



switching equipment enables a TV picture to skip out of a troubled channel and into a stand-by protection channel faster than the eye can wink.







The Navy almost scuttled me. I shudder to think of it. My crazy career could have ended right there.

To be scuttled by the Navy you've either got to do something wrong or neglect to do something right. They've got you both ways. For my part, I neglected to finish high school.

Ordinarily, a man can get along without a high school diploma. Plenty of men have. But not in the Navy. At least not in the U.S. Navy Materiel School at Bellevue, D. C., back in 1929. In those days a bluejacket had to have a mind like Einstein's. And I didn't.



BIG, BLACK monster of a locomotive is growling up and down the boilerbusting grades of the southern Appalachians these days, pulsing a defiant challenge to the sleek diesels so rapidly replacing its coal-burning brothers.

This new power plant on wheels burns coal, too, like all the other engines operated by the Norfolk and Western Railway. But


the resemblance ends right there.


For this hulking brute is a coal-fired, steam-turbine-electric locomotive. Steam generated in the boiler at high pressure drives a turbine which develops 4500 horsepower at an electric generator supplying power to 12 traction motors, one for each axle.

But though this is a steam locomotive, the legendary Casey Jones and his mates of a bygone day would never recognize it as such.

In size alone, it beats anything Casey ever saw. Together with its tender, it is a little over 161 feet long and weighs 586 tons.

The black giant is so long that, with its tender, it cannot be handled on existing turntables. When it is necessary to turn it around, the tender is uncoupled, the huge

locomotive is turned, and the tender hitched onto the other end. It is nearly 40 feet longer than the N&W's longest conventional engine.

Casey and his friends would find a few other items turned around, too. Coal, 20 tons of it, is in a compartment of the engine itself, in front of the cab. The boiler is behind the cab, along with the turbine and generators. The tender contains only water (22,000 gallons) and a special water softener, with a brakeman's cupola perched jauntily on top.

Coal is fed from bunker to boiler by an automatic stoker. The softened, de-aerated, preheated water, preheated air for combustion and steam pressure all are fed and maintained at the proper levels by automatic controls. Even the ashes are removed automatically. The grate travels like an endless belt, depositing the ashes as it makes its turn.

Incidentally, one glance at the steampressure indicator would have sent Casey and his fireman jumping from the cab for their lives. The needle holds at 600 pounds per square inch, twice that of a conventional steam locomotive.

Locomotive 2300, the official designation given the engine by the N&W, is many things to many people.

To the mountaineer watching from his lonely shack, or the town dweller along the right of way, it is a long (the engine itself is nearly 112 feet), angular "shoebox" on wheels that can haul a mile-long string of coal cars past his place at 60 miles per hour. Such smoke as there is comes from a stack that is little more than a hole in the roof, and there is no puffing. The sound that comes from No. 2300 could best be described as a dull roar.

Coal men look on it hopefully as a

development that may restore to them a once-great market that has been shrinking steadily since the advent of the diesel.

The N&W people see it as the answer — maybe — to the diesel power they have so far scorned. The N&W, alone among major railroads, has stuck to the steam engine for both freight and passenger use.


A quick glance at the railroad's operations shows the reasoning behind the N&W's position. Economically, Norfolk and Western makes a major portion of its living hauling coal out of the rich southern Appalachian field, and is not disposed to slap its best customer by using diesel power.

Moreover, it's good coal. And, by virtue of its availability, it's the cheapest fuel the railroad could burn.

Technically, N&W motive-power men believe they have developed the steam locomotive to the highest possible degree of efficiency. The railroad builds many of its own in the huge shops near Roanoke, Va., to fit the road's requirements. It has developed servicing facilities designed to get the best out of the huge locomotives. And aside from the lower initial cost of the steam engine as compared with the diesel, there remains the fact that, as one N&W motive-power man put it, "a steam engine is just getting broken in good when it's 30 years old."

So efficient are the N&W's giant "A" class (12 drivers) and "Y-6" class (16 drivers) locomotives that the road long ago tore down 208 miles of overhead wire and scrapped an entire fleet of electric locomotives once used to haul the long coal trains over some of the toughest trackage in the nation.

Nevertheless, N&W engineers recognize along with railroad men everywhere that electric drive is the best way to deliver power to the wheels of a locomotive. Electric drive means smoother operation and higher tractive effort. There are no reciprocating parts to eat up the power. It is easy





on the rails. Its light, standardized running gear means easier work for shop crews.


The most direct answer to this, of course, was the old electric locomotive. But the cost of stringing overhead wire or laying third rails over miles of track was prohibitive in most instances.


Then came the diesel-electric. To many railroads, this self-propelled power plant with its relatively high efficiency and low-cost operation was the answer to the rising coal cost and increasing obsolescence of the old steam locomotive,

But not to the N&W. It stuck to coal and made the best of it.



# Handle on New Mount Lifts or Lowers Outboard Motor

You can raise or lower an outboard motor merely by moving a handle if the motor is clamped to a new mount. Raising the long handle lifts the motor in relation to the boat. Most outboards require 18 inches or more of water, but the new mount makes it possible to use the motor in water only six inches deep. The mount is especially effective in turbulent water filled with rocks and shallows, as it gives the operator instant control over the depth of the propeller.

# Wind Gauge for Home Use

Operating on the same principle as an aircraft air-speed indicator, a simple wind gauge has been developed by a Chicago manufacturer. Pressure derived from the wind entering a calibrated opening mounted on a weather vane is transmitted by flexible tubing to the indicator tube, which can be mounted any place inside a building. The indicator is calibrated in both miles per hour and the Beaufort scale, whose top reading is 12.








# Automobile Refrigerator Hooks to Air Conditioner

You can munch popsicles while driving through the desert if your car is equipped with a new auto refrigerator. The unit connects to any refrigerated, automobile airconditioning system and can be installed in an hour. It mounts on the floor in front of the instrument panel, behind the front seat or in the trunk compartment. Its capacity is 960 cubic inches which is large enough for 18 bottled drinks or two dozen 12-ounce cans.

# Coin-Operated Recorder Allows Dictation on Trip

Businessmen on trips can dictate letters to a new coin-operated recorder and mail one transcript home. A quarter buys a 15-minute recording belt and a stamped mailing envelope. Another quarter activates the recording machine for 10 minutes. The unit is housed in a soundproof booth and provided with a comfortable chair. It is being installed in hotels, airports and railroad stations throughout the country.







Headlights are retractable. Two driving lights are set in the grille."








"... Second most interesting was also a Farina ... this one on a V6 Lancia chassis. It has similar roof fins in the rear—watch for these on some of Detroit's cars of tomorrow. Front end is a large oval with horizontal louvers. I didn't think the styling work-out was as well done in the rear (left) as in the front. The recessed front grille is another styling trick that Detroit stylists may be using very shortly."

# Railroad Tosses "Passengers" Over Cliff at Supersonic Speed

SURPASSING the fevered imaginations of children's TV scripters or comic-book artists is a new 12,000-foot railroad under construction near Utah's Zion National Park. Cars on this railroad toss "passengers" off the top of a 1500-foot cliff at supersonic speeds. Parachutes and other deceleration devices then are supposed to float them gently to the floor of the desert a mile or so away.

Fortunately the passengers will be mechanical dummies studded with recording instruments. They are the Air Force's robots testing bail-outs from supersonic planes—bail-outs that might kill human pilots.

The trains on the railroad consist of two cars, a rocket pusher and a test sled. The latter carries the dummy or test ejection seat or capsule. The former provides the power and is halted by a water brake before it also plunges over the edge of the cliff. The facility is being built because the Air Force found that full-scale testing of ejection methods from high-speed aircraft was too expensive, and that tests from missiles were impractical. Scheduled completion date of the center is 1956.

# Even the Stagehands Have to Swim

THE BEST WAY to make a good underwater movie is to take the entire motion-picture company below the surface. That's what director George Sidney did when he filmed the underwater scenes for Esther Williams' forthcoming Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer picture, Jupiter's Darling.


The entire company, sometimes as many as 25 persons, went underwater and stayed there. Camera crews, property men and electricians for handling the lights wore aqua lungs that allowed them to stay down for two hours at a time. Part of the time Sidney directed the picture from the bottom, sometimes he observed the action from a glasswalled chamber built into the hull of a boat on the surface.

Even the actors, who wore no breathing apparatus, stayed under water for half an hour or so. Between camera "takes" they gulped air from compressedair hoses that were held by safety men who were out of camera range.

About the only members of the company who stayed on the surface were a pair of property men in a rowboat who looked


down on the action below them and released schools of fish into the scene when they saw Sidney wave his hand in their direction.

The picture tells the story of Hannibal's march on Rome and its underwater scenes are part of the story. The movie is said to include the longest underwater footage ever shot in color by a Hollywood studio. Some of the scenes were made in 20 to 50 feet of water at Silver Springs, Fla.,

and other sequences were made in a huge tank on the MGM lot in California.

Part of the action at Silver Springs called for an underwater chase in which actors dressed as gladiators swim in pursuit of Esther Williams. The chase occurs in and around the sunken wreck of an ancient Roman galley.

This set was built at the studio and is a replica of a galley's ribs and broken planking and is complete to such details as moss,

seaweed and barnacles, the last of which were made of rubber so that actors who brushed against them wouldn't be cut. Visible inside the wrecked part of the galley were urns and chests typical of the period. The set was taken apart after construction and shipped to Silver Springs, then reassembled and sunk below the surface.

The big technical achievement that made it practical to film long scenes under water was the invention of a neutral-buoyancy camera that neither sinks to the bottom, nor floats to the surface. It stays just where the cameraman puts it, at any depth down to 90 feet. The camera and its waterproof blimp and attachments weigh 510 pounds on dry land, yet below the surface it is literally weightless. In spite of its great bulk an underwater cameraman can point or pan with it as easily as you operate a small, lightweight, amateur-movie camera.

Pushing the unit in front of him, a


cameraman would swim down to the desired location, turn the camera in the right direction, tip it to the correct angle and then take his hands away. Unless there are currents in the water the camera remains motionless until it is purposely moved again.

The neutral-buoyancy housing, or blimp, was perfected by John Arnold, head of the MGM camera

department. The camera was to be entirely self-contained with its own power so that there would be no trailing wires or connections to the surface. It was to be held by hand instead of operated from a tripod. It was to carry 1000 feet of film so that as much as an entire day's shooting could be recorded.

Arnold designed and built two outfits, one containing a standard motion-picture camera fitted with a CinemaScope lens, the other having a different kind of wide-screen lens. The waterproof blimp enclosing each camera is made of aluminum sections bolted together and having rubber gaskets in





# House Trailer Mounted on Pontoons Becomes Comfortable Barge

SOMETHING NEW in a boat with all the comforts of home is *Dumbo*, an ordinary house trailer mounted on pontoons. The craft is designed to meet the needs of confirmed landlubbers who want a comfortable home for fishing or just nosing around the inland waters. The barge measures 40 by 15 feet, and is mounted on 47 pontoons.

Secured to the deck is a standard house trailer minus its undercarriage. The craft is complete with a pressure water system, a generating plant (along with plugs for shore tie-in to 110-volt current), four bunks and a butane stove and refrigerator. Two 12-horsepower outboard motors push the barge along at about five knots.

Wheel is mounted on platform above the trailer to give pilot a good view. Beneath deck are 47 pontoons





# I Chose a Steel-Frame House


I'M JUST COMPLETING a new house that is a mechanical masterpiece. It was designed for comfort and easy maintenance and was built through a new construction system. It contains striking innovations for efficient living.

The house has a steel frame like an office building. To a large extent it was put together with a welding torch instead of hammer and nails. It has built-in sound insulation and is considered proof against fire, earthquake, windstorm, insects and extremes in temperature. Yet it cost no more than standard high-quality construction. It should last for a couple of centuries.

About the only addition it may require in the next 50 years or so would be a solar battery to provide all light, heat and power. When perfected, this battery could be placed on the roof adjacent to the space reserved for the future heliport.

I can open or close the aluminum garage door from my car from as far as 100 feet away, using a new magnetic-impulse transmitter that is keyed to my garage door alone. From a master panel in the bedroom I can control prowler lights outside the house as well as the principal lights inside. One button on the panel turns on the coffeemaker in the kitchen. Also, from the







Footings and floors are poured in one operation. Reinforcing rods buried in slab tie columns together

bedroom, I can talk over a built-in intercom system to the kitchen or to visitors at the front door.

Although the exterior of the house is plain in appearance, the inside is a dream. The house has three bedrooms, a study, two bathrooms, a living room and entry, dining room, kitchen, a breakfast nook and laundry area. There's a lanai or semienclosed porch off the living room, along with some sliding glass doors. The two-car garage is in the front of the house where it

belongs, avoiding a long driveway to the rear on which unseen children might be playing. You can step directly from the garage to the kitchen with your bundles, a convenience housewives appreciate.


The steel-frame construction system that I used is the invention of Eugene Memmler of Glendale, Calif. Several years ago Memmler asked himself: "With all the new building materials and construction methods, why do people keep on building frame houses that constructionwise are about the same as they were a century ago?"

He evolved a new technique using steel, concrete, as bestos-cement panels and wood, and employed each material where it contributed most efficiently to the structure. Then he built a residence for himself as a test structure. He figured that the materials would cost a lot more than a conventional wood frame but that erection costs would be less, so he would come out even.

His system works so well that I used it, with his help and that of MackIntosh and MackIntosh, engineers, and architect Adrian Wilson, A.I.A. My contractors were Luther, Dahlin and Rogers.

In addition, a number of national companies lent some of their best engineering talent to help me put the house together. If you happen to be in Los Angeles you are invited for a visit any time up to March 1.

The frame is made of 3½-inch vertical pipe columns spaced eight feet apart. Across the tops are welded 12-inch junior I-beams that support the flat steel-roof deck. The bases of the vertical columns are anchored in concrete and, in addition, are joined together by tightly stretched reinforcing rods. After the concrete floor slab was poured, these embedded rods provided a kind of prestressing to the floor that made other reinforcing unnecessary.

The roof consists of a half inch of insulation on top of the steel deck, with three plies of roofing paper mopped with hot asphalt and finished with a layer of lightweight crushed volcanic rock. The flat roof has several advantages. It is architecturally modern, costs less than a pitched roof and allowed me to install a new kind of nonglare skylighting that helps illuminate some of the rooms below.

The steel frame supports the entire weight of the roof, so all the walls are non-load-bearing. Exterior walls are only 1½ inches thick yet have the same insulating value as 25 inches of solid masonry. They consist of fabricated panels faced on each side with a layer of asbestos and cement. After the steel frame was erected, these panels were shoved into place and bolted to the frame, their edges sealed with calking compound.

Inside the house I used conventional wood-stud and plaster partitions because this type of wall is the most practical for concealing the necessary water pipes, plumbing stacks and wiring. After these partitions were set in place they were anchored permanently to the floor and the overhead beams by means of steel fasteners shot from a gun.

Where electric switches and outlets were required on the outside wall of a room, they were built into the sheet-metal covers that conceal the interior exposures of the steel columns of the house frame. The electric outlets, incidentally, have spaces for three plugs instead of the usual two. In some rooms I connected one set of contacts in an outlet to a handy wall switch at the

# Beach Buggies Tow Sand Sleds

FOLLOWERS of a new sport around Southampton, L. I., area, hitch homemade sleds to hopped-up, stripped-down Model As and ride the sand instead of the waves.

A short rope gripped with both hands maintains the rider's balance as the towing car picks up speed, and a well in the rear of the sled furnishes a secure foothold as the device whips along the beach. A steel plate on the bottom protects the sled from the sharp sand.

Sand-sledding really got started when a group of enthusiasts formed the Southampton Beach Buggy Association, bought six Model A Fords and stripped them down. Most of the cars weigh only about 900 pounds. Each car was hopped up and equipped with oversize tires to give traction in soft sand.

When all is ready, the sled is hitched to the back of the beach buggy and the car starts out slowly, gathering speed as it goes. The sledders scoot along at 25 to 35 miles per hour on the dry sand.

Towing cars pull sleds at speeds up to 35 miles per hour. Sledders' club has six stripped-down Model As




## Drill With Cylindrical Bit Cuts Concrete and Stone

Like a mole tunneling through dirt, a new machine cuts its way through concrete, reinforcing bars or stone. It is equipped with diamond-embedded bits which are cylindrical in shape and which cut out a solid core of the material. Depending upon the bit used, the resulting hole is ¼ inch to six inches in diameter. The drill will cut a six-inch-diameter hole through a foot of concrete in less than two minutes. An extension arm can be used if the hole is to be more than 18 inches deep. It is quiet, dust-less and electrically powered. It's portable, lightweight and will drill vertically or horizontally.

#### Rain Detector Buzzes Alarm

You're warned of the first few splatters of rain by a moisture detector that sounds a buzzer. This allows time before the storm to close windows, bring in laundry from the line and call in pets and children. A moisture-sensitive grid, placed outdoors, is connected by a long cord to the buzzer unit that is plugged into a standard electrical outlet. The detector is like units which raise convertible tops when it rains.






## Tractor-Driven Pile Driver Tamps Soil and Digs Wells

Tractor engines can be made to do the hard farm work of driving fence posts, tamping soil or breaking up stone or concrete with a driver and breaker attached to a Ford tractor. Designed for one-man operation, the unit is operated by a single lever. A 200-pound drive weight is actuated by the tractor's power take-off, and attachments adapt the implement to post-driving, tamping or well drilling.

## Corner Tape for Dry Walls

Packaged in 100-foot rolls and as easy to handle as ordinary paper tape, a new steel corner tape for sealing dry-wall joints has been marketed. The tape consists of two thin strips of steel mounted on paper, and can be shaped easily into the joints between wall and ceiling. It is applied with wallboard-joint cement and smoothed over.

# LISTEN -It's the Wail of the Turboprops

'HERE'S A NEW SOUND in America's skies today, the eerie wail of the


turboprops.

The distinctive sound comes from the whine of the propeller tips, the scream of the turbine and the roar of the jet exhaust. That's what you hear from the ground. Inside the plane there's often so little noise that one new turboprop transport has been dubbed the "hushliner."

There's a big surge to this kind of aerial

propulsion because the turboprop looks like the champion power plant for hauling heavy cargoes over long distances. It permits higher speeds than are practical with piston engines and is more economical than

Lockheed added 100 miles per hour to the speed of a Navy Super Constellation when it converted the plane to turboprop power, yet kept much of the economy that had been obtained with piston engines.



The new turboprop "Super Connie" can fly 16-ton loads across the United States in less than six hours, a good two hours under

present airline schedules.

Convair has converted some of its Model 340 piston airliners to turboprops for the Air Force; Douglas is testing a big C-124 military transport on turboprops instead of the original piston engines; Martin has some conversions under way, and Boeing has been modifying some of its Strato-

freighters for turboprop power.

Recently Lockheed flew its new YC-130, the first cargo transport designed from the ground up for turboprop engines. The plane has a wingspan of 132 feet and a fat fuselage that sits close to the ground for truck-level loading through a huge door under the upswept tail. Douglas has under construction a similar and even larger transport that is designed to carry 25 tons of payload a distance of 3500 miles at better than 400 miles per hour. Both the Lockheed and Douglas turboprop transports might be able, as civilian transports, to haul cargo at five cents per ton mile, from one half to one third of today's costs with piston-engine transports.

Turboprops are used on the big Convair XP5Y flying boats, on Allison's demonstration Turbo-Liner and have been tested by North American and Douglas for carrierbased aircraft. The new engines power the vertical-take-off fighters built by Lockheed

and Convair.

With the exception of Allison's Turbo-Liner, all American turboprop development so far has been for the armed forces. Meanwhile, English builders of turboprop engines have been busy in the civil as well as military field. Their turboprop-powered passenger transports have been used in Europe for several years. In the United States, Capital Airlines has ordered 40 of the English transports and begins using some of them on its routes this spring. The new Capital airliners are Vickers Viscounts that are powered by four Rolls-Royce turboprop "Dart" engines. The Viscount carries 40 or more passengers, has a normal range of 1000 miles and flies in excess of 300 miles per hour. Trans-Canada Air Lines also has ordered Viscounts for early delivery.

Basically, the turboprop has the same kind of gas turbine that is used to drive a jet aircraft. As a turbojet, all the thrust from the turbine is used as jet drive, out the tail pipe. When redesigned as a turbine-propeller power plant, more wheels are added to the turbine and these additional blades absorb most of the jet thrust. The main shaft now has enough torque to drive a set of propellers through a 10-to-1-reduction gearbox. Only about 10 percent of the

power goes out the tailpipe as jet thrust.

From the standpoint of fuel economy the turboprop is almost as good as a piston engine. A typical turboprop consumes .42 pounds of fuel per hour per horsepower at 460 miles per hour as compared to the .40 pounds of fuel per hour per horsepower required by a piston engine at only 345 miles per hour. A pure jet uses more than twice as much fuel.


The turboprop has other advantages. Compared to a piston engine it weighs approximately half as much for the power developed. It has about half the frontal area and thus less drag. Compared to a jet, its propellers allow it to take off with much less runway and then to climb at a greater angle. It lands more slowly and comes to a stop much sooner. Engineers say that aircraft piston engines developing more than 4000 horsepower don't appear practical, yet turboprops developing 5500 horsepower already are in use. Ultimately the engines may be designed to produce as much as 15,000 horsepower.


The turboprop is a constant-speed engine that runs continually at high revolutions per minute. The pilot doesn't change his power settings for climb, cruise or descent. His throttle simply changes the pitch of the propeller blades.

The controls in the cockpit are about the same as ever, the chief difference being that the engine throttle lever has two quadrants, one for ground operation and the other for take-off and flight. The throttle is moved through a gate to go from one range to the other.


Starting a turboprop engine is somewhat different from starting a jet because of the great drag of the propellers. A compressed-air starter rotates the gas turbine's shaft up to some 2000 revolutions per minute, at which point the burners "light off" and begin to produce power. But drag is so great that the engine would simply quit if left alone at this point, so the starter continues to boost it along until 6000 revolutions per minute are attained. At this speed the

starter shuts off and the engine slowly accelerates up to "idle" at 13,000 revolutions per minute. At idle the propeller blades are turned to exert a slight negative thrust to counteract the slight positive thrust from the tail pipe.

Now the pilot can operate his throttle, pushing it ahead in ground range to taxi slowly ahead, or pulling it back to reverse the propeller pitch to make the plane move

backward.

When he moves the throttle into flight range for take-off the propellers change their angle of attack to take deeper bites of air. In the meantime, more fuel automatically flows to the burners so that engine revolutions per minute remain unchanged under the heavier load. In a broad sense the propeller blades know only one speed and operate at that speed continuously. The blades merely change their angle of attack in response to movements of the throttle.

When flying a turboprop transport, the pilot doesn't climb at a rather flat angle until he reaches cruising altitude and then fly straight and level, as he would do in a piston-engine plane. Instead, he climbs at a very steep angle to the initial cruising altitude and then continues to climb gradually for most of the distance to his desti-

nation This is because the turboprop gains in efficiency with altitude, and the pilot can climb to greater altitudes as the plane's weight is reduced by the consumption of fuel.

Most turboprops built so far are of the simple direct-coupled type in which additional turbine wheels are added to a standard gas turbine. More complicated to build and much simpler to operate is the so-called free turbine. This is a standard gas turbine with a hollow main shaft having a second shaft contained inside the hollow shaft. This shaft contains the additional turbine wheels at one end, and is connected to the propeller gearbox at its other end. It is this shaft that rotates the propellers. The British "Proteus" is of this type.

Another kind, the dual-spool turboprop, is similar to the free turbine and has an additional compressor stage at its front, directly behind the gearbox. This also is called the "supercharged" turboprop engine. It is the most complicated of all to design and build, but is less affected by high ground temperatures (which can reduce take-off payload) and maintains full power to high altitudes. It can be designed for a fuel consumption so low that it is said to compete with a diesel in economy.

Still another turboprop engine consists of two gas turbines placed side by side and feeding into a common gearbox. One turbine can be shut down for economical operation at low altitude, both of them can be used for climbing and for high speed at high altitude.

Another design of gas turbine is the socalled bypass or ducted-fan engine. This would be a gas turbine with some extralarge compressor blades at its forward end. Much of the compressed air would travel through the turbine as usual, with the balance of the air being ducted along the outside of the engine casing to join the hot jet exhaust. On paper this engine is quite efficient although it has not yet been built.

Now that Capital Airlines is testing turboprop Viscounts, other airlines will be watching to see how the new power plants operate. Until now most airlines have had a wait-and-see attitude because the turboprops have not been entirely reliable in the past. In fact, various military turboprop aircraft have spent most of their lives on the ground waiting for replacement parts to be designed and built. The basic turboprop engine is pretty rugged, to be sure;

and the difficulties have had to do with propeller-pitch controls and with the safety controls that must function if an engine happens to overheat or overspeed.


Among the most important safety features recently developed is a negativethrust-control system that detaches the propeller assembly from the engine immediately in case of power-plant failure, even before the feathering device that weathercocks the blades into the wind has time to operate. Without such a system, the drag from one propeller of a multiengined plane could be so great when a power plant failed that the plane could go out of control or even whip around so rapidly that it would break up.

Now that this and other safety controls have been proven, various air-transport manufacturers are expected to develop turboprop airliners within the next couple

of years.

Turboprop airliners are the next step, and even when the pure-jet airliners begin to flash past them they won't go out of the picture. For short passenger hauls and for flying cargo they will still be unsurpassed.

Unnecessary with piston engines, propeller-pitch controls are added to turboprop flight engineer's board





ABOUT TWO YEARS AGO, a Jaguar sports car set a record of 100.65 miles per hour for 10,000 miles. It was the first production car to average more than 100 miles per hour for 10,000 miles.

Now a 1955 Packard with its new V8 engine has averaged 104.74 miles per hour for 25,000 miles! The car was a Patrician four-door sedan with the new torsion-bar suspension. The 104.74-mile-per-hour average is figured on elapsed time—actual running time had to be several miles per hour faster to allow for pit stops. The top lap speed (21/2-mile track) was 114 miles per hour.

Packard is bragging about the engine (and well it should) and the fact that oil consumption was the same at the finish of the 25,000-mile grind as at the start—a quart every 845 miles. But there will be little bragging about gasoline economy! It averaged about 7 miles per gallon! Let that be a lesson to you. If you want economical driving, don't average 104 miles per hour!

#### Twelve Drivers Used

Twelve drivers took part in the test. They were relieved every hour at refueling stops. The run would have been uneventful, says Packard, except for the weather. There was considerable rain during the period and driving at 110 miles per hour in rain is not exactly relaxing.

The unbelievable part of the feat is the fact that only one car was available for it. In most runs of this type, several cars are started with the hope that at least one will finish successfully. Packard's limited budget meant that only one 1955 car could be made ready for the run.

As it happened, there was a breakdown at just over 10,000 miles and the whole thing had to be restarted. A hydraulic valve lifter failed—something that could happen to anybody, as they say. The aver-

age speed at that point was 105.859 miles per hour-a new record itself.

But Packard decided to go for the 25,000 as planned so a new engine was installed in the same car and the run restarted. This time the engine didn't miss a beat.

#### Most-Powerful Engine

Incidentally, the 1955 Packard engine has a 352-cubic-inch displacement and a reported 260 horsepower with one fourbarrel carburetor. The Carribbean convertible will have two four-barrel carburetors and its horsepower, probably the highest in the industry, is still secret.

Besides Packard, the only 1955 cars still waiting to be unveiled are Hudson, Nash, Kaiser and Willys. Kaiser is still an unknown quantity. Willys will have a major styling change, say informed sources.

Hudson and Nash are now twins under the skin, but outwardly there is considerable difference. In fact, George Romney, president of American Motors, reports that the two cars share only one exterior body panel. The basic body shell is identical, however. You'll be amazed at what can be done with the same "skeleton"-both have the unitized, frameless construction.

The 1955 Nash offers a unique fender treatment. Front fenders no longer house the headlamps. The lights are now inset in the oval front grille, similar to those on the Nash-Healey sports car. The front fenders come to a graceful curve with small parking lamps set into the lower halves.


Buick will spark the midseason sales period with its four-door hardtop sedan. This company is the one that set the trend when it brought out the two-door hardtop several years ago. It is expected (by Buick, at least) that the four-door hardtop will have a similar effect. The absence of any center post in the four-door sedan will make the traditional family car as sleek as a convertible. Whether the leak and rattle problems have been solved for four doors remains to be seen—these are still problems in some two-door hardtops!

#### Air-Cooled Engines

Chrysler Corporation has developed a 200-horsepower air-cooled engine for an experimental airborne military truck. It has six cylinders and a fuel-injection system instead of a carburetor. The truck body, wheels and axles are made of aluminum. Each wheel has independent torsion-bar suspension. The 2½-ton truck weighs only 9000 pounds, compared with 14,000 for a conventional model.

American Motors has bought the rights to the Mighty Mite, the midget more compact than the Jeep that will run on three wheels if necessary. Engineers at American Motors have developed an air-cooled, lightweight engine for the tiny vehicle. This may be a hint of future plans for the small,

basic car so dear to Nash.



# "Snort" Makes Supersonic Tests for Navy

CAPTIVE TESTS of guided missiles, rockets, model or full-size airplanes and assorted parts are being made at supersonic speeds at the Navy's new research track at China Lake, Calif. The track has been dubbed the "Snort" due to the sound from its powerful rocket motors. The Snort is 4.1 miles long and was designed to bridge the gap between wind-tunnel and free-flight testing. Among its many advantages are the recovery of test objects intact and instrument (including photographic) recordings of all phases of the tests. The

Snort affords accurate measurements of thrust, acceleration, velocity, lift, drag, vibration, shock-wave effects, flutter and many other factors. Measuring instruments include magnetic-pickup track coils, a telemetering system and cameras stationed every 500 feet along the track. Test items can be mounted on either monorail or dualrail carriages which ride on metal shoes. The Snort's supporting facilities at the station consist of a test-control building, an assembly building, a blockhouse and a magazine for storing explosives.

# Airborne Radar Sees Through Storms


NORTHBOUND over the Caribbean in a flight from Panama to Miami, the pilot of a Panagra DC-6 saw the sky ahead of him illuminated by lightning flashes from horizon to horizon. Normally this would call for greatly reduced speed to meet expected thunderstorm turbulence,


or a lengthy, schedule-destroying detour.

The pilot neither reduced speed nor did
he detour markedly from his course. He
arrived in Miami on schedule and with no
discomfort to his passengers.

At North Platte, Neb., airport a DC-3 took off directly into a front 152 miles long,

with clouds 40,000 feet high. Three scheduled flights in the vicinity prudently detoured widely, but the DC-3, a United Air Lines cargo plane, flew right into the front and 20 to 30 miles through it, Only "mild choppiness" was experienced.

Neither pilot unduly endangered lives, cargo or aircraft. Each was able to "see" the storm centers hidden in the cloud masses and widespread lightning flashes with one of electronics' greatest contributions to safety on schedule for the airlines—airborne weather radar.

The storm centers appeared to them as "doughnuts" of light surrounding dark spots on hooded radarscopes in their cockpits. The dark holes in the doughnuts—the cores of the storms—were clearly visible because of isoecho contour circuits in the radar sets.

These formidable-sounding circuits actually have the simple function of eliminating return signals, or echoes, of greatest intensity from the scopes. Thus very heavy rain at the storm center appears as a black spot surrounded by reflections of lesser precipitation.

Airborne weather radar can probe storms as far as 200 miles ahead and report them faithfully on the scope in the cockpit.

It enables a pilot to determine whether a threatening sky is truly dangerous or whether slight detours around storm centers can carry him ahead on his course. It also can help him to spot prominent terrain features in heavy weather.

## Long-Range "Voodoo" Fighter


Powered by two 10,000-pound-thrust Pratt and Whitney J-57 turbojet engines, the McDonnell F-101A "Voodoo" fighter is one of the most powerful fighter planes ever built. Performance figures are secret, but the aircraft is in the supersonic class and can carry atomic weapons. It is capable of in-flight refueling. A long-range fighter, the Voodoo will be assigned to the Strategic Air Command. Dimensions are: 39-foot, 7-inch wingspan, 67-foot, 4-inch length and 18-foot height. Wings and stabilizers are swept back 35 degrees. The wing skin is of heavy, preformed sections.


### Dry-Ice Balloon

Dry Ice has been adopted to time the release of anti-Communist leaflets from Free Europe balloons wafted over Hungary. A frame carried beneath the plastic balloon is fitted with two cardboard boxes, one at each end of a free-swinging rod. The Dry Ice evaporates, allowing the upper box to tip and spill its load of leaflets.

#### Gas Insulates New Transformer

Gas, rather than liquid, insulates and cools new transformers under development by General Electric Co. Sulphur hexafluoride, a heavier-than-air gas, is the agent used in this first application of a gaseous insulation to high-voltage power transformers. The new insulator allows design of transformers rated at 69,000 volts.






## Lifesaving Bellows Powered by Crank

# They Photograph Engine Wear

IF YOU'VE ever missed railroad connections because your train fell behind schedule, you'll be glad to know that something is being done to prevent such mishaps in the future.

The "cure" depends upon an instrument known as an emission spectrograph, which looks a little like a fugitive from a comic strip. The complete system requires, among other things, milk bottles, fountain straws and an electric hot plate. Recently, several railways each invested \$25,000 in such contrivances to make their trains run on time.


The machine "photographs" wear and tear inside a diesel engine. It sees the same things a mechanic would if he could crawl under a cylinder head or perch on top of a bearing and stay there during every mile the engine was in operation. Thanks to the emission spectrograph, late arrivals due to mechanical failures have dwindled to the vanishing point on many

of the railroad lines in this country.

Briefly, this is how the emission spectrograph works: Pulling freight and passengers back and forth causes two major kinds of wear inside a diesel engine. One is leakage—gaskets and piston rings loosen, and water or fuel oil gets into the lubricating system. Also, air filters begin to let in dirt, as well as air, after a while. This dirt is the villain primarily responsible for the second type of wear—erosion. Just as sand kicked up in a storm will chip paint off a building, these small dirt particles will chip tiny bits of metal off engine parts which, in turn, means overhauling more often.

Now, if you had a method of measuring the amount of water and fuel oil leaking into the lubricating system, and a method of measuring the dirt and other foreign bodies, you would know when the engine had to be pulled in for an overhaul and what parts had to be replaced.

You can obtain both measurements from

Meters and dials stud control board of emission spectrograph which measures foreign elements in oil sample


the emission spectrograph. And, by analyzing lube-oil samples at periodic intervals, the gadget accurately produces a continuous diesel-engine history covering every operating mile.

The machine supplies engine data in the form of numbers. Each number represents

the concentration of a particular foreign element in the lubricating oil. A high silicon concentration, for example, means a lot of dirt is getting in (since silicon is the chief chemical element in airborne dirt), and the engine's air filters should be checked. A high concentration of boron (one of the elements in radiator water) means there is a leak in the cooling system. Similarly, a large quantity of copper, lead, silver or other metal in the lubricating oil indicates which parts should be checked for wear.


Recently, I saw the instrument put through its paces at the Rock Island Lines' Chicago research laboratory. The Rock Island's emission spectrograph keeps tab, not on one engine, but on 600, which operate along 6000 miles of track between Memphis and Denver, Minneapolis and Houston. Rock Island's chief chemist, J. T. Rudd, showed me one engine-history report that described what was going on outside the engine, as well as inside. He pulled a card out of a file and pointed to a column headed "silicon," which contained the numbers (Continued to page 230)



## Towering Excavator Moves Along As It Scrapes Clay From Bank

Clay for bricks is planed from the sides of deep pits with a slanting excavator. The 92-foot-high tower of the machine rests against the face of the clay bank. Cutters and scrapers mounted on an endless chain travel from top to bottom of the bank and carry the cut clay into a chute feeding a central hopper. From the hopper the clay is carried by conveyor to an outside hopper where wagons transport the clay to the


brickyard. The machine moves along the clay face at six inches per minute. The tower can be adjusted to various angles and also turns about its axis. When digging, it swings back and forth to make a semicircular cut. The design of the English machine permits a safe angle of digging and a smooth, stable face. The clay is delivered in small, workable lumps. It can dig a clay face 90 feet deep at the rate of 110 tons per hour.



## **Tri-Duty Inspection Tool** Casts Light in Right Spot

Inspection of tight wiring or close machine areas is easy with a three-way tool. Essentially, it is a flashlight powered by miniature batteries. When a plastic probe is inserted in its nose, light is beamed to the tip of the probe and given off in a flood of illumination. A small round mirror that is clipped to the probe permits inspection of tight areas. The compact probe is designed for engineers, machine and TV technicians, dentists and repairmen. It offers the proper illumination at the spot desired.

# Let's Import Rain for the Dust Bowl

New Mexico scientists pursuing the rain-making project turn up a strange discovery: Water changing into ice generates electricity




YUCATAN? This is Dust Bowl. We'd like about 800,000,000 tons of rain next week. Start your ground generators!"

Fantastic instructions like this may not seem farfetched a few years from now. There's a possibility that dry Texas and much of the drought area can be changed into a vast garden spot simply by seeding rain clouds over the Yucatan peninsula in Mexico.

The idea of controlling the weather from a distance stems in part from a striking relationship that has been observed between periodic cloud-seeding activities in New Mexico and subsequent heavy rainstorms as far away as the Ohio valley. The air masses that were seeded in New Mexico were on their way east toward the Ohio.

To test the long-range idea, a proposal to seed the Yucatan clouds is advanced by Two thunderstorm scientists, Doctors Workman and Reynolds, diagram some electric fields inside a cloud





Dr. E. J. Workman, president of the New Mexico Institute of Mining and Technology. The Socorro campus of the institute has been headquarters for much of the rainmaking research conducted in the United States.

"Summer winds frequently sweep north from the Gulf of Mexico after leaving much moisture in the Yucatan area," Doctor Workman states. "It would be a worthwhile experiment to seed the Yucatan area in an effort to reduce rainfall in that wet region and thus force the air masses to transport their moisture farther north.

"Quite possibly all of northeastern Mexico, Texas and parts of New Mexico and Oklahoma would benefit.

"Usually when you seed clouds with silver iodide or other nuclei you are trying to increase the rainfall in the immediate area. But the same method can actually reduce precipitation. If an immature cloud is seeded, for instance, the cloud-building mechanism is disrupted and the cloud

"Similarly, overseeding can put a mature cloud right down on the ground and end its life, bringing a relatively quick end to its rain production.

Either or both of these methods should be tried off Yucatan in efforts to increase the rainfall where we need it.

Modern research on rain making (actually rain augmentation) has been going on continuously ever since Dr. Irving Langmuir and Dr. Vincent J. Schaefer of General Electric developed their seeding techniques in 1946. Yet the subject is so broad that it is still far from being an exact science, although about a dozen groups in the United States and abroad are actively studying it.

To learn more about how to make it rain, the cloud physicists at the New Mexico institute go aloft in aircraft studded with research instruments. They bore through thunderstorms, tag air masses with fluorescent aerosols and then trace the air masses for hundreds of miles to observe the mixing of the atmosphere. Today they

are preparing to create artificial thunderstorms and other rain clouds inside a huge test tube at Socorro, and to use radio direction-finding apparatus on a continental scale (with stations in Minnesota, Florida and New Mexico) for tracing thunderstorms by their electrical discharges.

Already, working with zerofreeze boxes and other apparatus
in their thunderstorm laboratory,
the Socorro scientists have learned
a number of brand-new facts about
nature. One of their milestones
was the discovery of what probably causes lightning. Doctors
Workman and S. E. Reynolds
found that an electric charge is
created when water freezes into
the solid state, no matter whether
the freezing occurs in a cloud or in
your refrigerator at home.


A sample no larger than an ordinary ice cube, they discovered, may generate as much as 250 volts while changing from water to ice. The amperage is extremely small, usually less than 100 microamperes, but enough to be significant in thunderstorm electrification.

At Socorro this Workman-Reynolds effect is demonstrated by inserting one lead from an electrostatic voltmeter into water contained in a plastic cup with a platinum base placed on a freezing unit. The base of the cup is grounded to the unit. The voltmeter needle remains at zero until freezing begins, then slowly swings over to 40, 50 or 150 volts, depending on the impurities in the water. The voltmeter needle returns to zero when all the water has frozen.

In a thunderstorm, Doctor Workman theorizes, water that is shed from growing ice generates enough voltage to produce a lightning stroke, apparently a logical theory.

The step-by-step sequence is something like this: The thunderstorm has its beginning as an updraft of air from the heated surface of the ground, or as a breeze that is deflected upward by a mountainside. In either event, the warm air travels upward until it encounters sub-zero temperatures.

The moisture in the air freezes into ice crystals and becomes electrified in doing so. Soon the ice crystals become heavy enough to begin falling through the ascending column of air or in the region alongside it, and it is at this point that the separation of the electric charges begins. Water droplets in the ascending air column rob the ice and




Generator on car creates clouds of silver-iodide smoke, seeding cloud formations in experiments to increase the rainfall

hail pellets of their positive charge and thus a region of positive charge is built up high in the cloud.

As the pellets continue to fall, they encounter warmer temperatures and begin to melt, yielding their negative charge to the water vapor low in the cloud.

The result of this process, extremely simplified here, is that a region of positive charge builds up high in the cloud and a negatively charged center gathers in the lower portion of the cloud. These centers may discharge together as sheet lightning, or the discharge may occur between the ground and the low negative center in the

form of a lightning stroke. This last event leaves the cloud with a net positive charge, something that explains the "fair-weather positive field" that surrounds the earth.

A thunderstorm goes through its whole complicated life in about half an hour. It begins with an updraft, then precipitation drags the air downward and creates a downdraft, killing the system. But this action in turn generates a second cell. This is the explanation of why a weather pilot flying through a line of thunderheads may find an updraft in one, a downdraft in the next.

The same electrical phenomenon that causes lightning and thunder may be the key to other natural conditions that have puzzled scientists in the past.


"For instance," Doctor Workman suggests, "every lake and pond apparently produces current during winter freezing. Some electrolysis takes place, converting small amount of water into free oxygen and free hydrogen. This has been demonstrated in the laboratory. Thus the freezing of water can account for the constant trace of hydrogen in the atmosphere, something that has been difficult to explain in the past.


This winter a reservoir on the Socorro campus is being used in large-scale tests of the Workman-Reynolds effect. The electric potential between the ice and water will be measured during the time the reservoir is freezing. Amperage likewise will be

measured and it may be that the reservoir will be found to be producing several amperes of current. Copper and tin electrodes will be placed in shore waters to learn whether the "freeze" electricity can perform an electroplating action. If it does, this could be an explanation of how, in quite a few instances, some natural deposits of pure metals were created.

Other research at the institute has shown that ice can be an efficient conductor of (Continued to page 234)

Cross section shows how one type of portable generator produces silver-iodide cloud through combustion







## "Octopus" Melts Ice on Ship

Hot exhaust gases from an airplane gas-turbine engine may be used by the Navy to melt ice on ships in arctic waters. The engine, a Boeing Model 502, would supplant the axes and steam now used to clear masts and deck gear. Six flexible reinforced-rubber hoses are connected to extensions on the engine's

exhaust pipes. The extensions, four inches in diameter, overlap the two-inch exhaust outlets. Cold air rushes in around the twoinch pipes, mixing with the 1200-degree-



Fahrenheit exhaust gases and lowering their temperature to 600 degrees. Two of the modified engines are being tested on icebreakers in arctic regions.



## Crane Attachment Pounds Deep Hole

Deep holes for cisterns, wells and for drainage are dug rapidly with an attachment for a crane. With powerful pile-driver strokes, the unit eats through dirt or asphalt street. Essential features of the unit are a grapple, a bucket with sharp diging teeth and a hammer. The hammer smashes down on a metal frame connected to the coupling arms of the open bucket. The bucket opens to dig a rectangular hole, closes to lift the material and deposit it.



## Push Buttons Ease Hospital Work

STAFF WORKERS at the new Long Island Jewish Hospital, in Floral Park, N. Y., have an army of electronic aids ready to assist them at the push of a button. These include a two-way communication system between patient and nurses, vest-pocket portable receivers carried by doctors to pick up messages from a high-frequency-radio paging system, and units outside operating rooms to test doctors and nurses for static electricity. Another innovation is an electronic bed monitor attached to the springs that relays a signal to the nurses' station if a patient tosses about more than usual. The hospital also has a cooling system which uses water from a deep well.






## Farmer Relaxes in Swivel Chair of Milk Plant



Without leaving his swivel chair in the pit, former can milk from 25 to 30 cows per hour. Below, the little steel building, measuring 11 by 26 feet, can be attached to an existing barn



IN A NEW milk plant, the dairy farmer does all his work from a swivel chair. The "packaged plant" includes the prefabricated building and most of its equipment, right down to the cushioned swivel chair itself. The steel building measures 11 by 26 feet and is divided into two rooms. The milkhouse contains the milkhandling equipment. The remainder of the building is the milking room, which has a pit in the center. From his swivel chair in the pit the farmer pulls a cord, which opens a sliding door to admit a cow from the holding area. The cow is stopped in the first stall for cleaning and then moves on to the next stall for milking. The arrangement of the stalls permits two cows to be milked simultaneously while a third cow is being prepared for milking. From his comfortable chair the farmer can twist a crank, dropping mixed grain and feed supplement into two mangers from an overhead hopper, permitting the cows to feed while they are being milked. The walls and ceiling of the building are insulated and the inside walls are lined with easily cleaned plastic. The stalls, mangers, swivel chair and even a towel dispenser are provided. Only the milking equipment, plumbing and wiring are not included since each farmer has his own preferences.


The name of Jess Oppenheimer, head writer and producer of *I Love Lucy*, had come up during our discussion, and it was to this one-man "idea factory" that Lucy was referring when she spoke of The Brains.

Oppenheimer came by the appellation of The Brains because of an amazing penchant for inventing mechanical devices at the drop of a problem. He dreams them up—

and works them out—with the same prodigiousness and facility that he's been turning out award-winning scripts for the most popular situation comedy on television,

Oppenheimer's associates say he is a bona fide genius who has been endowed with a surplus supply of gray matter from childhood. When he was in the third grade of grammar school, his teachers made the startling discovery that he was quietly toting around an IQ in excess of 140, that mental borderline where normalcy ends and genius begins.

A group of college savants under the aegis of Stanford University promptly included young Jess among the 1000 gifted children of 140-plus IQ, and from that day forward Oppenheimer has been an intellectual guinea pig followed with passionate interest by psychologists interested in the social and economic metamorphosis of the genius. On an average of once a year, fieldworkers go forth and check on what is

happening to these human brain trusters. It is obvious that Jess Oppenheimer has been no disappointment at all to Prof. Lewis Terman,

An inexpensive system for synchronizing series-wound motors.



which children cannot receive a shock even if they insert a screwdriver.

There will be more on the way. Oppenheimer is thinking all the time. Almost all his inventions have materialized after he explained his idea, and his wife, Estelle, scoffed, "That's impossible!"



> Brentwood home, the drapes happened to be pulled back, and Oppenheimer happened to look at the window. He saw a reflection of the room in the window, jumped up excitedly and cried: "That's it!"

"Dear," his wife asked quiet-



Oppenheimer jubilantly explained that because it was dark outside and the lights were on in the room, it was possible to see the reflection in the window. Yet, he pointed out, if he were outside in the dark, looking inside, he wouldn't see any reflection at all in the window.

"Well," he concluded triumphantly, "there's no reason why I can't apply the same principle to the television lens and figure out a way of looking directly into the camera to read the script without inter-

fering with the picture."

Oppenheimer promptly built a working model of the Jayo Viewer. It works so well that he stands to make a young, or even a more substantial, fortune renting the viewers to television stations which have been praying for just such a miracle.

His viewer projects a reflection of the script-in letters that are 5/8 inch highonto a two-way mirror placed in front of the lens at a 45-degree angle. The commentator or actor can't even see the lens. He merely sees the script going by. Conversely, the lens penetrates the antireflective coating on the rear of the mirror and photographs the performer without picking up any of the light illuminating the script. The effect is that the commentator may relax, and in fact give the impression that he is thinking up his lines as he goes along.

Oppenheimer's viewer not only achieves the illusion of spontaneity in newscasts, but it effects other improvements and short cuts which the industry is expected to

For purposes of visibility, it previously had been necessary to develop a special typewriter with letters 1/2 inch high. Special paper — usually teletypewriter paper 12 or 13 inches wide—was required. This






When this film is projected onto the beam splitter-the Oppenheimer two-way mirror chemically treated with 25-percent-transmission and




Three giant dredgers in brown-coal open cut at Yallourn, Australia, produce 20,000 tons of coal daily

## Australians Mine Brown Coal for Gas

BROWN COAL, which lies untouched in many countries, will be turned into gas for commercial and household use by a new plant near Melbourne, Australia. The fourth of its kind in the world, it will be similar to three plants built in Germany and now behind the Iron Curtain.

Dredger's endless chain of buckets digs 550 tons of coal hourly



Earthy brown and crumbly, brown coal is much different from black coal and has a high moisture content, low heating value, deteriorates rapidly in storage and often ignites spontaneously. Although unmined in the United States, it comprises almost one third of our total coal resources. In

> Australia, brown-coal reserves outnumber black-coal reserves. Nearly 7,000,000 tons of brown coal are taken each year from the great open-cut mine at Yallourn.

The Melbourne plant, due for completion in 1956, will use a mixture of one third raw coal and two thirds dried briquettes. Oxygen and superheated steam are mixed outside the generator and fed into it through the grate. They come in contact with the carbon derived from brown coal to produce a mixture of hydrogen and carbon monoxide known as "water gas." As this rises through the bed, its temperature falls and methane formation takes place, increasing the heating value of the gas. The gas is then washed and precooled in a spray cooler and further cooled under pressure in tubular coolers, where tar and oil by-products are condensed and recovered. It is stripped of the benzol it contains, dried, and piped into town mains.

It is expected that within 30 years all of the gas used in Victoria will come from brown coal. Gasoline, diesel oil and tar will be among the valuable by-products.

# Art of Carpentry Taught by Kits

A SCALE-MODEL method of teaching carpentry is being used with great success in a number of high schools and colleges. Each student is furnished with a complete kit of miniature lumber for building a cutaway model of a house, barn, church or some other structure. Called Minimalic Construction, the method was developed by O. G. Hughson of Portland, Ore., 89-year-old philanthropist and educator, who has spent 20 years perfecting this means of giving boys a trade knowhow along with the fun of a hobby.

Each Mini kit contains a full stack of lumber (230 pieces) plus blueprints, nails and instructions.

Because a complete model house would be immensely complicated, these are of cutaway plan. The building's framework is completed; enough of the siding, roof, doorways and so forth is installed to give the principles involved. The models are of good size, scaled 1½ inch to the foot, so they can be assembled by standard methods. Regular carpentry tools are used and each board


is fitted and assembled with small nails just as if it were on a real house. The student learns how to use a carpenter's square, to read blueprints, methods for putting in a foundation and framing, then finishing with siding and window frames. Kits are available only to schools and most of the cost is absorbed by West Coast lumber companies.



The engraving ranges from the simplest scrolls to full presentation. With only a few minor exceptions, involving changes in screw threads and firing-pin assembly, the new gun is a perfect reproduction of the old Frontier Model. It has the same weights, lines and barrel lengths. To the eye, it is the same handgun that recalls so vividly the stories, legends and personalities of the frontiersmen who many years ago made it famous.




### Fowl Feathers Removed By Dip in Solution

Reported to be the most powerful instrument of its type in the world, a 15,000,000volt linear accelerator for research and treatment of cancer has been perfected in England. The machine will be installed in St. Bartholomew's Hospital in London. It first will be used for research, and later for high-voltage cancer therapy.





### Gauge Measures Brake Drums


Featuring micrometer accuracy, a gauge for brake drums checks diameters to determine if the drums are round and safe enough for continued use. Measuring drums from 8 to 18% inches in diameter, the gauge can be used on drums on or off the lathe. Readings are seen on a large, direct-reading scale. By establishing diameter, the mechanic can match the lining to the drum for 100-percent contact.

### **Dolly Eases Tire Changing**

One man can change truck tires weighing from 30 to 300 pounds with a lightweight dolly. The tool aids in pulling off the wheel and transporting it over floors, soft or hard dirt or over graveled terrain. It weighs less than seven pounds.

Designed especially for miniature and candid-camera work, a lightweight stroboscopic-flash unit will provide 1000 flashes on one set of dry cells. The unit weighs only 50 ounces and comes in a case slung on a shoulder strap. Duration of the flash is about ½ second, with three to four seconds required for the unit to build up power between shutter openings.

### **Uplifted Airplane Cockpit Protects Pilots While Dusting Crops**

Perched several feet higher than they customarily are, pilots in a newly designed crop-dusting airplane are less likely to be crushed between the engine and the cargo in the event of an accident. Most dusters now in use are converted trainers in which the pilot sits directly ahead of hundreds of pounds of chemical. The new airplane also has sharp steel blades on the leading edges

of the landing gear to cut any wires it might accidentally strike while flying low. It weighs 886 pounds empty and carries an 800-pound load of chemicals. When it has been certified by the Civil Aeronautics Administration, the plane's builders, Charles Kellenbarger and the Ohio Aviation Research and Development Foundation, plan to make the blueprints available.





### CLYMER ROAD TESTS THE JAGUAR

By Floyd Clymer

FOR ANYONE who wants to drive a different kind of automobile, one that packs a terrific punch and handles unlike any American car, the Jaguar XK 120 is his dish.

I drove the test Jaguar XK 120 M (modified) in California, to Santa Maria, to Bakersfield, over the hot Mojave Desert, over winding mountain roads of the Lake Arrowhead region, returning over the Angeles Crest mountain highway to Los Angeles, a distance of 512 miles. The test was over all types of roads, including some offhighway roads that were no more than trails.

Outside of a lot of necessary gearshifting



in city traffic and on hills, the car is easily controlled and flexible in performance. Handling on corners is excellent, due to the combination of a short wheelbase, narrow tread, excellent power and suspension and its light weight that is well-balanced with 1500 pounds on front and 1610 pounds on rear wheels.

The six-cylinder engine develops 190 horsepower at 5400 revolutions per minute, with a compression ratio of 8:1. With 210-cubic-inch displacement, the engine size is smaller than either a Ford Six (223.0 cubic inches) or a Chevrolet Six (235.5 cubic inches). This engine provides high power






### Double-Purpose Tire Tool Acts as Dolly and Wrench

Tires are changed quickly and safely with a tool that keeps you out of danger should the jack fail. One end of the tool serves as a cradle for the tire so that it can be lifted, lowered or spun around to match up with the studs. The tire rests on rollers which permit easy rotation. The other end of the tool contains a socket for tightening nuts. The rollers on the cradle serve as the handles of the wrench to permit fast tightening.

### Hose Flushes Auto Radiator

To simplify flushing of automobile radiators, a radiator cap has been developed with a coupling for an ordinary garden hose. This enables the automobile owner or service-station attendant to flush out radiators and engine blocks simply by attaching a hose to the cap, opening the drain cocks on the block, the radiator or both and turning on the water at moderate pressure. Caps are made to fit all cars.






### Device Allows Musicians to Turn Music With Their Feet

Teutonic inventiveness and love of music merge in a German device that allows musicians playing string, wind or reed instruments to turn sheet music without using their hands. Operated by a pedal, the page turner moves only one sheet at a time—by reaching behind the pages. The music stand and turner can be folded for carrying without removal of the score.

### Motorized Cherry Pitter Speeds Fruit Preparation

Designed primarily for the housewife, an electric cherry pitter perfected in Germany should also prove a boon to small canners. The pitter takes cherries from a hopper, slits them, pits them and drops them into a waiting dish in one operation. Pits drop into another container and juice is diverted to a glass.

### Huge Rolling Dry Dock Repairs Small Boats

Designed by the Army Transportation Corps to speed repair of landing barges and other small craft where permanent facilities are not available, a rolling dry dock mounted on huge, tubeless, pneumatic tires is undergoing tests at Fort Eustis, Va. The dry dock will pick up vessels 60 feet long and weighing 75 tons. It is not powered, but is hauled ashore by Caterpillar tractors. Mounted on 36 by 41-inch tires with a 9½-foot inflated diameter, the dry dock is 42 feet long and 32 feet wide.



### Homemade Power Mower Built From Scrap Parts

Fred Dunham of Nashville, Tenn., used parts from a Crosley, a Cushman scooter, a sewing machine and an airplane to make a homemade power mower. The job took up his spare time for a month, but he has what he wanted—power, maneuverability and economy. A Crosley engine does the work. A chain-and-sprocket assembly provides drive through the Crosley transmission. A belt assembly pulls the two 25-inch rotary blades which cut a 50-inch swath. He gets about "two acres per gallon" of gasoline.

### Motorcycle Racing on Ice Is Rugged Swedish Sport

Motorcycle racing on ice is one of the most spectacular of Sweden's many winter sports. The motorcycles speed in tight circles around small tracks on ice, depending for traction on scores of spikes embedded in the tires. Sturdy guards are installed over the wheels to minimize chances of injury to riders in case of collisions. The riders wear heavy knee pads on one leg because in cornering they drag their inside knees on the ice to maintain balance.

### Thick Rims Protect Records

Thick rims on some of the new longplaying phonograph records protect the grooves from nicks and scratches during storage. Because the outer rims are slightly higher than the rest of the records, there is no contact between playing areas when the disks are stacked atop each other. RCA developed the feature and is making it available to other manufacturers. Closeup shows the spike-studded front tire and the metal guard that reduces danger to driver in crash

# An Old Mill Grinds Again

NE OF THE few remaining gristmills in the Midwest now is grinding corn meal for the market again, thanks to a group of Muskogee, Okla., citizens and some modern engineering equipment. The mill has been a landmark at Bitting Springs, Okla., for four generations. A few years ago the group of citizens bought the old mill and put it back into operation so they would have a source of whole-grain corn meal. Since then they have added modern equipment to condition the grain so it will not become rancid and are packaging it for shipment to market. An electric motor whirls the extractor to remove moisture from the grain, which then is dried under infrared lamps. But the 20-foot water wheel still turns the stone burrs which grind the grain, and the romantic building looks much as it did a century ago. \* \* \*

To clean the grain, it is placed in a container and lowered by hand into a tank of running spring water


### Combination Boat and Sled Travels Over Water or Ice

Specially designed for travel over water or ice, a combination boat and sled now links Frauenchiemsee Island off Germany with the mainland all year around. Winter ice that blocked boat travel had previously

isolated the island for lengthy periods. The new boat-sled navigates easily over mixed stretches of ice and open water. It is poled over ice and rowed or poled through water, slush or splinter ice.

### **Chopper Shreds Bales**

Farmers can "unbale" hay or straw with a shredder that chops, loosens, fluffs up the tightly packed material and blows it into a pile. It eliminates the job of shaking bales and slabs apart by hand. Baled straw torn apart by the shredder and used for bedding covers a larger area because it can be spread evenly. Hard-packed hay is made palatable by shredding. The machine is powered by a ½ to ¾-horsepower motor.



### Coast Guard Buoy Carrier Made From Surplus Parts

Buoys, like icebergs, have most of their bulk beneath water. On dry land the bottom-heavy giants are awkward to handle. But Coast Guard engineers at Portsmouth, Va., have built a carrier that easily handles the largest, 12-ton buoy. They put it together with four-inch steel pipe, a metal center brace, surplus airplane wheels and two chain hoists, at a cost of \$1200. It is pulled from place to place by a crawler-type tractor.

### Make-It-Yourself Carving Material


LOOKING for a new craft material? Then try your hand at Girostone, a homemade material that looks like granite, yet is almost as light as balsa. Larry Argiro, asso-ciate professor of art at State University Teachers College, New Paltz, N. Y., discovered Girostone by accident. It is a mixture of vermiculite aggregate, cement and sand. You can make it hard or soft by varying the amount of vermiculite. Argiro recommends start-ing with a soft mix of four parts vermiculite to one part cement, with a little sand. Add enough water to form a thick paste and pour into a shoebox or other container. In two or three days knock it out of the container and it's ready for your knife. The soft varieties can even be carved with a spoon, making them ideal for children, while harder types may require a hammer, chisel and coping saw. You can carve anything from Girostone that you can carve from other materials, so projects are limited only by imagination,




Plaque takes shape as youngster wields a paring knife. Girostone can be cast in any thickness and as soft as desired




Metalock "stitches" cracks in heavy metal, such as the turbine casing above and the tool frame, right



### Metal Stitching Saves British Industry Millions of Pounds

American ingenuity in applying the principle of ordinary corrugated fasteners, or "wiggle nails," to metal has saved British industry millions of pounds in the past few years. The process, called Metalock, consists of inserting a series of metal locks, or stitches, across a fracture line in a casting or forging, and then crossing them with a line of interlocking studs forced into the fracture itself. Perfected in the Texas oil fields where repair of metal without weld-

ing heat is often necessary, the process was adopted by the Navy during the war, but was not widely used in England or on the Continent until 1946. Scarcity of replacement parts in war-damaged countries boomed the business. Metalock has been used in Britain for speedy repair of such irreplaceable items as steam cylinder heads of foreign or obsolete design, for pump and turbine casings, generator frames and winding drums.



### Largest "Quiet" Room To Test Transformer Noises

You might hear a pin drop, but you couldn't get an echo with a cannon cracker in the world's largest anechoic chamber, or "quiet" room. Anechoic means "without echo," and a room without echoes was precisely what General Electric had in mind when the immense chamber was constructed. The walls are completely lined with glass-fiber wedges arranged in a pattern that absorbs all sound. The chamber is 43 feet high, 58 feet long and 48 feet wide and has walls 5 feet thick. It was built to aid engineers attempting to reduce the hum and soundreproducing qualities of electrical transformers of all sizes.

# Taking That Spot-News Picture

### By Richard W. Emery

I T'S A COMMON THING in a newspaper photo lab to hear someone complain: "Too late! Some amateur beat me to it!"

That means that once again the nonprofessional who just happened to be on the spot in time got a "spot news" picture the press cameraman didn't get.

Nobody doubts that the most essential single thing about getting that "big picture" is being there while the picture can be shot. Newsmen go to great pains to "be there." Their employers at great expense set up

news-gathering organizations backed up by telephones, radios, automobiles, planes —everything possible to aid the day-andnight vigil for spot-news breaks and coverage by photography.

But the unexpected happening has a way of popping up at unlikely times and places. Press cameramen can't always clip off the miles in time. That's when the photographic honors may go to someone else who has a camera and uses it well.

There's no love lost between the working

press photographers and the "amateurs" who often beat them to the punch. Press management, however, usually looks with friendly eyes on the amateur photographers.

"Amateur" photos many a time have saved the day for a newspaper. Most newspapers and newsphoto services have a standing offer for good photos of spot news, and members of their staffs have been warned against "growling" or "biting in clinches" with amateur

competitors.

Sometimes the newsman and the amateur break even on arrival time, prowl their respective paths around the big event and come up with pictures in which the newsman is grievously outpointed. The disgruntled newsman may then see the amateur's pictures replace his in his own newspaper. That's when you'll hear another old complaint in the newsphoto lab: "These amateurs have a million dollars to spend on equipment. They have the best cameras and every gadget money can buy. They're walking dictionaries on photography. They aren't amateurs! They're real experts!"

But a modest housewife with an inexpensive camera won the Pulitzer Award for Press Photography for 1953. Her "li'l old beat-up 15-year-old" camera took a sharp, clear picture of a truck and its driver hanging perilously from a high bridge.

"Just happened to be

there," said the press ex-perts, enviously. "Just luck. Anybody there could easily have shot the same thing!"

The lamenting press cameraman, however, knows better than that. Through his own wide experience he realizes that luck alone won't get the picture for you, or deliver it to a picture editor. He knows that there are 10 musts in spot-news photography.

The 10 musts apply equally to professional news cameramen and their amateur opponents.

- You must have your camera with you in working order.
- It must be properly loaded with good film.
- 3. You must know your camera is focused sharply on the subject in regard to distance.
  - You must expose the

film to enough light to completely register a picture-image while also stopping action.

You must aim the camera at the subject.

Your camera must be motionless while its shutter is open.

You must avoid accidents and oversights.

 You must get enough facts about your picture to identify it accurately and as fully as possible.

Your picture must be transported from the scene to the outlet which will use it.

Your negative must be properly developed and printed.

Each one of those 10 points is full of possibilities for not coming up with a spot-news picture on the editor's desk. To take a closer look:

You must have your camera with you in working order. If you don't habitually keep a camera near you, you won't have it in an emergency. Provide a dust-tight, insulated case to carry your camera in, in your automobile. If you have a large camera, too big to be handily carried, get a small, spare one which will slip into a pocket. Use your camera often enough to keep acquainted with it. Keep it in repair, ready for quick use.

It must be properly loaded with good film. Film past its expiration date (printed on the package) may still be good, but fresh film is a safer bet. Load film into your camera very carefully, in subdued light. If you don't, you may light-streak the film before you have taken a picture on it. There are fast films and slow films, black-and-white and color. You must know what kind of film you are




### Italian Design Borrowed for American Executive Amphibian

Taking a leaf from the sports-car makers' book, a newly formed Milwaukee aircraft company plans to market a gull-wing amphibian combining Italian-made air frame and wings, American engines and other components. The plane, known as the Royal Gull, is a five-place, executive-type amphibian. Wings and air frame are made by Italy's Piaggio & Co., while power comes from two 260-horsepower Lycoming engines turning pusher-type three-bladed Hartzell propellers. The aircraft is in the 180-mile-per-hour class and can cruise seven hours. It carries a 1940-pound load.

### Rear-Seat Table

Metal straps suspend a sturdy table from the back of an automobile front seat, giving backseat riders a chance to play cards, type, sew or otherwise amuse themselves. The 12 by 30-inch table top is resin-treated hardwood fiberboard finished in enamel. Hangers, legs and supports are sturdily made of steel. The table top can be folded down or the entire unit removed and stored in the trunk.






### Reverse Pickaback

Semitrailers on flatcars are becoming common sights in the United States as more and more railroads adopt the pickaback method of moving less than carload freight, but in Germany the situation is reversed, and freight cars are mounted on trailers for movement through city streets. Lack of sidings hampered West German railroads until this method was devised.





### Model of Rail Auto Built for Assembly by HO Enthusiasts

Model-railroad fans can now obtain an authentic HO model of a rail automobile in kit form. The all-brass model is a copy of a 1907 Thomas Flyer once used on the Diamond & Calder Railroad near Diamond Springs, Calif. It is powered by an electric motor and is quickly assembled by the purchaser from a few basic sections.

### Sliding-Roof Cars Loaded From Above

Freight cars built in Germany have sliding roofs so large loads can be dropped into place from above. The roof is built in two sections which operate like sliding doors. Mounted on roller bearings, the roof sections can easily be moved by one man. The ends of the freight cars are hinged like the gate of a dump truck so the freight cars can be unloaded faster by tilting them.



### "Car"-pentry Shop

Itinerant carpenters in Yugoslavia have used their ingenuity to build a traveling workshop. They mounted saws and drills on an old automobile and devised a system of gears and belts from an engine to power the tools. Now they can move their shop from door to door and even town to search of customers.

Test pilots at a major aircraft plant flew 3,700,-000 miles in 1953 to check new production models as well as for engineering test purposes.

### Transistor Pocket Radio


THERE ARE NO vacuum tubes employed in this transistor pocket radio recently introduced by Regency of Indianapolis, Ind. It is claimed to be several years ahead of the time set by many stereatronics experts for the development of such a unit for consumer use.


This model, TR-1, is priced at \$49.95 and comes in four colors: Black, bone white, cloud white and mandarin red. It measures 3 by 5 by 1¼ inches and weighs less than 12 ounces. Its size is, of course, made possible by the use of tiny high-performance transistors. A miniature 22½-volt battery supplies the power for the radio.

Photos A and B illustrate the diminutive size of this ultracompact pocket set. The transistor used is known as a grown junction n-p-n type and only four are used in the entire set. This circuit, Fig. 1, uses one transistor as a combination mixer-oscillator, two as intermediate-frequency amplifiers and one as an audio amplifier. A germanium diode is used as a detector.

One of the features of this truly pocket radio is the advantage of long battery life as the power consumption is only a fraction of that required for a comparable vacuum-tube unit. This results in a considerable saving in weight and battery-replacement cost. Service problems of tube replacement are eliminated; transistors operate in a different manner from vacuum tubes. The hot filament or cathode in a vacuum tube is continually being consumed as it is operated. No similar life-shortening action takes place in transistors.


COLOR-TELEVISION receivers have been simplified in circuitry and the number of controls reduced to a practical minimum. Only two added controls need be adjusted by anyone, in the Motorola receiver illustrated, to turn a good monochrome (black-andwhite) picture into beautiful "live" color provided that the program is being telecast in both mediums.

More than 75 percent of the nation's 30,000,000 TV households are now within the areas receiving color broadcasts. Live-color programing averages about 10 to 15 hours per week with several added hours of selected films in color. Tricolor-picture tubes with large screens have been perfected to a point where manufacturers no longer hesitate to get into full production. These tubes are now made in the popular 19 and 21-inch sizes. The Model 19CT1 Motorola color-TV set shown in photos A and C employs a 19-in. Hytron "205" tricolor-picture tube.

Many years of experimenting and field testing, by this manufacturer and several others, have gone into the development of color-TV receivers. Today the results are highly satisfactory when the programing is good and the telecasting meets the technical requirements. In this writer's opinion both CBS and NBC engineers have done, and are doing, an excellent job.

Early color telecasts leaned heavily on vivid greens, blues and reds. This distracted from story continuity as such emphasis on

color was not natural or pleasing to the average viewer. Early color movies went through the same growing-up period. Today programing has been greatly improved and there are fewer complaints of "forced" color in either system. In other words: a poor program is not improved by receiving it in color.

It has been estimated that color-TV production for 1955 will be about 150,000 sets. In 1957 it should reach -3,500,000 and 4,500,000 by

1958.

As comparatively few color-TV sets are now in homes, you probably do not have yours as yet. However, as a reader of Popular Mechanics Magazine, you are interested in what they look like and what they do. Operation is easy and no technical knowledge is necessary. Sketch B shows all of the controls that are located on the front of the receiver. You will note that with two important exceptions they are no different from those found on most modern black-and-white-TV sets.


A color-television picture screen is composed of extremely tiny phosphor dots of three different colors, arranged in a regular sequence and the different dot colors are red, green and blue when lighted. An exploded view of the tricolor-picture tube is shown in Fig. 2, and a diagrammatic illustration of the mask and screen appears in Fig. 1. The screen dots are of such minute size that it is very difficult to see the individual dot colors even when viewed closely and the final result is a blending of the three colors to form a lighted screen of a particular tint. Note in Fig. 1 that the converging beams from the three electron guns, sketch G, pass through the


hole in the aperture mask and strike their

respective phosphor dots.

When the blue, green and red dots of the picture screen are mixed in the proper intensities, the screen will appear white to the viewer. It is on such a white screen, made up of these three different colors, that a black-and-white picture may be constructed. It is easy to see that a black-andwhite picture is actually being formed on a colored screen, also that there is actually no black or white area on the screen. To








### COLOR-INTENSITY CONTROL

Advance this control slowly to the right until color begins to appear in the picture. Continue to adjust the control until the desired strength of color is obtained. In some color-TV sets this is called the Chroma control.

### COLOR-SHADING CONTROL

This really is a master control and is only operative when the color picture is on the screen. Adjust this control next for the most-pleasing and natural flesh tones or for some object having familiar coloring. The final touching up for best picture detail and most-satisfactory color reproduction is done with the usual fine-tuning dial at far right. If the fine-tuning control is not adjusted correctly the color may be removed from the picture.




distinguish a black-and-white picture formed on a three-color screen from one formed on a regular white screen, TV engineers use the word "monochrome." This word will be used from now on to describe a black-and-white picture on the screen of a color-television receiver. The basic color adjustments are all made at the factory but it is necessary that the dealer's serviceman make the final convergence-coil adjustment and check the supplementary controls on the rear panel, sketch F, to correct any misadjustment caused by rough handling in shipment. This job is done by the serviceman who uses a color-dot generator which produces a pattern of small dots on the face of the color tube and provides a quick and easy method for making accurate convergence adjustments.

The first operating step on front panel B is to turn the receiver on by rotating the on-off-volume control to the right until a click is heard. Now, before advancing this control, let the circuitry warm up for two or three minutes. In a color receiver this warm-up period is necessary in order to produce a good picture either in color or in monochrome. The three color channels require slightly different warm-up periods. After warm-up, advance this control for medium volume. Always adjust the receiver for a good monochrome picture first with color-intensity control turned off by counterclockwise rotation until stop is reached. Turn the contrast control to about the middle of its range; then adjust the brightness control until the picture screen is well-lighted. Now turn the channel selector to the desired channel number and adjust the fine-tuning control for best picture detail. Then readjust contrast control for most-pleasing picture. Adjust the acoustinator (tone control) for tone desired. None of the other controls need be touched. The small undercover combination controls at top center are the conventional-TV picture-adjustment controls to be found on any television receiver and are seldom used. Now, if the program is being telecast in color on that channel, and you are getting a good monochrome picture on the screen, refer to the color-receiving controls in sketch D and follow the simple steps for receiving color programs. Any member of the family who can tune your present black-and-white-TV set, can operate this color set and get satisfactory results. Just remember to warm up the set first; adjust for the desired strength of color and then use the color-shading control for the most natural and pleasing flesh tones. After the color program is off, turn the color-intensity control completely off and you are all set for monochrome programs. These have an interesting background-lighting effect not found in regular black-and-white sets. The blacks are soft and velvety and the whites are pleasingly clean and clear.

Photo E shows a rear view of this Model 19CT1 color-TV receiver with the back cover removed. Note that the color-section chassis is mounted in a vertical position for

# RAILROAD in a SUITCASE

WHEN FRANK BEATTY, Popular Mechanics art director, craves a bit of diversion, he dons his cap and bandana and loses himself in the operation of his Lilliputian railroad. Frank refers to his HO system as his "railroad in a suitcase" for he designed it so it can be folded in a compact case for easy carrying and storing.

Covering an area only 4-ft. sq., Frank's layout takes his fast freights through villages, mountain gaps and countryside in remarkable realism, as everything is in Tom Thumb scale. Every inch of space is put to use; even the top of a mountain lifts off to provide storage for some of the rolling stock. Except for the transformer, which is carried separately along with the rolling stock, all the scenery and parts of the layout are integral, with ample clearance being provided for the tiny buildings when the unit is folded.






Above, separate cover board fitted with handle (shown on floor) is used to hold two halves of folded unit together. Below, HO freight on elevated siding


Frank's railroad is supported at chair height by four detachable pipe legs which are turned into pipe flanges screwed to blocks attached to the corners. Detached, the legs are stored on top of a cover board and held with either spring clips or short

The general layout is shown in the diagram on the opposite page which also spots the location of the various buildings, mountains, shrubbery, etc. The curve sec-tions of the track are laid out on a 20-in. radius, using standard wooden roadbed which is sold in hobby shops. The pullapart drawing on page 166 shows how the "suitcase" is made. The bottom consists of






two sections of 1/4-in, plywood which are spaced 1/16 in, apart with two sheet-metal straps held with screws. The straps are removed for folding. A strip of cloth tape, tacked to one side only, is placed over the joint. One section of plywood is framed on three sides with pieces of 1 x 4, while the other section is framed with pieces of  $1 \times 2$ . Both sections are held together with 1 x 2 cleats, bolted across the ends. These cleats are made removable and are bolted to a cover board during storage. Teenuts have been used for all bolts as they permit flush mounting. Reinforcing cleats, ½ x ¾ in., are glued and nailed to the bottom of the plywood sections along the outer edges.

The cover board, which is fitted with a suitcase handle and a sheet-metal bracket at each end, holds the two sections together when they are dismantled. Registering holes to match those in the brackets are made in both sections for bolts and Teenuts. Two cleats on the underside of the cover board provide extra rigidity.

The mountain storage compartment is formed in one corner of the layout with plywood and fitted with a triangular wooden cover held with two screws. Then regular plaster-patching compound called Spackle is applied with a spatula to simulate rocks and typical mountain terrain. The other mountain in the foreground is






Flat-iron straps hold both halves together on one side while a cover board bolts to the opposite side

formed by tacking screen wire to an irregular wooden base, forming the wire into peaks and plastering it with Spackle.

The track roadbed is elevated 1 in. from front to rear of the layout to provide a gradual grade and allow underpasses to be formed under the raised portion as well as the lumberyard siding. Spackle is applied to the sloping sides of the roadbed, after which it is painted appropriately and finally coated with varnish and sprinkled with sand when tacky. The road through the town is treated similarly, and "grass" is planted by sprinkling packaged hobbystore grass in wet shellac or varnish. The various buildings are glued permanently in place. Where the track layout crosses the joint in the plywood, regular fish plates or jumper wires may be used to wire the abutting ends of the track. A wooden block, located in one corner of the layout, serves



### Cork Inserted in Vacuum Bottle With Aid of Toothpick

An ordinary wooden or plastic toothpick can be used to relieve the vapor pressure which makes it difficult to insert the cork in a vacuum bottle filled with hot liquid. The toothpick is held alongside the cork as it is pushed into the bottle and allows the excess pressure to escape.

The toothpick is removed when the cork is in place. The cork should be moistened before it is inserted in the bottle.






### Plywood Supported on Saw Table By Pipe-and-Caster Assembly

When ripping plywood on a bench saw, additional support for the plywood sheet can be provided by a pipe-and-caster assembly, as shown. Wooden plugs are driven into the ends of two lengths of pipe and then drilled to take casters. Holes are drilled in the cross member of a sawhorse in which the pipes are inserted. In use, when the plywood extends beyond the saw, the work rolls across the casters. For extrawide work, two of these assemblies could be used side by side, or a single one can be turned parallel to the saw table.

### Graduate for Home Workshop Improvised From Fruit Jar

A graduate for mixing various solutions needed around the home workshop can be improvised from a glass fruit jar. Attach a strip of waterproof adhesive tape vertically to the jar and mark it with waterproof ink. To accurately mark the volumes, use a kitchen



measuring cup to pour water into the jar in measured amounts. For a quart jar, every 4 oz. would be precise enough. For 1-oz. measures, use a smaller container, such as a small mayonnaise jar.



### Condensation Inside Metal Window Prevented by Extra Storm Sash



Condensation appears on the frames of some metal casement windows, even when the regular metal-framed storm sash is installed, because the window frame is not completely covered. One way to overcome this problem is to install an inside storm sash which covers the entire window, and is spaced 1 or 2 in. away from it. The storm sash should fit the window opening snugly and be provided with felt or rubber gaskets on all four edges. The sash is kept in place by screws which pass through it and into tapped holes in the metal frame of the window. Sleeves fitted over the screws hold the storm sash the proper distance from the window.

### Photographs in Mail Protected With Corrugated Cardboard




When mailing photographs or artwork, use corrugated cardboard instead of flat cardboard. The corrugated material is not only stronger, but lighter, so it will save on postage. Cut the pieces slightly smaller than the size of the envelope, and also cut them so that they can be inserted in the envelope

with the corrugations of one piece at right angles to the other. In this way, protection both lengthwise and crosswise is provided against bending. With the photos or artwork between the sheets of cardboard, fasten strips of tape over the edges to keep them together and to prevent the work from slipping past the edge where it would be damaged.

### Plier Wrench on Hoist Rope Lifts Sheets of Metal

When hoisting flat or corrugated sheets of metal or other material to the roof of a building, a plier wrench will provide a quick and convenient way of attaching the sheets to the hoist rope. One end of a length of strong wire is twisted tightly around the adjusting screw on the plier, then the other end is formed into a loop through which the hoist rope is tied.—Howard R. Clark, Springdale, Ark.




### Containers for Lens Filters From Fishhook Boxes

Small round boxes of the type in which fishhooks are sold will come in handy for storing and carrying lens filters. Transparent tops set in plastic slip-on covers make it possible to identify the filters without removing the covers. 







# TOAST RACK with a COZY



#### Hinge Modified as Spring Latch Locks Window in Open Position

A double-hung window sash cannot be opened from the outside when it is held by a lock made from a T-hinge and a length of flat steel. The short leaf of the hinge is screwed to the top edge of the lower sash so the long leaf will contact a length of flat steel screwed to the side member of the upper sash. The hinge then is fitted with a flat spring, as shown in the detail. The top end of the long leaf is filed to a narrow width and bent at right angles to fit into holes drilled in the flat steel. Positions of the holes in the flat can be varied to suit individual requirements. When the window is opened from either top or bottom, the spring-loaded leaf is pulled back, then released to fit into the hole corresponding to the opening of the window. The lock also can be used on horizontal-sliding windows.

#### Five Dulled Phonograph Needles Provide Music-Staff Scriber




Music students and musicians who have frequent occasion to copy or transpose music can make a simple staff scriber by soldering five phonograph needles in a sheet-metal holder. When the assembly is soldered, rub the points of the needles against

a piece of emery cloth to dull them. This prevents the needles from cutting through the carbon paper over which they are drawn to produce carbon lines on blank paper underneath.

### Wall Hanger for Rope Coil Cut From Radiator Hose

A short length of automobile-radiator hose can be utilized as a handy wall hanger for a coil of rope or line. Slit the hose lengthwise and round off the corners at the ends of the cut to permit easy insertion and removal of the rope. Punch two




holes in the hose and screw it to the wall, using washers under the screwheads.


#### Photo-Developing Time Reduced By Utilizing Washer Agitator

The job of agitating a film tank during lengthy fine-grain processing can be simplified by utilizing the agitator of a washing machine. A bolt that fits the threaded hole in the agitator shaft is used to bolt a block of wood to the shaft. The tank is held on the block with clips shaped from coathanger wire. Development is so efficient that the time can be reduced approximately 10 percent. In the case of Microdol, for example, developing time can be cut from 16 to 13 min.—Turk Smith, Phoenix, Ariz.

### Simple Bed Tray You Can Make in One Evening





This simple and attractive lap tray will help mother in a dozen ways around the house to save time and eliminate extra cleaning, especially in the sickroom. Complete meals can be placed on the tray and carried to a bedridden child or adult, then placed on the bed over the patient's lap. Between meals, the cleared tray can be used as a play surface for a youngster or as a card or writing table for an adult.

The suggested dimensions for the tray

can be varied to suit the individual needs, but care should be taken to see that it is not so large as to be awkward to handle the tray nor so small that it is impractical. The cutout at the back of the table top, which allows the tray to fit closer to the person using it, was cut with 1½-in. radius on the original. This size is all right for a child, but might have to be increased for an adult. For purposes of storage, the dowel legs of the tray could be removable.

#### Alarm Warns of Sump-Pump Failure to Prevent Basement Flooding

A flooded basement may be prevented by this alarm installed in the sump tank to give warning if the pump fails to operate because of some minor defect. The alarm system is actuated when the water level in the sump reaches a predetermined height, which raises the float so the copper




plate on top of the float rod contacts the plate fixed to the wooden support. This connection closes the circuit which causes the doorbell to ring. The doorbell may be powered by a 6-volt battery or other 6-volt supply source. The wooden support for the alarm is simply a 2 x 4 with two long screw eyes set in it so they align vertically to assure free motion of the float rod. A stop pin keeps the rod from dropping too far. A pump that seldom runs may become inoperative because the float rod has become corroded so it cannot raise with the float and close the switch, or the electric motor itself may become "frozen." A preventive measure to assure that the pump will operate properly when necessary is to fill the sump with water every couple of months and allow the pump to empty it.



#### Shellac Sizes Plaster Patches



# UNUSUAL SMALL BOAT



Above, this little boat is seven feet of safe water fun for children. It's good looking and easy to use



The boat has many uses; among other things it can serve as a picnic table, as above. Below, with the three sections nested, it makes a compact package that is lightweight and fits into most car trunks

HERE IS A SMALL BOAT, which divides into three sections, that is designed primarily for children's fun. It is safe, lightweight and, in addition to boating, can be used as a picnic table or as a back-yard wading pool. For ease of handling and carrying, the three sections of the boat nest one inside the other, making a compact package small enough to fit into the trunk of a car. The boat has unusually good stability, provided by a flat bottom and very wide beam. The heaviest section weighs only 32 lb., and the total weight of all three sections is only 76 lb., all of which make for easy handling and transporting.

The boat is constructed of ¼-in. exterior plywood throughout. Every effort was made to be economical in the use of this material, and all of the plywood parts can be cut from one 4 x 16-ft. sheet if desired, as shown in Fig. 4. Note dotted lines on ends of sidepieces in pattern. This indicates waste material which should be cut off after each side is in place on the boat. The frame is made from hardwood. On the original model, the chine molding and cross members were cut from white-oak flooring and the uprights were cut from beech. The dimensions of the chine, frame and upright members are given in Fig. 3.

The first step in the assembly of the boat is to cut out all of the plywood pieces. Check over-all dimensions in plan view, WTM 56

Fig. 2. Next the ¾ x 1-in. cross members are installed. They are glued to the bottom sheets and held by ¾-in. No. 7 flatheaded brass screws driven in every 2 in. Note that cross members are set in ¾6 in. from the ends to provide a seal for the partitions to be installed later. Now the chine pieces are cut to size. To make them easy to bend to the shape of the plywood bottom, rip each of these lengthwise vertically through the center. The outer half of each chine is then glued and screwed in place, being bent as you go. The inner half is then placed against the outer piece and fastened to it and to the bottom with glue and screws.

The bulkheads, bow and stern pieces can now be installed. They are attached to the bottom frame and the upright members of the frame are attached to them and to the bottom frame. Then temporary braces are used to hold the endpieces at the proper angle, as shown in the photo on page 177. With this much of the three sections of the boat complete, they are placed on the floor and, with cardboard between them to provide \( \frac{1}{2} \) in. of spacing, they are clamped together while the sides are put on.


The sides are temporarily positioned on the boat. They are held in place by drilling holes through the excess material at the ends of the sidepieces and running wires through them. The wires are drawn taut between the two sides until the sidepieces are drawn snugly against the uprights. Once they are in position, they are care-




When you can't take the boat to the water, bring water to the boat and you have a little wading pool

fully marked and removed. Along the top and bottom edges, the sides are cut to within 1/16 in. of the marked line. The ends are not cut, since they must be used to hold the sides in place as the glue sets. Once the sides are trimmed, they are replaced on the boat, held once again by the wire. All joints are flooded with glue, and then screws are driven 2 in. apart into all of the upright members and into the chine molding.

The outside molding is now put on. The bow and stern moldings, see Fig. 3, are installed first. The side moldings are ripped in half lengthwise so as to be easier to bend around the curve and held with screws driven from the inside of the boat. Note





that the stern molding is made wider so that it will support an outboard motor.


When all the glue has dried thoroughly, the three sections of the boat are cut apart by sawing the sides through at the junction points. The excess material is trimmed off the ends and all edges are sanded smooth. The three sections are held together with clamps while holes are drilled for the bolts and wing nuts which hold the sections together. The holes are \% in. in dia., and into these are fitted \%-in. cap screws, 2\% in. long. The screws are fitted with standard

wing nuts and washers. The seat rails are \( \frac{3}{4} \)-in. quarter round, and 11/4-in, quarter round is installed to strengthen upright members and notched to clear the wing nuts. The seats are cut from ordinary ¼-in. plywood, and another section of floor is cut for the center section of the boat from the same material. See details in Fig. 6. This floor is glued in the bottom of this section because of the hard wear it gets. To prevent excessive wear on the underside of the bottom, two strips of 1/6 x 11/2-in. white oak were run the length of the bottom, spaced 241/2 in. apart. The boat was finished by sanding it completely and staining a deep red mahogany. The molding was painted green. Several


coats of spar varnish completed the boat.


Collapsible oars are made by sawing 7-ft. softwood oars in half and fitting them with aluminum ferrules as shown in Fig. 5.

Small tubing fitted to the end of one oar section fits into larger tubing fitted to the other oar end. The two are held together by a cap screw. The position of the oarlocks is given in Fig. 1.




#### Notebook Lists Home Repairs

A small notebook and pencil tied to strings and hung on a nail next to the workbench are used by one family to keep Dad aware of needed home repairs. Whenever a member of the family notices a needed repair he drops by the workshop and jots it down in the book. Checking through the book also gives Dad the chance to order needed parts and supplies, such as hinges and brackets, ahead of the time he will use them.—B. Ainslie, Ottawa, Can.

#### Holes Drilled in Trowel Blade Remove Excess Plaster

Amateur plasterers often have difficulty in removing excess plaster from a patching job without gouging out too much and breaking the key to the laths. A number of ¼-in. holes drilled in the trowel, as shown in the photograph, will allow the excess plaster to be forced through the trowel as the plaster is leveled, thus maintaining a smooth surface. A regular trowel should be used for the finish troweling of the whole patch to assure a smooth surface that will align with the wall.




## FLAT-FOLDING



Designed to fold flat like a cigarette case, this unusual sewing caddy with its drop-leaf shelf can be stood open beside an easy chair to make sewing a real pleasure. Closed, it is flat enough to be stored behind a door or hung in a closet.

Each half is made exactly like the other and both are surface-hinged together along one edge to swing open. In addition to the drop shelf, one half is fitted with a spool rack, swing-out button drawers and a trough for odds and ends. The other half has an elastic-top cloth storage pocket tacked to the inside. A row of hooks at the top holds such items as scissors, darning egg, tape measure and pincushion. The two plywood handles are jigsawed at one time and are set flush in each half of the stand. The outside of the stand is faced with plywood panels that are first covered with gay cretonne or chintz and then tacked to the legs. Sheet-brass catch completes the stand.






#### Auxiliary Cabinet Shelves Permit Additional Storage



When kitchen cabinets become overcrowded, it often is possible to gain additional narrow auxiliary shelves at the back of the cabinets. Dishes, plates and bowls usually are stacked only 4 to 6 in. high and the space above, while necessary at the front, is wasted at the back. This space generally will allow the installation of shelves about 3 in. deep. If the original cabinet shelves fit on brackets which are adjustable in holes drilled in the cabinet ends, the auxiliary shelves can be installed in the same manner. Cut the auxiliary shelves 11/2 in. shorter than the regular shelves and nail 34 x 34-in. cleats across the ends. The cleats should be as long as the regular shelves are deep.


#### Cleaning Soiled Holiday Candles

To make soiled holiday candles look like new again, wipe them with a soft cloth dipped in kerosene and then wrung out. Do this quickly, using a smooth up and down motion. Then, using the same motion, reharden the wax with a cloth dipped in cold water. To polish the candles and restore their original luster, simply rub briskly a few times with a crumpled sheet of tissue paper.

#### Dowels Chucked in Drill Press Sandpapered to Point

A number of wooden dowels or metal rods can be shaped to an identical point by chucking them in a drill press and using the tool illustrated, which is a beveled wooden block screwed to a base plate. The angle side of the block is covered with sandpaper to shape wooden



dowels and a file is held against it when shaping metal rods. In use, the block is moved slowly back and forth to prevent the sandpaper or file from becoming clogged in one spot.


#### Plastic Cable Shaped as Guide For Drawing Irregular Curves

Draftsmen, and others who have occasion to draw irregular curves, will find that a length of flat, plastic wiring cable can be shaped to almost any desired curvature. It has a smooth edge for use with either a pencil or ruling pen, and permits a line to be drawn in one continuous sweep rather than in short segments as is the case when standard fixed curves are used. Once the cable is bent, it will retain its shape until it is deliberately rebent.






IF YOU HAVE only an occasional need for a regular drawing table but are faced with the problem of where to put it, this compact, disappearing unit may be the answer. Opening out from a shallow wall cabinet, 4¾ in. wide, the table actually takes no floor space at all. The novel way that it folds is shown in the sectional view. A standard-size drawing board, 31 x 42 in., provides the table top. This is fitted with wooden rollers which operate in channel tracks

formed by the sides of the cabinet. The drawing board is faced on the underside with two paneled frames, a short upper one being permanently screwed to the board itself while a lower frame is hinged to the upper one and to the cabinet at the bottom. The hinged panel provides the supporting brace for the drawing board. The cabinet is mounted at the top of the baseboard and securely screwed to wall study through the mounting cleats.






# Corner Table

WTM 56 modern Furniture



While designed as a companion piece to the coffee and step tables presented in the October 1954 Plan of the Month, this attractive corner table can be used alone with any grouping of contemporary furniture. The same matching brass grillwork used in the previous designs is incorporated here and general construction closely follows that of the other tables. Both the square and triangular table tops are made up separately by first assembling an outside frame of rabbeted pieces and then covering with plywood. You'll note in the details that the plywood also is rabbeted and allowed to overhang the edges of the frame so it later can be sanded flush with the face of the frame. Canted corner cleats provide a means of attaching the tapered table legs with screws from the inside. The triangular top is supported with a simple rectangular frame, plus a post at the back

#### Floor of Insulated Hardboard Can Be Installed Quickly


One method of installing a floor quickly when finishing an attic or other space to provide living quarters, is to use 4 x 4-ft. sheets of ¼-in. tempered hardboard. Because the floor will be smooth and have relatively few joints, tile can be installed with a minimum of labor. To provide sound insulation against the noise of footsteps, the hardboard should be nailed over an underlayment of ½-in. insulation board. When nailing the hardboard over the insulation, draw lines on the hardboard to show the locations of the floor joists, and use 9d nails.

#### Freeing Stuck Drinking Glasses

If two drinking glasses stick together, separate them by pouring cold water in the top one and setting the bottom one in warm water. The cold water will cause the top glass to contract slightly, while the warm water will make the bottom glass expand sufficiently to free them easily.

#### Cardboard Trough Taped to Wall Catches Plaster Dust




Positioned just beneath the work, a trough made of light cardboard or heavy paper will catch most of the plaster dust and shavings caused by drilling into a plastered wall. The trough is held against the wall

with a strip of masking tape along the back edge and two tape "braces" which lead from the front edge of the trough to the wall. When pulled from the wall after the job is done, the tape will leave only faint marks that can be removed. The trough is useful when installing wall switches and outlets, and larger versions can be made for use under more extensive repair jobs. Rex W. Logan, Kansas City, Mo.


#### Tubing Keeps Towels on Rack

If you have trouble keeping towels from sliding off smooth towel rods, a few short lengths of rubber tubing slipped over the rods will overcome the problem. If the rod is clamped at both ends, slit the tubing lengthwise.




#### Cabinet Under Open Lavatory Stores Bathroom Supplies

Soap, scouring powder and other frequently used bathroom supplies can be stored neatly out of sight in a simple cabinet built under an open lavatory. The base of the cabinet is a platform made of 1-in. stock and is set back about 4 in. from the front edge of the lavatory to provide toe space. The door and side panels of the cabinet consist of a frame of 1 x 2s covered with hardboard. Shelves fitted with rails may be attached to the inside of the door to store small items. In the cabinet shown in the photo, time and materials were saved by eliminating the side not usually visible.



CABINET

LETTER WRITING becomes twice the pleasure when your stationery is stored near at hand in a convenient little cabinet such as this one. There are separate compartments for both writing paper and envelopes and a shallow drawer for pen, pencils and stamps. It may be made from common fir plywood and painted, or from fan-cy hardwood-faced plywood and varnished. You'll need pieces of 1/2, 3/8 and 1/4-in. stock. The sides are cut out first, a rabbet being run along the top, rear and bottom edges, and a ¼-in. groove made 1¾6 in. up from the bottom. The back, top, bottom and pull-out lid are cut from %-in. stock. With the exception of the lid, all three members are glued in the rabbeted edges of the side pieces. The lid rides on two %-in.-dowel rollers, and a stop cleat across the rear edge of the lid prevents pulling it all the way out. Obviously, the lid must be in place before the separate paper-and-envelope compart-ment is installed. The drawer is made to fit the opening.







# PLYWOOD EDGES

By William B. Eagan

WHILE THE USE of plywood has become universal in both the building
and furniture industries, its use in the
home shop has always confronted the
craftsman with the problem of how to conceal or treat the exposed laminations of the
material. The drawings on this and the
following two pages illustrate a number of
ways that the edges can be covered. Some
of the methods are comparatively simple
while others are more involved.





The most common type of drawer joint is shown in Fig. 1, but here the edge grain is exposed and conspicuous. Figs. 2 and 3 show how the same drawer joint can be made so very little or no edge grain is exposed. The amount of edge grain exposed in Fig. 2 may be further reduced and even camouflaged by rounding the corner.

You also have the problem of what to do with plywood edges when the material is used for the shelves in a bookcase or for a table top. The easiest solution is to hide the exposed plies with strips of veneer as shown in Fig. 4. Usually the grain of the veneer is placed lengthwise, but a pleasing variation is had by letting the grain run vertically. In this treatment, often referred to as crossbanding, two plies of veneer produce the best job. This consists of gluing two sheets of veneer together with the grain at right angles and then cutting the edging strips from it. Here, the veneer is brought flush with the top surface of the






plywood. The objection to having the edge of the veneer show can be overcome by first rabbeting the laminated edge of the plywood as shown in Fig. 5 and letting the top ply overhang the edge of the veneer banding. This latter method also tends to protect the edge of the veneer from wear and damage.

Instead of using thin veneer as in Fig. 4, a ¼-in, strip of matching solid stock may be glued to the edge to hide the plies, Fig. 6. Similar treatment is shown in Figs. 7 and 8 except that stock molding is used. By running a groove in the center of the plywood edge to receive a molding which is narrower than the thickness of the plywood, a variation can be had resulting in a stronger joint, Fig. 9. There are cases where the objectionable plies can be "concealed" without actually adding anything to the edges. Such is the case when a piece of furniture is given a two-tone treatment by painting or staining the plywood edges, or when design permits the edges to be beaded or fluted on a shaper as shown in Fig. 10. Beading should be limited to furniture such as Duncan Phyfe.

In facing the edges with banding or molding, glue alone is not relied on. The stripping is nailed also. Fig. 11 shows how the nailheads are concealed by first lifting a chip with a narrow gouge, driving the brad and then gluing the chip down again. Done properly, the chip seldom can be detected when the final finish is applied to the wood. When veneer is to be applied to a curved plywood edge, Fig. 12 shows a simple method for holding the work until the glue sets.

Figs. 13 to 25 inclusive show additional ways that molding of one kind or another can be used to dress off the edges of plywood. Plain butt edging, Fig. 13, in which



the strip is surface-glued, is the easiest of all to apply. Where it is desirable to reduce the visible thickness of the strip, the mi-tered butt joint can be used, Fig. 14. Here, the strip is dressed at an angle to match a similar bevel cut in the plywood and simply surface-glued and nailed in place. Splines, Figs. 17 and 19, often are used to give a stronger joint when applying edge moldings. The use of a spline is especially recommended where a wide molding is involved. If molding equipment is available, plain solid stock may be applied to the edges and shaped afterward. The home craftsman will find many stock moldings adaptable. Fig. 22 pictures a joint that perhaps is the strongest of all but one that requires a complicated cut made by a special machine.

A bold treatment of the plain crossbanded edge is shown in Figs. 26 and 27. Here, inlaid banding is used. A strong contrast is obtained by using rare woods, such as ebony, holly, ivory or boxwood. In Fig. 27, a rabbet is cut along the upper edge of the plywood to take a built-up mosaic strip and veneer covers the rest of the exposed laminations.

#### Clothespins Utilized as "Staples" To Make Temporary Fence



A neat temporary fence, such as the kind needed to protect a newly seeded lawn, can be made quickly and easily by using wooden clothespins to "staple" a wire or rope to lengths of \$4-in. pipe. The pipes first are

driven very firmly into the ground and spaced around the area to be protected. Then the clothespins are fitted over a length of wire or light rope and slipped into the ends of the pipes. Tie the line to the first pipe, keep it fairly taut all the way around the fence and tie it to the last pipe. Caution: An extremely low fence is hazardous for adults and running children.

#### Waxed Sheet Under Plywood Speeds Jigsaw Operation

To simplify moving and turning small pieces of thin plywood on a jigsaw table, place the work on top of a sheet of wax paper. This also is helpful if the stock is of resinous quality, as the wax paper "lubricates" the saw blade.


Stacked Cans Resist Toppling When Held With Paper



To aid in keeping stacks of boxes or cans in a warehouse or store from being knocked over easily, place a sheet of wrapping paper between the tiers. A stack so arranged will resist considerable impact because only the top layer of cans or boxes is loose. The paper "binds" the units in each layer together so that the full weight of one or more layers must be overcome before the stack will topple.

#### Diameter of Sphere Measured By Using Wooden Blocks

The diameter of spheres, disks or round stock can be determined quickly by using two wooden blocks and a straightedge. The sphere or other object to be measured is placed between the blocks—which should have parallel sides and a squared end—and a straightedge rule is held against them. The distance between the blocks is the diameter of the object. Various types of flat-jaw clamps can be used in a similar manner for this kind of measuring.




#### Miniature Wardrobe Closet Stores Child's Dresses



With only limited closet space in the house, one handyman provided hanging storage for his small daughter's dresses by building a miniature wardrobe closet to sit on top of a chest of drawers. Plywood was used in the construction of the closet which is a simple box fitted with a hinged door. The box is 12 in. deep x 24 in. high and can be made any convenient length. The exterior is painted to match the chest on which it sits and decal decorations may be applied to the door. The inside can be covered with a dainty wallpaper or painted. A 1-in. dowel, set in brackets, supports the hangers for the dresses.—Maurine M. Remenih, Arlington Heights, Ill.

#### Tray on Stepladder Tread Holds Small Parts



When using a stepladder on a job where small parts are involved, a tray made from a pie tin can be clipped to the top tread to hold the parts. A sheet-metal or spring-steel clip is soldered to the bottom of the tin as illustrated.

#### Scratched Floors Rejuvenated

Wood putty can be used effectively to fill unsightly scratches and gouges in hardwood floors. Apply the putty with your fingers or a putty knife and work it into the scratch, building it up a little higher than the board surface. When the putty has hardened, sand it flush with the floor, using a medium-fine sandpaper. Then finish with shellac. If the floor is light colored, the putty may be used as it comes from the can. However, if the floor has darkened, the putty should be stained to match before it is applied, or stain can be applied to it after it has been sanded smooth.—Bureau of Industrial Service, Inc., New York City.

#### Wood-Screw Lubricant Kept in Cosmetic Jar


To be sure of always having a supply of lubricant for use with wood screws, fill a small cosmetic jar with cotton and saturate it with linseed oil or liquid soap. The wood screws then can be wiped across the cotton to pick up oil without the problem of having an excess that will drip from



the screws. Be sure the jar has an airtight lid to prevent evaporation or hardening of the liquid when not in use.

#### Clothespins Provide Holder For Darkroom Thermometer

Two plastic clothespins, of the type shown in the photograph, can be used to provide a simple and convenient holder for a photographic stirring-rod thermometer. The light spring action of the clothespins holds the thermometer firmly, yet allows it to be picked up easily. The clothespins are fastened to the edge of a table or shelf with small staples.



### Pipe Fittings Form Sturdy Closet Clothes Pole

Unlike the wooden clothes pole that bends and creaks under the weight of winter garments, this pipe rack will handle your heaviest garments safely. Its strength is limited only by that of the shelf to which it is attached. The original rack was made up of 1-in, pipe and fittings, although 1/2 or ¾-in. pipe can be used. As shown in the drawing, the lengths of pipe which form the clothes pole are suspended from the underside of the closet shelf

with floor flanges and nipples, the latter being about 2½ in. long. The nipples are turned into an elbow at each end of the clothes pole and into one or more pipe tees



#### Refrigerator Recess Decorated With Valance Hung on Hooks

The valance is jigsawed from plywood and the clock is fastened to the back so the face shows through a framed opening. Artificial ivy, purchased at the 10-cent store, is used for decoration. The installation of the valance was simplified by hanging it on hooks and eyes, which also permits easy removal for cleaning.



#### Lawn Mower Stored Close to Wall By Using Storm-Sash Hanger

A lawn mower can be stored to occupy a minimum of floor space by using either a storm-sash hanger or a long hook and screw eye to hold it close to a wall. When using the sash hanger on wooden handles, the eye, usually screwed to the sash, is fastened to the mower handle near the top and the tongue is screwed to the wall. When using a hook and eye, the hook is screwed to the wall and the eye is driven into the mower handle near the bottom. Either method can also be used on metal-handled mowers, machine screws being substituted for the wood screws.

(When sending clothes to the cleaner, outline bad spots in white thread and, if you know what caused the spot, tag it so the spotter can use the correct cleaning fluid.







FIRE IS THE SECRET of working ornamental wrought iron—a red-hot piece of iron can be bent easily to almost any shape. While the traditional heat source for iron-working is the open forge, excellent results can be achieved with an ordinary liquid-fuel hand torch. A torch, a hammer, a drill and some rivets are all the basic equipment needed. Figs. 2, 3, 4 and 5 show a few examples of the type of work that can be done either with


the torch or a small forge.


The metal: Old-fashioned wrought or puddled iron is no longer manufactured to any great extent because mild steel is nearly identical to it and much less expensive to make. The main feature of wrought iron or mild steel is that they contain only a trace of silicon and carbon. Such a material is tough, malleable, bends easily and welds beautifully. Unlike carbon steel, it does not harden when heated red-hot and plunged into water. Some of the many stock shapes available in mild steel are shown in Fig. 6. The rectangular shape with rounded edges, usually called band iron or strap iron, can be purchased at many hardware and farm stores, while complete iron stocks for craftwork are available from














craft and metal-supply houses. The material usually is available in 10-ft. lengths for craft use.

Heating equipment: Many projects in wrought iron can be worked cold. However, band iron over 1/8 in. thick and rounds over 1/4 in. in dia. become increasingly more difficult to bend. An inexpensive liquid-fuel torch is the least expensive and simplest solution. This type of torch will put a red heat on band iron up to about % x ¾ in. and rounds to a %-in. dia. The localized nature of the heat, Fig. 11, makes the torch ideal for angular bending. As in Fig. 12, rod stock can be bent with hand pressure alone.

One of the hottest heat sources is the twin-carbon are torch, Fig. 29. An obvious disadvantage of the arc torch is that you have to wear a helmet and gloves for protection against the ultraviolet and infrared rays. A small are torch, working on 110 volts, will heat rounds up to about ¾ in. in dia. for angular bending. Like all torches, however, it is generally unsatisfactory for


heating a long length of rod.


Most fascinating and satisfying of the heat sources is the time-honored forge, Fig. This is the most flexible, most economical heat source for regular work. And, if you burn smithing charcoal, the fire will be clean and smokeless-practical for use in the basement workshop. A draft connection should be made to a chimney or to a basement window, in the latter case using a low-speed exhaust blower. A typical home-shop forge is shown in Fig. 7. The fire itself should be deep enough to bury the work yet protect it from direct air from the blower, Fig. 8. The forge will put a red heat on 2-in.-dia. bar stock in about 5 min. With the forge fire, a large area or a long length of work can be heated uniformly, this being especially important for such jobs as making a long twist, Fig. 22.

Basic operations: The basic operations in working with wrought iron are cutting and bending. Cutting is done with a hacksaw or with a chisel or hardie, Fig. 9. A 3-in. bench shear, Fig. 10, is ideal for cutting light stock.

Most of the basic bends are shown in Figs. 12 to 22. One of the most useful bending devices is a bar or a block of metal having one or more holes bored through it. This is used in the same way as the hex bar pictured in Fig. 14. An eye is formed by first making a ring, Fig. 17, and then bending the standing metal with the aid of a vise, Fig. 18. Gradual bends of all kinds can be hammered hot or cold on any type of round anvil or bar, Fig. 20. Single twists of a quarter or half turn are made with a wrench, Fig. 21. In the details, W equals the width of the stock.

Scroll bends: Gradual curves or scrolls





predominate all period designs in wrought iron. These curves are made on a bending jig. The jig consists of a purchased or homemade setup of two metal pins around which the work is bent, Figs. 23 to 25. Eye bends can be made directly around the smaller pin, Fig. 25, while large bends are worked gradually with a series of bends, Fig. 24. Large work also can be bent over wooden forms, Fig. 26, a method which is used widely for bending tubing. When a number of pieces are to be bent to the same curve, a handle-and-roller setup, Fig. 27, saves time and assures perfect work.

Fastenings: Ironwork is assembled by welding or brazing, or with machine screws, bolts or rivets, as in Fig. 28. Riveting is the most popular home-shop method, and most riveting jobs can be done with the simplest of equipment, as in Fig. 30.

Finishing: The most popular finish for all ironwork is flat or satin-black paint. A protective or rust-inhibiting undercoat should be applied on all ironwork used outdoors. This also is desirable on indoor ironwork to secure better finish adhesion.




#### Face Painted on Split Rubber Ball "Talks" When Squeezed


## Trap for Night-Flying Insects Uses Light As Bait .



A screened-in porch or enclosed patio will be a pleasanter place if this simple trap for night-flying insects is hung near the outside entrance. The trap consists of two baffles of bright sheet metal which are flanged and screwed to a strip of metal. The strip is fitted on the diameter of a cake or pie pan and the ends then are screwed to the rim of the pan. A lamp harp, of the type with a threaded base that screws onto a lamp socket, is inverted and screwed to the center of the strip between the baffles. The bulb is a special type that gives little visible light, but is highly attractive to insects. Such bulbs are available at most appliance stores. The insects are attracted

to the light, and when they try to fly around the bulb, strike the baffles and fall into the pan. A thin layer of kerosene or insecticide in the bottom of the pan takes care of the rest.

#### Floodlight Clamp Bolted to Stand




The problem of attaching spring-clamp type photo-floodlamp reflectors to portable light stands so the floodlamp does not "drop" can by solved by drilling a small hole in the horizontal section of the light standard. A machine screw then is passed through the clamp fixture and through the hole in the standard and held with a wing nut. The spring clamp of the reflector now can be utilized to store the cord when the light is not in use.

AND-WEAVING, once a necessary skill in every American household, is again entering the home. But this time it comes as a creative and extremely practical hobby for those looking for an outlet for artistic expression or just a relaxing kind of doit-yourself fun. It's fun that can pay off in a well-dressed look, too. For example, you can weave material for a suit or coat of the finest imported wool, hand-spun if you like, in the color you prefer and according to your own choice of pattern. This can be done for around 10 dollars. Even after you have paid a tailor to

make the suit or coat for you, it will still cost only about half the retail price of a similar garment.

Unlike the old-fashioned treadle loom, today's loom is as modern and practical as the power saw or sewing machine. There is a portable, lightweight model made of tubular aluminum that is set on a table top and can be stored in a closet. And you can make anything on it that grandmother made on her cumbersome treadle loom. In fact, the weavers of today can do things that grandmother never dreamed of because of the synthetic yarns at their disposal. If you like to experiment, you can combine things like split bamboo, leather and plastic. This can be easily done without any prior training. A half-hour practice session to learn the operation of a modern loom and how to throw a shuttle is all it takes.



In the past, the only stumbling block to learning to weave had been the problem of making warps. But now the manufacturer of the loom does this for you. The warp is the yarn which runs horizontally from the back of the loom to the front, the woof, or weft, being passed through it at right angles during the weaving operation. At least one manufacturer provides a warping, or threading-in, service for his customers who send him the detachable parts involved in dressing the loom. For a nominal fee he puts on the warp and threads it properly, using whatever materials the customer specifies or supplies. In this way, it takes you only a few minutes to set up the loom, compared to hours of tedious work formerly required.

Such a service simplifies hand-weaving to the point where even a 10-year-old child can weave. You can buy a loom or rent one on a monthly basis. The only other costs, in addition to the warping service, are those of the materials used. These will vary with the size of the project and the

selection of yarns.

Regardless of the type of loom, weaving is accomplished by raising a certain number of threads in the warp so that the weaver may pass the weft through at right angles and thus make the web. The harness raises the threads in the warp by means of heddles, each of which controls a single thread or a group of threads. The manner in which the warp threads are strung through the heddles is determined by the pattern desired by the weaver. Thus, a

#### PARTS OF THE LOOM

A-WARP BEAM: Cylinder of wood or metal at back of loom around which warp is wound.


B—HARNESS: Frame of wood or metal holding heddles which permits weaver to raise a selection of warp threads. Harnesses of treadle loom are foot-operated while harnesses of some modern looms are operated by levers or a cylinder-and-pin arrangement at top of loom.

C—HEDDLE: Device of string or flat metal having an eye through which warp is threaded according to pattern. Each heddle may control single thread or combination of warp threads.

D—BEATER: Heavy wooden or metal frame swung against woven material between each row of weft yarn. Amount of beating varies with type of yarn and desired tightness of material. Rhythm is most important in beating. The reed is a comblike device held in the beater through which the warp is threaded. Reed serves to keep warp threads properly spaced. Individual teeth in reed are known as "dents." Number of dents per inch designates the kind of reed.

E—BREAST BEAM: Cylinder of wood or metal at front of loom over which web is held taut.

F—CLOTH BEAM: Wooden or metal roller at front of loom and below breast beam on which finished cloth is wound.

single harness may control every other thread, every two threads, every three, four or whatever the desired combination may be. By adding harnesses, the weaver adds the variety of control. For the beginner, the four-harness loom is adequate since, coupled with the variations of warping and the variety possible in the weft, there are hundreds of possible patterns from which to choose.


The foot-operated treadles, or the hand-

operated wheel, raise the harness which in turn raises a specific number of warp threads. This forms a V-shaped opening between the warp threads known as the shed, and it is through this opening that the yarn for the weft is passed. As the weaver throws the shuttle through the shed, the yarn unwinds.

After each "throw" the harnesses are shifted, interlocking each thread in the weft with the threads in the warp. Then the

weft is beaten, or pressed firmly together, according to the tightness desired in the finished material. Getting a rhythmic beat assures uniformity in the woven fabric. That is all there is to the weaving operation; raise the harness by means of the treadle or handwheel, throw the shuttle and beat the weft. Some weavers beat before they change harnesses while others beat before and after. It makes no difference as long as the beat is consistent and rhythmic.

Cylinder-and-pin setup of modern loom raises harness according to pattern. Pins are relocated in holes as desired



#### WEAVING TERMS

THREAD: A length of tightly spun or twisted filaments which produce a smooth, fine strand. Warp material usually is called a warp thread.

YARN: A length of loosely twisted filaments in a single strand. Weft material usually is called weft yarn.

WARP: Threads running lengthwise in loom.

WEFT: Yarn woven crosswise in the warp.

SHUTTLE: A device, usually of wood, for holding weft yarn. There are two basic types: A "stick shuttle" for holding heavier materials which are pushed through the warp threads. A "throw shuttle" which is a boat-shaped and hollowed-out block holding weft yarn wound on a quill. As the shuttle is thrown through the warp threads, the weft material unwinds.

SHED: A V-shaped opening, as seen from the side, in the warp threads. This is produced when certain warp threads are raised by the harness. The shuttle is pushed or thrown from side to side through the shed, bringing the weft over and under a combination of warp threads.

PICK SHOT OR THROW: A single traverse of the warp threads by the weft yarn.

BEAT: After each throw of the shuttle, the beater is swung against the woven material, or web. The beat must be rhythmic and of the same force each time in order to produce evenly woven material. Force of beat is varied depending on the material used and the desired tightness.

SELVAGE: The edges of the woven material running parallel to the warp threads.

#### WEAVE PATTERNS

TABBY OR PLAIN WEAVE: Alternate warp threads—one thread up, one thread down (1-2, 1-2, 1-2, 1-2). This results in a fifty-fifty arrangement of the warp and weft color and the material is the same on both sides.

**TWILL:** Progressive alternation of warp threads (1-2, 2-3, 3-4, 4-1). By coming back on the next four warp threads in reverse order (4-3, 3-2, 2-1, 1-4) a herringbone results. When the material is turned over, the pattern will be the same on both sides but the colors will be reversed.

BASKET: Two sets of alternate warp threads are raised in opposition (1-2, 3-4, 1-2, 3-4). As with the twill, the pattern will remain the same, but the colors will be reversed on opposite sides of the material.

#### Lanterns to Light Skating Pond Held by Tree-Branch Supports




To support several lanterns above the ice for illuminating large areas of a skating pond, one sportsman hit upon the idea of using forked branches and discarded implement wheels for the purpose. Each branch was inserted in the hub of a wheel as shown, thus providing a base for holding it in an upright position. Then a lantern was hung from the forked end of each limb at the height desired, providing not only light but a rustic decoration.

#### Safety Pin Used as Cotter To Provide Quick Release

To prevent the wing nuts on the clamps of his boat trailer from working loose when the trailer was towed over rough roads, one man drilled holes in the bolts just above the nuts and installed large safety pins. Safety pins were used, rather than cotter pins, to provide quick release when it was necessary to loosen the wing nuts.




# Handy Hints for the PHOTOGRAPHER

MOVIE MAKING, still close-ups and developing all can be done more easily by adapting one or more of the five hints illustrated on this page. Left, home-movie title fade-ins and fade-outs are made by using a sheet of cellulose-acetate tracing film cemented to a cardboard frame. In use, the title card is held against the back of the film. Then with the camera running, title card is slowly tipped backward to produce a "dissolve." Fade-ins of titles are accomplished by reversing the procedure. Titles can be filmed in color or black and white.

Below, when using a slow, fine-grain developing solution, fit the 5 x 7-in. developing tray inside a warsurplus .30-cal. ammunition box. The clamps on the lid hold it tightly in place so the box is completely light-tight. With the developer inside the box, darkroom lights can be left on during the developing time





When obliged to carry heavy rubber boots by the small finger loops, sportsmen and hunters will find that a common clothespin can be used as a comfortable









# RESTORING IGNITION SYSTEM







ENERALLY, the job of reclaiming an J old car, truck or tractor engine includes an overhaul of the ignition system, as many of its parts frequently require rebuilding or replacing. First, the parts must be checked for electrical and mechanical defects. To do a thorough job, the distributor, Fig. 1, should be removed from the engine. Before removing the unit be sure to note the position of the distributor arm. Some mechanics mark its position relative to the housing so that there can be no error in replacing the unit in precisely the same position. Also, the engine crankshaft must not be moved until the distributor, Figs. 1 and 2, has been replaced. These precautions make it unnecessary to retime the engine after assembly.

One of the important electrical checks is for a grounded terminal, Fig. 3. Using test prods, place one on the terminal and one on the metal distributor housing with the breaker points open. The test bulb will light if the terminal is grounded. Another fairly reliable test for grounded terminal, when the system is complete with battery, is to remove the wire from the terminal, turn on the ignition switch and then flash the wire to the terminal with the points closed. Normally there will be a spark. But if there also is a spark when the points are open, it generally indicates a loose terminal or defective terminal bushings. There also is the possibility of a shorted condenser or a grounded contact-arm spring. If the tests turn up none of these common defects the unit probably is still in serviceable condition electrically.

One of the most important mechanical checks is to determine the amount of side play in the distributor shaft. If this is excessive, above .005 or .006, new bushings are needed. Also it should be remembered that normally the distributor cam rides freely on the distributor shaft. If it is frozen on the shaft, due to rust or other causes, the automatic spark advance will be rendered inoperative. If the cam does







not move freely under finger pressure, then dismantle the unit by removing the breaker plate and the insulated terminal. This will expose the centrifugal governor weights which are driven by the distributor shaft. These weights rotate the breaker cam on the shaft to advance or retard the spark according to engine speed. The cam can be freed and lifted off the end of the shaft by removing the governor-weight springs, Fig. 4, and then working it off the end of the shaft. Clean the parts in a solvent, polish the shaft and cam with crocus cloth and oil and then examine the weight springs carefully for spots of rust. If the springs show any sign of rust, they should be replaced. Be sure that the weights move freely from the retarded to the advanced positions. These movements involve the three parts A, B and C in Fig. 4.


Nearly all distributors are equipped with a vacuum advance. The weights (centrifugal advance) control spark advance in relation to engine speed while the vacuum unit controls spark according to engine load. When overhauling old engines most mechanics replace the vacuum unit as, in most cases, it is not practical to attempt a repair.

When assembling and replacing the distributor on the engine, check to see that the timing-adjustment screw is tight. Fig. 5 shows one type. Also check the breakerpoint gap with a feeler gauge as in Fig. 6. If necessary, reset according to the manufacturer's instructions. Be sure that the wear surfaces of the cam are smooth. Also, it's a good idea to check the tension of the breaker-arm spring as in Fig. 7. Lubricate the parts as they are assembled.


To prevent the possibility of explosion shattering the distributor cap, a comparatively rare occurrence and due to a fuelair mixture entering the distributor through the vacuum unit, mechanics vent the unit by drilling a ½-in. hole in the bottom of the bracket, Fig. 8. This prevents the fuel mixture reaching the distributor. \*\*







#### Pliers Provide Flashlight Support When Changing Flat Tire

#### Keep Your Tools Sharp . .

To get the most out of your workshop tools and bits, keep them sharp, for even the best quality tools, when dull, can't do a good job. Sharpening tools isn't difficult, but there is a right way and a wrong way for each edge, and there are tricks that make the job easy. All the information you need to do a professional job on your tools is in next month's big story on tool sharpening

to both doors. Noise from one room was still clearly audible in the other, even though the walls also were soundproofed. The solution to this particular problem was to apply ¾-in. tile to the face of one door, leaving the ½-in. tile on the other. The different thicknesses of tile on each surface cancelled out the harmonics which had been responsible for the transference of sound.—Robert F. Welch, Venice, Calif.

### Electric Motor and Tools Carried in Bucket

A fractional-hp. electric motor, which is difficult to carry because of its shape, can be transported easily from one job or building to another by placing it in a bucket. Wrenches, V-belts and other necessary accessories for the motor can



be carried in the bucket at the same time. Because of the extra weight, the handle of the bucket should be provided with a grip made from a section of rubber hose to make it easier to carry.

#### Plastic-Backed Print Smoothed On Ferrotype Tin With Alcohol

Photo paper which has a plasticized or water-resistant back sometimes is difficult to roll smoothly onto a ferrotype tin. To overcome this, squeegee the excess water from the print, then moisten the back with denatured alcohol. When the alcohol has softened the material on the back, force the paper into smooth contact with the ferrotype tin with a roller or squeegee.




# How to TURN A BALL

TURNING A wooden ball, or sphere, in your wood lathe is easier than it looks. The trick is in following through with all details of a step-by-step procedure. Follow the proper sequence and you end up with a perfect ball on the first try. Ordinarily, it is best to use hardwoods of dense grain


such as birch and maple.

Figs. 1 to 5, inclusive, picture the several steps in turning a ball on the screw center where the diameter of the finished ball does not exceed 4 in. When mounted on the screw center as shown, only one separate step, that of mounting in a cup chuck as in Fig. 5, is required to finish the ball completely. The first step is to turn the stock to the cylindrical form and to the exact diameter of the ball as in Fig. 1. The table, Fig. 8, gives the length of the octagon side for balls ranging from 1½ to 6-in. dia. Note how the measurement is made in Fig. 1, also the upper detail in Fig. 8, the latter showing the work mounted between centers. Rough-turn to the octagonal shape as in Fig. 2. Then make a template of ¼-in. plywood, bandsawing the end to the same radius as that of the ball. Taper the radius end of the template to a width a trifle more than one fourth the diameter of the ball, lower detail, Fig. 8. Wrap a piece of fine sandpaper around the partially turned ball and sand the curved end of the template. Now turn the ball shape by working the tool directly over the template as in Fig. 3.






MARK LINES FOR OCTAGON





ROUGH-TURN TO OCTAGON SHAPE



TURN BALL SHAPE










Then sand as in Fig. 4. Keep the paper and template moving uniformly over the surface, as otherwise a flat or groove may be produced. If the ball is to be center-drilled this operation can be carried out before removing the turning from the screw center. Lathe speed used in these operations should be about 2400 r.p.m.

There are several precautions to be taken when sanding the ball shape. The first thing of importance is the choice of a sandpaper grade to suit the type of wood. As a rule you can use a grade-coarser paper on softwood than on the average piece of hardwood and get a smoother job without scratching or burning. When sanding a ball, select a grade of paper that will work





on the flat grain of a piece of waste of the same kind of wood without leaving scratches. Touch this to the rotating ball with the template as in Fig. 4, then stop the lathe and observe the results carefully. If there are no pronounced scratches on the surface, it probably is safe to proceed. The reason for this precaution is that the purpose of sanding is only to smooth the ball, not to shape it. Also, before sanding, be sure that the paper used is not creased. A crease in the sandpaper will leave a scratch, or groove, that is difficult to remove without reducing the diameter of the ball.

The final step is to cut the ball from the waste and mount it in a cup chuck as in Figs. 5 and 8. Then turn off the hub, or boss, remaining after sawing the ball from the waste. This must be done with special care as the interrupted cut may cause the turning chisel to dig in and spoil the work.

When a number of balls of the same diameter are required, turn a spindle to the ball diameter, then remove the waste and partially turn each ball individually as in Fig. 6. Cut them apart with a bandsaw as in Fig. 7, or with a handsaw, then mount in the cup chuck as in Fig. 8 and finish each one separately. If the balls turned between centers require center holes, they may be accurately drilled with the setup pictured in Fig. 10, using the cup chuck on the tail center. Ordinarily, the diameter of the cup chuck should be slightly less than one fourth the diameter of the ball. Note also that the ball-bearing lathe center in the tailstock is fitted with a pad as in Fig. 5.

Where the ball is to be 4 in. or more in diameter it is best to remove a portion of the waste by compound bandsawing, the layout on the rough block being made on all four sides, as in Fig. 11. Then bandsaw the block to the shape shown in Fig. 12 and blacken one face with a soft-lead pencil. The blackened strip should be about ½ to ¾ in. wide so that it is readily seen while the work is rotating. After the ball has been partially finished between centers, be especially careful when turning down center projections, or bosses, to prevent over-cutting. Have lathe in a good light so that you can see the double image of the ball as it rotates. The double image will gradually fade out as the work comes to a spherical shape. Then sand with the tem-plate as in Fig. 9, stopping the lathe frequently to note the progress of the work. When the fine sanding marks begin to crisscross those made in the first sanding operation the curve is uniform.







#### Single-Leg Steel Welding Table Provides Foot Clearance



Because its top is supported on a single center leg, the heavy-duty welding table, shown in the photograph, eliminates the problem of foot clearance when working around it. The table top is a 36 x 36-in. piece of 11/2-in, steel plate welded to the leg, which is a length of 5-in.-dia. steel pipe set in the concrete floor. The lower shelf on which the tools are stored is 29 in. square and is a light steel plate. A steel flat welded to the edge provides a flange. The table is used both for welding and cutting and its extra-strong construction will absorb the heavy hammering required when fabricating or straightening metal shapes.-Leland Elam, Sacramento, Calif.

#### Beaded Surface Can be Simulated With Half-Round Molding



The easiest way to simulate a beaded surface on either flat or curved work is to apply half-round molding as shown in the illustration. For round work, the periphery must be divided accurately for the strips and spaces between them. The spacing between the strips can be varied for

best appearance, but all spaces must be of equal width. The easiest way to obtain this equal spacing is to use a spacing block when applying the strips. Unusual effects can be obtained by using spacing strips made of a darker wood than the molding strips, or by staining them beforehand.

#### Reversible Poultry-Feed Trough Easily Cleared of Rain or Snow

Rain or snow, which often fills outside poultryfeed troughs, is merely dumped out by inverting a two-way trough made from two sections of eaves trough riveted together. Turned up. the trough can be filled with feed immediately while the lower trough drains and dries.




## Sickle Bar Raised Hydraulically On Converted Mower

To avoid having to raise the sickle bar manually on a horse-drawn mower adapted for use with a tractor, one farmer mounted a hydraulic cylinder on the mower tongue to operate off the tractor hydraulic unit. In mounting the cylinder, the upper end was pivot-bolted to the sickle-bar lifting lever. The lower end pivots on a bolt in a bracket formed by welding square pieces of flat steel to a triangular-shaped piece. The bracket then is bolted to the tongue.


#### Portable Electric Drill Powers Garden Cultivator

For surface cultivation of garden row crops this improvised unit, powered by a portable electric drill of 1/2-in. capacity, has all the principal advantages of a rotary cultivator. It's especially handy in small gardens because of its light weight and maneuverability. The drill, which should be of the slow-speed type, is mounted in the inverted position on a wooden platform supported by two wooden wheels. Small rubber-tired wheels can be substituted. The handle is formed by bending ½-in. pipe

or conduit and the ends are attached to the platform, or base, by means of pipe clamps. The axle is attached in the same manner. The cultivator blades, or teeth, are bent to the shape indicated and placed side-byside on a 1/2-in. bolt with spacer washers between. After spacing the blades the nut is drawn tight to hold them in position. The switch on the drill is locked in the on position and a separate two-pole switch is located on the handle to provide more convenient control of the drill motor.


#### Automatic Release for Trip Rope Protects Driver of Tractor

The danger of the seat being pulled off a tractor by a trip rope tied to the seat, when an implement accidentally becomes unhooked, can be eliminated by using a "slip fitting" to hold the end of the rope. The fitting is a short length of auto-radiator hose slit down one side and attached to the tractor seat with a wire loop. The trip rope is passed through the hose, then a metal ring, length of dowel or just a large knot is tied in the end so the hanging weight of the rope will not pull it through. A heavy pull on the rope will cause it to slip through the slit in the hose, thus preventing it from pulling on the seat.






Flexibility of a large emery board makes it especially useful for finishing small metal parts. It is better and smoother than an ordinary file for this purpose and also much easier to control when the dimension is close to the required size. Both sides can be used Every good artist has his own ideas of how a pencil should be pointed to suit the work he is doing. An emery board cemented or thumbtacked to edge of drawing board, either side out, is just the thing for pointing the pencil. For a sharp, flat point it's usually best to use fine side of board

Lower left, small parts gripped in the vise may suddenly slip sidewise if a little too much pressure is applied when driving a screw or drilling a hole. To prevent this mishap, place an emery board on either side of work before tightening vise jaws. Friction surface of boards holds securely



#### Arrow-Fletching Jig Made Quickly Utilizing Short Dowel



When gluing new feathers on an arrow, the problem of holding them in position until the glue has dried can be solved by using a jig made from a short length of dowel. The dowel is drilled lengthwise to fit over the

end of the arrow and three equally spaced slots are cut to hold the feathers. The jig should be coated with paraffin to prevent the glue from adhering to it. In use, the jig is slipped over the end of the arrow, and the feathers, their one edge dipped in glue, are inserted in the slots. When the glue is dry, the jig is removed from the arrow, leaving the feathers in the required position.

#### Rubber Band on Ball of Twine Prevents Unwinding




One method of assuring that a ball of twine will not become unwound when it is dropped is to use a wide rubber band with a hole punched in it. The band is snapped


around the ball and the loose end of the twine is pulled through the hole, as shown. If the ball of twine unwinds from the inside, the rubber band need not be removed to use the twine.

#### Cut Bolt to Take Off Rusted Nut

When a bolt on which a nut has rusted fast is in a restricted location that prevents



gripping the head with a wrench, and a hammer and chisel cannot be used, split the bolt lengthwise with a hacksaw. Cut down through the bolt until the nut also is cut in half, then drive out the bolt with hammer and punch.—Hugh Lineback, Stillwater, Okla.



#### Welded Clamp on Tractor Lift Pulls Pipe Out of Well

Tractor power and a welded clamp have replaced muscle power on one farm for pulling the pump pipe from a well. Consisting of two % x 2 x 9-in. flat-steel sides with a steel block welded between them near the center, the clamp has a clevis fitted at each end. One clevis is used to suspend the clamp from the hydraulic lift of a tractor. Shaped from flat steel, the clevis at the opposite end has squared ends which aid the clamp to grip the pipe. A trip rope, passed through an eye welded on this clevis, is used to release the grip of the clamp. To use the clamp, the pump must first be jacked up from the platform and unscrewed from the pipe which is held with a regular alligator-jaw clamp. The welded clamp then is fitted over the pipe and it is raised the limit of the hydraulic lift. The clamp then is released with the trip rope and the clamp lowered. The process is repeated until all the pipe is pulled. A. M. Wettach, Mt. Pleasant, Iowa.

#### Magnet Removes Drill Chips From Blind Hole in Steel

Chips caused by drilling or tapping a blind hole in iron or steel can be removed by using a soft iron or steel rod and a strong magnet. The rod should be long enough to reach the bottom of the hole, and small enough in diameter to enter the hole freely. Drop the rod to the bottom of the hole and place the magnet on the end. When magnet and rod are removed from the hole, some of the chips will cling to the bottom of the rod. Pull the magnet away from the rod to clean it of chips, then repeat the complete operation until all the chips are removed from the hole.



in the end of one claw. The sharp-edged notch can be used to pull most tacks and brads and will not hinder the use of the hammer claw for pulling nails.


#### Repairing Threads Over Keyways

#### Handy Water Bucket Improvised From Automobile Inner Tube




cement a piece of inner-tube rubber on both sides of each end of the tube around the handholes. The bucket also would be handy on an outing or camping trip.

The bung on one end of the drum is bushed down to receive a small-size supply line. The bung on the top is left open to provide a supply of air and is covered to keep out the rain.


In this doweled joint, end grain is joined to flat grain. End grain should have two coats of glue before joining. Dowel locators assure perfect alignment







LUE KNOW-HOW has been simplified by the ready-to-mix and ready-to-apply cold adhesives which eliminate heating and the temperature problem at the time of application. Liquid hide glues have supplanted the older hide glues that were supplied in the flake form and required heating for a period of time to reduce them to a usable consistency. Although the older glues were highly effective in durability and holding power, they are not so suitable for use in small manufacturing plants and home shops due to the special equipment required for preparation and application. Both the liquid hide glues and the newer resin glues, the latter having the appearance and consistency of thick cream, are especially useful in home-shop joinery. Both these glues, also the







Laminating hardboard to wood is easy with the setup pictured. C-clamps should be equally spaced to distribute pressure uniformly. Wipe away excess glue



ready-to-mix type supplied in the powder form, require only the simplest clamping equipment. All are water-resistant in the sense that holding power is affected little, if any, by ordinary dampness. When a completely waterproof glue is required, the craftsman uses a resorcinol glue supplied in a two-part container, one part of which contains a dry powder, the other a catalyst in liquid form. When the powder and liquid are mixed in accordance with instructions they form a waterproof glue of great holding power. When gluing woods which contain natural oils such as rosewood, teak, lemon and yew wood, the craftsman uses a casein glue, which comes as a powder and is mixed with water to form a fairly heavy liquid.

Edge-gluing and joint-gluing of frames


and cabinet parts require not only the use of the correct glue, but a careful trial fitting of the parts to insure full contact over the whole area of the meeting surfaces. When edge-gluing a number of strips to form a wide panel, the edges of the strips must be jointed true, either by machine or by handplaning. Craftsmen make a trial assembly of cabinet frames before applying glue to the joints. This will assure a perfect fit of the parts when they are glued and clamped. When gluing cabinet-frame members where end grain is joined to flat grain, it is important to apply two coats of glue to the end grain. Allow the first coat to become tacky, then apply a second coat and join, When joining flat grain, as in edge-to-edge work, the important thing is to apply the glue in a uniform coating. This can be done




Bar clamps, or carpenter's clamps, are best for edgegluing a number of strips to form a wide panel or top. Note spacing and alternate position of center clamp



On work where exposed metal is not objectionable, corrugated fasteners are suitable "clamps" for edgegluing. Usually they are driven into both sides of joint









Simply spread glue on joining faces, locate parts and wrap with tape Craftsmen often improvise bar clamps when building or repairing chairs. This simple, two-part clamp is especially effective for this type of parts assembly








For repairing a single chair, twisted cords can be used to apply pressure until glue sets. Cord clamp is quickly improvised from a length of clothesline



In some cases, chair assembly can be speeded up by applying pressure in two directions simultaneously. Here three bar clamps will be placed at right angles

When the amount of work to be done justifies its purchase, the band clamp is best for chair work. Here the lower assembly is clamped in one operation



with a thin wooden paddle, a brush, or best of all, a glue applicator of the roller type. This applicator operates in a manner similar to a wheel-type paint striper.

Beginning with the two right-hand photos on page 215, various methods of clamping are pictured. Correct application of the clamps and the amount of pressure applied are the two most important points about clamping. Bar clamps, C-clamps and wooden hand screws, or adjustable clamps, are the most commonly used in the small shop. Bar clamps, or carpenter's clamps, are used chiefly in edge-gluing several strips of stock, also in cabinet-frame assembly. It is important that bar clamps be located square with the work so that pressure is exerted uniformly. Also, when more than two bar clamps must be used, locate the center clamp, or clamps as the case may be, equidistant from those near the ends of the work. The upper left-hand photo on page 217 is a good example of correct bar-clamping. Note that the center clamp is placed with the bar across the opposite face of the work. This position of the third clamp helps to equalize the pressure and also prevents any tendency of the work to buckle. If the work has been cut to the finish size before clamping it will be necessary to protect the edges at the point where the metal clamp jaws engage. This is done by placing small pine blocks between the edge of the stock and the jaws, or by cementing pieces of leather to the face of the jaws. You also can improvise a good substitute for bar clamps, the clamp in the lower right-hand photo on page 216 being a good example.


C-clamps and edge clamps, upper left and upper right-hand photos on page 216, are used when it is necessary to apply pressure near the edges of the work, as in gluing on an edging strip, or in veneering. Edging clamps, upper right-hand photo, page 216, are provided with a sliding bracket, or jaw, which makes it possible to apply equal pressure in two directions. Another clamp which belongs in this classification is the simple spring clamp shown in the lower left-hand photo, page 216. This clamp works in a manner similar to pliers, the spring acting to close the pivoted jaws. Spring-type clothespins also can be used

in the same manner.

Improvised miter clamps, rubber bands, cellulose tape, corrugated fasteners, "chevron type" fasteners, all these can be made to serve as clamps in certain gluing operations. In building or repairing chairs, the band clamp, lower photo at the left, is universally useful. It consists of a length of canvas or other tough fabric attached to a special fixture having a snubbing device which permits adjustment of the fabric band to any required length.

#### Razor Blade Attached to Block Provides Cardboard Cutter




One man who had frequent need to cut corrugated cardboard for packing inserts, mailing photos and other purposes, made a simple and efficient cutter by thumbtacking a single-edge razor blade to one side of a small wooden block. The blade is set to just cut

through the cardboard. When one corner of the blade is dulled, the blade is easily changed end for end. A double-edge blade also could be used for this purpose, but the upper edge of the blade should be covered with cellulose or adhesive tape to prevent injury to the fingers.

#### Vertical-Sliding Haymow Door Is Counterbalanced

The time and labor involved in closing a conventional hinged-type haymow door can be reduced considerably by using this counterbalanced door that slides vertically. Tracks for the door are provided by first nailing 2 x 4s to the outside surface of the barn, then nailing 1 x 6s on top of them and allowing one edge to project. Ropes tied to each side of the door lead up over pulleys and down to free-hanging weights which counterbalance the door so it can be operated with a minimum of effort.


#### Tanks Set in Concrete Floor Furnish Water for Hog Lot

The waterers in the hog lot of one farm are buried 5 ft. in the ground to aid in keeping the water at a constant temperature and to prevent winter freezing. The waterers are discarded hot-water tanks, each having one end removed. The tanks are set in the ground at such a depth that when the concrete floor is poured around them, 3 in. of the tank projects above the surface. The water line that supplies the tank is run underground from a boxed-in pan and float just outside the fence. A 12quart bucket, with holes punched around the sides, fits in the top of each tank, to prevent feed and dirt from dropping into the tanks. The buckets are cleaned simply by lifting them and pouring their contents on the ground.—G. Laycock, Batavia, Ohio.

#### Chicken-Wire Fencing Spliced With Sections of Tubing


Splicing together two lengths of chickenwire fencing, which usually is done by sewing with wire or by twisting the strands together, can be accomplished more easily with diagonal sections cut from a length of

copper tubing. Cut the tubing as indicated by the dotted lines in the detail then spread the points of the resulting rings with a screwdriver. Use a pair of pliers to pinch the rings onto the chicken wire, as shown in the illustration. The rings should be spaced every 5 in along the splice.











## Wheelbarrow Hand Guards Prevent Skinned Knuckles



When an extremely heavy wheelbarrow is used in a confined area, steel barn-door handles bolted to the wheelbarrow handles will provide maximum protection.

#### Ends of Cut Hose Join Tightly When Hacksawed Together





#### Poultry Fountains Suspended From Pivoted Supply Lines


As an aid in keeping the litter dry and water fountains clean, one poultry raiser suspends the fountains with the water-supply pipes. A swing joint, provided by two pipe elbows connected directly to each fountain, permits the fountain to be gradually raised and kept level as the chicks grow. Also, the fountains can be lifted out of the way when the floor is cleaned. Under ordinary pressure the elbows will not leak when used in this manner. However, for use over a period of years, a regular swing-joint fitting in place of the elbows would assure complete watertightness.







# Care and Feeding of Engines

#### FACTS ABOUT ANTI-FREEZE

Before adding anti-freeze, your cooling system should be flushed with clear water and allowed to drain. After adding anti-freeze, run engine till solution is thoroughly mixed, leaving radiator cap off so air can escape. Then stop engine and check level of solution in radiator, being sure hydrometer is clean and bulb is free to move. Fill and empty hydrometer several times to get a correct reading, as all hydrometer tests are calibrated for the temperature of the solution.

Never mix glycol-type anti-freeze with alcohol-type, as freezing points vary widely and accurate testing would be impossible. Do not mix different brands of alcohol-type anti-freeze, as rust-inhibitors may cause a chemical reaction that would reduce anti-rust effect. Do not use anti-freeze from one year to the next unless you add new rust-inhibitor. Rust-inhibitor will lose its effectiveness after one year.

Always tighten hose clamps or replace hose when adding anti-freeze. Anti-freeze will seep through places where water will not pass. Be careful with stop-leak compounds; don't use them to stop a hose-leak.

#### WHEN ENGINE CUTS OUT



If your engine cuts out at speeds over 50 mph, here are two of several possible causes: SPARK PLUGS may be of too hot a type, missing fire under extreme heat, and should be replaced. Or

SPRING TENSION in distributor may need adjust ing. This tension should be 17 to 20 ounces. Measure with an ounce scale as shown, then loosen adjusting screw and move spring in or out till correct tension is reached.

#### Ice Dams

Q-Last winter ice formed near the eaves along the north side of the roof on my ranch-type home. Several leaks developed just above the cornice. Water has damaged the plaster. After ice melted in the spring the shingles appeared to be in good condition. The roof did not leak during the spring, summer or fall. What was the cause?

-N.R., Conn.

A—Snow on the lower edge of the roof melts during warmer weather and then freezes during a cold snap, forming a dam which retains much of the water running down from a higher level as the snow melts during a warm day. The water held above the ice dam thus formed seeps under the tabs of the shingles and leaks into the attic, usually at a point just above the plate. You did not say, but apparently the shingles were laid directly on the roof boards without an underroofing of smooth roll roofing or asphalt-coated paper made for this purpose. Many homeowners experiencing this trouble have installed lead-coated electric heating cable, looping the cable across the width of the roof in vertical loops extending from 15 to 30 in. above the eaves. The cable must be properly connected to the power line and a switch provided for turning the current off and on. Such units are said to be quite effective when correctly installed.



#### Snow Mold

Q-When my lawn started last spring I noticed that in several small patches there was no new growth, the plants apparently having been killed. However, the grass near these spots seemed entirely unaffected. I raked the soil in the bare spots and reseeded, using the best seed and a fertilizer of recommended proportions. The new seeding caught immediately and made a good growth. What was the cause?

A—Did you spill oil, dry-cleaning fluid or any other root-destroying chemical on the areas affected? If not, then the description would indicate that the bare spots in the lawn resulted from what is known as snow mold. The fact that the new

seeding germinated and grew readily wou'd tend to bear out this conclusion. What is called snow mold on lawns generally results when the area is covered for long periods with drifted snow or ice to a considerable depth. As a preventive it might be practical to level small snowdrifts and it is said that recurrence can be prevented to some extent by treating the soil with mercuric chloride at the rate of about 3 oz. per 1000 sq. ft. However, in your own experience this would appear to be unnecessary. Piles of leaves, grass clippings and newspapers also can damage grass in the manner you describe if covered with snow during the winter. However, the damage is seldom as extensive and complete as that caused by the so-called snow mold.

#### Winter House Plants

Q—What varieties of house plants can I grow in a large old-fashioned bay window located on the north side of the the north side of the house? If possible I would like to grow plants in the bay the year around. During the summer months plants would get some direct sunlight during the morning and evening hours, but how about the winter months? Storm sash are used all during the winter, all during the winter, but the bay is directly exposed.—R. H., Mo.



A—Nearly all potted plants should do reasonably well during the summer months, but only certain ones can be expected to thrive during winter in a north window. Ordinarily the common ferns, ivies and variegated-foliage plants do best, especially during the cold months. There are others, of course, but these seem to be the most consistently successful. Start them in large pots that provide plenty of space for rich soil. Place gravel and a small amount of sand in the bottom of each pot to provide aeration and ample drainage. Water on a regular schedule. Most careful indoor gardeners A—Nearly all potted plants should do reasonably to provide aeration and ample drainage. Water on a regular schedule. Most careful indoor gardeners place the pot in a shallow container which can be filled with water at regular intervals. Liquid plant food should be supplied frequently. When nights are severely cold, tender plants should be moved away from the window or may be protected by covering the lower half of the sash with heavy corrugated cardboard held in place with cellulose tape. On more moderate days when the sunshine is bright, move the plants close to the window. In some cases indoor gardeners build a removable flat of metal, or wood with a metal lining, in which the potted plants can be arranged attractively. the potted plants can be arranged attractively.


#### Noise Problem

Q-We moved into our new home three years ago It is of frame construction, 1½-story with brick veneer across the front and on one side, full base-ment and hardwood floors. Walls are plasterboard, ment and hardwood floors. Walls are plasterboard, dry-wall construction throughout. Ever since we moved in we have been puzzled by unusual snapping, or creaking, sounds which seem to originate in the attic space, but also are sometimes heard in the walls in different locations and at different times, but more particularly at night. This has become so objectionable that we are thinking seriously of selling, but have hesitated to do so because we like the location. What is the cause of the objectionable noise?—C. M., Wash.

A—We wouldn't sell for the recent given. There

-We wouldn't sell for the reason given. are several possible causes of the phenomenon you describe, but the most likely one is a slow shrinkage of the framing materials. This can take place over a considerable period of time, especially in a humid climate where dry-out of the housed frame members of the structure is impeded by the comparatively high moisture content of the air. As the materials dry they contract slightly along the length. Wherever framing parts are joined, any contraction of the members causes meeting surcontraction of the members causes meeting surfaces to slip past one another, resulting in the squeaks, or creaking sounds. The movements are so very slight that as a rule no damage results and in time the wood will stabilize at some point.



"14." "175," and "12.3." These numbers represented the amount of silicon found by the emission spectrograph in successive samples of lubricating oil taken from one engine during a three-week period.

'The second sample, registering 175, was taken right after the unit finished a run through the Texas Panhandle during the height of the dust storms there early this year," Rudd explained. "So much dirt was in the air that the engine filter couldn't handle it. Notice also that the copper and lead counts went up, too. That represents the damage to engine parts caused by the dirt. You can see from this report what kind of a job the emission spectrograph is doing for us."

Rudd then showed me an empty milk bottle. "This is where the analysis begins," he explained. The bottle was made of cardboard, in the shape of a cone. After a lubricating-oil sample comes in, 30 grams are poured into one of these cardboard bottles.

Rudd walked over to a laboratory bench with a small box on it. This was an electric hot plate.

He opened a drawer and brought out a black pellet about the size of an aspirin tablet. He put this on the hot plate and turned on the juice, first setting the dial at 700 degrees Fahrenheit. While the pellet was "cooking," he used a fountain straw to remove 10 drops of oil from the milk bottle containing the sample. He let this oil fall on the pellet, one drop at a time. As each drop hit, it burned. The residue, consisting of a tarry coating on the top of the pellet, contained the contaminants that were in the oil.

After Rudd had prepared the pellet, we walked into a small room near by. Inside, and taking up most of the space, was the emission spectrograph and a related piece of equipment known as a "densitometer." The important parts of the emission spectrograph include: A spark gap, like those on the spark plugs in your car; a prism; a camera and enough controls to keep my two-year-old son happy for a century.

The pellet was placed on a small platform, only a little larger than the pellet itself. This platform is actually one of the two electrodes that form the spark gap. A small motor turns the pellet, much like a midget phonograph record. Meanwhile, high-frequency electric current arcs across the spark gap. Color of the spark is determined by impurities coating the pellet.

You may remember, if you took highschool chemistry, that every chemical

element gives off a light of a certain color when it burns. Thus, if you can separate the colors in the spark, you can identify the elements coating the pellet.

That is what the prism is for. It separates the light from the spark into its component colors. These colors are then

"painted" on a photographic plate.

The actual colors don't show up in the picture; rather, each color is designated in terms of its wavelength. What you get in the photo is a line about 1/4-inch thick and just about six or seven inches long. There are dark and light places along this line which correspond, respectively, to large and small quantities of a particular color in the spark. Since the colors designate particular contaminants, these dark and light points along the line represent large and small concentrations of contaminants in the lubricating oil. In other words, as the concentration of each contaminant varies, so does the shading along the line in the emission-spectrograph photo.

To find out the exact concentration, you need some means of measuring this shading. The densitometer handles this job. It rates the darkness or density of any point along the line in terms of a number. A dark point might receive a rating of 2, and a lighter portion a rating of 20. The scale ranges from 0 (black) to 100 (white).

The final step in the process is to convert the densitometer reading, with the aid of a standard formula, into figures which represent the concentration of each contaminant per million parts of oil. This is done on a glorified slide rule which was devel-

oped by Rock Island chemists.

Although the Rock Island paid \$25,000 for its emission spectrograph, "the money was well-spent even if we have saved only one crankshaft," explained J. E. Tiedt, supervisor of operations at the Chicago lab. Fortunately, crankshaft failures are almost as rare today as a snowstorm on the Sahara. But, as Tiedt pointed out, when a crankshaft does burn out, the cost of replacing it, including labor and engine down time, is well above \$25,000.

Actually, of course, the emission spectrograph is saving more than engine crankshafts. For it is able to spot troubles that can affect every part in the engine.

The new method is much speedier and far more thorough than the technique it replaced. Railroad chemists formerly checked engine wear by burning a few drops of an oil sample and then mixing the ash with various acids to find the contaminants. It took three men about a week to process 30 engine samples. With the emission spectrograph, three men can process over 50 samples a day.



electricity in one direction and an almost perfect insulator when the current is reversed. The flow of electrons is always toward the surface at which freezing began, and the ice must "grow" in one direction so that all its crystals adhere together evenly. The discovery that ice can behave something like a vacuum tube or transistor eventually may contribute toward a more scientific understanding of electricity and its conductors.

Their studies of thunderstorm electrification have led the Socorro scientists to suggest an intriguing possibility: Why not convert thunderstorms into mild rainstorms that would deliver plenty of rain and yet produce no lightning? Drawing the fangs of thunderstorms could reduce huge timber losses caused by lightning fires, as well as prevent disastrous lightning strikes in inhabited areas.

The scientists learned in the laboratory that the electrical effects caused by freezing become neutralized in the presence of ammonia; now they propose to infuse ammonia into a thunderstorm from ground generators or from aircraft. If the idea works, the storm will produce a soaking

rain without any lightning.

Cloud physicists think that every drop of rain begins with a nucleus of some sort on which cloud moisture gathers, eventually building up to a raindrop. About a million particles of cloud moisture must be collected to make up a drop of rain. The ice crystals that serve as nuclei in thunderstorms don't exist in relatively warm clouds at low altitudes, and one of the present problems is to learn what kind of nuclei, if any, induces precipitation from such clouds.

Dust particles and pollen are pretty well distributed in the atmosphere, but these don't attract or absorb moisture and so don't appear to be good condensation nuclei. Salt particles drawn up into the air during ocean storms could be ideal nuclei, and physicists from Socorro have flown over many parts of the country seeking these particles. So-called "chloride clouds have been found in the atmosphere along the Pacific and as far inland as Utah, but east of the Rockies the particles are relatively scarce. So far, the scientists haven't been able to pin-point definitely any kind of particle as the one that brings on rain from warm clouds.

In the hope of finding out, and also to learn more about thunderstorms, the New Mexico institute is completing a six-floor tower on top of its Socorro Thunderstorm





Laboratory. Cloud vapors will be generated in a chamber at the bottom of the tower, then conducted to the "cloud tube" that will extend to the tower's top. Ice crystals, salt particles and all other likely nuclei will be introduced into the artificial cloud in attempts to coalesce the vapor particles into actual raindrops. The cloud tube is insulated and portions of it may be refrigerated to temperatures as low as 20 degrees below zero F., thus duplicating the low temperatures found inside the tops of thunderclouds. Updrafts and downdrafts can be created in simulation of the air currents inside actual clouds.

If, as is hoped, studies with the cloud tube lead to the discovery of the mechanism by which warm clouds produce rain, then attempts will be made to increase artificially the amounts of that rainfall. The big goal of the Socorro scientists is to find ways of producing valuable amounts of rain in the areas where it is needed and at the times it is needed most.



#### No More Roar in Big Outboards

Last year the major outboard-motor manufacturers vied in quieting their smaller motors. This year the main emphasis is on eliminating the roar of the bigger outboards. Several silencing devices have been added to the 10 and 25-horsepower Johnson models and the 71/2, 15 and 25horsepower Evinrude models. A rubbercushion mounting system isolates the motor from the boat and prevents the boat from becoming a sounding board for the motor's vibration. The powerhead and hood are also mounted in rubber. A new two-stage air-intake silencer cuts down high and low frequencies, and an exhaust-relief silencer minimizes the noise behind the motor.



75-percent-reflective coating — the letters are magnified to % inch.

It does away completely with the need for uniform or special equipment. And as a bonus feature, Oppenheimer's invention has standard cues boxed on the top and bottom of each page. They are printed instruc-tions such as "Speed Up," "Slow Down," "One Minute to Go," etc. The director merely has to push a button to light up the particular instruction he wishes his performer to follow.

Another use to which the Javo Viewer lends itself, although this is not its primary purpose, is that of an off-camera prompter. By being placed at strategic positions during a performance, it can make fluffing a thing of the past.

If Oppenheimer was annoyed by newscasters who did not look him squarely in the eye from his TV screen, he has been no less put out with filmed comedy shows which resort to canned laughter. Probably the seed for this particular public service was planted when Oppenheimer was a boy in San Francisco. He and his pals used to patronize a movie house which had a special section equipped with earphones for the hard of hearing. Whenever there was a comedy, Oppenheimer and his cronies would sit in that section and use the earphones so they could hear the dialogue which otherwise would have been drowned out by audience laughter.

Oppenheimer worked out two intricate methods for getting authentic laugh tracks on filmed TV comedies. One system delays the actors on the set by means of a silent signaling system which suspends the dialogue for the predetermined duration of the laugh. During this lull in the conversation, the performers fill the breach with pantomime action known in the trade as pieces of business. If the line is considered to warrant a seven-second laugh, a nudge of the push button puts the light on for seven seconds. If the actor is supposed to come in after one or two seconds, the signal lasts that long. Laughs are recorded later, and in that way there is adequate audience reaction and no conflict with the movement of the story.

The second system plotted out by Hollywood's "Leonardo da Vinci" is the one that renders audiences superfluous. It provides, through the use of tape recording, a method of playing the laughs on the set while the performance is in progress. This is another multiple push-button device which operates a complete catalogue of laughs

differing in length and quality to meet the needs of the story.

This system offers the director a choice between a tape with preselected laughs which may be integrated chronologically with the dialogue, or a multiple tape in which the director may push the various buttons for a guffaw, a giggle, hearty laughter or whatever the script may justify.

As soon as the button is pushed, laughter rises just as it would with a live audience, and fades in the same manner. The machine stops automatically at the conclusion of one laugh, and is ready to launch the next laugh instantly at the push of a button.

As producer of I Love Lucy, Oppenheimer was concerned with the limitations of the conventional camera dolly inherited by TV from the movie sound stages. He realized that it was impossible to set up certain camera shots with existing dollies, so he invented the Jayo directional-control ball caster. It operates on giant balls instead of the wheels on which the conventional dolly moves. This ball-caster principle permits his dolly to move in any direction, yet keeps it susceptible to control when desired. When the brake assembly is applied, it converts the balls into wheels and allows the dolly to be steered in any direction. At the same time the assembly facilitates prompt change of direction whenever required.

It was while perfecting the Jayo Viewer that Oppenheimer developed his low-cost method for synchronizing series-wound motors. He came up with an idea, for which some of his patents now are pending, which synchronized three motors at a cost of \$40, supplanting the established method requiring a master motor costing \$250.

Oppenheimer and his wife were seeing a 3D picture, The House of Wax, when he got the inspiration for glasses that permit a person to see 3D in 2D. He noticed people holding their hands over one eye because of eyestrain and headache.

He solved this problem by inventing a pair of polarized glasses in which one lens is variable. This permits the viewer, by flicking a tiny rod extending from the circular eyepiece, to switch the variable lens to an opposite plane from the fixed lens. Presto! This converts the 3D image to 2D.

Mrs. Oppenheimer sometimes questions the wisdom of putting so much money in inventions. Oppenheimer insists the expenditure is justified.

"Aside from the fact that business investments are deductible," he smiles, "I don't think I've ever had any experience which I haven't sooner or later incorporated into a radio or TV show. So, one way or another, it can't help but pay for itself." \*\*\*



#### Taking That Spot-News Picture

using and, in a general way at least, know how to use it in your particular camera. Fast black-and-white film is best for press use. When you unload exposed film from your camera, again take great care to protect the film from strong light, especially direct sunshine.

You must know your camera is focused sharply on the subject in regard to distance. If you are shooting a simple box camera, which has fixed focus, you have no worries here. Other cameras must be focused upon the picture-to-be. Focusing is easy enough; the problem is to remember to do it. If you make camera adjustments in the same order each time you take pictures, you'll be less likely to forget an essential step in an emergency.

You must expose the film to enough light to register the picture-image while also stopping action. Many camera users shy from the job of trying to understand what "exposure" means. Exposure is putting enough light on the film to burn the pictureimage completely into the film's sensitized surface. If exposure is too "thin" you lose all shadowy areas of the picture. If exposure is too "heavy" the picture is muddy.

Your judgment is required in choosing a shutter speed and an aperture (size of opening in lens; also called diaphragm opening or iris; this is the f-stop shown on the dial) which together will admit the right total quantity of light.

The shutter regulates how long the light

enters the camera.

The aperture regulates how fast the light

The total amount of light needed is determined by the speed rating of the kind of film you are using.

You must measure (with a light meter) or estimate the brightness of light illumi-


nating the subject.

You must choose a shutter speed fast enough, if possible, to stop action in the scene you are shooting. If you intend to hold the camera in your hands for shooting, the shutter speed shouldn't be less than ‰ second; ‱ would be better.

Your choice of aperture depends on what shutter speed is required and on intensity of light on the subject. By buying and using a good light meter you can save yourself years of photographic aches and pains. You'll educate your eye to light values, and you'll take a short cut to understanding and applying the ABCs of exposure. The meter does its service by eliminating one big "guess" from your photography; the meter



takes a look at what you're going to shoot and tells you how bright the light is.

Lacking a meter at the time of your big picture, you make your best guess at light intensity. For protection against error you can bracket your shots. Give one shot much heavier exposure, and one shot much thinner exposure, than your best guess; of the three exposures, one should be close enough to give you a printable negative.

You must aim the camera at the subject. This sounds like an only too obvious rule, but many a news photo has been lost because the camera lopped off somebody's head, or because the camera was too close to take in the essential parts of the picture.

Your camera must be motionless while its shutter is open. Camera movement spoils more pictures than any other error. High shutter speed reduces the bad effect of camera movement; shutter speed alone won't eliminate it. Only immobilizing the camera solves the problem. The trouble here is that you probably won't have a tripod handy at the time and place of the unexpected big picture. You may be able to improvise a roosting place for your camera where it will cover the subject.

You must avoid accidents and oversights. There's an endless list of things which can defeat the camera user on the threshold of glory. The usual hullabaloo around the scene of a spot-news event raises the hazard level photographically and otherwise.

Do your picture-taking from a place where you won't get hurt. Camera and picture alike may be lost if the camera gets smashed, dropped or drenched. Trying to take pictures from a dangerous place raises mental hazards; you are much more likely to forget some step in camera mechanics focusing, for example. Find a safer spot and shoot with care!

You must identify the picture. What happened? Who are the people? Where did it happen? When? What other essential facts must be known to describe the picture? So far as possible you must get those facts for a spot-news picture.

Your picture must be transported to the news channel. Time counts in news photography. Instead of taking time to go home and develop your films, telephone newspapers that might want your pictures.

Your negative must be properly developed and printed. News-photo labs like to do their own developing and printing. They have cut the time of such processing to the minimum and they have their own ideas about contrast, cropping and size of prints. Their lab men are wizards at making the most out of a negative. Hand your exposed films over to them and hope for the best!







output by means of dual overhead camshafts, mounted at a 70-degree angle, which operate the overhead valves by a two-stage duplex roller chain. Because of its relatively small displacement, compared with American cars of similar output, the Jaguar uses dual carburetors, extra-large intake valves and header-type exhaust scavenging for maximum breathing. Naturally, these high-performance practices step up the engine revolutions for brake-horsepower rating, but likewise make this engine very effective in the lightweight Jaguar. Best performance is obtainable in the range above 4000 revolutions per minute, about where maximum torque occurs, whereas most American cars develop maximum torque in the 2000-2500 range.

Even though the Jaguar engine attains its best performance with high revolutions, it is interesting to note that, unlike the present engine trend (large bore and short





stroke), it has a comparatively long stroke (4.173 inches) and a smaller bore (3.268 inches). Long-stroke engines usually are not considered ideal for extreme high speed but Jaguar seems to be the exception and the long stroke does permit the handling of a high gear ratio with ease. The cylinder head is aluminum alloy with hemispherical combustion chambers. Twin S.U. horizontal carburetors are used with an electrically controlled automatic choke. Seven large steel-backed bearings carry the 2¾-inch-diameter crankshaft and the engine has minimum vibration.

At high and low speeds and around sharp corners the fast steering enables one to

correct skids quickly. From lock to lock only 2¾ turns of the wheel are required. This is a good safety feature, even though more effort is necessary to turn the wheels. Turn circle is small (31-foot diameter).

The four-speed gearbox is synchromesh in second, third and fourth speeds, with a fourth-gear ratio of 1:1 which, with the rear-axle ratio of 3.54:1, enables the Jag to cruise at high speeds with little effort or strain. I found the best maximum speeds on level ground for shifting up are as follows: From first, 30 miles per hour; from second, 63 miles per hour; and from third to fourth, 85 miles per hour.

The short, stubby gearshift lever is handy for top performance in traffic or on winding roads where quick shifting is often desired. A hand shift is a "must" for every true sports-car driver.



The ride is not soft and springy by American standards, but the independent front suspension, using wishbones and long torsion bars coupled with a rear suspension of semielliptic springs controlled by Girling hydraulic shocks, makes the car hold the road with little bounce, float or sponginess. The low-slung body and chassis still boasts a 7½-inch ground clearance, comparable to American cars.

Lockheed hydraulic brakes with 12-inch drums are used. Front drums are fitted with air-cooling ducts. Jaguar brakes are definitely improved over earlier models and at all speeds the car could be brought to a straight-line stop without side pull in either direction, although the pedal pressure is harder than is necessary for braking most American cars.

The gasoline economy, for a high-per-

formance sports car, is good.

Jaguar certainly offers many different features as compared to our cars. The driving position is excellent and one feels as though he is a "part of" and master of the car, due to the low center of gravity and the seating position. Like most other sports cars, entering or getting out of a Jag takes a little body "English" or twisting, but practice soon makes the entry a simple routine matter.

The Bluemel telescopic steering wheel can be moved in or out about three inches so that the driver may select the driving position that suits him best. Once a position is selected a large nut locks the wheel in one position. If desired, the wheel position can be changed while driving.

The divided bucket-type seats are finished in good-quality leather but, by American standards, they are rigid and without much spring—but a sports-car driver likes them that way. They can be individually adjusted. The body has a rigid feel and the doors open and close easily. The British must like to turn cranks for, unlike the quick-action steering wheel, it takes 3½ turns of the short crank to lower or raise the window of the convertible.

The clutch pedal requires considerable pressure, as does the brake pedal, and the foot must be lifted 4½ inches from the throttle pedal to reach the brake pedal—which is too much. The hand-brake lever, located alongside the shift lever is locked instead of released by pushing down on the



button on top. Jag calls it a "fly off" type. It is handy for quickly applying and releasing the hand brake in an emergency or in cornering because it will fly back to the off position automatically. It is also excellent for use in starting up on a hill.

The horn will not blow unless the ignition switch is on. A directional-signal lever is located directly above the horn button, with a warning light working when the lever is set for a turn in either direction. Twin electric windshield wipers operate satisfactorily. The instruments are welllocated in a walnut-wood instrument panel which appears expensive but old-fashioned.

Of course, no true sports-car enthusiast would be found dead without a tachometer on his car. Many drivers shift and drive by the "tach" to indicate when gears should be shifted for best performance.

Mounted within the Smith's tachometer dial is an electric clock with very small but readable dial. One unusual feature is part of the gasoline gauge. When the gasoline supply is almost exhausted, a small warning light flashes—a good idea. Oil and temperature gauges are mounted under a single glass dial.

As in most sports cars, rear vision in the convertible is not good because the tiny cowl mirror has small scope and the rear window glass is very small. The sidemounted mirror is more useful. Front vision, however, is excellent and little red guide lights appear at each front-fender tip. There were no sun visors on the convertible, but the chaps with the longvisored caps may not need them for, like golfers, fishermen and other outdoor sportsmen, they like the sun, front or rear.

One thing the foreigners do supply is an excellent set of tools, as does Jaguar. Many sports-car owners like to tinker with their cars. A central jack operates amidships to lift both wheels on one side of the car at the same time in case of a tire change.

The bumpers should be deeper and should afford more protection for use in traffic and parking. They are definitely too narrow and many cars with massive bumpers do not match up with the bumper positions of the Jag. Sometimes this causes damage to body, grille or trunk-lid handle and lock.

The acceleration of the Jaguar is great. Its excellent road-holding qualities, low road position of the car and its unique suspension make it fun to drive. Its performance came up to my expectations. It isn't exactly the type of car that every John Doe would enjoy for driving through traffic or for use as a family car, but it definitely offers something that cannot be had in any mass-produced American car.







motive-power men, however. And more than five years ago they got together with Baldwin-Lima-Hamilton, Westinghouse and the Babcock and Wilcox Company.

The problem they faced was the development of a heavy-duty locomotive that had the flexibility of electric drive, but which burned coal for its fuel.

Actually, the idea of a steam-turbineelectric locomotive was not new. Other locomotives, embodying similar features, had been built, operated—then scrapped.

The fault, engineers felt, lay in the boiler design. Previous steam turbines had used low-pressure boilers that gave poor fuel results. At least one ran into continual boiler trouble because of the stresses resulting from rapid drops of pressure every time the train was started.

So Babcock and Wilcox came up with a water-tube boiler in which a 600-pound pressure is maintained over the entire operating range by automatic controls.

N&W men say any crew on the board can take the 2300 up over the mountains after only a short period of instruction. C. E. Pond, the general superintendent of motive power, says it's even easier to operate than a conventional steam locomotive.

How is it working? The higher-ups in the N&W motive-power department won't talk-yet. Although 2300 has been in regular service since May 31, with a dynamometer car loaded with testing gear hitched right behind the tender, performance data has been kept a deep, dark secret pending completion of exhaustive tests.

But around the shops and among the men who have worked with the big boy since its inception, you sense a feeling of optimism and accomplishment.

"It's doing everything we thought it would, and then some," one young engi-neer said in an unguarded moment of enthusiasm.

The locomotive hasn't been given a formal name yet, although one imaginative writer dubbed it "Jawn Henry" after another legendary railroad figure and publicity men have fallen in line. Around the shops, though, it's more often referred to as "the big one."

Anyway, you come from the roundhouse with the feeling that the Norfolk and Western has got something.

Some of those concerned are already worrying about what will happen to the 2300s when the atomic-powered loco comes on the scene.





easy servicing and that two speakers are employed for high-quality sound distribution. See sketch G for further details of the electron-gun assembly that is installed in the neck of the tricolor-picture tube.


When the back cover is in place, the rearpanel supplementary controls appear as in sketch F. The average color-TV-set owner will leave these to his serviceman. Students and experimenters will find interesting data on the adjustment of these supplementary controls in the manual. These supplementary controls need adjustment so infrequently as to be negligible. The three-position area-selector switch allows you to adapt the receiver to your location.


A color, as compared to monochrome, signal contains a number of additional signals which must reach the receiver for



good color reproduction. Color reception requires a broad-band type of antenna. Narrow-band, single-channel antennas are unsatisfactory. In strong-signal areas, indoor antennas often give good color reception; however outdoor broad-band types are best. 

doorway so that from the door I can switch on a table lamp. The other contacts in the outlet remain "hot" at all times.

Other lighting is provided by incandescent lamps or fluorescent tubes recessed above ceiling panels of corrugated plastic.

My ceiling consists of four-by-four-foot panels of glass-fiber insulating material spray-painted a pleasing light shade. These rest on the lower flanges of the I-beams and on steel straps that divide the areas between the I-beams into appropriate spaces.

There is a 12-inch space above the ceiling which represents the depth of the I-beams. All the wiring for the house as well as the gas pipes for heating and cooking run in this space through small holes cut in the beams. All hot and cold-water piping may also be placed above the ceiling. If one of the overhead utilities ever requires service you can reach it simply by lifting out one of the ceiling panels.

For heating I used counterflow forceddraft gas-fired heating furnaces at two locations. Hot air from the furnaces circulates through large perimeter ducts along the outside edges of the floor slab.

The exterior of the house is painted with a plastic coating that was developed to stand up under severe industrial and chemical conditions. It is expected to last several times longer than most ordinary house paints. For the interior I selected a vinyl-resin coating that is available in numerous decorators' colors.

I used cork tile on much of the concrete floor slab, vinyl-tile flooring in the kitchen and bathroom areas and carpets in the bedrooms. Wall paneling in the dining area is another new product. It consists of wide, thin strips of walnut veneer woven together in a diamond pattern and then compressed flat in a press.

Other features of the house include clothes hampers that are built into the walls and that have enough room for large amounts of soiled clothes, gas-stove and oven-broiler units that are built right into the kitchen cabinets with an automatic timer for the oven, sliding wardrobe doors that extend all the way up to the ceiling and a front-door peephole with a swivel eyepiece so that all parts of the front entrance can be viewed.

Kitchen and bathroom tile has striking designs that were created by the silkscreen process, then baked in permanently by firing in a kiln. Another attraction is a rotating platform in the cabinets alongside the fireplace. A table-top television set on

this platform can be turned so it can be seen from the living room, from out-ofdoors or from the dining area.

The house has some 2250 square feet of heated living area. When an additional 265 square feet are added (half the area of the garage and porches) for estimating purposes, the house cost \$14 per square foot to build. This figure includes all normal profits for the contractors, but does not include the price of the land or the cost of architects' plans or financing.

By eliminating the remote-control garage-door operator, the budget set aside for landscaping and for draperies and by other economies, this house could be built for \$12.50 per square foot. Constructionwise it would be no different.

The steel-pipe columns, I-beams and the other materials are available in all parts of the United States, so a house like this can be built anywhere. In extremely rigorous climates the cost might rise a few cents a square foot because of extra floor insulation and a larger-capacity heating plant.

You can build as large a house or as small a house as you want with this construction system. Practically any floor plan can be adapted to it. Its basic principle is a four-foot module (the width of the exterior wall panels) and costs are kept down when this module is followed. Unless you have had considerable experience in steel fabrication and erection this is not the kind of building that the average "do it yourself" home builder can put together. It calls for a portable welding and cutting outfit and the knowledge of how to use these tools.

There's one thing about a house like this that's an actual handicap: It is so novel in appearance, especially when the steel frame is standing by itself, that people passing by just can't help stopping in to ask questions. Time is money and that runs up the costs. And some craftsmen and subcontractors are lost at first. Plumbing drains, for instance, have to be laid out with care ahead of time, before the floor is poured or the partitions are erected.

Too, carpenters and electricians find that they can't nail into the overhead beams as usual. Then they learn that wonders can be done with a welding torch. With the portable electric-welding outfit you not only weld the house frame together, you tack onto it all the brackets and clamps that the subcontractors require. With the same torch you cut holes through the steel just where they are needed.

Memmler spent a couple of years working out all these details and the final result is a house that's a masterpiece of construction.

the seams. The front of the blimp contains a large faceplate of half-inch optical glass, and that serves as a window for the lens. Behind the camera another port in the blimp allows the cameraman to read the footage indicator on the camera.

By means of remote controls on the outside of the blimp, the cameraman can start and stop the camera, change focus and diaphragm setting, adjust his view-finder lens and make all the other changes required.

The neutral-buoyancy feature is provided by a complete aqua-lung unit similar to those worn by the cameramen and technicians. Operated by water pressure, a valve automatically admits air into the blimp from a compressed-air storage cylinder when the camera is moved downward in the water.

Four hollow buoyancy tubes on top of the CinemaScope camera (two for the lighter, wide-screen camera) are used as stabilizers that normally keep the camera upright when under water. Arnold provided each unit with a battery-powered propeller so it could move along under its own power while the cameraman swam or walked beside it.

Complete with its cameras and lenses, each neutral-buoyancy blimp cost \$22,000. Both have performed so well that MGM is thinking about making more underwater movies, some of which may be filmed below the surface in their entirety.




#### Motorized Snow Shovel

Shoveling snow is almost fun when you use a motorized snow shovel. The unit is equipped with a 1/4-horsepower electric motor that uses household current and travels at the rate of 24 feet per minute. The 36-pound unit is given the necessary traction by the operator, who steps on a foot plate each time a "bite" is taken. Tilting the handle regulates the distance between blade and sidewalk. Heavy snow and ice are easily broken up and pushed away by the machine, according to the manufacturer, who also recommends its use in cleaning industrial waste from factory floors. Attachments for edging and cultivating soon will be manufactured.

Anglers can make their own fishing rods with kits that contain all the necessary parts including tubular glass-fiber shafts. Several different models of casting, spinning and fly rods are available. The angler assembles the parts, wrapping the guides and cementing the ferrules and rod tip in place.
