



## Do We Need Synthetic Oil Now?

By Dr. Gustav Egloff

OIL, THAT MAGIC LIQUID that does everything from lubricating tiny watches to firing massive boilers, is in the nation's headlines almost every day. Forecasts of imminent exhaustion of our oil fields frighten every user from the motorist to the railroad president.

What is the story on our oil supply as it is described today by experts in the field? Are we facing an oil shortage? Should we build gigantic plants for converting our



These questions are not just academic. They are important to the entire economy of this oil-dependent nation.

Experts in the oil industry are accustomed to cries of shortage. Ever since the first gusher began to slacken its flow, predictions of an oil drought have been in the news. These oilmen are the people who are most directly concerned about our oil because it means dollars and cents to them—billions of dollars, in fact. Their huge investment (20 billion dollars) in wells, refineries, pipe lines, tankers and other


equipment depends upon the flow of oil from the ground. If that flow stops, their investment becomes almost worthless. Strangely enough, they're not worried!

Oilmen admit that eventually we'll run out of oil. But, they say, eventually is a long way off. They are also agreed that we will probably turn to synthetic oil on a giant scale some day, but, they claim, we shouldn't jump overboard right now. There is still a lot to be learned about the complicated processes involved in economically converting coal to oil. For this reason, they believe we should continue

our research in the field. Small pilot plants should be built and operated. In these test plants the kinks can be ironed out of the complex processes so that, when we do need them, we can build and operate commercial plants efficiently. But that doesn't mean we should expect to convert to oil made from coal or shale tomorrow.

What are our present oil reserves? Definite statements about the actual number of barrels of oil in the earth are impossible to make. Just as you can't state how many trees there are in a forest until you have seen the forest, you can't guess how many

Graph shows that U. S. oil discoveries have greatly exceeded production except during depressions and war




barrels of oil there are under the earth's surface until you've drilled.

However, there are facts to prove that we are not facing an immediate oil shortage. Only in years of serious depression, such as 1931-34, has there been more oil consumed in this country than there were new discoveries. Even when oil exploration was reduced because of steel shortages during the war, annual discoveries of new reserves were much greater than actual consumption in every year but one. In 1947, when oil consumption reached a new peak, we discovered 1.8 billion barrels of petroleum oils more than we actually used. At the end of that year our proved reserves were about 26 billion barrels or over twice as large as they were in 1928 and four times as large as in 1918.


Of course, there were spot oil shortages in various sections of the country last year, but these were not due to a lack of reserves. They were the result of unusually cold weather and inadequate transportation facilities. Even if we had a full-grown synthetic-oil industry we would still have had the transportation bottleneck and the resultant shortages.

To make the oil-reserves picture even more encouraging, there are billions of

barrels of oil in the ground that can be extracted by methods other than pumping. Oilmen call such processes secondary-recovery methods. One of the biggest challenges to the oil industry is not that of finding more gushers, but the development of methods which will remove a higher percentage of oil from the ground. With the present estimate of 80 percent left underground in parts of Pennsylvania where the oil is of top quality, this challenge is a tempting one. Oil, real petro-


Another underwater drilling project is in Venezuela at Lake Maracaibo where vast oil field is under 100 feet of water. Workers weld foundation for derrick


leum, not synthetic, can be extracted from the great quantities of oil sand still available in the areas of "exhausted" wells when necessary. Normally, an oil well is abandoned when the pumps can no longer remove oil from the ground at a rate that will show a profit. These wells "run out" not because the oil is exhausted, but because the water or gas pressure at the base of the well has dropped so low as to be incapable of driving the oil from the sand. Oil companies are using compressed air, water, gas and chemical solutions to increase the yield, but even with these methods there is still a large percentage of oil left in the ground.


There are other methods of secondary oil recovery such as the horizontal drilling technique used by Leo Ranney in the Franklin, Pa., fields. With this process it is possible to drill horizontally into the oil sands for 3000 feet or more. Thus, instead of the vertical drilling alone, there is at the bottom of a conventional shaft a series of horizontal drilled holes radiating outward like spokes on a wheel to tap oil reserves sealed in by natural barriers.


In Australia, the Ranney process is now being used at the bottom of a shaft 1200 feet deep. Radiating outward from the base of this shaft, horizontal holes, each 4000 feet long, are drilled into oil-bearing glauconite sandstone. Perforated pipe, which lines the first 100 feet of these holes,

sand may have by-product value and if so its sale would cut the cost of the oil.

Oil obtained from this process is not a low-grade variety. Its quality depends upon the field since it is the same grade oil as was recovered initially by drilling. Because of this, the method could be used best in fields where higher-quality oil is found, such as those in Pennsylvania.

At the Wietzer fields near Hanover, Germany, this mining process has been in use for years.

Removing these oil-laden sands is especially important because usually more oil is left in the ground than is removed by drilling and pumping. In some areas the percentage of oil remaining in the sand is as high as 90 percent. Heavy viscous oils cling most firmly to sand particles and it is this type of petroleum deposit that can be best recovered by the mining method.


Another method of secondary oil recovery is that of draining the "exhausted" oil sands, a system being used at Pechelbronn, France. There, oil sands are drained by a series of pits and galleries very similar to those in a coal mine.

At Pechelbronn there are seven shafts currently in use and an eighth is being dug. Some of these shafts go as deep as 1200 feet into the earth. Latest reports show that the process was recovering 620 barrels of oil a day. This figure seems minute compared with our gigantic production, but the important factor is that this is oil that otherwise would have been left in the ground. If the process were used in this country, there would, no doubt, be a greater yield because our fields have much thicker layers of oil sand than those in the Pechelbronn area.

To drain the oil, a vertical shaft is sunk, and from this, horizontal shafts are dug just above the oil-sand seam. Pits are sunk in these galleries at regular intervals and extending down into the oil sand. Then by gravity flow the oil runs into the pits and pumps force it through pipes to the surface. Oil flow can be accelerated by forcing compressed air into the sand.

According to the Bureau of Mines report on the process, "after years of oilwell development and pumping have made

### Pack Gives Hot or Cold Treatments

You have your choice of heat or cold with a combination ice pack and hot-water bottle that is small enough to be carried in the coat pocket. A liquid, sealed in a flexible Vinylite-plastic bag, congeals to a semisolid state and becomes extremely cold when placed in a refrigerator. For heat treatments, the bag is placed in boiling water for a few minutes and it absorbs heat which it holds for a long period. It folds into a case only 4 by 8 inches in size.







### Rotary Hoe Thins Plants When Pushed Along Row


Thinning long rows of plants, a tedious job when done by hand, is a simple operation with a gardening implement that looks like a small cultivator. The offset blades of a rotary hoe, which is geared to the wheels, make 150 gaps each minute. The hoe blades dig under the soil and cut off the plants at regular intervals. These intervals can be adjusted by means of three interchangeable gears. Made in England, the machine is said to thin plants five times faster than an experienced worker.













With a slide in microscope just forward of lens, Hollis prepares to snap photo. Ground glass shows the field

SCIENCE continually searches by Clifford B. Hicks es for better ways to record its discoveries. One technique is to photograph a world too small for the human eye to see. V. P. Hollis of the University of Minnesota pries into that world with a microscope and a camera to make photographic about life

B. Hicks graphs that are works of art as well as tools of the scientists. Hollis is director of the university's photographic laboratory. Scientists and professors consider his photographs invaluable aids in teaching students the facts about life in a suboptical world.

This photo, showing cross section of louse feeding on a leaf, won Hollis a high award in science photography










Left, an untouched horsehair from the bow of a violin. Right, the same hair after resin has been applied.

Students in the university's science classes can learn the behavior of minute organisms through lectures, textbooks and drawings; they can catch a glimpse of this tiny world through a microscope; but they can have no accurate record for long-term study without an actual photograph that shows the specimen in detail.

In addition, scientists engaged in research have difficulty in comparing several specimens through microscopes. Photographs of the specimens are an ideal an-

swer to this problem.


Hollis provides those photographs through a process called photomicrography. This method is not merely the technique of taking extreme close-ups with a lens that will catch the subject in detail. Hollis has an expensive microscope connected directly to his camera. He substitutes a sheet of film for his own eye in looking through the microscope, and snaps a permanent record of the specimen mounted on the slide. He has developed his technique over a period of 17 years.

The technical name for Hollis' equipment is the Leitz UMA Photomicrographic Apparatus. The camera is mounted on tubular runners for horizontal movement. Attached to the lens is the microscope with a side telescope for locating the field. The light source, usually an arc lamp, is mounted at the opposite end of the optical bench, and the light passes through a heatabsorbing filter and stage controls before it strikes the specimen. The entire appara-

tus is floated on springs.

When scientists and professors at the university request Hollis to snap a permanent record of their work, he must first

have the specimen in condition to photograph. This is an art in itself. Scientists usually do this part of the job, slicing tiny cross sections of the organisms and mounting them on glass slides. In some cases, living specimens are mounted in water.

The photographer slips the slide into the microscope, turns on the arc lamp and then squints through the microscope's telescope to locate the tiny portion he wishes to photograph. When he has found his field he turns to the ground glass on his camera, where this field is enlarged many times. Then with a fine-focus adjustment he sharpens the image until it stands out boldly on the glass, and snaps the picture.

In cases where the subject must be mounted in water, the camera and microscope can be swung into a vertical position so the hollowed-out slide stands level.

One of Hollis' unusual photos is his cross section of a plant louse feeding on a leaf. This photo won him a second award in the First International Photography in Science Salon sponsored by the Smithsonian Institution. It is an extremely thin section of the louse, sliced while the insect was feeding on the leaf. In order to make the slide, the leaf and louse were immersed in





a fixative which "froze" them in their relative positions and killed the insect. The section then was cut about eight microns (in the neighborhood of 3/10,000 inch) thick, with the louse's beak still penetrating the leaf. This specimen was stained and mounted on a slide for the photo.

Hollis generally uses transmitted light which goes directly through the specimen to expose the film. However, on some photos, such as a beautiful design made by hollyhock pollen, he uses incident light, which falls on the subject without passing


through it.

The photographer is justly proud of his photograph of a wheat kernel plainly showing the thiamin it contains. A cross section of the kernel was mounted on a glass slide and a sharp beam of ultraviolet light cast on it. Light in this band excited the fluorescence of the thiamin, so that it stands out plainly in the finished photo.

Hollis uses exposures that vary from 1/100 second to 5 minutes, although most of his photos are made at 1/10 or 1/25 second. He can magnify a specimen up to 4200 diameters, but he seldom goes above 1500. Greater magnification increases size but not resolution so is of little value.

Starting with a crude setup he rigged by himself without special equipment, Hollis has developed a technique that has made his photomicrographs tools for research workers and valuable aids for students.

### Water Skis

Anyone can walk on water with six-foot shoes made of light plywood. Watertight compartments in the shoes keep the wearer afloat. Fins on the bottom bite into the water to give the "water walker" stability. Beginners use water-ski poles to keep their balance, but experienced users can move without assistance. The water shoes are similar to those developed in Venice, Italy, as reported in Popular Mechanics, April 1948.

### Nonstop Electric Clock

Even though the power fails, a new electric clock continues to record the time without losing a second. Attached to the clock is a spring-driven unit that takes over instantly if the electric supply is cut off. Most spring-driven nonelectric clocks will not start themselves if the balance wheel happens to stop on dead center. This

characteristic weakness of spring-driven timepieces has been overcome in the auxiliary unit of the combination clock by magnets which keep the wheel under peak tension while the electric unit is operating. If the electricity is cut off even for an instant, the balance wheel is released and the



main spindle continues to move. The clock will operate on spring power for at least 24 hours. It is designed for recording instruments and time switches where the stoppage of the clock would result in serious complications. An automatic signal gives ample warning when winding is necessary.



### **Two-Color Radar**

Two-color radar that enables operators to distinguish between their own and enemy planes has been developed for the U.S. Air Force. It is undergoing initial tests in a 300-foot, aluminum sheathed tower at Nutley, N. J. Natural echoes and those created by a "responder" in the aircraft register on the same screen as contrastingly colored blobs of light. They are optically combined and superimposed at a spot corresponding to the plane's position. It has previously been necessary to use separate antennas and screens for the two kinds of echoes. As an aid to detection and tracking, the radar's scanning rate has been speeded, with the antenna rotating completely every second instead of every 6 to 10 seconds.

### Cost-of-Living Meter

What happens to prices and the value of the dollar under varying conditions is shown with an "econometer" built at the New York University College of Engineering. It consists of a two-pointed arrow several feet long and balanced on a knife edge. Above the arms of the arrow are two flasks containing red and blue liquid on which petcocks may be opened to permit the liquid to fall into beakers suspended from the arms of the arrow. Petcocks at the bottom are used to draw off the liquid. On the left side a scale representing prices is marked in units from \$.67 to \$2.50. These prices are affected by the production rate, imports, exports and other factors. On the right side a scále is marked off from \$.50 to \$1.60 representing purchasing power measured by the real value of a dollar. The figure \$1.00 on the price side indicates the general price level of goods in 1940; 100 cents on the right scale represents the 1940 value of the dollar. As production increases (represented by red liquid dropping into the beaker) the left arrow goes down lowering prices and raising the value of the dollar on the opposite scale. As purchasing power (blue liquid) is added on the other side the value of the dollar goes down and prices go up. The econometer is constructed so that one cubic meter of liquid represents one billion dollars and today's situation of a 55-cent dollar and about \$1.90 prices is achieved by simply putting in and letting out appropriate quantities of the liquid.

### Plastic "Magnets" Are Cheaper and Lighter Than Metal Type

"Magnets" made of plastic instead of metal have been developed and show all the characteristics of permanent metal magnets. The pieces of plastic are not really magnets because their atomic structure must be changed before they will exhibit magnetic properties, so they have been named electrets. They are made by liquefying plastics of either the thermosetting or thermoplastic types and then exposing them to a strong electric field. The bonding forces that hold the atoms to-


gether are realigned in the process, and when the plastic hardens it has a positive and negative pole. The electrets are less expensive to make than cobalt-steel magnets. Being lightweight and extremely sensitive, they may be used in loudspeakers, microphones, vacuum tubes and electrical instruments.







ONE SUNDAY afternoon just 22 years ago visitors at the St. Louis Zoo witnessed a history-making event. None of them guessed it. In fact, some laughed. Even George P. Vierheller, the zoo director, would not have prophesied that here was the beginning of something that would bring the zoo world-wide renown.

All the visitors saw that Sunday in 1926 was an orangutan that rode a bike and drank water out of a bottle. The crowd of 40 or 50 was amused.

"It's a good little stunt," a friend told Mr. Vierheller, "but I doubt if it will put Ringling Brothers' circus out of business."


This summer nearly a million persons are beating a path to the three-ring circus at the St. Louis Zoo. One Hollywood movie director argued for an hour on the long-distance telephone in a futile attempt to get

one of the acts for a big production scene. But the show, like the zoo itself, belongs to the taxpayers of St. Louis. The zoo circus is not for sale and not a penny is charged for admission. That is only one of the amazing things about the animal acts which experts have acclaimed as three of the best in the world.

One of the acts consists of 13 lions, two tigers and two European brown bears. They perform in a huge iron cage before a permanent amphitheater seating a couple of thousand guests. The monkey act is made up of 10 chimpanzees, seven Shetland ponies and one Sicilian donkey. This show is presented on an attractive moated stage in an outdoor theater seating about 3000. The third act is composed of five Asiatic elephants. Each show lasts about half an hour and is presented twice on week days and three times on Sundays, when frequently a crowd of 30,000 attends.

Let's go to the show. Trumpets blare from loudspeakers as Jules Jacot, veteran lion trainer, steps forth. He addresses the crowd:

"Ladies and gentlemen, here at the wildanimal show we present a grand spectacle entitled 'The Crowning of the King.' You'll

see kings, queens and princes of the animal kingdom in this all-star cast. You'll even see Jumbo, the largest and most amazing snapping turtle in the world. We will try to show you not how tame wild animals are, but how intelligent under proper guidance."

Then Jacot, who has worked with circuses all over Europe and the U. S., pulls the trap-door rope and the first lions rush into the cage, followed by two tigers and

two brown bears. The bears put on a nursery scene, drinking out of bottles and riding a rocking horse. The tigers roll over at Jacot's commands. Two lions perform the difficult stunt of walking on their hind legs; a lioness stands on her forepaws; others jump through paper hoops, through Jacot's arms, and one lioness leaps on his back from her perch.

After the show gets under way Jacot begins the novelty acts. Two lions stand on

pedestals facing each other. In their teeth they hold a chain of wooden wieners on which their trainer sits and swings nonchalantly.

Leo I, a four-year-old male, plays the part of the king and also the turtle. During his coronation he wears a jeweled crown with attached spectacles and a robe of simulated ermine. As he stands on his pedestal the loudspeakers play "Old King Cole" and the crowd cheers. In the turtle act, Leo crouches under a giant shell with only his head and tail sticking out and lurches around the ring roaring and snapping at Jacot.

After the show Jacot explains some of his tricks.

"Stunts that look easiest are sometimes the hardest," he says, "and some that are

simple bring down the house. Take the bears. Did you notice I work them without muzzles or leashes? I've had my bears, Toska and Senorita, since they were cubs but I don't trust them. They are far more dangerous to work with than lions. When they growl or charge they are not fooling. Tigers are treacherous, too. The lions are great actors and most of their growling and charging is part of the show."

Although Jacot carries a revolver loaded with blank cartridges he never fires it during


a show.

"The shots mean nothing to the animals when they hear them all the time," he says. "I will never fire a blank unless there is real

danger."

All 17 in Jacot's show are performers. In many shows, he points out, only a few lions perform and the rest are just "stool warmers." After the show closes in October he works the animals daily throughout the winter. His voice cues are given in Spanish for the practical reason that there will probably be no shouts in this language from the crowd to confuse the animals.

"I start training lions when they are two years old," he says. "Before that age they want to




play all the time. I like to pick smart, mean lions instead of training tame ones to act wild. A well-trained mean lion is more dependable, because it's the nature of the beast to perform better when he is a little peeved.

"First I get acquainted with a young lion by moving him from cage to cage. Then I get him used to the arena. When the lion stops prowling back and forth I get in the cage with him. At first I stay close to the door and use a chair. If a lion keeps watching you and moves according to your moves you are safe. When a lion quits moving and begins to stalk, he is concentrating on you and no one can change his mind. Some late lion trainers have tried."

Jacot says lions have a touchy spot and when he finds it, he controls them by pointing his training rod in that direction. Some have it on the end of their tails, some on an ear, ribs, or on top of the tail where it joins the body. Pets lose these "touch" points and that is why he never makes a pet

of any performer. It may take years to teach a lion to do a trick (such as the wiener-chain swing or turtle act) but the lion must get the idea during the first week of training. For instance, Leo refused to crawl head first into the turtle shell. Jacot finally discovered that he wanted to back into it. Since then the act has gone smoothly.






### Dry "Raindrops" Aid in Experiments To Eliminate Radar's Blind Spot

Man-made "raindrops" that never fall and aren't wet are being used in experiments designed to cure the blind spot in radar sets. This blind spot occurs in sets using ultra-short waves less than ½ inch long. When these waves strike a raindrop they sometimes bounce back to the receiver and obscure the target image on the

scope. By suspending artificial plastic raindrops in mid-air by four strings, Westinghouse scientists make their own "rainstorms" to test the reflecting capacities of various radar sets. The reflected waves bounce into a hornlike receiver and are piped through a maze of metal ducts to sensitive measuring instruments.





### Camera "Times" Take-Off and Landing Tests

Take-off and landing performance of all Lockheed experimental planes is photographed with a special wire grid and a motion-picture camera. The grid, nine feet high and 64 feet long, has vertical wires marking off 100-foot sections of the runway and horizontal wires indicating altitude at 25 and 50-foot intervals. Twenty feet behind it is the camera, with a telescopic lens trained on the plane 2000 feet away. A


movable tape marked in tenths of a second is pulled past the camera, in the same direction as the plane, by an electrically timed motor. The film shows the exact time and distance required for take-off and landing and where the plane would clear a 50-foot obstacle, one of the government's licensing requirements. Effects of changes in propellers, engines and flap positions can also be observed accurately.





### Nonelectric Soldering Iron **Heated by Chemical Action**

Using no electricity or flame, a quickheating soldering iron reaches working temperature in five seconds after a chemical cartridge in the tip is punctured. Intense heat is maintained for eight minutes. The small cartridge fits in the recessed tip and is punctured by a spring rod that runs through the handle. At peak heat it has a wattage rating equivalent to a 200-watt iron, according to the manufacturer. For jobs requiring more than eight minutes, additional cartridges are used. The iron, plus one cartridge, weighs 20 ounces.



### Dentist "Hitches" a Ride On Movable Stool

Seated on a padded stool that rolls smoothly around the patient's chair, a dentist can now ride with his work. The footcontrol switch for the drill moves with the seat as the dentist rolls it around the chair. The seated position, being lower, also gives the dentist better visibility inside the patient's mouth.

### Atomic-Ray Counter Has Supersensitive Photo-Eve


Radiation is detected 30 times more efficiently with a "scintillation counter" now being tested at the University of Chicago.


It distinguishes between electrons passing through it at intervals of less than one tenmillionth of a second. Patterned after a

wartime German invention, the counter is simply a box containing an extremely sensitive photoelectric tube, surrounded by Dry Ice to deaden outside interference, and a small amount of fluorescent matter. Nuclear particles admitted to the box produce bursts of light in the fluorescent matter, usually naphthalene. The light is picked up by the tube and converted into a momentary current of electricity which can be amplified and measured accurately.


As quaint narrow-gauge railroads and roaring rivers give way to Diesel trucks in hauling logs out of our thinning forests, there's a boom in road building deep in virgin timber



PAUL BUNYAN was quite a fellow, but he'd be flabbergasted if he and Babe, the Blue Ox, were called upon to deliver to our sawmills and lumber yards as much timber as American lumbermen cut in a day. Right now wood consumption is at a high level; it is one of the critical items in our home-building program and has an ever-growing list of other uses.


That's why the U. S. Forest Service, custodian of one sixth of the nation's commercial timberland, has given high priority to construction of 2100 miles of access

roads into virgin timber territory.

In the old days of lumbering, logs were hauled out of the woods by puffing logging railroad engines, or floated down roaring rivers. Modern methods, however, demand gravel or asphalt-surfaced roads for the huge log-carrying Diesel trucks. Access roads are a key to lumber production.

The new program of access-road construction in national forests began during World War II, when 148 mineral-access roads and 85 timber-access roads were built. Today, under an \$18,000,000 program, the Forest Service is supervising construction of additional access roads to help meet postwar lumber needs. Mileage of access roads now being built in 31 states ranges from one mile in Illinois to 190 miles in

California, 240 miles in Idaho and 257 miles in Montana. These new roads are expected to carry more than a billion board-feet of logs every year.

Planning begins with on-the-ground surveys of resources and topography.

Portable stone-crushing plant provides material for all-weather road

Maps indicate stands of virgin timber that have never heard the ring of a woodsman's ax. The road-building program is finally correlated in the U. S. Forest Service headquarters in Washington, D. C. Roads are carefully plotted to link up with other roads in the area, not run blindly into the woods and stop.

After the planning stage comes construction. Survey crews mark out the new road locations. They are followed by construction crews with bulldozers, jackhammers, dynamite and large power saws to clear away brush, rocks,

stumps and trees. Finally, power graders smooth out the roads before crushed rock or asphalt is applied.

On the fringes of some forest areas opened up by access roads, portable sawmills may be set up. In other areas where

giant Douglas firs and Ponderosa pines grow 8 and 10 feet thick, logs are felled with gasoline-powered chain saws and trucked to larger sawmills. Normally, loads weighing 18 tons are hauled, but sometimes three monster logs weighing 70,000 pounds make a load for a big trucktrailer unit.

America's national forests include 73,-000,000 acres capable of growing commercial timber crops. This publicly owned

forest land has one third of the national saw-timber stand. In recent years these lands have supplied about 10 percent of the nation's yearly timber cut. With careful management, the national forests can help cushion the shock of private timber exhaustion. The first requisite for this increased cutting is the new roads, which will provide a means of reaching inaccessible virgin timber in national forests.

The long period needed to grow trees discourages many private lumbermen.




"Why," it is sometimes asked, "is the U. S. Forest Service building roads into national forests? Won't that mean cutting down trees at a time when a serious timber shortage threatens?"



Stainless steel, which has defied ordinary oxyacetylene torches, now is being cut by introducing an iron-rich powder into the flame. In the new process an additional head is attached to the standard torch. A nearby hopper is connected with the head by an extra hose. When the hopper is vibrated electrically and the powder forced into the flame by a jet of air, the additional


heat created by the powder, plus the fluxing and oxidizing action, keep the stainless steel in a molten state long enough to be blown out. Generally, a clean-up treatment such as chipping or grinding is necessary if the steel is to be welded. The same process is used for cleaning the sides of stainless-steel billets and for cutting steel alloys and some of the nonferrous metals.



### Screwdriver Kit Has Six Tools


Containing the right screwdriver for almost any job, a pocket-size kit eliminates looking through the toolbox for the blade you want. The interchangeable handle is shockproof and fluted for a firm grip. Five different blades, three of them standard screwdrivers and two for use on Phillips screws, lock in the handle by strong spring action. A six-inch extension is also available for reaching hard-to-get-at places. The kit includes a seven-section leatherette tool roll fitted with tie strings.






From the California coast come reports of a new experimental undersea ship firing guided missiles, and of other high-speed submarines playing hide-and-seek with new destroyers in mock battle.

In peace as in war the submarines are the silent service, and their evolution goes on behind closed doors of Navy research offices. But at home and abroad navies are studying the enemy developments of World War II—German "breathing" U-boats that could cruise at length on Diesel engines while submerged, huge Jap subs that launched aircraft from their decks—these advances are being weighed along with our own secret improvements.

The United States kept its cake and ate it too in the last war, so far as submarine warfare was concerned. Our submarines sank hundreds of enemy ships with few losses to themselves, while the American and Allied Navies were destroying a total of 911 enemy subs. We won on both sides of the ledger, and the United States Navy is doing all it possibly can to make that

One of the lessons learned during the war was that undersea boats are vastly more versatile than had been supposed. Instead of confining themselves to harrying enemy war vessels and merchant ships, our submarines also served as scouts, as transports, as mine layers in enemy waters, as lifeguards for rescuing downed

pleasant military situation a tradition.

aircraft crews, for reconnaissance photography and, to a limited extent, for actual shore bombardment.

Since then the importance of the submarine as a major weapon has continued to increase. In a sense, various types of small and medium-sized war vessels will be able to travel under the surface as well as on

top of it.

The present American fleet submarines are in excess of 300 feet long, are powered with four big Diesels, and have a surface speed of about 20 knots. At 15 knots they can cruise for 15,000 miles without refueling, more than sufficient for the standard 60-day war patrol. Their maximum underwater speed is about 10 knots which can be maintained for an hour before the batteries are drained.

Armed with one or two 5-inch deck guns

plus antiaircraft defense, the submarine's principal weapon has been its torpedoes. There are six torpedo tubes in the nose, four in the stern. Modern electric torpedoes leave no wake, can be set so as to turn to a desired course after leaving their tubes, and can be fitted with homing devices that steer them toward their targets.

The submarines use radar equipment on the surface and employ echo ranging and other sonar listening apparatus in both the sonic and supersonic frequencies while either afloat or submerged. These spotting and tracking devices are so accurate that submarines have been able to sink their targets by radar or sonar alone without having had a visual look at the target.

Highly efficient as they proved to be, our World War II submarines already are out of date. The Germans, for instance, made new and astonishing gains in submarine engineering and concepts of operations just as the war ended and this information is now the common property of all the great powers. At the same time our own countermeasures against submarines advanced to such a point that submarines of World War II characteristics are now extremely vulnerable.


Bowplane (left) is carefully checked before start of the cruise. Right, closing exhaust valves of engines

Today, the Navy's submarine experts are engaged in a hurry-up research program of testing ex-enemy developments as well as numerous ideas of our own. New submarines for which construction has been authorized will be designed to take advantage of the best of the new ideas. Existing submarines probably will be rebuilt along the same lines.

At the same time, other groups of naval experts have been given the job of working out improved antisubmarine measures so that new types of submarines can be combatted. Two hunter-killer destroyers identified by the symbol DDK are being

used as test ships. Another countermeasure is the use of sono-buoys that were developed during the war. These are automatic detector buoys that can be moored offshore or set adrift at sea. The buoys are equipped with sonar listening apparatus and a radio transmitter. Whenever the submerged sonar equipment picks up the sounds of a submarine in its vicinity these sounds automatically are broadcast from the buoy's radio, alerting radio stations either on shipboard or ashore. The position of a drifting buoy then can be fixed by using a radio compass loop.

Virtually all of the current research,





At main diving station seaman at left mans bowplane wheel and officer operates valves to flood sub tanks


both in improving submarines and improving the countermeasures, is in the secret category. About all that the silent service will talk about is the wartime developments of the Germans and Japanese. Some of these are quite important.

The best known is the Schnorkel breathing tube, invented by the Dutch and adopted by the Germans, that allows a submarine to use its Diesels underwater. The tube is a 15-inch pipe that can be raised to the surface and opened while the submarine is at a shallow depth. The pipe draws in air for the crew and the engines and also serves as an outlet for the engine exhaust. Submerged speeds of 16 knots or better are possible with the apparatus. Submarines equipped with it have remained submerged from 40 to 70 days and have cruised for thousands of miles without resurfacing.


The top of the tube is too small for detection by radar equipment and yet it is possible to mount on it a radar scanner or a radar of the IFF type to augment the periscopes.

Parallel with working out improvements on the Schnorkel is another program intended to increase a submarine's underwater speed by improving its streamlining. The submarines Pomodon, Odax, Amberjack and Corporal, rebuilt for these tests, are now making sea cruises in which their speeds, fuel-oil consumption and other characteristics are being compared with







The missile would be expelled from the tube to the surface of the water, where it instantly would release a launching platform from a compartment in the tail. The missile would rise automatically from the platform, which would be left afloat but eventually

would sink. When the missile is well on its course toward the target, the launching rockets would be jettisoned and wings would unfold from the side. A ram-jet engine then would propel it to the target. Subs also would be equipped with atomic torpedoes, which could be smaller in size than conventional torpedoes. Subs could cruise at high speeds and at depths where effectiveness of the enemy's sound detection would be reduced

### Push-a-Button Subway Map **Finds Shortest Routes**


Londoners traveling the subway can press a button to find the shortest route to any station on the line. When the destination button is pushed a map lights up to show the proper route with transfer stations. Secret of the map is the neon lamps which won't glow until a certain voltage is reached. In a case where it's possible to reach a given point by two different paths, the shorter path has fewer neon lamps. Thus the voltage builds up until the shorter route glows. The route-finder, built by the Sperry Gyroscope Co., Ltd., also may be used to show passengers on ocean liners the routes between decks.


### Aerial "Road Signs" Mark Path Across U.S.

Aerial "road signs" are up along the 3000-mile-long Skyway Number One for private flyers, stretching from Los Angeles to Washington, D. C. A thousand painted markers on rooftops, roads and prominent landmarks name the cities en route, with their exact latitude and longitude separated by an arrow indicating true north, and a symbol showing direction and distance to the nearest good airport. About 4000 more are needed to mark every community in a 40-mile-wide band along the route. Eastward from Abilene, Tex., the skyway takes paths north and south to Washington.




### Tire "Pump" Uses Gas Cartridges

Flat bicycle tires are inflated in seconds without a pump by means of a kit that uses compressed-gas cartridges. For light-weight tires one cartridge is enough. Two cartridges inflate a completely flat balloon tire. To use the kit, you screw an adapter on the valve stem. A cartridge is placed in the holder and screwed down on the adapter, puncturing the cartridge and sending compressed gas into the tire. The kit can be carried in a tool bag or pocket.

### Bicycle-Wheel Truing Stand

Adjustable for both axle width and wheel diameter, a bicycle-wheel truing stand accommodates any wheel from 6 to 30 inches in diameter. Two truing arms, mounted on an adjustable bar, detect any out-of-true portions of the wheel as it is turned. The stand is cast-aluminum.







### Wickets Form Movable Fence


Individual wickets installed side by side in the ground form a wire fence to protect lawns and flower beds. The wickets may be used as temporary fencing and moved about, or may be wired together to form a permanent fence. Each wicket is embedded in the ground by pushing or hammering on a shoulder that is offset in the wire. Made of steel, the wickets are 12 inches wide and 20½ inches high.

### Soap-Filled Wicks Carried in Pocket

You'll always have soap handy if you carry a packet of wicks each containing enough soap for a thorough washing of the hands. The soap is covered by a fine cloth mesh. To wash your hands, you merely place one of the wicks in your palm, run some water over it and lather. The wicks are packaged in a narrow envelope for convenience in carrying.

# IRON STEVEDORES OF THE COAL DOCKS

WITH ELECTRICAL MUSCLES that juggle a 100-ton carload of coal as though it were a basket of feathers, the iron stevedores along the Toledo lake front make the task of filling the cavernous holds of a coal boat look as effortless as throwing a light switch.


These untiring stevedores work at a new coal and ore-handling dock built for the New York Central and Baltimore and Ohio Railroads on the shore of Lake Erie. The dock, which began operation this spring, has a capacity of 20 million tons of coal and 4½ million tons of iron ore a year—and whether you think of those figures as shovelfuls or boatloads, they represent a heap of work!

The mechanical loaders are the middlemen between rail and water transportation. They transfer the bulky cargo so fast and so cheaply that the Great Lakes have become one of the world's busiest waterways. Long trains of cars loaded with coal from the Central States pour into Toledo night and day. To keep up with this steady stream, the dumpers, working 24 hours a day, dump cars at a rate of one a minute.




An empty coal car rolls back down the kickback trestle on its way to the yard. Huletts are at far right

Rolling back to yard, car is slowed down by retarders that grip wheels when operator moves these controls Juggling coal cars is only part of the work done by the mechanical stevedores. Many of the boats coming in for coal bring iron ore from the Minnesota ranges. Another section of the dock unloads these floating giants at a rate of 30 tons a minute. Each of the twin buckets of the Hulett ore unloaders digs into the heavy cargo and transfers it to railroad cars in 15-ton bites.



To make this smooth-running cycle continuous everything is timed as precisely as an aerial trapeze act. Coal trains roll into the yard on a strict schedule. From there, the cars are moved up to the coal dumpers which pick them up in an elevator and flip them upside down, dumping


the load into the boat. Now empty, the cars roll back to the yard where they are made into trains for the return trip to the mines. Some empties are pushed over to the ore dock where they are loaded with ore by the Huletts and hauled away to the steel mills.

It takes a lot of trackage to handle thousands of coal cars a day and there's plenty of it at the Toledo dock. It covers 212 acres and stretches back from the water more than four miles. Covering this tremendous acreage are 56 miles of tracks, enough to hold 5400 coal cars.

Dispatchers in the dumper control room signal yard crews when

coal cars are needed. A small electric locomotive pushes the cars in groups of eight or ten up to the bottom of the dumper ramp. From here a tough little locomotive known as a barney takes over.

Cable operated, the barney runs on an unusual narrow-gauge system between the standard-gauge tracks. From its pit below and behind the coal car, the barney rises to the track, like an unstreamlined porpoise breaking water, and rolls forward until it is just behind the car. It automatically slows down, eases against




High above the ship, this operator controls the coal dumper

the coupler and pushes the load of coal up to the dumper cradle. As the barney, pushing its load of coal, arrives at the top of the ramp, its wheels are forced inward on their axles by the narrowing track. By the time the coal car is on the cradle the barney is riding an inner pair of tracks that leads back to the pit. Reversing its course, it rolls to its pit below the next car and the process starts again.


The coal car, loaded with as much as 70 tons of coal, is hoisted by the cradle until it is high above the ship tied up at the

dock. Automatic clamps grab the sides of the car and it is flipped upside down, dumping the coal into a broad pan that looks like a flattened funnel.

After the dumping, the car is righted and lowered to track level. Another car, pushed up the ramp by the barney, hits the empty car knocking it off of the cradle and down a descending ramp on the opposite side of the dumper. This car then rolls up a kickback trestle from which it glides back and is automatically switched into the empty-car yard.

There are two dumpers in operation at the dock now and a third is being built. Each of these machines handles a carload a minute. That means three cars of coal can be dumped every minute, 24 hours a day.

As the empty car rolls back from the kickback trestle to the empty yard it passes a retarder system in the tracks. These retarders squeeze the wheels of the car, slowing it down. From a control tower, an operator regulates the amount of pressure exerted against the wheels to slow down the car so it won't jump the track when it hits the other empties. At the same time he must not slow it down so much that it will stop before it reaches the end of the yard. Every type of coal car—and there are many—has its own rolling characteristics and the retarder operator has to know them all.

A switchman, also in the control tower, opens and closes remote-controlled switches to sort the empty coal cars by railroads. By switching all cars bearing the name of one railroad on the same track, he speeds the job of making up trains for the trip back to the mines. He also inspects each car visually as it passes his station and when he spots a "cripple" he switches it to a sidetrack.

Adjacent to the coal dock, the ore-unloading pier juts out into the lake. On this pier, two Hulett unloaders transfer ore from the boat to railroad cars that roll under their bridgelike chassis.

These Huletts consist of two jointed arms that dip their tremendous fists into the ship's hold, picking up 30 tons of ore a minute. At the end of each arm is a clamshell bucket controlled by an op-

erator who rides in a cab directly above the scoop. Like a three-dimensional-elevator operator, he guides the giant arm back and forth, up and down, and from side to side.


These twin scoops pick up the ore from the hold, carry it back over the tracks and dump it into a hopper. It is weighed and then dropped into cars on the tracks below.

As the ore in the hold gets so low that the scoop can't pick up full bites, bulldozers are lowered into the boat. These powerful tractors shove the heavy ore into piles big enough for the scoops to get their teeth into. When the holds

have been completely emptied, the boat is moved over to the coal dock to take on its load of coal.

A streamlined office building at the dock is the nerve center of the operation. Orders are transmitted by an intercommunication system to the machine operators and to the train yards. Ship-to-shore radio enables ship captains to get their docking instructions while approaching the port.

With the addition of these new facilities, Toledo, already the busiest bituminouscoal port in the world, is expected to forge





Scoop of the ore unloader lowers bulldozer into hold to scrape up ore

farther into the lead. During 1947, the Toledo area handled 23 million tons of coal and in 1948 the total should greatly exceed this figure.

But whether or not the 1948 total surpasses last year's mark, the new dock will dump a lot of coal and unload a lot of ore. It's a far cry from the old days, not too many years ago, when hundreds of coal shovelers swarmed aboard the lake boats to transfer cargo. Now the work is done by electricity and the machine operators just sit back and push buttons.

Unloading ore at a rate of 30 tons a minute, these two Huletts can empty this huge lake boat in a few hours


### Good-by to Toothache?


Mass control of tooth decay could be possible within six years through a chemical dentifrice that would prevent the formation of corroding acids in the mouth, according to Dr. Leonard Fosdick of Northwestern University. Decay is caused by sugars and fermentable carbohydrates which are converted into acids. Research indicates that through use of certain enzyme inhibitors it may be possible to prepare a dentifrice that actually will prevent decay. If such a dentifrice were used in conjunction with the proper diet and oral hygiene, dentists could achieve mass control of tooth decay in a short time, according to Fosdick, who is one of the leaders in tooth-decay research.

### Electrical "Yardstick"

With an electrical "yardstick" scientists can measure the high voltages required in many laboratory experiments. Two spheres of the measuring device are held apart by an adjustable frame that permits the gap to be increased or decreased. Normally the air space would prevent electricity from passing in an arc from one sphere to the other. But when the voltage becomes too great the air barrier is broken down and the charge leaps across the gap. The distance between the spheres thus can be used as an accurate measure of the voltage. The instrument is used by Westinghouse scientists in developing improved electrical insulating materials.

¶Man-made earthquakes in the form of explosions can be detected 200 miles away with small, portable seismographs developed by Carnegie Institution of Washington scientists.






# **HOOVER DAM CALLS THE DOCTOR**


MORE THAN 400,000 tons of silt, clay and sand are being deposited in Lake Mead behind Hoover Dam every day. In the last 13 years the muddy Colorado has dropped two billion tons of sediment in the lake, reducing the capacity of the reservoir by possibly five percent. Unless some remedy is applied, the reservoir eventually will lose most of its storage value.

Lake Mead is a fresh-water reservoir and yet it contains several million tons of salts in solution. So vast is the lake that this quantity of mineral gives the water only nominal hardness. An oddity is the fact that the water that is discharged downstream is saltier than the water flowing into the reservoir.

The weight of the water in the huge lake imposes great strains on the earth's crust and some portions of the Lake Mead area have settled several inches. Light earthquakes due to adjustments of the earth occur frequently.

Nearly one million acre-feet of water evaporate from the surface of the lake every year. The loss amounts to more than a billion tons of precious water that could provide power for a fair-sized city as well as irrigating from 100,000 to 300,000 acres of land if the evaporation could be halted. These are some of the high lights from studies that are being conducted by the Office of River Control for the lower Colorado and by associated agencies. The rivercontrol office operates that portion of the river which extends from Lees Ferry, 355 miles upstream from Hoover Dam, to the international border below Yuma, a distance of almost 700 miles.


Hoover Dam and the other structures on the river are used to create electrical energy that is distributed as far away as southern California, to provide drinking water that travels by aqueduct to Los Angeles and its neighboring cities, and to take water from the river for irrigating vast tracts in Arizona and California.

Operating the river is a complex task and one of the big problems now confronting C. P. Vetter, chief of the Office of River Control, is the silting of Lake Mead.

The water that flows into the head of the reservoir looks like brown soup; the water that is discharged through the dam is crystal clear. Vetter knows the approximate tonnage of the sediment that has accumulated, but it's hard to say what volume the sediment occupies.

To find out, the Geological Survey and the Navy are cooperating with the Bureau

of Reclamation and are measuring the actual depths of the water in the reservoir. These findings will be compared with the

original profiles.

The Navy's survey party is using an improved type of fathometer as well as other echo devices for making precise soundings from the surface of the lake. Underwater photographs may also be made to check on the underwater contours. The Navy may employ underwater television apparatus to study the bottom as a way of finding locations from which the most revealing photographs can be made.

In addition to six small craft that were shipped across country to the site, the Navy has launched a 107-foot self-propelled steel pontoon barge on the lake. This is used as a platform for taking corings of the sediment deposits. Analysis will be made of the core samples to determine the degree of compaction, important in measuring the volume of the sediment. The survey will require a full year of field work and is to include the establishment of check points so that periodic measurements can be made in the future.


The sediment problem is not new. It was recognized at the time the dam was built but it was a problem that didn't need to be solved immediately. Now, at the narrow head of the reservoir, the silt is about 250 feet deep. In some portions of the main reservoir the original river bed is buried under as much as 100 feet of sediment.

Scouring out this material or by-passing the incoming sediment via diversion channels are two suggestions that have been considered and discarded because of the tremendous cost. The best solution seems to be to build another dam upstream to remove the sediment load from the water be-

fore it enters Lake Mead.


This would simply transfer the sediment problem from Lake Mead to the upper reservoir but the full plan goes further than that. Complete development of the Colorado is to involve the building of some 30 additional dams on the river and its tributaries. The river would be converted into a chain of lakes, each of which would act as a settling basin for sediment in addition to generating power, assisting in flood control, or providing irrigation water. Ultimately the fight against sediment will have to be carried even farther upstream and will consist of erosion-control measures in the areas that are contributing most of the sediment.

Colorado River water is hard and some engineers once thought that Lake Mead would slowly turn into a body of salty water too highly mineralized to drink. They reasoned that evaporation would concentrate the minerals year after year.

That fear has vanished now although evaporation plus the leaching of salts from the bed of the reservoir actually have increased the water's hardness. The average salinity of the incoming river is 575 parts per million and the average salinity of the lake itself is 650 parts per million. The discharge is even higher in mineralization and averages 680 parts per million, because the water that is discharged through the hydroelectric turbines is drawn from a depth at which the minerals are concentrated. The fact is that the salinity of the discharge waters seems to have passed its peak and to be gradually decreasing. Minerals consist mostly of calcium sulphate and calcium bicarbonate with some sodium, potassium and fluoride.

Hard as it is, the water is softer and better for agriculture than the water that irrigators used to draw from the river before Hoover Dam was built. This is because the salinity of the free river used to vary with the season. The purest water came downstream in the great spring floods when water wasn't needed for irrigation. Salinity was highest in the summer just at the time when water was being diverted to irrigation ditches.

Today the reservoir mixes up a whole year's supply of water before it goes downstream and the average salinity remains pretty constant the year around. The Office of River Control estimates that nearly 10 million tons of salts have been kept out of irrigation ditches in the last 13 years because of the action of the reservoir.

Loss of water by evaporation from the 125,000-acre lake is tremendous. The estimate of a loss of one million acre-feet per year is computed from measurements of evaporation from floating pans of water and from pans that are placed on shore.

Water conservationists regard evaporation as pure waste even though this lost water isn't in demand today. Sometime in the future the demand for water from the river may exceed the supply and when that time

comes the water that just disappears into the air will be needed. One suggestion that may have to be tested is to coat the reservoir surface with some nonvolatile liquid such as a light oil. The thin film would prevent or reduce evaporation and would not affect the purity of the water or its value for generating electricity. Presumably the film would kill the fish life in the reservoir, at present a great tourist attraction, but eventually the need for additional water may overbalance the recreational value of the reservoir.

A moderate earthquake that rattles doors and windows is an alarming event to most people. Residents in the neighborhood of Lake Mead became accustomed to them in 1939 when 34 moderate quakes in one month indicated how the earth was adjusting itself under the weight of the newly filled reservoir.

Seismic activity in the vicinity hasn't again approached that high point but

earthquakes are still occurring and probably will continue as long as the reservoir is used. A week may go by without a shock being felt, then for a time there may be one or more shocks a day. Dozens of others too weak to be noticed are recorded by seismic instruments.

This continuing activity seems to be caused by the seasonal changes in the reservoir's level. Lake Mead has a total capacity of 31 million acre-feet and the water reaches its highest elevation in late July or early August. At that time the water load may be as high as 42 billion tons, depending on the degree to which the reservoir has filled.

By late March the normal discharge of water through the tur-

bines draws down the level of the lake by 65 feet, reducing the impounded water to about 28 billion tons. The earth moves around under this varying load.

The Coast and Geodetic Survey maintains three seismograph stations in the vicinity of the reservoir and other seismographs are installed inside the dam itself. The purpose of the installations is to check the security of the dam and to obtain background information that will be useful in planning other dams. Seismic studies at Lake Mead have confirmed the early conclusions that there are no major faults in the vicinity and that the dam is safe.

Water temperatures in a reservoir might seem unimportant but they are of more than academic interest. At Lake Mead, for instance, they help in eliminating the floating debris and other river trash that might




Tilt meter inside Hoover Dam measures slight seasonal movements of tremendous mass of concrete caused by changes in temperature

collect around the intake towers and become a problem. Logs, branches and other material that come down the river into Lake Mead collect in big rafts and remain at the upper end of the reservoir. This is because the inflowing water is cold. It flows into the lake as an undercurrent. A return flow occurs at the surface and keeps surface materials at the head of the lake.

The reservoir is a fisherman's paradise. Once that portion of the Colorado was too muddy and seasonally too warm for trout. It was always too swift for bass. Today rainbow trout are thriving in the cold, clear water below the dam and bass are multiplying in the quiet waters. A fisherman simply decides what kind of fish he wants and picks his spot accordingly. He's too content to worry about the two-billionton menace growing beneath this paradise.

### **Rotary Mower Cuts Tall Grass**

Grass of any height is cut by a rotary power mower that has a single flexible blade. The blade revolves beneath the motor to cut even tall or tangled grass. The mower's frame is made of polished aluminum and the main wheels are equipped with pneumatic tires. Powered by a direct-drive vertical motor, the mower can be adjusted to three cutting heights. It is available in three models with 16, 18 and 20-inch cutting blades.



### Lightweight Motorcycle

Weighing only 170 pounds, the newest entrant in the light motorcycle field is the Harley-Davidson 125, powered by a one-cylinder, two-cycle engine. It has a foot-operated three-speed gearshift and a handle-bar controlled clutch. The reinforced tubular-steel frame has a wheelbase of approximately 50 inches. For more convenient reading, the speedometer is mounted in the headlight housing. The engine is lubricated by oil mixed into the gasoline.

### **Garden Tool Makes Straight Rows**

Straight garden rows are assured without stakes and string when a new tool is used to dig the furrows. A rod across the tool is set for the proper distance between rows. The tip of the rod then can be guided along the preceding row in digging the new furrow; or the tool can be reversed and the rod will scrape the earth to mark off the next row. After the furrow is dug and all of the seeds have been planted the tool is turned over and a corrugated roller covers the seeds with dirt. Two additional tines can be attached to the tool to convert it to a cultivator.

### Safety Photo Trimmer Protects Fingers

Instead of the usual lever-type cutting blade that may drop on the operator's fingers, a new paper cutter has two blades only an inch apart and is operated by pressing down on the base. The operator never touches the blade, but merely places the paper under a transparent guide rule, presses down on the platen and the edge is trimmed. The cutter can be operated horizontally on a table or vertically when fastened to the wall. The platen and guide rule are calibrated to assure accurate trimming. With its 11¼-inch cutting blade, the trimmer will handle all popular print sizes.

### **Overlay Checks Shorthand**

Students can easily check their shorthand characters with the aid of a transparent sheet printed with shorthand marks. The sheet, made of Celanese Lumarith plastic, is placed over the student's characters, offering an accurate comparison of the student's letters with perfectly formed letters. The characters appear in opaque red on the sheet. Any finger smudges can be wiped off the plastic with a damp cloth.






### Twin Dials Measure Your Bite For Dental Work


Looking like a pair of earphones worn upside down, a new gauge for dentists measures the precise bite of patients being fitted with artificial teeth. Called a condylometer, the device has two dials that measure the movements of the condyles, those bony lumps just in front of the ears that move as the jaw is opened and closed. These measurements enable the dentist to construct better-fitting dentures.

### **Tool Welds Tread on Metal Floors**

Iron or steel surfaces are given a nonskid tread by a vibrating hand tool that attaches to either a.c. or d.c. welding machines. The vibrating electrode holder causes intermittent arcing which melts the electrode and fuses the molten droplets to the floor. Five linear feet can be applied in a minute and no welding skill is required.

# CAMP in COMFORT


Two ESSENTIALS for a successful camping trip are a rainproof tent and a warm, comfortable bed. Wise campers long ago learned the fallacy of imitating the hardy backwoodsman and "going light" with a meager tarpaulin for shelter, a thin blanket roll for a bed and a rock for a pillow. The summer camper goes for pleasure and health and, if he is wise, plans his outfit carefully for maximum comfort. The trick is to get real comfort without too much weight and bulk.

Adequate shelter being the major consideration, the most important item is the tent. It must be thoroughly rainproof for one driving shower can soak the bedding, ruin the food supply and wreck that long-planned trip right at the start. If you are not sure your tent will shed a hard rain, erect it in the back yard and turn a hose stream on it. If one drop of water goes through, you'd better not plan to use that tent if you want to stay dry.

Of the many types of tents on the market, we can here consider three, each of which has certain advantages depending on your mode of transportation, whether it be by foot, auto, pack horse or canoe.

The umbrella tent: This all-purpose tent—granting that moderate weight and bulk are permissible—is almost universal for the automobile camper. It comes in sizes from about 7 by 10 feet, adequate for two persons, to a four-man size, which is 11½ to 12 feet square. The smaller size, in good, durable, 10-ounce twill, will weigh only about 25 pounds with center pole, while

the larger tent may weigh 35 pounds. Made of lighter and more expensive fabrics, either tent will weigh much less, but it will be less durable. The saving in weight and bulk is not important when transportation is by automobile. Of course, all such tents have sewed-in floors.

For the mountain pack trip, where every pound of weight must be considered and the whole outfit goes on a mule's back, the smaller umbrella tent is a practical shelter that takes up no more space than a small sleeping bag. The jointed center pole is as easily carried as a fishing rod and the necessary shovel. With this tent you're sure of a dry camp when that first heavy thunderstorm pelts down. Likewise, the 11-foot tent easily pays its way on the trip when the party numbers three or four persons.

All good umbrella tents have a mosquito curtain of netting or stronger bobbinet sewed in at the top of the door flap, either to tie down along the sides or fitted with the tighter zipper fastening. This is essential, not only in mosquito country, but also to repel flies when you eat inside the tent. On warm nights with the tent flap back and net curtain tight, you sleep soundly, unbothered by flying and crawling insects. In cool weather, the flap is tied down and sufficient air is admitted


through the one or more net-covered windows of the umbrella tent.


This tent has the additional advantage of ample headroom at any point since the sides are nearly vertical. One type has a jointed center pole, with a four-arm stretcher sliding on it, each arm of which is inserted at a top corner of the tent. Many campers prefer this center pole, due to its comparatively light weight and the four stretchers are handy for hanging clothes. Another tent has four metal corner poles with sliding stretchers extending from each pole to the peak of the roof. This type provides an all-clear space inside, but is heavier and requires more time to erect.

At least eight steel pegs, not less than 10 inches long, are needed for the umbrella tent. Additional protection against strong winds is provided by guying the tent peak and its four upper corners to additional pegs. Iron half-hooks welded to the projecting ends of the stretchers, make this job a quick and easy one, anchoring the tent for anything but a gale. Another advantage of this tent is the wide door flap, which may be erected as a sunshade under which to sit or dine in hot weather.

The pyramid or miner's tent: Here is perhaps the most comfortable tent for its (Continued to page 250)







### Mechanical Hands

Designed for use by remote control in radioactive areas, a pair of mechanical hands can do everything human hands can and more. The hands extend over a protective wall into the radiation area while the operator controls them from a safe place. Most movements are mechanical, being controlled by linkages with the handles, but wrist action is electrical. This permits the wrist

to twist around completely any number of times, a feat which is particularly useful when unscrewing a nut. Interchangeable hands are used for different operations. Some are highly specialized such as one






By remote control, mechanical hands do anything the operator (see upper photo) wants: pour chemicals, bore holes, or even play solitaire

hand that consists of a pair of snips instead of hooks. Control of the hands is so sensitive that a gentle squeeze can be applied to break the shell of a hard-boiled egg without damaging its contents.



### Trench Digger

Foundations and shallow trenches are dug by a bucket-line machine that can be towed behind a small tractor or jeep. The machine digs a trench from one to 30 inches deep and 12 to 18 inches wide. The endless bucket line brings the dirt to the top of the machine where it is dumped onto a conveyor and moves off to the right of the trench. Powered through the take-off of the tractor or jeep, the digger has a 180to-1 gear-reduction attachment which slows the vehicle to a "walk" of 160 feet per hour.

PHOTOGRAPHY has come a long way since the days of the tintype, but it still has its eye on the future. Not satisfied with pictures that you merely look at, it is now making some you can wear and use.

The cameraman is invading the fields of fabrics and ceramics. You will soon be wearing photo-printed neckties and eating from photo-decorated dishes.

Fundamental techniques in the art are unchanged, but it is finding new vehicles of expression. It is beginning to free itself from the limitations of film and paper—useful as these are—and is aiming for bigger targets.

The printing of photographs on fabrics will probably be the biggest development Chemist at light table cuts master printing film in laboratory. At rear, another chemist mixes dye for emulsion as girl proves that fabrics can be ironed


industrially and by far the most obvious insofar as the public is concerned. You will soon be seeing Sinatra's portrait on bobby-soxers' shirts, photographs of fire engines on frocks, and the photogenic Grand Canvon on sofa pillows.

While photographic fabrics will undoubtedly strike the eye most frequently, the scientific-minded will be more interested in a process for printing photographs, not on, but in glass. Pottery, metal and plywood are other substances which are or will soon be used as carriers for the modern photographer's art.

The development of photosensitive glass at the Corning Glass Works goes back to 1937, when Dr. Robert Dalton discovered

that certain ruby glass could be permanently changed in color by ultraviolet irradiation and heat treatment. Before the war, a clear glass was made in which ruby-colored designs could be "printed."

The war interrupted the photosensitiveglass project, although photographic glass almost turned up as legal tender. The Treasury Department was interested in making coins of this material to save critical metals, but the vast quantity required in a hurry exceeded production facilities and the idea was dropped.

Prime ingredient in the photosensitizing process is the introduction into the glass of metallic particles so small that they cannot be seen under a high-powered micro-

scope. Different metals produce different colors in the finished print.

The glass is exposed to ultraviolet light through the film or glass negative—the light preferably being of high intensity and essentially parallel, but it can come from a number of sources. Sunlight, sunlamp, mercury arc or carbon arc may be used for the exposure.

The picture is produced by the precipitation of the metallic particles in the glass. These particles are so fine that the image is virtually without grain. The exposure is made with a contact printing frame and no special precautions need be taken with the glass except to shield it from potent sources of ultraviolet until it is used.

The development of the latent image is completed when the exposed glass is heated to 1000 degrees Fahrenheit in an electric furnace.

Various glasses, depending on their metal content, produce one or more color shades in the finished picture. One glass will give a blue, purple, ruby or orange image, another yellow or brown, and a third only a bright red. The color a particular glass produces is the result of the exposure time. Thus, after a period of exposure which would produce an all-purple image, part of the negative can be masked with black tape and the remainder, after continued exposure, will be ruby.

The picture is three-dimensional, in some cases the image penetrating the glass as much as two inches. Exposure time and duration of heat treatment, either separately or in combination, establish the depth of the image. The finished picture is indestructible, unless the glass is shattered; unalterable, unless again subjected

to 1000 degrees temperature, and ageless as far as any apparent or predictable deterioration is concerned.

The three-dimensional effect of the image is heightened by the fact that dark areas in the image penetrate deeper into the glass than the high-lighted portions.

Photosensitive glass can be worked like ordinary glass; it can be drawn, rolled, blown or pressed in the conventional manner. If extra strength is desired it may be tempered.

The potential uses for this material are almost unlimited, but some which suggest themselves are portraits, land and sea scapes, tableware, costume jewelry such as portraits in pins or rings, photomurals, decorative tile, church windows, advertising displays, scratch and heat-resistant instrument dials, and slides for projection.

Special lighting of the glass picture increases its general effectiveness, particularly when opalescent glass is combined with the clear variety. The opal glass, such as used in lighting fixtures, contains microscopic transparent crystals which scatter light in every direction. It can serve to some extent as a shading medium or, by directing the light on the opal glass, a selfilluminated effect is achieved.

A score of glass and research firms in many parts of the country have been licensed by Corning to use its photosensitive glass. Considerable testing is being done to discover the most economical use for the material. Incidentally, its cost is not much greater than that of ordinary glass of equivalent quality.

Photographic decoration of fabrics has been described as a step "snapping textile printing out of a hundred-year lethargy." Men in the field insist that a revolution in

### Luxury Bus Has Snack Bar

Snacks are served en route aboard new express buses operating from Chicago, New York and St. Louis. Each of the luxury buses, placed in service by the American-Burlington Buslines, has a snack bar with a stewardess in attendance where sandwiches and cold drinks are available. Other improvements include complete lavatory facilities, reclining seats, and a two-way radio telephone and complete air conditioning. The seats have individual reading lights. The buses, built on a 41-passenger chassis, seat 32 with the extra space devoted to the lavatory, snack bar and more leg room between seats. All seats on the new buses are reserved.

### Electric Cart Keeps Meals Hot

During loading delays, meals for airline passengers are kept hot in dining service carts that can be hooked to portable motor generators. The mobile cart is of steelframe construction, with aluminum skin, measuring three feet wide, five feet high and eight feet long. Inside, the hot food boxes and liquid containers have electric heating elements that are plugged in when placed in their respective compartments. The cart is wired for 24volt d.c., the same as that in DC-6 buffets.


### Buses Ride Trolley In Cincinnati



A small wing at the tail end of the main skis holds them in place during flight, when the gear is about three fourths retracted.



### Shield on Ventilator Wing Keeps Rain Out of Auto

Water can't drip inside the car when the ventilator wing is open during a rainstorm if a metal shield is attached to the bottom of the pivoting window. The device is held in place by a simple snap-on clamp. A rubber seal fits tightly against the glass to prevent leaks. The water that drips down the ventilator collects on the shield and the flow of air drives the water outside the door.





# fishing for Shark







TO SHARKERS the Caribbean is a vast, rich, fishing ground. Wartime research disclosed that the shark is a valuable source of Vitamin A, so more and more fishermen are hunting this vicious undersea killer whose liver and byproducts find a market all over the Western Hemisphere.

Today, every part of a shark is valuable: the liver contains Vitamin A; the fins are delicacies in Chinese restaurants; the hide can be sold to leather manufacturers; the meat is eaten all over the world; the carcass is ground into meal for poultry and livestock; even the teeth can be sold—as souvenirs. Recently, the shark's backbone has been found to contain great amounts of calcium, thus adding the dog-food market to the list of outlets.

In the past, sharks have been caught with nets. The bulk of the industry was on the Pacific Coast, where the largest catches still are made, but the Caribbean area promises to reap more valuable catches since the advent of a new shark-fishing rig which utilizes steel cable. Note the wide mouth on this ugly fellow, pulled alongside by chain. Below, diagrams show two methods of setting chain rig. Some sharkers now use heavy cable instead of chains

Since deep-water sharks are more valuable than the shallow-water varieties, shark fishermen early saw the need for a rig which would put the giant 5-inch hooks in depths over 100 fathoms. Heavy chain lines were bulky and dangerous under certain conditions. Then a Key West sharker developed a method which has been rewarding him with unusually large catches. This method, which consists of laying a mile of stranded steel cable strung at 30-foot intervals with 12-foot chain leaders, is also used by Thompson Enterprises, Inc., whose vessel, The Heron, is now equipped

with gear capable of bringing in the huge 14 and 15-foot monsters.

Sharkers begin their operations by filling lockers in the vessel's hold with bonita, yellowjack and barracuda for bait.

Because there are more than 40 different species of sharks in the Caribbean area, the skipper of a shark boat must use all his knowledge of fishing, plus hydrographic charts, to pick a likely spot for his hooks. Sharks vary in value according to type, habitat, season and sex.

As soon as the boat reaches an offshore (Continued to page 220)


### Navy Repair Shop Has Glass Walls

Everything from 16inch battleship gun mounts to delicate optical instruments can be rebuilt in a new six-story naval repair shop whose walls are built of glass to provide even interior illumination. Heat and glare resistant, the glass covers 80 percent of the exterior walls and roof of the building, located at the San Francisco Naval Shipyard, Hunters' Point, Calif. One large work bay has a ceiling 67 feet high and is equipped with 40 and 60-ton traveling cranes for moving heavy ordnance pieces. An outside crane with a capacity of 15 tons will hoist

submarine periscopes from railroad cars to the top floor where they may be set up inside a glass-enclosed tower for testing and



calibration. The building rests on wood and concrete piles driven some 45 feet into the ground and spaced 5 feet apart.




### Fishing-Rod Wrapper

Wrapping a fishing rod is done in half the usual time with a semi-automatic machine that lays down any thread evenly, tightly and without bunching. It also ties the thread under automatically. The rod, supported by two uprights, is rotated by hand during the wrapping operation. If desired, two threads can be wrapped simultaneously. The machine can be used also for wrapping golf clubs and for fletching arrows.

### Stray-Parts Auto Goes 130 M.P.H.

With 12 speeds forward and two in reverse, a high-powered car built by Walter Johnson, a mechanic of Akron, Ohio, zooms along the highway at 65 miles an hour in low gear. Johnson calls the car the "Mongrel 8" because it's made up of so many stray parts. In a test on the sands of Daytona Beach, Fla., Johnson

cruised along at 130 miles an hour and believes the homemade auto is capable of 40 miles faster. The sleek body and fenders



are electric-welded. Johnson figures he has invested only \$200 in his creation, and has turned down an offer of \$5000 for the car.







# TREE CUTTERS


TREES are lopped off in sections and gently lowered to the ground by a hydraulic cutter which prevents damage to nearby buildings. The machine is used in Columbus, Ohio, to remove trees killed by the deadly disease called phloem necrosis. The operator wraps a steel cable on a boom around the upper part of the tree. The saw cuts through the upper branches, which are lowered by the boom. Lower sections of the tree are removed in the same way. An automobile engine operates the hydraulic pump which powers the cutter. A mechanical cutter in operation in North Carolina cuts through trees up to 40 inches in diameter, saws them into log lengths and loads them on a truck. The cutter is credited with producing 40,000 board feet of logs per day.





### Motorcycle for Invalids Has One-Hand Control


Designed for invalids, a British three-wheeled motorcycle has an ingenious control mechanism that permits driving with only one hand. Throttle, brake, clutch, gearshift and steering handle are combined in a compact control head. A gasoline engine is mounted in front of the right rear wheel and is completely enclosed except for the air-cooled cylinder head. The vehicle goes 80 miles on a gallon of gas and cruises at 30 miles an hour.



### Mechanical Iceman Loads Fishing Boat in 15 Minutes




Icing a fishing boat, usually a three-hour operation, is done in 15 minutes by a combination truck and ice crusher used in Honolulu. The truck delivers 12,600 pounds of ice either in block form or as crushed ice piped into the hold. Blocks of ice weighing 300 pounds are lowered from the truck body to the ground by a hydraulic hopper. When crushed ice is needed, blocks are slid on a conveyor in the truck floor and automatically fed into the crusher. The crusher's revolving steel fingers grind 1300 pounds of ice per minute.

# Confusion in the cockpit



I MAGINE yourself flying a brand-new plane.
The cockpit is a mechanical jungle of gadgets
—knobs, switches, dials,
levers, buttons, handles.
You're coming in for a
landing. Where the devil
are the flap controls? The
brakes? The cutoff
switch? You grab the
book of instructions. But
you can't make heads or
tails of it....

A nightmare? Actually—no. But if it happened to you—yes.

With automatic aid, tiny stick in copilot's right hand flies a 104-ton Flying Wing. His left hand is on overhead throttles



Do you wonder if this man sees dials in his dreams? A B-36 engineer, he has to maintain a constant vigil over power output equal to that of five locomotives

"It's happened to me," says Commander Norval R. Richardson of the research and development group of the Navy's Bureau of Aeronautics. "And I'm supposed to

know cockpits!"


Situations such as this have spurred the Navy, the Air Force, the Civil Aeronautics Board and America's major airplane manufacturers to research on the twin problems of (1) making cockpit controls simpler and more efficient, and (2) increasing pilot comfort. Some day airplane cockpits may be as standardized as the dashboard of your automobile.

Čockpit research began during World War II when it was painfully evident that Army and Navy planes had too many controls, guns, radio sets, radars and other equipment jammed into too little space. Some 3000 to 4000 persons worked on Navy cockpits alone and they developed more

than 100 mockups and remockups.

Today the work is continuing. Jet planes present a majority of the old cockpit problems—and many new ones. Some of the former instruments have been removed, some additional added. The net result is still confusing.

Lindbergh made his famous solo ocean crossing with just these instruments: (1) compass, (2) oil-pressure gauge, (3) altimeter, (4) magneto switch, (5) tachometer indicating propeller r.p.m., (6) bank-and-turn indicator, (7) air speed, (8) clock, (9) inclinometer, (10) gas pump, (11) control stick, and (12) throttle


don't like to change. A youngster can tell in a minute if a control doesn't 'feel' right."


The basic principles of cockpit design were developed by the trial-and-error method. Engineers would stumble on a basic principle without knowing it. Then they'd backslide on later cockpits before they were aware that a new principle had been discovered. What was most disconcerting was that flyers had been using badly-designed cockpits for years, which probably explains many crashes and combat losses. One Air Force

study revealed that 50 percent of the accidents laid to "pilot error" were due to mistakes in selecting the right control.

For example, engineers learned that a pilot should not be required to transfer control of a plane from one hand to another during take-offs and landings. Same with

transfer of vision. In many planes a pilot had to wrench his eyes away from the runway and look into the cockpit to find the control he wanted. A few years ago a Navy flyer washed out a dive bomber at Roosevelt Field when he took his eyes off his landing, mistook a golf fairway for the strip and ended up in a bunker.

For many years there was no rhyme or reason for the way many important controls operated. For example, the prop control was mounted on the aft end of the power-control quadrant and moved up and down, rather than forward and backward. The mixture control was another offender. Some planes actually had the "idle" cutoff position at the forward end—just beyond the "full rich" position. In other words, if you pushed all controls forward for a take-off you would cut your fuel.

Some of the most important advances in cockpit controls have been developed by engineers at the El Segundo (Calif.) Division of Douglas Aircraft, and incorporated in the Navy's newest dive and attack bomber, the AD Series Skyraider.

Three principles were followed: (1) the control should, as much as possible, look like the part of the airplane to which it is connected, (2) the control should move in the same direction as the part, and (3)

the control should be placed as nearly as possible in a corresponding position in the cockpit to the place of the part it controls on the plane.

For example, the lever that lowers the arresting hook looks like an arresting hook. Flap controls resemble and work like landing flaps. The landing wheel lever is equipped with a small plastic tire and shock-absorber strut.

With devices like these, recognition is almost instinctive. Or, as Li'l Abner puts it—"as any fool kin plainly see." It goes further. A pilot doesn't even have to look. He can feel the control and know that it is the right one.

Older and slower aircraft gave a pilot time to perform his relatively few tasks. With the increase in instruments, and speed, it was necessary to ration a pilot's time. Power-actuated devices were substituted for manual controls; a flick of a switch held the instrument through its cycle of operation with no additional effort on the part of the pilot.

Records show that many pilots would have survived crashes if their heads had not been banged against gun sights, instrument boards and other hard objects. Engineers are still attempting to remove or recess knobs, cotter keys and levers.

Attention is being given to body clearances for head, knees and elbows.

"When a cockpit is cleaned up and streamlined, it's actually easier to fly,"

pilots say.


Lettering and lighting have been improved. During the war, fluorescent lighting around instruments eliminated glare. Now the engineers have gone a step farther. Indirect red lighting has increased pilots' night vision. A flyer can look from his instruments into the night sky with practically no adjustment of the pupils.

Interesting developments are being made with plug-in instruments. The base is sim-

ilar to that of a radio tube. If an altimeter should get out of whack in mid-air, the pilot merely pulls it out and plugs in a new one. Plug-in instruments are smaller and are said to produce a saving of 25 to 50 percent in panel space.

A new instrument, the Mach meter, came into being as planes moved toward the speed of sound. One of its first known uses was on the Lockheed P-38. With two hands that are operated by impact and static pressure, it is preset to warn the pilot when his plane nears its particular maximum safe speed. Beyond that, shock waves may break the craft into pieces.

One man, traveling about 10 miles a minute, has to keep himself constantly aware of the information all these instruments relay. They are, in jet P-80 cockpit, (1) standby compass, (2) altimeter, (3) fluid-injection pressure indicator, (4) turn-and-bank indicator, (5) landing-gear warning lights, (6) air-speed indicator, (7) universal altitude indicator, (8) rate-of-climb indicator, (9) gun sight, (10) windshield-defroster valve, (11) windshield defroster, (12) gyrosyn compass, (13) tail-pipe-temperature indicator, (14) rear-view mirror, (15) gyro-instrument warning light, (16) turn-and-bank-instrument warning light, (17) radio compass, (18) fuel pressure, (19) tachometer, (20) oil pressure, (21) ammeter, (22) fire-warning indicator, (23) fuel-quantity warning light, (24) fuel-quantity indicator, (25) fuel counter, (26) parking-brake handle, (27) elevator-tab neutral light, (28) radio-compass remote control, (29) hydraulic pressure, (30) clock, (31) gun-sight selector switch, (32) bomb-dropping switch, (33) control-stick grip, (34) gun-sight reticle dimmer, (35) fuel-pump warning lights, (36) accelerometer, (37) oxygen-cylinder pressure and (38) oxygen flow. The safe maximum varies with altitude and is gauged by the ratio of true air speed to the speed of sound. For example, the Mach number reached by Maj. Marion Carl of the Marines when he set a world's speed mark of 650 miles an hour was .831, or .169 short of the speed of sound at the altitude at which he flew. Since indicated air speed decreases with altitude and the Mach number increases, the instrument is vital for safety in 600-mile-an-hour planes.

Streamlining today's highspeed planes involved juggling the position of a plane's
windshield. The ideal windshield, aerodynamically,
would be that parallel with
the air stream. On the other
hand, the ideal position from
the point of view of the pilot
—who wants to see where
he's going and what's coming
—would be perpendicular. So
a compromise of about 35 degrees has been necessary.

Cockpit-design studies have been made on the distance between a pilot's eye and the

windshield. It has been found that an increase in this distance rapidly reduces the field of vision and aggravates interference of dirt, fog and other matter on the glass.


Another improvement being incorporated in Army and Navy experimental aircraft is a single control for adjusting both rudder pedals simultaneously. The potential hazard of unequal adjustment through individual controls has long been recognized. British, German and Japanese planes

during the war used a single adjustment device, American planes did not. Now they're getting them.

Even the color scheme of cockpit interiors is receiving serious study from aircraft engineers in the interest of safety. Factors that enter into this phase of design are night vision, minimum windshield glare from reflection, adequate cockpit illumination, maintenance conditions and—in line with the trend toward more consideration for the man who has to sit in that cockpit—the psychological effect on the pilot.

For the flyer who says, "I don't care about the color scheme, just give me a comfortable seat," there is also






To cut down drag, radio-antenna wires were built right into the bubble canopy of a speedy P-80

### Radio-Control Box Dictates Every Move of Miniature Robot Auto






Remote-control box in hand of operator, lower right, makes robot car turn, reverse or go straight ahead. Even the horn is blown by one of the buttons

"Electron," a futuristic miniature robot automobile, sounds its horn and maneuvers like an ordinary car in response to radio directions flashed to it by its operator. The car was built by Dick Glotch, radio mechanic at Mare Island Navy Base, Calif., to demonstrate the principles of radio control. Aside from a specially built body of aluminum and Plexiglas, all the parts used are available from war-surplus materials or other general sources. The car is guid-

ed straight ahead, made to turn left or right, back up or stop, or sound its horn by means of a remote-control box attached to a small radio transmitter. Each position of the control-box switch causes the transmitter to radiate at a different frequency. The car's radio receiver has selective amplifiers each tuned to match one of the frequencies radiated by the transmitter and each is connected by relays to the electric motor that performs the desired maneuver. Wet cells supply power to the motors and horn and also serve as the radio receiver's



A-battery. It uses a one-wheel drive to avoid differential problems. The front wheels are turned in either direction by starting or reversing the motor that drives a worm gear connected to the wheels. Glotch has maneuvered his car from a distance of several hundred feet and estimates that the range of the radio control is more than a mile. He is working now on a fluid-drive model equipped with head-lights that will turn on when the car is in motion and a taillight that will operate when the car is backing.


### Revolving Plow "Hugs" Plantings


Vineyard and orchard farmers can do the work that formerly required three separate tools with a new rotary power cultivator. The tractor-pulled cultivator makes it possible for one man to plow close to trees and vines without damaging them. Ordinarily, vineyards and orchards were plowed, then cultivated with a French plow and finished with a circle harrow. The new cultivator performs all three operations at once. It consists of a revolving blade holding six small plows. A circular guard bar keeps the blade away from vines or trees. The blade is revolved by the power take-off from the tractor. It leaves a smooth mulch about three inches deep.

### Synthetic Resin Aids Paper Makers

Short-fibered wood, such as poplar, beech, maple and birch, may soon provide a new source of paper, the National Bureau of Standards has announced. A synthetic resin, devel-

oped by the bureau, greatly strengthens paper made from these woods. Without this resin, such paper breaks down under the beating process used to develop good






bonding. The new synthetic, melamineformaldehyde, may increase the use of short-fibered wood, which grows abundantly in the Northeast, by 75 percent.

# The Navy's Incredible Eye

Most amazing of a houseful of miracles at the missile laboratory on a California desert is a camera that blinks its eye for a hundred-millionth of a second



Out Of the barren vastness of California's Mojave Desert has come a photographic miracle—a camera that takes a picture in a hundred-millionth of a second! Invented by Dr. A. M. Zarem of the Naval Ordnance Test Station, the camera is 25,000 times faster than any movie camera commercially available.

But this super-speed camera is only one of many miracles being produced at the Michelson Laboratory, newest addition to the station. Roughly equal in size to the state of Rhode Island, the inland naval base was created in 1943 as a rocket-testing range. It has grown until now it is one of the world's most complex research centers.

Completely self-contained, the scientific community is also one of the world's most modern cities. The heat and dry-

ness were given a knockout punch by twentieth-century engineering. Every building, including homes for 12,000 residents, is air conditioned.


At present, the community has 2000 permanent buildings, ranging from the sprawling Michelson Laboratory to the streamlined corner grocery. Residents include families of 3800 civilian employees and 1000 naval personnel. Civilians and service personnel combine talents in research on rocket weapons, guided missiles and aviation ordnance. The super-speed camera will be used to record rapidly moving phenomena in these fields.


Principal facility at the station is the Michelson Laboratory. Built at a cost of \$8,000,000, the laboratory has 7½ acres of floor space, all air conditioned. All air entering the building is filtered twice. Windows are sealed. Every entrance is a double-door type providing an air lock between the inside air and the desert atmosphere. Completely insulated, the building is a comfortable oasis in the desert.

















### Steam Engine Burning Fuel Oil Installed in Standard Car




### **Bolt-On Wall Panels Cut Costs**


Construction costs of multistory buildings may be greatly reduced by a wall panel that bolts to the framework without the use of scaffolding. The panels are about four feet square and either three or four inches thick. Weighing only 120 as much as a masonry wall, the panels are made of insulating material covered with stainless steel on the exterior and lacquered steel on the interior. Individual panels are connected by a weatherproof, fireproof joint on all four sides and are bolted together and to the girders at each floor. Insulating quality of the four-inch panel equals that of a 12inch masonry wall. Lightweight, the wall reduces strain on the foundation and its narrowness increases usable floor space. It can be produced for about half the cost of brick or masonry walls and maintenance costs are low due to metal facings.









Above, about 850 cubic yards of silt an hour gush from end of pipe. Below, locations of dredge, pipe, shoulders and drainage ditch are shown on the map


## SILT RETURNS TO THE LAND

Motorists driving on the approach to a new bridge over the Mississippi River at Memphis will soon be riding along 1,480,-000 cubic yards of silt sucked up from the bottom of Old Man River. Silt, which is topsoil washed into the river by the erosive action of rains and streams, is usually considered utter waste. By dredging the silt from the river and using it, engineers are recovering some of this huge loss. Because earth slides have damaged previous roadbeds over the lowland between the levee and the river, highway engineers are using the silt to form wide protecting shoulders along the approach. The screwtype blade of a powerful river dredge sucks an average of 850 cubic yards of silt an hour from the river bed and forces it through more than a mile of 25-inch pipe to the project. Water that carries the suspended silt along the pipe drains back to the river in a long ditch after the silt has settled to the bottom. The roadway is 35 feet higher than the surrounding land.


Diagonal slice from hardwood log produces beautiful grain effect to give this graceful coffee table a distinctive and exclusive touch. Legs are half-lapped and interlock


IF IT'S the unusual you crave in occasional furniture, this coffee table should really intrigue you. Its novel construction calls for a top sliced diagonally from a log. Cut in this manner, the top assumes the natural contour of the log and the grain is enhanced by the annual-growth rings which take on a beautiful pattern.


The original table top was cut from an 18-in. cherry log, 4 ft. long. The log should be fairly round, thoroughly seasoned and the bark should be removed. To mark the log for cutting, make a wooden frame from stock 1% in. wide, measuring 18 by 291/8 in., inside measurement. The frame is placed over the log as in Fig. 3 and is tacked temporarily in place. Then a pencil is run around both sides of the frame to mark the log and the space between the lines is chalked. Fig. 1 shows how the log can be supported at an angle with a lad-der and braced for sawing. Work carefully with a crosscut saw and try to make both cuts parallel. The saw will produce a rough surface which must be planed flat on the side selected for the underside of the top. Then 3/6-in. grooves are run on






the underside for the leg tenons, locating them according to Fig. 4. Each groove can be cut on a bench saw by cutting a wooden strip to slide in one of the saw-table grooves and tacking it to the underside of the work parallel with the line of cut. A 34-in. rim is marked around the top surface and the area inside the rim is routed ¼ in. deep. This can be done with a router bit in a drill press, or with a portable router. After sanding smooth, a sealer should be applied to both sides of the top to seal the end grain and to retard checking. Fig. 6 details the leg patterns. Although the point of half lap is indicated by dotted lines, it is best to determine this by placing one corresponding leg on top of the other, as in Fig. 5, and marking directly. The assembled pairs of legs are notched to fit together as in Fig. 2 and then the top is glued to the leg tenons.





### **Chugging Catches Walleyes**

Walleyes lie in wait for minnows near the bottom of the water and chugging with this combination of natural and artificial bait usually results in a good catch. To assemble a chugging lure, first take a heavy sinker-one large enough to carry the line to the bottom - and scrape it bright. After tying the sinker to the end of the line, attach two small strips of cloth at the upper end of the sinker, one white and the other red. Then fasten a single or treble hook to the lower ring of the sinker. The hook is baited with a minnow, frog, worms or pork rind. To chug, allow the boat to drift while raising and lowering the bait slowly so that it touches the bottom about every two feet. Sometimes varying the movements, slow to fast, gives good results.-R. A. Jenkins, St. Louis, Mo.



When fitting overlapping or flush-type matched cabinet doors, I save a lot of time by hanging them as a single door. To do this, I first cut the plywood to fit the entire opening, allowing for clearance at top and bottom. If the doors are to overlap the opening, I rabbet the inside edges and round the outside edges. Next, I partially form individual doors by sawing part way in from the top and bottom edges, as shown in the detail, stopping the cuts about 3 in. apart. If fixed shelves are already in the cabinet, the uncut portion of the panel should come at a point between the shelves so that they do not interfere with completing the cut later. Unless a narrow-gauge blade is used, a fine-tooth handsaw is preferred to a power saw to obtain a close-fitting joint between the doors. Next; I fasten the offset part of all four hinges to the rear side of the panel and complete hinging it to the cabinet after shimming it snugly in the opening with cardboard. Finally, I saw through the uncut part to make two separate doors and sand the edges.




# BRING EM BACK




Designed to hook over the transom of a row-boat, this convenient live box rides partially submerged to assure the fish you catch a constant supply of fresh water. Being located at the rear of the boat, the box will not impose any appreciable drag when rowing. Construction details show how it is assembled. Redwood is the most durable wood to use, although pine will do. The rounded side of the box is covered with hardware cloth and trimmed with molding. Flat-iron brackets, which hook over the transom at the top, fit in sockets at the bottom and are anchored with retaining pins. Note that the cover is made large enough to overlap the opening on all three sides.


# Novel Igloo Incinerator of Troweled Concrete Combines Both Utility and Attractiveness



Wish you could burn rubbish in the back yard without having an old oil drum or other eyesore cluttering up the place? Then, here's just the thing for you an attractive concrete incinerator that will do the job and always present a neat appearance. The base of the unit is poured in a sheet-metal or linoleum form. A wooden form for the igloo is made as shown, and this is covered with expanded metal lath, except over the firedoor and smoke-hole openings. Galvanized iron is used for the smoke-hole form and also to support the concrete over the fire-door frame. Then, cement is troweled over the lath to a 4-in. thickness. The wooden forms may be burned away later.

### Pull Cord Attached to Toggle Switch Permits Operation by Small Children

If a young voice exclaiming, "Daddy, please turn on the light for me," frequently interrupts your browsing through the evening paper, you'll like this idea of W. Wild of St. Louis, Mo. He attached a pull cord to the toggle wall switch so the chil-



dren could turn on the lights by themselves. To do this, the top screw of the switch plate is replaced with a wooden pulley, as shown in the detail. Note the sheet-metal guard that keeps the cord from jumping off the pulley. Next, a small screw eye is turned into the side of the toggle switch. One piece of colored cord is looped over the pulley and tied to the upper part of the screw eye. Then, a shorter length of cord is tied to the lower part of the screw eye, and tassels are fastened to the dangling ends of the cord. This arrangement does not interfere with the normal operation of the switch, and the children soon learn to pull the cord to turn the lights on or off.


### Substitute for Bucktail Flies

For those who prefer to tie their own trout flies and bass bugs, woodchuck (ground-hog) tail hair will serve as an excellent substitute for bucktail hair. This is very similar to bucktail hair and works just as well. To tan woodchuck tails, first remove the tail bone and tack the tail, flesh side out, in a cool, dry place. Then rub salt into the flesh side of the tail. When the tail is dry, pack it in a glass jar along with naphtha flakes or cedar shavings to protect against possible damage by moths.

Attached and removed with a few turns of two wing nuts, this mounting bracket permits a lightweight outboard motor to be operated at maximum efficiency on almost any canoe. As the motor is held well out to one side of the canoe, full benefit of steering, tilting and reversing features is attained. The unit is constructed entirely of 34-in, oak. The crosspiece is 2 in. wide and long enough to project about 1 in. over one side of the canoe and 10 in. over the other. The motor mount is a 6 by 10-in. piece of wood, screwed to the crosspiece at an angle and braced by two triangu-

lar flat-iron brackets bolted in place. The crosspiece is slotted to take two hooks which are tightened with wing nuts so that the bracket is held securely to the gun-

wales. The hooks can be made by cutting the heads from long bolts and bending the unthreaded portion to shape. A coat of marine varnish will preserve the wood.


### Baking Soda Removes Stains On Rare China

Those who take pride in their collection of rare china will welcome this handy tip for removing tea and coffee stains from hairline cracks. First, apply ordinary baking soda, slightly moistened, to the area that is stained. Let stand for about one hour and wipe off. If one application does not remove the stain completely, repeat the treatment.

While beating ingredients in a bowl with one hand and adding material with the other, the bowl can be prevented from slipping by placing it on a folded towel.

### Improvised Woodworkers' Clamp Assembled From Scrap Parts

An inexpensive bar clamp can be improvised from two lengths of iron rod, two pieces of flat iron, two nuts, two washers and a couple of cotter pins. Thread one end of each of the rods to take a nut and drill a series of holes along




each rod to permit inserting cotter pins. Then drill two holes in each of the flat-iron pieces to fit over the rods. In use, the top piece of flat iron is held in place by washers and cotter pins, and the lower piece is tightened with the nuts. The length of the rods, the number and spacing of the holes determine the over-all width of work the clamp will handle. Make the thread length equal to the distance between the cotter-pin holes.

# Build "GOLD RUSH OF '47"

### the A.M.A. Open Class B record holder



IN RESPONSE to many requests, Popular Mechanics
presents the plans on how to build the famed model speed plane "Gold Rush of '47"—the A.M.A. Open Class B record inclusion holder which blazed across the contest piece fields of last year at a speed of 134.91 m.p.h. as it will to construction is so very simple that its

record is all the more impressive.

Fuselage: Begin by selecting two pieces of clear white pine to be used as the top and bottom halves. Cut to the rough dimensions with allowance at each end for waste and face off one side of each piece. Then glue the laced sides together with a sheet of thin paper between so they can be easily separated later. Carefully locate center points on the joint. Mount in the lathe rough-turn and mark off stations at sections A-A to Gi G inclusive, Fig. 2. Then, using a cutoff teat and calipers, cut the fuselage down to size at each station. Remove the waste to depth between the stations, and finish with fine sandpaper. Finally, face off the most of the fuselage square. Remove from the lathe and cut off the waste at the ends by hand. From a point rughly halfway between sections D-D and L-E, plane a fee on each bide of the fuselage to section G.G. Then separate the piece into the original halves by running a knife blade along the joint, and sand the joining faces to remove the glue and paper.

face of each half of the fuselage and carefully check the dimensions with

the plans. See Fig. 2, sections A-A to G-G inclusive. Pick the straightest-grained piece for the bottom balf of the fuselage as it will bear the lad. Now, draw in all lines indicating wall thickness and location of engine bearers. Back of the engine well, hollow the bottom half to a uniform wall thickness of 18 in. The engine section gets a different process. The original ship was powered by a McCoy 49 engine and dimensions are given for this particular power plant. As the width at the base of the engine mounting lugs is 1½ in., measure % in. on each side of the center line and draw lines parallel with the center line from the rear of the engine well to the nose of the ship. The area between these lines is recessed to a depth of 1316 in. at the rear and slowly tapered up in depth to conform to the shape of the fuselage at the nose. Wall thickness from a point directly under the engine to the forward end of the fuselage should be at least ¼ in. Hollow the top half to a uniform 1/8-in. wall thickness and finish the two halves smoothly on the inside with sandpaper so that the bulkheads will fit snugly.

Next, make the magnesium crutch, Fig. 2, by first scribing the layout lines on the magnesium sheet. Saw out the openings

in the center but do not finish-file the outside until the crutch has been mounted in the fuselage. Cut away the bottom half of the fuselage to receive the crutch in a smooth, snug fit. Then drill and tap mounting holes as shown in Fig. 2. After mounting the crutch, file the outside edges flush with the wood. Next, attach the 1/16-in. magnesium landing skid to the underside of the bottom half as in Fig. 2, running the tie bolts through both the crutch and skid in a trial fit. Then, remove the crutch and skid from the shell and fit the wooden bulkheads.

The 1/4-in.-wide magnesium brace at the nose can be formed




um or, cut a ring from a piece of tubing and split it in half. Drill and tap the brace for a screw which comes up through the forward end of the skid. This brace is mounted on the crutch by means of two 2-56 machine screws. Nut plates, section B-B, Fig. 2, are cut from 1/8-in. duralumin and are drilled and tapped to fit the engine mounting bolts. Use 3-48 machine screws for attaching the plates to bottom of the crutch.


Wing: The wing, Figs. 2 and 3, is made in one piece. Location of the ribs, Fig. 3, and the half spar are indicated on the bottom sheet of 1/16-in. balsa wood by drawing the outline directly on the wood. Then cement the ribs in place. Now, install the maple half spar shown in Fig. 4. This forms a rigid support on which the control plate, Figs. 4 and 6, is mounted. Drill a No. 10 hole in the half spar and wing bottom to aid the installation of the control plate later, and cut curved slots for the control-plate tabs.







Then glue the top skin over the ribs. Wing tips are made from scrap balsa and merely close the opening at the outer ends of the wing. Two ½-in. pieces of ½6-in. o.d. aluminum tubing are installed for controlwire guides. See the plan view, Fig. 2. Control wires can be installed in either the right or left wing.

Cover the wing with silk to give an extremely smooth contour, and coat the wing surface with a sealer. To install the wing, measure % in. up from the fuselage center line to the leading and trailing edges of the wing center section, Fig. 2, making sure that the 0-deg. incidence is accurate. The leading edge of the wing should be 41/2 in. from the nose. Draw the approximate rib profile on each side and cut out with a sharp knife or coping saw. Try the wing and trim the opening to fit. After the wing is correctly located and cemented in place, continue the hole in the bottom of the wing and half spar through the top of the fuselage. Then, make the control plate, Fig. 6, and install on the bottom surface of the wing as in Figs. 4 and 5, inserting the bolt through the top of the fuselage and locking it in place with a staple made from 1/32in. wire. The prongs of the staple are forced into the top of the fuselage on each side of the bolt head, and the straight section enters the slot in the head to prevent the bolt from turning. Finally, make the block and fitting to hold the bicycle-spoke tie-down which anchors the leading edge of the wing. In the profile view, Fig. 2, these parts are shown in section just forward of the fuel tank and leading edge of the center section of the wing.

Tail section: The stabilizer is made of ½16-in. mahogany or aircraft plywood and the elevator is balsa, edged with a maple strip, Fig. 5. The elevator hinge is made from two pieces of aircraft linen, ½ in. wide and 9 in. long, sewn together down the center of the cloth. Glue the hinge in place before making and installing the control horn and cover, Figs. 5 and 6. At this time, install the piano-wire control cable between the control plate and elevator horn, bending the wire to fit.

Engine cowling: A carefully made cowl, Figs. 1, 2 and 7, gives efficient engine cooling which results in a smoother-running engine. First, mount the base block on the fuselage and then cement the sides in place, holding them in position with pins. Make sure the top block is correctly re-









cessed for the cylinder-head fins and spark plug or glow plug, and also that it is grooved for the high-tension wire or glowplug lead. Place the engine in the bottom shell and mount the top half of the fuselage to determine height of the top block. Allow the block to rest on the head and cement it in place on the side panels. Where the cowl meets the fuselage, fill in to a smooth contour with wood putty. Sand all over and cover the cowl with silk. Next, make the fuel tank, Figs. 8 and 9, and test for leaks. Then install the engine and all accessories in the lower half of the fuselage as in Fig. 10. The take-off dolly, Fig. 8, is easily made, the important thing being to adjust the wheels so that it rolls straight when pushed.

Finish: All surfaces should be filled and

sprayed with synthetic enamel.

Flying: Use a 3-1 methanol and castoroil mixture. If using spark ignition, setting on the point gap should be .003 in. maximum. Start with a 9-in.-dia. 10-in.pitch prop, true the pitch to approximately 10½ in. and make an accurate airfoil shape for the blades. With the plane at rest, the engine should turn 14,500 r.p.m. minimum.

# Anchor Held in Raised Position On Outside of Boat



Wet, muddy anchors may be kept on the outside of a small boat by belaying them in the manner shown. Insert an eyebolt through the gunwale of the boat and attach the anchor rope with a snap hook. To hold the anchor in the raised position, loop the rope under the eye of the bolt, bring it up to the top of the gunwale and then under the portion of rope holding the anchor. The weight of the anchor will keep the rope from slipping. Drop the anchor by pulling on the dangling loop of rope.



### Ruler Markings Renewed With Rubber-Stamp Pad



lightly with a cloth. The ink will remain only in the calibrations making them clearly visible. Repeat the operation if needed.


### Discardable Glue Brushes Cut From Scrubbing Brush

Then he drilled a ¼-in.-dia. hole, ¼ in. deep, directly over each tuft, and after sawing the squares apart along the lines, glued a 2-in. length of ¼-in. dowel in each of the holes to serve as a handle.






the wide brim of a sombrero, which is a feature of the design as are the V-notches regularly spaced along the top edges of sloping members. The rope decoration on the mitered spacers, Fig. 1, can be omitted without detracting from the appearance.

Another portable rack designed especially for the individual bike is pictured and detailed in Fig. 2. Its construction is similar to the first rack and the finish is the same except for variations in the enamel colors on the jigsawed bird that mounts guard at the head of the rack. Top edges of the long horizontal members, and also the head board, are V-notched at regular

intervals in the same manner as are the sloping members of the four-place rack in Fig. 1. Bandsawed feet are attached to the horizontal members to hold the rack firmly in the upright position.


The permanent rack, Fig. 3, can be made to accommodate either one, two, three or four bikes as required. Set the center post in concrete and slot the top end for a horse's head which is sawed to profile from the cross-hatched detail in Fig. 3. Then add as many racks as desired, following the assembly plan in Fig. 3. Paint the head brown, bridle white, and the balance of the rack a contrasting color.

### Adjustable Truss for Garage Ceiling Joist Prevents Buckling Walls



The walls of a hip or gable-roofed garage or small barn can be kept from buckling by installing one or more ceiling joists and fastening this flat-iron truss under each joist. Also, with these trusses in place the space between the joists and rafters may be used for storage without danger of sagging the joists and bulging the side walls inward. The truss consists of four lengths of flat iron, two of which are bolted to the joist and rafter at each plate. These points are reinforced with pieces of sheet metal. At the center of the rafter, the flat-iron strips are bolted to a tension adjustment which is assembled from pipe fittings and a bolt with double nuts, as shown.

## Reversing Fan Position Accelerates Cooling



Experiments conducted by Westinghouse Electric Corp. have shown that the cooling power of an electric fan can be increased as much as 75 percent on a sweltering night. This is done by setting the fan in front of an open window to blow air out the window. In one typical test, a nonoscillating, 16-in. portable fan, placed to blow air into a room, reduced room temperature only eight degrees, from 84 to 76, in two hours' time. But when the same fan was turned around, the temperature in the room was lowered from 86 to 72 degrees in the same period of time, a drop of 14 degrees. The distance the fan is placed back from the window should be about 1½ times the width of the opening. Thus, if the opening is 2 ft. wide, the fan should be placed 3 ft. from the window.

This increase in efficiency is explained as being the result of an air stream set up by the fan. As the air stream rushes to the window, it draws with it additional air from the room. This causes greater amounts of cool air to enter through other open windows to replace the warm air exhausted from the room. As warm air will concentrate in the path leading to the fan, it is not advisable to place the fan in the room you are trying to cool. The windows through which the warm air will be expelled and the cool air drawn in should be carefully selected to take advantage of natural air movement through the room.



## Bringing Out Scribe Lines on Metal With Discarded Hypo Solution


When working with copper, brass or bronze and it is difficult to see the scribed layout, try polishing the metal and swabbing it with photographic hypo solution. The hypo will deposit a thin white film on the metal when dry, bringing out the scribed lines clearly when the hypo is wiped from the surface.

¶The tendency of furnace pipes to rust in a damp basement during summer months can be avoided to some extent by burning papers in the firebox ten or twelve times throughout the season. This replaces the moist air in the pipes with dry air.




## Removal of Roller-Chain Pins Simplified by Repair Block



The pins of bicycle and motorcycle roller chains
are removed easily without straining the links or
rollers if the chain
is mounted in a
repair block made
of hardwood
scraps. The block
consists of two

side pieces fastened to a center piece, allowing enough room below the chain for the pins to be driven out. Small wooden spacer blocks are slipped between the rollers to hold the chain in position. All of the blocks must be the same thickness in order to keep the rollers and links parallel.

Did you ever find yourself badly in need of a fire when miles away from the nearest shelter, and discover that although the matches were dry, there was no dry wood available? At times, such a situation could have serious consequences, and for this reason, it's an excellent idea to carry several fire rolls on every hunting or fishing trip. These fire rolls are easy to make and their cost is negligible. Just fold a few sheets of newspaper four times and roll them up tightly. Fasten the rolled paper with pieces of light wire spaced an inch or two apart along its length. After cutting the paper into 3-in. rolls, soak it in paraffin melted in a double boiler. Then, remove the rolls from the paraffin and allow them to harden. Place a couple of these rolls in your hunting-coat pocket or tackle box, and when you need a fire in a hurry, pile small twigs and larger branches over one of the rolls and light it. The resulting hot flame, which burns for 5 minutes or more, will ignite the twigs easily. The twigs will dry and ignite the branches, giving you a good fire even in a moderate rain. If the twigs are very wet, use two fire rolls.



### Fence Wire Used as Floor In Garage Attic

Besides being cheaper than wood flooring, I found that wire fencing made an excellent floor for the attic over my garage as it not only prevented dust and dirt from collecting, but also afforded a view from below of the items stored. I left the center unfloored for access by ladder.



## PORTABLE "SCREENED PORCH" FOR BABY


## PARTY MAGIC

By Bill Turner

WE AREN'T going to show you how to pull a rabbit from a hat as Johnny Jones, professional magician, is doing above, but some of the following tricks are just as mystifying and can be executed expertly with very little practice and concentration. No special apparatus or stage props are needed, as all the stunts are performed with common articles that are always handy. Some of the tricks are real posers and, if skillfully done, will prove just as baffling to your audience as some involved stunts which require special magic equipment.

As a good example, try this stunt, a favorite of Joe Berg, inventor of tricks. It's done with three empty glass tumblers which are placed in a row on a table. Then, asking the spectators to watch carefully, take a glass in each hand and quickly give them both an end-over-end half-turn, Fig. 1. This movement is repeated twice, always turning two glasses at once. Finally, all the glasses are mouth up. Now turn the center

glass mouth down and challenge a spectator to try it. But try as he will, the spectator cannot bring the three glasses mouth up by turning two at a time. Here's where you take over, rearranging the tumblers and successfully repeating the performance in a few quick moves. After reading the simple secret below, practice a few minutes and try this trick at the next party. You'll have everybody in the place turning tumblers and scratching his head, wondering how it's done. The idea is to start with the end glasses mouth down and the center one mouth up, but when the spectator is invited to try, the two end glasses are placed mouth up and the center one mouth down. The trick derives its mystery from something besides a mere secret. Its success depends to a large extent on a slick presentation, Fig. 2, and also on skill in deception. This is achieved by planning the talk and action to focus attention on the routine, which keeps the audience watching for an extra turn or some other secret



manipulation that will reveal the trick. By this time, the guests will be asking for more. So borrow a man's handkerchief and proceed to push a small object right through the cloth without leaving a hole in it. First, place the handkerchief over your left hand, doubled loosely into a fist, and poke a pocket into the center of the handkerchief with the right forefinger. At the same time, the right middle finger is secretly extended. Then the left fingers are opened slightly so that the right middle finger can enter the left fist, carrying a fold of cloth with it to form an opening that is unknown to the spectators. Fig. 3 shows this with the fingers slightly opened and Fig. 4 shows how it appears with the fingers closed. Now pick up a pencil, cigarette, or other small object, and place it in the secret opening, holding it in place with the left fingers. To the audience, it appears that the object has been placed in the pocket. Then say a few words of magic, release the grip of the left fingers, and the object drops through the opening in the handkerchief to the floor. But to the attentive spectators, it appears to pass through the solid center of the hankerchief.


Another trick that calls for quick sleight of hand is shown in Figs. 5 and 6. The sequence of this thimble trick begins with the thimble on the forefinger of the right

hand. Point this finger to the left and touch the thimble to the end of the left forefinger. Draw the hands apart, rather quickly. Then repeat the action and this time the thimble appears to jump, quite magically, to the left finger tip, Fig. 6, B and C. The deception depends upon easy, swift manipulation of the thimble plus control of the attention of the audience—a technique professional magicians call "misdirection." The last three fingers of each hand are folded loosely into the palms, while the thumbs are held parallel with the first fingers and are kept out of sight of the audience. As the fingers touch, the tip of the left thumb is near the thimble. The first time the fingers are pulled apart nothing happens except that you follow the thimble on the right finger with your eyes. This serves to misdirect the attention of the

spectators and is an important part of the deception. Now, moving a little slower than before, touch the fingers again, as in Fig. 6, A. Slide the inside of the left forefinger tip against the thimble and secretly seize the thimble between the left thumb and left finger tip, pulling it off the right finger. Bending the left forefinger slightly, push forward on the thimble with the left thumb, and it will flip onto the left finger quite easily. But be sure to follow the right finger with the eyes just as before, Fig. 5. Thus the spectators' attention is directed to the finger and they never see the flipping motion which transfers the thimble.

This one will require practice.


Here are three more party tricks which have not been illustrated because they are so very easy to follow. For the first one, obtain a number of spools of colored thread and select six or eight of these of sharply contrasting colors. With these you can perform a puzzling feat of divination. While your back is turned, have a spectator select one of the spools. Next, have him place this spool in your hands, which are held behind your back, and put the other spools in his pocket. Then, apparently by sense of touch alone, you name the color of the spool you hold. Here's the way the trick is worked. When the spectator has put the spool in your hands, turn to face the audience. Quickly and unobtrusively break off a short length of thread from the spool, wad it up, and insert it under the nail of the middle finger of your right hand. In the meantime, distract the attention of the audience by talking about the strange powers of divination. Even ask the spectator to help by concentrating on the color he selected. While talking, bring the right hand out from behind your back and point a finger at the spectators in a natural gesture. This provides an opportunity to glimpse the color of the thread under the fingernail. Do this very subtly, bringing the hand in line with the eyes so it does not attract the attention of those who are watching every move.

Most tricks should never be repeated, but here's one to perform at the dinner table that becomes more baffling with repetition. If there is a dish of olives, select four of them with the right hand, palming one and dropping three on the table in front of you. Hold the concealed olive in the crook of the second and third fingers, keeping the hand in a natural, relaxed position with its back toward the audience. Then pick up one of the three olives from the table, taking it between the right thumb and forefinger. Place it in the palm of the left hand and close the left fingers over it. Do this quickly but openly so that everyone sees just what is done. Then pick

up another olive and put this second olive into the left palm in the same way as the first. At the same time, secretly drop the palmed olive into the left hand and immediately close the fingers. Then pick up the third olive, saying that you will put it into your pocket. Go through the motions of putting it in the right-hand coat pocket, but palm the olive instead. Then, as the final gesture, open the left hand and drop the three olives on the table, saying that the one placed in the pocket has mysteriously joined the others. As the fourth olive remains palmed in the right hand, you are ready to repeat the trick. Most audiences will give up trying to guess and ask how it's done.

Finally, here's a number puzzler which is rare in that it does not appear to depend upon trick figuring as such stunts usually do. To the audience, there seems to be no possible explanation for the feat of prophecy which the magician accomplishes. Write a number, as explained later, on a piece of paper. Then fold the paper and hand it to a spectator for safekeeping. No one but you knows what is written. Now look over the audience and purposely ask a stranger to write certain figures in a column. These are the number of years he has been married, the year of his birth, his age, and the year he was married. The spectator is asked to add the column of figures and read the total. It will be found that this total and the figure written on the paper are exactly the same. It works this way. The total of the stranger's age in years, birth year, number of years married, and the year he was married is certain to equal twice the figure of the current year. In other words, if the year is 1948, the figure 3896 would be the prophecy.

### **Handle for Heavy Bundles**



Heavy bundles of paper or cartons tied with rope or wire can be carried with ease by using this snap-on handle. The handle consists of a short length of pipe having a diameter that affords a good grip. A piece of stiff wire is inserted through the pipe and the ends

of the wire are bent hook-shaped. Then, an ordinary harness snap is fastened to each hook. To carry a bundle, just clip the harness snaps to the binding.


### Length of Dog's Tether Adjusted With Tent-Rope Tightener



In order to protect his plants and shrubs, one man frequently finds it necessary to vary the length of his dog's tether when the animal is staked in different parts of the yard. To adjust the tether, he uses a tent-rope tightener made from a short length of dowel by drilling a hole through it near each end.

### **Fuller Ball Covers Grease Fitting**

The grease fittings on a car or piece of machinery are protected from damage and kept free of dirt if they are covered with ordinary fuller balls. This type of washer fits snugly over the



tip of the fitting and is easily removed for greasing. One end of the ball should be plugged to prevent dirt from entering.

## Screwdriver From Key Blank





## LUBRICATING YOUR AUTO

Good lubrication of the auto engine means more than just adding a quart of new oil occasionally. Like all other common servicing operations, it calls for scheduled attention to important details



In a full-pressure oil system, oil is pumped directly to the crankshaft and connecting-rod bearings; also to the camshaft and piston rings. In engines with overhead valves, oil is pumped to rocker-arm shaft



LTHOUGH good engine lubrication represents only a small percentage of the average yearly cost of operating a car, there is more to it than merely adding a quart of oil now and then. Oil in the crankcase gradually becomes contaminated with certain acids and mildly abrasive particles. Just how rapidly the oil becomes contaminated to a point where it is injurious to the engine and should be replaced, depends much on the driverlength of trips, choking, etc.—and on atmospheric conditions. In some cases it may be possible to drive as much as two or three thousand miles without changing oil, while in other cases it may be advisable to change at 500 miles or less.

For example, in a car that is driven only a mile or two at a time in winter, such as on shopping trips, moisture condenses inside the crankcase each time the motor cools, some of it reaching the oil. Combustion gases passing the pistons mix with the moisture and form a mild sulphuric acid, which pits the bearings, pistons and

cylinder walls.

An oil filter does not remove moisture, acid or gasoline. It will remove most solid contaminating and abrasive agents, such as dust, metal and rust particles from the engine, gummy residues from leaded fuels, etc. However, even with an oil filter and a carburetor air cleaner, the oil should be changed at regular intervals, length of the intervals being determined by the operating habits of the driver, distances the car is driven regularly, season of the year and condition of the roads on which the car is operated most of the time.




Wash breather cap in gasoline at regular intervals. Then coat the element with a heavy motor oil

## ENGINE


Check the oil level frequently and refill. When checking the oil level after a long drive, wait for the oil to drain back into the oil pan to get the true reading. If the oil appears discolored or if there are indications of water, drain, flush and refill with new lubricant



One method often suggested for determining oil-change periods is to test the oil for contamination, especially acid content, at regular intervals over a period of time, and from this data work out an oil-changing schedule for both winter and summer.

A lubricating oil has to perform several separate jobs in protecting the engine from excessive wear. It must lubricate moving parts and reduce friction to a minimum, Figs. 1 and 2. The oil also acts as a coolant in carrying off heat from the cylinders and the bearings. In addition, it seals engine compression by providing an oil film between the pistons and the cylinder walls. Some oils also act as cleansing agents by removing dirt and carbon from the working parts of the motor.


Always use a high-quality motor oil of the correct viscosity for the particular engine, selecting it according to the type of operation and season of the year. Oils are now available for various kinds of operating conditions. Usually these are designated as regular, premium and heavy-duty grades. The regular-type motor oil is satisfactory for average use in a passenger car. However, regular grades do not ordinarily contain oxidation inhibitors (additives) which aid in preventing sudden breakdown of the oil under exceptionally severe operating conditions. For constant hot-running conditions, such as mountain travel and long runs in summer heat, where motor oil tends to break down rapidly, a premium-type oil should be used. This contains a chemical (additive) which resists breakdown of the oil by oxidation, thus preventing undue sludge formation and bearing corrosion. Heavy-duty motor oils contain not only additives, but also detergent agents which cleanse the engine parts of solid deposits and tend to keep sludge dissolved in the oil. Generally, this special grade is required only for trucks and other heavy-duty engines, but it can be used in passenger-car engines subjected to severe operating conditions. When using these special oils for the first time. the crankcase should be drained after 300

to 500 miles, as the first filling will rapidly collect crankcase waste and sludge. It is not advisable to mix different kinds of pre-

mium lubricating oils.

For best results, engine operating temperatures should never be lower than 140 deg. or more than 180 deg. F., and preferably should be between 160 and 180 deg. F. The proper operating temperature is important as it affects the efficiency of the lubricating system. Clean the cooling system regularly of rust and other loose deposits by a thorough back flushing. A loose fan belt may cause overheating and overloading of the cooling system. If the engine runs too cool in cold weather, cover a portion of the radiator. When starting a cold engine, remember that most engine wear takes place during the warming-up period, especially if the engine is raced idle or put under load immediately after starting. When temperatures are below 70 deg., it is good driving practice to allow the engine to warm up before driving the car. After stopping, oil drains rapidly from the working parts when the engine is warm and because of this the bearing surfaces will be relatively dry when the engine is started again. These bearing and sliding surfaces run dry until oil from the pump reaches them. The small quantity of oil left on the bearing surfaces will not stand up under heavy loads or high speeds. Be sure that the automatic choke is working properly as a rich fuel mixture causes dilution of the crankcase oil.

Poor crankcase ventilation, especially in a cold-running engine, will cause extra condensation of water in the crankcase. Short runs in cold weather aggravate this condition. Check and clean the crankcase ventilator openings, Fig. 4, at regular intervals. Wash the filler cap in gasoline and then reoil. An efficient oil filter is helpful in maintaining a clean oil supply, provided the filter element is replaced regularly. However, a filter does not eliminate the need for a regular oil drain; it simply per-

mits the extension of time between drainings. Always renew the filter element when changing to a premium grade of oil. An oil that looks clean may contain too much acid and fine abrasives for safe lubrication. Only a complete draining, flushing and oil renewal will provide ade-

quate protection.

As the cost of a complete oil change is small compared to the yearly bill for gasoline, repairs, storage, etc., it pays to drain and flush the engine oiling system at least twice a year-spring and fall. Without an efficient filter, draining should be done more often. Because some oil remains trapped in the oiling system when draining, flush the crankcase at each draining. Use a flushing oil, which has the properties of a light lubricant, to eliminate any danger of the bearings running dry during the flushing process. Always drain the oil when hot and be sure the drain plug is replaced tightly. See that the plug gasket, Fig. 6, is in good condition. Check the oil level, Fig. 5, after the engine has run awhile. Remember that the filter takes about a quart. When checking the oil level, allow time for the oil to drain back to the crankcase to get an accurate reading. In both new and reconditioned engines, a light-grade lubricating oil should be added to the gasoline for upper-cylinder lubrication. Too heavy an oil may foul the plugs and cause extra deposits of carbon and gum around the valves, pistons, etc.

Generator and starting-motor bearings, Fig. 7, if provided with oil cups, require a few drops of light motor oil at regular intervals. Clean the cups before oiling to prevent dirt getting into the bearings. Do not overlubricate. Use a high-temperature grease in the distributor-shaft grease cup, Fig. 8, and put a few drops of oil on the felt pad under the rotor. A light smear of grease on the rotating cam face will save wear in the breaker assembly. Waterpump lubrication varies, and some have bearings that do not require lubrication. Use a medium oil in the water-pump oil cups and a special water-pump grease in the grease cups. This grease will resist heat and the dissolving action of water. As with all moving parts, do not overlubri-

cate the water pump.


The fans on some engines require separate lubrication. Use a small amount of chassis lubricant for fans having pressure-type fittings, and a motor oil for those having sump-type lubrication.

¶If your car won't start due to the ignition system being wet, try sprinkling carbon tetrachloride over the distributor, coil and spark plugs. This usually will permit the motor to be started immediately.

### Suspended from the ceiling of a studio living room or informal dining room, this unusual fixture conveys a feeling of pioneer days to your cabin or ranch-type home. It's especially appropriate if western-style architecture and furnishings prevail in the room. The yoke can be bandsawed from a 2 or 3-in.-thick piece of wood, preferably oak, to the size indicated in the squared pattern. The bows may be bent by steaming them and clamping in shape, and they are fastened to the yoke by means of wedges, as shown. Hickory, if available, is excellent wood for the bows. The fixture is held to the ceiling with two lengths of chain which are attached to eyes in the yoke. Although these parts on the original were taken from an old lighting fixture, threaded brass tubing and eyes can be purchased for this purpose. The yoke is drilled to take the tubing and the eyes for the chain and light are turned on each

end of this. Then, a lantern-type light, which is attached to the lower eye, is wired through the tubing and along the chain to




### Patching Small Holes in Walls

## Shelf Brackets Are Mass-Produced in Plastic With This Simple Four-Piece Wooden Mold





Crystal-clear or bril-liantly colored plastic provides distinctive brackets for glass shelves. If Lucite, Plexiglas or other heat-forming plastic is used, it's easy to bend brackets of a variety of interesting designs in a simple wooden mold. The mold is made by nailing two strips of wood to a plywood base to form a right angle, as shown. Then, a square piece of plywood is jigsawed for the scroll and the edges of this same piece are used to form the angle part of the bracket against the wooden strips. The hook to retain the shelf at the end of the angle piece is bent over a dowel and held in place with a small wooden block. For the brackets pictured, ¼ by ½-in. plastic was used for the angle piece, and 1/8 by 1/2in. material for the scroll. The parts of each bracket are cemented together or held with ornamental drivescrews, and the vertical leg is drilled to take wood screws for attaching the unit to a wall.


Extension Lamp for Workbench Supported by Coat Hanger

Suspended by a bracket bent from a coat hanger, an ordinary drop-cord lamp will provide ample light at any point on your workbench top. A cork, which has been drilled slightly smaller than the drop cord and grooved around the side, is slipped over the cord. Then, a wire coat hanger is bent around the cork, as shown, and is hung from a nail or hook driven into the wall above the bench. Several nails or hooks placed at intervals along the wall permit the light to be moved as needed. The light is adjusted to the desired height by pulling the cord through the cork.




## BE CAREFUL

Although the electrical circuit in this unit is not dangerous if handled correctly, you must keep in mind that the power output is 2000 volts, which, if passed through your body under certain conditions, might prove fatal. When testing the unit, stand on a dry, nonconductive surface. Before touching any parts of the circuit inside the case, switch off the power supply and "short" the terminals of the condenser to discharge it, using a screwdriver having an insulated handle. In operation, unless picture exposures are made within a few seconds of each other, always remember to turn off the switch and then flash the bulb, after taking each picture, to discharge the energy remaining in the condenser. Keep wiring and cables in good order



THOUSANDS of photo flashes of brilliant sunlight quality and positive uniformity at a fraction of a cent per flash—that's what you get in this battery-operated, high-speed flash unit. The speed shot, Fig. 1, of a light bulb being shattered by a rifle bullet is a good example of what can be done in high-speed flash photography. Synchronization of the speed light to the





High-speed shot of a lamp bulb being shattered by rifle bullet

shutter of the camera is simple because the total duration of the flash is only ½5,000 second. This makes a high-speed camera unnecessary; excellent photographs can be taken with any low-priced camera equipped with a solenoid or used with the open-shut method of exposure. Being battery-operated, the unit can be used anywhere. Completely assembled it weighs less than 10 lbs., and is adaptable to your present flash gun (with

To prepare the transformer for rewinding first remove the bolts and brackets and also the iron core


batteries) without disturbing synchronization or hindering normal operation in any way. A high-voltage switch or relay is used in its circuit, making it impossible to come in contact with the 2000 volts in normal operation. All electrical units are housed in a metal case which assures further safety to the operator because it makes a perfect electrical shield. The condenser charges quickly enough to allow a maximum of a flash every four seconds, which is faster than a series of shots normally can be taken under average conditions.

Fully charged batteries will give about 100 flashes of the single high-speed glow lamp. In operation, a high-voltage condenser stores energy. When ready to utilize this stored energy, the capacitor (condenser) is discharged through the flash bulb, giving off an intense blue-white light. The relay acts as a magnetic switch while the rheostat and the output transformer are used solely in the synchronization of


any between-the-lens shutter.

Rewinding the transformer: A standard a.c. transformer is rewound for this unit.

Loosen the primary winding by carefully working a screwdriver between primary and secondary windings





It has a 2½-volt filament winding which is unnecessary when using a cold-cathode rectifier tube. (The CK 1013 tube is used to minimize current consumption from the battery.) Remove bolts and mounting brackets, then remove the iron core from the transformer, Fig. 4. Take off the outer insulating material and carefully lift aside the high-voltage leads. Unwind the filament winding from the coil, Fig. 5, being careful not to damage the high-voltage secondary winding. After this is done, the high-voltage leads are replaced in their original position and taped down. The next step, Fig. 6, shows how to remove the primary winding of the transformer by carefully inserting a very small screwdriver all the way through between primary and secondary windings. Press the primary inward, and repeat this on all four sides of the coil until the primary is free and may be removed. The primary is mounted on a square cardboard form, which may be removed in the same manner. After the form has been removed, it is carefully bent back into shape and a wooden block is

Completed coil with the new primary winding in place ready for assembly into the core and brackets




New primary is inserted in the original secondary winding. Leads are insulated and all parts taped


then cut so that it will fit tightly into the paper form. This is done to prevent the form from losing its shape while the primary is rewound. Before rewinding, wind one layer of cellulose tape around the coil form. The primary is wound with two strands of No. 20 enameled copper wire wound parallel with each other in order to have the equivalent of a larger size wire but to minimize the thickness of the primary winding. When starting to wind, leave about 6 in. of wire projecting to serve as primary leads. Wind four turns, leave a large loop and twist this as in Fig. 7 for a center tap, then wind four more turns. Bend the center lead down, laying it parallel with the other two leads. Slip lengths of varnished cambric tubing over each of the three leads of the primary. Another layer of tape is then applied over the coil. Insert the primary, with its leads coming out the sides, back into the secondary winding, Fig. 8. Finally, remove the wooden form and wrap all original insulating material around the transformer coil. Now, replace the transformer core, Fig. 9, and





reassemble with bolts and brackets as in Fig. 10.

Assembly: Before assembling, have at hand all parts listed in Fig. 11. Note that in the box below Fig. 11, letters A, B, C, and so on, serve as key letters to locate the parts in the wiring diagram, Fig. 13. Actual layout of parts in the case is not important. It is only necessary to arrange them to occupy a minimum of space so as to leave ample room for the wiring. Build the case, Fig. 2, first, as it serves as a chassis on which all parts are mounted. Capacitors vary somewhat in size so make sure the case is large enough. To facilitate mounting of parts, the sides of the case are attached with metal screws so that they can be screwed in place after the electrical units are assembled inside. Since the capacitor is oil-impregnated, and no holes may be drilled in the housing or container, spot solder it into position. Fasten the high-voltage transformer to the case with mounting brackets, using 6-32 bolts and






The upper flange of the heat-bulb socket is cut off so that a length of brass tubing will fit over it


nuts. Make the L-shaped bracket of 16-ga. sheet metal as detailed in Fig. 3. Cut two holes, one to mount a miniature-series 7-pin tube socket which holds the CK 1013 rectifier tube, and the second, a larger hole, for the 7-prong wafer socket for the vibrator. After the socket has been mounted on the bracket, bolt the bracket to the case as in Fig. 12. Before mounting the relay, solder 6-in. leads on all the terminals. Mount the relay as in Fig. 12, using 6-32 bolts and nuts. The primary leads of the output transformer are cut short for they are unnecessary to the circuit. Then solder the transformer to the capacitor. Fasten the 6-ohm rheostat, the Howard B. Jones plug and the switch to the top of the case.

Wiring: The wiring is simple if the circuit diagram in Fig. 13 is carefully followed. All wiring in the power-supply unit should be done with a good grade of highvoltage radio test-prod-lead wire. The leads are further insulated by covering the wire with varnished cambric tubing to prevent any possibilities of leakage which would reduce the maximum output voltage. When connecting the secondary of the output transformer, use terminals No. 1 and its highest number to get maximum inductance of the winding. In order to transform d.c. current, it is necessary to use an interrupter. This vibrator, or interrupter, is the synchronous-type 7-prong, 2-volt vibrator commonly used in portable radios with rechargeable batteries. The contacts of the vibrators should be paralleled to give maximum current efficiency. It is wired as shown in the diagram, Fig. 13.

Socket assembly: The glow-lamp socket assembly is made up as in Figs. 14, 15 and 16. First, get a piece of chrome-plated tubing, 1% in. in diameter and 1 in. long, and also a screw base from a heat lamp with an oversize flange, Fig. 14. Break the glass in the base by wrapping the base with cloth




The length of brass tubing is then soldered to the heatbulb socket. Also see the detail below, Fig. 16




and striking lightly with a hammer. Remove the glass with pliers. Trim off the upright flange, leaving a disk or shoulder 13/16 in. in diameter, Fig. 16, so that the screw base will fit snugly inside the tubing. The socket is then soldered into one end of the tubing, Fig. 15. Drill a %-in. hole near the bottom of the tubing for the power cord to the glow lamp and synchronizer, Fig. 16. Insert a rubber grommet in the hole and feed the cable through this hole. Solder the outer shielding of the cable to the inside of the tubing. A short length of wire is then soldered, one end to the outer edge of the screw base and the other end to the tubing, to make the ground connection. The black lead of the cable is carefully skinned, covered with the cambric tubing, and then soldered to the center contact of the screw base, Fig. 16. Remove the No. 1 and No. 3 terminals of the 4-prong tube socket. The white lead of the cable is covered with insulation and soldered to the No. 4 pin of the socket. Then push varnished cambric tubing over the No. 4 pin, leaving no exposed socket connection. Solder a short length of wire to the No. 2 pin.

The other end is soldered to the tubing to make an electrical ground, Fig. 16. Fit the socket into the end of the brass tubing. Drill and tap two 6-32 threads, one opposite the No. 1 and the other opposite the No. 3 terminals. Fasten the 4-prong socket to the brass tubing by inserting short screws in the tapped holes. Make sure the screws are short so that they do not project through the prong holes of the 4-prong socket. Solder a male plug to one end of the power cord, Fig. 16. Do all the assembling and wiring before connecting the batteries into the circuit, which should be the last operation before testing. Many electricians keep one hand in a trouser pocket and use only one hand when testing or otherwise working inside the box after connecting the batteries. This helps avoid a possible shock by accidentally getting both hands in a position that would provide a path from one hand to the other for the high-voltage current.

Adjustment and operation: The unit is easily synchronized with the camera shutter without changing the adjustment of the solenoid tripper. The output transformer is used in conjunction with the rheostat in order to increase or decrease the time of the flash. By varying the rheostat, one may synchronize the speed light with the shutter by holding the light unit and reflector as closely as possible to the open back of the camera. A piece of thin paper is placed over the front element of the wide-open lens, with the shutter set at its fastest speed. Now press the button of the gun. You will probably see a "Y" or other odd-shaped light figure on the paper. Turn the rheostat to the left and try another flash. Repeat until you see a clear round spot of light the full diameter of the lens. If the rheostat is turned completely to the left and you still do not see the round spot of light, increase the distance of the contacts on the relay and repeat the test. (Caution: When working on the relay, be careful. Make sure the capacitor has been

shorted several times, before attempting any adjustment.) When the round spot is showing through the lens, the flash is perfectly synchronized with the shutter. Permanently set the control in this position. Make your own tests to determine the correct exposures, as various reflectors differ in their light-concentration and light-reflection qualities.

Battery charger: An efficient charger for the speed-light batteries is pictured and detailed in Figs. 17 and 18. Use a Thordarson (T-21F15, 7.5-volt) center-tapped transformer for the power source, and a small copper-oxide (dry-disk type) rectifier, Mallory (type IB8R, full-wave). Any make of transformer with a 110-volt primary, and with a 7.5-volt secondary center tapped (current rating, 2 amps.) may be used. The center tap on the secondary winding is very important because the oxide rectifier is only connected across one half the secondary winding. Another oxide rectifier may be connected, if desired, to the other half of the filament winding to charge two batteries at once instead of only one at a time, Fig. 18.

### Clothespin Handles on Reflectors Prevent Burned Fingers


After burning my fingers in adjusting hot photoflood reflectors, I clamped a couple of wooden clothespins to the rim of the reflector as shown. These provided cool handles which I could grasp to tilt the



reflector. Besides serving as handles, the clothespins also can be used to hold a diffusing cloth over the reflector.

## BELT SANDER




NEEDED a belt sander, but couldn't justify the express of a self-contained unit, so I made one, which is electrically driven through a flex ble shaft. It works efficiently and, being made entirely from scraps of hardwood, costs only the price of a 3-in. sanding be, and a few bolts.

The pull-apart drawing, Fig. 1, shows the assembly of the sander and dimensions all the parts. The dimensions given accommo-

date a standard 3 by 291/2-in. sanding belt, but the sander can be made proportionately larger to take longer belts. A standard rubber-faced sanding drum on the flexible shaft provides the drive drum. A similar

by placing a number of solid-rubber disks between two metal washers or on a threaded shaft and clamping them together with a nut. Then, the drum is trued while rotating by holding coarse sandpaper or a grinding wheel against the rubber. 


## Floor-Board Opening on Jeep Gives Easy Access to Breather Cap



Because of the inaccessible location of the breather cap and ventilator in the transmission, owners of war-surplus jeeps are apt to neglect cleaning the caps and plugged ventilator holes regularly. This results in leaking oil seals and rusted transfer cases. To get at the cap requires reaching up under the floor boards in a space above the transfer case barely large enough for the hand and removing a cotter key from the reverse side of the breather cap. However, a simple solution to the problem was discovered during the war. An opening is cut in the metal floor board directly over the breather cap so that it can be reached by emoving a plate covering the opening. The breather cap usually is located approximately  $2\frac{1}{2}$  in. back from the dust cover on the gearshift levers and about 3 in. from the  $\frac{1}{4}$ -in. raised plate reinforcing the floor board. The detail shows how nuts are soldered to the floor board to take short cap screws which hold the plate.

## Chucking Threaded Work







The wire should be heavy enough to keep the jaws from injuring the top of the thread.—Shiro Fujihira, Seattle, Wash.

## Fluorescent Ceiling Fixture Converted to Hanging Workshop Light


Wanting a good fluorescent light for his workshop, but hesitating to buy one because of the expense, D. J. Bachner of Jackson Heights, N. Y. converted an ordinary twin-tube ceiling fixture into an excellent workbench and drawing-board light. In addition, the light can be raised to the ceiling to furnish illumination for the entire shop. He first made a sheet-metal reflector to fit over the fixture. This is bent in a U-shape and a hole is cut in it to provide for the lamp cord. Then the reflector is drilled for four small bolts centered and spaced along its length, and the underside of the sheet metal is painted white to afford a good reflecting surface. The overhanging sides of the reflector are bent to come just below the bottom of the fluorescent tubes in order to direct the light downward. When the reflector is finished, the mounting flange is removed from the fixture which is drilled to coincide with the holes in the reflector. Next, a suspension bracket for each end of the fixture is bent from heavy-gauge sheet metal, as shown in the lower photo, and fitted with an eyebolt at the top. Holes are drilled through the legs of the brackets and the end plates of the fixture, and the brackets are bolted to the end plates. After the brackets are in place, the reflector is bolted to the fixture. The fixture is attached to the ceiling by means of screen hooks and lengths of lightweight chain, a method that permits the light to be adjusted to almost any height. As his fixture was of the plug-in type, Mr. Bachner fastened a surface-mounted receptacle to the ceiling near the light. However, if a direct-wired fixture is used, it may be connected to a junction box in the ceiling. A wall switch will be found most convenient.







## Bleeder Valve for Pneumatic Tools Improvised From Gas Shutoff Cock



When a twoway air valve is needed to bleed equipment before disconnecting it from an air-pressure tank, one can be made in a jiffy by altering a gas shutoff cock as shown. With the cock in the closed position, insert a drill through one

of the threaded openings and make a hole in the side of the cylinder at right angles to the original hole. Then, drill another hole through one side of the valve casting to coincide with the original hole in the cylinder. Use a drill with a diameter approximately one half the width of the valve opening. This will retain ample surface on either side of the holes and prevent air leakage. Thus, a ¾6-in. drill would be used for a valve with a ¾6-in. opening. An extension handle fastened to the top of the valve facilitates operation.


### Altered Pressure-Type Oilcan Meters Insecticide



To permit regulating the amount of corn-worm oil applied to each ear of sweet corn in my garden, I devised a metering applicator from a pump-type oilcan. I soldered a U-shaped metal bracket under the thumb lever of the can and bored a small hole in the top of the bracket. Then, a nut was soldered over the hole and a machine screw was inserted as a stop. By adjusting the height of the screw, I am able to control the amount of oil applied with each stroke of the plunger.



### Paintbrush Strains Cleaning Fluid Used to Wash Small Parts

After using a commercial cleaner or gasoline to wash small parts, much of the residue may be removed from the fluid by straining it through the bristles of a paintbrush. Just place the brush over the funnel spout when the liquid is poured back into the container. Small washers, cotter pins and other parts that may have been overlooked also will be recovered.





## SMALL CLAMPS from HINGES

Hinges need not serve only as hinges. They can be put to work as efficient clamps. Ideal for holding small work in position for soldering and light brazing, they are especially useful where the nature of the work requires a clamp having narrow jaws and a deep throat. Modelmakers will find these clamps just the thing for holding odd-shaped work, as the ends of the jaws can be bent and shaped to fit the exact contour of the parts to be glued or soldered. The four examples show various applications of hinges for clamping small work.

Strap hinges make the best clamps. The drawing below shows a typical clamp and also a few of the many different types of jaws that can be formed. A wing nut, washer and stove bolt provide clamping pressure. The bolt is placed in a hole drilled in the hinge leaf and the head is backed with a nut. A slot formed in the other leaf engages the end of the bolt and permits opening the clamp jaws. The amount the jaws can be opened is determined by the length of the slot. A small coil spring placed over the bolt between the leaves of the hinge will provide a clamp with self-opening jaws. When a clamp is used to hold parts to be brazed, the parts should be clamped to an asbestos pad.



## Turpentine Softens Glaze On Sanding Belts

When a sanding belt or disk becomes glazed to the point where it no longer will cut, don't throw it away. You can get further use from it merely by removing the glaze with turpentine. First, soften the glazed areas with the turpentine and then remove the deposits with a wire scratch brush, being careful not to rub too hard so as to wear away the abrasive. An oilcan makes a handy applicator and container for the turpentine. Fast evaporation of turpentine permits the belt to be used almost immediately. Caution: Do not turn on the sander to speed the removal of the glaze, as sparks might ignite the turpentine.




## HONE TOOLS

By Sam Brown

NLESS there are nicks in the cutting edge, it's not necessary to grind a tool each time to sharpen it. Once ground, any tool can be kept razor sharp for many hours of use by frequent, light honing. The right stone to use in honing depends upon the type of tool and its purpose. Grass and bread knives cut best if honed on a coarse stone, while most other tools require honing on a medium or fine stone to prevent the edge from tearing the work and to hold up under cutting pressure.

Artificial abrasives, aluminum oxide and silicon carbide, are gradually replacing natural or mined stones for honing tools. Aluminum oxide is of the same physical structure as natural corundum and is often called "India." In this country, Arkansas is about the only natural oilstone





of commercial importance. This stone is mineral novaculite, and is largely composed of silica. The stratification of novaculite, Fig. 4, runs from hard Arkansas to soft and then grades off to the still softer and more porous lily-white Washita, Fig. First-grade Washita is the same as lilywhite, but is not graded for color.

The bench oilstone: The conventional combination coarse-fine oilstone is widely used in sharpening most straightedge tools in the home shop, although Fig. 1 shows several other shapes which are recommended for honing special tools. The combination oilstone usually consists of either aluminum oxide or silicon carbide. Artificial stones are graded coarse, medium and fine-150, 240 or 320 abrasive grains per inch. Natural stones are not graded by grit size, but by the variety of stone itself. Hard Arkansas, for example, is of both hard and fine texture, whereas soft Arkansas is soft and coarse. The soft stones cut faster but produce a coarse edge. Certain species of fine sandstone, such as Queer Creek and Hindustan, possess this feature to a marked degree and are used extensively for sharpening scythes and other tools requiring a coarse edge.


The bench oilstone should be kept in a box such as shown in Fig. 2. If the stone has not been preoiled, it should be soaked overnight in a mixture of oil, 1 part, and kerosene, 1 part, Fig. 6. In use, the stone should be worn down uniformly to prevent the formation of a hollow. However, should the stone become hollowed, it should be rubbed flat on a piece of glass, Fig. 7, using



SILICON CARBIDE Hardest abrasive made. Cuts fast with light pressure, but breaks down under a heavy pressure









#### DRAWKNIFE

Use a scythestone or a flat stone of coarse grit. Stroke up or down or round and round. Watch bevel by sighting and use stone dry or wet. Same technique is used to sharpen blade of scythe or sickle

#### JOINTER

Hone jointer knives by wrapping bench stone in paper to prevent marking table. Wedge pulley to hold cutterhead steady. Use oil and hone lightly. Use coarse side of stone first if blades are dull



#### MORTISING CHISEL

If you are unable to obtain a stone of the correct cone shape for sharpening a mortising chisel, turn a wooden cone and cover it with silicon-carbide paper. Apply oil and run lathe at slow speed

#### LATHE TOOL BITS

Although having blunt edges, lathe bits will stand up much longer if honed to a medium or fine edge. If tool is carbide tipped, use silicon-carbide stone. Mount stone in chuck of jigsaw

#### SHAPER CUTTERS

Use coarse, then fine side of bench stone. Hone only on flat side of cutter. Give bevel a light paring stroke with sharpening stick to remove wire edge. Molding cutters are honed the same









 Chisel has been newly ground on 60-grit wheel, so honing starts on coarse side of stone. Apply a few drops of light oil beforehand

 Test on your thumbnail — if chisel is sharp, it will bite in; if not, it will slide off. Make this test also at end of step 3

80-grit silicon-carbide grains and water as a lubricant. Silica sand also can be used to dress a hollowed stone.

Using the oilstone: There are no stroking rules in honing other than the obvious one of having the tool in contact with the stone at the proper angle. It is advisable, however, to hone against the edge of the tool whenever possible to hold burring to a minimum. Always use oil but avoid charging the stone with anything heavy or gummy. A kerosene-and-oil mixture is excellent. Being fairly thin, the mixture floats away any metal particles and prevents them from becoming embedded in the stone. It also permits smooth stroking and reduces friction. After a stone has been used, it should be wiped dry with a clean cloth. Never let oil containing metal particles dry on it, as this will form a glaze.

Kinds of edges: When magnified, any edge will show as a series of sharp "mountain peaks," and the relative size of the peaks classes the edge as coarse, medium or fine. When a chisel is ground on a 60-grit wheel, the edge may be sharp but it is very coarse. Honing on the coarse side of an oilstone gives an ordinary coarse edge, which then can be brought to any degree of fineness by honing on the fine side.


Honing suggestions: The photos in Fig. 10 show the general procedure in honing a chisel and the steps also apply equally as well to plane irons and similar tools. To construct a strop, Fig. 3, glue the leather to a wooden block with the hair side up. Hints on the opposite page cover honing operations for a variety of tools.

## Household Lye Distinguishes Aluminum Stock From Similar Metals

When you wish to determine if a piece of metal actually is aluminum or another type of metal with a similar appearance, try this easy test. First make a 40-percent solution of household lye in water, being sure to use a glass container. Then, file or cut a few chips from the stock

in question and drop them into the solution. If the chips produce a vigorous reaction and disappear in a few seconds, the metal is aluminum. When using this solution, be careful not to get it on your hands or clothing. Also, flush the drain thoroughly after disposing of the solution.




## Sawhorse Benches Have Pipe Legs

A pair of sturdy sawhorse benches, made to the dimensions given in the detail, will be invaluable around the shop by providing a rigid working surface even when the heaviest tools are employed. Each set of legs is made by welding together lengths of 1-in, pipe and a piece of flat iron. Bolt holes are drilled through the flattened end of the diagonal brace and also through the flat iron to permit fastening the legs to a plank.

## Gravity Coolant Dispenser on Tool Post Rides With the Carriage


For a small lathe not equipped with a coolant system, this handy cutting-oil dispenser makes it easy to keep the tool bit well lubricated at all times. Being mounted on the tool post it rides with the carriage, out of the way, and has a flexible metal



hose which directs the oil to the very tip of the cutting tool. A simple faucet controls the flow of oil. The details show how the dispenser is made. A section of pipe having an inside diameter which will fit over the square head of the tool-post clamping bolt is tapped for a setscrew and soldered to the bottom of a tin can having a presstype lid. Then a small hole is made in the bottom of the can and a length of tubing, in which the faucet is installed, is soldered over the hole. The flexible metal hose is soldered to the end of the tubing. Note that the drip hole in the faucet must be located at a point where the spring will keep it on the outside of the tube when the faucet is in the "off" position. It is important, too, that the bolt of the faucet be the same size as the inside diameter of the tube.

## Counterbalanced Hole Cutter Uses Lathe Tool Bit


Designed to compensate for the overhang of the extended toolbit holder, this hole cutter is balanced to rotate with little or no vibration. The shank and head of the cutter are machined in one piece, the shank and the pilot on the end being off-



set in the square head. A ½-in. hole is drilled through the head and squared with a file to take a 3-in. or longer arm. Another square hole is formed in the end of the arm for a ¼-in. lathe tool bit. Setscrews are used to lock both the arm and bit in place. Note the shape of the cutting edge.


## Jig for Scroll Chamfering and Pattern Routing





By using this jig as a guide, it's easy to chamfer the edges of a scroll-sawed cutout on a drill press with a rose-head countersink. The jig is made as shown and clamped to the drill-press table. The countersink, with the squared end cut off, is chucked in the drill

press and the guide pin in the tapered insert is centered under the countersink. After the countersink is lowered to make the desired bevel, the drill press is locked and the work is guided by holding its edge against the pin. Standard 5/16-in. shaper cutters can be used instead of the countersink by mounting on a shaft and offsetting the guide pin to suit the depth of cut. The jig can be adapted for pattern routing by fashioning several wooden inserts and equipping each with a pin of a different size to correspond with the diameters of the routers that will be used. A template




is prepared by sawing or routing a master pattern in a block of wood, and then tacking to the underside of the work. The pin is centered exactly under the router, and the work is guided by placing the master pattern over the pin. In this way, any number of identical pieces can be routed without further adjustment of the jig.


## Poultry Watering Fountain Is Improvised From Five-Gallon Oilcan

When small flocks of chickens or turkeys are moved to a temporary range where there are no facilities for supplying water, an automatic watering fountain can be quickly improvised from a 5-gal. fuel-oil can. The can is laid on its side and the spout is inserted to the fullest possible depth in a drinking pan. Water from the can will flow into the drinking pan and maintain a constant level, providing the filler cap of the oilcan is screwed tight to prevent the seepage of air into the can. Depending on the length of the spout, the can may be held off the ground with blocks or propped so it will not roll.





LTHOUGH the actual operation of drilling metal or wood is one of the simplest shop procedures, skill and "know how" are required to keep the drills sharp, to know the correct speed and lubricant to use and the right drill for the job at hand. The principal parts of a drill are shown in Fig. 1. The dead center should be on the exact center of the drill axis and the cutting edges must be equal both in length and in angle. The margin is a narrow, raised rib with a cutting edge being the full diameter of the drill. In operation, the rib accurately sizes the hole and reduces friction. The shank is the end of the drill that is held by a drill-press chuck or a taper socket. The drill shown has a tapered shank with a tang on the end which engages a slot in the small end of the tapered socket to give a positive drive. Drills also are made with a straight


shank and a bit-stock shank, as in Fig. 2. The diameter of a drill decreases slightly from the cutting point in order to prevent binding in the drilled hole. Sizes are designated in four classifications. Number drills range from No. 80 to No. 1 (.0135 in. to .228 in.); letter drills from A to Z (.234 in. to .413 in.); fractional drills rise from 1/64 in. upward by 64ths, and metric drills are listed from .5 mm. to 10 mm. by .1 mm., larger than 10 mm. by .5 mm.

Normally, the cutting edges of a new drill gradually wear away with use and require sharpening. A dull drill will not cut properly and may be damaged by excessive heat generated by friction at the cutting point. Drills should be sharpened on a medium-grit grinding wheel. To prevent a drill from overheating and losing its temper while grinding, it should be dipped frequently in water while being sharpened. Cold water should not be used for this purpose, however, as it may cause cracking or distortion of the drill bit.

Most drilling trouble is due to faulty grinding of the cutting-edge clearance and angle. The two cutting edges

of a drill must be made equal both in length and angle, and the angle must be such as to produce best results in the material to be drilled, Figs. 3 and 4. For average drilling, an angle of 59 deg. at the cutting edges has been found most satisfactory and new drills are ground to this angle unless made for special purposes. A drill gauge, Fig. 4, is used to check the angle of the cutting edge when grinding.


If either the lengths or angles of the cutting edges are ground unequally, the drill will drift and form an oversize, stepped hole. This will happen even though lip clearance is correct for the angle at which each lip is ground. The clearance, as shown in the center and right-hand details in Fig. 4, allows the drill to penetrate the material being drilled. For average work the clearance angle back of the cutting edges



should be between 8 and 12 deg., but it is sometimes increased to 15 deg. where heavy feeds are taken in soft materials. When cutting-edge clearances have been ground uniformly to the proper angle, the angle subtended by the dead-center line and each cutting edge should be at least 120 deg., and not more than 135 deg., as shown in Fig. 1. Excessive clearance will weaken the cutting edges and cause them to break down. Insufficient clearance will prevent the drill from properly penetrating the material and may result in splitting the drill. After grinding, the drill point should be checked carefully to assure accuracy of the cutting-edge lengths and angles, the clearance angles and the location of the dead center.

Although with practice the mechanic can do an accurate job of drill grinding



by hand, use of an automatic grinding attachment, Fig. 7, is recommended. This will produce an accurately ground drill point and will save excess grinding.

When drilling hard material it is sometimes desirable to use a heavy feed pressure. To prevent the drill from chipping, a narrow flat is ground on the leading side of each cutting edge. Care must

be taken not to give the edge a negative rake, however, as this would cause heating and possible breakage. This type of drill point also is used when drilling soft materials, such as brass, where a normal point may tend to dig in. Note from Fig. 5 that the web increases in thickness from the cutting point to the shank to give the drill greater rigidity. As a result, the web becomes thicker at the point after a number of sharpenings and must be thinned by grinding to maintain ease of penetration of the drill point. Fig. 6 shows two methods of reducing the thickness of the web at the point. The best way is to use a round-faced grinding wheel, the radius of the wheel face being less than that of the flutes. Another method is to grind a bevel on the trailing edge of the heel as in the upper right-hand detail of Fig. 6, using a squarefaced wheel. Except for cast iron, which is drilled dry, most metals require use of a lubricant for best results. Lubricant serves a threefold purpose. It dissipates heat rapidly, lubricates the drill at the cutting edges and aids in the formation of uniform chips. This results in smooth, clean work with a minimum of wear on the drill.

The chart, Fig. 8, makes it easy to figure proper drill speeds and feeds in all common drilling operations. It also lists the correct



Work to be drilled should be clamped securely to the drill-press table and the

securely to the drill-press table and the drill should be held firmly by the chuck or taper socket. When using taper-shank drills, see that the shank and the inside of the socket are smooth and free from grit, and that the drill tang is not damaged. Use a block of wood to drive the drill shank tightly in the socket. In removing the drill from the socket, place a piece of wood under the drill point to prevent it from striking the drill-press table or the work, and use a drift of the correct size to drive out the drill. When drills are used at the bench, keep them in a metal stand especially made for the purpose. Drills not in use should never be stored loose in a drawer or chest or together with other tools as they are likely to become nicked or otherwise damaged. Stored drills should be oiled to prevent rusting.

## Testing Gear Compound for Grit

Whether or not gear grease contains grit can be determined by placing a small amount of the grease between two clean pieces of glass. These are rubbed together until a thin film of grease remains and then held up to the light. Any foreign particles will be apparent.


## MOTOR DIRECTIONAL "SWITCH"


This inexpensive motor directional "switch" differs from the commercial reversing type in that it is used in conjunction with the motor switch. This feature eliminates the possibility of accidentally starting the machine in the wrong rotation. While a directional switch generally is used in operating a shaper or a metal lathe, such a switch also can be adapted for use where a countershaft or a motor is used to drive two machines placed on opposite sides of the drive pulley. This obviates need for crossing the belt.




Fig. 2 HOR.-CENT. HOR.-SIZE HOR.-HOLD BRIGHTNESS

If the motor is of the split-phase or capacitor type, reversing rotation ordinarily is done by transposing the position of the two starting-coil leads. But when the motor is equipped with this directional switch, the direction of rotation is reversed by just moving a lever. Fig. 1 shows what the switch looks like with the cover removed and Fig. 2 shows the parts and how they go together. To install it on a motor, remove the motor cover plate and disconnect the two starting-coil leads, leaving the motor-switch leads connected. Next, short lengths of wire, connected to the motor terminals, are brought through holes in the cover plate for connection to terminals on the directional switch. The directional switch is connected to the startingcoil leads according to the wiring diagram in Fig. 3 and then mounted on the motor with an angle bracket. Remember that in using this switch, the motor should come to a complete stop before changing the direction of rotation. Positive contact must be maintained to prevent arcing.



In plants where ruled schedule boards must be rearranged from time to time, the arrangement of the lines may be changed and the board used again in a few minutes if it is ruled with tape. When the lines are to be rearranged, the tape is stripped off and replaced with new tape in the position desired. This, of course, is much quicker than repainting the lines. Waterproof adhesive tape is particularly suitable for the purpose as it will not be affected when the board is washed and also will not damage the board when removed. If a permanent board is needed, the same method may be used followed by an application of clear lacquer or varnish to preserve the whiteness of the tape and the surface of the board.—Neal Houlahen, Glenshaw, Pa.

## Tire-Bead Breaker Helps Remove Inside Car-Door Handles



When removing inside door handles from some of the older model cars it is often difficult to keep the collar depressed while knocking out the pin which holds the handle. This was my problem until I thought of using a


### **Creosote Treatment of Fence Posts**

Here's a way to creosote wooden fence posts if pressure treatment, which requires special equipment to apply the preservative, isn't available. All you need are two oil drums, creosote and some used crankcase oil. Prepare a mixture of creosote, 4 parts, and crankcase oil, 1 part. Fill each drum with enough solution to cover the posts to a height of 21/2 ft. Prop up one drum and build a fire beneath it; then stand the posts on end in this container and heat for about three hours, keeping the creosote solution just under the boiling point. At the end of this period, remove the posts and plunge them into the unheated mixture in the other drum. Deep penetration of the creosote will result.


## UNIVERSAL FM RECEIVER-TUNER


LTHOUGH this FM unit is a complete receiver in itself, it is primarily designed to serve as the nucleus of a highfidelity installation for the reception and reproduction of FM broadcast entertainment. It may be used alone or in conjunction with a public-address system or with any standard broadcast or short-wave receiver. The built-in monitor speaker can be switched on and off as desired. With any external amplifier-loudspeaker system capable of amplifying and audibly reproducing the full output, the high sensitivity and fidelity capabilities of this FM unit are fully realized. Most large standard broadcast receivers have suitable audio-


amplifier stages.

Nine tubes, plus a rectifier and tuning indicator, are employed in a superheterodyne circuit with ratio-type FM detector. The frequency range is 87 to 109 megacycles and the dial is calibrated in both megacycles and channels. Volume and tone controls are operative both in the unit and external audio systems. Photo A shows a front view of the cabinet. The weight is 24 pounds. Photo B identifies the various tubes and their location. When using this National FM unit with an external amplifier, the interconnection is made with a low-loss shielded cable that should not exceed 10 ft. in length, and preferably shorter. If a longer connecting cable is necessary, the voltage-divider network, Fig. 1, is used across the output terminals to compensate for the resulting loss of high-frequency tones due to the longer cable. A suitable FM folded-doublet antenna made from Amphenol 300-ohm twin lead is detailed in Fig. 2. As this type of antenna is quite directional, maximum results are obtained when the receiving antenna is parallel with the transmitting antenna.









## THREE-TUBE POCKET SET

By L. M. Degettel

THIS three-tube walkie-talkie-type portable receiver is designed for speaker reception of local broadcasting stations and is ideal to take to the ball game or on hikes. The entire broadcast band is covered by a single tuning condenser. Construction is simple in spite of the limited space and the fact that the set employs a 3-tube circuit complete with batteries and speaker.

Construction should begin with the chassis and panel detailed in Figs. 1 and 2. Make a careful study of photos A, B, C, D and E. This panel may be made of either thin plywood or 1/8-in. hard-pressed wood. The speaker should be shock-mounted as detailed in Fig. 5, and covered to protect it during assembly. The chassis and brackets are made of 1/16-in. sheet aluminum. Wiring should begin with the filament circuit, followed with the speaker and the output transformer. A good commonground connection is carried throughout the set, as indicated in Fig. 4. Miniature electrolytic filter condenser C5 should be carefully mounted so that its outer shell does not touch connections on the tube sockets. The metal shell in the center of each tube socket acts as a shield and may be used for a common-ground tie point.


Before installing the loop antenna, check the set to be sure that all wiring up to this point is correct. A hum should be heard in the speaker when the No. 6 pin of the second 1U5 tube is touched with a short

piece of wire.

The finished loop L1 is about 23/4 in, wide and 5 in. long. Loop L2 is random-wound with No. 24 d.c.c. wire on a 2½-in.-dia. form. A small can was used for the purpose. The coil is then removed and tied with thread in several places. This coil is next formed until it has the same shape as the inside of coil L1. Duco cement is applied to one side of L2, and the coil is mounted in the center of coil L1. A weight is then placed on top of the loop to insure a flat assembly. The combination loop is finally cemented to the small panel. Before making the circuit connections to L1 and L2, examine the schematic circuit diagram, Fig. 3, to make sure that the coils are connected with the same direction of winding. Now turn the set on, with variable condenser C1 fully opened. The regeneration control is now slowly rotated until a squeal is heard in the speaker. If no squeal is heard, reverse the two wires connected to feedback coil L2. To receive stations, adjust the tuning-condenser C1 and back off




# TELEVISION RECEIVER HAS SIMPLIFIED CONTROLS

ONLY three controls on the front panel are necessary for complete operation of this comparatively low-cost table-model television receiver. These controls are clearly shown in photo A and are detailed in Fig. 1. The 8-position tuning knob is adjustable to any 8 of the 13 channels available for television broadcasting in any locality and the set is pretuned for the reception of the 8 stations.

The picture size of this direct-view receiver is 4½ by 6 in., or approximately 26 square inches; the cabinet is 9¼ in. high, 16¾ in. deep and 16¾ in. wide. This compact unit weighs only 26½ pounds and may be easily carried about the house to provide television entertainment in any room desired where antenna leads are available. Owing to its light weight and compact size, special stands or tables are unnecessary.

Designed for use on 115-volt 60-cycle a.c., this Motorola model features a safety interlock which disconnects the power cord from the chassis whenever the protective metal back cover, shown in photo B, is removed from the cabinet. The service adjustment controls in Fig. 2 are adjusted at the factory so that none other than the front-panel operating instructions need be followed in putting the receiver in operation. However, to provide for any misadjustment of the rear-panel controls due to handling, simple instructions are supplied for adjusting these insulated





emergency controls. The efficient audio system employs a 6½-in. permanent-magnet speaker and operates on an intercarrier sound system which eliminates the necessity for vernier tuning. This also does away with the need for automatic frequency control and makes it possible to tune in weak signals for best picture reception and still maintain good audio reception. Additional features include high usable sensitivity, automatic brightness stabilizer and automatic volume control. The chassis is completely shielded against oscillator radiation and all wired connections are pretested for resistance to humidity.

The 11-unit block diagram given in Fig. 3 illustrates the operation of the receiver which has 15 tubes, 2 rectifiers, a germanium crystal detector and a 7-in. cathode-ray picture tube. Antenna input connections for either a 300-ohm balanced line or for matching to a 75-ohm shielded lead-in, are made as indicated in the detailed sketch, Fig. 4.





the regeneration control very slowly until a station comes in clear and loud. Turns should now be removed, one or two at a time, from the outside of the antenna loop L1 until the stations at both ends of the broadcast band can be received. Nine turns were necessary for the original model.



Next, tune C1 to the lowest-frequency station and adjust the regeneration control for maximum volume and clarity. Padder condenser C4 is then adjusted until it is just possible to hear the squeal when the tuning condenser is slightly off the station. The set is now ready for the case. A piece of thin cardboard must be placed between the front panel and the metal brownflocked grille screen. This screen covers the entire front panel and must be trimmed to give a tight fit when it is in place. The dial is cut from heavy drawing paper and is cemented to the grille screen.

The case was finished in a cream color with matching knobs. L3 is a single-turn



capacity coupling loop for use if an external antenna is desired. It is made with No. 20 insulated hookup wire and is mounted on the inside of the back cover, photo B. If the set is microphonic, wrap a piece of paper around the first 1U5 tube, or use a rubber band. ### Fishing for Shark

spot that is calculated to be a "good hole for sharks" the gargantuan fishing line is let out. The bait is cut into chunks about the size of a man's hand. As the cable pays out a crewman snaps on the baited leaders. These leaders swivel on an ordinary harness snap.

Many methods of laying the line are in use. Some skippers suspend their lines from buoys with anchors at each end. Others prefer to lay the line on the bottom with an anchor on one end and the boat riding on the other. Above an irregular coral bottom, set lines must be suspended high enough to clear the jagged edges of rock which would foul a line.

After about eight hours, the line is drawn up. One man takes position on the bow to signal the winch hand whenever a shark appears. Another man stands by the bollard block to unsnap the leaders. The skipper always operates the engine throttle, backing down whenever necessary to keep the line taut. If a large shark manages to get some slack in the line near the surface, the leader usually parts.

Whenever a shark breaks the surface, the winch is stopped, the leader unsnapped, and the shark towed aft to be gaffed and hoisted aboard by the power boom. This is the ticklish moment in shark fishing. Many times the shark is still alive and thrashes the water into foam. In such cases the crewmen swat the shark's snout—his tenderest spot.

The catch is dumped into a cockpit just forward of the wheelhouse to await butchering, which is done at sea if time permits. Those sharkers who have port facilities for processing the entire shark take their catch to the factory dock for butchering.

Shark livers must be segregated as to type and sex before being sent to the processing plant, for potency varies according to these classifications. This means that when butchering is done at sea the skipper must be able to identify each shark—not an easy matter. Telltale features are shape of head and snout, position of fins and characteristics of teeth. For example, the tiger shark has seven rows of razor-sharp teeth with serrated edges.

Putting hooks on the floor of the Caribbean is asking for trouble. Sharks are not the only monsters that lurk in the 300 and 400-fathom depths. Thompson Enterprises, Inc., reported that one boat recently caught a shark too large to be hoisted aboard. It had to be towed. Boats have brought up giant moray eels and even larger snake eels.





encouraging work going on. Several aircraft companies, including Boeing and North American, have been improving this part of the plane.

For example, North American's P-82 is equipped with a pulsating seat to reduce pilot fatigue on long flights. The cushion has a multiple-celled rubber bladder, sandwiched between two layers of foam rubber. Air pressure is reduced and increased alternately inside the cells of the bladder—thus giving the pilot relief from compression fatigue or the "double feature feeling."

The breathtaking speeds of jet planes have posed new problems for the cockpit engineers. At low speeds it was a relatively simple matter for a pilot to bail out. At high speeds, the problem becomes complicated. He may be thrown against some part of the plane and be knocked cold, injured or killed.

Ejection seats were developed, first by the Germans, then by the British and the U. S. Army and Navy. Two of the first planes to use the "break away" seat were Lockheed's P-80 and Douglas' Skystreak.


The installation of such seats brings new worries to the cockpit engineers. Adequate clearance must be provided for the pilot and his seat when he is thrown clear. At the same time, the functional cockpit arrangement of controls must be maintained.

The next step, say engineers, will be the ejection of the entire cockpit. Planes soon will be flying at supersonic speeds in the stratosphere. If thrown out at such dizzy speeds, pilots would be torn apart or die from lack of oxygen. If that didn't finish them off, they might freeze to death before they reached earth.

The obvious answer is an ejection cockpit. Then the pilot could voluntarily or—
if he had passed out—be automatically thrown free in his pressurized cockpit. When his fall had slowed and he reached a predetermined altitude, his parachute would open and let him down. His pressurized cockpit might serve as a life raft on the ocean or as a protected home in arctic or desert country. It would be equipped with oars, sail, radio, food, water and snowshoes.

Ejection cockpits are still pretty much in the study-and-discussion stage. Engineers hold their heads and say that this new trend means that they'll have to start from scratch and redesign the pilot's compartment all over again.





### Gutter Downspouts Open at the Joint

Q-Two of the downspouts on my house are Q—Two of the downspouts on my house are opening at the joints. On one downspout the joint has started to open just above the point where the downspout enters the draintile. On the other the opening is about a foot below the elbow at the gutter. What causes this and is there any way to repair the parts? They are still in good condition except for the joints.

J.M.—Toronto, Ont., Can.

-Usually this trouble is caused by a collection of leaves or other trash which only partially clogs the downspout but is sufficient to catch and hold snow and slush. When the temperature falls, this freezes and forces the folded joint open. Ordinarily, downspouts in this condition can be repaired satisfactorily without dismantling by simply wrapping one turn of wire around the pipe at the point where the joint has started to open. Pull the wire tight and twist with pliers. Then wrap another length of wire an inch or so nearer the center of the open joint and again twist tight. By proceeding in this fashion for the length of the open joint, you can force it together as good as new in most cases. new in most cases.



### Refinishing **Breakfast Set**

Q-I have a light-colored maple break-jast set which needs refinishing. The top especially, is badly marred and scratched. I want to refinish the set in the same color as the original. What is the proper proce-dure? E.R.—San Francisco, Calif.

A—Judging from your description, the original finish of the set was what is known as blonde maple. If, as you say, the set is rather badly marred and scratched, the best procedure is to remove the old finish with a prepared remover. This done, sand thoroughly and then apply a commercial wood bleach, carefully following the directions on the container. After bleaching, any digs or gauges too deep to be removed by sanding directions on the container. After bleaching, any digs or gouges too deep to be removed by sanding should be filled with stick shellac of a color to match the bleached wood. Sand the fills smooth after the shellac has set. Then finish with one coat of white shellac followed by one or two coats of a good furniture varnish. Sand between coats with fine paper and rub down the final coat to a retiny smooth surface. satiny-smooth surface.





### Removing Oil-Burner Soot From Siding

Q — The siding on my house is stained in spots with a dark, oily stain which I suppose is soot from the oil burner. How can I remove this grime so it will not discolor new paint? M.M.—Hartford, Conn.

A—Dark, greasy dust from an oil burner that settles on the siding usually can be removed quite easily with an ordinary paint cleaner. If the old paint is chalking uniformly this may not be necessary, as a brisk brushing may remove the loose particles of paint pigment and take the grime along with them. Incidentally, it would be a good idea to have the burner checked, as a correctly adjusted oil burner should not produce the trouble-some soot deposit you describe. some soot deposit you describe.

### Attaching Wooden Strips to Concrete

Q—I'm planning a recreation room in my basement and want to use knotty pine on the wall at one end of the room. My problem is how to fasten the pine boards to the wall, which is concrete. Can you help me?

F.M.—Manchester, N.H.

A—First you will have to attach furring strips to the wall to get a nailing base, and to provide space back of the boards for circulation of air. If the wall is the common height of 6½ or 7 ft. from the basement floor to the bottom of the joists, you will need at least three horizontal strips spaced evenly, the first strip placed about 8 in. above the floor. These strips are attached to the concrete wall with lead or fiber screw anchors. To install the anchors, first drill holes to the required depth with a star drill of the correct size. Tap the anchors in place in the holes with light blows of a hammer so as not to upset the ends. Then simply drive ordinary wood screws through the furring strips into the screw anchors just as the furring strips into the screw anchors just as you would drive the screws into wood.

### **Refinishing Wall Registers**

-The wall registers in my home need cleaning and refinishing. I prefer not to paint them. How can I refinish the registers myself so they will look like new?


A—Go over all the metal surfaces lightly with fine steel wool, 00 size or finer, to remove the discoloration and grime. Then clean thoroughly with a soft cloth dipped in lacquer thinner. Have the windows open and avoid inhaling the fumes of the thinner. Finally, finish with one coat of clear lacquer applied with a fine-bristle brush. Do not get lacquer on the painted wall as it will soften oil paint. oil paint.



### Stained Exterior **Doors Turn White**

Q-Two doors in my home are stained. Recently, both of them have turned white, the color ranging from gray to white on the inside of the door. What is this, and how do I restore the finish? J.G.-Minneapolis,

-Excess moisture commonly causes bleaching of the varnish finish you describe. It is probable that the doors "sweat," that is, high humidity in that the doors "sweat," that is, high humidity in the house causes moisture from the air to condense on the interior surfaces of the doors. Usually, the only remedy is to remove the old finish entirely, but first try rubbing the doors lightly with camphorated oil. In some cases, this treatment will restore the finish to its original color. To avoid further trouble, reduce the humidity in the house during the winter months.

Prone-position cockpits-where the pilot lies on his stomach—have been built on an experimental basis over a period of several years, mainly with an eye to highspeed research. To date, engineers have no fixed opinion as to the desirability of such a radical departure. "They solve some problems and create others," says Al Mayo, a Douglas engineer. "We feel that we must know much more about the limitations of the human body under high negative and positive G forces before we know whether prone cockpits are necessary or desirable."

Most of the work on redesigning cockpits has been done on small single-seat military planes. But many of the improvements are being installed on bombers and large transports. Lockheed, Martin, Boeing, Douglas, Consolidated and others are working on problems of greater visibility, increased pilot comfort and decreased noise levels.

The Boeing Stratocruiser, for example, has new-type windows that are electrically heated and made of nonshatterable "bird proof" glass. Consolidated's B-36 bomber is equipped with a simplified, easy-to-read, instrument panel. The latest Martin Mars flying boat groups pilots, flight engineer, navigator and radioman on a compact, efficient flight deck.

Col. Philip B. Klein, chief of the fighter branch of aircraft projects at Wright Field Air Materiel Command, in a pessimistic mood, recently said: "The time is not far distant when we will have to admit God never intended that we should move as fast as the contrivances we put together might carry us."

But until such limitations are reached, cockpit engineers will be plugging away to make flying safer by providing easier and more efficient controls. If clothes make the man, cockpits make the pilot!

ically into silk-screen printing; and roller printing, which is a hundred years old and has improved only to the extent that its equipment has been made more efficient.

The problem of recording photographs on fabric had been the concern of scientists for 60 years when Ross-Smith walked into the laboratory at General Aniline and asked the head chemist to sensitize his handkerchief and put Lana Turner's picture on it. The chemist used an old method, never before successful. However, the result was so good that the company went to work on the process and perfected it.

The method used in the Photone process is simple. The material to be printed is sensitized and run over rollers which hold the film negatives. The printing is done by contact with a high-wattage mercury-vapor lamp inside the roller. In successive straight-line steps it is developed, fixed and finished.

A number of problems had to be solved before the process could be called a success: Light-sensitive dyes had to be found that would stand up under daily usage; sensitizers and fixatives which would not damage the fabric fibers had to be discovered, and unevenness in development had to be overcome.

Details of the process are being kept secret at present, because many changes have been made in the technique since patents were issued.

The photographic image, as it appears on the fabric, can embrace any or all of 32 tones and may be in red, blue, brown or black. With the development of a color-separation method and the necessary printing equipment, four-color reproduction will be possible—probably within the next two years.

The process can be used on a wide range of fabrics, being effective on rough monk's cloth as well as ultrasmooth satin. Even velvets and pile fabrics, such as used in automobiles, previously thought unprintable, produce a good image.

Women's clothes surely will be the first big market, beginning with the luxury lines. But the list of possibilities seems endless. Scarves, neckties, tablecloths, draperies, lingerie, bathing suits, pajamas and sport shirts are a few other uses that come to mind.

Printing pictures on ceramics is a problem under study at the Onondaga (N. Y.) Pottery Company. This involves working with a porous surface—unglazed pottery —but it is believed that the technique resembles the Corning process in that the latent color is brought out by heat.



Body Styling. Regardless of body style or series, at first glance the most impressive feature of the '49 Ford is the complete departure from previous exterior design. The body has been made full width, with rear fenders integral with the rear quarter panels. Front fenders are more massive and have higher crowns, giving an almost unbroken line from side to side across the hood. The clean, smoothly-flowing horizontal lines of the body are evidence of the careful attention paid to this design detail. Wind noise and air resistance are reduced and, of course, usable space within the body is greatly increased by the full width design. In the process of achieving

this smoothness of design a number of the dirt and moisture collecting seams found in conventional designs are eliminated.

Stainless steel moldings extending horizontally backwards along the sides of the body, do double duty as protective rub-rails. Extra-heavy "Fender Guard" bumpers curl around the sides of the fenders for added protection. On all models the trunk capacity has been markedly increased. Usable trunk volume is 28.5 cubic feet in coupes; sedans have 19 cubic feet, an increase of 57%. The trunk lid is externally hinged and provided with an ornamental handle incorporating the license plate lamp, and license plate holder.


Body construction is likewise completely new, affording greater strength and safety with reduced weight. The combined body and frame structure is actually 59% more rigid. It is of the all-steel, all-welded type, incorporating material and design features that reflect over 21 years of research into the problems of combining maximum strength with minimum weight. The body is bolted firmly to the frame at 22 points, with special shims provided for insulation. Front pillar posts have a narrow cross-section to improve visibility. Another interesting innovation is that the rear wheel housings are completely separated from exterior sheet metal and welded to the rear floor pan. This increases stiffness at

the rear portion of body and provides exceptionally solid footings for the full-arch roof rails.

Insulation. Bodies are effectively insulated against heat and noise, a variety of methods being used. Roof, floor and deck-lid panels are lined with a special waffleboard-type insulation. Sprayed-on sound-deadening materials are used for door panels, quarter panels and wheel housings. In addition, the dash is insulated by the use of heavy fabric material.

All structural members in the new Ford bodies are carefully cleaned, treated with a rust inhibitor and painted. This treatment is applied even to the inside surfaces of such large box-section members as the center pillars, in which special openings are provided for the purpose.

"Lounge Car" Interiors of the Ford "Forty-Niner" show every bit as much change as the exterior body lines. Most important advancement is the great increase effected in usable space. This has been accomplished, in part, by moving the engine 5 inches forward. Extending the body sides outward to the full width of the car likewise results in substantially increased seat widths, particularly at the hip and shoulder levels. Front seats are 57" wide, an increase of




White outline-'48 Ford; gray outline-'49 Ford.

6.5", while rear seats now measure 60", or 73/4" more than before. 56" shoulder room has been provided in the front seat and 55" in the rear seat of sedans, enabling three large people to occupy each seat with complete comfort.

Added riding comfort is obtained by scientifically positioning seats well forward between the wheels, resulting in a smooth, soft "Mid Ship" ride. Also new for Ford this year is the seat construction employed — lightweight tubular frame containing a unique "zig-zag" spring base and short, soft-acting coil springs.

Visibility. Another important achievement in body design has been accomplished by Ford engineers in substantially increasing the window area of the new models, while at the same time lowering the overall height of the body over 3". The greater visibility provided for both driver and passengers alike is an important contribution to greater safety of operation, as well as adding to comfort and pleasure. The total vision area in the popular Tudor model, for example,



has been increased from 2612 square inches to 2916 square inches. The extra-wide and extradeep V-type windshield gives over 20% more vision area than before.

Instrument Panel. In keeping with the high quality and luxury feeling of the new Ford interiors, the instrument panel has been completely restyled to combine beauty and utility. Oil pressure gauge, fuel gauge and battery charging and engine temperature indicators have been grouped in a single cluster around the rim of the 100 mph. speedometer directly in front of the driver. The speedometer face also contains the headlight beam indicator light, and provision for turn signal indicators. A completely non-glare lighting system is employed to illuminate the gauges and speedometer. Based on the "black light" system developed during the war for illumination of aircraft control panels, the Ford system uses a light that approximates ultra-violet and is invisible to the human eye. Instrument figures, graduations and pointers are coated with a substance that emits a clear glow when acted upon by the "black light" rays, thus becoming easily readable in the dark with no distracting bright light or reflections.

Custom models have a clock in the center of the instrument panel and locking glove compartment at the far right. Provision is made for the installation of a radio below the clock, with speaker grille located at the top of the panel next to the windshield. Tests show that this highlevel speaker placement gives greatly improved acoustical reception for all passengers.

Controls. The popular dash-mounted starter button has been retained. The windshield wiper control has been placed within easy reach on the instrument panel, along with a three-position light switch, three-position ignition switch and lock, choke control, and on the Custom models, an automatic cigar lighter. An ash tray is also provided in the panel. Operating controls and their placement follow standard practice, a twospoke steering wheel being used to provide unobstructed vision of the gauges and speedometer cluster. A T-handle pull-type parking brake control is used in place of the pistol-grip type.

Two upholstery choices will be available in the Custom series—blue-gray tweed broadcloth and a gray-green striped mohair. In the Ford series, green striped broadcloth or green and red striped mohair is offered. Both series may be had tailored in tan leather, at extra cost. The convertible model comes in either red leather combined with beige bedford cord, tan leather with beige bedford cord, or green leather with green bedford cord, depending on the exterior body color selected. Station Wagons have genuine leather upholstery on driver's seat and vinyl is used on passenger seats.

Door controls have been extensively modified to give greater ease of operation and safety. Outside door handles operate by pulling outward. Inside door handles pull up to open, thus eliminating the possibility of accidentally opening a door by leaning on the handle. Also, possibility of snagging clothing is minimized by placing open ends of handles towards front of car. Door lock inside controls are push buttons which return to open position whenever the door is opened or closed. It is thus impossible to lock the keys in the car. Ignition key operates

exterior door locks located in both front doors. Either right or left door may be opened with the key, regardless of which one was locked from the outside originally.

Appointments. Ford models are provided with a variety of interior appointments, including arm rests at each side of both front and rear seats in sedans and club coupes, an ash tray in both front and rear compartments, coat hooks, interior light and sun visor. The Custom models are equipped in even greater detail, with extra quality upholstery and floor mats, cigar lighter, robe and assist cords, clock, dual sliding-type sun visors, two ash trays in rear compartment and two interior lights.

maintain nearly constant temperature inside the car regardless of outside temperature. Thermostat is set by a push-pull knob on dash. All the way out permits maximum flow through the coil, and all the way in shuts off flow completely, permitting blower to be used in hot weather for forced circulation of fresh, low-humidity air.

Defroster operates in conjunction with heater. A push-pull knob on dash regulates dampers inside the heating coil box, directing warm air to the windshield. When defroster knob is pulled out to its "full out" position, full discharge from the powerful blower flows through the defroster ducts to remove heavy ice from windshield quickly on the coldest day.

A Living Room on Wheels—that's the overall impression created by Ford's new combination of increased visibility, greater usable interior roominess, extra-wide seats and smartly styled materials and fittings. This comparison is further heightened by Ford's new ventilating system, which admits fresh air through screened openings next to the radiator and discharges the air into the car body just above the toe boards. Each inlet is individually controlled by knobs on the steering column bracket. The forward movement of the car produces a ram effect in the air intake, delivering fresh air under pressure. This pressurized ventilation permits vent windows to be opened slightly even in rainy weather to maintain air circulation.

The three-way "Magic Air" heating system (available at extra cost) is designed to operate in conjunction with this new ventilating system. A two-speed blower takes air from the right-hand air intake and passes it through a heating coil. The warmed air then enters the car body through an outlet that extends across the dash above the toe board. A three-way valve permits operation of the system as either (1) a fresh-air heater with forced circulation for cold weather or quick warm-up; (2) a fresh-air heater without blower for milder weather; (3) with intake closed, as a recirculating heater for quick heating in very cold weather or to keep out obnoxious fumes in heavy traffic.



Both V-8 and Six cylinder engines incorporate many radical changes in design and construction which decrease power losses, increase engine efficiency, provide exceptional accessibility for servicing and assure longer engine life. The major changes incorporated in both engines include: a new "Equa-Flo" cooling system with balanced type thermostat and pressure type radiator cap; greatly improved lubrication system; new combustion chamber contours; redesigned intake manifolding; unique vacuum differential spark advance regulation; new single breaker-type distributor mounted for easy accessibility; more effective crankcase ventilation; timing mark on pulley or damper at front of engine and a carefully engineered 3-point rubber mounting system.

The new V-8 engine has an off-center location of oil passage in each crank pin, providing a "sludge pocket" designed to trap foreign matter carried over from main bearings. Individual steel-backed precision-type bearings are locked in the end of each connecting rod replacing the single floating type formerly used for each pair

of rods. V-8 valves are precision set and periodic adjustment is not required. Valves are straight stemmed and guides are one-piece type for better heat transfer and more effective lubrication. Heat and wear resistant valve seat inserts are used at both intake and exhaust valves.

The Ford 6-cylinder engine block has been increased in height and connecting rods have been made longer with consequent decrease in side-wall thrust. Larger main and connecting rod bearings are provided. Cylinder walls are lubricated by pressure spray from a drilled hole in lower end of each connecting rod. An extra-quiet rotor type oil pump is gear driven from center of camshaft. Another innovation is provision for installing a base-mounted oil filter (at extra cost) connected directly to the engine lubrication system by drilled holes, thus eliminating all external oil lines. Valve mechanism on the Six is completely new with high-lift cams, pressed-in valve guides, and self-locking, adjustable tappets. Either the modern viscous type or the efficient new rubber type vibration damper is bolted to front end of crankshaft.

Savings in gasoline mileage of up to 10% have been achieved. The major factors responsible for this increased economy are: (1) the

manifolding with more even distribution to each cylinder; (4) new combustion chamber contours permitting high (6.8 to 1) compression without detonation even when using non-premium fuels.

Lubricating oil is forced under full pressure to camshaft, crankshaft, main and connecting rod lower bearings through passages in engine block, in both V-8 and Six. On the V-8, timing and distributor drive gears are lubricated by an intermittent pressure spray while cylinder walls, pistons, pins, valve mechanism and oil pump drive gears are lubricated by throw off from the bearings. Cylinder walls, pistons, and pins on the Six receive oil under pressure from a drilled hole in lower end of each connecting rod while timing gears, distributor and oil pump drive gears are lubricated by throw off from bearings.

The new "Equa-Flo" cooling system gives an equal flow of coolant throughout every part of the system. The high-capacity water pumps



(two on V-8, one on Six) force all coolant directly to rear of block, thence up into head and back to radiator. Turbulence is high as a result of the high velocity, improving heat transfer. Uniform temperatures are maintained with no possibility of hot spots. No special provision is required for valve seat cooling. A pressure-type radiator cap is used on the flat tube and fin-type radiator, permitting a maximum pressure of about 41/2 pounds in the cooling system with a correspondingly higher, more efficient coolant temperature. Loss of coolant is practically eliminated by use of the pressure type cap. New balanced type thermostats, which are not affected by water pressure, are used on both engines for quick warm-up and a recirculating by-pass at each pump assures uniform temperatures during warm-up period.


The generator is rated at 30 amperes at 7 volts and is air cooled. A three-way regulator maintains constant voltage, limits current output and prevents battery discharge through the generator. Ignition wiring is provided with heavy synthetic sheathing that is highly resistant to moisture, oil and ozone.

**Economical Service.** The new Ford engines are designed for quick, economical inspection and service. Engine accessories are positioned well above the center plane of the engine where they can be reached easily. The distributor is near the top of engine, and ignition wires are held in place by rubber grommets. A timing mark is provided at front of engine where it can be seen clearly. For quick, easy servicing of bearings, oil pump intake screen, etc., oil

New Suspension. Of great interest to automobile enthusiasts is the fact that, with the introduction of the "Forty-Niner," the transverse spring suspension that has long been almost a Ford trade-mark has been done away with. The new Fords for '49 have a completely new suspension system, using "Para-Flex" rear springs and "Hydra-Coil" front springs. Both elements of the system have been carefully engineered to work in complete harmony with each other, for a balanced, cushioned ride.

The "Para-Flex" rear springs are, as the name implies, semi-elliptic leaf springs mounted parallel to the frame. Rear shock absorbers are hydraulic double-acting aircraft type.

Cross section view of the new 100 h.p. Ford V-8 engine.



Frames for the Convertible and Station Wagon models are further reinforced to compensate for the inherent loss of body rigidity in the former and the normally heavier loads to be expected in the latter.

Another chassis change for '49 is the adoption of Hotchkiss drive in place of the former torque tube and radius rod system. In this new system all driving and braking forces are


transmitted through the rear springs, giving smoother, more comfortable starts and stops, and reducing unsprung weight.

Axle Ratios. A further development is the use of a new semi-floating rear axle, with hypoid ring gear and pinion carried in an extra-strong, light-weight banjo housing. Hypoid design, together with the forward location of the rear seat, practically eliminates drive line tunnel in rear compartment floor. Single row, ball type wheel bearings are permanently lubricated. Rear axle ratio, standard, is 3.73 to 1; with overdrive, 4.10 to 1. An optional ratio of 4.10 to 1 is designed for use in the mountains. The heavier Station Wagon model has a 3.91 to 1 axle ratio as standard and 4.27 to 1 with overdrive.

The transmission of the '49 Ford is of conventional 3-speed type, with shift lever mounted on the steering column. Quiet, long-life helical gears are used in all speeds. Transmission ratios are as follows: 1st, 2.819; 2nd, 1.604; 3rd, direct; reverse, 3.625.

**Overdrive.** Another innovation is the availability of factory-installed overdrive transmission. The unit consists essentially of a conventional

3-speed transmission plus a planetary gear set, over-running clutch and necessary controls. The planetary gear set provides an automatic 4th speed ratio of 0.70 to 1.

Shift into overdrive gear is made at any time after car reaches a speed of about 27 mph. by simply releasing accelerator pedal for an instant. Eastman Kodak has a process by which drawings are transferred photographically to metal, rubber, plywood, certain other woods and many plastics. The whole process takes eight minutes and can be done in normal room lighting.

If you'd like to try printing photographs on various materials, what you'll need is palladium. Such work can be done on any surface porous enough to absorb a thin

solution of palladium chloride.

Palladium has 80 degrees of gradation between black and white, as compared to the five of silver, giving it much greater subtlety and flexibility. The palladium does not lie on the paper, as does silver, but soaks in, and with it contact prints can be made in ordinary light using a fluorescent lamp or some other source of ultraviolet light.

What these new developments will do to the fabric and pottery industries is still uncertain. As for you, the consumer, don't be surprised if you find a photograph of yourself decorating your napkin when you sit down at the dinner table some day in

the near future.

those of unimproved submarines. The streamlining program includes removal of deck guns and other topside appurtenances, reducing the size and smoothing out the contours of the superstructure, and reshaping the bow. Improved breathing tubes are installed on 11 submarines.

Two other wartime undersea vessels have been classified as radar picket submarines for development of radar scouting techniques both for normal ocean climates and under arctic conditions. Undoubtedly part of the research program is to develop ways of raising radar equipment to the surface from a submerged vessel to follow movements of surface ships.

Still another submarine is being used for underwater-transport research. Both the Americans and Japanese put submarines to this use during the war and the idea was so valuable that methods of carrying large cargoes or groups of men underwater are being investigated.

More than usual secrecy surrounds an experimental submarine that is designated by the symbol SSG and is classed as a guided-missile submarine for studies in that field. The Germans had visions of rockets that could be launched from a submerged ship and that would travel up through the water, emerge into the air, and





can be housed over to provide space for shore-bombardment rockets, guided missiles, or piloted or pilotless aircraft.

New systems of underwater propulsion are an intriguing subject and some people predict that the first installation of an atomic power plant for vehicular use will be in a submarine. Presumably the energy would be used to create steam for operating ordinary turbines. The sub would be capable of operating almost indefinitely underwater at speeds that are attained now only on the surface. Underwater endurance, in fact, would be limited only by the oxygen, food, and health requirements.

At the end of the war the Germans had designed an undersea boat that could do 25 knots, submerged, using as a power plant a special gas turbine that burned kerosene or fuel oil plus hydrogen peroxide. The hydrogen peroxide provided the oxygen needed for combustion. The idea never got into production, for one reason because a tremendous tonnage of hydrogen peroxide would be needed.

Pending the time when atomic power plants are actually built and put to use, the search is still going on for efficient fuels that require no air for combustion.

the project no longer remunerative, petroleum has been recovered by mining and drainage to an additional 40 percent of the original sand content where only 20 percent had been obtained from wells on the surface." In other words, where originally 80 percent of the oil was left in the ground after pumping was discontinued, the mining and draining method recovered twice as much as had been produced by drilling. So, instead of 80 percent being left underground, now there is only 40 percent.





The same process is being used successfully in the Higashiyama fields of Japan. These fields produced 156,710 barrels of crude in the first six years from a series of drainage galleries and crosscuts that divide the sand into rectangular blocks.

In the United States the same technique could be expected to produce better yields per cut especially in areas where the residual content of reservoir sand is much greater than in Japan.

According to recent estimates the capital investment required to set up synthetic-oil plants capable of producing 2 million barrels a day—the target set by governmental advocates of the program—would range anywhere from 20 to over 30 billion dollars. These figures, for plant construction alone, are greater than the total amount invested in our entire petroleum industry. And this industry is now producing, refining and transporting 5½ million barrels of oil daily, or almost three times the hoped-for production from coal and shale.

Not only would the synthetic program require huge amounts of money, it would also require more coal than it is possible to mine today without vast expenditures for equipment and manpower in the mines. Nor does the estimated figure include the cost of transporting the raw materials and synthetic oil. It doesn't include the cost of housing for the employees required to run the complex plants built in out-of-theway places. Complete new cities would have to be built around the plant sites.


The government has set aside 60 million dollars for research in the development of commercial synthetic-oil plants, and oil and coal companies are also spending many millions. This is proper procedure. By such investigations we can get the knowledge needed to design, construct and operate commercial plants economically. It is premature to build large plants until we have such knowledge.

One phase of the synthetic-oil program that is commercially practical today is the one using natural gas as the basic material. Two such plants are being built, each of which will produce 7000 barrels of gasoline and Diesel oil a day. In addition, each plant will produce daily about 400,000 pounds of chemicals such as alcohols and fatty acids. The synthetic oil from these plants will be competitive with crude products at today's prices whereas the proposed coal and shale synthetics could not compete on the market if produced by

processes we know of at this time.

The synthetic-oil processes as planned

today will produce largely internal-combustion-engine and heating oils. These oils are not true petroleum. Oil from shale is equivalent to a low-grade crude oil. Lubricating oil can be produced from natural-gas synthetic products by the use of expensive secondary processes.

The best way for this country to assure itself of petroleum is to increase exploration for new fields, to develop new ways to increase oil recovery, to develop the vast oil deposits of the continental shelf and to explore the possibilities of new methods of secondary recovery.

In the U. S. tideland oil fields alone, which are those beneath the coastal waters, there are now an estimated 100 billion barrels of crude oil or roughly 50 years' supply at the present rate of consumption. In addition, we have in the United States proved reserves totaling another 13 years' supply. Together these reserves assure us 63 years' supply of oil at the current rate of use. Then, in addition, there are billions of barrels of oil in the proved reserves of South America which are available to us. These reserves do not include the vast oil fields of the Near East.

These proved reserves do not include new quantities of oil still to be discovered in the United States. Every year we find new reserves and there is no reason to assume that we won't find more next year and for years to come. Extensive deepdrilling programs are in progress to test the possibilities of oil production at levels below 15,000 feet underground.


There are other facts that brighten the future of oil. Many power plants and steam engines began burning oil instead of coal when residual fuel oil, left after the refining process, was sold at extremely low prices. The oil industry at that time was selling this oil at a price below its cost from the crude.

Today, the industry can process this residual fuel oil by hydrogenation so that it is converted to more gasoline and higher-valued products by volume than the original amount used. For every 100 gallons of residual oil processed, over 105 gallons of gasoline can be produced. In 1947, for example, the production of residual fuel oil was 448 million barrels. If processed into gasoline, this would have provided more than 460 million barrels or more than 55 percent of our total gasoline production for 1947.

If all this residual oil were refined and it is not the same oil you burn in your furnace at home, that is a distillate product, not residual oil—we would have a



greater supply of gasoline than could be

sold on the present market.

Fuel oil should not be used for firing large power plants. The logical fuel for such use is coal and as residual oil prices increase because of its higher value as gasoline, such users may have to change back to coal. When this happens, enough oil will be available for processing so that we will have more than enough motor fuel. The supply of this residual oil is tremendous since about 25 percent of the crude oil run becomes residual oil.

Converting coal into synthetic oil results in a loss of 60 percent of its original heating capacity with present methods of synthesis. These processes require heat to produce the end products leaving only 40 percent of the total BTUs of the original

coal in the synthetic oil.

Research in the coal-burning field will develop more efficient use of the tremendous power of coal. Burning powdered coal in gas turbines is an example of such progress. To convert coal into oil and then have only 40 percent of its value left is not the economical way to use our resources.

What about the use of atomic energy as a means of providing heat for power plants instead of burning oil? This is a definite development of the future and it promises to provide, in 25 years or so, enough energy to alleviate some of our fuel problems.

This, then, is what the experts in the oil industry say about the synthetic-oil program. We should continue our research in the field, but it is too soon to consider investing billions of dollars in something that is still not adequately investigated. We should make sure we have the right answers to economical production before we go ahead with plans for commercial plants. We have time for careful study—there's enough oil in the ground for at least another 100 years.

best for the mountain pack-animal trip. For the boat or canoe camper, the center pole may be dispensed with and the peak of the tent roped to the limb of a tree. The four small corner poles, likewise, are not essential and only a small amount of space at head height will be lost due to the tent not being stretched tightly.

Two men can erect this tent in about three minutes by first pegging out the corners, then stretching the peak, either by the pole or by a rope fastened to a limb. The four corner poles may then be used or not, as desired. With its sewed-in floor and a mosquito curtain to roll down over the wedge-shaped door, this little tent is adaptable for hot or cold nights. It will withstand a wind of gale force when guyed from the center pole to four additional pegs set well out from the tent corners.

The Army mountain tent: Lightest of all, this tent is perfect for the canoe or backpack trip, where bulk cannot be great and every pound must pay its way. Made of extremely light and strong waterproof fabric, it is warm and snug for cold nights and equally comfortable when the nights are warm. A circular door fastens snugly and air is provided through tunnel-shaped windows at front and back. A strong bobbinet curtain is insectproof and may be tied back when not in use.

Weighing only a few pounds and with a bulk of not much more than two rolled blankets, this little tent will sleep two men. in snug fashion or has space for one sleeper and all his duffle. Available in many war-surplus stores at a fraction of its original cost, the tent comes complete with jointed poles, rope and steel pegs. The poles are erected shear-fashion, front and rear, to eliminate the center-pole problem. The back-packer in a woods country may not bother carrying poles and pegs and instead cut his own in the forest. A strong, sewed-in floor completes this little shelter which is one of the most comfortable and weatherproof small tents that has ever been designed.

The sleeping bag: The one-time popular folding cot, with its bulky bedroll, has been largely replaced by the modern sleeping bag equipped with an air mattress. This is the ideal combination for outdoor sleeping. The air mattress, a perfect insulator against cold and dampness, is inflated in a few minutes with a small pump or by blowing into it. Its weight and bulk are little more than that of a spare blanket.

Most sleeping bags have a pocket for the air mattress. Thus it becomes an integral

part of the bag with only the corner containing the valve being exposed for inflation and deflation. The best models are zippered down one side and across the foot so they can be opened wide for arranging bedding which may be used for extra warmth. The warmest and lightest type of sleeping bag is padded with down, closely quilted, inside a sateen or cotton cover. It weighs only a few pounds, but is amply warm for the coldest weather and is ideal for the back-packing outdoorsman.

The somewhat heavier and less expensive bags are padded with either kapok or wool, well quilted, and blankets are added when more warmth is necessary. The ordinary-size bag, about 30 inches wide, will take a wool blanket nicely when it is folded the long way. One or two such blankets, plus an inside washable cotton blanket, will insure warm, comfortable sleeping in temperatures well below freezing.

Many campers dislike the close confinement of a small sleeping bag, and for them there is an extra-wide bag, measuring from 36 to 40 inches across. In this, the extra blankets are used full width, the edges tucked in on each side. For real sleeping comfort the wise camper uses a pair of narrow sheets inside the bag and a pillow slip on a feather pillow. Then, tucked in his sleeping bag on an air mattress, inflated just enough so he will sink into it without touching the ground, he enjoys the restful slumber which contributes so much in pleasure and health to outdoor living.


All good sleeping bags have waterproof covers and a long flap, which folds down over the opening. This protects the bedding from dust in transportation and may be stretched out as a shelter for the head, when the bag is used in the open. The canoe traveler and the back-packer, who dispense with a tent entirely, may thus sleep comfortably even in bad weather.

When you plan that camping trip, remember these two essentials: A water-proof shelter and a soft, warm bed. The success of your trip—and often your health—depends on these two items.

### Carburetor Ice Detector for Planes

Pilots of private planes can tell exactly when ice begins to form in the carburetor with an ice detector hooked to the engine. A neon light on the instrument panel flashes to warn the pilot to turn on his preheater and thus avoid the danger of the engine choking and a crash landing. 

### **New Roads to Timberland**

(Continued from page 103)

Corporations estimated the total stand of saw timber in the United States at 2,826,-000,000,000 board-feet. During 1945-46 the Forest Service estimated that only 1,601,-000,000,000 board-feet remained. This would indicate that in 36 years this nation's wood pile has been reduced by 44 percent. The important thing, however, is that depletion has been largely from private lands. National-forest timber has held its own or even increased a little. Where private timberlands are giving out, many communities and industries become more and more dependent upon nationalforest timber. The Forest Service, therefore, has the double task of providing as much timber as can be safely cut now, and managing the timber resources wisely so more timber will keep growing for future generations.

Unlike such resources as coal, iron and oil, timber if properly managed can replenish itself and produce a continuing harvest. Uncle Sam, the nation's largest timber farmer, has found it necessary to build roads not only to harvest trees but to (1) fight forest fires, (2) replant burned-over areas and thin out young growth, (3) combat insect pests and disease, (4) improve grazing facilities, and (5) provide recreational areas.

The new timber-access roads will be part of a planned national-forest road network of 138,167 miles, of which 53,438 are now of satisfactory standard, 46,976 miles of unsatisfactory standard, and 37,753 miles merely in the blueprint stage.

In addition to roads, the Forest Service is building or maintaining 165,145 miles of trails. Last year the Forest Service fought nearly 10,000 fires within national-forest boundaries, which burned over 175,000 acres and did \$1,000,000 damage. And even though the new techniques of aerial fire fighting hold much promise, roads and trails are still indispensable in fighting fires. In some areas, it is necessary for fire fighters to travel 10 to 35 miles on foot over mountainous terrain to reach fires.

New roads also are often a boon to reforestation crews. Up to the beginning of World War II, some 1,150,000 acres of deforested land in national forests had been replanted. But some 2,200,000 acres still must be planted to bring the land back to productivity and another 1,000,000 acres are so understocked that fill-in planting is needed. Today, the Forest Service is bringing its system of nurseries back into



production and has as a goal completion of planting on these lands in 15 years.

Modern forestry does not depend entirely upon the natural growth, but upon scientific speed-up methods. Cleanings in young stands can favor desired species. Thinnings can provide the best spacing and increase the growth rate of individual trees 50 to 10¢ percent. Pruning of polesized timber can result in growth of knotfree wood at a younger age than would naturally occur. At a cost of \$12 to \$15 per acre, pruning in young conifers may increase the value of timber by \$100 or more per acre.

Science also has developed methods of combating some destructive forest insects and diseases—the white-pine blister rust and the pine bark beetle, for example. Access roads will help this front-line combat, as it will aid the Forest Service in management of national forests where in a year more than 1,300,000 cattle and horses and nearly 4,000,000 sheep and goats graze. Present ranges must be maintained in good condition and other ranges that have deteriorated from droughts and over-grazing built up.

Finally, as host to some 18,000,000 Americans who annually visit national forests, the Forest Service hopes that new roads may expand recreational opportunities.

Yet there will always be roadless areas in the national forests. More than 70 areas, totaling some 13,000,000 acres have been designated as wilderness areas, to be maintained permanently in their primitive status. In these wild areas, accessible only by trail or water, those who wish really to "rough it" or see nature free of artificial influences, will never be bothered by the sound of motor cars.

Forest Service engineers have developed several items of equipment especially adapted to road and trail building and other work. Among the newest is a "trail beetle," a tiny crawler tractor weighing only 1900 pounds. Another is a "trail mule," a three-wheeled, motor-driven, freight-carrying cart to negotiate steep mountain trails. In contrast is the new giant "tomcat" logging tractor, combining tractor and logging arch in one compact unit for snaking out and yarding big logs.

To sum up: the 2100 miles of access roads now under construction not only will provide timber for postwar construction, but will be a part of the transportation network by which the Forest Service can protect and manage the timber resources of the future. How Paul Bunyan would rejoice to be there with Babe, the Blue Ox, helping build those new roads!





## Three-Ring Zoo

The turtle shell (made of airplane tubing, wire mesh and molded green papiermache) is only one of scores of circus properties concocted by the zoo staff. The chimpanzee show requires specially built tricycles, bicycles and unicycles including an old-fashioned high wheeler and a bicvcle-built-for-two.

Other chimpanzee properties include stilts of various sizes, harness and saddles for the ponies, bizarre instruments for the jungle orchestra, acrobatic equipment and 42 costumes. These costumes, made by Mrs. Henry Pennypacker, wife of the assistant director, have zippers in hard-toreach places. The trainers, Ben Fridrich and Mike Kostial, keep a watchful eye on stage to prevent the chimps from unzipping each other and turning the Chimpanzee Circus Review into a strip-tease act.

"Chimps are like people," says Fridrich. "Some have talent and brains and some don't. Take Cookie; he is nine years old and we've had him in the show since he was three. I think he understands everything we say to him." He turned toward Cookie. sitting on his chair on stage. "Hey, Cookie! Make a face." Cookie complied by rolling his lower lip away down and screwing up his nose. "When Cookie was three he could turn a key in a lock and thread a needle. He does back somersaults on the ponies, rides bikes and plays in the orchestra."

The chimpanzee actors range from small four-year-old Nero, who steals many a scene, to Rastus, nine, oldest and toughest, who retires this year. When male chimps reach maturity (about the age of 10) they sometimes become savage and unmanageable and the trainers take no chances. Swanty, one of the brightest, has to wear a muzzle because of his mischievous nature. He not only nips his fellow actors with his sharp teeth but sometimes breaks up an act which he thinks is getting too big a hand. Occasionally, when seven or eight of the group are riding the ponies he will leap at them and knock them all off.

Among the hits of the chimpanzee review are the pony-riding stunts. One of the most difficult is the "table catch," performed by seven ponies, one donkey and nine chimpanzees—one more chimpanzee than there are mounts. As they ride up to a table at the front of the ring each monkey, in turn, leaps on the table top. As he does so the chimp already standing on the table leaps on the first chimp's horse as it comes out from under the table. Then the



first chimp goes over the table to catch the horse of the rider just behind him. The action is so fast there seems to be a continuous stream of chimps pouring over the table and a moving circle of ponies underneath. Another popular riding act is a Wild West solo by Cookie mounted on rearing White Lightning.

The bicycle acts include a Gay Nineties revue. The most difficult act is unicycle riding performed by Cookie and Tommy. Unicycle training starts by the trainer holding both cycle and chimpanzee as he moves them around the stage. Then a rope is used with the chimp gripping the rope and holding on while the trainer pulls him around. This rope is gradually lengthened until the trainer can stand in the center of the stage as the chimpanzee rides around. Finally, he performs without the rope. Only four chimps have mastered this show-stopping stunt.

The chimpanzee orchestra consists of a piano, snare drum, bass drum, trombone, tom-tom and xylophone. Cookie, the trombone player, is the star. He puts his mouth in place and works the slide up and down producing a weird assortment of honks synchronized with his actions. The slide is electrically connected with three sets of automobile horns concealed under a bench. Tommy obviously enjoys his piano act and makes faces as he thumps the keys. Most of the chimpanzee stars have understudies. Eight new actors are being trained to replace the aging stars.

Changing of actors does not worry Floyd Smith, the elephant trainer. His stars, Clara Belle, 15 years old; Marian, 14; Vi, 13; Lady, 7; and Honey, 6, need no understudies. Clara Belle, leader of the herd, has been performing for 11 years.

"The hardest trick to teach an elephant is to lie down on its side," says Smith. "The reason is because this king of beasts (king in my opinion) fears nothing when on his feet. When an elephant lies down it's at the mercy of other animals because it takes him so long to get up. At first I have to use a block and tackle to throw them-doesn't hurt — while I give the command 'down' and pull down on them with the bull hook. They soon get the idea because elephants are smart.'

His elephants are so smart, Smith reports, that they craftily test out every new helper he hires. As the new man walks by, Clara Belle casually slaps him with one of her big ears. If she is allowed to get by with it, the next time the man passes near she "accidentally" whacks him with her trunk, looking very innocent. If this passes

He encouraged her to make odd bawling noises, bellows and chirps. In the hilarious finale an imitation skunk is pulled out of the tuba, the viol lays an egg and the organ collapses. Marian, the drummer, was taught to press the bass-drum pedal by working with an old bedspring.

In a solo act, Vi counts by beating on a gong. The audience calls out numbers up to 10 and with no apparent cue from Smith she hits the gong the right number of times. How this act is performed remains one of Smith's secrets.

## Glass 'Lung' Gives Oxygen to Blood

Victims of pneumonia, tuberculosis and other lung-damaging diseases may be aided by an artificial lung that has been successfully used in the laboratory on animals and is ready for trial on humans. When lung tissues are injured by diseases, the lungs fail to absorb oxygen and eliminate carbon dioxide. The artificial lung takes over these functions outside the body. The blood is drawn from the patient, oxygenated, rid of carbon dioxide and restored to the body. Carbon dioxide is absorbed by a container of calcium hydroxide. The lung, a glass chamber, was developed by four brothers, Dr. John R. Guarino, a physician, and Louis, Frank and Vincent Guarino, who are engineers.

#### Level Has Built-In Angle Indicator

Eliminating complicated figuring, a combination level and angle indicator gives the craftsman the exact degree of slope or pitch by means of a 360-degree dial and weighted needle. To cut a board at the proper angle to fit a sloping wall, ceiling or cornice, the carpenter merely places the level against the slope and reads the angle on the dial. He then transfers this angle to the board and marks it. Made of aluminum, the tool also has four level vials, two horizontal and two vertical.

#### Same Fuse Can Be Used Six Times

Six fuses are built into a single unit, giving the same plug six lives before it must be renewed. Whenever a fuse blows, a red neon signal glows through a window in the unit so the householder can tell at a
