

The wire you see with the parachute on the end of it is a telephone wire, being payed out from a C-47 cargo plane.

A soldier throws out a parachute with the wire and a weight attached. The weight drops the line to the target area. From then on, through a tube thrust out of the doorway of the plane, the wire thrums out steadily—sixteen miles of it can be laid in 6 2/3 minutes. Isolated patrols can be linked quickly with headquarters. Jungles and mountain ranges

no longer need be obstacles to communication.

This is in sharp contrast to the old, dangerous way. The laying of wire through swamps and over mountains often meant the transporting of coils on the backs of men crawling through jungle vegetation, and in the line of sniper fire. It is reported that in one sector of the Asiatic theater alone, 41 men were killed or wounded in a single wire-laying mission.



THE Japs are in for a few surprises when our armored forces get rolling in the Pacific. Our Army intends to show them the latest in mobile tank warfare, guaranteed to make them lose more than their "face." Soon they will be introduced to a new trinity of armored destruction—"General Pershing," "General Chaffee" and the "Locust." These are the nicknames of our newest tanks, the M-26, the M-24

Below, 45-ton General Pershing with 90-mm. high-velocity gun





By a trick of fate, mobile tank warfare in the European phase of World War II ended where it began some 500 years agoin Bohemia, land of the Czechs. Mobility and firepower, the essence of tank warfare, began when Jan Zizka, the blind Hussite leader of the Czechs, mounted a cannon on a two-wheeled wagon back in the 15th century. This mobility was brought to perfection by Hitler. Then came Patton.

One captured German general inquired whether the Americans had perhaps adopted the methods of the German tank expert, Heinz Guderian. He was assured that General George S. Patton, Jr., had his own type of armored razzledazzle.

But while the tanks were helping shorten the war in Europe, there was criticism of our tanks occasioned by comparison with German armor. Commentators and analysts, many of whom still



misunderstand our tank situation, had compared our Sherman tanks with the Nazis' Royal Tiger or the Russian Stalin. The statistics they marshalled were indisputable! On graphs, charts and pictures, our heavy tankthe General Shermanlooked weak. Why didn't we have a larger tank?

The situation became such that finally a long letter from General Patton to General Thomas P. Handy, the Army's Deputy Chief of Staff, was published. He wrote in part: "It is patent that if a Tiger tank with an enormous thickness of armor were put at one end of a village street and engaged in a fight with a Mark IV

tank (General Sherman) at the other end, the Mark IV would not last. However, the great mobility of the Mark IV tank usually enables it to circumvent the slow and unwieldy Tigers and attack them from the rear. Had the armored divisions which accompanied the Third Army across France been equipped with Tiger tanks, the road


losses would have been 100 were negligible."

The answer, then, was simple. Our Army has not seen fit to approve a larger tank, although tanks as heavy as 60 tons were built more than three years ago for experimental purposes. Our Army's traditional concept of tank warfare has been that there should be three types of tanks: Light, medium and heavy.

It was the tanks which paced the final






Caring for wounded tank men in advance units is major problem; medics rehearse transfer of men to Weasel

raced 55 miles in one day to reach the Elbe River, where they secured intact one of the important bridges for the use of the Ninth Army.

In another sector, the First Army was using the new M-26 tanks for the first time. The M-26 or General Pershing weighs more than 45 tons, upward of 20 tons more than the General Sherman. It has much heavier armor plate, and mounts a 90-mm. high-velocity gun instead of the 75 or 76-mm. in the Sherman.

Major General J. Lawton Collins, commanding the 7th Corps, who rode in one of the new tanks, said it was apparently as easy to drive and shift gears as in an automobile. It is more maneuverable and can move over soft ground which would bog a Sherman. This is due to its wider tread, so wide, in fact, that engineers' bridges had to be widened to accommodate it. A distinguishing feature, in addition to its low silhouette, are the six dual, independently sprung road wheels which support the tank.



Armored warfare presents special problems for supply and medical evacuation. In Europe at times our tanks would lose contact with the supply columns speeding behind them and the tank men would subsist on emergency rations. Gasoline presented an enormous problem, as tank engines consume it in astronomical quantities. General Patton solved this problem on occasions by having trucks race ahead and deposit caches of gasoline along the proposed route of tanks.

The problem of getting wounded men out of tanks and back to medical

facilities has been solved. One of the pioneer units, the 47th Medical Battalion, Armored, in nearly five years of experimenting has just about set the pattern for armored medical units. When this unit was activated at Fort Knox, Ky., in July 1940 as part of the 1st Armored Division, the unit was handed a new, major problem in warfare: how to render medical support to the fast rolling tank men.


The battalion's first goal was to get its surgeons and their operating tables on



U. S. Army engineer guides tank driver onto newly built pontoon bridge


wheels. In the Louisiana and Carolina maneuvers of 1940 and 1941, 47th Battalion medics came up with their first innovation—surgical trucks. Tested and modified in North Africa and Italy, these trucks are now the key equipment around which all armored medical battalions are organized. Each company of a battalion has two of these trucks. Navy's Tigercat Hits 425 M.P.H. With 2 Engines

Bigger by half than the Hellcat, the new Grumman F7F Tigercat is the Navy's first twin-engine fighter plane. Its two 2100horsepower engines have more than twice the horsepower of the Hellcat. Most powerful fighter and fighter-bomber ever made for the Navy, the Tigercat can do 425 miles per hour at its critical altitude, and is faster at sea level than anything the Japs have. This gives us a vital advantage against sneak attacks at low levels, for which the Japs have demonstrated a fondness in operations in the Pacific. Wings of the Tigercat can be folded for carrier operations or to permit greater utilization of space in land bases. A tip to the Nips: Don't fool with a Tigercat.



Britain's Double-Deck Airliner Carries 70 Passengers

Powered by four Bristol Centaurus engines of more than 2500 horsepower each, the Shetland Flying Boat is Britain's largest aircraft yet to fly. With a loaded weight of 130,000 pounds, a wing span of 150 feet and an overall length of 110 feet, the Shetland was planned for world-wide patrol and reconnaissance duties. It has a maximum speed of 267 miles an hour and, cruis-

ing at 184 miles an hour, will carry a payload of 7620 pounds for a range of 4650 statute miles, distance from London to Bombay. Seventy passengers and a crew of 11 can be carried on the plane's two decks, with three main compartments, a promenade and a kitchen. Two generators provide power for lighting, cooking, refrigeration and air conditioning.







Flown Into Net, Airplane Drops Without Injury

British engineers recently tested the ability of one light plane to "take it" by flying the craft into a vertical net. Space was left for the propeller so the full impact was taken by the wings. The plane, a Miles M.38 Messenger, originally designed for war duties, dropped to the ground undamaged. Another test withstood by the sturdy plane was a takeoff in which two

rockets literally threw it into the air. The Messenger is expected to be a favorite with British flyers after the war. It takes off in



60 yards, has a top speed of 120 miles an hour, a stalling speed of 28, and carries four. It is powered by a 140-horsepower engine.

Postwar Plane for Sportsmen Has a 25-Foot Wing Span



Designed for the sportsman pilot who may want to come down in a convenient field, the "Skyhopper" can take off in 400 feet. It has a wing span of 25 feet, an overall length of 18 feet, and a height of only 63 inches. Tests show that it can climb at 750 feet per minute. Fuel capacity is 10 gallons, which gives a cruising range of 275 miles. It has a top speed of 125 miles an hour. All instruments are shock mounted according to Army standards to provide longer life and more

accurate readings and all movable control surfaces are balanced to prevent vibration. The craft will sell for approximately \$1000.

Family Model of "Flying Jeep" Accommodates 4 Persons

Nonstop weekend trips of 580 miles can be made with the Stinson Voyager-125, a four-place passenger plane. This is a post-

war model of the L-5
"Flying Jeep" used by the
Army for artillery spotting, reconnaissance and
other important jobs on
the war fronts. The Voyager has a top speed of 128
miles an hour, can climb
670 feet per minute and
stay aloft five hours. It
takes off in 550 feet at sea
level and lands in 280 feet.
In addition to the pilot,
three passengers and full

fuel load, it will carry 131 pounds of baggage. Cruising speed is 116 miles per hour and service ceiling is 13,800 feet.

Tank Taken for Ride




Four men working with block and tackle recently lowered a 60,000-pound water tank, standing 65 feet high on its tower, moved it 200 miles by truck and raised the tank again to its original height. First, four heavy timbers about 32 feet long were placed upright and connected to form a square support about the base of the tower. Block and tackle were fastened to the tower 25 feet above the ground and the legs were disconnected below that point. Then the entire tower was lowered 25 feet. Two repetitions of this operation brought the tank to the ground and it was rolled onto a truck for the trip from Casa Grande, Ariz., to Agua Prieta, Sonora, Mexico.

Hose Within Hose Keeps Melted Compound Flowing to Transformers

Potting compound for filling transformers is premelted in a tank and conveyed in liquid form by means of metallic hoses. A small hose heated by resistance wires running through it is enclosed in a larger hose and the liquid flows between the two hoses.

Heat is controlled by a variable thermostat on the tank.



Bad News for Insects —Find Super-DDT

Discovery of a synthetic compound deadlier to insects than DDT is reported by British chemists. Called Gammexane or 666, the super-DDT is chemically the gamma isomer of benzene hexachloride, and is not particularly close to DDT in structural chemistry. Tests showed it to be the deadliest weevil poison ever tested by the British. Half the concentration reguired in a DDT solution killed flies. Length of its effectiveness is unknown.

Colored Tabs Posted Over Umpire's Chair Tell Tennis Score

Bright colored markers mounted above the umpire's chair kept the spectators informed of the match score throughout the playing of the National Clay Courts Championships at the River Forest, Ill., Tennis Club. Devised by a club member, the ingenious visual scorer consisted of a T-shaped mount made of ordinary pipe. Yellow tabs of metal tubing, pressed flat and perforated for hanging on hooks, indicated the game score of the set in progress, and if the games passed 10-all a blue marker was suspended to indicate 10. Red markers fixed on pegs above told the score in sets. At the umpire's feet a placard gave the names of the players on each side. In the photograph, the set score is twoall and the umpire is removing the game markers at the completion of a 6-2 set. When these visual scorers are used the umpire need not repeatedly call out the score.



75-mm. Guns Fired in Giant Vacuum Jug Get Substratosphere Test

Artillery for superbombers and high altitude fighters is to be given a substratosphere test in a 50-foot steel vacuum jug. The unique firing chamber duplicates atmospheric changes encountered by a plane during a 5000-foot-per-minute climb up to 50,000 feet, where the temperature is about 70 below zero. Under these conditions Army experts study the effect on the speed of shells and firing mechanism of 75-mm. aircraft cannon. The range of the chamber

is only 27 feet compared to the previous shortest firing range of 300 feet for heavy caliber guns. The forward end of the chamber holds 20 tons of sand with a steel armor plate backstop. During tests the shells plow 10 feet through the sand and strike the armor plate with enough power theoretically to hurl a one-pound projectile 680 miles. This chamber was designed for the proving ground at Aberdeen, Md., by the York Corporation, York, Pa.




Service Station on Wheels For Industrial Plants

Only 21 inches wide, a compact lubricating cart for use in industrial plants is virtually a service station on wheels. Designed for operation by one man, it is pushed like a perambulator and can be maneuvered easily between rows of machines in a plant where space is limited. The cart carries many types of lubricants as well as a variety of pumps, oilcans, handguns and other tools. One model has a portable pump which is capable of developing 7000 pounds pressure per square inch.



Twin bomb bays of the B-32, arranged in tandem, are shown here with doors open. The tail rises 32 feet high in taxiing position





WITH flying suit zipped up and parachute harness snapped on, you step from the "ready" room into the hot Texas sunshine at the Fort Worth Army Air Field. On the flight line before you, with its four powerful engines idling, is Uncle Sam's new superbomber, the B-32, designed and built by Consolidated-Vultee.

As you pause at a respectful distance, you remember the words spoken a few minutes before by Lt. Gen. Barton K. Yount:

"The B-32 will help us knock out the Japs just twice as quick."

The first thing that catches

your eye about the B-32 is its lofty singlefin tail which rises to a height of 32 feet two inches. It is the bomber's most distinctive exterior feature and will always make it easy to identify.

"There's a tale behind that tail," says the


flight officer who is assigned to fly with you. "The B-32 started life with a twin tail similar to Consolidated's B-24 Liberator. It was changed on the third experimental model to achieve less drag and greater stability. About the same time they also lopped off the pressurized cabin and remote gun control."


The abandonment of these two outstanding features of the famed Boeing B-29, our first "superheavy," called for some explaining. It was soon forthcoming:

"You see the B-29 was de-

signed with one eye on European conditions and one on the Pacific. At that time missions were flown for considerable distances over enemy territory. As we have pushed the Japs back and acquired new bases such as Iwo Jima, that no longer

holds true. We can now safely approach Japan at moderate altitudes, climb up over the target for the bombing run, and after the bombs are dropped come back down for most of the trip back to home base.

"Even with a pressurized cabin we would use oxygen over the target—so why bother with pressurization at all? As for giving up remote gun control, tests on the combat model of the B-32 showed more accurate fire control with individual turrets."

The B-32 and B-29 have their likes and unlikes. Both are said to have similar speed (announced for the B-29 as 350 miles an hour), similar range (3600 miles for the B-29), about the same service ceiling (35,000 feet for the B-29) and similar bomb load. The B-29 has a maximum capacity of 10 tons of bombs, but on most missions over Japan the average has been about seven.

Both superbombers are powered with

four 2200-horsepower Wright Cyclone engines equipped with turbosuperchargers. These 18-cylinder engines are air-cooled, double-row radial. Span of the B-32's low-drag Davis wing is 135 feet compared with 141.3 feet for the B-29. The B-32's fuse-lage is 83 feet one inch long, about 16 feet shorter than the B-29. Gross weight of the B-32, including crew (eight men compared with 11 on the B-29), fuel and bombs is 100,000 pounds—20,000 pounds less than the B-29.

The wing area of the B-32 is 1422 square feet compared with 1739 for the Superfortress. The B-32 wing weighs 1000 pounds less than it did on the original model. Part of this weight saving was due to redesigning to make use of artificially aged and stretched aluminum alloy.


The flight officer leads the way toward the open bomb bay doors. After a glance

at the dual wheels of the tricycle landing gear, you climb a short steel ladder onto the bomb bay catwalk and proceed forward into the cockpit. To the left is the navigator's table and across the way a cot on which are piled the chest-type parachutes that can be snapped to your harness in a jiffy.

"Not much chance you'll have to use this chute," says the f.o., "but if anything should happen all you have to do is step out on the catwalk, hold your head down and fall forward." He grinned. "Simple."

You look about the roomy cockpit. Pilot and copilot are in their conventional positions, but between them is a station for the engineer. He sits on the floor between the two pilots, his feet resting on one of the steps leading down to the bombardier's compartment in the nose. The engineer's job is similar to that of the enlisted aerial engineer, or "flying crew chief," on a B-24 or B-17. He does not have the cruise-control responsibility of the B-29 flight engineer who occupies a station back of the copilot with an instrument console of his own.

All flight instruments on the B-32 are on one large panel before the three-man flying team. These three key men receive their B-32 transition training together.


As the big bomber taxis across the field getting ready for the takeoff, you glance

across the runways to the mile-long Consolidated plant where the bombers are rolling off the assembly lines. The pilot "revs" up each engine, and the bomber trembles and tries to pull away. The B-32's four-bladed Curtiss propellers are 16 feet eight inches in diameter, the largest on any land plane in mass production. You watch the pilot set a single control which synchronizes all four engines by altering the propeller blade angles. This control maintains synchronization through various flight conditions and saves the pilot the headache of manually adjusting separate controls.

The copilot holds a check list in his hand as he speaks into the interphone. There are 75 items to be checked before takeoff. After the last one is checked, the bomber surges forward with a tremendous roar and in less than 30 seconds you and 50 tons of bomber are in the air.

Although the giant B-32 seemed to take off without effort, you are told that 160 gallons of high octane gasoline were consumed in taxiing and taking off. It requires 190 gallons to lift a B-32 to 10,000 feet. These factors, and many others, are carefully weighed by the crew when planning a long mission. They must carry adequate fuel for emergencies such as the loss of one engine; the bomber consumes 15 percent more gasoline on only three engines. Un-






Sawdust Retread Is Nonskid

Tires made with ordinary sawdust may eliminate the bothersome wintertime job of putting on chains if the invention of two Morgantown, W. Va., brothers proves successful. With a special remilling process the sawdust is worked into the retread camelback, which is applied to the tire in the same way as ordinary camelback to provide an abrasive tread. In tests before representatives of leading rubber companies the inventors ran an automobile up a snow and ice-covered 12-percent grade, stopped the car, started it again and finally backed the car up the grade. The rubber companies are making their own tests, not only for nonskid qualities, but to see if the sawdust also increases mileage.




Portable Freight-Car Ramp Supports 15,000 Pounds

Gaps between loading platforms and freight cars can be bridged with a portable nonskid ramp which is moved with a fork truck. It spans any gap between five and 46 inches and carries loads up to 15,000 pounds. Lift handles slide down flush with the riding surface when not in use. Shock plates absorb impact and transmit it to stringer plates which prevent truck and load from running off the sides. Ends of the stringers are set back and rounded off to permit the truck to turn sharp corners.


Sanding disks, drums, blocks and compound shapes for use on a workshop lathe, saw or grinder head may be coated with abrasive quickly and easily with a can of water-soluble, quick-drying cement and abrasive in various grits. Such sanding shapes are invaluable in working on irregular surfaces which flat sandpaper can't cover. To coat a desired shape, first make sure it is clean and dry, then apply a full

coat of cement with a small, clean paint brush. Pour the abrasive on immediately and shake off the excess grit by tapping the shape lightly on the corner. Apply a second cement coating 20 or 30 minutes later, directly over the abrasive, and pour on more abrasive, shaking off the excess as before. Allow the finished shape to dry overnight. When the abrasive becomes badly worn, the shape may be recoated.



of carrier Bon Homme Richard, and gun inspection are used for such purposes as storage. Sixteen shipyards in three states operate un-

der the navy yard's jurisdiction. More than 700 companies, each with subcontractors, some as far west as Gary, Ind., make parts

for its ships.

What the navy yard manufactures is principally trouble for the nation's enemies. In 1944 it performed repairs, alterations and other services on 1616 ships, 833 of which went into drydock. In addition the field service division handled 1517 vessels built in private yards, fitting them out or providing alterations. Also, merchant ships totaling 7286 paid service calls at the yard.

While repairing and altering at the above rate, the yard has built and sent to sea during the present expansion program the greatest warships that have ever wet their hulls. These include the 45,000-ton superbattleships Missouri, North Carolina and Iowa and the 27,000-ton Essex type aircraft carriers Bennington and Bon Homme Richard. Just a few months ago, from the sixstory depth of one of the yard's huge construction drydocks emerged the greatest airplane carrier ever built, the 45,000-ton USS Franklin D. Roosevelt.

Some of the problems which the yard, under Rear Admiral Freeland A. Daubin,

NCLE SAM decided back in 1801 to build a navy yard convenient to the promising little settlement of New York. After shopping around he invested five dollars in a 42-acre piece of land on the

Brooklyn waterfront.

Today, colossal is the only word to describe the operations of the New York Navy Yard at Brooklyn. The 70,000 employees of this largest navy yard in the world form a community about as large as Schenectady, N. Y., or Topeka, Kan.

The original 42 acres on the East River near Brooklyn Bridge have grown to 290. Four annexes raise this total to 788 acres. Eighty more locations, mostly in Brooklyn,

commandant, and Rear Admiral Sherman S. Kennedy, general manager, has solved are examples of Yankee ingenuity on a gigantic scale.

There was the time two 280-foot, 1300ton destroyer escorts limped into the yard. The stern of one was badly damaged. The midsection of the other had been blown out, but bow and stern were okay.


The two vessels were set in a construction drydock side by side. The two stern sections were cut from the two ships so that the good section could be transferred from the vessel damaged amidship. The 200-ton undamaged section was cradled in steel and concrete. Wooden skids were built between the two destroyer escorts and greased. A block and tackle arrangement at the bottom of the drydock reached to the top. A second block and tackle at this point led to a great crane.

The crane lifted, the good stern edged sideways until it replaced the amputated stern. The great job, which was something like sewing a giant tip on the finger of a gargantuan glove, was completed in 21 days. The new ship, a combination of two badly damaged ones, was soon back at sea.

Another remarkable job was performed on a destroyer which was towed in with the entire middle section damaged beyond repair. Cutting away the center of the ship, with the exception of enough deck for workmen to pass between bow and stern sections, the navy yard built in a new center and the nation had another seaworthy ship instead of a hopeless heap of scrap.

One of the most difficult jobs ever tackled

was to repair the stern of a warship after a collision with another vessel. The fantail area was not only a jumble of twisted bunks and equipment, but was filled with gasoline and oil fumes, highly explosive and deadly to workmen. Quantities of powder and other explosives had been released into the damaged section by the crash.


The problem was handled first by berthing the tinder box at a safe dock and calling fire fighting equipment. Powerful streams of water were hosed into the section until gasoline, oil and other explosives were washed out: Experts in diving costumes and others in gas masks tackled the wreckage by hand, using hack saws and cold chisels. Finally the ship was drydocked without hazard.

Incredible as it seems, even in these mod-

ern days of fabrication, the yard has a stock of bows, or forward sections, for the most numerous classes of destroyers and destroyer escorts. In common with all ships which travel the sea, the bow sections are most often damaged by collision with other ships, docks and various obstructions. When a ship of this class comes in with severe damage it is often drydocked, the damaged area cut away and a new nose is fitted on. "Plastic surgery" goes to sea with the result that the damaged vessel is in fighting trim again in a couple of weeks.

All jobs of this magnitude go into the repair drydocks which, along with construction drydocks, have reached the peak of efficiency in the New York Navy Yard. Great pits, lined with concrete and reinforced, they are approximately as deep as

a six-story building is high and their floors are big enough for a football game with room to spare for the spectators.

On repair jobs ingenuity and the rush of activity at the yard combine to save time and put ships back at sea in record time. Whenever possible, four or five ships are lined up and floated in, the end of the drydock is closed and water is pumped out. Repair crews numbering into the hundreds swarm onto the various vessels. Work is scheduled so all the vessels are finished about the same time.

Often several large warships, too wide to be placed parallel in a repair drydock, are fitted in by placing the narrow bow of one alongside the narrow stern of another and continuing this pattern for the length of the dock. By such efficient use of the repair dock it is necessary only to empty them once and flood them once to handle a number of warships.

The use of these gigantic concrete ditches is an advantage Uncle Sam did not have during the last war when all sizable warships were constructed on building ways which start above ground and slope into the water so a ship will slide off when launched. Although the New York Navy Yard still uses both building ways and construction drydocks, no-

where is the art of below-surface construction brought to greater efficiency than it is here in Brooklyn.

So huge are these concrete ditches that the gates which hold back the water while ships are being built are virtual ships themselves. They are steel caissons which can be floated away and moved at will by tug power.

Floated into place, they are sunk into the mouth of the dock by permitting them to fill with water. Once they have formed a "stopper" for the mouth of the drydock, the dock is emptied and construction is begun. When the ship is finished, the caisson is pumped dry, whereupon it floats to

the surface. It is hauled off by a tug and the completed war vessel leaves the flooded dock under its

own power.

Construction drydocks cost more to construct than building ways because of the extent of excavation necessary and the reinforcement of bottom and walls. However, in the long run the method is cheaper and faster. When a ship is being designed for construction on a slanted building way, every angle under calculation must be modified to care for this slant. Construction on the horizontal bottom of a drydock eliminates these laborious calculations.

Another advantage of "ditch" construction is that leaks can be discovered and corrected, trim and balance of a craft checked and motive power tested as soon as the dock is flooded. Any developments needing correction can be handled merely by emptying the drydock. Still another advantage of the construction drydock is that it serves as a repair dock instead of being out of commission on occasions when no vessels are being built.

To move huge warship parts around the navy yard a network of railroad tracks supports one of the greatest collection of huge portable cranes in existence. Most of these cranes will lift 300,000 pounds with ease and place a section into the designated spot with exact precision. The cranes not only serve to move guns and fabricated parts onto ships being built, repaired or modified, but they do such odd jobs as loading 100-ton landing craft onto larger ships.

In addition, the yard boasts a gigantic ham-

merhead crane, so-called because it resembles a hammer with the vertical section simulating the handle. The crane will handle up to 900,000 pounds and it can sling a 200-ton tug, a 16-inch gun or a 150-ton turret section as a routine job.

The 50 miles of railroad track which criss-cross the yard near Brooklyn Bridge do more than move cranes. They transport the 150 navy yard freight cars, hauled by electric and Diesel locomotives, and even include a classification yard. Despite the congested location of the yard, which has more skyscrapers within rifle shot than any other such establishment in the world, no civilian railroad connects directly with the navy yard railroad. Every car which comes into the area is brought in by car float or car ferry.

In addition to the huge waterborne traffic, 150,000 automobiles and trucks enter the navy yard

every day.

Figures dealing with yard operation are gigantic by any measure. The stock pile of material on hand has an average value of \$180,000,-000. More than 25,000 phone calls a day keep its 1575 telephones busy.

The monthly payroll runs \$15,-000,000 and to facilitate the cashing of up to \$600,000 in payroll checks per day a branch bank is operated within the yard. The building floor area is 6,500,000 feet. Paved roads total 22 miles. Forty

restaurants do a \$3,500,000 business yearly. Salvage alone gives another idea of the magnitude of the operation. In an average year 105,400,000 pounds of iron and steel scrap are collected along with 7,656,000 pounds of nonferrous scrap. The paper scrap item hits the 3,200,000-pound mark and 825,000 pounds of rags are collected, so that nothing valuable is wasted.

More than \$300,000 a year will be saved by a new oxygen carrying pipe line 10 miles in length with 700 outlets for weld-

ing and flame-cutting.

Roughly speaking, the working force of the yard is divided 20,000 on new construction, 20,000 on repairs, 10,000 on manufacture of parts, etc., and 20,000 on maintenance, utilities, transportation, clerical work and various minor classifications. Keeping this huge force at top speed during the war has been an inspiring and gratifying task, according to Rear Admiral Kennedy.

"The lights have never been turned off and the telephones have never stopped ringing a minute since the war started," he says. "Nor has the fighting spirit of our huge army of workers flagged in their battle to get ships in shipshape condition to the fighting fronts. We have hit our completion dates with 100 percent efficiency under our slogan, 'service to the fleet'."

Goggles for Amphibious Troops Help Gauge Depth of Water

Sun goggles recently issued to Army and Navy men have Polaroid lenses which assist in amphibious operations by transmitting true colors. The lenses show the color of water at a depth of two feet as white, at six feet as yellow, at eight feet light green, at 10 feet dark green and at 20 feet black. The lenses, made of a new type of lightpolarizing plastic material which is neutral in shade, are also useful in identifying airplanes and signals where colors are involved. They transmit 12 percent of visible light, one third that of ordinary sun glass lenses. The shatterproof goggles protect the eyes against glare, wind and dust. They permit 180-degree normal vision while the eyes are looking directly ahead.

(Although a twin-engine plane burning 87-octane fuel can climb at the rate of 1000 feet per minute, 100-octane increases the rate to 1400 feet per minute.



FM Speeds Train Orders

Static-free radio communication is achieved between yard office and switch engines with the first adaptation of frequency modulation radio to railroads. Mobile FM radio sets maintain constant communication between crews and yard office over the Westinghouse Company's 25 miles of switchtracks in Pittsburgh. The system consists of one stationary transmitter and installations on five locomotives. The FM broadcasts are said to be heard with great clarity.

Dummy Airplanes Fool Enemy's Aerial Spies



Dummy air bases complete with landing strip and all facilities now can be constructed in record time by American aviation engineers, who have concentrated efforts on ease and rapidity of handling. Made of target cloth, wood and wire, with parts hinged for compact folding, a dummy P-51 can be unloaded and set up in seven minutes by a crew of five. An entire squadron can be folded and hauled away in two 21/2-ton trucks. In erecting a camouflage installation bulldozers first scrape out the major strip just deeply enough to show from the air. Bamboo or tree trunks provide an operations tower and simulated bivouac areas indicate personnel activity. Trucks are run into a clear area to leave tire tracks that spell "ack-ack" to photo intelligence men. Fake radio

traffic soon attracts enemy monitors. Supplemented by occasional flights by genuine aircraft these air bases defy detection by enemy photo reconnaissance planes.



Electrical "Manicurist" for Home

You can give yourself a speedy, professional manicure in your own home by using an electrical plastic "pencil" provided with buffer, file, cuticle pusher and brush attachments. It is claimed that the robot manicurist files the nails so smooth that they will not snag the sheerest hose. Powered by a 1/2000 horsepower motor and easy to operate, the machine prevents hangnails and, with the buffer attachment, massages hands and finger joints.

RADIO PILOTS YOUR POSTWAR



A PPLICATION of radio equipment to wartime aviation has been given a tremendous boost by Army Air Forces experimentation and research, just as military necessity has spurred practical development of many other techniques.

Consider a suppositional flight by a globe-girdling plane such as the cargo version of the B-29. Before takeoff, radiorange has reported on weather conditions that may be encountered. New electronics equipment is able to detect severe thunderstorms up to 100 miles away and weak cumulo-nimbus clouds to at least 50 miles. This information, plus a knowledge of Plane is poised for landing approach by instruments. Localized transmitter in background and mobile set, above, send beams aligned with runway's center line

weather characteristics in a particular area, allows for adequate warning of impending meteorological disturbances, especially valuable in flights over the Pacific. No observation stations are available there and treacherous, turbulent areas and quickly changing frontal cumulus constantly jeopardize air operations. With data-thus collected, radio is then put into effect to communicate forecasts and reports to all airports in the airways system, using point-to-point and air-to-ground circuits.

At takeoff time, improved radiophones enable tower operators to keep in two-way touch with pilots, issuing instructions and transmitting last-minute information. If other planes take to the sky at the same time, air-to-air communication between planes may be accomplished automatically without fading at altitude or increasing in audio output on descent. Frequencies are preset on the ground and the radio operator simply selects the channel he desires to use; the receiver







If pilot or copilot must communicate with the navigator or the radioman, increased sensitivity of his interphone amplifier will compensate for low microphone output in upper air, and its three-step volume control will modulate the increased power output capacity

of the amplifier to overcome the reduced sensitivity of headsets in high flying. In the new "lip" microphone all unwanted sounds and noises are cancelled out by the acoustics of the design. It is so constructed that sounds enter either front or back and noises originating at a distance affect both sides of the diaphragm at once, resulting in no movement. Weighing less than two ounces, this small microphone can be worn under a respirator.

With the plane leveled off at a selected altitude for flight to its destination, scores of radio navigational aids are available to guide the craft along its route. At present,

B-29s carry close to a ton of communications and radio equipment, and, while this weight factor will be reduced considerably when bombing, identification, detecting and jamming apparatus are no longer needed, the devices are equal to every current situation. An electronics system has been perfected in which an airborne interrogator receives directional data from two responder beacons located on the ground. Precision navigation within line-ofsight range can be performed by ranging on these two stations, and a plane can locate itself in the air to within 50 feet. Radio-telemetry may

also be employed to determine precise position, with a radio transmitter on the ground sending a modulated wave of a given length to the aircraft in flight from which it is retransmitted to the ground on a different wave length by a receivertransmitter called a telesonde. The interference of the two waves is indicated on the ground by an oscilloscope and gives the distance, which may be read directly from a quadrant.

The principles and practices of the fighter control system-developed to a high degree of efficiency during war-undoubtedly will be used to monitor commercial

aircraft. At remote outposts throughout the world, including midocean "artificial islands," transmitters will navigational aids to sea-

be set up to provide spanning airliners. Should a pilot want a bearing, his radio operator advises an airways station, which alerts all direction-finding stations within the control net. The airliner operator then sends his identification signal and any other required signal at established intervals. while each DF station

takes a directional bearing on these signals and transmits it to the central station. All bearings are evaluated there and the plane's position at the time the signals were received is radioed to the craft. The pilot flies a set heading during this period and upon receipt of the bearing adds the distance traveled within the time of three to four minutes to establish his correct position. In this connection, radio set SCR-291 may prove extremely valuable in furnishing accurate bearings for planes on world-wide air routes. The equipment includes a radio receiver, a loop or Adcock-type antenna array and a cathode ray tube and motor-driven goniometer which provide instantaneous bearings. The plane operator tunes the signal in, reads the visual trace pattern, determines the true direction by pressing a switch and enters his findings on a chart for evaluation into a fix. A control network of several of these DF stations and a master station can cover an operational area 1000 miles in diameter.

To increase efficiency, the latest type of very-high-frequency vertical antennas will be used. Formed of streamlined compregwood with a metal plating, they can withstand icing and acceleration loads, reduce drag, neutralize the effect of precipitation static and pick up and radiate low-frequency waves more effectively. To eliminate undesirable sounds, a "probe antenna" locates sources of noise in loose metal or electrical connections, faulty ignition and elsewhere, and dampens out the interference. Precipitation static, caused by the passage of rain, snow, ice or dust over the metal skin of the plane, often making radio reception impossible, also is reduced considerably by a drytype discharger riveted to the skin, which emits accumulated charges constantly.

In event of a forced landing at sea, the chances of quick rescue are greatly heightened by radio devices. A portable transmitter is parachuted into the water and begins to send repetitive distress signals as soon as the radio marker buoy strikes the surface. The signal is sent out continuously for 12 hours, and ships and planes can be guided to the survivors by radio compasses. For life rafts, the Corner Reflector has been developed, a lightweight collapsible set of intersecting surfaces made of metallized cloth or screenlike material on an aluminum frame which reinforces the raft's "Gibson Girl" radio signal.

Assuming that all has gone well, however, the plane would continue on its course, guided at all times by a chain of radio-range stations stretching at inter-(Continued to page 150)


Miniature Steam Engine Hauls 1500:Pound Load




A VIATION designers are looking forward to creating within the "visible future" a rocket ship that would fly at the rate of 100,000 miles per hour.


At least, states Hall Hibbard, vice-president and chief engineer of Lockheed Aircraft Corporation, the basic principles of such a space ship are understood

and the problems that remain are minor in comparison to the ones already solved.

It is conceivable that such an airplane, moving outside the atmosphere, could fly all the way around the world in half an hour. Provided that it could carry enough fuel and a livable atmosphere for its occupants, it could travel to the moon, around it and return to earth between daybreak and dark.

The swiftest vehicle in the world today is our P-80 Shooting Star, Lockheed's jet propulsion aircraft that gets its thrust from a gas turbine. It is a transitional type between the aircraft that get their power from reciprocating engines and the rocket craft of the future.

The P-80 wing has a knife-like leading edge and other aerodynamic innovations that master the problems encountered when the speed of sound is approached or surpassed. The pressurized cabin is unique

among production fighters.

Small and light, the Shooting Star is extremely maneuverable through use of a hydraulic aileron boost and electrically operated flaps, and can carry heavy loads of ammunition, photographic equipment, bombs and fuel. Ceiling of the P-80 is well above that of propeller driven airplanes. The engine can be completely replaced in 15 minutes. There is no engine torque or vibration. The General Electric jet engine (gas turbine) is installed in the fuselage between the cockpit and tail.





The 750-mile-per-hour speed-of-sound mark is a barrier because at that speed a projectile such as an aircraft sets up a shock wave that increases its drag materially. A lot of power, possibly gravitational power, will be needed to break through that barrier. An airplane trying to fly past the speed of sound may be able to accelerate by going into a dive, getting an extra boost from gravity and passing on to the higher speeds at which drag is less. Research in ballistics indicates drag or air resistance is less at 1000 or 1200 miles per hour than at 750 miles per hour.

Aircraft engineers are whittling away at the speed-of-sound barrier all the time and are just about ready to punch through it. Then they will encounter another serious problem, the unavoidable fact that heat is created at high speed because of friction with the atmosphere.

Already, in aircraft that are slower than Lockheed's P-80, heating troubles due to friction plus heat caused by the compression of ventilation air are a matter of concern. Some kind of refrigeration system appears necessary for any low-altitude airplane to fly, say, at 1000 miles per hour.


To fly faster than the 1500-mile limit fixed for moderate altitudes, it will be necessary to climb out of the atmosphere into space, above the friction of the earth's envelope. A cruising altitude of 100 miles above sea level would eliminate all frictional heat problems.

Oxygen doesn't exist at that altitude, so the gas turbine power plant would be useless. Oxygen or some other oxidizer would have to be carried as part of the fuel supply, using jet propulsion of the true

rocket type.

The present main obstacle to space flying is the inefficiency of rocket fuels. Liquid oxygen and gasoline are used up so rapidly that not enough can be carried for protracted flights. The German rocket plane ME-163 ran out of fuel after 15 minutes of powered flight. This plane had no ceiling in the usual sense and could climb until its fuel was exhausted. With a slightly greater fuel capacity and a pressurized cabin it could be flown out beyond the atmosphere.


Below is the Speed Spectrum, showing the average possible top speeds of various known and future aircraft





Research on better rocket fuels is under way. Possibly within 10 years an improved fuel will be developed, the engineers suggest, that will permit the building of a practical space ship.

What will this ship look like?

It will compare pretty closely with present airplane shapes, modified for high speed, Mr. Hibbard believes. Its fuselage will have a long pointed nose. A wing and conventional control surfaces with sharp leading edges will provide lift and maneuverability for taking off and for climbing through











Steel Fingers Unload Railroad Cross Ties

Manpower shortages and an arduous physical task were eased at the same time by development of a mechanical unloader for railroad cross ties, tested successfully at the Southern Wood Preserving Company's plant at East Point, Ga. The electrically operated mechanism is mounted on a horizontal steel boom which is pivotally supported on a steel frame. The frame rests on a concrete foundation at one side of the unloading track. Revolving on roller bearings, the boom is long enough to reach either end of the car and is racked back and forth on roller bearings by an electric motor drive. A separate electric motor on the outer end of the boom operates a rope drum from which a steel hoisting cable extends out over a sheave at the front end of the boom. The cable is attached to a multiple cross tie hook or grapple which picks up five ties, weighing 1500 pounds, and releases them automatically at the proper place. The machine also can be used to load boxcars.

Rotary Snowplow Cuts Grass With Simple Attachment

Using an assortment of materials, Arthur A. Schwartz, Bell Aircraft engineer, built a rotary snowplow for clearing his walks which he converts to a lawn mower in summer by the addition of a simple attachment. Materials for the hybrid device cost him \$12 and included an electric motor, a garbage pail for the scoop, a length of stovepipe, a frying pan for a housing to support the spinning blades, two pulley wheels, scrap metal for the blades of the fan and some assorted nuts and bolts. He plans a gasoline powered model for use where electrical connections are not available.


Hospital Cars Have Kitchens And Pharmacies

An exact model of the car, on a scale of 1/2 inch to a foot, was built by Boucher and is complete down to bunks that can be dropped to provide seats for patients able to walk.

Electric Gauge for Tool Holes Gives Instant Readings











when the first big Diesel-electric freight locomotive in its fancy blue jacket rumbled through Winslow, Ariz., with only a brief pause for station identification, Winslow was a cowtown of 3500, shopping center for Navajos and Hopis and jumping-off place for tourists who had read the ads about the Painted Desert and Petrified Forest.







Since then Winslow has doubled its human population and filled its roundhouses to overflowing. It has become an important railroad town, with a train arriving or leaving every 12 minutes around the clock. It is home to a fleet of 68 main line Diesel-electric freight engines-probably 78 by the time you read this-hauling 2300 cars of freight in and out of the Winslow yards every 24 hours. The Santa Fe railway calls this the "Diesel Capital of the World." Some of our Navy bases might dispute the title; but upwards of 400,000 Diesel horsepower are stabled in the Santa Fe's Winslow yards.


Quite probably the Santa Fe would be suffering acute traffic pains today had the railroad not begun in early 1941 to acquire these 5400-horse-power streamline giants from Electro-Motive Division of General Motors Corporation at a continuous rate of about three four-unit locomotives every two months. The war has multiplied the passenger and freight loads to the aircraft factories and shipyards

and military establishments on the Pacific coast and to the California ports of embarkation, and a new peak is approaching as the Army and Navy transfer their forces and materiel from Europe to the Japanese theater. True, the Santa Fe's fleet of steam locomotives knew their way around the 451 miles of mountain curves and steep grades and blistering

desert between Winslow and Barstow, Calif., but it took two steam engines, and often three, to haul a heavy freight train up to the 3000 and 7000-foot passes of California and Arizona. One of these Diesels can tow 3500 tons imperturbably up the same grades without a pause to gulp water, without a halt on the downgrade to cool burning brakes.

On these rugged 451 miles west of Winslow the 60-mile-an-hour freight Diesels and the 100-mile-an-hour streamliners that pull the "Super-Chief" from Los Angeles to Chicago in 41¾ hours meet their severest tests. From Winslow westward they climb steeply to the rarefied atmosphere of Riordan, 7311 feet above sea level, Diesel engines purring as smoothly in the zero weather of the Arizona mountains as in the semitropic warmth of Needles, Calif., at nearly sea level. Eastward from San Bernardino the rails climb 2750 feet in 25 miles to the Cajon pass, a grade of better than 2 percent. The Diesels take in stride the extremes of temperature and pressure and grade.

The debate between advocates of Diesel and steam power has only just begun—and into it must come the proponents of electric, steam turbine and turbine-electric locomotives. It is easy for Diesel adherents to claim economy in fuel and maintenance costs, but fuel costs vary according to many factors—inherent efficiency, price, cost of hauling, availability for work. The Diesel need burn no fuel during "standby" time and on the Santa Fe it has the high average of


working 91.5 percent of the total hours in the month. As to maintenance, a true account will have to be based on more years of Diesel-electric experience than have yet run out. The life span of a locomotive is unknown.

Maintenance problems are relatively simple. One obvious advantage of the multiple-unit Diesel over steam is that if one engine is disabled the ailing unit is simply cut out of the circuit and running repairs effected while the freight keeps rolling on its remaining 4050 horsepower. When an

iron horse of the steam variety breaks down it may block traffic until the veterinarian comes.

Whatever the merits of the Diesel in the allover transportation picture, it has performed to the eminent satisfaction of the Santa Fe on its particular territory. For one thing, it has virtually eliminated a fairly colossal water-hauling problem in the waterless regions of the southwest. Some towns along the railroad depend entirely on the Santa Fe for water supplies and when the insatiably thirsty steam locomotive prevailed on the Arizona lines it was necessary to haul a million gallons of water per day in tank cars to Ash Fork, Ariz., alone. The Diesels drink only enough to cool

themselves, and with traffic three times as heavy today Ash Fork needs only 360,000 gallons of water.

The Diesels also excel in downhill travel. Coming down the mountain into Ash Fork or San Bernardino the trains used to grind to a stop with smoke pouring from overheated brake shoes and wheels. Every 10 or 12 miles on the downgrade it was necessary to stop and let the air brakes cool. Just the other day the engineer of a Diesel-electric released his air brakes at Supai for the tortuous 23mile ride to Ash Fork, 1800 feet lower. In all that distance, with 2300 tons of freight behind him, he applied the air brakes just 20 times, a few seconds at a time. The brake shoes were cool when the train pulled into Ash Fork. The Diesel's electric retarding brake had done the work.

This dynamic brake turns the traction motors into generators, the resistance thus set up acting as a brake on the locomotive. The current gen-

erated is dissipated as heat through grids on the roof. As much as 4300 horsepower is generated and thrown away and no one has thought of any better use for the waste current than to make toast on the rooftop grids. The problem bothers no one, for the electric brake pays its way liberally in running time saved and reduced wear on all brakes. Just a hint of the saving in wheel wear alone is evident in the tabulation of 11,000 pairs of car wheels changed due to wear in 1942, when the fleet of Diesel-electrics with dynamic brakes was just beginning; in 1943 only 4000 pairs were changed.




More than 2600 lubricating oil filters are used each month

Most of the work on the Diesels is centered in the railroad shops at Winslow, which have been turned into a "superservice" station for "Lightning Wagons"—the name given by the Indians when the first of the freight Diesels came west in '41. Navajos, Hopis, Lagunas, Mexicans, Spaniards and Nordics perform the superservice.

A locomotive requiring no repairs spends eight minutes at the fuel rack filling her 5000-gallon oil tanks, moves on to the sand tower where four boxes on each engine unit are refilled, travels to the wash rack for a steam and oil bath, takes on radiator

water, undergoes routine inspection and is back on the main line in 90 minutes, ready to haul another string of freight cars west.

Each Diesel unit requires 250 gallons of distilled water for its cooling system and the Winslow shop distills 23,000 gallons a day. Each engine uses 190 gallons of lubricating oil in its crankcase, which is drained every 20,000 miles. Drained oil is sent to a reclamation plant and 80 percent of the original volume is reclaimed and used again.


After every 2000 miles the locomotive goes into the shop for inspection and servicing which become more comprehensive with each 2000-mile step. The check sheet includes such items as inspection of pistons and crankcases, air compressors and fire extinguishers; engine air filters are cleaned, fan bearings and generator belts checked. The cooling system is completely inspected. Electrical inspectors go over traction motors, brushes, main and auxiliary generators, batteries, driving controls and instruments, headlights and interior lights, wiring and electrical cabinets. Engines are run under load for an operating test. Viscosity of oil in the Diesel engines is checked and other lubricating jobs performed.

At 4000 and 6000 miles every engine undergoes an additional routine, and another special serv-

icing is prescribed at monthly intervals. In one recent month 588 Diesel-electric locomotives went through Winslow's "superservice" station in an average of 5 hours and 43 minutes each. The average "turnaround" time for a steam engine is about 11 hours.

The big Diesels do their heavy chores with little interruption at the rate of 10,000 miles a month; some of the four-year-olds have passed the half-million-mile post.

Three of the outdoor service tracks have lighted pits. The 200-foot platforms just fit a four-unit Diesel



Most of the engineers of this Dieselized line are very happy in the upholstered arm chairs of their streamline cabs. Of course, wherever railroaders swap yarns there will be engineers who snort at the pretty Diesels with their drawing-room luxuries; for them, the hand at the steam throttle, the grimy cab, the brute power of the old iron horse, the rhythmic thrust of the steel driving rods leave nothing to be desired.

But the men who direct the fleet are so imbued with the Diesel spir-

it they dream it, literally.

One of the Santa Fe mechanical chiefs was on an inspection trip not long ago. In the middle of the night he burst into the room of a division officer and woke him.

"What have we got a steam engine on here for?" he demanded.

His victim sleepily protested that the Diesel was still up ahead. "No sir," exclaimed the motive power chief, "the whistle of the steam engine wakened me and I got up and dressed and went forward. Sure enough, I saw the steam engine myself. What's wrong with the Diesel?"

The division officer got out of bed and quieted the boss. He was walking in his sleep. It was all a bad dream. The Diesel was up

there, pulling the load.

Houses Carried in Planes Forecast for After War

Perfection of a portable hospital shelter which can be transported by air points the way to postwar air transport of prefabricated houses and small buildings for remote areas. The hospital sheater weighs 3700 pounds, takes only two thirds the cargo space of a C-47 airplane and can be erected by four men in two hours. Adequate ventilation is stressed in design of a shelter for use in tropical climates and insulation is emphasized in one designed for the Arctic. Each unit has two rooms, one 16 by 16 feet and the other eight feet square. There are electrical connections and a stovepipe outlet. Each room has an outside door. Developed by the Equipment Branch and Aero Medical Laboratory of the Air Technical Service Command, each unit can accommodate 12 patients on litters.



Folding Bedguard Makes Crib of Daybed






Baby can have a room of his own even in the tiniest quarters with the newly patented bedguard, two slotted walls hinged together at right angles, which converts a daybed couch or single bed into a crib. The side traversing the bed adjusts to fit the width; legs adjust for various heights. The guard is held rigidly to the bed by the crosspiece and hinged corner and may be folded for easy storage and transportation. Rubber tips prevent the legs from slipping. As a child grows older, the bedguard may be placed to allow him to climb in and out yet keep him from rolling out at night.





MOST fabulous airplane ever built, the \$22,000,000 Hughes "Hercules" all-wood flying boat that could transport 400 soldiers and all their equipment across the Atlantic between dawn and dusk, is scheduled to make its test flights this winter.

This mammoth airplane weighs some 225 tons loaded for takeoff. Its full-cantilever wing is 320 feet long and has as much area as two ordinary residential lots. Its horizontal tail surfaces alone are three times the area of a standard two-engined airliner's wing.

The flying boat is powered by




eight Pratt & Whitney "Wasp Major" barrel engines of new design that can develop a total of 28,000 horsepower, equivalent to the power plants of 11 ocean-going Liberty ships. Its fuel tanks can hold 42 tons of gasoline, sufficient for 5000 miles of flight while carrying a 65-ton payload. The 70ton "Mars," the largest flying boat in the world until now, could be disassembled and carried as cargo by the new giant, with a partial fuel load.

Those are only a few of the breath-taking facts about the "Hercules." Its fuselage is 220 feet long. The pilot and copilot sit at the front of a flight compartment that is larger than an ordinary living room, 28 feet

above the waterline. The plane's tail fin is 52 feet tall and its top is 85 feet above the keel. Either of the streamlined wing floats is the size of a 20-passenger lifeboat.

There are 11 feet of headroom inside the wing at the root, and flight mechanics can walk through the wing to any of the engines, then crawl on hands and knees to the wing tips themselves. The wing has a designed deflection allowance of nine feet up or down at its tips, a total flexibility of 18 feet. There is an acre of skin in the wing, a total of two and a half acres of skin surface for the entire airplane. It will require a mile run for its takeoff.


Conceived as a long range military trans-



port in 1942 by Henry J. Kaiser and Howard Hughes, the plane was financed principally by the Defense Plant Corporation and has been built by the Hughes Aircraft Company in Culver City, Calif. Exterior shape above the water line was designed by Mr. Hughes, with Ray Hopper the chief designer for the entire project. The total cost of the first plane, estimated at \$22,000,000, includes the plant at which it was built, an assembly and testing site on the ocean, and considerable preliminary research and testing. The "Hercules" is insured for \$4,500,000.

Cargo arrangements below are possible in Gargantua of the air if used in military transport. Craft could carry


This is how "Hercules" would discharge tanks from bow doors like LST. Below, workers completing all-wood wing, which is 320 feet long




Decision to build the plane of wood was necessitated by the scarcity of aircraft metals when it was designed. Aside from the engines, instruments, control systems, control surface hinges and a tubular bracing system inside the leading edge of the wing, there is hardly a pound of metal on board. Even the engine mounts are of strong plywood. There are no nails or screws in the entire structure, although five tons of nails were used in the nailing strips during construction. Then each nail was withdrawn.


To provide the best strengthweight ratio, all structural members and the skin are built up as plywoods and veneers, the individual plies ranging from 1/4 of an inch to 1/8 of an inch in thickness. The plane's main hull longeron, 10 by 10 inches in cross section and 100 feet long, is built up from such plies.

Construction woods include spruce, birch, maple, poplar and mahogany. Construction of the plane actually began in the forests themselves, for individual trees were carefully selected and cut




Finished wing float of wood, with strut, above, has an aluminized surface. One of two, it's as large as 20-passenger lifeboat






Hull under construction towers above four floors of scaffolding. It is 220 feet long. Open area showing amidship will receive the giant wing

down, the stripping of the bark and the veneering of the wood was carefully watched, and the shipments were guarded against damage all the way to the plant.

The veneers were put together with a thermosetting formaldehyde type of glue, the forming being completed in presses and in a huge autoclave chamber inside of which heat and pressure could be applied. All exterior surfaces are finished with a coat of wood filler, a coat of sealer, a .002-inch thick sheet of tissue paper, two coats of clear spar varnish, and a final coat of aluminized spar varnish. These coats furnish protection against moisture and the sun's rays. The finished "Hercules" is considered to be one of the finest examples of woodworkers' craftsmanship in the world.

The plane was built inside a huge wooden hangar equal in size to the area of two large aircraft carriers. Temperature and humidity in the hangar were rigidly controlled.

Planned as a cargo carrier, the fuselage contains a large cargo hold that is

Navy Feeds "Bean Soup" to Fires to Quench Them Swiftly

More than 4,000,000 gallons of bean soup have been made for the Navy since the start of the war and no sailor has eaten a spoonful. In concentrated form, made from soybeans, it's mixed with water and air under pressure to form a smothering blanket of foam for fire fighting aboard ship. The soup comes in cans for quick handling. When connected to water and air supply the soup combines to pour a stream of snowlike chemical from a

hose. This forms a six to eight-inch blanket separating the flame from the combustible agent. Air is excluded and flames are extinguished in 30 seconds. Flight and hangar





decks of the carrier Enterprise, soaked with gasoline, burned furiously after a bomb hit, but the flames were extinguished in a minute by the chemical blanket.

Parachutes Drop Trench Digger to Cut Off Forest Fires



Smoke jumpers who parachute from planes of the United States Forest Service to fight forest fires with mechanized equipment now use a portable motorpowered trencher to keep flames from spreading. Packed in two parachute units, the trencher is dropped with the jumpers, who can have it in action in 10 minutes. Powered by a small outboard or aircraft motor, the beater head cuts a shallow trench 12 to 15 inches wide around the fire line, doing the work of 25 men with grub hoes and shovels. Centrifugal force is utilized in the beater head, which is a series of forged iron picks in three sections of three picks each. Each pick operates as a separate unit, with pendulum action providing resiliency to prevent a pick from snapping when it hits an obstacle. The head

chews up roots and small timber, tossing debris 15 to 18 feet to the side. The trencher operates easily over rough forest terrain.


Drum of Gasoline Freezes Solid in the World's Coldest Rooms

Aircraft engines for Army planes are tested in the world's coldest laboratory at Wright Field. A temperature of 110 degrees below zero is maintained in four large steel-walled chambers. At this temperature Army research workers can freeze a drum of ordinary gasoline solid. The laboratory was built for testing every piece of equipment that helps start an aircraft engine. Heat from the engines, once they are started, is carried away by fans. The two largest chambers are 36 by 16 feet, and it

takes 16 hours to drop the temperature to 110 degrees below zero, according to engineers of the York Corporation, York, Pa., who built the equipment. Workers in the chambers wear electrically heated suits.








Collector "Paints" With Stamps


Compass Dial Trains Navy Men to Visualize Navigation



Navy trainees are provided with a small dial which has a relative compass superimposed on a true compass to help them understand simple bearing and maneuvering problems. True north is located at the top of the true compass. The problems are explained on the back of the dial, which is used as a visual aid in seamanship, navigation and ordnance classes. To solve the problems, the student cuts out the silhouettes of ships drawn on the corners of the dial and places them according to instructions. For example, he is told to turn the guide ship which is centered on the dial so that it is set on a specified course. The position of another ship is also given. Then, by reading clockwise on the dials, the student is able to determine both true and relative bearings of the secondary ship.


Accurate Color Printing Sure With Voltage Stabilizer

Constant voltages required for accurate photoprinting of color values are maintained by a General Electric voltage stabilizer in use at Ansco's San Francisco laboratories. Plugged into a 115-volt outlet, the stabilizer provides a constant power supply for the photo-enlarger lamp, regardless of line voltage fluctuations.



Fingertip control for huge earth moving and cargo carrying vehicles using big single tires is provided by a constant ratio hydraulic steering mechanism soon to be offered as a postwar product. The system has no mechanical connections between steering wheel and axles. Impetus is transmitted to cylinders through flexible ducts or hoses. The steering head, to which the steering wheel is attached, contains a steering drive, metering pump, steering, relief and check valves, and an oil reservoir. Oil is drawn from the reservoir through a suction line to an engine driven hydraulic pump. The steering wheel serves merely as the hydraulic control valve for the power steer. When the wheel is turned to the right, the pump forces oil into the left-hand cylinder, causing right-hand steering movement. Pressure is on the right-hand cylinder for a left-hand turn. Front wheels of the vehicle remain in a locked position until the steering wheel is turned. A constant ratio between steering wheel and front wheel movement is provided by the metering pump.

BEARINGS BY THE BILLION

Ball & Roller Bearing Information Center photo

THOUGH the world seems to have lost its bearings entirely in the last few years, actually it has them by the billion today.

When the last Jap has surrendered and industry begins to turn out the mechanical marvels that promise to revolutionize our everyday living, we won't be able to turn around without encountering the "tremendous trifle," the antifriction bearing, without which no nation can have a modern army.

There isn't much glamor about bearings and little has been said about their magnificent share in the march to victory. Without antifriction bearings, our B-29s wouldn't be bombing Tokyo at will. Our mechanized equipment couldn't have rolled across Germany to cut Naziland to

ters in Japan.
Today our ball and roller
bearing industry is manufacturing more than 30 mil-

lion bearings a month for the armed forces. AAF requirements alone in 1945 call for 100 million complete bearings, plus 35 million balls and 25 million rollers. There are 3500 antifriction bearings in the B-29 Superfortress. The electric turbosupercharg-

er, which gives American flyers a priceless margin of altitude over the enemy, was made possible by bearings. Bearings operating at minus 70 degrees Fahrenheit to plus 350 degrees permit the supercharger to attain more than 35,000 r.p.m.

The smallest bearing ever built, 2.7 millimeters in diameter, goes into the Norden bombsight. It contains three of the world's smallest steel balls, each ½5 inch in diameter, smaller than a pinhead. Seven thousand fit into a tablespoon. Produced only 10 months after we entered World War II, this bearing surpassed German achievements that took 35 years.

Bearing manufacture attains the peak of precision in aircraft bearings mass produced with one-millionth of an inch tolerances. All flight navigation instruments contain ball or roller bearings

bearings. Worker

Workers on fine precision bearings wear kid gloves, lintproof gowns and caps. Stethoscopes and hypodermic syringes are as common as in a hospital—the stethoscopes used to detect sound imperfections and

the syringes to place a single drop of oil on tiny bearings. Plants are dustproof and air-conditioned and a constant temperature is maintained in precision rooms.

A step-by-step journey sponsored by the ATSC through roller bearing, ball bearing and ball manufacturing plants in Chicago, one of our three bearing centers, gives a fascinating picture of a precision

industry at work.

In the Aetna Ball & Roller Bearing Company plant is produced a propeller blade retention roller bearing which makes it possible to adjust the blade's pitch under enormous centrifugal pressure created by the propeller revolving at high speed. The rings holding the rollers, called raceways or races, are 7¼ inches in diameter, and the bearing is built to withstand 170,000-pound pressures.

Automatic machines cut the rollers from long steel rods. Rough-

nesses are removed, then the rollers are heat-treated, cleaned, ground and polished. Finished rollers go

through an automatic size selector at the rate of 5000 per hour.

Made of high alloy steel with approximately seven per cent each of chrome and tungsten, the superhard matched races are cut from sleeve-type forgings. First the rough sliced rings are machined, then heat treated, quenched and cooled. Grinding operations follow, with a rigid inspection to check size, parallelism and flatness. Each ring has a Magnaflux inspection in which it is demagnetized, magnetized, and dipped in a two percent iron oxide colloidal suspension which forms lines that reveal any defects-and then again demagnetized. Final grinding and polishing operations are followed by individual inspections. Races and rollers, in fact, undergo careful inspection at each stage of manufacture.

Serial numbers are etched on the races by electric pencil and the races then segregated by .0005 variations in size, matched, oiled and wrapped. Rollers are assembled in brass retainers in semicircular form, two for each bearing. The bearing—roller assembly and races—is assembled on the propeller blade during manufacture, and the races can be removed from the blade only by cutting.

More than 60,000,000 steel balls a month are produced in the plant of the Strom Steel Ball Company, with ball diameters held to tolerances of 50 millionths of an inch, approximately 1/40 the diameter of a human hair. First a steel rod is heated and fed into a header, a machine which cuts off a portion of the bar, squeezes it in a die and ejects it as a rough sphere.

Next comes flashing, a rough grinding to remove gross imperfections such as the rim left around the middle of a ball. Further grinding brings the ball to approximate size. Only smaller sizes get the soft lap treatment, a polish grinding for extreme accuracy. After heat treatment for hardness, the balls are run at high speed through the multiple grooves of lapping machines.

The Ahlberg Bearing Company uses balls from Strom in its propeller thrust ball bearing assembly for Rolls Royce engines, Inner and outer races are cut roughly by automatic machines and then

Grill on Tripod Has Own Firebox




Doubling as a refrigerator on the way to a picnic and an outdoor fireplace after you get there, an all-purpose grill is said to be a boon to picnickers. It can be used to bake, roast, boil or steam, and in addition provides hot running water from a built-in faucet. The grill is suspended from a tripod. An enameled three-gallon oven tank around the firebox can be packed with ice and food carried in the firebox itself. After the food is removed and a charcoal or wood fire built, the ice quickly becomes hot water available for coffee or other purposes. The grill can be used on a porch as well as outdoors or set in an indoor fireplace.

ground. Heat treatment is applied by a conveyortype electric furnace which reaches 3000 degrees. After a hardness test the races go through a series of grinding operations with the grinders shaped to the contours of the grooved raceways. Diamond tools "dress" the grinders to accurate contour. A Magnaflux inspection follows. An optical comparator magnifies a bearing part 30 times and projects it onto glass for comparison with a drawing of itself, similarly enlarged.

Although the bearing industry won't be free from war production until after the defeat of the Japs, it will have a large-scale place in making a success of the postwar design for better living, since almost anything that moves moves easier on antifriction bearings. The "tremendous trifle" will

"Juicy Fleet" Skims Off Oil To Keep Pearl Harbor Safe

Dangerous fire hazards at Pearl Harbor are eliminated by the "Juicy Fleet," which skims oil from the surface of the water. Oil salvage is a by-product of the fire prevention operation and the fleet scooped 3,000,000 gallons of oil, 40 percent of which was reclaimed, from the harbor last year. Flat-bottomed boats scoop the oil scum into a large tank, the water going to the bottom and the oil passing through the reclaiming process. The fleet was developed in the navy yard after the Japs' sneak attack when oil was inches thick on the water.



Plastic Crane Cab Is Air Conditioned

As neat and streamlined as a modern showcase, a new cab for overhead cranes is a completely enclosed cage of shatterproof transparent plastic which eliminates corners and blind spots. The cab is air conditioned and its control switches are situated so that all of them can be operated easily from a sitting position. A traveling platform serves as an entrance vestibule and as a means of cleaning the exterior of the windows.

Planks Are Made From Excelsior and Cement

Excelsior made from low-grade timber is mixed with portland cement to produce a plank in a process just patented. The excelsior is immersed successively in sodium silicate and calcium chloride, which react to precipitate calcium silicate on the fibers. Common salt, produced by the reaction, is removed by washing. The excelsior then is mixed with cement, molded to dimensions, cured in a moist room and set aside to dry.

BLIMP Squadron X, like most other Navy units, has its own unique claims to distinction.

It has, for instance, flown its airships on convoy duty and antisubmarine patrol off the coast of southern California for more than three million miles without one injury to a crew member. It invented and uses air-sea rescue gear by which the survivors of marine disasters may be hauled up to safety from the water.

By no means the least of its distinctions, it has on its roster Lieutenant Peter Culbertson, USN.

Culbertson is the Hot-Shot Charlie of lighter-than-air, a pilot whose exploits are



the talk of blimp stations on both coasts. Such gossip results indirectly from his firm conviction that an airship is a versatile conveyance that has many more uses than its military duties suggest. For doing things with an airship that had never been done before, Culbertson has received the Distinguished Flying Cross, the Air Medal—and half a dozen official reprimands.

He is the blimp commander who, exasperated by the lofty attitude of some fighter pilots, buzzed a P-38 field with his cumbersome airship. He is the one who trailed a rope across the deck of a tuna boat with the shouted question "Got a fish to spare?" and hauled up a tuna that the fishermen tied to the line. Ten minutes later it was being cooked on the airship's electric stove.

His fellow pilots and superior officers regard Culbertson with mixed emotions. He is among the best airship pilots in the country, they agree, which is the same as the whole world in lighter-than-air operations. Usually cocky, occasionally irrepressible, he chafes under the restraint of some of the rules that govern the operation of air-

ships. He's inclined to the idea that all rules should contain in their language a list of exceptions. He's an "eager beaver" on patrol and likes to return home with not one pint of fuel beyond the absolute minimum that the rules say must be kept in reserve. The squadron has lumped all these characteristics into one nickname. They call him "Ace."

Today, with the discretion of 26 years and the prudence of a qualified command pilot, Ace denies that it was he who flew one of the Navy's big dirigibles under the Golden Gate Bridge. Though such a maneuver would be perfectly simple, he explains. The roadway of the bridge is 250 feet above the water and a blimp is only 65 feet high. Nothing to it.

He admits to the incident in which he fell out of his airship, catching hold with one hand in the split second before a 700-foot fall. Lighter-than-air people don't wear parachutes.

"Apparently the bomb bay doors under the ship's cabin were not quite closed," he says. "A gust of wind blew them the rest of the way open and then the wind lifted out a section of the light metal decking that covers the bomb bay. I was stepping backward in the cabin at the time and I stepped right through the hole. As I fell I grabbed at a bar in the bomb bay, caught it, and swung with most of my body hanging out in the air. The first thing I remember was one of the crew looking down at me with amazement on his face and shouting, 'What in the world are you doing down there, Mr. Culbertson?"

The sharp shadow that a blimp throws on the water in sun or moonlight is a familiar and likewise useful image to its crew. Pilots sight on it in making time-



speed calculations. Imagine, then, the consternation of one pilot who glanced down at the water preparatory to making such a check and perceived that his shadow was double. One alongside the other, the perfect outlines of two airships were coasting over the waves.

He turned his ship to the left and the two shadows moved together. He swung to the right and descended a few hundred feet. His shadow and its twin held formation. There was no meteorological explanation for such a phenomenon and so the pilot made a plausible—and accurate—guess. Culbertson had sighted him at sea, had flown over at a high altitude, and once above him had descended until he had reached a minimum safe operating distance overhead. Now he was jockeying his airship to match every move that the uncomfortable pilot below him was making.

These stories might give the impression that Culbertson is an irresponsible pilot. That isn't at all correct. Few people realize, he says, the preciseness with which an airship can be safely maneuvered.

What he did on July 2, 1944, is without parallel in air history. It was a rescue feat so daring and outstanding that Rear Admiral Charles E. Rosendahl personally pinned on him the Distinguished Flying

Cross. To the Ace the day was one of ordinary flying plus 15 minutes of nightmare.

That morning, over in the Imperial Valley on the other side of the coastal range, a group of Navy pilots was on a routine training flight, firing at towed targets. The engine of one plane conked out and the pilot jumped. Somehow he became twisted in the shrouds of his parachute and was injured when the 'chute jerked open. One of the crew of a companion plane parachuted down to give him help. The scene was 20 miles east of Holtville, California.

Twenty miles would be an easy distance


for a rescue party to travel under ordinary circumstances. But the two men had landed in the middle of a vast sand dune area, so soft underfoot that not even a track-type vehicle could enter it. There was no spot closer than the Holtville airport at which a rescue plane could land.

That day in Imperial, 10 miles west of Holtville, the temperature climbed to 108 degrees in the shaded Weather Bureau instrument shelter. It was hotter still on the ground at Holtville; one report was that the temperature hit 131 degrees. It probably was all of that out in the dunes. The relative humidity was 15 percent, so dry that you could dip a hand-

kerchief in a bucket of water, if you had the water, and flick the cloth dry with a few waves of your hand.

Men don't live for more than a few hours under those conditions unless they have adequate shade and water. Early travelers sometimes died of the heat only a mile or two from help. Even now, almost every summer, a few people die in arid areas of the southwest when cars break down on lonely roads. Often their wrist watches are still ticking when they are found. In a few hours, victims shrink so much from dehydration that rings slip from their fingers.

Rescue parties were sent out from Holtville. The first few miles were relatively easy, then the blistering sun began to have an effect. Some of the men grew dizzy, stopped, and staggered as they went on. The water in their canteens was now almost too hot to drink.

Some of the men began to feel that unless they turned back now they wouldn't live until dark. They did turn back, all but a Navy pilot and an enlisted mechanic who were determined to find their companions. Those two trudged on. The heat warped their judgment and they wandered away from the course. Then a plane buzzed down and corrected them. It dropped more water which by now they needed badly. They were making half a mile per hour in sand up to their ankles.

Meanwhile from Holtville a call went through to the lighter-than-air station on the coast. Would it be possible for a blimp to come and land on the desert, without help of a landing crew, and rescue the men?


The officer who re-ceived the call shook his head. Through the window as he held the phone he was watching a blimp nose in for a landing. Forty men on the landing mat were streaming out to catch the lines and hold the ship down. That was the normal procedure. Still, there was a story that Lieutenant Culbertson had landed on an island without the help of a ground crew and had picked up a passenger.

"No," it was decided over the phone, "it's impossible, but we'll try it."

Lamps Expand Gears For "Zero" Fit

Reduction driving gears on aircraft engines are given a "zero" fit on crankshafts by means of an infrared lamp bank at the Studebaker plant, South Bend, Ind. Near the beginning of an assembly line the tunnel-like oven heats the gear to 500 degrees. This expands the gear so that it can be installed on the crankshaft. On cooling, the metal shrinks to its normal size. The method is said to be more efficient and more economical and to avoid the noxious odor of the hot oil dip system formerly used for expansion. Although much smaller, the lamp bank is similar to those used in the quick drying of automobile paint.



Fellow students stationed in the school yard hold the chute taut to keep the descent from being too precipitous.

Postwar Electric Planes May Have Less Weight


Airplanes powered by electric motors driven by turbines are a postwar possibility and manufacturing costs already are being estimated, according to a report to an air transport meeting of the Society of Automotive Engineers. Preliminary engineering investigations suggest that electric planes might permit great savings in weight and power through reduced drag and more efficient propeller locations, says Austin F. Trumbull, United Air Lines representative with Douglas Aircraft.



Radio Units Are Kept in Step To Boost Overseas Wordage

Transmitting and receiving units are kept in exact electrical step with each other in the errorproof radio system of word transmission opened between the United States and Great Britain by RCA Communications, Inc. Up to 488 words a minute can be routed simultaneously in both directions on eight channels carried by terminal stations. RCA expects to handle 200,000,000 words of world-wide communications this year with the new system, compared with 63,000,000 words in 1938. Differing little in appearance from conventional apparatus, two cabinet racks, one a receiver and one a transmitter, form a unit of the multiplex radio telegraph.

Transmitting operator (upper right) sends message over multiplex d'stributor (right). At full capacity, unit keeps 16 operators busy receiving and sending












Student Pilots "Fly" Captive P-47 To Get Feel of Fighter

Before student pilots go aloft in a highpowered fighter they get the feel of it in a captive P-47 Thunderbolt under the watchful eyes of instructors at Seymour Johnson Field, N. C. The plane is mounted on concrete pillars in a suspended position of flight. This enables the students to start the effgine and operate the flaps and retractable landing gear. The trainees practice every detail of procedure from an emergency landing to the proper fastening of shoulder harness. A complete instrument panel which is mounted in a glassedin control booth connected with the plane gives duplicate readings of the P-47's instruments. By using a vacuum motor the instructor can transfix air speed readings to the cockpit. Among other things radio procedure is practiced thoroughly before a landing is simulated. The instructors can fake an emergency, such as falling oil pressure or a defective hydraulic system, to test the pilot's reactions.

Adjustable Triangle for Drawing Speeds Work of Draftsmen


Any angle from zero to 90 degrees may be drawn quickly with the aid of an adjustable triangle made of transparent plastic. The calibrations, in half degrees, are



molded in the clear plastic and cannot become mutilated through use. A large-sized thumb screw locks the triangle securely in any set position. The three-ounce unit is only 6¾ inches wide and 7½ inches high.

Tweezers Plugged Into Welder Pick Up Tiny Elements

Picking up, bending and welding tiny elements of a product can be accomplished easily with a pair of insulated forged copper tweezers that plug into spot welding equipment. The tweezers have plastic covered, flexible copper leads terminating in a pair of lugs which connect in place of regular welding electrodes. Capable of being





handled successfully by an inexperienced operator, the tweezers are used in making small, precise units, instruments, toys, optical goods, jewelry, household ware and luggage. Safe enough to be operated barehanded, they eliminate oxidation and produce a clean weld. They are said to be 50 percent faster than other welding electrodes and are ideal for quick successive welds on one product where space is limited. Four thousand welds an hour are possible with these tweezers, originally developed to weld tiny radio tube wires.

The hook, which is available in a variety of bright colors to match the home's color scheme, can be used in kitchen, bedroom, entry hall, cupboard or closet. Although only one and three-quarter inches long the hook is ruggedly designed.

20,000,000 Pictures a Month Snapped by U. S. Flyers

Members of the Army Air Forces take more than 20,000,000 pictures a month and use more photographic film, paper and equipment than any other organization in the world. One group has more than 180 cameras and averages 60 missions a day, exposing some 450,000 negatives. About 50 or 60 prints are made from many of these negatives. To conserve film and paper, technicians invented a developer to use photographic paper fogged by age.
