MEMORANDUM FOR THE DIRECTOR

Re: ALBERT EUGENE KAHN;

Pursuant to your request, there is set out below brief, identifying information concerning Albert E. Kahn.

Peoples Fraternal Order which is the Jewish section and by far the most power-ful section of the International Workers Order, primary Communist Front in the foreign language field. Kahn is a Communist, is known to be extremely pro-Soviet and extremely anti-Bureau and in the past has been identified with the publication of a number of pro-Communist, pro-Soviet publications including The Hours. Kahn has also contributed material to the officially recognized Communist press.

It will be recalled that the informant Gregory in the Bilvermaster case has advised that Kahn furnished information to Jacob M. Golos, important Soviet agent who was Gregory's superior until his death on November 27, 1943, in New York (1968) Expertigation of Kahn in connection with the Silvermaster case has not yet reflected that he is presently involved in perational active Soviet espionage.

It will be recalled also that Albert B. Kahn was apparently instrumental in furnishing George Seldes, Editor of "In Fact", with the highly unreliable and specious statement of Alexy Pelypenko concerning Father Charles E. Coughlin whose statement was made the basis for a "blast" in both "In Fact" and the "Daily Worker", which "blast" it should be noted was directed at the Department of Justice but did not name the Bureau.

Albert E. Kahn is a figure of considerable importance in Communist activities and particularly in Communist Jewish activities. It appears probable that his desire to go to Poland is in some way connected with the Professional Communist-Jawish organization of which he has so long been a part.



In connection with the above case there is set out below information concerning Silvermaster obtained discreetly by Mr. Leo L. Laughlin, former Bureau SAC now connected with the War Assets Corporation, from Charles H. Keeting, a former employee of the Civil Service Commission now employed by the Office of Compliance Enforcement, War Assets Corporation.

The following information concerning Silvermaster was obtained discreetly through several conversations with Charles M. Keeting, formerly with the Civil Service Commission and now employed as an agent in the Office of Compliance Enforcements

"Around 1943 Silvermaster was employed by the Department of Agriculture, and he went from there to the Foreign Economic Administration on a reimbursable basis. He refused to transfer until cleared by Civil Service Commission, Keeting gave them a hearing. However, Silvermaster sensing that was in the air went back to Agriculture and Civil Service lost jurisdiction. Keeting insisted that if he had transferred to FRA Civil Service probably would have had him removed because of un-American activities on the theory that all appointments to FRA were subject to investigation by Civil Service.

"Alfred Klein, Council for the Civil Service Commission, indicated by an informal memorandum that even if the Civil Service Commission had jurisdiction over Silvermaster, he probably would have retained his eligibility because the Commission had been unable to prove recent activities on the part of the subject.

"According to Keeting, the Department of Agriculture conducted quite an extensive investigation on Silvermaster. This Enquiry was handled by an Investigator named Johns, who was attached to the office of the Chief Investigator Forester.

"Keeting also alleges that the American Legion in the State of California has a large file on Silvermaster and has been invisting from time to time, when his name arises in connection with Government employment, that he be removed from Government service.

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answer to the various allegations in the report, and the report with Silvermaster's answer was referred to Secretary of War Patterson. He ruled that in his opinion a case had not been made against the subject.

"Keeting states that Silvermaster's alleged Party name is Serge Komov and that he was a member of the Professional Section of the Communist Party in Ban Francisco, California, Keeting says, according to investigation conducted by Civil Service, Silvermaster has been underground since about 1935. He added that the Civil Service Commission has a 200 page report on this individual. He also stated that Silvermaster is an extremely close friend of Bruce Minton, whose real name is Richard Brandenstein, alias Richard Branston, the editor of 'New Masses'."

In addition to the above information, a photostatic copy has been obtained in strictest confidence of Silvermaster's personnel file at the War assets Corporation, a copy of which will be made available to you for your confidential information and assistance in connection with the above case as soon as possible.





Dear Sir:

During the course of investigation of the captioned case, subject JOSEPH/CREGG has come to New York on several occasions. Usually these visits were ostensibly for the purpose of having dental work performed at the offices of Dr. A. B. WEINSTEIN, who has figured prominently as a suspect in the investigation.

On February 15, 1946, CREGG came from his brother's residence in Newark to the office of Dr. WEINSTEIN at 20 East 53rd Street, arriving at about 10:00 A.M. He remained in Dr. WEINSTEIN'S office until 1:10 P.M. After lunching at a nearby restaurant he began a shopping tour which took him into a number of stores. As soon as surveillance was instituted it was obvious to the surveilling agents that CREGG was taking highly unusual precautions to determine whether he was under surveillance. In the various stores it was obvious that he was more interested in determining whether or not he was being followed than he was in making any purchases. At one store he was observed to stop at a tie counter and subsequently to assume a crouching position so that his whole body was below the counter level. He then remained in this position and by peering over the top of the counter endeavored to ascertain whether or not he was being followed.

On the occasion of CREGG'S last visit to New York on March 21st, he again went to WEINSTEIN'S office at about 10:30 A.M. and left there at about 1:20 P.M. He immediately embarked upon a series of maneuvers and evasive tactics, going in and out of Fifth Avenue stores, entering by one door and immediately exiting by another door. He would stop in front of store windows, using same as mirrors in his attempt to determine whether there was anyone behind him. He would stop in the middle of the street and turn completely around, obviously examining the faces of all persons who were behind him. On one occasion he stood on a crowded street corner for at least fifteen minutes, ostensibly reading a newspaper. It was obvious to the surveilling agents, who were, of course, discreetly concealed, that he was again attempting to discover whether anyone were watching him. - 5640

CREGG eventually entered the main entrance of Hotel at Madison Avenue and 46th Street. At this time there were the

on foot and one agent driving a car. The agents on foot entered the lobby as soon as a discreet interval had elapsed and observed CREGG passing down a corridor towards the men's bar. The surveilling agents went down the same corridor and, having ascertained that CREGG was not in the men's bar, immediately went out of a door at the end of the aforementioned corridor, which also exits on Madison Avenue. In the meantime the agent driving the car had observed CREGG come out of the last mentioned exit. CREGG of course had entered and left the hotel only as an evasive maneuver. Due to heavy traffic conditions it was impossible for the agent in the car to leave the vehicle. He directed the two agents on foot, but they were unable to find CREGG in the heavy pedestrian traffic. CREGG was located on the following day in the vicinity of WEINSTEIN'S office.

The above information is set out in order that the Bureau may be aware of the extreme difficulty encountered in attempting to maintain a discreet surveillance in this city. On the occasion of GREGI'S last visit to New York the surveillance was lost in the interest of discretion. Since the inception of this investigation every precaution has been taken so that the various surveillances would be conducted on a most circumspect basis. With regard to subject GREGG, however, it appears that a completely discreet and yet fully effective physical surveillance is virtually impossible.

It is felt that the Bureau may desire to authorize a somewhat closer coverage of CREGG on his visits to New York City, assuming, of course, that every attempt would be made to conduct the physical surveillances on the most discreet possible basis.



On March 15, 1945 MARINI advised JEROME's secretary that he had already fur the desired information to JEROME relative to the Vatican political activities. On the basis of recently developed information, it appears that Ursula Wasserman is, at the present time, deeply involved in Soviet espionage operations in the United States and possibly in Latin America. She first came up in connection with the Gregory Case in view of the activities of her paramour, Jules Korchein, Korchein is a partner of Abraham Brothman, a consulting engineer, who at least as late as the fall of 1940, is known to have been furnishing commercial blue prints to the MKVD through the Soviet agent Jacob Golos (Who died 67)

Masserman apparently was intended to be used as an intermediary by a strongly suspected Soviet agent who re-entered the United States from Europe on March 8, 1946, carrying a package which reportedly contained a "political testament" from France and which was delivered through intermediaries to Alexander Trachtenberg, a Mational Functionary of the Communist Party - USA. It is noted that the strongly suspected Soviet agent who carried this document into the United States had directed a latter to Ursula Wasserman requesting that Wasserman meet the boat on which the suspected agent was arriving. As noted, at this time, however, Masserman had already departed for Buenos Aires and the letter was opened by Jules Korchein, who met the suspected agent and took her to Masserman's empty apartment in New York City.

In view of the importance of Wasserman's activities and contacts at the present time, it will be appreciated if you will furnish us all information available to you or which you can procure regarding the individuals and addresses listed above. In connection with the

It should be noted in this connection that while voluminous references were contained in the Bureau files to individuals of these names, the various reviews which have been conducted reflect that little of this information is identical with the above subjects.

HERBERT S. MARKS

The only reference in the Bureau files, other than the information imed on March 25, 1946, from the Washington Field regarding Marks which was furnished you in my memorandum in the above case dated March 25, 1946, which can be identified with this subject is contained in the report of Special Agent Norman E. Hanson dated April 1, 1942, in the case entitled "Edward F. Prichard, Jr.; Internal Security; Hatch Act.

Other the above, contain no identifiable record with regard to Marks.


JAMES R. NEWMAN

Set out below are the results of a complete review The Bureau files regarding this subject:

COPIES DESTROYED

In the October 26, 1937 issue of "The Student Advocate," official publication of the American Student Union, was a statement that one of the contributors to this publication, James Newman, a graduate of Wesleyan University, in June, 1937, was at that time Cooperative Secretary of the American Student Union. You will recall that considerable investigation was conducted of the American Student Union which reflected strong Communist infiltration thereof and reflected further that the American Student Union had a predilection for following the then official Communist Party line.

The magazine Wational Republic, "edited by Walter S. Steele and devoted in major part to a continuing expose of Communism, contained in its issue of February, 1938 on page ten, an article concerning the Third Annual Convention of the American Student Union, which was held December 27 to 31, 1937 at Vassar College, Poughkeepsie, New York. This article reflects that one of the speakers at this convention was James Newman, a member of the Cooperative Section of the American Student Union.



On June 11, 1943, Captain W. D. Puleston, Security Officer, Roard of Economic Warfare, by memorandum in connection with a security check, requested any information in the Bureau files concerning James R. Newman, who was described as follows:



From the above information supplied and names listed, it can be readily

noted that a number of individuals on some of whom the Bureau has considerable derogatory information are involved in the so-called Russian espionage circle, particularly does the Bureau have informant consistent with this scheme on Mr. Alger Hiss of the State Department, Dr. Condon of the Bureau of Standards and related information on Messrs. Appleby and Schwartzwalder of the Bureau of the Budget. It is known from Bureau investigations that Dr. Condon is a personal friend of Silvermaster. although investigation has not definitely shown that Dr. Condon has passed on information to Silvermaster.

With reference to Undersecretary Acheson of the State Department, Assistant Secretary Peterson of the War Department and Secretary Wallace of the Commerce Department, their political leanings have been known to the Bureau for some time, and it is not beyond the realm of conjecture that they would fit into such a scheme. So far as the comments and writings of Swing and Childs are concerned, it is again possible that they could be used outside of espionage activities but to a certain degree of usefulness in subtle Soviet propaganda.

RECOMMENDATION:

In view of the many non-specific statements made by in relating the above information, and in view of the fact that many of his comments are based upon dislike of certain individuals mentioned, it is recommended that no definite action be taken on this matter as a whole, but that the matter be referred to the Internal Security Section for an appropriate check of the files on the names of Newman, Dr. Condon and others who may be in touch with known Soviet espionage agents. It is particularly suggested that the names of James Newman be checked through the indices to determine if there is any tie known to the Bureau between him and Silvermaster or other Soviet agents. It may also be advisable to determine the activities of Hiss and Marks in the Undersecretary of State's Office to reveal the part they play, if any, in this so-called espionage ring.

It is not suggested that any active investigation be conducted on Swing or Childs in view of the non-specific information related by regarding their activities.

March 20, 1946 -- Addendum-It would be my recommendation, in view of the circumstances outlined above, that a discreet, active investigation should also be conducted of James Newman.

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

In view of the high positions of the individuals listed above, the necessity for extreme discretion in the conduct of this investigation be is obvious. The New York Office has now advised that on the basis of the recent publicity in the Corby Case in Canada, the informant Gregory in the above-captioned Silvermaster case recalled on March 26, 1946, that four or five weeks prior to the death of Jacob M. Golos, her then Soviet superior, on November 27, 1943, Fred Rose and his wife came to New York City and remained approximately ten days, spending most of the time with Golos. You will recall that Rose is presently being tried in Montreal, Canada, in connection with the above-captioned Guzenko case on charges of violating the Canadian Official Secrets Act. According to the informant Gregory, the expense money for the trip of Rose and his wife to New York was secured by Golos from his Soviet contacts and furnished to Rose before his departure from Montreal.

Gregory was not present at most of the conversations between Golos and Fred Rose but she does recall that Rose had a list of the names of seven or eight Canadian Government employees with whom he desired to have Golos arrange contacts presumably in Canada. Although Gregory saw this list, she does not recall any of the names but she stated that she believes the name, Eric Adams, may have been on the list. It will be recalled in this connection that Eric Adams is presently in custody in Ottawa in connection with the Canadian RECORDED prosecutive action in the Corby Case.

The informant advised further that in the early part of 1944, several young Canadians of both sexes in uniform contacted her in New York and mentioned that Fred Rose had suggested that they look her up. These Canadians carried no messages and there was no indication that the visits were other than social, except that all of them advised Gregory that Fred Rose would like very much to have her visit him in Canada. Later in 1944, Gregory received a note from Rose, asking that she come to Canada to see him but she declined because of the press of business. She has not seen Rose since the Fall of 1943 and has received no other communications from him. Gregory recalls that at the time Rose was in New York with his wife, his mistress was there also and that his

mistress was in the Canadian Women's Army Corps and her name was on the list described above and consequently was on the list supplied to Golos. Gregory is of the opinion also that this girl was to take a position in the Interpretational Labor Office in Canada after her return there. The exact identity of Rose's mistress in this connection is not known but it will be recalled in connection with the Corby Case that two employees of the International Labor Office in Montreal have figured very prominently as Soviet agents. One of these. Frieda linton, was named by Guzenko as a recruiting agent for Red Army Intelligence and is known to have been in contact with a number of subjects in custody in Canada. The other, Hermins Rabinowitz, according to Guzenko, made several contacts with the Soviet Embassy in connection with the operations of the Soviet espionage ring in Switzerland, which has been involved in the Corby Case and which involved the Soviet agent of primary importance. Sisi, who reportedly had access to the German General Staff during the European war. Efforts will be made to definitely identify this mistress of Fred Rose and particularly to ascertain whether or not this person is identical with either Frieda Linton or Hermina Rabinowits.

The above-noted contacts between Fred Rose, Jacob Golos and the informant Gregory are believed of considerable significance in view of the light they throw on the apparent organizational connections between the subjects of the Silvermaster case and the subjects of the Guzenko case. It will be recalled in this connection that in addition to this information indicating an organizational connection between the two cases, the informant Gregory has previously advised that Hazen Sise, who has been deeply implicated in the Corby Case, was at one time, while he was in New York City, introduced to the informant and to Jacob Golos by a Royal Canadian Air Force pilot who was sent to New York City for this purpose by Fred Rose. This information, of course, raises the definite possibility that at least at one time there was such a direct organizational connection between Fred Rose and Jacob Golos, between the Soviet espionage parallels involved in the Corby Case in Canada and the Soviet espionage parallels involved in the Silvermaster case in the United States.

Chambers stated that he cannot testify that Alger Hiss was an actual member of the Communist Party or was paying dues, but that the only thing he could testify to was the information he previously furnished the Bureau. You will recall that Mr. Chambers was interviewed in August 1942 and June 1945 when he furnished information concerning the alleged connection of Alger Hiss with the underground organisation of the Communist Party. HANDLED BY According to SA Spencer, Mr. Chambers was very cordial and the New York Wifice is of the opinion that he would go along with the Bureau. However, he desires to be notified in advance of the use of his name. If you agree, hereafter the name of Mr. Chambers will not be furnished to any other Governmental agency as to the source of information on Hiss unless approval is obtained from you. 

The nature of this employment was not stated. It is to be noted that no derogatory information or additional background information was contained in the records of the Hamtramck Welfare Department relative to VERA WITTE.

The records of the Michigan State Welfare Department, Detroit, Michigan, indicated that Mrs. WITTE has been employed by the State of Michigan as a welfare worker since December 16, 1940. Mrs. WITTE since her employment has requested leaves on the following occasions: from July 9 to August 31, 1942, reason given as sickness with a notation that she could be reached c/o Mrs. I. PETERS, 1351 15th Street, NW, Puyallup, Washington. (It could not be ascertained if this was the State of Washington or Washington, D.C.); from July, 1943, to December, 1943, reason given as sickness, to be reached at the address of 5515 30th Street, NW, Washington, D.C.

In a form made out by Mrs. WITTE at the time of her employment, she stated she was born April 20, 1898, in Russia, that she was an American citizen and that she had attended the Classico Gym, Tvrutrx, Siberia, and had completed this course in 1915. She attended the University of Fetrograd from 1915 to 1917 and did voluntary work for the MCA, Tvkutrx, Siberia, from 1918 to 1919. The personnel file contained the following telegram dated August 23, 1942, addressed to Mrs. CELIA GREEN, Wayne County Social Aid, 4707 Rivard, Detroit, Michigan: "Brother escaped Japanese concentration camp, Hong Kong. Arrived unexpectedly Washington. Will appreciate extension of my sick leave another week in order I may stay a few days with him before he reports for military service over seas." It was signed, "WITTE, 5515 30th Street, MW, Washington, D.C." There was no derogatory information relative to VERA WITTE in the records of the Michigan State Welfare.

MISCELLANEOUS:

The Indices of the Detroit Field Office were checked relative to VERA WITTE and the initials V.V. but it was ascertained that on October 30, 1945, a highly confidential source made available to Special Agents of the Detroit Field Office the contents of the personal brief case of CARL WINTER, Michigan State Chairman of the Communist Party which was located in his residence at 1440 Collingwood, Detroit. Among the contents of this brief case was noted a type-written memo, the minutes of the meeting of the Michigan Communist Party State Poard dated October 1, 1945. At the heading of the memo opposite the abbreviations ARS were the initials T.J., V.V. and J.I. It is believed that the abbreviations

and initials represent the names of those individuals excused or absent from the Board meeting. The names represented by the initials were identified, with the exception V.V.

Mrs. W. REIN, 2611 Medbury, Detroit, Michigan, who formerly resided next door to VERA WITTE at 12597 Longview, afforded the reporting Agent the following information. VERA WITTE resides at 12607 Longview, Detroit, the following information. His draft board is in receipt of a letter from his wife dated May 12, 1940, advising that her husband had received a commission in the United States Army as a major and stationed at Lowry Field, Denver, Colorado. This board is also in receipt of a letter dated October 19, 1942, from Mrs. LAVROW stating that her husband, Major ALEXANDER IVAN LAVROW is in the active military service and stationed with the Army Air Corps in California. There was no address given.

a member of the faculty at Harvard University because the Boston Field Division had been advised that the above named HALPERIN would undoubtedly contact the Romance Language Department at Harvard. T-l advised that he could remember HALPERIN as a student at Harvard, in approximately 1927. He remembered further, that HALPERIN at that time had a definitely Jewish appearance and that he was an outspoken advocate of Communism.

The surveillance was undertaken at the above address on March 8, 1946, by Special Agents JOHN DESMOND and DRENTON S. GORDON and at approximately 10:15 a.m. HALPERIN left the Commonwealth Avenue address and proceeded to Harvard Square, Cambridge, Massachusetts. He traveled by the Boston public transportation system, and appeared to be suspicious during this twenty minute trip. He constantly looked about him and in traveling on foct, would run for approximately one block and then walk slowly for a block. From the transportation center at Harvard Square the Subject of the surveillance, proceeded in the fashion described heretofore, to the Wiedener Library at Harvard. It is noted that this is a large building with multiple entrances. Through observation it was determined that MAIT AIN entered one of the corridors which houses the Romance Language Division but it could not be determined whom he visited. The narrow corridors and guard system in force at the Wiedener Library did not permit a discreet observation of the corridor in which HALPERIK was last seen, and efforts to locate him upon his departure from this point, were met with negative results.

On the same date at 5:25 p.m., HALPERIN was observed returning to 1156 Commonwealth Avenue, where he stayed for the remainder of the night, by Special Agents FREDERICK M. COMMORS and RICHARD DOW.

Under date of March 9, 1946, Special Agents JOHN LEANY and JOHN F. DESMOND of the Boston Field Division observed HALPERIN leaving his apartment at 1156 Commonwealth Avenue, at which time he took a street car in front of the building, to Copley Square, Boston, proceeding to Boston University College of Liberal Arts. He left the University at 11:50 a.m. in the company of an elderly Jewish-appearing man described as 5.5", approximately 130 lb., 60 years of age, who was later identified as Professor SAMUEL MONTEFIORE WAXMAN, head of the Romance Language Department, Boston University. HALPERIN, in company with WAXMAN, proceeded to the main dining room of the Hotel Lenox at the corner of Boylston and Exotor Streets, remaining there until about 2:10 p.m. They then went to the Vendome Bookshop on Boylston Street, where they remained for approximately three or four minutes. Thereafter they parted company and HALPERIN returned to the apartment on Commonwealth Avenue.

On March 10, 1946, Special Agents DAVID A. LYMNI and John F. DEC. OND observed HALPERIN leave the apartment at approximately 6:00 p.m. and

take a street car to the Arlington Street Station. He came upstairs and entered the Hotel Statler. Inside the front door he was immediately greeted by an individual who was later identified to be his brother-in-law, MILTON LARTIN FRISCH. After conversing a few minutes they left the Statler, returning immediately to the Commonwealth Avenue apartment of HALPERIN'S father. HALPERIN remained at the apartment the remainder of the evening, and MILTON FRISCH returned to downtown Boston.

On March 11, 1946, at 10:10 a.m., HALPERIN left the apartment at Commonwealth Avenue and took a subway to the First National Bank building located at 1 Federal Street, Boston, Mass. He entered the First National Bank building and took an elevator to an office on the 11th floor. It was not feasible to ascertain just which office MALPERIN entered, and inquiries have failed to reflect whom he contacted. The physical characteristics of this building are such that a close, discreet surveillance is not possible.

At 11:30 a.m., MALPERIN was observed leaving the building, at which time he returned to his father's apartment at 1150 Commonwealth Avenue.

At 2:00 p.m., HALPERIN, accompanied by his father, proceeded to the South Station at which time they were met by MILTON FRISCH and his girlfriend. HALFERIN boarded the train "The Patriot" which left Boston at 3:00 p.m. It was determined that HALFERIN'S reservation was for Seat 22, Car 710. He was carrying two bags—a light brown traveling bag, and a small black brief case.

Immediately following HALFERIN'S departure on the train, Agents
DESMOND and LYNCH placed under surveillance, MILTON FRISCH and his
girlfriend, to a point where their car was parked. They were driving
a Packard bearing Massachusetts license No. D-891-B which, it was
ascertained from the Mass. Registry of Motor Vehicles, is listed to
the United Auto Wrecking Co., Bread Street, Lynn, Mass.

On March 13, 1946, Special Agent JOHN DESMOND identified SANUEL MONTEFICRE MAXIAN from the 1944 Year Book of Boston University, entitled "THE Hub", in which book WAXIAN's picture appeared. Further inquiries reflected WAXIAN was head of the Romance Language Lopartment at Boston University and resides at 21 Forest Street, Cambridge, Massachusetts. No record was located in the indices of the Boston Field Division except that WAXIAN appeared on the list of the North American Spanish Aid Committee.

On March 12, 1946, Special Agent DEE onl and the reporting Agent contacted Chief of Detectives CHARLES DUGGAN at the Lynn Police Department. By use of a telephonic pretent, Chief Letective DUGGAN ascertained that MILTON FRISCH had operated the Packard bearing

Massachusetts license No. D-891-B which is licensed to the United Auto Wrecking Co., 869 Broad Street, Lynn, Massachusetts, and at which place MILTON FRISCH is self-employed.

The records of Local Braft Board No. 88, Lynn, Mass., reflect MILTON LAMTIN FRISCH, Order No. 2075, resides at 62 Rogers Avenue, Lynn, Lass., that he was born at Lynn, Mass., September 23, 1919. He listed as the person who would always know his whereabouts, Mrs. ANNIE M. FRISCH; at the time of his registration October 16, 1940 he was attending Boston University as a student. He was described as follows: 175 lb., eyes brown, hair black, complexion dark. His questionnaire reflected that he was taking a course in Eusiness Administration at Boston University and would graduate in 1941.

The file further reflected that MILTON AFFRISCH entered the Marines on May 16, 1941. He went to Quantico, Virginia, Feb. 1, 1942, went through 0.0.S., and when separated from Service, January 14, 1946, he held the rank of Captain.

No further information was located on FRISCH at Lynn, Hass., and the records of and Laring Corps Intelligence at Boston, disclose no further information concerning him.

The 1945 directory at Lynn, Mass., reflected the following names at 62 Rogers Avenue, Lynn, Massachusetts, all with the surname of TRISCH:

Confidential Informant T-2 advised that he was reasonably familiar with FRISCE family and the United Auto Wrecking Co. He stated that to his knowledge they were not Communistically inclined and that he could not recall them ever receiving Communist literature.

Informant T-3, a neighbor of the FRISCH family, advised that he had been residing in the neighborhood for several years and that to his knowledge the family was not involved in radical or communist matters. he stated that he could not recall any periodicals or communist literature having been deligred to the house. He stated that SIMMA (or FMILMA) and presently residing at the address. He also said that a son-in-law whom he later recalled was MALPARIM, was investigated by the Dies Committee. He also recalled that another

daughter resided in Providence, R.I., and was married to a man by the name of ROTTENBERG. He recalled that THELMA taught Hebrew in Boston, Mass.

Inquiries at the School Committees at Lynn and Boston, Mass., as well as the State House, have failed to reflect the school at which THELLECTISCH is teaching.

The marriage records at the City of Lynn, Mass., indicate THEMIAN FRISCH, 62 Rogers Avenue, Lynn, Mass., a teacher, with parents HERMAN S. FRISCH and ANNIE STEIN FRISCH, was married December 5, 1945, at Lynn, Mass., by Rabbi I. HARBURG, to HAROLD S. HOCH, U. S. Army, whose home address was given as 382 South Broadway, Lawrence, Mass. With respect to HOCH, the records indicate his birthplace as Lawrence, and his parents' names were HARRY L. HOCH and ANNIE SPERBER.

On March 13, 1946, reporting Agent contacted Informant T-4, who stated that MAURICE HAMPERIN had not applied for a position in the Romance Language Department of Harvard University, and that if he had done so, such a request must necessarily clear through him. He further advised Agent that he would contact the Boston Field Division in the event such a request should develop from MAURICE HAMPERIN.

Informant further obtained from the records of Marvard University, information that MAURICE HYMAN HALPERIN graduated from Harvard, cum laude, in 1927. His mother's name was indicated as ETHEL SUMMER HALPERIN. The record further reflected he married EDITH FRISCH, September 1926 and that he was at the University of Oklahoma, in 1937.

The Bureau of Vital Statistics, State House, Boston, Lass., reflected that on September 5, 1926, MAURICE HALPERIN married EDITH FRISCH at Nahant, Mass. The marriage coremony was performed by B. GORDON, Rabbi, 28 Blossom Street, Lynn, Mass. The record reflected that at the time of marriage MAURICE HALPERIN was a teacher, with birthplace at Boston, Mass., and EDITH FRISCH was a college student with birth place of Wabash, Indiana. The parents of HALFERIN were indicated as PHILIP HALPERIN, father, and ETHEL SULLER, mother. The parents of EDITH FRISCH were indicated as HERMAN FRISCH and ARNA STEIN.

Contact was made at the West Lynn Post Office and at the main Fost Office, Lynn, Mass., for an individual by the name of "SULLY", residing at 44 Sumerville Street, Lynn, Mass. There is no such individual known to postal authorities and there is no such street listed at Lynn, Mass. A directory check at the Police Station and other sources of information at Lynn, Mass., has failed to reflect the identity of this individual.

The records of the Boston Field Division reflect a Dr. JOSEP. FRISCH, Union Street, Vineyard Lawon, Late., born January 28, 1912, at Jushwell, Illinois, further, that his father and mother reside in Lynn, Lass.,

and that both parents were born in Austria and of the Jewish race. The aforementioned Dr. FRISCH is reported as a graduate of the Middlesex School of Medicine, Prospect Street, Cambridge, mass. The information contained herein does not reflect, however, anything of a derogatory nature concerning Dr. JOSEPH FRISCH, nor do the indices of the Boston Field Division reflect anything concerning members of the FRISCH family, of a derogatory or Communistic nature.



Reference is made to a teletype received from the Washington Field Division under date of March 25, 1946, requesting further efforts to verify the surname of HARRY DEXTER WHITE.

No record of this Subject's birth was located at the Boston City. Hall, or at the State Bureau of Vital Statistics, Boston, Mass.

The high school records at Everett, Massachusetts, reflect that HARRY DEXTER WHITE was born October 9, 1892. No place of birth was given nor was the name of his parents. The records reflected that he resided at 20 Dyer Avenue, Everett, Massachusetts, and that he graduated from Everett High School, in June 1909. No further record was located at the high school or at the office of the Superintendent of Schools, Everett, Massachusetts.

A directory check was made at the Parlan Memorial Library, 410 Broadway, Everett, Massachusetts, which reflected the following in the Everett directories:

1908. JACOB NHITE - business crockery, 99 Salem St., Boston, Mass., home 20 Dyer Street.

NATHAM, clerk, business 99 Salem, home 20 Dyer.

SAMUEL, apprentice, home 20 Dyer

This directory reflected JACOB died 16/1909.25 1910.

COPIES DESTROYED 11/4/58

- 1916. This directory listed ESTHER, widow of JACOB, at 20 Dyer Ave.
 The directory did not list other members of the family
 at this address.
- 1920. Boston city directory reflects ESTHER removed to Boston, at 50 Fowler Street, and this is maintained in the Boston directories until the year 1930. However, none of these directories reflect the names of NATHAN, SAMUEL, or HARRY DEXTER WHITE.

The voting records at Everett, Massachusetts, disclosed JACOB HITE registered October 12, 1906, then 47 years of age; that he was a merchant, and had been naturalized at Boston, May 6, 1897. No record of SAMUEL, HARRY, or NATHAN, was located.

The records of the District Court of Boston, Massachusetts, reflect in Volume 300, Page 192, Circuit Court, JACOB WHITE a peddler, of 109 Salem Street, was born in Russia, age 1, August 1, 1860, that he arrived at Boston, April 2, 1885, and made primary declaration, July 23, 1888, in which he was erroneously called JACOB WEIT. The records further reflect that JACOB WHITE was admitted to citizenship in 1897. However, this record was not stamped with the actual date of admission, but it is probably true that the date was Lay 6, 1897.

No record was located at the Immigration & Naturalization office, or through the State House records, East Boston, Lass., of the arrival of JACOB WHITE in this country, nor were there records of NATHAN I.

WHITE, HARRY DEXTER WHITE, or SALUEL A. WHITE.

The Boston city directory of 1911 disclosed HARRY D. WHITE boards at 282 Hanover Street, place of employment at 99 Salem Street, Boston, Massachusetts. NATHAN I. WHITE had the same business and residence address, reflecting further that he was employed by J. WHITE SONS. SAMUEL A., student, was also indicated as residing at 282 Hanover Street, Boston. There is the probability that some confusion occurred and that SAMUEL A. WHITE, not HARRY D., was employed at 99 Salem Street, as college records reflect HARRY D. WHITE was in school in 1911.

The records of the Massachusetts Agricultural College, Amherst, Massachusetts, reflected HARRY DEXTER WHITE was born October 29, 1892 at Boston, Massachusetts, and that his father's name was N. I. WHITE, 288 Hanover Street, Boston, Massachusetts. He attended this college from September 14, 1911, to February 1912.

The voting records at Brookline, Massachusetts, reflect that MATHAN I. WHITE, age 38 in 1924, resided at 21 Russell Street, Brookline, Massachusetts, that his father was JACOB WHITE, admitted to citizenship in the Circuit Court, U.S., Massachusetts district, May 6, 1897, and and the occupation of MATHAN I. WHITE was listed as merchant. In

addition, the voting records disclosed the name BESSIE FACHTE, wife of NATHAN, registered to vote October 14, 1924, being 32 years of age, and that she was born in Austria.

The 1945 street list at Brookline, Massachusetts lists in addition to NATHAN I. and BESSIE F. WHITE at 21 Russell Street, Brookline, WILLIAM H., age 21, student at Harvard University.

No record of NATHAN I. WHITE, SAMUEL, or HARRY DEXTER WHITE, was located at the local draft board in Brookline, Massachusetts.

The city of Boston records reflect the birth, October 9, 1892, of a male child named HARRY, born to ISAAC and SARAGHITE, who were born in Russia, and the further fact that ISAAC was a peddler. It was suggested by city officials at City Hall, Boston, Massachusetts, that there was a probability the foregoing HARRY WHITE, born October 9, 1892, son of ISAAC and SARA, could be HARRY DEXTER WHITE, inasmuch as it appears to be a common practice on the part of foreigners to change their names on arriving in this country, and assuming others at their own free will. This possibility should be noticed in view of the fact that HARRY DEXTER WHITE listed as his date of birth at Everett High School, October 9, 1892, and the further fact that both JACOB WHITE, who was erroneously called JACOB WEIT, was also indicated as being a peddler in the official court records.

NATHAN I. WHITE, whom HARRY DEXTER WHITE mentions as his father, appears from the directory checks, to be the same individual who is presently residing at 21 Russell Street, Brookline, Massachusetts, and HARRY DEXTER WHITE appears to be, from this information, the brother, rather than the son, of NATHAN I. WHITE.

Records of the Merchants Credit Bureau, Boston, Mass., fail to reflect information concerning SAMUEL A., or HARRY DEXTER WHITE. Information contained concerning NATHAN I. WHITE was not of material value in this investigation, as it did not disclose members of his family.

Unless advised to the contrary, no further investigation will be made concerning HARRY DEXTER WHITE, by the Boston Field Division.



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of the Pacific hut, WITTE and his wife purchased three or four lots in the vicinity of 15th and East H Street for \$1250 and a second Pacific hut for \$200. In the second hut, WITTE set up a woodworking shop where he angaged in the manufacture of various articles of furniture and Christmas Items, such as sleds, which he subsequently sold to the Morthern Commercial Longary of Thehorage. He further engaged in experiments with birchwood for furniture, but later meased these experiments when he found the wood unsatisfactory.

At the present time WITTE is attempting to sell his shop and the Pacific mut in which he is residing in contemplation of a trip to the States. Shortly after their arrival, they purchased a truck from the Surplus Property Division for \$600 and WITTE recently sold it for \$675. They have also purchased a sedan which they plan to take with them by boat from Anchorage to Seattle, from which point they plan to travel by this sedan along the West Coast through California, across Southern United States for a visit with her mother in Atlanta, Georgia, and thence to Washington, D.C. According to the informant, after renewing acquaintances in Washington, they intend to travel along the East Coast to New York and then to Detroit, Michigan, where they contemplate the purchase of a truck in order to return to Alaska via the Alcan Highway.

The informant further advised that WITTE has expensive cameras, including a motion picture camera, and several guns of expensive makes. According to a "For Sale" advertisement in the local newspaper, WITTE is attempting to sell these guns at the present time. Mrs. WITTE has written a child's book on Alaska and has been paid \$600 on account. In addition, she also writes articles regarding life in Alaska.

The Anchorage NEWS of January 13, 1946 contained an article concerning the manner in which the WITTES have made themselves comfortable in a Pacific hut and also details with his experiments in his woodworking shop. The paper contained a picture of Mr. and Mrs. WITTE and this together with the article is being forwarded as an enclosure to the office of origin.

The informant further advised that WITTE and his wife are quite social-minded and that several Army officers visit them at their residence. One officer was identified as Major WAKEFIELD, who is reportedly connected with the Surplus Property Office at Fort Richardson near Anchorage. According to the informant, the WITTES have traveled extensively over the Territory of Alaska and have indicated that they are believers in non-profit business. Mr. WITTE especially delights in talking about Emsia and Mareportedly very clever and entertaining.

Mrs. WITTE advised the informant in the course of general conversation that her husband left Russia when he was 27 years of age and that his father was a Baron there and a liaison officer between Russia and the

congolian Government. She advised that his father was sent by the Russians to make an agricultural survey in Mongolia and that the change in the political set up in Russia has not affected his status as he still holds his position there. She advised further that she has been in Russia and that WITTE diversed his first wife, who was a Russian. She advised that her husband was his first wife, who was a Russian. She advised that her husband was with his father during the latter's agricultural survey. She was with his father during the latter's agricultural survey. She advised also that her husband attended Stalingrad High School and Caskburg (ph.) University. In conclusion, she stated that when they returned from their trip to the States they plan to faise racing dogs and continue their travel throughout the Territory.

Referenced radiogram from the Washington Field Division advised that no record of BORIS WITTE was located in the Passport Division of the State Department.

On March 4, 1946, Mr. GERALD ROBERTS, 11th and East E Streets, Anchorage, volunteered the following information:

On the previous evening near the corner of 9th and East E Streets he was stopped on the street by an individual making inquiry as to whether or not any Russians lived in the vicinity. He engaged the man in conversation and was advised by the individual that he was a civilian worker who had just returned from Attu and that he was to be paid off at Fort Richardson, that he had come by boat to Seward, Alaska, and that he constantly compared conditions about him with the conditions in Russia, commenting, "The people here don't seem to have any mental happiness". According to ROBERTS, the individual was of Russian extraction and was interested in the East B area of the city and apparently had been told or knew that someone of Russian ancestry could be located in this area. ROBERTS stated that the man was evidently without funds and questioned him several times about the possibility of getting work, stating that he had been offered a job in the last day or two as a truck driver.

ROBERTS thought that because of the man's behavior he may be a survivor of the wreck of the DONBAS. In addition he was wearing a white sailor's cap and a heavy Navy blue service coat.

Because of the Russian's interest in the East B area, ROBERTS advised that he drove him to the home of BORIS WITTE, but inasmuch as it was late at night the WITTES had apparently retired or were not at home. The Russian advised ROBERTS that there was someone living in Anchorage whom he had set in Washington, D.C. at a Rotary Club meeting but that the name of WITTE appeared unfamiliar to him. The following description of the individual was supplied by BOBERTS:

Confidential Informant T-2 made available the following information regarding the correspondence received by Buils and LVE WITTE through Post Office Box 2366 in Anchorage, from February 18, 1946. A moderate amount of mail was received and all appeared to be of an innocuous nature.

- To: Mrs. BORIS WITTE; return address Play Center, 1819 The Street, NW, Washington, D.C., postmarked Mashington, D.C., 2/16/16, 6:30 P.M. The writer indicated that she saw HELEN SILVER ASTER recently at a missian for Relief dinner and that HELEN indicated that she never hears from the WITTES. The writer stated also that she had tried to talk HAROLD TOKES out of being so histy about quitting but had been unable to make any impression. The letter was signed only with the initials [L.K."]
- To: Mrs. Bords witte; return address Bent Var Buren, 237 Clifton Road, ME, Atlanta, Leorgia, postmarked at Atlanta, 2/15/46. The writer appeared to be the mother of Mrs. Witte and advised that "John received compensation for his lectures", but requested Mrs. Witten not to tell anybody about this matter. Apparently Mrs. Witte's mother expects a visit from BORIS and her daughter in the near future.
- Van Gilder Hotel, Seward, Alaska, postmarked at Seward, 2/19/46. The writer informed the WITTES of the wreck of the SS YUKON. It is noted that O'DELL was one of the soldier survivors and he was interviewed by an agent of this office concerning this wreck. At that time he advised that he was a Sea Scout and that he was enroute to his home in Virginia.
- To: Mrs. BORIS WITTE; return address HELEN R. BRYAN,
 58 Bank Street, New York, dated 2/17/46. The letter
 begins "Darling EVE" and BRYAN states that she is pleased
 that the WITTES are contemplating a visit to her in New
 York. She advised that EDDIE's appearance before the
 RANKIN Committee was quite different from hers. She
 continued by stating that there was an entirely different
 atmosphere. ERLIE ADALSON, the counsel, introduced him

to each member of the committee and he was permitted to consult with his counsel, that is, the lawyer was not allowed to go in but was just outside. He was in the room with the committee about an hour. They asked him several questions, a number of which he answered and others he did not. We felt ever so relieved because they did not cite him and we all felt very gay coming home on the train. We all went to Cafe Society for dinner. We heard that WCOD had announced at his press conference that afternoon that his committee would meet on Friday at which time he would attempt to cite aDDIE for contempt of Congress. So all day I worked for pressure so that they would not cite EDDIE. Friday they announced that the committee had not come to an agreement or the citation and that they would meet again on Tuesday. WITA is now in charge of our fund raising. She comes in each morning at 11 and works until 6 on a voluntary basis. This letter also contained an enclosure which was a letter from "JAMES", apparently a brother of Mrs. WITTE, on Rice Hotel, Houston, Texas, stationery. JAMES advised his mother that he was planning to stay here through Wednesday night and at the Texas State Hotel for five days and then five days at the San Jusinto. He advised that the company is taking care of additional hotel expenses and that there is no place to rent in Houston so we are forced to buy.

To: Mrs. Bords WITTE; return address - 58 Bank Street, New York City, 3/5/46. This envelope contained two letters signed "SMITTY". HELE BRYAN advised Mrs. WITTE that she does not think SMITTY had anything to do with the whole business about the letter. AT HANOVER, NEW HAMPSHIRE

The following investigation was conducted by Special Agents Robert Scott McLeod, James M. Ackerman and Charles T. --etcher.

WILLIAM WALTER REMINGTON arrived at White River Junction, Vermont, on a train out of New York City. His train arrived at White River Junction at 4:15 and he immediately took a bus to Hanover, New Hampshire. While in Hanover, he was under constant surveillance of agents.

He roomed in the Green Lantern Inn, 80 South Main Street, Hanover, and spent much of the first day wandsring about the campus of Partmouth College and observing points of interest. He manifested special interest in the art collection in the Baker Library. He was unaccompanied on this tour and his familiarity with the various sites of the college caused a check to be made of the Dartmouth Alumni Register. This source revealed that REMINGTON had graduated from Dartmouth in the class of 1939. He majored in economics and received a Phi Beta Kappa key.

In the latter part of the evening of January 12, 1946 REMINGTON visited GEORGE THERIAULT at the latter's home at 20 Valley Road, Hanover. Theriault is Assistant Professor of Sociology at Dartmouth College. (1)

Confidential Informant T1 ascertained that REMINGTON had contacted Dean of Faculty at Dartmouth GORDON BILL telephonically from New York City at about 6 PM on January 11, 1946. He arranged for an appointment with DEAN BILL for Sunday morning, January 13, at 10 AM. The purpose of the appointment was to secure the Dean's advice concerning several opportunities for employment available to him, these opportunities allegedly including a Government position carrying a salary of \$7,500, and several teaching positions including one at Williams College, Williamsburg, Massachusetts. In this telephone conversation REMINGTON also announced that he was presently completing a thesis on "Russian Economy," and that he contemplated contacting several Dartmouth professors coucerning this thesis while at Hanover. (U)

On Sunday morning, January 13, 1946, REMINGTON first visited Mr. RUSSEIL R. - LARLON of Bulch Hill Road, Hanover. Larmon is the Professor of Administration and holds the chair furnished by the Benjamin Ames Kimball Foundation at Dartmouth. During the war, Larmon took a selectical leave of absence in order to accept a position as director of the OPA for the State of New Hampshire 10

At 10 AV on the same morning, REMINGTON kept his appairment with Dean GORDON BILL the Administration Office of artmouth College. Thereafter, REMINGTON visited William PHELPS KIMBALL at 12 Buel Street, Hanover, New Hampshire. KIMBALL is the Dean of Theyer School at Dartmouth and is also Professor of Civil Engineering. (1)


Thereafter, Confidential Informant Tl contacted DEAN BILL under a suitable pretext and in a thoroughly discreet manner. From Dean BILL he ascertained that REMINGTON discussed various epportunities for employment and showed a definite inclination to accept the teaching fellowship at Williams College, Williamsburg, Massachusetts. (It is to be noted that the Boston press has reported that Williams College has more than tripled its enrollment in its effort to accommodate veterans, both as students and as teachers. Its program of expansion insofar as veterans are concerned is under the direction of its leading authority in history, Professor FREDERICK L. SCHUMAN. SCHUMAN, an author of several current works on European history, has been attacked by book reviewers in the New York Times and in Boston papers as a Soviet apologist. He is the subject of a closed Internal Security case in the Boston Field Division). W

REMINGTON also advised DEAN BILL that he had contacted several of the professors at Dartmouth for the purpose of getting informative data and advice about his thesis. Dean BILL considers REMINGTON to be absolutely brilliant for his age and a person who is loyal to the United States beyond question.

REMINGTON had advised Dean BILL that he intended to take the 2:55 PM train from White River Junction, Vermont, on that day and that he intended to return to Washington, D, C.

REMINGTON departed from Hanover by bus at 2:30 PM and thereafter boarded the 2:55 PM train. The train arrived at Springfield, Massachusetts, at 6:40 PM and without any prior indication of his action REMINGTON suddenly jumped off the train with all his belongings and ran into the station where the surveillance was lost. It was ascertained that by sprinting REMINGTON would be able to get a 6:35 PM train for Grand Central Station, New York, inasmuch as the 6:35 PM train was habitually late at Springfield. By catching this train more than two hours could be saved in the time of arrival at New York City. It was furthe ascertained that the constant failure of the 6:35 PM train at Springfield to maintain its schedule is well known to Dartmouth students who take awantage of this point in cutting their traveling time to New York City. Thi field division was subsequently advised that the subject

did take that train and did arrive in New York City. (U)



DONALD NIVEN WHEELER

By teletype dated January 31, 1946 the Washington Field Division requested

a surveillance of DONALD NIVEN WHEELER and MARY WHEELER who left Washington at 10 AM on that day and whose arrival in Boston was anticipated at about 7 PM. The Washington Field Division advised the WHEELERS were visiting Boston upon the invitation of DICK and JACKIE GOODWIN and they had left word in case of emergency they could be reached through RICHARD and HELEK SCHLATTER.

The indices of the Boston Field Division reflect that DONALD NIVEN WHEELER, according to a Bureau letter dated April 30, 1942, was under consideration for a position in the office of the Coordinator of Information. From this source it was ascertained that DONAID N. WHEELER was then residing at 4118 Third Road, North Arlington, Virginia; that he was born on October 23, 1913 at White Bluffs, Washington. He had served in the United States Army from March 1918 to August 1919, although no explanation was given of his ability to serve in the armed forces at such a tender age. He claimed employment at Harvard University as an assistant professor from 1928 to 1942 at a salary of \$6,000 per year. He also claimed to have been emplayed at the University of Chicago as an associate professor under Professor H. H. Barrows from 1919 to 1928 at \$4,500 per year, and to have been employed by Denison University, Danville, Ohio, as an instructor to Professor Chamberlain from 1915 to 1916 at \$1,500 per year. The applicant claimed to have attended Beloit, College, Beloit, Wisconsin, from 1909 to 1911 and the University of Chicago from 1912 to 1917, receiving a PhD from the latter school in 1920.

It is noted that all the foregoing dates are inconsistent with the self-alleged birthdate of October 23, 1913.

For references WHEELER gave the following: Mrs. R. C. Barnard, 223 H Street, N. W., Washington, D. C.; PHILIP S. BROWN, economist, Board of Governors, Federal Reserve System, Mashington, D. C.; G. B. NOBLE, Professor, Reed College, Portland, Oregon; V. L. Shittick, professor, Reed College, Portland, Oregon and BLAIR STEWART, professor, Reed College, Portland, Oregon.

Special Agent J. E. Baumert ascertained from the secretary of the Harvard Club, Cambridge, Massachusetts, in 1942, that DONALD N. WHEELER had never been employed at the University as an assistant or an associate professor. Moreover, the secretary, J. W. Greene advised that it would have been impossible for WHEELER to have been employed by Harvard without some record being available at the University and there was no record of Wheeler either as a student or as a teacher.

The records of the Merchants Credit Bureau, 52 Chauncy Street, Boston, Massachusetts, and the Massachusetts Board of Probation, Suffolk County Courthouse were also checked by Special Agent Baumert with reference to MHEELER with negative results.

In accordance with Bureau teletype instructions dated May 16 1942 the employee investination of WHEELER was discontinued.

On January 31, 1946 the WHEELERS arrived at the South Station, Boston, on the second section of the train from Washington, D. C. They arrived in Boston at 7:15 PM and were met by an individual subsequently determined to be ROBERT M. 600DWIN. They proceeded via the Boston Elevated System to Harvard Square, Cambridge, Massachusetts, from which point they walked leisurely to 7 Revere Street, Goodwin's home, where they spent the evening. It is a the end They slept that evening at Mrs. Horton's Rooming House which is at the end of Revere Street, which is a dead-end street, and next to 7 Revere Street.

The surveillance this evening was conducted by Special Agent McGee and the writer.

At 10:10 A on February 1, 1946 the WHEELERS were observed by Special Agents DESMOND and BRASSARD to enter 7 Revere Street.

At 12:40 PL the Goodwins and the Wheelers left 7 Revere Street and were observed by Special Agents Desmond and Brassard to enter a large multiple section apartment house from the rear. It is to be noted that Revere Street is a short alley running from Mount Auburn Street, Cambridge, toward but not quite into Memorial Drive, Cambridge. Memorial Drive bounds the Charles River and both it and Mount Auburn Street are main thoroughfare. There are four dilapidated houses on Revere Street which were unoccupied before the wartime housing shortage. Horton's Rooming House is at the end of Revere Street but there is an alleyway suitable for foot traffic between Horton's and #7 which leads into Gerry Street. Gerry Street is also a dead-end alley similar in type to Revere Street, opening onto Mount Auburn Street. It is closed and is bounded by the multiple section apartment house referred to above, which has fifteen entrances. It was not possible to follow the Wheelers into the apartment house. Therefore, the surveillance was momentarily discontinued. Fruitless efforts were made by the surveilling agents to cover the fifteen entrances to the Memorial Drive apartment house with negative results.

At 5:30 PM on February 1, 1946 the Goodwins and the Wheelers were observed by Special Agent FRANCIS MCGEE and the writer to return to 7 Revere Street. They remained there until 11:30 PM when the WHEELERS returned to their room at Horton's Rooming House.

Special Agent McGEE and the writer observed DONALD NIVEN WHEELER leaving

Horton's Rooming House at 9:20 Am on February 2, 1946. He obtained a paper and returned to 7 Revere Street where with his wife he joined the Goodwins at their home.

At 10:15 AM DONALD NIVEN WHEELER unaccompanied shopped in Harvard Square, Cambridge. He visited a Tweed Shop, Woolworth's and a Kresge's store. He was observed to purchase a small tablet of notebook paper. He returned to 7 Revere Steet at 11 AM.

At 1 PM on February 2, 1946 the Goodwins and Wheelers went on an extensive shopping tour of Harvard Square. They made a number of purchases, principally of foodstuffs and returned to the Goodwin residence at 2:55 PM.

Memorial Drive, Cambridge. The surveillance at this point was being conducted by Special Agents JOHN DESMOND and PAUL BRASSARD. 907 Memorial Drive was determined to be the home of RICHARD B. and SUZANNE HELEN SCHLATTER. Surveilling agents noted a number of persons were visiting 907 Memorial Drive on that evening. 907 Memorial Drive is one quarter of a long two-story frame building divided into four apartments, each with a separate entrance. The building is approximately eighty years old and features windows which run from the floor to the ceiling. After the GOODWINS and WHEELERS entered, the shades were drawn so that the windows were completely covered. This was the only apartment in the building where such an action was taken on the evening in question.

Surveilling agents observed the following cars parked in front of this house and observed the occupants of some of them enter the Schlatter home. The license numbers taken will be referred to below together with available information concerning the registered owners.

On February 3, 1946 WHEELER and his wife left Horton's Rooming House at 10:30 AM and after obtaining a newspaper returned to the Goodwin home. Shortly thereafter the Goodwins and the Wheelers left 7 Revere Street and inasmuch as they gave indications of being "tail conscious," the surveillance was discontinued by Special Agents Brassard and Desmond. The two couples were observed by these agents to return to 7 Revere Street at 2:15 PM and to again leave 7 Revere Street at 3:20 PM under similar circumstances.

Special Agent McGee and the writer located the WHELERS and GOODWINS at 907 Memorial Drive, the Schlatter home, at 6 PM on February 3, 1946. There were a number of people then present at the Schlatter home and at 7:10 PM the entire group was seen to proceed from 907 Memorial Drive to the Goodwin home s. Revere Street. A gathering of an undetermined nature ensued and

lasted until 10:30 PM. At that time all persons departed and the numbers of license plates were observed and will be referred to below. The WHEELERS remained at the GOODWIN home until 12:30 AM, February 4, 1946, at which time they returned to the Horton's Rooming House.

At 10:15 AM on February 4, 1946 Special Agents McGee and the writer observed the WHEELERS leave the Horton's Rooming House and proceed to the Boston Elevated Station at Harvard Square. They were accompanied to Harvard Square by the Goodwins. The Wheelers proceeded to the station and boarded the 11 Am train for New York City, Grand Central Station. The New York Field Division was so advised by teletype on the same date.

For the completion of the Boston file the following description of the Wheelers is being set forth below:

There is being set forth below under suitable headings information available in the Boston Field Division concerning persons contacted by WHEELER during his visit reflected above.

RICHARD MURPHEY GOODWIN JACQUELINE (JACKIE) GOODWIN

The Harvard University Directory for 1945-1946 reflects that RICHARD MURPHEY GOODWIN is an instructor and tutor in economics at Harvard. His University address is the Lowell Building M-ll, Harvard. His residence address is 7 Revere Street, Cambridge, and his residence telephone is Eliot 2981. The Goodwins have two children, a boy approximately seven, and a girl approximately four.

In December, 1942 agents of this office executed a Presidential Warrant of Search and Apprehension for Shigeto Tsura, a Japanese alien, who had been teaching fellow at Harvard University. Among his personal effects was found a considerable amount of material pertaining to "Science and Society - a Marxist Publication." Tsura appeared to have been one of the editors of this organ, described by Communist propaganda. GOODWIN was listed as one of the editors of "Science by and Society" by Tsura.

There is information available locally that the Commonwealth College in Arkansas was closed by State authorities in 1940 because of its allegedly having taught subversive doctrines. Widespread publicity was given to the fact that the college had imbedded in its foyer the emblem of the Communists, the hammer and the sickle. GOODWIN was listed in that institution's records as a contributor of funds to the institution. Also in the effects of Shigeto Tsura was found a copy of the November 1933 issue of "The Harvard Critic." One of the editors of the "Critic" was RICHARD MURPHEY GOODWIN. The "Critic" was published four times per year and as indicated in its title was extremely critical of the president and trustees of Harvard University. It offered a book review and recommended for reading at that time a book entitled "The Coming Struggle for Power" by JOHN STRACHEY. This book and its author have both been described as Communist inspired in the Boston public press. The magazine also contains an article entitled "Propaganda in Art" in which the thesis is offered that there ixists in the world today (1933) but two fundamentally opposing systems of life capitalism and communism. It rests upon the student to choose one or the other. One sentence of the article was descriptive of the whole wherein it is stated that capitalism "is in the last states of collapse and

Communism or the emancipation of labor is in the ascendency."

A highly confidential source having access to the records of the Joint Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee in August, 1945 advised that Mrs. RICHAPD GOODNIN had attended a meeting of the Executive Committee of the Joint Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee in Boston in December, 1944 and again in January, 1945.

RICHARD B. SCHLATTER SUZANNE HELEN SCHLATTER

The 1945-1946 Harvard Directory reflects that Schlatter is an instructor at Harvard University and resides at 907 Memorial Drive, Cambridge. His residence telephone number is Trowbridge 1663.

Information in the files of the Boston Field Division reflects that SCHLATTER was associated with GOODWIN as an editor of the "Harvard Critic" and also of "Science and Society." SCHLATTER was also a financial contributor to the Commonwealth College in whose records it is noted he was a Rhodes scholar.

In 1942 there was established in the greater Boston area the American Defense Committee under the leadership of Dean Ralph Barton Perry of the Harvard Divinity School. It is to be noted that while PERRY has been affiliated with a large number of Communist front organizations there is no reliable source indicating that he is a member of the Communist Party.

As indicated in the details above concerning WHEELER a number of license plates were noted on two different occasions by surveilling agents. There is being set forth below under a heading pertaining to each plate pertinent data readily available.

OHIO DS 49

From C. Ervin Nofer, Chief of the Records Division of the Motor Vehicles Department, Columbus, Ohio, it was ascertained that this plate was issued to D. D. SCHLATTER, 310 North Union Street, Fostoria, Ohio. The plate was issued for a 1941 Packard Clipper sedan. This car was observed in front of the Richard Schlatter home on February 2, 1946 and again in front of the Goodwin home on February 3, 1946, on both occasions WHEELERS being present with other people.

There is no record of D. D. SCHLATTER in the indices of the Boston Field Division and it is noted that he might be related to RICHARD SCHLATTER.

MASSACHUSETTS #151-077

This car was observed at 907 Memorial Drive on February 2 and 7 Revere Street on February 3 under the circumstances noted above.

At the Massachusetts Registry of Motor Vehicles, 100 Nashua Street, Boston, Massachusetts, it was ascertained that 1946 plate 151-077 was issued to cover a 1939 Ford two-door sedan registered to HERTA M. EPSTEIN, 910 Memorial Drive, Cambridge. HERTA M. EPSTEIN had United States Enemy Registration 3755010 in the files of the Boston Field Division. She registered as an enemy alien on February 27, 1942 at which time her address was 910 Memorial Drive. HERTAXEPSTEIN was born in Strossbourg, Alsace, in 1894 and her nationality was given as German. She arrived in Boston as a German-Jewish refugee on October 15, 1937 and took out first papers for citizenship on October 18, 1937. She has since been employed by the New England Division of the American Committee for Christian Refugees at 3 Church Street, Cambridge, Massachusetts.

A number of travel permits were obtained for her during the war in order that she might take refugee children to Concord, New Hampshire; Groton, Massachusetts; Marlboro, New Hampshire; and Northempton, Massachusetts Massachusetts; Marlboro, New Hampshire; and Northempton, Massachusetts is to be noted DIEFFENBACH, according to maintained in the files of the Boston Field Division, has been affiliated with a number of Communist infiltrated groups. Particularly, he has been a sponsor of the Council of American-Soviet Friendship and a trustee of the Samuel Adams School.

A biography of Dieffenbach obtainable at the Kirstein Library in Boston reflects that he is the son of a person of the same name who assisted Karl Marx in staging a revolution in Germany.

The Boston Field Division has no information reflecting that DIEFFENBACH is a member of the Communist Party.

HERTA EPSTEIN was used as a reference by a number of Jewish German refugees who attempted to obtain travel permits during the course of the war.

According to these sources she was, in 1941, the Executive Secretary of the

Committee for Jewish Refugess located at 5 Beacon Street, Boston. It is to be noted that this group collaborated with the Unitarian Service Committee which operated underground houses in Spain and Portugal for the transmission of Jewish refugees from German occupied Europe to the United States. This same group received funds from and transmitted funds for the Joint Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee, according to information available locally through confidential sources.

MASSACHUSETTS #57-771

The vehicle bearing this plate was observed in front of 907 Memorial Drive February 2, 1946 under the circumstances described above.

At the Registry of Motor Vehicles it was ascertained that this vehicle is registered to ANNETTE B SULLIVAN, 21 Lafayette Circle, Wellesley, and the automobile is a 1941 Dodge sedan.

A highly confidential source made available to Special Agent L. G. Healey in August 1941 the records of the North American Spanish Aid Committee, a Communist inspired organization. These records reflected that ANNETTE B. SULLIVAN was a member of the committee.

Confidential Informant T3 advised that ANNETTE SULLIVAN is the wife of DONAL M. SULLIVAN. She is of Jewish ancestry and her husband is of Northern Irish ancestry. T3 noted that DONAL M. SULLIVAN while a student at Harvard in the early 1930's was correspondent of the Boston Globe. Following his graduation he continued his affiliation with the Globe and was subsequently responsible for the formation of the Boston Newspaper Guild, CIG

T3 advised that in 1940 a series of meetings were held at 12 Wright Street, Cambridge, Massachusetts, at the home of George F. Burrows. These meetings were directed, according to the informant who attended one of them, as occasions for the distribution of propaganda concerning Civil Liberties and other matters and for the exhibition of Russian films. Among those alleged by the informant to have attended the meetings at various times were the following individuals: DAVID RILES with alias David Neyhus, until recently Administrative Assistant at the White House; EARL ATTESLOW /

(not otherwise identified but reported to hold a \$6,000 a year position in Washington, D. C., in government service.); OTIS A. HOOD (State chairman of the Communist arty in Massachusetts); ELLA FRANKFURTER (sister of Felix Frankfurter); fromer Congressman THOMAS ELIOT (whom the informant recalls was endorsed by the Daily Worker because with Congressman Geyer he introduced the first anti-poll tax bill); and DONAL SULLIVAN with his wife ANMETTE.

MASSACHUSETTS LICENSE 587-279

The vehicle bearing this number was observed among those present at 7 Revere Street on February 3, 1946 under the circumstances set forth above.

At the Registry of Motor Vehicles, 100 Nashua Street, Boston, it was ascertained this plate was issued to cover a 1940 Ford two-door sedan. The registration was issued to A. LINCOLN GORDON, 68 Snake Hill Road, Belmont, Massachusetts.

The "Advocate," a Jewish weekly newspaper published in Boston in a 1943 issue carried a news story reflecting Mrs. A. LINCOLN GORDON was a patroness of the American Jewish Congress.

The following plates issued to the following persons were also observed on the evenings in question but cannot be definitely established as having any direct contact with the WHEELERS. The information is, therefore, being set forth for potential reference purposes.

Massachusetts #21-658 issued to Robert J. Douglas, Jr., 1775 Massachusetts Avenue, Cambridge, who was observed parked in the vicinity of 907 Memorial Drive on February 2, 1946.

Massachusetts plate #89-410 issued to CHARLOTTE OCCUES, 908 Memorial Drive, Cambridge.

West Virginia plate #194520 issued to J. Frank Heflin, 900 Memorial Drive, Cambridge.

The indices of the Boston Field Division contain no references to any of the per as mentioned immediately above.

ARNOID 9787

By teletype dated February 26, 1946 the Washington Field Division requested the Boston office to identify the subscriber to Boston telephone "Arnold 9787."

It was ascertained that this number is listed for a pay station at 3115 Washington Street, Boston. The person responsible for the phone is PAUL HALAGIAN. There is no record of PAUL HALAGIAN in the Boston Field Division indices or in the Merchants Credit Bureau, 52 Chauncy Street.

The Polk City Directory and the Telephone Directory were checked for this name and address with negative results.

The Merchants Credit Bureau does have a record of a PAUL G. HALAJIAN. In September, 1945 HALAJIAN was fifty-five years old and resided with a son at 2 Victor Street, Dorchester, Massachusetts. He owns his own home at this address and conducts a small dry goods store at 710 Dudley Street, Boston. None of these addresses is in proximity to 3115 Washington Street.

LYNN 3-3395

By teletype dated February 26 the Washington Field Division requested the identity of the subscriber to Lynn 3-3395 be ascertained.

Through the listing service maintained by the telephone company it was ascertained this telephone was listed to FPANK FRISCH, 8 Chase Street, Lynn, Massachusetts.

There are no references to this name in the indices of the Boston Field Division.

The Merchants Credit Bureau at Boston advised that one FRANK FRISCH of Lynn is the president of the Manchester Waste Corporation, 36-38 Harbor Street, Lynn, Massachusetts. The treasurer of the company is MAXAFRISCH and the clerk of the corporation is SIDLE FRISCH. It is noted that a reference is made to a FRISCH family on page nine of the writer's reference report.

THELMAYFRISCHE

By teletype dated January 9, 6 the Washington Field Division requested

the boston Field Division to ascertain whether THELMA FRISCHE of Lynn, Hassachusetts, who had recently married a soldier named HAROLD, was engaged in any Communist activities.

The indices of the Boston Field Division were checked with reference to THELMA FRISCHE with negative results.

LAUCHLIN CURRIE

The following information concerning LAUGHLIN CUPRIE appeared in the Boston Globe of February 9, 1946.

"HAPVARD'S CURRIE GOT YALE MAN OUT OF JAIL IN CHINA"

"Chungking, China, Feb. 8 (CDN) with new free speech laws protecting him from being returned to concentration camp, China's foremost expert on government craft, Yale educated economics professor Ma Yin-Chu today announced his unique plan to torture his former jailers.

"Kuomintang special police guards who once held him political prisoner near Manchurian young Marshal Chang Hsueh-Liang, in Kweichow, tremble to hear what Dr. Ma has in mind. Dr. Ma plans to settle an old score with the secret police by giving them life sentences at hard study--principally in economics.

*Torturing his wardens is nothing new to this bumptious Eli whose athletic tastes and behavior belong definitely to the turtle-neck sweater and beerstein period. When given solitary confinement in 1939, under rough conditions, for criticizing the government, the roly-poly professor insisted on cold baths every morning. Watching the 60-year-old savant romping in the icy douches, the political police broke into shudders. Their confidence in their own methods was undermined.

"Dr. Ma is an expert on squeeze, which is Chinese for graft. He plans to educate his ex-guards by taxing the industrialists, have built fortunes on alleged squeeze. Ma, who is Yale 1910, says the first taxee should be T. V. Soong, Harvard 1915, and second, H. H. Kung, Yale, 1909.

"The fact that I am free today I owe to Roosevelt's economist, Lauchlin Currie," said Ma.

"I was released through Currie asking the Generalissimo about me. I understand Currie is Harvard."

(Currie studied at Harvard in 1926 and 1927 and later taught money and banking there.)
