Information was obtained from a confidential source by the New York Field Office of this Dureau, to the effect that Fr. Wilhelm Reich was on the Medical Edvisory leard of the Communist Party, United (tates of America, which Foord is understood to have published the magazine ontitled "Health and Hygiene." Salph Teiola was at one time the editor of this magazine. Telephone directories maintained by the New York Field Sivision of this Eurecu indicate that Dr. Wilhelm Reich resides at 75-02 Resel Street, Forest Hills, Long Island, New York, telephone, Boulevard 8-5097. The telephone directories also show a listing for Fr. Jith Buxboum, 110 Fast 87th Street, New York, New York, telephone, Atmeter 9-3587. There is also a listing for Fr. Harold Asron, 151 West 74th 'treet, How York, Hew York, telephone, Undicott 2-4393. Pecording to confidential sources, Fr. Harold faron actively perticipated in the examination of American volunteers who were going to "pain to flight for the Spanish Loyalist Covernment in 1937 and is reported as being a morber of the Communist Party.

Reference is made to Fureau letter of April 11, 1940, Tureau file 61-7659 entitled Communist Farty, Subversive Activities - General.

Reference is also made to a letter from the Albany office to the Durgau dated November 19, 1940, copy of which was furnished to .. the New York office, transmitting a copy of a Personal History of an alien applicant for professional license in New York State.

Flease be informed that the Personal History of WILKEL PRICH, the subject of this inquiry, as set out in the curriculum of the New School for Cocial Research in the Spring 1940 edition would appear to be possibly identical with the subject of the Personal History furnished by the Albany office with the lexter referred to although the name on that personal history is spelled RIECH and not REICH. It is noted however, that this is probably an error inasmuch as there is a MINHALL HEICH at the address given, 75-02 Eccsel Street, Forest Hills, long Island, New York. Inasmuch as the letter of the Albany office of November 19. 1940 indicates that a copy of the Personal History was furnished to the sureau, no informationtherefrom is being set out in this letter and no further investigative activity is being undertaken by the New York office in this matter and the inquiry will be considered closed unless additional instructions are received or additional information concerning WILHELM REICH, DR. EDITH BUXBAUM, or DM. MARCID AANON comes to the attention of the New York office.

Re: MRS. ELSA STAI

There is no information available regarding the above named subject nor is there any information available concerning Dr. William Forbes Thorburn.

Information has been previously furnished concerning Ingrid Whrburg in a memorandum entitled "Heinz Behrendt, et al, dated January 30, 1941."

Concerning Dr. Wilhelm Reich, 75-02 Kessel Street, Forest Hills, Long Island, New York, information is available that Dr. Reich came to the United States in 1939 from Oslo, Norway. Dr. Reich is described as an Austrian and is reported to have been a paid Communist agent in Austria prior to the Anschluss and to have been expelled from Austria and other countries for his Communistic activities. Available information indicates that Dr. Reich had a considerable political following in Austria, especially among the women doctors. The divorced wife of Dr. Reich is also reported to be engaged in Communistic activities.

Information has been obtained from a confidential source to the effect that Dr. William Reich was on the Medical Advisory Board of the Communist Party, United States of America, which board is understood to have published the magazine entitled "Mealth and Hygiene."

A visa was issued to Dr. Reich on August 11, 1939, by the Department of State of the United States Government, inasmuch as he was able to prove that the New York Seminar for Vegetotheraphy was a part of the New School for Social Research, which is an accredited educational institution.

A confidential source has advised that prior to 1933 Dr. Heich was a member of the German Communist Party and on his arrival in Norway became a member of the Norwegian Communist Party. However, in 1936, he was expelled from the Norwegian Communist Party for not adhering closely enough to the party line.

MEMORANDUM FOR MR. E. A.

With reference to your memorandum of May 7, 1941 concerning Dr. Wilhelm Peich, please be advised that a custodial detention card relative to Dr. Reich has been prepared, but has not as yet been approved. An investigation concerning Dr. Reich was requested of the New York Office by letter dated March 26, 1941, to determine definitely that he is presently in the United States and if so, the nature of his activities in Communist connections in this country, if any.

The facts concerning his background have not been brought to the attention of the Immigration and Naturalization authorities inasmuch as it was felt that further details developed during the investigation requested would make it possible to present a more accurate picture to these authorities.

Since the receipt of the Department of State memorandum of April 30, 1941, which lists Dr. Reich as an interested person in the visa application of Mrs. Flsa Stai, giving his address in Forest Hills, Long Island, New York, it would appear that he is presently in the United States, and if you so desire, the information presently available will be communicated to the Immigration authorities....

The following information concerning Dr. Wilhelm Reigh is subsitted to you for any attention you may deem appropriate.

Dr. Wilholm Reich is presently residing at 75-02 Eessel Street, Forest Hills, Long Island, New York.

A visa was issued to Dr. Reich on August 11, 1939, by the Dopartment of State, and he arrived in the United States in 1939 from Oslo, Hormay. Dr. Reich is reported to be an Austrian and is said to have been a paid Communist agent in Austria prior to the Anschluss. It is said that he was expelled from Austria and other countries for Communist activities.

It has been confidentially reported that Dr. Reich has in the past been on the Medical Advisory Board of the Communist Party, U.S.A., which Board allegedly published the magazine entitled "Health and Hygiene".

It is reported that prior to 1933, Dr. Reich was a member of the Gersen Communist Party and on his arrival in Norway, became a member of the Commnist Party of Borway. It is said that in 1936, he was expelled from the Morwegian Communist Party For failure to adhere to the "purty line".

DETAILS:

On December 12, 1941, upon receipt of reference teletype. subject, DR. WILHELM REICH, was apprehended at his residence at 9906 69th Avenue, Forest Hills, Long Island, New York, by Special Agents and together with Detective of the 112th Precinct, New York Police Department, at 2:30 A. M., and he was immediately brought to the Office of the New York Field Division where he was fingerprinted by Special Agent and where he was photographed.

At the time of his apprehension, Dr. REICH exhibited the copy of his declaration of intention, upon which his name appeared, and through which identification was made.

At the New York Office he advised Special Agent that he was engaged in research and instruction in connection with the Organe Research Institute located at 9906 69th Avenue, Forest Hills, Long Island, his residence; that his relatives were EVA REICH and LORE REICH, who reside with subject's former wife, who is now Mrs. ANNIE RUBENSTEIN, residing at 27 West 96th Street, New York City. At this time the subject claimed to be of Jewish descent, but advised that he was not of the Jewish religion, stating that he has no religion. It was also ascertained that he formerly resided at 75-02 Kessel Street, Forest Hills, Long Island.

At the New York Office subject further stated to Special Agent that he was not actually married to ILSE OLLENDORF, but that he did reside with her as man and wife, considering her his common law wife. The following description of subject was obtained at this time:

Age 44 yrs. Sex Male. White. Color Complexion Very ruddy. Eyes Brown. Hair Gray 51 9 g n Height 158 lbs. Weight Build Stocky. Rece Jewish. Nationality Austrian. Date and Place of Birth, Dobzownica, Austria, March 24, 1897. Alien Registration Number 4505146.

Subject arrived at the New York Field Office from his residence at 3:10 A. M., and departed therefrom at approximately 4:00 A. M. on December 12, 1941, and at approximately 4:20 A. M. on this date, he was delivered into the custody of the Immigration and Naturalization Service, Ellis Island, New York City.

On December 12, 1941, subjected executed two copies of a consent to the search of his residence located at 9906 69th Avenue, Forest Hills, Long Island, New York, authorizing Special Agents and to take any of his property which may be desired. Both copies of this consent are being retained in the files of this case in the New York Field Office.

On December 18, 1941, a search was conducted of the home of subject, 9906 69th Avenue, Forest Hills, Long Island, New York, by Present at the time of this search was Special Agents and Miss CAROL BERNARD. Miss CAROL BERNARD, who advised that she resided at 114-15 Jamaica Avenue, Jamaica, New York, was Dr. REICH's medical assistant. She stated that she is a graduate of Paine Hall School of Technical Training, Jamaica, New York. She further advised that her salary is \$80.00 per month, and that this position was obtained through contact and acquaintance of Miss ILSE ULLENDURF, while attending Paine Hall School. She also advised that she had worked for Dr. REICH for the past 9 months and that he was the best employer that she had ever worked for, and that Dr. REICH made her feel as though "she were working with him rather than for him. " She stated that her duties were principally those of assisting as a technician in Dr. REICH's laboratory,

which is located in the basement of his residence and that in Dr. REICH'S absence she had been asked to stay with ILSE OLLENDORF.

While searching subject's house Agents observed that it was a two-story residence, in the basement of which subject has a technical laboratory where the following instruments were observed:

An Organometer, which bore the words "Pat. app. No. 377,277."

A Multi-Violet Microscope.

A motion pickers machine, and

A microscope, to which a camera could be attached.

In subject's library on the second floor, Agents observed approximately 1,000 volumes of technical books dealing with medical and political subjects. The following volumes were observed upon his shelves:

The following books and writing were obtained from Dr. REICH's home and are being retained in the files of the New York Field Office pending further action in this matter:

The Development of Socialism from a Science to a Fact,"
by Karl Rudek, 1918, published by the Communist Party of

German-Austria (a pamphlet).

"Through Democracy to Fascism, 1918-1928," by Johannes Wertheim, Publishing Company of the Labor Book Store, Vienna (no date). The last sentence of this booklet, which was translated by W. L. Warner, Translator of the New York Field Office, is as follows: "The way of democracy leads to Fascism, that is the result of the ten-year existence of the Austrian Republic. The determined mass struggle of the laboring class against the bourgeoisie and Fascism under the leadership of the Communist Party--that is the only way by which the laboring class of Austria can attain victory."

"The 17th Party Anniversary Day of the Communist Party of the Soviet Union," a report of the work of the Central Committee of the Communist Party of the Soviet Union, published 1934 by the Publishing Company of the Foreign Workers of the USSR, Moscow-Leningrad.

Also obtained from subject's files was a front-page of the Berlin illustrated newspaper bearing a portrait of Hitler, which sheet appears to have been contained in a notebook, since it bears two punch holes and has been trimmed down by someone. Also obtained were numerous photographs of Nazi soldiers during the occupation of Austria by Germany. All of these pictures are being retained in the New York Office. Also obtained was the front sheet of the newspaper entitled "Neue Front." Organ fuer Proletarisch-Revolutionaere Sammlung, dated September, 1934, and published by the Sozialistischen Arbeiter--Partei Deutschlands.

The following writing by subject were obtained from his library:

One volume entitled "Mass Psychology of Fascism," concerning sexual economy of political reaction and cencerning proletarian sexual politics, written in memory of the Austrian fighters for a Socialistic Future, who fell. It was printed in 1933 by the Press for Sexual Politics in Kopenhagen, Pregue and Zurich. This pamphlet is printed in German. The above was translated by Translator W. L. Warner of the New York Field Office.

Also obtained were two volumes, paper hound, being numbers 4 and 5 of a series of political pamphlets. Number 4 is entitled

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"The Natural Organization in Labor Democracy," by a laboratory worker, published in Oslo, Norway, January, 1939, by the Sexpol-Verlag. Number 5 is entitled "Future Problems of Labor Democracy," published by the Sexpol-Verlag, Europa, April, 1941.

It is noted that the subject made the statement at the time of his apprehension to Special Agent that he was the author of the above pamphlets and he gave Special Agent instructions as to where they could be located in his home. Miss CAROL BERNARD advised that a translation was being made of these works and she furnished Agents a copy of the English translation of the first 23 pages of the second part of Number 5. She advised that this translation was being made by Dr. THEODORE P. WOLFE at subject's request, and that subject plans to have it published in English as soon as the translation is completed. It appears from the translated parts which were furnished to Agents, and which are being retained in the New York Office, that. this work is primarily Socialistic and that subject makes statements which tend to show his hatred of Hitler and of his dissatisfaction with Communism.

Subject states in this work that "The first sensible thing to do would be to uproot Hitlerism." "The Soviet Union has not done anything towards advancing a solution of the problems of human society."

The above writings of subject are being retained in the file of this case in the New York Field Office.

Also obtained from subject's home were two files containing current correspondence, an examination of which failed to reveal any matter considered pertinent: however, it was learned that subject owns a summer home near Oquossoc, Maine, located on a RFD route. These files are being presently held in the New York Field Office and will be returned to subject at the outcome of his hearing.

Agents and for the purpose of obtaining data for subject's further consideration for custodial detention, it being noted that he has heretofore been so considered. A review of the files of the New York Office reflects that Dr. REICH is the subject in New York file 100-27 entitled WILHELM REICH; INTERNAL SECURITY - R, in which file it appears that a letter from the Bureau, dated April 28, 1941 requested that New York Field Division conduct an investigation concerning alleged Communists and subversive activities of subject. This request was based upon information previously forwarded to the Bureau by the New York Office by letter dated March 18, 1941, to the

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effect that the subject was an alien applicant for a professional 11cense in New York State, this information having been received from confidential informant No. 1, who advised that personal history furnished by subject in connection with this application was forwarded to the New York Office; also, that the personal history of subject as set out in the curriculum of the New School for Social Research in the spring of 1940 shows subject's identity as the subject of a communication to the Bureau from the State Department, dated March 29, 1940, relative to the issuance of a passport to Dr. WILHELM REICH. Also contained in this file of the New York Office is a copy of a reference report of Special Agent (made at Washington, D. C., June 16, 1941, setting out that upon subject's arrival in the United States at the Port of New York, August 28, 1939, on the S.S. Stavangerfjord, he possessed a non-quota immigration visa No. 19, issued to him by the American Consulate in Oslo, Norway, and that on his application for a visa, subject stated that he was born at Dobrzanicke, Poland, on March 24, 1897, and that he had been a professor of psychology at the Psychological Institute of the University of Oslo, and came to the United States solely for the purpose of teaching psychology at the New School for Social Research, 66 West 12th Street, New York City.

By reference letter of March 26, 1941, from the Bureau to the New York Field Division (Eureau file 100-14601), the Bureau advised that it had received a communication from the Department of State captioned "Communist Activities of Dr. WILHELM REICH," copies of which were enclosed with this letter with a request that it be determined what subject's Communist connections and activities in this country were, From the enclosure, it appears that subject obtained Section 4 (D) visa in Oslo, Norway, on August 11, 1939, since he was able to prove that the New York Seminer for Vegetotherapy was a part of the New School for Social Research, an accredited educational institution; however, it was learned later by the State Department that before 1933 Dr. REICH was a member of the Communist Party and upon his arriving in Norway, he became a member of the Norwegian Communist Party from which he was expelled in 1936 for not adhering to the party line. However, his connection with the Communist Party in Norway could not be definitely established inasmuch as its files had been confiscated.

At the Immigration and Naturalization Service, 641 Washington Street, New York City, a check revealed Dr. REICH to be the subject of file No. 2271-2-696856. From a copy of his application for certificate of arrival and preliminary form for a declaration of intention filed on September 11, 1939, it appeared that subject resided at 7502 Kessel Street, Forest Hills, New York. From his declaration of intention filed in the United States District, Eastern District of New York, Brooklyn,

New York, on November 20, 1939, declaration No. 287944, it appeared that subject entered the United States at the Port of New York on August 28, 1939, aboard the S.S. Stavangerfjord as WILHELM REICH: that his parents were LEON REICH and CAECILIA ROMIJER (maiden name); that his last port of foreign residence was Oslo. Norway; that his destination in this country was the New School for Social Research, Dr. ALVIN JOHNSON, Director, New York City; that he was accompanied on his voyage by a student of technology, one KARL CONCHERON, from Oslo, Norway; that his occupation was given as professor of medical psychology; that his nationality was German--previously Austrian; that his race was German; that he was born on March 24, 1897 at Dobzonica, located in Austria, and subsequently to 1918 being in Poland, and in Ukrainia; that his merital status is divorced from his former wife, Dr. ANNIE REIGH in 1934 at Vienna; that he married her in 1922 in Vienna. He further stated that his former wife, ANNIE REICH, was born in Vienne, Austria, April 9, 1902; that she arrived at the Port of New York on July 21, 1938, and is now residing in New York City.

Subject states that he has two children, EVA, born in 1924, and LORE, born in 1928, both residing in New York City.

Nothing is contained in the files of the Immigration and Naturalization Service indicating that subject had applied for or received his final citizenship papers.

Through the courtesy of the State Department of Education, 80 Centre Street, New York City, the records of the State Department of Education were checked, which included the register for 1940, the American Medical Association Directory for New York State, and the office files, with negative results.

Special Agents and interviewed the New School for Social Research, 66 West 12th Street, New York City, which school is considered one of liberal education and of free thought. Advised that subject had been an associate professor in this school for 2 years during 1939 and 1940 at a salary of approximately \$1500.00 per year, conducting a lecture in psychiatry; that subject is an important figure in the medical world as a psychoanalyst, but that his teachings differed slightly from the theories of most psychoanalysts in that he concentrated his studies upon the growth and development of the deteriorated muscle tissue and combined biological functions of the human body with its mental functions.

stated that subject's connection with the School was terminated after the spring term of 1941 because Dr. REICH seems to

break with any of his acquaintances after he has known them for a while, and is very egotistical and disregards the ideas of other scientists; and he claims to have a cure-all for cancer—all of which stated smacked of "quack" tactics on subject's part. was reluctant to attempt any analysis of subject's political views and he advised thatit was not his practice to discuss politics with subject inasmuch as the qualifications of the associates of the New School were based solely upon the ability of the individuals as instructors in their different fields, and that the School makes no inquiry of their political views or background.

suggested that

New York City, formerly attended lectures of subject and was now in practice as a psychologist and had also been connected with Columbia University, New York City, and that could furnish considerable information as to Dr. REICH's background and activities.

An interview was had with
the Psychiatric School, Columbia University, 168 and Broadway, New
York City. He stated that he knew and knew of nothing against
his reputation, nor that he possessed any Communistic or Nazi tendencies,
but stated that his accuaintance was very slight and suggested that Agent
contact New York City, who
was a highly reputable psychologist and who, positively
stated, could be relied upon in this matter, and who was closely acquainted with and with Dr. REICH.

In an interview with at his office at New York City, he advised that had studied under subject for a number of years both in Europe and in this country, and that was now a private practitioner and was also connected with the Vanderbilt Clinic in New York City. redvised that on one occasion he attended a lecture given by Dr. REICH at the New School for Social Research at the instance of balso stated that he has read a number of articles written by subject, but that he does not have a personal acquaintance with him. He advised that subject is a Jewish refugee of German or Austrian descent; that he is not well known among doctors in this country and his reputetion is not high professionally because he has gone off on a tangent to develop some new theories relating to sex psychosis and his work is looked down upon generally by the best psychoanalysts in this country.

advised that efter attending one of REICH's lectures, he was not impressed enough to want to attend any others. He said that

REICH's work on the sexual angle and the experiments that he conducts are based upon sexual emotions, and subject's income is principally derived from a few patients who attend his clinic and from a few doctors who attend the Seminar, which he conducts at his home in Forest Hills.

Concerning advised that he studied with subject in Oslo and should be able to furnish considerable information of subject's political activities and sympathies; that he had known a number of years and had never known him to exhibit any radical sympathies, and he felt that he could be relied upon. He advised that is the psychiatrist in New York City, who stands very high medically and who is definitely very American.

was interviewed at his residence at

New York City, and he advised that he had known
Dr. REICH since 1920 as an important medical figure. He stated that
Dr. REICH was associated in Vienna, Austria with the Vienna Psychiatric
Clinic, which he headed in founding in 1922; that he was a leader in the
technological Seminar of psychoanalysis in Vienna and was complimented
by Dr. SIGMUND FREUD, founder of the study of mental conditions, for his
work in connection with this Seminar; that from 1930 to 1933 subject
worked in Berlin and conducted a Seminar at the Psycholitic Institute
at the University of Berlin. Subsequently to 1933, subject worked as
a psychoanalyst in Denmark, Sweden and Norway. In the latter country,
he was connected with the Scandinavian Institute for Life Research in
Sex Economy at the University of Oslo.

further advised that in Vienna and in Berlin Dr. REICH was associated with the Socialist Movement and that later he became affiliated with the Communist Party. However, state the extent of his activity nor his exact connection other than further stated that he was a member of the Communist Party. that he believed subject joined the Communist Party because of the fact that he is a foremost student of political psychosis and as a result stated, however, that Dr. became interested in Communism. KEICH did not agree with the principals of Communism and for that reason he severed all connections with the Communist Party and has stated that Communism won't work because it is not practical, since people have not developed mentally to such a degree as to accept it. furnished no definite information of the date or place of subject's last connections with the Communist Party. It was further ascertained that subject is now married to a Dr. ILSE OLLENDORF, who from

is also a practicing psychoanalyst, residing at subject's home; that subject about ten years previously divorced his first wife, Dr. ANNIE REICH.

also advised that in 1939 Dr. REICH announced the discovery of a biological energy which, he states, comes from the body organs and that his work has been solely involved in experimenting with this energy, which he claims that he is able to control in such a way as to cure cancer; that he claims that at least one actual cure by its use; that subject has applied for a patent on his method of controlling this energy, which he has named "Orgone," and has now attempted to organize an association of psychoanalysts to be known as the Orgone Research Institute, the purpose of which organization was to commercialize subject's treatment of cancer. However, he seems to have made very little progress with it.

further advised that subject is a member of the International Association for Sex Economy, which was organized in Oslo, Norway, and which studies the economy of biological energy in the body.

During the search of subject's home, it was ascertained that subject held an acknowledgment of indebtedness in the amount of \$1760.00 and being questioned concerning this debt, stated that it represented his debt to subject for instruction received during 1938 and 1939 in Oslo at the University of Oslo and for instruction during 1940 in this country at Dr. REICH's Seminar.

further stated that Dr. REICH had learned as an alien he should not possess photographic equipment, and that he had turned over to him subject's Leica Camera No. 41288 and a Cine-Kodak motion picture camera, both of which subject used in his laboratory by atteching to a microscope.

New York City, who is a professional psychiatrist and also employed as an instructor at Columbia University, advised that he had not been in touch with Dr. REICH during the past year, but that he had been told that Dr. REICH was devoting all of his time to research in an attempt to formulate a cure for cancer afflictions. Stated that he had met Dr. REICH in Vienna while he was studying there and that he was of the opinion that Dr. REICH is desirous of being a good citizen and that he was not aware of subversive activity on the part of Dr. REICH. He stated that his contacts and relationships with Dr. REICH had been entirely in the interest of science and research and, therefore, he had never discussed politics with Dr. REICH.

Post Office, advised that he delivered mail at the subject present residence, but could furnish no information concerning him.

, another letter carrier at this Post Office Station, advised that he formerly delivered mail to subject at his former home at 7502 Kessel Street, Forest Hills, New York, and that subject operated a laboratory and office while at this location, and that on one occasion he was invited in by one of the assistants, but all that he remembers is having seen numerous gases of guinea pigs and white mice. He could furnish no further information about subject.

Neither of these carriers could suggest any reliable neighbors of subject at either place, inasmuch as most of the neighbors were either German refugees or German people.

Confidential informant No. 2, who is a by profession and who has many contacts in the neighborhood in which the subject resides, advised that he had made numerous attempts to find individuals in the neighborhood of 9906 69th Avenue, Forest Hills, Long Island, New York, who were acquainted with the subject, with negative results. He advised that in this particular locality of Forest Hills that many wealthy refugees have taken up residence within the past few years and that they did not mingle with the general public and lived rather secluded lives.

In connection with the report that subject DR. WILHELM REICH had recently purchased a home at 9906-69 Avenue, Forest Hills, Long Island, New York, Agent contacted Confidential Informant

3 did state, however, that the property at the above address formerly was owned by DANIEL F. SULLIVAN and wife; that the bank foreclosed on this family and on June 23, 1941 DR. WILHELM REICH signed a contract of sale for this property, with an agreement that the deed would be delivered to him not later than September 15, 1941. DR. REICH'S address at that time was given as 75-02 Kessel St., Forest Hills, Long Island, New York. The real estate broker handling this matter was indicated to be LOUIS McGAHIE, 106-22 Continental Avenue, Forest Hills, Long Island, New York.

further indicated that on September 8, 1941 DR. REICH assigned the property in question to ILSE OLLENDORFF, whose address was given as being identical with that of the Doctor. No information Concerning ILSE OLLENDORFF,

the aforementioned sale was finally consummated on September 10, 1941; that the total price of the house was \$14,000,00:

The indices of the New York City office were checked for the name of with negative results.

A check of New York City, indicates that WILHELM REICH, 75-02 Kessel Street, Forest Hills, Long Island, New York, was employed by the New School of Social Research, 66 West 12 Street, New York City, as a professor; that no salary figures were available; that DR. REICH was similarly engaged at one of the universities in Norway prior to coming to the United States; and that he holds a degree es Doctor of Philosophy. No bank reference was given ! It was further ascertained from this source that subject is 40 years of age, and married, although the identity of his wife was unknown; further, that this family has resided at 75-02 Kessel Street since August or September 1939, where a domestic was employed. The name of the landlord could not be however, the monthly rental for this property, which is a detached one family private home, was estimated to be over \$100.00.

No further information was available concerning the REICH family.





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

Dear Sir:

About a week ago a friendly neighbor of mine told me that he has been visited by two plain-clothes police ment who made enquiries about me. They told him that a police investigation was under way because I am suspected of being a fascist or a communist, and an abortionist. They also told him some stories about me which they had picked up somewhere, apparently some neighbor gossip, which they interpreted in a peculiar manner. For instance, that I had paid my rent at 75-02 Kessel Street, Forest Hills, punctually every first of the month, and that this made me suspect, because where did I get the money from? Or that I had grown high hedges around my house and this was suspicious too. Fore of such stories made me suspicious of the policement, for instance, the story that they had the permission to tap my wire but that they could not do this for one reason or the other.

My wife visited th refore the Assistant District Attorney. Hr. line Smith in Brooklyn and told him the story. Mr. Smith confirmed again the fact that the District Attorney's office was completely satisfied with the results of a hearing held in December 1941, after a thorough investigation through the F.B.It regarding my activities. There was nothing whatsoever to incriminate me.

appreciate it if you would accept my offer of a complete and thorough investigation at my home. I have nothing to hide and I would like to avoid the creation of bad rumors and nasty stories in my neighbor hood about me. I shall be only too glad to give you any information you may desire.

I would approciate very much the protection of the police against further denounciation, defamation of character and damaging regults of this first happening which by ir. Pugh of the F.B.I. was called most unfortunate.

Reference is made to Bureau letter dated July 15th, 1942, Bureau File 100-14601.

From a review of the file in instant matter there is no indication that an investigation has been conducted concerning the captioned individual since his release by the Alien Enemy Hearing Board, dated January 27th, 1942, which is set forth in the report of Special Agent dated February 7th, 1942, at New York City.

However, there does appear a complaint received in this office from New York City, concerning the captioned individual, wherein she furnished certain information concerning DR. REICH which she had obtained from dealer in medical stationery, New York City. No action was taken by this office on this complaint.

The files further reflect that on May 29th, 1942, Patrolman of the New York City Police Department, telephonically requested this office as to the disposition of the alien enemy case concerning Dr. REICH. It is further reflected that on June 28th, 1942, an inquiry was made at this office concerning Dr. WILHELM REICH by Special Squad #1 of the New York City Police Department. It should be noted. however, that this later inquiry by the New York City Police Department was made subsequent to the date of the letter sent to the Police Commissioner at New York City by Dr. REICH. MEMORANDUM FOR HUGH B. COX, ASSISTANT ATTORNEY GENERAL AND

J. EDGAR HOOVER, DIRECTOR FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION


I refer to Mr. L. M. C. Smith's memorandum to me dated June 28, 1943, which reviews the history, development, and meaning of the Special Case work and of the danger classifications that were made as a part of that work.

After full re-consideration of these individual danger classifications, I am satisfied that they serve no useful purpose. The detention of alien enemies is being dealt with under the procedures established by the Alien Enemy Control Unit. The Special Case procedure has been found to be valueless and is not used in that connection. There is no statutory authorization or other present justification for keeping a "custodial detention" list of citizens. The Department fulfills its proper functions by investigating the activities of persons who may have violated the law. It is not aided in this work by classifying persons as to dangerousness.

Apart from these general considerations, it is now clear to me that this classification system is inherently unreliable. The evidence used for the purpose of making the classifications was inadequate; the standards applied to the evidence for the purpose of making the classifications were defective; and finally, the notion that it is possible to make a valid determination as to how dangerous a person is in the abstract and without reference to time, environment, and other relevant circumstances, is impractical, unwise, and dangerous.

For the foregoing reasons I am satisified that the adoption of this classification system was a mistake that should be rectified for the future. Accordingly, I direct that the classifications heretofore made should not be regarded as classifications of dangerousness or as a

determination of fact in any sense. In the future, they should not be used for any purpose whatsoever. Questions raised as to the status or activities of a particular person should be disposed of by consideration of all available information, but without reference to any classification heretofore made.

A copy of this memorandum should be placed in the file of each person who has hitherto been given a classification. In addition, each card upon which a classification appears should be stamped with the following language:

"THIS CLASSIFICATION IS UNRELIABLE. IT IS HEREBY CANCELLED, AND SHOULD NOT BE USED AS A DETERMINATION OF DANGEROUSNESS OR OF ANY OTHER FACT: (SEE MEMORANDUM OF JULY 16, 1943 FROM THE ATTORNEY GENERAL TO HUGH B. COX AND J. EDGAR HOOVER)."

"ILLIAM ROBERT REICH was also State Literature Director for the Communist Party of N.J., and is a teacher in the Lorkers School, 35 East 12th Street, New York City, N.Y., which is also operated by the Communist Party.

In view of these facts it is believed that Dr. WILHELM REICH mentioned in reference letter, and WILLIAM ROBERT REICH, a key figure in the Newark Field Division are not identical.

Reference is made to Bureau letter dated September 23, 1943, stating that the above captioned individual is carried on the key figure list of the New York office, although it was noted by a review of the case that investigation did not indicate he had been active in Communist affairs in this country, and that it was desired that a report be submitted setting forth all significant information received by this office subsequent to the closing report of Special Agent dated February 7, 1942, at New York City, which might tend to substantiate the key figure status given the Subject.

A careful examination of the key figure list maintained by the New York office fails to reflect the name of Dr. WILHELM REICH, although there does appear the name of WILLIAM REICH, an instructor at Worker's School. This office has no information as yet tending to substantiate whether these individuals are identical, although a new case has been opened on WILLIAM REICH. An investigation is presently in progress to ascertain his identity and activities.

Until and unless investigation proves that Dr. WILHELK REICH and WILLIAM REICH are one and the same individuals, the case on WILHELM REICH will be considered closed.

Reference is made to your letter of October 11, 1943, ceptioned, "Er. Hilber Reich; Security Matter - Co in which you state that Dr. Reich's name is not carried on your Key Figure list, but that the name of one William Reich does appear on the list. This William Reich you identify as an instructor at the Worker School and you state that an investigation of him is presently in progress.

For your information, it is pointed out that the Memark Field Office is presently investigating a William Robert Reich who operates a book store located in Newark, Hem Jersey, which is considered the state distribution center of the Communication Party of New Jersey. This William Reich is also the New Jersey state liter-ture director of the Party and is listed as a teacher in the Workers School at 35 E. Lith Street, Hew York City. It would, therefore, appear that the Billiam keich who is named on your Key Figure list is identical with the subject of the Bewark Office's investigation. Accordingly, eny information developed by your offige should be COMMUNICATION TURNS to the Newark Office which is the office of origin at the present
