On November 27, 1945, a Wrs. Steinberg phoned Wrs. Gregory in the latter had Gares! (phonetic) address handy as she thought Wr. Steinberg would like to say hello to him when he went to New York the following week. Wrs. Silvermaster stated that this address was in the address book which Gregory Silvermaster carried on his person. It was indicated that Steinberg was employed in the Justice Department.

It is believed that Steinberg has been identified now as Morton Haskell Steinberg, 5335 32nd Street, Washington, D. C. He was the subject of a Departmental Applicant, Special Assistant to the Attorney General, Antitrust Division Investigation in June of 1944.

Steinberg was born in St. Ignace, Michigan, November 17, 1900. His legal residence is Muskegon, Michigan. He received an A.B. degree at the University of Wisconsin; an LL.R. degree from the University of Detroit in 1926; and attended the Georgetown School of Foreign Service, Washington, D. C. in 1934 and 1935.

He was employed by the National Recovery Administration, Washington, D. C., as Assistant Counsel, February through August, 1934. He was Attorney for General Claims Arbitration between the United States and Mexico from September, 1931 through December, 1936. From January, 1937 through September, 1937 he was Special Counsel for the Special Mexican Claims Commission. From January, 1938 through April, 1943, he was Regional Counsel of the Federal Public Housing Authority. From May, 1943, to September, 1944, he was Division Counsel of the Textile Division for the War Production Board. On September 1, 1944, he was appointed Special Assistant to the Attorney General, Antitrust Division Department of Justice, Washington, D. C. His salary since July 1, 1945, has been \$6,650.00 per annum.


Steinberg's wife's name is Elizabeth. They have two children, Judith age 13 and Daniel age 9.



Information was received from Whittaker Chambers in May of 1945 that Schlomer Adler is definitely a Communist and was employed by the United States Treasury Department. This informant further advised that he knows Adler to have been in close contact with Peter and to have made reports of a financial nature to Peter. He stated that he suspected the Communist Party was playing the stock market and that they utilized Adler's financial infor tion in this connection. It is to be noted that Peter referred to above relates to Alexander Stevens. (100-25824-36, p. 21)

Information was received from Mr. A. A. Berle, Assistant Secretes of State, relative to Sol Adler which he had received from Whittaker Chambe in 1939. This information is to the effect that Schlomer Adler is employed by the W. S. Treasury Department and that he sent weekly reports to the Communist Party (General Counsel's Office). (100-25824-27)

Solomon Adler, United States Treasury Department, was questioned Sureau Agents in econoction with the Philip Jaffe case at which time he admitted that he was acquainted with John Service, having first met him the Fall of 1941 in Changking, China. He advised he considered Service to a loyal, capable and honest person and one mon would not obtain confidential information for the use of anyone . 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On February 15, 1944, Louis Slevitz, 822 Lexington Avenue, New York Citaent three American Express Company traveler's checks for \$50 each to Rose Arenal Paris 7, Maxico, D. F. The mency apparently paid for curios which Rose Arenal obtained for Slevitz. Inquiry ecocerning Slevitz by the New York Field Division reflected that he came and operates a "Pan-American" chop at \$22 Lexington Avenue. New York City. A Laboratory report of June 23, 1944 concerned a letter from Rose to Er. and Ers. Lou Amerbach, \$400 Mayne Avenue, Bronz, New York. This letter contained personal conversation. It was noted, however, that in a letter from Rose to Jos and Bess Beigel there appeared the fellowings "Aurt received your letter and may be I will get some commissions -- into is having trouble with his Mechatany Breeker and Mechatan were previously mentioned in the Alto case as having left Now York on a trip to Mexico. A Laboratory report dated July 22, 1944, concerned a letter addressed to Mrs. Rose Arenal, Kexice, D. F., with the return address A. Siskind, Chilmark, Massachusetts. In this letter the writer said "Are you resigning from the system?"

A Laboratory report of September 20, 1944, concerned a letter of August 29 to Mrs. Resotte Arenal from Myman 2, Melson, Mexican and Indian artist, P. O. Box 377, Summerville, New Jersey. Melson mentioned that a friend of his, John Arvenie, while in Mexico had bought coveral pieces of silver from his expecter in Mexico City. Arenal lost the mane and address of the firm but told Helson that Arenal could furnish Belson with the name of this firm. It later appeared that Mrs. John Arvenie was undertaking a trip to Mexico City in the early part of October, 1944.



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

He received an A.A. degree and in the Fall of 1929 went to Hollins College, Minter Park, Florida, where he majored in psychology and was graduated in 1931 with a B.A. degree. The following year he attended Columbia University and took an M.i. degree there in 1932. He is married to War aret Gusmings Hinckley and they have two children, Charles C. Hinckley and Jill Einckley, as well as an unadopted charge, Million MgHab. It is reported that both Minekley and his wife are American bern.

From September 1933, to January 1935, he was employed as an instructor of psychology at Black Rountain College, Black Mountain, Borth Carolina. From January 1935, to July 1936, he was colf-employed and engaged in research on american Youth problems involving tests of aptitude towards the Chinese in America. This research was made for the Chine Institute. |

Rinerley was the Executive Secretary of the American Touth Congress, a Communist front erganization, from July 1935, to January 1936, and from that time to July 4, 1939, he was Chairman of the American Touth Congress with an office at 80 west 40th Street, New York City. His work was mainly organisetional and, according to his our statement, his responsibilities included the coordination of policy and activities of an ever-expanding mevenent of youth organizations through the American Touth Congress.

From September 1938, to July 1939, he was a Secretary of the American Union for Concerted Peace Efforts and his employer was Clark M. Eichelberger, 8 dest 40th Street, New York City. His work included the preparation of Peace study outlines, the organization of dramatic radio programs, directing the organizing of local peace committees, organization of Peace and Security meek in April 1939, and he also erganized a matienal conference of 100 leaders of public spinion held at the Shoreham Hotel, Mashington, D. C., to bring the sees attitudes of or anised public opinion to the attention of those

From July 1939, to February 1940, he was engaged in preparing a book about American Youth problems. In February 1940, he was appointed Administrative issistant of the Federal Forum Project, United States Office of Education, Federal Security Agency but, according to his statement, upon the expiration of the appropriation his employment was terminated July 30, 1941.

On October 6, 1941, he received a temporary appointment as Economic Staticism, RailFoad Retirement Beard and resigned from that position February 1, 1942. On February 9, 1942, he was appointed Senior Presetion Specialist, Defense Saxurities, Defense Savings Staff, Treasury Department, but following an investigation of his background and activities, he was not retained by the Treasury Department. As of February 1943, Hinckley was employed as Assistant Treasury Department. As of February 1943, Hinckley was employed as Assistant Director of Employment Personnel, American Red Gross, Mashington, D. C. //

In October of 1935 Hinckley, as a member of the Mational Council of the American Youth Congress, set with the Assistant Secretary of State, Balton Moore, and the NIA Aministrator, Ambrey Hilliams, in the Matriot of Columbia to ask that this country make more drastic regulations for peace in view of the Italomethic for passes in view of the Italomethic for and to protest against the imadequacy of the NIA program. ()

In February 1937, Hinekley, as the Chairman of the convention of the Matienal Council, American Youth Congress, at the Maconie Temple, Thirteenth and New York Avenue, Sorthwest, Mashington, D. C., epened the convention and introduced seven members of the United Auto Morkers Union who participated in the sit-down strike at Flint, Michigan. He also introduced John Davis, colored, representing the Lational Megroes Council and, on February 20, 1937, led approximately 1600 alleged students in a parade to the White Rouse to present a petition containing the signatures of some two million persons in favor of the "American Youth Besk." Among the benners carried were "Scholarships not Battleships," "Touth, Cur First Concern," "He want Jobs-That's the American Toute Act," "Young Communist League," et cetra. When informed the parade could not go on the maite House grounds, a sit-down strike occurred which was dispersed after the arrest of the two leaders, Milliam W. Minckley and Abbott Sicon, the Legislative Director of the American Touth Congress. It is to be noted that the police records do not show that Rinckley was arrested. Later the two were received by President Roosevelt.

The information indicates that Rinckley was also connected with the American Peace Robilization, the American League for Peace and Decocracy and it is noted that his picture as head of the Communist controlled American Youth Congress appeared in the Ioung Communist League yearbook for 1937, the Toung Communist League being reportedly a section of the American Youth Congress.

It is further moted that he was made an idulalisticative isolatest to the Commissioner of Education, John E. Studebaker, and was maded by mitacoose before the Mas Constitute as a Communist, according to the Chicago Barald imprison of May 27, 1940. David Weintraub, who has been identified above, emplained that during this period Magdoff's wife, Beatrice Magdoff, was offered a teaching position in New York City, that during this period the Magdoffs resided at 455 West 34th Street in New York and Marry Magdoff semmeted daily from New York to Philadelphia. 

It was at that time that she mut Professor James Mandanhall whom she believed to be a number of the League Against War and Pascism. Elisabeth Benting subsequently determined that both Lee Pohr and Professor Jesus Hendenhall were members of the Communist Party and were active in the Communist movement in the United States at this time (1934). Elizabeth Bentley stated that she reculled that sometime in March, 1935, she, Klisebeth Bentley, became a rogular member of the Communist Party and was sponsored by Professor James Mendenhall and Miss Lee Puhr.

A complete review of the Bureau files was made in the name James Mendembell and it was ascertained that a complete Internal Security, Butch et investigation was conducted of one Dr. James Edgar Mendenhall, who was employed as principal education specialist, Office of Price Administration, Eashington, D. C., and it is believed that this individual may possibly be identical with the above described professor, James Mandachall.

The following information was obtained from a review of the Bureau files conserving this individual:

Office for Emergency Management reveals that he was born in New York City on October 25, 1917 and attended Kemilworth Elementary School, Ridgewood School, Semjamin Franklin Junior Righ School, and Ridgewood Righ School, all Leosted at Ridgewood, New Jersey. He received his Baycheler of Arts degree in June, 1939, from Dartmouth Gollege: Hanover, New Hampshire and in June, 1940, attained his Master of Arts degree from Columbia University. He has completed most of his requirements for a Dector of Philosophy degree at Columbia University, New York City and he was a member of the Phi Bete Rappa fraternity.

Remington was employed as Assistant Industrial Economist in the Consumers Division of the Office for Emergency Management at \$3,200 per year. The file further reflects that from September, 1936 to May, 1937, he was employed on the Tennesses Valley Authority Project, Enoxville, Tennesses from April, 1937 until August, 1937, Workers Education Committee, Enoxville, Tennesses; and from May, 1940 to July, 1941 as Junior Economist, Mational Resources Planning Board, Mashington, D. C.

Remington is believed to have been an active member of the American pulper People's Mebilisation and regular meetings of this organisation were held with at the apartment of Anna Goodman, where Remington and his wife, Ann Remington, errowers regularly in attendance. Remington was one of several individuals who solicited funds for the housing of the American Touth Congress delegates during their convention in Eashington, D. C., which was held from February 7 to February 9, 1941. Remington and his wife were members of the Geoperative League and Rochdale Stores, including the Geoperative Book Shop.

Buring a subsequent investigation conducted by a Congressional committee, Menry Mart admitted he was a member of the Communist Party. (101-1185)

Investigation conducted by Army intelligence relative to divate the Thomas Hamilton reflects that William P. Remington, formerly resident at 2225 M Street, Northwest, Washington, D. C., was listed as an acquaintance of Marilton. The investigation conducted further reflects that Marilton was definitely believed to have Communist sympathies and was actively engaged in Communist activity.





Representative Howard W. Smith was Chairman of this Committee. 

On occasion the subject would obtain copies of United States Treasury documents made by Sonya Gold in the office of Harry D. White and deliver them to the informant on the latter's visits to the Milvernaster home.

Elisabeth Terrill Bentley in her statement advised that about April, 1941, the United States Service and Shipping Corporation started business with offices at 212 Fifth Avenue, New York City. At this time Reynolds was President and Treasurer; Elisabeth Bentley was the Vice President; and Max Spector was Assistant Treasurer. Spector, according to Elisabeth Bentley, was formerly associated with the Amtorg Trading Corporation and although she knew he was a Communist, she had no information that would indicate that Max Spector was involved in any other activities.

A complete review of the Bureau files was made in the mame of Max Spector which reflected little background information concerning this individual as follows:

The paper in this article gave her activities stating that she had gone to Spain en Jameary 16 (1937) with the First Medical Bureau to Aid Spanish Denouracy, Medical Smit, and that she had returned to the United States to lecture during the Spanish Aid Week of May 30 to June 9. According to this article, Lini Fuhr was born in New Jameary of Dutch parents and as a small child worked as a bobbin girl in Sew Jersey factory. At the age of sixteen, she became a telephone operator and at eighteen, began training at New Rochelle Mospital as a nurse.



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

In line with the foregoing the writer and Special Agent Winterrowd, in their recent interview with Budenz, made certain inquiries for the purpose of determine the nature of his relationship with Golos and Bentley. When this subject was initially mentioned Budenz furnished little information of value, although he did state that to the best of his recollection he, Budenz, initiated the original contact with Golos in New York City, at which time Budenz was affiliated with the Chicago Communist "Midwest Record." He stated that, to the best of his recollection at the time he travelled to New York City to obtain advertising for his newspaper since it was infinancial arrears at which time someone suggested to him that he might obtain advertising from Jacob Golos who Budenz believes was affiliated with World Tourists. Budenz stated further at the time of our original inquiry that he would contact Golos; that he would receive advertising commitments for his paper from Golos; and that as far as he could recall then he saw Golos between six and twelve times from the time of his initial contact until the latter part of 1943. (Golos died in November, 1943.)

When interviewed by the writer and Special Agent Winterrowd on a subsequent date, Mr. Budenz stated that during the intervening period he had given much thought to our earlier discussions and that in connection with the instant matter he had additional information to offer. He related that he now recalled having met and having been acquainted with Golos for a much longer period of time than he had previously stated. He advised that to the best of his recollection he has known Golos since 1925 and possibly even since 1922. In an endeavor to accurately place his original contact in point of time he stated that he more than likely made his U

initial acquaintance with Golos when Sidney Billman was the head of the Russian-American Corporation, and during which period Golos was an official in another organisation (name not recalled) which was Communist in its political orientation.

At this point Budenz stated that in addition to knowing Golos he also knew Bentley wbut he knew her by the name of Helen Johns. Immediately thereafter he stated that even though Bentley utilized the name of Helen Johns in her associations with Budenz he knew at the same time that her name was actually Elizabeth Bentley.

At this point in the interview, Budens digressed temporarily by stating that one thing which recalls to his mind his relationship with Golos and Bentley was an incident which arose in connection with a United States citizen of Czech descent, who was the viewed by many in the United States as an authority on Czech matters. This individual's last name was Rubes (phonetic). From the manner in which Laura Rubes acted, Budenz was not entirely conwinced of her sincerity; in fact he had the impression for a time that she might have been "watching" or spying on Budenz' activities. Accordingly, Budenz discussed the Rubes woman with Elizabeth Johnstone, the wife of Jack Johnstone and an individual who was formerly married to a Czech and who knew the background of the Czechs very well. Elizabeth Johnstone furnished general information to Budenz concerning Laura Rubes, which information apparently satisfied him as to her reliability. (The latter deduction is one of inference only since Budens did not actually state this to the interviewing Agents.) In any event, at about this time Laura Rubes advised Budenz that she had a letter from her father who was then in Cairo and who, according to Budenz, was representing United States interests and may even have been a representative of the United States Government in Egypt. At this point Budenz advise Golos of the receipt of the Rubes letter and of the fact that Laura Rubes! father was in Cairo whereupon, according to Budenz, Golos "seemed interested." Elucidating upon this interest of Golos, Budenz stated that he got the definite impression from Golos that he seemed interested in knowing what Mr. Rubes! attitude might be toward Tito and in knowing whether Rubes might be getting in touch with King Peter. U

Next Budenz advised that he and Golos occasionally discussed Adamic and his attitude at that time concerning a Federated Yugoslavia. He stated that he, Budenz, would make reports on what people such as Adamic said concerning problems such as the Yugoslavian one; that these reports would be made to Browder or Landy was a regular thing; and that he may also have furnished them to Golos but he didn't recall.

Budenz asserted that from his contacts with Golos it would appear that the latter was more interested in Yugoslav subjects than in anything else.

Inasmich as Adamic's attitude at that time concerning a Federated Yugoslavia was in conflict with the policies expressed by the Soviet Union concerning the Slavic peoples, and in view of Budenz' very friendly relationship with Adamic, the following question was put to Budenz: "Would Golos try to get you to bring pressure to bear upon Adamic in order that he might change his policy regarding a Federated Yugoslavia," whereupon Budenz replied that Golos, Browder and Landy all tried to get Budenz to have Adamic change his policy. (It may be considered noteworthy that subsequently Adamic did substantially alter his expressions on the question of a Federated Yugoslavia, and altered them in such a fashion as to bring his dieas in line with those expressed by Soviet officials.)

Continuing, Budenz expressed the conviction that Golos was a "runner" between the Soviets and interested groups in the United States.  $\bigcup$ 

Getting back to the subject of Helen Johns alias Bentley, Budenz advised that Golos told him that he, Golos, had heart trouble; that accordingly he wanted Budens to furnish any information he received in the future concerning such matters as the foregoing to Helen Johns inasmuch as she was trustworthy and because she would in turn make the information available to Golos. At this point in discussing Helen Johns, Budenz inferred that she was a behind-the-scene operator since he would see her occasionally in the building occupied by Communist Party headquarters at which time she would obviously indicate to Budenz that she did not want him to recognize her while in the building. U

In recalling the peculiar nature of the activities engaged in by both Golos and Johns, Budenz stated that he got the distinct impression that both Golos and Johns were working for the Control Commission, and that Golos was actually a member of that Commission (which entity Budenz described as being one which is supposed to regulate the conduct of Communist Party members.) Budenz stated that from their activities he got the impression that they may have been engaged in some defensive measures for protective purposes with respect to certain of the activities in which some of the Communist Party members were engaged. U

At this point, Budens launched into a discussion of the Control Commission and he made certain comments which are of such a nature that they are worthy of quoting herein:

At this point, in order to emphasize the importance of the Control Commission, Budenz recalled an incident which obviously relates to the activities of that Commission. He stated that when Casey was affiliated with the "Daily Worker" there was a lot of eruption in Party and "Daily Worker" headquarters; that Casey was so afraid of the ninth floor (the officials of the Communist Party) that he did things on his own without conferring with or soliciting the advice of Communist Party officials; that on one occasion Budenz himself wrote a ten page editorial on the Chinese question; that Casey apparently disagreed with the policy of the editorial and, therefore, without conferring with the hierarchy of the Party tore up the editorial and as a result, when the "Daily Worker" of that date was ready to appear on the streets, it contained ten pages of blank space. As a result there was a tremendous eruption in Communist Party and "Daily Worker" headquarters and Meveryone was considered suspect." At this point, Bittleman discussed the matter with Budenz; Budenz advised him that Casey tore up the editorial; whereupon Bittleman stated that "he would call Golos on the Control Commission." When Budens Indicated that he would bring the matter to the attention of Golos on the Control Commission, Harry Gannis begged him not to do it and, according to Budenz, Bittleman did not refer the matter to Golos on the Control Commission.

continuing, Budenz stated: "I think the question of the Control Commission is a very important one—all through the years we've heard the Control Commission spoken of from time to time, sometimes even at National Committee meetings"—but apparently spoken of in a surreptitious fashion.

Additional inquiries were made of Budenz of the Control Commission and he did furnish information of value which will be set out in subsequent memoranda under suitable captions.

Justice sought or solicited Budens to register as an agent of a foreign principal, he discussed the matter with Joa Brodsky at which time Brodsky referred to past Registration Act cases involving Communists and specifically to the Golos case (who you will recall was convicted for violating the terms of the Foreign Agents Registration Act in March, 1940.) Brodsky stated at the time that Golos was purposely made a "fall man" and that it was prearranged by high ranking functionarie here that Golos would submit to prosecution.

#### OBSERVATION:

It will be observed that Budenz has confirmed in its entirety that portion of the Bentley statement which relates to the association existing between them and the activities engaged in by Golos, Bentley and Budenz. It is further observed that an Agent having a thorough knowledge of the Silvermaster case might well be able to elicit from Budenz additional information concerning other principals in the case. Accordingly, it is suggested that consideration might be given the advisability of a subsequent interview with Budenz by the qualified Agent relative to certain additional details of the Silvermaster matter.

In this regard it will be recalled that Budens has indicated to the writer that he hopes to be in Washington the first of the year at which time he will make contact with the writer. If such contact is made you will be immediately advised, at which time you may desire considering the advisability of having Budenz interviewed in greater detail with respect to sthewangles of the Silvermaster case by Special Agent Lish Whitson.

It should be noted that this communication was prepared on a Russian typewriter. Translated this letter reads as follows:

"Dear Elena Petrovna

"Many, many thanks for the photos. The last few days I have been running around in circles, as they say, trying to have a picture taken which would at least be presentable. Unfortunately, nothing came of my efforts, inasmuch as the good photographers are swamped with work and will not fill orders for three weeks, and the lousy ones take pictures that are horrible to look at. I had myself photographed just the same, but it came out terribly. I was ready to trim down that large picture on all sides, but it looked so strange then - the face alone. When I came home yesterday I was very pleasantly surprised to receive your letter. Once again many thanks to you and Lada. It was awfully nice of him to do the printing. If you had sent the films, I could have done it here quite quickly by asking one of Vilmin's acquaintances, who is in the photography business, or rather he develops his favorite photographs himself. Now I can send off my application without further delay, thanks to your 'kindness'. RX - 11

"Yesterday we had such terrible weather that it took he and hour and a half to get home from work - the snowdrifts were so high 46 and there was such a traffic tie-up. My legs got numb while I was waiting for a bus. It's no fun poking along on the busses, but it is not so bad as driving a car in such weather. I quite understand how you felt sliding along Washington's mountainous (sic) streets.

"But all's well that ends well... So Anatoli left by plane. You did not have very long to enjoy him. How does he feel, generally speaking? I hope being in the service hasn't gotten him off the track in a moral sense. So he is going to take up his scientific studies again. It's wonderful that you have such a capable, intelligent boy, who is not lazy. That is so important in life. And how is your nephew, the one who was a pilot?

"Incidentally, I didn't recognize your handwriting in the last letter. It was much finer than usual. I was glad to learn that your hand is getting back to normal. That is really a very disagreeable thing. What does your doctor say about it? You said nothing about it in your letter.

"Here we are, with the winter almost half over. It is strange how quickly time flies. As usual my situation is quite uncertain and I don't know what I'll decide to do. But for the time being there is no use guessing.

"It is time for me to close. Please convey my thanks to Lada and ask him to forgive me for bothering him. Perhaps some time or other I can do something for him. Who knows what the future will bring?

"And again my thanks to you. If I can do anything for you, please write.

"I shall finish for the present. I still have a hundred different things to do; I run around all the time like a squirrel in a wheel.

The informant in this case, Elizabeth Terrill Bentley, has vised that one of her previous Russian contacts known to her only as ack" had indicated that the NKVD had code designations for the various gencies of the United States Government. It is her recollection that the de designation for the FBI was "hotel".

Jack also cautioned Bentley to stay away from the Soviet Consulate General in New York City inasmuch as he believed the FBI had the Consulate General building under observation and that he did not want her to be identified as a person with Soviet contacts I

Another item of interest furnished by informant Bentley was in regard to the attempt by OSS to establish an office in Moscow in December of 1943 with a corresponding office for the NKVD to be set up in Washington, D. C. Bentley found out about this from Duncan Lee of OSS who was associated with William Donovan's law firm in Mew York. According to Bentley, Lee said that President Roosevelt and Admiral Leahy were not in favor of the plan but that you had stated that it would not make much difference because the NKVD had been operating in the United States since the Amtorg Trading Corporation was established in New York City. She also said that Major Lee was frightened about the prospects of an official NKVD mission coming to the United States because he had visions NKVD visiting him at his home and thanking him for his cooperation.
