I thought the President and you would be interested in the following information concerning the activities of Charles France.

Charles Kramer, who at the present time is on loan from the Office of Price Administration to Senator Claude Pepper's Wartime Health and Education Subcommittee, has been identified by an unusually reliable source as a known / Soviet espionage agent operating within the United States Government offices in Mashington. You may further recall that on March 20, 1946, Senator Claude Pepper delivered before the United States Senate a formal speech contained in the Congressional Record dated March 20, 1946, in which he strongly criticise the United States Foreign Palicy for the Seviet Union and advocated the destruction of all United States facilities capable of producing the destructive forms of atomic energy. In addition, in this speech Senator Pepper advocated that the United Nations Security Council be afforded the right of examination of all United States facilities of research in the storic energy field. in

. Alger Hiss has been connected with the State Department since 1936. On November 16, 1944, he was made Deputy Director in the Office of Special Political Affairs, and in 1945 he was Secretary General to the United Nations Conference on International Organization held at San Francisco, California. He is at present serving with the State Department on United Nations matters.

Prior to his employment with the State Department he was from 1929 to 19 secretary to Justice Holmes of the U. S. Supreme Court. Later he was connected with law firms in New York City and on May 12, 1933, he was made Principal Attorney in the Agricultural Adjustment Administration, U. S. Department of Agriculture. In 1935 he was employed as a Special Attorney by the Department of Justice.

He is a subject in the Gregory case and was reported to have been one of the principal contacts of a group of subagents in an unknown espionage underground parallel operating in the government in Washington, D. C.

According to Dies Committee records, Alger Hiss was reported to be a member of the Washington Committee for Democratic Action, an alleged Communist front organization. His wife, Priscilla, is also reported to be a member of the same organization.

According to information made available by a former member of the Communist Party, Alger Hiss was associated with the Communist Party as late as 1937 as a member of the underground and was quite active with a group in Baltimore, Maryland. He is reported by another source to have been active in the underground Communist Party movement in Washington, D. C., as late as 1945.

The former Party member stated that there was no reason to believe that Alger Hiss had ever broken with the Communist Party. On one occasion the informant made a special trip to the home of Alger Hiss in Washington with the intention of talking to him in an effort to persuade Hiss to leave the Communist Party. After exhaustive efforts and an all night session with Hiss, the informant said that Hiss, with tears in his eyes, refused to break with the Communist Party and gave as his reasons his loyalty to his friends and his principles. The informant said that in his opinion one of the strongest reasons for Hiss maintaining contact with the Communist Party was the fanatic loyalty to the Party on the part of his wife.

Alger Hiss recently attended the United Nations Conference in London and shortly after his return to the United States in February, 1946, at his own request, Hiss was interviewed by a Bureau representative at which time he failed to furnish any additional information concerning himself and his past activities.

Marks is presently the Legal Assistant to the Orfice of the Assistant Secretary of State, Room 281, State Department, telephone Extension 2161.

Investigation reveals from 1941 to 1945 he was employed as Assistant General Council, War Broduction Board. It is interesting to note that from 1942 to 1943 James Newman was also employed by the war Production Board as a liaison man with the War Department. It therefore appears that Newman and Marks have had an opportunity to become acquainted with one another through their association at the War Production Board. Investigation further reveals that Marks has been in telephonic communication on two occasions with Dr. Julius Robert Oppenheimer, namely on December 26, 1945, and May 16, 1946. Oppenheimer is presently employed on the National Committee of Atomic Information. Investigation reveals that Oppenheimer has been in contact with high Communist Party functionaries on the mest Coast while he was connected with the Hadiation Laboratory at the University of California, Berkeley, California.

JAKES R. NEAMAN

Newman is presently Program Analyst, Office of war Mobilization, at a salary of 39,000 per annum.

Investigation reflects that Newman was formerly engaged in the practice of law in New York City and in 1940 and 1941 he employed Michael Endelman, a prominent Communist Party member in New York City.

A physical surveillance of Newman reflects that he has been seen in wasnington in contact with Dr. Edward U. Condon of the Bureau of Standards, who is a known contact of Nathan Gregory Silvermaster. He has also been seen in the

Another of his contacts, according to a physical surveillance, is Hareld W. Stein of the Office of War Mobilization and Peconversion, who is a known contact of Alger Hiss as reflected by investigation in the Gregory Case. Continued surveillances are being conducted on both Marks and Newman by the Washington Field Office.

No investigation is being conducted of Assistant Secretary of Mar Howard C. Petersen; however, all information concerning him has been furnished to Lieutenant General Howt S. Vandenberg of G-2 and to Colonel L. R. Forney for their personal and confidential information. Both of these have assured the Eureau that should any information come to their attention concerning Petersen, it would immediately be brought to the Eureau's attention.

ACTION:

The above data are for your information. Investigation of the above allegation is for the present being centered around the activities of Newman and is being made as a art of the Gregory Case since it was alleged that the information Newman desires to pass on to his Russian principals is made available to either Nathan Gregory Silvermaster or Dr. Edward Condon, who are known contacts in the Gregory investigation. The field has been instructed to press this angle of the Gregory Case and should further substantiating information be developed, the investigation will be expanded.

Dear Georges

I thought the President and you would be interested in the following information with respect to certain high Government efficials operating an alleged espionage network in Washington, D. C., on behalf of the Soviet Government.

Information has been furnished to this Bureau through a source believed to be reliable that there is an enormous Soviet espionage ring in Washington operating with the view of obtaining all information possible with reference to atomic energy, its specific use as an instrument of war, and the commercial aspects of the energy in peacetime, and that a number of high Government officials whose identities will be set out hereinafter are involved. It has been alleged that the following departments and agencies of the United States Government handle the problem and current development of atomic energy and among these departments and agencies, the United States secret of atomic energy is held in trust. The names of the individuals in each department or agency who control such matters have been furnished as follows:

State Department - Under Secretary of State Dean Acheson. Assistant to the Under Secretary of State Herbert Marks Former Assistant Secretary of War John J. McCloy

War Department - Assistant Secretary of War Howard C. Peterson .

Commerce Department - Secretary of Commerce Henry A. Wallace

Bureau of the Budget - Paul H. Appleby George SchwartswaldALL INFORMATION CON

Bureau of Standards . Dr. Edward V. Condon

United Mations Organisation - Alger Miss Abe Feller

The individual who furnished this information has reported that all of the above individuals mentioned are noted for their pro-Soviet leanings, mentioning specifically Alger Hiss of the United Mations Organization, Paul Appleby and George Shanizated of the Bureau of the Budget, Dr. Condon of the Bureau of Standards, and John J. NoCloy of the State Department.

The informant has stated that the McMahon Committee headed by Senator Brien McMahon of Connecticut is charged with formulating the policy concerning atomic energy and serving as advisors to the Committee are Dr. Condon of the Bureau of Standards, who, the informant states, is nothing more or less than an espionage agent in disguise, and James R. Newman, an employee of the Office of War Mobilisation and Reconversion who is known to the informant to be a personal friend of Mathan Gregory Silvermaster, who, you may recall, is one of the principal individuals known to have operated as an agent of the Soviet Government in U. S. Government offices for a considerable time until December, It is known that Silvermaster obtained information through his associates in a Russian espionage network and such information was turned ever to the Soviet Government. The informant has indicated that Newman is also a friend of the news commentator Raymond Gram Swing and columnist Marquis Childs. Herman is also reported to be the so-called ringleader of this particular Soviet espionage network and through his employment with the Office of War Mobilisation and Reconversion, he had access to material flowing from the White House. The informant stated that through Dr. Edward Condon at the Bureau of Standards, Norman has access to technical data concerning atomic energy. The informant further stated that Secretary of Commerce Henry A. Wallace knows of the background of Dr. Condon but condones his further employment in this highly strategie and important position.

James Newman allegedly obtains from the War Department through the ecoperation of Assistant Secretary of War Peterson highly technical information on the atomic bomb itself and all matters relating generally to atomic energy. According to the informant, Newman has a direct line to Assistant Secretary Peterson's effice.

With reference to the State Department, it was reported that Neuman is in personal and daily contact with Dean Acheson, Herbert Marks, and on some eccasions with John J. McCley, and therefore, any knowledge of atomic energy and international relations with reference to it are immediately known to him.

In so far as the international picture is concerned with respect to atomic energy, it was reported that Neuman is in a position to obtain this information from Alger Hiss of the State Department who helds the position of advisor to Mr. Stettinius, the American Representative to the United Sations is nization.

Concerning the Bureau of the Budget, the informant reported that Paul Appleby and sometimes George Schwartswalder pass upon the recommendations of the Office of War Mebilisation and Reconversion which are made to the President concerning the necessary appropriations to earry on experimental operations concerning atomic energy and particularly its relative position to that of a large Army and Mavy. It was pointed out that in almost all cases the final decision at the Bureau of the Budget on such matters is passed upon by Paul Appleby.

The informant has drawn the conclusion that the entire setup of the McMahon Committee to investigate and recommend legislation on atomic energy and its use is a scheme to make available information concerning the atomic bomb and atomic energy, and that it all amounts to Soviet espionage in this country directed toward the obtaining for the Soviet Union the knowledge possessed by the United States concerning atomic energy and specifically the atomic bomb.

The informant stated that technical and exacting information which Newman desires to pass on to Bussian principals is made available to Mr. Silvermaster, or, in those matters of highly technical nature, Dr. Edward Condon of the Bureau of Standards contacts Silvermaster directly. The news commentator Raymond Gram Swing, according to the informant, is utilized for subtle propaganda with reference to agitation for release of atomic energy to the Allied Powers and that the same use is made of Marquis Childs, a feature Mashington newspaper writer.

The informant is of the spinion that the entire setup has a use other than that of espionage for the Soviet Government, namely, the promotion of pro-Soviet propagands, which, when reduced to its simplest form, advances the argument "shy keep a large Army and Navy when the use of atomic energy eliminates the necessity for such a large force." In Government circles and smong those handling the question of atomic energy, the unanimous argument of all and especially of those mentioned above is in agreement that a large Army and Navy are not necessary to the United States as the United States has exclusive knowledge and the "know how" of the atomic bomb.

It is known to this Bureau that Dr. Condon is a personal friend of Matham Gregory Silvermaster, and although Silvermaster is presently under investigation by this Bureau, no information has been developed to substantiate



the fact that Condon has turned over any information of a confidential nature to Silvermaster. It has also been made known to this Bureau through various sources in the past that the political views of Under Secretary of State Dean Acheson, Assistant Secretary of War Howard C. Peterson, and Secretary of Commerce Henry Wallace have been pro-Russian in nature, and therefore, it is not beyond the realm of conjecture that they would fit into a scheme as set out above. Alger Hiss of the United Mations Organisation has been reported to this Bureau as a former member of the Communist underground organisation operating within the Government in Washington, D. C.

Since James R. Newman has been described as the ringleader of this alleged espionage network and, further, since Herbert S. Marks is in close touch with information dealing with relations between the United States and Russia at the State Department in the office of Dean Acheson, investigations are being conducted by this Bureau concerning the activities of these two individuals. You may be assured that you will be kept advised of all developments in connection with the above allegations.

Set out below is a summary of available information regarding James R. Newman and Byron S. Miller, both presently employed by the Office of War Mobilization and Reconversion.


JAMES R. NEWAN

James R. Newman is presently employed as Program Analyst, Office of War Mobilization and Reconversion, Grade P-8, \$9,000 per annum. He was born in New York on August 3, 1907, and his father was born in Prague, Czechoslovakia in 1880, becoming a naturalized American citizen in 1906. Newman, from December, 1941 to June, 1942, was employed by the War Department as Assistant Chief of Tax Amortization; from June, 1942 to April, 1943 he was employed by the War Production Board as Head Program Planner; from April, 1943 to August, 1944 he was employed as Head Intelligence Officer in Washington and London, England with the Foreign Economic Administration; and from May 17, 1945 to date ne has been employed by the Office of War Mobilization and Reconversion. During 1937 and 1938 one James Newman, a graduate of Wesleyan University, possibly identical with James R. Newman, is known to have been active in the American Student Union, an organization which was subject to considerable Communist infiltration. In June. 1937, this James Newman was Cooperative Secretary of this organization. On September 19, 1941, Carl Sacner, who was born October 24, 1864, in Czechoslovakia filed application for visas for himself and his immediate family. One of the sponsors listed by him was James R. Newman, age 34, Attorney-at-Law, 386 Fourth Avenue, New York City, a cousin of the

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BYRON S. MILLER

Byron S. Miller was born February 24, 1915, at Gary, Indiana. He attended the University of Chicago, receiving an A.B. Degree on June 11, 1935, and a J.D. Degree on June 11, 1937. From 1937 until November, 1941, he was employed as an attorney by Charles Aaron, an attorney in Chicago. In 1941 he applied for a position with the Office of Price Administration. He is presently employed by the Office of War Mobilization and Reconversion. During the hearings of the Senate Committee on Atomic Energy on April 8 and 9, 1946, Byron S. Miller was present for the purpose of presenting legislation suggested by the Federation of Atomic Scientists in Washington, D. C. It was ascertained at this time that Miller was working under James R. Newman concerning whom information is set out above. Newman was also present at these hearings and appeared to be on the staff of the Committee, pessibly in association with Br. Edward U. Condon.

The original draft of legislation submitted by Miller on behalf of the Federation of Atomic Scientists contained numerous loopholes inasmuch as it restricted any violations of law to the wilful communication or transmission of secret data and based the penalty upon the degree of intent, also making the crime dependent upon the successful commission of the offense to the point where an actual advantage is secured by a foreign nation.

At one time Miller was reported to have been a member of the National Lawyers Guild, an organization subject to considerable Communist infiltration and influence.

In addition, on February 5, 1946, William Walter Remington, a subject of an active investigation involving Soviet espionage agents in agencies of the United States Government, is known to have indicated that he was acquainted with Byron Miller. Remington has been reliably identified as a Soviet agent and is presently the subject of investigation in the same case involving Nathan Gregory Silvermaster.

Dear George:

As of possible interest to the President and you, information has been received from a highly confidential source of unquestioned reliability that on the morning of May 27, 1946, Helen Silvermaster, the wife of Mathan Gregory Silvermaster, an employee of the Ear Assets Corporation, who has been reliably identified as an important Soviet espionage agent, was in contact with an unknown woman believed to be Willie Macavoy. Willie Macavoy is the wife of Clifford Macavoy, an employee of the CIO.

During the conversation between Helen Silvermaster and this woman, they discussed the recent rail strike and the woman believed to be Willie Macavoy stated that the President had gone mad. She stated further that Lee Pressman, attorney for the CIO, thought that the President "just gets awfully mad and does these things; that people can get to him and use him for their purposes." The unknown woman believed to be Willie Macavoy also quoted Pressman as stating that President Truman wrote the death of the Democratic Party on May 25.



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

It would appear, therefore, that World Tourists' activity in sending used clothing to the USSR is responsible for the attached article.

Parcels for Russia Cost **You Plenty**

By PATRICIA O'HAIRE and CHARLES McHARRY.

Sending clothing and food items to needy relatives in the Soviet Union is an expensive -almost prohibitive process these days, this city's one million persons of Russian descent are complaining.

Moscow insists that recipient of moscow insists that recipient of a parcel containing food or clothing pay import duties, which, in some cases, amount to 100% of the value of the items received.

The parcel may be paid for in advance, through World Tourists Inc., an agency with offices at 1123 Broadway which has Russia's per-

Broadway which has Russia's per-mission to collect all duties on shipments headed for the Soviets.

Suppose you wish to send a par-cel to Pinsk. You have a cousin there who can use an old suit which is hanging in your closet. You have the suit cleaned and fumigated, get receipts for same and take suit and receipts to World Tourists, Inc. There your suit is 'processed," and there you start paying.

Import Duty Charged.

It is first appraised. Let's say its worth is set at \$20. You first pay the Russian import duty. That amounts, in the case of your \$20 suit, to 80% of the value, or \$16.
Then you pay an item which is listed as "USSR . . . 10%." That is two bucks more. Then there's a "Soviet 1% fee." Somehow that

comes to only 38 cents.

Next comes the "Inspection Charge ... \$1.65." That goes, the agency explains, to the Russian import inspectors. Afterward comes a "license fee," which, for your suit, amounts to \$2. It also goes to Moscow. That ends your

duty paying. The suit has cost you, up to this point, \$22.03.

But you're not finished. There is a \$7 service fee which goes to the agency for packing and "processing" cessing."

Parcel Post, Yet.

You are now down to the parcel post rate. It comes to \$1.23 for your suit and brings the total outlay to \$30.26, That ends it. If you pack and mail the suit yourself, the cousin in Pinsk will pay about \$20 on its receipt.

Leon Fedotov, an attache at the USSR consulate here, admitted yestenday that many Russians were in dir need of food and clothes.

"The duty is high," he said "but after all, the workers receive many rubles. They can afford to pay to receive such things as Americans.

Reference is made to Bureau letter dated April 9, 1946, requesting information concerning the above captioned

All available files of the United States Embassy in Havana, Cuba were checked and various Attaches were personally interviewed to ascertain if the files reflected or if Embassy personnel had any recollection of EDWIN BERNARD ROSSKAM having visited the United States Embassy at Havana. The files were negative and no one recalled ever having heard of ROSSKAM.

The records of the WAR SHIPPING ADMINISTRATION, U.S. Embassy at Havana were searched for information concerning the SS "CAPE BARROW". Mr. COLINS HAY of the WAR SHIPPING ADMINISTRA-TION Office, Havana, stated that this ship is operated by the American Export Lines as general agents but that at the time of the last trip to Havana the SS "CAPE BARROW" was operated by the Agwi Lines. Their record did not reflect that the SS "CAPE" BARROW" called at the Port of Havana but that this ship arrived at Santa Cruz, Cuba en route from Puerto Rico to the United States: that it arrived on March 3, 1946 and departed Santa Cruz for Philadelphia, Pennsylvania on March 12, 1946.

Mr. DOUGLAS SINGER, assistant manager of the Ward Line docks, an agent of Agwi Lines at Havana, Cuba, was interviewed for additional information concerning the movement of the SS "CAPE BARROW" and to ascertain if his records revealed that this ship carried passengers and if so their identities.


Mr. SINGER, after reviewing his records, stated that the SS "CAPE BARROW" docked at Santa Cruz del Sur, Guayabal, Cuba on March 3, 1946, arriving from Puerto Rico, and



that this ship loaded raw sugar and sailed March 12, 1946 at 2:30 p.m. and arrived at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania March 17,

Mr. SINGER had no information concerning passengers aboard this ship other than a copy of a telegram from the ship's agents, namely, the Puerto Rican Lines, San Juan, Puerto Rico received prior to the arrival of the SS "CAPE BARROW" at Cuba stating that the ship carried five passengers who were American citizens in transit to the mainland from Puerto Rico.

Mr. SINGER stated that the names and identities of these passengers can be obtained at the New York-Puerto Rico Steamship Company, pier 13, East River, New York City, or from the offices of the Puerto Rican Lines, San Juan, Puerto Rico.



Therefore, it does not appear on the official records that EDWIN BERNARD ROSSKAM visited in Cuba during the trip back to the United States probably began at Puerto Rico.

Inasmuch as there appears to be no further investigation conducted by this office, this matter is being considered Referred Upon Completion.



Dr. CARD, the subject of Chicago file No. 100-4503, is Executive Director of the Council of American-Soviet Friendship, and as such has been one of the foremost Russian apologists and advocates in the Chicago area. He has in the past been a lecturer on the Rotary International program for international understanding. It has been reported that he has spurned offers to be a guest lecturer at the Communist dominated Abraham Lincoln School or to speak at functions of Russian War Relief to avoid confusion as to with which organization he was identified. He is reported to have been in sharp conflict with the CCASF over a statement of policy, taking the position that the chairman's ideas were much too conservative.



CARD is a graduate of the University of Nebraska, where he received his AB degree in 1926, and was given his PhD degree at the University of Wisconsin in 1935. He presently resides at 6128 Ingleside Avenue in Chicago.

WILLIAM W. PENINGTON

The files of Confidential Informant reflect that HARRY SAMUEL MAGDOFF was a member of the National Committee for Students Congress Against War in July of 1932. This information appeared in an article in the Student Review for July of 1933 entitled "Imperialism."

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The files of the Industrial Detail, Chicago Police Department, reflect that the Daily Worker of March 21, 1933, on page three, column 7, on a New York date line, has the following story. "'Karl Marx - Fifty Years After,' by Harry Magdoff features the March issue of Student Review of which he is editor." The story further states that the Student Review is the official publication of the National Student League with offices at 13 West Seventeenth Street, New York City.

On May 1, 1946, the writer checked the marriage licenses at the Bureau of Vital Statistics in Chicago and ascertained that HARRY MAGDOFF and BEATRICE GREZIER were married at Paris, Illinois, on December 30, 1932, by GEORGE B. BRESTON, a judge of the circuit court. This license, No. 1359-811, Cook County, Illinois, reflects that HARRY MAGDOFF was born August 21, 1909, and that as of December 30, 1932, resided at 6030 Ingleside Avenue, Chicago. It further reflects that his wife was then residing at 6020 Drexel Boulevard in Chicago and was born February 18, 1911.

Efforts to locate further information relative to subject's activities in Chicago have met with negative results.

PHILIP O. KEENEY

By letter dated May 3, 1946, the Washington Field Division requested the Chicago Office to ascertain the identity of the residents of 348 South Madison Street, Woodstock, Illinois, and to furnish background information on the individuals residing there.

On May 22, 1946, Mr. LEWIS THAYER, Chief of Police at Woodstock, Illinois, advised that the building at 348 South Madison Street has two floors, the first floor of which was occupied by Mr. A. L. HUFFMAN, and that the second floor was occupied by Mrs. RAYNOWD DANIELS, a woman of some 83 years of age and the mother of MARY JANE DANIELS, KEENEY, the wife of PHILIP C. KEENEY.

Confidential Informant T-1 has advised that MARY JANE KEENEY is a brilliant but neurotic individual, and that she had met PHILIP O. KEENEY at Ann Arbor, Michigan, while KEENEY was a librarian at the State University at Ann Arbor. It was while they were both located in Ann Arbor that they were married.

The informant stated that some time in the early 1930's the KEENEYS moved to Missoula, Montana, where Mr. KEENEY was finally elevated to the position of professor in the School of Library Science, and that he was subsequently discharged from the university because of his reported Communist activities in the State of Montana. The informant made available to the writer a pamphlet entitled "The Keeney Case" published by the American Federation of Teachers, 506 South Wabash Avenue, Chicago, Illinois, she thought in 1937. However, it appears that the pamphlet was published in March, 1939. This pamphlet is being enclosed for the Washington Field Division for whatever information of value it may contain relative to the above-mentioned individual.

The informant advised that Mrs. KEENEY has recently returned from Paris, France, where she was a member of the Board of Foreign Relations, and that she was at this time planning to join her husband in Japan, where he is believed to be making a study of Japanese libraries.

The informant further advised that Mrs. KEENEY was last in Woodstock, Illinois, in March of 1945 to visit her mother who, at that time, was in very poor health. She at that time advised the informant that she could be reached at the following addresses in Washington, D. C.: Mrs. PHILIP OLIN KEENEY, 215 B Street, Northeast, Washington, D. C., telephone Franklin 1955, or at Executive 7030, Executive 2554 or Executive 2222.

WALTER R SASSAMAN

By letter dated May 10, 1946, the Washington Field Office requested the Chicago Office to obtain information relative to one SASSAMAN, who resides at 11027 South Green Street, Chicago. It has been ascertained that



the building at 11027 South Green Street, Chicago, is occupied by WALTER R. SASSAMAN and his family. The files of the Chicago Field Division reflect that Mr. SASSAMAN is the educational director of Region No. 4 of the United Auto Workers, CIO.

The indices further reflect that SASSANAN is an associate of various instructors of the Communist dominated Abraham Lincoln School at 30 West Washington, Chicago, and is reflected to have been a partner of ARTHUE STEIN, former art director of the Abraham Lincoln School, in an art program for the working people.

On May 18, 1944 Confidential Informant learned from MICILIFACOLBERT of the Abraham Lincoln School, Extension Division, that WALTER SASSAMAN was interested in getting an extension course for one of his UAW locals. She also advised the informant that SASSAMAN was endeavoring to do all he could for the advancement of the Abraham Lincoln School.

On November 30, 1944, Confidential Informant learned from LILILIAN/EIKIN of the Joint Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee that she was to have a conference with WAITER SASSAIAN on that day. The exact nature of this conference was not learned by the informant.

On May 21, 1946, Confidential Informant T-2 advised that the SASSALAIS have a daughter approximately four years of age, and that there is frequently delivered to their home at 11027 South Green Street by the postman a small package which could contain slides for a magic lantern. It was this informant's opinion that these packages undoubtedly contained files for some type of camera equipment. However, he had no specific information on which to base his opinion.

BORIS O WITTE; EVA KNOX XITTE

Reference report of the writer sets forth leads relative to contacts of the WITTES while they were in Chicago in April of 1946. Relative to these individuals, it has been ascertained that IEON CARNOVSKY of 1424 East 58th Street, Chicago, is an associate professor and assistant dean of the Graduate Library School of the University of Chicago, and that as such he teaches methods of library operation and edits the Library Quarterly.

The files of Local Board No. 88 in Chicago reflect that he was born in St. Louis, Missouri, on November 28, 1903, and that he is married to MARION S. CARNOVSKY.



Until their marriage in 1939, she was a director of the training class at the Enoch Pratt Free Library in Baltimore, Maryland. The following is the description of CARNOVSKY obtained from his Selective Service file:
