The report of Special Agent Francis D. O'Brien dated November 12, 1948, at New York City, (Bureau file reference 65-56402-6399) in the case entitled, "Ursula Wasserman, was., Internal Security - R," sets forth the following information which was the basis for the above data sheet:

"On March 1, 1946 arrangements were made through the United States Customs Service, New York City, for the writer and SA Kalnes to be present at Pier 19, Staten Island, New York, at the time the SS Pacific Express was sailing and the baggage of the passengers was to be examined. It was ascertained at this time that Wasserman had in her possession at the time an address book which contained the names of a number of individuals, among which was the name of Arthur Adams, mentioned hereinbefore as a suspected Soviet Agent.

The purpose of this memorandum is to acquaint you with information set forth in the report of SA Lambert G. Zander, October 1, 1946 at Washington, D.C. in the above captioned case which information can not be substantiated.

The Economic Cooperation Administration has requested the Bureau to conduct an investigation of Milton Gilbert (124-2682). Gilbert was previously the subject of a Loyalty Investigation and Bernard R. Bell was a witness for Gilbert at the latter's loyalty hearing.

A review of Bureau records reflect that Bernard R. Bell was the subject of investigation in Bureau files 101-4223 and 77-24900. The report of SA Zander, as previously mentioned, states on page 73 that Bell "has been reported as being active in the Washington Bookshop and as having been chairman of the Cooperative Committee of the Washington Committee for Democractic Action". This same information is set forth in Bureau file 62-60527-14882. A review of the records of the Bureau and of the WFO do not substantiate this statement. The original source of this statement is not known and this information will not be utilized in the present investigation of Gilbert.

It is recommended that this statement not be used in the future.

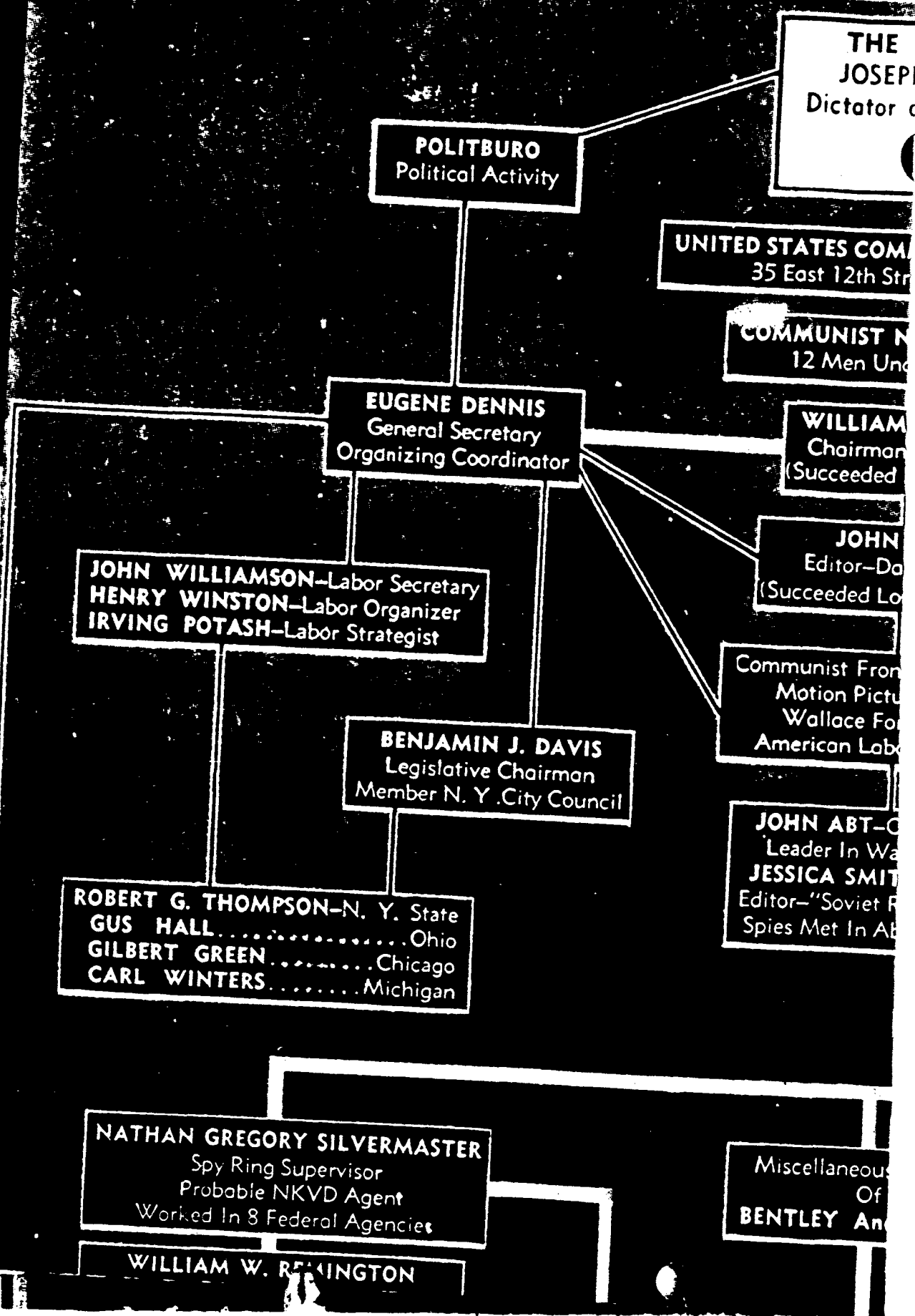

Reference is made to Bureau letter of March 11, 1949, instructing that the Gregory Case be reviewed and separate files opened for each subject and important associate of subjects. Further the all data pertaining to each individual appearing in various files in the Washington Field Office should be incorporated in a separate summary report and furnished to the office where the subject is presently residing, together with recommendations for security index card in the new separate case. (u)

Preliminary examination of the Gregory Case indicates that the number of such individuals will exceed seventy. Many of these are residents of New York City, and have never been actively investigated by the Washington Field Office, and have never lived in Washington, D. C. Several others were out of New York for a time, but returned there prior to active investigation in this case. Some of these are JOHN ABT, LAUCHLIN CURRIE, and PETER RHODES. In some instances no doubt, New York has already made separate investigative files, and will have many references pertaining to these subjects. (u)

In view of the above, it is respectfully suggested that the New York Division is in a better position to prepare summaries on certain subjects presently residing in the New York area where their presence will be a continuing responsibility of that Division. (u)

There are a number of subjects, however, now in New York, who were investigated at length by this office, and Washington Field Office will prepare summary reports on these individuals in any event. (u)

Suggested breakdown of cases to be prepared by the New York Division and the Washington Field Office is set forth hereafter. It is noted that in several instances separate reports have been submitted heretofore. However, these are not indicated separately at this time, and a complete tabulation will be furnished at a later date. (u)

ReNYlet to Director dated November 3, 1948 in the Gregory Case, File Number 100-17493, serial 5904, in which New York transmitted photostatic copies of a letter written by Mrs. JOSEPHINE A. BOCK of 807 Varnum Street, N. W., Washington, D. C. to LOUIS BUDENZ who made the letter available to an Agent.

In this letter Mrs. BOCK stated that she worked for the Air Corps under ULLMAN and SILVERMAN in 1943 and said that she had known of their Communistic tactics. She said that she wished to have an interview with Mr. BUDENZ so that he could explain to her what tactics these people (SILVERMAN and ULLMAN) were using on her.

It was determined from a review of WFO files 100-13428, 101-1503, 100-0-1402, and 62-0-9470A, that Mrs. BOCK has made numerous complaints to the WFO in the past about alleged subversives, all of which appear to be unfounded. On August 4, 1948 she appeared at the WFO and said that the Navy had requested that she go to the U. S. Public Health Service for the purpose of having a mental examination. She informed that she had a private physician, Dr. HENRY HADLEY, who told her that he had been in touch with the Navy Department in connection with this matter and a nurse at the Navy Department told Dr. HADLEY that one of the things that was an indication that there was something wrong with her mentally was that she reported numerous things to the FBI that were unfounded. Mrs. BOCK said that she felt the request of the Navy Department that she have a mental test was the result of the work of some Communistic group in the Navy Department trying to get rid of her.

Mrs. HELENA SMITH, who had been Administrative Assistant in the Analysis and Plans Group which SILVERMAN headed, was interviewed and she said that Mrs. BOCK had not worked very long in that section and had only been a minor employee and Mrs. SMITH did not believe that she was at all acquainted with SILVERMAN. Mrs. SMITH described Mrs. BOCK as being "rather peculiar".

In view of the above, Mrs. BOCK is not being interviewed at this time.

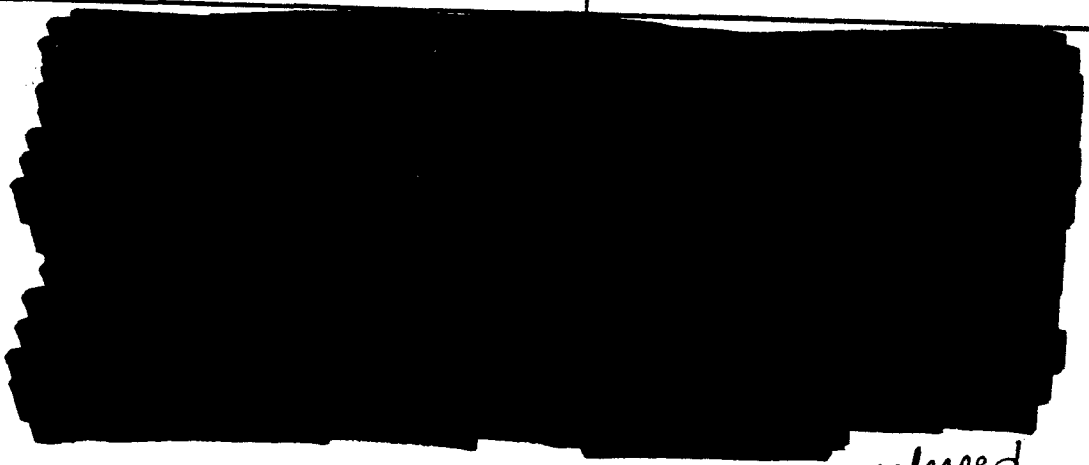

principals of GREGORY just prior to the advent of JOSEPH KATZ previously known as unknown subject; JACK, who is the subject of instant case.

This letter suggested WANDA MARVIN as possibly identical with unknown subject, CATHERINE, and made reference to the surveillance of JOSEPH KATZ on May 27, 1944, when he was followed to the apartment of WANDA MARVIN, after having been observed in meeting with MIKHAIL A. CHALIAPIN of the Russian Consulate, New York City. From available serials, it is understood the above surveillance placed JOSEPH KATZ in the apartment building at 64 W. 55th Street, New York City where WANDA MARVIN was a resident, as was JANET RANKIN, since married to EUGENE W. SILITCH, and that KATZ was not actually followed to a particular apartment within the building. Later, he was identified tentatively as a visitor of JANET RANKIN, this identification being predicated upon the recollection of FRANK O'NEAL, apartment superintendent at 64 W. 55th Street.

Although EUGENE W. SILITCH appears to be a somewhat questionable character, nothing reported thus far appears to cast suspicion upon JANET RANKIN directly as a Communist or Soviet sympathizer. For this reason, it appears quite possible that KATZ may have visited some individual other than JANET RANKIN during the surveillance of May 27, 1944. This individual could have been MARK or WANDA MARVIN and may have been some entirely different person.

It is recalled that unknown subject, CATHERINE, first came into the picture in the Gregory case in October 1943. JACOB GOLOS was aware of her existence and advised informant GREGORY of the coming meeting with CATHERINE through MARGARET (OLGA PRAVDINA). Shortly thereafter, unknown subject, BILL, entered the case following the death of GOLOS, on Thanksgiving 1943 and continued to serve as a contact for GREGORY until October 1944 when BILL set up the arrangements for GREGORY's meeting with JOSEPH KATZ as "unknown subject JACK." The above matter is recalled to indicate the probable close association between JOSEPH KATZ and unknown subjects BILL and CATHERINE. Because of this probable connection, sufficient copies of this report in this case are being designated for the Bureau and other offices for inclusion in the respective files in the case entitled "Unknown Subjects, BILL and CATHERINE."

Remytel to Bureau dated June 13, 1949. WALTER M. DeCEW of the Process Engineering Company, Mt. Vernon, New York, was interviewed concerning his information on an individual named PERAZICH who was formerly connected with UNRRA and had represented UNRRA in Yugoslavia. This individual, PERAZICH, believed identical with GEORGE M. PERAZICH, a subject in the investigation "GREGORY; ESPIONAGE - R" and named by ELIZABETH BENTLEY as a member of the Penlo Group.

DeCEW stated that approximately one year ago PERAZICH came to him seeking a position as an economist on the magazine "Nucleonics", a McGraw-Hill publication of nuclear technology. At that time DeCEW was the technical editor of the magazine. It is to be noted that DeCEW is listed among the staff of experts on the above magazine as a physicist and mathematician having a background of intimate association with the Atomic Project at Oak Ridge and Los Alamos. DeCEW advised that he ascertained from PERAZICH, who had verbal recommendations from the following Chicago University professors: JACOB MARSCHAK, LEO SZILARD, EDWARD LEVI and SAMUEL SCHURR, that PERAZICH was an engineer whose specialty was determination of the economic implications of new scientific advances.

DeCEW ascertained that about two years ago PERAZICH was employed by the Econometric Society which was commissioned to write a report on "Economics of Atomic Power" dealing with the practical use of atomic energy by industry and the general public. DeCEW believed that PERAZICH became connected with this project through the influence of a close friend, LEO SZILARD, who DeCEW describes as a dangerously pro-Russian and possibly a Communist. Also, he is believed to have assisted in the writing of the Atomic Energy Act.

The above-mentioned report was the result of a research project conducted by PERAZICH who acted as an engineer and in association with JACOB MARSCHAK and SAMUEL SCHURR, economists at Chicago University. In conducting the research, DeCEW states that PERAZICH, through the influence of this Chicago University group, was able to go to Oak Ridge where he interviewed GALE YOUNG and JOHN MENEKE, scientists at that project. DeCEW alleges that he obtained classified information from them although this information may possibly be declassified at the present time. DeCEW believed that from his conversation with PERAZICH, he had an intimate knowledge of nuclear reaction which indicated he may have obtained classified data. DeCEW does not question the loyalty of YOUNG and

MENEKE, both of whom are known to him. DeCEW recalled that this report was reviewed in the Harvard Law Review by EDWARD LEVI, a law professor at Chicago University, and he also believed that JOHN MENEKE had written a review in the publication "Econometric". He stated that at the present time the report is being put into book form and it will be published by the Princeton University Press and is expected to be presented to the general public in the near future. DeCEW stated that PERAZICH, who had an engineering education in Yugoslavia, assisted the Chicago economists in translating atomic energy data which was included in their report.

DeCEW stated that he had been employed on the atomic bomb project at Oak Ridge and also Los Alamos during the war and that he had entered the United States Army as a private and was assigned to Oak Ridge where he handled various mathematical problems in connection with the project.

DeCEW stated that he had been very disgusted with the manner in which the Atomic Energy Program has been conducted especially that policy of the government of concealing atomic secrets from industry. He described the entire atomic energy program as a socialized industry and by means of their control of patent rights this would be utilized as a vehicle to ^{referred} socialization of basic industries. He stated that he believed that FREDERICK VOLIOT CURIE, the head of the French Atomic Energy Commission, set the Communist Party line on atomic energy throughout the entire world. He stated that ALEXANDER SACHS of New York City, who first consulted President ROOSEVELT on the atomic bomb project, was in accord with this concerning CURIE. He pointed out in this connection that he had been in contact with various atomic energy scientists in his position as technical editor of "Nucleonics" and that he had learned from GEORGE HENERY (Ph.) who is identified with the Atomic Energy Program of Denmark and Sweden, that he had refused to cooperate in the transmitting of information to CURIE for this reason.

DeCEW stated that shortly after the election of President TRUMAN, a meeting was held in New York City of the Federation of American Scientists at which were discussed resolutions to be taken up in an effort to change the present Atomic Energy Program. In this connection, he mentioned that the group were very much against the requirement of FBI clearance of various atomic energy personnel and they had blamed LILIENTHAL, the chairman of the Atomic Energy Commission, for not keeping the FBI out. Also under discussion was an effort to have new hearings on the McMahon Act in order to write in new

provisions relaxing security restrictions. DeCEW stated that the scientists are a very influential group in the administration of the Atomic Energy Program. He stated that LILLIENTHAL, Atomic Energy Commission chairman, had been forced to clear FRANK GRAHAM, now Senator GRAHAM, formerly of North Carolina University, and Dr. EDWARD U. CONDON, otherwise LILLIENTHAL was threatened with the loss of the much needed support of the scientists in his administration of the program. DeCEW stated that by his maneuver in clearing GRAHAM and CONDON for access to atomic secrets, that LILLIENTHAL won over the scientists' support.

The above information is being submitted to the Bureau in view of the fact that DeCEW has stated that he was interviewed by DONALD APPEL of the House Un-American Activities Committee and an unidentified New York "Journal American" reporter on Thursday, last. DeCEW stated that if he recalls any further information which would be of interest to the Bureau, he would make it available to the New York Office.

By letter dated March 11, 1949, the Bureau instructed the Washington Field Office to immediately review the file in the Gregory case and to open thereafter separate investigative files on each individual mentioned by Gregory or any other individuals who, through investigation in connection with the Gregory case, appear to warrant further attention by the Bureau. The Bureau instructed further that these new case files should be opened under the appropriate caption, such as, "Internal Security - C or R," "Espionage - R" or "Security Matter - C."

The Washington Field Office subsequently suggested by letter dated March 22, 1949 that the New York Office should prepare summaries on certain subjects presently residing in the New York area and those subjects were listed.

The Bureau by letter dated April 4, 1949 agreed that the New York Office should prepare such summaries and requested that this matter receive immediate and expeditious attention by both the New York and Washington Field Offices.

On May 5, 1949, the New York and Washington Field Offices were requested to immediately advise the Bureau of the status of this project in their respective offices.

The files of the Bureau reflect that your office has not complied with the Bureau's request contained in Bureau letter dated May 5, 1949. Therefore, you are instructed to submit an explanation as to why these instructions were ignored. Further, you are instructed to place this matter in line for immediate handling.

Rebulet July 22, 1949, which called attention to previous requests and instructions set out in Bulet March 11, 1949, to the Washington Field Office concerning the preparation by the field of separate summary reports on the various subjects in this case. In reference letter attention of the New York Office was also called to Bulet dated April 4, 1949, wherein the Bureau agreed with recommendations of the Washington Field Office that summary reports of certain subjects in this case could be more properly prepared by the New York Office. This letter further requested that the matters of the preparation of summaries receive immediate and expeditious attention.

The New York Office was not in receipt of Bureau letter dated March 11, 1949, which contained the basic instructions and authorization for the preparation of the individual summaries in this matter, until the same was forwarded on request by the Washington Field Office. At the present time, on the basis of the foregoing instructions, the New York Office has opened and assigned cases on all of the subjects which were designated for summarization by the New York Office and specifically mentioned in the letter from the Washington Field Office to the Bureau dated March 22, 1949. These summaries are, and for some time past have been, in process of preparation. The Bureau should be in receipt of the said reports regularly and periodically until the project has been completed.

It is regretted that the instructions of the Bureau, particularly those contained in Bureau letter dated May 5, 1949, wherein advice was requested as to the status of this project, were not completely and expeditiously complied with. However, it is to be pointed out that for the most part the personnel to whom the cases were assigned, and who are familiar with the GREGORY subjects, were actively and continuously engaged in the HISS trial until its completion on July 8, 1949. In compliance with the instructions set out in referenced Bureau letter of July 22, 1949, these matters have been placed in line for immediate handling, and it is contemplated that the project of the various summaries on the GREGORY subjects will be completed by the New York Office at a very early date.

Rebuletts 3/11, 4/4 and 7/22/49. In accordance therewith, separate investigative files have been opened in this office on various subjects, mentioned by GREGORY, who reside in the New York area; and on those unknown subjects who are believed to be located in this area. More particularly, summaries in individual case files have been prepared or are in the process of being prepared on those subjects specifically mentioned in WFO letter to Bureau and New York dated 3/22 last. In addition, separate case files have been opened on subjects where further investigation has been suggested at New York by other offices. In each instance, further investigation under appropriate captions or recommendation of security index cards has been or will be given individual consideration.

As set out in New York letter to Bureau dated 8/17/49, the Bureau was advised that ELIZABETH TERRILL BENTLEY intends to proceed to Chicago, Illinois, to take up a teaching post at Mundelein College in that city. Miss BENTLEY plans to reside at the home of Mrs. LANWERS, 1533 Highland Avenue, Chicago 40, Illinois, and arrangements were made whereby she could be contacted by the Chicago Office.

The Special Grand Jury which was impanelled to hear Espionage matters in the Southern District of New York has been recessed for some time; no additional witnesses have been scheduled for appearance before that body; nor is it contemplated at this time that witnesses will be scheduled, except possibly in connection with the ALGER HISS retrial. SAAG T. J. Donegan, who has handled the Grand Jury, is actively engaged in the HISS matter. Close liaison is being maintained by this office with Mr. Donegan, and if the Grand Jury reconvenes and hears additional testimony, appropriate action will be taken and the Bureau immediately advised. A review of the file reflects that all leads at New York have been covered and no stops are outstanding.

In view of the foregoing, this matter is being Referred upon Completion to the Washington Field Office. In the event further pertinent information is received at New York, the Bureau and the WFO will be immediately advised. RUC.
