

RE: NORMAN CHANDLER BURSLER

It was ascertained through suitable pretext that BURSIER moved from 1414 inclined Street, N. W., Eashington, D. C., to 6220 Greenwood Avenue, Chicago, Illinois, on or about March 1, 1946.



A report in the files of the Berekely, California, Police Department dated November 30, 1931, sets forth that BURSIER was also very active in the Friends of the Soviet Union. He was also reported to be organizing another club of radicals independent of the Friends of the Soviet Union, an organization known as the Social Problems Club.

A report submitted by Captain JOHNSON of the Berkeley, California, Police Department under date of March 27, 1933, definitely tabulates BURSIER as a Communist out states he is not of the outspoken type but on the other hand a quiet worker who is one of the leaders of the Social Problems Club.

BURSIER'S name 'as found in the files of the International Labor Defense under date of July, 1934. His name appeared under the title, "Unit and Unit Leaders—useg Branch." His name also was found under the title, "International Labor Defense Lawyers."

The files of the Subversive Dotail of the Berkeley, California, Police epartment revealed that as of August, 1934, BURSLER resided at 1738 Milvia Street, erkeley, California, and at this time this address was said to be a nest of communists. It is also noted that in 1934 GEORGE PERAZICH (a subject in the case ntitled, "Nathan Gregory Silvermaster, was, Etal - Espionage - R") resided at .738 Milvia Street, Berkeley, California. The subversive files described PERAZICH as Yugoslavian, who was at that time a graduate student at the University of alifornia and a member of the Communist Party. In connection with his Communist.

Party membership PERAZICH is stated to have boasted of his participation in agitalions, hunger strikes, and riots. PERAZICH acted as a critic for the "Students Outpost," an official publication of the Social Problems Club. He was also a former President of the Social Problems Club and a member of the Friends of the Soviet Union. He was on the national committee of the Students Congress Against ar and on numerous occasions defended Communists in debates.

BERNARD ROSENBLUM also resided at 1738 Milvia Street, Berkeley, California in 1934. This individual is reported as a "Communist Party member or at least a member of the Young Communist League."

On Armistice Day, 1932, a demonstration against war under the auspices of the Social Problems Club, the Friends of the Soviet Union, the Finnish Kaleva, the Oakland (California) Branch of the Young Communist League and the Communist Party was held on the occasion of the Army-Navy football game. This demonstration was held at Sather Cate at the southern and main entrances to the University of California campus. The Police Department noted that among those present were Mr. and Mrs. POSSELL, Mr. and Mrs. ROSSUS, BERNARD ROSE/BLUM, DARMIN ALONZO, and NORMAN BURSLER.

Mr. FRANK 11 FRECK, 2713 Haste Street, and ALFFED R KAHN, 2606 Haste Street, both Berkeley, California, gave a statement to the Berkeley Police Department, which is summarized as follows:

The Social Problems Club was organized at the University of California in January, 1931. There were four original members, namely, SAN COE, HARRY ROSENBLUH, ORIAI BURSLER and FRANK-FRECK. The purpose of this club was to serve as a forum for those interested in social, political and economic problems. COE had been a Communist Party agitator at the City College of New York; HARRY ROSENBLUM was an agitator for the Communist Party in the State of Mashington; and FRECK advised that BURSLER had formerly been a secretary of the Communist Party in China. He stated the Social Problems Club was identical with that of a Communist organization then misting at the City College of New York. The Young Communist League soon became a dominant influence of the Social Problems Club, as a consequence of which most non-Communists terminated their affiliation therewith. FRECK stated that strong connections between the Social Problems Club and the Communist Party became increasingly apparent and he was finally invited to join the Young Communist League. 13 advised that he joined the YCL and attended a meeting which was held at the nome of JOSEPH STEGEL. The purpose of this meeting was to draw up plans for the control of the Social Problems Club. Individuals present at this meeting were LOUIS CLOBIATT, GEORGE PERAZICH, DAR IN ALCHZO, JOSEPH POSSELL and wife, SAN COE, and HARTY ROSENBLUM. FRECK advised he withdrew from the Social Problems Club in 1932 when the club had gone under the domination of the Communist Party and was installed as a chapter of the National Students League.

The subversive files of the office of the District Ittorney, Alameda County, Oakland, California, contained extensive information on BURSLER. It is noted that BURSLER was associated with Professor ALIEM BUCHAMAN, 2630 Bancroft way at Berkeley, Professor FELIX LUGEL, DOROTHY PAY and VANE DART, all Communists or Communist sympathizers.

It was also ascertained from the files of the District Attorney that Mrs. FRANK KLEEBERGER of 16 Sunset Drive, Berkeley, California, related that during the summer of 1931 BURSLER worked for her husband, now deceased, who operated a Boys' Summer Camp at Echo Lake, California. She advised that BURSLER'S brother, WILLIAM BURSLER, was also employed at the camp. According to Mrs. KLEEBERGER, WILLIAM BURSLER told her that his brother, NORMAN, as being paid by the Communist Party to organize and propagandize. In this connection she stated NORMAN BURSLER continually boosted Communism and made repeated efforts to convert his associates into the party.

Mrs. KLEEBERGER maintains NORIAN BURSLER was an avowed Communist and made no effort to deny allegations of this association.

There is set out below a letter which was found by the Berkeley, Californi Police Department near the premises of 1738 Hilvia Street, Berkeley, California:

"Vacaville, California December 27, 1932

"Ifi Si Don Bigotes:

"The hounds of the law are pretty quiet and are taking a retreat with their tales between their legs; hence I won't have to take advantage of all of the clean linen and hang keys that adorn our happy home in the fair city. I expect to return to Berkeley around the 3rd or 4th.

"Now as to status. The have remained in status quo (meaning the ALCIZO family). No more threats or epithets have been hurled at us. The strikers are going strong also have ro—established fairly good units of the 'Stalin Buroaucracy', both young and old.

It will be noted that BURSIER is known to have resided at 1738 Milvia Street, Berkeley, California, as of August, 1934. It has also been pointed out that GEORGE PERAZICH resided at this address.

Under date of June 24, 1934, MORIAN BURSIER, 1738 Milvia Street, Berkeley, California, wrote the following letter to DOROTHY MAY, a notorious Communist agitator, who was then serving a six months sentence in the Imperial County Jail for criminal syndicalism.

"Dear Dorothy:

"This evening the radio is humming softly the strains of Schubert's Serenade. Mrs. SNYDER (LEMANSNYDER, a registered Communist in 1934) is ironing in the kitchen and Mrs. ROE (MARY ROE, also a registered Communist in 1934), sits behind me shelling beans. Hy mind bridges the chasm to yesterday and once more sitting in your home answering the persistent questions of a precocious youngster of fourteen. Now she is in jail, think I, to the tune of the Serenade, and there through devotion to ideals we once discussed, and of course by virtue of the chicanery of hypocritical political hirelings of a decadent ruling class. The story of such imprisonment as yours can only add fuel to the flames of revolt rising once again throughout the land. You must find time upon your release to come up and speak to the U. C. (University of California) students who are in even greater numbers becoming interested in what's going on in the life from which they have been sheltered so long They tell me your partner in honor is ETTACUTLER (a notorious Communist). Give her my regards.


the International Labor Defense near the University under the leader-ship of a former instructor, who expects to go to the Soviet Union for study in the near future. We decided at the last minute to write to you two girls. ALEX plans to write to you, as also does GEORGE and DARTIN (ALONZO).

Comradely, NORMAN."

The security files in the area of Berkeley, California, are filled with information to the effect that BURSLER openly avowed, by his own statements, that







during his stay in China he had been secretary of the Communist Party in Shanghai.

Starting in or about August, 1932, BURSIER resided at 2211 Union Street, Berkeley, California, for approximately a year. This address was a shack occupied by a number of students at the University of California, who were listed as Communists.

In the spring of 1933 BURSLER was active in a branch of the Friends of the Soviet Union and his name was specifically mentioned by one Mrs. ESTHER KENNEDY, who at that time made a report to the Berkeley Police Department.

On December 6, 1926, NORMAN BURSLER registered to vote from 1028 Peralta Street, Albany, California, at which time he mentioned his affiliation as "Workers Party." In the spring of 1928 BURSLER registered from 2324 Dwight Tay, Berkeley, California, as an "independent." Additional voting registrations on the part of NORMAN BURSLER are as follows:

In regard to the above mentioned "Torkers Party" affiliation on the part of NORIAN BURSLER, 1028 Peralta Street, Albany, California, attention is directed to a memorandum dated November 6, 1935, entitled "Outline of Business Experience and Education of Norman Bursler," which was prepared by himself:

In part this memorandum states: "From October, 1925 until December, 1926, I attended Wellesley School, Berkeley, California, completing the preparatory work necessary for admission to the university. Afternoons and Saturdays were spent in the employ of the California Cap Company of Oakland, California, and their subsidiary, the Multiphone Company....."

The U. S. Official Postal Guide lists the city of Albany, California, as having a post office which is a branch of the Berkeley, California, post office department. It should also be noted that in 1928 the Workers Party changed its name and became known as the Communist Party of the United States of America.

The complete text of the personal history statement drawn up, by BURSLER

himself is contained in the report of Special Agent LAHBERT G. ZANDER dated a lashington, D. C. Merch 15, 1946, in the matter of "Nathan Gregory Silvermaster," as, Etal - Espionage - R."

Attention is invited to a book entitled, "Spirit and Structure of German fascism," by ROBERT ALEXAIDED BRADY, which was published by the Viking Press, June, 1937. This book was the subject of adverse comment on the part of the Civil Service Commission. The book lists the following acknowledgement: "Mr. NORIAN BURSLER of the University of California, and Professor TILLIAN H. TAYLOR of the University of Hawaii, provided valuable aid in the collection and first sifting of original source material." The above mentioned book is an attack on capitalism and shows how the United States is heading toward Fascism. It will be noted that Dr. BRADY and his wife, MILDRED EDE BRADY, were dismissed from the Office of Price Administration on the request of the Civil Service Commission on the basis of alleged Communist activities.

NORMAN BURSLER worked with Dr. BRADY on a Carnegie financed research project in New York and California.

During the period March 1 to 15, 1946, a mail cover placed on FITZGERALD reflected the following information.

On March 5, 1946, a letter was postmarked in Brooklyn, New York, and addressed to FITZGERALD bearing the return address of Mrs. E. FITZGERALD, 1205 East 34th Street, Brooklyn, New York. She is believed to be MARY KUGLED FITZGERALD, wife of EDWARD FITZGERALD, Sr., who is known to reside at that address. They are the parents of subject (L)

On March 15, 1946, a letter was postmarked in Tashington, D. C., and addressed to FITZGERALD bearing the return address of 2920 Vista Street, N. E., Washington 18, D. C. No name was given but the address telephone directory reflected one FIORENCE M. HASTLIN resides at 2920 Vista Street, N. E. The Washington city directory reflects she is an employee of the General Accounting Office. The files of the Washington Field Office contain no record concerning her CONF. INFT.

The following information was obtained from March 1 to 15; 1946.

During this period information was received concerning frequent contacts between Mrs. REBECCA FITZCER.LD and her fellow workers at the Fublic Relations Section of the American Red Cross. Her most frequent contact is VERA MESSITT (phonetic) who is apparently Mrs. FITZCER.LD's secretary.

On March 2, 1946, the subject contacted Mrs. BEATRICETY GDOFF who indicated HARRY IL GDOFF is somewhat discouraged at the Department of Commerce. The subject indicated he was uncertain about the National Housing Administration because "We don't know too much about WYATT yet and how he is going to turn out." FITZGEPLED thought any move made by MAGDOFF would also affect him.

On March 5, 1946, the subject contacted H.RRY M.GDOFF and they discussed their positions with the Department of Commerce. They both indicated they are apparently dissatisfied with their jobs, and FITZGER.LD indicated he could not get "upstairs" if M.GDOFF left his present position. It was further indicated in their conversation that H.RRY M.GDOFF is to It was further indicated in their conversation that H.RRY M.GDOFF is to receive a new job "upstairs" and will leave his present position. M.GDOFF stated he was going to talk to PHILIP H.USER, the assistant secretary, concerning the matter and he would again talk to the subject before taking the matter up with his chief AMOS TAYLOR. FITZGER.LD said if M.GDOFF leaves, they will look around for a new head of the division, and he will stay on in his present position until he gets a really good alternative as "the



situation is unbearable." MacDOFF asked FITZCER.LD how he felt about his (M.GDOFF's) going "upstairs," and FITZCER.LD said whatever M.GDOFF did does not make a long run difference to him. (It is believed the position "upstairs" for M.GDOFF refers to a staff position in HENRY W.LLL.CE's office.)

On March 5, 1916, Mrs. EVELYN ST. CLAIRE (phonetic) contacted Mrs. FITZCER.LD and stated she and her husband were residing at the Vardman Park Hotel but were leaving for New York in the morning. She further said when they returned to Washington they would probably stay at the Carlton. Mrs. FITZCER.LD said to her, "I am glad you are here—not just for work I can get out of you." Mrs. ST. CLAIRE said her husband was working on a Western Union case. She further said she would come to see Mrs. FITZ-GER.LD that afternoon.

On March 6, 1946, Mrs. S.R.H CORNELISON contacted FITZGEP.LD and indicated her intention of visiting Mrs. FITZGEP.LD on the following day. Mrs. CORNELISON stated she has had two of her sketches accepted, one by Collier's. Her agent M.CK wrote her that Good Housekeeping and Collier's both liked her work. She indicated she would also like to get her things published in Vogue and The New Yorker

On March 6, 1946, FITZGER.LD contacted BE.TRICE M.GEOFF and discussed the reaction of IRVING K.FL.N and all of their reactions concerning M.GDOFF's new job. Mrs. M.GDOFF indicated H.RRY would see ANOS T.YLOR, his chief, tomorrow and if he did not "come across," PHILIP H.USER would go to Secretary W.LL.CE and take H.RRY "upstairs."

On March 7, 1916, FITZGER LD contacted his maid and asked how his wife was inasmuch as she was suffering from a serious ailment. he asked if Mrs. CORNELISON had visited Mrs. FITZGER LD. The maid said no one had been there during the afternoon except Mrs. FITZGER LD's secretary who is believed to be VER. NESBITT. The files of the Mashington Field Office contain no record concerning her.

On March 8, 1946, FITZGER.LD contacted his wife and said he had spoken to DOROTHY and IRVING K.PL.N. DOROTHY is suffering from a lack of red corpuscles. FITZGER.LD said he would call LESLIE KISH and ask him and his girl friend HIDA to come to visit them tonight. He also stated J.NE_PHEL.N (phonetic) would probably be out to see them that night. He further stated IRVING KAPLN and FUCHS were out at the "sound" (phonetic) today, and he did not know what the MAGDOFFS were doing.

The files of the Washington Field Office reflect LESLIE KISH lives at 2909 Olive Avenue, N. W., in the home of FEROL M. CORNELISON and that he was present there on the evening of February 2, 1946, when a party was given which was attended by the K.PIANS, MAGDOFFS, the FITZGERALDS,

WEINTRAUB, and others. He is at present employed in the Department of Agriculture and was until recently a sergeant in the U. S. Army. A Hatch Act investigation was conducted by this office in regard to LESLIE KISH in 1942, and the following information was reflected by that investigation.

KISH was at that time employed as assistant statistician, Bureau of Agricultural Economics of the U. S. Department of Agriculture. (It was confidentially reported his name appeared in the active indices of the American Peace Mobilization). (The files of the Dies Committee reflected KISH was a member of the Washington Committee for Democratic Action) (The January 31, 1939, issue of the Daily Worker included LESLIE KISH's name among a list of volunteers who fought with the ABRAHAM LINCOLN Brigade in the Spanish Civil War.)

On April 7, 1942, KISH gave a statement denying he had ever been a member of the American Peace Mobilization, the Washington Committee for Democratic Action, or the Communist Party. He admitted having served with the Loyalists during the Spanish Civil Wark

The FUCHS of whom the subject spoke is probably HERBERT FUCHS, husband of FRANCES FUCHS, who is a friend and contact of the FITZGEPALDS, the KAPLANS, and the MAGDOFFS. He was formerly attorney with the National Labor Relations Board and on December 19, 1940, addressed a meeting of the Washington Committee for Democratic Action protesting the U. S. Government's undermining of the federal employees' rights. At present the FUCHS and their children are living with Mn. and Mrs. EDMARD J. STONE of 2921 Argyle Drive in Alexandria, Virginia, while they are looking for a place to live.

The files of the Washington Field Office contain no record concerning JANE FHELAN.

On March 8, 1946, FITZGERALD again contacted his wife and told her LESLIE KISH and HILDA would come out to see them on the following night, and stated neither they nor the MAGDOFF family could come on the evening of March 8, 1946. Mrs. FITZGERALD said the St. CLAIPES were in New York City until Monday when the subject suggested inviting them. FITZGERALD also said the STONES would come out on the following night with LESLIE and HILDA. He further stated the FUCHS would take care of the STONES' house while they were out.

The STONES to whom FITZCERALD referred are EDMUND J. STONE and his wife JANE SANFORD STONE, friends and contacts of the KAFLANS and FAG-POFFS. The files of the Washington Field Office reflect ED UND J. STONE was listed as a member of the Washington Bookshop Association and his address TFO 100-17493

was given as 4831 Resevoir Road, N. E., Washington, D. C. Accordingly, it appears he is identical with the EDJARD STONE who was listed as a reference by FITZGERALD when he applied for his position with the War Production Board on February 13, 1942. EDW.RD STONE's address was listed as 4831 Resevoir Road.

On March 8, 1946, an unidentified woman contacted EDWLRD FITZ-GERALD and said she was coming over to see Mrs. FITZGERALD on the following day. The subject told her he had talked to LEONARD MIERENBERG who told him PEGGY came out of the ether o.k.

The files of the Washington Field Office reflect LEONARD D. MIERENBERG is a member of the Union of Federal workers of America of the CIO, and he is employed by the U. S. Treasury Department. He returned in December from Europe where he was a civilian doing work for the Treasury Department with the Office of Military Government. His wife MARGARET AREMENT HERENBERG, who is called PEGGY, lives with him at 2529 14th Street, N. E., apartment 612A. The NIERENBERGS are friends of the KAPLANS.

MARGARET MIERENBERG was the subject of an applicant investigation by this office for the Office of Emergency Management in 1942. The investigation at that time reflected the following information. She was born on June 28, 1913. Her neighborhood investigation was favorable with the exception of one informant who stated he thought MARGARET MIERENBERG had communistic tendencies since she had formerly been in the habit of talking about communism, STALIN, and how good Russia was. She listed as references Mr. DAVID MEINTRAUB, by whom she was formerly employed when he was director of the National Research Project in Philadelphia; EDMUND J. STONE of the War Production Board; and HARRY MAGDOFF. All three of these references were interviewed by Bureau agents and advised MARGARET MIERENBERG had no subversive connections.

The Mashington Field Office files further reflect she was a member of the Mashington Bookshop. She presently is employed with the CIO Maritime Committee.

On March 9, 1946, EDMUND STONE contacted the subject who invited him to come to see the FITZGER.LDS. STONE declined but said he had talked to NIERINBERG last night. STONE asked FITZGER.LD about his job, and FITZGER.LD said, "When HARRY gives his final word to MKE, he will go on with his reorganization plans and I'll stay." STONE asked if MAGDOFF was going "upstairs," and FITZGER.LD replied MAGDOFF doesn't know which is the best but that the job with WATT looks good. FITZGER.LD said once a man takes a job "upstairs" it depends on how long the secretary remains in office. He also said MAGDOFF's departure makes hiw own job impossible for very much longer, and that he will look for a new position.

On March 12, 1946, LESLIE KISH contacted Mrs. FITZGERALD. She told him they had enjoyed his visit on Saturday. KISH asked if HARRY MAGDEFF had ever called to explain why he did not show up. KISH also told her he would call her on Wednesday morning and perhaps they could have lunch at "that Mexican place." They also discussed HILDA who is KISH's girlfriend and who apparently works at a hospital.

During the period March 1 to 15, 1946, no physical surveillance was maintained on subject FITZER.LD.

During the period from March 1 to 15, 1946, confidential informant whose identity is known to the Bureau, stated FAYE GLASSER contacted ERNA ROSENBERG on March 6, and 11, 1946. On the latter date, Mrs. GLASSER advised she would bring LINDA over to stay at the POSENBERG residence on March 12, 1946.

Confidential informant furnished the information that on January 24, 1946, Mrs. HAROLD CLASSER informed ELIZABETH COHEN (phonetic) that HILDEGARDE KNEELAND (phonetic) was enchanted by ELIZABETH the other evening.

The report of Special Agent KENNETH A. CLOW dated April 10, 1942, at Washington, D. C., entitled "Miss HILDEGARDE KNEELAND, Principal economist, Research Division, Office of Frice Administration and Civilian Supply; Internal Security, Hatch Act," reflects Miss KNEELAND is employed in the above position, and the Special Committee Investigating un-American Activities lists her name as a member of the Washington Committee for Democratic Action. A confidential source advised the name of HILDEGARDE KNEELAND appears on the active indices of the Washington Committee for Democratic Action and the American Peace Mobilization, now known as the American People's Mobilization. She attended the Alice Barrows Dinner September 1, 1933, which was subsequently investigated by the 73rd Congress, Second Session, House of Representatives.

In her testimony before this investigating committee, she denied the allegations of Dr. JILLIM JIRT that she advocated the overthrow of the U. S. Government. Informants who have business or social acquaintance with Miss KNEFLIND advise she is a liberal and advocates certain economic and social changes but does not advocate the overthrow of our democracy by force and violence.

She was born July 10, 1889, in New York City and her address at that time in the District of Columbia was listed as 1830 K Street, N. W. She is reported to be presently employed by the Budget Bureau.

On February 5, 1946, advised that HENRY J. TASCA (phonetic) of Rome, Italy, planned to contact HAROLD CLASSER on February 6, 1946.

The report of Special agent J. A. BERNARD, Washington, D. C., dated January 11, 1941, entitled "HEWRY J. TASCA, Special Inquiry, Advisory Com-

mission to the Council of National Defense," reflects that TASC. is employed by the Commission as a senior economist at \$1,600 per annum and was promoted on August 16, 1940, to \$5400 per annum. His personnel file at the advisory Commission to the Council of National Defense reflects TASCA was born in Providence, Rhode Island, August 23, 1912. He received his N. B. A. degree in 1934 and his Ph. D. in 1937 from the University of Pennsylvania. He attended the University of London in London, England, from October, 1938, to May, 1939. He was employed as an aconomic analyst, State Department, from July, 1937, to October, 1938, and was assistant director of Rockefeller Study of Trade Regulations and Commercial Policy at London from November, 1938, to July, 1940. He attended the International Studies Conference on Economic Policy and Peace, Bergen, Norway, August 26, 1939, to August 30, 1939, as an expert on commercial policies and trade regulations.

The report of Special Agent 7. D. TEMPLE, Washington, D. C., dated March 7, 1941, in the same case reflected that TASCA's superior in the Division of Trade Agreement in the State Department considered him not capable for the type of work done in that division. TASCA has written a book on "The Reciprocal Trade Policy of the United States." He was also a research fellow for the Brookings Institute.

On February 6, 1946, confidential informant advised Mrs. ANNIE STEIN contacted Mrs. GLASSER, and they discussed their children's school work. It is to be noted Mrs. STEIN has contacted Mrs. GLASSER on several occasions and regularly takes the children to school. The informant has advised ANNIE STEIN is the wife of ARTHUR STEIN, 5750 Macarthur Boulevard, N. W. W.

The report of Special Agent A. J. MacDOM.LD, Washington, D. C., dated February 11, 1942, entitled "ARTHUR STEIN, statistician, Office of Director of Research and Statistics, Federal Works Agency: Internal Security, Hatch Act," reflects that STEIN's name appears on the active indices of the National Federation for Constitutional Liberties, the Washington Committee for Democratic action, the American Feace Mobilization, and is shown on the October, 1939, list of the un-American Activities Committee as being a member of the American League for Peace and Democracy. Informants advise STEIN is a prominent and active Communist and belongs to the National Communist Party unit in New York.

Mrs. .NNIE STEIN advised informants her husband joined the Communist Party prior to their marriage, and he has advanced to the position of chief organizer of the Communist Party for this area. Informants have also advised NIMIE STEIN was listed in the active indices of the Washington Committee for Democratic action and confidential informant listed her as being a member of the Washington Bookshop associ tion, an alleged communist dominated group. The list of names furnished to the attorney General by the Dies Com-

On March 2, 1946, an individual known to informant as JANET SUTTLESON (phonetic) contacted SONIA GOLD to advise she was packed in

preparation for her trip and was anticipating taking the Congressional (Pennsylvania) train on March 3, 1946. (11)

On March 5, 1946, a person known to informant only as HEMRY COLLINS contacted BEIA COLD and arranged to meet hir at 5:15 p.m., on March 6, 1946, at Temporary Building T, 14th Street and Constitution Avenue. GOLD advised he would pick up SONIA at 5:30 that same date.

On March 8, 1946, SONIA GOLD contacted DICK SASULY to advise it would be impossible to meet with them on that week-end. She advised the house the COLDS had contemplated buying had a defect in the deed, and they contemplated not completing the contract.

On March 9, 1946, an individual known to informant as BILL LEVITT contacted BELA COLD to advise he was in town only for that evening. He inquired whether GOLD had room for two people to stay at his house. GOLD suggested he might put them in the attic. (LEVITT advised he had written to LESLIE KISH at the address GOLD had given him but had received no reply. GOLD stated KISH is back in town and in the division). In the course of the conversation GOLD also advised that LIKERT (possibly REMSIS LIKERT, head of the Division of Program Surveys, Bureau of Agricultural Economics), is in Germany for a short while. At this time LEVITT inquired concerning HAROLD TOUNG (possibly HAROLD R. YOUNG, solicitor in the Department of Commerce). GOLD advised YOUNG "was still there and maintained an apartment in town."

On the same date ELIZABETH SASULY contacted COLD to inquire of him concerning his proposed purchase of a house. GOLD advised a flaw in the deed indicates he has sufficient grounds to break the contract. COLD further advised at this time he and SONIA have definitely decided to spend the summer in New Hampshire where he can finish "the book" and sit in the sun. COLD indicated he has the maximum amount of leave coming to him, and he expects to be back September 1.

On March 10, 1946, a woman known to informant as BELLA or RELLA (possibly BELLA-RODMAN) contacted GOLD and discussed his housing problems. At the same time SONIA GOLD advised that "BEL is going to resign and do what I have always wanted to do. I'll tell you more about it later." During the same conversation the person known to informant as RELIA indicated she was greatly interested in reading on atomic energy. She stated she and SAM "are all prepared to open a plant to electrify the world at 1028 Connecticut Avenue at no cost—atomic operations."

On the same date SOMIA GOLD was reported by informant to have contacted New York at which time she advised BELA GOLD intended to locate a home in the country from June, 1946, until September to finish his book.

On March 6, 1946, Special Agents KENNERLY H. CORBETT and JOHN J. BARRON placed themselves in a position to surveil the entrance to BEIA GOLD's place of business at 11th Street and Constitution Avenue. It was observed that GOLD's car, a black tudor Ford, 1939 model, bearing Virginia license 126-963, was parked in the rear of the building. At 5:30 p.m., GOLD left the building and entered his car and proceeded to 15th Street where he parked the car in the block north of Constitution Avenue. GOLD proceeded on foot to the U. S. Treasury Department at 15th Street and Pennsylvania Avenue where he met Mrs. GOLD at 5:45 p.m. The couple walked about the block in which the Willard Hotel is located until 6 p.m. when they entered the Willard lobby on the Pennsylvania side of the hotel.

At 6:05 p.m., the COLDS were met by a man in the uniform of the U. S. Army bearing the rank insignia of major. It is to be noted CONF. INF advised on March 5, 1946, that HENRY COLLINS had telephoned BELA GOLD to arrange for a meeting with the GOLDS.

The three people, the GOLDS and the soldier, left the Willard Hotel, proceeded to the GOLDS' car, and drove north to Harvey's Restaurant, 1107 Connecticut Avenue, where I'rs. GOLD and COLLINS alighted. GOLD parked his car and joined the others at Harvey's Restaurant where the three were assigned to a table for dinner. At this time, 6:30 p.m., the surveillance was discontinued.







On March 7, 1946, a surveillance on MICHAEL GREENBERG was conducted by Special Agents WILLIAM C. CORNELISON and RAPHAEL I. NIXON at 1130 AM. The surveillance was begun at the office of MICHAEL GREENBERG at Connecticut Avenue and "L" Streets, MW. At 12:40 FM subject GREENBERG was observed entering his office building. At 5:10 PM the subject came out of his office with an unidentified man and woman who are apparently his co-workers. The subject and unknown man were overheard to say they were "going to the Mayflower for a couple of drinks to celebrate (the unknown man's) birthday."

At 5:15 PH the subject and unknown man were observed to enter the Men's Bar where they remained until 6:25 PM, at which time the subject and the unknown man came out of the Payflower and after an exchange of goodby's the subject proceeded to 17th and "K" Streets where he purchased a bottle of liquor in the Benjamin Franklin Liquor Store.

At 6:45 PM the subject was observed to board Capitol Transit Bus No. 4862 marked MacArthur Boulevard. At 7:05 PM the subject was observed getting off the bus at a bus stop in front of 4864 MacArthur Boulevard and entered Apartment 107 at 4884 MacArthur Boulevard.

It was ascertained from Confidential Informant that ROSE L. CREGG, wife of JCSEPH GREGG, has prepared a manual entitled "Our Cooperative Nursey School", which contains information relative to the Takoma Park— Silver Spring (Maryland) Cooperative Nursey School.

The Manual Committee is said to be composed of EMILY S. HORIN,

Director of the School; MARION T. JONES, teacher; RUTH H. ZIMMERMAN; MARY LERCH BRICE; ROSELIE B. SORUS; and GLENORE FOR HORNE.

There is being set out below a summarization of the data supplied by Confidential Informant during the period of March 1, 1946 to March 15, 1946 inclusive

During the above-mentioned period the great majority of the information supplied by informant dealt with conferences between Mrs. GREGG and members of the Takoma Park-Silver Spring Cooperative School. The names of individuals having children in this school were set out in the January 28, 1946 report in this case.

However, on Harch 2, 1946 it is noted that ROSE GREGG in a social conversation with JENNIE MILLER, wife of ROBERT T. MILLER III, a subject in this case.

On March 3, 1946 a man named BOB, who is believed to be ROBERT T. MILLER, conferred with JOSEPH GREGG. GREGG inquired concerning BOB's work, to which BOB replied that they are getting two new people in the morning. They discussed re-employment of veterans and GREGG said there was nothing new at his office.

BOB then advised that CARL (possibly CARL SPAETH) broke a luncheon engagement with him at the last minute. GREGG stated that CARL accepts every invitation he gets and then chooses which one to keep. They discussed the elections in Argentina and GREGG maintained it will be a mess if PERCN wins. However, "If the other guy wins, Argentina will be more pro-Europe than pro-American". BOB and GREGG agreed to get together sometime during the week and "chew the fat".

According to informant, a Mr. LORE (phonetic) conferred with Mrs. GREGG on March 8, 1946. In this connection Mr. LCRE reportedly advised Mrs. GREGG that he has not received the check from Mr. GREGG. She stated that it was just an oversight and would be handled immediately. LCRE advised that the "owner's son" from Chicago, Illinois is here and is wondering about the check. He also advised that Mrs. HCBBLE (phonetic) is in Florida.

Mrs. GREGG inquired concerning a individual named P.T, and Mr. LORE stated that he would let her know as soon as PAT gets in town.

On March 11, 1946 JEMMIE MILLER, wife of ROBERT T. MILLER, III, invited the GREGGS to have dinner with her before the concert on the following day. N

No information of value to this investigation has been received as a result of the Mail Cover maintained on HALPERIN's residence, 9456 Georgia Avenue, Silver Spring, Maryland, during the period of this report.

There is being set out below a summarization of the data supplied by Confidential Informant during the period of March 1st to March 15th, 1946 inclusive.

On March 1, 1946 Mrs. HALPERIN, during a conversation with an unidentified woman, mentioned the name of JEHLTE MILLER (wife of ROBERT T. MILLER III).

On the following day, March 2, 1946, HALFERIN attempted to contact a Mr. REAM. This individual is identical with LOUIS M.—REAM, who resides at 2480 16th Street, NT. telephone number DE-3185, and is employed by the American Red Cross.

Subsequent to the foregoing, BOB ROGERS conferred with HALPERIN and suggested that he purchase a copy of "Subrosa", a book which depicts the activities of the Office of Strategic Services. ROGERS inquired as to whether HALPERIN had told his family about his dismissal on his job, to which HALPERIN replied in the negative. HALPERIN then stated that he is trying to get in touch with LOUIS REAM for the purpose of advising him that the "jigg is up", and the past is not of so much importance or concern as the future. ROGERS suggested that HALPERIN also tell REAM that "the McCORMACK son is in the descendent".

Also, on March 2, 1946 an unidentified woman talked to Mrs. HALPERIN, during which conversation Mrs. HALPERIN mentioned that BOB RCGERS had invited them to his home for the purpose of celebrating HALPERIN's birthday. The unidentified woman, who may be EDITH-MAHL, advised that she will convey the news concerning the get-together to DAVE (believed to be DAVID R. WAHL).

It was further ascertained from this informant that on March 2, 1946 HALFERIN contacted an individual named RUTH, who is believed to be Mrs. RUTH DEUTSCH, inasmuch as HALPERIN asked her if CARL (KAREL) had told her about the party the next day.

On the third of March, 1946, ROBERT T. MILLER attempted to reach HALPERIN. He was told that HALPERIN could be reached at ADams-7291. Shortly subsequent to this, HALPERIN contacted ROBERT T. MILLER, who con-

gratulated him on his birthday anniversary. HALPERIN agreed tentatively to have lunch with MILLER on the following day.

Informant advised that on March 4, 1946 WOODROW BORAH engaged in a social conversation with HALPERIN.

Also, on March 4, 1946, HALPERIN contacted LOUIS REAM of the American Red Cross. According to informant, REAM has been attempting to obtain certain information and apply pressure with reference to what is believed to be HALPERIN's dismissal from the State Department, which was effective on February 12, 1946. In this connection, HALPERIN stated, "Could anybody find out anything, or they just wouldn't talk?" REAM replied, "they just said there was enough of a case, and I guess after they announced the story they didn't want to go beyond it" *** (1)

HALPERIN advised that he has talked to Colonel McCORIACK as a consequence of which he and McCORIACK have parted as friends. HALPERIN continued by stating, "I'm going on leave the end of the week", and explained this by stating, "I'm going on sick leave at the end of the week and that's going to carry me along until the end of May". He also advised that upon the completion of his sick leave, the annual leave will begin and will carry him on until October, 1946.

HALPERIN described his feelings on this point by stating, "I ain't done so bad". RIAM replied that he did not know what the story is (about HALPERIN's dismissal) so HALPERIN stated, "I'm sure I know what it was, Louie. It was one of those things, but I couldn't get it out of them. I talked to BEN OHEN, who was most sympathetic etc. and so on, but he said he didn't like the procedure and what—not, and he long advocated they have some sort of a board which Congress might trust....My guess is that they are just scared of someone in Congress or somewhere else rattling some skeltons in peoples' closets, you know".

HALPERIN maintains that his dismissal results from his old Oklahoma background and "general fear, you know" (HALPERIN was dismissed from the University of Oklahoma on the bases of alleged Communist activities).

They then discussed the possibility of General Marshall succeeding Mr. BYRNES as Secretary of State.

HALPERIN also advised RELI that on the occasion of his conference with McCORACK, this individual told him that he would probably be resigning from the State Department. In this connection, HALPERIN advised he thinks there is only one chance in ten that McCORNACK will remain with the State Department: HALPERIN also maintained that FUSSELL "if he does not do anything else, he will get him (McCORNACK)".

HALPERIN advised, "I feel a great deal of relief now being out of this mess, and I'm going to get down to work, of course".

REAM stated, "Well, Maurice, one thing is certain, our friendship will always continue". HALPERIN thanked REAM for all his efforts in his (HALPERIN'S) behalf, and stated that he will probably just work around his house until school is out.

On the same day, HALFERIN conferred with an individual whom he addressed as 1000". This individual is not believed identical with BOB ROGERS, who is presumably employed in the Latin-American Section of the State Department in the Dorchester House, Washington, D. C. HALFERIN inquired as to whether DOC is going to Mexico at last; to which DOC stated "I do not know". DOC explained that there is much confusion concerning his trip to Mexico, and he is just standing by awaiting orders to depart. HALFERIN advised that he intends to go to Boston on the following Tednesday as he will no longer be employed after the close of work on Friday. He stated that he will be on the payroll for quite a while, but will not return to his employment with the State Department. HALFERIN also related that he will see the "United Food Company man" when he gets to Boston. It would appear that HALFERIN hopes to sell some sort of a proposition to the United Food Company.

HALPERIN, in cluding, stated that he had a lot of work to do.
They agreed to get together at some future date, providing DOC is still in town.

It was ascertained from informant on March 4, 1946 that HALPERIN directed the following night telegram to PHILLIP FALPERIN, 1156 Commonwealth avenue, Boston, Massachusetss: "Taking 3:00 p.m. train Mednesday, March sixth. Expect me after midnight".

On the fifth of Tarch, 1946, EDITH HALFERIN conferred with an unidentified woman named DANZEL (phonetic). Mrs. HALFERIN mentioned that her hus and had decided to leave the State Department, but will remain on annual and sick leave until October, 1946. She stated he will now be in a position to write a book, for which he already has a publisher. Ihrs. HALFERIN added, however, that she thought HALFERIN would rather set up an institute or do some type of Latin-American work. DANZEL was also advised that HALFERIN was in a position where he could not write or publish anything while he was working with O.S.S. They spoke about a warrantly, who has been able to write with freedom. This individual may be identical with a Dr. WARREN, who is a member of the Cosmos Club, and apparently a social acquaintance of MAURICE HALFERIN.

Later in the day of March 5th, Halperin conferred with DAVID Thil. During the course of this conversation, Wall mentioned that he is a

member of a Riding Club (automobile) with CHEP, ST. CLAIR, the BENTLEYS (phonetic), and PHILLIP DUNAWAY. He also advised that IRVEIG DUNAWAY. He also advised that IRVEIG DEWORK (pronounced DEEWORK), who is his (TAHL'S) counterpart in the World Jewish Congress, and Captain HERBERT FIERCE (phonetic), who is in the Civil Affairs Commission under HILDRING (General HILDRING) are at his home. He invited HALPERIN to come on over. He invited HALPERIN to pick up the DUNAWAY's on his way over.

On March 7, 1946 Mrs. HALPERIN contacted her maid at home and instructed her to be on the lookcut for a man from HALPERIN's office, who may bring an envelope to the house that afternoon. A short while subsequent to this, Mrs. HALPERIN again conferred with her maid to ascertain whether the envelope had been delivered. The answer was "no".

Mrs. HALPERIN conferred with Miss THERES SORACCO, an employee of the Latin-American Section of the State Department in the Dorchester House, Washington, D. C. (This individual is identical with the person previously reported on numerous occasions as "TEREY").

She advised Liss SORACCO that inasmuch as her family was coming to Mashington, she would like to postpone the dinner engagement on Saturday night.

lirs. HALPERIN recontacted Hiss THERESA SORACCO on March 8, 1946 to inquire if she had heard from an HALPERIN. SCRACCO answered in the affirmitive, and stated that BOB RUGERS would bring "some things" out to the HALPERIN's that evening, at which time they would give are. HALPERIN the message received from her husband.

On the same day, BOB RUGERS of the Latin-American Section of the State Department, conferred with Mrs. HALPERIN. He stated that he, RUGERS, will be out the following day and not tonight. ROGERS advised that HALPERIN will return to Washington, D. C. at midnight on Monday, inasmuch as he is leaving Boston via the 3:00 p.m. train.

ROGERS further advised that he had the following message for Lirs. HALFERIN from her husband: "You can live in Beston if you are willing to take in washing". According to ROGERS, HALFERIN's statement means that he could not make enough money in Boston. RECERS also stated that Lirs. HALPERIN should not take in washing at first, inasmuch as there is a book to write. ROGERS will bring out some of HALPERIN's property tomorrow, but first he must see the WAHL'S (DAVID R. WAHL) and the DUNAWAYS (PHILLIP DUNAWAY).

On March 9, 1946 Mrs. BUSSEY (phonetic), whose child is named FREDDIE and is presently attending the LaFellettee School, engaged in a

social conversation with Mrs. Half RIN. This woman has another child named Barbara, and her husband's name is FRED. Mrs. HalfErin stated, "There are big things cooking over at this end...may Boston, may be lichigan, or New York...I don't care". They agreed to get together to tall the situation over in the near future.

On the 11th of March, 1946 NAMEY SNODGRASS (phonetic) contacted EDITH MALFERIN. It would appear that NAMEY is also known as ANY SNODGRASS and her husband's name is PAUL. According to informant, the SNODGRASS's do not have a telephone and have to use that of the landlord. Informant also states either PAUL or NAMEY are employed at some type of laboratory. It was agreed that the SNODGRASS's and MALFATN'S should get together at the SNODGRASS home at approximately 6:30 p.m. on Saturday.

On Harch 13, 1946 HAURICE HALPERIN conferred with an unidentified man named KIRKPATRICK. This individual is possibly identical with EVRON KIRKPATRICK of the Office of Research and Intelligence of the United States Department of State. HALPERIN stated that PHIL (PHILLIP DUNAWAY, who is employed by the Office of Research and Intelligence of the Department of State) had given him KIRKPATRICK's message about the "scare item" in the curriculum meeting. KIRKPATRICK inquired concerning HALPERIN's reaction, whereupon they discussed an article HALPERIN has prepared, which apparently deals with HALF RIN's desires to secure a position as a language professor at some University. HALPERIN advised that the last time he had to do something like this was in 1927. KIRKPATRICK replied that he will have his secretary retype the article and delete certain things which he feels should be left out.

It was also ascertained from informant on the same day that BCB RCGERS contacted AURICE HABFERIN for the purpose of advising him that the new situation is "grimd", and that WOODROW (WOODROW BORNH, who replaced HALFERIN as Chief of the Latin-American Section) will tell him about it. ROGERS further advised that "the man in charge is very stupid". RCGERS suggested that KALFERIN get after Colonel McCORLCK, remarking about the unhappy state that McCORLCK himself is in.

HALFERIN advised that there is no question but what he can obtain a position as professor in Boston at one of the universities in the event he chooses to do so. HALFERIN also advised ROGERS concerning his trip to the Company (United Food Company in Boston), stating that the ideas he presented were quite new to them. They discussed in a general way HALFERIN's attempts to discover the reason for his dismissal from the State Deport ent. It was agreed by them that after all is said and done HALFERIN is better off out of the whole mess.

ROGERS advised that LLL TYLL'S (phonetic) intends to warry

his secretary from England, and will try to place her in a "cozy job here"

It would appear that ROGERS will attempt to have the future Mrs. EVANS take over the position vacated by EVELYN RUTH ROSSMAN, CAF-7, in the Latin-American Section.

Later in the day, WOODROW BORAH conferred with MAURICE HALPERIN.

After engaging in a general social conversation, they agreed to meet for dinner that evening after which they would go to the concert in Constitution Hall.

Additional information supplied by informant on March 13, 1946 reveals that MAURICE HALPERIN conferred with BIHL WARREN (It is believed this individual is identical with the person referred to as "DÖC!" in the conference hereinbefore set out on March 4, 1946). WARREN advised that he was leaving Mashington, D. C. at 4:35 p.m., and due back the 13th of April. He said he will arrive in Merico City, Mexico at 8:00 a.m. on March 14th via American Air Lines. These individuals discussed HALPERIN's prospects in Boston, whereupon HALP RIN advised that "the senior member of the Committee told me I'm the man". HALPERIN advised his duties in this connection would be to coordinate studies on Latin American countries and would entail approximately half teaching time and half time devoted to organization and administration.

HALFERIN further related that he spent an hour in the Office of the Vice President of the Fruit (Food) Company (United Fruit Company or Food Company). He stated that the company is worried about the future, social and economic problems etc. HALFERIN further related that he "dropped seeds in Cambridge", and let them know as much about him as he wanted them to know.

WOCDROW BORAH and MAURICE MALPERIN confirmed the dinner engagement for instant night (March 13, 1946). BORAH advised that PHIL (DUNAWAY) wants MALPERIN to call him that night..not his office but at home.

Additional data obtained from informant on March 13, 1946 indicates that EDITH WAHL and HALPERIN discussed general social matters.

MAURICE MALFERIN conferred with THIRESA SORACCO on March 13, 1946, whom he advised that he expected a letter from a kid named CALDWELL from Boston or Cambridge". SORACCO informed him that he has a letter there from IRVING LECHARD (phonetic). He explained the letter from CALDWELL as being a business application, and requested her to send a copy of the "Blue Book" to Professor WILLIAM BIRRIEN of Harvard University, Cambridge, Massachusetts with the compliments of MAURICE HALPERIN.

HALPERIN then conveyed the following data to SORACCO, concerning the expenses incurred on his trip to Boston: "Left Mednesday, Karch 6, 1946 at 3:00 p.m. Arrived Poston, Massachusetts 11:50 p.m. Taxi back Bay Station to 1156 Commonwealth Avenue — \$1.00. Back: Londay, March 11th—left Boston 3:00 p.m. Taxi to station from 1156 Commonwealth Avenue — \$1.00. Arrived Washington, D. C., midnight. Taxi home 90¢"

HALPERIN then invited Hiss SORACCO and BOB ROGERS to dinner at his home at 5:30 p.m. on Friday. They also discussed the possibility of SORACCO's leaving the Latin-American Section in the event her request for a C.F-7 Rating is not approved.

On the same day, HALPERIN and WOODROW BORAH conferred, at which time HALPERIN inquired concerning POLLAN's first name. BORAH advised his complete name is ARTHUR A FOLLAN.

Shortly subsequent to the above, on March 13, 1946 MAURICE HALPERIN attempted to contact Colonel AIFRED McCORLACK of the State Department, and left word to have him call HALPERIN upon his return to his office.

WOODROW BORAH recontacted HALPERIN to advise him that ARTHUR A. POLLAN is the Executive Vice President of the United Fruit Company HALP RIN replied that he is working on the Fruit Company thing.

Colonel McCORMACK contacted MAURICE HALPERIN, who inquired "Do you think it is going to come out O.K.?" McCORMACK said he did not know as he had not heard anything as yet. HALPERIN asked him if he receive d his letter and if it were satisfactory, and McCORMACK replied that he is waiting for a confirmation of the legality of the way HALPERIN is proposing to do this thing. McCORMACK added that he has no objection, providing it conforms to Civil Service regulations. HALPERIN has checked it, and is sure his method conforms with the regulations. It is possible that this refers to the proposed sick leave and annual leave period to extend to keep HALPERIN on the payroll until October, 1946.

It was also determined from informant on March 13, 1946 that an unidentified man named AL contacted HALFERIN. This man inquired as to what HALFERIN knows of his successor, adding that he understood he saw something of "your friend BOB HILLER (ROBERT T. MILLER III) when he was in C.I.A.A." HALFERIN replied "Well, I guess BCB would be able to give us the done". The following is the conversation which took place between HALFERIN and ALFERIN and ALFE

D: I don't believe I have. Well how is it coming, al?

It was reported that on Parch 14, 1946 WOODROW WILSON BORAH conferred with MAURICE HALPERIN. BURAH advised that he tought HALPERIN might be interested in the fact that "the <u>Division declared war</u> on the Soviet Union Wednesday at 4:30 p.m.,..we are in a great crusade...I'm afraid

"we have JAMES (unidentified) back...the man is a fool, I think". BORAH went on to state that JAMES has his own ideas and is really emphasizing them. He stated that Tuesday, JAMES was already beginning to pound them and on Wednesday he was beginning to preach. BORAH also advised "the non-Communists left the hemispheric bloc against the Soviet Union and the need of tracing every instance of opposition to Russia. He's (JAMES) a Socialist. PHIL (DUNAWAY) had told me this was just a form of displaying it. I do not think it is. It is a little too much display. He is an idiot on political matters even though he is a bolitical scientist".

BORAH also advised that JAIES is a Rockefeller man, having been in the Rockefeller organization for a year. He also stated that IRVING (GOLDIAN) is taking the brunt of the whole thing, and JAHES has decided he will run it directly with GOLDIAN and he, BORAH, is not to touch it. HALPERIN asked if BORAH has begun to notice much of a change. BORAH replied that the whole office is completely aware of it and a number of the members of the force are talking about leaving. BORAH made a statement that he and BOB ROGERS will probably be fired.

EORAH then referred to some unidentified man who has been reviewing the work of his section, stating that he is "terribly anxious to make good and is very young...only 22". He described this individual as having a little more brain power than JAITS and maintained if this person "does this through O.R.I. at large, he will cook the division".

HALPERIN is becoming more appreciated everyday. They discussed information which HALPERIN had sent to the U ited Fruit Company, whereupon HALPERIN advised that he sent a copy of this communication to "our fruind in 109", with the explanation that he, HALPERIN, had separated himself from his department. BORAH said with reference to HALPERIN's leaving the State Department, that all the force have been cross—examining him to determine whether HALPERIN was dismissed or left of his own volition. He advised HALPERIN that the force suspects semething and BOB ROGELS himself is suspicious. BORAH added that as long as BOB ROGERS "only suspects, it is O.K.". He also remarked, "I was thinking with amusement tonight, it would be wonderful if the non-Communists left and got tired of this". BORAH continued by advising that he has his own particular candidate to offer and criticized the new man as being a good looking military man, but with no brains.

HALPERIN and BORAH indicated mutual friendship for HAR ID EISBERG, an employee in the Latin-American Division, and BORAH stated that DAVID BUSH ELL (likewise an employee in the Latin-American Division) will go to Harvard University this fall. BORAH statedthat BUSH ELL will take studies in connection with his doctorate. (VI)



In concluding BORAH advised that the new man in the office is named WILLEORE (phonetic) and he is a Rhode Scholar. BORAH agreed to come to MALPERIN's house the next day and help him spade his garden.

On March 15, 1946 WOODROW BCRAH advised MAURICE HALPERIN that he and IRVING COLDMAN would be out at 10:00 or 11:00 a.m. to help work in the garden. HALPERIN mentioned that he will speak to LEOMARD (unidentified) at the Unive sity" about a possible Assistant Professorship for BCRAH.

Shortly subsequent to the above, HALFERIN invited BOB ROGERS and I iss THERESA SORACCO for supper that night.

Conversation with MAURICE HALP RIN on March 15, 1946. She mentioned that PHILLIP is very unhappy, but has not, as yet, resigned his position. PHILLIP DUNAWAY is employed by the Office of Research and Intelligence of the United States Department of State in Room #605 of the War Annex #1 Building.

The following information was furnished by confidential informant during the period March 1 to 15, 1946.

On March 1, 1946, an unidentified woman was in contact with Mrs. HISS at which time they discussed plans for shopping. Mrs. HISS stated she was going to pick up ISOBELLE (possibly ISOBELLE AHAFFEY). She also advised next week DORIS SULLEY (phonetic) is going to visit the HISS home. It was indicated DORIS had previously shared a house with Mr. and Mrs. HISS.

On March 2, 1946, LOUIS BOENH of New York was reported to have contacted ALGER HISS. BOEHM stated he had been introduced to HISS by a Mr. SPAULDING about two months ago at which time he discussed with HISS the peace treaty work." HISS indicated he was about to leave for NBC for radio broadcast. BOEHM indicated he himself was leaving for Florida that night. Mr. BOEHM indicated he was interested in ascertaining if the State Department might use his service as a sort of legal adviser in the drafting of treaties. HISS indicated this matter was outside his field, and probably Mr. MATTHEWS, director of the European Office, would handle such matters.

On March 7, 1966, a person known to informant only as TARME (possibly DARME or DARME) contacted Mrs. HISS to discuss attendance at the Roosevelt dinner. They also discussed plans for the dinner at the HISS home.

On March 13, 1946, the informant believed this same person recontacted Mrs. HISS to advise that her husband has a speaking engagement Thursday night in New York, and the discussion further concerned possibilities for a dinner the week following. Both Mrs. HISS and DARYL indicated the security council meeting in New York would probably interfere for the husbands of both women.

At this time Mrs. HISS advised that WILDER and MARCIA FOOTE have bought a home in Larchmont, New York. Mrs. HISS also indicated at this time ALGER HISS "has to go to Boston." DARYL indicated her husband DON had to be in New York on Tuesday, Thursday, and Saturday of that week.

On March 14, 1946, informant advised an unidentified woman contacted Mrs. HISS to invite her and ALCER HISS to dinner. Mrs. HISS advised at this time that ALGER HISS was to be in Boston Monday through Wednesday, and that the security council meeting is to begin on the 23rd of March at Hunter College, New York City.

On the same date MARCIA FOOTE contacted Mrs. HISS at which time they discussed social activities. Mrs. HISS indicated JOE and HERBERT ABRAHAM were coming to the HISS home for dinner the following Thursday.

Baltimore confidential informant advised he learned THOMAS COX, known communist, and BEATRICE AVNET, known communist, discussed on January 18, 1946, the Citizens Committee for Relief of Strikers' Families, by of which COX was chairman.

During this discussion, it was mentioned Mrs. CHARLES HAISS, mother of ALCER J. HISS, is a "blue blood and is a possible lead for a new committee." On the following day, AVNET and COX also mentioned Mrs. HISS, and at this time stated she is sending a check to them for the "Citizens Committee for Aid to Strikers' Families Fund."

During this discussion, COX stated Mrs. HISS is the mother of ALGER J. HISS who is being attacked by the State Department.

The following information was obtained by confidential informant in the period March 1 to 15, 1946.

On March 1, 1946, MIRIAL SEBORER Contacted DOROTHY KAPLAN and advised she had quit her job. DOROTHY then invited MIRIAM to her house for the night.

On the same date DOROTHY KAPLAN was in touch with a woman known to informant as PAUIA at which time DOROTHY advised "I am not going this week-end."

On March 2, 1946, DORCIHY KAPLAN contacted an individual known to informant as CFORGE (probabl; WSILVERIAN) who advised her SARAH was not home at that time. Mrs. KAPLAN then made arrangements to go to the SILVER-LAMS for that evening.

On March 3, 1946, DOROTHY MAPLAN called the Carfield Hospital to speak with Mrs. FPANCES FUCHS. X V)

On March 6, 1946, DOROTHY MAPIAN contacted the Pennsylvania Railroad and obtained reservations for Np. NEEDLEMAN for New York City on the 9 o'clock train for March 7, 1946.

It was noted on the same date an unknown man contacted IRVING KAPLAN advising he hoped to leave town that night and requested that DORCTHY KAPLAN attempt to get an airplane reservation for him that night. KAPLAN advised the man he would pick him up at one of the Hot Shoppes that evening. Subsequent information received by informant indicated no airlines reservations to New York were available that night. It was subsequent to these contacts that Mrs. KAPLAN obtained the reservations for Mr. MEEDLEMAN for New York City on March 7, 1946.





In a previous report, it was noted that on December 29, 1945 a woman occupying room 702 at the Commodore Hotel, Washington, D. C., was contacted by CHARIES KRAMER. Special Agent GEORGE G. McKENNA was advised by the Desk Clerk J. J. MATER that this room has been occupied for years by the manager of the hotel, L. M. FIREY.

The following background on CHARLES FLATO of 1731 New Hampshire Avenue, N. 7., who has contacted CHARLES KRAMER in the past, was obtained by Special Employee NICHOLAS MANFREDA at Stone's Mercantile Agency:

CHARLES SIDNEY FLATO, according to information dated December 12, 1942 at the Agency, was born about 1908. Since December 7, 1942, he was employed by the Board of Economic Farfare at 14th and Constitution Avenue, N.W. as a Principal Liaison Officer at \$5600 per year. He had formerly been employed by the Federal Power Commission. At this time, he claimed that his wife was employed by the Civil Aeronautics Authority as a clerk. Stone's was advised by a Boston Credit Agency that FLATO was a writer by profession, spent some twelve or fourteen years as a free-lance writer and contributed to various magazines particularly with reference to labor problems and current events. He has resided in Washington since about 1936. He is the son of HID A and DAVID A. FLATO. His father is President and Treasurer of a hardware concern FLATO'S INC. located at 154 Harvard Ave., Allston, Massachusetts.

Special Employee MANFREDA found no criminal record for FLATO.

No physical surveillance of the subject was continued during the period of this report - March 1st to March 15th inclusive.

On March 1, 1946 LEE advised the maid at his home that his new office number was DUpont-1530, extension #74. This number is listed to the Chinese Supply Commission, 2311 Massachusetts Avenue, NV. However, it will be noted that LEE is working in a branch office of this Commission at 2132 Bancroft Place, NV, Mashington, D. C. V(11)

On the 4th of Merch, 1946 DUNCAN LEE engaged in a social conversation with one MARGERY KENNEDY of Room #702 of the Chastleton Hotel, telephone DUpont-1000. In this connection KENNEDY advised that BETTY McDOMALD, whom they both knew in China, is in Mashington, D. C. (4)

Additional information obtained from informant on March 4, 1946 indicates that GUY PECKETT (phonetic) obtained the name "MORWOOD S. ALLIAN" from DUNCAN LEE. They referred to this individual as having published a book and LEE said he could be contacted through the office of BURT SERVICE (phonetic), or FAUL ECKLE (phonetic).

Later in the day HENRY MARFIELD, then of the Wardman Park Hotel, told LEE that he and JOE KAUFNAN are in town.

On March 8, 1946 DUNCAN LEE was advised that DICK REPLER had attempted to reach him from New York City. At this time LEE was attending a party at the home of Lieutenant Commander DONALD M. DAVIES, 1135 South Thomas, Arlington, Virginia, telephone number GLebe-4400 (U)

During the period from March 1 to 15, 1946, SOLOMON LISCHINSKY remained in the vicinity of Seattle, Washington, and is expected to return to Washington, D. C., by April 1, 1946.

It was ascertained through a confidential source that LISCHIMSKY stated he has been purchasing boats in the vicinity of Seattle.

This same source revealed on February 16, 1916, Mrs. LISCHINSKY and the children attended a birthday party for RICHIE CARSEL and spent the night at the CARSEL residence

A review of the file entitled "LEO KRZYCKI with aliases; Registration Act, Internal Security - R," reflects in April, 1945, a letter was addressed to KRZYCKI in care of PETER-CANGAIA, 333 Lester Avenue, Oakland, California, from one VERDA BARNES in which it was mentioned she had been contacted by a friend of hers, SOLOMON A. LISCHINSKY who was in Washington, D. C., and encountering difficulty in connection with his temporary appointment as UMRA delegate to Poland. The delegation was awaiting clearance from Jarsaw and all were cleared but two of the members of the delegation. LISCHINSKY was one of the two, and she thinks the Warsaw government has confused him with someone else. He informed her that LISCHINSKY is a royal family name in Poland and perhaps for that reason they think he is a relative and would be friendly with the Polish government in London. She indicated he is anxious to have the objection removed and to get on with his assignment. The letter further indicates that BARNES has known LISCHINSKY for a number of years in Washington, that he formerly held positions with the Tolan Committee and WAPPA. She indicated she had a great deal of confidence in him and that she is sure the charge against him is in error. She informed that JOHN ABT also knows Mr. LISCHINSKY since he was employed by Amalgamated for a short time and worked under JOHN's direction. BARNES indicated she would be very grateful for any help he might give Mr. LISCHIMSKY.

Regarding VERDA BAFNES, the Tashington Field Office files reflect on January 10, 1946, an unknown man contacted Mr. HADDOCK and Mr. LEVIN at the Office of the CIO Maritime Committee requesting the address of VERDA BARNES. He was advised she might be reached at the National CIO Headquarters. It was also noted on January 15, 1946, VERDA BARNES contacted HARRIET SOUSLOG, who is executive secretary of the Harry Bridges Victory Committee, and legislative representative of the International Longshoremen Workers Union at the CIO Maritime Committee Office.

In connection with the investigation of the American Youth Congress in 1941, the name VERDA BARNES of Idaho appears in a newspaper article dated March 17, 1941, in the periodical "The Review" where she is mentioned as a member of a youth organization entitled, "The Committee of Three Million, Inc."

In connection with the investigation of ELEANOR WOOLEY FOTHER, with aliases; Internal Security - C," who is secretary-treasurer of the CIC auxiliaries and a writer for the CIO News, it was noted on October 2, 1944, she wrote the following article, "Momen in Mar," reflecting VERDA BARNES as women's director of the PAC, and that she had given a fine speech at the U. E. Auxiliary Convention.

BARMES pointed out the tramendous responsibilities which rest on women of this country in the November elections. The article continued by pointing out the lack of ballots for soldiers, the large percentage of women voters, and urged women to ring doorbells for votes.

According to a memorandum dated July 16, 1938, in connection with the National rally of young democrats in Scattle, Washington, as reflected by the Dies Committee investigation, there was a round table discussion of the reporter system in women's clubs. "The key note for the rally was made by VERDA BARNES," it was reported who asked for support of the President and the New Deal. Her address at the time was shown as 2151 California Street, N. W., Washington, D. C., and position as vice chairman of the Advisory Committee.

According to the city directory of Washington, D. C., from 1936 - 1943, the following was noted:

In 1938 a VERDA BARNES, employed as a stenographer, resided at 1/03 H Avenue, N. W. In 1940 a VERDA BARNES (Mrs.), employed as a clerk in the Interior Department, resided in apartment 201, 2151 California Street, I. V., Washington, D. C. In 1941 VERDA W. BARNES was employed in research by JAY FRANKLIN and resided at 3610 N Street, N. W. In 1943 VARDA W. BARNES, specialist with the War Manpower Commission, resided at 3610 N Street, N. W.

The personnel file of SOLOMON A. LISCHINSKY was exhibited by Mr. FRED PARKER in the investigative section of UNRRA, 231,2 Massachusetts Avenue, N. J. This file reflected LISCHINSKY filed an application on February 21, 1914, for the position of statistician with UNRRA. In this application he stated he was born on March 27, 1908, in Montreal, Canada, and he is a citizen of the United States. He was described as being 5 feet 8 inches in height, and weighing 180 pounds. His wife was described as being 29 years of age and he has a daughter two years old and a son four years old.

From August, 1942, to the date of the application, LISCHIYSKY was the deputy chief of program and control records. Branch of Tools Division, War Production Board, under the supervision of HARRY MACDOFF. In this position he was charged with the responsibility for administering the activities of the branch, both as to program and operations. This branch had the responsibility for developing and maintaining statistical controls required to coordinate, within the overall war program, the operations of the industries under the jurisdiction of the Tools Division. For a few months, prior to the application, he was designated as chief of staff to the combined production and resources board, Machine Tool Committee, and to the American Operating Committee which is the advisory body to the American chairman of the former.

From August, 1941, to August, 1942, he was an economist for the House Committee investigating national defense migration at a salary from \$3200 to \$5,000 funder the supervision of P. K. LAIB, staff director. He resigned from this position. From October, 1938, to February, 1941, he was an economist for the Wage-Hour Bureau, Amalgamated Clothing Workers of America, Washington, D. C., under the supervision of JOHN JABT. LISCHINSKY stated he resigned from this position.

From June, 1937, to October, 1938, he was head of the research department for the Labor Bureau of the Middle West, 11 South LaSalle Street, Chicago, Illinois, under the supervision of O. D. ZIMRING at a salary ranging from \$1800 to \$2210 per annum. He stated he also resigned his position. From March, 1937, to June, 1937, he was special statistical staff analyst, National Research Project, 1015 Chestnut Street, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, \$3500 per annum. He resigned from this position. From November, 1936, to February, 1937, he was a supervisor at the Social Science Research Council, Loago, Illinois, at \$1800 per annum. He resigned this position. From Systember, 1935, to June, 1936, he was a lecturer at People's Junior College, 200 West Douglas Boulevard, Chicago, Illinois, at \$2,000 per annum until the college closed.

From February to April, 193h, he was employed by the Department of Epiene, Toronto, Canada, under the supervision of Dr. W. T. FRASER of the University of Toronto. He stated the reason he left this position was the completion of the assignment. From September to December, 1933, he was employed at \$25 per week by the Parliament State Businessmen's Association in Toronto. From January to September, 1933, he was employed by the Toronto Daily Star, \$15 per week, and edited a small weekly paper at the same time. From 1929 to 1932 he was a tutoral fellow at the University of Toronto and employed by the University on a part time teaching fellowship in the Department of Mathematics. He stated in his application he can speak French fairly well and can read it well. He can also read German fairly well. From 1924 to 1927 he attended the University of Manitoba and received a B. A. degree in 1927. In 1929 he received his M. A. degree from the same university. From

1927 to 1932 he attended the University of Toronto and received his Ph. D. degree in May, 1932.

During the year 1941-1942 he studied mathematics and statistics at American University. He gave the following references in his application:

On Saptember 6, 1944, LISCHINSKY was transferred from the War Production Board to the position of senior analyst, grade 13, Bureau of Supply, UNRRA, Washington, D. C., salary \$7,000 per annum.

He was thereafter transferred to the Polish Mission but since Saptember 16, 1945, has been chief of the Agriculture Equipment Branch, Supply Bureau, Agriculture Rehabilitation Division, UNRRA, Washington, D. C., and is presently in grade 13 receiving \$7600 per annum. LISCHINSKY now holds a passport in connection with the proposed travel when he was assigned to the Polish Mission but no travel is presently contemplated for LISCHINSKY.

His personnel file contained an investigative report dated April 19, 1004, which sets forth information obtained in the Civil Service files which has previously been set forth in this case. There was a statement in the report that LISCHINSKY's education was verified as set forth in his application. This report reflected LISCHINSKY entered the United States on April 14, 19.6. It was further revealed LISCHINSKY received an efficiency rating of excellent while employed with the Labor Bureau in Chicago, and the Amalgamated Clothing Workers gave him the rating of excellent. When he was with the Herse Committee on National Defense Migration where his record was "satisfactory," his supervisor stated he would gladly rehire him if available. All supervisors vouched for LISCHINSKY for his loyalty, patriotism, and good character. The report concluded there was no record in the Folice Department, credit bureaus, and Dies Committee records.

Mr. GEORGE N. FERAZICH of UPRR. was interviewed and personally recommended him.

QUINN lives at 3464 artha Custis Drive. BEADIE informed her that there will be a meeting in two weeks. (11)

On March 1st BE. (V.N. TASSEL) contacted PEADIE MAGDOFF and inquired if H.RRY could come over and talk to V.N. TASSEL about the matter. BELDIE told her that HARRY could call in the morning. BEA advised BENDIE that the KAPPYS visited them last night.

On March 2, 1946 Mr. W.M T.SSEL contacted H.RRY MAGDOFF and asked H.RRY to come over as he was anxious to see him. H.RRY advised he would be over in about thirty minutes. BELDIE M.GDOFF contacted LEON.RD NIERENBERG and inquired if PEGGY was in. PEGGY will be back about 1.30 and BELDIE said that she and FREDDIE may drop in after a while.

BEIDIE MIGDOFF contacted BEI (V N TISSEL?) and inquired if MIRRY had left. He had not.

On March 2nd Poppa contacted HARRY MAGDOFF who advised that he is going to Philadelphia in a week or so to make a speech.

On Farch 3, 1946 BELDIE MIGDOFF contacted PEIRL (AMEIROD?) and told her that she would be over to see her in about an hour. PEIRL's address is 33 F Street. BELDIE MIGDOFF contacted FRIED! ———, to say that she left her pocketbook over there last night and would be by between three and four to pick it up. BELDIE said the party last night was grand.

On March 4th BELDIE MIGDOFF told Mrs. (MIRGIRET) PACKIRD that she is getting started and has contacted the man at LONG and CURRY Insurance. PACKIRD advised that she resided at 3232 Ravensworth, Park Fairfax, that her car is a 1941 Ford and that it was repaired February 8th and cost 15 for the fender.

PEIDIE M.GDOFF contacted the Washington Post, Circulation
Department complaining that she paid a boy for the Post and the next day
her regular carrier came to collect and said he had no helper. PEIDIE was
advised that she had been victimized.

Mr. BRISHEIRS contacted BFIDIE MIGDOFF who told him that she had recently backed into and damaged a neighbor's car on February 14th but failed to notify the insurance company until now.

HIRRY advised "we should chance the second paragraph in the morning, it will take about a half an hour." MILLIE contacted BELDIF and said she was going for a week for the conference and thought that her mother in law was coming to take care of the kids. BELDIE contacted Mrs. WELVER and asked when the next meeting was. It is on March 18th and the next one on the 26th. BELDIE advised that on the 18th a desert party will be held at BETTY COULTER'S house at 7.45. ITIDRED CHESKIN contacted BEADIE and asked if she and HARRY could go to the theater Saturday night. BEADIE will try to get a sitter. MILDRED may be reached at home TE 5434 or at work DI 8382.

On March 6th BEIDTE contacted BEIDTE WIN TISSEIL who said that BLN was a little concerned about CHURCHILL 's speech and described this speech as world shaking and terrible. Irs. VAN TISSEL said Churchill said "Let's gang up on Bussia" and went to town on Communism and wants to fight Communism. She said it was really vicious and Churchill should be deported for abusing the hospitality of this country because in 1938 a Bussian was deported for the same thing. She said "Look at JOHN (STRICHEY, phonetic)" BEIDIE MISDOFF recalled this and stated she was going to read Churchill's speech.

On March 6th HIRRY MIGDOFF contacted BEIDIE MIGDOFF and said he would be coming about 5.30 however he saw PHIL today but has not seen NIOS vot. HIRRY said "I'll have to leave here; they are acting very queer." On March 6th ED (FITZGERILD) contacted BELDIE MIGDOFF and asked if HIRRY had told her about KAPPYS reactions and all their reactions. ED thought KAPPY had a nice job. BELDIE said that HIRRY saw PHIL who understood how HIRRY felt. She said that HIRRY would see MIOS temorrow, but HIRRY doesn't think MIOS will come across. PHIL said if not he (PHIL) will go to the Secretary and take HIRRY upstairs and perhaps at some future date HIRRY can come back to something he likes. ED advised that he had decided that HIRRY has to move. He will be boxed if he doesn't, but he doesn't think that HIRRY should move upstairs. ED is sure that MIOS will not come across, but BELDIE asked how about the other issistant Directors. ED advised that that has not been set up yet and that the reorganization depends upon the budget and it his to go through Congress. BELDIE said that if MIOS doesn't do anything HIRRY has to go to this housing thing and ED advised her to sit and wait. HIRRY will get a good job. **Y 11**)

SMIDIE 1: SDOFF contacted her mother Jerome 6-6532 in New York. PRIDIE said she was going to the Convention to be held in Kansas City starting april 28th and wants her mother to come here. BELDIE will drive her and the kids to Petroit where they will remain with relatives while BELDIE will proceed from Petroit to Kansas City by air. Her mother will think of it and advise BELDIE later.

On March 6th RUTH HEXTER contacted BELDUE MIGDOFF. The MIGDOFFS are going to the National Theater Saturday. RUTH will sit with MIGDOFFS children Saturday night and BELDUE will sit for RUTH next Thursday.

On Tarch 7, 1946 HERRY MEGDOFF contacted BE DIE who asked if he had been up to see him yet. HIRRY said he had been but it was no good. They "his" hands are tied. She asked who tied them and HLRRY said it was HIKE. She asked H.RRY if he told "him" that he was quitting. H.RRY said he told him that it was most likely that he HLRRY would quit but HLRRY added that he also thought he could come back if he wanted to. HIRRY feels that it is a load off his mind. BELDIE asked if he was going upstairs or the other place. HIRRY said that shortly they will talk about that. BELDTE stated if he was going up to see "what you call him" - "Yes". HIPRY said that he and K.PPY had talked about this. BE DIE said that she and ED had talked about this. ED said he changed his mind after hearing KIPPY and now thinks HIRRY should go. FEIDIE asked if HIRRY would take care of ED otherwise they would throw him to the dogs. BE DIE asked who was going to be editor, H.SWELL?, phonetic, HIRRY S'IID, now. BEIDTE said fix them up good and take your whole staff with you. She said that she saw DOT KIPLAN and she is having breakfast with DOROTHY on Saturday morning. H.RRY said that FRIEDA was quite nice and full of energy. Her oldest sister SARA is quite capable. H'RRY said he did not know whether or not his new job would be a pressure job.



On March 7, 1946 <u>LEON_RD NIERENBERG</u> contacted <u>PEADIE M.GDOFF</u>
say that PEGGY was in Garfield Hospital but that her condition was uncertain.

LILLIE (NELSON?) contacted BEIDIE MIGDOFF who said HIRRY was changing jobs and would take another one in the Department (Commerce) or go over with TY TT and be in charge of all supplies. BEIDIE MIGDOFF contacted MIGDOFF contacted MIGDOFF said HIRRY would definitely change jobs because of TKE and go to housing or else be in TLIL 18:13 office.

On Narch 7th BELDIE M.GDOFF advised RETTY (COULTER?) and told DETTY about a letter received from Mrs. OGDEN, phonetic, and the University of Virginia, Extension Division, requesting permission to publish a series of articles telling about the League in Trington and the work it was doing.

BELDIE thinks it is a good idea but BELDIE wants to think the matter over before giving a decision. She thinks it should be brought to the attention of the National Organization and its authority obtained. BELDIE mentioned that HARRY will probably go to work for housing.

On March 7th NORTON (LONG) contacted HIRRY MIGDOFF. has CREEDEN, phonetic, on, the one who did the Oakridge job and worked under JEFFERS. NORTON said that CREEDEN was a plenty tough operator and "that CREEDEN may start a little program himself and that ROBBIE NE COMB, phonetic, is trying to begin over in FHL. HIRRY said that he talked to 110S today but PHIL is putting plenty terrific pressure on HIRRY's side and wants him upstairs. PHIL saw the Secretary today about it. NORTON said he was quite concerned about getting legislation lined up and getting political strategy operating right. "There was nobody in my job yet on account of MZ COPTIN who having won his fight at UNRR! does not want to leave until summer". However he said, if NLL were over here he could keep an eye on things and he would be in safe hands. There is no body in the top flight yet except IFO GREPLO, phonetic, who was there to start with. LONG said he got a guy named PHILLIPSON. phonetic, but he does not have too much faith in him. He said that he got some good guys EDDIE COOPER, N.T ROGG, phonetic, and BENNY GENSBERG from CPA. GINSBERG is a good writer. He can write this economic junk and make it sound good but LONG wants HIRRY to come up with some guys as LONG never waved C.F 15s around before without picking up some people. LONG said that it is an administrative program with a lot of steam behind it in spite the raking we took in the House. He thinks it is a sinch to win in the Senate. LONG believes that "YATT is going places; he is so much better than to stay with "IJL.CE. LONG advised HLRRY that there was something here that moving concretely to do something which is more important in terms of practical liberal action than anything that "dreamer" has got. He told HERY that when HERY was over in agriculture he could do something positive and that over in Commerce all HLRRY sould do is to have AL ERO NING, phonetic, or SCHIMDLER, phonetic, come out with newspaper gloss. HIRRY said that there is A lot in the political situation in the next four to eight years that is cynamite whereas WALLACE can be a complete washout but he still has that popular ppeal. NORTON believes that WATT will have more, that WATT needs a team and when you get a team you can do more through him on this administration which after all is more important for what happens two years from now. LONG said that HARRY can have more effect on TRUMAN through WALLACE and told HARRY that eight years from now HARRY would be an old man with a grey beard. HARRY said that eight years from now he would start to live and LONG said in a concentration camp no doubt. HARRY said that's very likely the case or some place else," and LONG remarked that if the Atom bomb likes you that long. LONG wants HARRY to come over and said that he could get a raise from TRUMAN for HARRY. HARRY advised LONG that he talked to NOS today and that PHIL started talking fast and furious and is anxious to have HARRY stay and wants to talk to the Secretary about it.

LONG thinks that he should get TYATT to speak to the Secretary but HIRRY remarked that that would make me "hot stuff" and "ILLICE would want to keep me. LONG stated that he wanted HIRRY to make a decision about it because he has to have somebody for that spot, it's terribly important. HIRRY asked what CREEDEN will do and LONG explained that CREEDEN will be Deputy for Operations. He further explained that he, LONG, is ssistant Administrator for the Program but would have to watch CREEDEN on accout of he gets things done fast and in a hurry. LONG advised that BORTHIM does not want to come in for he has his own company and was offered the job as Executive issistant to the President but turned the job down. NATHAN is not an organization man, he is no organizer. He is an ideal man. HIRRY said that he would let LONG know but Monday and HLRRY has to think of his own boys. LONG asked HIRRY to tell him their names and their grades so that he could get it moving. LONG said that he could do what he pleased around the job for "YLTT practically told him so. HIRRY asked if he had thought of MATAROSE. LONG replied no that he TALLICE had an open fight with BROTTING the other day. HERRY replied that it was terrific. "IL CE said "I am sure the General hasn't finished his study yet so he can get some completion on the thing". Then the General replied "That's right but I still believe it,"

NORTON engaged in a conversation about JOHNHY HAYNES, phonetic, and NORTON said that he got his feeling about TALLACE when the latter referred H.YNES to NORTON. NORTON wants HARRY to come over to a "New Teal Job" and get out of the phony atmosphere he is in.



On March 7th BEADIE MAGDOFF contacted CHESSY (IRVINO) CHESKIN in reference to tickets for the National Theater Saturday. BEADIE tells CHESKIN about PEGGY MIEREMBERG's operation. They discussed the recent organization of the Commerce Department and its effect on HARRY MAGDOFF.

BEADIE MAGDOFF contacted IRVING CHESKIN and continued discussion of HARRY MAGDOFF's situation for a change in jobs. They referred to PHIL (Dr. PHILIP LANGUAGE). Assistant Head of Census) and how he wants HARRY to work in TILLICE'S office. CHESKIN said MORTON LONG is Assistant administrator of Planning to TYLTT in the present setup and CHESKIN believes they have in mind making HARRY head of the Materials Requirements Division.

On March 7th BELDIE M.GDOFF contacted C.THERINE STONE and they discussed League activities. C.THERINE says the past few days have been ominous due to the action taken by Military and Naval leaders. On Earch 8th BEIDIE MIGDOFF unsuccessfully tried to contact
PENRL EXELROD who had just left for MIGDOFFS. BEIDIE MIGDOFF
attempted to contact CHROLINE at the POTLIKIN residence without success. PEIDIE
MIGDOFF changed her appointment at Group Health, 1422 K Street to 4 PM.

ED FITZGER LD contacted HLRRY MLGDOFF and they discussed the condition of PEGGY NIFRENBERG. ED asked HLRRY whether he and BE DIE were coming over tomorrow night. HLRRY will speak to BE DIE and tell ED tomorrow. ED said HILL and LESLIE (KISH) and probably the STONES were coming about 8.30.

On Farch 9, 1946 FETTY COULTER contacted BELDIE and told her that Reverend GEORGE CATTITY.N, Glebe 3810, pastor of St. Mary's Church tried to convey a message to BETTY concerning Atomic energy but BETTY did not know whether he had in mind giving a forum on atomic energy or whether he wanted "us" to give one. RELDIE suggested that SYLVI VISKIN handle this and contact TITTMAN.



On March 9th BEADIE contacted Reverend TITTLIN, Glebe 3810, St.

Mary's Church and asked him what he had in mind as to the forum he had spoken to irs. COULTER about. Reverend TITTLIN said he wanted to sponsor a forum and have three or four prominent speakers and wanted to know if the Lenge would publicize it. They decided to have the speakers speak for about two hours and then have about a one hour long open forum. They decided to have subjects as atomic energy, legislation and international question as topics. TITTMIN mentioned that they hoped to get Dr. ETIE, phonetic, on atomic Energy. BELDIE thought the idea was fine and offered to see that the League got this into the papers etc. She will contact him in a couple of days and tell him just what action the League has taken. NORTON continued that he would like to get J.CK to handle the statistical job and H.RRY the material requirements job so that he would have time for badly needed politics. HIRRY declared there was nothing to keep J.CK at OP. and both agreed that JACK was tops. MORTON mentioned he would work later for (MLL) C.TLIN, phonetic, whom he described as rough and tumble fighter and whom he knows knows his way around. HIRRY stated that he has not had too much direct contact with MAL but agreed that he could handle himself. HIRRY again assured MORTON that he would let him know on Yonday, HIRRY asked if NORTON had considered S. DENNIS for the job. NORT said that there was something wrong with DENNIS. Everyone says DENNIS is a wonderful boy but ----, MORT said he wanted a guy who knows what makes CPA tick because it is important to know guys at CPA.

MORTON again' said he would keep his fingers crossed until Monday and would breathe a whole lot easier if HURRY said yes. HURRY stated that it was a terrific job and an important job. MORTON declared that the housing problem would mean the difference between what happens in November or not and the difference if housing goes over whother or not some dreams of Secretary TALIACE and other boys come true. NORTON asserted if they did a job in housing they would get enough support to carry the rest of the program. If housing does not go through the rest of the stuff would be pretty "Paput" : and things may get so bad that the Republicans may get in. HIRRY agreed that housing itself would carry the program for five or six years. NOFTON chided HIRRY that he could not see HIUSER saying that it was more important for HIRRY up there in the stratosphere playing astronomy. HIRRY stated that HIUSER is trying to develop a staff of economists for the Secretary. NORTON inquired why the Secretary wanted economists when he has BRO NINGS, SCHINDLERS and what not. HERRY asked if NORTON was getting hitched (CHERLES JANORTON replied that HITCHED had gone back to Oxford. NORTON stated that if he really wanted to get "Shugeh" (phonetic). (They subsequently referred to .DLFR as SOL .DLFR).
NO.TON explained that SHIOBEL was a wonderful guy, that he kept Chiang Ki
Shek amused with his jokes and that he knew SHIOBEL when he just came over in
1936 in New York and worked for the TPA. NORTON wondered if SOL still had that
old fire.

On March 9th HIRRY MIGDOFF contacted BENDIE WIN TISSELL and asked if he and Irs. MIGDOFF might stop over. BENDIE replied that the KIPLINS were there and wanted to play poker.

On March 10, 1946 BEADIE contacted PEARL AXELROD and told her that they would be over at 3 FM. C.ROLINE (POTANKIN?) told BEIDIE M.GDOFF that ALM is going away next week and so wasn't able to come to the M.GDOFFS. BEIDIE urged CAROLINE to come anyway saying she invited the AXELRODS too. CIRCLINE said she had been working on a poll in Ilexandria but results were very disappointing as too many people were completely negative. JO'N (DE IND), MRS -GATES and six others worked on it. Fifty three out of 128 thought it would keep the peace. The rest were "no" and that they did not know. BELDIE was anxious to know how sentiment was divided and what reasons were given. CLROLINE said that fortytwo were doubtful and thirty two said "no". One man said, according to CLROLINE, that it will not keep the peace with Churchill making attacks on dussia as in l'issouri. CLROLIMA said she is going to play up that answer and quote him whether BETTY (COULTER) likes it or not. BE'DIE applauded that attitude. C.ROLINE plans to take the poll to the llexandria Gazette tomorrow. and asked BEIDIE MIGDOFF if she would do it. She said she would. CIROLINE will mail it to the Post.

On Farch 10, 1946 HIRRY MIGDOFF told BEADIE(WIN?) that he is bringing the book over that VIN wants.

On March 11, 1946 JOIN DE TIND told BE DIE M.GDOFF that complications had arisen and that the meeting would be at her house at 1.30 PM. BEIDIE will be there. BEIDIE tried to contact Mrs. NETMIN, telephone company TE 9900. Mrs. NETMIN was out and BE DIE left word that Mrs. NETMIN call her tomorrow. BEIDIE contacted PEIRI (AXELDOD) who says she knows the CHESSYS (CHESKINS) from Tashington and Philadelphia. BEIDIE said she thinks HIPRY has decided to stay with Commerce. BEIDIE is going to JOINIE's house for the meeting this afternoon.

On March 11th LONG contacted BELDIE and told her that HURRY would contact him later. BELDIE added that she thought HURRY was going to hold him off for another day and LONG said that this would be cruelty.

On Earth 11th HERRY MEGDOFF contacted NORTON LONG at the NHL. HIRRY said that he had been in PHIL's office all day and was going to see the Secretary tomorrow downstairs. MIKE and NIOS would like to see me go but I will probably stay he said. HARRY had another candidate for LONG and LONG said don't tell me its HAROLD DENING QUE BY, phonetic. (H. POLD D. KURE? 2837 Beachwood Circle, Arlington, Virginia, CH 0593). HIRRY said "no," that he had IL BUTLER who is in the TPE. LONG stated that BUTLER was BUNKER's Assistant a born reactionary and did no good and that he had heard this from at least four good sources. He asked HIRRY if he was trying to pull an .. I BROWING, phonetic, on him. HARRY said that he did not know where LONG got his information that BUTLER worked with AL BUNKER and is a competent guy. LONG said so was BENKENSTEIN, phonetic, and McDOFF said "I helped the Tool Division do a job; what the hell is this?" IONG said "Yes," but you were on the side of the ingels and HiRRY replied Yes but I did it through those boys. He (BUTLE:) was over at lar Assets now. LONG asked if BOB MATHAN knew BUTLER and HARRY said that he did. Then LONG stated that MATHAN didn't mention BUTLER the other day when IONG talked to him.

On Farch 11th ED FITZGERLID contacted BEIDIE and said that REBECC. is better and is now working half days. BEIDIE said HIRRY was quite said because LONG felt so badly about HIRRY not going to NHL. BEIDIE contacted LEONIFD NIERENBERG who said PEGGY is some better. BEIDIE says HIRRY will see the Secretary tomorrow and will probably stay with Commerce. She says IONG is a good guy and HIRRY feels blue about turning LONG down. BEIDIE said somebody gave LONG a bad steer on KIFPIE who would not listen to LONG.

BEIDIE MIGDOFF contacted CY XELROD and gave a message for PENRL that BE DIE couldn't make it tomorrow morning.

On March 12, 1946 munknown woman contacted BELDIE saying that the Gazette carried the "poll" story in yesterdays paper, headlines read "Citizens doubtful Lbout UNO". Other than this the woman said the Gazette played it up well. The woman further stated there is a maeting tonight to prepare the script for the radio meeting and program. The script will be prepared by Trs. NEEN who formerly did work of this type on the lest Coast. Participants in the program will be JOIN DE TIND, MRS. THOMAS JONES, HELEN DILYOND and Mrs. LEBELU, phonetic.

HIRT HODSON, phonetic, telephone Ch 8918 contacted BEIDIE and said that the meeting had been set for Farch 25th at Fr. TITTEIN's church, St. Hary's located on Globe Road. HODSON suggested the meeting be titled "One Torld or None". Mr. J. H. RUSH, atomic scientist from Blueridge and Treasurer of the Federation of merican Scientists, Tashington, D.C. will speak on "Two Genii". Fr. BRYCE TOOLE, a lawyer specializing in foreign law in the United States Department of Justice will speak on "The Effective Union of Ours." Fr.

RUSH, according to HODSON is very anxious to know the name of the

domestic speaker that BELDIE will have on the program. BELDIE will let her know as soon as they have decided. Ir. TITTMIN will be happy to be Chairman in charge of questions and answers and desires that colored parsons be invited

On March 12th BELDIF contacted MARY (KILPATRICK?) about the meeting to be held on March 25th at St. Mary's Church pertaining to atomic Energy. The meeting is Mrs. HODSON's idea and Mr. TITTELN has asked us to help sponsor it. BELDIE will call SYLVIA and told her she thought that MARY would be glad to hear the good news. BEADLE is anxious to have Senator MCTAMON on the program. BELDIE contacted SYLVI- (ZISKING?) and requested that at the meeting this Friday SYLVIA take up the matter of publicising the meeting to be held at ir. TITTMAN's church on March 25th. Negroes will be invited. The church will accommodate about 200 persons. The meeting will be sponsored by the North Arlington club. BELDIE attempted to contact HERB SCHILLEL at the Capitol x 1268 but in his absence talked to FRITZIE, phonetic, and told her that the League of Jomen Voters were planning a meeting on Atomic Energy to be held in North -rlington. BEIDIE would like Senator FollHON to speak on tomic Energy at the meeting and wanted to know if HERB could get McMINON for them. FRITZIE said he didn't think that HERB had close connections with FCTMHON. FRITZIE will take the matter up with him and suggested that BEDIE re-contact them unless she hears from HERB this afternoon.

On March 12th BEIDIE MIGDOFF contacted CITHTRINE STONE and discussed the meeting for March 25th and said that she wants Senator MCTHON on the program with RUSH and TOOLE. BEIDIE thinks a league person should chairman the meeting but TTTTMN wants to chairman the question period. CATHTRINE will be glad to introduce the speakers and will make an effort to obtain MCMIHON. BEIDIE said the meeting was a League proposition. BEIDIE and CATHTRINE discussed RUSH's and TOOLE's topics which might be called the "Control of Atomic Energy." CATHTRINE thinks the domestic speaker should be one who is strong for UNO. CATHTRINE will talk the matter over with Mrs. NITCH.

DAVID said that the big news is that LEHMAN, phonetic, has resigned UNRRA because
of health. DAVID believes LEHMAN expects to run for the Senate in November.

On March 12th ENORTH GIN, phonetic, asked HURRY MIGDOFF if it were possible to call EZRI DEMPISON at home. HURRY said ED/DENNISON had no phone but lives in elexandria on Gunston Road. BETTY (COULTER) contacted REIDIE MIGDOFF and read to her a letter which had been drafted summarizing League

activities regarding a survey of educational programs.

On Parch 13, 1946 BEADIE M.GDOFF attempted to contact CARL GREEN at 1600. GRENN was not in. (1600 may be the street number of the apartment in which GREEN resides). On the same date BELDIE attempted to contact CARL GREEN at the Sub-Committee on Tar Pobilization, extension 1268 at the Capitol. He was not in.

BE DIE contacted Reverend/TITTM/N and told him that he has been chosen to act as Chairman of the question period. BE DIE is trying to get Senator ICM/HON to be the third speaker on the program if he is available; otherwise BE DIE will try to get Dr. COMDON, phonetic, whom she says heads the Bureau of Standards.

On the same date JINET NOTE, phonetic, told BELDIE that she is too tired to go to the meeting but BELDIE offered to pick JIN up at 7.30 PM and JINET decided to go. JINET lives at 3321. South Takefield Street.

On the same date YELVI LISHINSKY told HIRRY MIGDOFF that she would not be able to come over tomorrow night because her sitter would not be available. NELVI remarked that SOL flow to San Francisco from Seattle and hopes to e home in a couple of weeks.

LESLIE KISH contacted HIRRY MIGDOFF and suggested that they get together soon. HIRRY suggested that he get in touch with BEIDIE to set a definite time. To HIRRY's question concerning HILDI, LES replied that he had been seeing her often and that he has "got it bad".

On March 13th MIRY HODSON, phonetic, asked BELDIE MIGDOTF if fliers had been obtained. BELDIF said "No" that the publicity affairs would be handled at the meeting Friday at which time the matter of fliers would be discussed. BELDIE is trying to get GREEN and VOOHRIS of California to speak. BELDIE contacted Mrs. J. VOOHRIS who informed her that Congressman VOOHRIS would not be able to speak on March 25th due to a prior engagement. Mrs. VOOHRIS suggested Congressman CHET HILIFIELD of California.

Through Informant it was learned that BEIDIE MIGDOFF contacted Mrs. CHET HILIFIELD and explained the March 25th meeting to her. The latter suggested that BEIDIE contact Congressman HILIFIELD's office, extension 720 Capitol.

On March 13th BELDIE MIGDOFF discussed the League meeting with Congressman's HILIFIELD's Secretary. Congressman HILIFIELD accepted the invitation to speak on March 25th and BELDIE requested that he talk on the HcMLHON Bill vs the May-Johnson Bill.



Informant advised BE DIE M'GDOFF qontacted MIRY HO'SON and told her that Congressman H LIFIELD would speak on the 25th at 8.15 PK.

Papa, New York City, contacted BE/DIE MIGDOFF to say that Nema is coming down on the 11.45 AM plane March 23rd. Papa did not know whether Mama was going to Detroit with BE/DIE and BE/DIE said that HARRY and FREDDY were going to New York this week-end.

On March 14th LESLIE KISH contacted HIRTY MIGDOTF who said that he had visited PEGGY (NIERENBERG?). LESLIE said that EVIL would be here next Saturday before being discharged. LESLIE is bringing EVIL over tonight at 9 PM and will see HILM who lives near HIRRY.

Through informant it was learned that BEIDIE MIGDOFF obtained the phone number of FELEMIESINSKY, phonetic, from HIRRY MIGDOFF as FRanklin 8260, extension 294. HIRRY told BEIDIE that LESLIE KISH's girlfriend HILD, and ETIL were coming out to see him tonight. BEIDIE felt sorry for HIRRY. BEIDIE said that she had called SYLVII ZISKIND and accepted the invitation for dimer on Saturday.

On March 15, 1946 JEIN RULSON visited BEIDIE M. GDOFF. (U)

On Farch 15th the aforementioned informant advised that Frs. MUDSON, phonetic, contacted BELDIE M.GDOTF to say that Congressman HOLLYFIELD, phonetic, will be unable to speak at the meeting on March 25th but he will try to at another Congressman to take his place. Mrs. MUDSON said that HELEN CLH.G. DOUCL S is very interested in the subject of atomic energy control and perhaps she could be secured. BELDIE likes the idea.

Through informant it was learned that <u>M.RY KILP.TRICK</u> told BELDIE MIGDOFF that she was at National Headquarters and saw two new publications one is a brief on "that Has Been Done at UNO Feetings". BELDIE suggested it be sent to the members. The other publication is a history of the League but it was 25¢ per copy. BELDIE said that it would be enough to get them for each board member and Chairmen of the discussion groups. Through the same informant it was learned that on March 15th BELDIE told STLVII (ZISKING?) to hold up on the publicity since Congressman HOLLYFIELD does not believe he can come.

On March 15th SYLVI. (ZISKIMD?) told BELDIE M.GDOFF that she heard from lirs. HODGSON, phonetic, this morning. Mrs. HODGSON is writing a letter to the Mational Board protesting against action without consulting members on Atomic energy matters, that she does not see any evidence of Fascist tendencies in our government. BELDIE and SYLVII laughed at this.



SYLVII added that the letter ended with a plea for world government BE DIE stated that Mrs. HODGSON has changed her tune by saying that in a democratic government it doesn't make any difference whether the military or some other part of the government controls atomic energy.

On Farch 15th HIRRY MIGDOFF advised BEIDIE that the KISHES, phonetic, would be out later. Frs. MIGDOFF contacted the National League of omen Voters and endeavored to locate Frs. MITCHELL who would not be in for ten days.

It was ascerta ned that 1150 North Capitol Street is the address of Sibley Hospital and with the assistance of Mrs. F. R. HUNSEN, Medical Clerk-Librarian it was ascertained that Mrs. PELRI AXELROD was admitted to the hospital at 11.20 M December 5, 1905 and occupied Room 208. Frs. AXEL-ROD was an obstetric patient and gave birth to a daughter JOAN RIY, XELROD on December 5th. The records indicate that I'rs. FEIRL IXELROD and husband SOLOMON J.Y XELROD reside at 3717 Lyons Lane, Lexandria, Virginia telephone TE 5104. SOL J. XELROD was employed by the United States Department of agriculture and his business phone was listed as Republic 4142, extension 5404. records reflect further that Dr. SOLOPON J.COB .XELROD, Lae 33 was born September 25, 1912 in Gloversville, New York and his occupation is listed as "M. D. Surgeon". PEIRL SYLVI GITTMIN is the maiden name of Irs. PEIRL MELROD. She is 32 years of age and was born on Movember 9, 1913 in New York, New York. The record reflects their nationality as Jewish and states that they were from New York. Irs. AXELROD was discharged from the hospital on December 13, 1945 and her doctor was Dr. A. BARBANEL who, according to Frs. HLMSEN, is now in California. The aforegoing data in this report reflects that the IXELRODS and the IXGDOFFS are in frequent contact with each other and visit each other's homes.

In the same report of Special agent FLOYD L. JONES on page 106, second paragraph it was learned through Confidential Informant on December 12,1945 that HARRY S. MAGDOFF is endeavoring to become an economist by for a group in DC members of which are MILT EISEMHO'ER, brother of General EISEMHO'ER, TIMI! HOYD GARRISON and a Judge STORY. A review of the report of Special agent JONES dated January 11, 1946 at Mashington, D.C. reflects on




page 72, 5th paragraph that on December 27, 1945 it was learned through confidential informant M.GDOFF stated that he and MOSAK of the US Steel were being called in as experts for the Fact Finding Committee on the General Fotors Strike. In the report of Special Legent FLOYD L. JONES dated January 28, 1946 at Eashington, D.C., pages 84 and 85 information is set forth that M.GDOFF has appointed to the staff of the General Fotors Fact Finding Committee which committee was composed of MILT EISENHO ER, TILLIM LLOYD GLARISON and Judge STORY.

The Report of Special Agent FLOYD L. BARNEY told MILLER he is preparing a couple of pieces and maybe they could do something on it themselves if he would like to see it go through. BARNEY laughed at some person near him and BILL said, "What's DURKEE screaming at you for?" BARNEY replied, "She says to tell you the phone is tapped." BOB replied laughingly, "You tell her I know it."

On March 4, 1946, Mrs. MILLER tried to contact Mrs. HALPERIN and left word for HALPERIN to contact her at Ordway 1420.

On March 5, 1946, Mr. MILLER contacted information and inquired as to the telephone number of CHARLES P. KINDLEBERGER and was advised by the operator it was Temple 4107.

On the same date subject contacted CHARLES P. KINDLEBERGER and asked him to give him (MILLER) some good advice because someone called his chief today and said they wanted him to be detailed to a job in the German Embassy in Washington to formulate a plan for what the German officers abroad should be allowed to do when they begin to be represented abroad. He asked KINDLEBERGER if this made sense to him whereupon KINDLEBERGER replied he knows what it is about and it is a dirty job and has some legal aspects, and it is an administrative job and not a policy formulating job. He stated they make recommendations to political directors and added he wouldn't do it and thought MILLER ought to go into the job with his eyes open; furthermore, that this job was out of his bailiwick and that the political boys are handling it.

On the same date subject contacted "Doc" and asked him if he MILLER could come over to see him, and the doctor apparently was not too enthusiastic about it because the doctor said he thought it would be o.k. and "There is somebody here who probably it would be best not to ----."

The doctor asked MILLER, "Did you find out anything?" MILLER replied no. The doctor said, "I did." MILLER stated his leg hurt him so the doctor advised him to come on over then, and MILLER said he would be there in a half hour. (The above doctor is believed to be one Dr. ROBERT T. MORSE.)

On March 7, 1946, JENNY TILLER contacted Dr. CREGG (femals). However the doctor was not in, and Mrs. MILLER left her number for the doctor to call.

On March 8, 1946, SYLVIA HERSHMAN contacted JENNY MILLER and during the conversation she mentioned the name of MYRON

On March 11, 1946, JENNY MILLER contacted an unknown man and asked for HERBERT but was advised she could contact HERBERT at GE 3510 at the Conberyo Car Wash and Paint Shop.

On the same date the subject contacted JENNY MILLER and wanted to know when the HORONITZ concert is to be held. He told her it would be on tonight.

On the same date ANN FELTUS contacted JEMNY MILLER and advised her she and RANDY had arrived by plane the night before and both were ill on the 17-hour plane trip from California. She added RANDY had to rush to Georgia by plane this morning, and she is going to New York soon whether or not RANDY comes back right away.

On March 13, 1946, Mrs. SEEBURG contacted JENTY MILLER and wanted Mrs. MILLER to substitute for her at the library that afternoon. Mrs. MILLER consented to do so, and during the conversation the names of Mrs. CANVISAR and Mrs. NORRIS were mentioned as being substitutes.

On the same date Mrs. RYZKIE (phonetic) contacted JEMNY MILLER and advised her she had tried to get HANNAH BERNHARDT to pick up Mrs. MILLER and Mrs. DIAMOND on the way to the tea tomorrow afternoon. Mrs. RYZKIE told JEMNY MILLER a number of speakers including Mrs. EPSTEIN (phonetic) were going to be there. JENNY MILLER asked if Mrs. EPSTEIN was the wife of the noted "EPSTEIN" who writes for "The Nation" about Palestine. Mrs. RYZKIE stated it probably was his wife because Mrs. EPSTEIN comes from Palestine.

On the same date ANN FILTUS contacted JENNY MILIER and JENNY asked ANN how her mother made out with the doctor that she JENNY referred her to, and JENNY mentioned he wants to marry someone who is able to speak Russian or Yiddish. JENNY asked ANN how "that" particular guest made out the other night whereupon ANN replied, "It wasn't necessary to sell him anything." During the conversation a WALTER was mentioned as having visited ANN, and she advised WALTER is a young architect from New York whose fither

The following is a summary of information furnished by Confidential Informant regarding PERIO and his contacts during the period of March 1st through Earch 15, 1946 inclusive

On March 4, 1946 Mrs. PERIO contacted the .reade Sunshine Laundry and requested that her rugs be picked up for cleaning today

VICTOR PERLO contacted his wife and said that he was going to be near the Social Security Building and could pick up the pictures.

On March 7, 1946 JENN HINTON of North 7960 contacted ELLEN PERIO and said that ELLEN's name had been given to her as one who would know some teacher whem she could work into the CIO UF I and ELLEN said she did not even know any teachers and she is surprised that her name was given. However ELLEN said that she formerly was in the UF I and that she had been Secretary of Local 302. JFAN said she had been president of local #1. ELLEN said that her child's teacher was coming to dinner tomorrow and she would see what sort of a prospect she turned out to be and would let JEAN know although ELLEN said she did not hold any hope out because of her knowledge of district teachers. ELLEN said that her child's teacher was young and might be impressionable. ELLEN asked about BIHE SHYRMER, phonetic, and JEAN said he was no longer around in the Union but was teaching history in a high school in Chevy Chase or Bethesda,

The travel Division will know if the travel reservations are OK by next Saturday and will contact ELLEN PERLO who said that the other couple might back out but she was pretty sure they would go.

ELLEM PERLO contacted KLEINER KLOTHES, INCORPORMED for laundry service for her baby.

On Farch 13, 1946 ELLEN PERLO contacted Mrs. MEMNEKER, her mother and requested that Mr. MEMNEKER pick her up at the brauty parlor whose number is moodley 9672.

On Farth 14th an unidentified woman contacted ELLEM PERIO and said she got a letter from JLCK in which he thanks the woman for the pictures of subject's baby. She said that JLCK also said in the letter that SLM visited him and FRLNK(who is flying to Boston) visited him. Also that SLM and LL are working in the yard. (apparently FRLNK's wife is EVILY)

A mail cover on the above named subject has been unproductive during the period of this report. The following information regarding REDMONT and his contacts was furnished by Confidential Informant

March 1, 1946, JOAN REDMONT was contacted by a man giving his name as ELBERT who said that he and PAULA were in town and that he was on his way to Topeka, Kansas, on a change of Army orders. JOAN invited them out. Subsequently JOAN REDMONT contacted her brother, DON ROTHENBURG and invited him over to dinner saying that ELBERT and PAULA were there

On the same date ELBERT and PAULA contacted ELBERT's parents, otherwise not identified, but whose telephone number was given as New York City, Wadsworth 7-1944. ELBERT said that he was on his way to Harvard and would leave Washington for New York City the next day ()

On March 2, 1946, JOAN REDMONT contacted an unidentified woman mentioning a meeting of women for a nursery school. The woman was busy but asked JOAN to drop in at her office on that date

MILLIE contacted JOAN discussing the REDMONTs selling their furniture and preparing to leave. JOAN said that REDMONT will plan to leave three weeks from March 14, 1946.

LILLIAN LEVIN (PH) contacted JOAN REDMONT saying that she got the note JOAN left for her and that she would be over that night. JOAN asked if LILLIAN has all of the information and LILLIAN said that she thinks so, that it is at RUTH YASSIS (PH), 1205 Trenton place, Southeast, at 8:30 P.M.

PHYSICAL SURVEILLANCE

Upon receipt of information of Confidential Informant that the REDMONT's plan to go to New York on March 8, 1946, a physical surveillance was conducted by Special Agents KENNERLY R. CORBETT and WILLLIJ! R. CORNELISON at Union Station.

At 3:25 P.M. JOAN REDMONT and a child approximately five years of age (believed to be DENNIS REDMONT) boarded the B & O Railroad Train "Royal Blue."

At 3:35 P.M. BERN/RD REDMONT boarded the above referred to train. The three entered Car B, seats #37,38 and 42. JOAN REDMONT was dressed in a bright red raincoat with a small red cap. She was carrying a brown cloth coat. DENNIS REDMONT (the child) was dressed in a gray suit with gray cap and high-top black rubber boots. BERNARD REDMONT was dressed in a grayish-brown tweed suit, brown tweed overcoat and brown snap brim hat. He wore a red necktie and tan shoes. He was carrying a large airplane-type gray brown suitcase and a smaller suitcase of the same type. He was also carrying an old-appearing brown brief case.

WILLIAM WALTER REMINGTON

The following information was furnished by confidential_informant concerning the activities of REMINGTON from March 1 to 15, 1946. (4)

On March 1, 1946, JOHN contacted subject advising him he wanted to get his reaction to WYATT's program. The subject advised JOHN the people closest to WYATT were AL EROWN and NORT LONG and some of the other NHA boys. Subject further stated he did not feel that AL and NORT were familiar with the problems of production and were lacking in good judgment. Subject also stated one DIVERS is also very close to WYATT and he DIVERS is in disagreement with LONG and BROWN as to how construction should be restricted. JOHN added he thought DIVERS was a much more sensible man than BROWN. The subject stated WYATT was a shrewd, conscientious, and clever small town boy who does not yet know how to pick and choose his associates because he had not been in the big town before he needed help and counsel very badly. The subject added FHIL COOMBS (who is with BCWLES) is very worried about the materials unit in the program division. He added

REMINGTON further stated PHIL thinks the limits on new construction are good, and he thinks by working on specific issues he might be able to instruct TYATT and his staff. REMINGTON added he thinks all houses under construction and costing more than \$15,000 should come in on an application for review because they should be stopped in certain sections. JOHN added LINK and he had talked before on this before LINK left for Chicago, and they both thought the same thing. JOHN added he thinks by holding construction up they are tying up someone's money. JOHN further stated he did not think TYATT is equipped to handle the whole housing problem. (U)

PHIL is not going with WYATT but is going to stay with BOVIES (U)

On March 2, 1946, JULIA MCKENNEY (phonetic) contacted BILLY REMING—
TON and inquired as to what his plans were regarding his teaching at Williams
College. The subject told JULIA he was going to teach but he would be back
in six months inasmuch as he is only going to teach two semesters. He
added he was going to Williams College in June and ANN will be here (D. C.)
during the summer.

On the same date BOE DAVENFORT contacted ANN REMINGTON and asked her if she and BILL would like to go to a square dance on Church Street next Thursday night. ANN advised she would like to go and will advise 508.

On the same date <u>ANN REMINGTON</u> contacted Mrs. EVAR (phonetic) of the Tauxement Nursery School. The conversation was about payment of teachers and they decided a meeting would be held Thursday night. (u)

On the same date ANN REMINGTON contacted the subject and told him about her talk with MIDGE ALLEN and about the new job that WARD had been offered in Germany. She stated MIDGE was afraid to bring up any objection to WARD's going because of her not being able to follow him before September due to pregnancy. ANN told BILL she thought someone should point this out to WARD and suggested that BILL mention something about it to WARD on his way home this evening. ANN added that she thought the job seemed important enough that WARD will go. BILL told ANN he did not think it was such an excellent job. However, ANN added "with his ultimate aim in international affairs, it is probably a good job to take." The subject told ANN he would talk to WARD this evening and try to persuade him not to go to Germany.

On the same date BOB contacted BILL REMINGTON and advised him a fellow named HILLIARD (phonetic) who works with REMINGTON had been calling him. BOB advised REMINGTON he is very anxious to leave OPA and he has a good replacement for his job, a young fellow who is honest and thorough. (U)

On March 5, 1946, Mrs. MOOSE (phonetic) contacted WILLIAM H. E. JOHNSON and advised him she was in town for a few days and manted him to meet her son-in-law Ensign REMINGTON. They agreed to meet JOHNSON at the Pentagon Building at 12 noon for lunch tomorrow.

On March 6, 1946, ANN REMINGTON contacted subject and they discussed a letter which was received from FOX of Williams College about living conditions. BILL advised ANN they would check on that when they arrived there, and he also added he had learned his pay account in the Navy had been screwed up so his discharge would not go through next week as had been planned. (1)

On the same date BOB DAVENFORT contacted REMINGTON to advise him dancing would be tomorrow night at 7:30 at 3721 S Street. REMINGTON told him he would try to be there by that time. (u)

On the same date ANN REMINGTON contacted one JOYCE and asked her if she was going to HAMMER's party Saturday night, and JOYCE replied yes. ANN advised JOYCE inasmuch as liquor was quite expensive she thought it would be a good idea for those invited to bring their own.

JOYCE agreed. (1)

On the same date ANN REMINGTON called subject and inquired what time he was eating. BILL replied he would be out of the meeting at 1 p.m. and would meet JOE HILLIPS at the Independence Avenue door of the Social Security Building. ANN advised she will probably meet them there and they will eat together.

On March 8, 1946, LUCILLE HARRIS contacted Mrs. REMINGTON and asked her to help out with the nursery school Friday and ANN agreed to do so. (4)

On the same date subject contacted JIN DAWIDSON at CPA, and advised him he and DICK BISSELL are having a meeting on March 9, 1946, and he would like to know what company is on strike. He was advised by JIM that the American Smelting and Refining Company was on strike. DAVIDSON said the pig lead is down 50 per cent. DAVIDSON added he did not know what union was striking but stated it had been going on for three weeks and the Labor Department was trying to settle it. He added there were two ways of settling the strike and it was either to raise prices which has already been refused by OPA or to grant premium prices. REMINGTON then advised DAVIDSON they could give raises in wages and then later apply for increased prices according to the new wage price policy. DAVIDSON advised REMINGTON to contact HARRY HAYES, director of mines and minerals at CPA, and he could get the full details, and he added there was about two or three weeks! supply of lead on hand. REMINGTON asked DAVIDSON if it would be all right if MIKE DOYCHE (phonetic) worked with them and gathered information. DAVIDSON replied their past experience has shown they cannot get along with DOYCFE and would not have any confidence in any information that he might gather. (4)

On the same date MARION TURHTING contacted BILL REMINGTON and he asked her how serious the lead situation was, and she replied it was bad. BILL advised him he was still in the Navy and added he expected to be in town for the next couple of months but intends to leave Washington fairly soon.

On the same date subject contacted HAL TOBEY and asked him if he is still looking (probably for a job). TOBEY replied yes and subject suggested that he contact PHIL COOMBS either Monday or Tuesday inasmuch as he is expecting TOBEY to call him COOMBS. TOBEY advised REMINGTON he had seen HAL STYNE (phonetic) but he is non-committal about his plans whereupon REMINGTON advised TOBEY that HAL STYNE is contemplating going to the TYATT shop, but he has not persuaded WYATT to offer him a big enough job as yet. TOBEY stated the McCABE affair apparently was for SCHNEIDER (phonetic). He stated McCABE is leaving on a round-the-world tour, and HAL thought he would represent SCHNEIDER's office. TOBEY added that HAL suggested that he TOBEY contact NORTON LONG at NHA. BILL advised him they are all in the same project but he didn't think he would be happy under IONG. advised TOM BLAISDALE that SMITH was in Japan with EMERSON ROSS with the Military Government reporting to MacARTHUR. BILL advised TOM that ANN could not find the address and he will call him tomorrow. (4)

COOMBS replied that LUCY STONE and MARGARET FISHER, whom he knows intimately, are two of the ablest and completely sincere liberal operators; that MARGARET FISHER accompanied MARY MCCLOUD BETHUNE on an airplane tour of the south and faced every issue directly; that LUCY MASON organized the negroes of the district to put HELEN DOUGLAS ANKIN in Congress. (U)

RETINGTON asked PHIL if LUCY STONE had anything to do with the CIO and PHIL replied LUCY's title is Southern Public Relations Representative of the CIO and in that capacity looks around and throws her weight where it is needed. Both REMINGTON and COOMES agreed that the fellow who wrote it was a d--- fool and if he was a sincere solid liberal he would be very close to LUCY STONE and MARGARET FISHER. REMINGTON added the guy who wrote the letters stated LUCY STONE and MARGARET FISHER failed to employ a single negro on their staffs, to which PHIL replied that MARGARET FISHER has a staff of one, a red-headed Jew, and that LUCY STONE shares an office with KEN DOTY of the Textile Workers who is a very liberal person and who has a brother in the Wage and Hour Division of the Department of Labor. REMINGTON advised PHIL he REMINGTON is in a position to squelch the aspirant and would definitely do so.

On March 15, 1946, JOAN REDMONT contacted ANN REGINGTON and invited her and her husband over on Friday evening, March 22, 1946. ANN REMINGTON told JOAN she could not come because they will be in Williamstown, New York, that week-end, and they plan to return on Monday, March 25, 1946. JOAN stated BERNIE was leaving in three weeks and she invited the REMINGTONS to dinner on Wednesday, March 27, 1946. ANN accepted. (U)

The following information concerning the activities of ALLAN ROSENBERG were obtained from Confidential Informant March 7, 1946, ALLAN told his wife ERNA that he had received two NOSENBERG letters from her mother who lives in Wavelon Hollow, Patterson, New York. She mentioned that she received a letter from STEPHERARAPP (phonetic) and he, STEPHEN, was no longer MUR AND DUNDIE'S (phonetic) link; ROSENBERG took his place. On March 7, 1946, ALLAN told ERNA that he got a new client today, FRANK COE. ALLAN is handling the purchase of a house in Falls Church, Virginia as COE is going to Savannah for Bretton Woods. ERNA said he couldn't charge FRANK COE much for this service as he is a friend,

On March 8, 1946, ALLAN MOSENBERG was in conversation with one MILDRED and her husband MANNIE, who asked how the American Yugoslav Corporation was. ALLAN said, "It stank. It was all screwed up with politics and all kinds of things and the condition seemed to be permanent." MIID RED wanted to know when ALLAN would be coming up to her place in Auburndale, Massachusetts and ALLAN said, "I hadn't any definite time in mind at present." () A)

On March 9th, ALLAN ROSENBERG talked with an unidentified. man, possibly NIPPIE SCHARFMAN. ROSENBERG told him that he had visited HAROLD GLASSER's house the preceding night and would take pictures of it that morning for mortgage purposes. ERNA ROSENBERG on this same day conversed with EMILY SCHARFMAN. ERNA said that BENNIE announced very proudly to her husband that he is getting involved in the Union For Democratic Action and ALLAN tried to interest him in the Metropolitan Radio Station; — the EDERECKER business (phonetic) — on the Medical psychiatric angle. EMIN wanted to know what the status of the radio station was. ERNA replied that the application was in and the hearing was scheduled to take place on March 11th. ERNA asked if "our boys" were handling the hearings and EMILY said "no". EMILY and ERNA discussed two other California radio stations which are "still in the fire" - one in San Francisco and one in Hollywood." (Apparently ALLAN ROSENBERG and NIPPIE SCHARFMAN hope to get the Washington law ousiness from the California radio stations. ENA said that ALLAN had hopes of getting some UA station work also and that ALLAN had discussed "some foreign thing upstairs" with HAROLD last night (HAROLD GLASSER) and "What about another foreign thing upstairs?" ERNA said, "I can't bear to discuss it with ALLAN; that is what he discussed with HAROLD last night. I don't know what the decision is," EMILY observed, "Te certainly ought to get somebody else going up there," ERNA said, "You mean for the rent?" EMILY answered, "For anything, for business - some sort of a combine." At this juncture, EMILY ROSENBERG and ERNA SCHARFMAN agreed that the matter depended

upon Mr. GIASSER and would involve AIIAN in the business end of it, which would take away from his law practice. They agree that another man like RIP (ph) is needed. ERNA said EDTIMESMITH (phonetic) turned it down and AIIAN was not too interested but HAROLD kept urging him on. ERNA declared that some of the things militating against getting a contract were that the different European relationships have all faltered terrifically - "Our country's relationship with Yugoslavia - that throws that out. In Greece that holds that up - Bulgaria strongly connected with the political, that just holds everything up." ERNA ROSENBERG complained that we are so anti-Russian at present that a friend of Russia does not have a chance the way things are going. ERNA observed that HARTIET SIMMONS (phonetic), ED BRECKER'S Assistant, and the RUBENSTEINS would be coming out on the morrow. (1)

When ERNA said that BENNTE announced he was getting involved in the Union For Democratic Action EMILY said, "Oh, so are we" and ERNA said, "Yeah, I know." (U)

On March 12th, ERNA ROSENBERG advised her husband that the SCHRIERS (phonetic) would be coming to visit them on the weekend of April 19th ()

On March 14th, EMILY SCHARFMAN conversed with ERNA ROSENBERG and said that KARL was here and would handle the book with
the publishers for a fee of 10%. EMILY said KATHE INE, ARTHUR and
ELEANOR came over when KARL was there. ELEANOR DETAIN (phonetic) was
mentioned as an old friend of EMILY'S. In a later conversation, EMILY
SCHARFMAN and ERNA discussed the question whether ALLAN should give
some parties to help their business and to get in the public eye.
EMILY SCHARFMAN expressed dislike of the idea but supposed it might
do some good if JIMY BYRNES or BEN COHEN (State Department) were there.
It was mentioned that LOU-HARVIS, one of the dearest friends of
ALLAN ROSENBERG and NIPPIE SCHARFMAN, had not given them any business
as expected. (U)

On March 15th, EMILY SCHARFMAN and ERNA again conversed at length. ERNA told of the new case that ALLAN ROSENBERG and NIPPIE SCHARFMAN have with Congressman HUGH DELACEY who is trying to get a license for a labor station in Seattle. They got the case through ED HRECKER, who resigned at FCC to become manager of the Metropolitan Radio Broadcasting. ERNA asserted that they would get the license as there were eleven channels and eleven applicants. ERNA said they were trying to get similar cases in Hollywood and San Francisco and that ALLAN is trying to get ELMER RENSON a station. ERNA stated ()



that BENSON used to be a senator from Minnesota and is very progressive. ALLIN had HAROLD write BENSON a letter on this. ERNA expressed some fear that Metropolitan Radio Broadcasting would be refused a license on account of "Dies Committee stuff" for they were questioned closely about the people involved. However, "They picked it very carefully and the names of the people mentioned are people who are all very well educated and leaders in various fields." ERNA said, "ED BRECKER did a wonderful job with it and apparently has decided to help ALIAN." She observed that there is not so much money in the Labor Union cases but it gives them a good reputation. EMILY SCHARFMAN said WHITMAN and her husband were going away on a vacation on Tuesday. "HITMAN's (phonetic) husband worked on the atomic bomb and is now leaving "Public Science" to go into "Private Science". (1)

ALLAN ROSENBERG in a conversation with his wife ERNA mentioned that besides his new client, DELLCEY had another client who was a friend of CHARLES FLATO. ERNA thought this letter case would be an OPA case and ALLAN said it was but that in the course of it he wanted to patent something.

On this same day late in the evening HALPERIN, believed to be a subject of this case, conversed with ALLAN ROSENBERG and HALPERIN said that he would be leaving on Monday.





ABRAHAL GEORGE SILVERMAN

During the period March 1 to 15, 1946, confidential informant furnished the following information concerning the subject.

On March 1, 1946, "JERRY SIMON contacted Mrs. SILVERMAN to ask her if she had seen JERRY's husband. It appeared from this conversation that JERRY SIHON was employed at the Public Assistance and Children's Services where Mrs. SILVERMAN works. The Public Assistance and Children's Services was contacted under pretext, and they advised Mrs. MARJORIE F. SILON is employed there in the position of supervisor.

On March 1, 1946, JOSEPH F. GOLD contacted the subject and told him he saw ERMIN today and he was going to see WACNER, and he had been told that a firm of engineers in Cleveland named Wallman is saying they have "the thing" from Monsieur B. GOLD went on to discuss financial dealings with SILVERIAN, and he stated ERMIN thinks he has bought and sold 25,000 dozen lots of hose.

JOSEPH F. GOLD, according to the files of the Nashington Field Office, lives at 623 Academy Street, Newark, Delaware. He is involved with the subject and ERTIT SCHAEFER and CHRISTOPHER JAMES NACHER in financial dealings, relative to the export and sale of various sorts of surplus government property. The files of the Washington Field Office contain no further record concerning him, and a credit check in Washington met with negative results

The files of the Washington Field Office reflect ERVIN MAX SCHAEFER was the subject of an applicant investigation by this office for OEM in 1943. The following information is reflected by that investigation.

He was born January 29, 1895, in Hamburg, Germany, and is a Jewish refugee in this country registered as an alien enemy. With his wife and three children he has resided in Vashington since September 1, 1943, and formerly lived in New York City from 1940 to 1943; in London, England, from 1939 to 1940; and in Fornesch, Germany, until 1939. He was formerly a director of a chemical company in Fornesch, Germany, and he served about one month in a German concentration camp. Since July, 1943, he has been employed by the Timber Engineering Company, Washington, D. C., at \$500 per month in connection with development of the wood sugar industry. The investigation reflected his sentiments were anti-Nazi but no subversive information was developed.

Monsieur B. is probably Mr. JEAN BAUDELAIRE, chief of the French Mission of Public Works, French Supply Council, Washington, D. C., where the

subject is employed. He has been mentioned by GOLD in previously reported conversations with subject. The files of the Washington Field Office contain no record concerning BAUDELAIRE

On March 1, 1946, a person named JINY contacted SILVER AN and discussed the "Report of the Working Group on Credit Requests of the Italian Government," and said they want money. SILVER AN said everybody wants money, and there was nothing new to report

JIMY is possibly identical with one JHANN (phonetic) who was with SILVERIAN and JOP GOLD on the evening of March 6, 1946. also reported FAYE GLASSER in a conversation with a woman named EVELYN on February 3, 1946, said she was giving a supper for DEL-SCHMEIDER from Paris and JIM MANN, a good friend of JOE, from Switzerland. The files of the Washington Field Office, the Washington telephone directory, and the Tashington city directory reflect no information concerning JIM MANN.

On March 1, 1946, the subject contacted CHPISTOPHER AGNER to discuss their business venture, and on March 2, 1946, WAGNER contacted SILVERIAN in regard to the same matter. At that time WAGNER complained about the way in which ERVIN SCHLEFER was conducting himself. WAGNER stated ERVIN "hedged" about the hosiery, and that ERVIN should understand that "we are all four in this together." SILVERWAN said he would talk to ERVIN and that he was interested in only one thing, "preserving our equity in those things we gave over to." SILVERWAN further said, "MURRAY will do what we tell him to do, and JACK FIELD, what I tell him to do.

The four men referred to above are believed to be SILVERGAN, CHRISTOPHER WAGNER, ERWIN SCHAEFER, and JOE GOLD. MURRAY is probably identical with MAT or NAT MURRAY who as previously reported contacted the subject on January 8, 13, and 16, 1946.

On January 13, 1946, MATHURRAY's name was connected with FRANK MURRAY Corporation but when FRANK MURRAY of that corporation was contacted under pretext, he advised he knew of no one by the name of MAT MURRAY. The files of the Tashington Field Office reflect no information on this individual. The Tashington telephone directory was negative

On March 2, 1946, ŒORŒ SILVERIN was contacted by his brother DAWD who said, "They are working like hell over here, getting all these



loans ready. The files of the Washington Field Office reflect no record of DAVID SILVERMAN.

On March 3, 1946, ERVIN SCHAEFER contacted GEORGE SILVERMAN to advise him that CHRIS and FLORENCE WAGNER had called the gathering off because WAGNER had an important business call. GEORGE asked if they could bather on the following night, and ERVIN said they should all four be together including JOE GOLD. Thereafter SCHAEFER inquired about LEON BLUM, and SILVERMAN said he was sick and was forced to postpone his visit here.

On March 4, 1946, SILVERMAN contacted his wife to tell her "the guys have decided to meet at our house," and he explained there would be less interference from the wives. The meeting was to be at 8 p.m.

On March 5, 1946, JOE GOLD contacted SILVERMAN concerning their business transactions and requested SILVERMAN to assist him in obtaining a job. With reference to their business, GOLD asked if they would be able to see IAUCHLIN CURRIE. SILVERMAN indicated they would but he did not wish to make the first approach. They discussed further steps in contacting CURRIE.

It should be noted LAUCHLIN CURRIE, a subject of this case, was a friend and fellow student of SILVERFAN at Harvard University.

On March 6, 1946, the subject contacted Miss HELEN H. RINGE. She said she was glad he was able to establish contact with her and asked when she was going to see him. SILVERMAN said Thursday or Friday. SILVERMAN told her to let him know what her office telephone number is as soon as she has one. She agreed and added she might even have lunch with him, and she urged SILVERMAN to keep in touch with her.

HELEN H. RINGE lives in apartment 708, 2000 Connecticut Avenue, N. W., and is employed at room 922, Tar Manpower Commission, 1778 Pennsyl-Tyania Avenue.

On the morning of March 6, 1946, HARRY WHITE asked the subject when he was going to New York. SILVERIAN said it would not be until perhaps the end of next week. WHITE said he thought SILVERIAN was going sooner than that, and he wanted to get word to Mayor O'DTYER. WHITE arranged to pick up SILVERIAN at his home at 9 a.m., and drive him to work.



On March 7, 1946, JOE GOLD contacted SILVERMAN and spoke of their meeting last night. JOE mentioned he won \$30 and that JIM MANN lost some money (evidently in a poker game)

On March 7, 1946, an unidentified man contacted ŒORŒ SILVERMAN and ŒORŒ told him he was reading about the atomic bomb. He said one book by McGraw-Hill contains an article by all the "big shots": LANGERE, LOUGON, EINSTEIN, OPENHAUER, which makes interesting and disturbing reading. SILVERMAN further stated it made one feel one ought to do something about it. The unidentified man said he would drop those three books by before ŒORŒ got up and a said he would drop those three books by before ŒORŒ got

engaged in a lengthy conversation. She said Mayor WILLIAM O'DWYER of New York called her on the previous day indicating he was tied up with HANNEGAN, but would like to see her. FLORENCE said she was taking the New York train at ll a.m. on March 10, 1946. However, she agreed to wait until the 4 p.m. train for which O'DWYER had reservations. FLORENCE asked SILVERMAN's advice on how to approach O'DWYER, and they both agreed to appear independent though friendly, and FLORENCE would indicate she was "interested in some of the international stuff that's going on and possibly UND," and that she would appreciate help from him if she ever needed any

SILVERNAN stated a judgeship would be the only thing she would accept from O'DWYER, and FLORENCE said she had given up such an idea long ago, but she decided to retain his friendship for whatever it was worth. SILVERNAN mentioned O'DWYER had appointed some notorious fascist friend as a member of the board of education. FLORENCE said in talking with the Mayor, she would try to be careful and allow him to do all the talking. SILVERNAN agreed, telling her not to indicate she did not believe O'DWYER had been a great success. SILVERNAN described him as a "cheap politician in . " but did not finish the sentence.

In this connection it should be noted FLORENCE ODELL MAGNER is an employee of the legal division of the Treasury Department and resides with her husband CHRISTOPHER JAMES TAGNER at apartment 601, 2100 Connecticut Avenue, N. W.

The files of the Washington Field Office reflect the following information concerning her.

A special investigation was conducted by this office regarding her friend IRVING FRANK SHERMAN and his close associate FRANK CONNOLLY who is also a frequent contact of FLORENCE WIGNER. The investigation that was conducted on FRANK CONNOLLY in connection with this case indicated he was forming a company to deal in surplus government commodities having office

in New York and Washington, D. C. Through FLORENCE WAGNER, he contacted SILVERMAN who is also involved in CONNOLLY's business transactions. Both CONNOLLY and FLORENCE WAGNER worked hard for O'DWYER's election, and they expected appointments to positions with the New York City government on O'DTYER's election. According to this investigation, GEORGE SILVERMAN also expected some such appointment, but all are now antagonistic toward O'DTYER because of his delay in appointing them to positions with the city of New York. According to this investigation, FLORENCE and CHRIS WAGNER are also friends of JERCHE OHRBACH of Ohrbach's Department Store in New York City

On March 11, 1946, CHRIS WAGNER in New York contacted the subject and told him he and FLORENCE had decided to stay at the Biltmore Hotel. They discussed business transactions involving various commodities including chrome, white oak, and aluminum roofing. In connection with white oak, they mentioned a man by the name of ACTON. WAGNER indicated a man named BERNIE was in on the Ecuador thing," possibly referring to BERNIE BERNSTEIN. WAGNER stated he would get in touch with BERNIE and inquired about his telephone number in New York City. SILVERMAN did not know the number and stated BERNIE planned to open an office soon. WAGNER said FLORENCE could get the number from Mrs. KLOTZ

They discussed FLORENCE's trip and her three-hour conversation with Mayor MILLIAM O'DAYER. WAGNER said C'DAYER said FRANK CONNOLLY is half crazy but he still may get him a job. SILVERMAN agreed that CONNOLLY is half crazy. WAGNER stated FLORENCE had not evaluated O'DAYER's conversation, and SILVERMAN said they would have a chance to do that when she comes back. MAGNER thought they would return by the night of March 12, 1946. SILVERMAN mentioned JOE GOLD and ERAIN SCHAEFER were coming to his house for awhile that night. SILVERMAN also said it looks as though JOE GOLD is going to Korea.

The man named ACTON mentioned above is probably identical with VICTOR ACTON, apartment 411, 2100 Connecticut Avenue, who is employed by the British Army Staff. He came to Tashington in May, 1943, from Johannesburg, South Africa, as an assistant supply officer with the British Army Staff. He is an engineer and is planning to act as contact man for FRANK CONNOLLY's company in South Africa where they will export for sale U. S. surplus property.

Mrs. KIOTZ mentioned above is probably identical with HENRIETTA KIOTZ, special assistant to the Secretary of the Treasury, whose husband is HERMAN KLOTZ. The KIOTZES are good friends and contacts of the HARRY WHITES and SHLVERMASTERS.

On March 14, 1946, the subject contacted HELLN RINGE and told her he was going to Boston because his son DICKIE wanted to quit Harvard University before graduation.

On March 15, 1946, SILVERMAN called his office and talked to OSCAR LALTMAN and asked him to attend a meeting today and to have the stuff ready inasmuch as it is due today.

The French Supply Council was contacted under pretext, and it was determined that OSCAR L. ALTMAN is assistant chief of the Office of Analysis and Flans at the French Supply Council. It should be noted this is OSCAR L. ALTMAN and he is not identical with the OSCAR K. ALTMAN who was formerly manager of the High Hat Club who was investigated by this office for possible pro-Nazi sympathies.


Physical Surveillance

On March 6, 1946, HARRY DEXTER WHITE was observed to stop in front of subject's residence where he picked up SILVERMAN and drove him to his office at 1800 Massachusetts Avenue. At this point, WHITE parked his car and SILVERMAN remained in the car for five minutes talking to WHITE.

On March 12, 1916, SILVERMAN was observed to leave the French Supply Council at 12:10 p.m., and he proceeded to 6615 5th Street by taxi. When he entered the house, he was carrying a package wrapped in brown paper which appeared to be the size of a book. At 1:50 p.m., he left the house without the package and returned to work by bus. It should be noted 6615 5th Street is the home of DAVID WEINTRAUB. The files of the Washington Field Office reflect the following information concerning WEINTRAUB.


He was formerly director of the National Research Project, Foreign Relief and Rehabilitation Division, U. S. State Department. On February 2, 1946, he attended a party at FEROL M. CORNELISON's home which was also attended by IRVING and DOROTHY KAPLAN, HARRY and BEATTIE NACHOFF, BEATRICE HELMAN, EDWARD and REBECCA FITZGERALD, and others. He was given as a reference by MARGARET AREMENT NIERENBERG when she obtained a position with the federal government and by GEORGE PERAZICH when he obtained his position with UNRRA. He arranged with his friend MAURICE HUBERMAN to sublet his apartment at Alban Towers to GEORGE PERAZICH.

Informant whose identity is known to the Bureau furnished the following information: On or about February 11, 1946 Mrs. H. P. SILVERLASTER, 5515 30th Street, N., Mashington, D.C. received a communication from BORIS P. TITTE, Box 2366, Anchorage, Alaska in which it was indicated that the MITTE's had decided to return to the United States. They advised that Alaska is OK in many respects and that they enjoyed being there and working there very much but on the other hand it is apparent to them that not much can be gained by their remaining there. They stated that the main objection to Alaska is the terrible reactionary people and that they both fear that they are almost suffocating in that atmosphere. Consequently they have decided that it isn't worth while spending their time under such circumstances. They said that they would explain in great detail their reactions to this situation when they next see the SILVERNASTERS. It is their present intention to sell their

possessions and possibly in a month or so return to the states. It is their intention upon leaving Alaska to drive to California and Arizona. They subsequently intend to spend sometime in Chicago, Atlanta, Washington and New York. Their ultimate plans are to purchase some property somewhere in Connecticut and intend to build. Their present plan will bring them to Washington sometime in May. The WITTE's also indicated that they may stop to see ANATOLE, HELEN SILVERMASTER's son at Chapel Hill, North Carolina on their way up from Atlanta to Washington.

The following information was obtained from Confidential Informant regarding the activities of NATHAM GREGORY SILVERMASTER from March 1st to March 15, 1946 inclusive:

March 1, 1946

An unidentified man at the SILVERMASTER residence was in contact with the Railway Express Company indicating that he would like a trunk shipped to Chicago, Illinois and that the trunk will be on the back porch at 5515 30th Street, NI. It was subsequently determined that this trunk was the property of MORMAN CHANDLER BURSLER and the trunk was shipped under his name to the Law School at Chicago University, Chicago, Illinois. (U)

A highly confidential informant of the Chicago Field Division advised the centents of this trunk which were set out in detail in the report of Special Agent LAMPERT G. ZAMDER in instant case dated March 15, 1946 at Tashington, D.C.

An individual identified as HERBERT RESNER advised HELEN SILVER ASTER that he is leaving for New York in the morning. He invited the SILVER ASTERS to come to Room 1441 at the Statler Hotel and that he had just completed the case in the Supreme Court here. There was some indication that the RESNERS and the SILVERMASTERS had not been in contact with each other for the past five years. It was subsequently determined that HERBERT RESNER is an attorney from San Francisco, California and active in Communist endeavors in that locality.

March 3, 1946

On March 3, 1946 HENRY LORGANTHAU, JR. from New York City contacted GREGORY SILVERMASTER. It was indicated that FORMATHAU is going to produce or edit a weekly radio program and that he is presently endeavoring to secure some Vashington contacts. CHARLES MILCOLMSON is now working for him in Tashington, D.C. The latter has just completed an undercover book with an individual identified to our informant as a lr. Right, phonetic, who was formerly head of the Publicity for the Department of Justice. Our

informant believes that this reference may be to JOHN ROGGE of the Department of Justice. MILCOLMSON was recommended to MORGINTHIU by BORALLEN and MORGINTHIU checked and found MILCOLMSON to be an excellent man and thoroughly reliable. MORGINTHIU had previously asked MILCOLMSON to check with SILVERMISTER if he wants any information as to what is going on regarding the sale of surplus property particularly if the property effects the Veteran. SILVERMISTER agreed to assist MORGINTHIU on that matter.

MORGANTHAU also indicated that he needed some little scandal to make his program interesting and it would be wonderful if he could get it. He also wants to be constructive naturally but he needs some scandal. MORGANTHAU also requested SILVERMASTER to advise ULLMANN of his doings and indicated that they would like to think of him as an outlet and a crusader for them. EXILE DESPRES is working for MORGINTHIU in the foreign field and. also teaching at illiams College. DESPRES furnished MORG.NTHAU with considerable information regarding the Argentine and Franco. It is to be noted that ETILE DESPRES was listed in the Congressional Directory of Lugust, 1945 as an employee of the Office of the Secretary of State. MORGINTHIU requested SILVERNISTER and ULLMINN to keep him advised if there is any indication of something going wrong and where a little publicity might straighten things out. His New York address is 285 Padison wenue, New York City and he will give SILVERNASTER his new telephone number at a later date. The only individual in MORGINTHIU's mail is their old friend HEMRIETTA KLOTZ and as a matter of fact KLOTZ had suggested that YORGINTHIU recontact SILVER-MISTER and ULLMINN (U)

VORGINTHIU stated he received figures from INNI ROSENPERG that 600,000 veterans have applied for loans and only 3,000 were successful. SILVERNISTER and FORGINTHIU discussed prices of farms for veterans at some length and FORGINTHIU stated that the Government could purchase large tracts of property in the Central Dairy and Poultry Houses such as the one now in operation at Florence, Arizona. SILVERNISTER worked on that project and in fact initiated it and MORGINTHIU indicated that they would call it Communistic but he believes it to be the right answer. He further indicated that he would visit Tashington several times monthly and will want to contact SILVERNISTER, that he intended to take on the fight of low interest rates against insurance companies. SILVERNISTER assurred MORGINTHIU that he should consider him as an outlet and a crusader. He also indicated that he would be glad to use any of the information ULLMINN returned from Germany.

March 5, 1946

In individual identified as ELIZAPETH S.SULY contacted HELEN SILVERELSTER advising that she had not relt well today and remained at home but would like HELEN to come over for lunch; however HELEN SILVERELSTER was unable to accept the invitation.

An unidentified woman known to the informant only as FRINCES contacted Mrs. SILVERMISTER and inquired if LUD was at home. She and her family had just arrived in town and were going sightseeing. LUD who is apparently LUDIIG ULLMINN suggested that they take his car and then come out to the house for lunch.

And advised that he had just returned from abroad and that his mother, father, sister, and brother-in-law from his home in Missouri are in town. They are all driving out to see EMILY and that he had previously advised PETELL, GRETA's husband, that when his family arrived he would arrange to call her. GRETA indicated that it would be splendid and that they live only four houses from EMILY. GRETA indicated that to get to her home he should drive out Mt. Vernon Boulevard through Alexandria, turn right on Belle Haven Road and that would run into Forest Hill Road. EMILY lives at the fork of these two roads

At 12.45 PM FRANCES ULINAMN contacted an individual by the name of ORSBY at Richmond, Virginia 4-3505

March 11, 1946

in individual identified by the informant as MIRY JOKEENEY contacted Mrs. SILVERMASTER. They discussed her recent return from abroad and MARY JANE KEENEY indicated that she had seen LUD over there. She was apparently referring to TILLIAM LUDING ULLMANN who has just recently returned from Frankfurt, Germany. They agreed to visit each other the following week.

March 14, 1946

MARY-JANE-KEENEY contacted HELEN SILVERNASTER stating that she would like to visit the SILVERNASTERS this evening but Mrs. SILVERNASTER advised that it would be inconvenient inasmuch as ULLMAN vill be out and she isn't feeling very well. She asked MARY JAME KEENEY to come out on Sunday and they agreed. MARY JAME KEENEY advised that she has her apartment back and will have it ready for the decorators on Monday. (1)

At 9.25 AF an individual identified by the informant as IZ

KAULKINS, phonetic, contacted MELEN SILVERMASTER stating that he had had a
pleasant trip to California and was just seeing LVD, apparently referring to
LVD IG ULLY NN, at his office. HELEN SILVERMASTER extended an invitation
to IZ and the EBBERS, phonetic, to visit her Briday night. IZ indicated that
he would call BRUCK EBER, phonetic or MIRILM EBER, phonetic, and see if these
people thought it agreeable. IZ indicated that the office was no place to
talk to LVD IG. It was further indicated that IZ has a younger sister ID ALLY MAS
phonetic, who lives in Pasadena, California. IZ's father who is not too
well now lives in the East.

and advised that BRUCE's wife is sick and they will be unable to come to PELEM's house for the meeting; however IZ called some of the 21 and extended an invitation to them: RUS and FLORENCE NIXON LINGDON, JOE PATCLIF. A number of people will be there but most of them will arrive after dinner. He and the NIXONS are coming but SASULYS won't make it until after. JEAN and BILL GREENE will be there for dinner also, that will make a certain four. IZADORE stated he tried to get

"The Farm Security Crowd" but that MIRILLE and his wife, prometic, had a previous engagement which they couldn't cancel.

PHYSICAL SURVEILLANCE

Inasmuch as there had been an indication from the New York Field Division that LOUISE BRANSTON would arrive in Tashington, D.C. from New York and possibly make contact with GREGORY SILVERMASTER, subject SILVERMASTER was kept under strict physical surveillance during this day. However there was no indication up until 9.30 PM of any contact by an individual who could be identified as LOUISE BRANSTON. At 9.50 PM the surveillance was discontinued inasmuch as the New York Office advised that LOUISE BRANSTON'S plans for an expected contact with SILVERMASTER in Tashington had been changed.

On March 15th a physical surveillance was maintained upon the SILVERMISTER residence. ILLIST L. and JEIN HINTON GREENE were identified as being present at the SILVERMISTERS home on that evening. The GREENE's were driving a blue Chevrolet Coupe, DC tag 91-942 and it was subsequently determined that these tags were issued to the GREENES who listed their address at 1739 Harvard Street, NV, Tashington, D.C.

7.40 PM. He arrived alone in an automobile bearing Virginia license tags 62672.

ELIZIBETH SASULY arrived at the SILVENDASTERS at approximately 9.20 PM and her husband DICK SASULY arrived at 9.45 PM. It was observed in the course of this surveillance that SILVERMASTERS 1941 Chrysler sedan now bears 1946 DC tags of 105-064.

In addition to RUSS MIXON who was present at the SILVERILSTERS no further identifications were made as a result of this surveillance.

Reference is made to the report of Special Agent LIBERT G. ZANDER dated March 15, 1946 at "ashington, D.C. in this case in which it was noted that on February 23, 1946 the unidentified couple who were visiting the SILVERMISTERS on that evening driving an automobile licensed to ME TON C. LICHEMBRUCH at 4711 Rosedale Avenue, Bethesda, Maryland. The indices of the Washington Field Division were checked with reference to NE TON C. LICHEMBRUCH with negative results; however it was determined from the files of the local Credit Bureaus that NE TON C. INCHEMBRUCH and his wife, LELL, have lived at this address since February, 1940. They are renting this house from the Allied Realty Company at 6600 Wisconsin Avenue, Chevy Chase, Maryland for a little over \$75 per month. They formerly lived at 80 Guron Place, New Rochelle, New York. He was born on May 17, 1886. He is presently employed by the Farm

Credit Administration as Assistant Chicf Examiner which position he has held since October 3, 1934. He presently is receiving a salary of 56,000 year. His wife is employed in the Public Assistance Division of the District of Columbia as a case supervisor.

Further reference is made to the same report in which Confidential Informant on February 23rd advised that HELEN SILVERM STER contacted an individual identified as MRGERITE CLEM, phonetic, who is presently living at the Fontana Apartments. A check of the available General Indices shows that one MARGARETE KLEW lives at apartment 501 at Montana Apartments, 1726 M Street, N. Check of the indices of the Tashington Field Division indicates that in the report of Special Ligent NED E. HOLVIN, JR. dated June 19, 1942 made at Tashington, D.C. and entitled United American Spanish .id Committee. Tashington Committee for Spanish Refugees, Internal Security - C, that MARGARETE KLEM of 1726 M Street, No appears on the active indices and mailing list of the United American Spanish Lid Committee. In the report of Special Agent T. T. DATSEY made at Mashington, D.C. on January 21, 1941 entitled Tashington Committee for Democratic Action, Internal Security - C - MIRGIRETE KLEN appears on the membership list of that organization. In the report of Special Ligent T. ... D. SEY made at Tashington, D.C. on Harch 8, 1941 in the case entitled League of Jomen Shappers, Internal Security - C, the name of MIRCIRETE/KELM appears on the rols of active members of that association as of January 1, 1941. No further information is presently available regarding the identity of activities of MIRGIRETE KIEH.



RE: HELEN TENNEY

Confidential Informant whose identity is known to the Bureau, furnished the following information concerning the activities by of the subject HELEN TENNEY

On March 3, 1946, BEATRICE HOWELL got in touch with HELEN
TENNEY and they decided to go for a drive to Annapolis. It was decided
that BEATRICE would get in touch with ELSA ZOCK (phonetic) and her
husband, who live out near Catholic University, and invite them along;
this BEATRICE did. Thereafter JEAN asked HELEN TENNEY to dinner
but she declined the invitation on account of the intended trip to
Annapolis. HELEN mentioned that she would go to New York City on
Friday. JEAN said that she would go to New York herself on Saturday
and they agreed that they would try to come back together on the 3:30 PM
train on Sunday, (March 10, 1946)

On March 5, 1946, HELEN TEMNEY'S mother in New York City advised HELEN that EDITH (her sister) was coming down to Washington on the 1 PM train, B and O Railroad. She expected to arrive on Thursday and she would visit "DUTCH", whose husband's name is EUGENE PORTER MEISET, 1611 Mount Eagle Place, Parkfairfax. The affair at "DUTCH'S" would occur on March 7, 1946 at 7 PM and would be informal.

On March 12, 1946, GREGORY got in touch with HELEN TENNEY, They indulged in personal conversation and asked about each others health. GREGORY asked if HELEN TENNEY would have dinner with her the following night. TENNEY said she was to have dinner with some relatives but since she would see them on Thursday she would get out of it. They agreed to meet at 6 PM at Pierre's Restaurant on Connecticut Avenue and talk over what has been happening to each other

The following physical surveillance of HELEN TENNEY was conducted on March 7, 1946 by Special Agents JOHN J. BARRON and AUBREY S. BRENT of the Washington Field Office;

At 5:28 PM, a woman answering the description of HELEN TENNEY left Temporary Building Q, 26th and Water Streets, N.W., accompanied by two other women. They got into a 1941 Plymouth four-door Sedan, bright blue in color and bearing New York license plates for the year 1946 number N8763. This is the car driven by HELEN TEINEY. The car proceeded North to Pennsylvania Avenue, thence to 20th Street where one woman got out of the car. The car then proceeded to I Street where it was parked across from the subject's home at 2038 I Street, N.W. Both women entered 2038 I Street, at 5:45 PM.



The following description of the woman believed to be HELEN TENNEY was obtained from observation by the agents:

Age 32 to 35 years Height 51 6n Reight 130 lbs. Hair Brown and gray Build Medium: legs sturdy Glasses with light horn rims Eyes Clothing Blue gray two-piece suit; tan blouse; hat - pilgrim type with large shovel brim in front and buckle on crown. Carried green slicker of light transparent type.

The following is a description of companion:

Age 28 to 35 years
Height 51 8"
Weight 145 lbs.
Hair Rolled up about edges

close to head coiffure (brown)

Build Heavy but well proportioned Dressed in a brown fur jacket thigh length and tan frock.

The agents continued the surveillance until 7 PM observing that the lights were turned on in the apartment on the third floor front of 2038 I Street, N.W. At 7 PM the surveillance was discontinued.

On March 8, 1946, Special Agents JOHN J. BARRON and AUBREY S. BRENT took up the surveillance of the subject's home at 8:15 AM. A weman believed to be HELEN TENNEY came out of 2038 I Street, N.W. and drove off in the car bearing New York license N8763. She parked the car at 26th and Water Streets behind the temporary office buildings located there. At 12:20 PM, the agents observed the subject's car leave the parking area and proceed South to Constitution Avenue, East to 17th Street where the car turned left against traffic lights after stopoing in the middle of the intersection. The surveillance was lost after this time when the agents also turned North on 17th Street but could not locate subject or car. However, at 12:50 PM, the agents observed the car parked at the corner of 17th and E Streets in front of the Red Cross building. At 1:38 PM, the subject was observed crossing E Street at 17th in the company of another woman wearing a blue gray uniform coat and cap. The two women stood on the corner talking for a few minutes, then departed. The subject entered her car and the other woman

proceeded up the steps to the entrance of the Red Cross building. The identity of this woman was not ascertained. The subject's car proceeded to Constitution Avenue, I st to 26th Street and North to where it again entered the parking area behind the temporary office buildings. The surveillance was continued until 6:45 PM when the car was observed still parked in the area. Subsequent spot checks were made by Agent BARRON at 7:30 PM and the car was observed parked in the same place. Again, on March 9, 1946 at 11:30 AM, a spot check was made by Agent BARRON and the subject's car was observed parked in the same place.

The following is a description of the woman observed in the company of the subject at 17th and E Streets, N.W. at 1:38 PM on March 8, 1946:

(In view of the information given by Confidential Informant that HELEN TENNEY intended to go to New York City on Friday, March 8, 1946, it may safely be assumed that the subject parked her car at the Red Cross building for the period in which she was in New York).

In view of the information furnished by respecting the dinner engagement of GREGORY and HELEN TENNEY, the following surveillance of GREGORY and HELEN TENNEY was conjucted by Special Agents M. A. TAYLOR, CHARLES LANMAN, JOHN BARRON and AUBREY S. HRENT

At 5:40 PM, GREGORY was observed to enter Pierre's Restaurant located at 1929 Q Street, N.W. Agent BRENT entered Pierre's at 5:45 PM and GREGORY was observed sitting on a sofa facing the entrance. GREGORY shortly thereafter got up and moved to the Cocktail Lounge and seated herself at a table for two located against the East wall of the Lounge where she could be easily seen by anyone entering. She ordered a cocktail, smoked cigarettes and continuously adjusted the knot of hair at the back of her neck with both hands. At 6:05 PM, HELEN TENNEY entered the Cocktail Lounge and walked directly to GREGORY'S table. She seated herself and ordered a cocktail. At 7:15 PM they left the Cocktail Lounge and



- walked up the steps to the dining room on the second floor. turned downstairs almost immediately, got their coats and left. walked down Connecticut Avenue to Maxime's Restaurant at 1731 Connecticut Avenue. They entered but immediately came out. Agents BARRON and BRENT observed them entering Alfred's Restaurant at 1724 Connecticut Avenue, N.W. at 7:20 PM. At 8:15 PM, they left Alfred's Restaurant and strolled South on the West side of Connecticut Avenue to the corner of Connecticut Avenue and R Street where they stood in front of a drugstore talking for about ten minutes. They separated and TENNEY continued to walk down Connecticut Avenue while CREGORY entered the drugstore where Agent BARRON observed that she went to the rear apparently in search of a phone booth but finding none available she immediately left the drugstore and walked North to Connecticut Avenue and S Street where she entered a restaurant and bar located on the Northeast corner. Here Agent BARRON observed her using a telephone booth. In approximately five minutes, GREGORY came out and walked to the corner of Connecticut Avenue and S Streets and took yellow cab number 120 to the home of NATHAN CRECCRY SILVERMASTER. Agents TAYLOR, LANMAN and BRENT observed GREGORY entering the SILVERMASTER residence.

On this eccasion, HELEN TENNEY was dressed as follows:

Black sailor straw hat with black vail extending over forehead; black Jacket with a purple design throughout; black skirt; black cloth coat; and horn rimmed glasses

GREGORY appeared as follows:

Gray cloth coat; black dress; hair combed tack into knot; horn rimmed glasses; gold ring-shaped earrings; and gold necklace

After the meeting between GREGORY and HELEN TENNEY, GREGORY was interviewed on March 14, 1946 by Special Agent M. A. TAYLOR of the Tashington Field Office and Special Agent CHARLES LANMAN of the New York Office. The details of this interview are not being set forth at length inasmuch as it is expected that the New York Office will report them. However, it should be mentioned that GREGORY stated that TENNEY expressed considerable concern because she had no contact with a Russian agent since two weeks prior to Christmas when a woman telephoned her concerning a contact and thereafter failed to meet her as agreed. TENNEY told GREGORY that she had had several contacts both men and



women since GREGORY discontinued service as a contact. However, GREGORY could furnish the names of none of these contacts. TENNEY also expressed concern to GREGORY because she said she had learned through her mother in New York that Agents had followed her in New York City during a visit around Washington's birthday and they had made inquiries about her (TENNEY) and the girl friend from the chauffeur of the man who maintains TENNEY'S mother. TENNEY told GREGORY she was anxious because she had no contact to lean upon or to inform about being followed. She asked GREGORY to help her regain contact and GREGORY said she would see what she could do.

By teletype dated March 14, 1946 the Bureau and the New York Office have already been apprised of this information,

During the period of this report, March 1st to March 15th, the results of the mail cover of the subject's home have been negative.



RE: "ILLIAM LUD"IG ULLMANN

The mail cover placed upon this subject during the period March 15th inclusive produced only the following results

On March 15, 1946 a communication postmarked New York 7 PM was addressed to WILLIAF L. ULLMANN, 5515 30th Street, NY from the Commodore Hotel at 42nd and Lexington Avenue, New, New York. No further identity of the correspondent was available

advised that under date of January 26th TILLIAM L. ULLMANN addressed a communication to HELEN and GREGORY SILVERMASTER from Perlin, Germany from the Office of Military Government for Germany, Finance Division. He indicated that he was being very comfortably taken care of in Germany and indicated that up to this time he had strictly been concerned with business but that he had made arrangements to visit with an individual identified as "ZAP". He indicated that he had met MARY JANE (presumably MARY JANE KEENEY). He also indicated that apparently every soldier is now a foreign exchange expert and they have worked out some complicated arbitration schemes that even the Treasury experts did not think of and successfully. He indicated that he received information there that VINSON and THITE's name were both sent to the Senate for "Brenton Toods", and that stirred up the Treasury people somewhat. He said he didn't know how successful he had been in getting them to stay but he indicated that he would manage to ease some of the administrative problems to the satisfaction of the people and of the Army Headquarters. Captain ZAP, an Army man and not a treasury man has been most helpful to him as has a Mr. and Mrs. PANNING of the Treasury Department.

The same informant advised that subject "ILLIAN ULLNANN addressed a communication to Mrs. HELEN P. SILVERNASTER from Frankfurt, Germany indicating that he had a successful visit in Berlin and he conferred with General CLAY and reached an agreement by which the Treasury people are now free to make up their own minds as to whether they remain there or go home after they have served their six months. He indicated that he would attempt to contact an individual named ALLEN and is attempting to obtain his release from the Army. He further indicated that he had dined with KLEPPER FOSTER ADA'S and HELGA Who is apparently HELGA ALLSKY. He also spent some time with JACK PENNETT of the Treasury Department.

Since his return to duties at the Treasury Department it has been noted that ULLMANN now offices in Room 3203 of the Treasury Department Building and his extension is 2036.

The following information was obtained through Confidential during the period of March 1st through Larch 15, 1946 inclusive Informant

On larch 1, 1946 the informant advised that TANDA contacted MARY THEELER. TANDA quit her job temporarily and her office building will be moved next week. They talked of the inefficiency of the Veterans Administration and WANDA spoke about "JQE". (possibly her husband working for the Veterans Administration.). WANDA said that JOE was appointed there because he was recommended by two officers from Fort Dix to Colonel BRANSON in the Veterans Administration. "ANDA said it would take an atomic bomb to get them started at the Veterans Administration. On the same date the informant advised that Frs. LEILY LYNCH contacted MARY HELFR. LEILA mentioned DEVNIS who is apparently her husband. LEILA asked the name of a certain woman who worked with him. MARY said it was BONNIE PETERS, phonetic. BONNIE's husband works with a Mr. LESCOLA, phonetic, in a barber shop. LEILA said that she was going to leave sometime in August and they planned to get together Tuesday

On Parch 1st ELINA asked DONALD if he has heard from MILTON. He has not. ELIMA said that she had told MARY she would come over for dinner tomorrow afternoon but just remembered that she had invited RUTH PFREZ, phonetic, out to the farm for dinner. ELINA said that she would be driving into town on Sunday and might drop by to visit the THEELERS. ELINA said that she got a letter from "your extravagant brother" (apparently Elina's husband). The cable said "returned from successful field trip, am staying at least through August. Please try to get Swiss Visa." ELTMA said he also air mailed "350" to her. ELINA and FHEELER discussed getting the visa and ELINA said that



Mrs. SHIPLEY (phonetic) of the State Department would probably think her a foreigner since she was born in laska ...

On Earch 2, 1946 Mrs. MILLER received a telegram from MARGARET in Philadelphia stating "Decided advisable bring Nancy another week and when time available (1)

On Farch 3, 1946 Informant advised that MARY WHEELER contacted MARCUS who used to be on the board and knows them all. MARY is arranging a verty for ELEANOR probably next Saturday. ELEANOR's friends will be invited.

On Parch 3rd M.RY THEELER contacted M.RLIN and said she was talking to STINLTY who said he was seeing his personal lawyer about staying six weeks more in the house. M.RLIN advised M.RY that ELEINOR would be by at 2.30.
M.RY is planning a going away party for ELEINOR and plans to invite her close friends. She wants to tell her about it to make up the list of guests and to make sure she is present. M.RY says the girls at the bookshop wanted a surprise party. ELEINOR is to call M.RY from ESTHER POSEOFF's, phonetic, or M.RIIN's. The party is to be next Saturday or Sunday. M.RY advised that she would take "Arm" any time he wants to take the driver's test (either in DC or Maryland)

On Parch 3rd Informant advised that ELFANOR would not be able to leave as planned since NORA has come down with either Scarlet Fever or Measles. On Parch 3rd MARY "HEELER contacted MARGARET and said that she had a headache and did not feel well and did not think she could tell her about "that affair because it is so involved." MARY says that they did not leave there until 3 AM and adds "however they did not misbehave but it is a good thing that ALFRED is young and DAVE kept saying it was better than a movie."

On Narch 4th it was learned through Informant that 'ILDRED was not going to be able to go with CLTH RINE as planned. On the same date GALE (a lady) told MARY HEELER that "it was nice to get a message from you", bod MARY said that GALE and MARGARET HOLMES, phonetic, can make plans for ELELNOR's going away party (GALE is INGUS' wife). MARY said SIRIH (phonetic) from the bookshop suggested the party. MARY said there would be about two dozen people at the party. It was suggested that they invite VIVI N and TOW PATE, phonetic, and VIRGIL EKESON, his wife and her sister to the Party. The 16th was set as a possible date for the party.

On the same date BIRBIR HOLMES and MIRY HEELER discussed the party which MIRY is planning for ELENOR (her sister-in-law) on March 16, 1946.

MIRY said she and GILE (RICHTER) are planning the party. The following are among those who may be there. BILL and DELLIH and DR. (JOHN) Plane, and FRICES Plane (MIRY mentioned that BILL and DELLIH are workers in the bookshop.

MERCUS GOLDHEN and MERY and ENGUS (RICHTER) and GILE RICHTER, PEGGY and GORDON CINTYRE, DENTE REDICE and the boys FELTS (phonetic). (These are the people who are taking over ELE NOR's home); POPTLE SARAH MESTER, the JOSEPH PIERCES, HENRIETT ADNES and FRENCH ROBERTS. MERY THEELER states that GILE RICHTER is inviting VIRGIL and LEON MESSON and his wife and his wife's sister and TOM and VIVIEN TITE. ROSE SSIS is discussed as being invited. MERGERET states that another person who is a good worker and a member of the board of the bookshop is EVELYN TYPOUS and she has been very close for the past year and a half to ELE NOR. EERY said that the party would be made up largely of bookshop people and that at the last party of bookshop people she had 150 people.

On Farch 4, 1946 M.RY THEELER invited FRINCES PLYNE and her husband Dr. JOHN PLYNE to ELEXNOR's farewell party at 7 PM Saturday March 16th. ELEXNOR is leaving on the 18th of March.

On March 4th MIRY THEELTR discussed ELTIMOR'S party with ESTHER who said she would tell PEGGY and GORDON MCINTYRE, EVELYN TYMOUS, MIRIE HENRIETTY, JONES, FRENCH, ROBERTS and JOE FIERCE who can be reached at DUpont 8787

On Farch 5th MIRY SEGBERT or SEEBERG advised MIRY THEELER that she was going to a bound meeting tonight (of the bookshop) and they discussed the party for ELEINOF (1)

On March 6th ELELNOR contacted MIRY THEELER who asked her to call MIRIE at GE 0889 to accept a date for dinner for Friday which MIRIE offered her. ELELNOR says she would like MIRY to aske MIRIE to see her at the "bookshop" at 5 PM. She said there were some things she wanted to discuss. ELINOR asked if MIRY can invite PISHIERS to the Buffet dinner and MIRY said that she could. ELFLNOR said they needed a better excuse for the party than her leaving, something like an election for the strikers (1)

On Warch 8th CVNTHIL contacted MIRY THEELER who said that DONLID THEELER has loads of leave and if he can get it they are going to drive out est for the whole summer. They will leave early in June and return in August. Next fall MIRY may consider working again. CYNTHIL works now and on Sundays, drives patients from Talter Reed Hospital to Bethesda Hospital for sightseeing. She goes to lunch at 11.50 M. They will meet next Monday for lunch at noon.

Also that GEORGE had talked to GEORGE ATENAN, phonetic. ELE/NOR is going to meet PORSH. TSON, EXecutive 4660 extension 2804 at the Trocadero at 1.30 PM today. ELE/NOR and her children are leaving Tuesday at 1.30 PM apparently to join her husband GEORGE in Germany. She is putting their valuables in a safe deposit box. MRY TREELER stated she has to cable GEORGE that she has received the microscopes and his address is Colonel GEORGE S. HEELER 0-826106, OMG, US, PO #742. ELE/NOR mentioned that she has seen the TISCHLERS, phonetic.

On March 14th "IMP" (IRMISTERD L. COLEMIN), Tisconsin Ivenue,
Nowhom the City Directory lists as an artist, his wife is "MIRIN") contacted
MIRY HEELER. MIRLIN was still very ill and he wanted MIRY to come over and
take care of his children INNIRED and BOWEN this afternoon. He said that hecema
was going to the "paper" at 2 o'clock today. MIRY asked him if he would be
able to "keep his date" this evening and he said he didn't think so. He
said CLULKINS (IZ) has called a special meeting for all the clients tonight.

MIRY JINE told ELEINOR that she does not have a specific message from her husband GEORGE "HEELER. She could tell ELEINOR all about him in Berlin. (ELTINOR may be going to Berlin to join her husband). MIRY JINE said that THELLY MILE and she were going to be at MIRCUS (SUPPLER?) house on Saturday night. THELLY DILLE may be down from New York on Sunday. MIRY JINE saw THELM! in New York. RUTH SHERLEN might possibly be identical with RUTH SHERLEN mentioned in the
following files

The name of RUTH SHERM N, wife of BOB (ROBERT) SHERVIN, who is president of the Commerce Department Local No. 23, UF T, was on the CIO Committee to reinstate HELEN TILLER who was fired from the Labor Department for com unistic activity (mentioned in file 100-121, serial 196). ROBERT STERVIN, it was pointed out, was active in the Committee for Democratic action and worked for the National Negro Congress, and it was believed he appeared unconcerned about whether or not he is thought of as a communist. His wife in 1911 worked at Social Security and school his beliefs but was not considered wholeheartedly behind his ideas. She is not active in organization work although frequently accompanied BOB SHERMIN to many of his meetings. This information is pointed out in the report of Special agent J. M. CONVELLY dated December 17, 1941, at Tashington, D.C., in the case catilled: "Communist Party ctivities, Eshington, D.C.; Internal Security - R. M. M.

On the morning of March 1, 1946, subject WHITE contacted one IEE, advising he was leaving home shortly and would pick IEE up on the corner at nine. It is believed the individual referred to is IEE PRESSMAN, General Counsel, CIO.

On the same morning, March 1, 1946, ANNEWHITE contacted FRANCES
EDEISTEIN. ANNE indicated she did not have a car and that BERNIE (BERNARD
BERNSTEIN) is in New York most of the time and with BERNICE expecting a baby,
she needed their car. ANNE stated she would have the car less and less
frequently. FRANCES indicated she usually had her car Tuesday, Wednesday and
Thursday. ANNE suggested she get over to her house early enough that night
so they could review the play. FRANCES said she couldn't make it before

Later, the same afternoon, FRANCES contacted ANNE, indicating she could not make it that night, but would see her the next night. ANNE said she was mad at herself as her writing was not going well

On the evening of Saturday, March 2, 1946, JOE FREEMAN, Treasury Department, contacted HARRY WHITE apolygizing for calling WHITE at home. FREEMAN stated they had been getting ready for "these negotiations" with the Swiss and had not been able to get in touch with HARRY. He stated RANDOLPH PAUL (phonetic) had asked AUGUST (presumably AUGUST A SCHMIDT) and FREEMAN. JOE said there was one issue in which he and AUGUST were in disagreement and they wished to confer with WHITE. He inquired if WHITE could read a memorandum stating their position by Monday, and WHITE said he would read it the first thing on Monday morning.

On the morning of March 3, 1946, ANNE WHITE received a telegram addressed to HARRY or ANNE WHITE, as follows: "BUNDLE ARRIVED LAST NIGHT. MARGARET AND BABY PERFECT. LOVE. IRVING"

Subject WHITE was contacted by one VALENSI who spoke poor English with a strong foreign accent. The latter invited WHITE to a party at his residence between 6:00 and 8:00 P.M., next Tuesday, March 5, 1946. WHITE indicated he would try and go, but thought Mrs. WHITE had dinner guests for that night. VALENSI stated MENDES-FRANCE (phonetic) had arrived in New York. VALENSI is undoubtedly identical with CHRISTIAN VALENSI, Financial Attache, French Embassy.

On the early evening of March 3, 1946. WHITE contacted his secretary, Mrs. SHANAHAN, to inquire if that dinner is for business suit or black tie, and was advised that it was for a business suit for him and long dress for





Mrs. WHITE. Informant advised later that the WHITES were out that evening, and apparently the above conversation reflected that subject and his wife were invited to a function of some kind

No information of value was received from this informant on March 4, 1946.

At noon on March 5, 1946, one Miss GURLING (phonetic) contacted ANNE WHITE and introduced herself. ANNE stated they had received a letter from the girl's father advising that she would arrive. ANNE mentioned that HARRY WHITE was leaving to attend the Bretton Woods Conference and wanted Miss GURLING out for dinner before he left. She stated she would call HARRY at the Treasury Department and tell him to bring Miss GURLING out for dinner the next evening. GURLING stated she was working at the Airport

Later, on the afternoon of March 5, 1946, WHITE contacted ANNE WHITE mentioning the Norwegian Embassy and stating that something was doing there that night. He stated he would be home at 7:00 P.M. and would bring CHURCHILL'S speech for her to read.

At 8:50 P.M., on March 5, 1946, SAM MILIER contacted ANNE WHITE, who inquired if SALLY MILIER had quit her job and SAM advised yes. ANNE stated HARRY WHITE was dining that night with the Norwegians and that he would work the next day and Thursday. She did not know when they would leave for Savannah but the trunks would leave on Wednesday. ANNE stated HARRY is still subject to dizzy spells, but they are clearing up somewhat.

MILIER inquired if WHITE would quit the Treasury before going on the trip, and ANNE stated he would quit when he returned. They discussed the forthcoming marriage of SALLY MILIER and ABE WOLFSON in Chicago, and ANNE stated she did not think she and HARRY would go. MILIER said he didn't really want to go; however, he and EVELYN probably would go.

At 6:00 P.M., on March 6, 1946, ANNE WHITE was contacted by an unidentified woman who advised that HARRY had left for home and that Miss GURLING was accompanying him.





On the morning of March 7, 1946, FRANCES EDEISTEIN contacted ANNE WHITE who informed FRANCES that HARRY was leaving that night. FRANCES indicated she had a Dr. WEINSTEIN (phonetic) for their children who were sick.

On the late afternoon of March 7, 1946, WHITE contacted his wife, indicating he would be home at the usual time and that she need not drive him to the depot that night as a Treasury car would pick him up

At 7:15 P.M., on the same date, a Mr. KELLY contacted WHITE who advised the Secretary had requested him to inquire of WHITE if State is to take the responsibility for suggesting attendance of the Congressional Committee. WHITE stated he and HORN talked it over and State has the responsibility and both suggested it. KELLY inquired if they suggested weights and measures too, and WHITE stated no. KELLY asked if it was necessary now to invite the corresponding Senate Committee, and WHITE stated there is none. However, KELLY indicated there is a corresponding authority somewhere which should be invited, to which WHITE agreed. KELLY suggested they wait until WHITE arrives and they agreed upon this.

On March 8, 1946, there was nothing of value reported by this Informant.

On the morning of March 9, 1946. an unidentified woman contacted the Underwood Company to inquire about ordering a portable typewriter, however, upon learning the price she did not want the typewriter.

On the evening of March 9, 1946, ANNE WHITE contacted one SI (phonetic) to inquire about the health of his family. He indicated one of his children may have tuberculosis and the others are O.K. They discussed tennis, and ANNE stated she is fifty-one and has given it up. She mentioned WHITE is out of town and took his tennis racket with him. She also mentioned BERNICE (REFNISTEIN) is expecting a baby any hour.

On the early morning of March 11, 1946, JOAN WHITE contacted a Mrs. BERGER (phonetic) for whom JOAN had apparently acted as a sitter.

JOAN inquired if everything was all right on the previous night. Answer yes.

JOAN indicated she would see her Thursday

On the morning of March 12, 1946, ANNE WHITE was contacted by ANNE FELTUS who incuired whether ANNE was better informed than she. Mrs. FELTUS stated RANDY has a room mate (in Savannah?) and could not do much conversation. ANNE advised HARRY had called the night before stating things were slow, the reverse of the Bretton Woods talks, that it looks as if Washington would be the domicile and appointments had not yet been made. ANNE FELTUS observed that VINSON is Chairman of both Boards, which is not unexpected, and he believed the Americans should not take both top positions. ANNE replied that it was well known that they knew that beforehand. Mrs. FELTUS stated that she understood HARRY would get the -- (sentence not finished), and ANNE WHITE stated, 'No, it was understood he wouldn't. He went without any expectation of it because that was determined beforehand". She continued that they apparently feel just one officer should be an American and the decision was made a matter of a few weeks ago. Mrs. FELTUS indicated she did not know this and it was too bad as WHITE had worked so hard, so long and so devotedly. Mrs. WHITE said she was just as well pleased as so difficult a job would tax WHITE too heavily, nevertheless, there is some frustration.

Mrs. FELTUS commented on the British loan being in a messy condition at this moment, and ANNE WHITE stated she expected it would go right through as it was expected to. ANNE WHITE said she was not making any plans -- just waiting, but was pretty certain what the outcome would be in Savannah and HARRY would be Executive Director in any case, but there was no expectation at all of his receiving the Director Generalship. Mrs. FELTUS stated she wanted to work on semething very badly and indicated it had to do with the Security Conference which opens in less than ten days. She stated she would work with one of the Governments involved--United Nations Organization. ANNE stated she would not ask which one and Mrs. FELTUS stated you probably already know. HARRY had something to do with it in the very beginning. ANNE stated she didn't know, and Mrs. FELTUS stated, Well, three guesses. They laughed, and ANNE WHITE stated "I won't even try to guess".

On the evening of March 12, 1946, subject HARRY WHITE contacted ANNE WHITE from Savannah. They engaged in some personal chatter. WHITE indicated that the work was going on about the same as at Bretton Woods, only different. He stated he thought the domicile of the International Money Organization would be in Washington, and advised he expected to be

On the morning of March 13, 1946, ANNE WHITE contacted FRANCES EDEISTEIN advising that the BERNSTEINS have a daughter. ANNE advised that HARRY WHITE had written her Sunday, but she hadn't received any other letters. ANNE stated she hated lost letters, but there was nothing in such letters that she could not read about in the newspapers any way

On the early evening of March 13, 1946, one SANDY contacted JOAN WHITE who stated she wanted SANDY to play some symphony music at her place after school the following day.

On the morning of March 15, 1946, HARRY WHITE contacted his wife from Savannah. He stated he thought the Conference would be through by Saturday, but now believes it would be Monday or Tuesday before he could leave. He stated they were making slow progress in the Congress. WHITE advised ANNE the site would be in Washington and a struggle was taking place over salaries with the British leading the fight so the salaries may be lower, and alternates between twelve and fifteen, from which they would attempt to pay taxes. Between fifteen and twenty-five may be decided. WHITE was probably talking in terms of thousands of dollars per year salary.

ANNE WHITE wanted to know if anyone had been selected for the bank, and WHITE stated press notices indicated LOW DOUGLAS, former Budget Director, may head the bank. ANNE mentioned that ABE WOLFSON is to be married on the 31st and would spend his honeymoon in the hotel where HARRY is staying in Savannah. HARRY inquired if they planned to go to Chicago, and ANNE stated no it would be silly. ANNE asked if he was going to Florida, and he stated no, he wanted to come home. WHITE stated it had not been exactly "upbuilding". ANNE stated if he returned to Washington he would get into a - you know -- that working again. HARRY stated he thought he would come back home and then they could go North together. ANNE asked him if he was disgusted, and HARRY stated, "Yes, off and on "Yes, off a





PHYSICAL SURVEILLANCE

On the early morning of March 6, 1946, a confidential informant acquainted with subject CECRCE SILVERMAN advised that he was contacted by HARRY WHITE who inquired when SILVERMAN was going to New York. CECRCE replied not until the end of the week perhaps. WHITE stated he thought he was going sooner than that and indicated he wanted to get word to O'DWYER. SILVERMAN asked WHITE if he was free for lunch that date and WHITE stated he was going on the "Hill" and did not know if he would be back. Thereupon WHITE arranged to pick up subject SILVERMAN at 9:00 A.M. at his home

On the basis of the above information, surveillance was conducted by Agents KENNERLY R. CORBETT and JEROME M. CARLAND.

At 9:00 A.M., subject SILVERMAN was observed standing on the entrance walk outside his apartment house at 2325 - 15th Street, N. W. At 9:10 A.M., subject WHITE drove up in front of the apartment house and picked up subject SILVERMAN, thereafter proceeding south on 15th Street along on 15th Street to New Hampshire Avenue, south on New Hampshire Avenue to 18th Street, and thence to the French Supply Mission on the southwest corner of 18th Street and Massachusetts Avenue, N. W. The car stopped directly opposite the 1430 - 18th Street entrance of the Mission. SILVERMAN romained in the car talking with WHITE until 9:20 A.M., when he left the car and entered the French Mission. WHITE was observed to drive away in his car, bearing 1945 Maryland tags 304-702. Surveillance was discontinued at this point.
