The syslog server logs the messages for the administrator's use. Some of the generated messages are for informational purposes only and do not require any action. Other messages indicate a caution or error condition that may require action.

2 Console Messages

%CLI-E-FAILED, Execution failed for "command"

Explanation:

An error occurred when the specified command was executed.

Recommended Action:

Another error follows this error message, which indicates the actual cause of the error. Examine the subsequent error message and fix the problem accordingly.

%CLI-E-IVNUMBER, invalid numerical value

Explanation:

The numerical value specified is not valid.

Recommended Action:

Verify the numerical value and re-enter command with a valid number.

%CLI-E-INCMPCMD, incomplete command – aborting

Explanation:

The command is incomplete. It is either missing a parameter value or a required option.

Recommended Action:

Specify a complete command with the missing parameter.

%CLI-E-IVNUMLOLIMIT, numerical value <number> is lower than acceptable.

Explanation:

The numerical value specified is smaller than acceptable.

Recommended Action:

Verify the numerical value and re-enter the command with a valid number.

%CLI-E-IVMACADDR, invalid MAC address

Explanation:

An invalid MAC address has been specified.

Recommended Action:

%CLI-E-IVIPADDR, invalid IP address <IP address>

Explanation:

An invalid IP address is specified.

Recommended Action:

Specify an IP address of the form x.x.x.x where x must be between 0-255.

%CLI-E-IVIPADDR MASK, invalid IP address or mask

Explanation:

An IP address and mask pair in which the address and/or mask is invalid has been specified. Depending on the command, the mask may be a network mask or filtering mask. The mask can be described using the traditional IP address syntax (255.0.0.0) or the CIDR syntax (/8). For example, the following two parameters are equivalent, 10.1.0.0/255.255.0.0 or 10.1.0.0/16.

Recommended Action:

Specify a valid IP address and mask pair.

%CLI-E-IVPORTNAME, syntax error in port name <port_name>

Explanation:

The port name is invalid.

Recommended Action:

Ensure that the port name specified (e.g., et.2.2, gi.1.1) is valid and that it is physically present.

%CONFIG-I-SAVED, configuration saved to Startup configuration

Explanation:

The active configuration has been saved to the Startup configuration.

Recommended Action:

Informational message. No action necessary.

%CONFIG-E-STARTUP FULL, no more free space in startup file

Explanation:

The startup file if fully loaded and has come to its maximum capacity.

Recommended Action:

Delete one or more commands from the startup file or delete it completely.

Are you sure you want to overwrite the Startup configuration [no]?

Explanation:

Prompt, asking the user whether he wants to overwrite the startup configuration. Displayed when the user types a command for saving active configuration to the startup file.

Recommended Action:

None.

vfs	process	cat:	Cannot	open	/int-flash/c	fg/startur

Explanation:

This message alerts the user that no startup file exists.

Recommended Action:

Informational message. No action necessary.

Startup configuration for the next system reboot

Explanation:

This message is displayed before printing the startup configuration.

Recommended Action:

None.

RCLI init - error initializing password. RCLI will not run.

Explanation:

The system was unable to initialize default values for the different passwords.

Recommended Action:

Reboot the device.

RCLI system init - error initializing timer. RCLI will not run.

Explanation:

The system was unable to initialize default value for the timer.

Recommended Action:

Reboot the device.

CLIG_system_init: Unable to alloc private params ARR

Explanation:

Memory allocation problem.

Recommended Action:

Check if the device has enough memory and reboot it.

RCLI timeout exceeded

Explanation:

No password was entered within a period of time. Therefore, the RCLI session was interrupted.

Recommended Action:

Try to log on to the RCLI again using the command 'rs'.

Invalid Password

Explanation:

The user has entered an invalid password when trying to access one of the modes, which require one.

Recommended Action:

Re-enter the password.

RCLIG system init2 - Failed to create chunk Array

Explanation:

Memory problem.

Recommended Action:

Verify that the device has enough memory and reboot it.

RCLIG_system_init2 - Failed to create active DB

Explanation:

Memory problem while trying to allocate the active configuration database.

Recommended Action:

Verify that the device has enough memory and reboot it.

RCLIG_system_init2 - Failed to create scratchpad DB

Explanation:

Memory problem while trying to allocate the scratchpad configuration database.

Recommended Action:

Verify that the device has enough memory and reboot it.

RCLIP system noPasswordPrintout1(2)

Explanation:

No default password exists when entering a given mode.

Recommended Action:

None.

Running system configuration:

Explanation:

This message is displayed before printing the system configuration

Recommended Action:

None.

The problem is the <parameter_name> parameter

Explanation:

Message, showing which of the input parameters is invalid (name or value).

Recommended Action:

None.

3 Configuration Messages

%CONFIG-I-ERASED Startup configuration file erased

Explanation:

The Startup configuration file is erased.

Recommended Action:

Informational Message. No action necessary.

%CONFIG-I-NOCONFIG Startup configuration file is empty

Explanation:

The user is attempting to examine the active configuration of the system but the system has no configuration.

Recommended Action:

Informational Message. No action necessary.

%CONFIG-I-NOCONFIG, the running system has no configuration

Explanation:

The user is attempting to examine the active configuration of the system but the system has no configuration.

Recommended Action:

Informational Message. No action necessary.

%CONFIG-I-NOCHANGES, there are no non-committed changes

Explanation:

The user is attempting to examine the non-committed commands in the scratchpad and there are not any.

Recommended Action:

Informational Message. No action necessary.

%CLI-W-CHANGES, Uncommitted configuration changes exist, Are you sure you want to exit [no]?

Explanation:

The user is attempting to log off or exit but there are non-committed configuration changes in the scratchpad.

Recommended Action:

Commit the changes.

%CONFIG-W-NOCOMMIT, Changes in Scratchpad not committed to the running system

Explanation:

This warning message is displayed when you want to exit Configure mode after making configuration changes but did not commit the changes. The non-committed changes will not have any effect on the running system. They will stay in the Scratchpad until you commit them or erase the scratchpad.

Recommended Action:

Commit the changes if you want them to affect the running system.

%CONFIG-E-DUPLICATE, Command is already in the active configuration, ignored...

Explanation:

The user is attempting to enter a configuration command that is already in the active configuration. In other words, the same configuration command is entered again.

Recommended Action:

None.

%CONFIG-E-NOMATCH, No matching command found

Explanation:

The user is attempting to negate a command (using "no...") but the specified command doesn't exist in the active configuration.

Recommended Action:

Verify you have entered the command to be negated correctly. You can also use the *negate* command together with a command number.

%SYS-E-UNSUPPORTEDCOPY, Copying from <source> to <destination> is not supported in current version.

Explanation:

This error message appears when the user attempts to perform a copy operation, which is not supported in the current version.

Recommended Action:

Ensure that the <source> - <destination> path is supported and the copy operation can be performed.

%SYS-E-ILLEGALCOPY, Copying from <source> to <destination is not allowed.

Explanation:

This error message appears when the user attempts to perform an illegal copy operation from the specified source to the given destination.

Recommended Action:

Ensure that the copy source and destination are compatible.

4 Filters Messages

%L2TM-I-CLI-ACK, Successful gos set I2 registration

Explanation:

This message is displayed as acknowledgment of a successfully completed qos set 12 configuration command.

Recommended Action:

None.

%CLI-E-TABLEFULL, table is full

Explanation:

This message appears when the maximum number of aggregate policies has been reached.

Recommended Action:

Negate unused aggregate-generations.

%CLI-E-MAXLEN, '%.26s' exceeded maximum length of %d characters

Explanation:

The interface name is too long.

Recommended Action:

Ensure that the interface names are not excessive in length.

%CLI-E-IVMACADDR, invalid MAC address '%s' format 'XX:XX:XX:XX:XX'

Explanation:

An invalid MAC address has been specified.

Recommended Action:

Re-enter a proper MAC address. The format of the MAC address should be xx:xx:xx:xx:xx:xx

%CLI-E-MISSOPTION, parser error - missing required option 'dest-mac'

Explanation:

One of the required CLI command options is missing (dest-mac).

Recommended Action:

Re-enter the command with the appropriate option (dest-mac).

%CLI-E-PARSENOOPT, parser error - missing required option 'name'

Explanation:

One of the required CLI command options is missing (name).

Recommended Action:

Re-enter the command with the appropriate option (name).

%CLI-E-NOOPTVAL, missing required value for option 'vlan'

Explanation:

One of the required CLI command options is missing (vlan).

Recommended Action:

Re-enter the command with the appropriate option (vlan).

%CLI-E-IVNUMTOOHI, '%d' is higher than the acceptable range (1-4096)

Explanation:

The numerical value specified is higher than acceptable.

Recommended Action:

Verify the numerical value and re-enter the command with a valid number.

%CLI-E-IVNUMTOOLOW, '%d' is lower than the acceptable range (1-%d)

Explanation:

The numerical value specified is smaller than acceptable.

Recommended Action:

Verify the numerical value and re-enter the command with a valid number.

%CLI-E-MISSOPTION, missing one of these required options: <option_name>

Explanation:

One of the required CLI command options is missing.

Recommended Action:

Re-enter the command with the appropriate option.

5 GVRP/GARP Messages

%GVRP-I-STOPPED, GVRP has been stopped

Explanation:

This message is displayed when GVRP is disabled globally on the device.

Recommended Action:

Informational Message. No action necessary.

%GVRP-I-DYN_VLAN_DISABLED, Dynamic VLAN has been disabled

Explanation:

This message is displayed when Dynamic VLAN Creation is disabled. This means that dynamic vlan creation by gvrp is not permitted anymore.

Recommended Action:

Informational Message. No action necessary.

%GVRP-I-STARTED, GVRP has been started

Explanation:

This message is displayed when GVRP is enabled globally on the device.

Recommended Action:

Informational Message. No action necessary.

%GVRP-I-DYN_VLAN_ENABLED, Dynamic VLAN has been enabled

Explanation:

This message is displayed when Dynamic VLAN creation is enabled. This means that dynamic vlan creation by gvrp is allowed.

Recommended Action:

Informational Message. No action necessary.

%GARP-I-TIMER_SET, GARP timers set. Leaveall = <number>, Leave = <number>, Join = <number>

Explanation:

This message displays the current values of the various garp timers. This message is displayed after a new value was set to one of the garp timers.

Recommended Action:

Informational Message. No action necessary.

%GARP-E-BAD_TIMERS, Wrong GARP timer values. Timers should satisfy the following relationship: Leave >= Join * 3 and LeaveAll > Leave

Explanation:

This error message is displayed when the user attempts to set timer's values, which do not satisfy the desired relationship between the timers.

Recommended Action:

Set values that satisfy the following relationship: Leave >= Join * 3 and LeaveAll > Leave

%GVRP-E-REG_MODE, Cannot set registrar mode on a port that is not gvrp enabled

Explanation:

This error message is displayed when the user attempts to set registrar mode on a port, that is not gvrp enabled. The operation is aborted.

Recommended Action:

Enable gvrp on the port or set registrar mode only on ports that are gvrp-enabled.

GVRP is not enabled globally. No statistics available.

Explanation:

This error message is displayed when the user attempts to watch gvrp statistics while gvrp is not enabled globally on the device.

Recommended Action:

Enable gvrp globally on the device.

Time <number> is invalid

Explanation:

This error message is displayed when the user tries to set invalid numerical value.

Recommended Action:

Set a valid numerical value.

Time <number> is not in the acceptable range

Explanation:

This error message is displayed when the user attempts to set a value to one of the garp timers, which is not in the acceptable range.

Recommended Action:

For LeaveAll timer - set value in the range: 5000-180000

For Leave timer - set value in the range: 600-30000

For Join timer - set value in the range: 200-10000

6 Interface Messages

%INTERFACE-I-CREATEDIF, Interface <Interface_name> was successfully created

Explanation:

This message is displayed when an interface has been successfully created by the "interface create" command.

Recommended Action:

Informational Message. No action necessary.

%INTERFACE-I-REMOVEDIF, Interface <Interface_name> was successfully removed

Explanation:

This message is displayed when the negation of an "interface create" command has completed successfully.

Recommended Action:

Informational Message. No action necessary.

%INTERFACE-E-IPADDREXISTS The IP address <IP_address> is already configured on interface <Interface_name>

Explanation:

This message is displayed when the user is trying to configure the same address twice on the system. This is not allowed.

Recommended Action:

Remove the command, which generated this error from the configuration.

%INTERFACE-E-EXISTS Interface < Interface name > has already been created. Please use another name for the interface.

Explanation:

This message is displayed when the user is attempting to create an interface with a name which is already being used by another interface.

Recommended Action:

Use another name for the interface being created.

%INTERFACE-E-BADPORT The specified port <port number> is illegal. Please check the port name and try again.

Explanation:

This error message should not appear.

Recommended Action:

Contact RTAC.

%INTERFACE-E-BADVLAN The specified VLAN does not exist.

Explanation:

This message is displayed when the user has specified a VC to be applied to an interface when a VC is already applied to the interface.

Recommended Action:

Verify the port name.

%INTERFACE-E-IFVLANEXISTS, There is already an IP interface called <Interface name> on VLAN <VLAN name>. A VLAN can be bound to only one L3 interface for each protocol.

Explanation:

This message is displayed when the user attempts to create an IP/IPX interface on a VLAN that already has an IP interface association. As the message text states, only one L3 interface can be associated with a VLAN for each type of protocol.

Recommended Action:

Specify a different interface type/name for the given VLAN.

VLAN <VLAN name>. Please use the -vlan- option of the -interface createcommand instead of the -port- option.

Explanation:

When an interface is created using the interface create... port portname command, a VLAN is created for the interface, and the port is added to the VLAN. If the port is an access port and is already on a VLAN for the type of interface being created, then it cannot be added to another VLAN.

Recommended Action:

Use the interface create... vlan < vlanname > version of the command to bind the interface to the VLAN, which contains the desired port.

7 IGMP Snooping Messages

%IGMP-I-SNOOP-	STARTED Igmr	L2 Snooping	Started

Explanation:

This message is displayed when Layer 2 IGMP Snooping service is started.

Recommended Action:

None.

%IGMP-I-SNOOP Igmp L2 Snooping Stopped

Explanation:

This message is displayed when Layer 2 IGMP Snooping service is stopped.

Recommended Action:

None.

%IGMP-E-INV_VLAN <1> <VLAN_name> is not found

Explanation:

This message is displayed if an attempt is made to set parameters for VLAN based IGMP on an invalid VLAN.

Recommended Action:

Verify specified VLAN.

%IGMP-E-GENERR

Explanation:

This message appears when the general error occurred.

Recommended Action:

This message may appear either because of wrong number of parameters or because of SNMP operation failure.

%IGMP-E-OVERLAP L2 IGMP <port list> Invalid Ports

Explanation:

This message is displayed if an attempt is made to set parameters for VLAN based IGMP snooping with a portlist that contains both permanent and filter ports.

Recommended Action:

Only specify either filter or permanent ports in the command for setting VLAN based IGMP snooping.

%IGMP-E-INV COMM - router and leave timeout are set together only

Explanation:

This message is displayed if an attempt is made to set only one of the timeouts above.

Recommended Action:

Specify either both or none of the timeout in the command.

8 IP Messages

%IP-I-ROUTEDELETED, Route to <IP address> via gateway <IP_address> was successfully deleted

Explanation:

This message indicates that a route entry was deleted.

Recommended Action:

This message is informational only. No action is necessary.

%IP-I-ROUTEADDED, Route to <IP address> via gateway <IP address> was successfully added

Explanation:

This message indicates that a route entry was added.

Recommended Action:

This message is informational only. No action is necessary.

%RIP-E-IFNOTFOUND, <Interface name> is not a known interface

Explanation:

A RIP parameter has been configured for an interface that does not exist.

Recommended Action:

Use a valid interface.

%IPHELPER-E-NOSUCHIF, No such interface: <Interface name>

Explanation:

This error message appears when the user specifies a helper address for a nonexistent interface.

Recommended Action:

Specify a helper address on an existing interface.

%RIP-E-IFNOTFOUND, <interface name> is not a known interface.

Explanation:

A RIP parameter has been configured for an interface that does not exist.

Recommended Action:

Use a valid interface.

%RIP-E-NOSUCHTASK, RIP Task does not exist.

Explanation:

The user attempted to display RIP information. However, RIP is not running.

Recommended Action:

Either RIP has not been started, or RIP was started but the routing configuration is invalid. Refer to error messages that were displayed after the configuration changes were made active.

%ARP-E-HOSTUNREACH <IP address> no route to host. ARP entry not added.

Explanation:

This message displays when an ARP entry is added from the Enable mode and the action failed.

Recommended Action:

The host may not be unreachable through a directly connected interface. Create an interface and then add the ARP entry.

%STATIC-E-ROUTEEXISTS Static route to network <name> already exists.

Explanation:

A static route has been added multiple times.

Recommended Action:

Remove the duplicate static route entries.

9 Layer 2 Table Manager Messages

%L2TM-I-MAP NOAPPLY, Map <map name> is now not applied on ports <port list>

Explanation:

This message is displayed when the mapping (priority-map) is deactivated on ports.

Recommended Action:

Informational Message. No action necessary.

%L2TM-I-MAP APPLIED, Map <map name > is now applied on ports <port list>

Explanation:

This message is displayed when the mapping (priority-map) is activated on ports.

Recommended Action:

Informational Message. No action necessary.

%L2TM-I-MAP CREATED, Map <map name> created

Explanation:

This message is displayed when the mapping (priority-map) is created.

Recommended Action:

Informational Message. No action necessary.

%L2TM-I-MAP PRIO ON, port priorities maps are Disabled. All ports are in their standard/default priorities.

Explanation:

This message is displayed when the mapping (priority-map) is disabled.

Recommended Action:

Informational Message. No action necessary.

%L2TM-I-MAP PRIO OFF, Port priorities maps are Enabled. All ports are in their respective applied priorities.

Explanation:

This message is displayed when the mapping (priority-map) is enabled.

Recommended Action:

Informational Message. No action necessary.

%L2TM-E MAP APPLY, Map cannot be applied on ports <port list>

Explanation:

This message is displayed when an attempt to apply the priority to ports has failed.

Recommended Action:

This message can be caused by ports already assigned to priority. This error message is followed by a %L2TM-E-GENERAL and has an explanation.

%L2TM-E-NOREMOVE, Map cannot be removed because it is applied on ports and/or SmartTRUNKs. Please remove port pointing to this map before removing map.

Explanation:

This message is displayed when trying to remove map while it is applied on ports.

Recommended Action:

Remove ports assigned to this map before removing the map.

%L2TM-E-ILLEGAL1PPRIORITYMAP, Priority Map is illegal

Explanation:

This message is displayed when the failed Priority Map is illegal.

Recommended Action:

Try a different mapping based on the limitation.

%L2TM-E-GENERAL

Explanation:

This message is a general error and can describe different cases depending on the scenario.

Recommended Action:

Follow instructions in the error descriptions.

10 Layer 3 ACL Messages

%ACL-E-IFNOTFOUND, <interface name>: no such interface.

Explanation:

The user is trying to apply an ACL to a non-existent interface.

Recommended Action:

Create the interface first before applying the ACL.

%ACL-E-PARAMMISSING Parameter missing

Explanation:

This message appears when the user types the command with a missing parameter.

Recommended Action:

Check the command format and type in all parameters.

%ACL-E-WRONGDIRECTION Wrong direction

Explanation:

This message appears when the user specifies direction is neither <input> nor <output>

Recommended Action:

Make sure that you provide a valid direction.

%ACL-E-WRONGPORT Wrong port <port_number>

Explanation:

This message appears when the user specifies a wrong port number.

Recommended Action:

Make sure that you type in a valid port number.

%CLI-E-FAILED, Execution failed for "no acl"

Explanation:

This message indicates that an ACL could not be deleted.

Recommended Action:

This ACL is applied to ports/interfaces. First remove it from all ports/interfaces, which it is applied to and then delete it.

%CLI-E-FAILED, Execution failed for "acl"

Explanation:

This message indicates that an ACL could not be modified.

Recommended Action:

This ACL is applied to some ports/interfaces. First remove it from all ports/interfaces, which it is applied to and then modify it.

%ACL-E-NOMODIFY, ACL <name> is currently in use by other commands -- delete these references before deleting this ACL

Explanation:

This message indicates that an ACL could not be deleted.

Recommended Action:

This ACL is applied to ports/interfaces. First remove it from all ports/interfaces, which it is applied to and then delete it.

%ACL-E-NOMEM processing error - insufficient memory

Explanation:

This message appears when network load exceeds system capacity.

Recommended Action:

System resources are limited. Upgrade with more memory. If problem persists, contact RTAC.

%RL-E-BKTUSED All resources (bucket) required by the policy are in use.

Explanation:

Resources needed for the aggregate or default rate limiting policy are already used by another rate limiting policy.

Recommended Action:

Determine if the maximum number of policies used has been reached. If it has, negate some policy apply commands. If not, contact technical support.

%ACL-E-REFERENCE, ACL <acl_name> is being referenced by other commands -- delete these references before deleting this ACL

Explanation:

This message indicates that an ACL could not be deleted.

Recommended Action:

This ACL is applied to ports/interfaces. First remove it from all ports/interfaces, which it is applied to and then delete it.

11 OSPF Messages

Area <area_id> successfully created</area_id>
Explanation:
This message announces the successful creation of an OSPF area.
Recommended Action:
None.
Area <area_id> successfully deleted</area_id>
Explanation:
This message announces the successful deletion of an area.
Recommended Action:
None.
Area creation failed: unsupported action
Explanation:
Internal error.
Recommended Action:

Contact RTAC.

Contact RTAC.

Area creation failed: low system resources
Explanation:
This message indicates memory deficiency.
Recommended Action:
Delete unused areas and/or interfaces.
Area creation failed: entry already exists
Explanation:
This message appears when the user attempts to create the same area more than once.
Recommended Action:
Verify the area ID and make sure that such area doesn't already exist.
Area deletion failed: unsupported action
Explanation:
Internal error.
Recommended Action:
Contact RTAC.
Area deletion failed: low system resources
Explanation:
Internal error.
Recommended Action:

Area deletion failed: entry does not exist

Explanation:

This message appears when the user attempts to delete an OSPF area that doesn't exist.

Recommended Action:

Make sure that you specify a valid area ID.

OSPF interface addition failed: IP-address or keyword "backbone" required

Explanation:

This message appears when the user tries to add an interface to an area with unknown or misspelled ID.

Recommended Action:

Verify the correctness of an area ID.

OSPF interface addition failed: unknown interface type

Explanation:

This message is displayed when the misspelled interface is passed as a parameter.

Recommended Action:

Verify the spelling of the interface.

OSPF interface addition failed: unsupported interface type

Explanation:

This message appears when the user attempts to add an unsupported interface to the area. Presently, ES 500 supports only broadcast interfaces.

Recommended Action:

Configure an interface of a supported type.

OSPF interface successfully added

Explanation:

This message announces the successful additional on an interface to the OSPF area.

Recommended Action:

None.

OSPF interface addition failed: unsupported action

Explanation:

Internal error.

Recommended Action:

Explanation:

Rstp is not supported in this version.

Explanation:

This message appears when the specified parameter is higher than the acceptable range.

Recommended Action:

Provide a value in the acceptable range.

Explanation:

This message is displayed when a SmartTRUNK has been successfully created.

Recommended Action:

This message is displayed when a SmartTRUNK is deleted before the member ports are deleted.

Explanation:

This message is displayed when SmartTRUNK is deleted and there are actions on SmartTRUNK that have not been removed.

Explanation:

This message is displayed when a non-existent SmartTRUNK is specified for any SmartTRUNK command.

Recommended Action:

Verify SmartTRUNK has been created.

%STRNK-E-GENERAL, GVRP is enabled on the port.

Explanation:

This message is displayed when the port is gyrp-enabled, so you cannot add it to a trunk.

Recommended Action:

Verify that the port is not gyrp-enabled when you try to add it to a trunk.

%STRNK-E-GENERAL, L3 interface is defined on the port.

Explanation:

This message is displayed when the L3 interface is defined on the port, so you cannot add it to a trunk.

Recommended Action:

Verify that no L3 interface is enabled on the port when you try to add it to a trunk.

%STRNK-E-GENERAL, the port belongs to a vlan (not the default vlan).

Explanation:

This message is displayed when the port belongs to a VLAN, so you cannot add it to a trunk.

Recommended Action:

Verify that the port doesn't belong to a VLAN when you try to add it to a trunk.

%STRNK-E-GENERAL, the port is a copy port.

Explanation:

This message is displayed when the port is a copy port, so you cannot add it to a trunk.

Recommended Action:

Verify that the port is not a copy port when you try to add it to a trunk

%STRNK-E-GENERAL, balancing is not supported for the given layer with the specific criterion.

Explanation:

This message is displayed when you try to set a layer number with usedAddress that is not supported by the device.

Recommended Action:

Make sure that the device supports the balancing on the specified layer.

%STRNK-E-EXISTS, SmartTRUNK <name> already exists

Explanation:

This message is displayed when the SmartTRUNK being created already exists.

Recommended Action:

Verify the name of the SmartTRUNK being created.

%STRNK-E-FAILED, SmartTRUNK(s) <name> could not be created

Explanation:

This message is displayed when an error is encountered while creating a SmartTRUNK because system memory is insufficient.

Recommended Action:

Upgrade memory on Control Module.

%STRNK-E-DIFFGRP Port <port name> already part of a different **SmartTRUNK**

Explanation:

This error message is displayed when the user attempts to add a port to a SmartTRUNK and the port is already a member of an existing SmartTRUNK group.

Recommended Action:

Verify the port specified is not a member of another SmartTRUNK.

%STRNK-E-DIFFNEGOTIATION Port <port name> auto-negotiation setting does not match setting

Explanation:

The auto negotiation setting of the port being added is not the same as that of the other ports in the same trunk.

Recommended Action:

Change the auto negotiation setting of the port to that of the other ports in the SmartTRUNK.

%STRNK-E-DIFFSPEED Port speed of <port name> does not match speed of other STRNK ports

Explanation:

The speed of the port being added is to the same as that of the other ports already part of the SmartTRUNK.

Check the speed of the ports belonging to the SmartTRUNK and use a port of the appropriate speed.

%STRNK-E-DUPX Port <port name> is not full-duplex, cannot add to **SmartTRUNK**

Explanation:

The port being added to the SmartTRUNK should be full duplex. A half duplex port cannot be added to the SmartTRUNK.

Recommended Action:

Check the settings of the port and make it full duplex.

%STRNK-E-TRUNKPORT, Port <port name> is a TRUNK port, hence cannot add to SmartTRUNK

This message appears when the user tries to add a port, which was configured as a TRUNK port, to a SmartTRUNK.

This message is displayed when the specified ports were successfully changed to be trunk ports (or access ports).

This message is displayed when at the completion of the vlan add port command.

Recommended Action:

Informational message. No action necessary.

Explanation:

This message is displayed when a VLAN was created successfully.

Recommended Action:

Informational Message. No action necessary.

%VLAN-I-BIND, superVLAN to subVLAN success.

Explanation:

This message is displayed when the system makes a connection between subVlan and superVlan for the implementation of the AggregateVlan.

Recommended Action:

Informational Message. No action necessary.

%VLAN-I-CREATED, superVLAN created

Explanation:

This message is displayed when a VLAN was created successfully.

Recommended Action:

None.

%VLAN-I-REMOVED, VLAN <vlan name>successfully removed.

Explanation:

This message is displayed when a VLAN was negated (removed) successfully.

Recommended Action:

Informational Message. No action necessary.

%VLAN-E-ADDFAILURE, port(s) <port list> cannot be added to VLAN <vlan name>

Explanation:

This message is displayed when none of the specified ports could be added to the given VLAN. This usually occurs when the user tries to assign access ports to a VLAN, which are already part of another VLAN.

Recommended Action:

Make sure that the ports you are trying to assign to a new VLAN do not already belong to another VLAN.

%VLAN-E-BADNAME RSVD, The VLAN name conflicts with a reserved name. Please select another name.

Explanation:

VLAN names beginning with "SYS" are reserved, as are other names such as "Default".

Recommended Action:

Use a different name for the VLAN

%VLAN-E-BADNAME VLAN ALNUM, VLAN's name must begin with an alphanumeric character.

Explanation:

This message is displayed when the user is trying to create a VLAN with a name that begins with a nonalphanumeric character, such as an underscore. This is not allowed.

Recommended Action:

Use a VLAN name, which begins with an alphanumeric character (A-Z, a-z, 0-9).

%VLAN-E-BADNAME TOOBIG, The VLAN name cannot exceed 32 characters.

Explanation:

This message is displayed when the VLAN name exceeds 32 characters.

Recommended Action:

Please select another name that does not exceed 32 characters.

%VLAN-E-BADPROTOCOL, VLAN does not support this protocol.

Explanation:

This message may appear when the user attempts to create a VLAN, based on a protocol that is not supported by ES 500.

Use the supported protocol.

%VLAN-E-NOCREATE, Failed to create VLAN <vlan name>

Explanation:

This message is displayed when the system failed to create a VLAN.

Recommended Action:

Please call Technical Support for information about this message.

%VLAN-E-DUPVID, VLAN ID <vlan_name> already exist. Please use a different VLAN ID

Explanation:

This message is displayed when an attempt is made to create a VLAN with an ID that is already in use by another VLAN.

Recommended Action:

Use a different VLAN ID for the VLAN being created, or remove the VLAN, which already has this VLAN ID.

%VLAN-E-NOBIND, Failed to bind superVLAN <vlan_name> to subVLAN <vlan_name>

Explanation:

This error is followed by a general error <%VLAN-E-GENERAL>, which specifies the exact reason for the error. This error can appear when the user tries to define a VLAN, which already has a direct IP interface, as a sub-VLAN.

Recommended Action:

Delete the IP interface and try to bind it again to the superVLAN.

%VLAN-E-NOCREATE, Failed to create superVLAN

Explanation:

An internal error occurred while creating a VLAN.

Please note the error and actions leading up to it and contact RTAC.

%VLAN-E-NOSUCHVLAN, VLAN <vlan name> does not exist

Explanation:

This message is displayed when the user is trying to remove a VLAN, which does not exist.

Recommended Action:

Check the VLAN name and try again.

%VLAN-E-NOT REMOVED, VLAN <vlan name> could not be removed

Explanation:

This message is displayed when the user is trying to delete a reserved VLAN, or a VLAN, which does not exist.

Recommended Action:

Check the name of the VLAN; do not try to remove reserved VLANs.

VLAN-E-DUPVID VLAN ID, ID already exists. Please use different VLAN ID.

Explanation:

This message is displayed when an attempt is made to create a VLAN with an ID, which is already in use by another VLAN.

Recommended Action:

Use a different VLAN ID for the VLAN being created, or remove the VLAN, which already has this VLAN ID.

%VLAN-E-NOT REMOVED, VLAN could not be removed, has Ports.

Explanation:

This message is displayed when the user is trying to delete a VLAN, which has ports.

Make sure that there are no ports in the VLAN that you want to delete.

%VLAN-E-NOACCESSCHNG, Some ports or SmartTRUNKs (<port list>) cannot be changed to trunk mode. Please remove them from all nondefault VLANs before retrying this command. If default STP is enabled on these ports, please negate the STP commands. If the port is being used for system-wide Address Translation or as a stackable VLAN access port, it cannot be a trunk port. If the port is a backbone stackable VLAN port, it cannot be changed to an access port.

Explanation:

An access port can belong to at most one VLAN per protocol type. A trunk port may belong to any number of VLANs. When changing a port from a trunk port to an access port, if the trunk port belongs to too many VLANs, this message is displayed.
