A Detroit Credit Report indicated that ROTHMEYER was about fifty-six years of age and known since 1920 when he was employed by the Wayne Tool Company, and has resided at 1465 Balmoral Drive since 1930. He is married and his wife's name is ROSE ROTHMEYER. In 1931, he was associated with the Ex-Cello Air Corporation and was President of the Air Parts and Tool Manufacturing Company. His present occupation is listed as being self-employed as a construction engineer with offices located at 913 Fisher Building, Detroit, Michigan. The Detroit indices reflect that ROTHMEYER was interviewed by an Agent in 1943 to be a Covernment witness (2)

According to the report of Special Agent JOHN W. WOLF entitled, "JOHN EOCHAN KELLY, with aliases - REGISTRATION ACT", dated May 10, 1943, at Detroit, Michigan, ROTHMEYER stated that he had retired from active business a number of years ago, but since the war he had been acting as a Consulting Engineer for various defense plants throughout Michigan and the United States. ROTHMEYER stated further he had also been acting as a Consulting Engineer for the Board of Economic Warfare on a part time basis and that he made frequent trips to Washington, D. C., and New York on behalf of the United States Government in this capacity. At the time of the interview, ROTHMEYER stated that in the event any further interview with him was desired, he could be located either at the Willard or Mayflower Hotels in Washington, D. C., or at the Office of the Board of Economic Warfare, 2501 - Q - Street, N. W., telephone EXecutive 7030, Extension 2301

ROTHMEYER continued that to the best of his recollection he had first met the subject of the Registration Act case in 1937 or 1938 during the time of the Spanish Revolution. ROTHMEYER stated he had been contacted by several individuals, at which time he was advised where was a great scarcity of mercury in the United States and that in all likelihood there could be an immense profit involved in the event it was possible to import mercury from Spain. ROTHMEYER stated that when he first met KELLY, the subject of the Registration Act case, he was not overly impressed, but stated on this occasion he had discussed with KELLY the possibilities of securing the consent of the Spanish Government to allow mercury to be exported. ROTHMEYER stated KELLY made the proposition that he, KELLY, would go to Spain to conduct the necessary inquiries and investigation to determine the amounts and possibilities of exporting mercury from Spain and that in order to do this he would need \$5,000 or \$10,000, which sum ROTHMEYER was supposed to advance. ROTHMEYER stated that he had accompanied KELLY to the Spanish Embassy in Washington, at which time KELLY seemed to be well known by the officials of the Spanish Government at the Embassy. ROTHMEYER stated that the only thing discussed was the possibility of securing the consent of the Spanish Government for the export of mercury and that he believed it was during the course of this visit that KELLY made the remark that he was very familiar with a relative of FRANCO. ROTHMEYER concluded the interview by stating that he did not feel that he was a competent person to testify in the Registration Act case

In 1933 he reorganized the China National Aviation Corporation, the first airline to operate in China and in 1934 organized a company to manufacture airplanes in China. He negotiated for the sale of a large number of planes from the Curtiss-Wright Company to China and is also credited with being the organizer of the American Group of Flying Tigers in China. He later established and operated Hindustan Aircraft, Ltd., for the manufacture of airplanes for the India Government, and in March, 1945, the Inter-Continent Corporation, of which he was then President. He undertook to build a giant fertilizer plant in Travancore, India, under the sponsorship of the India Government with the objective of doubling farm produce in India within a period of fifteen years. In connection with this project, PAWLEY was listed as American Representative of the State of Travancore. Will







In August, 1942, the Cambridge Port Savings Bank Massachusetts Avenue, Central Square, Cambridge, reported to the Boston Office that the savings account of JOHN STADIER had unusually heavy activity for a Jewish alien known to the bank as a truck driver. In the month of August, STADIER deposited \$5700 obtained, according to statements made by him to a bank teller, from Roumania. He excited the bank's suspicions by entering the bank shortly before closing hours to either deposit or withdraw money in amounts approximating from one to three thousand dollars. He appeared to bank officials to be excitable and in an unnecessary hurry. The bank ascertained he was born in Berlin and his wife in Hungary. He was described as being forty-seven years of age, 5'10' in height, weight 150 pounds, with no criminal record known to the Cambridge Police.

A recontact was had with the Treasurer of the Bank, and it was ascertained that in the pasttwo years the bank account has been very normal. He transferred a large part of his account to an unknown commercial bank in late 1942 and now maintains a relatively inactive and small savings account. His conduct in the recent months has not been the occasion of any suspicion by the bank officials (x)

The Merchants' Credit Bureau of Boston reports unverified employment for JOHN STADIER at the Westinghouse Electric Company, South Boston, Massachusetts. His high credit allowance is \$50.00, and there are no records of any suits or judgments against him plus

It is also the recollection of Agent BARRON that LYND became associated with one of the Government Emergency Bureaus established in 1940 or 1941. It was reported to Agent BARRON by members of the faculty that LYND was making periodic visits to Washington at that time in an advisory capacity to one of the Emergency Units of the Government.

In the report of Special Agent MAURITZ FORARION dated Febru-ary 14, 1946, at Newark, New Jersey, it was set out that Beach MITAR, New Jersey, telephone number 4-8851 is listed to AUCUST N. ROBITZEK, 78th and Boulevard, Harvey Cedars, New Jersey, a small town on an island six miles from the New Jersey mainland, approximately ten miles north of Beach Haven, New Jersey. Personal observation disclosed the address of ROBITZEK is a general grocery store advertised as "SAM LEARS". It contains a Western Union Telegraph Office, the United States Post Office for Harvey Cedars and two public telephone numbers, Beach Haven 4-8861 and 4-8851. SAMUEL IEARS is the United States Postmaster and advised he sold the grocery store to ROBITZEK on August 8, 1944. The purchase was financed by Mrs. CARL BINGAMAN, Medford, New Jersey, a half-sister of ROBITZEK. Mrs. BINGAMAN is the wife of CARL BINGAMAN, who operates the BINGAMAN and GICK Bus Line between Medford and Camden, New Jersey. She has been a resident of Harvey Cedars for over twenty years and has a good reputation there. ROBITZEK came to Harvey Cedars in August, 1944 from Duquesne, Pennsylvania or vicinity. His mother and father, first names unknown, are believed to have operated a bakery shop in Duquesne, Pennsylvania. ROBITZEK was employed in a steel mill in Duquesne where he lost his right leg below the knee, and a few months ago received a back pay check from the steel mill, believed to be the United States Steel Mill in Duquesne, Pennsylvania. He married a Mrs. LILLIAN MATTERN from Duquesne or a township on the outskirts of Duquesne. Mrs. ROBITZEK has a son from her first marriage who is in the Seabees. His name is JACK MATTERN. ROBITZEK is a newcomer to Harvey Cedars and the above information was obtained from SAMUEL LEARS, who said he would vouch for his reliability. He is intelligent but uneducated, and has never made any derogatory statements in the presence of LEARS who sees him every day. ROBITZEK is also known to the Acting Chief of Police, HARRY HAINES, also Commander of the VFW Post of Harvey Cedars who states he is a grouch and on one occasion expressed a resentful remark about a young vetoran who is a competitor of ROBITZEK'S and who started in business as a result of funds received under the G.I. Bill of Rights. On another occasion, ROBITZEK remarked that unions were going too far in their demands and their net gain would be nothing. ROBITZEK is described as follows: age 45 to 50; height 6'; weight 170 pounds, hair gray; peculiarities right leg amputated below knee, wears a hanger limb; relatives - wife - LILLIA; address 78th and Boulevard, Harvey Cedars, New Jersey; nationality believed to be of Slavic ancestry. 100- 20068-26 A review of the Washington Field Office indices revealed in the case entitled, "RICHARD BRANSTEN, Et Al", in the report of Special Agent W. A. HIICENDORF dated August 10, 1942 at New Haven, Connecticut, there is set out that RICHARD BRANSTEN was born February 24, 1906, at San Francisco, California. He received an A.B. Degree in English Literature at Harvard College and studied

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English Literature for three months at Leland Stanford University. He is a writer and executive, being a "Vice President" for the "In Fact, Inc.", Chatham-Phoenix Building, Long Island City, New York. BRANSTEN lists his occupation as an employed writer and historian author. He lists his most recent book as being "The Fat Years and The Lean". He was married August 12, 1937, at New Milford, Connecticut, to his wife, RUTH, now twenty-nine. years of age, and has one child, THOMAS BRANSTEN. He lists the worth of his home as \$5,000 and his stocks and bonds between thirty-five and forty thousand. The file also indicated that he has an adopted child, age five, of his wife's sister and brother-in-law, both of whom are deceased, as well as an additional child of his own approximately three years of age. The report further stated that during the latter part of October, 1941, the BRANSTENS had moved from Westport, Connecticut, to 5019 Reno Road, N. W., Washington, D. C., and through a confidential informant it was learned that the BRANSTENS had stored some sixteen cartons of correspondence and books. It was confidentially ascertained that the correspondence contained admissions by the BRANSTENS \forall that they have been members of the Communist Party. Included among these effects were numerous issues of the magazine "THE COMMUNIST", numerous bound volumes of various issues of "NEW MASSES", various publications by EARL BROWDER, including "UNITY FOR PEACE and DEMOCRACY"; "RELIGION AND COMMUNISM"; "THE PEOPLE AGAINST THE WARMAKERS"; and "THE DEMCCRATIC FRONT". There were also various labor publications and such books as "Seven Red Sundays" by RAYMOND SENDER; a copy of the New Soviet Constitution, published by the International Publishing Company in 1936; a pamphlet captioned "Songs of the People", which includes words and music to the "Internationale", "Comintern", and the "Frisco Strike Saga". This correspondence indicates furthermore that BRANSTEN as a reporter covered the Longshoremen's strikes on the West Coast along the Gulf of Mexico and the various automotive workers strikes in the Detroit area. It indicates further, as a reporter, he covered the Spanish Civil War

In the report of Special Agent E. W. BURKE dated June 22, 1942, at Washington, D. C., it was set out that RICHARD BRANSTEN, alias BRUCK MINTON,

and has been a Washington correspondent and editor for the "New Masses" and



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"Daily Worker". A letter dated January 14, 1942, from the New York Office to the Bureau entitled, "RUTH BRANSTEN, alias RUTH McKENNY; INTERNAL SECURITY - HATCH ACT", advised that

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
In the report of Special Agent HUCH D, McCULLOUGH dated June 14, 1945, at Washington, D. C., it was reported that a letter from the Los Angeles Field Division dated April 19, 1945, indicated that RICHARD BRANSTEN was friendly with a "CREG" who, according to the Los Angeles letter, was believed to be CREGORY SILVERMASTER, subject in the instant case.

In the report of Special Agent WALTER A. HILGENDORF dated February 4, 1943, at New Haven, Connecticut, correspondence by RUTH BRANSTEN to her husband related as follows: "All through the part of your letter when you were describing yourself, Darling, you are a splendid Communist, both thoughtful and devoted, and you are exceedingly useful. That is what I worry about with myself. After all, the kind of books I suppose I will always write are useful enough but indirect. I am just learning to be a good Communist. You know so much more than I do but you can teach me and maybe I can help you too. We ought to be a good pair". A review of further correspondence as set out in the referenced report reveals RICHARD BRANSTEN and his wife both to be members of the Communist Party.

In an article appearing in the September 2, 1942, issue of the Washington Star, it was indicated that Mrs. BRANSTEN, who writes under the name of RUTH McKENNEY, is the author of the book "MY SISTER EILEEN", from which the play by the same title was taken.

The following telegram dated September 1, 1945, was charged to the Washington telephone of NATHAN CREGORY SILVERMASTER, and was directed to Miss JUNE HINTON, Post Office Box 1663, Santa Fe, New Mexico, and read as follows:

"Please wire quickly to our Washington address JEAN'S telephone number. Signed - BILL CREENE ".

WHEELER is believed to be identical with GEORGE SHAW WHEELER, about whom an investigation was conducted for the Office of Emergency Management, and a review of the Washington Field Office indices revealed that in the case entitled, "GEORGE SHAW WHEELER; EMPLOYEE INVESTIGATION - OFFICE OF EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT", it was reported that GEORGE SHAW WHEELER was born May 22, 1908 at Tacoma, Washington. He graduated from White Bluffs, Washington, High School about 1924. He received a Bachelor of Arts Degree from Reed College, Portland, Oregon, in 1929 and took post-graduate work at that college from September 1929 to June 1930. He also took post-graduate work at the University of Chicago, Chicago, Illinois, from September 1930 to August 1934. WHEELER was employed by the National Labor Relations Board from August 16, 1934 to October 19, 1938; by the Wage and Hour Division of the Department of Labor from October 20, 1938 to May 1, 1942; by the Wer Production Board from May 1, 1942 to September 17, 1943. Since September 18, 1943, WHEELER was employed as Chief of Section, Blockade and Re-occupation Branch, Re-occupation Division, France Section, Foreign Economic Administration at a salary of \$6,500 a year

In the report of Special Agent E. S. BLAKESLEY dated February 28, 1942, at Washington, D. C., it was set out that the Special Committee on Un-American Activities, House of Representatives, MARTIN DIES, Chairman, furnished the information that in addition to the Washington Committee for Democratic Action, CECRCE S. WHEELER is a member of the American Peace Mobilization, the Washington Book Shop and was a member at large of the Executive Council Washington Committee to Aid China.

He admitted being a member of the Washington Committee for Democratic Action and attending meetings of the American Peace


