Life on a Russian Warship

Russian navy ships even "smell different," reports British artist, George H. Davis, who inspected the soviet cruisers Ordzhonikidze and Sverdlov as well as destroyers of the Skoryi class when they visited England recently. After his visit aboard the ships, Mr. Davis prepared for Popular Mechanics the drawings presented on pages 148-151.

"The ships are very well found and very clean," the artist writes us, "though the 'smell' of the ship is different to that of a British ship." Having visited many foreign vessels, he asserts that each one has its distinctive smell.

His report to PM brought interesting comments on life aboard a soviet warship.

"In the big cruisers of the Sverdlov class," says Mr. Davis, "the officers are accommodated amidships; there are two and four-berth cabins just as comfortable as those in American or British ships.

"The crewmen eat and sleep in their main quarters forward and aft. Russian





seamen sleep in cot beds which fold to the walls. The petty officers have comfortable recreation rooms and cabins. There is, of course, considerable political propaganda in the Propaganda and Recreation Hall.

"Both officers and men are well fed and the big galley that feeds the crew and the smaller one for the officers have to supply the wants of 1050 officers and men.

"The sailors are called at 6 o'clock, do physical training at 6:15 and breakfast at 7. At 8 a.m. the whole crew turns out for the hoisting of the flag. For the rest of the morning they go about their various duties including scrubbing of the wooden decks (using a primitive type of birch broom). At noon the bugle calls the men to their main midday meal consisting of an excellent three-course lunch. Unlike the British navy (but like that of the United States) the ships are 'dry'; that is, no intoxicating liquor is used in men's quarters or wardroom. There are, however, soft drinks to be bought and of course the beloved ice cream. After dinner there is a so-called 'rest period,' then more work until 5 p.m. and at 6, supper is served. After supper those not on necessary duties are able to do more or less as they please within the scope of discipline; instrument playing and dancing are popular recreations and chess is popular with the older men."

Mr. Davis noted that the Russian sailors are not large, heavy men as often thought to be the typical Russian physique, most of the seamen actually being lightweight and five feet six to nine inches in height. He described the vessels as "happy ships" and was amused to observe that the commander always addressed the men as "Comrades," and when the petty officers met him in the morning they first saluted and then shook his hand.

Aboard the big cruisers Mr. Davis saw a large number of cadet "officers in the making," distinguished by a peaked cap instead of the sailor's round cap with black back ribbons. He commented on the extreme "bagginess" of the officers' trousers which "certainly does not add to the smartness of their uniforms."



Hundreds of scientific tests have been made on this substance by the Institute of Oceanography of the University of British Columbia and by the Pacific Fisheries Experimental Station of the Fisheries Research board of Canada. It is amber-colored both as a solid and a liquid, with a melting point of 50 degrees F. Chemical analysis has shown it to be essentially a wax (fatty alcohols combined with fatty acids), but with only a trace of the glycerides typical of fish and marine-animal oils or of the hydrocarbons inherent in the petroleums. It cannot even be stated whether it is of animal, vegetable or mineral origin.

Among the theories that have been advanced and rejected for substantial reasons are: 1. That it is derivative from sperm or other animal oils; 2. That it is decomposed ambergris; 3. That it is the remains of rotting explosives; 4. That it is a product of decomposed local trees, washed down by the mountain rivers; 5. That it comes from a seaweed.

A similarity in the chemical composition of this peculiar substance and that of the seeds of certain of the sagebrush family of California and Nevada has raised speculation as to whether, possibly, the remains of semitropical vegetation from some former geological era lie rotting in the deep ocean trough of Bute Inlet.



Submarine Hull Sections Are Automatically Welded Together



Huge 20 to 60-ton sections of the hull of the Nautilus were buttwelded together by a new welding process developed for the job. The sections of the hull were mounted on rollers and revolved under a stationary automatic-welding machine. Three passes on the machine over a 100-hour period were sufficient to complete the joining of the sections. The same job done by older methods would have required 300 hours of labor. The process was also used on the second atomic submarine, the Seawolf, and will be used on the Skate, third atomic submarine to be built.




Direction Finder in Subway



Space Thermometer

Scientists can take the temperature of the moon or of a manmade satellite with a tripod instrument no bigger than a large camera. The Radiometer, developed by Barnes Engineering Co., collects infrared radiation from the object and converts the received energy into electrical signals that can be translated into a temperature reading. Preliminary uncorrected readings of the moon showed it to be 248 degrees Fahrenheit on its sunlit portion and minus 302 on its dark portion. Earthly studies can also be made of rockets and missiles in flight, of speeding tires and fragile objects like electrical filaments that can't be touched.

Color Radar for Ships

Ship-radar operators often have difficulty during rough weather in separating nearby ships from the reflection of the sea on their scopes. To remedy this situation, David Sunstein, of Cynwyd, Pa., has invented a color radar system, based on the principle that signals reflected from a target such as a ship are ordinarily of greater amplitude than those reflected from land masses or the sea. Taking advantage of this difference, the inventor has made a radarscope which shows the target in one color and the surrounding environment in another, making it easy for the operator to pick out the ship's reflection in the sea.

Tracer radioisotopes were used in studies at the Rock Island Arsenal to give fast and accurate measurements of the rate of wear of a machine-tool bit.







BACK IN MARCH 1954, an unfamiliar word cropped up in the headlines. On that day a small island in the Pacific was sucked into the ugly fireball of a hydrogen bomb. Scientists found that the island fell to earth as radioactive particles. An area of 14,000 square miles was so contaminated with this radioactive dust that it was temporarily unsafe for human habitation. This island that fell from the sky in a rain of radioactivity was called fallout.

Since that day, everyone from teen-agers in soda fountains to diplomats in secret halls have discussed the effects of fallout. As the word has become more familiar, it somehow has become more sinister and mysterious.

Yet there's little mystery about fallout. Scientists and Civil Defense officials know a great deal about it, and are determined to spread that knowledge as far as possible. They realize that people who know the facts on fallout will respond intelligently to the problems fallout creates. Here are their answers to basic questions:

Just what is fallout, anyway?

When a hydrogen bomb explodes, the parts of the bomb itself are blown into highly radioactive dust. Other dust particles in the air are also made radioactive. If the fireball touches the ground, tons of earth and debris are sucked up into it and made radioactive. These particles, most of them so small they are invisible, spear upward into the mushroom cloud as high as 25 miles. As they are carried downwind, they gradually fall back to earth. The settling of these radioactive particles on the earth's surface is called fallout.

After the bomb explodes, how soon does this radioactive rain start falling?

Some particles from the explosion early in 1954 no doubt are still drifting through the stratosphere. However, almost all the particles fall within a period of several hours. Consider the 1954 test: At a point 170 miles from ground zero, the fallout began about eight hours after the burst and continued for several more hours.

How far do the particles travel?


It depends on several factors, such as the size of the bomb, the height of the explosion, the velocity of the winds at all levels up to 80,000 feet and the weather conditions. An air burst, for example, causes negligible fallout because only the products of the bomb itself, plus particles naturally in the air, become radioactive. A ground burst draws up a great amount of radioactive debris. The size of the particles and the velocity of the wind determine how far the dust will travel. Rain causes the particles to fall at a faster rate, producing a rainout.

Fallout particles may travel clear around the earth. But if you consider only the danger area—the area where fallout can have serious to lethal effects—then you can calculate some fairly precise answers. Consider the 1954 test again: In a cigar-shaped belt about 140 miles long and 20 miles wide, the radiation would have been fatal to most persons remaining there for 24 to 48 hours.

Why specify "24 to 48 hours"?

A couple of reasons. In the first place, the longer a human being is exposed to radiation, the more damage is done. Just think of it in terms of a sunburn.

In the second place, the radioactivity of these fallout particles declines with the passage of time. The rate of this "decay" depends upon the type of particle, and there are about 90 different radioactive "species" created by the bomb. Some become harmless in a fraction of a second, but others may remain dangerous for

hundreds of years. Fortunately, most of these radioactive species decay fairly rapidly. The rate of radiation one hour after the burst in an area of intense fallout concentration is extremely dangerous. Twenty-three hours later, as little as two percent of that radiation may remain.

What about those "radioactive fish"?

As indicated above, a very small percentage of this radioactive debris has an extremely long life. It's possible, though very unlikely, that a fish would take up one of these long-life particles. It's even more unlikely that a fisherman would catch that particular fish in the vastness of the ocean. Unlikely, but possible.

Can long-life particles be produced deliberately?

Yes, indeed, which is the reason, in addition to its awesome power, that the H-bomb can be such a terrible weapon. For example, the bomb can be encased in strontium. Radioactive strontium has a half-life of approximately 28 years (half its power will be gone in that length of time), so the stuff would continue to be dangerous for several generations.

What's the principal danger from these radiations?


In large doses they are fatal. In smaller doses they can produce lifelong disabilities.

During the recent H-bomb tests, rockets penetrated radioactive cloud to pick up information on fallout

But even in still smaller doses they may have a profound effect. Though they may seem to have no effect on a person, they may alter his reproductive genes, causing harmful mutations to be passed on to his children. They, in turn, will inevitably pass them on to their children, and so on.

Is there any chance that weapons tests will increase radioactivity in the atmosphere to a point where it is dangerous?

Radioactivity is measured in roentgens. Total radiation over the first 30 years of a person's life should be kept to 10 roentgens, according to the Genetics Committee of the National Academy of Sciences. On the average, the committee says, we now receive 4.3 roentgens from natural radiation and 3 or 4 roentgens from medical X-rays in 30 years. It further states that we definitely have been receiving increased radiation from fallout as a result of weapons tests during the past five years. However, this increase is not dangerous at its present rate. According to the committee, it could be dangerous if weapons tests were stepped up considerably.


Has anyone made specific studies of fallout—from bomb tests —in the United States?

Yes. The AEC maintains a fallout-monitoring network of some 88 stations throughout the world, including 26 in the United States. (Incidentally, this network is one way government officials learn of secret bomb tests in Russia.)

The AEC recently released a report based on figures from these monitoring stations. The report shows that the gamma dose (the type of radiation that can alter the genes and thereby affect heredity) from fallout is about three percent of the gamma dose from natural sources.

The total fallout, including all types of fission products, is measured in millicuries. The report shows that the highest accumulation has been at Grand Junction, Colo., with 740 millicuries per square mile. The lowest recorded accumulation was in Nigeria with 33 millicuries per square mile.

Soap Made in One Hour Instead of Eight Days


Automation has come to soap manufacturing via a process developed in Sweden. Conventional methods take from eight days to two weeks to make soap. With the new process, soap of high uniform quality is made in less than 60 minutes. Raw material is fed into the bottom of a specially designed centrifuge and saponification takes place in about 20 minutes. Then the soap is passed on through four stages in which it is washed, electrolyte added and spent lye is removed. Solid impurities are continuously removed during the process. Coloring and other ingredients are added.

Clock in a Bottle


Using a method that he has evolved for putting models into bottles, Norman D. Brookes of Luton, England, has constructed and assembled a battery-driven electric clock inside a gallon jug. Using parts designed to pass through the one-inch-diameter neck, he first assembled the clock outside the bottle so that it could be timed and adjusted before it was taken apart and reassembled in the bottle with the aid of surgical forceps and special screwdrivers. The project took a year to complete.






Roll-Up Sides Speed Loading

Two men with lift trucks can load a new 10door boxcar in 10 minutes. Five doors on each side roll up out of the way like overhead garage doors to permit direct loading by the trucks. Hand loading of the conventional boxcar requires 10 to 16 hours, so the car only averages two hours of traveling time out of the 24. The new five-compartment car is expected to average at least 6 out of 24 hours, thereby doing the work of three standard boxcars. Elimination of unnecessary handling cuts freight damage. The multiple compartments reduce the shifting of cargo in transit and permit segregation of shipments as to items and destination. The car, not yet in pro-duction, has floors, ceilings, bulkheads, walls and door panels made of a strong, lightweight plastic sandwich.

Surgery Sponges

Surgical sponges made of dextran, a derivative of sugar, can safely be left inside a patient to be absorbed after they have stopped the blood or kept a therapeutic agent at a given point.

Pressed Oyster Shells Form Wall Panels

MOTHER-OF-PEARL wall panels are made of specially prepared oyster shells fastened to a thin backing. This iridescent paneling is applied like wallpaper. The panels were developed originally by Irving Kay of New York as a specialty product for high-priced decorators, but he has recently gone into quantity production. Imported from Australia, the oyster shells are first soaked for many days, then flattened in huge hydraulic presses, burnished and trimmed. The pearly disks are then fitted individually to a base material and set in adhesive. After several days, the rough panels are trimmed to size and the surfaces smoothed over. Through the application of heat and other processes, the panels can be formed to any shape. Aside from wall use, the material is effective as a furniture inlay or for automobile interiors. The biggest wall to be covered with the paneling is in the lobby of the Fontainebleau Hotel in Miami. This project cost \$150,000. The paneling, called KappaShell, sells for \$6 a square foot. It is used in President Eisenhower's personal plane and in the homes of many celebrities. The company's latest job in Europe is a room in Prince Rainier's Monaco palace.

Chrysler Family Makes Debut

CHRYSLER'S style theme for 1957 is the dart or wedge. These all-new, freshly styled beauties have a definite airplanish look with down-pointing noses and up-pointing tails. Let's look at them in order.

The Imperial offers a convertible for the first time. Its hardtop models have distinctive landau-type roofs of stepped-up design that give them a "Park Avenue" look.







Four headlights are optional. Windshields are double wrapped, being curved vertically as well as horizontally. Windows in the doors are also curved, swinging upward and inward.

Tailfins are emphasized by a sharply sloping rear-deck lid (which the buyer can get with a simulated spare-tire cover embossed on it). There are no up-sticking taillights on Imperial fenders this year. Instead the gunsight theme has been worked into the trailing edge of the fenders themselves. Tailfins are getting so high these days that to mount taillights atop them would raise the lights almost to roof level!

Over-all height of the Imperial has been reduced three inches without sacrificing headroom. Seat height is reduced, however; especially the front seat, which is lower by 2.6 inches.

The car is actually more than five inches shorter than last year. Wheelbase is down to 129 inches, over-all width is increased by 2.4 inches and front overhang reduced 2.4 inches.

Fourteen-inch wheels are standard (this is true on all Chrysler Corporation cars).


Engine displacement is 392 cubic inches. It develops 325 horsepower.

Chrysler Adds Series




Horsepowers are as follows: Windsor 285 horsepower; Saratoga 295; New Yorker 325.

The Chrysler frame is longer this year, although wheelbase is unchanged at 126 inches. The following innovations are common to the whole line: Torsion-bar front springs; ball-joint front suspension and antidive braking; renewable paper filters in air cleaners; step-down design to provide lower center of gravity and added headroom; flush-mounted air intakes at base of windshield; centerplane brakes;

dash-mounted rear-view mirrors to eliminate a dangerous blind spot; horizontal placement of spare tires in trunk of all except station wagons, and larger, sharply raked windshields.






Chevrolet Gets Fins, Optional Fuel Injection

BIG NEWS at Chevrolet is mechanical. For the first time, fuel injection is offered (at extra cost, to be sure) on a low-price production model.

Whether the price of the injection system (unknown at this writing) will scare buyers away is anybody's guess, but it will boost V8 output to 283 horsepower or one horsepower per cubic inch, a remarkable ratio for a production engine.


Style changes are less exciting. Bold tailfins have been added and front grille and bumper are more impressive. Over-all, the cars are 2½ inches longer, but extended fenders, front and rear, make it seem longer. Bodies are lower by more than an inch and 14-inch wheels are standard.

The new triple-turbine automatic transmission features a variable-pitch stator plus a hill retarder that provides braking during downhill runs. This transmission, Chevrolet claims, delivers nearly twice the torque multiplication of a standard converter and shifts without jerks.

Fresh air is taken into the passenger compartment through intakes directly above each headlight, eliminating the slot at the base of the windshield. Ducts carry the air along the fenders into openings at



Fuel injection and carburetion differ in that an injection system squirts gasoline into the manifold at the intake valve of each cylinder, assuring even distribution. In a carburetor system, gasoline is mixed with air at a central point (the carburetor) and the mixture sucked into the cylinders through long and restricted passages, resulting in starvation of some cylinders.



LOW, THAT'S THE WORD for the 1957 Ford. If you require proof, look at the photograph at the top of the page. That man has both feet on the ground!

Fairlane models (like the four-door hardtop above) are four inches lower than in 1956. Custom models are three inches lower. To do this, Ford uses a flared frame, step-down in rear, sharply offset rear axle.

They are all longer, too. Fairlanes are nine inches longer, Customs three inches longer.

There are two wheelbases this year. The Fairlane series has 118-inch wheelbase (2½ inches more than 1956) and the others have 116-inch wheelbase (½ inch more

than 1956).

Horsepower continues upward. Tops in the Ford line is a 245-horsepower V8 available on all models. Also available are the 212-horsepower V8, 190-horsepower V8 and 144-horsepower six.

Styling changes are striking and represent the most complete change since the war. Total cost of tooling, development and introduction is said to be \$209,000,000.

Fairlane models feature boldly sculp-






tured ribs that flare out from the center of the body ending above large circular taillights (which are about the only characteristically Ford part in the new styling). Custom models have similar styling, but more subdued lines.

Flatter front fenders and a much lower hood (which, incidentally, is hinged at the forward edge for safety and better en-

gine access) combine to give the car a road-hugging appearance. Windshield shape is changed, the corner posts canting forward sharply. Heater air is drawn through an intake at the base of the windshield.



Mercury Goes All Out

Things are changed at Mercury also. A look at the styling proves it. It is a bold approach that is unmistakably different. But under the sheet metal are the parts that really matter and bold developments are there too.

A unique approach to air suspension is an air-filled doughnut inside which the forward end of the rear spring rides. Mercury engineers say that 80 percent of the rear-end vibrations are transmitted through forward spring hangers. By insulating the springs inside a pair of rubber tires (about the size of baby-buggy tires) they discovered they could keep most of the vibrations out of the body.

These forward hangers also thrust the car forward on acceleration and retard the car during braking. The air-filled rubber (Continued to page 284)

American Motors Gets V8 Across the Board

A MERICAN MOTORS now offers V8 engines in all three—Hudson, Nash and Rambler. For economy buyers, Rambler alone retains a six.

Nash features four headlights, arranged in vertical pairs in the fenders (grille-

WHILE YOU ADMIRE the 1957 automotive beauties (many of which are in this issue), here's something to think about:

You can now drive on toll roads from New York to the outskirts of Chicago without seeing a single stop light. And you're not allowed to drive over 70 miles per hour legally anywhere along the way. In fact, only in certain parts of Pennsylvania can you hit 70. Most of the way, the limit is 65 (Ohio and Indiana) and 60 (New Jersey).

So what? you ask. Here's the point: With no stop lights, how can you demonstrate the remarkable acceleration of your new 300-horsepower beauty? With these speed limits, where can you let the power plant stretch its muscles? With broad, multilane highways all the way where will you use the fast-passing ability for darting in and out of traffic? Your 300-horsepower beauty (and perhaps you, too) will arrive at your destination utterly frustrated!

Yet engines get bigger, horsepowers higher. It's a strange business!

Prices Are Up

Industry observers, who have a hunch that customers will resist the higher prices on 1957 cars, feel that this could result in a less frenzied sales market. The reason? They feel manufacturers will cut back production to prevent big inventories.

They see no chance of manufacturers cutting prices. Nor will dealers cut margins to absorb increases. Because dealers have fewer 1956 models to unload, their chances of making money next year are said to be improved. And that is without figuring on a boom year in sales.

General Motors seems to be taking a somewhat restrained attitude toward the competitive struggle for sales. As a result, Ford and Chrysler may pick up a few percentage points in the 1957 scramble.

Right now, General Motors is selling over 50 percent of the market and that's about as big a piece as is considered proper at this moment. Restraint in merchandising (such as, for example, the absence of a 1957 Motorama) by GM might also give the independents a chance to improve their position.

Better Quality Controls

One result of the dealers' revolt against factory practices was a guarantee by the companies to pay dealers the full cost of new-car preparation and repair services during warranty periods. To keep such charges from becoming astronomical, manufacturers are expected to clamp down on quality control on the assembly line and in parts manufacturing. The real winner in this clamp-down is, of course, you—the customer. Your 1957 car should be better made than those of recent years.

Making predictions can be dangerous because nothing is definite until the car is on the street. Here are some examples of

quick switches in recent weeks:


One car was set for a new automatic transmission. It was to have plenty of pick-up plus unparalleled smoothness. Factory engineers worked out drawings, photographers took pictures, everything was set to publicize this new achievement. Then, without warning, the whole thing was canceled. Lots of words had to be "eaten" (and rewritten) and pictures discarded.

Another car had its engineers sitting up nights figuring out a neat, compact solution to the spare-tire problem. They came up with a lightweight, easy-to-use tire that was carried deflated in a small box in one corner of the trunk. Provisions for quick inflation were perfected. The thing worked fine. Engineers beamed. Pictures were taken. Then, bang, the project was tossed out the window.

Here's another example: One 1957 car had most of its publicity artwork completed at great expenditure of time and money. Suddenly the boss decided to get rid of an important piece of trim—a piece that is as obvious as a fat man in a jockey room. (It, incidentally, has been part of the car for many years—can you guess which car it is?) His decision meant throwing away piles of photographs and starting over.

That's the sort of thing that goes on in every company right up until announcement day. It's no wonder the press agents have a weary look at this time of year.

Rumor is that Pontiac will bring out an expensive sports-type car with plenty of horsepower and, no doubt, fuel injection. Chevrolet's optional fuel injection, by the way, was one of the industry's best-guarded secrets. The day the news leaked out, one top engineer in the division confessed it was as new to him as to the inquiring reporters!

Weird-Looking Hot Rods Compete in Drag Races

Some of the oddest-looking cars in the world show up at the National Championship Drag Races. These souped-up, cut-down hand-fabricated speedsters resemble the automobiles that most citizens drive only in that they have four wheels. Everything else has been modified in the interest of speed. The only other consideration designers keep in mind is the safety regulations set up by the National Hot Rod Association, requiring roll bars and other forms of protection for the driver in the event of an accident. These cars may be weird, but they are fast.

Front car is of "slingshot" design, with driver behind rear wheels. Rear car is 1932 Ford with Cadillac engine, Hydra-Matic






Lawn Sweeper For Tiny Tractor



Electric Line Gives Way to Diesels as GIANT BLOWERS COOL CASCADE TUNNEL





ENDING nearly half a century of electrified operations in the Cascade Mountains, a unique engine-cooling system has been put into operation at the longest railroad tunnel in the Western Hemisphere, allowing heavily loaded, diesel-driven trains to move uphill through the eight-mile bore. The ventilating scheme, costing \$650,000, blows outdoor air into the long tunnel through big fans installed behind a steel door in the east portal.

Railroad men say there's nothing like it in the world.

Until the ventilation problem was solved last summer, the Great Northern Railroad was required to employ a 74-mile electri-

fied zone in the high mountains between Wenatchee, Wash., on the east slope, and Skykomish, Wash., on the west, to drive its heavy freight trains through the bore.


Basic units in the ventilation system are two six-foot fans, each powered by an 800-horsepower electric motor and turning at 1150 revolutions per minute. A special control station and powerhouse has been erected near the east portal to house the motors, electric switches and control mechanism.

The east portal of the tunnel has been reconstructed to house a steel drop door which prevents the air blast from circulating out the near portal and back to the fans. When a heavy-tonnage freight train enters the west portal of the 41,152-foot tunnel, the operator engages the master control, closing the east portal door and starting one of the fans, which forces approximately 220,000 cubic feet of air per minute against the oncoming train.

Prior to ventilating the tunnel, diesel operation of full-tonnage trains was not practical because of overheating of engines. Lighter trains do not require assistance from the cooling system, and all trains westbound downgrade operate without the fans. After a train has passed through the tunnel in either direction, both fans are operated to change completely the air within the bore.


Automatic features of the tunnel include a switch which opens the door and turns off the fans when a train approaches within 3250 feet of the closed portal. A stop signal is provided in the event the door should fail to open. ***

ESEARCH at the University of Houston may turn out to be of great importance to the farmer. Laron Golden and .C. B. Johnson, shown at right, are using radioactivity to study the role of phosphorus in plant growth. Phosphorus is one of the essential elements because no plant can grow without it. Yet it readily "marries" many other elements in the soil, making it unavailable to plants. Johnson and Golden are using radioactive fertilizer to check how much phosphate is taken up by plants within a given period. So far their tests indicate that it is best to place phosphate fertilizer in concentrated bands to prevent all of it from being lost by "marriage" to other elements.



in the Classroom

IN A CLASSROOM in Sauk Rapids, Minn., the engineers and designers of the future are already at work building the machines of their era. The instructor responsible for this forward-looking activity is Alfred Lease, industrial arts teacher, who believes in encouraging the imagination of his students.

Backed by his encouragement, the class has produced such items as "Lease's Lemon," a flying saucer with a 51/2-foot diameter, operated by torque, that really flies; a glider-helicopter, built of around-the-shop parts, which actually flies when towed by a car at a speed of 23 miles per hour; and, Herbert Watt, a mechanical man who walks, talks, hears, drinks and does other amazing things.

The flying-saucer frame is made of balsa wood and is powered by two electric motors. Operated by a remote-control panel, the saucer rises vertically on both motors spins when one of the motors is slowed up. The development of the device is so simple that Lease wonders how it has been overlooked. "Torque power is cheap," he says. "It's surprising that not too many have used it before."

The helicopter was made from commercially supplied plans and built from available parts such as the %-inch pipe used for the frame. Towed by a car at 23 miles an hour, it is released for its gliding flights.

Herbert Watt, the robot, is the second mechanical man to come from this classroom, and is a very capable fellow. He is operated by remote control.


Frame of flying saucer shown at top of page is made of balsa wood and parts of a



SHIPS OF ALL AGES

IF YOU ARE a newcomer in Paris, one of the first places you are likely to go is the Place du Trocadero to enjoy the wonderful view of the Eiffel Tower and the wide panorama of the city.


Beside you, as you stand looking at the sight, are the two majestic wings of the Palais de Chaillot, curving out like halves

of a gigantic, broken horseshoe.

The acres within these wings house four unusual museums and a number of other things. Among the "other things," on the top floor of the west wing, is perhaps the smallest and most versatile shipyard in

When I visited this extraordinary place recently, the finishing touches were being put on a 14,000-ton aircraft carrier; a beautiful galley was at the halfway stage; the rigging was being repaired on an obsolete "floating battery"; the seats were being fitted into a lifeboat; and three Breton fishing smacks had just been completed.

This and other activities were being carried out by a chief and 15 craftsmen. Everything, of course, was in miniature, Fine detail shows up on La Royale, a Venetian galley that carried 378 rowers, 150 sailors and 200 soldiers

for this "shipyard" was the neat, airy little workshop that makes the admirable model vessels exhibited two floors below in the French Navy's famous Musee de la Marine, or Naval Museum.

The aircraft carrier, a 1500 scale model of the Arromanches (formerly the British Colossus), had been covered with a plastic hood while its 35 pieces of artillery were being made. At various benches, workers were busy fashioning tiny bits of gear with a watchmaker's precision. Before them were midget "lumber piles" of boxwood, maple and basswood. Their tools were few—mainly a jigsaw, some sharp little knives, a bit of sandpaper that served as a plane,

and a bottle of glue that did the work of nails, screws, bolts and rivets.

Craftsmen Are Authorities

Several of these craftsmen, I learned, are authorities on naval archaeology and students of the innumerable 18th-century treatises on sails, rigging, shipbuilding, naval artillery and marine history. Some are regular sailors, others civilian specialists from the navy yards at Brest and Toulouse.


In this pleasant workshop they have recaptured something that is becoming more and more rare—the old-time artisan's love of his craft, his pride in work well done. Here time doesn't count; neither does profit or loss. A job must be done perfectly, whether it requires a month or two years. Roughly speaking, it takes as long for this workshop to turn out a model as it would for a real shipyard to produce the original.

The making of a model starts with detailed plans of the entire craft and its visible gear, drawn rigorously to scale by the workshop's chief, Marcel Caudrelier. To draft the plans of a ship when a model exists is not a superhuman feat, although it is a meticulous one. Similarly with a ship of which the full-scale plans are available. But many of the models are made for the first time, and often part or all of the plans have disappeared or cannot be obtained.

In such cases, Caudrelier gathers every document he can find—photographs, drawings or paintings, written descriptions, partial plans, anything that may yield a little information.

When these have been assembled his real work starts. Not only must he draw the over-all plans of the vessel, but he must prepare detailed plans of every part, and often whole sets of plans for a single accessory.


I got some idea of the incredible labor involved when he showed me a tiny gun to be placed on the deck of a warship. Although the gun was only about an inch high and the barrel not much bigger around than a pin, 37 separate pieces were required for its construction, and each of these pieces called for a detailed plan about six inches square.

Here's a cross section of the bathysphere in which a pair of French naval experts made a record descent of 13,500 feet









The many problems that come up in reproducing microscopic objects have long since been solved. The museum's special paint, maquettine, spreads over the tiniest parts without gumming, and the workshop manufactures the string-thick rope used in the rigging. The rope has the same number of strands and the same diameter, in scale, as the original.


Every portion of a "collection model" is made by hand but, in the case of "series models," when a lifesaver, a piece of artillery or any other accessory is to be repeated several times, the work is simplified by manufacturing the necessary number of plastic copies from a handmade prototype. On the model of the prewar French battleship Richelieu (scale 1600), there are no less than 317 plastic accessories.

The museum's workshop "mass produces" certain models in series of 10. The (Continued to page 242)



ALGAE

ENGINEER SCIENTISTS at the University of California are studying a new food that has some fantastic properties.


It costs nothing, or less than nothing, to raise.

It can be grown at the rate of 30 to 40 tons per acre per year, as against an average of less than two tons per acre, dry weight, for field crops.

It is more than 50 percent protein. In fact it is higher in protein, fat and vitamin content than any other vegetable substance except a few seeds.

It is grown in tanks or ponds yet requires less than a hundredth of the water used in ordinary agriculture to produce an equal amount of protein.

It is a good energy food for humans although it is looked upon mainly as a food supplement for domestic animals. Chicks gain weight by more than four percent per day on it. Pigs and cattle thrive when it is

added to ordinary cellulose feed. Dogs and cats love it.

Produced in either powder or pellet form, it is dark green, almost black, in color. It has a flavor something like grass or alfalfa.

This remarkable substance consists of algae that are grown in sewage ponds, then harvested and dried. Algae are common unicellular plants, comparable to a "scum," that grow in warm, quiet waters. They not only flourish in sewage ponds, they aid in converting the sewage into water that can be used in irrigation, industry or, after filtering and chlorination, as drinking water.

The story of algae as a food is one in which two different branches of science contributed their findings to reach some brand-new conclusions.

About 10 years ago research people who were studying photosynthesis became excited over the efficiency with which some green algae use sunlight for growth. Dr. H. A. Spoehr, of the Carnegie Institution, and others made precise studies with the

strain known as chlorella. They found that chlorella has high food value and that it grows rapidly in sunlight when supplied with carbon dioxide and nutrients. Pilot plants were built and many of the problems in growing and harvesting were studied.

Large chlorella farms were envisioned for sunny desert regions on land that was otherwise of little value. Using little water, such a farm would grow its algae in plastic tubes laid on the ground or on the roofs of buildings. Circulating the algae cultures through the tubes, and harvesting the product would all be automatic.

Recently engineers of the Arthur D. Little Company of Cambridge, Mass., surveyed the financial aspects of these proposals. The engineers based their studies on a hypothetical 100-acre farm that would use some 63 acres as growth areas.

Counting all the automatic machinery, it was estimated that the 100-acre farm would cost \$3,220,000. The farm would produce some 35 tons of dry algae per acre per year

at a cost of 25 cents per pound. With certain economies and further research it was thought that this cost could be reduced and that the algae could be produced at a profit if sold at 25 cents per pound.

However, some cheap proteins such as yeast cost even less. The final conclusions of the engineers were that commercially grown algae can't compete with cheaper proteins at present, but that eventually the algae may become a major factor in the world's food supply.

Meanwhile some entirely different studies were being made at the University of California. Harold B. Gotaas, professor of




Extracting algae from water with separator, above, is not as economical as chemical precipitation method


sanitary engineering, Wm. J. Oswald, assistant research engineeer, and Clarence Golueke, assistant research biologist, teamed up to investigate a phenomenon that sometimes occurs in sewage ponds. These ponds are areas in which sewage is stored until natural bacterial action has converted wastes into harmless materials.

It had been observed that in some ponds the conversion process took place much more rapidly than in others. These special ponds had one thing in common: All of them supported flourishing growths of green algae. It was speculated that the

Model of a pilot plant designed for use in desert areas where algae would be produced with a minimum of water






Ramjet Helicopter Rotor Chases Frost From Citrus Groves


Frost is kept from 10 to 15 acres of citrus trees by a ramjet helicopter rotor mounted on a 35-foot tower. The small rotor-tip jet engines release heat to warm the air as they turn the rotor to create an air blast. The cylindrical tower acts as a standpipe to hold 680 gallons of fuel oil or gasoline to feed the ramjets at a maximum rate of 105 gallons per hour. Below 26 degrees, the

rotor would turn almost all the time. The wind machine is operated by touching a starter button, switching on a spark plug and dialing a fuel knob for the desired heat. A truck starter mounted atop the tower revs up the rotor to operating speed. The unit, not in production, was designed by Hiller Helicopter engineer Joseph Beckett.

Sports Timer for Rallies

Auto enthusiasts who take part in rallies will appreciate a mechanical copilot that tells the driver whether he is ahead or behind schedule. There are two dials on the instrument. The driver sets one dial to the average speed he must maintain to keep his schedule. The other dial, consisting of a clock and a third-hand indicator, informs him how much ahead or behind schedule he is at that moment.

Here's How to Split A Giant Redwood




OGGING a redwood forest presents problems not found in forests of smaller trees, the Ladew Timber Company of Orick, Calif., found when they began operations among the giants. Because of the load limits, most redwoods are too large to haul even over our modern highways. They must usually be split and hauled in sections. A truck loaded with a smaller-diameter redwood can sometimes add half of another without being overloaded. The result is a great many trees being split in the woods. Blowing them apart with dynamite, sawing them lengthwise, sledging and hand wedging or picking them up and dropping were methods that not only wasted time, but the split couldn't be controlled and a valuable log might be damaged.

By fabricating a steel wedge and installing it on the rear of a big crawler tractor, these loggers found a simple remedy for this problem. It is made of one-inch by eight-inch steel stock 40 inches long -sharpened to a knife edge. It rotates on a threeinch swivel shaft and is mounted on a U-frame of one by eight-inch steel stock which fits over the shaft of the logging winch. The winch cable is used to lower the wedge into splitting position or raise it out of the way when the tractor is used for other duties. If the winch cable is needed for bringing in logs, it can be unhooked from the wedge.


In operation the redwood to be split is held in the arch of a companion tractor. The wedge is swiveled and can be raised or lowered so the split will occur exactly where required when the wedge is forced into the end of the log.




Nail-On Bricks (Look Authentic

You can "lay" a new brick facing accurately and speedily with hammer and nails. Made of hard-burned ceramic clay, the 23 inch thick veneer comes predrilled for the nails. After the first course is laid, the succeeding courses are self-aligning. The hard. vitrified surface of the brick is impervious to moisture and can be wiped clean as easily as a wall tile. A masonry saw or guillotine cutter is used to make the bricks fit around doors or windows. The joints are automatically sized. Mortar is applied to joints to complete the realistic effect of the ceramic facing.

When framing pictures, you can now employ a special nonreflecting glass that permits better visibility from any angle.

Plastic-Foam Floats are Boat Landings and Swim Rafts

High buoyancy is a feature of a prefabricated marine float made of foam plastic. Each cubic foot of the plastic has a lift factor of 55 pounds. The float, which comes in various sizes, is clad in a wooden shell and is available as a complete unit as well as in knockdown form, assembled from a kit. Five by 10-foot, 6 by 12-foot and 20 by 30-foot floats are being made for use by swimmers and as boat landings. Skids on the bottom ease the job of launching and removing the floats from the water.





Auto Burglar Alarm

Set off by any drastic movement of the car body, a burglar alarm sounds the horn automatically, frightening thieves away. Two mercury switches are used to trigger the alarm. One is mounted to the underside of the hood, the other to the underside of the trunk lid. If either is raised, the horn is set in operation. Should the thief jack up the car to steal a tire or wheel, the alarm sounds. Installation is simple. A dashmounted switch cuts the system when its protection is not needed.

Helicopter-Liner Carries 25 Persons

New York Airways is negotiating with the Bell Aircraft Corporation for delivery of Bell's projected D-216 passenger-carrying helicopter. Now on the drawing boards, the helicopter is designed to carry 25 passengers and all forecasts indicate it will reduce operating costs to about 10 cents per available seat mile. Powered by three gas-turbine engines, the D-216 will provide the first "one engine out" performance for a helicopter, since any two of its three engines will

deliver sufficient power to lift its maximum payload. First deliveries of the D-216 can be made within 36 months after contracts are signed.

Pencil Serves as Gauge

You can use a mechanical pencil made in Germany as a handy gauge to measure the size of bolts and other small objects. The pencil clip fastens to a sliding jaw that snugs up against the object being measured. The pencil, plated in chromium, silver or gilt, has a four-inch measuring scale as well as a metric measuring scale.



Their Job Is to Guard Your Health



YOU MAY NOT REALIZE IT as you go about your daily work, but it's a big job to guard the health of America's working force. Our industry has grown increasingly complex. Whole new industries have blossomed. Men are working with more new materials and chemicals than ever before. And every job in American industry has its hazards.

Protecting the workman's health has become a profession in itself. Whole laboratories, staffed with specialists and equipped with the latest scientific devices, are the scenes of research aimed at making your job safer. Some of these laboratories are operated by industry, some are privately operated, some are government research programs. In Cincinnati, for instance, is the federal government's Occupational Health Field Headquarters, the government's center of industrial-health research for the whole country. Here some 70 physicians, industrial hygienists, chemists, engineers and technicians labor in the search for ways to make industrial jobs safer.

Recently two of the nation's largest railroad companies called on the Department of Health, Education and Welfare to help them solve a problem. Company officials were concerned by an increase in skin poisoning among their shop workers. Sores on hands and arms were causing discomfort and loss of time and efficiency. The request



was passed on by Washington to the field headquarters in Cincinnati.

A few days later a small team of specialists showed up in the shops. After some detective work they traced the trouble to chromate being added to diesel radiators as a rust preventive. The solution is also widely used in air-conditioning systems.

Before they left the scene the industrialhealth specialists had laid down a program to clear up the chromate poisoning. They suggested that the shops substitute a different rust inhibitor, one without chromate. They also recommended that the workmen use a milder cleansing agent on their hands and arms and that they wash more often. As final insurance they suggested protective gloves and sleeves, as well as protective ointments for the workmen exposed to poisons. The trouble was cured.

These specialists are accustomed to measuring and working with infinitesimal amounts of poisons. For instance, if they're measuring carbon monoxide in the air they know that the maximum safe level is 100 parts per million for eight hours' exposure. Rates of poisoning which to the average workman seem harmless are known by industrial-health workers to be hazardous.

The problems these industrial-health specialists cope with come in wide variety. Not long ago Juan A. Gonzalez, of Puerto Rico's Department of Health, shipped off to Cincinnati some seeds from a native plant called Indian licorice. Mr. Gonzalez was worried lest the seeds were poisonous.

And this might well concern him. Native Puerto Rican artisans were fashioning the seeds into costume jewelry, especially earrings, which were being sold to American women. If they were poisonous, both the workers and buyers were taking a chance.

At the Occupational Health Field Headquarters, samples of the highly polished and colorful seeds were fed to rabbits, dogs and rats. Within 24 hours one of the test rabbits was dead and the other animals were seriously ill. Newspapers across the country carried the story and the poisonbearing costume jewelry disappeared from the market.

500 Million Days Lost

But most of their research efforts are aimed at industrial plants, mines and agriculture. As our industrial technology has grown so has our need for better protection for the workman's health. American workmen lose about 500 million man-days a year to sickness and injury. This represents a loss of billions of dollars to both workmen and industry.

Industrial-health experts estimate that only about one out of every four American workmen labors in a plant that has a good

medical program.

The Department of Health, Education and Welfare estimates that there are some 22,000 well-defined occupations. Three fourths of these call for working with machinery or dangerous substances. The carpenter carrying wood, or the office worker using a duplicating fluid, may suffer a skin disease. The machine worker may be injured by the cutting oils he uses. The stonecutter or miner may suffer silicosis which is caused by breathing quartz dust. Grocers, cannery workers and meat packers sometimes contract skin ailments from the materials they handle. The life guard at the neighborhood swimming pool may contract a fungus disease from the water.

The variety of occupational troubles makes a long and growing list. But most of (Continued to page 256)

Wood Arches 294 Feet Long Glued Together in Shop

Wood arches 294 feet long—a record length—and nearly eight stories high at their center span a clear distance of 242½ feet to support the four-inch wood roof of a new building near West Palm Beach, Fla. The arches, "shop grown" in Arkansas by

gluing and molding together ordinary sizes of lumber, were manufactured and shipped in four sections, then joined at the Riviera Beach, Fla., building site. They vary in depth from 26 inches at the base to 46 inches at the point of maximum stress.




Navy Helicopter Used for Mine Sweeping

Navy tests have shown that the use of the helicopter as a mine sweeper is a major contribution to the solution of its problem of keeping sea lanes open. During the tests, an HSL-1 helicopter towed a 300-ton salvage derrick about the water with ease. When modified for mine sweeping, the HSL-1 will permit aerial sweeping of large areas with much greater safety for both personnel and equipment.

Please Pass the TV Signal

Airliners crossing the Atlantic could be the vehicles for transmitting London telecasts to New York television viewers and vice versa under a system patented recently by a New Jersey man. The TV signals would be relayed from plane to plane and would require departure of 24 transoceanic planes daily from New York and London at one-hour intervals. Patent rights have been assigned to Bell Telephone Laboratories, which have no plans for it at present.

Soviet Fleet Ranks No. 2



There are great differences in the composition of the three fleets. Both the United States and Britain have fine modern aircraft carriers in some numbers, for example, while the Russians have not commissioned a single vessel of this type. Their big fleet of new-type heavy cruisers of the Sverdlov class is designed for attack and for commerce raiding, and not for action against their opposite numbers in the United States fleet, or the smaller, older ships of the British navy. Russian destroyers of the Skoryi class are fine modern ships, fast and well armed, and are designed to lay mines as well as perform the other duties of their class. The mines are released through doors in their square sterns.

The most numerous type of ship flying the naval ensign of the Soviets is their mighty fleet of underwater craft. The number of submarines possessed by Russia is a closely guarded secret, but it is well known that recently a considerable number of very large ocean-going types with a submerged displacement of 2900 tons, a length of 320 feet and a cruising range of 20,000 miles, has been built. In addition to this type, a large number of the smaller seagoing patrol type of 1600 tons submerged displacement with good speeds both on the surface and submerged is being built.

It is generally known that at the moment


the Russians have about 100 undersca boats in various stages of construction. Conservative estimates say she has well over 400 subs in commission—and the estimates run all the way to 800. Some of these are obsolete and of little fighting value.


Russia's battleships, at least two of her cruisers and several of her destroyers also are victims of obsolescence. That is why the Russians could boast not long ago that they were reducing the size of their fleet. Most of these old ships could be pruned out early and sent to the scrap heap without impairing the fighting efficiency of the fleet.


Frigates are the most numerous type of vessel in the British navy today, a popularity earned as a result of the splendid work done by this type of ship during World War II. In the U. S. Navy, frigates and patrol ships doing similar work reach a total of at least 311 vessels of all sorts and sizes. A considerable number of the fast frigates flying the white ensign of the British navy are converted destroyers which have raised freeboards for improving their sea-keeping qualities—which partially explains the scarcity of destroyers in the British navy.


The Russians have neither a large nor an up-to-date fleet of frigates, their boats being largely ex-enemy vessels and small patrol boats. Rumors say that two new types are under construction, but it is obvious that in a navy designed for attack, the frigate and the seagoing patrol vessel can have but a small role to play.


Type Changed With Tweezers On Versatile Typewriter

One typewriter that features interchangeable type can now do the work of several machines. The interchangeable type, available with mathematical signs, chemical symbols, foreign-language symbols, special type fonts, company trade marks or other special-order symbols, can be inserted quickly by the typist. With tweezers, the typist removes the old type from the type bar, selects a new type and locks it in place. A spring-retainer clip on each type block locks the block into place in accurate alignment. The new, versatile typewriter has a 44-character keyboard and provides four extra characters with section and paragraph marks, a plus sign and an equal sign.

Three-Wheel Car Gets 80 Miles Per Gallon

You can go 70 miles per hour in the Star, a three-wheel car that gets up to 80 miles per gallon of gas. Built by an American firm, it is powered by a one-cylinder German engine. The streamlined body is made of molded glass fiber. Less than three feet high, it is 10½ feet long, 50 inches wide and weighs only 400 pounds.

Grooved Fluorescent Lamp Twice as Bright

Light output of a new grooved fluorescent lamp is twice that of present lamps of the same length. The new, higher-wattage lamp maintains the same efficiency as the older lamps but increases the concentration of light. The grooves increase the area of lighted tube surface and decrease the absorption of light by mercury vapor inside the tube, allowing more radiation to escape. Designed for new installations only, the lamp

requires different ballast equipment and a different fixture. The standard 200-watt tube is eight feet long, but four-foot lamps



will be made and six-foot lamps may be developed for street lighting. Other uses will include outdoor floodlighting and signs.

High-Temperature Lubricants Developed for Aircraft


Making another assault on the thermal barrier, General Electric Company has announced that its chemists are on the verge of finding high-temperature aircraft lubricants that will operate between 1000 and 2000 degrees, F. The upper limit in present-day lubricants is around 500 degrees in hydraulic systems and 350 degrees in bearings. The biggest problem facing the chemists working with the new compounds is that, while they flow at red heat, they freeze at around 400 degrees—the point where other lubricants boil.


Cube Measures Mercury Density

Fifteen London scientists have constructed a nearly perfect cube of tungstencarbide with cobalt to measure the density of mercury. The 22-pound, 3½-inch-square cube, which has "no fault that affects its volume by as much as one part in 100 million," is floated in mercury during the measuring process. It was polished with diamond dust. During the last stages, it was submerged just below the surface of melted paraffin. Differences in light reflections enabled the scientists to make contour maps of the face with contours at an interval of ½,000,000 inch.

Transport "Propelloplane"

Army officials are studying drawings of a proposed "Propelloplane" transport that could land a large number of troops in a small jungle clearing or on a tiny mountain plateau. The plane, equipped with Pogo-type propellers, would employ a pivoting wing to take off, land and hover like a helicopter. Once in the air, the wing would assume a conventional horizontal position. The design was by Hiller Helicopter.

CEATTLE'S WINTER carnival features an indoor ski-jumping contest in the Civic Ice Arena that leaves spectators breathless. The jumpers zoom through a hole high in the wall of the arena, hurtle down a frost-planked runway beneath the girders and take off into space just below the highest lights. The slide is 120 feet long, 36 feet wide and has a 35-degree pitch. It is 75 feet high at its summit outside the building. One of the bricked-in windows, high on the arena wall, is removed to accommodate the slide. (The hole is bricked up again after the carnival.) The landing area terminates on the arena floor which is cov-

ered with shaved ice. Over 200,000 pounds of ice are needed to cover the slide, decking and landing area.

Because the arena is used by the Seattle Americans' hockey team, the ski jump has to be put up and taken down in a few hours. Erection starts at 10:30 p.m. after a game and must be completed by noon the next day for the ice-coating operation to get under way. The outdoor section is constructed the day before. The work is done by a 65-man crew. Disassembly takes only six hours.

Only the world's best jumpers compete in this indoor event. The Norwegian jumper, Rolf Helle, performs somersaults on six-foot skis because his regular eightfooters might clip a girder as he turns over. Exhibition slalom running is performed on the ice-covered landing area.

Geiger With Transistors Fits Shirt Pocket

Uranium prospectors now can carry a geiger counter around in their shirt pockets. Transistors cut down the size and weight of a new geiger counter which operates on two pen-type flashlight batteries. The instrument is only 2½ inches wide and 5 inches long, and weighs 15 ounces.



Compressed-Air Floodlight Can't Cause Explosions


Compressed air furnishes the power to light an explosion proof floodlight. Used in areas of mines and refineries where electricity is not available, the 22-pound unit is connected to an air line that drives turbogenerators inside. The exhausted air cools the 150-watt, 12-volt lamp.

"Portable" Cobblestones Used in Parisian Movie Scenery



Parisian citizens were curious about the new type of pavement being put on one of their streets. Workmen laid down interlocking sections of pavement resembling ancient cobblestones like pieces of carpeting. The new pavement didn't seem like much of an improvement to them. Then it was explained that a motion-picture company was about to film a movie sequence set in the streets of Paris 100 years ago, and the streets at that time were paved with cobblestones. The portable pavement being laid was only a part of the scenery.

Obstacle Course for Trail Riders


ONE OF THE fastest-growing sports in the United States is the combination of open-country trail riding and trail-class competition in horse shows. Any horse lover can participate with an ordinary saddle horse, plus the time and effort necessary to condition him properly.


This upswing in trail riding during the past three years is putting at least a half million horses on the trails annually, and has developed the trail-horse class until it has the greatest number of entries and is the most competitive and entertaining horse-show event.

Trail classes are good competitive rides

that serve as a training ground for the trail horse. In these classes the horse and rider are subjected to the type of obstacles that they will encounter on the trail.

One of the leading areas for developing trail-horse competition and education in the show arena is the Pacific Coast. A hub for the development has been Sacramento, Calif. Here the Sacramento County Horsemen's Association, The Greenies, Gold Trail Mounties, Sacramento County Sheriff's Posse, American River Riders and Sacramento Ladies Mounted Patrol—all organizations that are a part of the California State Horsemen's Association—have combined their talents to develop some of the most efficient devices for trail-horse education and competition. All their units are





designed to simulate open-country trail conditions.

The upswing in open-country trail riding is pointed up by the fact that controlled trails hundreds of miles long are being or have been set up in many states. California has a nearly completed trail that is 3000 miles long. Many other states, including Vermont, Iowa, Florida, Texas, Arizona, Colorado, Nevada, Oregon and Washington have similar trails completed or nearing completion.


The trail-class obstacles are ideal for training both the horse and rider. The rider must learn to direct his mount over, around or through the obstacle and the horse must learn to recognize the directions and obey them instantly.


Training Forestalls Trouble

This training eliminates much trouble and danger for the rider on the open trails. It sets up a proper understanding between the man and his mount.

In this tough hazard the horse must back between two standards, then turn and back between two more

Horsemen who set up hazards for trail classes take into consideration all phases of trail riding and build their obstacles to simulate as many of them as possible.

Gates are important in a trail class, for gates of varying types will be encountered on any trail ride. The good trail rider is able to open nearly every type of gate, ride through it and close it without dismounting.

A trail horse should go willingly under branches, through heavy brush or other close quarters. He should not balk at bridges of any type, whether high or low, with railings or without, wide or narrow.

On the trail there is always the chance of coming upon a wild animal, dead or alive, or upon the spoor of one that has passed recently. What will be the reaction of the horse when this happens?

There are a number of methods of testing a horse and rider on this problem. One is to make an imitation animal by fastening the hide of a deer over a rack. A deer head is mounted on the end of the rack on a swivel. A spring is attached to the rack and head at one side, and a rope is fastened to the other side at the antlers. This gives movement to the head. The figure is set at a point where the horse will come across it when he has to

advance to some other obstacle such as a bridge, gate or heavy brush. As he approaches, the rope is pulled and the head moves. The spring snaps the head back to proper position.

The trail horse can be thoroughly startled by this development, but in his training he must be taught to overcome the fear and follow the orders of the rider.

Close Quarters

On the trail the horse is quite often called upon to pass through close quarters. One way to teach this is to set panels close together so the animal must pass between them, making a right-angle turn in doing so.

Backing up on the trail is often necessary and it can be in very tight and crooked quarters. One way to teach this is to set up four standards. Two of them must be backed between, then the horse must swing off at almost a right angle to back between the other two.


What will the horse do if he is called to carry double? He may have to do so on the trail, and every trail rider should first find out in the show arena what the reaction will be. Carrying double may not bother one horse while the next will really balk at the additional weight. The arena is the proving ground where the horse learns he must carry double if his rider wants him to.

Disturbing Noises


On the trail occasionally the horse may be required to carry something that makes a disturbing noise. To simulate this, rocks are placed in a bucket. The horse is shown the bucket and the rocks are rattled. Then the rider mounts and during the ride continually rattles the rocks. Thus the horse is trained to know that noise on his back will not hurt him.


Bridges can present additional problems for it is not unusual for small animals to scurry across them, or for larger animals to bound out from under them as they are approached. Brush that hangs over the bridges can also be a problem. In the show arena obstacles to help solve these are set up.










Pipe is still supported by carrying arm of rail car which reverses to set pipe against its neighbor

Oval Sewer Pipe Can Pass Through Section of Same Size

Tunnelers installing deep sewer mains can carry sections of a new oval-shaped pipe through the just-completed portion of the main. The ratio of height to width gives it this advantage over circular pipe. Forms and bracing for finished work are eliminated, which makes for greater safety and lowered construction cost. Pipe sections are carried through the newly laid main on a car running on a track. At the end of the main, the car supports the section while the pipelayer easily turns it into position. Then the car backs the section of pipe up and sets it in place.



Waste pulp liquors will be burned to produce \$1,000,000 worth of steam power a year for a new Norwegian paper mill. An American invention. the Zimmerman process, flows the dissolved organic waste into a reactor with compressed air. In the reactor, the oxygen in the air "burns" the organic material in a flameless chemical reaction. The heat gen-

erated is transmitted to the water in the waste to form steam. The steam, plus nitrogen and carbon dioxide that come from the air, is used to make power. Inorganic materials are recovered in a later step. The process can purify sewage and other organic wastes that are now polluting many streams.

Flying Laboratory For Jet-Pilot Study

Once in the air, a T-29 airliner that serves as a flying laboratory is controlled by a second pilot seated in a cockpit installed in the transport's main cabin. The cockpit and complete electronic control system he operates are those of the F-102 jet interceptor, which employs radar to seek, find and destroy an enemy despite darkness or fog. Hughes Aircraft engineers working on an improved control system study the operation of the system in flight while a psychologist observes the pilot's performance. The transport flies at one fifth the cost of the jet fighter, which couldn't carry even one of

the several experts who study a spread-out nonminiaturized version of the control system in the big plane. With the flying lab-

oratory, the engineers can make a series of modifications or adjustments during one flight and observe their effect.



Grip Wheels Dig Into Ice To Prevent Slipping

Wheel slipping in snow and ice is prevented by a cog wheel that is lowered into place against the molding of the rear tire. The wheel's teeth fit accurately into the molding of certain tires so that the wheel turns with the tire. The half-inch teeth dig into snow or ice to give the tire a firm grip. Fixed to the car or truck axle, the grip-wheel unit is raised and lowered by a simple lever connected to the hand brake. The grip wheel does not affect the movement of the car. It is made in Sweden.

"Siamese" Ships Launched Together

Two supply vessels, each 135 feet long and 32 feet in beam, were launched simultaneously at Pascagoula, Miss. They were built in 54 days and are destined to service the oil rigs in the offshore oil fields of the Gulf of Mexico. The launching was actually a "Siamese-twin launching," since both vessels were temporarily welded together and rested on the same cradle for the unique ceremony.

Held together by frame welded between them, sister ships are launched



Barrage Balloon Answers Question: How High Does a Fly Fly?

What kinds of flies fly high and how high does a fly fly? These two questions are being answered in England with the aid of a wartime barrage balloon. "Katy," the balloon, goes up 1000 feet each day carrying a trap 10 feet long. Flies are sucked into

the trap by powerful electric fans. Katy's harvest is about 7500 flies per day. Her activities are part of a program aimed at improving crop-spraying methods. When more facts are available about flies' habits, it will be easier to eliminate them.




Kit Tests Uranium Samples While in the Field

Uranium prospectors can test samples in the field with a pocket viewer that is part of a kit. Minerals to be tested are made into beads with chemicals and a blowtorch from the kit. The beads are placed in a plastic chamber in the viewer, and the prospector peers through an eyepiece enclosing a magnifying lens. Sunlight passing through an ultraviolet-ray filter lens strikes the beads and causes them to fluoresce if they contain even one part in 10 million of uranium. Over 30 minerals that activate a geiger counter don't pass this test.

Cellophane Aids Plants

Waste cellophane can prove valuable to the farmer and gardener, tests at Rutgers University show. Shredded into flakes and impregnated with fertilizer salts, it prevents leaching. Used as a mulch, cellophane flakes stop evaporation, protect the soil and control weeds. Waste cellophane, mixed with limestone and fertilizer, can be composted to produce a product with the qualities of commercially cultivated peat. Mesquite—bane of the Southwestern rancher—here has been given an aerial treatment of 2,4,5-T. Ranchers examine the lush stand of grass that came up when mesquite died

SOMEDAY THE FARMER may have at his fingertips an arsenal of chemical weapons that will kill every growing plant on the land—except those he is cultivating. That's the goal of his ally, the weed-control specialist, whose dream of the weed-free farm now seems possible of attainment.

Just look what's happened in weed control since 1944. Before that, the "man with the hoe" was the symbol of the farmer all over the world. True, in advanced countries the power of the horse or the tractor had replaced the muscles of the man, but the method was still the same: grubbing weeds out of the

ground. The few chemicals used to control weeds were chiefly the soil sterilants: Common salt, sodium arsenite and sodium chlorate. No one had developed a practical selective weed killer.

Suddenly, in 1944, this was changed. The years since then have witnessed perhaps the most rapid advance in farming methods since a shaggy cave man planted a seed to become the first farmer.

The spark that touched off this revolution was the discovery of the weed-killing power of a long-handled chemical—2,4-dichlorophenoxyacetic acid. Today we just call it 2,4-D. This chemical has many close relatives, among which MCP and 2,4,5-T are also widely used for weed killing.

Magic Chemicals

Here was a startling discovery. When these magic chemicals were applied to the tops of plants at rates of only ½ to 2 pounds per acre, certain species of plants shriveled and died, yet others were barely affected. Thus it became possible for a farmer to kill most broadleaved weeds in his corn, wheat or rice field without harming his crop.

Since then scores of weed killers tailormade for certain crops have been developed. We have come to the startling realization that we can find selective herbicides for almost any weed-killing job, and only the lack of a profitable market will prevent us from doing so.

oratory work and field testing by many crop-control scientists, but at least it seems possible to attain.

I am asked two questions more frequently than all others put together: "What shall I use to kill the weeds in my lawn?" and "What is there about a weed killer that will kill one plant and have almost no effect on the other?" Let's leave the weeds in the lawn for a moment and discuss the second question.

Suppose you spray a 2,4-D solution on a cornfield overgrown with giant ragweed and bindweed. A few days later the annual ragweed and the perennial bindweed are


Comparative amounts of weed seed and wheat from equal areas, unsprayed (top) and treated (bottom)

A possible answer is that the physical structure of the plants is so different that one catches and absorbs more of the spray than the other. But that isn't the basic reason.

Different Enzyme Systems

The plants react differently because they have different enzyme systems. The total enzyme systems of a plant or animal direct its entire life. The 2,4-D has a disruptive effect on some enzyme systems but not on others.

Since all species of plants have different enzyme systems, weed killers may have a different and specific effect on each species. In effect, it is the plant that makes the selection and not the chemical. These ef-

fects are so specific that we often need to make recommendations for each variety of a particular crop. There are also varieties of weeds which may respond differently. This may well be a reason for conflicting results. At least, it is thus absolutely essential for satisfactory recommendations to identify the particular weed in the crop.

Herbicide action may vary with the weather, the concentration, the method of application and other factors, and may thus endanger the farmer's crop.

It is commonly believed that 2,4-D does not affect corn, yet in one experiment the yield of corn was reduced from 80 bushels to two bushels per acre by one application. This was the wrong formulation, at the wrong time, in the wrong concentration, by the wrong method, but it serves as a warning of what can happen.

Not long ago, following three years of


2,4-D makes a clean sweep of mustards in small grain. At left is a treated field; right, an untreated one

hard work at a half-dozen different experiment stations, a new weed killer was marketed for use on cotton. During the year it was introduced, unusual weather conditions caused the herbicide to kill thousands of acres of cotton. The herbicide is still a good one, but its reputation has never recovered from this blot. A similar experience is possible with most herbicides now in use.

Riders spot Johnson grass, douse it with herbicide

The usefulness of a herbicide depends as much on the way it is applied as the chemical itself. The first 2,4-D sprays were applied in up to 320 gallons of water per acre. Heavy tanks mashed down the crops. Then Harold A. Waters tried the simplest possible approach. To an ordinary paint-spraying nozzle he attached a low-pressure pump, and proved that only 5 to 10 gallons of water per acre could apply the herbicide accurately.

Apply as Droplets

Because modern herbicides are so powerful, we must apply them so that they do not drift and injure desirable plants. They should be applied not as mists, but in droplets which tend to fall to the plants. The inexpensive low-pressure pump with what is now known as a weed-control nozzle is ideal for this purpose.

Here are the most up-to-date recommendations for killing weeds in various crops:

Lawns. 2,4-D in a dilute drenching spray is basic. You can even apply it with a sprinkling can, provided you do not use the can later to water the flowers. There


Rare World War I Fighter Flies Again

WHEN Dwight Woodard, a Richland Center, Wis., airport operator, heard one of his students tell of a plane he'd seen in a northern Wisconsin barn, he could hardly wait to see it—especially after the student told him, "There must have been something wrong with it because when we turned the prop, the whole engine turned around." To Woodard, this meant a famous old French Le Rhone rotary engine, unique in that the crankshaft was stationary while the engine and propeller rotated around it.

The plane proved to be a Thomas Morse Scout S4B, and Woodard bought the shell. Woodard spent thousands of dollars and hours searching for parts and rebuilding the ship.

Electric Eye on Camera Sets Correct Lens Opening

Fully automatic, a new movie camera has a battery-operated mechanism that sets the lens opening to the precise amount the lighting requires for perfect exposure. An electric eye "reads" the lighting conditions and sets the diaphragm as conditions change. If subject moves from bright sunshine into the shade, the exposure is automatically corrected while the camera operates. No attention by the photographer is necessary. Another feature of the automatic camera is a warning signal that pops up in the view finder whenever the amount of light becomes too low for proper exposure, thus preventing waste of film. Current for the exposure-adjusting mechanism is provided by six tiny batteries, similar to those used in hearing aids. The life of the batteries is a minimum of one year. The camera, a Bell and Howell product, has a 20-millimeter f:1.9 lens. Wide-angle and telephoto attachments are available.

Huge Plastic Tarpaulin Lines Pond to Prevent Water Seepage




Waterproof plastic tarpaulin, above, is used to cover nearly half an acre of the dry bed of a manmade pond. Below, pond no longer seeps away



When a manmade pond at Clemson College, Clemson, S. C., seeped away, agricultural engineers lined the cavity with waterproof plastic. Strips of Krene plastic, often used for shower curtains, were heat-sealed together to produce a tarpaulin to cover almost half an acre. The plastic liner, which came through the winter undamaged, eliminated the three-incha-day drop in water level. Similar liners may be used to hoard water for livestock and irrigation purposes. During a dry period, the water thus saved might spell the difference between crop failure and survival.


Potent Insecticide

Extracted for the first time, a potent new hormone holds promise of an insecticide against which pests cannot develop resistance. The hormone, extracted from insects at Harvard University, prevents metamorphosis.



Canadian Radar Network To Control Airspace

Like the rest of the world, Canada's air transport traffic has shot up in volume in recent years—and absolute control of all planes in the air has become essential. To accomplish this, the Canadian government is installing a network of radar at 15 major airports stretching across the country. The equipment, called Airport and Airways Surveillance Radar, will permit each airport to track planes within a 200-mile radius. The AASR system has improvements which enable it to track planes even in bad weather without a cluttered-up screen, and which filter out all unmoving objects so that a moving plane is easily spotted on the scope.



Below, electronically generated map of the control area is projected on AASR screen at flip of switch




Pocket Vacuum Cleaner Takes Lint From Clothes

You can brush lint and dust from your clothes with a pocket vacuum cleaner that looks like a flashlight. Two flashlight batteries power a tiny suction motor in the head to draw dust into a small bag. The vacuum created is not powerful, but serves principally to prevent dust brushed free from being scattered about the room. The circular brush on the head is swept across the cloth like a whisk broom.


Windshield Rain Repellent

Raindrops roll off an airplane windshield coated with a substance that ends the need for wipers. Made of silicones and waxes, the hard coating, to which raindrops can't stick, is applied in 15 minutes and lasts for several days of heavy rain. The wind and speed of the plane also help sweep the raindrops away. Although not adaptable for autos because of their slow speed, it may eliminate salt-spray crust on boats.

BASKING SHARKS, the bane of the salmon fisheries along the British Columbia coast, are being chased and speared by a vessel mounting a knifelike ram on its prow.

In the first month that the Canadian Fisheries Department's Comox Post was fitted with the ram, it killed nearly 50 sharks. Eighteen were speared in a single day in Barkley Sound on the west coast of Vancouver Island.


Basking sharks, named for their habit of floating lazily near the surface, attain a length of 30 feet. When one becomes entangled in a salmon net, it can tear it apart in minutes, destroying hundreds of dollars' worth of webbing. Trolling gear is also damaged when the hooks catch in the sides of the monsters. The sharks feed on the same food as salmon, frequent the same areas and are usually at greatest numbers during the height of the sockeye-salmonfishing season. Up to 50 may gather in an area where salmon are feeding making it impossible for the fishermen to put down their nets.


The sharks, which have no commercial value, have been a problem for many years. Harpooning has proved to be successful but slow. Rifle fire is ineffective and a danger to nearby fishermen.

Now, when a group of sharks is sighted, the Comox Post steers directly for the school, picks out an individual floating near the surface, and rams it. This not only reduces the shark population, but breaks up and scatters the school, making it reasonably safe for fishermen to operate in the immediate area.

The triangular ram when not in use is carried like a closed clasp knife above the water line. For operation, it is lowered from a hinge by a cable so its point and cutting edge are just beneath the surface of the water. Chain braces on either side of the bow keep it firmly in position.

TV Camera in Drone "Peers" Over Enemy Lines


Army combat commanders can peer over enemy lines with a TV camera mounted in a remotely controlled plane. An L-17 was fitted with a 42-pound autopilot that enables a ground operator to regulate its flight, landings and take-offs within a 25mile range. TV pictures of strategic territory beneath the plane are relayed to a monitor set at the 250-pound ground station, which can be carried in a Jeep. It includes radio links for commanding the drone. Still photos can also be made.



Infrared Lamp Over Balcony Makes January Like June

Gerald M. Loeb, Wall Street investment broker, likes to sit on the balcony of his home in Redding, Conn., in shirt sleeves the year 'round. He is able to do this in comfort since he suspended a 5000-watt infrared waterproof heater over the balcony which is on the south side of his house. The balcony is perfectly comfortable on the coldest winter day, Loeb reports, unless a high wind is blowing across it.

MOTOR SWIMMING WITH FOOT AND GAS ENGINE POWER

What with automobiles and motor boats to ride in, motor skates to walk on, and a screw propeller to push a swimmer through the water, it begins to look as though the class in physical culture had little to do but enjoy itself, while a gasoline engine does the work. Of all the varied applications of the gas motor the swimming outfit is the most unique. Its utility would seem quite doubtful, but as a curiosity or amusement it is worth knowing.


M. Constantini, of Paris, who invented the motor skate, has brought out a motor swimming device which, the Scientific American says, consists of "a waterproof casing containing a gasoline motor which drives a screw. The machine is strapped to the swimmer's back and propels him through the water" at a rate faster than he would

swim, and, of course, without physical exertion. Air bags are used to float the machinery.

An American has also invented a swimming machine, but in his case the swimmer must furnish the motive power himself. This device is capable of considerable speed with comparatively small effort. The operator stretches at full length upon a float which is pointed at the forward end. The propeller is driven by gearing driven by means of foot pedals similar to the pedals of a bicycle. Another float over the machinery serves to support it in the water. This arrangement permits the swimmer to keep his head out of water and to undertake long distances. When tired one has simply to cease working the pedals until rested.



"Trainfire" Rifle Course Simulates Combat

Stationary targets are replaced by man-size targets that pop from ground



Army recruits in the near future may be given a much different course in rifle marksmanship. A new course, called "trainfire," is under test by the Army. The goal of the course is to reproduce in training the marksmanship problems that the rifleman will face in combat. Instead of stationary targets at known distances, the new program uses man-size silhouette targets, some moving and some stationary, that pop up at unknown ranges. The rifleman also is trained to fire from foxholes and from behind trees, rather than from the formal body positions of the existing course. The new system cuts the marksmanship course from 86 hours to 74 hours.

Lamprey Poison in Great Lakes May Save Trout

Trout-destroying sea lampreys may be cleaned out of the Great Lakes with a chemical developed by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service. Dissolved in the spawning beds, it kills the lamprey larvae. If the

chemical proves harmless to other fish and animals, it will see widespread use. The eellike parasite has lowered the trout catch in Lake Michigan alone from a \$3,000,000 peak to an all-time low of \$1500.









Tips on TV Buying

Considering the many new TV models, it is interesting to note that despite widely varying prices most sets of any particular manufacturer are built around a single chassis. In only a few instances is there a difference in basic chassis design of the highest-priced units and that of the medium and low-priced lines (excluding the small-screen portables). Since it is chassis design which largely determines picture quality, the varying prices are due chiefly to features which contribute more to appearance and operating convenience than to actual performance.

When viewed in demonstration rooms, a casual observation may reveal little difference in picture and sound quality of different brands. Yet, some units may provide better performance than others under certain conditions. Here are a number of "look and listen" tests you can make to assure lasting satisfaction with your final selection.

 Tune in a strong station on several sets and adjust brightness and contrast controls for best picture. A good picture has all the detail of a sharp, glossy photograph. Carefully compare picture quality of the various sets. Rotate brightness control to maximum. Picture should remain in sharp focus with little or no "blooming" (enlargement of image).

Turn contrast control to maximum and watch for evidence of picture "bending" or an annoying raspy buzz in the speaker.

 Rotate fine-tuning control. Picture and sound should remain good over several degrees of rotation.

5. Change stations. Picture contrast and sound volume should remain relatively

constant on all channels.

6. Rotate horizontal-hold control. Picture should remain steady, without distortion, over a large portion of the control.

If available, plug a motor-driven appliance into nearby outlet. Picture should

remain steady.

 Turn volume to minimum and listen for any hum which may be audible a few feet from the set. Turn volume to higherthan-normal listening level and compare the over-all tone quality of the various sets.

Any set scoring high in the above tests is likely to perform well in your home, providing it is properly installed and adjusted, and used with a satisfactory antenna system.







KNOTTY-PINE HUTCH CABINET

By Hi Sibley

HERE IS A PROJECT designed especially for the home craftsman. The original was made of knotty pine, but any wood with an interesting grain is suitable. Glue, dowels and screws are used to assemble the unit.

Start construction by assembling the base. Storage shelf, ends and counter top are made by edge-gluing equal length boards. Clamp them together until dry and then sand the surfaces flush. Ready-made panels often can be obtained from your lumberyard. The shelf in the storage area rests on 2¾-in. cleats to bring it to the level of the bottom of the door opening. Drawer rails are made from four pieces of 1 x 2, 15¼ in. long, and rest on cleats front and back. The front cleat is a 31½-in. length of 1 x 3, and is positioned to bring the top edge 20 in. up from the floor. Front panels are screwed to cleats from the inside. Cut the doorframe members to fit flush with the edges of the front paneling, mitering them at the corners. Either solid paneling

or ¾-in. pine-faced plywood may be used for the flush door. Wrought-iron hinges and handles add to the rugged appearance of the cabinet. The drawer can be made without mortised joints by cutting the sides ¼ in. narrower to allow the plywood bottom

Reinforcing Loose-Leaf Pages With Cellulose Tape

If loose-leaf pages or spacers are subject to heavy use, try reinforcing the holes with a bit of ordinary cellulose tape. Fold a small piece of the tape over the hole and then repunch the hole.



to be screwed to the lower edges. Recess the screwheads so they will not wear the rails. The back is then fastened between the sides flush with the rear edges. Dowels are used to join the counter top to the base along the front edge. Wood screws driven up through cleats anchor it along the sides. Cut a recess in the back edge of the top ¾ in. wide by 33 in. long to accommodate the back paneling.

Six pieces of 6-in. V-tongue-and-groove pine 68% in. long form the back of the cabinet. Fasten them to the cleats and top panel of the counter with wood screws. Then cut out the two upright supports for the shelves. By temporarily nailing the two pieces together they can both be cut at the same time with a bandsaw. If a scroll or coping saw is used, cut one and use it as a pattern for the other. Fit the shelves between the uprights before fastening them to the counter. Dowels are used to fasten the shelves to the uprights and for joining the assembly to the counter top. Reinforce all shelves with screws driven in from the rear side of the back. Measure the height of the shelves closely and mark the back with horizontal chalk lines to prevent missing the shelves with the screws. Scroll-cut the top piece and join it to the cabinet with a cleat screwed to the top of the rear paneling as shown.

Modeling Clay Cleans Type

Ordinary modeling clay is effective for cleaning type on a typewriter that may have become clogged with dirt and ink. Using a piece about the size of a walnut, work it in your fingers until pliable and then press it onto the keys a section at a time. Roll it off as shown, folding the soiled area back into the ball, and rework the clay before cleaning the next section. A small piece will last for many cleanings.





Cutaway drawing shows relation of various parts of planter. Toe space at base prevents marring of finish







34-in. plywood, faced two sides. The base consists of a frame of 4-in.-wide plywood, mitered at the corners so that the plywood stands on edge. This is fastened to the regular flooring with screws and glue blocks, after which a shoe mold is added. Make the base frame about five inches less in over-all size than the unit for toe space.

Then, carefully cutting all pieces of the planter to size, miter all butting edges. This allows them to be joined without the end grain showing. However, on the edges of the open book shelves, covering the end grain can be done, as here, by the use of Woodtape. Easily applied, photo 5, this product provides a simple answer to the problem of covering end grain.

When assembled, make a cutout in the top for a copper planting box. In this instance, the depth of the box is 8 in.; length and width will vary with your plan. The local sheet-metal shop will make the box if you have no facilities. Instruct them to put a 1-in. lip around it as this becomes the sole support.

The Lumiline fixture is mounted on a suitable shelf, screwed to the inside of the planter, beneath which is placed the toggle switch. Placing the switch as shown in drawing 2 keeps it handy yet unobtrusive. For the glass insert over the light fixture, use translucent diffusing glass. Do not use clear glass. Rabbet the top of the planter to take the glass flush.

When installing the large dowels that reach from the planter top to the ceiling, drill blind holes just large enough to take them with a snug fit, photo 1. Cut the dowels ½ in. longer than the actual distance from the top of the planter to the ceiling. Then drill a hole in one end of each pole and insert a spring, as shown in Fig. 2. This feature has several advantages in that it

solves the problem of how to affix the ceiling ends of the poles, plus the very good feature of easing any future painting of the ceiling. The poles can be removed quickly at any time, and yet the springs hold them firmly in place.


The grooving operation explained last month and shown in this issue, photo 4, should be done with care to produce straight and even lines. Occasionally a groove will be fuzzy on its inner slopes. Sand lightly with fine-grit paper wrapped around a block of wood.


Construction of the plate rail, Fig. 7, is similar to that of the planter. The depth of the unit is four inches and, in this case, the shelves were dadoed into the sides. As with the planter, plan and install your wiring beforehand.


Hardwood plywood, while beautiful in its natural state, is enhanced by proper finishing. Preparation of the plywood for finishing is accomplished with light sanding and thoroughly removing all dust. Then, using cheesecloth or other lintfree cloth, wipe on a stain (in this application, a chartreuse stain was applied to remove the red coloring of the mahogany). Wipe the stain with the grain. As soon as the stain "takes," wipe surface clean before starting a new section. It is advisable to experiment on a scrap piece of the paneling to make certain you have the color desired.




Finishing operations, photos 8 and 9, start with stain of desired color, wiped with the grain then filler wiped against grain, allowing ample drying time. Final finish ends up as satiny smooth luster











When moving a kitchen range to clean behind it. sharp, burred edges on its underside may cause ugly gouges in the floor covering. To avoid this, apply a felt or fabric tape to the edges on the underside. Apply the tape with a waterproof cement, or use a self-adhering fabric which will not become loosened when watersoaked while the floor is being mopped.

To clean plaster figurines, vases, etc., dip them in a starch-and-water solution. When the starch is dry, brush it off with a soft-bristled brush.

Auxiliary Flash Unit Improvised With Extension Cord and Dish Pan

When you wish to make a two-flash shot and have only one reflector, insert the second lamp in an extension-cord socket and clip it to the edge of a white dish pan as shown. An adapter may be used in the extension-cord socket which is set in the "on" position so it can be operated from the camera, though some distance away.


Neat Stick-On Labels From Tape

Labels that stick firmly to fishing-tackle boxes, suitcases, raincoats and children's school clothing are made easily from medical adhesive tape. They may be hand lettered or typed. Stick the blank label on waxed paper; the kind that is used for wrapping food is fine. The paper should be of such a size that it can be inserted in a typewriter. Type the required identification on the label. It will now pull easily from the waxed paper, but will stick firmly to any dry surface that is not waxed or oiled.

Anchoring Screws in End Grain

Where a strong joint must be produced by driving wood screws into end grain, there will be very little tendency for the screws to loosen if they penetrate a dowel as shown. The dowel is coated with glue and driven to a snug fit in the hole. Pilot holes for the screws should be drilled through the dowel to prevent splitting.



"NORTH WIND" --Boy-Size Iceboat

IT'S A SAFE, sharp performer on the blue ice of a frozen pond; a speedy wind-driven sled on level stretches of hard snow. You don't have to run directly before the wind. You can sail on the quarter with a following wind as much as 30 deg. off the course. The swinging sail boom and front steering give close control on fast runs.

The frame, seat, seat back and seat risers are cut from 34-in. pine, but the mast, strut and sail boom should be hardwood. Oak, ½ in. in thickness, is just right. Only clear, straight-grained stock should be used. Cut the runners (all three are identical) from 1 or 11/8-in, white pine and groove for the 1/4-in. round steel shoes. Notch the runners for the running bar, or spacer, and the steering bar. Countersink the head of the pivot bolt in the front runner. Join fixed parts with screws and glue. When joining, care must be taken to align the notched ends of the seat board and the frame vertically, so that the mast will stand perpendicular. Note that the bolts holding the mast, also the bolt on which the boom pivots, are fitted with wing nuts. Finish the mast and boom in natural color with spar varnish and the other parts with a sealer and colored gloss enamel. Geo. W. Blow, Arlington Heights, Ill.



Paint Code Identifies Keys


the key. For more than a few locks use a combination of two or more colors, striping the lock and key similarly.

Dowel Plugs Aid Mortise Drilling

Mortises, formed by drilling a series of holes, can be made easier and neater by plugging each hole as it is drilled with a dowel slightly longer than the depth of the hole. The holes can then be drilled closer together leaving less wood between them to be chiseled out. After all holes are drilled the dowels may be pulled out with a pair of pliers and the mortise chiseled clear.—P. Casperson, El Cajon, Calif.

Towel Speeds Evaporation Rate Of Radiator Humidifying Tank

A turkish towel draped over a coathanger-wire frame as shown, and fitted in a radiator water pan, will greatly accelerate the rate of evaporation to increase humidity inside the house. The towel, which acts as a wick, may become hardened with lime in a few weeks and will have to be replaced.—Ed Packer, Oak Park, Ill.






Tighten loose handle on household brush by spreading twisted wire and gluing tang back in handle










Quickie Bonbon Server

With a 15-cent gimlet and a 6-in, wooden bowl you can make an attractive little candy dish almost as quick as you can say bonbon. Simply turn the gimlet into center of the bowl and leave it there for a handle. It is easier to start the gimlet if a small pilot hole is first drilled through the bowl. A coat of clear lacquer on the steel part of the gimlet will keep the metal shiny. A disk of felt may be glued to the bottom of the bowl to prevent marring.

Threaded Studs Removed By Using Two Nuts




When only the threaded portion of a stud is accessible, use two nuts turned together tightly on the stud to remove it without damaging the threads. Fit a wrench on the lower nut and turn off nuts and stud together. Heating a tight stud often helps to loosen it.

When making boiled starch, drop a little paraffin in it. Clothes starched with this solution will have much less tendency to stick to the soleplate of an iron.

Slot in Board Holds T-Square

A T-square may be kept conveniently at hand and yet out of the way by hanging it in a notch cut on the edge of the drawing board. The notch should be near the top of the board and may be lined with felt to




protect the T-square edges. An additional piece of felt on top of the board extending beyond the cut will prevent disalignment of the crossbar should the T-square be accidentally dropped into the slot. Sponge rubber may be used in place of felt.

Roll-Fed Telephone Note Pad

Heavy sheet metal was used to make this telephone note pad which is equipped with a roll of adding-machine tape as a paper supply. The roll rotates on a 1/4-in. bolt fitted between two pieces of sheet metal welded to the bottom of the L-shaped writing surface. The paper passes up through a slot at the back of the writing table and under a bar welded near the front edge, which also aids in tearing off used paper. Sheet-metal clips welded to the side of the holder grip a pencil, and the entire assembly is attached to the wall with screws through the right-angle flange of the top piece. File all exposed edges on the sheet metal smooth and apply one or two coats of enamel to the completed unit so it will harmonize with the color scheme of the kitchen.-E. V. Reyner, Townsend, Mont.




Rocket Ship and Launching Station

By Hi Sibley

YOUNGSTERS will be delighted with this "toy of tomorrow" that features a fast-flying, lightweight balsa rocket ship that has aluminum tail fins to guide it in flight. Power for the ship is supplied by a coil compression spring concealed in the launching tower. Rocket take-off is controlled by pulling a spring-loaded trigger rod that extends through the "spaceship station." When the ship is pushed down into the tower so that it compresses the spring, one end of the trigger rod fits into a hole in the ship and holds it in place un-

til released. To prevent wear in the soft balsa wood of the hull, the hole is bushed with a short length of small-diameter tubing. Drill a %-in.-dia. hole 4½ in. deep in the end of the balsa block used for the hull, then cut the slots for the tail fins. After the hull has been shaped and the fins cemented in place, bind the end of the hull with thread as indicated. Brush a coat of shellac on the thread and over the hull to seal the wood. Aluminum paint is applied over the shellac to give the spaceship hull a more authentic metallic appearance.





FOUNTAIN PEN makes good one-drop oiler, especially a pen on which point has been damaged and is no longer worth repair cost. Fill with light oil and use for lubricating sewing machines, small motors




LARGE COOKIE TIN placed on floor of utility room or hallway catches water dripping from wet or snow-covered galoshes, rubbers and umbrellas, prevents water stains on the floor or rug. If used in hallway, tin should be placed near wall or in corner




FIBER DOOR MAT will stay in place if you lay it over a piece cut from surfaced roll roofing and tacked to porch floor. The piece of roll roofing should be about 2 in. smaller each way than the over-all size of the mat, so that mat conceals it at all times

SMALL SCREW HOOK, or L-hook, will anchor a flowerpot safely on a sloping window sill. Determine the location of the flowerpot, allowing space for sash to close, then drive screw hook into sill. Place flowerpot so hook enters hole in bottom as shown HEAT FROM SMALL LIGHT BULB in trouble lamp will shrink wood in a drawer sufficiently so that it can be fully withdrawn and edges planed for an easier fit. Garage Door Protected by Roll-Type Weather Stripping




Tacked to the bottom edge of a wooden overhead garage door, roll-type weather stripping proves beneficial in three ways. First, as weather stripping, it helps to keep the door closed tightly, shaping itself to the floor and preventing drafts. Second, it prevents the door from contacting the floor, so that moisture is not absorbed that may cause loosening of the paint and rotting of the wood. Third, it reduces the noise of the door striking the floor, and serves as a shock absorber. Since the weather stripping raises the door a trifle from its original position, compensating adjustments may have to be made in the latching mechanism of the door hardware.

It is possible to write black on a glass or bright metal surface with a steel pen by using an ink consisting of water glass, 1 to 2 parts and liquid India ink, 10 parts.

Ear Syringe Used to Blow Lint From Camera-Lens Parts


The last step in cleaning a camera is to remove the lint that has settled on the lens. A small ear syringe provides an effective means of blowing the lint from the camera. Blowing with the mouth also helps to remove the debris, but the breath deposits moisture on the camera parts where it may cause trouble later.

Straps Cut From Inner Tube Hold Heavy Rubbers on Shoes

Farmers and other outdoor workers who wear heavy rubbers that might be pulled off in deep mud can prevent this by wearing rubber-band straps cut from an inner tube. Each band is slit about half its length as



shown. The wide portion of the band fits across the bottom of the foot while the slit portion fits over the instep and around the heel.

Measuring Distances by Pacing

Measuring such distances as the length of a driveway or the width of a plot of ground can be done fairly accurately by pacing, if the average length of your stride is known. To determine this factor, measure a distance exactly 100 ft. long and walk it several times, counting the number of steps required. As an example: If you walk the 100 ft. in 38 paces, your pace would be 2.63 ft. The number of your paces multiplied by this number then would produce the approximate length of any definite distance paced.—O. H. Hampsch, Oak Park, Ill.

Sewing "Caddy"

It may look like half of a manmade satellite, but it's actually a down-to-earth holder for sewing needs. Made from a 6-in. wooden bowl, dowel pegs, an empty spool and a cork, the unit shown below proves handy for any sewing job. Thread-spool pegs 3/16 in. in diameter and 1½ in. long are glued into holes drilled at an angle of 50 deg. from horizontal. A longer dowel runs up through the center of the cork pincushion and through an empty spool that provides a handle. The dowel projects above the spool to form a thimble rest.



Peg holes are drilled with bowl supported on an angled drill-press table. A nail driven through a hole in the center of bowl and into a board permits bowl to rotate for uniform drilling




Standard Pipe and Bolts Make Lightweight Tie Rod

When ready-made tie rods are not available, a quickly assembled tie rod can be made from standard pipe with short bolts fitted in the ends. To do this, first cut two rings for each tie rod off the end of the pipe stock. Then cut the pipe to the desired length, saw two crosswise cuts in the ends, insert the bolt head and bend in the cut sections. After the ring is slipped over the bent sections of the pipe and tightened, the tie rod is ready for use.






Calibrate Your Enlarger

WHEN MAKING several different sizes of enlargements from the same negative, considerable time and darkroom materials can be saved when you work with a calibrated enlarger and use the table of enlarging ratios shown below. You then will get good quality prints having consistently uniform tone values, Fig. 1, without having to make several test strips for each change of print size.


Calibration Scale


First, make the calibration scale, so that you know how many times (diameters) a negative is being enlarged. To establish the number of times of enlargement for any one position of the enlarger head, draw a line 1 in. long on a piece of clear negative or tracing paper as shown in Fig. 6, and place it in the negative carrier. Focus the line on the easel with the enlarger head lowered to give the minimum number of times enlargement to the nearest half unit. Then, raise the enlarger head and mark each intermediate position on the upright or support-2, 21/2, 3, 31/2, etc., until the enlarger is as high as it will go. If more than one lens is used with the enlarger, a different scale must be made for each of them. The aperture must be the same for all tests and prints.

Fig. 2 shows a calibrated Omega DII enlarger with a strip of white adhesive tape attached to the right-hand supporting beam and the calibration scale marked on the tape in India ink. Select any part on the enlarging head that slides on the upright


and scribe a pointer or index line on it for use as a point of reference when adjusting the enlarger to the desired setting. For the Omega DII enlarger, the upper edge of the locking block is used as a pointer. Since it has a light-colored surface, a black line is painted along the upper edge for easier reading.

On some enlargers it is impossible to attach a suitable material on the upright for marking the scale because it would interfere with raising and lowering of the enlarger head. In this case, mark the scale on a thin strip of wood and hold it next to the upright each time a setting is changed as shown in Fig. 3, or fasten the strip to a


wall bracket positioned so that it is adjacent to the upright for easy reading.

Correct Exposure

To get the proper exposure for any size enlargement, first make a print by the test-strip method, noting the number of times of enlargement and exact exposure time required for a good quality print. Look up the guide number for the test print you have just made, using the table shown and then the guide number for the enlargement about to be made. To arrive at the new exposure, multiply the new guide number by the exposure in seconds of the test enlargement. Then divide the result by the old







To establish number-of-times enlargement for any one position of the enlarger head, project a 1-in. line (drawn on clear negative or tracing paper) on easel. The 4-in. line above indicates 4-times enlargement

guide number which will give the correct exposure in seconds for the new enlargement. The same procedure applies if the print is larger or smaller than the first (test) print. When an exposure is made with the enlarger head set between lines, 5½ and 6, for example, make a corresponding adjustment in the guide number.

Variables That Affect Prints

Since the speed or scale of contrast varies with the different types of papers, it is necessary to make one test print for each type and grade. The speed of even the same paper may vary somewhat if it is taken from a different lot, making it necessary to run a test print beforehand for good results.

The illumination and optics used in an enlarger may introduce slight variations, but they are usually insignificant. If it is found that your enlargements turn out consistently darker or lighter than the test print, make an allowance for it by increasing or decreasing the new exposure slightly as the case may be. Other factors entering into the determination of length of exposure are density of negative, color of negative and duration of development. Negatives of medium density and with good tone values simplify developing work. Also, follow through with accurate and uniform timing when processing prints.

Linseed-Oil Dip Eases Nail Driving

Nails that are dipped in linseed oil can be driven more easily. This treatment is especially helpful when hard or tough woods are used. The oil also prevents rust-

linseed

ing, which damages the wood fibers and reduces the holding power of the nail.


"Magnet Mop" Picks Up Metal Parts


Nuts, bolts and other metal parts are easily retrieved from the floor with this magnetic mop made of one or more bar or dowel magnets taped to the end of a broom handle. Use adhe-



sive tape and attach a magnet crosswise at the end of the handle, adding additional magnets end to end at the sides for wider coverage.

(It's unnecessary to mat a water-color painting for framing if, before it is painted, masking tape is used to completely cover the margins, leaving only the area to be painted visible. The tape will prevent splashes and paint runs on the margin, and it provides a good surface on which to test colors and shape your brush.






Feeding Station Provides Food for Squirrels

Squirrels will appreciate this feeding station, especially during winter months, to supplement their cache of nuts. Waterproof plywood is used for the back, roof and front panel; and standard 1-in. stock for the remainder of the pieces. The roof cleat is 11½ in. long and beveled on one

side to fit the angle of the roof, which is 10×13 in. In assembling, first attach the floor and cleat to the back panel. Then install the sides and rafters which have been grooved to fit the edge of the back. Finally, nail on the roof and front panel.








Candles often make the setting, and with the holiday season just ahead why not start now to devise ways of enhancing the condles you will use? Following are but a few suggestions you may wish to try, and from them get ideas of your own. Take for example this candelabra. Not only does it meet last-minute need for a multiple candleholder, but its simplicity makes it easy to store when not in use. The four cake candles are turned into holes cut in a strip of aluminum which fits over a standard-size toper



Colored "drippings" may be applied easily to a candle by holding a crayon over the flame until soft and then touching it to the top of the candle. Heat will cause the spot of color to run slowly down the side

Add originality to your candles by cutting a spiral groove in them with a wood gouge or similar tool. On colored candles the gouging will produce a two-tone effect as they are usually white inside




A candle which is lit by striking it as you would a match will surprise holiday guests. To prepare it, snip the wick short and dip it in a paste made by soaking the heads of book matches in a little water


If the candles which you saved from a previous occasion have become soiled and embedded with dirt, try cleaning them with denatured or rubbing alcohal. Moisten a soft cloth and wipe the candles thoroughly












A portable electric candle can be made by fitting a flashlight in a length of mailing tube. Cut a slot in the tube for access to the switch, and tape colored cellophane to top to represent flame




Candles can be made to release bursts of fragrance at intervals while they are burning if perfume is injected into tiny holes drilled in the sides of them. Seal the perfume in the holes with shavings from the candle



To make a reflective candlestick holder cut a 5-in. disk of stiff paper with a 1-in. hole in the center, cover it on one side with aluminum foil, and staple it together to form a shallow inverted cone. Then place a candle in the center hole and fill the inside of the cone with plaster or putty to steady the candle

Inexpensive decals offer an easy way of decorating candles. Soak the decals in water for a few minutes and then slide them on the candles, pressing them dry with a soft cloth. If the decals do not stick, remove them, apply a coat of shellac to the candles and then press the decals against the wet shellac



Bars of paraffin are easily converted into novel candles by heating, shaping and inserting small cake candles in them. Warm the bars in your hands or in water of 100 deg. or less before shaping. Use a gimlet or drill to make the holes for the candles. Shellac applied to the paraffin will prevent dripping

Ordinary liquid food color to which has been added an equal amount of denatured alcohol can be used to color candles. Apply the color by dipping or with a cotton swab. Designs and names may be also drawn on the candles with a small brush. To remove the color hold the candles under running cold water






Base of Kitchen Cabinet Rabbeted To Receive Edge of Floor Tile

Floor tile and linoleum can be fitted easily around a floor cabinet in the kitchen if the bottom outside edge of the cabinet is rabbeted to receive the floor covering. Before the cabinet is installed, the rabbet is cut \% in. up from the bottom and approximately \% in. deep. The undercut will allow up to \%-in. variation.


An old address or outdated price is easily blocked out with an eraser and stamp-pad ink. The eraser can be cut to the required size with a razor blade and used the same as a hand stamp. A wooden handle can be glued to the eraser if desired.

Painting Sequence for Door

Visible paint overlaps can be avoided when finishing a paneled door if the proper sequence is followed. Paint the molded edges first, working away from the corners, and then cover the panels. If any paint gets on the rails and stiles while doing the recessed areas, wipe it off immediately. After finishing the panels, start at the top crossrail and work down the vertical stiles, painting each rail as you come to it. Center stiles are painted down together with the outer stiles. Finish by painting the leading and trailing edge, being sure not to get paint on the opposite side of the door. Brush marks in enamel are avoided by using paint of the right consistency and working in a temperature above 65 deg. Paint should be applied sparingly so it does not sag or run, but enough must be used to cover the surface to eliminate touching up.


RADIO-PHONO CABINET


RATHER THAN REFINISH or rebuild that old radio-phonograph cabinet, why not build a "slip cover" for it, using wood and styling that match furnishings either in the den or family room? The cabinet pictured above at the right is made with a top section recessed in a manner similar to a dry sink which provides space for natural or artificial greenery. It is made of selected knotty pine and is de-signed to fit over the old cabinet pictured at the left, making it unnecessary to reassemble the record player and radio units. The alternate designs, center, suggest a traditional type and one of more modern lines with an island base. As will be seen from the detail the construction of the slip-over cabinet is simple, involving little more shop work than building a box. No dimensions are given. Access to records, the radio-control panel and record-player "drawer," will have to be carefully planned. In the cabinet pictured, the lefthand door is a false drawer front attached to the record-player slide. In this case, false hinges were used. For the alternate designs shown, plywood, faced in the wood desired, can be used for the sides and top.







CRAZY JIGSAW

An interesting pattern of interlocking curlicues is first drawn on two sides of a block of balsa wood as shown in the photo (left). Make the loops fairly large to avoid sharp turns with the jigsaw blade. A soft lead pencil should be used to draw lines so that marking indentations are not left in wood

Two cuts are made lengthwise along the block following the lines drawn on one side which produces three irregular-shaped strips. Before making the cuts remove the hold-down assembly from the saw. The saw table should be tilted slightly for all cuts, one degree is enough, so that pieces can be assembled from one side only

Fitted back together, the three strips are turned 90 degrees, bringing the other marked side up, and then clamped between two pieces of flat stock to prevent sideward motion. An extra C-clamp is kept handy for clamping the work behind the blade when the front one is removed. Feed the work slowly, keeping it flat on the table



BLOCK PUZZLE

HERE'S A PUZZLE for you to make which has a two-fold purpose; the first being a lesson in making intricate cuts with a jigsaw, and then hours of entertainment as you and your friends try to put the pieces back together. There are only two requirements for making the puzzle: access to a jigsaw and plenty of patience.


To start with, you'll need a piece of balsa or other softwood at least 2 in. square and 6 in. long. A pattern of interlocking loops is drawn on two sides of the block, and the jigsaw used to cut along the lines. Run the saw as slowly as possible with considerable tension on the blade. Feed the work gradually so the blade does not run off the line or break. If one should break, insert the new blade in the work at the point from which the cut was started. A small magnet will retrieve the bottom end of the broken blade if it cannot be reached with your fingers. Cuts should be made with a slight bevel, so a specific order has to be followed to assemble the puzzle.




Each of the nine strips formed by cutting the block lengthwise may then be crosscut into smaller pieces making this unusual puzzle even more complicated to put together


Pictured below are six strips as they appear before being cut apart. Crosscuts are made so that the pieces will interlock when put together. As each piece is cut out place it on a table in proper sequence so that the entire puzzle can be quickly assembled to check for fit. Chips caused by overlapping cuts are discarded, creating the effect of missing pieces when the puzzle is being assembled






Making a Print-Mounting Rule for Centering





Prints can be placed in the exact center of a mount quickly and easily with a plastic rule like the one shown in the illustration. It is made from a 1/8-in.-thick strip of clear plastic 24½ in. long by 2 in. wide. Two scales drawn on stiff paper are glued to the underside of the rule so they can be read through the plastic. The scales start at zero in the center and extend 12 in. in both directions. To use, place the print on the mount. Then place the rule on top of the print and adjust both the print and mount until opposite edges line up with identical markings on the rule. Then there will be an equal margin on both sides of the print. The same procedure is used to establish the top and bottom margins.



Golf Tees Support Vine On Mantel Trellis

Climbing plants kept on a mantel are suspended nicely with golf tees set into the holes of this trellis which is made from a sheet of perforated hardboard and framed with door trim. Rabbet the edge of the casing to fit the hardboard. The trellis may be finished with contrasting colors, or the panel painted to match the room decor and the frame finished clear. To hang the trellis on the wall, use two large L-hooks which will fit into the holes of the hardboard. Pointed ends of tees may have to be cut off.-William C. Eymann, Palo Alto, Calif.

Shingles Angle-Cut Uniformly




This miter box for shingles aids in making uniform diagonal cuts at the correct angle so that shingles will fit evenly at roof hips and valleys, and on gable-end walls. The guide strip is fastened to two strips of wood nailed at right angles on a large panel. With one

end free, the guide strip is aligned with a mark on the first shingle to be cut, and is then nailed in position. From then on make each diagonal cut in the fixture running the saw along the guide strip.

Chalk Wrapped With Tape Keeps Hands Free of Dust

To keep fingers free of chalk dust when writing on a blackboard, wrap the chalk spirally with electrician's plastic tape. As the chalk wears down, the tape is unwound to keep the end clear. The tape helps to prevent the chalk from breaking.

PORTRAIT DIFFUSION


IT IS JUST AS EASY to make a diffused portrait with a contact printer as it is with an enlarger, when a thin sheet of clear plastic the same size as the negative is used between the negative and print paper during the exposure. The ability of transparent plastic to diffuse light slightly is sufficient to soften harsh lines, conceal skin blemishes and reduce contrast generally. For most negatives, clear plastic .095 in. thick will provide adequate diffusion. Thin or extremely contrasted negatives require plastic that is slightly thicker to obtain enough diffusion.

If a heavily diffused print is desired, such as the one at the bottom of this page, it may be necessary to use plastic double the thickness needed to produce a portrait that is only moderately diffused—photograph above drawing. The photograph at the top of the page was printed without the plastic. Be sure the plastic is free of scratches and internal defects, which might cast a shadow and appear as a light streak or spot on the print. When not in use, store the plastic sheets in sheet-film boxes to keep free of lint.—Don Honick, Chicago.



Tie Rack Made From Wire Hanger



Heat Reseals Original Wrapper Around Exposed-Film Roll



Film-purchased in a moistureproof foil and plastic wrapper can be resealed in the original package, after the roll has been exposed, by using a warm iron. When first opening the package, remember to cut only a narrow strip from the laminated seal, leaving sufficient adhesive to be heated and pressed together when resealing.



Doors Kept From Swinging Shut

Doors that swing partly shut can be a hazard, particularly in the dark when their position cannot be determined. This situation is remedied without the use of door checks or stops by merely removing one or both of the hinge pins and bending them slightly. The friction of the bent pin will hold the door at any set position.






BED STORAGE HEADBOARD

A ROLL-AWAY BED for a week-end guest may be stored in this movable head-board, which can be dimensioned to fit any size folding bed. To make it, construct the upper and lower framework first, using 2 x 2-in. stock. Reinforce the corners of the lower frame with metal angle plates. Then cut the plywood panels to size, miter them at the vertical joints, and fasten them to the frames at top and bottom. Note that the top panel extends out over the fluorescent light fixture. Mount the fixture at the top of the front panel and run the cord through a hole, tacking it to the inside of the enclosure. Fasten the ends of the light shade to the front panel with dowels and nail the front of the shade to the top and ends. Tack a 1-in.-thick blanket of sponge rubber to the front of the headboard and cover it with a sheet of heavy plastic, which is tacked in place with ornamental upholstery nails. Now, turn the headboard upside down and install the casters, preferably piano casters which have a horizontal mounting plate. Turn the headboard back up on its wheels and finish it to blend with room decor.


Temporary Towel Rack for Guests Made From Dowels and Cord



This temporary towel rack solves the problem of hanging towels and washcloths for overnight guests in a home with limited bathroom accommodations. The rack, which consists of five 1/4 or 3/8in. dowel crossbars tied to two lengths of cord and suspended from screw hooks as shown, can be stored in a drawer when not in use. To identify matching towels and washcloths attach a piece of adhesive tape, with a guest's name or initials on it, to a spring-type clothespin and clip the latter on the appropriate washcloth. Paint crossbars and clothespins a matching color.

Replacing a Paring-Knife Handle

A broken handle on a paring knife can be replaced with two pieces of tempered hardboard. First remove the broken handle and use it as a pattern to cut the new pieces. Place them together in a vise and cut a slot in their abutting surfaces to accommodate the shank of the knife. Drill holes in each piece coinciding with those in the shank, apply waterproof glue to the adjoining surfaces, and fasten the new handle to the shank with brads, driving them through the holes. Clamp the handle together until dry and then file the brads flush with the surface of the handle. Sand edges of the handle smooth with fine abrasive paper. Courtesy of Masonite Corporation.



Battery Clip on Warning Flag Permits Quick Attachment

No time is wasted in tying or wiring a red warning flag to the end of a projecting load on a car or truck when the flag is attached to a large battery-cable clip that permits it to be snapped on or off in a moment. The flag can be attached to the clip by threading one corner of it through the cable end of the clip and knotting it as shown. If the flag has a grommet in one corner, twist a wire loop through the clip and the grommet. The clips can be purchased at most auto-supply stores.


RETOUCHING CASE

By Don Honick

You can do retouching of negatives almost anywhere with the aid of this portable retouching stand. Its glass-fitted cover is designed to be supported at an angle which permits negatives placed against the glass to be backlighted, and there is plenty of room inside the case for retouching equipment and materials.


Cut out the pieces for the case from ¼-in. plywood according to the dimensions given in the detail, right. After sanding the edges, glue and nail the pieces together as indicated. A 5 x 7-in. hole is cut in the cover for a sheet of frosted glass. Glue cleats around the opening on the inside edges on which to rest the glass, and then glue the glass to the cleats. Cut two identical support arms from ¼-in. ply-

wood and bolt them to the sides of the case so they will fold inside when the cover is closed, and will position the cover at a 60-deg. angle when it is open. The ends of the arms rest against ½-in.-sq. cleats glued to the underside of the cover. Hinge the cover to the case and install a hasp and handle. A strip of elastic tacked inside the case will keep retouching fluids from sliding around when the case is carried. Cement a felt disk to each corner of the case bottom to prevent it scratching a table.



Print Contrast Controlled By Brighter Bulb


When making prints with a condenser enlarger, greater contrast can be produced by using a bulb that will give the brightest workable light. Most condenser enlargers will take bulbs of high or low light intensities. With a brighter bulb you can reduce the enlarger aperture so that the depth of field will help conceal slight buckles in the negative being printed.



INCREASING USE OF home electrical appliances and also the higher current requirements of newer-type individual appliances make the wiring of many older homes inadequate to handle the load safely. Compare, as an example, the 300 to 500-watt rating of earlier electric irons with a modern iron which requires up to 1000 watts. The same increase in current requirements is true of certain other appliances. Also, the regular electric service of 20 or more years ago was planned before such electrically operated units as clothes driers, water heaters, home-shop power tools, kitchen ranges and air conditioners

became standard household equipment. Wires carrying current throughout the house have a certain resistance to the flow of current. This is greater for the smaller sizes of wire and less for the larger sizes, Table I, also Fig. 2. Thus when planning an all-new service, or additions to an older service, the wire size becomes important. Voltage drop on inadequate supply lines not only reduces the actual voltage available at the appliance, it also sets a definite limit to the amount of current that can be


carried safely by a wire of a given size. Table I gives safe capacities for the common sizes of house wiring, also the voltage



drop at these currents per 50 ft. of circuit. Voltage drop should not exceed 2 percent on branch lines with lights or 5 percent under any conditions. A drop in voltage greater than these percentages is not only power wasted, it can become a hazard. Electric power is measured in watts and many appliances have the rated wattage and voltage stamped on the name plate. From this it is possible to calculate current requirements (amps.) simply by dividing the watts by the voltage. On fractional-hp. motors in such sizes as are used on household appliances, the amperage usually is stamped on the name plate. Using this information it is possible to determine the total current requirements of a number of appliances. Fig. 1, which is purely representative and not intended to be in any way typical, pictures the appliances commonly operated on the 115-v., 60-amp. service, the branch lines


being fused to 15 amps. Such units as the electric range, clothes drier, water heater and certain types of air conditioners require a 230-v., 100-amp. service.

The amount of current available at each outlet depends on the wire size of the supply lines, the number of branch lines carrying current to outlets throughout the house and also on the number of taps into current flowing to each branch line. With an inadequate service, overloading of one branch in effect robs others of current and may cause a voltage drop below the nominal limits throughout the system. Wattage used up in line loss heats the wires. The resistance of the overloaded wires increases as they warm up. Thus if overloading goes beyond safe limits for an appreciable length

of time the wires may heat to the point of igniting the insulation. Over a long period of time there is equal hazard in the cumulative effect of a continuing overloaded condition, which is certain to cause a breakdown of the insulation.

When planning an adequate service for an older home, decide on the number of additional outlets, lights and switches. Then you can plan the special-purpose circuits and other wiring which are to be added. Figs. 3 and 4 suggest a procedure in planning. Minimum standards call for one outlet for each 20 ft. of wall, but usually it is better to reduce this to one outlet for each 12 ft. of wall, or simply plan enough outlets so that no point on a usable wall is more than 6 ft. from an outlet, and in the kitchen about 4 ft.

In older homes most of the branch circuits are general-purpose circuits supplying both lights and outlets for appliances.

Usually these will have a capacity of 15 amps., depending on the wire size. This means that the maximum power that can be taken from them is about 1725 watts, less if the wire size is smaller than No. 14. Modern homes will require at least one appliance circuit for outlets in the kitchen, dining room, breakfast room and laundry to handle heavy-current appliances. These outlets usually are wired with No. 12 wire and fused for 20 amps. The appliance circuit should carry all outlets in these rooms (except clock outlets), but no outlets in any other rooms and no light fixtures. Note Tables IV and V. the latter summarizing specifications for branch circuits.

A check list of the actual load on general-purpose and appliance circuits, of which Table VI is a sample, is helpful in planning wiring layout and calculating the total amperage. Note also Tables IV, VII and VIII in this connection.

Individual appliances drawing over 16 amps., such as a range, water heater and the electric drier, require special circuits, Fig. 5. Independent circuits, although not necessary, are desirable for large motors, or groups of motors, such as power tools in the home shop. Independent circuits prevent dimming of lights due to the heavy starting current required by the larger motors. When making up the check list of outlets, lighting fixtures and the wattage of lamps and appliances, include all those appliances you may add in the future. Where two appliances are of a type never used simultaneously, list only the one with the highest wattage. Convert watts to amps. by





dividing the total by the line voltage and you have the current requirement. Since the load connected to any branch must not exceed its capacity-better slightly under full capacity-you can easily determine the number of branch circuits required to carry the estimated load. This method is reasonably accurate when estimating wiring requirements for both old and new homes, but before actual work is carried out you must make sure that the procedures are in accordance with local and national electrical codes.

When you plan to increase the demand on an existing installation the wire size, service capacity and the type of service, whether 2 or 3-wire, are important considerations. Appliance circuits on No. 12 wire are now required in most localities. Circuits on which lights are used cannot be fused for more than 20 amps. See Table V. Special-purpose circuits, Fig. 5, for larger appliances should use the size of wire required by their current demand. The total current requirement generally is used in determining the size of serviceentrance conductors and the amp. rating of the service-entrance switch and the fuses required. The current demand of a range is determined separately from Table III and added to the other requirements. In figuring a new service entrance, either for new construction or for an existing installation, it's best to anticipate possible future demand and go beyond that required at present, both in wire size and type of service.

At present electricity is supplied to homes either by 2-wire 110, 115 or 120-v. systems or by 3-wire 110/220, 115/230 or 120/240-v. systems, 115/230-v. being perhaps the most common of the 3-wire services. The 2 and 3-wire systems are diagrammed in Figs. 6 and 7. The 3-wire system provides both voltages and should be installed wherever possible as it offers several advantages. Because the 3wire system doubles the voltage, smaller wires can be used from entrance to main switch. Smaller fuses are required. As an example, a 13,000-watt service would require 120-amp, fuses and main switch and No. 0 wire size on a 2-wire, 115-v. system. The same





service would require only 60-amp. fuses and No. 4 wire on a 3-wire 115-230-v. system. Appliances which take a heavier current, also larger shop motors, usually are designed for 230-v. current. Motors of ½ hp. and larger generally are arranged for operation on either 115 or 230-v. current. On the higher voltage the units require less current and can be operated with smaller sizes of wire.

Grounding is simple and 230 v. can be obtained even though the potential at no point exceeds 115 v. above ground. The 3-wire system also provides a better-balanced load condition. Most power suppliers require a 3-wire installation when new wiring is added to existing systems.

Existing installations, especially those in older homes, should be carefully checked over before planning new additions to the service. Condition of the existing wiring and the wire size are important considerations, also the method of grounding the system. Proper grounding means that one side of the 115-v. system, or the center point of the 230-v. circuit, is directly connected to moist earth. Acceptable methods of grounding are shown in Figs. 8 and 9. When special-purpose circuits are added to an existing system, wiring through the special-purpose fuse boxes must be properly carried out. Fig. 10 shows acceptable methods.



Breaking in Newly M'xed Developer

When starting to use a fresh batch of developer, whether for prints or negatives, it is best to start the chemicals working with a dummy sheet of emulsion. In the case of printing, if the developer has not been "mellowed," it may give a false timing. When developing negatives, the fresh light action of the chemicals combined with the lack of a "stabilizer" would otherwise tend to spot the negatives and cause extreme contrasts. There is no added expense in the conditioning process, since you can use scraps of previously exposed paper or film which you normally throw away. If a sheet of exposed paper the same size as the developer tray is left in the bottom of the tray, as shown, it will aid in determining contrasts when developing prints.



Several colors may be combined for a particular shade, mixing three parts of color to one part of glycerin. A temporary pad for a particular color can be made with a few layers of flannel cloth placed in the top of a flat pocket-size tobacco can.—Ken Murray, Colon, Mich.





Plane Has Wood Guide Fence For Edge-Planing Accurately

Square or angular edge-planing can be done more accurately if a fence is attached to the side of the plane. Close-grained hardwood should be used for the fence, which is rabbeted along one side so that the block extends under the bottom edge of the plane slightly. Matching holes are drilled in the fence and plane, those in the latter being tapped for 1/4-20 screws. Sand the surface of the block that contacts the work smooth and apply a coat of wax to minimize friction.


Ice Preserves Cut Flowers





MILLING ATTACHMENT for your lathe

By J. C. Magee

BUILDING A MILLING ATTACHMENT for your lathe is like adding a small milling machine to your metalworking equipment. Nearly all machining on the attachment can be done on the lathe, the only exceptions being certain tapping and filing operations. The attachment pictured above and detailed on the following pages has been especially designed with round slides to eliminate cutting of dovetail slides, an operation difficult to carry out in the small shop with limited equipment. The unit is made with a flat mounting plate grooved on one face for locating work in a true horizontal plane. The location of the groove and the pattern of tapped holes for mounting work, vises and other fixtures is not given, as these must be arranged according to the requirements of the operator.

Before you begin construction note three dimensions carefully, the diameter of the drill-rod slides, the hole diameter on the top and bottom spacer bars and the hole diameter on the mounting bracket. Polished drill rod generally is held to very close tolerances in manufacture, but where you have to machine parts to a sliding fit and a press fit on two rods it is necessary to know the precise diameter of the rods throughout the length. Check carefully with a micrometer. If, for example, both rods check 1.000, or slightly under, then you can hold the hole dimensions in the spacer bars to 1.0005, rather than the 1.005 indicated on the details.

The hole dimension on the mounting bracket, .9997, is calculated to give a press fit of the rods, but it also is dependent to


some extent on the mike reading of the rods. If the rods are over (a 1.000-plus reading on the mike) then it may be necessary to increase the hole diameters in the mounting bracket slightly in order to obtain a press fit without heating.


Construction of the attachment can be simplified by boring the top and bottom spacers and the mounting bracket to a close fit on the rods and then using setscrews to hold the rods in the mounting bracket. This procedure will give you an attachment sufficiently accurate for all practical work but not for jobs calling for a high degree of precision. Note that the upper ends of the rods are shouldered 1/8 in, and the holes in the top plate are counterbored to take the projections. Note also that the arbor flange fits into a counterbore in the top plate. The arbor thread can be right or left-hand as desired. Some operators prefer a left-hand thread on a raising and lowering screw, or arbor. On the original attachment, holes in the upper ends (shouldered ends) of the rods, or slides, were tapped for 16-in. screws and are so specified in details at the right. However, there is less danger of distorting the projections when hand-tapping the holes if the ends of the slides are drilled and tapped for 1/4-20 screws as indicated on the opposite page.

The top spacer bar is slotted after boring, the slots running in from the edge at an angle of 30 deg. Note that the holes for the clamping screws are drilled body size from the edge to the slots. Beyond the slots the holes are drilled tap size. This procedure is necessary to permit a clamping action on the drill-rod slides when the screws


are tightened.

It is necessary that the bores in the spacer bars and mounting plate be located precisely, especially the spacing of the holes. To handle such a job with the required accuracy, machinists generally use toolmaker's buttons which are center-drilled and hardened and ground to close dimensions. However, shop-made tool-steel buttons will serve the purpose if you take time to do an accurate job of turning to size. In practice, the buttons are indicated (with a dial indicator) after the work is mounted on the lathe faceplate. As the first step, locate the hole centers, using a scriber on a surface plate. Prick-punch the hole centers, recheck, and then drill and tap for 10-32 screws as in the lower right-hand detail on the opposite page. Mount the buttons on the work and clamp lightly to the large faceplate, counterbalancing with a weight. Then indicate one button (with a dial indicator), shifting the work until the button runs dead true. Clamp the work securely to the faceplate, recheck after

clamping, then remove button, leaving work centered for boring. Indicate each button in this manner before boring the hole.

Dimensions of the clamping plate are laid out to fit the compound of a 9-in. lathe. Be sure to check measurements of the compound T-slot before making this part to fit your own lathe, as it may be necessary to alter the dimensions to assure correct mounting. The plate should be a close slid-

ing fit in the compound T-slot.


On the original unit the top plate was machined from brass. Use of brass makes a somewhat easier operating unit, as the top plate serves as a thrust bearing for the arbor. However, use of brass is not essential. Steel of the type known to the trade as "free machining" is probably best for making the spacer bars, mounting bracket, top plate and clamping plate. Although the mounting bracket can be cut to the rough shape with an ordinary hacksaw, it may be possible to order it flame-cut and thus save considerable labor and time. If this is done all that will be necessary is to clean up with a file and round the corners.

The handwheel, or palm wheel, shown in the upper right-hand detail on the preceding page, can be made as indicated, or a ball crank substituted. Many users will prefer a ball crank, although a palm wheel gives a somewhat closer control for fine settings of the work-mounting plate. * * *

■ Concentrate the light in your workshop, if it is equipped with only a bare bulb, by using one of the small deep foil plates used for freezing food. Cut a round hole in the center and slide it over the small end of the bulb.

Centering Milling Cutter

When cutting keyways, the milling cutter can be centered accurately over the work by using a short piece of drill rod as a gauge. To arrive at the diameter of the drill rod to be used, subtract the width of the cutter from the diameter of the work and divide the re-




mainder by 2. Place the gauge between the side of the cutter and the vertical edge of a toolmaker's square which is butted against the side of the work. Adjust the worktable of the mill until the gauge just touches both the cutter and the square.

Metal Rib Stiffens Hacksaw Blade For Cutting in Confined Place

When it is necessary to use a hacksaw blade without the frame, a section of umbrella rib crimped over the back of the blade will help stiffen it so it won't buckle when being used. Use pliers to pinch the rib over the edge of the blade and then bind the two together at the ends by wrapping with several turns of friction tape. The taped ends also will provide a better grip on the blade.

Metal Cut in "Wood Sandwich"


Thin-gauge sheet metal can be hacksawed without being twisted, or breaking the saw blade, if the metal is sandwiched between two scraps of wood and clamped in a vise. Mark a line on the metal, offset 1 in. from the line to be cut, and align it with the edge of the wood. The cut is then made 1 in. from the end of the wood.






CUSTOM CABINET PULLS

By Ralph Treves









IF YOU PREFER something beside stock types of door and drawer pulls, there are many solid-brass fittings and stock of various shapes that can be made into distinctive hardware. Among the fittings that can be used are such things as boat hardware to provide a nautical motif for a game room or a boy's room. Another example would be to use small door knockers as pulls. Solid-brass stock is available in a variety of shapes, including flats, rounds, hexagons and special shapes, such as the stock used to make the door pulls illustrated in this article. This latter type stock usually is sold in odd lengths, and is handled by hardware stores catering to the hobbyist and do-it-yourself craftsman. If stock of an unusual shape is used, cut the ends of the pulls at an angle, so the unusual design is accented. To saw accurate angle cuts,

make a miter box from a metal channel, as shown in Fig. 1, and clamp the stock to one side. Fig. 2 details the method of attaching the pull to the door or drawer. Blind holes are drilled and tapped on the back sides, then spacers, which are short lengths of brass round stock drilled through, are fitted between the pulls and the surfaces to which they are attached. The screws are driven into the pulls from inside the doors so they do not show. To obtain a high polish on the brass, first clean it with steel wool, then buff it on a buffing wheel, Fig. 3, using jewelers' rouge. Do not use brass polish, since the metal must be perfectly clean to receive clear lacquer or plastic spray. Application of either of these two materials will assure that the brass stays shining and corrosion-free for years, eliminating the need for frequent polishing.

Straw-Insulated Hog Shelters Used the Year Around



Mineral-Feed Trough From Drum





Cracked Turkey Eggs Patched With Tape for Hatching

Turkey eggs that ordinarily cannot be used for hatching purposes because of cracked or "toe marked" shells are repaired with cellophane tape by one turkey breeder who reports successful incubation of 55 percent for the taped eggs. Almost any size crack can be sealed with tape so that it can go through a hatching process. Small cracks and thin shells can be detected at the time of candling and taped before any further damage occurs.

V-Clamp Holds Round Stock for End-Drilling

This shop-designed V-clamp was originally made to release a lathe for other work and permit fast end-drilling of short lengths of round stock on a drill press. Using the same design principle, dimensions can be altered to suit any special purpose. As detailed above, the clamp is suitable only for short length of stock not exceeding 1 in. in diameter. The steel clamp

block should be finished all over either by filing or milling. Special care must be taken when elongating the center hole to form the vee, or crotch. The clamp screw can be any handy size, but in any case the end should be shouldered and squared in the lathe and preferably hardened so that it will fit squarely against the workpiece.

Tubing Bent With Pulley

I used an ordinary V-pulley of the right diameter and clamped it by its hub in a vise. Then, by hand I wrapped the pieces of tubing around the wheel. Perfectly round, smooth bends were obtained because the V-shaped walls of the wheel supported the tubing on each side.







Drill-Bit Size Marked Legibly On Paper Tab Glued in Flute

HOW WOULD WITH YOUR

Q-How do you drill a hole in a piece of wood that is thicker than the drill bit is long?

A-MAKE A POSITION JIG so that you can drill from both sides of the work and keep the holes aligned. To make the jig, clamp a board to the drill-press table and drill a hole in it of the same diameter as the hole to be drilled in the workpiece. Next, drill a hole in one side of the work, then invert it over a short length of dowel fitted in the hole in the board. The hole drilled from the opposite side of the work now will be in perfect alignment

Q-What drill-press accessory is especially useful when building furniture where it is necessary to cover the screwheads for a more finished and professional appearance?

A—THE TOOL YOU NEED is called a plug cutter. In effect it is a hollow drill that produces plugs equal to its inside diameter. Plugs are cut from the stock used for the furniture and driven into counterbored holes in which the screws have been driven. The plugs are allowed to project slightly, then sanded flush. Other uses for the plugs include the repair of screw holes that have become oversize. The hole is bored out large enough to accept a wooden plug wiped with glue. A pilot hole then is drilled in the plug and the screw is reinserted


Q—To assure accuracy when drilling a hole down the center of a dawel, rod or other cylinder, what procedure should be used on a drill press?

A-MAKE A CLAMP, consisting of two wooden V-blocks cut on a table saw and held together with bolts and wing nuts. On a vertical drill press it will be necessary to attach the clamp to some sort of a base to hold it vertical. If you have a combination power tool that can be set up as a horizontal drill press, a base will not be necessary, as the work can be clamped to the table as shown in the photograph. Another advantage of the horizontal drill press is that work of almost any length can be end drilled

YOU DO IT DRILL PRESS?

Q—What setup on a drill press will permit accurate drilling of holes to receive splayed legs for a table?


A—CLAMP TWO PIECES OF WOOD to the drill-press table to form a V-block, or, as shown in the photograph, if your drill-press table has a miter gauge, use it for one side of the V-block. Adjust the table to the desired angle, then drill all four holes. This method also can be used for round work by drawing a radius through each hole location and keeping it aligned with the drill bit while drilling the hole





A—PLACE A PIECE OF WOOD between the workpiece and the fence as shown in the photograph, so the chisel will bear against it and stay aligned. If your drill-press table is not equipped with a fence, clamp a strip of wood to the table to act as one. Although the photograph indicates that the work is being held by hand, for safety and greater accuracy, both the workpiece and the piece of wood used to keep the chisel aligned should be clamped to the fence

Q—To make a joint by which two pieces of wood can be joined in a sliding arrangement, what drillpress attachment can be used?

A—A DOVETAIL CUTTER does the job nicely. To cut the slot accurately for the slide, make a setup like the one shown in the large photograph. A fence—which can be a strip of wood clamped to the drill-press table—is used to guide work under the cutter and the work then is held in alignment by a clamp arrangement as indicated. The dovetail tenon is cut in a similar manner as illustrated in the inset photograph. To assure that the wooden members will slide freely, cut the tenon sufficiently undersize to provide clearance, should the wood expand from moisture








Pickup Truck Has Combination Carrying Rack on Front Bumper





The combination carrying rack and grill guard fitted on the front bumper of the pickup truck shown is made of welded steel and is designed to carry boxes, barrels, bags of feed and other objects when the rack is lowered. When it is up the rack serves as a sturdy grill guard. Also, a pivoted bracket can be swung out on either side of the truck for carrying pipe or lumber. Angle iron and flat steel are used for the framework of the unit. The two end bars are 34in, pipe that reinforce the rack and serve as shafts for the pipe-carrying extensions. The rack can be raised or lowered by means of simple hinges that are fastened to the bumper supports. The lowered rack is supported by the bumper.-F. Leland Elam, Sacramento, Calif.







Peep-Sight Level Measures Tree Height


HERE'S A TOOL which not only aids in laying out a driveway or leveling a plot of sloping ground but also can be used to measure the height of a tree or structure too difficult to measure by other means. It consists of a 12-in. spirit level, two anglebrace sights, a protractor and a weighted pointer. Assembled as shown in the photo at the right, the unit may be fastened to a camera tripod. Precision sights may be purchased for mounting on the level, but relatively accurate sights can be made from two 1-in. angle brackets as shown below and at the right. The protractor is fastened to the side of the level with its center point 2% in. from the front end and ½ in. down from the top. Cut the pointer from thin metal to the pattern given in the detail. An adjustable balance weight for the pointer is made from a bolt and two cap nuts. Suspend the pointer from a nail driven into the level at the center point of the protractor. For tripod mounting, recess a mending strip in the bottom edge of the level, centering it 5 in. from the sighting end. Drill and tap a hole through the strip to accommodate the mounting screw of the tripod. To measure the height of an object a known distance away follow the formula given below:

Plaster Stain

Q-We've just moved into a new home and we notice a reddish-brown streak on the plastered ceiling of the living room. It cannot be removed by washing and on close examination it appears to be in the plaster and not on the surface. The room has not yet been painted. What could cause this?—B. H., Mass.

A—Judging from your description we would guess offhand that the streak is a sap stain from one of the ceiling joists, or is caused by a slow leak in the roof, or by some foreign substance which found its way into the plaster at the time of mixing and did not show up as a discoloration until the walls dried out. This is a comparatively rare occurrence, but it is a possibility to be considered. If there is a leak and the streak is due to the presence of moisture, repairing the leak may or may not eliminate the discoloration. We would suggest that you first make sure that the plaster is dry, then sand the discolored area lightly with medium and fine sandpaper. The chances are good that this treatment either will remove the discoloration entirely or at least reduce it to such an extent that it will not show under paint. After sanding, coat the area with white shellac.



Screens Rust

Q—Two years ago I purchased ready-made galvanized window screens and while taking them down this fall I noticed rust spots on some of the lower panels. I was rather surprised as I thought galvanizing would protect the screen for at least 5 years. I coated the frames with spar varnish. I don't want to use paint if avoidable. What other protective coating can I use?


—C. N., Mich.

A—We would, of course, recommend painting the screen wire and frames, as the pigment finish is perhaps the more durable when compared with any clear finish. However, if you wish to retain the original natural wood finish then, of course, a transparent finish must be used for refinishing. Spar varnish will give reasonably good service on the screen frames and it also can be used on the

Care and Feeding of Engines

CRANKCASE DILUTION

Driving habits can contribute to sludge in your crankcase and sluggishness in your engine. Slow speeds and short trips keep the engine too cool to vaporize the normal condensation. Sludge results. You can help

correct this by changing oil oftener, draining out the water with the drained oil. Also, you can increase engine operating temperature by using a 180° thermostat—in which case, use only permanent anti-freeze.




SLUDGE IN THE CRANKCASE

nent anti-freeze. Sluggish operation may also be caused by a thermostat which is stuck in the open position. If your water gauge shows engine to be operating at less than 180°, have thermostat checked or replaced with a new one.

MANIFOLD HEAT CONTROL VALVE

The job of the manifold heat control valve is to heat the fuel mixture during engine warm-up, while the valve is closed. It should open thermostatically as



soon as the engine is warm. If it is stuck and stays closed, the fuel stays too hot and too lean, the engine may miss, the effect of a good tune-up be ruined. Don't blame spark plugs un't lyou check this valve, which is mounted in exhaust manifold below the carburetor. (In Ford V-8's, it is in the crossover pipe ahead of the right manifold.) If you find this valve is stuck, free it by lubricating with a mixture of kerostoners.

MANIFOLD HEAT CONTROL with a mixture of kerosene and soda, or use a good carburetor cleaning fluid.

screen wire to give fair protection against corrosion. Although it can be applied to the wire mesh with a small brush, it is better to make an applicator by tacking a strip of pile carpet (a strip cut from an old rug is just the thing provided it is clean) to a block of wood. With this type of applicator you can apply the varnish uniformly to the screen wire. Before refinishing, clean rust from the wire with a stiff-bristle brush. A suede shoebrush is just the thing. To avoid extensive rust damage it's a good idea to refinish the screens as soon as possible after you take them down.



Trimming Evergreens

Q-I have several large evergreens on my property which have grown to a height of about 20 ft., some higher, and now the lower branches on nearly all of these trees seem to be dy-ing out. The trees are what I would call uniformly well-shaped individual specimens and I would like to preserve them if pos-sible. I've thought of trimming them out to a height of 5 ft. or more above ground but have been advised against it. Is there any reason why these lower branches should not be removed? Will the trees be harmed in any way?-A. L., Mo.

A—What kind of evergreens? Unfortunately, you did not say and that makes it difficult for us to give you a definite answer. There are many different forms, or types, of evergreens and pruning trimming or shearing procedures must be varied to suit. You say your evergreens have grown to a height of 20 ft. or more and that would ordinarily indicate they are of the medium or tall-growing pyramidal type. As a rule the various types require very little trimming or shearing except perhaps to correct growth faults that develop as a result of injury or from other causes. However, there may be some reason to consider pruning the lower limbs of an older tree such as the blue spruce, for example, older specimens of which often have lower limbs practically defoliated from the trunk well outward toward the tips. Generally this is a natural growth process, but sometimes more extensive defoliation is due to what is known as needle cast, which may be caused by any one of several types of fungi. Defoliation of lower limbs gives the tree a scraggly appearance which may justify cutting these off to the height you suggest. When this is done, care must be taken not to damage the bark. Ordinarily pruning of this kind should be carried out in the late fall.

Waterproof Concrete-Masonry Walls

Q-I'm planning a home and intend to begin construction next spring, using blocks for the walls and a concrete-slab floor. Cinder blocks seem to the cheapest in this locality, but I'm doubtful about using them as I'm told they are not waterproof. What are your recommendations?—K.B., Tex.

A—Cinder blocks are quite widely used in light building construction, both in residential and industrial types. In regular building practice the outside of the wall is finished with cement plaster or cement stucco and coated with a transparent waterproofer. However, for home construction we would tend to favor the use of standard concrete blocks made with cement, sand and gravel or other aggregates used in the regular heavyweight blocks, or lightweight blocks made with light aggregates other than cinders. We think you would find either of these more satisfactory in the long run. To assure a sound, durable wall good practice in concrete-masonry construction must be carried out in all details.



Richelieu, the first of these, came out in 1946, and since then many other vessels of all types have been "prefabricated."

An exquisite little "mass produced" Mediterranean xebec, for example, was among the wedding presents received by Prince Rainier and Grace Kelly.

One of the first exhibits you will see as you enter the Musee de la Marine is a magnificent model of a frigate mounted on a pedestal and sealed in a dustproof glass case a yard high. The price of this, including the case, is about \$300. The same model made to order commercially would probably cost between \$2000 and \$3000.

Model for Nonexistent Ship

Next to the frigate, you will see one of the richest and most precious exhibits of the entire collection. It is an exquisitely decorated and fully rigged model (scale \\\^{1}/36\)) of a 17th-century 124-cannon ship of the line called the Louis XV. No actual French man-of-war ever bore this name, but the model, perfect in every one of its luxurious details, was specially made for the nautical instruction of the youthful Louis XV some 250 years ago.

A little less elaborate but equally beautiful are the museum's models of galleys. These craft were usually about 155 feet long, with a beam of some 20 feet. Most of the deck space was taken up by 25 or 30 rough benches, divided by a catwalk along which a guard patrolled. Approximately 250 galley slaves, chained to their places, tugged at the oars, and the moment one of them weakened, the guard's lash cracked across his bare back. Safely removed from the filth and stench of the human engines, the officers stuck to their quarters in the delicately decorated poop.

First Steamboat

We Americans are prone to think of Robert Fulton as the inventor of the steamboat, but Fulton himself never made any such claim, for he was well aware that in 1776, 16 years before he demonstrated his boat on the Seine, the Marquis de Jouffroy d'Abbans had launched a successful boat propelled by steam. Later the Frenchman built a larger steamboat, which for many years maintained a regular service on the Saone River between Macon and Lyon.

The museum possesses a model of one of Jouffroy d'Abbans' early steamboats, so well constructed that, after 175 years, it can still run under its own power.

France's first propeller-driven ship was (Continued to page 246)

the Corse, a 515-ton aviso built in 1842 and remaining in service until 1890, while the historic Napoleon, a 5120-ton, 94-cannon three-mast ship built at Toulon in 1850, was the world's first propeller-driven man-of-war. It had a speed of 13 knots.

The Napoleon was designed by a brilliant young naval engineer, Stanislas Dupuy de Lome, who also had the honor of designing the 5618-ton Gloire, the first armored ship ever made. Launched in 1859, this famous vessel marked the beginning of modern navies. It was copied by all the great powers and, between 1862 and 1864, France built 11 ships which were almost identical. Models of the Corse, Napoleon and Gloire, as well as scores of other historically important steamships, are exhibited in the museum.

Along with the magnificent models that trace the development of French ship-building are many curiosities. Perhaps the most astonishing of these is the exquisite model of a fully rigged 88-cannon warship which the City of Dieppe presented to Empress Marie Louise when, in 1811 a few weeks after her visit to this port with Napoleon, she gave birth to a son. The allegorical sea horses drawing the ship, as well as every single one of the hundreds of details, including the sails, banners and rigging, are carved out of ivory.

Ebony and Ivory Model

Another exhibit of which the museum is particularly proud is its model (scale 1/40) of the century-old man-of-war Valmy, for this fine ship is built of ebony and ivory, with the metalwork in sterling silver. Six craftsmen worked five years to make it.


Together with the priceless Louis XV and beautifully sculptured 17th-century man-of-war Soleil-Royal, these two models are possibly the most valuable in the entire collection. But nobody knows what they or the other miniature vessels in the museum are worth—that is, what price they would bring if put up for sale today. None has ever been placed on public sale.

Even in the rare cases where the museum has actually bought models, the price paid has little relation to what they could be sold for today. A striking example of this is the model of the *Muiron* (scale ½), for which the museum paid 310 gold francs, or about \$77 in 1836.

The real Muiron was a 44-cannon frigate built at Venice in 1797. It was captured by the French shortly afterward, and in 1799 brought General Bonaparte back from Egypt to France, successfully evading the British fleet. Bonaparte was so delighted with the ship that he ordered the present

model in 1803, and kept it on the desk of his bedchamber right up to his downfall. Obviously the original purchase price of 310 francs furnishes little clue as to what a museum or private collector would be willing to pay for this ship today.

Largest Model

Near the door of the Musee de la Marine stands its largest model, l'Ocean, a vessel of 120 cannon, 20 feet long and 16½ feet high. Built for the instruction of sailors, the outsize model somehow came into the possession of a Belgian showman, who exhibited it in country fairs along the Franco-Belgian border. He also used it for another purpose. Every time he brought it into France, its hold was filled with lace and precious stones. The French customs finally caught up to him. L'Ocean was seized and eventually given to the museum.

The centerpiece of the vast collection of famous and curious ships, of marine paintings and documents, of figureheads and ship's gear and of all manner of other things that tell the story of man's struggle to conquer the sea is Le Canot de l'Empereur. This is not a model but the original, a graceful and beautifully decorated boat more than 57 feet long, which was rowed

by a crew of 24 men.


This priceless craft has a curious history. In 1811, when Napoleon announced that he was going to Antwerp to inspect the defenses at the mouth of the Scheldt, it was decided that he must have a boat worthy of him. Plans were hastily drawn up, a sculptor went to work at once on the decorations, and in 21 days and nights of uninterrupted labor the craft was completed. Two days later, Napoleon was taken in it to visit the port. He never used it again.

Stored away in the Brest arsenal, it was only taken out 47 years later, when Napoleon III and Empress Eugenie paid a visit to the naval base. It served a final time in 1903, a half-century later, when President

Emile Loubet went to Brest.

After that this fine boat, with the lifesize gilt figure of Neptune sitting on its prow and its luxurious cabin filled with dust and memories, lay forgotten at Brest for another 40 years. Then in 1943, at a time when the Germans, confident that they would win the war, were already planning a postwar Paris of their making, it was decided to bring the Emperor's boat to Paris. With the Germans taking charge of everything the craft was loaded on a special car and, since it protruded far over the sides, the track in the opposite direction was cleared during its voyage from Brest.

In Paris, however, manpower could not (Continued to page 252)





be spared to get the bulky exhibit into the Palais de Chaillot, and consequently it was left outside in a makeshift shelter until the war's end. A huge hole was then cut in the wall and, on July 28, 1945, 134 years after it was built, the Canot de l'Empereur moved into its permanent home. There is also a model of it in the museum.

Beginnings of the Museum

This was one of the final steps in forming France's great ship museum, which had its beginnings 277 years ago, in 1679.

In that year, Jean-Baptiste Colbert, Louis XIV's illustrious minister, took a step of primary importance in the history of shipbuilding. Until then vessels had been constructed almost by improvisation.

Colbert now ordered the superintendents of all navy yards to make a model, on the scale of ½ or ½ of every ship they built, and he further specified that "these models must be made with such precision that they may serve for the measurements and proportions of any ships built in the future."

In the century that followed the orders, magnificent collections grew up in the various arsenals. Members of Royalty and the Court began seeking models to add to their private collections of curios. In this way the arsenal exhibitions were pretty thoroughly ransacked by the influential people of the country.

During the French Revolution many collections of the emigrating nobility were seized and placed on display, but some years passed before these ships, the royal collection and numerous models from the arsenals were united in a single museum. This was opened to the public in 1833 on the top floor of the Louvre.


When the huge old Trocadero was made over into the Palais de Chaillot for the 1937 World's Fair, part of one wing was given to the Musee de la Marine, which by then was run by the Navy. But only toward the end of the war could the museum start moving into its splendid new quarters.

The new museum has been managed from the start by Lt. Comdr. Jacques Vichot.

A well-stocked marine library and documentation service is open to the public for research, and naval experts are available for technical information. Twice a month visitors are conducted through the workrooms where the models are built.

The models that have been accumulated over the last 2½ centuries continue to increase. The storerooms are stuffed with models that can't be placed on exhibition. And, a decade after moving in, the Navy is beginning to grumble that its magnificent quarters are too small for the proper display of its incomparable collections. ***





In the training of trail horses the rider and the horse should both be properly educated to recognize when an obstacle is not safe for crossing.

The rider should be aware that the horse can often sense hidden dangers that may not be apparent to the human eye. One device used at a horse show was a huge tractor tire covered with a canvas. The depression in the middle was filled with water.

This was an extremely hazardous obstacle. It was meant to be the type the horse should refuse, and the rider should recognize the horse was right. Several horses approached it, then shied away. But most of them, when the riders insisted, proceeded. Each stepped into the hazard and promptly slipped.

Finally one good rider approached the hazard. The horse refused to go through. Three times this was repeated with the same result. Without forcing the horse through, the man rode on to the next hazard.

The judges awarded the rider first place in the event. He and his horse both had trail know-how. It was brought out in the show arena and it would also be put to work on the open-country trail.


Radiation Detector Clipped to Clothes

Plastic beads that acquire an electrostatic charge when shaken are used in a new radiation detector that may be clipped to the clothes or placed on a table. The charged beads repel each other and cling to the sealed glass walls of the dosimeter. When 50 roentgen units of radiation have accumulated, however, the beads lose their



charge and fall out of sight. Fifty roentgens is approximately one eighth the amount of radiation the average person can withstand. The dosimeter is intended for personnel in areas where exposure may occur and for the general public in the event of an atomic attack.



these are ailments or hazards that can be controlled with proper precautions. And here is where the Occupational Health Field Center enters the picture. The center, which occupies one floor of a rambling brick building in downtown Cincinnati, is staffed by experts.

Lab Has Four Sections

The laboratory is divided into four sections: Toxicology, medical, engineering, and the program or planning section which investigates problems and plans the laboratory's work. The toxicologists investigate substances to determine whether they may contain enough toxicants to damage workmen. The medical section deals in treatment. The engineering section works with such problems as mine and factory ventilation and soundproofing.

In addition to the staff in Cincinnati the field headquarters maintains a substation which deals in West Coast industrial-health problems from its Salt Lake City base. The 15 people in the Salt Lake City laboratory send their big problems back to Cincinnati where the laboratory is equipped with the

latest scientific apparatus.

One challenge they've tackled in recent years is a study of the hazards faced by uranium miners and millers. The people in this youthful industry were increasingly concerned about their health. They wanted to know if they faced hazards from radioactive dusts and what steps to take to pre-

vent trouble.

Their request reached Cincinnati in 1950, and a crew of two doctors, two laboratory technicians and four engineers and chemists tackled the problem from the Salt Lake City headquarters. They surveyed seven mines, collected hundreds of dust samples, and consulted with numerous uranium workers. They found that over a long time these workmen might face a serious hazard by breathing the radioactive dusts unless proper control measures were taken.

Their next step was to determine the amounts of ventilation needed in a uranium mine to reduce the dust to a safe level. They even built an experimental mine-ventilation project for close-up study. Their work brought a new degree of safety and confidence to the uranium worker. The occupational-health technicians in traveling lab-

oratories are still busy in this field.

Workmen Fainted on Job

In another trouble-shooting job a team of men from field headquarters visited a (Continued to page 258)





The physician and the industrial hygienist went over the plant with all the thoroughness of good detectives. They showed a special interest in new processes, changes in procedures and new materials being used.

Within 24 hours they found that the workmen were exposed to toxic amounts of lead and phosphate and that these, combined with heat and fast production schedules, were at the root of the fainting.

The investigators left behind a set of simple suggestions which soon corrected the trouble. They suggested that the workmen take more salt tablets to cut heat stress, that new exhaust ventilating equipment be installed in the plant and that the workmen be given more careful and frequent medical checkups.

Dr. W. Clark Cooper, director of the field headquarters, says the biggest single type of industrial ailment is dermatosis. "Occupational skin diseases seldom kill people," he says, "but they cost plenty in lost time and lowered efficiency." Statistics show that about two thirds of all industrial compensation cases are due to skin diseases. One 1951 survey in four states showed that 3100 cases of industrial skin disease cost \$830,800 or \$268 per case. And the industries lost the skill of these workers for the time they were off the job.

One of the simplest cases Dr. Donald J. Birmingham, chief dermatologist, ever tackled was in a rubber factory. Fifteen workers there ran rubber for gaskets through a soap solution eight hours a day. They were suffering serious discomfort from skin troubles. "Wear protective gloves," said Doctor Birmingham, and the trouble was stopped.

Find the Villain

But the solution to the problem is seldom as obvious. Most workmen have their own ideas about the cause of their sickness or injury on the job. And sometimes they're 100 percent wrong. Here's where the industrial-health scientists come in as they did in one Michigan case not long ago. The Public Health Service was asked to check into a serious outbreak of sores on the hands and forearms of workers in a factory making canvas tentage for the Army.

The canvas had been treated and impregnated for a number of things and finally dyed olive drab and these materials stained the workers' arms and clothing. The answer seemed obvious, that the trouble was some place in the materials used on the canvas.

But when the researchers patch-tested ailing workers with bits of material with (Continued to page 260)

which they worked, not one of them contracted a new sore from the patch. Then the technicians began to study the materials the workers used to wash their stained hands. Here was the villain. Powerful cleansing agents such as white gasoline, mineral spirits and some hand cleaners were causing the trouble.

Workmen switched to different cleansing techniques and began wearing sleeves and gloves. Within 60 days the trouble was gone.

One of the newer fields the occupationalhealth experts are tackling with increasing vigor is that of noise in industry. In wood and metal-working shops and on many other jobs noise is sometimes a hazard to the worker. Too much noise may prevent him from hearing a warning of danger, or the excessive noise may lower his working efficiency or even endanger his hearing ability.

Researchers are just beginning their studies in this complicated field. Their work may eventually lead to quieter and more pleasant working conditions.

Even the men who make the money you earn have industrial-health hazards. Fascinating as the task must sometimes seem from the outside, the workers in the United States Mints are often exposed to fumes of lead, zinc, selenium, tellurium and acid mists. The industrial-health watchdogs from Cincinnati have been called to this scene, too.

At their suggestion the mints were equipped with better devices for the control of dusts, excessive noise, better lighting. Now the men who make money go about their task assured of health protection all American workers ask of an increasingly complex industrial age. **

Thick-Shelled Eggs Coming to Market

Eggs with thicker, more durable shells may soon be coming to market, now that Dr. William H. McGibbon at the University of Wisconsin has shown that shell quality is inherited. The stronger shells are considered more desirable because they hold up better under handling and marketing. Doctor McGibbon has developed strains of hens which lay hard-shelled eggs, and other strains which lay softer-shelled varieties. A thin shell makes up eight percent of the egg's total weight, while the hard shell averages 11 percent of the weight.







algae were supplying an abundance of oxygen, something that was needed by the bacteria for oxidizing the sewage.

At the start, Professor Gotaas was merely interested in learning whether algae might be useful in sewage treatment. It turned out that the discoveries made by him and his associates were much broader than that.

They found that the oxygen given off by the algae helps the bacteria to efficiently digest the sewage, and that at the same time the carbon dioxide and ammonia given off by the bacteria are greedily consumed by the algae. The sewage meanwhile supplies all the phosphorus, magnesium, potassium and other minerals that the algae require.

After studying the independent work that had been done on chlorella the sanitary engineers realized that they had much more than an efficient process for sewage treatment, they also had an ideal method for growing algae.

For the last several years an outdoor sewage-treatment plant using algae has been in operation at the Richmond engineering station of the university. Typical sewage consisting of domestic and industrial wastes is piped from one of the city's main lines and is circulated to a number of long, shallow concrete tanks. Surprisingly, there are no obnoxious odors from the open vats. Only a faint smell reminiscent of freshly cut grass or hay can be detected.


The plant operates almost without human control except for the algae-harvesting operation. Raw sewage pours in at one end, fairly pure water and algae are removed at the other end.

Sewage treatment and algal growth occur together, at the same time. The speed of the process depends on the amount of sunlight that falls on the tanks. This varies with the season of the year and the geographical location. Depending on these factors, the detention period is from one to six days. It is estimated that a three-day treatment would be adequate in 12-inch-deep ponds as far north as New York City or Salt Lake City during 80 percent of the year. In the summer it would be possible to grow algae as far north as the Arctic Circle.

The University of California research group believes that it has worked out most of the major production problems. Now it is seeking the most efficient way of harvesting the algae. The cheapest method appears to be one in which the algae are precipitated by chemical coagulants.

From the day-to-day operation of the pilot plant some very general conclusions

have been reached. One is that the organic wastes from a city of 100,000 population can be made to produce 10 tons of dry algae concentrate per day, at the same time making available some 10,000,000 gallons of reclaimed water. These figures don't include the waste from the usual organic industries of a city that size. Such waste could raise the production figures materially.

A rough estimate is that it would cost from \$80 to \$100 per million gallons of sewage to construct and operate an algae plant. The present cost of processing sewage is from \$30 to \$50 or more per million gallons.

The algae plant could be a bargain even though it cost twice as much to operate. Even at a sales price of six cents per pound the dried concentrate would gross \$1200 per day (for a city of 100,000). Thus the sewage-treatment operation would break even or show a slight profit, as against the \$500 per day the same city now spends.

Algae at a Profit

These figures are the basis for the statement that algae can be produced for nothing, or less than nothing. If the algae were sold at a higher price the profit for treating the sewage would be correspondingly higher. Professor Gotaas stresses the fact, however, that the process is still in an experimental stage and that cost estimates are based on pilot-plant operation. Further economic studies are being made.


It is said that the United States throws away sufficient wastes to produce 10,000 tons of algae concentrate every day, more protein than is produced on a million acres of land in a year by conventional means.


Algae may have other uses besides being a source of food. The dried concentrate could be a worthwhile source of power. Its fuel characteristics are similar to those of medium-grade bituminous coal although the heat content is somewhat less.

Produces Methane Gas

Fifteen grams of algae can be made to produce 10 liters of gas, of which more than 60 percent is methane. The same gas also contains carbon dioxide and a trace of hydrogen. Methane is a good fuel. It can be compressed, bottled and transported. By means of a petroleum-refinery process it can even be changed into gasoline.

Algae may become an important source of vitamins. They may be used as organic collectors of certain rare elements such as germanium. Alga appears to have an important future, so important that the Rockefeller Foundation and the U. S. Public Health Service, together with the university, are jointly sponsoring the present studies.



are two types of 2.4-D: amine formulations and ester formulations. The ester type is the most active and therefore will have greater effects, but at the same time it is more dangerous to nearby flowers. The label will tell you which is present. The amines are water solutions and make clear sprays: the esters usually are oil solutions and make milky sprays in water. If your problem is mostly dandelions and plantains, use the amine type, as it will easily kill these weeds. On other broadleaved weeds which are more difficult to kill, your best bet is an ester formulation. On these hard-to-kill enemies, apply early in the season, just after they have started growth. Some of these stubborn weeds may require repeated doses.

Eliminating crab grass. 2,4-D does not appreciably affect any of the weedy grasses such as crab grass, quack grass, foxtail and nimble Will. Since your lawn grass and crab grass are both grasses, and closely related, it has been difficult to find a chemical that will kill one without injuring the other. You'll find three materials currently on the market: Phenyl mercuric acetate (PMA), potassium cyanate (PC) and disodium methyl arsenate, introduced last year.

All are marketed under several different trade names, and all are capable of doing an excellent job when conditions are right. However, all three can—and frequently do—burn the lawn grass if applied a bit too strong or when the weather is a little too hot. Apply them precisely according to the instructions.

Several new chemicals—one being sold on an experimental basis this year—have given excellent results in killing crab-grass seedlings as they come up. One of these chemicals may well prove as effective an answer to crab grass as 2,4-D is for dandelions. We'll know more next year.

Corn. Many farmers now give corn one spraying and one cultivation, where four cultivations were the rule not so long ago. 2,4-D again is the standard chemical. It can be applied pre-emergence at one to two pounds per acre, but is usually applied post-emergence. Apply it before the corn reaches a height of 10 inches. This catches the weeds in their younger, more susceptible stages. Another reason for early application is that one of the effects of 2,4-D on corn is to make it temporarily brittle, and corn more than a foot high is likely to be broken by a strong wind or the cultivator within 10 days after application. If you feel it absolutely necessary to spray corn more





Though the ester type is somewhat more hazardous to the corn, it is often used, but in lower doses, throughout the corn belt. The ester type is less affected by rain or dry weather. With plenty of moisture in the soil, rapidly growing corn sprayed in hot weather may be severely injured by either type of 2.4-D at any age.

Weed grasses in corn. It's ironic but inevitable that when we drastically reduce broadleaf weeds in corn, we invite an increase in the weed grasses. Several new products are available as weapons in this new battle. Dinitros, sold under the trade names Premerge and Sinox PE, when applied at a low dosage just as the corn is coming through and the grasses are in seed leaf, will usually wipe out the grasses. Two promising new chemicals in this field, being tested under the trademarks Karmex DL and Randox, may be on the market generally in 1957. TCB is also a new chemical of promise. Karmex DL and TCB may control all weed growth for four to six weeks after application.

Weeds in small grains. Not long ago spring wheat arriving at market averaged more than seven percent weed seeds. This waste not only had to be disposed of, but it probably prevented the production of twice as much wheat. Again, 2,4-D, frequently applied by plane, has worked a revolution. Most of the common small-grain weeds are susceptible, and the gain in crop yield has been almost unbelievable. But again, as in corn, there has been an invasion by weedy annual grasses. Wild oats are now the most serious single weed threat in the spring-wheat area and there is nothing yet on the market to combat them.

Control of brush. Chemicals have reduced the cost of controlling trees and brush by more than half. On most woody plants, 2,4,5-T is more effective than 2,4-D. 2,4,5-T is more expensive than 2,4-D. Mixtures of the two are widely sold as brush killers.

To kill brush, always use low-volatile ester formulations, applied either in water or in oil solutions. Use about four pounds of 2,4-D—2,4,5-T brush killer to 100 gallons of water to kill brush which is in leaf. To prevent resprouting of stumps and brush, or as a basal application to the lower 12 inches of standing trees, apply a solution of 8 to 16 pounds in 100 gallons of fuel oil (not water) liberally to the top and sides of the stumps or tree trunks, so that some runs down onto the root crown. Brush killer or 2,4,5-T is still more effective if

applied in frills (continuous ax cuts around the trunk). A machine has recently been introduced to do this girdling several times faster. Girdling will kill the tree without chemical application, but the chemical hastens the job and prevents sprouting.

Ammonium sulfamate, sold under the trade name Ammate, is usually deadly to brush in a water solution of ¾ to 1 pound per gallon. This same chemical is frequently applied dry or as a strong solution in frills, cups (notches) or on stumps.

Sodium arsenite, known as a tree killer—
and a good one—for more than a generation, is not only a deadly poison but actually attracts livestock. Prof. L. C. Swain of
the New Hampshire Agricultural Experiment Station has come up with a new technique that eliminates the poison hazard to
animals and man and does a better job. He
has devised tabs of blotting paper which
are saturated with sodium arsenite. The
tabs, inserted under the bark every three
to five inches around the trunk, will completely kill the tree at very low cost.

Poison ivy. Use any of the brush killers described above, or a new one on the market this year, amino triazole. Ammate or amino triazole is best to use in town, as the drift is less dangerous to other plants.

Canada thistle. This weed draws more cusses than any other in the northern United States and much of Canada. 2,4-D will easily shrivel the tops, but you have to make two applications a year for at least three years to knock out the roots. Amino triazole is the most promising herbicide we've found yet, though it is too early to make definite recommendations.

Quack or couch grass. Another of the most serious weeds in the northern states, quack grass can be controlled in large areas by cultivation. However, where the land is to go into corn or potatoes, try chemical control with a new herbicide called dalapon. The quack grass is permitted to make five to six inches of growth in early spring, then sprayed with 5 to 10 pounds of dalapon in 40 gallons of water per acre. Two to 10 days later the quack grass is plowed. If you want the field for corn you must allow at least 30 days between spraying and planting, since dalapon injures corn.

Soybeans. This crop suffers as much or more than corn from annual weeds. Tests prove three chemicals reasonably satisfactory, dinitro, CIPC, and a product sold under the trade name of Alanap. Alanap does not control smartweed. CIPC does not control ragweed and dinitro is mean to work with. Take your choice, and remember, there is some hazard to the beans with all three products.





Sugar beets. Heretofore sugar beets have been a notorious "stoop labor" crop. Chemical control of early weeds in the row has played an important part in the recent complete mechanization of this crop. TCA at five pounds per acre pre-emergence is a standard recommendation for control of annual grasses (except wild oats). Other herbicides are being successfully tried.

Cotton. Cotton, which usually takes the most hand labor for cultivation, has been produced without any hand cultivation by

the use of chemicals.

The most generally used pre-emergence herbicide in cotton is CIPC at 6 to 10 pounds per acre. To cut costs, it is usually applied in bands, 14 inches wide or wider, over the rows. With 42-inch rows this reduces the actual amount of chemical to two or three pounds per acre. Use the lower rates on lighter soils. Karmex DL is another pre-emergence herbicide that shows great promise.

After the cotton is up, herbicidal oils may be applied at the rate of five gallons per acre where the cotton is in 40-inch rows. The oil must be directed less than an inch above the soil and may be used not more than three times, at least five days apart. Oil applications must cease as soon as cracks appear in the bark of the cotton.

It is impossible at this stage to make general recommendations on the control of perennial weeds in established cotton. However, Dr. H. E. Rea of Texas has found it possible to control light infestations of Johnson grass by spot-treating them with oils of the Stoddard-solvent type. Obviously this kills the cotton at the point of application as well as the Johnson grass, but so does hoeing, and the oil is both surer and cheaper. Doctor Rea has developed some ingenious solenoid operated sprayers for applying oil from the tractor.

Peanuts. The treatment here is quite similar to that recommended for soybeans. Dinitros and SES used before emergence have given excellent results in controlling annuals, as have most of the other chemicals mentioned for soybeans. So far the control of perennials, such as Bermuda grass, has escaped us, but it seems clear at this stage that complete chemical weed control in peanuts isn't very far off.

Potatoes. 2,4-D is the veteran in this field. It is thoroughly practical as a preemergence spray, using the ester type at 1½ pounds per acre in 10 to 20 gallons of water. Spray it one to two days prior to the emergence of potatoes. A warning: Don't use it on sandy soils or in a hot spell.

Strawberries. These have always required costly hand weeding. Preplanting,

postplanting, and winter herbicides are now available to reduce the cost of growing this crop.

Vegetables. These differ so widely that most crops require different herbicides and different times and rates of application. Therefore, chemicals may do more harm than good to a small plot, and a home gardener should stick to his hoe. Here's a check list for the commercial grower:

Asparagus. Apply the new Karmex DW just after the cutting season at one to three

pounds per acre.

Squash, pumpkin and cucumber. Alanap

applied as a pre-emergence spray.

Tomatoes. These are extremely sensitive to most weed killers. However, some new compounds show promise for use both in direct-seeded tomatoes or as a preplanting treatment for transplants. Watch for news in this field within a year or two.

Cabbage, cauliflower, turnips, radishes, broccoli and Brussels sprouts. TCA gets the nod here, as it has little effect on the vegetables but brings death to grass weeds and some broadleaved weeds. Some new compounds may kill the most stubborn pests, but we're not sure yet.

Carrots. Here we have the most nearly ideal weed-control chemical, Stoddard solvent or "carrot oil." Just about all growing plants except members of the carrot family are susceptible to this chemical, so one application will knock practically all


the weeds out of carrots.

Unfortunately, we don't yet have the equivalent of carrot oil for other crops. If the farmer doesn't make a final clean-up with a hoe or plow, the weeds which are resistant will increase. This brings up a new and irritating situation: Before long he will have as many weeds in the field as ever, but they will be kinds which he cannot control with our present chemicals.

Even if we can achieve the weed-free farm, the farmer still should loosen the soil by at least one cultivation per season. But his work will be easier and his crops won't be fighting a continuous battle for food and sunlight.

Quieter Airliner Flights

Tests on the Lockheed Super Constellation have shown that the position of the plane's propellers as they spin has a serious effect on the noise level in the cabin. During the tests it was found that the two right engines running together at the same speed made less noise when they were 60 degrees out of phase. Under ideal phasing conditions, the noise level in the cabin can be cut 15.5 decibels, mostly in the low tones which are difficult to muffle.



How Dangerous Is Fallout?

(Continued from page 100)

Further, the report states that strontium-90, one of the long-lasting fission products, is absorbed by humans, plants and animals. The report concludes by quoting the National Academy of Sciences: "Already some children have accumulated a measurable amount of radioactive strontium in their bodies. The amount, however, is quite small—a thousandth of what is considered a permissible dose."

This seems to bear out the opinion of most experts that the fallout from bomb tests at present is not dangerous, but that man must watch the amount of radioactivity he releases into the atmosphere in the

future.

Suppose I were in the danger area, and were subject to fallout from a bomb. What could I do about it?

The Federal Civil Defense Administration hopes and expects that our earlywarning network would permit target areas to be evacuated. However, fallout can spread 200 miles or more downwind, so a person unaffected by the bomb itself could still be in great danger. He should take cover, cover as deep as possible. An old-fashioned storm or cyclone cellar would be excellent. Next best would be the basement of a home, with all the windows closed. Any cover would help a great deal. The main idea is to prevent dust from falling on you, and to remain in the shelter until you are told by authorities that radioactivity has fallen to a point where it is safe to leave. Eat no food which has been opened prior to the fallout, and drink no water unless you are sure it has been stored in a sealed container.

Is anything currently being done to protect us from possible fallout?

Yes, indeed. The problem is under continuous study by the Federal Civil Defense Administration. New instruments are being developed to measure this invisible danger. And right now the U.S. Weather Bureau is sending out coded fallout forecasts, regularly twice a day. These forecasts, in the hands of proper officials, would permit them to calculate the fallout pattern from a bomb burst at any point in the country, and warn those in the potential danger area to seek cover. **





FireSweep. It shares chassis and sheetmetal parts with Dodge, adding individuality by using De Soto grille, taillights and interiors. Its V8 engine is the single-rocker-arm-shaft design. Wheelbase is 122 inches, same as Dodge's. Over-all length is 215.8 inches, compared to Dodge's 212.2.

The big De Sotos, the FireFlite and the FireDome, have a 126-inch wheelbase and use the double-rocker-arm-shaft engine.

Horsepowers are 295 for the four-barrel FireFlite, 270 for the two-barrel FireDome, 260 for the four-barrel FireSweep and 245 for the two-barrel FireSweep. Displacement of both FireSweep engines is 325 cubic inches, of FireFlite and FireDome engines 341 cubic inches.

De Soto's over-all styling is simple and clean. From the rear, it retains its distinctive vertical row of three lights in each fender. The front grille is essentially a series of unbroken horizontal lines. Four headlights are optional on all except the FireSweep models.

Dodge Has Swept-Wing Styling

Dodge, even more than others in the Chrysler family, has emphasized tailfins.

Wheelbase is two inches longer, but over-all length only a fraction of an inch more. Width is increased by 3.3 inches and height lowered as much as 5 inches.

Wide-set headlights are hooded under forward-thrusting fenders and, being paired with large parking lights, look like dual headlights. This, plus the rugged grille, makes the car appear much wider.

The three-speed automatic transmission, Torque-Flite, is available on Dodge in addition to the two-speed PowerFlight. Retained is the six-cylinder engine for fleet buyers and the few low-power buyers.

The push-button shift is improved by a neutral-start button. The button automatically puts the transmission in neutral when you press it to start the engine.

Displacement is boosted to 325 cubic inches, intake valves enlarged and compression ratio up to 8.5 to 1. Horsepower ratings are: Coronet six, 138 horsepower; the V8s, 245 and 260 horsepower; and the D500, 285 and 310 horsepower.

Plymouth High Styled

With the Corporation putting its big sales effort on the breadwinning low-price field, Plymouth is out to do battle in a body that looks like a dream car.

Aiming for a bigger chunk of the stationwagon market, Plymouth offers some new

ideas in that body style. The rear seat on all eight-passenger wagons now faces rearward, giving the riders an observation-car view as they drive along the highway.

There is also a lockable compartment in the floor at the rear so you can hide your valuables out of sight, something wagons have never had before. To make room for this compartment, the engineers located the spare tire vertically in the left rear fender. When needed, it cranks down out of its protected compartment. The gasoline tank is located in the right rear fender. The rear window cranks up and down for ventilation and is powered on some models.

Wheelbase is now 118 inches, 3 inches more than last year. Over-all height is only 54.8 inches on hardtops. Belt lines (the horizontal line at the base of the windows) is lowered by about 2 inches.

Although these changes make Plymouth look much longer, by measurement it is a fraction of an inch shorter than it was in 1956. Width is greater by 3.6 inches.

Plymouth, like Dodge, retains the sixcylinder engine. It develops 132 horsepower. The 277-cubic-inch Plaza V8 develops 197 horsepower; the 301-cubic-inch Savoy and Belvedere V8s have 215 horsepower; and a power-pack version puts out 235 horsepower.





rings or doughnuts soften both these actions. They roll and flex just like the big tires on the wheels, softening road vibrations and driving torque.

Newly designed rear-spring bumpers reduce windup during acceleration. An improved shock absorber dampens extreme wheel movement while driving fast over chuck holes or on washboard roads. All body mounts this year are rubber insulated, there being no tire-carcass insulators as in previous years.

A left-hand-operated keyboard is used to shift the automatic transmission. The neutral-start button simplifies things. To start the car you turn the key and depress the neutral-start button. This puts the transmission in neutral and operates the starter simultaneously. An emergency-brake release button (a foot-operated "hand" brake is used this year) is also part of the control keyboard.

Carburetor air is drawn from inside or outside the engine compartment, depending upon temperature. This reduces choke time under freezing conditions by as much as 50 percent, saving gasoline and minimizing crankcase dilution. When the engine is hot, cooler and denser air is drawn in

from outside to increase power.


An automatic clutch allows the engine fan to free wheel at speeds over 40 miles per hour, increasing horsepower at the rear wheels slightly (however, even a trained engineer cannot sense the difference without a stopwatch). The real important gain is not the added horsepower, but the noise reduction. At high speed (when a fan is not needed at all) much of the engine noise is air turbulence caused by the fan whirling at as much as 5000 revolutions per minute. Free wheeling eliminates this and, as an obvious bonus, increases power slightly.

Mercury offers two engines: A 312-cubicinch V8 of 255 horsepower and a 368cubic-inch V8 of 290 horsepower. Both have a 9.75 to 1 compression ratio.

The body is longer by five inches. Wheelbase is now 122 inches, an increase of three inches. Over-all height is lowered by three inches. Width is greater by three inches where it counts-in the seating area as well as over-all. Despite a lowered roof, headroom is about the same (a fraction greater) in the front seat and two inches greater in the rear.







York Auto Show in December. It is expected to be loaded with exciting innovations although it must necessarily use much if not all of the same sheet metal as these models.

Lincoln for 1957

Principal styling changes in the Lincoln are in the rear fenders and the front headlight arrangement. It is longer by two inches than in 1956 but the added length is in the bumpers.

Rear fenders cant outward in a bold fin shape. Arranged vertically in front are two pairs of headlights (optional in states

that permit them).

One all-new body is offered, a four-door hardtop. Continued is the four-door sedan

with a slenderized center pillar.

The top two headlights are standard seven-inch units. The lower two are smaller auxiliary driving lights that can be turned on or off independent of the top lights. With all four lights on, there is 50 percent more light on the road. The lower location of the auxiliary lights makes shadows larger so objects on the road become more apparent.

The engine has a redesigned combustion chamber and develops 300 horsepower with its 368 cubic inches. Compression ratio is 10.0 to 1. Four-barrel carburetors and dual exhausts are standard (the tail pipes end below the rear bumpers out of sight where they do not soil the chrome).

Other important changes include a smaller turbine in the torque converter to permit increased engine speed for breakaway acceleration. An extra-cost locking differential minimizes slippage on ice. Adjustable shock absorbers (adjustable by dealer) are also optional.

Another optional feature is an electric door-locking system. By pushing a dashboard button you lock all four doors at once (a light flashes if a door is not fully closed). You still have to lock them individually when you leave the car, however. Power-operated vent windows are another optional feature.

Standard on all Lincolns is a warning light in the fuel gauge that tells the owner when he's down to three gallons of * * *

gas.



Shotgun Quickly "Ages" Chair For Antique Collector

Amateur antique collector Phil George of Wenatchee, Wash., "ages" furniture for his home with a shotgun. Using a light charge with minute soft lead pellets, he shoulders the shotgun and blasts the piece. The gouging of the pellets into the surface of a table or chair does in seconds what wear and tear of everyday use would do in several hundred years. He also makes worm holes by hammering a bent section of wire into the wood, and produces deep scars by hitting it with a length of chain. Fire is used for special effects.

Fatigue Is Responsible For Many Farm Accidents

The disappearance of the horse from the farm can be blamed for the high level of farm accidents, according to Dr. Franklin H. Top of Iowa City, Iowa. He points out that horses had to be rested periodically, and with this came rest for the farmer. The same horses could not be worked for 10 or 15 hours a day for several days. Mechanization has caused fatigue for the farmer, resulting in many farm accidents. Doctor Top points out that the majority of accidents occur at midmorning and midafternoon peaks, and suggests short breaks at those times to prevent fatigue.


[Hidden lightning flashes, some of them 100 miles long, which have previously been hidden from view by clouds, have been spotted for the first time on radarscopes.

Trout Go for a Ride On Fish Escalator

Catchable-sized trout at the Darrah Springs State Fish Hatchery in California take a ride on a portable escalator before they are planted in the state's trout streams. The escalator is used to load the trout into the hatchery's trucks and makes it possible to load the trucks in 15 minutes, instead of the several hours previously required. The escalator consists of an endless rubber belt with cleats three inches high. Two men use dip nets to put the fish on the escalator. Each pocket on the belt holds enough water to assure the fish a safe ride into the truck's tank. The fish are counted by measuring the displacement in the truck's tank after loading.

Spout at the top of the escalator is guided by emplayee of hatchery. Truck holds 5000 trout per load







Metal Guards Protect Trees

Durable metal tree guards are assembled from a knocked-down package that includes the necessary nuts and bolts. Made of galvanized mesh and sturdy posts that are driven into the ground, the guards are 18 inches in diameter and have a 60-inch mesh height. When the young tree or shrub no longer needs protection, the guard can be disassembled and used elsewhere.

Ball Bearings From the Sky

Microscopic ball bearings are falling out of the sky at the rate of 20 per hour per square yard of earth. That rate of fall, at least, is true in the Southwest where scientists of the New Mexico Institute of Mining and Technology are collecting and studying them. Known as spherules, they apparently originate as dust from interplanetary space that melts and forms into droplets as it enters the atmosphere, or from droplets torn off the molten surfaces of larger meteors.

The micrometeorites are magnetic, perfectly round and average 1,000 inch in diameter. They are collected by means of glass trays that are filled with ethylene glycol to prevent them from bouncing out or being blown away. The trays are placed in various locations including the top of a 10,300-foot mountain in New Mexico. Later the spherules are removed with a magnet for study under a microscope.




