

selects to assist him. The disclosure should be accompanied by a letter authorizing the patent attorney or agent to conduct a preliminary search among previously granted U. S. patents for similar types of invention. The patent attorney or agent then prepares a report of the probable patentability of the invention and recommends the further course the inventor should take, provided the report indicates possible patentability.

Debut for the 49 FORD

ONE ICY FEBRUARY night a 1949 Ford test car was delayed by road conditions on its return to the Ford Motor Company's proving grounds at Dearborn, Mich. The driver was upset because there was an ironclad rule that all the super-secret test

cars had to be back behind the high board fence of the proving grounds by dawn.


Like all test cars, this particular tardy model was devoid of chrome and dress-up trimmings. Despite its beaten-up look the car had the line and design of the new Ford.


"I was really sweating it out that morning," the driver said, "and making no unnecessary stops along the way. Once I was stopped for 20 minutes by a bottleneck caused by the slippery highway. People kept giving the car a second look. Then several men gathered around it. One of

them said, 'We've been trying to figure out what you got there. Is it a 1949 Studebaker?' I nodded and they were completely satisfied."

The Ford test driver still chuckles over that incident. As a matter of fact, the new Ford no more resembles a 1948 or prewar Ford than do the new Studebakers or Hudsons. It's







a strictly new postwar car following closely in the trend pioneered by Studebaker in 1946. If there had been no new Studebaker, Hudson, or — right in the Ford family — Mercury, the '49 Ford would have been a sensationally new postwar car. As it is, it is a sensationally new Ford which is totally unlike in appearance its grandparents of the Ford line.

Gone are the rough-riding old-fashioned transverse-leaf springs; gone are the narrow seats and windows of poor visibility, and — far from least — gone are the con-

servative black and gray paint jobs associated for years with Ford. The new cars rival the rainbow in attractive color variations. They have straight, modern lines, a massive but short hood, and the body is so wide the rear fenders have been entirely eliminated.

About the only points of similarity between the old and new Fords are the wheelbase (both 114 inches), tire size (600 x 16) and the basic V-8 engine. This engine has been improved in the '49 to such an extent that Ford engineers claim a 10 percent increase in gasoline mileage. The six-cylinder engine is entirely new and either the six or V-8 is available in all models. The horsepower of the improved

V-8 is the same as previously (100) and the six has been stepped up from 90 to 95. A 10 percent boost in gasoline mileage is also claimed for the new six. The engineers say gas consumption can be reduced as much as 25 percent by taking advantage of the overdrive which is available as op-


tional equipment.


If you have been a Ford driver in the past, prepare to be completely at a loss when you first get behind the wheel of the new '49. Few of the familiar gadgets are in their old familiar places. On the instrument panel, fuel level, oil pressure, water temperature and charge indicators are grouped around the outside rim of the speedometer. This handy five-in-one cluster is in line with the driver's view of the road. The clock dial has been centered on the panel and placed higher. Night glare has been eliminated on all instruments by "black lighting."

The car's interior is all new and inviting. The front seat is six inches wider than the '48 and the rear eight inches wider. The visibility, both front and rear, is excellent—there are 20 square feet of windows in the '49. You feel closer to the ground, and actually are four inches lower. This lower center of gravity is particularly noticeable as you take the car around a sharp curve on the proving ground


at high speed.

British-made Fords from top to bottom are the half-ton light panel truck, a two-door four-passenger Anglia sedan with a 90-inch wheelbase, and the four-door Prefect sedan with 94-inch wheelbase. All are powered by 30-hp. four-cylinder engine. Ford has imported 12,000 of these cars into the U. S. as a test of public taste for light cars

There is also the feeling of sitting further forward as one does in the Studebaker and Hudson. This is because Ford, too, has moved the body forward (five inches) which makes possible cradling of the seats between the axles for a smoother ride.

There is no questioning the smoothness of the new ride. The car rolls over rough Belgian block paving, over sharp bumps and dips, with an easy ride completely alien to any previous Ford. Even over a section of staggered bumps, which are taken by one wheel at a time, the car performs amazingly well. The reason is that Ford engineers, after years of holding onto an antique springing system, have adopted coil springs in the front, longitudinal springs in the rear and airplane-type shock absorbers. Also, the drive-shaft tunnel has

been decreased by adoption of the Hotchkiss drive and the hypoid rear axle. These changes have helped to minimize road noises, and engine vibration has been greatly reduced by rubber mounts.

The new heating system, which has an automatic temperature control, can be used as a fresh-air ventilator, a fresh-air heater or as a recirculating heater. The fresh air is scooped into the car through large intakes just behind the grille.

Better fuel distribution is achieved with a new intake manifold which is attached to the engine horizontal to the ground. This reduces the tendency of raw gasoline to flow toward the rear cylinders and makes engine operation smoother. In the car's new "equa-flow" cooling system water flows in volume to the full length of the

block. Temperatures in "hot spots" in the six and eight-cylinder engines have been decreased by as much as 12 degrees. The water pumps in the improved V-8 are larger. Combustion chambers have been redesigned and there is a new crankcase ventilation system.

Although the new four-door sedan is 239 pounds lighter than last year's model. Ford engineers point out that new standards of safety have been set in the rugged construction of the '49 chassis and body. The box-type frame is of all-welded construction in contrast to spot welds used on most frames. Despite

the fact that the frame is lighter, tests have shown that there is 59 percent more rigidity when combined with the body. A minor safety factor is that all doors hinge at the front and the inside handles push up instead of down to open the doors. Both features help prevent accidental opening. The doors have a new lock which eliminates persons being locked out with the keys inside.


The Ford steering is greatly changed and improved. It has a big car "feel" and hugs the road under a high wind. Road shocks have been cut to a minimum. This is partly the result of a newly designed linkage in which the pivot point of the tie rods is on the same center as the wheels.

There are two lines of the '49 cars - Ford and Ford Custom. The body styles in both lines include the club coupe, four-door sedan and two-door sedan. Convertible and station wagon (twodoor all-steel body) are obtained only in the custom line and the three-passenger coupe only in the Ford line. The new colors are Bayview Blue Metallic, Birch Gray, Sea Mist Green, Arabian Green, Colony Blue, Gun Metal, Midland Maroon Metallic, and Black. Two others—which would make the '49 Ford's great-great grandpappy Model-T spin in his junkyard grave — are Fez Red and Miami Cream which are available only in the convertible.

The new two-door Ford station wagon has an all-steel body; plywood veneer panels are bolted directly to the staut steel body. It carries eight passengers. The two rear seats are removable




Sedan coupe above is available in either the Ford or Ford Custom lines. Chassis below shows many new features such as improved frame and coil springs in front which replace leaf springs







Sprinkler Turns Itself Off With Time Valve

Lawn and garden sprinkler systems are turned off automatically after a preset period of flow by a time valve that operates by water pressure. A tiny portion of the water passing through the valve flows through a by-pass into a cylinder and moves a piston that closes the valve. A dial on top of the valve is set for the number of minutes the valve will remain open. Available in 1, 2 and 4-inch sizes, the valves can be set for any period from five minutes to two hours. Pressure variations do not affect its operation.





Piston on Tobacco Pouch Fills Pipe Without Waste

Pipes are filled with tobacco without spilling by a pouch that has a piston-operated filler attachment. The pouch doesn't have to be opened except for refilling. When the pouch is inverted, tobacco falls into a plastic cylinder and is forced into the pipe bowl and tamped by the piston. The tobacco stays moist longer because it is not exposed to the air.

Trap Catches Rats With Water

Liquid instead of food is used as the bait in a new rat trap. Tests prove that rats are as eager for water as for food. The rustproof metal trap is designed for use where food is plentiful but water is difficult to find. In appearance, the trap is similar to conventional traps except that one end is depressed to form a saucer. A perforated trigger covers this section and releases the powerful spring upon contact. Food also can be used as bait.

Retractable Wheels Form Boat Trailer

Like the landing gear of an airplane, the wheels on a boat trailer retract out of the way when the boat is in the water. For traveling over the road, the wheels are locked in the down position. The tow bar swings downward to act as a bow support for storing. In the water, it folds against the keel. For launching, the boat is unhooked from the car and wheeled into the water. When the boat floats, the wheels are raised out of the water to the retracted position.









Wipe-on Paint for Cars Applied With Mitten

Refinishing a car is easy with a smooth-flowing paint and a mitten that acts as a brush. The enamel dries to a hard gloss. It is applied by dipping the mitten in the paint and then wiping it across the car, the fingertip pad serving as a five-inch brush. The thumb pad is used as a smaller brush for painting window frames and other narrow surfaces. One coat of the paint dries in about two hours. The mitten and enough paint for two coats are provided in a kit which also includes a solvent cleaner for removing dirt before painting, sandpaper for smoothing the surface, plastic for filling cracks, and a spatula.

Speedy Racing Car Assembled From Kit


You can build your own racing car that will go up to 100 miles an hour with a kit now being sold in England. The car, called the "Marwyn," has a one-cylinder motor and is sold without the body. The buyer can design and build his own body style to fit the chassis, which is sold in parts ready for home assembly.






Seen from below, nose of the DC-6 above fits snugly in dock. Below, empty dock, showing steel framework



Push-Button Dock

FOUR-ENGINE airliners are practically rebuilt in four days at United Air Lines' new San Francisco maintenance base, featuring a push-button dock that fits around giant DC-6s and 4s like a tight glove. It replaces temporary workstands and ladders that, a company official explained, "made mechanics wait 50 minutes to do every 10 minutes of actual work."

Now, a few moments after a pressed button has flipped open the 25-ton steel hangar door, an army of 50 workers is swarming over the plane at the start of a 700-hour overhaul that every big plane gets about four times yearly. Two sections of a massive tail dock meanwhile swing down from the ceiling, enveloping the rear of the plane from either side, and metal







Halves of tail dock, upper right and in left background, drop into position when plane moves forward

catwalks that parallel the cabin on both sides drop into place. Four jacks boost the plane enough to get the landing gear a few inches off the ground.

The four engines nose forward over an inclined ramp, so accessible that their complete removal is accomplished in less than 16 minutes. Permanent floor lights play on working areas beneath the wings and cabin. Removed parts are sped to the base's cleaning and overhaul shops by electric hoists, overhead chain conveyors and elevators. Since about 95 percent of the parts needed can be anticipated from the ship's service record, they are set out in advance near their installation point.




Designed for use with air, oil or water pressure, a small utility press develops a force of 10,000 pounds from a line pressure of 100 pounds per square inch. If no air compressor is available, the press can be connected to a water tap and pressures of from 3500 to 7500 pounds are possible. Its unusual valve permits smooth speed control and enables work to be held at any selected pressure. It can be used for bending cold-rolled steel up to 1/8 inch in thickness, notching, shearing, punching and embossing metals.

Helicopter Jets Get "Whirl Test"

To duplicate operating conditions, jet engines for helicopters are whirling through tests at the tip of a giant blade at General Electric's experimental flight center. The runs are made in an outdoor bowl-shaped pit, 150 feet in diameter and 13 feet deep. A 1000horsepower electric motor drives the blade when the drag caused by the engines is being measured. When the burners are operating, the motor functions as a generator in gauging the thrust the jets produce.

Dresser for Fish Line Clamps on Fly Rod



The pads come without dressing so fishermen can choose their own.



Metal Rotors Help Helicopter Fight Ice


All-metal rotor blades and a cabin floor hatch are novel features of a Sikorsky helicopter being tested by the Navy for use on carriers, battleships and cruisers. The blades are more easily adapted to de-icing equipment than the wooden ones now used and are less likely to be damaged. Air-sea rescues and cargo loading are simplified by the hatch. To protect deck personnel and prevent the blades from striking a rolling deck during landings on heavy seas, the tail rotor is mounted on an arm that extends upward high enough to give full head clearance. Designated the XHJS-1, the craft carries five, has a 110-mile-anhour top speed and range of 330 miles.

Woody first made a name for himself as a glider champion in Kansas, where he set a world's distance record. He came to Honolulu shortly before the Japanese attacked Pearl Harbor.

On Christmas Island, as a war worker, he watched natives build a catamaran after an ancient design. Completed, he saw it sail with extraordinary speed.

Here was something that made his glider seem tame. He decided to do research on

Polynesian catamarans, and work into the design of one

some of his knowledge of aeronautics. He wanted to build the fastest catamaran the world had ever seen.

He found in Alfred Kumalae, a Hawaiian lad, the partner he needed, and together they worked out the design for their new craft at Waikiki. They followed the ancient Polynesian design exactly, except for the wing innovation. They built it entirely of plywood. It took almost a year to complete and dug into their savings to the not inconsiderable sum of \$4000. They christened it "Manu Kai," which means seabird in Hawaiian.

The craft's remarkable speed is due to several factors.

One is the light weight of the catamaran (just over 2000 pounds) compared with other craft of equal size, giving it a draft of only 15 inches. The small draft and light


weight leave little drag or weight for the sails to pull over the water.


The catamaran is able to outdistance other sailing craft because it keeps its stability and sails in an upright position. Conventional sailboats heel over in even a moderate breeze and spill air off the top of the sail. Because the catamaran keeps upright, the wind flows off the back of the sail instead of spilling off, giving it added speed and thrust.

Trials proved the most speed could be obtained in a beam wind or a close reach.

Taper ratios run from about 3 to 1 in ordinary sailboats to as high as 9 to 1 in racing yachts. In contrast, the Manu Kai's hulls have a 20 to 1 taper ratio. This makes the craft long, slender, and very fast.

Woody's innovation, the wing, besides holding the two hulls together, is designed to add speed. It is skin stressed and internally braced like an airplane. When the





craft sails to windward, the wing, an airfoil, lifts the catamaran, thus reducing the weight in the water and increasing the speed.

What makes the Manu Kai so unusual and astounding to the yachting fraternity is the lack of either keel or centerboard that mark other mod-

ern catamarans.

Until the "seabird" was built no modern catamaran had been able to prevent leeway without the use of a keel or centerboard. One was built without keel or centerboard, but it made too much leeway and had to be refashioned.

The secret lies in the unsymmetrical hulls, designed in the old Polynesian fashion. The inboard sides are curved, the outboard sides are straight up and down, making a hydrofoil of the hulls. When a hydrofoil is pushed through the water, it lifts, like an airplane wing, and pre-

vents leeway.

Another convenience for singlehanded sailing of the Manu Kai is her small amount of sail area and short 15-foot boom for the mainsail and six-foot boom for the jib. It uses only 370 square feet of sail, against some 430 square feet in the latest Herreshoff catamaran developed in 1945. Despite this it is considerably faster than Herreshoff's 15-knot craft, but no official speed runs have been made.

As in all catamarans, a double rudder is needed for greater control. If one hull and rudder were out of the water, the opposite rudder would still provide control.

From each rudder a long tiller runs to the after end of the wing. These tillers are connected by a 10-foot crossbar, making it possible for the helmsman to steer from any position on the after-section of the wing, as the beam of the craft is only 13 feet.

Both the hulls and wing serve as stowage space and

living quarters.

The catamaran has five water-tight compartments, each accessible from a hatchway.



Six can be slept comfortably in the craft. Four are put in the wing section, which is entered by the hatches on deck, and there is space for one in each of the after hulls. Below, the Manu Kai carries only 370 square feet of sail, which is considerably less than half of that carried by one of the fastest catamarans developed in the early '30s





Its comparatively light weight and complete streamlining allow the catamaran to ride high at all times

The two forward sections of each hull are used for storage space for the lines, anchor and fishing gear.

The center part, comprising most of the wing and the two center sections of both hulls, provides the living and sleeping

quarters. This main section will sleep four. Two small built-in chairs, a desk and clothes pegs make up the furnishings.


The after sections of the hulls sleep one each. They, too, have plenty of room for clothing and additional gear.


> The catamaran rides the sea very easily, partly cutting through, but mostly riding over the waves. This is due to the light weight and draft and because the twin hulls are very sharp.


A round trip open-sea sail of almost 200 miles in rough weather between the Islands of Oahu and Maui has convinced Woody of the catamaran's seaworthiness under adverse conditions.













Freshly cut grass is changed from a nuisance to a valuable fertilizer by the invention of Harold Elliott and Thellar Johnston of St. Paul, Minn. 
Portable Spot Welder Weighs Only 23 Pounds


Foot-Triggered Skeet Trap Shoots "Propeller" Targets



FLUOROSCOPY, the "motion picture" member of the X-ray family and valuable diagnostic tool, is emerging from its

own Dark Age.

For almost 50 years, since Roentgen discovered the X-ray, the fluoroscope has been potentially the ideal medium for examining the human body, presenting for the doctor's observation the movements of the organs in a light and shadow picture on a fluorescent screen.


However, only a certain intensity of radiation could be tolerated by the patient without injury and the screen could produce a definitely limited amount of light from a given number of X-ray quanta. The resulting image was so dim that the physician could not distinguish objects less than one eighth inch apart, even after increasing the light-sensitiveness of his eyes for 30 minutes in a pitch-dark room.

It is estimated that the image of the average human abdomen, using the best equipment available today, is 30,000 times dimmer than a sheet of white paper held under


a reading lamp.


It seemed obvious that, since the rays couldn't be increased in power, or focused, or speeded up, or otherwise be made to produce greater brilliance on the screen, something had to be done with the rays after they left the patient's body and before they reached the doctor's eyes.



after four years study and experimentation, recently announced the perfection of a device which will, in its fully developed form, increase the brightness of the screen 500 times over what we have today.

The ingenious process worked out by Coltman and his associates introduces the use of electrons, which, unlike X-rays, can be accelerated and focused. In a vacuumtube "straightaway" the electrons are accelerated from 500 to 5000 miles per second as the diameter of the straightaway narrows from six inches to one inch. It was this conversion of X-rays to light to electrons to light that, for the first time, brought fluoroscopy out of the shadows.

The tube, 18 inches long and tapering in successive steps from a diameter of six inches to one inch, is contained in a glass

envelope and is itself evacuated. The larger end is sealed with a fluorescent surface on the outside and backing this up is a photoelectric or photosensitive surface coated with cesium and antimony.

The larger end of the tube is placed against the patient and the X-rays proceed through his body and strike its fluorescent surface, which lights up. The cesium-antimony combination has the useful quality of emitting a stream of electrons when exposed to light and a flow of these particles results from the action of the light on the photoelectric surface.

In this first and widest section of the tube there is an electrical field with a 200-volt potential and in it the electrons are still in low gear and moving at 500 miles per second. A series of electrostatic lenses, which focuses the electron beam much as glass lenses focus light, guides the beam into the next field. This has a 500-volt potential which accelerates the electrons to 800 miles per second;

the third field gets them up to 1300 miles per second with 1300 volts; the fourth field, with 3300 volts, speeds their rate to 2000 miles per second and in the final field, only one inch across and boasting a 20,000-volt potential, the tiny particles hit the finish line at 5000 miles per second.


The finish line is another fluorescent screen, where all the electrons launched by the light from a five-inch screen land on a one-inch screen and at a considerably higher velocity than the original X-rays. This screen has an aluminum backing to prevent light from going through the wrong way. Image brightness is proportional to the speed at which the electrons strike the screen; definition or contrast—to use a photographic term—depends on the number of electrons striking a given area.


The use of accelerated electrons brightens the image 20-fold and since the area of the second fluorescent screen is only ½5 that of the first, then 25 times 20 equals 500, the increase in brightness.

A simple lens or two, with either a single or double eyepiece, inverts the image to its normal position—it was reversed by the path of the electrons in the tube—and enlarges it so that it appears about


Diagram shows electron paths. Final image is only one inch across before magnifying


Spring Rod Lengthens Casts

Coiled at the base to form a spring, a steel bait-casting rod has great flexibility which gives a longer cast with less effort. Inside the coil spring are several flat steel springs to prevent lateral action during flexing and thus to increase casting accuracy. Less than a yard long, the rod has only one guide, a feature that assures free line action. Its shortness permits underhand casting along bushy streams and makes for greater safety when two or more fishermen are casting from the same boat.


Small Camp Stove Fits in Pocket

Small enough to fit in your coat pocket, a gasoline camp stove has a windshield, metal grid and generates enough heat for a four-quart pot or a large skillet. 




BAITS for BASS

The wisest bass cannot resist a popping plug when expertly cast into pockets and tiny bays along a shore


A SAVAGE and spectacular warrior is the large-mouth bass, most popular game fish we have, and sought by more anglers, young and old, expert and beginner alike, than any other fresh-water game fish. The bass is at home in countless lakes, streams and sloughs in almost every state, and provides nerve-tingling sport almost the year around for he may be fished all through the winter in many states of the South and Southwest.

The seasoned angler will seek this bronze-back battler with a wide variety of tackle and methods, with both live baits and a large assortment of artificial lures, for never can he know what will please these notional and unpredictable game fish. Plugs, spoons, wobbling lures and surface poppers and flies all provide fine sport, and their use is more interesting and exciting than that of bait, so we will deal with this type of fishing, which is becoming increasingly popular.


There is a tremendous thrill for the angler when a great bronze-back seizes his deep-running plug or wobbler, makes a wild run to the surface and comes out in a mighty leap, his great head shaking, in an effort to dislodge the hooks; and still more exciting is when a great fish smashes a surface offering with fury, his wide mouth agape. Each type of lure and the method of fishing it has its place, and each is studied by the successful seeker after old *Micropterus salmoides*.

There are hundreds of effective bass lures on the market of every size, color, action and weight. These may be divided into two general classes: the deep-running, underwater baits, which include plugs, wobblers and spinners; and the surface lures embracing the various poppers, "paddlers," "splashers," and scores of varieties of large flies. So beautifully colored and finished are many of these baits, and so varied the effective methods of casting and

"working" them, that just their possession and use contributes much to the angler's pleasure.

Surface lures: In warm weather. and particularly in shallow water, in the evening, bass will often be cruising for surface food, ready to smash anything that splashes or moves. It is then that the poppers provide the most thrilling sport. The larger sizes of these are cast with a light 51/2 or 6-foot rod—for the best sport—and a level-wind reel holding about 100 yards of 10 or 12-pound test line of braided silk or nylon. The plug is placed near a lily pad, log or projecting boulder, and is retrieved in slow, short jerks, which produce a disturbance on the surface.

Such baits probably simulate the movement of a frog or drowning mouse, and so provoke a strike. Again, that savage surge of a big bass may be due to pure pugnacity. But always it is satisfying and exciting. Some poppers are designed simply to create a disturbance; others, with spinners attached, hair or feather wings simulate some type of small mammal or large insect. The wise angler will try them all when necessary.

Casting-rod popping lures will weigh from 1/2 to 5/8 ounce, since it is the weight of the plug which flexes the rod and permits easy, accurate casting. These can be handled nicely up to a distance of about 100 feet. And sometimes a "surface and subsurface" plug is best. It is a floater which can be permitted to lie motionless for a moment - perhaps a big bass is craftily watching it—and retrieved in short jerks or by steady reeling, which will cause the plug to dart and dive, depending on its shape and construction.

Fly-rod surface lures: The finest sport of all is in the use of a pliant fly rod for bass, and a big one will test its strength to the limit. The fly rod, of course, depends on the weight of the line to flex it properly and so permit easy, long casts. It is usually fitted with an oildressed line of silk or nylon of size "D" or "C" to fit the fairly powerful rod which this fishing requires. A good rod is one nine feet long, weighing from 6 to 6½ ounces. The reel may be any fairly large-size single-action fly reel.

These lighter lures for the fly rod will weigh only from ½6 to ½8 ounce, and in the popper type will be made of cork, balsa wood or of one of these materials with feathers or hair wings attached. Retrieving is done by snapping up the tip of the rod while, at the same time, a bit of line is pulled in through the rod guides.

While all these popping lures attract bass by their surface disturbance, there are many types of bass bugs for use with fly rods which resemble very closely small frogs, minnows and large flying insects. Some are designed to float, while others will sink slowly, but come to the surface with gentle rod manipulation. All such bugs and the poppers have large single hooks, often protected by a slender wire to render them weedless, and may be cast directly on floating weeds, brush or lily pads. This is usually the best method of fishing them, the bug being skipped to the water from its resting place on the theory that a bass, often lying under the vegetation, will at once

and then retrieved in slow, short jerks, simulating a swimming or

wounded minnow. Other bushier flies are fished on the surface with a slow movement, then allowed to sink a foot or two and retrieved with varying speed and action, when they probably imitate bottom-hatched nymphs of many insects coming slowly to the surface. And the brighter flies, colored like miniature rainbows, just seem to arouse the ferocious pugnacity of the large-mouth, and he smashes at them with utter abandon.

All these fly-rod lures may be fished either from a boat, from shore or by wading, and offer the utmost in thrilling sport, but knowledge of where the bass lie and the action of the lure is essential. Good casting is important, too, and the proper rhythm and timing with the various lures on the fly rod may be done on one's lawn at home.

Underwater lures: First there are the plugs, of a hundred sizes, shapes and colors. Some of these are designed to go deep, perhaps 20 feet down when reeled in fast, and many have a metal "shovel" on the head, which may be bent to increase the diving action. Others will sink of their own weight and literally crawl along the bottom, the action varying with the angler's style of retrieve. And very often such a plug is most effective when permitted to stop, then is started suddenly.

These deep-searching plugs are best in deep lakes, having boulders, crevices and sunken logs, near which the big bass lie, and experience will help the angler decide when they are best. Next is the plug which goes to medium depth. It usually floats until the retrieve is started, then dives at once with irregular, darting motion, and so simulates a wounded minnow again. It is one of the best of all bass plugs when expertly maneuvered by the fisherman, for the predatory large-mouth cannot resist taking a minnow, especially one that apparently cannot escape.

Most of the plugs are equipped with two or more sets of "gang" hooks, usually fastened both fore and aft. These promise sure hooking of fish, and add considerable attractive action to the lure, but hang up easily on rocks, brush and logs. Also, they are attached to the body with a loose ring, and when a big bass leaps from the water shaking his head savagely, the leverage of the plug outside his mouth will often let him throw the plug—sometimes "right back at the boat."

Wobbling and darting lures: In this class we have the various "wounded minnows," of many types. Some of these are made of wood, curved for erratic action and fitted with many small gangs of hooks. They are most effective bass-getters when used in color combinations such as red and white; mottled green; and finished with "scale" and "perch" markings.

The many wobbling spoons, with large, single hook are also popular, particularly in the bright chrome finish. These are usually fine weedless attractors, for combing grass and weeds along the stream or lake bottom. Then many of the large spinners, nickel, copper, brass, red, red and white, and all these colors in various combinations, will often provoke a big old "he" bass to surge from his lair.


There are many fine single-hook, weedless lures, which have a slender metal body for quick sinking, over which is slipped a skirt of fiber, plastic or shredded rubber. These skirts come in a variety of solid and variegated colors so the angler who favors this type of bait, a splendid one for easy bulletlike casting, has only to change skirts to please the whim of the waiting largemouth. This bait sinks readily and can be fished far down directly beneath the boat by retrieving with varying speeds when the fish are unusually deep.

In considering the basic advantages of all these casting lures, for use with the casting rod, the action comes first: the

USAF Pack Plane to Have Detachable Fuselage

Efficient chimney draft is illustrated by a unique plastic model that shows just what happens when wind strikes a new chimney crown from any angle. First, the model's transparent tube of Tenite plastic is filled with cigarette smoke. Then the chimney crown is blown on from any direction—up, down or across—and the force of the air creates a siphon effect which draws the smoke out through vents. Since the crown is round, air from any direction produces the same effect. Downdrafts are guided across rather than into the vents to produce suction.

Runners on Mower Guide Blades

Sled-type runners on a power mower slide along the contours of the ground to guide the blades for an even cut. The mower's wheels always travel on cut grass, eliminating unsightly ridges. 

Mortar Sculptured Into Stone




Suction From Lawn Trimmer Pulls Grass Into Blade

Suction pulls grass into the blade of an electric lawn cutter designed for trimming around trees, flower beds and stones. The blade is constructed like a fan so that it draws the grass away from stones or flowers and into cutting range. The motor has a dustproof cover shaped like a bowl to aid in creating suction. The switch is located on the tubular handle which can be adjusted to the operator's reach. Powered by 110volt alternating or direct current, the trimmer is available with 50, 100 or 150 feet of cord.

Furnace Burns Oil or Gas

Either oil or gas can be used as fuel for a new furnace burner. The gas component for the burner uses either artificial or natural gas. The regular No. 2 grade of oil serves as fuel whenever the oil burner is used.



Seismograph Forecasts Hurricanes By Spotting Tiny Earth Tremors

Certain weather predictions can be made 25 percent more accurately by measuring earth tremors, it is claimed by Dr. L. Don Leet of Harvard, inventor of a new seismograph. The new device, on which readings are made continuously and above ground, can discover and follow the progress of storms by measuring the microseisms, small earth waves that are standard messengers of hurricanes. They consist of very slight tremors that only the most sensitive seismographs detect. These waves travel more than a mile per second through the ground and may be recorded as far as 1000 miles from the "eye" of a hurricane. The new seismograph is buried in the ground, but earth tremors are recorded on a roll of paper by a machine in the operator's office. With the old type of recorder, seismologists had to go underground to observe the recordings or wait until photographic plates were brought up and developed.

Consisting of only 12 separate parts, six of which are of Bakelite plastic, a pair of binoculars is lightweight and small enough to carry in the shirt pocket. The plastic parts are formed simultaneously in the same mold, making it possible for the manufacturer to produce the item economically.

Synthetic Rubber Is Improved When Produced at Zero

Tropical temperatures may be best for natural rubber trees, but tests have proved that a better synthetic rubber is produced when the temperature is held down to zero. Synthetic rubber made under frigid conditions has a tensile strength and stretching ability equal to natural rubber. In resistance to cracking and abrasion, it is expected to be superior to the natural product. Previously, synthetic rubber was made at a temperature of 125 degrees. Heat speeds the processing and as the temperature was lowered the time required increased until chemicals were found that cut processing time to the original 12 hours.

THE POT OF GOLD at the end of the rainbow is small change to the farmers of the Chula Vista district near San Diego. They reap a pot of gold off every acre, two or three times a year.

"Did all right last year," one of them muses as he figures his income tax. "Grossed \$2300 an acre from celery, another \$2000 from tomatoes. Total, \$4300. Costs were \$1900 an acre and that leaves a profit of \$2400. Now I multiply that by 20 acres..."

Fantastic? It sounds

Crop-dusting with a helicopter means a bigger yield. Here the hoppers are filled for a jump



so to farmers who consider a couple of hundred dollars an acre a good return. But some of the Chula Vista farmers do even better. Last year one man banked \$5000 an acre from cut flowers.

Chula Vista adjoins San Diego Bay, a few miles north of the Mexican border. The town and its environs boast the "world's shortest thermometer" with a winter average of 55 degrees and a summer average of 67 degrees. Some days are much hotter, of course, and the oldest inhabitants can recall a few winter frosts. But growers who keep smudge pots handy in case of a freeze rarely light them except for a routine test.


The year-round growing climate allows cultivation of two or three crops on the same ground in a year. A man who plants early cucumbers, for instance, may replant with string beans as soon as he harvests the cucumbers, and then raise a crop of

asters after the beans are picked.

This doesn't mean that Chula Vista has a magic soil or that anyone can stick a few seeds in the ground and automatically become rich. There are plenty of farmers in the district who earn only average incomes. The secret of success is the application of scientific knowledge and good business principles to agriculture. These pay off in Chula Vista just as they can boost farm profits anywhere. High income per acre is based on raising large tonnages of top-quality vegetables that are harvested at times when the same crops are out of season elsewhere.

Chula Vista is only one of numerous examples of high-income regions. Farms in the Encinitas district north of San Diego, in much of Los Angeles County, and in other areas as far north as Lompoc

in California are made to yield big returns. Carroll Lorbear, for instance, who grows winter celery and summer lima beans in West Los Angeles almost under the shadow of the Douglas aircraft factories, has grossed as much as \$40,000 from a seven-acre portion of his farms in an exceptional year.

Market fluctuations can make a farmer rich or poor almost overnight and most Chula Vista growers try to stabilize their income by doing their plantings over a period of weeks or longer. They prefer a long harvest season to the possibility that they would have to market an entire crop when the market is glutted.


Price fluctuations can have odd results. One farmer who was virtually down to his last dollar two years ago unexpectedly cleared a big income simply because he fell ill with influenza. He had staked all his money on tomatoes and then, when the crop was ripe, the price fell so low that he couldn't afford to pick them. He'd lost his shirt and all his friends advised him to plow the tomatoes under and get another crop into the ground as fast as he could. But he no sooner started to plow when the flu put him in bed.

Meanwhile, a sudden frost killed off the tomatoes in another section of the country. The price shot from two cents to 10 cents a pound. The farmer's tomatoes were still prime and as soon as he got out of had be started to harvest them. He

out of bed he started to harvest them. He ended up with a lot of money in the bank.

One businesslike farmer in Chula Vista finds it profitable to fly east for checking up on the markets and arranging his shipping schedules, even though his entire farm is less than 10 acres in size. Others who operate 30 or 40 acres are apt to spend \$800 a year in long-distance telephone calls, an

expense that pays off in obtaining the best prices.

Super-intensive cultivation produces fabulous crops. A typical example is the production from the 40-acre Chula Vista farm of Jaekel & Rogers. This farm is organized like any good business concern, with W. F. Rogers in charge of sales. Bob Conforth in charge of production, and Elmer Conforth in charge of equipment.

The farm has its own packing shed and spur track. Refrigerated cars carry much of the production to the Northwest, Midwest and East. Some 15 people are on the regular base payroll and employment sometimes


runs as high as 100 during harvest seasons. From their 40 acres Jackel & Rogers harvest as much as 80 carloads of celery every winter and some 500 tons of tomatoes, plus 24,000 dozen ears of corn every summer.


To obtain this astonishing production,

Bob Conforth keeps men and equipment busy in the fields every day of the year. There is practically no slack time. Celery, for instance, requires that the field be plowed, disked from six to 10 times to pulverize the soil, leveled, furrowed, planted,

fertilized several times, cultivated numerous times, sprayed frequently and irrigated periodically before harvesting.


For one purpose or another men ride equipment through the field or walk the rows a total of 45 times during the season. Each single acre involves 100 miles of equipment movement and 45 miles of walking on foot. Even this is not enough in itself. A quality crop hinges a great deal on the timing of the different operations. The entire farm including all personnel must

operate with the smoothness of clockwork.

Each acre of celery ground is fertilized with 2½ to four tons of commercial fertilizer heavy in phosphoric acid and potash and in addition some 20 tons of barnyard manure are spread over each acre. Dusts and sprays are employed against blight and aphids. Weeds are kept down with chemicals and with hand weeding. The total preharvest costs are in the neighborhood of \$800 per acre.

Jaekel & Rogers begins transplanting cel-

ery into the fields about August 15 and continues to plant until the middle of October. This provides a long harvest season that runs from December 15 to March 15.

To make most efficient use of the sun, rows are laid out in an east-west direction and the seedlings are planted along the southern exposure of ridges. If the slope of the land requires north-south rows for proper irrigation, the seedlings are planted on the east side of the rows to take advantage of the early sun. Consistent with the dimensions of the field and with good irrigation practice the rows are as long as possible. Long rows reduce the number of turn-arounds for equipment at the ends of the field, cutting down the time required to cultivate each acre.


Preparation of the soil for summer crops begins almost on the day the celery is harvested. Sweet corn is planted beginning in late February, pole tomatoes are set out in late March. The corn will be marketed in July, August and September, and the tomatoes will bear from the 10th of July until early winter. A small acreage is planted to miscellaneous crops for use by the

farm employees.

The farm's equipment includes two track-type tractors, a spray rig on a wheel tractor, plows and a subsoiler, two disks, six cultivators, power dusters and hand dusters, and fertilizer equipment. Mules are used to pull the cultivators. Jaekel & Rogers tries out new mechanical equipment as



soon as it becomes available and the firm devotes part of one field to test plots in which new seed varieties, new fertilizers and new farming methods are evaluated. The farm makes use of the advisory services offered by state and federal agricultural agencies.

How small an acreage in Chula Vista can support a family? That's hard to say, though an ex-construction foreman by the name of C. D. Cash does very well on 81/2 acres. With water, planning and hard work he has turned his small acreage into a

gold mine.

Cash raises giant column stock on 31/2 acres. summer asters and vegetables on the rest. At the peak of the winter stock season he ships hundreds of dozens of cut flowers by air to eastern florists. He gets top prices. He makes some deliveries in nearby San Diego and he derives part of his income from the flowers that he sells from a wayside stand on the highway alongside his farm.


The logical question is. why doesn't everyone rush to Chula Vista and start right in to make a fortune? There are lots of reasons against it. In the first place, while commodity prices may be high at any given time, no one can tell when they will drop, cutting deep into the farmer's profits.

In the second place, the Chula Vista district includes less than 100 square miles of agricultural land and all of it is in use. There is salt water on one side, the international border on another, the city of San Diego at the north and some barren hills on the East. There's simply no room for expansion in the area. In all, the district produces \$1,500,000 worth of celery


per year, the same amount in lemons and other citrus crops, \$500,000 worth of cucumbers, plus \$1,000,-000 worth of other crops.

The cost of farm land is up in the thousands of dollars per acre and water is always a problem. Some farms get irrigation water from their own wells but underground water can't be found everywhere. Reservoir water may cost as much as \$200 per acre per year and in a dry season like the spring of 1948 it could be severely rationed for irrigation.


Finally, not everyone makes a success of farming. There is a special know-how to scientific agriculture. The big-income farmers of Chula Vista have it, acquired from education, experience and experiment. They know that only by cashing in on the yearround growing season can they keep profits up. And year-round cultivation means year-round work for the farmers of this Garden of Eden.

Craftsmen using century-old techniques are patiently wiping bomb scars from the masonry of St. Paul's Cathedral in London, damaged by air raids during the war. 




Luxury Bus Has Washroom

Travel luxuries that include a cabinet for cold drinks, a drinking fountain, individual radios and a washroom are found on a new 50-passenger highway bus. The bus is divided into three compartments on two different levels. A 12-seat compartment on the lower level has the refrigerated cabinet, fountain and washroom. On the upper level, reached by two stairways, are the forward compartment seating the driver and six passengers, and the main compartment with 31 seats. Each seat has a pillow-type radio which can be heard only by the individual passenger, who has a choice of two programs. A public-address system permits announcements by the driver. The Grey-

hound bus is powered by two air-cooled, six-cylinder engines, rated at 150 horse-power each, installed at the rear. Under normal conditions one engine powers the bus while the second operates the acces-





sories. On steep grades the second engine cuts in automatically to maintain power without a shift in gears. Other features include a crashproof gasoline tank made of rubber, and tires with steel wire cords.

Air From Spare Tire "Blows Up" Canvas Bunkroom Atop Car

Tourists can make their bed on top of a car with a canvas sleeping compartment. When collapsed for travel the compartment extends only 11 inches above the top of the car. The dressing compartment is 6½ feet high and is built into the trunk. Flexible hoses inside the canvas are inflated with

air from the spare tire to "blow up" the canvas to three feet high. Inside the compartment are a full-size mattress and springs, a dresser drawer, two folding chairs and a wash basin with water under pressure. The water tank is equipped with an automatic gasoline heater.

DUAL-FUEL SYSTEMS which will permit the motorist to cruise on standard-grade gasoline and switch to a high-octane tank for quick acceleration or hill climbing may be the best answer to the demand of the motoring public for better performance and economical travel.


Those who read of the 100-octane gasoline developed for warplanes have wondered when this superfuel would be ready for their automobiles. Today's automobiles do not need it. Already engineers have road-tested an auto equipped with a dualfuel system and demonstrated that it operated without engine knocks on 40-octane gas during most of its time on the road.

This experiment is part of a cooperative effort by the automotive industry and Socony-Vacuum Oil Co., Inc., to provide more miles of travel per dollar spent on Signal panel shows driver which fuel is used. With both carburetors in operation, center light glows. The left light represents low octane, right high octane. If the driver switches to only one fuel, one of the other lights glows



gasoline, and optimum performance from fuel in automobiles already in the drawing-board stage.

In the automobile industry, there is a definite trend toward engines with still higher compression ratios which will give benefits in better performance and greater economy. Whether, for this development, fuels with higher octane-number ratings are necessary to provide knock-free performance over the entire operating range is open to question. Dual-fuel systems may provide a common meeting ground.

Heretofore, in supplying automotive fuels, the octane-number requirements at the most severe operating condition have been used of necessity by the petroleum industry as the criterion of the quality of the fuels. Requirements at other operating conditions consequently have received little attention.

More than \$4,000,000,000 must be spent by the petroleum industry in the next several years to increase production and refining capacity to meet demands; therefore, it is unlikely that octane-number levels of motor gasoline can be increased economically at as fast a rate as in the past.

Already, investments required for producing fuels with today's octane-number ratings are high. Still higher octane-number ratings will result in just as sharply increased investment totals.

During the war years, \$927,000,000 were expended on major projects in the nation's refineries. Of this total amount, \$864,000,000 were required alone for facilities to produce 100-octane-number aviation gasoline, represented principally by construction of catalytic cracking units.

This was a huge expenditure for equipment to manufacture a quality product. And what was its effect on the octane number of motor gasoline? Between 1941 and 1946, premium and regular grades increased barely three octane numbers, in spite of the fact that aviation-fuel production had been diverted largely to automobile gasoline by 1946!

In other words, an increase in antiknock quality of one octane number cost in the neighborhood of \$300,000,000. And it should be remembered too, that the refinery investment cost per octane number at present is about 50 percent above the average, for various reasons, of the period from 1941 to 1945.

It is with this economic background that the Socony-Vacuum Oil Company, Inc., undertook a test program on the practicability of dual-fuel systems in automobiles, guided by the facts that current fuels are not utilized to their highest degree, and that cost and other factors stand in the way of sharply increased octane-number ratings. The company's goal was to obtain serious consideration of the principle of




Diagram shows fuel system of the car. Note small size of high-octane tank compared with low-octane tank

dual-fuel carburetion by the automobile and petroleum industries.

To launch the test program, a 1947 eightcylinder car at the laboratories in Paulsboro, N. J., was equipped with a combination carburetor and control system.

This installation quickly demonstrated that knock-free operation was possible with fuel of a 40-octane-number rating for a majority of the time the car was in operation, although it normally has a full-throttle road requirement of fuel with a 77-octane-number rating.

The test car was operated under driving conditions of all kinds. It proved that the virtues of premium grade, high-octanenumber gasoline are utilized to their fullest only for quick starts in traffic, for the bursts of additional speed necessary for passing other cars and for climbing steep hills with heavy loads.

The dual-fuel system also demonstrated that consumption of the high-octane-number fuel should not exceed 20 percent of the car's total consumption. Thus complete freedom from knock without change in car performance, and under all driving conditions, is possible.

What does this mean? It proves that less investment is required for developing high-quality gasolines. The refining industry must be expanded to handle another 1,000,000 barrels per day of crude—production is already at the rate of better than 5,000,000 barrels daily—to meet the anticipated demands for petroleum products in the next few years. This expansion in re-

fining equipment and an increase in distribution facilities will cost the industry about \$1,500,000,000 at today's prices and, in light of current price trends, probably more at the time of installation. Another \$2,750,000,000 will be needed to find, produce and distribute the additional crude oil to fill these demands.

In this expansion program, current high qualities will be maintained. But the very need for expansion, with its total investment of \$4,250,000,000 precludes any additional investments aimed solely at improving the quality of products.

It might be noted, though, that the expansion program for the nation's refineries is certain to result in moderate increases in anti-knock quality, since the modern equipment to be installed incorporates many recent technological developments.

With present refining facilities, crude oil can be made without difficulty to yield 20 percent gasoline with a 97-octane (Research) number and 80 percent gasoline with an 83-octane (Research) rating, supplemented in each case by two milliliters of tetraethyl lead, which could constitute the new premium and regular grades.

It appears possible, therefore, for modern, existing refineries to take complete care of the anti-knock requirements of automobiles of the near future with high compression—provided the dual-fuel systems are utilized.

It is apparent that any improved engine design which leads to fuller utilization of

"Workshop" Bus Trains Hobbyists



Dashboard Table Slides Out of Way

Attached under the glove compartment, a sliding table for automobile dashboards provides a convenient work space while traveling. Strong enough to support a type-writer, the table can be used for serving refreshments, holding a make-up kit, or even as a seat for the baby. The table slides in a metal channel that is held in place by three bolts.

Rod Prevents Tank Rust

Hot-water tanks of the household type are prevented from rusting by installation of a small magnesium rod. The rod, technically known as an anode, reverses the batterylike action set up between the water and the metal. It becomes self-sacrificing and disintegrates in place of the tank walls. The rods can be installed in old or new water heaters and last about six years, depending upon the type of water used.




Oyster Hoister

Oysters are raked off the bottom of the sea, carried to the surface on an elevator and dumped in a barge by an oyster harvester. The harvester is attached permanently to the bow of the barge and powered by a small gasoline engine. Its conveyor belt has 19 rows of steel prongs which rake the bottom of the oyster bed, picking up all oysters but riding over objects too heavy to lift. Crawl wheels on the front of the conveyor revolve as the belt moves, digging into the water bottom to pull the craft along. A centrifugal pump shoots a high-pressure spray on the oysters to clean them as they are being carried up by the conveyor. The oyster elevator is suitable for harvesting oysters only a foot from the surface or on reefs eight feet deep. Three men can operate the machine. In a demonstration in Loui-

siana, A. M. Brown of Mobile, Ala., who invented the machine, painted several oysters and tossed them overboard in all direc-



At the Traffic Institute, veteran officers—finest in the country—are pumped full of facts on how accidents happen and how to help motorists behave


SEVENTEEN HUNDRED police officers from every section of the country have been learning the finer points of traffic enforcement at Northwestern University's Traffic Institute since 1936. It's not entirely coincidence that the national death rate per 100,000,000 vehicle miles has been cut more than half—since 1936.

Even faculty members don't suggest that the institute is solely responsible for this startling reduction in fatalities. Yet during the past 12 years those 1700 officers, crammed with knowledge of how accidents happen and what to do to prevent them, have taken over key positions on traffic police forces throughout the country. And the institute's sister organization, the Traffic Division of the International Association of Chiefs of Police, has probed traffic enforcement in 60 cities, counties and states and made recommendations that invariably have brought surprising slashes in the accident rate.

Franklin M. Kreml, director of both organizations, believes that if a cop can put his fingertip on the causes of a smash-up and remove them, similar accidents never will occur. The institute is dedicated to producing a superior police officer who can undercut accidents by operating on those causes.

Obviously, one organization can't teach every traffic cop in the country how to apply science to his job. So Kreml and his associates are forming a network of well-

trained men to blanket the country. Only those officers who are in key positions, or soon will work their way into those positions, are accepted as students, on the theory that the techniques these men are taught will sift down to every officer who waves a white glove or lives in the saddle of a motorcycle. Key men from every section of the country and from Panama, Canada, the Canal Zone, the Philippines, Puerto Rico, Mexico and China have graduated and now are directing model programs of traffic control.

Because the officer students are key men, they also are experienced patrolmen. Many have spent five to 15 years on motorcycles or in patrol cars. They already know how to handle traffic, so the instructors focus training on long-range programs for reducing accidents.

Part of the institute's program is basic research in traffic control. The U. S. Public Roads Administration and other interested organizations provide grants for research projects.

James Stannard Baker, Director of Research, has on the drawing board a mechanical cop that should be able to snare any driver who speeds through a restricted zone. The heart of the instrument will be a radar device for determining the speed of the car. Baker plans to combine this radar with a camera and a stroboscopic light.

The instrument will be pointed down the highway. Each car that passes the mechanical cop will come within the field of its radar beams. These beams bounce back to the instrument at a rate depending on the speed of the car. When a car exceeds the speed limit, the radar will trip the camera shutter and the light. The camera snaps a photo of the rear end of the car, plainly showing the license plate. One edge of the film catches a photo of a speedometer and

a 24-hour watch. After the photo is snapped the camera rolls the film for the next exposure.

At the end of every 24 hours the film is removed from the camera and developed. It contains a photo of every car that speeded, the license plate, and shows the actual speed and time of day of the violation. The speeder then is mailed a ticket and the photo becomes positive evidence in court.

Baker realizes that thoughtless persons who invariably push the edge of the law will raise an objection to the instrument when it is placed in use on the grounds that it spies on drivers. He points out that traffic lights and parking meters raised violent protest when first installed, but today they are accepted by every driver. The mechanical cop can't be bribed by a speeder who tries to buy his way out of trouble. And one patrolman with eight machines can replace about eight officers and the same number of patrol vehicles.

The research department also is working on a project to determine the "halo" effect of a cop. It's known that when a driver sees an officer he invariably slows down or pays scrupulous attention to highway signs. Just how far does this "halo" effect. this radiation of the cop's presence, extend? Half a mile? Three miles? The research department is determining the patrolman's average range of influence by observing what drivers do over a long distance before and after they see an officer.


About 30 officers attend each 4½-month course at the institute. Sixteen are awarded fellowships that pay all their expenses. Most of the others receive scholarships of some kind, and every officer, by previous agreement, draws his regular pay from his home town.

These picked officers attend classes 39 hours each week and crack the books for well over 30 hours outside class—a tough weekly grind.

The instructors pump knowledge into them on such specialized subjects as accident investigation and photography, questioning of suspects and how




Student cops learn to use the "drunk-o-meter," an instrument that puts suspect's breath from balloon through chemical tests







to present a court case. They learn to use scientific instruments in traffic enforcement. Students pick up the fundamentals of the "drunk-o-meter," an instrument for determining the alcoholic content of the blood. The suspect is required to blow up a balloon, and the instrument puts his breath through a series of tests to give a positive answer as to the amount of alcohol his system has absorbed.

Officers also learn to use the "Enoscope," an instrument that is as simple as it is effective. The Enoscope actually is a horizontal periscope-a frame containing two openings at right angles and a mirror at a 45-degree angle to pick up the view of one opening and reflect it through the other. An officer places two Enoscopes a known distance apart along a highway and stands between them with a stop watch in his hand. When a car passes one of the instruments he sees it flash in the mirror. By timing the car until he sees an answering






After the student cop digests books, lectures and discussions for three quarters of his term he is assigned to investigate traffic control in a town similar in size to his home town. For one week he probes the ins and outs of traffic police administration in that town, working with everyone from the mayor to the cop at the intersection. When he returns to the campus he is required to write a detailed report on the traffic police program. The report is not just a record of what he saw, but an interpretation of what can be done to increase safety in the


Fire-Stop Coating Applied Like Paint

By fighting fire with fire, a liquid coating that is spread over wood and fabric like paint reduces the danger of fire damage. Heat from the fire changes the thin coating into a heavy insulating blanket, preventing the spread of the flame. The hotter the fire becomes the thicker it makes the protective blanket so that, in effect, the fire helps put itself out. In a recent test, the curtains in two identical rooms, separated by a conventional plywood partition, were exposed to the flame of blowtorches. In the room that had not been treated with the protective coating, the flames spread rapidly and completely gutted it. In the second room, in which the curtain and woodwork had been sprayed with the coating, fire did no damage. The plywood panels of the treated wall were painted on both sides with the retardant and, even though the flame burned through the wall panels behind them, they effectively stopped the flames. Even a blowtorch flame failed to ignite the treated plywood.

Farmer's Ski-Car Built From Wrecks


By combining parts of three wrecked automobiles, a farmer-trapper in northern Saskatchewan made a ski-equipped car for driving over snow-covered roads. The motor and chassis are from a Chevrolet, the rear end is from a Hupmobile and the wheels were taken from a Ford. The skis were made from the steel frame of the Ford and are welded to the front wheels.





Painter's Power Hoist Eliminates Ladders

Because he doesn't like to climb ladders, Harold C. Raftery of Long Beach, Calif., built himself an electric hoist that enables him to paint buildings comfortably and safely. He can move sideways or up and down by pressing control buttons mounted on the cage. The power unit runs along the edge of the roof and contains two electric motors, one for up and down movement and one for sideways movement. The cage and power-unit chassis are made of aluminum angle strips.



Portable Mast Is "Pushed" Into Air to Test Antenna Sites

Like stacking a pile of blocks in reverse, a new method of speedy erection of portable microwave radio towers raises the mast by adding new sections to the bottom. A hoisting yoke at the ground level has a long-handled winch that raises the tower high enough so that another section can be added to the bottom. The hoisting is repeated until the tower is 200 feet high. Guy

cables are added to every sixth section. A microwave receiver with its antenna and dishlike reflector rolls up and down the tower to test reception qualities of the location. When testing is completed, the portable tower is taken down and a permanent mast erected. Developed by Bell Laboratories, the tower will be used in laying out the Chicago-New York relay system.



Specialists in underwater warfare, scientists at the Ordnance Laboratory developed this new submarine mine-laying device



ON HIS birthday, Rear Admiral Frank E. Beatty was given a crosscut saw by officers, bluejackets and civilian scientists of the Naval Ordnance Laboratory in Washington, D. C.

"What's this for?" he asked.

"A professional joke," said a spokesman. "We figured that you'd need something to help cut up those knotty problems we're going to run into at White Oak."

White Oak—938 acres of rolling Maryland countryside 12 miles north of Washington, D. C.—is one of the Navy Bureau of Ordnance's newest research centers. Congress appropriated \$15,000,000 to get it started, with more likely to be voted later. It is almost completed and in a few more months, 1000 Navy and civilian researchers and technicians will be at work on the project.

They'll be using more than \$10,-000,000 worth of new scientific equipment on a hundred or more research programs in torpedoes, mines, fuses, rockets, supersonic projectiles, depth charges, ammunition and pyrotechnica. "We investigate anything that makes noise or wiggles—above or below water," one of the laboratory's

scientists pointed out.

Admiral Beatty explained the reason for the new laboratory:

"Since most ordnance has little or no industrial use, the Navy finds it necessary to conduct its own research, development and testing. In peacetime, you can't farm out a magnetic mine or a torpedo to an automobile manu-

facturer or a university."

White Oak is an outstanding example of a military-civilian team at work. The administrative side of the laboratory consists of a small group of naval officers with seagoing experience, under the command of Admiral Beatty. A graduate of Annapolis, with a mechanical engineering degree from M.I.T., he won his blue-and-white Navy Cross as the skipper of the cruiser Columbia during the chips-down fighting in the South Pacific. The civilian research and development work is directed by Dr. Ralph Bennett, an expert on mine warfare.

White Oak itself is the result of an acorn that was planted in 1918. The Navy's mine barrage in the

North Sea helped to defeat the Kaiser's U-boat threat. Subsequently, it was decided to continue research on mines and a laboratory was set up in the Naval Gun Factory in Washington, D. C. There it remained until the end of World War II. Now

it is taking root at White Oak.

As planned, White Oak is a "dream" laboratory - designed after consultation with scores of U.S. scientists. It consists of approximately 50 permanent buildings all fitted with prefabricated, movable partitions so that laboratories and offices of any size may be created. They are fireproof, air-conditioned, provided with fluorescent lighting and connected by pedestrian tunnels. Laboratory areas are supplied with voltages of different values, compressed air, gas, steam, hot and cold water. A model shop is equipped to do all but the heaviest kind of machine work.


First group of buildings to be completed at White Oak (in which scientists are already at work) is the Magnetics Group.


The seven buildings in this group are as free from magnetism as science can make them. They were built in an area isolated from minor disturbing influences such as other buildings and vehicles. Iron and steel have been entirely eliminated. Nails are copper, light switches are porcelain, drains are transite, building beams are wood. Even the sand that went into the bricks was screened to make certain it did not contain minute particles of iron oxide.

"This kind of planning," according to Bennett, "has resulted in what is probably the earth's largest 'nonmagnetic' pole."

The buildings are equipped with coils of






Spiral pattern set up by a propeller in 12-inch, variable waterpressure tunnel. White Oak also has seven varied-size wind tunnels

varying size, through which electric current can be sent from a master control panel. The purpose is to duplicate terrestrial magnetic fields under any sort of a ship, at any speed, in any part of the world.

The magnetism research program at White Oak will not only be aimed at developing new and more powerful kinds of mines—but also toward such new equipment as the compensated airborne magnetometer. This is an uncannily sensitive device which has been described as "starting where radar leaves off." It was originally designed to point a finger at submerged submarines. It can also be used to locate oil and mineral deposits, and the contour of the earth underneath the polar ice cap.

One of the most interesting
—and perhaps significant—
group of buildings at White
Oak is the Wind Tunnel and


Ballistics Group.

Three of the seven planned wind tunnels are from the famous Nazi supersonic research center at Peenemunde on the Baltic, where the famous V-2 was developed. After the bombing of Peenemunde, this tunnel was moved to Kochel, Bavaria, where it was captured by the U.S. Army. The equipment was loaded aboard 38 railroad cars and shipped to White Oak. Redesigned and modernized, it will provide the Navy with a wind tunnel whose range of Mach numbers and number of nozzles are greater than any in existence.

The wind tunnel is operated from a huge steel sphere—52 feet in diameter—and two huge pipes that run out from it to two separate wind tunnels which can be worked in alternation. This is how it works: a vacuum is created in the sphere; quick-acting valves are opened and the air rushes in through the pipes. This takes but 40 seconds, after which the air is pumped out of the sphere—the whole cycle taking about 10 minutes.

What gives the air its tremendous speed are two nozzles. The first nozzle constricts

the air and speeds it up to the speed of sound, roughly 700 miles per hour. The second nozzle expands the air, but instead of slowing down, it speeds up still more—to almost 4000 miles per hour. Further improvements are planned to increase it to almost 10 times the speed of sound.

In these streams of air that flow at dizzying speeds are placed small models of rockets and other missiles (average size—2 inches in diameter). As the air rushes past, they are observed or photographed with elaborate optical apparatus. Two pressurized ranges will check, in free flight, models previously tested in wind tunnels.

In the future, the Acoustics Division plans to build apparatus whereby sound waves can be projected into the air to obtain upper-atmosphere temperatures and pressures. At present, such information is recorded by balloons and V-rockets fired into the stratosphere.

The laboratory will have one of the most complete X-ray experimental stations in the world, featuring a 10,000,000-volt betatron. This huge machine will produce powerful X-rays that will penetrate up to 20 inches of steel, exposing radiographic film in less than, a minute.

The betatron is useful not only for detecting flaws in steel and other materials, but also for looking inside weapons without disassembling them.


One of the more spectacular testing devices at the laboratory is a 75-foot steel drop-tower that can handle bombs and projectiles up to 1000 pounds. Its main purpose is to test live fuses. The fuses are mounted in dud bombs, hoisted by an electric motor to a height of 40 feet, and dropped on sand or armor plate.


The idea of the drop-tower grew out of experiences in World War II. Occasionally bombs were accidentally dropped in the course of handling—endangering ships and crew. Experiments at White Oak are designed to provide the knowledge of how to handle such "runaway" bombs and to test the workability of fuses after a fall.

Another bomb-testing device that has been tried is the bomb ejector tester, which simulates a plane diving at a 90-degree angle. The problem is to make certain that the bomb will clear the plane's propellers in a vertical dive. Inert bombs are hoisted up a 15-foot tower, fired from an ejector and their path measured by fast cameras.

Equally important as drop tests are the shock and vibration trials. Four pieces of equipment, based on the "air gun" principle, are used in shock testing. A projectile fired from a 16-inch gun or a heavy

bomb striking the water must be built rugged enough to withstand such a shock without being damaged or exploding upon contact. The equipment at White Oak tests acceleration and deceleration ranging from 4 to 35,000 times that of gravity.


And what about those billions of smaller shocks called vibrations? What happens to ammunition, mines and bombs that are transported by jiggling railroads, trucks, planes or ships? The White Oak facilities include a vibration machine that, as one scientist puts it, "shakes the very devil out of everything that goes into it."


Another question that the Navy is cur-

rently asking is: what happens to liveloaded rounds of ammunition when continuously drenched with salt water? Projectiles to be tested are placed in a spray cabinet and receive a three or four-week drench treatment. Other boxes and cubicles—which look like huge butchers' iceboxes—are temperature rooms that can be regulated between the span of 200 degrees above to 60 degrees below, Fahrenheit.

To study the peculiarities of sound waves, White Oak scientists are preparing one of the world's largest anechoic or "dead" rooms. This is a room which reflects almost no echo from its walls. Sound

waves are trapped by five-foot wedges of fiber glass which line the walls, floor and ceiling-making the room 99.9 echoproof.

The anechoic room will be three stories high, with a control room located on the second floor. Loudspeakers, microphones, sirens and acoustic air fuses will be tested here. The latter is a new type of weapon which holds great possibilities. The Nazis began experiments with it during the war. German fighter planes would fly above an American air formation and drop "air mines" equipped with acoustically sensitive fuses. The mines exploded when they fell within sound range of the Americanmade motors.

Also to be investigated in the anechoic room are human hearing problems. How loud can the reproduced spoken word become before it is unintelligible? An authoritative answer to this will be useful in designing loudspeakers and earphones.

The laboratory will also manufacture plastic devices in experimental lots and grow its own experimental lithium-sulphate crystals, used in weapons and such intricate devices as sonar, underwater sound detection and transmission systems. Because few crystals are known which possess the necessary piezo-electric qualities, the Navy hopes to discover new ways of producing and using them.

Although White Oak is one of the

"brains" of the Bureau of Ordnance, its eyes, ears and hands operate all over the U. S. Torpedoes are tested at Hiwassee Dam, N. C., and at Morris Dam, Calif. Mines and depth charges are tested at Fort Monroe, Va., and exploded near Solomons, Md. Fuses, pyrotechnica and parachute gear are tried out at the Naval Proving Ground, Dahlgren, Va. Rockets and jet motors are flown at Inyokern, Calif. New types of guns are developed at the Naval Gun Factory, Washington, D. C.

In addition, little groups travel literally to the ends of the earth to test Navy weapons under all conditions. One group may be at the atom-bomb testing grounds in the South Pacific. Another group may be testing the magnetometer in the Antarctic. The third may be investigating seismic waves in an Alaskan volcano.


"In the next war—which we hope will never come-there can be no delaying action," pointed out Admiral Beatty. "We hope to have completed a large backlog of pure and applied research which can be translated immediately into weapons. There won't be any time for research in a world of atomic weapons, proximity fuses and supersonic guided missiles."

Navy and civilian scientists at the Naval Ordnance Laboratory, White Oak, Md., are fighting the "cold war" right now with

Strip of Steel Six Miles Long Rolls Out of Mill Every Five Minutes

Every five minutes a massive rolling mill can produce a strip of steel 30 inches wide and more than six miles long. The cold mill, recently completed for Jones & Laughlin Steel Corporation, operates at more than 70 miles an hour to reduce hotrolled strip to tin-plate gauges. The strip is processed into tin cans and tops for glass containers. Hot-rolled strip about .095 to .109 inch in thickness is threaded into the mill. After passing through five stands in the machine it rolls out the other end, reduced in thickness to about .009 inch and elongated approximately nine times. Six large motors that power the mill have a total capacity of 16,850 horsepower. Because the strip moves at such high speeds it is difficult to measure accurately, so a special gauge X-rays the strip to check thickness. Great quantities of water that flow across the rollers to dissipate the heat produced by the mill are turned to steam. which is cleared from the room by a fogelimination system.

Research Scientists Bottle Sub-Zero Cold—458 Degrees Below!

Temperatures only one degree above absolute zero—about 458 degrees below zero Fahrenheit—are being "manufactured" by Westinghouse scientists. The purpose of the research is to discover how metals act in this super-cold and to find uses for such frigid temperatures. Absolute zero is approached by changing gaseous helium into a liquid, causing a drop of about 520 degrees Fahrenheit. The gas under high pres-

sure is put to work driving two piston engines, causing it to give up a large amount of energy in the form of heat, thus cooling the gas. The cold gas is used to cool still more gas in a continuous process. Finally a small portion is expanded through a tiny opening, changing it into a liquid. The liquid then is bottled up in a five-foot-deep cylinder. Metals to be studied are lowered into the cylinder.



Flip-Flop Marker for Football

Football downs are recorded for spectators by a marker with numerals which flop into place when a cord is pulled. Made of aluminum alloy, the marker has large numbered plates which are hinged at the top and turn over to expose the next number when the cord is pulled. A model for stadiums has numbers which can be viewed from four sides.



Pocket-Size Exposure Suit

Exposure, one of the biggest trials of airmen downed at sea, is curbed by an inflatable rubber suit small enough to be rolled into a pocket in the collar of a Mae West jacket. It weighs less than three ounces and provides air insulation against cold and damp. The suit is being tested in England and may soon be adopted as standard equipment for Royal Air Force crews.

Four-Jet Bomber "Hits the Deck" in 500 M.P.H. Tests


Low-level speed runs at more than 500 miles an hour have been made by one of the U.S. Air Force's new four-jet bombers, the North American XB-45. The craft





The Story of Rope

THE OLD INDIAN rope By Andrew Hamilton ing is difficult. Monkeys are trained to climb ropes and strip

fied people for generations. A fakir throws a rope above the stage where it stands without apparent support, as stiff as a rod. The trick is simply this: an unnoticed fourpronged hook at the end catches a taut piano wire in the dim light above the stage.

This vaudeville stunt is not half as amazing as the miracle of rope itself-one of mankind's most useful tools.

In China, tea bushes are sometimes planted on steep hillsides where harvestoff the leaves.

A tremendous hawser, 18 inches in diameter, was once woven for a special harbor job in South America.

Earliest automobile tires were not made of rubber, but of rope.




There are many kinds of cordage other than rope. A cable is simply a super-rope

in which ordinary rope is used as the component strands. Twine is two or more yarns, twisted together.

Rope is one of the oldest devices for lightening back-breaking work. Anthropologists say that our caveman ancestors probably used it even before they invented fire, the ax or the wheel.

Today, cordage-making in the United States is a giant and far-flung industry. Before World War II a score or more hard-fiber cordage and twine manufacturers were producing approximately 350,000,000 pounds a year. Wartime demands stepped


this up to 600,000,000 pounds by 1945. Now production has leveled off at about the prewar figures.

World War II proved that rope was indispensable to modern warfare. The Army used rope for tents and trucks, to lash guns in position, to help mountain troops scale peaks; the Navy used rope for cargo nets, boat fenders and refueling lines. A 35,000-ton battleship carries about 50 tons of rope. The Air Force

Loose bales of the silky blond fiber await shipment to United States factories where they will be combed and twisted into rope used rope for parachutes, for glider tows and for securing gear inside planes. The War Production Board found 400 uses for rope that were considered "critical."

Best material for making strong, longlasting rope is abaca, commonly known as Manila fiber. This is a fiber from a tree, botanically the same as the banana.


Other fibers, not quite as good as Manila, are sisal from the Dutch East Indies, Africa and Haiti, and henequen from Cuba and Mexico. Materials used to make ropes for special purposes are: cotton, jute, flax, strips of leather and, newest of all, nylon.






When bales of fiber arrive at the mill, they look like huge batches of blond hair. These fibers are scientifically blended and fed into the preparation machine. Thousands of small moving teeth comb, mix, overlap and parallel them into a continuous length of soft, silky "sliver." Oils—animal and vegetable fats and waterproofing compounds - are added at this stage to make the rope water repellent, flexible, easy to handle and less likely to wear out by internal friction.

In the second stage, the sliver is converted into yarn. Machines again comb the fiber, pass it through a funnel-shaped tube, twist it into yarn and wind it around a small capstan. From there it is wound on a large spool. Size and correct turn of the yarn are carefully regulated.


Third step is forming the strand. A scientific formula determines the number of individual yarns that will make up the finished strand.

Fourth and final step is laying the rope. A rope is usually formed of three or four strands. One of the chief problems of rope-making is to overcome the tendency for yarns to untwist. This is done by making the first twist when the fiber is spun into yarn from left to right. The second twist —from right to left—is applied when the yarns form the strand. The third twist, when strands are laid to form rope, is again from left to right. The three twists counteract each other.

About one third of all (Continued to page 230)



When the ball is driven the diskanchor checks its flight, but momentum drags the disk forward along the board. The disk's position indicates both the shot's distance and direction. 


Bender for Warped Lumber

Fire Door Closes Automatically

Resembling an automatic sprinkler head, the device holds the door open until the temperature reaches 135 degrees. Expanding thermal liquid in the device releases the plunger on the door closer and the door shuts automatically.


Collapsible Baby Stroller Folds for Carrying

PROSPECTING for Better Metals

THE SEARCH for new and better metals goes on endlessly at the Westinghouse Research Laboratories where a score of scientists are attacking the problem from every conceivable angle. Like a giant jigsaw puzzle in which the main pattern is apparent but not wholly clear, the concept of the right metal for the right job

is gradually taking shape.

Here are just a few of the questions that scientists are seeking to answer. What ingredients mixed together will produce the best metal for high-temperature applications such as the jet engine? What ingredients give a metal strength, hardness, toughness, elasticity? What hidden changes occur in a metal under heat treatment? How does the microscopically thin "skin" that forms on metal surfaces at high temperatures protect it from further corrosion? How is the presence of carbon in steel linked to brittleness?

To dig for the facts, researchers have at their command an ingenious array of equipment especially created for the job. There was the problem of testing the whirling disks used to hold the blades in jet engines. Such disks must be able to stand up under the simultaneous assaults of terrific heat and blurring speed. The scientists wanted to learn what happens inside a metal subjected to such punishment.


They built a "bombproof" dugout in which they can study jet disks under every temperature and speed up to the point where they literally explode. In this dugout, ringed with heavy sandbags and sunk deep below floor levels, disks made of specially developed alloys are heated up to temperatures above 1400 degrees Fahrenheit, and spun around at dizzying speeds of 1200 miles an hour—35,000 revolutions a minute. That's much more than presently used metals in jet engines can safely stand.


During tests, the disk is covered by a thin steel hood from which air has been evacuated to reduce friction. The hood was constructed purposely of very light steel, so that flying fragments of metals will easily penetrate its thin skin. Use of heavier steel would cause serious damage to the fragments and prevent close scrutiny of the type of fracture or break involved—vital information to the scientist.

As the heated disk spins, research engineers A. C. Hagg, B. Cammetti and Gale Sankey make continuous measurement of its temperature and of the expanding diameter. Even the toughest of metals tend to flow or "creep" under high stress or


Left, taking hot metal from furnace in laboratory steel mill. Right, metal in jet-engine blades must be tough Westinghouse photos







Micro-balance scales weigh single layer of oxygen atoms forming skin on metal. Below, "vest pocket" rolling mill turns out strips thin as tissue paper




temperature, and with the narrow clearances in the jet engine, knowledge of this rate of flow is vital to the design engineer to prevent future rubbing of surfaces.

Many other things happen to a metal when it gets red-hot. One of the most significant and interesting of these is oxidation—essentially the same process that causes exposed metals to rust. But scientists wonder whether oxidation at high temperature really is a "metal termite."

For as a metal grows hotter, a curious process takes place. A sub-microscopically thin skin—only a few atoms thick—is formed on the metal surface and protects the metal underneath from further deterioration. Is it possible, scientists are asking themselves, to develop an alloy in which this oxide skin would provide permanent protection over a wide range of temperatures? At present, all known oxide protection is vaporized as the temperature continues to go up.

Westinghouse men are attacking this problem from within and without. To study how fast and how thick the skin is formed, they use a balance scale so sensitive it can weigh a single layer of oxygen atoms! That's about one ten-millionth of an ounce. A perfectly clean metal sample is attached to the balance, which consists




Stream of water cools bell jar of induction furnace which has a heat of 3000 degrees Fahrenheit inside the furnace coils



In this way, the scientist gets a clear picture of when and how oxidation forms.

But this is only a partial view of metal oxide skins. To complete the picture, E. A. Gulbransen and J. W. Hickman, Westinghouse scientists, employ two sets of electronic "eyes"—the electron microscope and the electron diffraction camera.


With the electron microscope—which can magnify his vision 200,-000 times—the scientist sees the physical make-up of the film. He sees how atoms and molecules combine to form crystals and how these crystals grow as the temperature increases and the skin thickens. It tells him the size of the particles, how they are linked together and how they shift position under various temperatures.

What of the chemical nature of this skin? How do the oxygen atoms and molecules link up with the metal and what oxides do they form? These answers come from the electron diffraction camera which takes up where the electron microscope leaves off.

Left, electronic portrait of skin formed on nickel at 900 F. was made by the electron microscope at right


In this unique camera, the metal sample to be studied is bombarded with a powerful electron beam. The beam ricochets off various "faces" and "ridges" on the metal oxide skin and strikes a strip of photographic film. The result is a portrait consisting of a series of concentric half-circles. By measuring the distance between these half-circles, the scientist is able to determine the distance between the atoms in

the oxide skin being studied. This tells him the chemical nature of the film and how the oxidation takes place. It enables him to "fingerprint" chemically the great variety of oxide films that form on metals.


Research men recently made the camera an even more effective tool by adding a tiny furnace, so that the portraits can be made continuously at temperatures up to

Army Signal Corps Uses Rockets to Lay Field Telephone Wires

Employing a rocket that can be fired from its original container, the Army Signal Corps has developed a lightweight portable unit for laying telephone wire over rough country. The rocket is fired from a wedge-shaped hole dug in the ground. One man, equipped with a wire dispenser, small field telephone and a rocket, can establish wire communications for relatively short distances over rivers, cliffs and ravines.


Miniature Louvers Ventilate Eaves


Midget louvers, 21/2 inches in diameter, provide air circulation in building space that is normally tightly sealed. Designed for use under eaves to provide circulation between ceiling insulation and rafters, the aluminum louvers are forced into a small hole drilled in the wood. No screws or other fasteners are required as the spring of the metal holds them in place. Screens are built into the louvers.

"Coal" Tractor Run by Steam

Live steam powers a scale model of an early type farm tractor, a coal or wood-burning vehicle used many years ago. The model, built by Warren A. Built to a scale of two inches to the foot, the model is driven by steam generated from charcoal or by a supply of compressed air.





Drum Power Hoist Lifts Four at Once


By installing a multiple drum carrier on a fork-type power truck, one man can move up to four drums at a time. The carrier does not interfere with the driver's vision. It grips the drums firmly by hydraulic pressure and releases them quickly when desired. Not all drums need be the same size; it can handle drums that vary two inches in diameter. The carrier can be removed from the truck in 10 minutes.

"Land Ship" Trains Pilots

Far different from the streamlined planes they are learning to fly, a "land ship" is used to instruct British trainees in compass navigation. The boxlike vehicle is swung around in varying directions by the instructor and fliers learn to adjust their compass bearings accordingly. It is part of the training at the Air Service Training School in England.







Carrier Crash Crane Lifts 24,000 Pounds

Flyers can be rescued faster and larger planes salvaged with the Navy's new mobile carrier crash crane, now aboard the USS Franklin D. Roosevelt. It lifts 24,000 pounds, almost double the amount of previous models, and is the first to be operated entirely by electricity. Two lift forks can speedily right an overturned plane if immediate rescue of trapped occupants is necessary. Instead of operating only on

the flight deck of the carrier, it can reach out 65 feet over the side of the ship or from the hangar deck to lift up to 13,000 pounds. Though larger than previous types, the




Traffic Cop Dummy Aids School Children Crossing Street

Optical Glass Cookers


"HOW COME?" many an American asked himself early in World War II when asked to lend his binoculars to the Navy. The appeal was reminiscent of the British collection of shotguns and other firearms in the dark days of 1940 when a Hitler invasion was feared.

supposedly common optical devices. Civilian requirements for precision optical instruments such as binoculars, telescopes and microscopes in peacetime are negligible compared with the demands made on the industry during war.

Before the war we imported European optical glass. Bausch & Lomb, chief domestic supplier, increased production ten times in 1940 as war drew near. During the war, this company produced over five million pounds, but more was needed. The military asked for help from the Bureau of Standards where research had been conducted since 1912. Three miles


Technician inspects molten glass within the furnace with his optical pyrometer as he gets ready to remove the stirring rod


Ground and polished close to perfection, each element is tested by interferometer to assure uniform refraction throughout

from the White House, the bureau's laboratory was converted into a large-scale factory, producing more than a million pounds of high-quality optical glass for the armed services.

Optical glass should not be confused with the glass used in spectacles and reading glasses. Optical instruments must see things that are far beyond the human eye's capacity and must convert them into images which the eye can see. Tiny imperfections which do not affect vision with ordinary eyeglasses cannot be tolerated in instruments.

Perfect optical glass is practically impossible to make, but glass makers strive to get perfection by careful manufacture and the use of only pure materials.





Work begins early in the morning as the charging of the melting pot may take as long as 10 hours. An empty preheated pot is wheeled into the furnace and fired to the right

melting temperature.

As the technicians take turns watching the temperature indicator, the raw materials are assembled close to the furnace. A typical batch weighs 1400 pounds and includes sand, boric acid, borax, soda ash, saltpeter, zinc oxide, arsenic oxide and potash. It will produce about 1200 pounds of glass, enough to yield about 250 pounds of optical blanks.


When the temperature indicator reaches the critical point, the hanging door covering the furnace opening is swung up and charging begins. First part of the charge is cullet or waste glass from previous melts. This protects the bottom of the pot and hastens melting of the batch. Then the other materials are added slowly. The pot holds about 7 cubic feet and it normally takes from 5 to 10 hours to fill it.

The batch foams while melting. After the foaming subsides, a mechanically-driven, water-cooled metal rod, mounted on a carriage, is inserted through the opening in the furnace gate. At the end of the rod is a special ceramic stirrer or "thimble" made of the same material as the pot. Stirring eliminates bubbles. If not eliminated, these bubbles of gas trapped in the molten glass form "seeds" when the glass cools.




Removed from the molds, the optical-glass blanks are packed in big metal boxes and placed in furnaces for a critical annealing process

In its first cooling period, the glass cracks into irregular pieces that look like chunks of ice. Later it is remelted and cast into molds

Seeds and striae are the most common defects of optical glass. Striae are fine streaks within the glass which have a slightly different composition and therefore a different refractive index.


When the molten glass is reasonably free of bubbles, the heat is decreased and the pot gradually cooled in the furnace. Another shift of technicians takes over and stirring continues through the night and into the next day. The stirring is done more and more slowly until the cooling glass thickens to the point where it would be


ruined by further agitation. The temperature at which stirring is stopped is between 950 and 1100 degrees Centigrade, depending on the type of glass being made.

The pot is then removed from the furnace, covered with an insulated jacket and cooled slowly for about 3 days. In cooling, the glass breaks into large chunks which can be handled easily after the pot is broken. The large pieces are then broken or sawed to more convenient sizes for the molding operation.

Oil Solution Washes Cars

By the addition of a newly developed organic detergent, Diesel oil and kerosene are given soaplike properties and can be used effectively to remove mud and grease from trucks, buses and automobiles. One part detergent is mixed with 100 parts of the oil. The solution is sprayed over the painted surfaces and allowed to penetrate the grime, which is then rinsed away by water from a hose.















TOP DOWN

POURING concrete floors in reverse order is the method used successfully in Mexico and now under trial in the United States. Instead of pouring the bottom floor and working up, workers pour the roof first and then work downward. The method was invented by Manuel Gonzales Flores, a civil engineer of Mexico City. Principal feature of the system is a concrete form which descends like an elevator as each floor is poured. The steel framework of the building is erected in the usual manner. Then the concrete form is suspended from the roof framework on steel rods, adjusted until it fills the top floor, and filled with concrete. When the concrete has partially hardened, all the suspension rods are loosened except two, which are used to lower the form to the next floor, where it again is anchored in place and the process repeated. As the interior rods must pass through the concrete when the form is lowered, wooden cones are inserted to provide openings. The system enables the builder to use the same forms many times with subsequent savings in material, time and labor. After the top floor has been poured, it provides a "roof" over the building, protecting workmen during bad weather. By using the system, a building can be completed in one third the time required by conventional methods, according to the inventor.


View from below shows bottom of the form. System permits using same form as many as 30 times





Radio Controls Camera Lights

Photographic lights some distance from the camera can be set off by radio through a system invented by Kenneth Goodman, an electronics engineer of Columbus, Ohio. Attached to the camera is a miniature transmitter which sends out a signal at the proper instant. The signal is picked up by a receiver at the base of the light and flashes the bulb. The light then transmits the signal to similar lights.



Auto Towing Bar

Only 60 seconds are needed to install a tubular-steel rod as a rigid towing hook-up for passenger cars and light trucks. It is held in place on the bumpers by two steel clamps, each tightened by a single wing nut. Weighing 8 pounds, the 39-inch-long tow bar can pull 4000-pound vehicles up a grade of 25 percent.

Model-T of the Airways

Fifty miles on a gallon of gasoline is one accomplishment of a new plane described by its designer as the "Model-T of the air." The builder, Al Mooney of Wichita, Kans., used four steel belts to gear a 26-horsepower midget auto-type engine down from 3900 to 1950 revolutions a minute. Fuselage construction from nose to the rear of the cockpit is metal and from there back it is wood. The entire tail can be moved forward or back seven degrees, making elevator trim tabs unnecessary. Mooney's plane has a 27-foot wingspan, is 18 feet long and weighs only 450 pounds empty. It cruises 90 miles an hour and has a normal gasoline capacity of eight gallons.

Swiss Golf Watch Keeps Hole-By-Hole and Total Score


Golfers can keep a hole-by-hole and total score on a unique Swiss watch. In place of the usual 12 hour numbers, there are 18 openings to indicate holes in a round of golf. A blue "minute" hand is turned forward to each hole being played and the crown pressed down every time a stroke is taken. The

strokes (up to 10) are registered on a small disk opposite the number of each hole and this number stays there after the minute hand is moved ahead. A red "hour" hand keeps the running total in units of 10 and a red "second" hand records single strokes. For example, if the minute hand is at 14, the hour hand at six, and the second hand at eight, a player knows he has completed 14 holes in 68 strokes. The watch can be cleared for a new round by revolving the blue minute hand once or twice around the dial, which brings the 18 small disks and the two red hands back to zeros.

Concrete Gutter at Rock-Ledge Base Keeps Cellar of Hillside Home Dry



My home is in a beautiful hillside location, but I had the perplexing problem of keeping my basement dry because of water seepage from a rock ledge at the rear of the house. After attempting to waterproof the basement walls without success, I finally corrected the difficulty by building a concrete gutter along the base of the ledge. The gutter is sloped so it drains the water away from the house and down the side of the hill. I dug a trench along the entire length of the ledge back of the house, and troweled concrete on the sides and flush with the rock, using a section of eaves trough to form a channel at the bottom. Cracks between the gutter and rock ledge appeared due to settling of the concrete, so I sealed these with calking compound. The only maintenance required for the gutter is removing leaves.

Improved Method for Striping Accurate Border Line on Circular Work


Instead of using the edge of the work itself as a guide when striping a border line around a disk, a better job results if the work is rotated and the striping tool is held stationary against a fixed point. This method produces a perfect circle by preventing any irregularity in the edge of the work from being duplicated in the striped line. The work rotates on a nail point located at one end of a scrap board. Another nail is driven in the board a distance from the pivot point slightly greater than the radius

of the disk. The guide arm on the tool is set for depth and is held against the nail while the work is rotated.

Linoleum-Block Cuts Mounted With Friction Tape

When electricians' friction tape is used to mount a linoleum-block cut, the cut can be detached simply by peeling it from the wooden base. This method enables just one mounting block to be used for several different cuts, if they are of approximately the same size. As the friction tape is sticky on both



sides, the strips are attached to the mounting block by pressing them in place, as shown in the drawing. Then the linoleum cut is pressed down on the tape. Cover the entire surface of the block by placing the strips of tape edge to edge. If the tape is not sticky enough, fasten it with airplane cement or small carpet tacks.

Improvised Outdoor Ovens Give Uniform Heat


By cutting a section from the top of a 5-gal. can and hinging the piece with wire to serve as a door, an excellent camping or picnic oven can be improvised inexpensively. In use, the can is placed over a fire and supported by stones, which confine the heat to the oven, maintaining ample heat for roasting or baking. In addition, smoke and dust will not contaminate the food. A permanent oven is made by building up rock around the can to form a flue, as shown, and covering the unit with sand or clay to provide insulation. Light baking may be done by spreading a ½-in. layer of sand over the bottom of the can. A small oven for baking fish or toasting marshmallows on a fork is

made quickly by building a fire over a round tin can, which has been laid on its side. The open top of the can is left exposed

to permit inserting the food.


Repairing Pipe Fence Posts Rusted off at Base



If a pipe fence post has rusted off at its base, it can be repaired to last for years. To make the repair, select a length of galvanized pipe which will fit inside the post snugly. For example, a 1½-in. pipe will fit nicely inside a 2-in. pipe.


The length of pipe required should be twice the length of the embedded post. The pipe is inserted inside the lower half of the rusted post, and then the upper portion of the post is placed over the projecting length of pipe. Coat the break with thick white-lead paint to make the joint watertight. When dry, paint the post with a rubber-base paint.





Channel Iron Provides C-Clamps For Modelmakers



Any number of small C-clamps can be mass-produced quickly simply by sawing off sections of a length of channel iron and fitting them with a clamping screw. The clamping screw can be a ¼-in. carriage or stove bolt, the head being cut off and the bolt bent L-shape. The threaded end is filed to form a tenon to take a cup washer, which is peened loosely to the bolt.

Abrasive Bands Renewed Quickly By Spool-Type Locking Device

Using the camera-spool principle, one man found an effective way to tighten abrasive bands on a wooden sanding wheel. The bands are easy to attach and remove. First, he drilled a hole through the wheel near the rim and cut a slot between the hole and rim. Then he turned a wooden spool which is inserted in the hole as shown. The spool is centered in the hole by a shoulder turned in the flange and by


a separate wooden insert ring which is glued in the opposite end of the hole flush with the face of the wheel. The barrel of the spool is slotted lengthwise to take tabs cut on the ends of the abrasive band, and a slot for winding is made across the end of

the spool. To apply the abrasive band, tabs on the ends of the strip are inserted through the slot in the spool. Then the spool is placed in the hole, and at the same time the ends of the band are passed through the slot in the wheel. The spool is turned to tighten the band. When tightened, a metal clip, screwed to the side of the wheel, keeps the spool from unwinding. If necessary, the wheel may be counterbalanced by driving screws near the rim opposite the spool.

Easy Way to Pour Half of Contents From Open-Top Container

When you wish to pour half the contents of a full can of paint, gasoline or other liquid into another container, here's a way to get a close




approximation of this amount. Pour the liquid in the usual manner until the level of the liquid remaining in the can forms a line between the lower edge of the rim, A, and the upper edge of the bottom, B. At this point you have poured about one half of the contents from the can. This rule will hold true for both round and square cans, but, of course, it can be done only with open-top containers. If you want to divide the contents of a partially empty can equally, make a mark or place your finger on the outside of the can at the level of the liquid when the can is vertical. Then, use this mark in the same way as you would the lower edge of the rim when pouring from a full can.






Pool of Irving Snyder, Palm Springs, Calif.


JHETHER it's large and elaborate or small and unpretentious, there's nothing like the privacy and convenience of a swimming pool right in your own back yard. And when you can do most of the work yourself or with the help of friends and neighbors, the cost can be kept well within the limitations of the average pocketbook. The suggestions and pointers presented here cover construction ranging from simple wading pools to a large family-size swimming pool.

When building a wading pool for youngsters, locate it on high ground if possible to simplify draining and also to save excavating, Fig. 1. A simple circular-shaped wading pool is shown in Fig. 2. A novel feature of this pool is a sprinkler head which is attached to a length of pipe and screwed into a coupling on the drainpipe. The children will enjoy frolicking in the spray from the sprinkler while the pool is being filled. When the sprinkler head is not used, it is removed and the drain stopped with a pipe plug, Fig. 2. The sprinkler feature is practical only if the drainpipe outlet is easily accessible for attaching a hose. Galvanized sheet metal or heavy linoleum makes ideal forms for a circular pool. Fig. 7 shows how stakes and cross braces are used to support metal forms. As a safety precaution, do not make the depth of the pool at the center more than 12 in.

Fig. 6 details a pool of unusual construction which is suitable for youngsters learn-ing to swim. However, it is not desirable in regions where winter temperatures drop below freezing as the 2-in. walls will not withstand movement of the ground due to frost. The excavation for this pool is furred with strips nailed to stakes driven into the earth walls. Then metal lath is stapled to the furring strips and poultry wire is used in the bottom for reinforcement. Walls are plastered with cement and the



Here is an example of how a pool built on sloping ground reduces the job of excavating. Double-formed, pool is ready to be poured





This view shows the pool poured, the forms removed and drain installed. Walls take less concrete when bottom of pool is sloped


bottom is covered with a 3-in. layer of concrete poured over a 4-in. bed of gravel and strengthened with the wire. Finally, a reinforced curbing or parapet is laid

around the edge.


An inexpensive pool without plumbing is shown in Fig. 5. Measuring 12 by 20 ft., it is designed for high ground to eliminate drainage piping and has sloping walls to do away with the need for forms. Bottom and sides of the excavation are tamped well and then 2 in. of concrete is poured over the bottom. This is reinforced with 6-in. spot-welded wire mesh, on top of which an additional 2-in. layer of concrete is poured. When the bottom is firm but still soft, the walls are plastered with cement to form an integral mass which is troweled into a parapet all around the top. The bottom is troweled to slope toward a sump from which the water is siphoned with a hose to drain the pool.





Fig. 3 shows how the pool is double-formed—with inside and outside forms, and how it is reinforced. Note that the inner forms are suspended from crossbeams and that stakes are used to prevent the outer forms from giving way at the bottom. Rods reinforcing the walls and bottom are wired together at the lower corner as shown in Fig. 4, detail A. The walls of large pools generally are poured on footings and a separate slab poured for the bottom, much like the foundation of a house. Then a mastic is run in the joint to make it watertight as shown in Fig. 4, detail D.

Figs. 3 and 11 detail an adult-size pool, 10 by 22 ft. Note that it is complete with water filter, centrifugal pump, suction-cleaning facilities, diving board and ladder. The deep portion just off the diving board slopes upward at each end to cut material cost. However, don't skimp on the wall thickness and the reinforcement. A minimum wall thickness of 6 in. is recommended for mild climates. Pools built in regions of severe cold should be 10 in. thick to avoid cracking. Section A-A of

Figs. 9 and 10 give suggestions for making ladders of pipe or wood, and also plans for a springboard. The metal ladder should be of galvanized or stainless steel and embedded in the concrete at the time it is poured. Spruce is the best material for the springboard. Bevel the edges and cover the end with a nonslip padding of rope matting.


Three types of parapets are shown in Fig. 8. Parapets A and B incorporate a spillway in the top of the wall for floating off leaves and litter by raising the water level. In the case of B, drainpipes are spaced about 8 ft. apart all around the pool. Detail C shows construction of a parapet which extends above ground to provide a low seat around the pool and keeps debris from blowing into the water.


The concrete for small wading pools can be mixed in a wheelbarrow, but for large pools it is best to rent a small power mixer.



A recommended proportionate mix consists of portland cement, 1 part; sand, 21/2 parts; and gravel, 31/4 parts. If the pool is to be plastered, the proportions should be as follows: portland cement, 1 part; and sand, 3 parts. Six gallons of water per sack of cement is about right. It is always best to pour a job complete at one time, but if this cannot be done, the joint should be roughened to assure a good bond and brushed with a soupy mixture of cement and water just before the pouring is resumed. Be sure that the concrete is well spaded in the forms with a long pole, to prevent air pockets and porous places in the finished wall. Also, avoid cave-in areas in the dirt walls, Fig. 4, detail B, which take considerably more concrete. Forms should not be removed for two or three days, after which the concrete should be cured gradually by wetting it frequently for several days. Dirt fill around the outside of the walls is packed solidly by wetting with a hose as it is shoveled in place. Fig. 4, detail C.

The nozzle from an old vacuum cleaner attached to a long pole will be found handy for cleaning the walls and bottom of a pool. Fasten it to a length of large hose and connect it to the suction-pump inlet, Fig. 11. Finish the walls and bottom of the pool with a couple coats of rubber-base paint. When cracks develop which cause serious leakage, they can be filled with asbestos roofing cement and then painted.






Pyramid-Type Strawberry Bed



This pyramid-type strawberry bed holds a large number of plants in a small space while bringing each plant within easy reach for individual attention. The original bed, built to the dimensions given in the drawing, holds 64 plants in a space 6 ft. square without crowding. Because of the design of the pyramid the strawberry plants are not likely to spread, and weeding, watering and gathering the fruit is simplified. The bed consists of four square frames of diminishing size, filled with soil to about 2 in. above the top to allow for settling, and stacked pyramid fashion. A cheesecloth cover placed over the bed, will prevent birds from eating the fruit.—Carl C. Buebke, Portland, Ore.

Screw Inserted in Rim Lock Prevents Use of Passkey

If you have a mortise or rim-type lock on your door, you can alter it so that a passkey will not open it by simply turning a small machine screw through the bot-



tom of the lock, as shown. Place the screw at one side of the keyhole so that it will not interfere with inserting the key. Also, determine the location of the screw by noting the direction the key is turned to unlock the lock.

Then make two keys for your own use, one to operate the lock from the inside and the other from the outside, and grind off the portion of each key indicated by the dotted lines.

Getting the Most From Canned Heat

When using canned heat to cook outdoors after a long day of hunting or fishing, it's very annoying if the flame burns low because the fuel is almost exhausted. However, you can produce a high flame and enjoy a warm meal merely by



punching several holes around the side of the can with a nail. Punch the holes near the fuel level to obtain effective draft.

Plumb Bob Anchors Pie-Tin Buoy Used as Fishing-Hole Marker

On large lakes or rivers where it's often difficult to return to the exact location of a good fishing hole, a brightly colored marker buoy will permit you to find the spot in a jiffy. A float can be made by soldering two pie tins together and soldering a screw eye to the bottom of one of them. A plumb bob attached by means of a line serves as a weight to anchor the marker in place. When you find a spot you wish to mark, drop the weight and pay out the line until the weight is on the bottom. Then tie the buoy to the line. If it is painted orange, it will be easy to see in daylight and can be picked up at night in the beam of a flashlight.



OUTDOOR DESK

IDEAL for the naturalist, archaeologist or anyone who must do documentary work in the field, this folding desk-andstool combination provides substantial writing surface along with comparative comfort. The desk folds into a compact case for traveling. In addition to containing all the essential writing equipment, it also carries the three-drawer stool. Shelves, together with the stool drawers, afford ample space for storing paper, records and reference books. Two small drawers at the center partition hold pencils, pens, etc. A bottle of ink is inserted in a hole cut in the lower drawer and is held by means of a thumbscrew. A lamp, which can be connected to a portable power supply, is attached as shown. In this location, the lamp will furnish sufficient illumination and still not interfere with packing of the stool. The desk legs fold for carrying and are held folded by spring sash stops.







Here are some things to watch: In indoor events, wing area of both stick and cabin models must be limited to a maximum of a 150 sq. in. Maximum cross-sectional area of stick models must conform to the formula L²/150 as a maximum (L—the over-all length, excluding propeller), while the maximum cross-sectional area of cabin models must be L²/100 as a minimum.


Cross-section formulas are the same for outdoor rubber, but wing area may vary from 100 to 300 sq. in. Minimum weight is 4 oz. per 100 sq. in. of wing area. In gas free flight, the minimum weight is 100 oz. per cu. in. of piston displacement, and no model can weigh more than 7 pounds. In control-line events, no model can weigh more than 4 pounds. No metal props are permitted.

The details below are only representative of the acceptable methods of construction of the fuselage, or cabin types, in both rubber and gas models. Special care must be taken with built-up sections such as those in details A, B, C and D below at the left.










Flat-Glass Panes Reduce Cost Of Semicircular Sash

Using individual flat-glass panes instead of expensive curved ones, here's a way that you can gain the effect of a semicircular, multiple-pane window at a fraction of the cost of one glazed with curved glass. Vertical and horizontal members of the sash itself are assembled from T-iron, the mullions being straight and the bars curved, and all pieces are welded together to form a sash of the desired radius. Ends of the bars are notched to butt flush against the mullions. The width of the panes, which governs the spacing of the mullions, is determined by the particular radius. The example shows that the maximum glass size for a 10-ft. sash which projects 20 in., is 1334 in. This is the maximum width that the T-iron will accommodate. To determine the spacing of the mullions, lay out a full-size drawing on paper as in the horizontal-section detail. Swing a line representing the radius and swing another representing the width of the T-iron to be used. Then hold a straightedge at a tangent to the second line and note the maximum length that can be drawn within the two lines, allowance being made for glazing. The panes are set in the T-iron rabbets.

Snap Restores Halyard Pulley To Flagpole Top

To solve the problem of replacing a fallen halyard pulley at the top of a tall flagpole, one man devised this snap clamp which remains a permanent attachment on the pole. It is made in two parts cut from heavy-gauge sheet metal in the shape of a letter S. The two parts are pivoted together with a cap screw to form a figure eight and one end is provided with a coil spring. Then, the other end is fitted with a trigger made from heavy wire and a V-shaped piece of sheet metal. One end of the wire engages a notch filed in one leg as shown. In use, a light touch disengages the trigger, causing the spring to snap the jaws shut. The device is raised with a pole built up of sections, the first one having a hole in the end to receive the pivot screw snugly. Wire loops, formed around the flagpole and attached to each section as it is added, help guide the pole. The pulley and halyard are tied to the device with string or a rubber band so that a slight tug will free them. After the clamp reaches the top of the flagpole, the trigger is bumped against the ball spike to snap the clamp in place. Then the sectional pole is pulled away from the cap screw.






Tractor valve springs provide the knee action and these are set in can covers bolted to the axle with the same bolts which fasten the radius rod. A screw and a hexagon nut anchor each spring at the top and a leather snubber holds the springs in place, slightly compressed. Waterproof plywood and solid stock are used in the body, with sheet metal being used to cover the rounded ends. The teardrop fenders are shaped from 2 by 8-in. plank, covered with plywood.—J. C. 





SLAT HOUSES aid in starting seedlings


BUILT from rough framing stock and sided and roofed with spaced wooden lath or lattice stock, the slat house provides a means of controlling plant shade. Spaced slats give just the right amount of shade to tender seedlings and transplants. During the day each plant is alternately shaded and exposed to direct sunlight at regular intervals. This tends to lower the temperature both of the air and seedbed and also prevents too rapid evaporation of moisture. A slat house can be made an at-

tractive feature of the garden if some thought is given to selecting a design which fits in with the plan of the grounds. While the type pictured at the lower right on the next page is wholly utilitarian, others shown are more ornate architecturally. The design detailed in Figs. 1 to 4 inclusive has been selected as an all-around type suitable for most home grounds. The plan, Fig. 4, includes the potting bench, Fig. 2, and the framing is detailed in Fig. 3. Frame and slats should be stained.






Pull-Chain Shock Absorber For Ceiling Fixture



Because it was pulled too hard; the chain on the ceiling fixture in our pantry frequently broke, sometimes inside the fixture necessitating a bothersome repair job. I finally found a way to correct this trouble by fastening a small coil spring between the pull chain and the cord. The spring acts as a shock absorber preventing the chain from breaking unless it is pulled extremely hard.

Wire Mesh Prevents Damage To Growing Gladioli



Tender stalks of "glads" growing in small beds out in the open frequently are broken by the wind. To prevent this, drive wooden stakes at the four corners of the bed and stretch welded wire fencing


(4-in. mesh) over the bed when the plants are 6 to 8 in. high. Train the stalks through the wire mesh as the plants grow and raise the wire at intervals as growth progresses. With average-sized plants, height of the wire should not exceed 2 ft. at the end of the growing period. As the metal gets very hot on sunny days, some foliage should be

above the wire to keep it from getting too hot and injuring the plant. The fencing is held to the posts with soft-iron wire.

Infant's Crib Converted Into Swinging Cradle

Since I converted the baby's crib to a swinging cradle, he amuses himself for hours by kicking his legs to rock the crib. If he is restless during the night, rocking the crib gently usually will lull him to sleep. The two end supports are assembled from 2 by 2-in. stock and made rigid laterally by a 1 by 6-in. board. Eyebolts inserted near the ends of the top crossmember in each support and screw eyes turned into the crib, hold four lengths of chain. The dimensions are determined by the crib size.—C. H. Getting Home on a Sick Engine


If your car suddenly goes dead on the road, simple checks may enable you to locate and repair the trouble, at least temporarily so that you can get to a garage

IF YOU have ever had your car engine conk out on the road and experienced a helpless feeling as the car coasted to a stop miles from a garage, this article will be helpful. No doubt, your first thoughts were of an expensive service call, or even a stiff tow bill.


In many cases you can locate the trouble right on the spot and either correct it, or at least make a temporary repair that will permit the car to be driven home or to the nearest garage where permanent repairs can be made, thus saving the delay and expense of a service call or tow charge, especially on holidays when repair shops are closed.

Naturally, insurance against engine trouble on the road is to inspect the engine at regular intervals, make necessary adjustments and keep worn parts replaced. Also, it is a good idea always to carry a small emergency kit consisting of a few simple tools, such as wrenches, spare insulated wire, friction tape, a quart bottle and a 3-ft. length of small hose for siphoning gas from the tank.

But if you do get stuck on the road, just remember that a car engine needs four things to make it operate; fuel in the carburetor, spark at the spark plugs to ignite the fuel, and oil and water to prevent wear





Holding spark-plug cable 1/8 in. from cylinder head should produce a hot spark as engine is turned over




Clean and tighten cable connections at battery periodically. See that the ground connection is tight

and overheating. A glance at the temperature gauge will take care of the latter two. If the reading is normal, your water is okay, and the chances are the oil is too, because lack of oil would cause the engine to heat. This leaves the fuel and ignition systems, but a process of elimination may enable you to locate the trouble quickly. Just how the engine "died" may give you the key to which system is at fault. If the engine gave no signs of starting as the car coasted, the ignition system may be suspected. Sputtering, grabbing and kicking in and out is likely to indicate that the fuel system is at fault. In any case, check the fuel supply in the tank first.


If you suspect the ignition system, start the process of elimination by trying the starter. If it works, the battery and cables are all right, but don't overlook the possibility of loose connections at each end of the battery cables, or a broken cable. Sometimes they loosen and vibration will break the circuit enough to stop the engine, which may operate when the car is standing. Tighten the cables, Fig. 2. If one is broken, twist a few strands of heavy wire together, even fencing wire, for a repair.

If this does not locate the trouble, and


still assuming that the starter works, go back to the ignition. Remove the distributor cap and inspect it for cracks, Fig. 4. Then turn on the ignition switch and crank the motor until the distributor breaker points close. Now, with the switch on, spread the points quickly with your fingers. This should produce a spark. If it does, the ignition is okay to the distributor. Next, remove one of the spark-plug wires and hold it about 1/8 in. from a cylinder-head bolt, Fig. 1, and crank the motor over a few times. You should see a spark jump from the end of the wire to the bolt. If it does, the entire ignition system is okay.

The next move is to check the fuel system. Disconnect the fuel line at the carburetor or at the discharge side of the fuel pump and crank the motor several times. Gas should flow from the pump. If these few preliminary checks, which are fairly easy to do, have not disclosed the trouble, they should enable you to determine which system is at fault. It is now a matter of tracing the trouble to its source.


Suppose you found that the fuel system caused the trouble and gas did not flow




Breaks and abrasions in wiring, or loose connections inside distributor, may short-circuit the ignition coil

The fuel filter should be cleaned periodically. Wash out sediment and be sure screen is clean and open




Examine flexible line on the suction side of the fuel pump closely. Breaks here often cause air leaks

from the line when it was disconnected. The trouble is most likely to be in the fuel pump or the flexible connection between the main fuel line and the pump. However, check the filter screen in the line. The screen may be located as in Fig. 8, or it may be at the pump or carburetor. Usually a clogged screen does not stop the motor dead without long warning several days ahead. Again connect the fuel line to the carburetor, remove the air cleaner from the carburetor and pour a tiny stream of gas into the air intake while cranking the motor with the switch on. A pop bottle is best for pouring the gas. If there isn't a small hose for siphoning the gas from the car tank, there is a drain plug in the bottom of the tank that can be taken out to get gas. Be careful, though, in doing this or you will be sprayed with gas. Race the motor for several seconds. Sometimes this procedure will start a defective fuel pump to working. If it does, don't stop the motor because the pump may refuse to work again. If the motor refuses to start, check the flexible connection between the pump and main gas line, Fig 9. It may be cracked either externally or internally, allowing the pump to suck air into the line. Wrap it tightly with tape and again try the above procedure. If this fails, disconnect the fuel line at the pump, remove the fuel-tank cap and blow into the tank, pressing your cheeks tightly over the filler hole to prevent air from escaping. By this means, you can build up enough pressure to force gas from the line at the pump if the line is not clogged. If it is clogged, try to blow it out with a tire pump. If all of these remedies fail to correct fuel-system trouble, a mechanic is about your only hope.

If, however, the difficulty was found to be in the ignition system, it's a matter of eliminating the most likely causes of the trouble progressively. Fig. 3 shows the circuit of a typical ignition system. Suppose, for example, you had a spark at the distributor breaker points, but none at the plugs. The trouble is probably a damaged rotor. The spring contact may be broken or worn so that it does not touch the center contact in the cap. Sometimes a temporary repair can be made by binding a piece of tin or other thin metal to the rotor to carry

current from the center contact through the rotor. Don't overlook the possibility of a loose ground on the condenser, Fig. 5, which should be tightened.

The final check for this part of the ignition system is to remove the high-tension wire from the center contact of the distributor cap and make sure that it is clean and is seating correctly in the cap well, and also that it is not broken. Hold the free end about ¼ in. from the cylinder head as in Fig. 1, and crank the motor over several times. You should get a fat spark from the wire to the head. If not, the coil may be at fault.

To make sure about the coil, remove the "hot" primary wire from it and rub the end against an unpainted metal part of the car. There should be some indication of sparking. If there is sparking, and the connections in the distributor are tight and in good condition, Fig. 6, the trouble is likely a dead coil, which will have to be replaced. If you did not get sparking at the end of the primary wire, the trouble is between the coil and the battery. Trace the circuit, tightening all connections as you progress. Likely you will find a loose connection or a broken wire, but don't overlook the possibility of trouble in the ignition switch. Be sure the ignition switch is on when making the tests on the ignition.

In making periodic checks to avoid engine failure, consider the following:



Cutting Openings in Sheet Metal



When you want to cut a square or rectangular opening in sheet metal, mount the work in a vise and cut it with a cold chisel. This method will simplify the job and result in a straight-edged opening with

square corners. First, scribe the section to be removed and then clamp the work in the vise, aligning the jaws flush with one of the scribed lines. Rest the chisel at a slight angle on the vise jaw and give it a sharp blow with a hammer. The shearing action produced in this manner will cut through the metal easily, even if it is of fairly heavy gauge. The chisel should have a long tapering point.—Jo Ro Jung, New Orleans, La.

Wall Plaque Enlivens Child's Room


Made from wood scraps and finished in gay colors, this duck wall plaque will add a novel touch to a child's room. Suitable animal cutout designs can be obtained




from children's coloring books, or decals may be used. These are applied to the wood, then outline-sawed and finished with clear lacquer or shellac. Finish the parts separately and assemble with glue and brads, the brads being driven from the rear side. A roundheaded brass screw and a washer make an excellent eye for the duck, or regular glass-bead eyes can be used.—I. M. Fenn, Chicago.

Ball-Point Pen Serves as Stylus When Tracing Stencil

An inexpensive ball-point fountain pen makes a good substitute for a stylus when writing, ruling or drawing on a duplicator stencil. The pen makes a clear impression



that gives an excellent reproduction and, unlike the sharp point of the stylus, the ball point practically eliminates the danger of tearing the stencil.




Pivoted "Miter Box" for Bench Use Permits Sawing Intermediate Angles


Permitting a greater number of angles to be sawed than a common wooden miter box, this unusual one features a pivoted saw guide for making either right or lefthand cuts. It can be adjusted to any angle between 45 and 90 degs. Mounted permanently to the front edge of a workbench, it is designed so that the saw guide can be swung down out of the way when not in use. A vertical 2 by 4-in. support, having a 12-in, square block nailed to the face at one end, is spiked to the bench at the top to bring the block flush and nailed to the bench crossrail at the bottom. Then, calibrations, 90 to 45 degs., are marked on the block as shown, the 90-deg. mark and the hole for the pivot bolt being aligned exactly at right angles to the bench surface. The saw slot in the guide also must be centered exactly, and the lower end of the guide is pointed to serve as an indicator. The clamping handle is formed by welding a short length of rod to the bolt nut and is backed by a sheet-metal disk. The head of the pivot bolt should be embedded in the block so that it will not rotate. In using the "miter box," a cleat should be nailed temporarily to the bench top to provide a fence, its position determined by the thickness of the work, against which the latter is held when being sawed.

Nontangling Fishhook Holder

Often fishermen have trouble keeping snelled hooks from tangling and kinking in the tackle kit. Here's one way to keep them straight. Cut a piece of discarded garden hose about 8 in. long and make several slits in one end. Then fit the hooks over the other end and slip the snells into the slits, pulling them tight.


PANORAMS are fun to make. All you have to do is take a series of four or five shots of a land-scape or sky line covering an arc of 90 to 120 degrees, and crop the prints to line up. Then you'll have a panoramic picture similar to the one at the top of the page. While each print will not align perfectly, a continuous photo can be produced by care-

ful matching and trimming.

The important point in making a panorama is to have the rear nodal point of the camera lens directly over the axis of shift or rotation. As long as the lens is rotated on an axis perpendicular to the optical axis, the images of distant subjects will change their relative position very little with each shot, as illustrated in Fig. 1. But, if the camera is held by hand, the axis of shift or rotation is at your body, Fig. 2, and not the lens, and the series of prints will not match properly. The approximate location of the front and rear nodal points of a lens is shown in Fig. 4, and to bring the rear nodal point on a center line with the tripod axis, it is necessary to use a wooden top on the pan or tripod head as in Fig. 5.

Best results are obtained by using a camera which has a ground glass and a spirit level to correct distortion and keep it to a minimum. If you use a camera without a ground glass, use a spirit level and view each picture so that the outer edge of the








previously exposed area slightly overlaps the succeeding shot. Avoid shooting a panoram on a bright sunny day. Negative densities will vary as you swing away from the sun, making it difficult to match the tone of each photo when printing, so it is better to shoot on an overcast but bright day.

In making the prints, keep the enlarger at the same setting for all enlargements. Develop all the prints at the same time to allow you to watch and control the uniformity of tone values during development. When the prints are dried, trim adjoining edges and skive the rear side of the abutting edges with sandpaper to prevent a ridge at the joint. Match prominent parts of the image first. It will be necessary to shift the prints slightly and retrim to get them to align as closely as possible. Hold the prints in position with tabs of masking tape and when all the prints are matched, Fig. 3, use a straightedge to mark and crop the top and bottom edges of the finished print. Finally, mount them on cardboard with rubber cement.



Battery-Operated Tester Picks Out Duds Among Your Flash Bulbs



To prevent missing spectacular shots due to flash-bulb failure, one photographer made sure his flash-bulb bag contained no duds by testing them beforehand in this little tester. The tester is designed to handle all sizes of flash bulbs and glows to indicate a good bulb. It consists of two porcelain sign sockets, a flashlight battery, a test lamp and two strips of copper, assembled and wired as shown. By flattening the threads in one of the sockets, the bulbs can be tested quickly without screwing them in. A midget flash-bulb adapter permits testing bayonet-base bulbs.

Spring-Type-"Tripod" for Folding Camera

It's not always necessary to carry a tripod when taking pictures either indoors or outdoors with your folding camera. The spring-type clamp from a photoflood reflector, which may be fastened to almost any convenient object, will serve as a handy "tri-pod." This clamp will hold a light folding camera easily merely by tightening the socket clamp over the top of the camera. One arm of this clamp first should be flattened to provide a better grip on the back of the camera, and it may be padded with felt or cloth to prevent scratching the camera case. The swivel joint allows the camera to be held in practically any convenient position.

Avoid Using Your Expensive Tubular-Type Tripod in Sand and Dirt

When there is danger of getting grit from sand or mud into the telescoping legs of a tubular-type tripod, mount the pantype head on a wooden tripod. To mount the pan head, drill a small hole in the top of the tripod to engage the short stop pin in the base of the head, and attach the latter in the regular way.

Cooling Developer by Evaporation

During hot weather, if ice or cold water are not available, a tank of developer can be kept cool if wrapped in a cloth saturated with fast-evaporating fluid. Rubbing alcohol, which is economical and easy to obtain, can be used. Hold the cloth in place around the tank with rubber bands.








Preventing Water From Splashing

Water can be prevented from splashing when washing photoprints under a sink faucet if a strip of clean cloth is suspended from the faucet so the water runs down it. The cloth, which is held with a rubber band, should reach the tray bottom.




Detached Flash Gun Hung From Camera Handle

When taking pictures with a flash gun, many photographers who use a Speed-Graphic camera prefer to remove the gun from its bracket and hold it high above the bellows, as this method produces improved lighting effects affording better modeling and composition. However, the bothersome job of detaching the flash-gun cable from the camera or taking time to slide the gun on its bracket after each shot can be eliminated in the following manner. Merely unsnap the upper end of the leather handle and hang the flash gun from the square ring. The bulb may be changed and the gun left in this position ready for the next shot. The handle, of course, is snapped back easily in the carrying position when finished.



Sizing Solution Permits Spotting Glossy-Surface Prints



Glossy-type prints may be spotted or retouched as easily as prints having a matte or semi-matte finish if they are first sized with this simple solution. It is prepared by dissolving in water any of the wetting agents sold commercially as water-spot preventatives for negatives. Mix the solution to the proportions of powder, 1 gm.,

and water, 100 c.c. Apply the solution generously to the surface of the glossy print. Then remove the excess with a swab of dry cotton and spot the print in the usual way with pencil or water color and a brush. If you wish, a stock solution of the sizing can be prepared to manufacturer's directions and mixed as follows: stock solution, 1 part, and water, 8 parts. R. F. Donavan, Jersey City, N. J.


Cable Release Operated By Darkroom Timer

If your camera is not equipped with a built-in timer for taking self-portraits, you can use a darkroom timer of the wind-up type to trip the shutter remotely at a preset time. Just tape the end of the cable release to the face of the timer in a posi-

tion where the side of the pointer will contact and depress the plunger when it reaches the preset interval. Masking or adhesive tape will do to fasten the cable to the timer.



NE GOOD WAY to budget individual costs to a minimum and still enjoy all the thrills of sailing is to form a yacht club. Any group of friends with a common interest in sailing can pool talents, equipment and cash, and thereby gain all the advantages of group action on the purchase of additional gear, boats, tools, shore property for a clubhouse site and other incidental items. A clubhouse, grounds and a pier come high on the list of requirements. With careful planning, a clubhouse and a suitable pier can be built by the club members, thus confining the cash outlay to that required for good


materials. Every clubhouse should have private rooms for changing from ship to shore clothes, a locker for each member so that he has space for storage of sails, clothing and other small gear, and a fairly complete set of tools for the common use of all members for repair and maintenance. No clubhouse really "belongs" until it is fitted out with a flagpole rigged complete with yardarm so that the national ensign and club pennants can be flown in correct order on all occasions. Landscaping, telephone, an oar rack and other minor details of the layout usually are decided by a vote of the club members. A slanting dock constructed at the water's edge is handy as small sailing boats can be hauled up on it



tion of additional equipment, special skills of the members should be administered so that each individual contributes an equal share. With careful planning, clubs can build their own boats at greatly reduced costs by arranging a change-work schedule

which includes all members.

Sailing dinghies, or "dinks" as they are often called, are the smallest and simplest of the common sailboats. Having only one sail, they are easy to handle because there is no complicated rigging, unless of course, you add a spinnaker like the more daring sailors in Fig. 2. And if members are holding costs to a minimum, then the club will own mostly little boats of the Snipe class with perhaps an occasional Lightning or




Comet, which are larger, or in other words, a lot more boat. But the pleasure of sailing your own boat is not determined by the size of the craft or the amount of money you, as an individual member of your club, spend on


the sport. With skillful handling, the tiny little boats of the Snipe class are flashy performers and once you get the feel of sails in a fair wind you'll understand why

seasoned yachtsmen regard this particular sport so highly.

If you are a beginner, you'll need to take lengthy counsel with an experienced member of the club before venturing to hoist sail alone, Fig. 5. Take an instructor with you, not only on the first trip, but on several succeeding trips. You must acquire absolute confidence in the boat and in your own ability to handle it. Many beginners have difficulty overcoming the fear of getting away from shore, especially if there is a fairly strong offshore breeze. But a competent sailor will show you how to run out before the wind, then turn, come into the wind and tack back across it to the harbor, Fig. 9. You will be much impressed with the ease with which he handles the latter



maneuvers; how, after running on the port tack for an interval (reach), he eases off on the sheets to luff sail and simultaneously puts the rudder hard down to tack ship. The boom will swing to the opposite side to allow the sail to catch the wind from the new quarter, and before you know it your little boat is away on the starboard tack. It's a neat trick just to watch, if it's done by an old hand, but the real thrill comes when you do it yourself for the first time. Once you see demonstrated how quickly and smoothly the craft responds to the rudder and the set of the sail, you get the idea that with fair and steady winds you can go anywhere there is water under your keel, and you can come back just as easily to home harbor.

Your sailor friend also will show you how to turn into the wind and coast your little boat smoothly up to the dock. To do this expertly, you have to judge distance and wind strength to a nicety, because a light boat loses way quickly on being turned into the wind. It's a good idea to practice the maneuver often in both light and strong winds. Fig. 4 shows an approved manner of holding the sheet and tiller when sailing a small boat. It's easy and comfortable and you're in a position to slack off instantly on the sheet if the boat heels (tips) too sharply to an unexpected gust. And this brings up one of the first principles in sailing a small boat. Always hold the sheet in your hand. Never snub it, or fasten to a cleat, for even when the weather is fair and the wind light, some unlooked-for emergency may make it necessary to trim sail quickly to release wind pressure. Keep the sheet free. It's a rule in small boats. When sailing, except perhaps when everything is going smoothly as in Fig. 8, it's regular practice to sit on the weather side of the boat, that is, the side from which the wind is coming, Fig. 6, and change from starboard side to port side







and back again when you're beating to windward on repeated tacks. If the wind turns suddenly gusty or if a squall races down on you and the boat begins to heel alarmingly, ease off on the sheet and the tiller simultaneously. Or, if it looks like an emergency, merely let go of everything. The sail will swing out and the boat will come up into the wind and right herself. If you are quick, you usually can avoid capsizing, even when hit by a severe gust or wind squall. The student sailor need not unduly fear capsizing, for small sailboats do not sink readily when upset, Fig. 7. Unless the hull is damaged by collision or other accident, it will support your weight until a rescue party comes

alongside and picks you up.


When working back to windward, that is, tacking, many beginners tend to sail too close to the wind on the port and starboard tacks. This probably is due partly to the amateur's desire to reach home port, but mostly to the natural tendency of small sailing craft to come up into the wind when running the reach between tacks. To get the full drive of the sail and to steady the boat, it's generally considered good practice to hold her off, even where you must shorten the reach between port and starboard tacks. In this, good sailors rely on their judgment and gauge the procedure by the performance of the boat under varying conditions. Many sailing practices apply only loosely to the handling of the very small boats, particularly after one gains experience and comes to know his own boat well.

After you have mastered ordinary sailing techniques under the tutelage of your instructor and have gained confidence in yourself, your boat and your ability to take her out in any reasonably good sailing weather, you're eligible in most unofficial small clubs to wear the snappy blue-and-gold yachting cap and club emblem.

Colored Lengths of String on Spool Used for Measuring Range Lengths




For the marksman who likes to practice target shooting away from marked ranges, this measuring device will come in handy for determining target distances. Lacquer Preserves Chrome Parts

To keep the chrome on your car at its original brilliance without constant polishing, coat it with a mixture of clear lacquer, 1 part, and thinner, 3 parts. The lacquer may be sprayed on the large surfaces and applied with a clean brush to the smaller parts. This should be done on a warm, dry day so the finish will not appear milky.

Magnet Holds Jigsaw Blades




It's easy to select just the blade you want when your extra jigsaw blades are held by a horseshoe magnet. Hang the magnet on a nail near the workbench or jigsaw.

Storing the blades in this manner will be found more convenient than when they are kept in a drawer. A magnet is provided for each size of blades.

Screwheads Filled With Solder Discourage Hinge Removal


Petty theft from a toolbox, which has a cover that is surface hinged, is discouraged if the heads of the exposed hinge screws are soldered over to fill the slots. This has been found effective in foiling attempts to remove the screws, due to



the likelihood of the thief being discovered because of the extra time and work in-

volved in removing the solder.

Tape Adds Nonslip Surface To Drill-Press Table



When drilling strips of sheet metal on a drill press, the possibility that the work will rotate and injure the hands is reduced considerably if electrician's friction tape is applied to one corner of the table and the work rest-

ed on it. As this tape is sticky on both sides, it will adhere to the table top and provide a nonslip surface for the work.

Handling Fishhooks Safely

Even if fishhooks are kept in books or holders, the barbs on the hooks are apt to injure a finger when they are handled.


To avoid this, place a drop of nonwaterproof glue on the point of the hook and around the barb. Then the hook can be handled safely and, when placed in the water, the protective covering will dissolve.







Woodworker's TOOL CHEST

By Edward R. Lucas


THERE'S a place for each tool and you'll know just where to find it if your woodworking tools are kept in a chest like the one built by Vernon Cutler of Bremerfon, Wash. In addition to its convenience and efficiency, this chest conserves workshop space and, if constructed with close-fitting joints and lid, it appreciably retards tool rust. The chest has a spacious drawer for storing planes and other large tools, nine smaller drawers, a tool panel that folds compactly into its compartment, and plenty of room on the inside of the lid for hanging saws, a level and a square. Even the space between the large drawer and chest bottom can be utilized








Above, roomy bottom drawer provides ample storage space for planes or other large tools. Below, drawer inserts permit the number of compartments to be increased without the installation of extra drawers




for storing blueprints, magazine plans and pamphlets.

The outer shell of the chest is of cedar with all corners and edges protected by oak trim. The top and sides are lined with %-in. plywood panels and the bottom with 1/4-in. plywood. These liners extend % in. beyond the front edges of the top and sides to form a rabbet for the lid, Fig. 1 and Fig. 2, section B-B. Two 1/16 by 1-in, oak cleats are fastened across the bottom of the chest to give additional support. The vertical partitions and hardwood drawer runners are inserted as in Fig. 1 and Fig. 2, section A-A. All drawer fronts and the door for the tool-panel compartment should fit flush with the chest sides.

The tool panels are hinged and fitted as in Fig. 1, leaving at least 1/8-in. clearance between each wall of the compartment and the panels when they are folded. Note the wooden stop and the dowel spacers for the panels. The extension support, upper right-hand detail, Fig. 3, holds the tool panels in the open position. The lid is constructed in the same way as the rest of the chest, and is mortise-hinged to the chest top. Fig. 3 shows fixtures for mounting tools on inside of lid.

Milling Setup Doubles Output



Two identical cuts can be milled in the time it takes to make one cut, if the work is clamped as shown and a straightfaced cutter is used instead of an angular one. Here, the idea is used to mill shallow Vgrooves in shafting. Two pieces of work are placed in a V-block and


supported by a third piece labeled "distance shaft." As the distance shaft determines the spacing of the work and the depth of cut, the size of the shaft and cutter must be such to permit milling an identical groove in each shaft. Mounting two pieces of work in this manner also permits the work to be clamped along each side and thereby provides free passage for the cutter along the entire length.



Scrap Pipe Makes Sturdy Handles For Shed and Barn Doors

Excellent, inexpensive handles for the doors of barns and other out buildings can be made from lengths of pipe by sawing and bending them as shown. The finished handle has a round, comfortable grip and its size, of course, is determined by the pipe used. Holes are drilled in the flattened ends to permit fastening the handles to the door with screws.




Drill-Press Sanding Sleeve Does Coarse or Fine Work

Both coarse and fine sanding may be done on the same drill-press sanding drum without changing sleeves, if sleeves of two different grit sizes are cut in half and a piece of each is slipped on the drum. Raising or lowering the spindle and locking it in place brings either grit into working position. If the sanding drum is too large to pass through the hole in the drill-press table, a piece of wood the same thickness as the height of the lower sleeve section will serve as a platform to elevate the work.

Eliminating Trailer-Hitch Rattle

Rattling of the pin-type hitch between a tractor and wagon is eliminated by placing rubber washers on the clevis pin so that one is on



each side of the drawbar. Suitable washers can be fashioned by making a hole through the center of two rubber shoe heels.

■Torn coat linings, due to hanging the coat on a nail in the shop or barn, can be prevented by driving the nails lengthwise through a cork. Long, small-diameter corks are most suitable for this purpose.





LTHOUGH taper turning is a common shop operation, it requires a careful setup to produce work accurately to required dimensions. In most shops it commonly is done by one of three methods: (1) Setting-over the tailstock; (2) by use of a taper attachment and (3) by swiveling the compound. Most craftwork and small machine-shop work is done with the setover method. The mechanics of this operation are fairly well understood by most workers, and the main difficulty is not in the work itself but in calculating the required amount of setover. This is simplified by the table on the opposite page, which lists a considerable range of standard tapers. If the job happens to call for a taper not listed, use the next size under the specified taper.

Setover method: Nearly all lathes are equipped with setover tailstocks, the amount of setover varying with the size and type of machine. Although it serves the purpose where only an occasional taper is turned, in production work this system has two faults: First, it requires movement of the tailstock and the consequent tedious adjustment of getting it back to the proper position for straight turning; second, it tends to score the tail center. One good remedy for the first fault is to use an offset center, which is adjustable for setover. A simple type is shown in Fig. 2. Another style with a micrometer sleeve is pictured in Fig. 1. This model has a ball center, Fig. 5, which eliminates the problem of scored centers. Why the work scores the common 60-deg. center can be seen from Fig. 4. This is exaggerated, of course, as the scoring is not bad when cutting medium tapers. However, there is the possibility of an inaccuracy developing while the work is in progress, due to deep scoring of the center








tailstock setover. These are numbered 1 to 5 inclusive. A sample job, Fig. 7, is used to illustrate. However, when work is specified in this way, it is practical to make the setover without calculation, using the method shown in Figs. 12 and 13. In this method, the body of the taper is turned to the net diameter at the big end, and a shoulder cut is run in at the small end to the small-end diameter to give a second measuring point. Now, if the tailstock is offset so that the two measuring points are equidistant from the parallel line of carriage travel, the longitudinal carriage movement consequently will cause the tool to cut the taper as specified. This can be seen in Fig. 13. Method No. 4, Fig. 11, is another system of direct setting without calculating the setover. This requires a duplicate taper which is mounted between centers. Then the tailstock is set over until the tool point follows the taper. Now, if the workpiece is made the same length as the sample, the taper cut will duplicate the sample. Methods 1, 2 and 3 are measuring methods from a calculated setover. No. 2 is the most exact and simplest; No. 1 is fast but rough; No. 3 is the method most commonly used. In this last method, the calculated amount of setover is read on the cross-feed micrometer sleeve. In order

to take out backlash in the screw, the reading should be made as follows: Run the flat end of the tool holder lightly against a strip of paper held over the tailstock spindle, as shown in Fig. 10. Now, back up the feed until the paper can be pulled free. Take the micrometer reading from the sleeve and back off the calculated amount of setover. Then, with the tool remaining in this position, the tailstock is set over until it clips the paper with the same "feel" as before. In any case, do not overrun the setover—set it light and take a sample cut preparatory to checking.

Checking the taper: If a test sleeve is available, the work is tested by chalking the turned portion, Fig. 14, and then rotating the work inside the sleeve. Fig. 15 shows the small end of the work oversize; more setover is needed. This is the correct way to proceed—gradually coming down to size with a series of cuts. Testing should begin as soon as you have about 1 in. of tapered surface. Figs. 16 and 17 picture one of many types of taper gauges. These are often handy, but must be accurately made to be useful.

Taper attachment: The best taper attachments are specially-made fixtures permanently attached to the lathe, just like the gear box or carriage. A typical unit is



are loosened to allow the parts to move freely. For taper turning, bracket screw A is tightened to hold the taper-turning unit in a fixed position. Lead-screw nut C is loosened, releasing the cross-feed. Screw B is tightened, and this ties the free cross slide with the slide bar of the taper attachment. The taper-per-foot is set by swinging the pivoted taper bar until the index mark on the end of the bar reaches the correct reading on the fixed scale, Fig. 18. A taper attachment has many advantages: It is not necessary to set the tailstock over or to measure the amount of setover: the same taper can be cut on work of any length; work can be mounted in the chuck, and internal cuts, Fig. 20, are just as easily made as external cuts.

Tapering with compound: Lacking a taper attachment, internal taper cuts are usually made with the compound-slide hand-feed. A sample job is shown in Fig. 21. The feed of the average compound slide is 2 to 2½ in., so instead of boring the full length of the taper, a short distance at the bottom is bored straight with a suitable tool. The remaining distance is then within the travel of the compound, and also is sufficient for accurate fitting and practical use. Since this sample job is a No. 2 Morse taper, the compound swivel is 1 degree and 26 minutes, which is just a little under 1½ degrees. Set the compound parallel with

the lathe bed, and then swivel it the 1½ degrees required. It is a good idea to check the parallel position first, since the compound scale cannot always be relied on for this purpose. Fig. 22 shows the cut being made, using a ¼-in. boring bar.


Reaming a taper: Accurate boring with the boring tool alone can be done, but if you do much of this work it is better to finish with a taper reamer. Using the reamer, the hole need only be rough-bored, and then finished with a light reamer cut, Fig. 23. In this operation, the work should be flooded with oil, should run at lowest lathe speed and the feed must be slow and even to prevent jamming or "freezing." When doing this type of reaming, especially where considerable stock is to be removed, it may be necessary to withdraw the reamer at short intervals to clear it of chips. If the flutes fill with chips this may cause the reamer to freeze with possible scoring of the work. The outside of the sample job is finished by mounting on a No. 2 Morse chucking fixture or any kind of shank having a No. 2 Morse taper. The operation is shown in Figs. 24 and 25. If desired, the procedure can be reversed, turning the outside first and then centering in a 4-jaw chuck for the taper cut.


Special Wrench Speeds Tightening Of Conduit Locknuts



Not satisfied with the hammerand-screwdriver method of tightening the thin locknuts on conduit connectors. Joseph Marino of Chicago devised this special wrench which does the trick in a jiffy. The wrench has two guides which fit both thin-wall and rigid-type conduit connectors. It is

used by inserting the proper guide in the conduit connector after the locknut is started with the fingers. Two prongs on the wrench engage the lugs on the nut and permit drawing it up tightly against the outlet box. Both heads of the wrench are the same design but of different size. They are riveted and then tack welded to a suitable flat-iron handle. If the guides are grooved lengthwise, the wrench can be used to loosen nuts where wires are in place.


Try Square Aligns Rubber Stamp When Printing Data on Tracing



For draftsmen who use a rubber stamp to print the necessary information on a blueprint tracing, a try square cut from a wooden block will simplify aligning the stamp with the border of the tracing. As the lettering usually

does not extend to the lower edge of the stamp, this must be taken into consideration when locating the try square.

Tank Cart Speeds Mixing Liquid Used in Tractor Tires

To facilitate the job of filling tractor tires with liquid when extra weight is desired or when adding an antifreeze solution to the tires, one service station rigged up this handy mixing cart. It is nothing more than two 55-gal. oil drums anchored to a caster-fitted platform, and is used to mix thoroughly calcium chloride and water by pumping the solution from one tank to the other several times. This speeds



mixing, after which the solution is pumped into the tires. The amount of chemical used is varied according to the manufacturer. Avoid using a solution consisting of common table salt and water for an antifreeze, as the salt will separate from the water and permit the water to freeze and damage the tire.



"SEA CRAFT"- a 25-ft.

In This, the final installment of the "Sea Craft" series, the boat is completed ready for launching and the thrill of her maiden voyage.

Continuing with the cabin interior, install the framing and plywood covering of the port and starboard bunks and forward cabinets. The top of the port-side cabinet is cut out to take a 12 by 12-

in. galley sink, which drains through the hull, as in Fig. 43 of Part 4. Fresh water is piped to a faucet fitted through the bulkhead, Fig. 30 of Part 3. The bunk mattresses are supported on a removable frame woven of burlap webbing, as in Fig. 33 of Part 3. They are kept in place by a 1½-in. projection of the plywood bunk sides, which extend down over the inboard sides of the floor stringers. The hull ribs above the bunk frames are covered with 1/2-in. mahogany, Figs. 41 and 42 of Part 4. Center of the cabin floor is made in two removable sections, each supported by cleats fastened to the plywood bunk sides and floor timbers which are bolted to the frames on top of the tie bars (see station 3, Fig. 43 of Part 4). Note that the floor slopes to obtain maxi-






mum headroom at station 6. The cabin floor on both sides of the engine compartment is fastened permanently to the top edges of the floor stringers and floor timbers, Figs. 35 and 38 of Part 3.

Before covering the cockpit-bulkhead framing, install the water closet, which must be purchased from a marine supply house. Plywood is

used for the walls and doors of the toilet room, engine compartment and chart cabinet. Note in Fig. 35 of Part 3, that the sides and top of the engine compartment are removable. They also must be lined with asbestos. The sides are held in place at the top by hooks and at the bottom with quarter round nailed to the floor. One side and top are shown removed in the photo, Fig. 36 of Part 3. An alcohol cooking stove is bolted in a sheet-metal cabinet mounted on the bulkhead frame. The cabinet must be removable for access to the rear of the control box as detailed in Figs. 49 and 43 of Part 4. This box houses the compass, electrical switches, engine controls and steering gear. An inspection door in the front of the box, Fig. 37 of Part 3, is held in

The steering system, Figs. 30 and 38 of Part 3, consists of an automobile steering knuckle of the worm-gear type bolted in the control box so that a steering wheel can be fastened to the worm shaft. The stub shaft of the worm gear is welded to a vertical shaft extending below the cockpit floor. Lever arms attached to the lower end of the shaft and rudder post are connected with a steering rod of ½-in. pipe, which has a clevis welded to each end. A handoperated bilge pump is fastened to the port side of the control box with the outlet connected to a ½-in. galvanized pipe running under the cockpit floor to a hole in the transom. The pump intake is connected to

place with brass door buttons and plates.

The cabin stairway, Figs. 41 and 43 of Part 4, is covered with a trap door which projects under the cabin door when closed, preventing entrance to the cabin when the cabin door is locked.

a hose extending down to the bilge.

Two 6-volt storage batteries, placed in a box under the cockpit floor are connected to a S.P.D.T. switch located in the control box. The wiring hookup should be arranged so the batteries may be used individually or disconnected when the boat is not in use.


The stern deck is made of the same material as the forward deck. It is crowned 2 in. and the forward edge curved to conform with the radius of the cockpit seat, as in Fig. 47 and also Figs. 40 and 41 of Part 4. The seat top is made from three pieces of


plywood and is removable for access to storage space beneath. This provides an ideal place to store life preservers, which must be carried for each person on board. The side decks or shelves, extending from the sheer drop to the transom, should be installed at the same time as the stern deck. They are of 34-in. mahogany cut to fit snugly against the cabin sides and trimmed flush with the hull planking. The shelves, forward of the sheer drop, are of 34-in. plywood covered with canvas to provide a nonslip surface. They must be notched to clear the ventilating ducts. A block of wood is inserted between the fore and aft shelves where the sheer line drops, and 34-in. quarter round is fastened along the joint of the shelf and cabin side.


Before the cabin top is put on, cut grooves in the center strip for the insulated electrical wires, as in Figs. 46 and 47. These wires, which are connected to switches on the control-box panel, are brought through holes in the cabin top to the combination light, mast light and a horn which is required for a boat of this size. The wires leading to the cabin dome lights and toiletroom wall light, which have individual switches, are connected directly to an ammeter on the panel.

The two outer supports for the cockpit windshield, shown in pattern squares in Fig. 41 of Part 4, are installed next. Each side is made from two pieces doweled and glued together at the top and screwed to

station 4 on both sides along the sheer, Figs. 40 and 41 of Part 4, are screwed to the deck planking as in the upper detail of Fig. 42. The seam between the hull and deck planking at the sheer is covered with 1½-in. halfround molding. This also is used for the guard rail at the aft end of the hull, Fig. 41. The hatch cover for the chain locker should be a snug fit. It is planked with ½ by 3-in. mahogany over 1/4-in. plywood, which is rabbeted into the

top edges of the cover frame.

Before painting the exterior, mark the L.W.L. on the hull and fill the planking seams above this line with a fresh or saltwater seam sealer. Give the hull three or four coats of flat-white marine paint above the L.W.L., sanding the hull by hand after each coat. Then apply a mixture of flat and glossy white paint and follow with a coat of glossy white. The decks, cabin sides and windshield frames are sanded, and a mahogany-colored wood filler or a stain is applied, after which three coats of marine varnish are applied, sanding the first two coats. The seams between the deck planks are filled with a white seam sealer before varnishing.

All exterior hardware is installed next. The fore and aft mooring bits must be bolted securely in position to withstand considerable strain. Plate glass for the windshields and cabin windows is held in place with lead beading, as in Figs. 31 and 41. Mahogany on the interior of "Sea Craft's" cabin was stained and varnished and the plywood painted white, as in Fig. 44 of Part 4. The boat must be provided with a fire extinguisher which should be mounted on the cabin side wall above the chart cabinet. Before launching the boat give the bottom of the hull another coat of copper bottom paint and launch while the paint is wet.

A boat of this size must carry registration numbers. Application for a certificate of award of number can be made by the boat owner to the District Coast Guard Officer having jurisdiction over the area in which the owner resides.

In addition to a set of seven workingsize blueprints, full-size paper patterns for the hull frames and keel are also available.

the top edge of the cabin sides, Fig. 48. For the cabin roof, two pieces of %-in. plywood 4 by 12 ft. are needed. These are joined at the center, notched to clear the windshield supports and come flush with the bulkhead covering, and are trimmed slightly oversize along the cabin sides. When screwing the roof to the center strip and cabin-top beams, start at the center and work outward. Saw off the forward end of the plywood flush with the front edge of the first cabin-top beam and plane the sides to a well-rounded corner to blend into the filler blocks. The front of the cabin top is shaped from a timber, as in Fig. 45. The entire top is coated with canvas cement and one piece of canvas stretched tightly and tacked along the sides just below the seam between the filler blocks and cabin sides. The forward edge of the canvas is tacked under the front edge of the shaped timber and the aft edge is tacked to the bulkhead. The canvas then is given several coats of thinned paint. Half-round mahogany molding covers the tacked edges of the canvas along the cabin sides and bulkhead. The cockpit windshield is completed, as in sections F-F and E-E of Fig. 41, Part 4. The mast, also detailed in Fig. 41, supports a white light. Section D-D of Fig. 41 gives the dimensions of handrails fitted to the cabin top.

The cabin windshield, Fig. 45, fits into a rabbet cut in three pieces of 1½-in. stock, two of which are screwed to the forward edges of the cabin sides, section C-C of Fig. 41, and one placed horizontally across the forward deck. Widths of these pieces are not given as they will vary somewhat with each boat. Note in Fig. 47 that the rabbet on the athwartship piece is cut at an angle to fit a 36-deg. bevel on the lower edge of the windshield. Toe rails extending from the breast hook at the bow to

Radios in Your Hair


R ADIO receivers, tinier than a penny matchbox have been developed by Paramount sound men in Hollywood. These replace the megaphones that directors used in the days of silent pictures to shout instructions to their stars. The resulting confusion on crowded sets was nerve racking to both the director and members of the cast. When sound was added, the megaphone had to go. It was then replaced by intricate signaling systems and many necessary interruptions and expensive retakes. Now this tiny inductivetype receiver, that uses no batteries or tubes, is concealed on the actor's person. It is claimed that it can pick up signals as far as 300 feet away from the transmitter which is placed near the movie studio stage.

In photo A, Director Mitchell Leisen shows the studio hairdresser how to work the antenna into Andrea King's hairdo. The antenna wire is not long and is easily hidden in the hair; a flesh-colored plastic tube carries messages to the ear. The receiver, which is smaller than any hearing aid, has to be set on frequency before it is used. Its tiny size is clearly illustrated in the engineer's hand shown in photo B. Worn suspended from a neck ribbon it is easily concealed. John Beal carries his in his coat pocket, and the antenna is wound around his waist. The earplug lead comes up his neck behind his ear and tape holds it in place. Although flesh-colored plastic is used for the tubing, make-up is applied to

Either music or words of direction may be broadcast to the actors, but the sounds are inaudible to those not equipped with the tiny receivers. There are no trailing wires and the members of the cast are free to move about anywhere within the range of the transmitter, which is out of camera range. Engineer Robert Carr, in the studio sound department, operates the 150-watt transmitter located just off stage as shown in photo C. He monitors the signal and works in close cooperation with the stage director.

It is quite possible that this specialized 2-way communication system will find other useful applications; a similar system might be useful for the legitimate stage, especially for magicians.









BEGINNER'S ONE-TUBE






There is no tuning coil to wind and the usual variable tuning condenser is not required. Tuning is provided for with an inexpensive adjustable commercial tuning unit available from all radio parts houses for about 60 cents. This I.C.A. 3-in-1 radio tuner consists of a simple solenoid single-layer-wound coil with an adjustable slider for tuning. The terminal clips at each end of the tuner are common with the mounting brackets. For ease of construction the receiver is assembled on a 3/16 by 9 by 11½-in. hard-pressed-wood base, supported by

34 by 134 by 9-in. wooden cleats at each end. One cleat serves for mounting the front panel, which consists of a 3/16 by 71/4 by 9-in. piece of hard-pressed wood. Three wood screws are used to fasten the panel to the wood cleat in the final assembly. This panel also acts as an efficient baffle for the 5-in. PM loudspeaker; the on-off line switch is also mounted on this front panel. The speaker grille merely consists of 5 holes, 1%6 in. in diameter, arranged as shown in photo A, and backed with a piece of grille cloth.


Except for the speaker-matching transformer, tuning coil and the crystal detector, all of the other parts such as the various resistors and fixed condensers are underneath the base, as shown in photo B and pictorial wiring diagram Fig. 2. The schematic circuit diagram appears in Fig. 1. To mount the tube socket in the center of the base, it is necessary to cut a hole 1½ in. in diameter. Place the socket so that


the center key is in the position shown in Fig. 2; short 6-32 machine screws hold the mounting plate at each end. In this position, as viewed from the bottom, the socket terminals are numbered clockwise from 1 to 8.

When soldering the crystal detector on the 2-lug terminal strip mounted on the top of the base, be sure that the positive end goes to terminal 4 on the tube socket as indicated in Fig. 1. Apply the soldering iron only to the wire leads, and take care that the crystal itself is not overheated. Do not attempt to use a metal base for this set; the hardpressed wood provides good insulation, and is easy to cut and drill. Make all connections just as shown in Fig. 2; use rosincore wire solder and be sure that all soldered



2000 degrees Fahrenheit — an increase of several hundred degrees over previously attainable temperatures. A series of 20 tungsten-wire "hairpins," through which electric current passes to produce tremendous heat, is the heart of the furnace.

Still another piece of the giant jigsaw puzzle is being fitted in place with the aid of radioactive, "tagged" atoms, like those being used to track down and treat diseases of the human body. Here the problem is to find out how and why carbon, phosphorus and other elements affect the properties and behavior of metals.

James K. Stanley is tackling this problem by administering tiny "doses" of the tagged atoms and then tracing their path through the metal by means of sensitive recorders and counters. Only a pinch of the radioactive material is required to follow it through as much as a ton of molten steel. The electrons and rays thrown off by the "exploding" atoms are ticked off by the famed Geiger counter, while the position of the tagged atom can be determined by periodic exposure to a photographic plate which fogs up when bombarded with atomic particles.


The case of the "wandering" carbon atoms is another major project.

"Under the effect of heat, carbon atoms are always meandering about in the internal structure of metals," says Stanley. "Even at room temperature, the carbon atoms in the steel beams of a building, for example, are constantly taking up new positions, resulting in what metallurgists call 'aging' of steel, and bringing about a slight strengthening of the metal. The position of such atoms also determines the hardness and wearability of the metal, as well as brittleness. If we can follow the path of the atoms as they move through the metal and take up definite positions, we may eventually arrive at methods of spotting the carbon in the most advantageous places."

For this purpose, the scientists use radioactive carbon 14, which has a half life of 5000 years and hence can be stockpiled.

In another laboratory, scientists are "looking inside" metals in quite a different way. A plastic model of some piece of industrial equipment—a crane hook, for example—is loaded with heavy weights, and heated to somewhere around the boiling point of water. Then with the weights still attached, the model is cooled gradually down to room temperature. Next the scientist examines the plastic hook under





connections are neat and well made. No. 20 flexible insulated hookup wire is used for the circuit connections. It is necessary that the negative ends of the electrolytic filter condensers C2 and C3 be connected to common floating ground on the tie-point lug, as shown in Fig. 2. Mount the speaker-output transformer so that the primary leads face the tube socket, and drill two small holes for the leads that pass down through the base. The secondary leads connect directly to the voice-coil terminals on the speaker. A universal output transformer may be substituted, if desired.

Like any extremely simple receiver, this one has its limitations. Therefore, for maximum results a good antenna is absolutely necessary. If there is only one station in your locality, make this antenna as long and as high as you possibly can. If there are a number of stations in the area, you will have to compromise, since a long antenna will make the stations overlap on the tuning range. If the stations cannot be separated by adjusting the position of the slider on the tuning coil, shorten your antenna gradually until you can tune out the undesired station. No external ground is required on this set, and none should be used. Do not expect loud volume on distant stations as this receiver will only amplify the signals that can be picked up by the crystal detector, and these are usually limited to strong local broadcasting stations. With a good antenna, the results are highly satisfactory. The chassis base is intentionally large and provides room for experimenting with other circuits in which practically all of the same parts can be used. filled with motorcycle action pictures and stories; also literature on late models. special polarized light. What he sees is a series of brightly colored lines—red, yellow, green in a definite progression—literally "frozen" into the plastic material.

This is called the photoelastic method for studying how metals react to various loads. To the scientist's skilled eye, every line in the brightly colored pattern tells a story: how great the stresses are, where the greatest concentration of stresses occurs, and in what direction they are.

In the quest for new metals there are many other prospectors: researchers who make elaborate, painstaking analyses of the "creep" or plastic flow in metals, those who are probing the grain size and structure of metals to find out what secrets can be yielded here, and those who try countless combinations in the hope of developing new alloys for particular applications.

Although they work independently—each intent on his own area of conquest—their efforts are solidified on one broad frontal attack with a common objective: the creation of new alloys and metals to further man's progress.


Expert glass molders manipulate the glass at this stage. The rough pieces are first heated gradually in a preheating furnace to a temperature just below the softening point. Each piece is then picked up on the end of a steel pontil rod or punty as it is commonly called. The molder thrusts the hot glass fragment into a molding furnace and spins it until it is just fluid enough to start dropping off. He then quickly withdraws the punty from the furnace and, holding the soft glass over a heated steel mold, cuts off the right size piece with a pair of shears.

The hot syrupy glass drops into the mold and is pressed into shape. The molds are left to cool. When cool enough to be handled, the blanks are taken from the molds and inspected by immersion in a liquid having the same index of refraction as the glass.

The method gives an X-ray picture of the glass. In the liquid the glass surfaces of the blank disappear and any imperfection beneath the surface of the glass shows up clearly when illuminated.

As the glass had solidified in the molds, internal strains were created which seriously affect its physical and optical properties. One of the most critical processes in the manufacture of optical glass, annealing, is used to remove these strains. The blanks





Puttying Window Sash

Q—I reputtied most of the window sash in my home a year ago. The putty was allowed to dry two weeks before the sash were painted. Now the putty seems to be loose and on some of the windows, sections of it have fallen out. What is the cause of this and what is the remedy, if any?

H.M.—Lincoln, Neb.

A—It is essential that the wood be thoroughly dry before new putty is applied, and it also is necessary to paint the exposed wood in the rabbet with a light priming coat before the putty is applied. The procedure steps are: Remove all cracked and loose putty and clean the fine material out of the rabbet with a wire brush. Then apply a priming coat of paint in the rebbet using the same priming coat of paint in the rabbet, using the same color primer as will be used for the finishing coats. Apply putty after the paint is dry. After the putty has hardened, paint the sash in the regular way.

Water Creeps Under Front Door

Q—During driving rainstorms water comes under my front door, which is directly exposed, there being no hood or porch. Due to the location of the door, I cannot install a hood without some altera-tion of the exterior. Is there any other remedy for

G.F.-Birmingham, Ala.

A—There are several remedies, of course, but usually the simplest is to rehang the door, although in some instances it is easier to install a new threshold. In either case the idea is to relocate the door or the threshold so that the outer edge of the door bottom overhangs the top edge of the threshold bevel about \\\^4\) to \\\^3\\\^6\ in. In rehanging the door, simply move the hinges, stops and striker plate out \\\^4\) to \\\^3\\\^6\ in. This usually can be done without damaging the frame in any way. The alternative is fitting a new threshold so that the outer bottom edge of the door overhangs it as described. When the door or threshold are installed in this way, water drips from the lower outside edge of the door directly onto the sloping bevel of the threshold and is carried away.

Repairing Cracks in Stonework

Q—How can I fill narrow cracks in the stone-work across the front of my house? The stone is a reddish-brown color. W. S.—Oklahoma City, Okla.

A—If cracks follow the mortar joints the wall should be pointed up in the usual way, but to fill small cracks in the stone, mix equal parts of red lead and litharge, and add glycerine to make a thick paste. Then apply to the cracks with a stiff-bristled brush or with a putty knife.





Installing Cleanout in Chimney

Q-My chimney has no cleanout door at the bottom. Soot has filled the flue up to the furnace-pipe opening, and it seems impossible to get it out by any means I know of. The chimney is lined with tile. How can I break an opening through this tile to install a cleanout door, and is there any substitute for a cleanout door? I have found it impossible to obtain one thus far. it impossible to obtain one thus far.

E. R.—Lynn, Mass.

A—In many cases the tile lining does not extend to the bottom of a single-flue chimney, especially where the tile is square or rectangular in section. It is easy, therefore, to break an opening in the brick with a bricklayer's chisel or an ordinary cold chisel. Make the opening large enough so that the cleanout door can be set in mortar. Where the tile lining extends to the bottom, break through the bricks and chip the opening to the proper size. Then score the tile deeply with a cold chisel, and it will be possible to break through it without shattering. A discarded check damper of cast-iron construction makes a good cleanout door. construction makes a good cleanout door.

Removing Ink Stains From Fabric

Q-Recently I spilled writing ink on an article of clothing. Can you tell me what will remove the ink stains without damaging the fabric?

J. G. R.—Monterrey, N. L., Mexico

A—To remove ordinary ink stains from fabric, first soak the material in lukewarm water. Next squeeze or wring very lightly and spread over a clean, dry cloth. Apply a few drops of concentrated liquid ammonia, specific gravity 0.891, to the ink stain. Then saturate a tuft of absorbent cotton with dilute phosphoric acid and apply repeatedly to the ink spot. Press firmly but do not rub. Finally, rinse the fabric in clean, warm water and dry in the sun.

Reseeding Old Lawn

Q—My lawn is patchy and infested with weeds, and on several spots moss appears to be crowding out what little grass there is. The soil is very hard—seems to be mostly clay—and grass seed does not germinate and take root except in a few scattered places. I do not want to go to the expense of reworking, tilling and reseeding the entire lawn. Is there any other method by which I can improve it, get rid of the weeds, etc?

A—Unless you rebuild the sod completely you cannot expect to attain a perfect lawn, but there is much you can do to improve what you have. First, allow the grass to grow to a height of 3 or 4 in., and clip any tall-growing weeds with a small scythe or weed hook. Then apply a complete lawn fertilizer which is combined with a weed killer. This should be applied with a wheeled spreader so that you get uniform distribution. Several applications may be necessary during one season to kill the weeds and stimulate growth of the grass. As the weeds are killed out, there will be bare spots. Loosen the soil lightly in these spots with a spading Loosen the soil lightly in these spots with a spading fork and then spread rich black soil over the whole lawn, raking it to a uniform depth of about 1½ to 2 in. so the blades of grass will be exposed to the sunlight. Next, apply grass seed and fertilizer, mixed half and half, with the spreader. Finally, when the top ½ in. of soil is dry, roll the entire lawn. Do not rake it, as this tends to bunch the grass seed. By repeating this process of applying seed and fertilizer over a period of several seasons, your lawn will be greatly improved.

Removing Dark Stains From Red Linoleum

Q—The cabinet tops in my kitchen are red lino-leum and lately several dark-colored stains in the form of rings have appeared on the top of one cabinet. How can I remove these stains? Mrs. J. M.—Boise, Idaho.

-Go over the stains lightly with fine steel wool, working carefully so that the wool does not bunch and scratch the surface. Then wash with mild soap and water and wipe dry. Saturate a cloth with furniture polish and rub, first with the saturated cloth, then wipe with a dry, clean cloth. Finally, apply several coats of paste wax, polishing each coat to a high gloss.



are packed in metal cases and heated at carefully controlled temperatures in electric furnaces. They are then slowly cooled so that neither strains nor refractive inequalities develop.

Removed from the furnace, the blanks are again inspected in the immersion tank. After grinding and polishing, the optical element is ready for installation in binoculars, microscopes or other instrument. The grinding and polishing is done on ordinary abrasive wheels and buffing machines.

A peak production of 236,000 pounds was reached in 1943 by the Bureau of Standards. By the summer of 1944, there was a drop in production as requirements of the armed services were beginning to be met by commercial plants. Today, the Bureau is producing special types of glass and advancing optical-glass research.

the rope manufactured in the United States is used for general marine purposes. Another third goes to industry and agriculture. The remaining third is used for making wire-rope centers, for commercial fishing, oil-well drilling and miscellaneous purposes.

In addition to rope, agriculture, industry and commerce consume huge amounts of wrapping and baler twine. An official of the U. S. Department of Agriculture says:

"If no harvesting machines were made for a year, farmers would be inconvenienced... but they'd get along. However, if the supply of twine for a single harvest were suddenly cut off, it would mean not only a national but an international calamity. It would be impossible to get enough help to gather the crops."

The Plymouth Cordage Company, one of America's oldest and largest rope-makers, recommends 15 rules for the proper care of rope.

Remove from coils properly. When taking the usual right-laid rope from the coil, make sure it unwinds in a direction opposite to clockwise. Lay coil flat on the floor with the inside end at the bottom. Pull end of rope through the center of coil.

Store properly. A dry, unheated building, or a room with free air circulation is the best place to store rope.



Dry after wetting. A wet rope never should be stored—make sure it is thoroughly dry before putting away.

Keep it clean. If your rope gets dirty, wash with clean water and dry thoroughly

before storing.

Protect from chemicals. Keep rope away from storage batteries, paint, linseed oil,

manure and fertilizer.

Avoid kinks. If usage involves continual twisting in one direction, throw more turns into or out of the rope to avoid damage to rope structure.

Don't overload. With first-quality rope, it is safe to load up to one fifth the guaranteed minimum breaking strength.

Slack off guys. When ropes are used as guy lines, and other supports exposed to weather, they should be slacked off to prevent overstrain due to shortening from wetting.

Avoid sharp angles or bends. A sharp bend reduces tensile strength by putting

extra strain on the outer fibers.

Sheave right. You put unnecessary strain and friction load on a rope with sheaves that are too small.

Reverse ends. When using rope as tackle, reverse the ends periodically. If a rope is damaged, cut and splice.

Don't lubricate. A well-made rope is already lubricated by the manufacturer and no additional lubrication is necessary.

Avoid unnecessary wear and abrasion. Surface wear may come from allowing one rope to chafe another.

Splice correctly. Splices are better and stronger than knots, which reduce the strength of the rope up to 50 percent.


Avoid sudden jerks or strains. A common piece of twine may be difficult to break with a steady pull—yet it can be broken easily with a sharp snap. The same is true of ropes.





the anti-knock qualities of gasoline than at present, is certain to result also in improved economy. The improvement, therefore, does not depend solely upon increases in the octane numbers of the gasolines.

Too, the policies already existing in automotive design and in the marketing of motor fuel can provide the 20 percent premium gasoline sufficiently high in antiknock quality to meet the requirements of proposed high-efficiency auto engines.

Development of dual-fuel systems for automobiles underscores the fact that although significant increases in the octane number of motor fuels may be several years off, it should not impede the progress that the automotive industry can make in designing and producing engines and cars with improved performance and economy.

Currently, the Socony-Vacuum Oil Company, Inc., is cooperating with a major manufacturer of carburetors to develop a commercially practical unit for new automobiles which would utilize premiumgrade gasoline only under the conditions when this special fuel is needed. Other carburetor manufacturers are interested in the subject also. Hence the day of important announcements in this respect might not be far off.


The eventual commercial product, it is hoped, will reconcile the differences in octane-number requirements observed in the Paulsboro tests at various throttle openings (manifold vacuums). In order to study this relationship, several cars were operated on various octane-number fuels in city traffic, level open road and over mountainous terrain to determine the percentage of time during which knock-free operation was obtained.

In the test car alone, fuel of 70-octane number gave knock-free performance for 95 percent of the driving time. This demonstrates the waste of anti-knock quality because normally in similar cars an 80-octane-number fuel is used 100 percent of the time solely to satisfy the peak requirement.

In contrast to passenger vehicles, trucks and busses operate a greater proportion of the time under more nearly full-throttle conditions. Consequently they utilize octane ratings of their fuel more efficiently; but in general, commercial vehicles do not have as high maximum anti-knock quality requirements.

The potential importance of dual-fuel systems in automobiles also shows that distribution and marketing of a third grade



of gasoline—a "super-premium" gasoline—is not feasible. Not only is the required capital investment excessive, but the materials required for the installation of additional pumps, lines and tankage at the refineries, bulk terminals and service stations would have to be drawn from the same limited stocks now being used for the expansion of crude-oil production and refining facilities.

Whether the industry will be in a position to continue an upward trend in antiknock quality indefinitely is a serious question and will continue to be so for years. Such improvements cannot be obtained simply by turning valves and readjusting operating conditions on equipment currently in use. All of it is now being operated at maximum capacity to meet quantity demands. Refining facilities must be built to meet these increasing quantity requirements before emphasis can be placed upon construction for quality.

Certainly improvements in performance and economy in automobile engines through increases in compression ratios is highly desirable—up to the point where such engines will require fuels with higher octane ratings. This obstacle diminishes in importance if cars can utilize currently available octane ratings to their fullest. Dual-fuel systems to accomplish this are appropriate and appear justified so far on the basis of Socony-Vacuum's development efforts.



town through wise traffic enforcement. Some of the knowledge crammed into the officer's head may save home-town taxpayers some money when he returns to his job. For example, selective enforcement is emphasized throughout the course. Instructors explain this technique by pointing out that accidents occur according to definite patterns. Cars may frequently smash up on a particular corner between 5:00 and 6:00 p.m. Another area may be a hazard between 7:00 and 8:00 a.m. These areas need special attention from the traffic police at particular times, but they are as safe as other areas the rest of the day. By making a master pattern of such accidents for an entire town, city or county, and enforcing the danger areas "selectively," the head of the traffic police may, in some cases, reduce his force without any cut in its efficiency.

Modern training aids help the student cops solve traffic problems. One classroom

has a magnetic blackboard which attracts and holds small models of cars, so that the instructor quickly can set up a visual problem in enforcement. The officers get an overview of everything that's new in enforcement through demonstrations of wire recorders for taking statements of witnesses, speed tests in relation to stopping distances, walkie-talkies for emergency use, and the latest developments in engineering equipment.

The 4½-month course is not the only service of the institute and the IACP. They also offer a basic course in enforcement lasting only three weeks, sponsor regional courses in other parts of the country, courses for judges and prosecutors of traffic courts and a course for supervisors of large fleets of vehicles. In addition, the institute publishes information on enforcement, maintains a library of films dealing with traffic and backs up its graduates with an extension service. Extension men go into the officer's home town and help him apply what he has learned at the institute.

Hundreds of photos are submitted to the institute each year during the contest for police photographs. These pictures are snapped by officers on active duty. In last year's contest one photo showed a lipstick print on a car compared to the lipstick prints of a hit-and-run victim, resulting in a prison term for the driver.

Facilities aren't available for training the number of officers who are eager to attend the course. One young man was so enthusiastic about the institute after a visit that he immediately applied for enrollment. Unfortunately, he was not an officer and had never been on any police force, so his application was rejected. A few days later he telephoned from his home town—population a few hundred that he had persuaded the village fathers to appoint him Chief of Detectives. Kreml accepted him as a student on the theory that anyone with that much ingenuity could serve well in unsnarling some of the present traffic problems.





five inches in diameter, or the size of the

original screen.

Two laboratory tools brought this device over the hump from theory to practice. The first is a small pilot tube, three inches long by two inches in diameter, which proved that the fluorescent image could be intensified by the use of electrons as already described. It achieved a five-fold increase in brightness. A second tube, which more closely resembles the still unbuilt production model, proved that a 500-fold increase could be attained by electron acceleration and compression.

The advantages of this brighter image are manifold. It will largely eliminate the need for the doctor to remain in darkness for long periods or to wear red glasses in normal light in order to increase the light-sensitiveness of his eyes. A minute or two in darkness will enable him to see far greater detail and in a much shorter period than ever before.

Since examination and diagnosis will be possible in a much shorter time than here-tofore, it will be possible for more persons to have fluoroscopic examination. Details, which are nothing more than shadows contrasted against the brightness of the background, will be visible to an extent hitherto undreamed of.

Shortening of the examination period is also important to both doctor and patient for another reason: X-rays in too heavy or too lengthy doses can be harmful to the human body. A patient who must have thorough fluoroscopic examinations at frequent intervals may be running a risk and the physician who exposes himself to X-radiations for many hours a week may suffer unpleasant consequences.

This is a situation which is not emphasized by persons engaged in working with X-ray or manufacturing such equipment, but occasional hints in the direction of caution are encountered. The producer of a new fluoroscopic screen claims 40 percent greater brilliance, but he does not suggest that the doctor use this increased brightness to enable him to see more. No, the screen manufacturer suggests that power can be reduced with no deterioration of the image.

It is believed that, where extraordinary circumstances demand it, the fluoroscopic image can be transmitted by television from city to city, permitting eye-witness consultation by two or more specialists in widely separated points.

The device could also be applied directly to the television transmission and reception techniques, but not where you might first suspect. While it would be possible to use the kinescope screen in place of the larger screen in Coltman's tube and obtain a smaller and much more brilliant image. this would be undesirable in some cases and more easily achieved by other methods in other cases.

Brilliant images can now be obtained on kinescope or receiver tubes by reducing the size of the tube head, but it is possible that the image intensifier might prove useful on the transmission end. Where scenes of low brightness were to be telecast, the light rays of the scene itself could be brought directly to the photoelectric surface, which would accelerate the electrons and permit the orthicon or other television camera to pick up a greatly brightened image for transmission.

What Coltman has done is to make up for certain inherent deficiencies in the human eye, which has been the weak member of the team in the use of fluoroscopy up to now. The most carefully "light conditioned" eye sees a dim image on the screen because of its low sensitivity to light. The same amount of light striking a negative in radiography for even a short period of time produces a vastly superior image owing to the cumulative effect of the exposure.

The contrast sensitivity of the eye—its ability to distinguish between closely spaced objects - cannot be increased, but by raising the level of brightness of the background the contrast of the shadows is increased and they can be much more

readily distinguished.

Chief problems which were encountered by Coltman were in selecting fluorescent and photoelectric coating materials which would work together as a team. In most cases the latter "attacks" the phosphors in the former, resulting in an unstable and quite useless combination. The finding of a harmonious combination was the major factor in perfecting this development which has the laboratory name of "image intensifier."

Fortunately, the intensifier will in no way make obsolete current fluoroscopic equipment, which can use it simply by substituting the new tube assembly in place of the screen now used.

No production date has been set by Westinghouse, but a good guess places early 1950 as the date when it may be in the hands of the medical profession.





Baits for Bass

wobbling, crawling, erratic, diving or darting motion, which at first attracts the pugnacious bass. Each plug has its special characteristics of motion, but the angler's skill in retrieving, in pausing and changing speed is of equal necessity. Next in importance comes the hooks. The gangs will hook a fish easier, but are more easily thrown out during that high, head-shaking leap for which the bass is famous.

Many plugs so fitted will be lost on hidden obstructions. Also, this type does not usually cast as easily as the more slender, single-hook lure. The large single hook, with its long, keen point bites deep and is not easily dislodged. It is usually protected by a weedless device, which saves much tackle and also the angler's temper. This type lure, being heavy and slender, casts very easily and accurately.


Color of plugs: No two anglers will agree here, for one day the bass will take a red-and-white affair, and disregard it the next for something entirely different—perhaps jet black. And it is certain that color is less important than the plug's action. But experience has shown that certain color combinations have been most productive for a great many anglers. Thus, we might place red and white first; next, perhaps a yellow or yellow and brown "perch-scale." It looks like a large minnow. Then, sometimes black and white works well, as does a combination of red and yellow.

And, regardless of how we try to concentrate upon a few "tried and proven" bass lures, there is always a chance that the bass will want something different. Each season scores of new and attractive lures come on the market—and we must try them. That is why the confirmed bass fisherman buys the largest tackle box he can find, and stocks it full of such a variety of beautiful, shiny new gadgets. And that is one reason he is a bass enthusiast.

But finally, with all his lures, the angler must be expert in their use. Casting practice for distance and accuracy, at home on the lawn or in a park pool, is essential. The slender little rod will send out that plug easily, granting a good level-wind reel, and the delicate, all-important thumbing of its spinning spool.

Spiral Tripod Fits in Pocket

Small enough to be carried in the pocket when collapsed, a spiral tripod extends to more than five feet and will support any camera. The legs are formed of spiral coils of stainless-steel strips. When the spiral



is pulled out to extend the legs, the lightweight tripod will not vibrate if accidentally tapped. The legs are locked open by a few turns of the tips. For table-top photography, it can be set up only $5\frac{1}{2}$ inches high. Steel spear points under the rubber tips can be used to prevent slipping.

Tinsel Downpour

There's no connection between holiday spirit and tons of tinsel dropped from planes on Panama's highest peaks. It is a timesaver for United States Air Force teams mapping the entire republic, much of which is covered by dense jungle. Ground observers have had to laboriously select and work their way to the highest points for geodetic information. Now, air observers use altimeters to determine the greatest elevations, then drop batches of aluminum foil to mark them. The metal's bright reflection is detectable for great distances against the green foliage. The foil is war-surplus material that was used to fool enemy radar warning systems. It comes in 300-foot-long strips 1/2 inch wide and in narrow two-inch strips. Tinsel dropping has also been proposed as a method of marking paths for ground parties to follow to planes downed in jungle country.







Zinc Tags Mark Garden Rows

Garden rows are marked with metal tags that stand out parallel with the ground for easy reading. The tags are made of zinc so they won't rust or corrode. The writing surface is covered with thousands of tiny holes that retain the marks of a grease pencil. The tags are locked to stakes with a saw-tooth strip that is inserted through a hole in the label.

Big-Game Animal Population Up 25 Percent in Three Years

Good news to the sportsman is the fact that big-game animals in the United States increased their numbers by 25 percent from 1943 to 1946, according to the Fish and Wildlife Service. There were an estimated 8,240,400 big-game animals in 1946 compared with 6,598,422 in 1943. Michigan had the largest big-game population with 880,600 animals, nearly all of them being deer. Wisconsin and Pennsylvania ranked second and third. Kansas is the only state with no big game, the report stated. Of the total big-game animals in the country, 7,375,200 or about 90 percent were deer. Others in numbers exceeding 100,000 were elk, prong-horned antelope, peccary and black bear. Rocky Mountain bighorn sheep showed the largest increase with a gain of 75 percent from 9152 in 1943 to 16,000 in 1946. The moose population went up from 14,803 to 23,300 while buffalo dropped from 6047 to 5000. The Fish and Wildlife Service estimates that 923,600 big-game animals were killed in 1946.

Trim Gage for Ships



Ship loading plans can be formulated quickly with the aid of a trim gage that automatically shows the fore and aft draft the ship will have under any distribution of weight. The gage is a profile of the vessel with slots representing each compartment. The total weight to be stored in each compartment is set on a scale in each slot. When the weight in all the compartments has been set, scales at the right and left give direct readings of the fore and aft draft of the ship. This information is vital in loading the ship in order to keep it in correct trim. The gage also will calculate the trim for a voyage with several ports of call by determining the effect of discharging cargo at each port.

Pliofilm Keeps Apples Fresh

Apples kept in cases lined with Pliofilm hold their color and ripeness as much as three months longer than those in ordinary storage, tests at Iowa State College indicate. Weight loss is one half to one fourth of normal and soft rot is particularly reduced in Washington and West Virginia Delicious and Iowa Jonathan types. The apples were kept at 36 degrees, with a relative humidity of 86 percent.

Australia Drops Huts by Air To Hunters Slaughtering Deer

Australia is going to drop prefabricated huts by air to aid deer hunters in isolated areas. It is part of a campaign to wipe out thousands of red deer which have become a menace to crops and the national forests. Nearly 18,000 were killed in 12 months by hunters, spurred by large government bounties. The huts are divided into fourfoot plywood panels for easy assembly and have a galvanized steel covering.







Medicine From Earth Mold?

Dug out of the earth, a new mold similar to streptomycin has given excellent results in laboratory tests in the treatment of typhus fever, Rocky Mountain spotted fever, scrub typhus and parrot fever. The mold, called chloromycetin, was discovered by Dr. Paul R. Burkholder of Yale University in soil from a field near Caracas, Venezuela. The mold has not yet been used in the treatment of patients, although tests with animals show no poisonous effects. The chemical has been administered both by mouth and hypodermic injection. Results in the treatment of parrot fever are significant because the disease is caused by a virus, and virus diseases from the common cold to infantile paralysis have shown little reaction to molds or other chemicals.

Steel Ball Spinning 1800 M.P.H. Tests Paint for High-Speed Planes

Adhesive quality of paint is tested by putting dabs of it on a tiny steel ball that spins 2,400,000 times a minute, or about 1800 miles an hour. The method was developed by the Navy and the University of Cincinnati to test paint for high-speed aircraft, where its thickness has to be limited to about .001 inch because of the weight factor. At high speeds the thin coating tends to come off, causing dangerous disruption of the airflow. The ball is suspended in a vacuum in a centrifuge and subjected to a rotating magnetic field. After a small dab of paint is put on the ball, its speed is increased until centrifugal force is great enough to make the paint fly off. Both the ball's speed and the weight and area of the paint dot are then used to compute the adhesive qualities. The spinning is so swift and friction-free that the ball will continue to rotate for a week after the power is cut off.







Pointers on exterior painting



Before painting, prepare surfaces. Scraping with a wire brush or smoothing with $1\frac{1}{2}$ or 2 grade sandpaper will do if paint has worn evenly. A trisodium phosphate solution will clean old paint stained by mildew, rust or water.



In painting new exterior lumber, brush over all knots and sappy places with turpentine or solvent naphtha. Coat with shellac and let dry. Apply priming coat, fill cracks, then apply finish coat.



Brushes should be cleaned with the proper thinner. For oil base finishes (paint, enamel and varnish), use turpentine, then naphtha or mineral spirits. Alcohol for shellac or alcohol stain, lacquer thinner for lacquers, water for water-thinned paint. After cleaning, dry and suspend by the handle.




