

You state that the oldest DC-3 was perhaps one that retired at 84,875 hours. At Nathaniel Hawthorne College in Antrim, N.H., there's a DC-3 still flying at over 100,000 hours.

Apparently the 100,000-hour figure was sometimes bandied about the Hawthorne campus, Mr. Horner, but it's a bit optimistic. According to Maj. George W. Gibson, USAF (Ret.), director of aviation at the college, the plane had at least 83,414 hours on it as of June 1978. There are no plans to ground it in the near future. Maj. Gibson says he hopes to keep her flying "another 10 years anyway." recent issue of Flying featured a Naples Airlines DC-3 with 82,616 hours on it as of April 1978. It would seem that, barring any untoward occurrences, both planes will surpass the Edison Museum DC-3 soon. Thanks for telling us about the Hawthorne plane.

Poles apart

At the present time, Mountain Bell is installing virtually 100 percent of all distribution cable in new subdivisions completely underground. Approximately 85 percent of all construction is underground

or buried. Pole lines and aerial cable are installed as a last choice when terrain problems make buried construction extremely expensive. Only within the last five or six years has technology given the telephone industry a buried cable which can withstand the moisture problems of underground installation over a long period of time.


The Bell System long ago began this "Out of Sight" policy without governmental action or pressure from environmental groups.

Unfortunately, none of the companies I contacted had heard of this policy. How can I obtain a list of companies in the Washington, D.C., area who'll be offering this coverage?

Best bet is to consult an independent insurance agent, says Alex Picone, director of public relations of the Independent Insurance Agents of America. Allstate and some other well-known companies do not offer Homeowners '76 per se, but have similar policies. Homeowners '76 has been approved in 25 states and was pending in 7 others as of this June. It has been disapproved in New York and New Jersey. SATURDAY MECHANIC Servicing the '79 Ford and Lincoln-Mercury models









Here's a head start on what you do-it-yourselfers need to know about next year's cars.

by Paul Weissler

The 1979 Ford lineup presents an assortment of new service procedures for the weekend mechanic. Some, like Electronic Engine Control II (EEC II) and the Mustang-Capri turbo, covered last month, are highly complex. However, the new features make things easier, including a revolutionary single drive belt that's super-easy to change.

The new belt, which will go into Mustangs and Capris with the 302 V8, does the job that as many as four belts did before. It wraps around pulleys for the alternator. air pump, airconditioning and power steering, then doubles back in serpentine fashion to pick up the water pump/fan and an idler pulley.

The belt is automatically tensioned by the idler pulley, which is spring-loaded so it never needs adjustment. To change the belt, just insert a pry bar into a tang projecting from the idler pulley, pull to release spring tension and slide the old belt off. Place the new belt on all pulleys, pry on the spring and slide the belt onto the idler. The whole thing takes about a minute.

The belt differs from a conventional design in that it has five ribs, each actually a tiny V, in addition to the V edges. The accessory pul-

leys into which it fits have mating grooves. Result: the belt contact area is very substantial, roughly close to that provided by individual belts. Only the water pump/fan and idler pulleys, which come in contact with the smooth opposite side of the belt, have no ribs.

Cost to Ford of the single multirib belt is "within a penny" of the cost of the four belts it replaces, according to a Ford engineer, so you can expect to pay about that for a new one at the auto parts store.


The belt is so easy to change that the labor savings-whether you do it yourself or have the work done, should make the design a winner.

Ford will phase in the new belt design on other models in the next few years. The belt alone also will be tested in 1979 on LTD and Marquis models with the 351 V8, for water pump/fan, alternator and power steering. Other accessories on these cars still will be operated by conventional V-belts.



new LTD and Marquis have dropped the disc caliper with the machined slides in favor of a conventional pin-slider type. Ford made the change primarily for easier brake action (the machined slides rusted and resulted in sluggish brake performance). However, the guide pin design also is easier to handle when you're changing brake pads.

The pads themselves have been equipped with curved springs that create a scratching noise when the linings are worn.

Another brake change you'll notice on these cars, and also on Mustang-Capri 302 V8 models, is an aluminum master cylinder for weight reduction. It can't be honed, so it's replaced if the bore corrodes.

Aluminum also will be used for rear brake drums on LTD-Marquis and turbo versions of Mustang-Capri. The drums, like those introduced on some GM cars last year, have a steel insert, so they can be machined to correct scoring or out-of-round. The Ford drums are tabbed for extra-positive retention of the insert.

Steering column

Both Mustang-Capri and LTD-Marquis reflect the increasing use of multipurpose stalk switches on the steering column. There are two—one for wiper and washer, a second for directional signals, horn and headlamp dimmer.

To reach the switches, just remove the instrument panel bezel (four accessible screws), then the plastic covers on the steering column (four more screws). To take out a switch, just push off the electrical connector and undo top and bottom retaining screws. The job takes less than five minutes.

Fuse boxes on both new models also are easier to get to. Forget struggling with the little glass tubes somewhere under the dash. The boxes are behind a cover plate on the front of the dashboard, next to the steering column, and the fuses themselves are the spade type, which are easy to pull out.

The Mustang and Capri, which are derived from the Fairmont-Zephyr series, share other of the easy-service features of that line, including the front end with only two grease fittings, the separation of strut and coil spring (so the strut can be changed without a coil spring compressor) and the heater-core-in-a-drawer on non-airconditioned models.

Capri buffs will appreciate the easy under-hood location of the wiper motor. In European-built versions, the motor was deeply buried behind the dashboard.

Heater-air module

The LTD and Marquis get a brand-new heater/air module, but unfortunately more attention was given to heater output than serviceability. The heater core is in the ductwork under the dash, and replacing it is no fun. You've got to disconnect the right side of the dashboard, then the dashboard side of the ductwork from the engine compartment part, pull rearward on the flexible dash and drop the duct section to the floor of the passenger compartment. In the previous design, the heater core was behind a cover plate in the engine compartment and was easily replaced.

There are however, three plus factors in the new module:

■ Blower motor replacement is a snap. Just undo a few screws at the passenger's side of the engine compartment and lift it out.



Electrical connectors, like one on turn/ horn/dimmer switch, are easy to flick off.

- The evaporator is very easy to change. Just take out the engine compartment duct section—not difficult. Saturday mechanics normally wouldn't tackle this, but if you do, you'll find it feasible.
- The heater/air controls and the radio are easily removed for service from the front of the dash.

The new heater/air setup will be used on cars without air as well, but with no air components in the shell.

Fluidic washer





sion valve bodies, anywhere you wanted electronic or computer-like qualities from fluid movement. The attention, however, went hot and heavy to electronics, and it seemed fluidics was completely forgotten.

But no. It finally makes its automotive debut-on the '79 Mustang and Capri-in a windshield washer with single-nozzle design. A stream of water under pressure enters the fluidic nozzle, where the shape of the passages inside, and the air inside them, causes it to become unstable. The stream deflects against a left or right side wall. Whichever way it deflects results in a feedback passage filling with water, causing the stream to deflect back and forth, but so fast that it creates what looks like a fan-like

spray over the entire windshield, with no more power draw than the standard washer reservoir motor provides.

The fluidic nozzle is a simple plastic piece and probably will cost little or no more than two conventional nozzles. Its large opening should reduce the clogging problem, usual cause of nozzle failure.

You might be able to retrofit the fluidic nozzle to another car, but the job may not be all that simple. The ideal position for a spray to cover the entire windshield, or most of it, may not be dead center, and on some cars there may be no really good position possible. Even if a reasonably good position exists, it might present installation difficulties.

Sealed-adjustment carburetors

Carburetors you can't adjust are on the way, and Ford is trying out the concept on its 1979 models with the variable-venturi job, installed on all models with 302 and 351 V8s.

Ford will be fine-tuning the carbs on the assembly line, then installing plugs so you can't adjust the control vacuum to the variable venturi, and a plastic cap held by hollow rivets, so you can't get to and block open the cold enrichment system's bimetal valve (resulting in enrichment of the warm-engine mixture). The government has been pushing for this to prevent tampering (and higher exhaust emissions).


Halogen headlamps

Every sports car rally driver who regularly runs night events knows the bright light that the quartz-halogen lamp provides. They are popular pieces of rally equipment as a result. Now Ford will try quartz-halogen sealed beams on the 1979 Lincoln Versailles.

There's no price yet on the replacements for the four eyes, but if the replacement bulbs only for the non-sealed-beam driving lights are any indication, they could approach \$25 each. Can you imagine spending \$100 to replace burned-out head-lamps, or ones smashed in a minor mishap?

Quartz-halogens do last longer than conventional sealed beams and draw a lot less power, so a smaller, lighter alternator can be used.

Quartz-halogen is one of those things Detroit feels it has to try, to win the weight reduction/fuel economy/lower emissions battle. With everything else they're trying in that battle, the resulting sophistication may not be completely offset by easy-change drive belts, switches, and the like. However, there's little that Ford (or other makers) can do about the sophistication, so be glad there's an effort to simplify where possible. It is paying off.

ou may already have some of the tools needed for our surfacing system, but don't be misled; you do need husky equipment to saw and surface your own lumber. The setup we used is Homelite's 3½-cu.-in. chain saw with a 20-in. bar and a Haddon Lumber/Maker. The router is Rockwell's heavy-duty 21/2-hp with 1/2-in. collet. A special 2-in. carbide-tipped router bit and PM's jig complete the system.

Onsrud Cutter Mfg. Co. designed the bit to suit PM's jig. It spins at 28,000 rpm. The cutter's rake finishes linear wood grain easily as well as end grain to 1/8-in. depth. (PM-2 bit costs \$71.25 postpaid from Onsrud, Box 550, Libertyville, Ill. 60048.)

Size your jig to suit your needs. Ours can handle slabs about 21 in. high and log sections about 14 in. high. The jig fits well on a 46-in.long workbench.

Before surfacing stock, you must air-dry it until it stabilizes-as a rule of thumb, allow about one year for each inch of stock thickness. Coat the log ends with white glue and date each plank. (Note: To seal out moisture, many purists will opt for wax on the board ends.)

How the jig works

When the jig is moved either left or right it pivots to form a parallel-

ogram. This movement, of course, raises or lowers the top rails to achieve a rough depth setting. The fine adjustment for depth is done with the router's adjustment collar. One or two pieces of wood support the sides so the jig doesn't sag, and the top rails support the cross assembly upon which the router slides. Secure the setup to a bench.

Fabricating parallelogram

Begin by cutting angle-iron pieces to length. Lay out and bore the bench mounting holes. Lay out and bore pivot holes. Cut the two angle-iron top pieces and lay out and scribe center lines for a pivot hole and two tie-rod holes in each end of the top rails. Punch, drill and countersink for machine screws as shown. Deburr both sides of all drilled holes. To assure clearance for the cross assembly, lay out and scribe curved lines at top ends of riser bars. File tie rod ends flat. Scribe center line on ends of rods. Lay out and bore three holes on each end as shown in detail.

Fasten base angle to bench and riser bars to base angle as shown. Attach tie rods and riser bars to top rails. Tighten securely. Use lock washers on bolts to minimize loosening due to vibration. Top rails now have an up-and-down adjustment





To drill and tap holes in tie-rod ends, use a bench vise turned on its side and clamped to drill press table. Put rods through table's center hole and secure in vise. For more clearance, rotate table and motor 180° to clear base of press.

you can tighten at the desired height.


There should be some end play when the guide rail assembly is in place. Lay out and scribe center lines for machine screws. Bore holes and countersink for screws as shown. Align stop bars under guide rails and center-punch four holes in each. Bore holes and assemble, Cut stops from plastic rod, drill holes and install on each rail at the ends.

To modify router for use with jig, replace its base with one of sheet acrylic. Locate the base-mounting holes so router handles are perpendicular to guide rails and drill. Use jig or hole saw to cut center hole large enough to accommodate router bit.

Apply Liquid Gold lube to angle iron and put the jig to work.



More spray suggestions

We've received many letters from readers suggesting ways to cut a hole through a sink apron in order to install a spray attachment (Make Way for the Spray, Homeowners' Clinic, page 16, Feb. '78).

The simplest solution requires no cutting at all. Simply buy a single-lever faucet (three-hole) which has the spray attachment in its deck. Delta, Peerless and Moen, to name a few manufacturers, sell them.

If you have a stainless-steel sink, you can drill a series of holes in the steel, then file them until you've attained the desired cutout

The most ingenious method of drilling through a porcelain-onsteel sink was sent to us by Albert Affolter, Mankato, Minn., who first drilled the desired size hole through a 2x4. Then he clamped the 2x4 so the hole was over the area to be drilled and used it as a guide while he hand-rotated a pipe in the hole. To assure a clean cut he added carborundum powder and linseed oil to the hole. The porcelain was cut smooth, allowing him to proceed with drilling through the steel.

Talking floors

To avoid the cost of hardwood flooring 10 years ago, we carpeted directly over our plywood subfloor. Our floors now squeak constantly. Short of removing the carpeting, how can we correct this?-L.L. Jones, Royal Oak, Mich.

If your squeaking is widespread, the only solution is to roll back the carpet and underlying pad. Use 8d common nails every 6 in, along the edges of the plywood sheets, and every 12 in. on center in each panel's field.


Isolated squeaks can sometimes be eliminated by driving and setting 10d finishing nails through the carpet and underlying pad into the joist.

The joist location can usually be found from the ceiling below and transferred to the floor through careful measurement from a common reference point, like a wall or partition.

Another try at pouring concrete

Our recent tip on pouring a con-

crete floor (Homeowners' Clinic, page 10, June '78) included a diagram that incorrectly showed rigid insulation flat against the form board, leaving it vulnerable to moisture from the outside. The diagram below has the insulation

installed correctly, i.e.; set back from the form board, so concrete can be poured around it for protec-

Crumbling brick ledge

The concrete ledge that my brick veneer rests on breaks off at the corners. I have patched it several times, but the patch always breaks off within a year. What causes this, and how can I get the patch to stay?-Jan Berger, Belvidere,

The weakest points in unreinforced concrete are the corners. A hairline crack, allowing water en-

try, might have started when the form was removed. Judging from the photograph you sent us, your ledge appears to be in no danger of failing. If the look bothers you, your previous patches failed due to their shape. They had nothing to grab on to.


Using a masonry carbide-tipped bit, I would bore several 3/16-in.dia, holes in the existing concrete. Tap in some short masonry nails, leaving 1/4 in. exposed. Dampen the concrete slightly and apply mortar mix with a trowel, making certain the mortar is pressed firmly around the heads of the masonry nails, to assure keying to the existing con-

House too vapor-tight?

When we built our electricallyheated house, we made certain we had a vapor barrier installed under the dry wall in all walls and ceilings. In the winter, with the thermostat set in the mid sixties the humidity level hovers around 60-65 percent. The dehumidifier doesn't seem to work well under these conditions. Even our Thermopane windows sweat, and we're now seeing signs of mildew. What should we do?-Richard Castor, Bedford, N.Y.

I assume your house has electrically-heated warm air, and as such, is too tight for the same air to be constantly recirculated. cooler air must be introduced into your plenum, and provision made for eliminating the excess. Duct systems with automatic dampers can be installed. Such a system will alleviate your high winter humidity quickly.

Since I've outlined only the basics, a licensed mechanical engineer or heating contractor should be consulted for system design and layout.

Anyone who's been outdoors recently during cool weather knows it's the fat look now that's in. Puffy parkas and pants stuffed with waterfowl fuzz make you look like an overweight Arctic explorer—but they do keep you warm. Down—the light, tiny and so expensive fluffy filaments that geese and ducks wear under their feathers—has proved to be the best filling for cold weather gear. So far.

But this fall, down's top rating may start to go out of date. The 3M Company is introducing a new keep-you-warm material that is said to be even better than down. It's called Thinsulate thermal insulation and 3M rates it almost twice as effective as down and other synthetics now on the market.

That's saying a lot. Until now down has been accepted as the best material, for its weight, to retain body warmth, followed closely by man-made polyester fibers such as Hollofil and Polarguard. Slightly more down could be compressed into a stuff sack, and its light weight also made it popular with backpackers as the insulation in parkas, jackets, vests, and sleeping bags.

But get down well soaked through and you're in trouble. It compresses, loses its loft and ability to hold heat, and may take days in the field to dry out thoroughly. It is difficult to wash or dry-clean without removing its natural oils, and down has to be quilted into place so that it won't move around inside the layers of the garment or sleeping bag and end up all in one corner. Synthetics, on the other hand, wash easily and do not absorb much water so they dry out quickly and retain their insulating properties.

Down has also had definition problems. "Prime white northern goose down" doesn't really mean much, since "prime" is just a matter of opinion, black down is just as warm as "white," all down comes at present from northern waterfowl, and "goose down" has often been found to include chopped up feathers from ducks, geese and chickens. There has been so much adulteration of down, in fact, with fibers, feathers and residue, that the Federal Trade Commission has been asked to help stop the mislabeling of imports.

Much down comes from Poland and China.

Good down is good, however, so how do you measure the claims of something reported to be better? We watched 3M's St. Paul, Minn., development laboratories, using elaborate temperature measuring devices, take equal thicknesses of their Thinsulate, down, polyester and other materials and record thermal resistance to determine relative warmth. With the conductivity of air assigned a theoretical insulating value of 2, Thinsulate measured 1.8, down 1.0, polyester batt .9 and other materials less.

In "real life," test gloves and jackets have been made up and given extensive in-use and thermo-

graphic infrared workouts for direct comparison with existing cold-weather gear. When we grabbed a chunk of dry ice with a Thinsulate mitten and then one of another synthetic we found the difference dramatic. Ski jackets are predicted to be one of the first garments to use the development; they can be kept thin and stylish with the new material and still deliver great warmth. A few should be available this winter.

How does the new fiber work? 3M claims the microfibers are infinitely finer than those of down or the other synthetics and thus can hold a doubly efficient layer of "dead air." They weren't about to reveal how they create this material, but for future cold weather we should be happy with the results.





PHOTO HINTS

Alignment aid



For perfect slide or movie projection, the plane of the screen must be parallel to the plane of the film. Faulty alignment results in "keystoning" and uneven focus. The problem is common because most home screens can't be tilted, while projectors are easily adjusted. The solution is simple: an extension arm of 1/8 by 1/2 by 9in. iron or aluminum bar stock, bolted to the existing hook, with notches filed in the free end to take the screen's handle. After you experiment with the screen angle, you may be seeing your pictures at their best for the first time.—Robert Hertzberg

Light-sealing tube







APPLIANCE CLINIC QUESTIONS ANSWERED

Water torture

My experience with a Sears Kenmore Model 700 automatic clothes washer may benefit others. My problem was incomplete draining in the spin-and-rinse cycle. A half tub of water remained. The usual trouble-shooting procedures—assuring a clear drain, for example—failed to work. Then the light dawned.

This unit has a self-cleaning filter, but after seven years of use, it was ineffective. Lint had accumulated, blocking the filter. Draining slowed to a mere trickle. The timer would advance to spin before the washer drained completely. I bought a new filter from Sears for \$5.95, and now I'm back in business.—Robert G. Gill, Richmond, Va.

You're right, Mr. Gill. This information should help those who own washing machines with self-cleaning filters. Thanks.

Disposing of a problem

We have a General Electric Disposall that leaks at its base. I removed the base plate, but I couldn't find a way to get at seals or bearings that might need replacing. Must I junk the unit to get rid of the leak?—Don Cole, Lompoc, Calif.

No. But you have to be more specific about where it's leaking. Is it at the hopper-shredder housing joint? At the hopper boot where the unit connects to the sink drain? In the shredder housing?

The shredder housing, which contains the motor, is apparently what you call the "base." There's no reason to replace the seal or bearings in the shredder housing unless water is getting into the motor, which obviously is not the case. From your description, the leak appears to be external.

Okay. Suppose the leak is occurring at the hopper-shredder housing joint. The hopper sits atop the shredder housing and receives the refuse. A leak at this joint could be caused by a damaged or misaligned gasket or a loose clamp band, which holds the two parts together. First, try tightening the band screw. If that doesn't stop the leak, remove the Disposall from the sink and separate the hopper and shredder housings. Re-

place the gasket. Then make sure the two housings are securely clamped back together.

If the unit is leaking at the hopper boot, check for a loose lower support ring at the hoppersink flange and for a damaged hopper gasket. Make sure the unit hangs vertically and isn't pulled off center to meet the plumbing.

Finally, examine the outside of the shredder for a hole that may have been punched through the housing by a metal object inadvertently thrown in with garbage. Also look for a hairline crack in the housing.

Looking for clues

Our new Frigidaire refrigeratorfreezer worked okay for about six months, but now it runs too cold on the "warmest" setting. The freezer stays at 20° below zero, and the food compartment holds steady at 20° above zero. Two new thermostats have failed to solve the problem. The serviceman says the unit is cycling properly. What will it take to control temperature?—Harry W. Huffman, Mitchell, S.D.

We sympathize with the serviceman. This is a tough one to track down. If a low temperature was prevalent in either the freezer or the food compartment, the solution would be more apparent. Another factor muddying the water is the onset of the problem six months after the refrigerator was in use.

The thermostat, which controls temperature in both compartments, appears to be the likely culprit. But suppose the scenario went like this:

Six months after you bought the refrigerator, the original thermostat went bad. It was replaced—twice. Assuming the replacements weren't defective, what else could cause the thermostat to fail within a normal temperature range? The only thing we can think of is the sensing tube. This tube (or bulb) is attached to the thermostat and "tells" when the temperature has reached the desired level. The thermostat then turns off and the refrigeration cycle ceases.

It's possible that the serviceman inadvertently mispositioned the sensing tube when he replaced the original thermostat. The sensing tube should be located at the cold air inlet.

If it's not in its proper place, the temperature will drop below normal before the tube senses the cold and "tells" the thermostat to turn off refrigeration.


Getting exposure

The soap dispenser lid of our Frigidaire Custom Imperial dishwasher won't stay closed. It dumps detergent as soon as the door is swung shut. I can't figure out how to remove the dispenser to see what's wrong. What now?—John E. Romine, Indianapolis.

The soap dispenser is held by fasteners on the inside of the door panel. You'll have to remove the outer panel, which is held by screws, to expose the dispenser assembly. The dispenser's spring latch is probably broken and should be replaced.

SERVICE TIP

Have you ever taken apart the metal duct of a clothes dryer to clean out lint, and then tried to figure out how the pipes fit back together again? Here's

a method that's so simple you'll kick yourself for not using it until now:

Starting at the top (or bottom) duct, just number each section in succession. Write the numbers on pieces of duct tape and stick the tape to the pipes.



Tools that moonlight



These common household tools can help out in your shop. Use erasers for polishing metal or removing layout marks from wood. A soda-can opener can serve as a minipry bar or tack puller. Use toothpicks to apply tiny amounts of glue, paint or soldering flux. Cosmetic tweezers can be used to pick up smaller parts when shop tweezers are too clumsy. A dip tube-glass tubing with smaller opening at one endgood for dipping small amounts of liquid from containers. Use nail clippers to round corners of thin materials like cardboard. 

Remote boost starter

Universal tachometer

In PM's reports on the Rabbit and Olds diesels, we said that because | you can get an rpm reading from |

the engine has no electrical ignition system, there's no simple way to get an rpm reading. Now there is: a tachometer for any enginediesel, conventional gasoline and even a lawnmower or other small gas engine which has electrical ignition but no distributor. It will also let you set ignition timing on GM and Chrysler products without looking at the timing marks.

The tach features an electromagnetic probe. If you've looked at a late-model car, you may have noticed a little holder built into the fixed timing indicator for such a probe. With it, you read ignition timing on a remote meter, so you needn't struggle to read the marks on an accessory-loaded car. The universal tach uses the probe holder for rpm readings as well.

If you have an Olds diesel, therefore, you can use the probe holder (it's there because the block is also used for the gasoline engine) for rpm readings. The Rabbit diesel has a probe hole (at the flywheel bellhousing). While it's not the same size, you can tape it and brace it in the hole.

On diesels with no probe holder, you will have to make a holder for the probe, and file a notch on the crank pulley to take rpm readings.

The tach also has an inductive pickup that clamps onto the sparkplug wires. The clamp is included for two reasons:

 If you have a gasoline engine on which a conventional tach is difficult to connect (no distributor), the inductive pickup, which senses sparkplug firings.

■ If you have a GM or Chrysler product with a probe holder, you can read ignition timing without looking at the marks.


Ford products also have a probe holder almost directly opposite the fixed timing indicator. It can't be used with the ignition timing scale on the universal tachometer, which reads only to 600.

We took rpm readings with the probe on a Chevette, with the inductive pickup, and with our shop tach. All were within 50 rpm-as good as you can expect. We also did a comparison timing check, and the tester was just about on the button. If you use the probe on a Chrysler product, wrap it with tape, because the holder is slightly larger than GM's. Adjustable-length test lead

If you never have the right length test lead (jumper wire), here's a five-foot test lead that retracts into a spool. The five-foot length is the maximum you normally need, and by retracting what you don't want into the spool, you don't have wire dangling in dangerous places.

The wire is 16-gauge, normal thickness for electrical trouble-

shooting. One of the features I liked best is that there is no spring in the spool, so you can pull the wire ends out to the length you want, and they stay. With pleasure

While tuning up my Chevrolet, I noticed that a porcelain chip was broken off one of the sparkplugs. As far as I know, it's bouncing around in the combustion chamber. I turned the engine over a few cycles, hoping it would be blown out through the sparkplug port, but no luck. Can you tell me if I've got trouble?—Edward J. Pleasure, North Syracuse, N.Y.

You don't know for sure if the porcelain chip fell into the cylinder. If it did and piston damage hasn't occurred by now, the chip has probably been ejected out the exhaust, or has fractured into fine particles and disintegrated.

According to Meisner

Have I got a good one for you, Mort. It concerns Honda Accords equipped with airconditioners. My experience has been that sudden battery failure can be caused by washing the car.

After a few visits to my local automatic carwash, my battery had sudden heart failure. An investigation revealed that water had entered the cooling fan relay (part No. 61400). This relay operates the radiator cooling fan motor when the airconditioning is on. It is mounted on the right-side inner fender in an inverted position (that is, with the base up).

The relay is not sealed, so that water entering the case rusts the relay return spring, which eventually breaks. When this happens, the relay contacts, which the spring keeps open except when the cooling fan motor is working, close and stay closed. This energizes the cooling fan motor and drains the battery when the ignition is off.

The solution is to replace the relay and seal its openings with a silicone sealer .- Charles Meisner. New Berlin, Wis.

Hey, hey, Accord owners-this one is a top-drawer tip. Thanks, Charles.

Two for one

I'm stumped, My 1970 Buick Wildcat's 455-cu.-in. engine started pushing oil into the carburetor air-cleaner housing at 140,000 miles, at 160,000 miles I rebuilt the powerplant, which included replacing valve guides. The engine is still doing what I thought the overhaul would keep it from doingblowing oil into the air cleaner. How about a hint?-Steve Sabat, Levittown, N.Y.

How about two? The firsthave you checked the PCV system. especially the PCV valve? A blocked PCV valve can cause strong back pressure forcing oil into the air cleaner through the valvecover-to-air cleaner hose.

The second—in rebuilding the engine, did you re-ring the pistons? If not, blowby could be pushing oil past worn rings into the valve covers and onto the air cleaner through the closed PCV system.

Searching for roots

My problem concerns a 1978 AMC Concord D/L. The gas gauge needle quivers over the dial. I was told

that there are no baffles in the fuel tank to keep gas from sloshing. They say that it's this surging of gas that's causing the problem. Is this bunk?—H. Dilettuso, Glenshaw, Pa.

Is what bunk—that there are no baffles in the fuel tank? Nothat's not bunk. But the story that lack of baffles is causing the gauge to have the heebie-jeebieswell, that's something else again.

AMC had a problem early in the '78 production run with sensitive fuel gauges. Since then, the cause (using a lubricant of insufficient viscosity) has been corrected.

What can you do to desensitize your car's gauge? Buy a new one, but when you get the price, you may settle for a jumpy needle.

Confusin' fusin'


Why is it that my car keeps knocking out the fuse protecting the airconditioner blower motor circuit? It's a 1978 Ford Fairmont. I keep replacing the fuse (15-amp.). but soon lose it. Is there a deeply rooted electrical problem here?— Tony Kemper, Ft. Worth, Tex.

Probably not. During early production, Ford put 15-amp, fuses in airconditioner blower motor circuits of '78 Fairmonts and Zephyrs. You need a 35-amp, fuse.

The Jimmy drag

Ever since I purchased my 1976 four-wheel-drive 1/2-ton Suburban, I've had trouble with the right front tire wearing unevenly. The rehicle has been driven 12,000 miles and is equipped with manually operated lockout hubs and manual transmission. The truck



has never been operated in fourwheel drive. The only time the hubs have been in "Lock" position has been during the recommended break-in period and also during once-a-month recommended drive period thereafter.

My dealer says the condition is caused by the four-wheel drive, and frequent tire rotation is the only solution. But I've rotated tires as often as he suggests. I presently have a new eight-ply Firestone Snowbiter on this wheel, and it's showing uneven wear in less than 1,000 miles.

Can you offer a solution to this annoying, expensive problem?— F.L. Bingham, Quaker Hill, Conn.

I don't follow your dealer's reasoning. Why will a truck with four-wheel drive wear one particular tire on one side unless there's a defect or alignment problem?

My thinking runs to an alignment problem. The toe-in should be set exactly at 0 and camber should be tested by the service manual method to manual specification. Also have the vehicle's turning radius checked.


In cases like this, there is also the possibility of a bent steering arm.


Oh Solex Mia

I have a 1970 Opel Kadette with 1.9-liter engine and one-barrel Solex carburetor. I had a new carburetor installed at 27,000 miles and had the carburetor overhauled again at 35,000 miles, but I can't

get rid of the problem. The engine starts and runs well when cold, but starting is hard when the engine is warm. Is there a cure?-Dr. Mervin A. Mathias, San Carlos, Calif.

Sure. This model had an inherent hot-hard start problem which was recognized in 1970-71. The trouble is caused by high fuel pump line pressure when the en-











gine is hot. To relieve the condition, remove the fuel pump, take off the cover and take out the strainer. Drill a 1/64-inch relief hole in the body of the pump at the groove nearest the outlet pipe. Clean particles from the pump, install the strainer after cleaning, then reinstall the cover and pump.

Old ways die hard

Recently, after purchasing a Sears Die Hard battery, I noticed a bulge in the case. The Sears people insist it's normal and showed me other batteries in the store which also have bulges. I always thought a bulge indicated a defect in the case, but I'll submit to Sears' explanation if you tell me to.—Frederick K. Pollock, Fort Huachuca, Ariz.

I know I'll hear from some of you for what I'm about to say, but I've got support from several authorities in the battery business. The Sears people are right, Mr. Pollock. A bulge in a battery case does not indicate a defective battery. A defective battery is one that has a cracked case and also, of course, one that happens to be electrically weak.

I, too, was brought up to believe

that a bulge denotes a weakness in the battery case. There is a fine line of distinction between a bulge and a bubble or balloon. A bubble or balloon, which is a distinct raised area of small size, like a bubble-gum bubble, indicates a weakness in the case. Your battery doesn't seem to have this.

For those of you who are going to take exception with me on this, here's another antiquated battery tale to chomp on. A battery left on a concrete floor will not—repeat, not—go dead. Not unless it's an old-time battery made of a rubber

composition. Old-timers placed on unsealed concrete floors would have charge drawn from them by moisture emanating from the floor. That's why we used to store batteries on a plank of wood or off the floor. Modern battery cases are plastic. Moisture won't affect them, Now, how about that?





File guide smooths dowel ends





With tin and solder, you can improvise an effective tool for smoothing or filing wooden dowels. Shape a guide as shown to fit around a file. Secure guide perpendicular to a tube holding the dowel. To make the tube, wrap tin-can material around the dowel, solder overlap. Solder triangular and angle braces as shown. Bow the file guide slightly for chip clearance and cover the file back with adhesive so it won't wear out the guide. To use the jig, clamp dowel in a vise, attach the guide, and insert file (which should move snugly). If greater accuracy is desirable, machine the parts from metal.—Walter E. Burton

Only 13 months to go

If Donald A. Henderson is right, Oct. 26 of next year will be a momentous day in the history of science. On that day it will have been two years since the last reported case of smallpox, and Henderson will feel confident enough to say that the disease has been eliminated—a scientific first.

Henderson, dean of the School of Hygiene and Public Health of Johns Hopkins University and a prime mover in the battle against smallpox, says the two-year figure is three times longer than the longest time the disease has gone undetected in any country and is thus "very conservative." He believes there are no unreported cases, partly because of excellent worldwide cooperation and partly because there are "substantial rewards" offered for reporting verifiable cases (as a result, a lot of nonsmallpox is reported).

The smallpox virus species will still exist, frozen at minus 20°C., in four laboratories around the world, for reference if needed.


If the two years pass with no reported cases, all smallpox vaccination programs will end, and it will no longer be necessary to be immunized to travel anywhere in the world. What if cases are reported? "We'll just have to track the virus down, tighten our surveillance program, and try again," Henderson says. "But I don't think it will happen."

Bringing Mars down to Earth

If you know what you're looking for, you can figure out the best way to find it, right? That's the principle behind an environmental chamber (see photo) that simulates the surface of Mars.

Designed by David B. Wenner of the geology department at the University of Georgia, the silverdollar-size chamber provides a carbon dioxide atmosphere of 1 to 10 millibars pressure at about minus 80°C. Mineral samples placed in the chamber can be analyzed for light reflectance spectra to see if they match those of Mars obtained by telescope.

Of particular interest to researchers is palagonite, a volcanic rock found in Iceland and Antarctica that looks similar to the rustred soil of Mars. If palagonite seems to exist on Mars, instru-

ments on future probes can be designed to seek confirmation. Such confirmation would shed new light on Martian geology, especially the possible existence of a layer of permafrost like Earth's.

The dating game

A method for dating objects as old as 30 million years has been developed at the Lawrence Berkeley Laboratory in California. The previous limit with conventional carbon-14 dating has been about 40,000 years.

In both the new and old methods, a small bit of the object to be dated is burned to form carbon dioxide gas. With the old method, the gas is introduced into a Geiger counter, which counts the decaying C-14 atoms. With the new method, known as direct counting, the gas becomes ionized when placed in a cyclotron and its C-14 atoms can be counted.

Much older objects can be dated this way, because billions of atoms are being counted, not just the one or two per minute that decay in older samples. Also, a much smaller sample need be burned. Where 1 to 10 grams were needed, only 1 to 10 milligrams are required—so that objects too precious to be destroyed can now be dated.

The new method is not restricted to C-14. Other radioactive isotopes can be used to date different types of objects. Beryllium-10, with a half-life of 1.5 million years, shows promise for use in dating rocks from 1 million to 30 million years old.

Accuracy of ± 1000 years on a

40,000-year-old sample has been achieved with the new method so far (C-14 accuracy is about ± 100 to 200 years), and scientists hope to tighten it to ± 200 soon. According to Richard Muller, inventor of direct counting, a few years of development are needed. Then, he says, he hopes that "beryllium-10 will become the carbon 14 of sedimentary rock. Direct counting will not supplant C-14 but rather supplement it for objects that cannot now be dated."



"We've had everyone from Boy Scout troops to international government agencies apply for them," says Ernest Ott of the Goddard Space Flight Center in Greenbelt, Md., and customer liaison officer for the project. As of mid-June, about 250 spaces had been sold to about 130 different groups. Materials processing (e.g., metals refining) and biology (e.g., zero-gravity effects on insect reproduction) are the two most popular categories.

After a \$500 down payment, if your experiment is accepted (it need not be original), you pay the rest in two other installments.

The shuttle is scheduled to make its first operational flight in mid-1980.—Tom Sahagian

'79 car news

When the all-new, front-drive Cadillac Eldorado, Buick Riviera and Olds Toronado debut next month, the Eldorado will be slightly longer than the other two in both wheelbase (115.8 vs. inches 114) and overall length, and it may also get the optional 350-cu.-in. Oldsbuilt diesel that was offered in the Seville earlier this year. Apparently, Cadillac feels its customers still equate size with value and will be willing to pay a bunch more for a few extra inches of status.

Pontiac's immensely popular Firebird will get a front and rear facelift for '79. In front, there is no conventional grille opening at all, just two large air intake slots below the bumper line. Around back, the '79 model will be distinguished by full-width taillamp lenses that appear totally black until the bulbs are lit and red light shows through from underneath. Very tricky.

Chrysler's '79 three-door sporty hatchbacks, sleek little numbers with very Italian-looking fastback rooflines and Chevy Monza-like soft-nosed front ends, taking a cue from Chevy's popular Camaro Z-28 performance model, will be called Horizon TC3 and Omni 2+2. An Omni appearance package will be called "024." Chrysler's all-new '79 big cars, rather ordinary-looking four-doors (in profile) with impressive standup grilles Buick-like sweptback headlamps, will boast chrome-plated aluminum bumpers and optional stamped aluminum wheels-both industry firsts. Base models will use the 225-cu.-in. "slant six" as standard engine, and both 400 and 440 V8 will be dropped for passenger-car

Chrysler also will expand usage of its unique electron beam-welded

die-cast aluminum intake manifold, will have electrical system diagnostic connectors on all '79 cars, will replace Lean Burn with a more sophisticated electronic spark-control system on most engines, will have an electronic device to detect and eliminate detonation on certain 318 V8s and will introduce a unique intake manifold fuel-injection system (called EFM, for Electronic Fuel Metering) in some 360 V8-powered cars later in the year.

Federal follies

General Motors has calculated that it spent some \$1.25 billion in 1977 just in meeting government regulations. That's about \$2100 per U.S. employee or \$200 per GM car and truck sold during the year, not including money spent to add the required equipment or to improve fuel economy. Total expenditures for 1974 through 1977 are more than \$4.5 billion, or over 1.1 billion per year.

But just in case you thought the feds were thinking of backing off a bit, listen to the new speedometer rules they want for '80-model cars, which will be introduced just one year from now. In addition to tamperproof speedometers (not a bad idea) and dual (miles and kilometers per hour) graduations. the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) plans to require even spacing between all numerals (ruling out anything but circular dials) and that the 55-mph point shall be not only included but also prominently highlighted.

Presumably our guardians in Washington feel that we motorists are too stupid to read an unevenly-graduated dial and that spotlighting the 55-mph mark would help us comply with the federal speed limit, which is now widely ignored.

GM says the law would require redesign of no less than nine instrument panels in 1980 cars just to accommodate the circular dials—at a cost of more than \$9 million. And we all know whose pockets that extra money will come out of.

New engines for '79-'82

Expected engine developments for the near future include a host of new displacement sizes coming in the next few model years—most of them will be smaller—and a few allnew units.

GM is considering a V4 powerplant for both front-drive and rear-drive small cars by 1982, the primary advantage of the "V" configuration over an inline "four" being compactness and adaptability to different drivetrains. Other GM plans include a 267-cu.-in. V8 for certain '79 intermediates, a 229-cu.-in. version of the current 200 V6 and an all-new smaller 60° V6 for the '80 front-drive compacts, a diesel version of the 260-V8 to supplement Oldsmobile's successful 350-cu.-in. diesel and a larger, new-design diesel (primarily for trucks) in '81 or '82. Also look for Pontiac to turbocharge its 2.5-liter four-cylinder engine for the '80 compact.

Among other plans, Ford will have a 254-cu.-in. version of its current 305 V8 ready for '80 compact, intermediate and large cars; and Chrysler will replace the 1.7-liter VW-built engine currently used in its Omni and Horizon front-drive small cars with a new 2.2- liter Four of its own by the '81 model year—and may have a smaller-displacement version ready for 1982.

The mini trucks battle intensifies

Reliable sources at Chevrolet report that the Japanese-built LUV mini-pickup will get a factory four-wheel-drive option along about November of this year, which should make it an instant favorite with the economy-minded off-road bunch and the California Custom crowd. Mazda hinted at a 4x4 mini-truck as long ago as 1974, but it looks like Chevy will get there first.


Also jumping, although belatedly, on the tiny-truck bandwagon is Chrysler Corp., which will begin importation of a Mitsubishi-built mini this fall. Mitsubishi, as you know, is a Japanese Chrysler partner and already does the excellent Dodge Colt and Challenger, also Plymouth Sapporo and Arrow. The vehicle will be a pickup version of the Arrow and will be sold by Chrysler-Plymouth dealers.

VW, too, is chomping the pro-



HOW TO TURN A LITTLE-USED PORCH INTO A MUCH-USED ROOM

Enclosing an existing porch is one good way of adding an extra room to your home. You can keep the wide-open, outdoor feeling that a porch has and at the same time make use of the sun's natural light by incorporating large glass areas into the room design. Since your porch already has a roof and floor, you're several steps along the way toward creating a permanent living space for very little money.

The porch enclosure shown is designed around PPG Industries' concept of turning a porch into a room by using glass walls. It utilizes four pairs of standard 6-ft. safety glass patio doors and solid wall sections. Widths of the three wall sections can be either enlarged or reduced to suit your existing porch.


The sliding glass door that opens to the deck is the entry to the room. The other three glass doors actually function as large slider windows. Decorative plant shelves serve the same purpose as an inside railing to prevent mistaking these doors for entries.

Other useful and attractive features of the plan include a 14-ft. octagonal deck and a free-standing fireplace. A beamed cathedral ceiling adds to the spacious feeling of the room. The deck is adjustable to suit available space. The fireplace is a focal point of the room. In temperate climates it can also serve as the sole source of heat for the room; in colder climates it can be a valuable extra heat source.

For plans of this porch enclosure see the directions below. These plans include specific construction details and information for building the addition, such as details for connecting the new walls to the existing one, details of header and sole plate construction and door details.

S tore food processor parts neatly and conveniently on hand in this accessory rack. It's quick, easy and inexpensive to make.


Since the rack shelf consists of two pieces glued together, you can make the odd-shaped cutouts with a saw rather than carving or routing them. Make sure you select perfectly flat wood to facilitate joining.

Cut the four pieces needed. Either use your processor parts as guides to outline the cutouts, or enlarge the patterns below and trace them. Then bore entry holes for the saw blade in the cutouts: six in the top piece and four in the bottom one. Position holes for the long slots at the cutout ends so that two parallel cuts from hole to hole will form the slots.

Use a jigsaw or coping saw to make the internal cuts, making the cutouts slightly larger than the accessories to assure an easy fit.




Use processor parts as templates for marking cutouts, or use patterns below.



For precise cutouts, use set-tooth blade. For parts fit, remove line when cutting.



Bore saw-blade entry holes. One at each end makes it easier to cut narrow slots.




Use two nails to prealign shelf parts. Apply glue sparingly to mating surfaces, nail.

Use half-round and flat wood files, then sand to smooth any saw marks.

Glue shelf sections together and secure parts with finishing nails from below. To do this, drive two pilot nails partway to align sections. Separate and apply glue to both surfaces. Clamp shelf parts and fasten with nails. When the glue has dried, cut the shelf corners round, break the edges with a plane and sand smooth.

Attach the legs with glue and finishing nails. Set the heads below the surface and use plastic wood filler. Apply polyurethane varnish, following instructions on the label.—Rosario Capotosto






How to Carry a Passenge must be passenger safely


Passenger footrests on your motorcycle must be tight; check them frequently.


Seat strap should be checked for fraying and looseness, but best grip for passenger is around the rider's waist.

Remember your first ride as a passenger on a motorcycle? Fun, wasn't it? Or was it scary? If you were sitting behind some reckless throttle jockey, it undoubtedly was a hair-raising experience.

In fact, more than one potential motorcyclist has been turned off because of a frightening first ride. It seems that some cyclists feel they have to ride wildly to impress their passengers. It's hard to enjoy biking as a passenger if the guy up

front is popping wheelies, riding hands off and scraping mufflers in the turns.

Consider your passenger's viewpoint: Maneuvers or situations normal to you might be downright frightening to him. For example, the person in back has no way of knowing what you're planning to do, so he can't react as you can. Worse, he may—in false anticipation—react against you and cause you to lose control. Even if you're carrying a model passenger, the extra weight affects your bike's balance and control.

The right bike

Is your bike equipped for hauling a passenger? It should be adequately powered. You can't expect a 100-cc machine to haul two people safely on a crowded highway. A 250 is minimum, and, depending on the size of you and your passenger, even a 250 might not have enough stuff. For serious two-up riding, consider at least a 400-cc bike.

Your two-wheeler should have a set of passenger footrests and either a seat strap or a grab rail. Rear-tire pressure is important, too. Check the owner's manual for rec-

ommended pressure when carrying someone. If necessary, set up the rear shocks (if adjustable) to firm setting to accommodate the extra weight. And make sure your passenger is wearing a good helmet along with suitable eye protection.

How to sit and lean

Before you and your friend start chasing the horizon, brief him or her on the fine points of two-up riding. Your passenger should sit as near to you as possible. In this way, the center-of-gravity effect of your total weight will be near to the motorcycle's center of gravity. The bike, therefore, will be more controllable and responsive.

A passenger who sits too far rearward shifts the center of gravity effect too far back. The front end becomes light and tends to wander. Conversely, the passenger shouldn't sit too far forward and push you up

on the gas tank.

If your passenger holds onto either the seat strap or the grab rail, he'll tend to sit farther away from you. The best way is to have him place his arms around your waist, with fingers interlocked. This way he or she won't be so inclined to counterlean in the turns. Emphasize importance of leaning with you in the turns. It's a natural reaction, though, for an inexperienced passenger to lean opposite the bank side. So be prepared for it.

Make sure your passenger is centered in the seat. In other words, there shouldn't be any leaning to one side. It's not only annoying, but

it affects steering.

Tell your passenger to keep his feet on the footrests at all times. Even when you're stopped for a red light or a stop sign, you'll find it easier to manage the bike.


Warn about bumps ahead

Another good idea is to give your passenger some warning of impending jolts or bumps in the road. In this way, your friend can brace or support himself against the footrests to absorb the jolt better and not lose balance. A passenger who is jolted unexpectedly may react by grabbing you or by shifting his weight sharply.

When riding long distances packing double, plan periodic stops. It's tiring to both rider and passenger to sit cramped for long periods of time. A tired passenger will shift around a lot more trying to get

comfortable.

A little consideration will make motorcycling more enjoyable and safer for your passengers. They'll thank you for it.



anned flight made possible and sustained by nothing more than sunlight? It has the ring of a madman's obsession, of alchemy, a shell game . . . a free lunch. Yet it's none of these; as preparations for the first manned solar-powered flight move toward completion at several technology centers around the globe, this once mythical proposition is being taken quite seriously.


All energy—fossil fuels, nuclear, wind, solar—emanates directly or indirectly from the sun. But so far, only indirect solar power sources have normally been used to take aircraft aloft. Now


solar and ultralight aircraft technologies are melding to perfect a new flight format: direct solar-powered airplanes. The cost of cells which convert sunlight to electricity, still prohibitive but descending, is the primary barrier to this ultimate in ecologically sound aircraft.

With development of practical solar cells in the early 1950s came realization that an airplane's wings are potential ready-made platforms for thousands of solar cells which could power flight. Probably the first serious proposal came from the late Gus Raspet of Mississippi State University, and




his former student, Bruce Carmichael, in 1954. Twenty years later, it was updated by F.G. Irving and D. Morgan of London's Imperial College of Science and Technology, at an M.I.T. symposium. Their paper outlined how the idea had become practical technically, but at a projected price of around \$100,000 for solar cells alone on an





Startling new theories on LIGHT and COLOR

Some scientists now believe that the kind of light you are exposed to can affect your moods, your behavior and even your health.

Color is such an everyday part of our lives it is hard to imagine that it can have any effect other than to please or irritate. But therein lies the clue—all of us are aware that there are some colors we like and some we don't; some make us feel calm, while others are energizing. And if, as recent biochemical research indicates, for each psychological event there is a physiological reaction, the premise that color might actually influence our wellbeing sounds not so wild after all.

The use of color as therapy (see page 184) has been attempted in one form or another since the ancient Egyptians. The healers divined which color the patient was deficient in and put him in a room of that color. Gems of various hues were also employed, and could either be worn, held, or used to treat water: You soak the gem in the water, which "charges it" with the color of the gem, and then drink the water. Pythagoras experimented with color therapy, basing his methods on the notion that color could be "fed" through the eyes.

The idea behind the gems as talismans of health is that the various stones—which are minerals—vibrate at different frequencies and act as condensers of energy from the sun.

Now considering that light and color are frequency vibrations of a sort, the thinking that gems could alter the energy field around you is not so farfetched. Furthermore, some of the latest research in nutrition suggests that minerals are exceedingly important to health. The difference here is that proponents of gem therapy advanced the concept that it is not necessary to ingest the mineral; merely keeping it in contact with the skin was thought to be sufficient.

Different nutritive effects

Color therapists today generally believe that when the body is in balance it filters out of white light the colors that it needs. When something's amiss, hues applied in a variety of ways—even wearing a light blue sweater on a day when you have a sore throat—are supposed to help. Green, for instance, is thought to build muscle and tissue, and likewise, they attest, eating green foods will also help. Considering that green vegetables are a rich source of vitamins and minerals,

needed to build strong tissues, the color therapists have a point there.

Although color therapy smacks of the occult, some serious researchers, most of whom would scoff at matters psychic, are coming up with seemingly amazing results.

If we consider light a source of energy, it is reasonable to assume that each kind of light—each color—might have a different nutritive effect. Generally, foods of a certain color tend to have the same vitamins: Reddish foods (such as meat and beets) frequently are high sources of B vitamins; yellow-green foods (lemons, greens) are rich in Vitamin C.

At this stage of knowledge our concept of color is a combination of two theories, and the reality is probably somewhere in between. Light seems to act like a wave, with a crest and a trough. When two beams of light hit each other crest to crest, their brightness increases, and when a crest of one wave touches a trough of another, the brightness is diminished.

Yet, light remains a mystery, even to the physicists, because sometimes it behaves like a particle and not like a wave system. We do know that no matter what form it assumes it travels at the speed of 186,000 miles per second. This is a fact that we accept without fully comprehending.

Sir Isaac Newton passed light through a prism and a single white beam was dispersed into red. orange, yellow, green, blue, indigo and violet. He attempted to relate these colors to the seven notes in an octave, and while critics derided that connection as mystical nonsense, we now know that sound, in fact, has an effect on our perception of color. Low-pitched sounds tend to make color appear to deepen; red moves toward blue, orange appears more red. The opposite is true of high-pitched tones, which make colors seem lighter.

Light affects us in more ways than simply allowing us to see. Anything other than the full spectrum of natural sunlight has been shown to produce abnormalities in plants and animals. Light, in addition to being necessary for vision, stimulates both the pituitary and pineal glands and possibly other regions of the midbrain which control the production of hormones and have a great deal to do with how we feel.

It is not simply that portion of the spectrum which we can see that is important, but also the bands of long-wave ultra-violet that are present but not visible to the naked eye.

Are we light-starved?

Several studies over the last few decades link ordinary fluorescent lights, which contain only a part of the spectrum of light waves, to a host of general ills far beyond tired and aching eyes—from hyperactivity to cavities. And there is some data suggesting that limited lighting may be related to some forms of cancer. At least a half dozen animal studies have come up with a similar conclusions: reduced-spectrum lighting influences the growth and incidence of some types of cancer.

Incandescent lights, while they lack the full spectrum of natural sunlight, do not appear to cause the same problems as limited fluorescence. Nevertheless, incandescent bulbs emit little or no ultraviolet and have a graduated continuum which is slanted toward large amounts of red and infrared.

John Ott, former chairman and executive director of the Environmental Health and Light Research Institute in Fort Lauderdale, developed full-spectrum fluorescents after nearly 40 years observing the effects of lights upon plant growth.

Ott created the full-spectrum by adding the proportionate amount of non-visible "black light" to the blend of phosphors currently used in a fluorescent tube.

Improved fluorescents are manufactured by several companies: General Electric Chroma 50, Duro-Test Optima, Philips Verd-A-Ray and Vita Lite. They cost a bit more than the limited-spectrum tubes, and the black light burns out in approximately a year with normal use, although the tube will still appear to be going strong, making it necessary to replace the fixture before you can "see" that it needs to be.

Garcy Lighting of Chicago is manufacturing a system using regular tubes with a small black light tube that can be changed when necessary during the normal life of the larger tubes. Called Spectralite, (Please turn to page 184)

What to look for in the new video recorders

The right choice of features will help you get the most out of home TV recording.


The home video cassette recorder (VCR) is the hot new status appliance—for \$1000 or so, you may still be able to be the first on your block to own one. Everyone knows they let you store programs on tape for later viewing. But it's harder to know precisely which machine will meet your particular needs in terms of such lactors as picture quality, record-and-playback time and convenience of operation.


To find out just how gcod today's VCRs are, we chose a cross section of the available machines. The six you see here ably represent the general level of performance you can expect from a home video tape recorder. But this is far from a complete collection of VCRs—there already are dozens on the market.

In addition, newer models may already be available from each manufacturer. New machines are being introduced so often, it would be impossible to be completely up-to-date and still give each unit a thorough inspection. It's not as bad as it sounds, though. Most of the newer machines differ only in cosmetics and in additional features compared with the units we tested. The guts of the machines haven't changed much. So the performance you can expect from a VCR you see today is about the same as the performance of the machines we tested, even if it looks a little different or has a few extra conveniences.

The most important thing to remember when you shop for a VCR is that there are two major types of machines—Beta and VHS (Video Home System)—along with a couple of other versions that don't fit into either of these categories. The different types are not compatible—tapes made on one type of machine can't be played on another type. And formats that have few manufacturers behind them—those other than VHS and Beta—may not survive, so getting both prerecorded and brank tape could become a problem. Therefore, choosing the format family to join is an important buying decision.


In any case, the recording tape is housed in a plastic cartridge about the size of a soft-cover book and about








an inch thick. Inside the machine, the tape is drawn out of the cartridge and wrapped around a rotating drum that contains the record and playback heads. The tape is in contact with the drum for a little more than half the drum's circumference, so that the path the tape takes as it passes the heads is roughly the horseshoe shape of the Greek letter omega. That's why video recorders are said to use an "omega wrap."

The way the tape is drawn out of the cassette and wrapped around the heads differs for the different machine types. In the Beta system, one swinging arm draws the tape out at one point and wraps it around the drum. Recorders that belong to the VHS family use two parallel arms that pull the tape out at points on either











side of the drum, then swing together to wrap the tape tightly against the spinning drum. The VHS two-arm "Mloading" system is a little quicker, but the tape can't run at high speed once it's in playing position, so you have to wait for the tape to load and unload every time you switch from play or record to Fast Forward or Rewind, or vice versa. The second or two of delay gets to be a pain, especially if you're used to audio tape recorders and their immediate response.

Beta-format machines, on the other hand, wrap the tape as soon as the cassette is inserted into the machine, and keep it wrapped until you hit the Eject button. That creates a minor nuisance of its own. You can't get the tape out if you turn off the power before

Bright, clear pictures are possible with all of the half-dozen video cassette recorders (VCRs) we tested. To magnify any flaws that might appear in their reproduced pictures, we coupled them to the 5-foot diagonal Advent Videobeam projection television system, Model 710. 

ejecting the cassette. You have to turn the machine on again first. Strangely, VHS cassettes are larger, but the machines are smaller. The JVC recorder is substantially more compact than others. So it's easier to find somewhere to put it.

The complicated tape path causes another problem with VCRs. If the machines get cold—transporting one to a friend's house, say—bringing them into a warm room can cause moisture in the air to condense on the drum and other mechanical parts. The tape can stick

and cause severe damage to the machine's fragile innards. So you have to let a VCR sit for an hour or so after exposure to cold. Three of the VHS machines we tested—Panasonic, RCA and GE—have Dew lights to warn that the machine isn't ready. When the light is on, the machine won't start, so at least you don't have to worry that you haven't waited long enough.

Recording time is another confusing point. Basic Beta-format machines, like Sony's and Zenith's, can record up to three hours on a cassette. Basic VHS machines like the JVC can record up to two hours on one cartridge. The other VHS machines we tested—Panasonic, RCA and GE—have two playing speeds, so they can record up to four hours on a single cassette. If you want to record entire sporting events or long movies, the extended recording mode of some units could be very important.

The longer-recording units though, offer somewhat lower picture quality, not only at the slower speed

ere's a real oddball number," Ed Owen says, lifting a sleek gray plastic device from a glass case. It was faintly reminiscent of a hand-held color slide viewer.

"It's a Taser," he explains, "an electronic weapon manufactured in California. It works somewhat like a capacitor discharge system in a car. You fit little plugs in it. Each has two small barbs tethered to 15 feet of insulated wire. When you fire the thing its batteries discharge 50,000 volts of current. This explodes an electric squib that spits out the tethered barbs which, in turn, supposedly snag in the clothing of whoever you fired at. As long as you keep the trigger depressed it pulses 50,000 volts, feeding it to the barbs and giving the victim a charge designed to keep him 'pulsating' and out of action."

Edward M. Owen, a technician for the U.S. Treasury Department's Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms (ATF), notes that the unique "persuader" originally was developed to stop airplane highjackers. By the time it was perfected, highjacking had fallen off under the Sky Marshal program.

Watch that cigaret pack—it could be a gun. Basement gunsmiths have made deadly weapons from keys, grease guns, tire gauges and pens. Some you wouldn't believe.

The company, says Owen, tried to market Tasers commercially-as a deterrent to muggers and a general civilian protector. But as a commercially available weapon, the ATF could not approve it.

The Taser is only one of more than 4000 weapons in a "Firearms Technical Library" assembled by a team of five technical specialists under Technology Chief Nicholas Vainovich, in the Treasury Department's ATF Bureau.

The unique arsenal, located in the steel and concrete basement of the U.S. Post Office Building in Washington, D.C., is not open to the public. A wide variety of intrusion devices alerts security guards whenever an unauthorized person passes through the bank-vault-type door to the sealed area. It is, in fact, a "library" of guns available to law enforcement agencies as a weapons

information reference file. growing collection represents guns that have been seized in criminal cases, or were bought from criminals by members of ATF's army of 1600 agents. Representative military weapons have been donated by the armed services. Other weapons may be samples submitted by manufacturers, or guns confiscated by ATF under the National Firearms Act of 1934, and the Gun Control Act of 1968.

As Ed Owen explains it, there's no such thing as an "illegal firearm" in this country. However, certain weapons-such as machine sawed-off shotguns, shortbarreled rifles, pen guns, cane guns, military-type "destructive weapons" and other specified lethal devices-must be registered. An individual who wants to make such a device, which Treasury men call a

"National Firearms Act (NFA) weapon," may do so legally with ATF approval plus a registration fee (up to \$200)—provided local authorities and laws of his state permit him to own it. It costs a like fee to transfer most registered NFA weapons later, unless they're going to ATF.

Many of the exotic guns, "gangster-type" weapons and Saturday night specials on display in the gun library were seized in criminal cases. Biggest heartbreaker to a sportsman is the \$13,500 Purdy double-barreled shotgun, that a thief stole from the workshop of an Abercrombie and Fitch gunsmith. After sawing a foot off the barrels and six inches from the stock, he got caught using it in a narcotics stick-

Stories behind most weapons in the library are hard to come by. "Objectivity is our rule," Owen explains. "When I'd get a gun in a court case, I put the case report aside. I don't want to know about it. If I should find that some guy killed 47 people with the weapon, it could

Many devices, however, tell a graphic story by themselves. Typical is an attache case "assassination kit" seized in a Florida crime syndicate operation. Inside the innocent-looking thing is an Armalite AR7.22 rifle with silencer and cutdown barrel. A simple linkage bar extends from the trigger to a brass finger loop under the handle. A small hole, framed in ragged leather on the front end of the case, attests to the fact that the kit served its purpose. But Ed Owen apologizes for it.

"It's sloppy," he says. "The thick



had been waiting for America to build a car like the Rabbit and Honda. It finally came, but with better styling, a more roomy interior and a lower price tag," says a Wisconsin production supervisor and Horizon owner.


He's one of 2000 Plymouth Horizon and Dodge Omni owners we surveyed to get a wide spectrum of reactions to their cars. Most Omni-Horizon (O-H) owners thought the vehicles themselves were great, particularly as to economy, handling, roominess and comfort. But a few report un-

satisfactory dealer mechanics and small, annoying early problems.

Before we get into specific problems, let's review some over-



all reactions to the cars. A Minnesota office manager observes that "interior roominess is surprising. The trunk area holds a fantastic amount, especially when you put the rear seat-back down."

A Colorado Omni owner and industrial parts manager: "The front-wheel drive (fwd) gives exceptional stability in crosswinds despite the surface area of the car. I also like the precise, fairly short throws of the shifter and the performance from this small, economical engine."

A Michigan writer: "We like our Horizon's fuel economy—26 mpg in town and 31 on the highway. Also the fwd roadability and overall efficiency of layout. Interior space is intelligently used. Very comfortable. We love it!"

A Florida aircraft mechanic: "I originally wanted a VW Rabbit, but they cost too much. The wife wanted an American-made car with economy and good service. So we made a deal. We're very pleased with the Omni. It's quiet, has an excellent paint job, good fit and it rides a lot better than my old 1970 Dodge."

Omni owners rated dealer service average to poor by a 51-percent majority. Plymouth dealers scored better: only 46.8 percent of Horizon owners rated them average to poor. Repeated bring-backs, waits for parts and repairs, and lack of familiarity were some more-often-voiced criticisms.

Over 65 percent of the owners we queried had experienced mechanical or fit-and-finish problems that needed dealer adjustment—fairly high when compared with other cars we've reported in this price class. Most problems, though, were minor.

under warranty, but it surely is annoying to have to go back every week for service."

Over 80 percent of O-H owners rated workmanship good to excellent. "Every part is put together well," opines a South Carolina student. And a New York retiree echoes, "I was pleasantly surprised by the quality of my Omni. It's really sumptuous—well put together mechanically, neat and efficient."

We got the following responses from owners about comfort:

"Excellent spaciousness front and rear," comments a Michigan quality controller. "I have a sixfoot-two friend who's comfortable in the rear seat."

A Wisconsin dairy farmer: "For a small car, the ride is outstanding. There is also more legroom in the back seat than in a lot of fullsized cars."

A New York computer specialist: "This is truly a 4/5-passenger car, and it can seat that many in comfort and still not bottom out on most road surfaces."

Front-wheel drive and general handling characteristics received spontaneous praise. A New York


The Omni and Horizon are nimble and predictable handlers as PM found in its Firsthand Report (page 64, Jan. '78) and its coast-to-coast drive (page 93, Apr. '78). Owners, too, rate handling as a most-liked feature (second to fuel economy).

When it comes to fuel economy, owners are especially satisfied. In our surveys, low or lower-than-expected mpg usually is cited as a dislike or area needing improvement. Only a low (Omni) or insignificant number (Horizon) of owners complained.

The Omni-Horizon (O-H) uses a front-wheel-drive (fwd) VW Rabbit engine block, stroked slightly to give 128 cc more displacement and a little more torque. Chrysler puts on its own manifolds, a Holley two-barrel carb, ignition, and accessories. The O-H also uses the Rabbit's four-speed manual gearbox, although a Chrysler Torque-Flite is optional.

Slightly larger than the Rabbit and several hundred dollars less expensive, the O-H makes efficient use of space and boasts 34.4 cu. ft. of luggage area. Contrast this with 29.2 cu. ft. for the Nova hatchback. O-H weighs a mere 2100 lbs., thanks to such economies as 8-lb. aluminum bumpers that interchange front to rear. MacPherson struts fore and independent and coil-sprung axles aft suspend OH; front discs are standard.

schoolteacher says, "We testdrove our Horizon in 8 to 12 inches of snow, and because it negotiated our driveway with a 20-percent grade in deep snow, we bought it."

"It's a fun car to drive—puts me back in the driver's seat again," enthuses a Vermont physician. "We live on a curving, steep road eight miles out of town and find traction excellent."

A Florida car renter: "Frontwheel drive and steering really make the Horizon corner and hold the road very well."

A New York physician: "Excellent design. Easy to handle. Responsive. Good ride. Easy to park. A delight to drive. Easily maneuverable."

We next asked respondents to list features of their Omnis and Horizons they liked *least*. Roughly 15 percent had no complaints; here's a cross section of the rest:

"My fingers get caught in the door handles," complains a Delaware pipefitter, "and I can't get the doors open in wintertime when I wear gloves."

Illinois piano tuner: "The gas pedal is all wrong. Its angle is too steep, and it's too far to the right. It's impossible to drive any distance without getting a cramp." (The gas pedal position in later O-Hs has been changed for greater comfort.)

An independent Michigan mechanic criticized his dealer's service department: "The Omni is the first car we would like to own two of. However, after having to deal with the company's service staff, I have serious reservations."

"Rattles like a can of marbles when you go over railroad

tracks," groans an Oregon housewife.

Minnesota baker: "Noises in the

dashboard, no underneath vents, can hear shock absorbers and gas tank when rear seat folded flat, and it's hard to remove the oil filter."

Wisconsin postal clerk: "Gas mileage not so good as expected, and it's hard to find a comfortable position for your right foot when cruising."

Here's what Omni and Horizon owners like best about their cars.

A Colorado flower grower: "This Omni has replaced our Saab for personal use and a Ford van for business. It has traveled every major mountain pass in Colorado, driven through 18 or more inches of heavy, wet snow without snow tires, and done everything we expected of it and more. If it continues to perform as it has, we agree that is is the car of the future."

A Wisconsin carpenter foreman: "We like the solid feeling of the car, the front-wheel drive, the four doors, the comfortable and roomy back seat, the visibility, the idea of the hatch and rear storage area, but we especially like the Horizon's looks. That is what attracted us initially and what probably sold us on the car."

An independent designer/ technician from Wisconsin: "I tried the Honda and Rabbit but wanted to buy American. This was the only car on the market comparable to the Accord. It has excellent visibility, and handling is tops. I took delivery in mid-January, so I had the opportunity to try my Horizon out all winter. Can't praise front-wheel drive enough for safety in snow and on ice. I came from a Chrysler New Yorker, and





magine the worst: a thermonuclear war is imminent. The first burst of atomic radiation fills the atmosphere. All telecommunications halt.

How will our military commanders-and the President-stay in touch with the nuclear submarines still submerged and operational? Their remaining missiles might prove the margin between total victory and total defeat. But, according to sealed orders, they have to wait until they receive a direct Presidential command, How will anyone ever tell them where and when to strike?

Today, there is no foolproof way anyone could reach those submarines with any existing communication system. But if teams of both Naval and private scientists succeed, there may soon be a completely undetectable and jamproof way to communicate.

Even more incredibly, these supersecret beams will travel through the Earth, not over or around it like conventional radio messages. This improbable communications work will be based on radiationfree, subatomic particles called neutrinos.

Nuclear physicists have only been able to detect neutrinos regularly for about five years. Yet, forward looking scientists like Dr. Peter Kotzer of Western Washington Uni-

versity, Bellingham, Wash., say intense, powerful beams of these particles could also revolutionize all telecommunications-television, telephone and radio-in a few decades.

Neutrinos (Italian for "little neutrons") are exceptional because they pass through matter-all kinds-as if it were transparent (see The Shot Heard Around the World, page 94). Neutrinos have no mass and no electric charge. They are the offspring of subatomic particle collisions-protons colliding with protons. They travel at or near the speed of light.

Neutrinos are so small-about 100,000 times smaller than a proton—as to be almost incomprehensible. Protons are one of the basic

building blocks of the universe: One proton and one electron make up a hydrogen atom, the smallest atom. The space between the proton in the center of the atom and the rotating electron has been compared to the space between the Earth and the sun. Imagine how much smaller the neutrinos are!

A radio wave, or any kind of electromagnetic transmission, bumps against matter and is deflected or attenuated. Yet with just the shortest burst of energy, neutrinos will zoom right through any known medium. This ghost-like quality makes them almost impossible to intercept.

But tracking neutrinos, on the other hand, is fairly easy-if anything in the world of particle physics is easy-says Dr. Albert Saenz, head of a research team at the Naval Research Laboratory near Washington, D.C. Saenz's group is currently conducting studies in close contact with Kotzer and others. A decade ago, researchers began to realize that neutrinos fired in short bursts from man-made, high energy accelerators, such as one at Fermilab, near Bativia, Ill., occasionally collide with other subatomic particles and leave tracks that can be recorded on special detectors.

The frequency of these collisions is very, very low-on the order of one for every 17 tons of matter traversed. Yet, within a year, Kot-

zer's group may actually send and receive the first human "message" on a neutrino beam. Kotzer has three proposals before a Fermilab Review Committee: The first is a small test within the target area of an accelerator like Fermilab. The second would shoot a neutrino beam into Washington's Puget Sound to test working neutrino detectors. During most of its passage in that test, the neutrino beam would be above ground. So, the third proposed test-with no target yet fixed-would send a beam entirely through the Earth.

Since neutrinos were first found in 1956, they've only been "used" to explore pure scientific theories—the sun's structure, galactic explosions and even more exotic atomic particles. Kotzer's team wants its first test to examine "a simple coding scheme—like Morse code—to demonstrate that we can recognize patterns in neutrino beam bursts," he says.

640,000-watt bursts

Using a high-powered particle accelerator like Fermilab isn't like playing catch in the back yard, though. This huge accelerator is actually a series of small accelerators which, within seconds, generate more than 400 billion electron volts (giga-volts or GeV.) at 53.1 megahertz (millions of radio waves per second). An electron volt is a measure of the energy which a particle acquires when it is introduced into a field created by a specific voltage. In conventional terms, the energy of one proton thrown out from the 400 GeV. accelerator is .0000000064 joule. But the average number of protons emitted in a one-second burst is 100,000,000,000,000 or 10" protons. Each burst packs a very dangerous wallop of 640,000 watts.

Besides Fermilab, only three other accelerators in the world are powerful enough to conduct neutricommunications experiments: no Brookhaven Laboratory on Long Island, Serpukhov Laboratory near Moscow (which has more power than Fermilab) and the CERN Laboratory in Zurich, Switzerland. Brookhaven, with 40 GeV. powerthe minimum for these tests—was recently given the money to expand to Fermilab's present size.

Fermilab offers an excellent example of how such tests would occur at any of these locations. The Fermilab accelerator is a mile-wide ring of 1000 supermagnets buried 19 feet below ground. The proton burst begins in the "injector," a preaccelerator, a linear accelerator and a booster. The protons gather speed

and power through these three and are hurled into the main ring.

Driving protons with magnets

The magnets in the main ring "bend" the proton burst and increase its energy. Each time a proton burst circles this ring—about once every 20 billionths of a second (20 nanoseconds)—it can be driven out of the main ring by different magnets.

The protons hurtle through a series of stronger magnets, which fling them into "the switchyard." In this long, underground passage, the proton beam is magnetically manipulated, shaped and literally split into three separate beams. First, one is quickly "shaved off" into a proton testing area; another part into a meson (another particle) testing area a few hundred yards further along. The main beam shoots into the neutrino area (433 yards wide and 867 yards long), striking a 20-ton aluminum bar.

The proton beam collides with aluminum atoms and immediately releases a trillion neutrinos. Normally, the neutrinos fly into a 15-foot-high bubble chamber filled with about 8000 gallons of liquid hydrogen. Even then, the trillion neutrinos leave only a few "tracks" during each burst (see photo, page 92).



UPDIKE VS. NEUTRINOS

Almost two decades ago, when science's early guesses as to the nature of the shadowy world of subatomic particles served mainly to confuse the general public, the neutrino's suspected presence was announced. One of those taken aback by its bizarre properties was the respected novelist, John Updike, whose poem on the subject, Cosmic Gall, first appeared in The New Yorker in 1960. It remains a classic of its type:


Neutrinos, they are very small They have no charge and have no mass And do not interact at all. The earth is just a silly ball To them, through which they simply pass, Like dustmaids down a drafty hall Or photons through a sheet of glass. They snub the most exquisite gas, Ignore the most substantial wall, Cold shoulder steel and sounding brass, Insult the stallion in his stall, And, scorning barriers of class, Infiltrate you and me. the plan is to simulate special detectors like those that could constitute a deep underwater communications system. They will test to see if "Cherenkov detectors" will actually track and record neutrinos in synchronized bursts, the way electronic pulses are recorded in digital and analog computing.

"We will transmit specific neutri-

no patterns so we can tell if the receiver "reads" the pattern. We want to tune up for a search for special heavy-mass neutrinos that may travel slower than the speed of light. If we can trace them we'll learn how to control neutrinos in pulsed signals," says Kotzer.

The Cherenkov detectors, first built in 1970, don't actually catch neutrinos. They record on "photomultipliers" the infinitesimal flashes of blue light emitted when neutrinos collide with other particles. The light is emitted along a 41° muon (yet another subatomic particle) cone which races in front of the neutrinos.

Cherenkov, an 86-year-old Russian scientist, discovered and studied the bluish flashes as a researcher at a Moscow University laboratory in the early 1930s. Now retired after directing the same lab for many years, he still continues his particle physics research.

The detector is made of deceptively simple materials: two 5-inchsquare Lucite sheets. In a quarterinch space between the sheets, a sodium fluorescin solution is trapped. Photocells and conventional electronic devices record the flashes when they hit the Lucite sheets. If the flashes equal the same number, timing and spacing as that mathematically predicted from the neutrino beam at its origin, then neutrino "communications" will be a reality.

Kotzer's Cherenkov detector will include three photomultipliers. It will be five feet in diameter, will look like an eyeball, and will weigh about 50 pounds.

Undersea photomultipliers

This first "message" will also teach scientists how to calibrate undersea arrays of these photomultipliers. They'll then know how to refine the neutrino bursts and the detectors to operate within the same billionths of a second.

Yet this is only a beginning. The power of the Fermilab accelerator will soon be increased by 250 percent to one trillion electron volts (TeV.) and will thus achieve "Tevatron" status. Kotzer says that will increase the neutrino detection rate by 1500 percent while costs increase only 250 percent.

Dr. Saenz says the current neutrino beam collision rate averages only 25 collisions per hour for every million tons of water at a distance of 600 miles from the accelerator. With the Tevatron, Saenz speculates, the collision rate should jump to 25,000 per hour for every 10 million tons of water at 600 miles, and 2500 collisions per hour at 6000 miles. The one-yard-wide (at the Fermilab aperture) neutrino beam widens to three-fifths of a mile at a 600-mile distance and to six miles wide at 6000 miles. The water "catch basin" at 6000 miles would have to have a volume of 1350 cubic feet with several hundred detectors


The shot heard through the world

"It's been proposed that we work with the Russians to send neutrino beams from Fermilab to Lake Baykal, the largest freshwater lake in the world, near Mongolia," says Dr. Peter Kotzer of Western Washington University. "The lake is about 6000 miles through the Earth from Fermilab. (Remember the Earth's diameter is only 7917.) The lake is about 5000 feet deep and holds 6 percent of the world's fresh water." As if sending messages through the Earth isn't enough, Dr. Kotzer says "several new kinds of physics" will soon be possible using neutrino beams. Among them are:

Earth measurements. Neutrinos may oscillate in relation to other particles. If they do, we'll have a way to measure the motion of the Earth's subsurface plates and test the "Plate Tectonics" theory with a device 1000 times more sensitive than anything used now, Kotzer says. Neutrino beam determinations of these plate movements would be accurate to within one foot or less.

Extraterrestrial communications. The NASA Cyclops project is trying to detect intelligent signals from outer space. "Our opinion is that intelligent beings elsewhere in the universe would use neutrinos to send signals because of their distinct advantages over any kind of electromagnetic waves," Kotzer says. "We can now use our detectors to receive neutrinos from point-like sources in the galaxies and attempt to decode possible intelligent transmissions." This extragalactic search could be an extension of two very vigorous current programs to differentiate neutrinos from cosmic rays.

Cosmic ray detectors: "The largest of these programs is Project DUMAND (Deep Underwater Muon and Neutrino Detection) sponsored by the Naval Research Laboratory and concentrating on refining Cherenkov detectors to measure cosmic neutrino sources. A second project group is using manned submersibles carrying detectors to

1000 and 2000 feet deep, and is funded by the Harbor Beach Foundation. It's led by Edwin Link, who developed the famous Link Trainer for pilots, and J. Sword Johns. Off the Bahamas recently, this group set a world record by submerging cosmic ray recording equipment 2000 feet deep at normal atmospheric pressure and retrieving it. No small feat when you consider the tons of pressure per square inch at that depth.


Faster-than light particles. Neutrino communication refinements could detect and record suspected subatomic particles that move faster than light, Kotzer says.


New neutrinos. Kotzer also thinks the experiments may reveal new principles of particle physics. The theory is neutrinos can change into mu-mesons, heavy leptons or even electrons. As he puts it, "Proving that would be like proving humans can change their sex without the aid of surgery."





The idea of a fire breaking out in your home has never been a pleasant one. Unfortunately, the evidence mounting up now in reports from fire investigators, insurance companies and municipal officials points to an entirely new syndrome of fire in the home.

In brief, these fires, which can cause death in a number of ways, are deadlier than ever.

From these reports, the consensus describes the new fire syndrome as a new pattern of toxic or combustible gases being generated, sometimes leading to an explosive inferno from which there can be no escape.

Day after day, newspapers are reporting: "House explodes as firemen arrive. Seven die. Puzzled firemen find family dead but no one was burned."

And so on. It happens, too, in apartments, and even one-story ranch style homes—and mobile homes, many of which now are known to be literal firetraps.

Fires weren't always like this.

You'd smell wood smoke. (Now there may be no wood, no smell at first.) You'd hear the crackle of flames. (Now there may be silence—right up until the booming phenomenon known as "flashover.") And before, there would be time to phone firemen, or use a garden hose or fire extinguisher. (Now, says the National Fire Protection Assn., you're lucky if you have 20 seconds in which to act.)

The trouble is: We fill our homes today with plastics and flammables



The night inferno-a deadly fire that begins noiselessly and with little or no flame before a sudden violent eruption into holocaust-can claim human lives long before its telltale signs give any alarm.

and fluids, some of which are toxic, others explosive. Experts say some plastics burn in weird new ways, much hotter and faster, emitting deadly fumes that if inhaled, can alter the senses and kill by asphyxiation. "Two breaths of some of these fumes and you're in serious trouble," firemen say.

Homes can seal in fumes

To make matters worse, many homes now are almost virtually sealed-for heating and cooling efficiency. Fumes can't escape. Meanwhile we keep filling them with wonderful new devices and decorations not realizing that we're virtually priming a bomb.

Today's firemen are magnificent. They arrive in seconds, and readily risk their lives. But more often, houses and apartments are infernos even before firemen get there. And even if firemen can still get in, they can't see. "Smoke is often oily and thick," they say.

"We just have to pass our hands

over the beds and feel for people."

Officials didn't begin to piece together what was happening until one day in Washington, DC., three years ago.

At 10:30 a.m. firemen received an alarm. It came from Building 213 at the U.S. Navy Yard, where a common office copying-machine had overheated and caught fire.

It wasn't much of a fire. Firemen didn't even use masks. They doused the machine, had the fire out in a jiffy. Within 20 minutes they were on their way back to the station.

Then began a strange series of events. Back at the firehouse, firemen began falling ill. Some described it as tightness in the chest. Others had splitting headaches, dizziness, vomiting.

Next day, an engine driver fainted. Then he came to, said he "felt fine," and dropped dead.

Shocked, two Washington physicians, Drs. Robert Dyer and Victor Esch, began a long, careful investigation. The finger pointed not at CO (carbon monoxide), the old familiar cause of fire death, but at a gas which develops whenever polyvinyl chloride (PVC), a common household plastic, burns. The gas was hydrogen chloride (HCl), a real killer.

Before long the inquiry had also turned up other poisons: chlorine, phosgene, nitrogen dioxide, sulfur dioxide, ammonia.

As a service to doctors and firemen, the Journal of the American Medical Assn. recently devoted eight pages to fire dangers, including a five-page report from Drs. Dyer and Esch.

"Practically every structure today contains plastics capable of producing lung-damaging gases," the physicians warned. "The firefighter faces a great, new risk. . . ."


Dangerous slow burn

But what AMA didn't say was that the same risk now faces anyone whose house catches fire. Even "fire-retardant" furnishings like some drapes and rugs contribute new danger, for the very fact that they burn slowly, it's now being discovered, can lead to the emission of more gases.


One trouble, the medical investigation found, is that some plastics have a combustion temperature two to five times higher than other household combustibles. And even the wiring (including telephone wiring) in your house can give off poisonous gas, for it may be coated with PVC insulation.

Here's what might happen if a fire starts in your main switch box: The plastic insulation emits white, mist-like HCl fumes that resemble steam. One or two breaths can derange you to the point where it is impossible for you to think your way out.


Newspapers every day report deaths from "smoke inhalation." The real cause is often fire gases. In California recently, a confused woman could have escaped her onestory house merely by opening an outside bedroom door and stepping out to her lawn. Instead she opened




11:00 p.m.: Man watching TV show dozes off; his cigaret falls onto the plastic-base upholstery of his lounge chair.




11:40: Material has been smoldering very gradually; only now does it begin to emit visible amounts of thin smoke.

the wrong door, and ran into a flaming hall.

The danger can continue even after fires are out because of "heat sink." Hot concrete, for instance, can pour forth toxic HCl for about an hour.

Another danger, the AMA reported, is slowness to awaken. Most of us think we can jump right out of bed and escape. Instead, the AMA cited tests showing it can take a sleeper as much as 12 to 15 minutes to wake up and act.

Firemen say one primary pattern is the "bed-smoker's fire" (see photos on page 97). Another, nearly as common, is the "TV-chair" fire

Here's how the latter happens, as in the illustrations at right:

The time, let's say, is 10:50 p.m. You're watching TV with friends. It's been a jovial evening. One friend puts down a glass, lights a cigaret.

But the TV show proves dull-and he dozes off.

Time, 11:02 p.m.: Someone says, "I see smoke!" A thin thread of blue from the sleeper's chair. "Hey, man, you're on fire!" But it's only his cigaret in the foam rubber cushion.

The cushion is smoldering. You get some water and douse it. Laughter. Friend apologizes. (You say, "Oh, it's just an old chair.")

At midnight, friends leave. You go to bed.

3:40 a.m. Alone in the dark, the plastic chair is still invisibly smoldering. It's what's called a "cold fire." (Chairs have actually been known to turn entirely to ash without flame.)

4:47 a.m. Sudden hammering on your door. A neighbor leaving for an early job has seen a flicker of flame. He shouts, runs to call firemen.

4:52 a.m. It suddenly dawns on you that you've heard noises and smell something strange. It seems to take forever to wake up. Then the awful fact finally pentrates: Your house is on fire.

You run to collect your family. But the door's not where it should be. You bang your face against a wall. You don't realize you've inhaled toxic fumes and aren't thinking right. But let's say somehow, at last, you collect your family and go out a window.

4:58 a.m. Just as firemen arrive, your TV room literally blows up. You've had a flashover, in which superheated gases and soot have exploded. Your house is gone, but you were lucky.

Lesson from Texas

10 RULES FOR SURVIVING A HOME INFERNO

It was the writer's privilege, some years ago, to develop the "Family Fire Drill" program, now widely advocated by fire departments and insurance companies, with the help of the National Fire Protection Assn. Now, with new help from NFPA, the National Safety Council and the National Fire Prevention and Control Administration (a new government agency), I recommend this new inferno-escape procedure:

1. Sleep with bedroom doors closed to keep out fire gases.

 Install at least one smoke detector right now. They no longer cost a fortune. One major supplier is offering them at under \$17 retail. Get a reliable brand.

 Put it in the right place—never a "dead air" space. A preferred place is in the hall entrance to your sleeping area or at the top of a stairwell outside your bedrooms.

4. Make an up-to-date home fire escape plan, remembering about those gases. Train everyone. How will you all get out if separated by a flaming hall? After you're out, where will you meet—so you know everyone's out?

5. If yours is a two-story house, install (neatly boxed) rope or metal fire ladders in bedrooms. If separated by a hall from a child or someone infirm, give him a bedroom with a porch or carport roof which can be reached from a window. Consider purchasing one of the new escape devices (see text on this page).

6. If you buy a new house, be sure

it has detectors. If you build a house, be sure your architect designs every bedroom with an escape route.

7. Have an absolute rule: No one in your house ever again smokes in bed (already a criminal offense in some states). And be sure no one makes it a habit to smoke, drink and fail asleep while watching TV. Next to the bed-smoker, this person is one of the greatest threats to a household.

8. Add smoke detectors as soon as possible in strategic places where rising smoke would go, such as hallway ceilings, over TV sets, up stairways. And remember that children sometimes start fires in their rooms, so have detectors there, too.

9. Install inexpensive "remote" horns (about \$12 and up) so a detector alarm in one room will be broadcast in all bedrooms. Some now broadcast up to 200 feet by radio, even farther over electric light wiring. We tested one such unit in our TV room. It set off two bedroom alarms upstairs—plus two in a neighbor's house 300 feet away!

10. Best of all, add one of the new automatic home-sprinkler systems now being developed. Compact new systems can be installed in the ceiling without spoiling your room decor. Firemen say you can now virtually fireproof any home with them. Cost: in a new or remodeled home, as low as \$50 a room; can also be installed in older homes, with obvious additional work. But they can help pay for themselves in lower insurance costs.

communities is Farmers Branch, Tex. (pop. 30,000), a Dallas suburb. May 3, 1975, worried by growing fire danger, Farmers Branch city fathers ordered an electronic smoke detector (ESD) program into effect. Whenever anyone moved into a house, a detector was to be installed.

There were a few protests. But these died out on the very first day of the program when fire gases killed a woman. Since then, Fire Marshal Jack Dyer estimates, ESDs have saved 10 lives. And as this is written, they have helped 13 others escape.

There's no doubt that smoke detectors, which can sense fire long before you do (see Fire Alarm: New Home Appliance That May Save Your Life, page 74, Dec. '76), save lives. Some states now require them in all new dwellings and apartments. And one small Pennsylvania city now actually buys them at wholesale for its citizens. In some communities there's talk of selling them for \$3 a month—added to residents' water bills.

Other safeguards may come, soon. One is home fire masks. Against the new dangers, firemen in some cities now are ordered to wear masks in all fires. "In Farmers Branch," says Jack Dyer, "you'll see our men putting masks on while riding our trucks."

Masks and reserve air tanks now cost \$640 and up. But it's only a matter of time before home masks are available at lower cost.

New escape systems

"There is really no reason you should have to crawl out of a window and jump, or fall or try to fumble your way to a rope ladder," one researcher says. "From now on, our building codes should require all new homes and apartments to have ladders, or escape chutes like those in airliners. Or small window-balconies reachable through doors, with drop-down ladders or poles.

Already, several new products are making escape easier. One, is Reinhard Corp.'s "life ladder." Installed near a window, it looks like a downspout-but has rungs that flip out to make it a sturdy aluminum ladder. This can be used for up to 25-foot (three-story) heights. Another is the Booth with drop-down balcony. steps. which can be installed outside any window. Others include the

Driving the 79 Ford and Lincoln-Mercury models

The once-portly Ford LTD and Mercury Marquis are the latest cars to come back from a successful, but expensive, treatment at Weightwatchers.

tisn't often that an automaker completely re-engineers two highvolume model lines in one year, but Ford Motor Co. has done just that for 1979.

Phase Two of Ford's massive resizing program (Phase One magically transformed the stodgy Maverick/Comet into the light and lively Fairmont/Zephyr a year ago) features the all-new LTD/Marquis "family-size" cars, in addition to the fresh Mustang/Capri entries I reviewed last month.

If you've had an opportunity to try a Fairmont or Zephyr this year, you know that Ford scored a home run in its first trip to the plate in efficiency-car World Series. And if you can arrange a test drive in a '79 Mustang/Capri, and then in a new LTD/Marquis, you'll likely agree that the score is now three runs in three times at bat. Following GM by two years in its big-car downsizing effort, Ford engineers have had plenty of opportunity to observe just what makes the smaller GM models work so well, and they have hardly missed a trick in bringing the new LTD/Marquis to market.

If you are among those who have loved the big, soft, freeway cruiser school of design that has distinguished full-size Ford products in the past, you won't be disappointed in the '79 versions. They have lost none of the roominess, interior quiet or riding comfort of the gunboats they replace.

On the other hand, if you have never been a land yacht fan and thought the big Fords have always been a study in oversize, overweight mushy-handling excess, get ready for a pleasant surprise: These new cars actually respond to a driver's inputs, and they go around corners quite briskly without scraping their door handles. They are as much a departure from the cars they replace as the excellent Fairmont/Zephyr was from its predecessor.

In short, the '79 LTD/Marquis is easily the best big car Ford Motor Co. has ever built; and if the Phase Three intermediates, the downsized luxury cars and the Pinto/Bobcat replacement come out as good . . . look out GM!

Like the GM entries, the new Ford and Mercury are more than a foot shorter and hundreds of pounds lighter than the cars they replace. All three body styles (twodoor sedan, four-door sedan and four-door wagon) sit on a 114.4-in. wheelbase, which is down 6.6 in. from last year's Ford and 9.6 in. compared to the '78 Mercury. (For styling reasons, the '79 Mercs are still 3 inches longer than the Fords.) Yet the total interior volume (as measured by the EPA) has been increased by 1.6 cu. ft. in the four-door and a full 10 cu. ft. in the two-door. Trunk capacity is also up slightly, and the deep-well trunk floor has been retained.

Pleasing appearance

Styling, of course, is subjective, but I found the appearance of both Ford and Mercury generally pleasing, if not very original. There's a lot of GM design character in the cars, particularly in the highline Ford front end . . . if it didn't say "Ford" on the header panel, we'd swear it was an Oldsmobile. The lower-cost Ford front is better, but the Mercury designers seem to have given to their Marquis a greater family identity with a narrower, vertical-theme grille. However, the horizontally-ribbed taillamps around back are a direct steal from Pontiac. As for the LTD's rear, if you parked one in a row of Chrysler Cordobas, nobody would ever notice. Rooflines are standard American big-car practice, with large "opera" windows in the two-door version.

The new cars' interiors range from taxicab plain to bordello plush, depending on how much you care to spend, and there is plenty of stretching-out room in all directions in both front and rear.

I don't much care for the new four-spoke highline steering wheel, which is just too small in diameter, too skinny in rim width and much too "plastic" for my taste. Either the standard wheel or the optional sport wheel is advised if you are sensitive to such things—except that you can't get Ford's speed control with anything other than the four-spoker because the controls (they have a new "resume" feature

this year) are built into its spokes. Also, long-armed drivers should stay away from the three-spoke sport wheel since it is more deeply dished, and Ford still likes to place its steering wheels too close to the chest for our comfort. A telescoping-column option could solve this.

While we're on the negative side, we just can't understand why American interior designers continually refuse to think in terms of places to put things. Open the deceptively large glove-box door in the LTD/Marquis and you'll find a little box inside that's barely adequate for the owner's manual and a

couple of maps. Look around for some flat surface on which to rest your morning coffee cup . . . or sunglasses, or cigarets, or tollbooth change . . . and you won't find one anywhere. Now walk across the showroom and check out Ford's smallest car, the German-built Fiesta. It has a huge, bin-type glove box and a handy, sectioned parcel shelf on the dash above it-plus console bins and usable door-panel compartments in highline models.

Otherwise, the new cars' interiors are attractive, contemporary and well thought out. There's a multifunction control stalk for wiper/washer, headlamp dimmer and horn, and the radio/heater/air controls are in a central pod (GM style) in easy reach.

One other complaint involves the restraint system: it's a modern and comfortable "single loop" design, but the male buckle end parks way up high and far behind your head, so you have to twist, reach and strain to grab it and pull it across.

0-60 mph in 14 seconds

I got a sneak preview and test drive of a '79 Marquis back in May, courtesy of the Lincoln-Mercury Div., and I was very impressed with

HALOGEN HEADLAMPS AND HOW THEY WORK

Halogen gas acts like a magnet. As a light-bulb filament glows, it throws off particles of evaporated tungsten that the halogen gas in the bulb draws back onto the filament. In a conventional headlight, particles are deposited on the lens, causing the bulb to blacken.

There are five halogens—astatine. bromine, chlorine, fluorine and iodine. Bromine and iodine are the ones used in the production of halogen headlamps because of greater stability.

The regenerative qualities of a halogen headlamp allow the bulb to maintain the same white light output for practically the life of the lamp. A whiter light is generated than that produced by conventional headlamps, because a filament in a halogen atmosphere glows at a higher temperature, which brings up the use of quartz.

Quartz is often used in conjunction with the term, "halogen headlamp," because it refers to the composition of some halogen headlight bulbs. Since quartz won't crack under the heat created in a halogen headlamp, some manufacturers have been using an envelope made of quartz to enclose the filament and halogen element. High-temperature (hard) glass is also used.

Headlamps of cars built for use in the United States must be sealed beams. A sealed beam has bulb, lens and reflector combined into one hermetically sealed unit. Many cars built for sale in foreign countries use separate halogen bulbs and reflectors. They are not sealedbeam units.

The 1979 Lincoln Versailles is the first domestically produced car to offer U.S.-legal halogen headlamps. (Ford has indicated it will change to halogen headlamps on all models by 1981.)


A big reason for using halogen

headlamps in the Versailles is to reduce weight and improve fuel economy. The Versailles headlight uses less electrical energy to illuminate the same distance. Thus, a lighter-weight alternator and battery are employed.

The halogen headlamps double the upper beam output-150,000 rather than 75,000 candlepower. Although the candlepower is doubled, the light output is increased only 25 percent. It has to do with

the inverse square law-"Light output diminishes with the square of the distance."

However, light output on high beam is 10 to 15 percent more glaring than the high beam of a conventional sealed beam. If those drivers who install the halogen headlamps

aren't courteous and fail to dim their lights as they approach another car, there will be light fights, more blinded drivers and probably more accidents.

The halogen headlamps, which can be fitted on practically any car (Citroen is an example of the kind of car that's the exception), will be available in round or rectangular shape. They will cost "several times" the price of regular sealed beams.

No price is set yet, but one source says it will be three to five times the price of conventional lamps. For the extra cost, you get more light, which is great if you drive a lot in rural areas. But there is no advantage to having halogen sealed beams on a car driven mainly in town.-Mort Schultz

the car's driving character. It was a standard Marquis equipped with the base 302-cu.-in. V8 (with Ford's variable venturi two-barrel carb) and the supertall 2.26:1 standard rear axle. Even so, it moved along quite respectably, recording 14-second, 0-60-mph times with two aboard and cruising quietly and comfortably at well over the national speed limit.

Our test preprototype was not equipped with the new optional handling package (higher-rate springs, shocks and front sway bar, police-package rear sway bar, larger wheels and tires), but even in its base form it cornered flatter and with more axle control on rough surfaces than any other big Ford product in recent memory. The power steering was neither too quick nor too light and it did provide good feedback through the steering wheel in every maneuver we tried.

Well... almost every maneuver. Attempting a tight slalom test the engineers have been using to develop their Mustang/Capri suspension, we found ourselves spinning the wheel too quickly for the power assist to keep up. But I don't anticipate that many LTD/Marquis owners will be entering the local parking-lot gymkhanas.

On the handling course and skid pad, the big Merc acquitted itself well, with a lot of noise from the front tires but no more understeer than necessary for safety at the limit of adhesion. On the other hand, the brakes (at least on that car) could stand some improvement. The rears locked up and slid too easily in simulated panic stops, and there was noticeable fade after only a couple of fast 60-mph stops with two aboard.

New suspension design

Engineering features include much usage of computerized structural analysis and design and lightweight materials to keep the weight down, plus a new (for Ford) suspension design using twin "A" arms in front, a four-link, live-axle rear and coil springs all around. Also, all Marquis and California-bound LTDs with the optional 351-cu.-in. V8 will get Ford's very sophisticated new electronic engine control (EEC II) which uses a three-way catalyst and electronic feedback to the carburetor (Volvo's Lambda Sond) to monitor and control various engine functions. This is a preview of things to come in higheconomy, low emissions engine control for the 1980s, and Ford has high hopes for it.

Finally, both heating and aircon-

ditioning systems have been improved over '78, and the cars' body shapes have benefited from more than 270 hours in the wind tunnel for most aerodynamic efficiency.

New options are mainly in the entertainment system area: a slick electronic search-tune stereo radio with quadrasonic tape, an ultrafidelity sound system with high-output amplifier and special speakers, stereo radio with cassette tape, 40-channel CB and power antenna; plus dual reclining seatbacks for the "flight" bench seat, the handling suspension mentioned earlier and a new electronic digital clock with time, date and elapsed-time functions.

Mustang and Capri

As for the rest of Ford's '79 lineup, we've already covered the Mustang/Capri at length in the last issue (see page 82), and there's

little but detail changes to report in other car lines. You'll recall that the Mustang/Capri is a very nice sporty spinoff on the efficient Fairmont/Zephyr chassis, with engine choices ranging from a 2.3-liter four-cylinder through a 2.8-liter V6 to a 302 V8 and even a turbocharged 2.3-liter Four. There's a handsome notchback and a three-door hatchback Capri for Lincoln-Mercury. No question: the Fairmont/Zephyr is the best compact and the LTD/Marquis the best big car; the Mustang/Capri is the best sporty car from Ford since the original Mustang 15 years ago.

Pinto and Bobcat

The aged subcompact Pinto/Bobcat gets new front styling and taillamps for its second-last year before replacement by a more efficient front-drive design; and at the other end of the scale Lincoln's compact-luxury Versailles gets an extended, squared-off (Seville-like) padded roof to make it look less like the Granada/Monarch it's based on, plus the industry's first use of standard-equipment halogen headlamps. Granada/Monarch itself benefits from some interior and exterior trim changes, including a smoothlooking two-tone paint treatment, addition of an electronic voltage regulator and a four-speed manual overdrive as base transmission.

LTD II, T-bird and Cougar

Enjoying its last overweight year before downsizing, the intermediate LTD II/Thunderbird/Cougar also gets the maintenance-free electronic voltage regulator, plus revised grille and taillamp themes for T-Bird and Cougar XR-7 and a new optional 27-gallon fuel tank for a bit longer range between gas stops if you don't mind \$20 fillups.

Fairmont and Zephyr

Fairmont/Zephyr, which was light on option availability at its introduction a year ago, has been making up the distance with the addition of power seats, windows and door locks and a clip-up removable Moon-roof to its option list during 1978. New available equipment for '79 includes speed control, tilt steering wheel, "performance" instrumentation and an electric decklid release. Also, Ford's fourspeed manual overdrive transmission is now standard with the optional 200-cu.-in. Six and 302 V8 engines.

The Continentals

Finally, both the Lincoln Continental and Continental Mark V luxury cars will now be available in very special Collector's Series, for those collectors who may have missed out the first time dinosaurs became extinct.

5 ways to stretch

New tents and techniques mean extra action afloat.

Now you can turn the off-season on with weather protectors that make any boat a cruiser. Autumn, when the water is still warm and the crowds are long gone, provides

The action doesn't end on Labor Day up North once you have the right boat and gear for local conditions. For bigger seas, a larger cabin boat like Cruisers' Barnegat 22 is better. Built in Oconto, Wis., it has a deep-V hull by Jim Wynne, best known of the offshore performance-powerboat designers. Its bottom shape cuts waves instead of pounding and smashing through them. The rig we tested mounted an OMC sterndrive with characteristic extra high tilt-up so the boat can be run up on a beach easily.

A navy top extended back from the hardtop keeps cockpit anglers dry. Side curtains protect against chill autumn winds and add an extra cabin for sleeping a family or fishing party aboard.





The Camper-Craft (3000 Biscayne Blvd., Miami, Fla.) may be the most compact cruiser afloat. A center cockpit divides bow storage from an aft cabin sleeping two. Midship seats can be extended to sleep two more. A 12-gallon water supply, 40-gallon fuel tank, head and storage compartments make this easily trailerable 19-footer an overnighter with the performance of a runabout. Consid-

er it for fast passages along offseason waterways. Previewing two 1979 55-horse Johnson outboards, we got speeds well over 30 mph.

When the cruiser is buttoned up with full canvas, headroom and visibility are restricted for driving but enough for camping at anchor.



Even an open runabout, like Glastron's SSV-188, can carry canvas to ward off autumn winds, Pop-Tent for use ashore.

Glastron's versatile SSV-188, a bowrider runabout from the noted Austin, Tex., builder, can launch quickly almost any month of the year, thanks to a seakindly hull and weather-deflecting options. Pick this model for exploring sheltered waters.

Windshield and convertible top help bounce away spray when the waves kick up. Using Evinrude's new 140-hp V4 engine for 1979, this model showed the performance that should get you home ahead of a threatening fall squall. Canvas

your boating season

some of the best days and nights for boat camping. And when winter comes, trailer your rig south for a vacation where you can use the same system for more fun afloat. To test our season stretchers, we picked hulls from backpack to sleep-a-crew-aboard size. The craft below were designed for on-and off-shore fishing, water skiing,

exploring the shallows and crossing deep water.

Family's total supply of fishing tackle, life jackets, wet wear and sleeping bags fits in two duffel bags.

End-of-season fishing can continue even after the leaves have fallen with an inflatable pack raft (left) plus tent and gear that stow into a Camp Trails pack.

Bring-along boats can make any warm day suitable for going afloat. Equipment includes a large backpack, small inflatable dinghy or kayak, sleeping bag and mattress, life vest, shelter or tent, regular camping equipment and supplies plus (probably) fishing tackle. Early and late months, before the crowds arrive and after they leave, are often the best of times for angling, hiking and exploring by small boat.

Select clothes suitable for changeable weather and pack along an oversize poncho. This is required to cover both the hiker and backpack as well during a rain. Keep a checklist of items carried plus those you often wish you had along. On a trip, you quickly know which gear you can do without and which is essential.

Try this kind of boating with a companion or two for safety. Wilderness hiking and boating can take you far from help in an emergency.

can enclose the cockpit, and the sunlounger seats extend out to make a pair of bunks—with even more space on the cockpit deck for kids in sleeping bags. But now so many beaches are nearly deserted that we found it easier to tie up ashore and pitch a Pop-Tent cabana or backpacker tent.

An ice chest can hold a weekend supply of food; use another chest for waterproof storage of warm clothes and foul-weather gear, sleeping bags and air or foam mattresses.

Hydra-Sports 2100 CC center-console high-performance offshore fisherman of Kevlar can carry tent for beach camping.

The offshore open fishing boat was not designed for coldweather runs and camping out. A rugged deep-V model, however, like the deep-water 2100 CC made of extra light and strong Kevlar 49 aramid, from Hydra-Sports, 1011 Kirkland Ave., Nashville, Tenn. 37202, is designed to take the choppy conditions that autumn weather may stir up.

Rated for big horsepower and a one-ton load, this model can handle the largest outboards in open seas. We tested it with the new Evinrude 235-hp mill for next year and found it fully maneuverable in rough going. Pack a tent and gear in the forward cuddy and camp ashore on any deserted beach.






add-ons are not included with the basic, ready-to-live-in house.

To get the project rolling (more than 18 months ago) we commissioned award-winning architect Ira Grandberg, AIA, to come up with a new approach to putting together a factory-built house. It was apparent shortly after we started the project that factory construction could be the key to producing a lot of house for a low price. But, a house must look appealing. Thus, the challenge we posed to Grandberg was to create a factory-made house that didn't look like one.

The results, after a year and a half of meetings, planning, cost factoring and the like, are shown here. The architect successfully achieved a new look in manufactured housing by a) erecting the house in two levels instead of one, to emphasize the custom-built feeling, b) abutting the modules in nonconventional fashion so as to create a dynamic arrangement of roof lines outside. For good measure, PM and Armstrong then worked to create nu-

merous home-built projects that can be added any time—as budget allows—after you move in.

The concept might have been just a dream unless a manufacturer with imagination was found who would be willing to invest in the prototype by running it down the factory assembly line. HOW THE PM HOME WAS CREATED


Until Popular Mechanics coordinated the design of this house, the typical impression of a mobile home was that of a shiny rectangular cube being hauled down the road behind a truck. And that conception wasn't far from wrong. Many mobile homes lack the design features that buyers in the market for low-cost housing are seeking. But PM's vacation home design dramatically changes the picture. And as is shown on these pages, it's proof that a lot of handsome

house can still be factoryproduced at considerably less cost than an equal-quality, "stick-built" dwelling. Though our home is loaded with innovative ideas and topquality products, it can be built for approximately \$25 per sq. ft.-or less if your building site is especially convenient to one the manufacturer's of plants.

The secret is that the house is entirely built in a

to heat the home quickly upon entering, and then turn down the unit serving the area that isn't being used.

The home is covered by a one-year manufacturer's limited warranty against defects in material or work-manship. Protection is also provided against structural defects for three years through a homeowner's protection plan offered by the manufacturer. 

factory and then hauled to your site for erection and assembly. The price includes delivery and setup—as well as carpeting and appliances. Though the PM Home consists of four sections, clever architectural design arranges for hauling on just three trailers, cutting trucking costs by 25 percent. Once the units arrive at the job-site they are lowered one at a time onto foundation walls that have been erected to meet maker specifications.

The home is designed to comply with the federal standard for mobile homes, established by the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) to assure conformance to exacting materials and construction requirements. State codes for mobile homes vary slightly, so Fuqua Homes engineered the PM Home to meet the strictest criteria, thus making it acceptable to all state codes.

An important energy-saving feature designed into the PM Vacation Home is the zoned heating system which provides for two separate forced-air units, situated to serve different parts of the house. This means that the homeowner can turn on both systems








once the basic guidelines were established for the PM Vacation House—good looks, good living and low cost—we knew one of the surest routes to success would be to include a number of features that PM readers could duplicate themselves. Happily, all of the good ideas aren't exclusive to the owners of the PM house; you can build them for your own home

because PM's Home Carpentry series will give the details in the months ahead.

Planning a carport

Architect Ira Grandberg located the carport shown at the front-right of the house (see the floor plan at the left). Access to the house is through the front door and the offset created at the rear adds an interesting architectural dimension to the exterior. An important feature of Grandberg's design is the roof setback at the front. Without this break in the plane, the carport's front plane would have simply extended one of the house planes. With the break there is a dynamic interplay of roof lines to create interest and to direct your eye to the front deck and entry.

The carport shown is built on perimeter footings and a floor slab. It costs about \$1150 if you do the work yourself. You can cut costs by

approximately \$400 more if you install just the footings for the walls to set upon, and use gravel on the floor. The concrete slab can always be added later. Standard framing is used.

Make certain that the wall between the house and carport is finished to meet your local code requirements for fire safety. In more areas a double layer of 1/2-in.-thick plasterboard will do. Check this with your local building department.

The outside of our carport is finished with Masonite siding and Bird shingles to match the house proper. The inside walls are of Sheetrock.

Two great storage ideas

These are particularly clever because they stand in full view-thus the space that would



Standard framing in carport includes 2x6 rafters installed across the shorter span to simplify erection.





Wall framing is held plumb with temporary diagonal bracing until framing is in and walls covered both sides.

ordinarily go unused is used wisely, and with flair. The entry hall in the PM vacation house is of generous width so there is no inconvenience caused by placing the units as shown in the photos. Before building either one for your own home, do check the areas where you want to use it, in order to make certain that passage is not impeded.

Boot cube

Basically the cube is a rectangular box divided into equal-size storage compartments. There are no exotic woodworking techniques involved in its construction. Use either A-D

plywood or particleboard to build the unit; the plywood will hold nails better while the particleboard will provide a smoother finish for paint.

Start work by cutting all pieces to size, then carefully lay out the pieces for grooves, dadoes and edge rabbets. Plough the grooves with your router and the appropriate cutters. Assemble the unit with finishing nails and white glue.


Ski rack



Lay out the panel for the top section and attach the divider blocks with screws and glue. Complete the bottom section as detailed at left.

General directions


If you sand all parts of the ski rack smooth before you assemble the job, it will go a lot faster—and turn out better.

After assembly, dust off the pieces, wipe with a tack rag and prime-paint all of the wood members. Allow the ski rack to dry 24 hours and finish with semigloss enamel.





Build this bench for your patio



he clean lines of this contemporary patio bench harmonize perfectly with almost any outdoor setting. The seat is a welcome addition to a shady corner of the patio, or a pleasant spot overlooking garden. The shelves atop its bench legs can be used to display potted green or blooming plants.

Douglas fir was used throughout in this bench design from Western Wood Products Assn. Or you may choose to use a western pine with its handsome wood grain.

Bench construction

Except for the notched crosspiece and leg joint, all joinery is with butt joints. Assemble the bench with galvanized finishing nails and waterproof glue. Face-nail all parts, countersink nails and fill depressions with wood putty.

Begin by cutting the leg and shelf pieces (A, H, J, K); cut notches in legs for the crosspieces (I). Clamp and glue the leg verticals (H). Then nail the leg finishing pieces and glue the crosspieces in place. Do not attach the shelves until after the bench seat is in position.

Cut the lower rail (G) and end parts (F). Space the legs as needed then glue and nail the lower rails in place.

The bench seat rests on the leg crosspieces. Cut and assemble the seat parts (B) and end edging (D, E) on the ground. (Note: A slight space between bench slats allows rainwater to drain.) Test fit the bench before you drive nails home. After you have positioned the seat you can cut and nail the rest of the edging (C). Nail the shelves in

Finish with an oil-base preserving stain. Bright pillows will add extra color to the bench.



A retired California broadcaster notes, "My previous car was a 300D Mercedes five-cylinder. It was underpowered. The Olds is 50 percent better on power and 50 percent better on price."

"I bought this car," says a "to get Minnesota salesman, small-car economy in an affordable, family-sized sedan. I figure the Olds will need less maintenance, fewer tuneups, and will be worth more when I trade."

A Michigan charter boat operator: "Having owned a Peugeot 504 diesel, I'm fully sold on diesel economy. However, I wouldn't

Economy of operation ranks No. 1 among owners' specific likes. A field sales engineer for a Michigan switch company says, "I pick the self-serve stations where I pay 53.9 cents a gallon for No. 2 diesel fuel."

A Georgia restaurant franchiser: "We put 40,000 to 50,000 miles a year on our cars and have been trading every year. But with this diesel, we hope to get 150,000 to 300,000 miles."

An lowa engineer figures, "The diesel engine option's true cost pays for itself in 15,250 miles when compared with a similar Olds 88 with a conventional V8. I get about 20 mpg in town and 30 on the highway and spend less on maintenance."

Two traditional diesel handicaps are noise and power—too much of one and too little of the other. But neither drew many complaints this time. Only 12.1 percent of our respondents mentioned noise, and a mere 4.2 percent voted for more horses.

Engineering a winner

Oldsmobile took its 350-cu.-in. V8 and completely reworked it for diesel duty. Almost no components of the gasoline engine interchange.

To handle the 22.3:1 compression ratio, the diesel V8's beefier crankshaft uses half-inch-wider mains. Bearing support webs have been filled in. Oil capacity is 7.5 quarts instead of the usual four. The block, pan, crankshaft, pistons, rods, cam, and everything topside are unique to the diesel. And it weighs 111 pounds more than the gasoline V8.

Olds hoped to deliver 100,000 diesels during 1978 but has had problems with suppliers. Thus there's a backlog of orders. Some 45 percent of Olds diesel production goes to Chevrolet for installation in pickups.

Oldsmobile has done lots of development work to rid the diesel of its "truck" reputation. Extensive sound deadening, an automatic glowplug system, auxiliary hydraulic pumps for vacuum functions, twin batteries and an oil cooler in the radiator header tank are among its nuances.

The diesel adds \$800-\$1000 to the price of a new Oldsmobile, depending on series. It's available in the Olds 88, 98, and Custom Cruiser wagon. The Olds diesel is now available in the Cadillac Seville, and a smaller, 260-cu.-in. V8 diesel is in the works.

Make this PLAY CUBE for your youngsters

Kids will have hours of fun in this spacious, open-to-outdoors playhouse.

by Paul Levine

ere's a contemporary playhouse that will please your young ones and give them a place to entertain their friends.

Handsome red knotty cedar siding, in a diagonal pattern, is used to side a sturdy, plywood-sheathed frame of 2x3s. Four circular cutouts, one in each wall, help soften the angularity of the simple cube. They also dramatically set off the entrance, two large, round windows and a louver wall.

Framing the cube

Begin by constructing frames for floor and roof panels as shown in the framing plan on page 118. Cover one side of each with ¾-in. exterior plywood. In order to prevent children from picking up splinters from the floor, use A-D exterior-grade plywood—A side exposed to the interior.

Next, build the two wall frames. Note that the door-side panel must be 34 in. shorter than the louver side to create a slight pitch in the roof. Cut diagonal braces and top and bottom plates for window walls.

Now, position the floor on four leveled concrete block piers (footings). Tip door and louver walls in place and secure through plywood floor to floor framing with 16d common nails. Add the bottom plates for the two studless walls and tie into door and louver walls with lower diagonal braces. Checking squareness with a level or framing square as you go will assure accuracy and make sheathing and siding easier. Use 3-in. No. 16 fh screws to fasten braces to studs and plates.

The easiest way to assemble the top plates for the studless walls is to nail them to the roof section while it's still on the ground. After positioning the roof unit on top of the walls, toenail it to the two top plates already in place, using 10d

common nails. Add upper diagonal braces, checking for plumb as you go.

Sheathing and siding the cube

Before you start to sheath the framed cube, make a rudimentary compass for marking the circular window openings. First draw a line down the center of a narrow strip of plywood which is at least 29 in. long. Drill two holes 3/8 in. apart, about 1 in. from one end. At the other end, drive a 10d nail to act as a pivot, through a point 27 in. from the closer of the two holes. The compass can be mounted on a scrap plywood crosspiece between the middle two studs of a wall-or when that is not possible, it can be centered on a stake fashioned from a 2x3 and driven into the ground. In any case, the pivot nail must be positioned in the center of whichever face of the house you are about to sheath. Find centers by tacking four small nails at the corners, then tie two pieces of string diagonally across the face. The center will be where the strings intersect.

Use 3/8-in. exterior plywood (best side to the interior) to sheath the four walls. On all sides except the entry side, the sheathing can be cut into 12-in.-wide strips and nailed on as shown in plans on page 119. The door side should be sheathed, leaving an opening for the entrance. Recheck for plumb as you go.

Draw circles on wall faces using a pencil inserted in the outer hole of the compass arm. Use a sabre saw to cut out the circles on three sides. Do not cut a circle out of the door wall.

Use 8d galvanized finishing nails to secure cedar siding to 2x3s beneath sheathing. Using a nailset, set nails. When you install siding at the roof line, take care to make it appear horizontal.

A good method for cutting out

the circles in the siding on the window and louver sides is to first nail the cedar in place, letting the ends run ragged beyond the circumference. Then use the inner hole of the compass, with pencil, to scribe a circle. Make finished cut with a sabre saw. (See drawing, page 119.)

On the door side, the cedar siding boards have to be individually prefit, marked, removed, cut and then nailed in place.

Construct the door as shown and hang it between middle studs which act as jambs. Fasten the cedar siding on the door through the plywood from the inside. The cedar must be beveled back on the hinge side of the door to allow for opening clearance.

Finally, rip 34-in.-wide strips from siding material to make cedar trim. Nail it in place with 8d galvanized finishing nails.

To save time, you can substitute 1x2 pine for cedar trim at corners. Adjust dimensions accordingly.


Making the louver wall

First rip 45° bevels on both edges of 1x4 pine stock and then cut into 17½-in. lengths. Nail slats to three pairs of 1x2 uprights, leaving a ¾-in. overhang as shown in plans. The three completed louver units are face-nailed through uprights into the studs. Now you are ready to cover the playhouse with penetrating wood preservative and two coats of spar varnish. The wood panel of the door side was given two coats of exterior enamel.


Installing the windows

When the finish is dry, you are ready to cut and install the transparent sheet acrylic windows. Have a helper hold the plastic against the outside face of the window wall and trace the circle opening from the






Hatch opening is cut between two rafters, trimmed with cedar and then fitted with sheet-acrylic lid. Note: Roof access may not be safe for very young children.

inside onto the protective paper covering. Remove the plastic and enlarge the circle tracing so that the radius is 1/4 in. longer. Cut on this second line, using a sabre saw with a fine-tooth, hollow-ground blade. Spread silicone sealant along the inner lip of the window frame and press the window into place. You can bend the plastic slightly in order to bring it inside the house.

You can make the optional loose hatch/skylight from a scrap piece of transparent acrylic. The opening perimeter is trimmed with 34 x 34in. cedar. The transparent lid, sized 1 in, larger than perimeter trim on all sides, is simply screwed to a frame made of the 34 x 34-in. cedar.

Safety check

Children's playhouses cannot be made too safe. When you're finished


building this one, make a thorough check for hazards. Pull out all protruding nails and sand smooth any rough spots or splintered corners. The entry step, from grade level onto the floor, should be suited to the size of your children. Do not make it any higher than 6 in.


At this point, you can relax and let the kids loose.


Just in time for this year's apple crop—a press that is easy to build and to use.


You can make the most of this year's apple crop if you have your own cider press. The prototype shown on the facing page—which consists of a sprocket-wheel grinder and a clam-shell-design press—has yielded as much as 12 gallons of juice in an hour when operated by just one person. Using portable

power tools and some careful craftsmanship, you can build your own press, grinder and sawhorse stand for about half the cost of manufactured units.

There's nothing quite like tangy, sweet cider as a family drink in the fall. Happily it's possible to freeze the juice for drinking later. (If



Back view of this closed cider press shows the three hefty hinges used on the unit.




you're planning to ferment it, remember that making hard cider is subject to the same restrictions as wine and beer making.)

After pressing for cider use the leftover apple pulp to make apple butter, or use it as garden compost. Bury the pulp rather than spreading it on top of the soil.

Begin work on the press by constructing the 24x36-in, rectangular

MAKING CIDER **ACROSS THE COUNTRY**

Most cider makers agree that a blend of apple varieties makes the tastiest cider. A few crabapples added to a batch of cider made from blander varieties can perk up its taste. In the northeastern states McIntosh, Jonathan, Red Delicious and Golden Delicious are among those varieties that make the best cider. In the middle and southern states the Red Delicious, Golden Delicious and Jonathan are also good choices; in the Appalachian area Stayman Winesaps are good. Red Delicious and Golden Delicious are favorites in the northwestern states. Experiment by blending varieties until you get one you like.








frame made of 2x4s. Make six ribs. Nest the bottom three ribs in the frame. Then cut a 14-in.-square plate of plywood and nine 14-in. 1x2s to screw to the inside end of the frame. Fasten 13 sanded and rounded 1x2s into the bottom half with 11/2-in. No. 8 wood screws. The corner 1x2s must be notched to fit the slant of the ribs. Attach the top 1x2s so the top ribs will align with the bottom three ribs. Hinge the top to the bottom with strap hinges at the back and catch locks at the front. A chain keeps the top from falling too far open.

When assembling the plunger, remember the action achieved will be



a push-pull type. The jack, being cranked into a threaded block, will be pushing the pipe and plunger plate into the chamber.

To convert the car jack, remove the three leg standards. Replace the crank-handle rivet with a 3/8-in. bolt. Weld a crossbar made of 11/8-in. strap iron to two 30-in. lengths

of pipe. Insert the jack and clamp it with %-in. set collars above the thrust bearing and below the crossbar. Screw on the pipe flange.

To maximize a tight fit, cut the plunger-plate slightly oversize. Cover it with lengths of 1x2s and trim. Assemble the plunger and plate


Brackets improve sawhorses

Though a pair of sawhorses is undoubtedly one of a carpenter's most valuable tools, they can be inadequate for certain chores, such as laying out plywood paneling. Lack of stability can cause costly marking and cutting errors. If you tackle a lot of jobs away from your workbench, you might want to consider buying a set of Sawhorse Table Converter Brackets. Using the brackets, a pair of 2x4s cut to suit and a piece of plywood, you can quickly set up a sturdy carpentry worktable or roomy scaffold for painting and siding jobs. 




Pair of Stand-offs attached to level as in sketch above lets you check rough surface.





Solar collector panels add a beauty of their own, and bring in heat so that the building can be utilized during the cold-weather months.












Popular Mechanics. It features the use of passive solar collectors, but you could substitute an active system if you should want your shed to be capable of heating water for use in your swimming pool or your hotwater system.

For a snappy appearance the exterior of our shed version is covered with Long Ridge hardboard siding manufactured by Champion Building Products. This is a factory-primed type of hardboard that simulates the board-and-batten look. Textured asphalt shingles in the Timbertone pattern of Bird & Son complete this simple, yet stately-appearing little structure.

Economical post footings used

Starting from the ground, the individual post footings make the digging and concrete-pouring procedure a little bit easier as well as a lot less expensive than it would be for other foundations. The footings serve the same function as a continuous footing.

Before you place the concrete, you should set the 4x4 posts in the holes and place the concrete around each post. Then you place the 2x4 double-headers around the perime-

ter of the shed on top of the 4x4 posts. Take care that these headers are exactly level.

The next step is to install the 2x4 floor system. Locate the 2x4 joists 16 in. on center (o. c.) and along the 8-ft. length, as shown in the floor plan above. Now you can place the 5/8-in. tongue-and-groove plywood floor over the 2x4 floor-framing system and fasten it.

Next, you put up the 2x4 wall. Start with a 2x4 base plate on the "oor for each wall section, then add the stude 16 in. o.c. and complete each wall section with a doubled-up top plate.

Check for correct roof angle

Your roof framing system may now be put together using 2x4s of the proper length. Make sure that the roof angle of the collectors is approximately equal to the degrees of latitude where you are working (on our solar shed in New York State the roof pitch on the collector side is 45°).

Next to go on is the siding, followed by the roof sheathing on the noncollector section of the roof. Install ½-in. CDX plywood over the 2x4 roof framing. On top of the

plywood put 16-lb. saturated felt building paper and 235-lb. asphalt roof shingles.

For more efficient heat storage, install 3½-in.-thick insulation in the floor, walls and ceiling.

You may treat the entire shed, inside and out, with a coat of paint, stain or any other finish desired. For the sake of neatness, we suggest that the exposed 2x4s which carry the solar collectors either be stained or painted before you mount the collectors.

The panels used for this project form a passive solar system; that is, they collect the sun's energy to heat the shed only. There are no mechanical devices installed, such as fans or pumps, to distribute the heat elsewhere.

Installing the passive system

Installation of the passive system is quite simple. Each of the three 4x8-ft. collectors is propped into position and held in place by nails through the bottom and sides. A flexible self-adhesive sealant tape is placed around the perimeter of each panel; a task that can best be done on the ground before you prop the panels into position. The metal an-

gles and battens are then placed around the panels and screw-fastened to the wall studs with selfsealing screws.

Installation instructions that are supplied with the collector panels are precise and spell out all details so that you will find them easy to follow.

In the event you should elect to substitute an active solar system for the passive collectors, you can mount the panels in the same manner, but since they will be approximately 3 ft. wide instead of 4 ft., you will have to modify the framing system accordingly.

Active system offers hot water

In the active type of system, a liquid will flow through the collectors to be heated and then piped to a storage tank of approximately 80-gallon capacity to be used for storage of hot water. Since your existing water heater remains in your home, the solar system is operated in conjunction with your present system.







Charges! Countercharges! Warnings! Denials! Contradictions! Sounds like a United Nations debate, no?

Would you believe it's all about old-fashioned home insulation—that low-density porous material which curtails heat flow? Notwithstanding its other advantages, insulation helps keep a lid on what it costs to heat and cool a home.

A study five years ago by the then Federal Energy Administration revealed that seven of 10 houses in this country had no or insufficent insulation. Most people couldn't have cared less before 1973. Energy was cheap.

But with spurt after spurt in energy prices, people have been rushing to buy insulation. With the rush has come a preponderance of data that previously went unpublished or unnoticed.

Do you know, for instance, that in April a U.S. Congressional subcommittee took to task the prestigious Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) for not urging stronger standards to govern cellulose insulation?

Cellulose insulation is made of a finely-ground cellulose product, usually paper, but sometimes wood fiber. It can be poured from a bag between joists of an open attic floor or blown into place behind finished walls. It has good isulating qualities and is one of the least expensive materials on the market.

The problem? Cellulose is highly combustible in raw form. To lessen combustibility manufacturers treated the product with a borax derivative before borax became in short supply. Then, some reverted to aluminum sulfate. However, aluminum sulfate produces sulfuric acid as it absorbs moisture, and sulfuric acid rots wood framing. The subcommittee cited, as an example, a warehouse in Michigan that was insulated with aluminum sulfate-treated insulation. The structure had collapsed.

If this were the only finger of doubt pointed at insulation, people could live with it. But listen to these charges—some of which are unsupported by evidence and/or denied by the affected industry:

- Glass fiber insulation may cause cancer.
- Urea formaldehyde insulation emits an obnoxious odor that may be toxic.
- Urea formaldehyde shrinks seven to 15 percent, which leaves gaps in the insulation.
- Mineral wool that is blown into

place between walls can cause interior walls to blister.

And then, there's the controversy over how much insulation is enough. It's time to put the subject into perspective so you can examine facts and "non-facts" critically. This article, which is separated into five specific areas, does this for the most commonly used insulating materials. The five areas are as follows:

- Summary of insulation forms and materials that insulation is made from. Advantages and disadvantages are emphasized.
- The importance of the R value, which is the resistance to heat of insulation materials.
- How to figure the amount of insulation you need to buy so you don't end up with too much or not enough.
- Facts about the all-important vapor barrier.
 - 5. How to read packaging labels.

Important: Some types of insulation are in short supply. For example, none of three suppliers contacted had bagged mineral wool (glass fiber or rock wool) insulation in stock. They could supply highpriced vermiculite. Two were willing to place an order for mineral wool but there would be a six-week wait.

About R values


R value is a number indicating how much resistance insulation presents to heat flow. The higher the R value, the more effective the insulation. Blankets, batts and bags of insulation should be stamped with the R value. Don't buy any that aren't.

Different kinds of insulating materials of equal thickness have different R values. The following list outlines the approximate R values for the most commonly used insulating materials (where ranges are given, they indicate the difference in R value among manufacturers using the same material):

Don't deal with a contractor who talks in terms of inches instead of R value. Make certain your contract stipulates the R value of material he installs. The Federal Trade Commission warns that a claim about a product's thermal resistance, "either through generalization or exaggeration of R value, is the most common deceptive contractor practice." Combining two pieces of insulation will provide a sum total of their R values. For example, R 11 + R 19 = R 30

A point is eventually reached where the benefits obtained from installing more insulation are too

insignificant to justify cost. At what point no one can agree. Recommendations by manufacturers and government agencies vary somewhat as to the minimum R values that are needed for a home. Here are some examples:

(a) Federal Housing Administration Ceilings (i.e. attic floors): R 22 (R 19 for areas with less than 8000 degree days).

Exterior walls: R 13 (R 11 for areas with less than 8000 degree days). Floors over unheated basements: R 1.

(b) Edison Electric Institute (for electric homes)

Ceilings: R 30 (R 19 for areas with less than 3500 degree days).

Exterior walls (existing construction): R 11.

Floors over unheated basements: R 11

(c) Council of Better Business Bureaus:

Ceilings: R 30. Exterior walls: R 13.

Floors over unheated basements: R 19.

Or, use the map and chart above to find the recommended R value for ceilings, walls and floors in your area. Locate your home zone on the map and read the corresponding R values on the chart. (Figures supplied by Owens-Corning Fiberglass Corp.)

R value is the most important factor in insulation, but also know the advantages of different forms and materials before you buy.



Calculating quantities

ere's how to figure out how much insulating material you'll need to do the job:

1. Blanket rolls or batts

Obtain the overall area dimension by multiplying length times width. Allow for the space taken by framing. This is a constant. If studs are 16 in. on center (O.C.), multiply the area dimension by 0.9. If studs are 24 in. O.C., multiply the area dimension by 0.94. The number you get is the total square feet of blanket roll or batt insulation you need.

Example: 1250 square feet of attic floor space. Studs are 16 in. O.C. Thus, $1250 \times 0.9 = 1125$ square feet of insulation.

2. Loose fill

Determine the overall square footage, considering the constant number for the existing stud layout (see above). Determine the "maximum net coverage per bag" for the desired R value from label information.

Divide the overall square footage by "maximum net coverage per bag."

Example: Overall square footage is 1125. Each bag covers 32 square feet to obtain a desired R value of 30. Thus, 1125 ÷ 32 = 35.15 bags—make it 36.

FORMS AND MATERIALS

BLANKET ROLLS

Dimensions:

Thickness: variable from 11/8 to 8 in. Length: variable from 10 to 200 ft.

Width: 15, 19 or 23 in. to fit 16, 20 or 24 in. on center (OC) stud spacing, respectively.

Best uses:

Where framing is open.

Important: Spaces between framing members should be relatively free of obstructions.

Unfinished attic floor.

Important: Do not insulate rafters of an unfinished attic. It serves no purpose.

Open basement or crawlspace floor joists.

Unfinished walls (new-home construction). Materials:

Glass fiber.

Rock wool.

Note: The above materials are commonly grouped together under the term "mineral wool." According to the Council of Better Business Bureaus, rock wool has a higher insulating value per inch thickness than glass fiber.

Physical properties:

Fire-resistant.

Nonhygroscopic (it is moisture-resistant). Odorless.

Vermin-and rodent-resistant.

Required by federal specification to be noncorrosive to metal.

Other characteristics:

Available with or without vapor barrier backing

Advantages:

Relatively inexpensive (1434 cents per

Note: Prices quoted throughout were obtained from retail sources. They are given for comparison reasons only and may differ from area to area. Prices are for do-it-yourself materials.

Allows for uninterrupted vapor barrier.

Disadvantages:

Has to be cut to size (use heavy-duty

shears or sharp knife).

May irritate skin; wear gloves and protective breathing mask when installing. Some paper vapor barriers are flammable.

Speculation:

Fibers inhaled from glass fiber insulation may be carcinogenic. CPSC states: "While CPSC currently has no evidence supporting any pathological effects in humans, it is continuing to review ongoing studies to determine if some type of regulatory action may be needed."

BATT

Dimensions:

Thickness and width: same as blanket rolls.

Length: 4 and 8 feet.

Best uses:

Same as blanket rolls.

Materials:

Same as blanket rolls.

Physical properties:

Same as blanket rolls. Other characteristics:

Same as blanket rolls. Advantages:

Easy to handle because of relatively small size. Less work involved to install; batts are precut.

Disadvantages:

Over an area longer than 8 ft. breaks occur in vapor barrier coverage, require taping.

Some paper vapor barriers are flammable. Waste results if trimming has to be done. May irritate skin or nose.

More expensive than blanket rolls (23% cents per sq. ft.).



Speculation:

Same as blanket rolls.

FOAM

Material:

Urea formaldehyde, which is combined with a catalyst so it can be forced from a nozzle under pressure. Foam sets within 10 to 60 seconds.

Best uses:

To insulate exterior walls that are enclosed (existing structures). Urea formaldehyde foam is a contractor installed material.

Cost:

50 cents per sq. ft. (varies with area, contractor).

Areas of disagreement:

"If properly manufactured and installed, urea formaldehyde products can meet accepted levels for flammability safety, but they are not 'fireproof' as distributors sometimes claim (CPSC).

"The normal linear shrinkage of urea formaldehyde foam is in the seven to

15 percent range" (Modern Plastics Encyclopedia, 1975-76, supported by a test conducted by the Bureau of Standards). On the other hand, the National Association of Urea Formaldehyde Insulation Manufacturers claims normal shrinkage is one to three percent. "Another possible hazard linked with

urea formaldehyde insulation is emission of toxic fumes after the product has been installed. Improper mixing and curing of this product can contribute to production of such fumes" (CPSC).

Advantages:

One of the most effective insulating materials (inch-for-inch thickness) available.

"Rapco-Foam will not hydrolyze (i.e., absorb moisture). Moisture absorption in wet cavity wall over 24-hour period, two percent by weight" (Rapperswill Corp., a producer of urea formaldehyde).

Disadvantages:

If installed in an attic, high temperature may cause the material to disintegrate and fumes to seep into the living

"Quality of application to date has been very inconsistent. Choose a qualified contractor who will guarantee his work" (Department of Housing and Urban Development).

LOOSE FILL FOR POURING

Materials:

Rock wool.

Glass fiber.

Cellulose.

Vermiculite (manufactured from lightweight mica rock).

Best uses:

Attic floors, especially those interrupted by framing, piping that would reduce the effectiveness of blanket rolls, and those having nonstandard stud spacing.

Finished exterior walls if the home has exposed openings in the attic that allow pouring of insulation down between the studs.

Cost:

Cellulose: 10 cents sq. ft. Rock wool: 15 cents sq. ft. Glass fiber: 18 cents sq. ft. Vermiculite: 33 cents sq. ft.

Physical properties:

Rock wool and glass fiber: Same as blanket rolls.

Cellulose: Not fire-resistant if untreated. Note: CPSC warns that cellulose insulation, although treated, can catch fire if subjected to flame or spark. Do not install near light fixtures or heat ducts. Federal specification HH-1-515C requires that if starch is added to cellulose insulation, the manufacturer certify in writing that the product has been chemically treated to resist vermin.

Odorless.

Hygroscopic-will absorb moisture and

become less effective.

Some chemicals (aluminum sulfate is one) that are used to treat cellulose are corrosive.

Vermiculite: Least flammable insulating material with zero rating for all three Underwriters Laboratories tests (flame spread, fuel contributed, smoke developed—see "Reading Labels," page 136).

Odorless.

Vermin-and rodent-resistant.

Nonhygroscopic.

Noncorrosive.

Advantages:

All pour easily and fill holes and gaps readily.

From the standpoint of insulating value, cellulose provides the most per inch thickness, followed by rock wool, glass fiber and vermiculite. According to the Department of Housing and Urban Development, cellulose has "about 30 percent more insulation value than rock wool for the same installed thickness."



Disadvantages:

A separate vapor barrier (heavy polyethylene) should be laid before insulation is poured in an uninsulated attic.

Mineral wool has tendency to sag when installed in walls.

Must be contractor-installed.

LOOSE FILL FOR BLOWING.

Materials:

Rock wool. Glass fiber. Cellulose.

Best uses:

Finished or unfinished attic floors.

Finished exterior walls.

Cost:

Materials cost same as loose fill for pouring. Add 100 percent for contractor installation.

Physical properties:

Same as loose fill for pouring.

Advantages:

Same as loose fill for pouring.

Disadvantages:

Same as loose fill for pouring.



Rigid board.

Dimensions:

Some are precut ¾ x 13½ x 48" to fit between standard 2½" wide furring strips set 16" on center. Also available in 24" length up to 4" thick.

Best uses:

Basement walls.

Materials:

Polystyrene. Polyurethane.



Physical properties:

Combustible. Must not be exposed to open flames, sparks or other excessive heat. Must be covered with a minimum 1/2" gypsum wallboard.

Vermin- and rodent-resistant.

Noncorrosive.

Nonhygroscopic.

Advantages

Extremely high insulating value.

Precut size referred to above fits between furring strips. No adhesive or tacking required.


Easily trimmed (use serrated knife). No vapor barrier necessary.

What you should know about vapor barriers

A vapor barrier prevents water vapor from condensing and collecting in new insulation and on wood framing. Vapor control is also maintained by assuring adequate ventilation so don't cover attic (either gable or soffit) or crawl-space vents with insulation.

Most people assume that material used as coverings on mineral wool blankets and batts are vapor barriers, but these do not completely bar moisture transmission.

WITH VAPOR BARRIER



WITHOUT VAPOR BARRIER

These membranes are satisfactory for some vapor barrier purposes. Where no membrane is attached to the insulation, a separate vapor barrier is necessary. Materials that may be used as a vapor barrier include:

- Polyethylene sheeting, 2 mils or thicker in the attic and walls, and 4 mils or thicker as ground cover under slabs or over crawl-space earth.
- Foil-backed gypsum board.
- Waterproof laminated asphaltcoated paper.

Important: Always install a vapor barrier facing the "warm" side of the wall, the side heated in winter. If blanket rolls or batts with vapor membranes are to be installed over existing attic insulation, remove the membranes of the new insulation or slash them free with a knife. If a membrane is slashed, install new blankets or batts with the membrane side down. If you damage the vapor membrane during installation, use tape for repairs.

Caution: Some vapor membranes are flamable. The National Mineral Wool Insulation Assn. warns that a membrane with a flame spread greater than 200 (see "Reading labels") be marked as follows: "This vapor barrier is flammable and should not be left exposed. Special care should be taken when working close to the facing with an open flame."

Reading labels

The federal government and the American Society for Testing and Materials (ASTM) have set minimum specifications and standards for cellulose and mineral wool loose-fill insulation. On those that apply to cellulose. Packages should state that products meet these specifications.

Fed. Spec. HH-1-515C—"Insulation, Thermal (Loose Fill for Pneumatic or Poured Application): Cellulosic or Wood Fiber."

2. ASTM Standard C739-73—
"Standard Specification for Cellulosic Fiber (Wood Base) Loose-Fill Thermal Insulation."

The following are minimum specifications that apply to mineral wool: 1. Fed. Spec. HH-1-1030A—"Insu-

 Fed. Spec. HH-1-1030A—"Insulation, Thermal (Mineral Fiber for Pneumatic or Poured Application)."

 ASTM Standard C236-66—"Test for Thermal Conductance and Transmittance of Built-up Sections by Means of the Guarded Hot Box."

3. ASTM Standard C687-71—
"Recommended Practice for Determination of Thermal Resistance of Low Density Fibrous Loose-Fill Type Building Insulation."

Underwriters Laboratories (UL) also evaluates insulating materials with respect to flammability. Acording to UL, "if the material has passed the UL testing program and the follow-up factory inspections to ascertain that the product is the same as that which was originally tested, then, and then only, can the maker use the UL classified marking."

The UL marking indicates "flame spread," "fuel contributed" and "smoke developed." "Flame spread" rates how quickly the material burns. "Fuel contributed" rates the material's contribution as a fuel. "Smoke developed" is the amount of smoke the material generates. Ratings are based on a comparison with

noncombustible (asbestos-cement boards), which is zero, and with a combustible (untreated red oak lumber), which is 100.

In the sample label (below left) the flame spread of the insulation batt or blanket is 25, which means it burns one-quarter as quickly as red oak. The insulation contributes fuel to the fire one-half as much as red oak. Thus the value 50. The insulation is also rated 50 as a smoke developer.

You may see a label similar to the second sample (right). The FHC 25/50 designation means that the product has a flame spread of 25, and fuel contributed and smoke developed values of 50. FHC stands for "Fire Hazard Classification."



FHC and number flag a product's "Fire Hazard Classification" rating for buyers.



This specification for labeling home thermal insulation, proposed by the Department of Commerce, gives easily understood product information to consumers at the point of sale.

Uniform home insulation labeling

The Department of Commerce has proposed that manufacturers of home thermal insulation voluntarily adopt a uniform label to aid consumers. The label will list an insulating product's chemical material and form, along with its safety rating, area of coverage, R value and recommended application. Home insulation is the first product selected under new Vo-

luntary Consumer Product Information Labeling Program (CPILP). The government is seeking industry support, and if manufacturers participate, most types of insulation will be tested, rated and labeled. The National Bureau of Standards will select test procedures and design a label that can be easily understood by consumers (see sample at left).

Booklet on blown insulation






or everyone who is interested in giving solar collection a try-but not quite ready to remortgage the house to do it, PM has shopped around and come up with the following inexpensive space-heating, water-heating and solar-shading devices. Space-heating units are small and do not store heat, thus limiting them to daytime booster heating. But they provide a way to plunge into solar without extensive renovations and great expense. Water heaters are one of the most cost-effective ways to use solar energy, but require basic plumbing skills. Solar shading devices are actually more effective than conventional shades, blinds and draperies, and they are just as easy to install.

One for your window

This unit retails for \$370, weighs under 55 lbs., and can be installed in about 30 minutes. Sun Spot uses an automatic 17 W. blower that moves 55 cu. ft. of air per minute. A thermostat activates the blower when the sun heats the collector's absorber plate to 10°F, above room temperature. The blower shuts off when the plate cools to within 6°F. of room temperature. Even with the temperature outside in the high teens, it can produce 140-145°F. air, claims the manufacturer. Unit comes with a two-year warranty. 

Billed by its manufacturer as including "The World's Ugliest Solar Collector," this window unit sells for \$335. It includes 100 sq. ft. of a flexible polyethylene collector, flexible hose, and the air-handling unit with blower and thermometers showing room and collector temperatures. A thermostat that turns the blower on when the collector reaches 80° F. is \$16 extra.

The fascinating part of this unit is the collector itself (shown in cutaway). Because the collector can be situated separately from the air handler and ducted to it, the room you wish to heat doesn't

even have to have a south-facing window. You can locate the collector around a corner if necessary.

In operation, cold air blows through a serpentine duct in the absorber unit (see drawing). Air is then released between the absorber unit and lens and flows out the hot-air duct. Temperatures of up to 140° F. can be achieved, the manufacturer says. The collector can be purchased separately. Life expectancy is three to five years.



22 ways you can save energy around your house

These days a homeowner doesn'th have to look very far to bee reminded that his heating and cooling expenses are the highest even since man moved indoors. Thought industry and government are now pouring dollars into finding a practical alternative to oil and natural gas, we are years away from economicall solution to the energy crisis. So it makes sense to get the most mileages out of the energy you are paying for.

1. Heat-loss audit. This year many commercial and industrial buildings will be checked for heat loss by infrared photography, a processe



which may soon be practical for homeowners. But don't wait for it. If you devote a Saturday to making a heat-loss audit of your home, you can probably locate, and correct, most of your heat loss problems. And, the savings in heating fuel costs can be substantial.

The secret is in knowing where to look. An infrared photo of your home would visually show you areas where heat is escaping and we can make a pretty good guess as to where most of them would be. Depending on the age and construction of your house, you'll probably find heat escaping at

some or all of these points:


- Around doors and windows.
- At structural joints, particularly where dissimilar materials meet.
- Through the roof.

If you inspect these areas you can probably learn more about your home's heat losses than any infrared photo can tell you. Armed with that knowledge, put these pointers to work:

Caulking. Unless your house is fairly new, or you have been very conscientious about exterior maintenance, there are probably several places where joints have opened up or the old caulking has dried up and fallen out of the joint.

Check for cracks around door and window frames, places where wood and brick siding meet, and joints between the chimney and siding. Also check where the house framing meets the concrete foundation (you may be able to do this from the basement) and where water pipes, dryer vents, wires pass through walls.

Since caulking is not much fun, choose a caulking compound that won't have to be replaced for a long time. The silicone caulks are the



longest lasting. There are two basic types: Silicone rubber caulks and paintable silicone caulks. Silicone rubber types are most familiar because of their widespread use as a bathtub seal. The paintable silicone caulks are less rubberlike, but are still extremely resilient. They have the best adhesion to concrete. Paint will not stick to paintable silicone caulks, but will form a film over the surface. With silicone rubber caulks, paint first and then caulk. Both types are available in caulking cartridges for conventional caulking guns. Silicone rubber caulks also come in squeeze tubes-more convenient for some applications.

Vinyl and latex caulks are also premium-priced and premium-performance materials, although their resistance to weather and temperature is less than that of the silicones. Long exposure to sunlight and moisture reduce their flexibility and bond

Most butyl caulks usually contain

high percentages of solvents and shrink during cure. They do not stand up well to sunlight, but are frequently recommended for belowground-level applications.

Oil-based caulks are the cheapest and have the shortest useful life.

Whatever caulk you use, be sure you remove all the old loose, dry caulk from the joint and brush out dust and dirt before recaulking. The joint should be clean and dry when the caulk is applied.



Insulation is the quickest and surest way to bring down your heating and cooling bills. But make certain that what you plan to add is, in fact, needed and will actually improve the insulation picture in your home.

Use 3. Weatherstripping. this where doors or windows meet the frame. Since wooden doors and windows shrink and swell with weather changes, it is almost impossible to maintain a tight seal unless compressible weatherstripping material is applied where the surfaces meet.

The most common weatherstrippings are adhesive-backed foam strips and strips of formed plastic which must be tacked or stapled in place. The foam strips, which have an adhesive backing, are easily installed but not particularly durable. They also tend to become permanently compressed in time. The formed plastic strips do a better job and last longer but are harder to install and not particularly attractive. They are less compressible, thus not suitable for all applications.

Gaskets. Another solution to the weatherstripping problem is an idea borrowed from the automotive industry: "formed-in-place gaskets" made of a silicone sealant similar to the silicone rubber caulk you can buy. A clear silicone will be almost invisible and it will conform exactly to fill the space between door and

door frame.

To make custom-fitted weatherstripping, squeeze a bead of silicone on the portion of the door frame that comes in contact with the face of the door. The bead should fill the gap between door and frame. Before doing this, coat the portions of the door that will come in contact with the silicone with soap or dishwashing detergent to prevent the silicone from sticking to the door. Let the silicone caulk cure about 20 minutes or until it is not tacky to the touch. Then shut the door and wipe away any sealant squeeze-out.

Do this when you can leave the door shut a day or two since the silicone needs time to cure. Test the release material (soap or detergent) to be sure the silicone won't stick to a surface coated with it. Then apply the release material liberally. Otherwise, you may end up with a permanently closed door.

5. Attic doors, windows. In the same way you can weatherstrip the bottom of windows to assure a tight seal. If you have a trap door or folddown stairway to your attic, use the same technique to prevent heat escaping to the cold attic.

6. Storm windows. If you don't have storm windows, installing them will be an excellent investment. They can reduce heat loss through the glass by as much as 50 percent.

7. Loose screws. If you already have aluminum storms and screens, the screws holding the storm window flanges may have loosened or the frames may have buckled slightly to let in drafts. The best cure for this is to retighten the screws and caulk the joint where the storm window joins the wooden window frame. It's best, and easiest, to do this from the inside. A clear silicone gives the best appearance if the storm window and window frame are not the same color.

8. Inoperable storms. The storm window and screen inserts should slide easily in their tracks. If they don't, remove the inserts and clean the edges and channels with a soft rag and detergent. Use steel wool if necessary. Then lubricate the channel. Unless the unit is out-of-square,



it should then slide freely.

9. Sticky catches. The spring-loaded lugs that fit into notches in the frame to hold the window or screen in place should operate easily. If they don't secure the window in the closed position, it may work up and permit air leaks. Or they may permit the window to slide down when it should be locked in the up position. These catches often stick with disuse and should be lubricated and worked several times until they operate freely.

10. Choosing the right lubricant. For your storm windows this is very important. Windows and slides are probably bare aluminum or have a baked-on painted surface. Ordinary petroleum oil does not work very well on paint or aluminum. Graphite is fairly effective but is dirty and messy. Most silicone sprays are no more effective than petroleum oils on aluminum.

An effective aluminum lubricant is General Electric's Silicone Lubricant; it forms a tough film.

11. Clogged weep holes. Your storm window unit probably has small weep holes in the bottom tracks to permit rainwater to drain off. If clogged, clean them out with a thin, pointed tool.

12. Don't compare fuel bills—compare heat degree days. Because fuel prices change rapidly and weather varies from one season to the next, it is difficult to measure energy savings. To find out what you are saving, compare heating-degree days.

Since space heating accounts for a large percentage of home energy use—especially in the northern and northeastern parts of the United States—degree days give an accu-

HOWEREREUDE

rate method for calculating fuel needs from month to month and year to year. You can get degree-day information from a newspaper, local weather station, oil dealer or the local power company.

In most areas, heating is not required when the mean outdoor temperature is 65° F. or above. To obtain the mean temperature simply add the daily high and low temperatures together and divide by two.

The degree-days for a given day is calculated by subtracting the mean outdoor temperature from 65° F. For instance, if the daily high is 30° F. and the low is 10° , the equation reads 30 plus $10 \div 2$, or, 40 divided by $2 = 20^{\circ}$ F. mean temperature. Next, you subtract the mean temperature from 65° F. Thus, in our sample day above you would have 65-20=45 degree days.

13. Economical cooling. The conservation of energy has as much bearing on home cooling as it does on heating. That's why you should pay special attention to airconditioner maintenance during the cooling season to assure your unit working efficiently.

If you detected any mechanical problems at the end of the last cooling season, ask your airconditioning service specialist to check it over. Or, you may need only basic maintenance—such as the replacement or cleaning of the air filter.

A strong, steady flow of air is a must for an airconditioner to perform its cooling function. To assure clean air the unit is equipped with a filter that traps dust, dirt, pollen and other airborne contaminants. If the filter is clogged it will reduce the airflow and cause the unit to operate inefficiently.

To clean a room airconditioner, first remove the front panel. Then,


use a vacuum cleaner attachment to go over the inside walls, louvers in the front panel and inlet louvers. The inside may also need wiping with water and detergent or liquid cleaner.

Next, inspect the air filter. If it's aluminum, it can be washed and used for years. Nonwashable filters should be replaced when dirty. If you need a new one, buy a washable aluminum-mesh filter that can be trimmed to the correct size with scissors. A filter can be cleaned in warm soapy water and air-dried. After each washing it should be recoated with a filter adhesive to restore its original performance. The spray-on coating is usually available along with filters in most hardware and department stores.

When the hot season arrives, keep these suggestions in mind:

- 14. Be energy-conservation minded. Use your air conditioner in accordance with current energy recommendations or regulations.
- Turn on the airconditioning before your rooms heat up.
 - 16. Keep windows and doors shut.
 - 17. Don't let cold air escape.
- Use shades, awnings and drapes to protect against direct sunlight.
- 19. Keep grills and registers open for proper air movement.
- Check and clean the air filter periodically.
- 21. Remember: Fans are more economical to run than airconditioners.
- 22. An attic fan can make your whole house a little cooler.

Use common sense when installing a room airconditioner. If possible, place it in a window on the north or east side so the unit can produce cool air with less effort. If it must be in a window on the south or west side, consider installing an awning over it to help ease the load. For maximum airconditioner efficiency check its filter regularly (see No. 13 in text).





Solar observatory scientists, museum guides and science teachers say the question most often asked about the sun is: How long will it last? The best available answer is no more than a consensus of solar astronomers' rough guesses—at least another 5 billion years.



In 1901, a practical solar-powered steam engine was put to work pumping irrigation water on an ostrich farm in Pasadena, Calif.



The Solar Constant is the standard intensity of solar radiation impinging on the Earth's atmosphere at the mean distance between Earth and sun. It is the energy equivalent of 1.353 kilowatts of electricity per square meter. Under clear skies, some 80 to 90 percent of this radiation reaches the ground; under heavy cloud cover 10 percent or less. The average energy rate at the Earth's surface is about 1 kw per square meter.



Upon its completion in the coming year, the world's largest solar heating system will service a 14-building education complex in Saudi Arabia.



According to contemporary accounts, the great Greek mathematician, Archimedes, was supposed to have fashioned parabolic reflectors that focused the sun's rays on the sails of Roman ships and set them afire, thus assuring the Greeks' victory at the battle of Syracuse in 212 B.C. Most historians doubt that this ever really happened.



Despite considerable publicity given to warnings from medical authorities, every solar eclipse visible in heavily populated areas of the world produces a few isolated cases of blindness due to retinal burns suffered by people who have stared at the eclipse without any eye protection. Recommended densities of protective media vary up to three layers of completely exposed (and developed) photographic film for any sustained observation. The next solar eclipse visible in parts of the United States will occur on Feb. 26, 1979.



John Ericson, who designed the Union's Civil War armored ship, Monitor, built several solar-powered steam engines before announcing that the idea was totally impractical.



If you could see all the sun's radiation, it would seem twice as bright. Only 47 percent of solar radiation is within the visible spectrum—appears as sunlight. Approximately seven percent is in the ultraviolet range, while the remainder is in the near-infrared portion of the

spectrum.



Twenty years ago, when the space program's pioneers wanted to test spacecraft components' ability to resist the heat of re-entry, they decided to build a "solar furnace" based on a large reflector to generate the necessary high temperatures. Instead, somebody figured out a way to convert surplus World War II searchlights into a solar furnace—capable of 8000° F.—at one-eighth the cost of building one from scratch.



The solar energy—total sunlight—that falls on the land area of the United States in one year is estimated to be the equivalent of 500 times the amount of all the energy the United States will consume annually by the year 2000. Worldwide, the total energy available in solar radiation equates to 25 times that available in all known terrestrial energy sources.



The sun still contains more than 99 percent of the total mass of the Solar System, even though it loses mass—through radiation of energy—at the rate of 4.6 million tons per second.



During the Truman Administration.

government energy specialists predicted that some 13million solar-powered homes would exist in the United States by the year 2000.



The sun is often symbolized in ancient Egyptian art by a golden scarab beetle. If the scarab is painted black, however, it represents the forces of darkness or the underworld.



According to the American Bar Assn., the Latin maxim Cujus est solum ejus est usque ad coelum et ad inferos, meaning "The owner of the soil also owns to the sky and to the depths," was being applied in legal proceedings as early as the late 13th Century in cases where the blocking or interruption of sunlight above a person's property was found to constitute a trespass. In a notable exception, an Englishman named Bury was found to have built too close to his own property line and therefore could not legally prevent his neighbor from building a house that obstructed Bury's sunlight. The Latin maxim (of unknown origin) was quoted in that opinion, handed down in 1586, and has been a part of Anglo-American law ever since.



If you want to avoid using the word "sun" as a verb in a particular sentence, some alternatives are: apricate; bask; illume; irradiate; luxuriate.



At its equator, the sun makes one complete rotation in a little less than 25 days. Since it is a fluid body, however, its varying rates of rotation-slower toward the poles-contribute to the whorls and eddies associated with solar storms and sunspots that are believed to affect our weather.

If the sun were made entirely of coal, it would have burned to a cinder in about 5000 years.



We could-at considerable cost-load all of our dangerous radioactive wastes, surplus products of biochemical warfare experiments, extremely volatile toxic substances, etc., into a giant orbiting trash can which, say, every decade or so would be shot into the sun and incinerated.



stands still." [Galileo Galilei, on being condemned as a heretic by the Inquisition in 1634 for publishing his proof that Earth orbits the sun.]



"Il sole no si move-The sun does not move." [Leonardo da Vinci, more than a century prior to the trial of Galileo.



Earthlight, or Earthshine, is the sunlight reflected from the surface of the Earth that gives a faint illumination to the dark side of the moon.



At no time anywhere within the continental United States does sunlight come from directly overhead.



At least one team of astronomers believes there is a possibility that the sun is orbiting a "black hole"-an unimaginably dense, collapsed star whose gravitational field swallows everything that comes too near it, even light.



The pineal gland (or pineal body), found in the brains of all vertebrates, is obscure in function but believed to partially regulate sexual development. Biologists postulate that in primordial reptiles it was actually a third eye that tracked the sun and provided "navigational" inputs for seasonal events, including migration and mating. Atrophied and receded into the head, it may still respond to the stimulation of sunlight in unknown ways.



If the sun's total radiation were halved, the Earth's temperature would plunge below the freezing point. If the sun's radiation were doubled, the oceans would evapo-



More scientists have become convinced that there is a connection between the approximately 11.5-year cycle of sunspot activity and climate phenomena on Earth. Yet others have attempted to correlate bird migrations, animal behavior and even human sociology to the sunspot cycle. Oddly enough, the American Revolution, French Revolution and Russian Revolution all took place during periods of peak sunspot activity.



In 1958, the Fontainebleau Hotel in Miami Beach announced a 14-story addition. The neighboring Eden Roc hotel's management calculated that the additional floors would cast a shadow over their swimming pool, sunbathing and cabana areas—so they sued to prevent the new construction. A lower court handed down an injunction against the Fontainebleau, but it was overturned by the Florida Appellate Court and work proceeded.

ne way to boost the economic feasibility of tapping the sun's energy is to consider installing a solar-heating system yourself. A good percentage of solar equipment buyers are apparently up to the task. Grumman Energy Systems reports that in a recent survey of their Sunstream domestic hot water systems, about a third of all installations were done by do-it-yourselfers. Other solar manufacturers are also beginning to realize the benefits of designing and packaging systems that are easier to install.

"Kit" means different things to different manufacturers. Water-heating kits will usually not supply standard stock items which can be easily obtained locally, such as pipes, ducts, caulking, electric cables and even collector glazing. Other systems are complete down to the last pipe coupling. One such system is Solar Comfort's Joule Box Solar Water Heater. The optional plumbing package includes just about everything you'll need.

Before ordering a kit from a manufacturer, obtain the components list to be sure you know what you're getting, which items are optional, and what you must supply.


Some kits can be characterized as "loose" packaged—which generally means there will be more for you to put together. But loose packaging is not always a disadvantage. A kit

which requires on-site assembly of the collector, for instance, may prove easier than lifting a heavy preassembled unit onto the roof. On the other hand, loose-packed pumps, valves, gauges, heat exchangers and electronic controls may cause installation headaches for the do-it-yourselfer with average solar know-how. Try to choose a system that doesn't require a lot of wiring, plumbing and special fittings.



water for domestic use has been pioneered by Calmac Inc. in conjunction with the Marshall Space Flight Center. The key material is Ethylene-Propylene Diene Monomer (EPDM). It can be extruded into

In addition, EPDM is freeze-tolerant—water freezing inside the extruded tubes will not cause damage. EPDM also can maintain its shape in extreme heat—up to 375° if not subjected to pressure. 


plate extrusions which can be used to help fabricate anything from a collector or skylight, to a passive solar heating south wall.


The advantages of these collector systems are numerous. Low conductivity of the plastic is compensated for by spacing the tubing close together. Cost is significantly less than copper or aluminum and EPDM is non-corroding. Since it is freezetolerant, a freeze-inhibited, closed-loop system is not necessary. In fact, potable water can be run directly through the collectors, allowing a direct hookup with the existing hotwater heating system.

EPDM lightweight extrusions are also easy to work with. On-site installation lets you size a system to satisfy your needs.

Both Calmac and Bio-Energy systems offer hot-water heating systems for under \$1000.

Grumman Energy Systems' Sunstream water heating systems boast around 3000 installations. They offer several options, including a closedloop, freeze-inhibited system for






Solarcell's concentrating collector, and plumbing kit for solar hot water heating system (model A-40, \$650), are shipped in one 100-lb. package (above).

cold climes and open-loop systems for areas where freezing is infrequent or unlikely. You can also choose between a loose-packaged kit like the 60AS model (\$1238) or a factory-assembled tank-mounted control system like the 60AST, (\$1439). Grumman's installation manual is a good one.

Solarcell Corp. also packages both open- and closed-loop domestic hot water heating systems. They come with one or two non-tracking, focusing concentrator-type collectors constructed of high-impact ABS polymer plastic with extruded aluminum trim. The reflectors are of vacuum-metalized plating on ABS and the unit is sealed with 1/8-in. acrylic glazing. Depending on options you choose, kit prices range from about \$650 to \$1050. A price list on water storage tanks is also available.

Another innovative approach to flatplate collectors is at the heart of





Daystar's closed-loop systems. It features a convection suppressor—an accordion-like transparent plastic which helps to trap collected heat. The collectors are also equipped with a temperature limiter system to help re-radiate heat during periods of excessive temperature buildup.

TWO MODULAR CONTROL PACKAGES

Taco, Inc. has good news for solar doit-yourselfers. Their Solar Systemizers combine pumps, a highly efficient "counterflow" heat exchanger (optional), air separator, differential control, and hydronic controls. The only on-site connections required are supply and return piping, one power lead and two sensor connections. Although Taco doesn't package a complete hot water heating system, kits sold by many manufacturers include Taco components.

Solar Research also markets an easyto-install, factory-assembled control package. A further advantage of both systems is that they don't have to be built into or onto the water heater— Should the existing water heater or storage tank deteriorate, the entire system doesn't have to be reinstalled.



An effective method of heat transfer has been developed by Mor-Flo Industries. Their Solarstream water heating system features a patented solar storage tank which is encased by a second, heat exchanging tank. Between the tanks, a rust inhibiting and glycol solution circulates and transfers heat from collectors to the potable water stored in the inner tank. Double inner-wall construction keeps the solar fluid from contaminating the potable water. This arrangement is highly efficient due to the fully insulated, large surface design of the heat exchanging tank.

A variety of tank sizes with or without an auxiliary heat element is available. A worthwhile option is a pre-assembled control package mounted atop the tank. The Solar-

stream system utilizes lightweight Reynolds aluminum collectors.

Sun-heated living spaces

The following selection of solar devices that you can install includes at least one to match the skills of every home owner.

The first and most rudimentary, called Nightwalls, can turn even single-glazed windows, or patio doors into energy-assets rather than liabilities. Used during winter nights to reduce heat loss, a nightwall is made of 1-in.-thick rigid insulation sized to the shape of your opening and held in position with Nightwall

clips by Zomeworks. The clips are simply a pair of ½ x 6-in. flexible magnetic strips with adhesive backing. One strip adheres to the glass or window casing, the other to the panel of insulation. The clips cost about 35 cents each from Zomeworks.

If you don't want to bother with putting up, taking down and storing Nightwalls, Zomeworks markets the plans and components for a more sophisticated insulated window. A Beadwall is double-glazed with a 2¾-in. thick cavity that can be filled or emptied of its insulating Styrofoam beads, depending on whether

GLOSSARY OF SOLAR TERMS

Absorber plate—the surface of a flat-plate collector which absorbs solar radiation and converts it to heat.

Active system—requires mechanical power to collect, store or distribute solar heat.

Closed-loop system—a hot water heating

system which continually recirculates antifreeze through collectors. Heat is transfered to potable water by a heat exchanger.

Collector control sensors—temperature sensitive elements that signal the differential thermostat controller when conditions are right for activating system, collecting heat.

Concentrating solar collector—a device using reflective surfaces to focus sunlight on a small area where it is absorbed and converted to heat. Often capable of generating higher temperatures than flat plate collectors.

Cover plate—glazing used above absorber plate of collector to prevent excessive heat loss.

Differential-temperature thermostat—activates the pump or blower when collector temperature is sufficiently above tank temperature; it deactivates pump or blower when collector temperature does not exceed the storage temperature by preset amount.

Flat-plate collector—device which converts sunlight to heat energy on a plane surface of metal or plastic.

Heat exchanger—device used to transfer heat from one fluid to another (either liquid to liquid or air to liquid).

Heat storage—any devices, containers, masonry walls or mediums such as pebbles or water which can store collected solar heat for future use.

Liquid-based solar heating system—uses liquid (either water or antifreeze solution) to transport heat from collector to storage. Open-loop system—hot water heating system which needs no heat exchanger, and circulates potable water through collectors.


Passive system—relies on convection, not external mechanical power, to move the collected solar heat.

Solar water storage tank, or preheat tank—stone or glass-lined insulated tank used in a domestic water heating system to store hot water. May be equipped with an integral external heat exchanger. Solar tanks may be hooked-up in series with an existing hotwater heater—or one may be used as the sole hot-water storage tank if it's equipped with an auxiliary heat element.

Sol-air collector (\$150) can be windowmounted between sill and open sash. Gaps are filled with rigid insulation.







or not the sun is shinning and what the outside temperature is. Zomeworks will supply you with everything but the glazing, including preassembled, vented panels, motorstorage units, insulating beads, mounting and glazing accessories.

The Kalwall Solar Furnace another version of a glazed/insulated south wall-but with the addition of an effective means of storing solar heat. Vertical storage tubes made of a fiberglass-reinforced polyester (Sun-lite) and filled with water are better than a masonry wall when it comes to heat-storage capacity. The back of each tube is painted black in order to increase heat absorption-and the water is kept bacteria-free with chlorine. Natural convective currents or forced circulation of air may be used to move air around the warmed tubes to living spaces.

Kalwall also makes 2%-in.-thick window-wall panels of Sun-lite with U-factor of .41 (30 percent better than double-paned glass) and transmissivity of 77 percent. Other ways to obtain a well-insulated weather-wall include movable insulating panels (such as the Nightwall system) or thermal drapery.

A remarkable window- or wallmounted collector by Sol-air generates far more useful heat than its surface area would indicate. Two units will heat a normally insulated, average-sized room on a cold winter day.

The collector is double-glazed and is divided by insulating absorber panels to form a hot front side and a cooler back side. Air from the room enters the top of the unit, flows to the




BONDED JOINT LEXAN COVER

foot of the collector (since it is cooler and denser than the air already there) and then is forced to rise across the hot absorber/divider's front. The heated air then re-enters the room. The real key to the heat transfer from the sun to the air is the black fibrous composition and the three-dimensional design of the absorber/divider. It presents a much greater surface area to the flow of air than a typical flat-plate, air-type collector.

Based on the same principle as the Sol-air collector, Sunwall Inc. has developed a multipanel system which offers several practical waterand space-heating options. The panels are typically wall-mounted and consist of a vacuum-formed, doublelayer Uvex optical cover plate and a blackened Foamglas insulator/ab sorber. Uvex, manufactured by Eastman Chemical Products, Inc., is a lightweight, impact-resistant glazing material which is inhibited against UV degradation. Foamglas, from Pittsburgh Corning, is an inorganic, non-corrosive, closed-cell material with a surface of tiny, light/heat absorbing cavities. It gives off its heat payload quickly to the air stream circulated around it. A finned tube installed in the upper plenum of a Sunwall panel can be used to transfer heat from air to water for domestic uses. The Sunwall people recommend a minimum order of four optical covers (4 x 71/2 ft.) and four boxes of absorber/insulators, (totaling \$532 plus freight and tax), to assure a significant impact on your fuel bills. They can provide you with all the components, including a choice of two heat storage units.

One is a rock-bin kit, the other an Aquabin complete with an EPDM bladder.

One final air-type system is Park Energy's Thruflo Solar collector, which doubles as a weathertight roof membrane on southern exposures. Savings on roofing materials, for either new construction or when reroofing, help to offset the cost of the collector. The system has primarily been used for space-heating systems with rock storage, but a new domestic water heating system will also soon be available.

The collector is built up on a grid of 2x2s to allow air flow through a black, perforated aluminum sheet. This effective absorber-plate design allows air to pass through it-thereby maximizing heat transfer from the hot aluminum.

The transparent polycarbonate cover plate is extruded from GE's Lexan plastic resins to form a tubular, impact-resistant, highly insulating glazing material. Transmissivity is 78 percent, with a gradual loss over the years of a few percent.

Park Energy Company sells the perforated collector sheets in 22x24in sections or in rolls, and the cover plate in 1-ft. widths and varying lengths. Optional, hat-shaped steel channel members (which can be used to replace the grid of 2x2s), cover brackets, gaskets, cover-plate bonding liquid, sealant, screws, a complete installation manual and the license and plans for building the patented Rock Trench Storage system are also available. Cost per square foot of collector is about \$8.32.



How to stop winter's drafts at windows and doors

Here are products that help reduce heat loss around existing openings—plus how to replace an ill-fitting window.

by Joseph R. Provey
ASSISTANT HOME AND SHOP EDITOR

here are three ways to improve the insulating qualities of your windows and doors. The easiest and most cost effective is to seal around openings to prevent loss of heated air and infiltration of cold air. Fixed joints, such as where window casings meet the siding, should be caulked. Use long-lasting silicone, acrylic latex or butyl rubber compounds. Movable joints at operable windows and at doors require weatherstripping. The Polyflex system (shown in photo, page 159) is easy to install-scissors can be used to cut it to length. It can also be used at the head and sill of a window sash. To complete the seal around your door, The Stanley Works has just introduced a wood and vinyl door-bottom seal (photo, page 159). The wood portion can be finished to match the door interior.

The second approach to improved doors and windows is to provide insulating dead-air spaces at openings by using storm panels. Traditionally, these have been placed on the exterior, but many low-cost, interior storm units are now available. They are easier to install and remove since you don't need to work from a ladder, and they're just as effective as the outside variety. The clear plastic glazings are simple to size to your requirements.

includes a spline for fastening PVC film to an aluminum frame. Two-sided foam tape secures the frame to the opening (photo, top right).

Similar products from Plaskolite utilize semirigid Dupont Mylar held in place by either self-adhering plastic trim molding or by acrylic tape. Mylar is of high optical quality and comes in rolls for large applications such as at patio doors and large picture windows.

Exterior-type storm units, although usually more expensive than inside types, are not visible on the inside. Two such energy savers are the Bucks County aluminum storm door, by Chamberlain, which is completely weatherstripped, and Anaconda's new Patio Glide storm unit, which comes with its own track system. (See photos, page 159.)

Two more updated traditional methods of trapping air are the use





of thermal drapery liners and horizontal rolling shutters. The latter are derivatives of once-functional hinged shutters. The Velcro-fastened drapery liners, it is claimed, can improve single-glazed windows by 50 percent. The PVC extruded, double-wall insulating shutters can be controlled manually or electrically.

The final approach to improved doors or windows is to replace them. This is expensive—and usually in-

volves other considerations. Perhaps you want the additional security of an insulated steel door. Or, if you need new storms and screens, the cost of a new combination unit will be somewhat offset by what you would have spent. The replacement door systems shown above were designed with thermal breaks, core insulation and integral weatherstripping. The insulated sidelights can be purchased in many styles.

HOW TO REPLACE AN OLD WINDOW


For our replacement unit, we chose Andersen's Perma-Shield, Narroline combination unit which measures 29% x 53½ in. and costs about \$160. This window is vinyl clad on the exterior for low maintenance and comes with a screen and integral storm window to provide triple glazing.

To obtain the proper-size replacement unit: measure the existing glass width (including the edge covered by glazing compound) and add 4 in. This total approximates the proper width for the new unit. For the approximate height, measure the glass height of one sash, double it and add 6 in. Choose a unit that is equal to







or less than these dimensions.

Remove old storms and sash if possible from old unit before removing it from opening. Wear

safety goggles.

- "Oppose" shims when leveling new unit by (1) resting each jamb bottom (or jamb horn) on butt end of shingle/shim; and (2) tapping in second shim feather-edge first in between jamb and first shim. Drive a finishing nail at an angle through the jamb horn to hold each shim in place. When secured, cut away excess shingle with a knife or chisel.
- If using new trim, check with dealer to determine what stool (inside ledge) size is recommended for your new unit.
- Fur out inside frame of new unit with wood scrap to provide nailers for inside trim if needed.
- Do not drive nails into tension spring mechanisms when installing head trim.
- Install old or new exterior casing with 10d galvanized nails. Prime back side before installing. Set and putty nailheads.



order to gain altitude and distance. Solar cells can be attached to a wing's upper surface. But here, instead, we show them inside the wing, exposed to sunlight through the wing's clear upper surface of heavy-duty Mylar. This provides solar cell protection at the cost of a slight loss in efficiency. An impact on silicon crystal can crack it, reducing power output and requiring tedious, expensive replacement.

Solar power as an auxiliary power source is already here for aircraft. Energy Saving Systems, a firm that manufactures solar arrays for marine and home use, now caters directly to homebuilt airplane and sailplane buffs. Their 12- and 14-volt solar pane's charge batteries at 90 to 400 milliamp-hours (prices from \$90 to \$220). The cells are installed inside canopies, above instrument panels, or on external surfaces.

Since they are tied down outdoors for long periods of time and usually flown in clear weather, recreational aircraft thus can have batteries constantly at full charge. Famed aerobat Art Scholl claims he went two months without needing any other battery charging on last year's airshow tour.

Solar model airplanes

Graupner, a large German model manufacturer, has flown radio-controlled model airplanes powered solely by solar cells (except for Nicad batteries for the R/C equipment). Some of these were designed by Fred Militky, who had previously helped convert a medium-performance motorglider to non-solar electricity in Austria. This ultralight aircraft had managed to achieve 12 minutes of powered flight from 132 pounds of batteries feeding a 13-hp motor. This probably the was world's first manned electric airplane (possibly the first electric aircraft of any type to fly since 1884, when lighter-than-air experiments took place).

Graupner puts no current price on its Solaris model airplane, saying production awaits breakthroughs in the cost of solar cells. ESS's Ray Speicher recently added worth of cells to an R/C sailplane and found that they barely sustained level flight.

A U.S. pioneer in electric model airplanes is Robert Boucher of Astro Flight, Inc. His work led to an Air Force project with major aerospace companies. Boucher proposed a \$500,000, 100-foot wingspan, purely solar RPV to be an atmospheric

"satellite." It would range globally and indefinitely at a 120,000-foot altitude, clear of clouds. Sinking slowly by night, it would climb back in sunlight.

To prove its feasibility, Astro Flight made three one-third-scale versions under a government contract. These 22.5-pound models each carried a \$40,000 solar-cell array delivering 570 reportedly peak watts to a 0.6 hp motor. An altitude of 17,200 feet was reached.

Strangely, the Air Force has shown little further interest. Boucher, however, has been encouraged enough to consider a mancarrying version. He is proposing a 64-foot-wingspan craft that will resemble our hypothetical illustration, with cells costing about \$100,000. The aircraft known to be under construction in England reportedly has a cell array which cost \$84,600. Its co-designer says because of price, "it's going to be a long time until the idea is practical. We're doing it just because it's there."

While recreational solar aircraft are not likely to appear in the near future, such craft could be easily justified today for special research projects, such as mingling unobtrusively with migrating bird or animal populations. One geologist is reportedly interested in the idea for remote expeditions. No fuel would have to be transported, and, when not flying, the craft's cells could be used for charging batteries to power ground equipment.

Solar-powered transport?

Boucher takes a giant conceptual leap, suggesting a solar-powered aircraft for carrying up to 21 passengers on short hauls. Grossing 10,000 pounds and having a 500-foot wing span, it would have a light carbongraphite geodesic framework covered with fabric. Solar cells, he says, would deliver 500 kilowatts to two 300-hp motors for a cruising speed of 60 mph. Cost is estimated at \$1 million for the basic aircraft: five times that for solar-cell arrays,

A vision for an oil-less world? Gasoline would have to go up to "roughly 20 to 100 dollars per gallon," Boucher figures, to make such vehicles worthwhile. But the investment would be one-time. whereas "gas is energy on the installment plan."

Whatever shape solar-powered airplanes take, the idea is immediately feasible albeit at a price. It only remains to be demonstrated. And with the predicted steady drop in solar cell price per watt, sunpowered flight might soon be nothing to make light of.

situated precisely throughout the

grid.

Dr. Saenz and his team say they want to test a Cherenkov detector placed in 1000-foot-deep water (about right for nuclear submarines). Using the Tevatron, they believe they can easily send 15-bit messages of 1s and 0s (binary numbers) during each eight-second accelerator cycle. The 15-bit burst would actually take place within 30 billionths of a second. The actual

proton beam is only one second "long"; the other seven seconds is how long it takes the accelerator to get the beam up to 1 TeV.

Theoretically, the intrinsic number of collisions (message bits) each neutrino burst could produce, Kotzer notes, is 53 million per second. Even now, Kotzer says, with the proper spacing the Fermilab accelerator could unload 1113 bits in 21 billionths of a second. That's enough to set up a good low-data link between a ground station and submarines.

Dr. Saenz says he can't discuss

any practical interest the Navy may have in neutrino communications, but he notes that it could, in fact, be the only viable means by which to reach submarines in a thermonuclear war.

The Navy, however, is not rushing headlong to develop neutrino communications because it's already spent more than \$115 million on a controversial project to turn most of northern Michigan into a giant very-short-wave transmitter. Called Project Seafarer, the scheme was recently scaled down because of public pressure. The whole area would become a huge grid, with underground cables connecting each point in the grid. It would broadcast radio signals at Extreme Low Frequencies (ELF) to subs in deep water.

The main problem with an ELF communications system is that an enemy could simply build ELF receivers. ELF signals are not tapproof and their range and a submarine's ability to receive them are limited.


No radioactive dangers

Neutrinos, on the other hand, are transmitted in relatively narrow beams and collide with matter so infrequently that an enemy would have to virtually duplicate our deepwater Cherenkov detector network in the same spot. (Another important advantage of neutrinos is they are 1000 times less radioactive than the feeblest cosmic ray. They pose no known public danger at all.)

Unfortunately, cost is the prime factor. To conduct these simple experiments during the next three years will cost about \$10 million, Kotzer says. To build a new Tevatron exclusively for Naval research would take five to 10 years and cost several hundred million dollars. The Navy would need a separate, bombsheltered accelerator for its own supersecret communications.

Neutrino-beamed TV

The not-too-distant future holds great promise, however, for commercial applications. Kotzer and his colleagues say that within 10 to 15 years, accelerators with up to 40 TeV. may be built. The message rates from these would increase by the factor of a million over Fermilab's Tevatron output. Then, the transmission of television and telephone calls by neutrino beam would be possible. One thing is certain: It won't be long before some form of communication via a medium for which the world itself "doesn't exist" becomes a reality.





All components of the Spitfire torch combine to maximize heat on target.



to try out the new Spitfire propane blazing torch, I borrowed a tricycle in need of repair from a nearby preschool. The kids were pleased with the results-and so was I.

Unlike conventional propane torches, which operate at lower temperatures, the Spitfire can do hard soldering as well as soft. Heat is maximized by precise metering of the gas/air ratio. Also, a helical rotor inside the flame tube swirls the gas/air mixture and spins the heavier inert gases to the outer edge of the flame, where they act as an insulator to help keep heat concentrated. In addition, the stainless-steel torch tip does not conduct heat away from the flame.

Optional accessories include kit. brazing soldering rods (bronze, stainless steel and aluminum), small tips for lighter work, flame spreader for paint removal, heat shield for working close to a wall, spark lighter and spare flints. Five different torch kits range in price from \$10 for the simple torch shown, to about \$35. They are available at many retail hardware outlets. can say I'm not disappointed one bit!"

A Minnesota commercial artist: "Handling is fantastic, from parking to high-speed highway cruising. The engine is quiet and peppy and starts in 20-below weather without a block heater. The dealer gave me a good deal and lent me a demo until my car came in; no pressure. This car is well worth what I paid."

Now for some general comments from owners:

"I refer to my Omni as a 'Friday or Monday' car, because I think the parts were thrown at it during assembly," quips a self-employed Michigander, "But it handles incredibly well in every situation, and it's a fun car to maneuver. I find fuel consumption less than the EPA estimate, but it's still okay."

"My wife and I both love our Omni," states a Georgia salesman, "but we were having problems getting it debugged. When the local service department couldn't straighten things out, I got a call from Chrysler Corp. Last week I met a factory rep at the dealer's, and the





them out on a desk: a pack of Marlboro cigarets; an ordinary Zippo lighter; pens and pencils; a tire pressure gauge; a decorative brass key for a large iron gate; a small grease gun and an assortment of similar objects.

They're all guns-most of them confiscated in criminal cases. Fold back the paper of the cigaret pack and a tiny gun barrel appears in the top, with a squeeze-lever trigger on the side, under the thin covering of paper. Flip the lighter lid, and a half-inch barrel projects from the place a wick should be-with a finger-pull trigger where a flint wheel went. The gate key has a pullsnap trigger knob in the handle and the grease gun fires when the handle is rammed home. Most such gadgets are built to fire a single .25- or .22-cal. bullet. All of them can kill.

Ed Owen insists these are pretty ordinary. "Some are really unique," he says. "We've seen smoking-pipe guns, umbrella guns and one that looks like an old-fashioned drinking ladle. At one time the Germans produced a belt buckle gun."

Some cane guns and swords, popular at the turn of the century, were works of art. ATF has several. Most beautiful is a Doumontier, produced by a Frenchman of that name. The polished hardwood stick covering a slick steel barrel is topped by a jade handle carved in the form of a greyhound's head. Twist the handle, pull, and the breech slides open to accept a .410-gauge shot shell. Twist the silver band and a trigger drops into operating position.

A similar beauty has a plain jade handle that detaches to reveal a revolver cylinder that accommodates six .25-cal. shells. A stiletto bayonet projects from it—presumably in case the "gentleman" should miss at close quarters. He might. There's no barrel.

At one time ATF held an instruction class on oddball firearms for law enforcement agencies. "Uniformed police got really upset when they saw these things," Owen notes, "especially the lighter and cigarets. It seems when a traffic officer arrests someone, the culprit—if a smoker—invariably pulls out a pack of cigarets nervously and lights up. What if that pack is a gun?' they

We reveal that such firearms are mostly for collectors; that they shouldn't go around snapping every little old lady's cane over their knees to see if it's a gun. Hardened criminals don't bother with non-gun guns. Ordinary guns are too easily concealed."

Ingenious rocket pistol

Not all unusual guns come from basement workshops. Not long ago an American manufacturer produced a real rocket pistol. "The projectiles had four pinhead-size venturis in the rear," says Ed, holding up a sample inch-long missile. "You load four or five in the chamber, cock it and fire. The hammer drives the rocket back against a firing pin, which ignites the propellant. A spring clamp holds the projectile long enough to build up pressure, then off it goes. Angled venturis set it spinning—a perfect rocket behind a solid slug."

There was a problem with accuracy, Owen says. The tiny venturis tended to clog and the rockets would "hook into the rough." But the Air Force took the concept and applied it to lifesaving. Today such a unit—designed like a pen gun—fires rocket-powered flares as distress signals.

The most sinister weapons in ATF's arsenal are the automatics that started the whole business of gun registration and regulation, and were responsible for the National Firearms Act of 1934. Most infamous, of course, is the Thompson submachine gun that acquired notoriety in the gang wars of the Prohibition Era. Ed Owen can show you one that most ATF people believe was used in the notorious 1929 St. Valentine's Day massacre in Chicago.

"It was recovered from a man with the friendly name of Fred 'Killer' Burke," says Owen, "along with Chicago Police uniforms and other gangster gear.

"You don't see machine guns in hard crime much anymore," he adds. "The sawed-off shotgun is easier; all you need is a cheap single barrel gun and a hacksaw."

Collectors want Thompsons

But the collectors' market for Thompsons is booming. Back in the '20s, Nick Vainovich reveals, a standard one with a drum magazine holding 50 or 100 rounds went for a few hundred dollars. Today, collectors will drop \$1500 to \$5000 and more for a registered Thompson, depending on features.

A recently introduced wrinkle is what Owen calls "toy Thompsons"—replicas that don't require registration fees. "Some look more like the real thing than the guns themselves," says Ed, proceeding to prove

it by placing one of the library's genuine guns and a dummy side-by-side. "The difference," says Ed, hefting the toy, "is that one is about 12 pounds of solid zinc. But if you were to walk into a liquor store with it, you can bet everyone would hit the floor."

Miniature machine gun

Just as intriguing are the library's samples of a current production miniature of a 1928 Thompson (about half scale). The baby submachine gun takes a drum magazine holding 20 rounds of .25-cal. bullets-and fires them automatically just like its big brother.

Can anyone buy them? Yes, if you're cleared by ATF for registration, and pay the \$200 fee required for ownership or transfer of an automatic weapon.

"Whenever an article appears on unusual guns, people call with questions about what's legal or illegal," Ed Owen notes. "We get letters saying things like: 'Hey! I've got one like that; what do I do about it?"

"The best thing to do," he says, "is contact the nearest ATF office, listed in the phone book under U.S. Government, Treasury ment."

Can possession of an unreported NFA weapon be made legal? Not for most. ATF may do one of several things (except for unregistered machine-gun types, which automatically are confiscated): 1. If the weapon can be rendered unserviceable, it may be so altered, enabling you to keep it and register it without fee. 2. ATF may require that you give it to an authorized museum. 3. ATF may confiscate the device. For different kinds of weapons, other alternatives are sometimes effected.

Many such weapons eventually are acquired by the ATF weapons library, or destroyed. "A lot of those we keep," says Owen, "are guns we can adapt to the tests we have to run."

What about rare weapons that find their way into the gun library? They will join the burgeoning array of guns in the reference collections, displayed on racks, mounts and galleries of the new quarters. "Our goal," says Ed Owen, "is to have at least one of every firearm ever made anywhere in the world. Obviously that's unachievable, but it's what we're shooting for on the long range."

but at the standard speed as well. The visible differences include a little more snow, a little more jitter and a little more sensitivity to tracking adjustment with the four-hour machines. And while tapes recorded at the standard two-hour VHS speed can be played back on any other VHS machine, some four-hour tapes won't reproduce properly on any but the same machine used for recording. The picture "breaks up" with very annoying black bars across the screen or with snow that can't be adjusted out.

Normally, small differences in tape speed between machines can be compensated for by a "tracking" control found on every VCR. This is easy to find—though its small knob is hard to grasp—on the Panasonic, RCA and GE machines, but it's almost completely hidden under the bottom of the front panel on the Sony machine. You also have to get used to turning the control a bit, then waiting to see if you've made a proper adjustment since the effect of this adjustment isn't instantaneous.

Few actual manufacturers

You may have noticed that Panasonic, RCA and GE recorders seem to share many features and, in the remarkably pictures, look alike. That's because they are all made by the same company-Matsushita, the giant Japanese corporate parent of Panasonic. In fact, Matsushita makes most VHS machines, including the VHS recorder sold by Quasar, another Matsushita subsidiary. JVC, which developed the VHS format, is also part of the Matsushita "family," but builds its machine independently.

Most Beta-format machines are built by Sony, so here, too, there are few differences among machines aside from labels and cosmetics. Some older Beta machines had mechanical clock-timer accessories on top of the machine; now most have integrated, electronic clocks.

There are differences among the machines in how convenient it is to use the clock/timers. In the Panasonic-type units, the clock is set by a three-position toggle switch. Push up, and the time changes quickly; push down, and it changes slowly until correct time is displayed. The center position is for normal operation.

The JVC recorder has a much more convenient time-setting system: one pushbutton advances the hours by one every time it is pushed. This way, you don't have to wait for the clock to cycle through a whole day to set it an hour earlier than it is

already set, and you take much less chance that you'll run right past the time you want to set and have to do it all over again.

The Beta machines' timers are like the JVC, with an added wrinkle: a Fast-Minutes button that saves wear and tear on the Minutes-Setting button (and your finger). The timer is also easier to read on the Beta and JVC machines because it is on their front panels. Mounted on the top surface of the Panasonic, RCA and GE recorders, the timer can be seen only if you're standing. That causes a lot of bobbing and weaving when you're waiting for a program to start before turning on the machine, or wondering how much longer a program will last.

For now, all the timers do is turn power on at a preset time so you can record a program while you're away. Once started, the tape keeps running until the tape runs out. Newer machines beginning to be available have more complex timing functions that let you program four different time segments for starting and stopping the recorder in an ensuing week.

The newer recorders also let you program the channel you want to record—something you can't do with the recorders we tested. Ours are set to the one station you want to record at the time you want to start recording—you can't program a series of stations at different times, even if the shows are consecutive.

Setup complications

Just tuning-in the stations you want to record—even when you're there to record them—can be a problem. Precise fine-tuning is needed to get the best possible picture, and the fine-tuning knobs on all VCRs we tested were tough to use. They're behind the station-selector knobs and have to be pushed and then turned. It takes a lot of dexterity.

Even before you fine-tune the recorder, you have to turn off the automatic fine-tuning control. You may spend more time looking for the AFT switch than you spend making the adjustment. On the Zenith unit, the AFT switch is hidden in the recess the channel-selector sits in, and on the Sony it's neatly hidden below the front panel's bottom edge.

Other controls are generally scattered about the top and front panels in no apparent order. The JVC is the exception; its controls are all on the front panel. Even so, you really have to study the machine you buy before you can get the most out of it—or use it at all. Read the instruction



manual carefully to make sure you've hooked the machine up properly. It's not as simple as connecting an audio tape recorder because television sets don't generally have a convenient tap for a video deck the way high-fidelity amplifiers have a tape-output jack. You have to connect the video deck between the antenna and the set, and you have to match the antenna to the recorder, then the recorder to the set. There are so many different antenna/set hookups that provisions have been made on all the recorders for all sorts of options, including cable TV.

You'll have to get used to the VCR's selector switch, too. In the TV position, the antenna signal is fed directly to the TV set. In the VCR position, this signal passes through the recorder's channel selector first. On some machines, this amounts to pretuning; you can leave your TV set tuned to channel 3 or 4 (choose which one on the VCR), and always use the tuner on the recorder to select a station. All that's required is that the VCR's power be on. Other VCRs can be used for pretuning only if they are in the Record mode. If the Record button isn't pushed, all you'll get is snow. The other time the VCR position of the selector switch is used, of course, is when you play back a tape.


Not all the tapes you play have to be tapes you make yourself. There is a wide variety of prerecorded video tape available from a dozen or so sources. There are specialists in sports tapes, feature movies, X-rated movies, old films and even transferring your Super 8 or regular 8-mm film or 35-mm slides to video tape—a service Fotomat now offers.

You might want to make your own "home movies" directly on your VCR, too. Color and black-and-white cameras are available for all the VCRs we tested, but pretty expensive. Black-and-white cameras cost \$250 and up; the least expensive color VCR camera goes for around \$800.

What price entertainment?

Even without a camera, the VCR can provide hours of entertainment with prerecorded tapes and with tapes you make off the air. (All manufacturers caution, though, that off-the-air recording may infringe on producers' copyrights. But with the precedents already set in audio recording, it's unlikely the courts will uphold prosecution for normal home use.) It's up to you to decide whether you'll get enough entertainment to justify a \$1000 investment.

his roller-skate scooter is fun both for tots too small to safely use skateboards and for older ones who ride at full speed. Since fixed wheels give it a limited turning radius, there is little danger of the scooter veering sharply. Kids hold onto the handle to help maintain balance and lean in the direction they want to turn.

Using scrap wood and an old pair of roller skates, you can make two of these scooters in short order. Separate the wheel assemblies from the skates and remove or cut off projections from the flat mounting plates. Drill three holes in each plate for attaching to the footboard.

Cut pieces itemized in the materials list from 1-in, scrap wood. Or modify dimensions to suit stock on hand and size of user. Round the lower edge of the handle post to ride over small obstacles. Slightly round and sand all edges.

Turn the handle grip from 11/8in.-dia. round stock. Glue the grip into the hole in the handle post, along with a plywood washer on both sides to strengthen assembly.

Draw a centerline on underside of the footboard to position the wheel assemblies but do not attach them yet. Locate the front wheels as close as possible to the handle slot. Position the rear wheels at the very end of the footboard. Hold a straightedge against the sides of a front and a rear wheel to keep the assemblies aligned while marking for screws. Make holes for the mounting screws with an awl, but don't install them.

Secure the handle post in the footboard slot with glue and dowels. Reinforce this joint at the four 90° corners by gluing in 21/2-in.-long pieces of 34x34-in. cove stock.

Sand assembly, round all sharp corners and fill dents with wood putty. Finish with exterior paint.

When paint dries, attach the wheel assemblies. Glue rubber padding to top of the footboard for nonslip footing.—Emery J. Loiselle



it also eliminates the usual flicker of fluorescence, which is recognized as a contributing factor to headaches, eyestrain, skin blemishes, fatigue-and has even been known to cause spasms in some epileptics.

Fluorescent tubes have also been found to emit radiation at the terminals, and any type of fluorescent should have shields over the ends of the tubes. In addition, the whole tube should not be enclosed under plastic or glass since any covering prevents the full spectrum from coming through. Egg-crate designs (with a small grid) cover the tubes but retain open spaces, thus reducing glare but passing ultraviolet and the rest of the spectrum.

School behavior affected

Just how bad limited-spectrum lighting is was markedly demonstrated with a group of first graders during the 1973-74 school year in Sarasota, Fla. The four classrooms in the trial were windowless, and thus all lighting was artificial. Two classrooms kept their conventional fluorescents, and two had full-spectrum lights installed, with shields to reduce radiation at the terminals.

Under the normal lighting some

first-graders demonstrated nervous fatigue, irritability, lapses of attention and hyperactivity. Yet when full-spectrum lighting was installed, these same children settled down and paid more attention to their teachers, who reported improved overall classroom performance.

Before the lighting was changed students were photographed by concealed cameras fiddling around, leaping from their seats, flailing arms and paying little attention.

After two and three months these children were filmed again. Their behavior was entirely different. The children were calmer and more interested in their work.

One little boy stood out in the earlier photographs because of his extreme hyperactivity. After the lighting was changed he became much quieter and was able to sit still long enough to concentrate. His teacher reported that he now was capable of doing independent work, had overcome what appeared to be a severe learning disability and learned how to read in a relatively short time. In those rooms where the lighting was not changed from standard fluorescence, there was no improvement in behavior.

Although this experiment appears to connect conventional fluorescents and possibly some leaking radiation to hyperactivity, it is likely that they are only one of the many causes. In San Francisco, allergist Dr. Ben Feingold has cured some hyperactive children by simply removing all synthetic additives from their diet-and some of these are artificial colors. It appears that the ingested color reacts with certain wavelengths of light in the environment and in some children produces adverse reactions. Even a single hot dog can cause a tantrum. What is probable is that some youngsters are more susceptible to certain conditions than others, and these tendencies are exacerbated by limited-spectrum lighting.

COLOR THERAPY—WHAT'S IT LIKE?

The idea that if someone would only shine a little light on me I would feel better not only struck me as bizarre, but downright foolish. How could healing be so simple? So with these misgivings, but, I admit, a predilection to methods of healing other than the strictly Western, I set out for an appointment with Neil Michelsen, lecturer in "holistic healing." "Color, Music and Body Energy" it says at the top of his literature.

Michelsen is a follower of the teachings of the late Dinshah P. Ghadiali, the author of a body of work on color therapy who was eventually stopped from sending his literature or apparatus through the mails by the Food and Drug

Administration 25 years ago.

It was agreed Michelson would demonstrate what he believes and teaches on my person. He first examined me for various body imbalances with a complex system of muscle testing called kinesiology. With an arm or leg in various positions, I would resist his opposing force. when he pushed, I would push back.

Things were going along quite well; then, with my arm held to my side, knuckles forward. I tried to push my arm away from my torso as Michelsen pushed my arm towards it. I couldn't do it. I felt as if I had no strength at all. "Your pancreas," he said matter of factly. "Let's see if we can change the situation."

He selected two sheets of brightlycolored plastic film and slapped them on a Bell & Howell overhead projector. With the light turned on, they added up to a brilliant violet. He asked me to stand in front of the machine and fixed the light so that it shone on my face and chest. Then he left the room for a few minutes.

When he returned, we tried the muscle test again. This time I was as strong as I had been in the other tests. pancreas is probably overactive," he said. "Have you had any junk food lately?" The night before I had overdosed on a midnight round of coffee cake.

The test proceeded until we hit another snag. Thyroid, he said. Orange was the winning combination this time. After a few minutes of orange treatment, the arm seemed to have the same strength that I had come to know and expect.

"Now let's try something else," Michel-

sen said, this time choosing filters that added up to a deep shade of indigo. After less than a minute of that, my arm seemed weaker than it had been in the first place. Orange, he explained, stimulates the thyroid; indigo turns it down.

Now get this: I have a sluggish thyroid. At times, I have been prescribed medicine by physicians to turn up its action. And yet in a few minutes, Michelsen had apparently determined something that usually requires a complicated and costly laboratory test. Not only that, he had seemingly corrected the condition.

Rather than leave me in the debilitated state, he put me under orange light again to stimulate my thyroid.

I am aware that the power of suggestion could have been at work. But then I hadn't known what the indigo treatment was supposed to do-whether I would end up Wonder Woman or Weak Wanda.

The mysterious filters turn out to be no more than the kind which are used for special effects in stage lighting. They are available from most theatrical lighting stores (or can be obtained from Rosco Laboratories, 36 Bush, Port Chester, N.Y. 10573). All 13 filters, which can be combined to produce the 12 colors of the Dinshah system, cost about \$2.50. It is not necessary to use a projector, Michelsen advises, although it does make it simple. A 10-watt bulb (white, not soft-pink) shining behind the filter is adequate.

How long would the effects of the color last? Unknown, he said, especially since the imbalances in the body are probably due to something we inflict on ourselves, and if we're not willing to take the corrective measure (stop eating too much sugar, salt or whatever), the imbalance will persist.

Michelsen's credentials show him to be past president of the New York City Chapter of something called the National Council for Geocosmic Research. He has recently moved shop from New York to San Diego. He stresses that he is not a color therapist, does not give color treatments, but only conducts workshops for interested parties who may take the information and do with it what they choose. Does it really work? Obviously, more research is needed to answer that question conclusively.-L.D.

And fewer cavities

Amazingly, those Florida firstgraders under full-spectrum lighting also developed significantly fewer cavities than the group who studied under conventional light. While the reason for the difference in tooth decay is unclear, animal research backs up these findings.

Intuitively we know that sunlight (which contains all the colors of the spectrum) imbues us with a sense of well-being. Several studies attest to the fact that being in the darkness decreases the red cell count of the blood, while exposure to light

increases it. In either event the blood tends to right itself when the light is stabilized—that is, when we are sometimes in the dark and sometimes in the light.

In some circumstances it appears conclusive that color can have healing properties. When an infant is born with jaundice, giving the skin a sickly yellow tinge, exposure to blue light may correct the condition, depending on the cause. The yellow apparent in the skin is the result of a high bilirubin level in the blood. (Bilirubin is a yellowish substance formed when the body breaks down hemoglobin, the red cell material that transports oxygen through the body.) Premature infants often have livers which are not equipped to deal with this problem, and jaundice is the result. If the level of bilirubin is too high, brain damage and cerebral palsy may result.

Light replaces transfusion

Previously, the only treatment possible was a complete transfusion, or exchange of blood, which obviously endangers the infant to some degree. Often repeat transfusions were necessary.

In 1958, an English doctor, Richard Cremer, accidentally discovered that the bilirubin level could be corrected with artificial blue light in the nursery for eight hours a day for five or six days. Today, the bluelight treatment is finally replacing the transfusions. While an initial transfusion may still be necessary, the light treatment has considerably reduced the need for additional ones. At some medical centers, including the Mount Sinai Hospital in New York City, full-spectrum fluorescent has been found to work nearly as well as blue light. The babies are kept under the fullspectrum fluorescent around the clock for a few days. Shields cover their eyes. (Yet, the lighting in the rest of the hospital is limited-spectrum fluorescent.)

Medicine makes some people react differently to the sun. The tetracyclines especially cause some people to burn more readily, and as a result the dosage required may be different if you are wintering in sunny climes.

The profound effect of sunlight on human beings can be appreciated from the fact that its total absence can make a woman temporarily infertile. It happens to Eskimos who live near the Arctic Circle during the dark winter days when their land is unrelieved by sunlight.

If light is somehow related to behavior and the female's ability to conceive, might it also influence the sex of her offspring? Well, it appears to do so in chinchillas. In 1970 statistics compiled over five years by more than 2000 ranchers demonstrated that the ratio of females to males could be altered by the color of light under which they lived. Chinchillas, when bred under ordinary incandescent lightingsuch as plain light bulbs-have litters averaging 60 to 75 percent male; when the bulbs were changed to "daylight" bulbs-which have a transparent bluish glass-the ratio of females to males reverses. So, in this case, blue is for girls.

Pink light irritates

We are not suggesting that if you want a boy you replace your bedroom bulbs with pink bulbs; in fact, pink light produces irritability and tension when it is installed in offices to provide a softer feeling, according to light expert John Ott.

In one informal study at the University of South Florida, Ott remembers, three college students out of 300 were found to be "disturbed." All three wore the pinklens glasses so much in fashion.

In laboratory tests, pink fluorescent lighting kept on for 12 hours a day over a period of six months caused the tails of mice gradually to slough off. This group had the lowest survival rate as compared to mice kept under various types of fluorescent. Survival was highest under daylight—full-spectrum—fluorescent.


Plant life is similarly affected by color. Generally, long-wave light (red, orange) appears to accelerate plant growth, while short-wave (green, blue, violet) retards it. Plants that bloom during the long days of summer sunlight are found to grow tallest when exposed to orange-red light; they did not bloom at all under yellow, green or blue light, although they did produce heavy foliage. Morning glories, however, which open before dawn, do best under blue and fail under red.

Fish that spend their lives in aquariums thrive if a black light, the safe ultraviolet, is kept on at least part of the day. It not only prevents a disease known as "popeye" but also puts a stop to the finnipping that is common among aquarium fish. Some fish cannot be kept alive in captivity without the added black light.

Although discos and nightclubs often use this kind of lighting for effect rather than health (it makes white glow in the dark), those who

frequent them may be doing themselves a bit of good. At one Chicago seafood restaurant, according to Ott, the ultraviolet light was added many years ago for special effects. When the owner was queried about the health of the employees, he revealed that they generally got along extremely well, were seldom ill, and that he had the same waiters who had been there when the lights were installed-18 years before.

Although most of us are aware

that there are some colors we are attracted to and some we shun, does color elicit physiological changes that can be measured? That was the question Robert Gerard set out to answer a few years ago when he was working on his doctorate at the University of California at Los Angeles. His research confirmed intuition: Red does excite, blue does soothe. He did detailed studies of blood pressure, the conductivity of the palm that indicates the arousal of the autonomic nervous system, respiration rate, heartbeat, muscle activity, eyeblinks and brain waves.

He asked the subjects how they felt.

The more anxious the subject, the more red disturbed them. Blood pressure, eyeblinks, palm conductivity and breathing rate went up under red, down under blue. No difference was found in heartbeat, but there was in brain-wave activity. While the brain showed an immediate response to red, white and blue (the only colors used in the experiments), after 10 minutes the activity remained consistently greater for red than for blue. White elicited a response similar to red.

Restaurateurs for years have known that vivid red tends to make diners psychologically outgoing and expansive, and they use it in the decor of many posh eating places. How many more times have you seen red goblets, red tablecloths and red-flocked wallpaper than, say, yellow or green in restaurants? Yellow is thought to depress appetite.

Darell Boyd Harmon, a design consultant more interested in the effect of interiors than their appearance, discovered more than 40 years ago that the soft, warm colors in the red family, such as peach, tan and the light emitted from warm fluorescence are conducive to intellectual pursuits and would be good choices in schools, libraries and any other study centers. His extensive work in schools was done for the Texas State Health Dept.

Locker-room strategy

Soft, cool colors, Harmon found, such as green, blue-green and the light from cool fluorescence induce movement and would be ideal in a gym. However, the deeper, brighter blues have a tendency to orient a person inward, just as deep and vivid red tones energize. The knowledge that red impels people to action has been put to use by some school athletic coaches: They have their locker rooms painted vivid red, the visitors' a low-energy blue.

The tendency today, however, is still to play down the importance of color and concentrate solely on assuring adequate brightness. But the brightness needed to combat the dark walls that decorators make popular every other decade may actually impede your concentration. Think how often you close your eyes to solve a complex problem or comprehend difficult material: you are blocking out all visual stimulation which may be distracting. Color should be directed to help your concentration, not fight against it.

As our knowledge of the full role that color and 'ight play in our lives becomes more comprehensive, the improvements may be dramatic. PM



verbial bit to enter this market; you can almost count on the wily Germans to start pumping out Rabbit-based pickups sometime in this calendar year, now that the Westmoreland, Pa., plant is in operation and the stiff U.S. commercial-vehicle import duty can thus be avoided.

A prototype of this long-eared Bunny-Truck was spotted hopping around the Detroit area even before last Easter.

Finally, everyone in Motor City is humping to get an economical minivan on the market, and the advent of front-wheel-drive technology in Big Three trick bags is just the impetus that the idea has needed. Chrysler had domestic-built frontdrive on the U.S. market first with Omni/Horizon and could do a minivan version if and when its tight budget permits; but look for GM to be there first, possibly by the '81 model year, with front-drive Nova series mechanicals. Ford, however, with a front-drive Pinto replacement due for 1981, could be a surprise winner with a mini-van version if it can get the little devil out on the road simultaneously with the new car.





after setting them inside the press.

For maximum squeezing pressure, you may consider wrapping a length of cable over the last rib. This is an extra security measure to guard against the wood screws not holding due to the great pressure created.

Make the cider collection board of plywood 1/2 x28x35 in. Border it with 1x2s, allowing a 11/2-in. break for a spout. Apply polyurethane varnish to all pieces. When not needed for juicing, the press can serve as an end table.

Building the grinder

Have a machinist mill keyways to engage sprocket wheel and pulley. Weld hub. Bend and weld the 3/32-in. key stock to the wheel. This key stock will be shredding the apples at grinding time.

Align and mount the pillow-block



a combination of gravity and torque which keeps the belt tight.

Cut four $\frac{3}{8}$ x 12 x 13-in. plywood pieces (L in the main drawing on page 192), then cut out space indicated for the wheel and exit channel in the second and third pieces. The channel can have a removable section to make the exit large enough for treating fruits like coarse-stemmed grapes. Cut a $2\frac{1}{2}$ -in. hole in the fourth plywood piece for the sprocket-wheel hub. The

Attach hooks for holding prelaundered feed-bag-size burlap bags. When the apples are fed into the hopper the sprocket wheel behind the hopper shreds them and discharges the pulp into the burlap bag, ready to be squeezed in the press.


The gusset-reinforced sawhorse is built to hold up under heavy loads and is ideal for supporting the cider press or grinder units. Cut gussets and top from 1x6 stock. Use screws and white glue to assemble.

APPLE BUTTER

This is an excellent way to use apple pulp remaining after preparation of apple juice.

- 2 quarts cooked apple pulp
- 4 cups sugar
- 2 teaspoons ground cinnamon
- 1 teaspoon ground ginger
- 1/4 teaspoon ground cloves

Press pulp through a sieve or food mill. Measure pulp, add sugar and spices to two quarts of pulp, and cook about 15 minutes until flavors have blended. Stir frequently. If mixture becomes too thick, add a small amount of water until you have the desired consistency. Pour it hot into hot canning jars, leaving a ¼-in. airspace at the top. Adjust caps. Let soak about 10 minutes in a boilingwater bath. Yield: five pints.



first plywood piece will hold the front-side hopper. This plywood is removable for cleaning.

Now you can make and mount the rooftop bin and the hopper chute. The rooftop keeps handy the apples to be put in the hopper. The apples will need prodding into the hopper with a small board.

After construction is finished, polyurethane-varnish all wood pieces.

Allow the bit guide to extend at least 3/16 in. above the guide holder for "dialing" drill sizes.

■ Use a wood sealer to keep surfaces dirt-free.

■ To avoid enlarging the holes and destroying their accuracy during use, insert bits fully into the guide before operating your electric drill or hand drill.







good pickup and passing power compared with other diesel automobiles. We formerly owned a Mercedes 240D."

And another traditional diesel bugaboo that goes by the boards is cold-weather starting and driveability. "I have to wait about one minute on cold mornings for the glowplugs to warm up, "states a Michigan tugboat captain, "but after that there's no wait for engine warmup."

An Illinois kindergarten teacher adds, "The automatic glowplug system is much easier to use than on our previous 220D. And the factoryinstalled block heater is great. We had no starting problems all winter."

An Illinois retired fireman discloses, "The engine is a leetle noisy on a cold start, but nothing objectionable. After a short warm-up, there's very little noise. Driving down to Florida recently, I had all the windows shut, and at normal highway cruising speeds, I could hardly hear the engine at all. There's really only one problem with the car. When I stopped for fuel, everyone wanted to look under the hood, including truckers."

no mechanical problems at all with their cars (53.9 percent). Among those who did, though, 32.2 percent cited oil leaks. Many were the normal sorts of leaks not specific to diesel engines—at the rocker covers, for example. But others were traced to the oil cooler—a diesel add-on—and to an early type of oil-fill cap. At sustained high speeds, crankcase pressure would force oil up the oil-fill tube and past the cap. Both problems have been corrected in later models.

There was also a defect in early fuel injectors that allowed leakage and inaccurate metering. We heard a few complaints about that, too, but again we're assured the problem was one of those early bugs that soon got worked out by the Olds factory.

On the topic of diesel-fuel availability, we received mixed opinions. An Illinois farmer said, for example, "Not too many stations yet offer diesel fuel. I'm forced to travel to truck stops, where I receive a poor second at the pumps. After all, I'm only buying a maximum of 27.5 gallons while the trucks are tanking up with hundreds of gallons."

However, a California apartment house owner counters, "The car comes with a U.S. guide to diesel stations, and it lists one here in my town. A search of the city turned up four more that weren't listed. If the same holds true for other towns and cities, I don't believe anyone has to worry about finding diesel fuel. I was a bit apprehensive when we bought the car, and it would be to everyone's advantage if GM could list all diesel stations."

Comfort received a good round of applause, with owners commenting favorably on spaciousness, seating front and rear, and riding qualities. Tall drivers praised front-seat legroom, and families told us there was ample space for six.

A few owners voiced concern about having to eventually jump-start their cars. The diesel uses two 12-volt batteries, so some owners assume it has a 24-volt starter. Not so; it's just an H-D 12-volt.

Too, we noted a few comments on the Olds diesel's 3000-mile oilchange recommendation. Lots of drivers have gotten used to longer intervals, and considering that many diesel owners rack up lots of miles per month (e.g. traveling salesmen), 3000 miles sometimes roll around in a big hurry.

We asked owners to make sugges-



tions that might improve Olds diesels in the future. Fully 25.4 percent recommended no changes at allthat the car be left as is. Here, though, are some of the suggested improvements offered by the rest:

'Possibly turbocharge the diesel," recommends a Wisconsin farm manager. "Make a full set of gauges available," suggests a Michigan "Re-engineer manufacturer's rep. fuel tank so it doesn't slosh over at every refill."-Texas maintenance mechanic. "Smooth out the shifts in the automatic transmission."-Illinois CPA.

In summing up, a Nebraska farmer's view of his car is typical of a great number of other owners. "I believe this is the greatest car to come out of Detroit in a long time," he writes, "and I think it will be the forerunner of a whole new generation of American luxury cars. The perfomance of the Olds diesel, the style and comfort are all first-rate. 

Resmatic controlled-descent harness developed by Dr. J. Nigel Ellis of Wilmington, Del., in which a wire reel lowers you at a constant 3-ft .per-second maximum rate.

Smoke detectors vital

But your immediate objective, if you don't yet have them, is one or more smoke detectors. There are two types-ionization and photoelectric; some are wired into house circuits, others plug in or are powered by batteries.

Plug-in or battery ESDs are simple to hang from brackets near ceilings. Experts generally prefer permanent wiring connections, and some communities now permit you to make your own hookup if you know how. "If you can convince us, we give you a permit, and after the job's done we send an inspector to see it," says Farmers Branch Marshal Dyer.

What about heat detectors and

fire extinguishers?

Heat detectors (HDs) are considered very reliable, and automatic heat-activated extinguishers over your furnace, workbench and car. experts say, provide great protection.

But HDs have not been designed to give you a quick alarm if fire breaks out somewhere else in the house. Thus, ESDs are being built into HD units: You get HD reliability plus ESD ability to sense smoke drifting in from other rooms.

Fire extinguishers are handy, and can deal adequately with many small daytime fires. "But if fire ever wakes you up at night," warns one expert, "don't waste time with an extinguisher. Get everybody out!"


If you are an apartment dweller, "Pull the little red alarm box and get the hell out," says another "Time spent with an expert. extinguisher is better spent waking people up!"

Experts say some modern condominiums and town houses are no safer than most single-family homes. In one town house fire recently, fire started in the usual first-floor garage. There was only one escape stairway for 100 units.

Luckily, it was a daytime fire and all got out. But its management has since ordered 40 "downspout type"

escape ladders!



SLIP-JOINT PLIERS

Though there are probably special-purpose pliers for almost any gripping task, the old reliable slip-joint pliers is undoubtedly the most familiar-looking and versatile gripping tool you can own.


The term "slip-joint" means the jaw pivot can be adjusted to two (or more) positions—to suit different-size pieces of work—by simply sliding the jaws apart or

Here, the pliers hold a nut while screwdriver is used to turn the bolt.




You can use tool's crimping jaw to bend or cut a wire, or to straighten a nail.

together. The pliers' jaw consists of three different usable surfaces:

1. The straight jaw—usually with fine serrations, but which can also be smooth. These are used when a pinching action is needed on small objects such as holding a small brad while you start driving it with a hammer. 2. The curved jaw which has rugged looking teeth that will provide a sure grip on

irregular pieces, and for extra power when you have to securely grasp and shift a stubborn object.


3. The crimper—that portion of the jaw nearest the pivot point. As the name suggests, this is used for any crimping chore such as for closing an electric terminal connection. The crimper can also be used to straighten out kinked wire and bent nails and for cutting light-gauge wire such as aluminum and soft copper.

Though pliers can hold a nut while you turn a screw or bolt with screwdriver, don't mistake the pliers for a wrench. For safety reasons, the latter should be of pliers-when used—instead tightening or loosening a stubborn nut. Under extreme pressure pliers can slip off the nut-easier than you might suspect—with resultant severe damage to knuckles and or fingers. When using a pair of pliers to hold a nut that might scratch or burr, it is a good idea to wrap electrician's or friction tape around the nut for the pliers' jaws to grip. The tape will prevent unwanted scratches.

When you want to hold a workpiece with pliers, grip the object with the teeth—as close to the pivot point as possible—to get the maximum handle squeeze.

Do make it your practice to use your pliers for its intended purpose. Do not try to increase leverage by adding pipe "helpers," or the like, to extend handles. If your pliers lack insulating sleeves, you can create a cushioned handle by slipping rubber tubing over the handles.

If the teeth in your pliers become worn or damaged you can restore them by filing with a three-square file. Keep your pliers clean. Every so often, wipe it with a light coat of oil to prevent rust and work in a drop or two of oil around the pivot pin.
