. Just get a 25-cent galvanized-iron pail at the hardware store, and pick up an empty 5-gal. oilcan at a neighboring garage. With tin snips, cut the latter off halfway from the top, as shown, bend the sharp edges over toward the inside and hammer them



flat, so that there will be no danger of cutting one's hands. Fill this part about half full of water, put the glue in the pail and set the pail in the can. This makes as good a gluepot as you can wish for.—E. R. Haan, Chicago, Ill.

Paper Fastener Makes Neat Pencil Clip

In offices and schools, where pencils are frequently lost or mislaid and one finds it rather expensive to buy new clips all the time, it is much better to use the cheap and easily made clip shown in the illustration. It is formed from an ordinary paper clip; one end of the clip being bent down and around to form an eye that fits over the pencil snugly, as indicated by the dotted lines. A pair of long-nosed pliers is the best tool to use in doing the bending.

Continuous Supply of Paper for Drawing Table

dimensions are given for the table, but the front edge of the top should be at least 32 in. from the floor, with the top at the rear about 4 in. higher. The table proper should be about 3 ft. wide and 3 or 4 ft. long. Ordinary $\frac{3}{4}$ -in. lumber can be used throughout, except for the legs. These are cut from 2 by 4-in. stock so that each is approximately 2 in. square. Set the legs through the bottom of the table so that they come to the top in each of the four corners, thus providing greater strength. Each leg can be braced at the end by mortising in 1 by 3-in. pieces, and a footrest can be provided if desired. Cut boards for the top with the edges well jointed and with cleats on the underside for additional strength. The top should project over the front about an inch to facilitate lifting and also to give greater arm room. Ordinary hinges can be attached for holding it in place. For the drawing-paper feature, erect two boards at the top and back of the table in an upright position, attaching them with screws through the underside or bracing them with additional pieces on the outside. Provide each upright with a notch to take the rod which holds the paper roll. Place the roll between the uprights and attach a

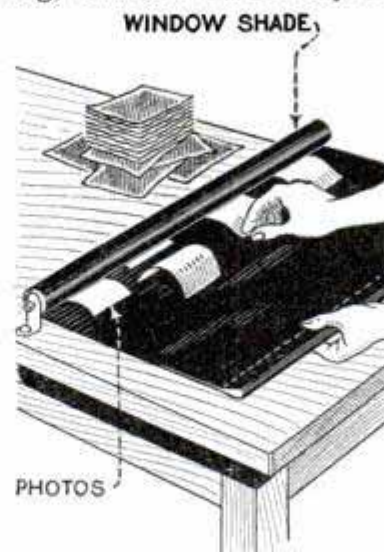
strip of iron or brass to the table top, as shown, by means of bolts. The front edge of the iron strip should be beveled slightly so that the paper will tear smoothly. This strip should be held down snugly. To facilitate pulling out the paper after one piece has been torn off, cut a depression just under the middle of the iron strip in the table top or drill a hole clear through. This will give your thumb and finger room to grasp the paper and pull it.—Dale R. Van Horn, Walton, Nebr.

Priming Wood

Many painters have used yellow ocher for priming because it is cheap, but actually it is most expensive, because it is too coarse to penetrate the pores of the wood and get any kind of an anchorage. It also absorbs moisture, which naturally affects the succeeding coat of paint. Sometimes it comes to the surface after the job has been finished, causing blistering and peeling, and in some cases it has never dried. From these facts it is easy to see that there are some materials which may be inexpensive but lead to a great deal of extra work to correct the error of using them.—L. H. Georger, Buffalo, N. Y.

Photographic Prints Are Flattened in Roller Shade

Photo prints generally curl when drying, but can be readily flattened again by



rolling them in a curtain as shown in the drawing. Of course, the prints are placed on the shade with the concave side down so that, when the shade is rolled, the prints will be turned in the direction op-

posite to the curl and this will flatten them. Sometimes it is necessary to repeat the operation a few times.—Walter X. Brennan, Mt. Clemens, Mich.

Effect of Temperature on Varnish

According to the best experience with varnish there are several points in its application which are of value to assure good work. The quantity of turpentine should be twice that of the oil. Turpentine must be used in all varnish or it will not dry, but less turpentine is needed in summer, because the heat causes the varnish to get thicker. In winter less oil should be used so that the varnish may dry rapidly, and more turpentine to increase the evaporation.

Christmas-Tree Decorations

In decorating Christmas trees a saving can be made by using burned-out electric lamps. They usually can be obtained for the asking, and should be prepared as follows. Using a drill press, small holes are bored through the cement in the base of



the lamps. Wire loops, bent as shown, are slipped into these holes, the bend preventing their easy withdrawal, and the projecting wire is wrapped about the tree branch with ease. The bulbs are dipped into a dilute solution of shellac and dusted with ground glass,

of which different colors are obtainable. While such decorations are, of course, suitable for the home tree, the idea was found especially valuable when it was necessary to decorate a large tree for a public square.—H. E. Benson, Boulder, Colo.

Corrosion in Hot-Water Pipes Prevented by Water Glass

Corrosion in hot-water or steam pipes can easily be prevented by adding $\frac{1}{2}$ gal. of water glass to the water supply and letting it circulate for a day or so before the furnace firing is discontinued. The water glass forms a coating on the inside of the pipes, which effectively prevents rust after the water has been drained out.



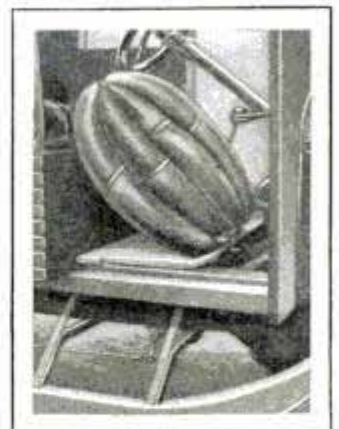
Increasing Capacity of an Ordinary Swing So That Three Can Ride Comfortably

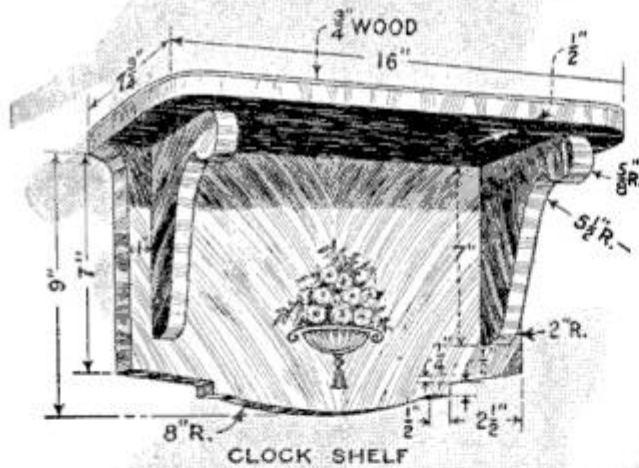

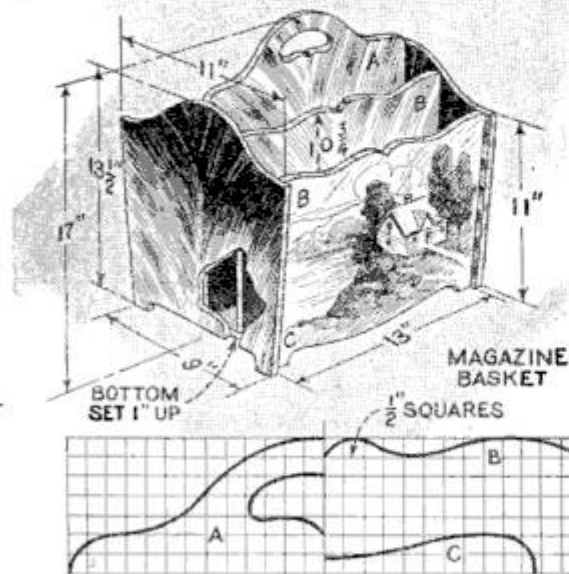

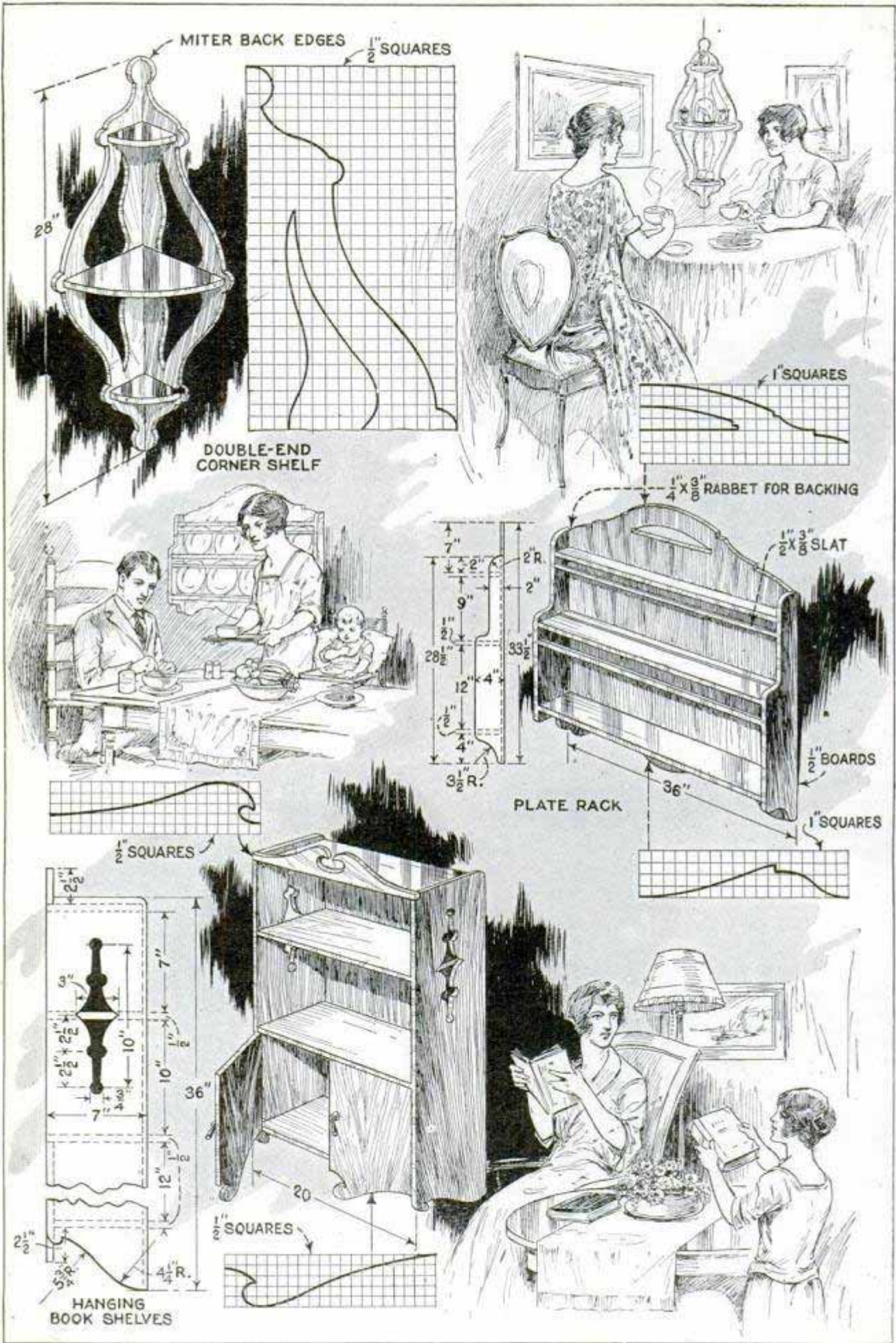
THE cycle is complete and the things our grandmothers considered smart are back with us again. The whatnot, corner shelves, wall brackets, and the like, have come into their own. Those of us who are fortunate enough to have some of these treasures of a former day in our attics can get them out, give them a bit of finishing and make them the envy of our less fortunate friends.

In case you happen to be one of the aforesaid friends, and possess neither attic nor heirlooms, you can, if you are handy with tools, make any of the articles illustrated with just the ordinary tool equipment found around a home. You will be agreeably surprised and pleased to note the change a few articles of this sort will make in a room. The home touch which you may have missed in your modernly furnished rooms can be added in just this way and with a very small expenditure of time and money.

Most of the articles illustrated are small and can be constructed of any close-grained soft wood of the thickness shown. Poplar, gum or white pine are all suitable for the purpose. For two or three of the larger articles, plywood is specified, so that greater width or strength may be obtained without the necessity of increasing the thickness of the pieces and producing a clumsy-looking piece of work.

A cross-section diagram is given of all the curved edges so that you can lay out a full-size pattern easily, or perhaps you may wish to design these curves yourself. If you do so, avoid sharp changes and rather make the lines of the curves long and sweeping.

Brads and finishing nails driven home with a fine nail set are best for fastening objects of this nature. Glue is not advis-



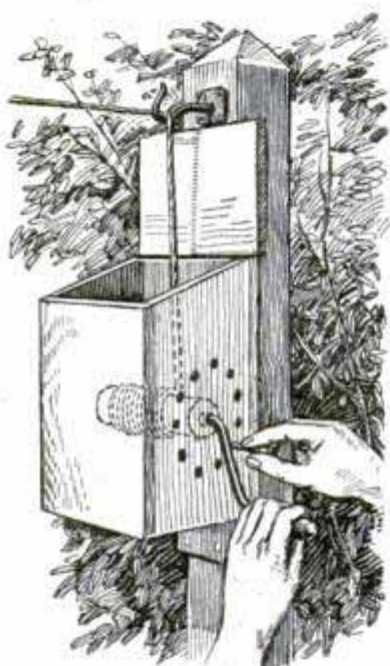
it is almost impossible to get the lacquer out of the brush. Lacquer is not only desirable because of its durability and quick-drying qualities, but also because of the beautiful colors which can be produced so easily. The popular colors for articles of this type are Chinese red, tobacco brown, jade green, Chinese yellow, Holland blue, nickel gray and black. Black may be used effectively for an all-over coat with red or gold stippling, or just for edges or blending. Roman gold is used in

much the same way or as your ingenuity may suggest.

Designs similar to those sketched can be obtained in the form of transfers from most art-material dealers and add greatly to the beauty of these articles, especially if they have rather large parts of the surfaces exposed.

No home workshop member need hesitate about attempting any of the articles illustrated, as he can rely on the finish to cover up minor imperfections.

Box on Pole Stores Clothesline



Winding up the clothesline and taking it into the house is not necessary if the reel and holder shown in the illustration are used. The clothesline can be drawn tight with the crank and can also be held in place by pushing a $\frac{1}{4}$ -in. carriage bolt

through one of the holes in the side, as indicated. When not in use, the line is wound on the roller and the lid closed until wanted again.—Francis W. Henry, Pottsville, Pa.

Concrete Troughs Cast Upside Down

When wooden forms are made for casting concrete troughs, the builder is often confronted with the difficulty of removing the trough intact because the form swells after the concrete is poured. The work can be simplified and the expense of lumber reduced by casting the troughs upside down over earth forms. Lay several planks on the ground, close together and level. Build up a mound of earth, preferably clay or some close-binding soil, to the shape and size of the interior of the trough. Wet it, pat it down and then

cover it with tar paper, pinning the latter in position with a few nails stuck through the paper into the form. Build a board form for the sides and ends of the trough, making it several inches wider and longer than the dirt form, and place it over the latter. The form should be about 4 in. higher than the mound. Pour in the concrete and allow it to set for three or four days. Then, by knocking off one side of the wooden form, the rest may be removed. The resulting trough can be picked up and turned over, and the rough corners and edges can then be smoothed off. This method saves much time in form building and gives just as good a job.—L. B. Robbins, Harwich, Mass.

Driving Screwhooks into Ceiling

When fastening screwhooks in ceilings or other places for ceiling fans, fixtures, gymnasium equipment, etc., I have found the following method entirely satisfactory.

First drill a hole a little smaller than the screwhook and then insert another hook in the brace instead of the bit. Start the screwhook into the hole and drive it home as shown in the drawing.—Thos. F. Johnson, Schulenburg, Texas

Build Your Own Ship Model

By J. EARLE MILLER



Parts 1 and 2 appeared in the October and November issues

YOU are now ready for the stakes, or bands of molding, along the hull, which serve both for ornament and as bumpers to protect the ship when rubbing against the dock. The stakes are $\frac{3}{16}$ in. thick and $\frac{1}{2}$ in. wide. Start with the top band along the poop. It begins on the line of the main-deck rail, where the latter curves sharply upward to meet the poop rail, and runs back, parallel to the latter and $\frac{3}{8}$ in. beneath it. Glue and pin it in place. The next stake runs along the top edge of the solid main-deck bulwark, just beneath the stanchions, and continues the full length from stern to fo'c'sle. The curve of the bulwark gives the correct line, and when carried out to the stern, the stake will be parallel to the first one. The same curve is carried forward and upward along the fo'c'sle so that the stake is parallel to the fo'c'sle bulwark line. A short stake is glued along the bulwark, just beneath the open rail, and uprights connect it at front and back of the forecastle with the long stake below. Between the uprights, a narrower stake divides the fo'c'sle side into two panels. It is so placed as to continue the main-deck rail line. The next long stake starts at the beak rail, and continues aft the length of the ship, parallel to the stake above.

Another full-length stake starts at the top of the beak bulwarks and continues aft, parallel to the one above. The final

stake, marking the water line, carries the line of the lower edge of the stem back in a gentle sweep to the point of greatest width at the stern, just above where the hull turns in sharply to form the stern lines. Instead of following the stem and hull lines it starts with a knee, roughly triangular in shape, forming additional bracing for the stem. Cut the knee to the shape shown, and carve or file down the edges to fit the lines of the stem and hull. Glue and pin it in place, and then fit the long stake. The final task on each side is to break up the top panel beneath the poop rail with five ornamental uprights. Cut a strip of basswood, $\frac{3}{8}$ in. wide and $\frac{1}{16}$ in. thick. At intervals of $\frac{3}{8}$ in. along its center line drill $\frac{5}{16}$ -in. holes, and then, with a knife, cut off sections, slicing through the center line of each hole. The result is small pieces, somewhat like an hourglass in shape. Five are required for each side, placing them equally. Only two stakes are required across the stern, placed as shown. From the same stock, cut three pieces and glue and pin them across the break of the poop, quarter and fo'c'sle decks, flush with the deck line.

The cradle may be made at any time, but is handy to have before the rigging starts, as it keeps the boat upright. It is cut from $\frac{1}{2}$ -in. white pine, using two pieces $2\frac{1}{2}$ by $6\frac{1}{2}$ in. They are joined by two braces, $6\frac{1}{2}$ in. long, which may be made of round dowel stock, square, or, if

a lathe is available, turned to an attractive shape, as was done in the case of this model. The end members are cut as shown in the sketch. Find the center point on the keel, measure $3\frac{1}{4}$ in. each way and bend two pieces of radio bus wire or wire solder to shape around the keel and sides of the hull. Lay the wire down on the end members of the cradle, adjusting it so that it comes just within the ends, keeping the center on the center line of the wood. Mark along the inner edge of the wire with a pencil, and, with a coping saw, cut out the cradle. After it is assembled, final fitting can be done with a file. The cradle is completed by gluing strips of green or brown felt along the top and bottom surfaces.

The deck furniture comes next. The inside of the bulwarks and the ends of the poop, quarterdeck and forecastle should be painted at this stage, and windows and doors added. The color scheme decided on for this boat was light gray or white underbody, black upperworks, with a French gray or white panel below the rails, so a deeper, pure gray was used for deck furniture and the inside surfaces. The best results are obtained by using automobile paints ground in japan, and sold in 4-oz. tubes. The japan colors dry much quicker than paints mixed in oil, and this is emphasized by cutting the paints as they come from the tube with enough turpentine to make a thick cream.

The doors to deck house and forecastle are cut from the grained paper pasted on cigar boxes to imitate wood, and a narrow black border is painted around them to represent the frame. The windows are painted with black borders and crossbars, and aluminum paint, the kind that comes in powder form with a separate can of solvent, is used for glass, while the shadows are touched up with a dash of light blue in the corner of the glass.

The deck furniture needed for this model includes four hatch covers, one windlass, a lifeboat, pump, a carved block and a bitt or bollard. The details of all are given in the sketches. The hatch covers are cut from $\frac{1}{8}$ -in. wood; their edges and a band around the top are painted black to represent the hatch coaming, and the center is painted a light brown, to represent time-worn and sea-stained can-

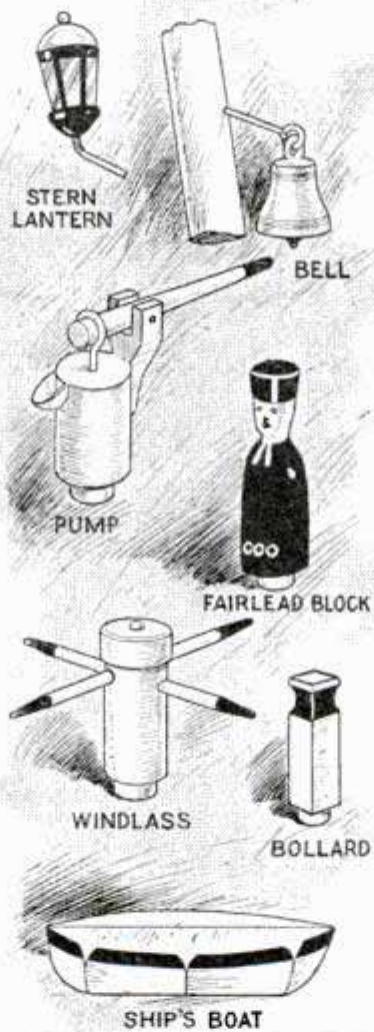
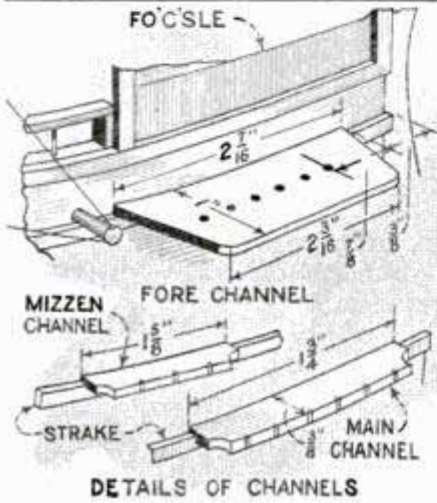
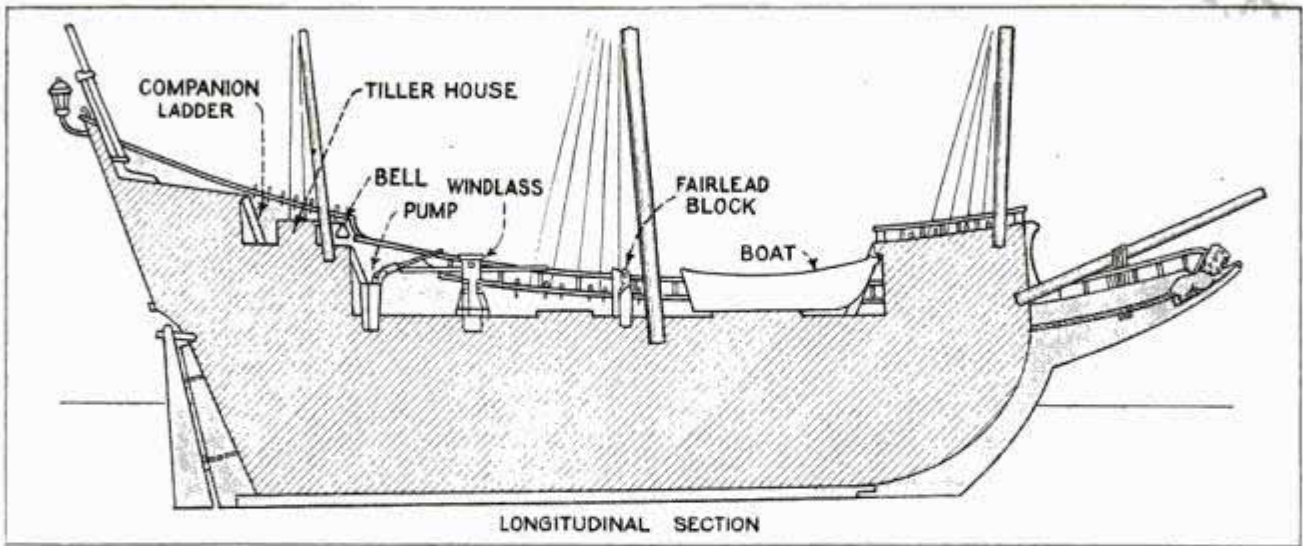
vas covers. The windlass and pump are made from pieces of $\frac{1}{8}$ and $\frac{7}{16}$ -in. dowel stock. The base of the capstan is notched to take the pawls, which are cut from wood and glued to the deck (see deck plan). The pump handle is glued in the notched support which in turn is glued to the side of the upright barrel; a spout, cut from $\frac{1}{8}$ -in. dowel rod and hollowed out, is glued in a hole drilled in the side, and the inner end of the pump handle is fastened to a wire which passes down through a hole drilled through the center of the barrel.

The lifeboat can be whittled from a piece of 1-in. pine. The top is beveled down $\frac{1}{8}$ in. on each side, and this surface painted the same brown as is used on the hatch covers, to represent the canvas cover. Lashing ropes are painted around the sides, and the underbody is white, with a black band around the gunwale. When assembled, the boat is lashed with black linen thread to short pins driven into the sides of the largest hatch cover, and the latter is then glued in place on the deck.

The carved figure or fairlead block that carries in its middle the block by which the main-yard lifts are led aft to the capstan, and from there to the belaying bitt, presented the greatest difficulty. Such carved figures were common on these old ships. The difficulty was finally solved when a set of tiny $1\frac{1}{2}$ in. high Noah's-ark figures, carved from wood and painted, were found in a toy store. Two small holes were drilled through Noah's stomach, spacing them $\frac{1}{8}$ in. apart, and the space between carved slightly, so that it resembled the pulley wheel of a block.

Three sets of ladders, to forecastle, quarter and poopdecks, complete the deck equipment. They are cut from $\frac{1}{16}$ by $\frac{3}{16}$ -in. white pine. The ends are beveled off to fit deck and wall, and steps, $\frac{3}{8}$ in. long, glued in place, each assembly being held together with the small clamps until the glue has set thoroughly.

All the deck furniture is painted before being glued in place. Pure gray, the same as on the bulwarks, was used, with black for the ends of the pump handle and capstan bars, and the part of the bitt where the rope would chafe. The ladder treads were done in gray and the sides in black.

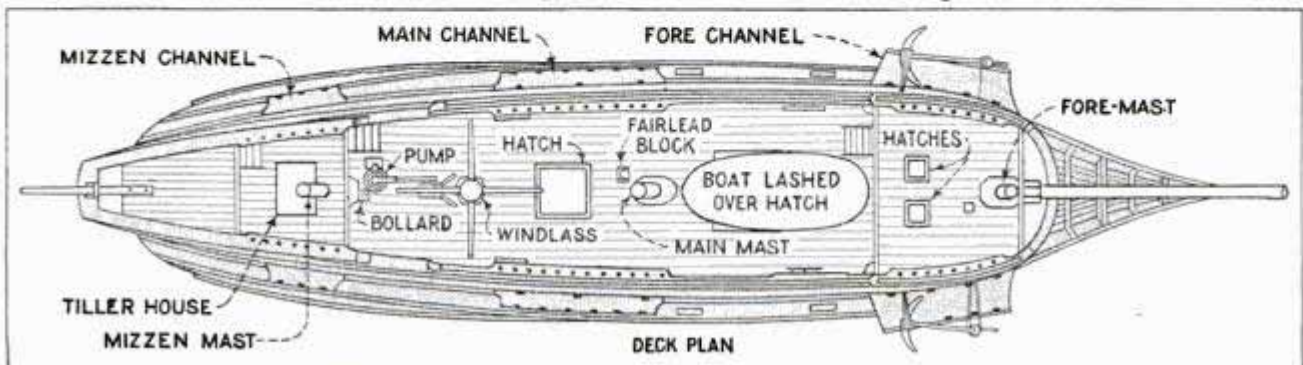
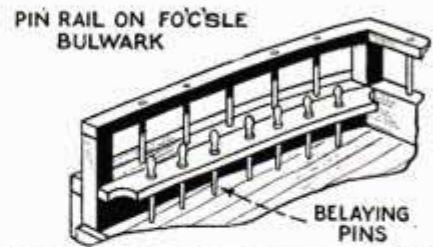


notches cut to half the width of the first strake below the main-deck line. Their position is shown in the plan view, and dimensions for cutting them are also given.

For the gun ports, draw a line straight down from the after end of the fore-castle, then measure back $\frac{3}{4}$ in. between the second and third strakes. That gives the front line of the open gun port. Lay out a $\frac{1}{2}$ -in. square, drill holes in each corner, $\frac{1}{4}$ in. deep, and, with a chisel, cut out the port. The gun is made from $\frac{7}{16}$ -in. dowel stock, $\frac{3}{4}$ in. long, $\frac{1}{2}$ in. showing and

The deck plan shown will be sufficient guide for placing the furniture.

Pin rails, to carry the belaying pins, channels, through which the shrouds are fastened, guns, gun ports and port covers, and the ornaments of the stern, complete the work on the hull. There are three channels on each side, cut from $\frac{3}{32}$ -in. basswood, and glued and pinned in place in



the other $\frac{1}{4}$ in. glued into a hole drilled in the back of the port. Paint the inside of the open port dark gray, gild the gun itself with gold enamel, and paint the tip of the muzzle either with black or silver paint. The port cover is $\frac{1}{2}$ in. square, cut from $\frac{1}{8}$ -in. basswood. Drill a small hole near the edge in the center of one side and fasten a short piece of wire. Drill a No. 60 hole through the bulwark, just above the deck line, pass the wire through, twist the end to prevent its pulling out, and glue the other edge of the port cover to the top of

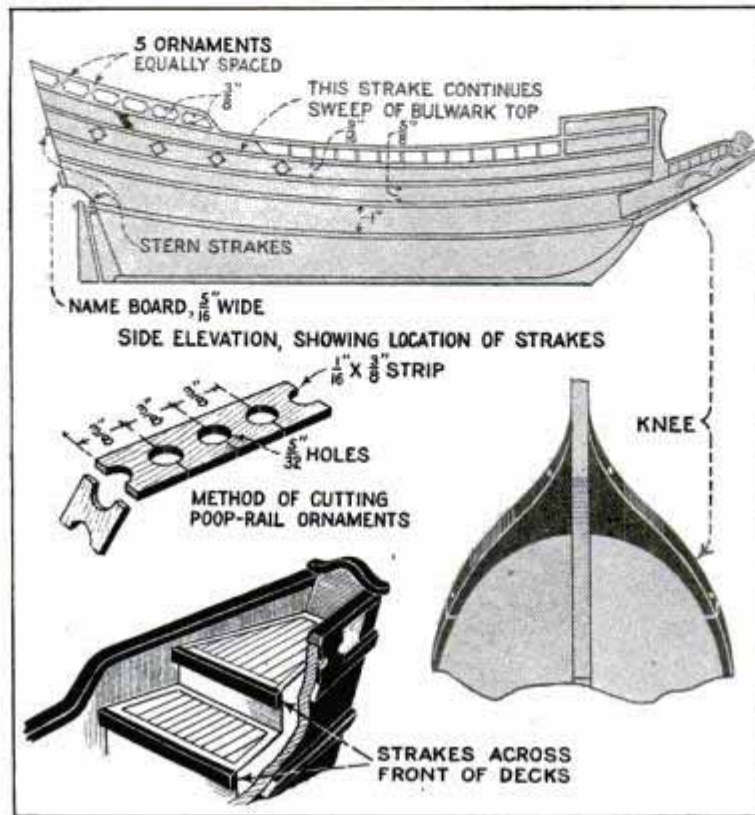
the port opening, letting it stand out at an angle of 45 degrees.

The front edge of the second port cover is 2 in. aft of the rear edge of the open gun port. The cover is cut to the same size as that for the open port, a similar wire lanyard attached and fastened through the bulwark, and the cover itself glued flat to the hull.

The pin rails are cut from $\frac{1}{8}$ by $\frac{1}{4}$ -in. basswood. The foremast rails run the length of the fo'c'sle deck on each side, and are glued and pinned to the bulwarks, flush with their top. The mainmast pin rails are $3\frac{1}{2}$ in. long, and are fastened in the same way to the bulwarks of the main deck, their front end being $3\frac{3}{4}$ in. aft of the forecastle. The mizzenmast pin rails are $1\frac{3}{4}$ in. long and are fastened to the solid bulwarks of the poop, about $\frac{3}{8}$ in. above the deck and approximately on the same line as the main-deck rail. Before attaching the pin rails drill No. 60 holes in them at $\frac{1}{4}$ -in. intervals, to take the belaying pins, to which all the loose tackle ends later will be fastened.

The stern ornaments include a lamp, the half moon, two small shields and two windows, painted on port covers. The lamp, $\frac{5}{8}$ in. thick at its greatest width and $1\frac{3}{16}$ in. high, can be cut from an ordinary

cork, or carved from wood. A bead, glued to the top will serve as the ball. The five faces are cut down flat and painted with aluminum paint, to represent the glass, while narrow black lines between them take the place of the iron bars of the frame. The top is gilded, and the ball painted black, as is the base. Drill a No. 58 hole in the center of the base,

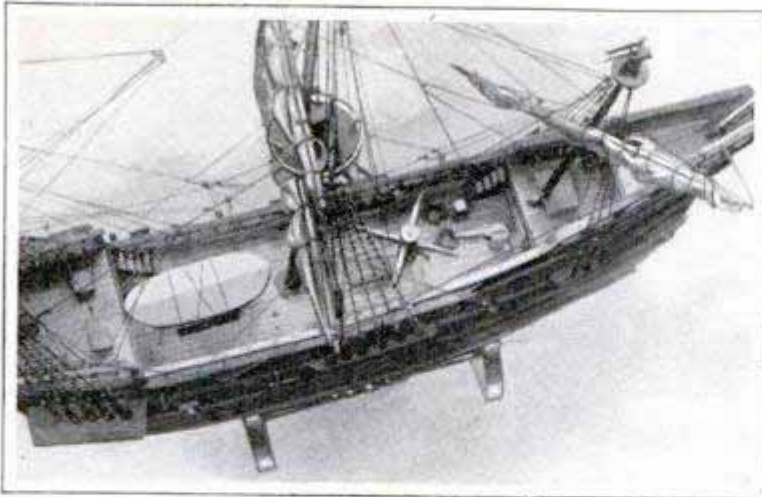


and a corresponding hole in the stern bulwark, $\frac{3}{8}$ in. below the rail top. Cut a short piece of wire, insert one end in the bulwark hole and the other in the lamp, and then bend it upward until the lamp is parallel to the stern.

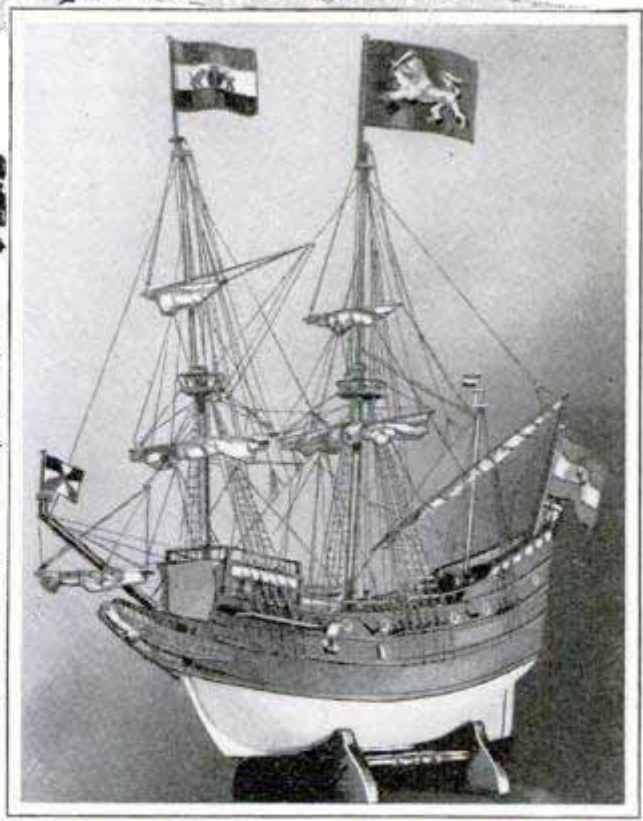
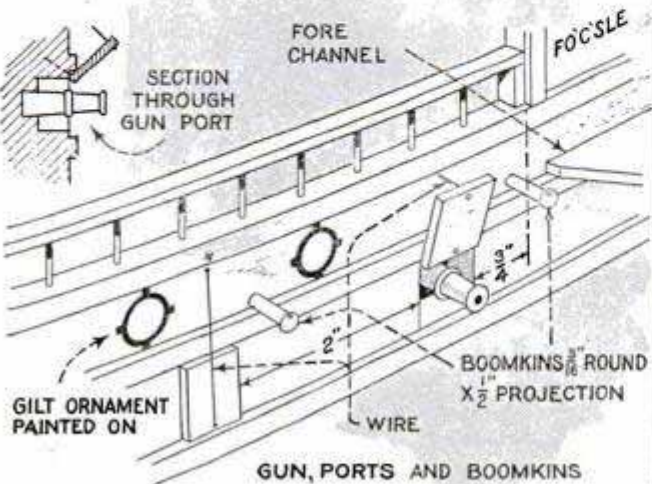
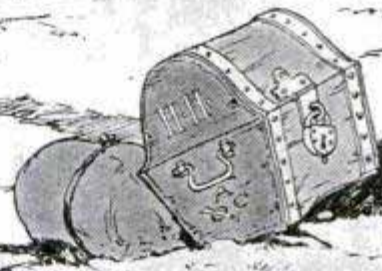
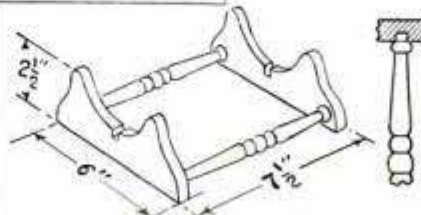
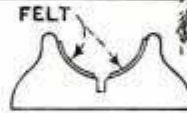
The half moon is sawed from a piece of $\frac{1}{16}$ -in. basswood. Gild it with gold paint and then add the eye, nose and mouth lines with black paint. The shields for the two coats of arms are cut from the same thickness of wood and painted red for the background, the lion on the one in gold, and the bend on the other in gold, with three small crosses of black. The windows are painted on $\frac{1}{2}$ -in. port covers with aluminum paint, set off with black borders and cross lines. (See the stern view in Part I.)

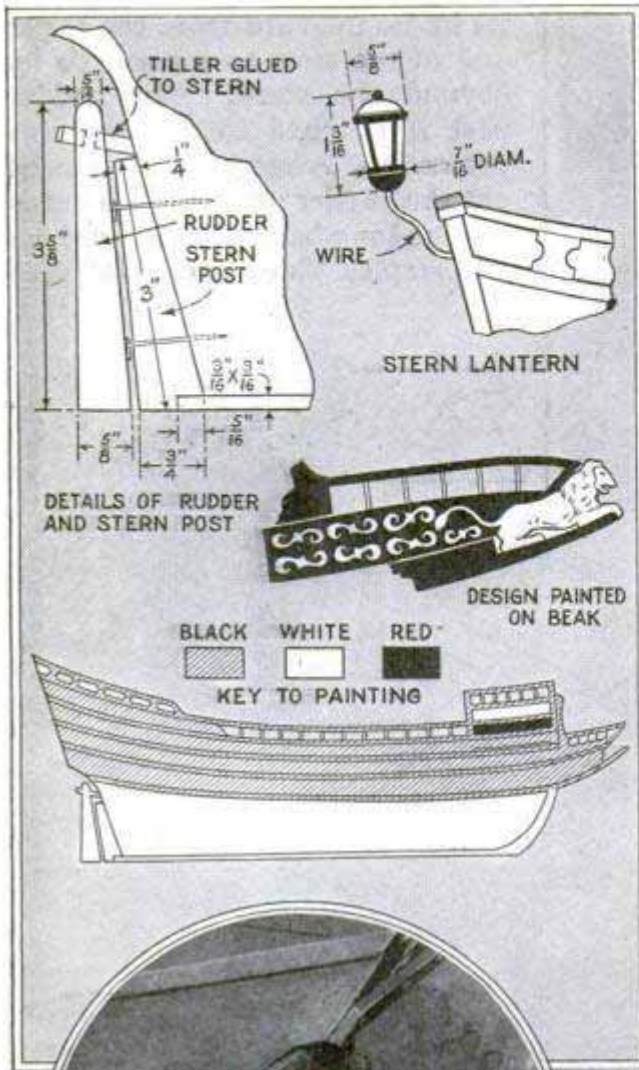
Beneath the windows, and just above the sharp break where the stern is cut inward, a name board, $\frac{1}{4}$ in. wide by $\frac{1}{8}$ in. thick, is glued in place.

Add the keel, rudder and rudder post, made and fitted as shown, and you are ready to start painting the hull. The keel,



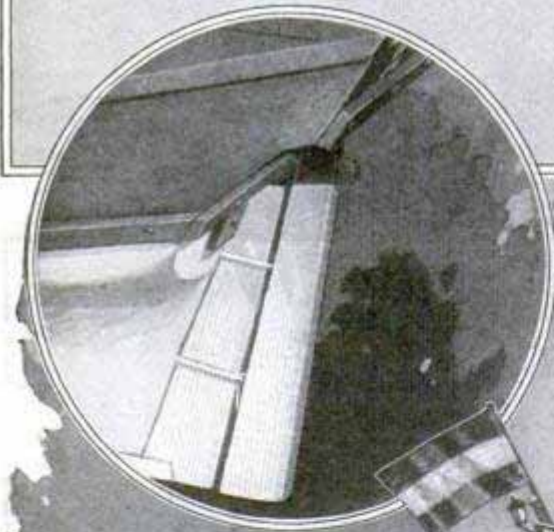
$\frac{3}{16}$ by $\frac{3}{16}$ in., runs from the lower end of the stem to a point $\frac{5}{16}$ in. beyond the stern. The rudder post is notched to fit over this projection. After you have sawed out the rudder post, cut the heads off two long bank pins, bend them into staples, glue the post in place





and then slip the staples around it and drive them into the hull. Leave the staples projecting slightly from the post until the rudder is attached. Cut the rudder, like the rudder post, from $\frac{3}{16}$ -in. basswood, drill a $\frac{3}{32}$ -in. hole through it to take the tiller bar, which is made in two sections, $\frac{3}{16}$ in. wide and $\frac{1}{8}$ in. thick. Round the ends to fit into the $\frac{3}{32}$ -in. hole, and glue them in. Next cut the heads from two common pins, bend them to form right angles, and drive the pointed ends into the rudder at the proper points so that, when the ends projecting downward are slipped into the staples around the rudder post, the lower end of the rudder will be on a line with the keel. Two more port covers, each $\frac{1}{2}$ -in. square, are glued on either side of the rudder, just below the water-line strake.

The boat is now ready for painting. The color scheme for this boat called for a light gray underbody, which was obtained by mixing French gray and a small amount of pure gray, to get a color which avoided

the chalky appearance of straight French gray. White can be used if desired. Underbody, stem up to the knees, and the rudder and rudder post below the waterline, were painted with this. The two port covers on the stern, below the painted water line, were done in black.

The upper part of the hull was painted a dead black, with the exception of the top panel on the poop and the two panels on the forecastle sides. The upper one of these, and the space between the ornaments on the poop panel, were painted with French gray, and the lower of the forecastle panels with the oriental red used on the coats of arms on the stern. The beak bulwarks and that part of the stem including the knees, which comes above the water line, were painted black, the figurehead was gilded, and two bands of gilded designs run, one along the beak bulwarks and the other along the stem, from the lion's tail back to the hull, filling in the space between the knees and the floor of the beak. Six gold ornaments were painted along the sides, as indicated in the sketches. These are simply $\frac{1}{2}$ -in. circles, with four projecting arms, forming the tips of a cross. The closed gun ports were given a narrow gold border to make them stand out from the hull.

The upper part of the stern requires more work. The bulwark rail, the edges down to the name plate, including the ends of the strakes, were given the effect of molding by painting a simple running design. The space around the half moon was broken up with four small gold stars, the name plate "Halve Maen" painted in gold, and the monogram of the company owning the boat, the Ostindische Cie van Amsterdam, painted between the two coats of arms, which represent the heraldic figures of the municipal arms of Amsterdam at the time of Hudson's adventures in America.

Next month's article will tell how to make the masts and spars and rig the ship.

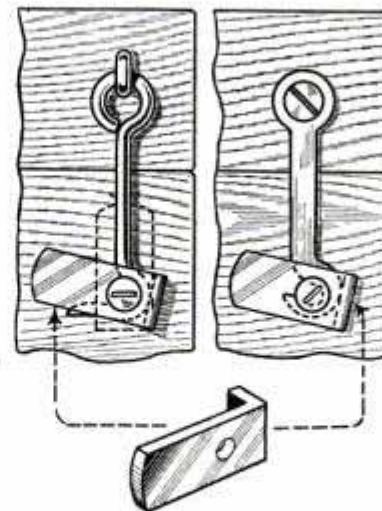
Clip Keeps Notebook in Vest Pocket

Machinists, foremen, and others who carry a notebook or price list in their vest pocket, frequently lose them when stooping over. By obtaining an ordinary pencil clip and attaching it to the book, as shown in the drawing, this can be avoided, and it also prevents the book from falling to the bottom of a deep pocket.—A. Bereskin, Winnipeg, Can.



Safety Catch for Door Hook

Often it is desired to lock covers of boxes, doors and cupboards by means of ordinary hooks, and in cases where these might open by vibration or sudden jars, it is a good idea to provide a safety catch to prevent this. Get a brass plate, about the size, in proportion to the hook, shown in the illustration, bend it at right angles at one end and drill a hole in it as indicated. The screw on which the hook catches is



removed and is then replaced with the brass plate in position. It must, of course, be free to turn easily. When the plate is held in the position indicated by the dotted lines of the left-hand detail,

the hook can be slipped off the screw, but when in the horizontal position, to which it naturally falls by gravity, the hook is securely locked.

Ladder Repaired with Wire



If your ladder is at the stage where it threatens to give way when you are half-way up, it is well worth while to spend an hour repairing it. To do this, get a plow plane and groove a path along the sides of the two standards, making the groove about $\frac{1}{16}$ in. deep. Next get some

heavy galvanized-iron wire, insert it in the groove, and stretch it tight, using small staples to hold it in place. You can get the wire very tight if you take your time, and after the job is completed, you will find that your ladder is much stronger.

Floors Painted in Two Colors to Improve Appearance

In trying to improve the appearance of a worn softwood floor one usually tries to figure out what paint to use and what color would be most attractive. On this basis the paint is bought and the job done, the result being a more or less indifferent effect in a single color, which grows tiresome in time. The drawing shows methods of floor decoration, which have been followed out with pleasing effect. If nothing elaborate is desired, borders can be painted around



the room that should be in lighter and darker colors contrasting to the rest of the floor. For example, a foot from the wall a strip, about 2 in. wide, is laid off and marked with a chalkline; the main floor space is painted gray, the border darker and the space between it and the baseboard, either a lighter or darker color as desired. Then there is the alternative of painting the space between the narrow border and the baseboard checker-fashion, in order to obtain something of the effect of marquetry flooring.

Disinfecting Poultry

A Wisconsin poultryman uses a novel and simple method for disinfecting the birds of his flock, as shown in the illustration. A cloth bag of coarse weave, somewhat similar to window-curtain material, is partly filled with disinfecting powder and this is tacked above the small door of the poultry house so that fowls entering or leaving the house must brush it with their backs.



Each movement of the sack sifts a small quantity of the powder into their feathers, and, as the process is repeated many times each day, the thorough disinfection of each fowl is insured.

Don't Grease the Springs

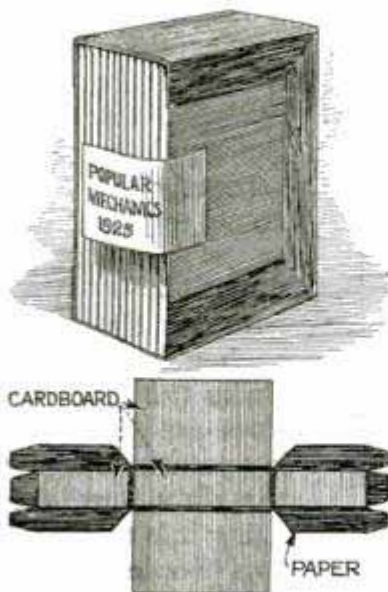
One of the things the automobile driver is prone to do in the attempt to make his car ride as easily as possible is to jack up the car, pry the spring leaves apart, and apply a liberal coating of grease or lubricating oil between the leaves. Some cars may be designed to use lubricant between the leaves; however, in the majority, this practice is not only unnecessary, but, in addition, is apt to ruin the riding qualities of the car for a considerable time. Most cars are designed and sprung so there must be friction between the leaves; not enough friction so that the car will ride hard or

squeak, but enough to give a cushioning effect and an easy spring action, instead of the oscillating action that a coil spring will give, for example. When the springs are lubricated the friction is destroyed, and the car bounces, and keeps on bouncing, when it passes over the slightest bump.

The only thing that is necessary to do with most springs is to keep them free from rust, and this may be accomplished by brushing a little penetrating oil, not lubricating oil, along the sides of the leaves occasionally. Spring covers are an excellent precaution against the entrance of moisture between the leaves, and they should be used wherever possible. Where the owner does not want to apply spring covers, on the score of expense, an excellent substitute can be made by wrapping the springs with a layer of black friction tape. This makes a close-fitting cover, and one that will wear for a long time. The last turns can be bound with a turn or two of wire, and the tape given a coat of enamel, to improve both the appearance and the moisture resistance. If in doubt whether the springs should be lubricated or not, write the manufacturer, but don't apply lubricant, until you know for sure that it will be of benefit.

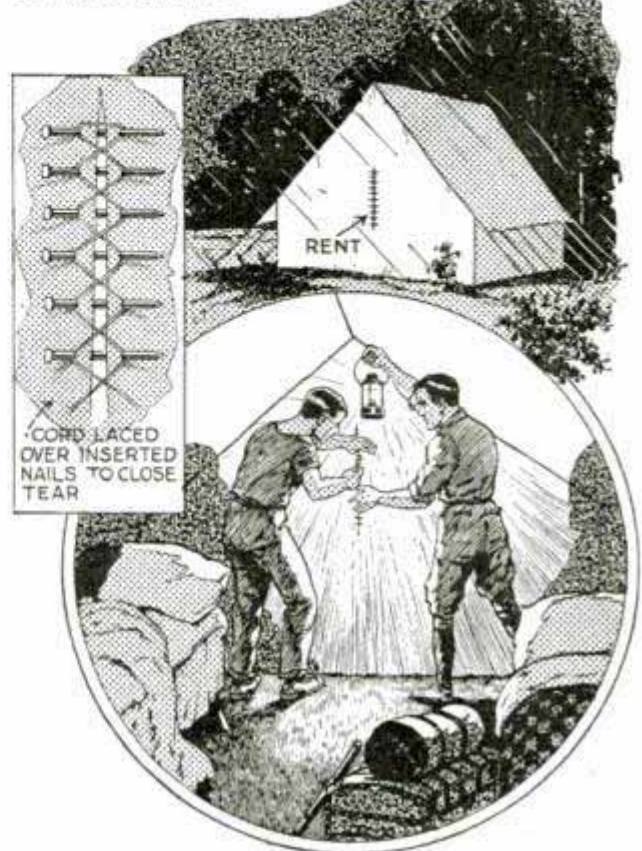
Cardboard Carton Files Magazines

Magazines can be kept together in neat cardboard cartons made to fit over them snugly. Get some heavy paper of the tough, brown fiber kind and cut it out as shown in the lower detail, reinforcing it by gluing on pieces of cardboard. The overlapping edges of the paper are then glued down over the sides, to form a carton. To keep a number of issues in the carton, remove the advertising and file the magazines in loose-leaf form.



Simple Repair for Torn Tent

During a heavy rainstorm a party of campers had the misfortune to have the wall

of their tent torn and were at a loss to repair it as no needle was available. However, the rent was satisfactorily closed by means of nails, as shown in the drawing. The nails were stuck through the canvas from the inside across the rent, leaving the heads and points projecting so that a length of twine could be laced over them. In this way the edges of the canvas were drawn together. Had the nails been lacking, green twigs with sharpened ends might have been used quite as effectively.

Test for Detecting Sewer Gas

If you suspect sewer gas but cannot readily determine whether it is that or some other odor, here is a good test: Soak a piece of white unglazed paper in a mixture of 1 oz. of lead acetate and a $\frac{1}{2}$ pt. of rain or distilled water. When the paper is thoroughly dry place it in the suspicious locality and if sewer gas is present the paper will shortly turn dark.—L. B. Robbins, Harwich, Mass.

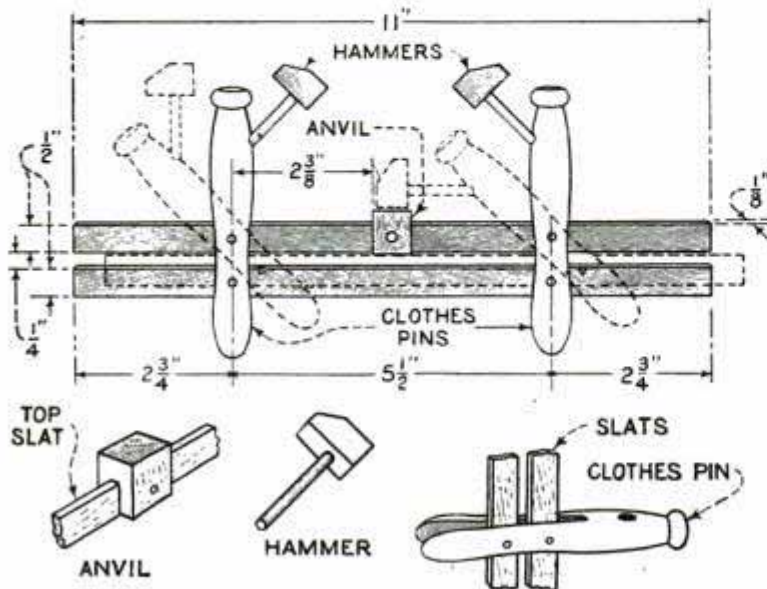

are sandpapered smooth and are then carved and painted, or merely painted, to resemble men. Two $\frac{1}{8}$ -in. slats, $\frac{1}{2}$ in. wide and 11 in. long, are also sandpapered smooth so that they will fit loosely between the slot in the clothespins, where they are attached with headless wire nails at points $5\frac{1}{2}$ in. apart, as indicated in the drawing that shows the dimensions and

which consist of small blocks whittled to shape with a jackknife, and short lengths of $\frac{1}{8}$ -in. dowel stock, or similar round pieces, carved from any piece of wood. Glue is used to hold the handles of the hammers in the clothespins and in the hammer heads. The anvil is attached to the upper slat, as indicated, it being cut to straddle the slat and then nailed on. Its size should be such that the two hammers will strike it alternately at the time the slats come together as they are pulled or pushed lengthwise in opposite directions by two playmates. The hammer shanks must also be of such a length that the heads will strike the anvil squarely when the slats are pulled. Usually this toy is operated by grasping the end of the slats, but another method of using it is to set it on the table with two people to operate it. It is also possible to run this toy with a small engine. In that case, the bottom slat should be fastened rigidly to



a wooden base and the upper slat joined with a connecting rod to the flywheel of the motor. A toy of this type is strong and will afford endless amusement for the children.

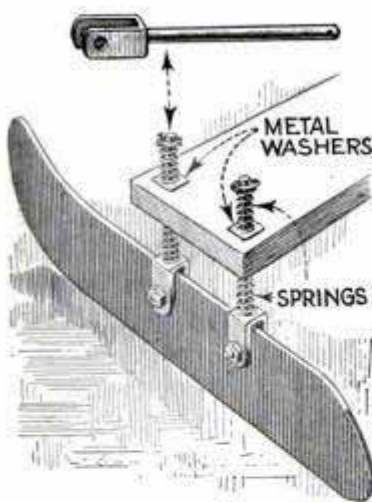
How to Detect Rosin Varnish

It does not take long to learn that varnish containing rosin is a very inferior grade. The best test to detect a rosin varnish is to rub the ball of the finger over it. If the varnish used is of good quality, the shine of the polish will be increased, but if it is rosin varnish, the rubbed spot will appear dull. This proves that rosin varnish is not hard enough to withstand wear of any kind. One should always be sure, when buying varnish, to get the best. Naturally the cheapness of rosin varnish has brought it into use in many homes, which have been built for price and not for service. It will pay anyone to avoid anything in varnishes which has a rosin base, for it will be ruined by water.—L. H. Georger, Buffalo, N. Y.

Shock-Absorbing Iceboat Runners

The usual method of fastening iceboat runners is to use a single bolt through the runner and the chock, which gives no resiliency whatever, and results in making the iceboat travel uncomfortably. The method shown in the illustration involves the use of two iron chocks for each runner.

Long bolts are welded to the chocks to stand vertically. The bolts are slipped through holes drilled in the ends of the runner plank, and steel coil springs are provided above and below the plank to serve as shock absorbers. A washer and cotter pin at the upper end of each bolt, above the top spring, keep the runners in position securely.



Fountain Provides Water for Dogs

A plumber of Huron, S. Dak., arranged a water fountain in the street to provide water for dogs. A square depression,

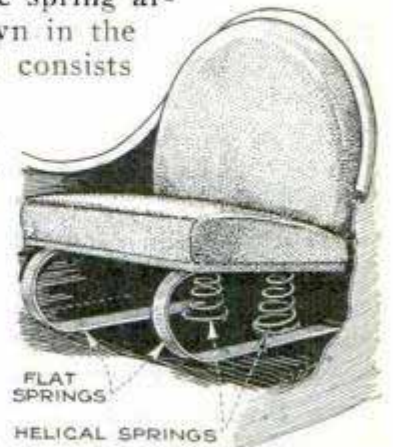


Overflow of Water Fountain Provides for Thirsty Dogs in Sidewalk Depression

about 4 in. deep, was made in the concrete next to the curb. During the summer months the overflow from the fountain was directed into it, the recess itself having an overflow into the gutter. Spring Construction for Seat of Racing Auto

Additional riding comfort on bucket seats for racing-type autos can be gained by providing the spring arrangement shown in the illustration. It consists of two U-shaped supports, made from old carriage springs, which are drilled at the ends for bolts, and bent at the centers. To obtain the required stiffness, two or more helical springs are attached to the flat springs as indicated.—G. A. Luers, Washington, D. C.





Swing for Indoor or Outdoor Use Is Adjustable and Can Be Used Also as a Trapeze

Combined Swing and Trapeze Adjustable for Children of Various Ages

All youngsters love to swing. The problem of making one swing serve for children of various ages and sizes was solved in the following manner: A sufficient length of $\frac{7}{8}$ -in. manila rope, two 25-cent swivel rope hitches, a pair of iron rings and a plain-board seat were obtained. If available, a pair of swinging rings, such as are shown in the photo, come in handy but are not essential. The height of the seat can be regulated by lengthening or shortening the free ends of the suspension ropes through the hitches. The advantages of the latter are that they do away with the tying of knots, are easily adjusted and do not slip as a carelessly tied knot may do. By removing the seat and rais-

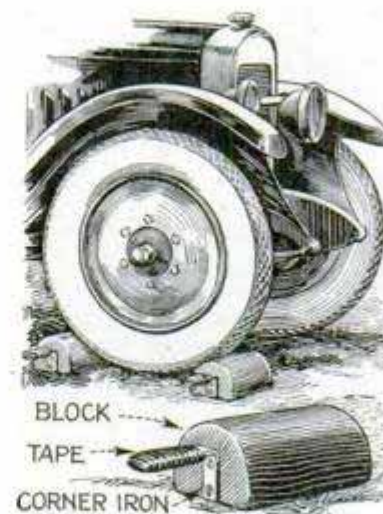
ing the rings a swinging trapeze is formed which is much enjoyed by children, as well as adults. The swing can be arranged either indoors or outdoors.—Elizabeth S. Friedman, Washington, D. C.

Refinishing Old Canvas Canoes

Canvas canoes, which have been painted from year to year with all the colors of the rainbow, sometimes need a good treatment of paint remover. To get rid of the coats of old paint without damage to the canvas offers a problem to many, but can be done in the following way: Apply any good paint or varnish remover and allow it to stand 10 minutes; then use a scrubbing brush dipped in gasoline. This should be done outdoors where there is plenty circulation of air. Never use a putty knife, as this has put more holes in canvas canoes than any other method of removing paint. A stiff scrubbing brush or large-size nail brush will do the work nicely. A little hard work with the brush and gasoline and paint remover will prove far more efficient than any other method, as the chance of slipping and cutting holes is eliminated.—L. Georger, Buffalo, N. Y.

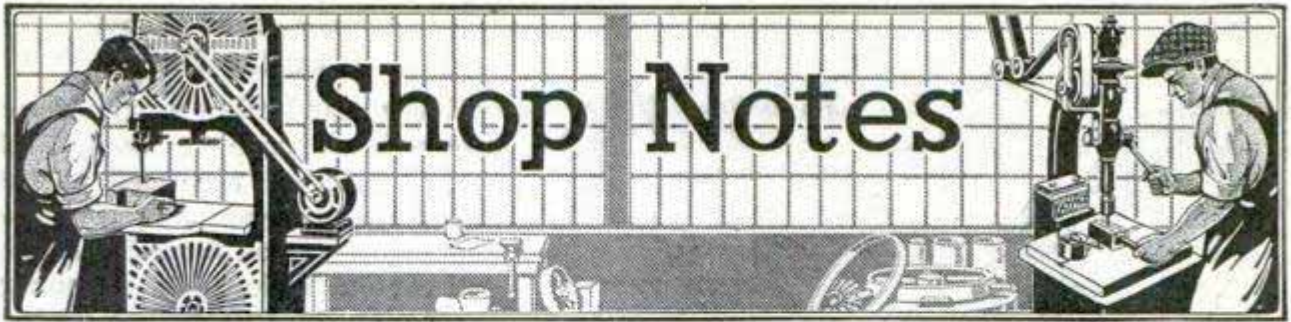
Safety Blocks Hold Auto Wheels

It is rather a serious matter if any of the cars fitted with disk or wire wheels run off the jack when changing wheels. To prevent this, it is a good plan to carry

screwed to the end of each block and wrapped with tape. The handles allow the blocks to be placed without danger of pinching the fingers.



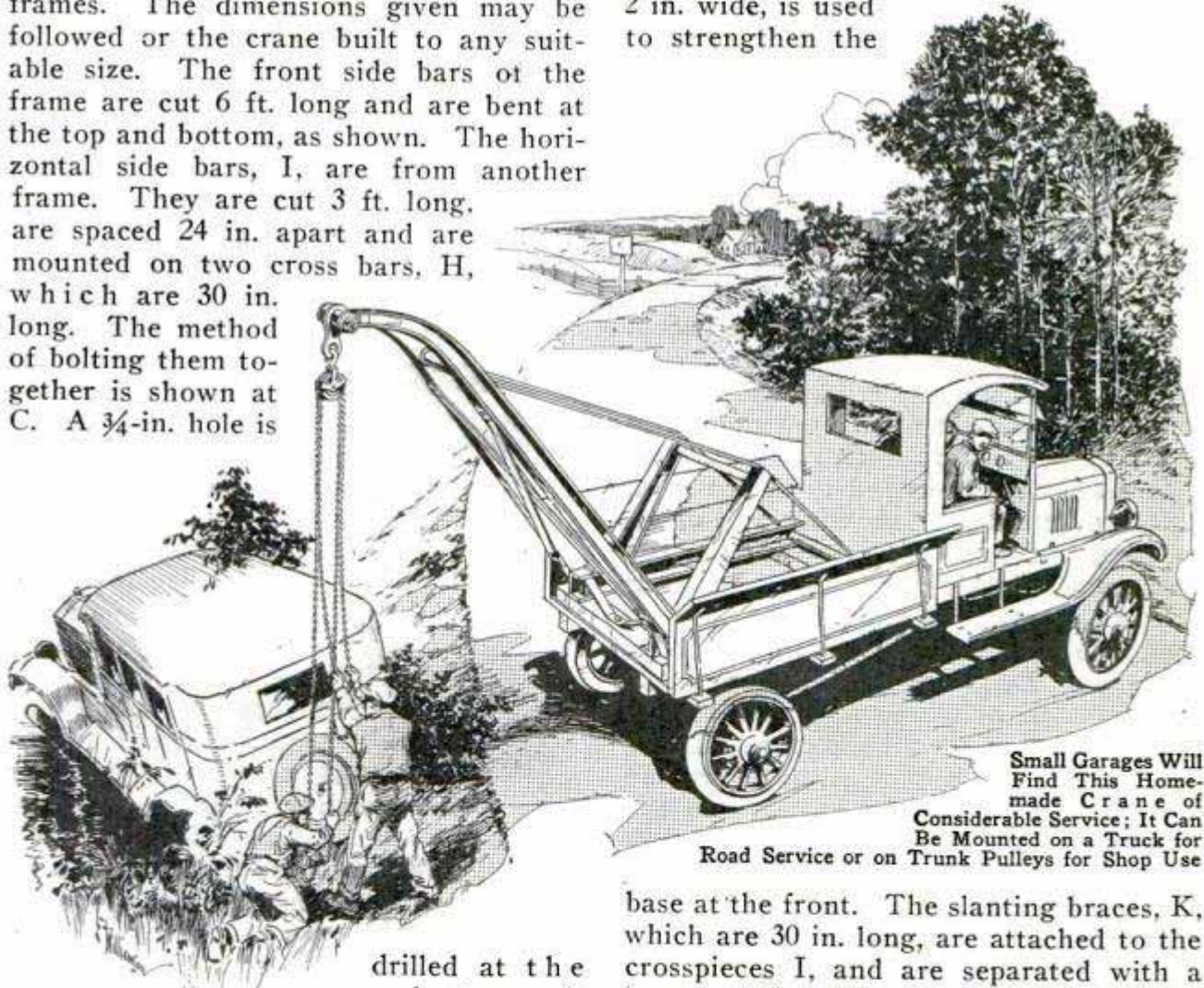

Wrecking Crane for Small Garage

By GEO. H. CAPPEL

NOWADAYS it is almost a necessity for every garage to have a wrecking crane and a good serviceable crane can readily be built by any enterprising mechanic. The drawing shows one which is made chiefly from two discarded auto frames. The dimensions given may be followed or the crane built to any suitable size. The front side bars of the frame are cut 6 ft. long and are bent at the top and bottom, as shown. The horizontal side bars, I, are from another frame. They are cut 3 ft. long, are spaced 24 in. apart and are mounted on two cross bars, H, which are 30 in. long. The method of bolting them together is shown at C. A $\frac{3}{4}$ -in. hole is

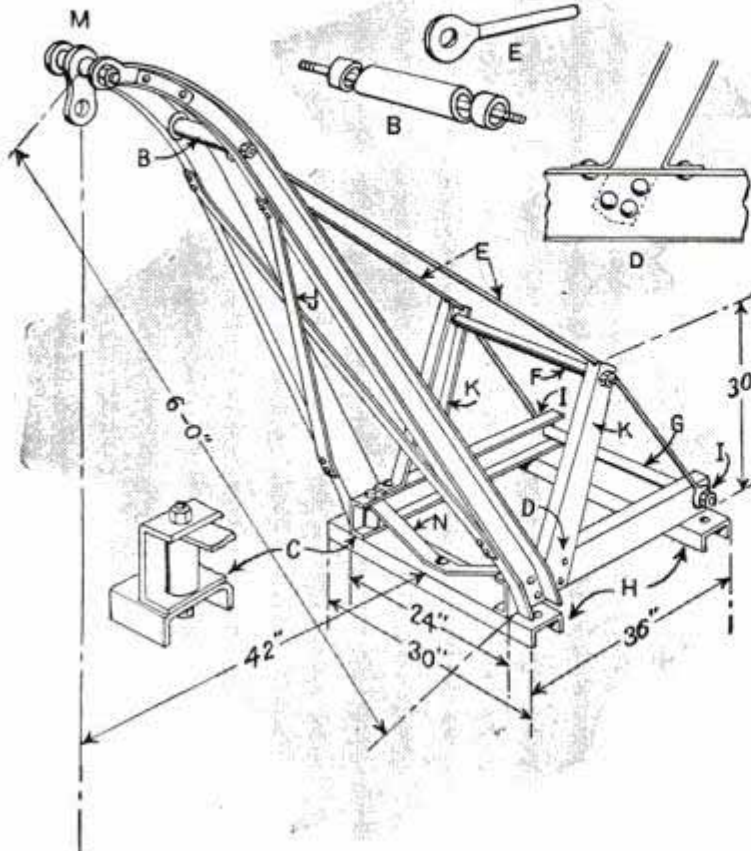
$\frac{3}{4}$ -in. bolts and a piece of $\frac{3}{4}$ or 1-in. gas pipe, cut to fit between the inside of the channels, keep the frame from drawing together and make a tight connection when the bolts are drawn up tight. A front cross brace, N, made of $\frac{1}{4}$ -in. flat stock, 2 in. wide, is used to strengthen the

drilled at the ends, to permit bolting to a truck. These holes should be drilled $28\frac{1}{2}$ in. center to center if the crane is to be used on a Ford truck. Long

base at the front. The slanting braces, K, which are 30 in. long, are attached to the crosspieces I, and are separated with a length of $\frac{3}{4}$ or 1-in. pipe, F, through which a long $\frac{3}{4}$ in. bolt is slipped. The braces, K, serve as a rest for the round-iron braces, E, which are attached last. The

main members of the crane are braced as shown with flat crosspieces, J. The crosspiece, B, like F and G, consists of a $\frac{3}{4}$ -in. bolt and a $\frac{3}{4}$ or 1-in. pipe. This completes the framework of the crane except the head, M. This should extend about $3\frac{1}{2}$ ft. beyond the rear crosspiece, H. An eye or hook plate is forged out of an iron bar, 6 in. long, $\frac{3}{4}$ in. thick and 3 in. wide. The lower hole is drilled to fit the hook on the differential block, while a $\frac{3}{4}$ or $\frac{7}{8}$ -in. steel bolt is slipped through the top hole and the ends of the frame. The brace rods, E, are attached after the frame is assembled so that they will have a tight fit. The detail, D, shows how the braces, K, are bent and bolted to the cross bars I.

If it is desired to use the crane also for general service in the garage, this can be done by bolting $6\frac{1}{2}$ -in. bars to the bottom of the crane. Large trunk pulleys are used for the front end and a castor at the rear end. In this way the crane can be used in the shop and only four bolts are needed to attach it to the pulleys. When used as a floor crane, it may be found desirable to weight the castor end. For light lifts, of course, this is unnecessary.

Sweet-Clover Stems Used for Feed

Every year I allow a part of my sweet-clover crop to seed, and then I harvest the seed. The stems of the clover then have become so large and hard that stock will eat but little of it. Running it through the threshing machine breaks up the stems so that they can be fed into a grinder made for handling ear corn, and last winter we ground about 40 bu. of clover straw. When mixed with oats or other ground feed, it is relished by stock and appears to have considerable food value.—Geo. G. McVicker, North Bend, Nebraska.

Valve-Cage Tool Adjustable for Height

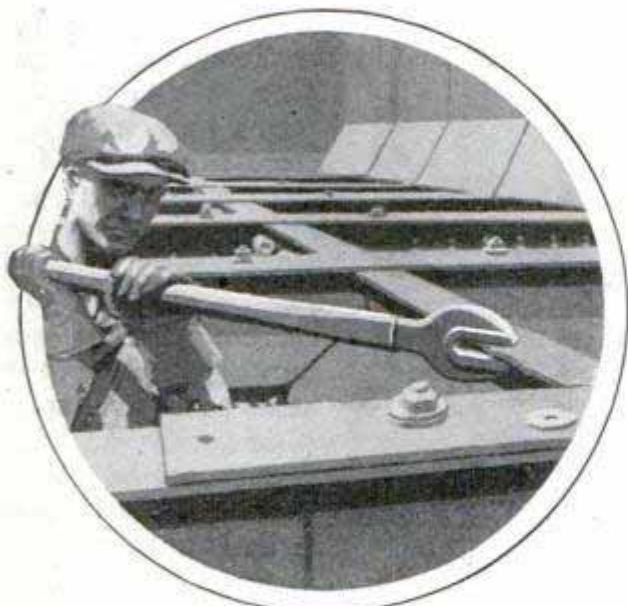
To release the pressure while removing spring-washer locks from valve stems, the illustrated tool will be found useful. It consists of one piece of $\frac{1}{4}$ by 3-in. steel, $5\frac{1}{2}$ in. long, and two $\frac{3}{8}$ by 9-in. steel rods, which have been threaded 1 in. of their length at the lower ends and $3\frac{1}{2}$ in. at the upper ends. Six $\frac{3}{8}$ -in. nuts are used on the rods, as shown, to properly locate the upper and lower plates. The upper plate is of $\frac{1}{4}$ by 2-in. steel and is $4\frac{3}{4}$ in. long, two holes being drilled in it, $3\frac{1}{4}$ in. center to center, and two holes drilled and tapped in the base the same distance apart. In the center of the upper plate, a $\frac{1}{2}$ -in. standard thread is tapped in which is fitted a 3-in. capscrew, with a piece of $\frac{1}{8}$ by $\frac{3}{4}$ -in. steel, $2\frac{3}{4}$ in. long, to form a thumbscrew handle. To the lower end of the capscrew is fitted a spring-washer release, made from $1\frac{1}{16}$ -in. stock, $1\frac{1}{4}$ in. long, with a $1\frac{1}{16}$ -in. hole drilled in the center. A cross slot, $\frac{5}{8}$ in. wide, is cut as shown in the photo, and the piece is then joined to the capscrew by reducing



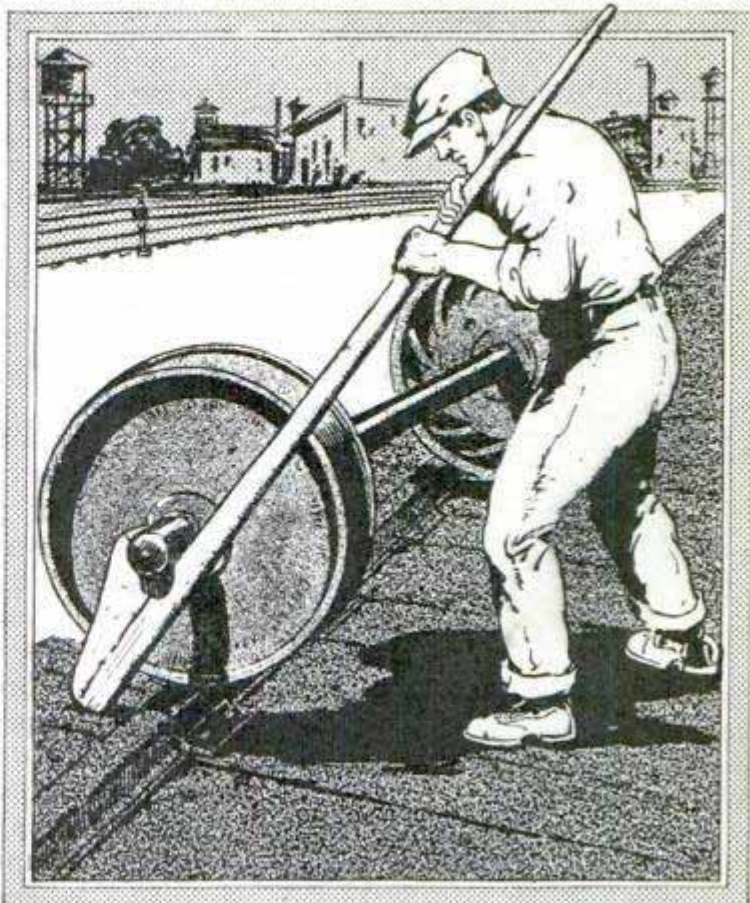
the end of the screw to $\frac{5}{16}$ in. in diameter for a distance of $\frac{3}{8}$ in. A $\frac{5}{16}$ -in. hole is drilled in the solid end of the spring-washer release and the end of the capscrew is riveted over, to prevent the washer release from coming off the screw. This makes a satisfactory cage tool as it holds the valve spring in whatever position desired and is adjustable to cages of all heights within its capacity.

Homemade Tool for Straightening Steel Flanges

Straightening steel flanges is usually done with a sledge hammer, the metal being well heated to make the work easier. In a Denver steel shop, where a great deal of repair work is done, a special tool was made for this purpose. It was made from a No. 4 alligator wrench and has been found indispensable for straightening steel flanges $\frac{1}{2}$ in. or less in thickness. The wrenches are heated in a forge and closed to a $\frac{3}{4}$ -in. gap. A 2 or 3-ft. section of $1\frac{1}{2}$ -in. gas pipe is slipped well up on the handle of the wrench, hammered down and welded. With this tool a workman may straighten flanges up to $\frac{1}{2}$ in. cold, without the muscle shock occasioned by the use of a sledge.—Jos. C. Coyle, Denver, Colo.

Handy Wooden Jack Facilitates Handling Railway Trucks over Tracks and in Shops

Handling Railway Trucks Easily

In rolling a pair of railway trucks it is difficult to change the course in which the wheels are rolling and to get them across tracks with the unaided hands. The jack shown in the drawing has been found very helpful in this task. A hardwood handle, resembling that of a peavey, but heavier at the lower end, has a triangular block of hardwood, 3 in. thick, spiked to the lower end. The upper end of the block, which is 4 in. wide, is curved to fit the axle of the truck. With the handle set vertically on the ground, the top of the block should be about 3 in. higher than the underside of the axle. In use, the jack is passed under the axle, and when the handle is pushed forward, the axle will be lifted and carried ahead. One man can turn or run a pair of trucks over the track with this jack.

Good Hydrant Installation

For the average farm where running water is piped to two or three outside points, the installation shown in the photo will prove satisfactory. The shut-off is set far enough underground to prevent its freezing in winter. Then this is covered with a column of 4-in. bell tile, and the stack is brought just above the ground with the bell of the last section of tile on top. A ½-gal. pail cover just fits into the bell, and a hole punched through the center of the cover will then make the installation complete.—Dale R. Van Horn, Walton, Nebr.



Emery-Wheel Stand

The emery-wheel stand shown in the drawing is made from an old piston which had been discarded from an automobile engine. It is mounted on the bench top by two long bolts, as shown. A wood block is placed between the bench and the piston to make it stand at the proper height. The wristpin bushings are left in the piston and serve as bearings for the shaft. The latter should be the right size to fit nicely in the bushings, and long enough to mount an emery wheel on one end and a pulley on the other. The end that carries the wheel can be threaded and the wheel clamped between two nuts, while the pulley is fastened with a key or a setscrew. A stand of this kind will carry a good-sized wheel, as considerable bearing

surface is provided by the wristpin bushings. In drilling the holes for the bolts, it is of importance to place them far enough apart so that the bolts will not interfere with the shaft.—Harold Jackson, Kankakee, Ill.

Altered Machine Tap Works Better

The machine tap will run into the work much more readily and will not break so easily if it is altered as indicated. Take any tap with four flutes and grind the threads down one-half of their depth on two opposite flutes. Whereas the ordinary tap would usually break after I had tapped about 90 holes, the altered tool tapped 450 without breakage. It is evident that this meant quite a saving where thousands of holes had to be tapped.—Arthur Whittier, Norwood, Mass.



New Use for Dictaphone

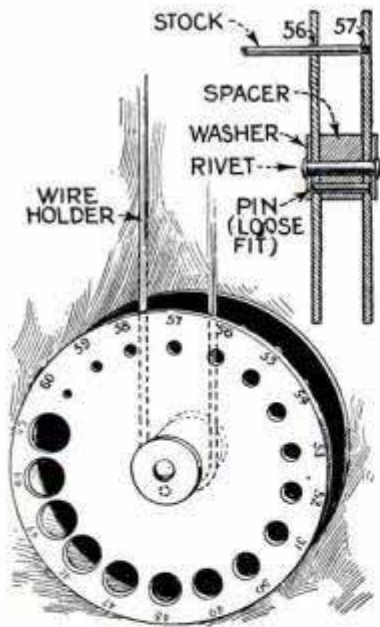
The dictaphone can be used to record orders for merchandise arriving by long-distance telephone. To do this, hold the mouthpiece of the dictaphone directly under the telephone transmitter so that you can speak into both at the same time. When the order starts coming in, each item is repeated to the customer and is thus recorded by the dictaphone. Shipping directions, terms and other information needed for the prompt and correct billing of the shipment may also be included. This method insures accuracy and at the same time saves telephone tolls as the order can be taken more quickly than if it had to be written down by hand.—M. W. Lowry, Athens, Georgia.

Improved Drill and Wire Gauge

A single drilled plate is the common form of drill and wire gauge, but a better instrument is obtained by using two plates as shown in the drawing. The difference in diameter of the drills is so slight that it requires close gauging to determine the exact number, and users of the single-plate gauge ordinarily try the next smaller hole as a check after the drill has been fitted, for, if this is not done, the drill or wire may be passed as a size larger than it is. The double-plate gauge, however, prevents mistakes of this kind and saves the time required to pull out the work and try it in the next hole. To make it, two plates were drilled together from the smallest to the largest size. After drilling, a spacing piece was pinned between the two plates and the pin riveted over on both sides. The riveting is not done until the plates are tight and is stopped when the plates are held snugly but movably on the pin. Next the back plate is moved around one hole, which brings the next smaller holes in line with the holes in the upper plate.

In this position a hole is drilled through both plates and the spacer, and a loose pin inserted. In use, the gauge is suspended by a wire holder from a nail or hook in the wall so that it can be spun around to bring the required hole to the most convenient position.

The work is tried in the holes until it enters the one it seems to fit best. It is then pushed farther through to try it in the next smaller hole, which is in line with it in the back plate. If it fails to enter this, its size corresponds with the number of the hole it entered.



Special Frame for Holding Dump Doors Aids Riveters

Support for Dump Doors Makes Riveting Easier

The device shown here was originated at the shops of a western railroad for holding dump doors of ore cars, as well as other broad, flat steel equipment, while riveting them. It is made of 4 by 6-in. timbers, securely bolted together in an A-shape and reinforced at the bottom with steel straps, which are turned up near the end of the two timbers that form the base of the device, to keep the doors from slipping. It is 3½ ft. in height, and the base timbers are the same length, which makes it convenient for the crew to stand in an easy position while performing their task with the rivet gun and the bucking bar. —Jos. C. Coyle, Denver, Colo.

Keeping Soldering Kit Handy

The electrician, tinsmith or other mechanic, who is often compelled to work in low attics or other small spaces, will find the illustrated stunt of providing pockets on the side of the blowtorch of considerable convenience, as it serves to keep the solder, flux, tape, etc., at hand and less likely to be mislaid.

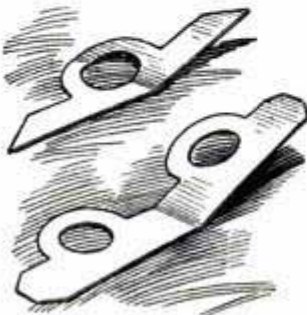
Simple Automatic Counter Attached to Frame of Roller Conveyor Is Found Dependable

Simple Counter for Roller Conveyor

The drawing shows a simple method of attaching a counter to a roller conveyor. The counter is placed on a bracket attached to the frame of the conveyor at a turn, and should be located on the outside of the curve, for the reason that there will be greater separation between the units at this point than elsewhere. The operating lever is made from light bar stock and is actuated by a spring attached to the counter arm, which can be swung out of the way instantly whenever desired. —J. S. Hagans, Chicago, Ill.

Handling Bearing Shims

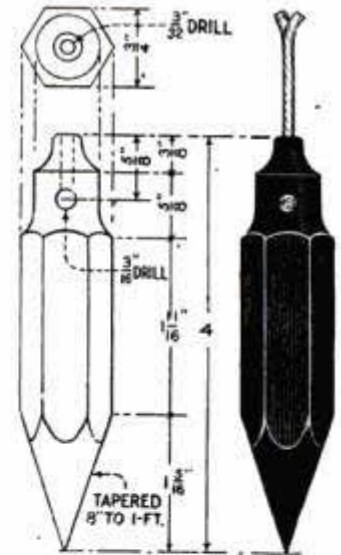
While working under the car on the main bearings, it is sometimes discouraging to have the thin shims slip off the bolts and scatter on the floor. A good method of preventing this is to bend the shims in the center slightly. Shims having a single hole are bent across the hole as shown in the upper detail. Those having two holes are bent between the holes as



shown below. Take care that the ends point up so that, when the bearing cap is replaced, the shim is smoothed out and the bending has no effect upon the fitting of the bearing. By replacing the heavier shims first, the thin ones will serve to hold all of them in place until the bearing cap is started over the bolts.—S. J. Gee, Montpelier, Idaho.

A Homemade Plumb Bob

Get a piece of cold-drawn steel, hexagon in shape, $4\frac{1}{4}$ in. long and $\frac{3}{4}$ in. wide. Lay out and center-punch for a $\frac{3}{16}$ -in. hole near the top end, according to dimensions given in the drawing. In locating this hole allow for $\frac{1}{32}$ in. to be faced off at the end. After the hole has been drilled, set up the work in the lathe. Place it in a three-jaw universal chuck, with the drilled end of the work extending $1\frac{1}{2}$ in. Adjust it so that it runs true. Now arrange the belt for the proper spindle speed, set the lathe tool for facing and face the end. Center the end of the work with the centering tool held in the toolpost. Center-drill this end as indicated, using a center drill with a $\frac{3}{32}$ -in. pilot drill, and drill a $\frac{3}{16}$ -in. hole in the end to intersect the $\frac{3}{16}$ -in. hole. Remove the drill chuck from the tailstock spindle, insert the hardened center and adjust the tailstock so that it will support the end of the work. Get a round-nose tool, ground to form the fillet at



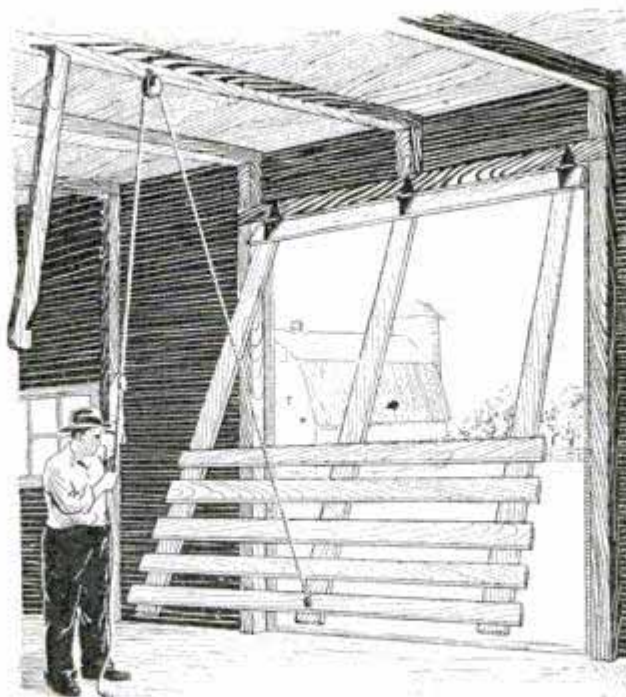
the end, and turn down to two diameters as indicated. Round the corner at the end with a file and polish the machined surfaces with a piece of emery cloth. Now turn the work around in the chuck so that it extends $1\frac{3}{4}$ in. True it as before and set the compound rest at a 108° angle, reading from the headstock side, with the handle toward the tailstock. Then turn down the work to a point and finish with emery cloth.

Keeping the Closed Car Warm

As cold weather approaches, the motorist is faced with the problem of keeping the car warm. The quantity of cold air that comes in through the floorboards and around the windows is surprising. This is especially true when the car is in motion. As the heat from the engine naturally escapes through the vents on the sides of the hood, one auto owner conserved a great deal of this heat by closing up these vents on the inside of the hood with two strips of cardboard, so that the fan blew the heated air from around the motor back against the floorboards, thus aiding in heating the inside of the car. The strips were held in place with no fastenings by simply bending the ends out through the first and last slot in the hood.

Gate Keeps Stock Safe and Ventilates Barn

To prevent the escape of stock from the barn and yet provide proper ventilation during the hot months, one farmer built a slat gate, hinged at the top as shown in the illustration. This gate is made of several 1 by 6-in. boards nailed to three vertical pieces, which are long enough to reach from the door sill to the top of the opening, where they are nailed to another horizontal piece, hinged to the top of the opening. A rope runs from the bottom of the gate over a pulley fastened to a ceiling joist at the proper distance inside, and a pull on this rope opens the gate. There is also an automatic lock, made of a 2 by 4-in. piece, 3 ft. long. This is hinged to the ceiling and has a notch, which engages with the lower edge of the gate when it is raised. The lower end of this lock is within reach.

Triangle Fitted to Be Used as T-Square

There are a great many instances where it is necessary to make rough sketches and where a little accuracy is of considerable value in future work. The drawing shows how a medium-sized triangle was made to do double duty. A short strip of heavy celluloid was slotted to give a snug fit on the edge of the triangle so that it could be removed when not needed. The method of using the device is clearly shown in the illustration.—L. H. Georger, Buffalo, N. Y.



Protection for Stucco-Finished Houses against Water Stains

Stucco should never start closer than 8 or 10 in. to the ground line. Splashing from rains will otherwise be sure to discolor it and cover it with dirt or soot, which lies on the surface of snowbanks next to the house walls. Another blemish often seen on stucco finish is discoloration just below the windows, such as rust from screens and windows. Extra-wide sills or sills with a groove or other trough-shaped depression near each end to force the water to run off through them are the best means to prevent this trouble.—Geo. G. McVicker, North Bend, Nebr.

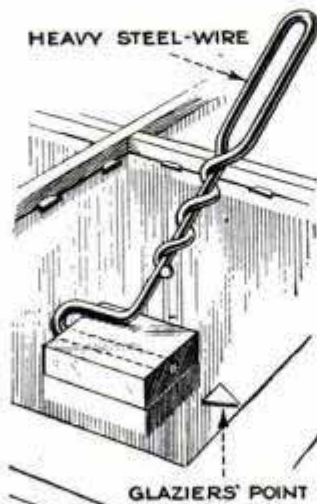
Old Hammers Drawn Out Make Good Tools for Removing Rivets

Tool for Backing Out Rivets Made from Old Hammer

In a large Denver shop old hammers which have become chipped and unsafe for use are drawn out to a $\frac{3}{4}$ -in. point, as shown in the photo, and are used for backing out old rivets, after the head has been removed with an air chisel. The "backout," as it is called, may be held safely upon a rivet by one workman while it is being struck with a sledge by a second man.—Jos. C. Coyle, Denver, Colo.

Handy Mallet for Glaziers

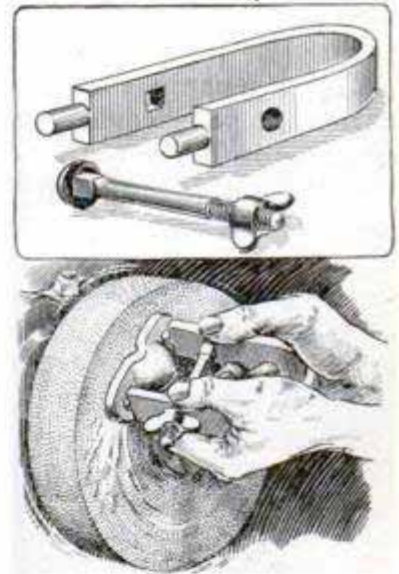
Glaziers and others who have occasion to reglaze windows and doors will find the mallet shown in the drawing of considerable assistance in their work. It consists of a piece of flat steel, squared and polished, through which a hole is drilled from end to end to receive a length of heavy steel wire. The hole is counter-sunk at one end to permit the end of the wire to be clinched without projecting beyond the side of the head. The wire is bent as indicated, to form a handle, and should fit



rather loosely in the hole. Thus, the head of the mallet will always lie flat against the glass no matter at what angle the handle is held in driving the points. In many shops beveled chisels or other similar tools are used for this purpose, but this tool will be found much more valuable and well worth the time required to make it.—G. E. Hendrickson, Argyle, Wis.

Holder Helps in Grinding Bearing Caps

Grinding bearing caps on an emery wheel is a job that requires care in order to get the flat surface of the cap ground evenly. A simple holder, which can be made in a short time and makes the work much easier, is shown in the illustration. It consists of a length of flat steel, bent to a U-shape and having the ends ground to fit in the bolt holes of the caps. Two holes are drilled through the sides of the holder to receive a bolt, which is provided with a wingnut to tighten it so that the holder will grip the bearing securely. In



this way, a comfortable grip is obtained, and at the same time the fingers are protected from the surface of the emery wheel.—G. A. Luers, Washington, D. C.

Waterproof Varnish for Wooden Trays

Wooden trays are often built for dark-room or laboratory use. To make them waterproof, yet chemically clean, is a simple matter if the following coating is applied: Melt $\frac{1}{2}$ lb. of common brown rosin and add 2 oz. of yellow-wax chips, stirring the mixture until it is smooth. This will fill all cracks and pores and will render the wood absolutely non-porous.—L. B. Robbins, Harwich, Mass.

Improving Your Hot-Air Furnace

By J. TATE

ACCORDING to a well-known heating engineer, it is possible, by a few simple and inexpensive changes, to effect a saving of 20 to 30 per cent in the coal required to heat a house in severe weather, where a hot-air furnace is used for heating. "In fact," he says, "it is easy to change hot-air house heating from a system markedly inferior to steam or hot-water apparatus to a system that compares very favorably with them in nearly all respects."

It may not be possible for all readers to realize the saving mentioned above, for some of the improvements indicated later may already be incorporated in their own furnaces, but there are many installations where the full amount may really be saved.

The first simple improvement possible to make in the majority of hot-air furnaces is that of a simple apparatus for humidifying the warm air supplied to the rooms. The desirability of maintaining a reasonable amount of moisture in the air of the average home is recognized by all heating and ventilating authorities: it is, in fact, essential to health, protection of woodwork in the house and economy of fuel. Where sufficient moisture is present in the air, the temperature of

the rooms can be kept at a lower point than when the air is dry, with equal comfort to the occupants, and a lower temperature means a saving in coal to begin with. In addition to this, if the air is dry, moisture is evaporated from the woodwork of the house and the furniture, with more or less disastrous effects, and the effect on the occupants is no less bad from the standpoint of health. Fortunately, it is comparatively easy to humidify the air in a hot-air furnace, much easier than it is to do the same thing in a house heated with steam or hot water. Do not, however, rely on the cast-iron water pan fitted to many furnaces to do the work, for it will not. There is only one place to fit a humidifying pan in the average hot-air furnace, and that is on top of the radiator or heating

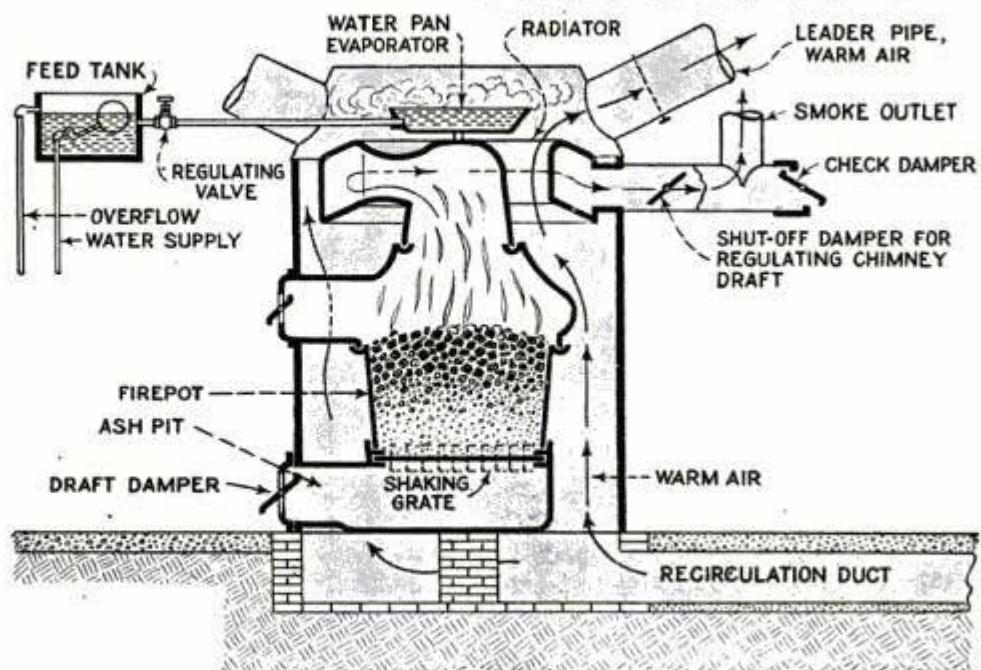

drum, just beneath the bonnet of the furnace. The installation of such a pan, which should be of cast iron, is shown in Fig. 1. To make the tank function without attention, an automatic ball cock is arranged in an external tank to keep the pan in the furnace constantly supplied with water. A regulating valve is fitted in the supply line leading to the furnace pan, and an overflow pipe to the external tank. In extreme weather, when the furnace is running at full capacity, the regulating valve must be closed somewhat, in order that the air in the house may not become too saturated and the windows covered with frost. The only thing to watch in fitting such a humidifier is to keep the water level in the float tank at the same level as is required for the furnace pan.

The next thing to consider is whether the cold-air supply to the furnace is taken entirely from outdoors. If it is, that means that all the air handled by the furnace must be raised from the temperature

prevailing outdoors to the temperature required for the house. In very cold or windy weather, the temperature difference is very considerable, and a lot of coal is needed to raise the temperature of the air to the higher level. This can be avoided almost entirely by the addition of a recirculation duct, through which all or a part of the air to be heated is taken from the interior of the house. Many furnaces are now fitted in this way, but many old ones are not, and it makes a considerable difference in the amount of coal burned in cold weather, and often a very appreciable difference in the comfort of the house, whether the air must be raised from zero or below to 68 or 70°, or from 50 to the same degree.

One heating engineer solved the problem in his own house by using a recirculation duct, cast right in the floor of the cellar, as indicated in Fig. 1. The main reason for using this construction was that, while it is well known that such a duct should have a cross-sectional area equal to the combined areas of all the hot-air pipes leading to the rooms, the lack of room in the ordinary cellar often makes the installation of a duct of such size impossible. The duct cast in the floor overcame this objection. The floor and walls of the duct were cast in concrete. For the top of the duct slabs of reinforced concrete were cast in open forms, about 3 in. thick, 3 ft. long and 2 ft. wide, with beveled edges. After the slabs were seasoned

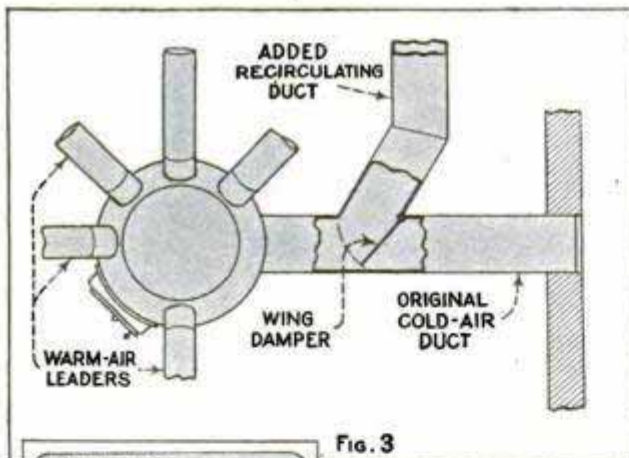

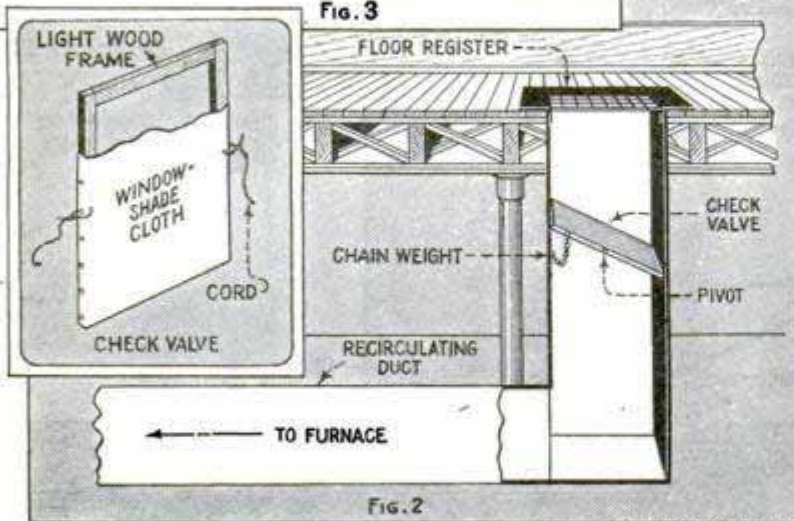
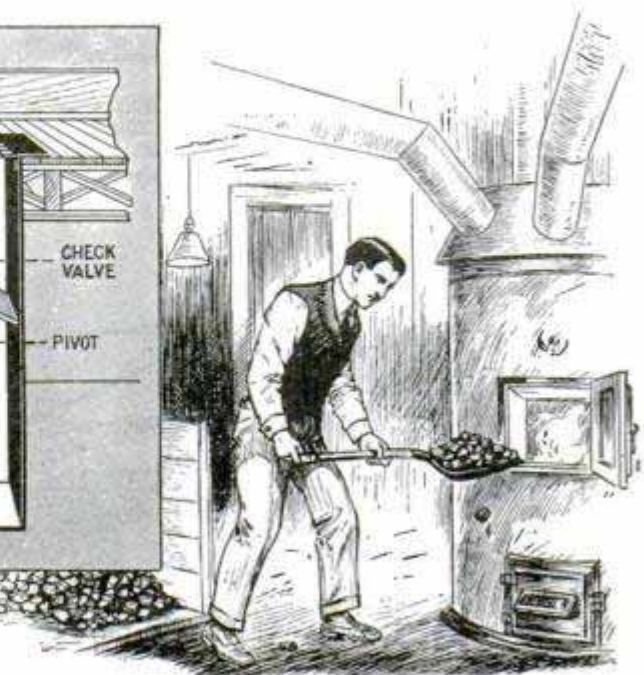

Details of the Fitting of the Recirculation Duct, Floor Register and How the Check Valve or Damper Is Made and Installed



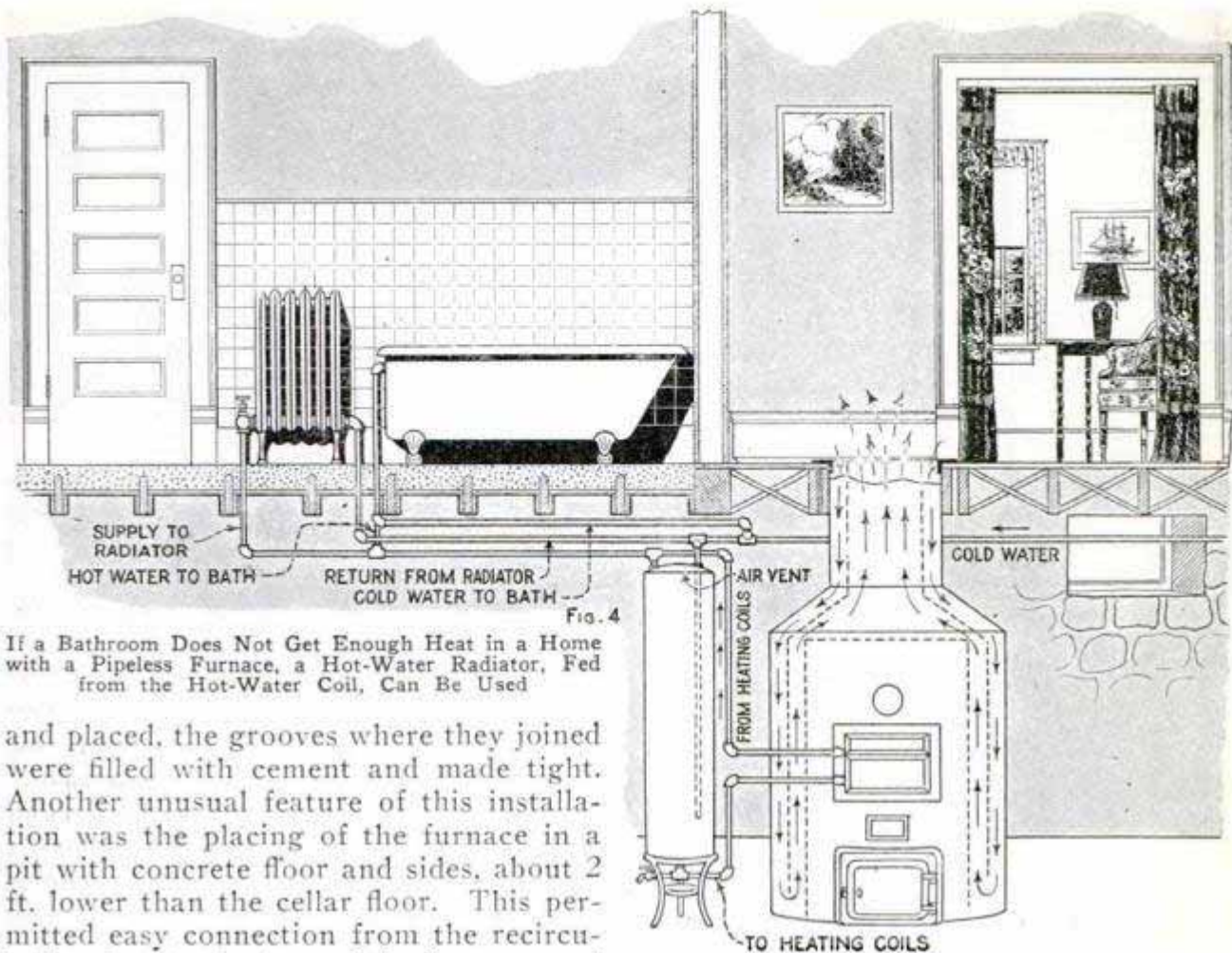

and placed, the grooves where they joined were filled with cement and made tight. Another unusual feature of this installation was the placing of the furnace in a pit with concrete floor and sides, about 2 ft. lower than the cellar floor. This permitted easy connection from the recirculation duct to the base of the furnace, and saved labor in feeding coal to the furnace, while the extra height helped the draft in the hot-air flues, especially those leading to the first floor.

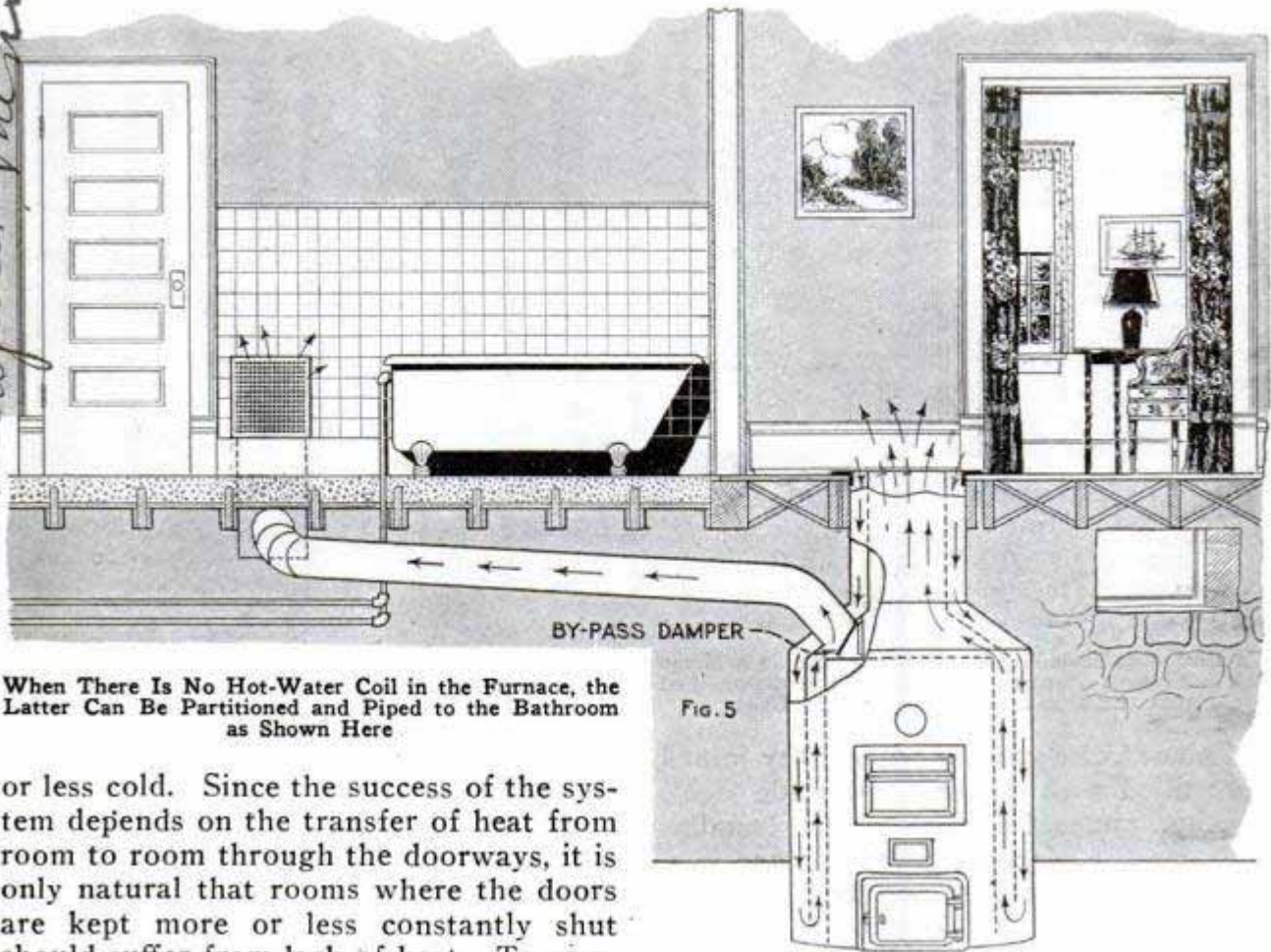
Where the floor duct cannot be installed, it is necessary to use a sheet-metal duct, proportioning this as mentioned above, or, if this is impossible, then as large as possible, at least as large as the original cold-air duct. The recirculation duct should be joined to the cold-air duct as illustrated in Fig. 3, so that a wing damper can be fitted to enable the air supply to the furnace to be taken either from outside or inside the house, or mixed in whatever proportions may be desirable, depending on the weather.

Occasionally, with a strong wind blowing into the outside cold-air duct of the installation described, more air would enter the duct than the furnace could handle. With the wing damper set, as it usually was, to take part of the supply from the inside and part from the outside, a strong current of cold air would flow around the damper and into the house through the recirculation duct and the register in

the hall. This could be stopped, of course, by closing one of the ducts by means of the wing damper, but this was often undesirable. What was needed, therefore, was a very light, almost frictionless check valve in the recirculation duct; one that would offer no resistance to the downward flow of the air from the house, but that would close against any air coming back through the duct from the outside. The valve that was finally fitted is shown in Fig. 2. This was hung in the vertical duct from the first floor in an inclined position, and was supported on cord trunnions near its center of gravity, so that it would swing closed by its own weight, but would open under the slightest suction from the furnace. In order to balance the damper accurately a very light chain was hung in a loop with one end attached to the side of the flue, and the other to the side of the damper. By altering the length of the loop, it was easy to adjust the damper, which worked perfectly.

Where a one-register or pipeless furnace is used to heat the house it is often the case that the bathroom is always more

or less cold. Since the success of the system depends on the transfer of heat from room to room through the doorways, it is only natural that rooms where the doors are kept more or less constantly shut should suffer from lack of heat. To remedy this partly, transoms can be provided over the doors, and these should be kept open. An opening should also be made at the bottom of the door. Another plan is to install a hot-water radiator connected to the range boiler,

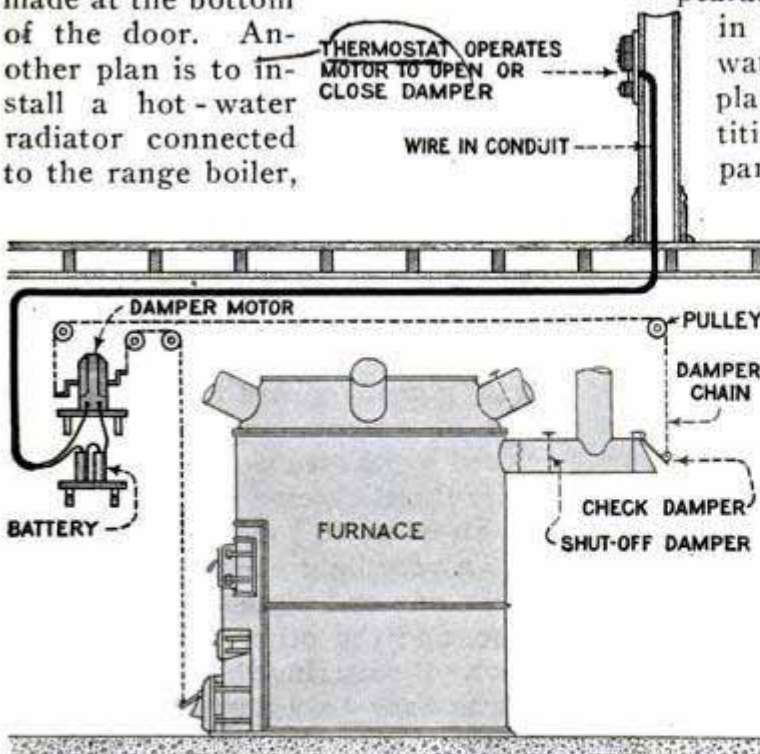

as shown in Fig. 4; if there is sufficient space, and there is no objection to the appearance, the range boiler may be located in the bathroom and connected to a water coil in the furnace. Still another plan is shown in Fig. 5, in which a partition is fitted to the furnace, and a part of the hot air led to a register in the bathroom by a regular leader pipe. There should be a damper in the leader pipe, so that all the heat can be sent to the rest of the house when heat is not needed for the bathroom.

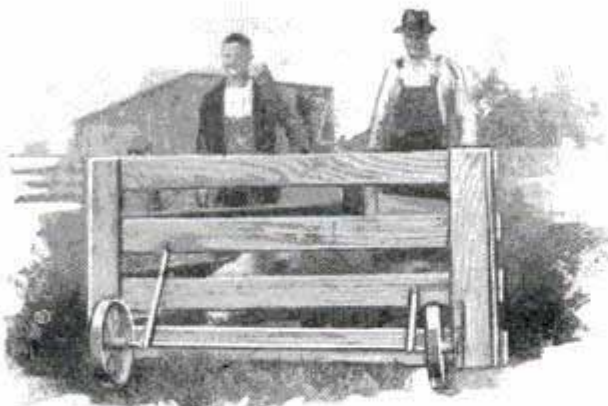
An automatic thermostat (Fig. 6). for controlling the furnace drafts, will not only prove of great convenience, but will be found a fuel saver. These devices consist of a thermostat in one of the living rooms, which controls a clockwork motor mounted near the furnace, and this motor, in turn, controls the ash-pit and check drafts. When adjusted and set, the thermostat will open and close the drafts all day to main-

tain a certain temperature, and many models can be set so as to keep the house at a lower temperature during the night, and to open the drafts to raise the temperature in the morning. These devices save fuel and frequent trips to the furnace and they also serve to keep the temperature in the house much more uniform than can be done with the infrequent manual attention usually given the fire.

However, in cases where certain kinds of soft coal are burned in the furnace, the use of a thermostat of this type is impractical, since the fire must be broken up at regular intervals, due to the caking and swelling of the coal, and, if the fire must be attended to in this manner, the dampers can be adjusted at the same time, but with the majority of coals and coke, the use of the thermostat will be attended with greater fuel efficiency and increased comfort in the house.

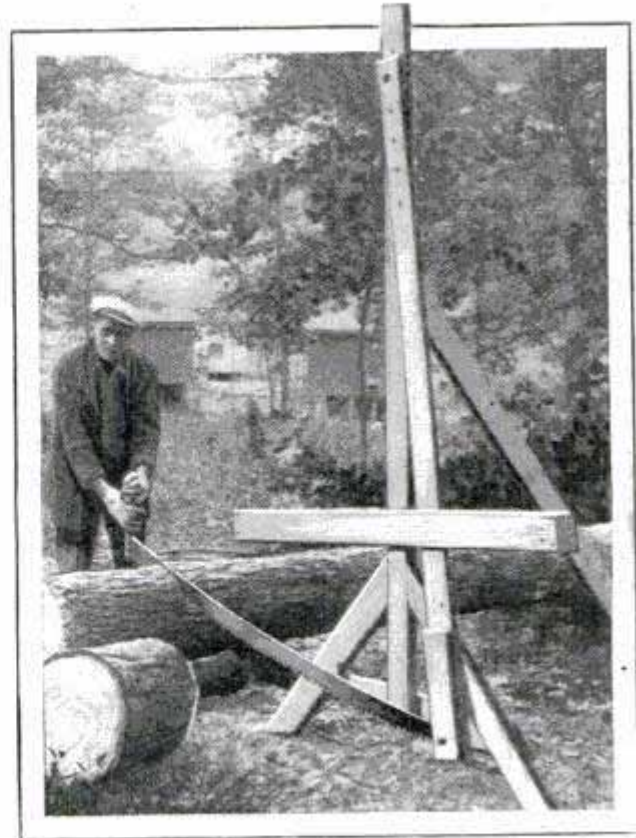
A Portable Hog Corral

The problem of transporting hogs from field to field by means of a portable corral was solved by two farmers as shown in the illustration. The inclosure is made of 1 by 6-in. boards and is triangular in shape, with one side hinged so that it can be used as a gate. Three wheels, two on one side and one at the apex, allow just sufficient clearance for the corral to be readily pushed over the ground. Since using this method, hogs have been easily

moved over a plank bridge from which, with ordinary driving methods, the animals were frequently frightened into the creek and drowned.—Mel Wharton, Portland, Oreg.



By Actual Test This Sawing Outfit Has Been Found to Do the Work of Two Men

One-Man Saw Outfit

This one-man saw outfit was made in two hours at a cost of 50 cents for material. The entire frame, including the pendulum, is made of 2 by 4-in. material. The pendulum works in a slide to prevent vibration and is adjustable in length for various sizes of timber by means of the holes bored in the upper end. This saw rig, by actual test, did the work of two men with a crosscut saw. It folds up like a pocketknife and is easily moved from log to log by one man. Also, it is adjustable to uneven ground.—E. Ellsworth Claspby, Lewiston, Pa.

Fill Tractor Tank with Kerosene to Prevent Rusting

When our tractor is placed in the shed for the winter, or at other times when it is not in use for several weeks, we fill the fuel tank with kerosene. Formerly this was not done and we often had trouble with rust getting into the pipe line to the carburetor. The rust forms on the inside of the tank, drops to the bottom and, as soon as the tank is filled, it washes along into the carburetor line.—Wendell N. Mitchell, Rogers, Nebr.

Ferrotyping Prints

When ferrotyping prints it will be found that a large percentage of the surplus water can be absorbed by a large piece of

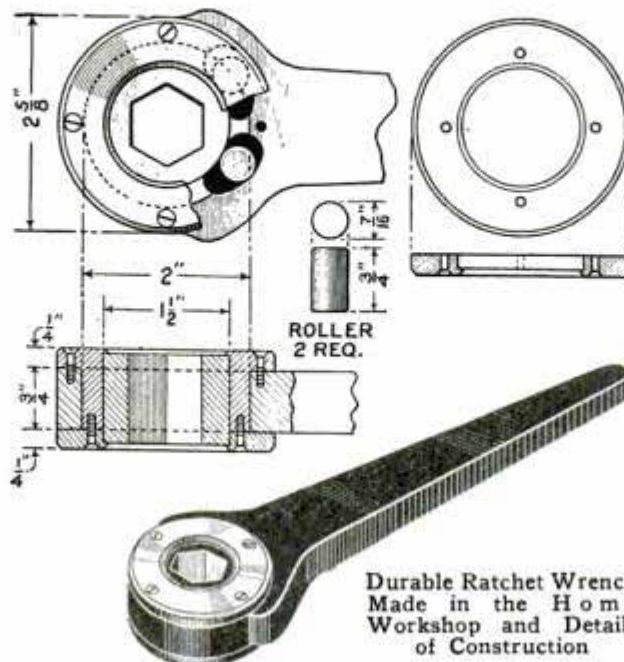


Large Piece of Oilcloth Absorbs Surplus Moisture from Ferrotyped Prints

oilcloth and the prints will then dry much more quickly. Such a piece of oilcloth is much handier to use than blotters and costs less.—Auguste Mathieu, Chicago, Ill.

Motorcycle Engine Makes Good Air Compressor

A discarded single-cylinder motorcycle engine can be readily converted into an efficient air compressor by making only a few changes in the operating mechanism. In most cases it will be found that the compression, though rather high, is not sufficient to inflate a large storage tank to 150 lb. or more, but this difficulty is easily overcome. Take the motor apart and get a plate of brass, or other similar metal, about $\frac{1}{4}$ in. thick. Cut a disk out of this a



few thousandths of an inch smaller in diameter than the diameter of the cylinder, and fasten it to the piston head with machine screws that have their flat heads counter-sunk below the surface. This should raise the compression to the proper point, but if it does not, thicker metal must be used depending on the amount of space left between the top of the piston and the cylinder head. Remove the pushrod that operates the exhaust valve and discard it. Also remove the spring and the operating mechanism of the intake valve. Grind both valves carefully and replace the intake spring with a lighter and weaker one, which will open automatically on the suction stroke of the piston. New piston rings should be installed if necessary. Then reassemble the motor, connect the air line to the spark-plug hole and insert a check valve somewhere in the line near the compressor. Mount the engine conveniently to the power supply and, if the compressor originally was one of the belt-driven machines, the original pulley will still serve its purpose. If the engine was equipped with a sprocket, this should be removed and a flat pulley substituted. Plenty of good oil should be provided in the crankcase at all times to give lubrication, and a glass oil cup may be installed on the side to show the height of the oil.

Homemade Ratchet Wrench

A handy set of ratchet wrenches can be made up by the home mechanic. Good steel, which is capable of being oil-tempered, should be used for this purpose. The sockets are hardened, but the handle is left normal. The rollers, which take the place of the usual ratchet and pawl, are also hardened. In use, a very slight back movement will release the rollers, yet they grip firmly.

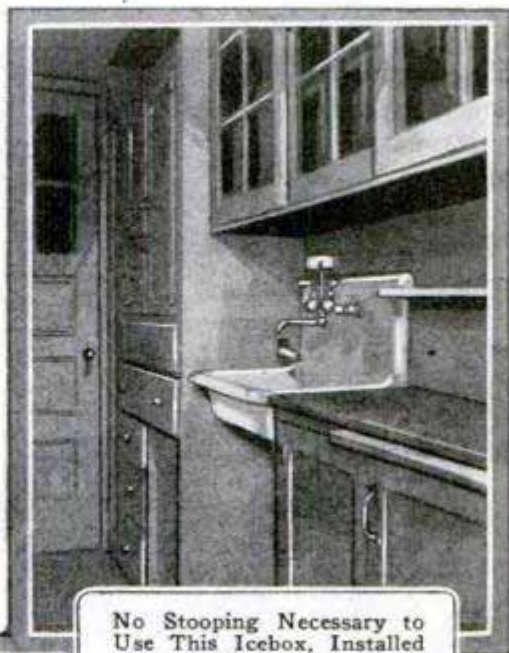

Sliding Drain Pan for Service Station

In a new drain pit just constructed at Wahoo, Nebr., a special sliding drain pan was installed to facilitate the handling of the used oil taken from

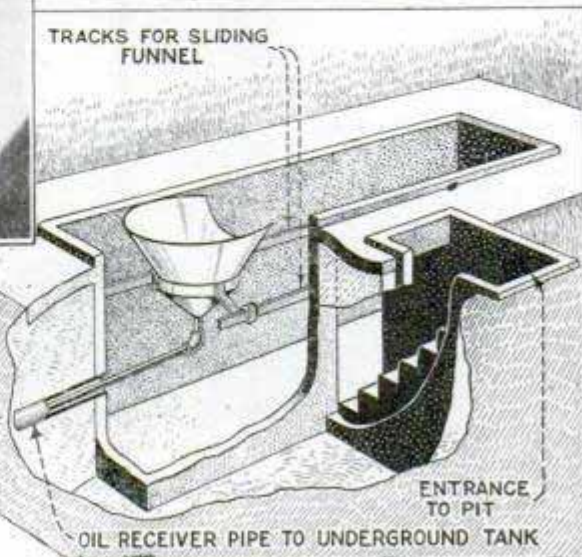


both crankcase and transmission. Strap-iron side bars are fastened to both sides of the pit, as shown, and sliding brackets are welded to an iron ring 26 in. in diameter, which holds a large funnel-shaped receiver. This can readily be moved directly under either the crankcase or the transmission drain. The funnel fits into the elbow of a 2-in. pipe leading back into the end of the pit through another pipe, which in turn extends 8 ft. underground to a receiving tank at the bottom of the pit. The service man enters the pit through a trap at the side rather than at the end. Both trap and pit are provided with covers.—Ralph W. McPherson, Wahoo, Nebr.

Imitation Marble Tiles

To prepare imitation marble finishes for decorative purposes, cut pieces of fiber wallboard into squares of the desired size and round off the edges with a sandpaper block, then coat the squares with white or colored paint and allow them to dry. A pan large enough to hold the squares is partly filled with water. On the surface of the water drop some ordinary but rather thin-mixed oil paint the color of

the veining. It will be found that the paint will distribute itself over the surface of the water in all sorts of irregular shapes. Now take the squares, one at a time, and, holding them by diagonally opposite corners, just

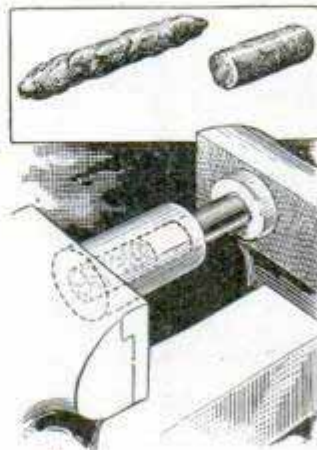


Novel Sliding Drain Pan in Oil Pit at Auto-Service Station Facilitates the Removal of Crankcase and Transmission Oil

touch them to the paint-covered surface of the water. This will produce the veined effect. Remove the squares, turn them face up and allow them to dry. There is nothing to prevent a second treatment to produce veins of two or more different colors.—J. S. Hagans, Chicago, Ill.

Making Gauze Motor Brushes

Being employed in the mechanical department of a mill using a few low-voltage electric motors, which usually are equipped with copper-gauze brushes, I constructed some of these, employing a very simple device, and believe that the construction may be of interest to many. A piece of cold-rolled steel shafting of suitable diameter was obtained for the forming die. This was cut

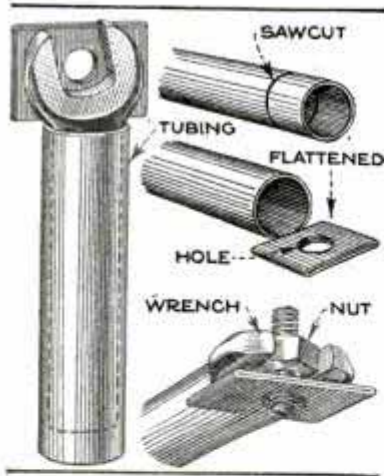


about three times the length of the brush

and its ends squared. A hole of the same cross section and size as the brush was drilled entirely through this shafting. A punch was turned to make a sliding fit in this hole, its length from the shoulder to the end being made equal to that of the die minus the length of the brush. The material for the brush was flexible lamp-cord of suitable size, from which the insulation was removed. The wire was wadded up so that it could readily be forced into the die. The wad was placed in the die, the punch started, and the whole placed between the jaws of a vise and screwed up until the shoulder of the punch rested against the end of the die. The finished brush is pushed out of the die by means of a suitable drift. It is well to keep both the die and the punch well lubricated.—W. J. Edmonds, Whitehall, New York.

Wrench Attachment for Catching Nuts

A simple device for preventing the loss of nuts when dismantling or assembling machinery is shown in the illustration. It is, of course, always undesirable to drop small pieces like these into other parts of the machine where they can hardly be



extricated and may cause trouble if left. Such trouble can be prevented by the use of the wrench attachment shown in the illustration. It is made from a short length

of brass tubing, first sawed nearly through at one end and flattened out; then a hole is drilled through the flat part. This hole clears the end of the bolt if it happens to project through the nut. No particular care is required when using this attachment, as the nut drops on the flattened end when released from the bolt.

Wooden Pump Handle and Bracket Found Satisfactory in Emergency

Emergency Repair for Pump Handle

When the bracket on which the pump handle was pivoted broke off, the emergency repair shown in the illustration was adopted and found entirely satisfactory. Two pieces of 1 by 4-in. boards served as a standard, on the end of which a wooden handle was pivoted. This support was braced at the bottom and fastened securely to the wooden platform of the pump. The emergency handle thus made was found just as useful and convenient as the original.—L. M. Jordan, Vredenburgh, Alabama.

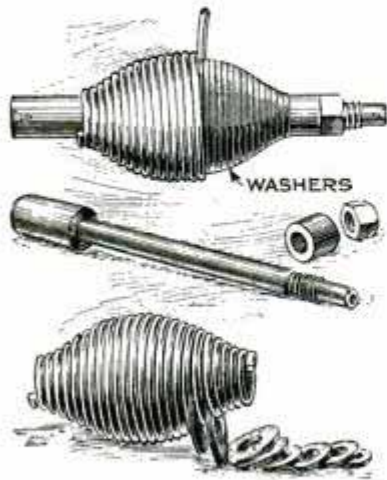
Handy Basting-Thread Pick

Tailors and seamstresses will find the alteration on a thimble shown in the illustration very handy for removing basting threads. An angular cut is made through the end of a common thimble and the piece is bent outward. With the thimble worn on the middle finger, the projecting point can readily be inserted under the stitches to be removed.—G. E. Hendrickson, Argyle, Wis.

To wind an odd-shaped spring, such as shown in the illustration, is not difficult, but how to get it off the arbor is perplexing.

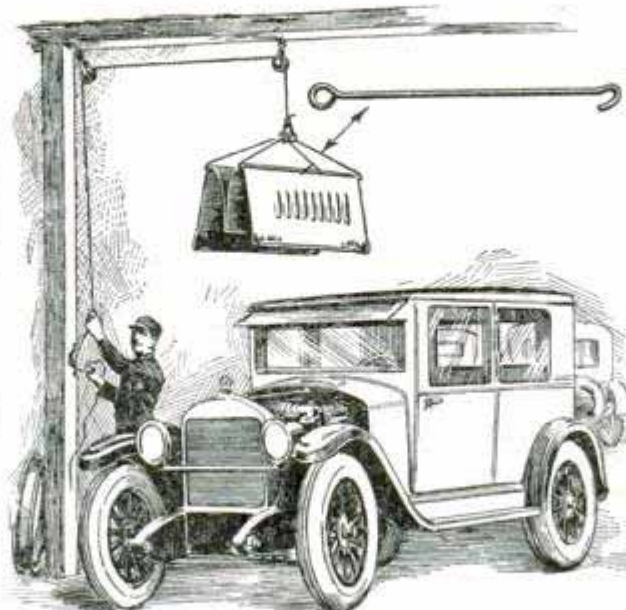


We had a large number of these springs to wind and the work was done in the following way: The arbor was turned down a little, as shown, in the center and $\frac{1}{16}$ -in. washers

were slipped on and held by a nut. The assembly was then put in a lathe and the washers turned down to the shape desired for the coil. After a spring had been wound, the arbor was removed from the lathe and the nut unscrewed. It was then an easy matter to slip the washers out of the spring as indicated in the lower detail. For convenience in reassembling, the washers should be numbered. — Charles Kugler, Philadelphia, Pa.

Lift for Handling Auto Hood

Handling the hood of an auto while working on the engine is something of a problem to many auto mechanics since it is easily marred and, if large, difficult to handle for one man, without damaging either the hood or the fenders. Four pieces of heavy wire or light round stock, shaped as shown in the detail and each measuring about 36 in. from eye to hook, form a sling and are strung together with a strong rope, which runs over a pulley as indicated. In use, the hooks

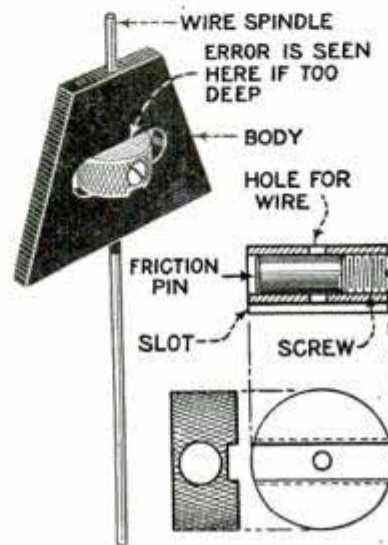


Lifting Auto Hood Entirely Out of the Way to Prevent Marring It

are slipped under the edges of the cover and it is then pulled up and out of the way, the rope being fastened securely. — G. C. Douglas, Raleigh, N. C.

Sensitive Depth Gauge

All regular-type depth gauges have one fault; it is impossible to tell if the depth being measured is more than the setting of the gauge. This does not apply, of course, in the case of parts where the



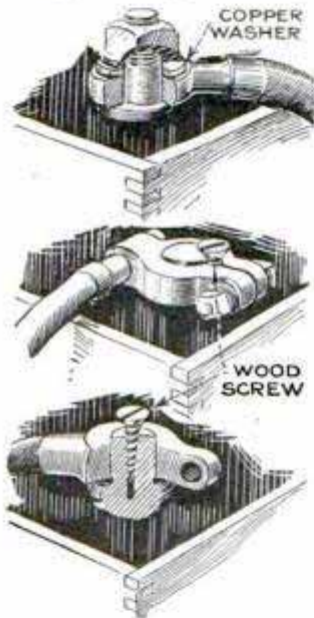
depth can be seen, nor is it a disadvantage where only one part is being measured, but when a depth gauge is used for inspecting a number of pieces, it is set to the correct depth and, if the work is too shallow, the

body of the gauge will stand clear of the work. If the body of the gauge touches the work, however, there is no means of telling how deep the part is without altering the setting of the spindle. The sensitive gauge shown is particularly adapted for inspection work, because it not only

measures the depth to which it is set, but also shows if the part is deeper, and how much. The body is made of $\frac{3}{16}$ -in. flat stock and the wire spindle is $\frac{3}{32}$ in. thick. A slot is cut in the center of the body to receive a special tightening collar, which is a knurled round piece, drilled in the center for the wire spindle, through the side for a friction pin, and is also drilled and tapped for a set-

screw. The friction pin is drilled to receive the wire spindle also. The bottom of the tightening collar is slotted, to clear the width of the body about $\frac{3}{16}$ in. When setting the gauge to depth, the collar is turned with the slot at right angles to the body, but, in use, the slot is turned back in line. The body of the gauge will stand clear of the top surface of the work in the ordinary way if the depth is too shallow, but if the hole is too deep, the spindle will drop down and show the extent of the error between the top of the tightening collar and the slot. If the hole is correct, there is no play in the spindle and the body of the gauge rests on the work.—Harry Moore, Montreal, Can.

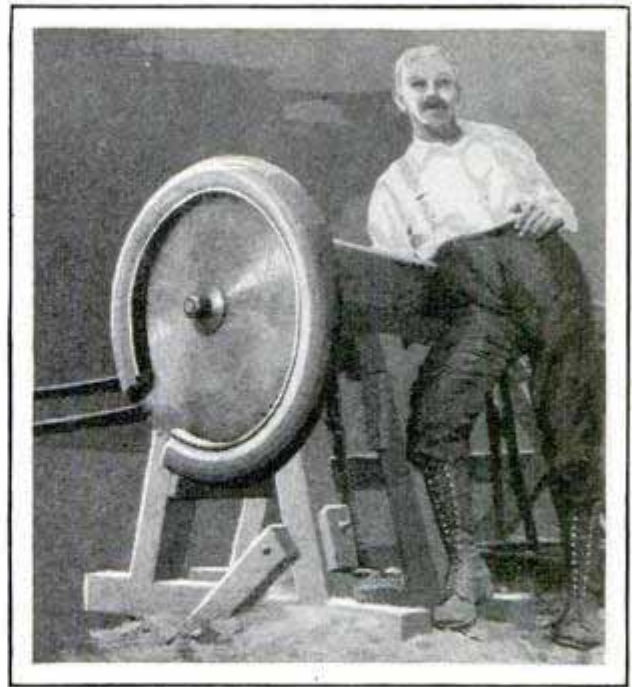
Tightening Storage-Battery Terminals



Storage - battery terminals must be kept tight to prevent them from loosening due to constant vibration. When the nut cannot be screwed down any more because of the shoulder on the terminal one or more copper washers under the nut will often remedy the trouble. Another method of tightening the lug on the terminal is

to drive down a small wood screw into the terminal or between the lug and the terminal, as shown in the two lower figures of the illustration. This acts as a wedge and spreads the terminal, taking up all the play between the lug and terminal. Even a nail will serve if a screw should happen not to be at hand.—G. A. Luers, Washington, D. C.

THIS four-room bungalow is an unusually fine example of the home that is all on one floor. Although of a conservative style, it has many individual features.

The porch may be inclosed as an extra room, or left open with trellises for trimming. In either case, it is within the main body of the house, and gives protection to the entrance door.

The working drawings for this design provide two methods of locating the partitions. One allows for a dining alcove and the other for a dining room approximately nine by twelve feet. There are many people who consider a formal dining room essential, and this alternate arrangement was worked out so that anyone who wanted a larger dining space than the dining alcove provided in the original plan, could build from this design. The one set of plans provides for both these arrangements, however.

The rooms open into each other in a convenient manner. The living room, approximately seventeen by thirteen feet, has windows on two sides and a handsome

fireplace at one end. A closet opens from the living room. In the alternate plan the living room and dining room are almost one large room, because of the wide opening between them.

The kitchen is arranged for the greatest efficiency, with plenty of cupboard room and everything within easy reach.

The two bedrooms and bath open from a small hall. Each bedroom has a large clothes closet, and there is a linen closet in the bathroom.

Home Builders' Questions

Q. How much extra will it cost to add a fireplace to our house while building? Can much be saved by building an inside fireplace instead of an outside one? **A.** The extra cost for a fireplace ranges between \$250 and \$400, depending on how many flues it contains, its size, height, the design of the mantel, and so on. An inside fireplace saves the difference in cost between face brick and common brick for that part of the stack which is within the house above grade.

Q. What is the ideal exposure for the different rooms of an ordinary house? **A.** The living room and living porch should be to the south or southwest, the dining room should have an eastern exposure for morning light, the principal bedrooms should have advantage of the best summer breeze. The best outlook from the living rooms should be given much consideration in arranging the rooms and facing the house.
