





An dashing this off to entch the mail leaving this afternoon; as there is a lot to say, shall be as brief and to the point as possible.

Your letter arrived a few days age and it was indeed welcome. Enfortimately the advice on the need for the preservation of harmony reached as much too late, as my last letter to you indicated. On the other hand, the news that the Division was actively participating in the drafting of licenses, etc. was extremely encouraging and the concrete manifestations of such activity even more so.

The new licenses represent a great step forward, and every one connected with working them out deserves congratulating. Please tell Bernard Fernstein this. K. Dr then was very happy about them and said they represented one of Fer's real contributions. I know the Chinese Government deeply appreciates them and that they helped to stave off and clamp down hostile criticism of the Board at a time when E was gathering momentum.

At the meeting of the People's Political Council this week the Board was criticised for (a) giving any support at all to Shanghai, and (b) for having Vite operating headquarters in Hong Kong instead of Chungking. While these view reflect those of the Generalissize, they also constitute organised attempts to divert attention from other things which are not above criticism and to concen-Otrate criticism on the Ministry of Finance. These criticisms also put Fex in a peculiar position, for he, of all members of the Board, with the exception of E.P., is the one who is strictest in allocating exchange to Shanghai and whe is most sympathetic to the idea that Chungking should be the operating headquarters. was far as Shanghai is concerned, whatever one does one is between the devil and Athe deep blue see. Chungking is now dead set against any support for Shanghai: Shanghai, on the other hand, is very resentful and feels that it hasn't been given enough. Fox feels that in the circumstances of the last three months the policy the Board has pursued is the only realistic ene. Any official indication ifrom Washington that it favors greater strictness would be a great help. That is why your last message is so encouraging. Our ambassador you know is strongly in favor of continued support.

For the information of the Division I kept detailed notes on my conversations with Cockran, the gist of which I am here appending.

wov. 8: cochran told me the origin of his visit, I think. He and Sir Otto are old friends, and when Otto arrived in Washington, he indicated to C. he was very anxious for an American to accompany him. C. tried to get a number of peeple, but no one was available. At the last minute Otto asked C. if he could come; C. asked Fell and the Secretary, and at a moment's notice the Secretary consented. Otto, according to C., was very anxious to cooperate

the Americans. Ten years ago, according to Otto, it might have been different. Then there would have been competition, and the selfish British banking colonial and imperialist elements would have finally decided British policy. Now the British, said C, reperting to O., have no ame to grind. America has been so decent to England with respect to her dollar position that the Fritish wouldn't even think of trying to cut us out. The U.S. and the V.L. now have the same interests at heart and should try to work together. C. encouraged me to see as much of him Q. as I could. Sir O., he said, is brilliant, selfless, hard-working, celf-contained, on top of his job, and in addition is a man who pushes and develops younger men. C. alluded briefly to his toa with the Generalissimo. C. had done most of the talking. The O'issimo had pressed him on Shanghai, and he had replied: "As far as I am concerned, you can cut Shanghai off tomorrow, but you must have what you are doing."

For, 9: The Gissimo invited Commatter and myself to dinner. Before dirmer the ? began his conversations with C. Se alluded to C's conversations with Eur; earlier in the day. (You must of course have already heard from C. that Emg made four specific proposals to him). After an interlude for dinner the C. indicated that as far as the military situation was concerned they were confident that with the military assistance they were getting they would not be defeated. But the economic situation was indeed gloomy. hars if things continued as at present there might be even an economie collapse within three months (?). That made matters worse was that whereas in the military field one could always withdraw from a piece of territory lost to the energ further into the interior without serious dislocation, in the economic sphere if a collapse should come it would hit the whole economy. It might even make the continuation of resistance impossible. Here was the United States spending a large sum of money on military assistance to China; this military assistance was essentially simple to apply. But in the economic sphere the picture was quite different. If aconomic collapse were to ensue, America's military assistance to China might be dissipated. The economic situation was grave and desanded some definite remedial policy. This, said the G., was his message. His note throughout was emphasis on the gravity of the economic problems confronting China. O's reply was that military science was an exact science, but that in economics we are still moving in unchartered spheres. He also indicated that as far as prices in Shanghai and the black markets in Hong Kong and Shanghai are concerned, there was no need to be widuly upset. (?) Preesing and exchange control were still recent phenomena, and it will take a little time for things to settle down, (which does not exactly bear on the grave economic problems to which the G. was referring). C. assured the G. of terrican cooperation.

Count to left at 10 pore and we had an hour together. He asked we how he had made out and if he had said anything wrong. I replied he had done an excellent job in difficult circumstances. 

Again the Division should know what a high Chinese Government official told me, namely that they couldn't quite make out the purpose of C's visit. At first they thought he was part of a joint economic mission, and they later realised that was not the case. What had made thom believe he was, was his conduct in Sir)'s presence. Of course as you know he and Sir O are old friends, and what with Sir O's senority ill, he had conducted himself in a manner which induced the belief in the Chinese that he was junior.

The above is a purely factual report which I am sure will give the

Division the basic data!

Fox is telling him that he is very lucky to have the opportunity to visit the States which was probably arranged for him by Micholson who as you know unfortunately passed away a couple of weeks ago.



It is important to realise with respect to 2048 that his peculiar combination of obtuseness and unscrupulousness makes whatever he has to say hopelessly unreliable. I do hope with allmy heart and soul that other matters do not turn out as higgledy-griglesby as this one did.

You must be well aware of the fact that Fox and I get on extremely well. The strain on him has been very great, but he has indeed stood up well against all the difficulties and obstacles he has encountered. His tremendous vitality has stood him in good stead. A lesser man would not have been equal to it, but he has come out of it all with flying colors. and I are of course thick as this was and all eye to eye.

I have met every member of the Board here. Chen you know. He is very good but he is a little older and is apt to get discouraged, though You sustains him. Pei is a very smart fellow and Tai is a Central Bank man with a European veneer of culture. Hall-Patch is not a lightweight nor a makeshift. As you know, Rogers was given the job of special financial adviser to the Government of the Creum Colony of Hong Kong, and is supposed to be running the exchange control. All the Board now is in Hong Kong except for its General Secretary who is on his way here from Chungking.

I take it for granted that you are keeping at least half an eye on the Far Eastern work of the Division. I know you must all be terribly busy with the economies of the four corners of the world, not to mention inflation at home, on your shoulders. Mevertheless, it would be a terrible pity if you can't afford to devote a small fraction of your time to keeping as courant, especially now that the Board is operating and the freezing has actually gone through. The question of the Agency is of vital importance and scaething should have heppened or been done before this letter reaches you. Bernie's solution is a very bright one as a temporary palliative. Next the new plan which encourages extending the functions of the Central Bank with respect to remittences and imports is bound to run up against the appalling inefficiency of that Confucian institutes. It is all very well to propose improving and strengthening the personnel, but merely proposing is not enough. Perhaps recommendations from your side might help.

You might be interested to know Shanghai's reactions to the Board. The Shanghai Finance and Cormerce, which it is reported is helped along by Mackey of National City, Shanghai, is fiercely and furiously anti-Board. Here are a few excerpts: "There apparently is no reason why exchange should not be sold to Japanese nationals resident in Shanghai for normal and legitimate trade purposes" Referring to Fox's visit to Shanghai - "such academic views"; (Ans. 20). mess and middle"; "Mr. Taylor, who is one of the American representatives associated with Mr. Manuel Fox in the work of the Stabilization Board but is himself not a member of that Board, is in Shanghai, and according to all accounts, has done all that was humanly possible to get the financialmachinery working satisfactorily" (Aug. 27). "Free China . . . can very well be left to look after iteelf" (Aug. 29). "Mr. Taylor bustled off to Hong Kong in order to see what improvements could be effected" (Sept. 3). And Finance and Commerce of Sept. 10 quoted in yesterday's Hong Kong papers talks about the "unending trials, difficulties and tribulations" ahead of Shanghailanders under the new Brond regulations. As far as the Board and Shanghai are concerned, your story of Leon Henderson as an ernithologist is 100% relevant, and it is the Born's witch is apt to be the female. The 2 men F.F.C. sent out to Shanghai and F.F. for a week or two have no background worth mentioning, and they are consequently bewildered and somewhat sut of their depth. Therefore, any reports they brime back -- particularly shout the functioning of the Board and the regit of it Changhai -- should be heavily discounted.

As you know Fox arrived in Manila at the end of August to establish direct contact with Washington. Fortunately his boat was held up for a few days and he was able to have several useful discussions with the other end which helped clarify the situation considerably. This was really a lucky break as previously there had been little or no interchange of opinions. It was a pity White was out of Washington at the time, as his familiarity with Far Eastern monetary problems would have contributed not a little to the discussions. It was all the more unfortunate that your absence coincided with his, as no one from our Division sat in on the exchange of opinions. In any case, the whole situation is now very much improved, though there are a lot of ticklish problems sutstanding, to put it mildly.

Authorisation for my trip from Mamila to Hong Kong was cleared just in time for me to eatch the boat. It appears that I am assigned to the Treasury to assist Fox en economic problems in general and freezing in particular. My headquarters will be Chungking. I shall probably shuttle back and forth to and from Hong Kong. This suits me admirably, particularly as Fox and I get on very well. There is one thing, however, which I should appreciate being attended to — I have received no salary payment since July 23, my checks presumably accumulating in Mrs. Shamahan's desk. That is all very well, and it is probably not advisable to have them sent out to me. But it should be possible to have say \$500 or \$1,000 (U.S.) made available to me by telegraphic transfer c/o the Embassy, Chungking against my per diems and/or my future salary, or even against past checks not received by me, if necessary. The last payment I received was in Mamila for my per diems up to the end of August, and it barely enabled me to clear my hotel and tailer's bills.

And now for a few random observations. Working conditions here are very difficult; examinications with Washington are, at best, slow, and in Chungking the frequent air raids this summer have made matters much worse. The web of intrique is promeistingly tengled on all sides. In the face of very great obstacles, Fex — I have the impression — has done a splendid job. He has extreed the respect and affection of the Chinese members of the Board, and he is undoubtedly the dominant personality at the Board meetings with the power to swing sufficient support to settle many crucial issues. He is, however, extremely sensitive about Washington's response or lack of response. Some indication, however mild, of Washington's interest and better still, appreciation, would mean a hell of a let to him and would, I am sure, have an extremely beneficial effect. The enormous difficulties and often apparently insuperable obstacles do not discourage or frighten him, on the contrary; but tardiness of communication and absence of response will tend to depress him, if sustained over any length of time.







The following investigation was conducted by Special Agent LAWRENCE W. SPILLANE, covering the period from May 1, to May 31, 1946: [((U)

Confidential Informant whose identity is known to the Burean, advised that on May 4, 1946, Mrs. BKLFRAGE spoke to Mrs. ALLISON HOOPER of Lenox, Massachusetts, indicating that she desired Mrs. HOOPER'S assistance in getting them passage to England and most of all, return passage to the United States. Mrs. BELFRAGE made reference to the work Mrs. HOOPER was doing and indicated that it could not be discussed at that time.

This Informant further advised that on May 8, 1946, BELFRAGE spoke to JIM ARONSON, indicating that they could get a statement from EHRENBERG for their book about the Russian conception of freedom of the press. BELFRACE stated that he heard EHRENBERG make a speech and upon speaking to him afterwards, EMPENBERG asked him to call him on the telephone. BELFRAGE stated that EHRENBERG is staying at the WALDORF ASTORIA HOTEL, and that he would be leaving for Chicago shortly. ARONSON suggested that they contact SHEP STONE, inasmuch as STONE was closeted with EHRENBERG for the greater part of a day. BELFRAGE said that in his speech, EHRENBERG mentioned that in Russia the war was spoken of in the past tense, and in the United States, it was spoken of in the future tense.

Mr. McDERMOTT, Credit Manager of the WALDORF ASTORIA HOTEL, advised that ILYAYEHRENBERG registered at this hotel on April 29, 1946, and indicated that he was a correspondent from Moscow, Russia. He further indicated that EHRENBERG also registered with KXSIMINOV and General M. GALAKTINOV, who were also believed to be Russian correspondents. The files of the New York Field Division revealed that ILYA EHRENBERG was employed by the Overseas News Service as a correspondent to report the Aussian-German war. He was also reported as correspondent for the Russian rmy paper Red Star," and was described as the most active journalist in Russia today.



The following investigation of ABRAHAM BROTHMAN was conducted by Special Agents FRANCIS D. O'BRIEN and NICHOLAS M. KALMES and covers the period from May 1 to June 5, 1946, inclusive.

According to Confidential Informant

ABRAHAM BROTHMAN has continued in business at 114 East 32nd Street, New York City and has been actively engaged on various projects relating to plastics and resins.

On May 28, 1946 the aforementioned informant advised that a Mr. LECATUR (phonetic) was in contact with EROTHMAN and advised him that he had a letter from the Soviet Union addressed to a Mr. POWELL (phonetic). According to LECATUR, the letter confirmed what he and BROTHMAN had discussed at the meeting and it also itemized a few things that they (Soviet Union) want. LECATUR also wanted to know how BROTHMAN was making out on "that" proposal and EROTHMAN replied that he had someone working on it and it should be ready by the end of next week. LECATUR added that POWELL wanted to sit in with BROTHMAN after a draft is made of the proposal and before it is typed. LECATUR stated that POWELL is in Boston a great deal of the time. BROTHMAN then made the statement that he was getting up a description of his plastics for LECATUR and will make three copies of this description for the Russians. In conclusion LECATUR stated that he would mail to BROTHMAN a photostatic copy of the letter which he received from the Soviet Union.

On June 3, 1946, Confidential Informant advised that ABE
BROTHMAN had been in upper New York State somewhere for the weekend and that he
was working on some job for the AMTORG people. No indication was given as to
the type of work BROTHMAN was doing for AMTORG.

This same informant advised that on May 8, 1946 an individual from the American Airlines was in contact with EROTHMAN regarding an application which he had made for credit on the American Airlines and the credit was to be extended that over the United States. The informant was unable to advise what action EROTHMAN took regarding this extension of credit by the American Airlines.

On May 15, 1946 the aforementioned informant advised that ROSE/REUBEN of the American-Russian Institute had a conference with BROTHMAN at which time REUBEN asked BROTHMAN if he could suggest or recommend some person who knew



a pamphlet describing the technical phases of Soviet industries and that they needed a person to translate from the Russian into English. BROTHMAN suggested the names of MATTHEW ZARRED, 48th Street, Sunnyside, Long Island and SHURA SWAN, no address given, but ROSE REUBEN indicated that she knew SWAN inasmuch as he had previously been an interpreter for technical commissions that had come to the United States from Russia. BROTHMAN then stated that an employee of his laboratory named BILLEROHALL, Aqueduct Avenue, Bronx, New York, had been used by his firm as a translator of Russian and that he thought that ROHALL could be used by REUBEN. REUBEN then stated that ANDY STEIGER of the American-Russian Institute was going with the UNRRA and would possibly go to China.

On May 3, 1946 from a highly confidential source it was ascertained that JACK DELANO mentioned in previous reports as a contact of MARY JANE KEENEY and URSULA WASSERMAN, was leaving New York City via the SS GEORGE WASHINGTON accompanied by his wife, IRENE DELANO and that he was due to arrive in Puerto Rico on May 9th. DELANO also had his car with him, a 1941 Dodge Coupe, New York License #37680. The San Juan Field Division was requested to obtain information concerning DELANO's activities in Puerto Rico and also his purpose for being there and business connections while there.

The mail cover placed against the name of EDWIN ROSSKA 10 Dowing Street, reveals that he continues to receive mail from the Office of Information, San Juan, Puerto Rico and that JACK DELANO has written to him from that address on one occasion.

The following investigation was conducted by Special Agent JAMES E. TIERNEY, JR., for the period of May 8 and 15, 1946.

Reference is made to the letter from the Washington Field Division dated April 15, 1946, in the above-entitled matter, requesting available background information on FREDERICK C GANS, 1650 Metropolitan Avenue, Parkchester, New York.

MR. JACK BARNES, rental agent for 1650 Metropolitan Avenue, Park-chester, New York, made available the following information concerning FREDERICK C. GANS:

He advised that Subject originally leased his apartment at this address on October 1, 1940, and has never recontacted him since sometime in 1942 to renew this lease. This lease has been automatically renewed since that date due to the fact that GANS had been a satisfactory tenant. Although he could not recall the exact month in 1942 that GANS contacted him, he revealed that at that time Subject was a First Lieutenant in the United States Army, having been so commissioned six months prior to the time he visited the rental agent's office. MR. BARNES revealed that as far as he knows, Subject GANS is still in the United States Army. He asserted that his records revealed that Subject, prior to his entering the Army, was an architectural designer employed by Kidmore Owings and Merrill, 5 East 57th Street, New York City. These records revealed that his occupation there was as a draftsman and designer. It was noted by MR. BARNES that Subject and his wife, whose first name is PRISCILIA, stated they were 29 years of age in 1940, when they rented their apartment from 3925 - 46th Street, Long Island City, New York, where they had resided for 2-1/2 years. They had lived prior to that time at 1030 Aratahoe Street, Los Angeles, California. Their dates of birth were not given.

The only other available information in these files revealed that Subject's wife's maiden name was BACON.

The Chief Clerk of Local Board 106, lill Metropolitan Avenue, Park-chester, New York, which Board covers Subject's residence address, checked her records for Subject's registration at that Board, with negative results. She advised that Subject, if he was for the Draft, should have registered at her Board inasmuch as he resided at his present address since October 1, 1940, which was prior to the first registration date. She revealed, however, that

Subject must have voluntarily enlisted into the Army prior to the date of the first registration and therefore would not be liable to register under the Selective Service Act.

The records of the Credit Bureau of Greater New York, the criminal records of the New York Police Department, and the indices of the New York Field Division were checked against Subject's name with negative results.

The investigating activity concerning Mrs. RAY ELSON is reported by Special Agent James R. Shinners.

In the report of Special Agent Edward W. Dooley, dated May 17, 1946, it was indicated that RAY FISON contemplated resigning from her position at the National Federation of Constitutional Liberties, at 205 East 42nd Street, New York City. EISON resigned her position on May 17th and since has obtained employment at the Scientific Instrument Company at 119 Chambers Street, New York City. This firm sells binoculars and scientific equipment and the position held by EISON is that of a stenographer, working four hours a day, five days a week at a salary of \$30 a week. It has been indicated by EISON that this position is on a temporary basis until she finds further employment.

According to Confidential Informant GREGORY, FISON has evidently decided against employment with the United Nations Organization in New York City. No reason for this action was given by ELSON since she had made application in person at Hunter College, New York City, on May 23, 1946, where she had an interview with a Miss AGNEW, of the U.N. Personnel Office. On May 24, 1946, FLSON had lunch with Confidential Informant GREGORY at Jack Delaney's Restaurant, Greenwich Village, and during this time discussed with GREGORY the various aspects concerning her application. The thing that concerned ELSON most, according to CREGORY, was the possibility of an FBI investigation of her application and FLSON stated that if the FBI did investigate she would immediately withdraw her application. ELSON also told the informant that in addition to being fearful of an FBI investigation, she was additionally concerned over the possibility of an FBI "grilling" because of what may be turned up in her background. GREGORY told ELSON that she did not believe the FBI was investigating personnel for the U.N. primarily because the U.N. was international in scope and had its own investigating forces. At the same luncheon, ELSON told the informant that she did not think the FBI was investigating her at the present time and made the statement that her telephone was all right. ELSON related also that she was financially in poor condition and that immediately after the luncheon she was going to see her step-father and borrow \$50.

It may be pointed out at this time that according to Confidential Informant ELSON made a call to YANK, who has been previously identified

as being JACK COLDMAN who is employed at the International Torkers Order at 189 Second Avenue. EISON was placed under surveillance to this address after her luncheon engagement with GREGORY and was observed to be in the company of JACK GOLDMAN when they went to the Manufacturers Trust Company located at 14th Street and Second Avenue. At this point, GOLDMAN was observed by surveilling Agents to endorse a check for \$50 to RAY EISON who cashed it immediately.

United Nations, she received her first information regarding this possibility of employment from ABE HACKMAN, previously mentioned in this case and at that time, HACKMAN gave EISON extended advice and procedures to follow in making her application. Set out is the pertinent section of a conversation reported by between RAY EISON and APE/HACKMAN:

CONFIDENTIAL INFORMANT

During the month of May, reflected that EISON maintained her usual contacts with previously mentioned friends and the following is the pertinent data received during this period:

On May 4, 1946 at 8:40 PM, an unidentified woman, IDL GAFFEN, contacted EISON and from the conversation it was indicated that GAFFEN is from California and she has just arrived in New York after being to Florida and Cuba. During the conversation, they discussed a man, JEROME, who lives at 3021 Holland Avenue, Bronx, New York. This has been subsequently identified as JEROME/SHUCHTER, a brother of RAY EISON. GAFFEN indicated that she was going to meet SHUCHTER on May 5th at his office at the Jewish Welfare Council, New York City.

At 6:55 PM on the same date FRANK DUTTO called and conversed with RAY and her husband JOE, at which time they discussed the May Day Parade in which DUTTO and JOE EISON participated. DUTTO commented that the parade exposed everybody and JOE commented that the parade was a wonderful experience and was serious even though the cops were "grim". DUTTO marched in the parade with the May Day Committee while JOE marched with the Artists. DUTTO also felt that the parade "floored" everybody and it was good for all those who came to see it.

On May 15, 1946 at 9:15 AM, ROSE MACKMAN, the wife of ABE HACKMAN, mentioned previously in this report, called RAY and explained the possibilities of EISON obtaining employment at the UN because there were positions opened at \$2600 per year, tax free. It was in this conversation that EISON was advised to call ABE HACKMAN, which conversation has been previously set out.

On May 18, 1946, RAY ELSON called EADIR KENNITZ, wife of MILTON KENNITZ, an employee of the N.F.C.L. During this conversation, ELSON commented at length of the setup at N.F.C.L. and found it hard in explaining her leaving the employ of N.F.C.L., the various ramifications necessary to keep an even balance. ELSON felt that on the whole the work was too hard and commented that MILT KAUFMAN is a very difficult person to work for and said that different individuals in the office made it hard to maintain peace. ELSON explained that her husband was participating in a large Veterans Housing Rally, which was held May 18, 1946 at the Lexington Avenue Armory. RAY commented that JOE had been working very hard to make the rally a big success and that she was going to attend with several of her friends.

In a conversation on May 22nd, JOE commented to a woman named JEAN that the rally held at the Armory attracted approximately 3,000 people and he felt that there should have been more. JEAN stated that she was highly in favor of veterans taking the initiative in such movements and made the comment that with the veterans "the revolution ought to be a push-over". No identification has been made of this woman to the present time.

A review of the surveillance logs during the month of May reflected that ELSON maintained her usual social contacts set out in previous reports. It may be noted that ELSON has made arrangements to spend the Summer at the Far Rockaway Beach house that was occupied by her and her husband last Summer. This house is located at 649 Grassmere Terrace at the intersection of Grassmere Terrace and Far Rockaway Boulevard. ELSON indicated in her conversation with Confidential Informant GREGORY that she intends to spend her Summer weekends at the house in Far Rockaway.

Pertinent data covered from a review of the logs of this period reflected that ELSON attended the May Day Parade on May 1, 1946 from various points of vantage along the route. It was noted from the surveillance log of this date that ELSON took unusually circuitous routes in going to the parade and checked on several occasions to see if she was being surveilled. She watched the parade from approximately 3:00 PM until 5:00 PM when she returned to her apartment at 161 West 16th Street.

On May 16, 1946, ELSON was not observed to leave 205 East 42nd Street and was not observed during the evening to be in her apartment. At twelve midnight ELSON was observed leaving a taxi cab at her apartment and it was ascertained that she was picked up at 52nd Street and Second Avenue. It was felt that ELSON had been at the residence of BILLIE at 333 East 53rd Street. This is believed to be the residence of LEONARD SANSONE. Information has already been set out regarding the activities of ELSON on May 24th, when she had lunch with Confidential Informant GREGORY following which she met JACK GOLDMAN at 189 Second Avenue.

ROSE HOWARD

On April 26, 1946, as set forth in the report of Special Agent Edward W. Dooley, dated May 17, 1946 at New York, Confidential Informant reported a conversation between JOSEPH FLSON and a woman Identified as ROSE who was staying with her brother at telephone number Fordham 4-0348. It will be recalled ROSE stated she met RAY when RAY was in California and added that she would like to have a visit with RAY ELSON.

Special Agent Howard R. Hawkins ascertained that the records of Local Board #121 at 2382 Grand Concourse, New York, reflected that HARRY MIRSKY, telephone number Fordham 4-0348, registered for Selective Service on February 15, 1942. At this time he resided at 2527 Valentine Avenue, Bronx, and presently resides at 30 West 190th Street, Bronx. He was born in Chernobile, Kiev, Russia, on July 30, 1898 and his wife is SALLY MIRSKY, who

was born September 9, 1903. His employment was given as a piece goods buyer of dress fabrics and textiles for the Pierrot Dress Company, 498 Seventh Avenue, New York City. His education consisted of eight years elementary school and stated he could read and write English. He is paid about \$40 a week in his present job and has had twenty years experience in this field.

LIRSKY stated he has no criminal record and no previous Army experience. In his registration, MIRSKY listed His Social Security Number is; his relatives as follows:

The ROSE HOWARD mentioned above undoubtedly is the ROSE who is a contact of RAY ELSCH.

H. WILDE, superintendent of 30 West 190th Street, Bronx, advised HARRY MIRSKY resided at that address and that MIRSKY and his wife, SALLY, had been visited recently by MIPSKY's sister, Mrs. POSE HOWARD, and her threeyear old daughter, SUSAN, who were from Los Angeles, California. WILDE described Mrs. HOWARD as follows:

Regarding Mrs. HOWARD, WILDE advised that she had been in New York City about three weeks but has since returned to California. He knew of no organizations with which the MIRSKYs or Mrs. HOWARD were associated and also stated that he had heard no conversations of a Communistic mature or did he note any Communist literature.

The records of the New York Field Division concerning ROSE HOWARD were negative.

ABRAHAM GELLI

It was ascertained on a previous date from Confidential Informant that there had been a contact between JOE ELSON and ABRAHAL GELLER.

At the office of EDWARD KESTNER, Registrar of New York University, Washington Square, Mrs. PANEK advised that ABRAHA! (FILER, 1850 52nd Street, Brooklyn, entered New York University from Cornell University in February, 1936. He was born in Husi, Roumania, July 6, 1912. He was a student at Brooklyn Tech High School from 1927 to 1929; Troy High School, Troy, New York, from 1929 to 1931 and Cornell University, Ithica from 1932 to 1936. He did not receive a degree from Cornell University where his records reflected he had considerable scholastic difficulty and was placed on probation June 15 1935. His father, WILLIAM GELLER, and mother, SOPHIA; are both residing at Taylor Street, Troy, New York, at the present time. His scholastic average at New York University was "D" and was dropped in June 1938 without receiving a degree. Both at New York University and Cornell University, he was a student in the School of Architecture.

In the report of Special Agent Jerome M. Garland, dated August 13, 1943, New York City, in the case entitled "NATIONAL MARITIME UNION OF AMERICA; INTERNAL SECURITY - C", on page 7 information was reported from Confidential Informant that on June 29, 1943 a woman named JEAN BARSAY, residing at 148 West 73rd Street, telephone TRafalgar 7-6694, conferred with FLORENCE SLIPYAVE, of N.M.U., for the purpose of advising her that a meeting would be held in BAPSAY's home the following Friday night. It was believed, according to Agent Garland, that the meeting to be held in BARSAY's home would be Communistic in nature.

Report of Special Agent Vincent J. Cahill, dated October 18, 1944 at New York, entitled "MARCARET ELEANORE HALLER; INTERNAL SECURITY - C" indicated that HALLER was a private secretary to JOSEPH CURRAN, President of the National Maritime Union and was considered a key figure in the New York Field Division. Upon HALLER's departure from New York City, certain material was disposed of, including an address book. This book contained the name of JEAN BAHSAY, telephone number TRafalgar 7-6694.

In another report, JEAN BARSAY, at the above address, was listed as an individual who had written to the Governor of New York, urging the pardon of MORRIS UXSCHAPPES, a known Communist.

HARVEY KAGAN

On April 14, 1946, as set forth in the report of Special Agent Edward W. Dooley, dated May 17, 1946 at New York, New York, Confidential Information Preported a conversation between HARVEY KAGAN and RAY ELSON. HARVEY disclosed he had attended Cooper Union. Subsequently on April 18, 1946, HARVEY spoke to RAY ELSON and it was agreed that HARVEY and his wife would visit the ELSONs on April 19, 1946.

Miss JUDITH ROSENBLATT, Registrar's Office, Cooper Union, Astor Place, advised that HARVEY KAGAN, 1980 East 24th Street, Brooklyn, telephone ES 5-7790, had entered Cooper Union, February 1, 1946 and had resigned from the school on March 6, 1946. The records reflect that KAGAN was born January 23, 1922 but the place of birth was not shown. His father is DAVID KAGAN, also residing at 1980 East 24th Street. KAGAN is registered for the Selective Service at Local Board #173, Brooklyn. He was attending the Architectural Day School and taking a first year refresher course. The records reflected that KAGAN entered New York University in 1940 where he studied architecture and Applied Arts. He left New York University in 1942 apparently to enter military service. He entered New York University from Brooklyn College.

The records of the New York Field Division were checked for information concerning HARVEY KACAN with negative results.

JACK GOLDMAN, wa: Wank 225 East 12th Street New York City

(W) (As indicated in the report of Special Agent Edward W. Dooley, dated May 17, 1946 at New York, JACK GOLDMAN had been in frequent contact with RAY ELSON. Tit may be pointed out that earlier in this report, it was shown that RAY ELSON contacted GOLDMAN following her luncheon engagement with Confidential Informant GREGORY on May 26, 1946. At this time GOLDMAN was observed by surveilling Agents to give ELSON a check in the Manufacturers Trust Company at 14th Street and Second Avenue for \$50, which he endorsed and turned over to ELSON.

Inquiry at the Manufacturers Trust Company through Mr. TROTTER reflected that GOLDMAN opened his account at the Manufacturers Trust Company in March of 1946. In his application, GOLDMAN stated that he was secretary of the New York County Jewish Peoples Fraternal Order at 80 Fifth Avenue. His original deposit with the bank was \$75. TROTTER pointed out that he did not require GOLDMAN to submit any references because he was satisfied with the background as given to TROTTER in their original interview.

It may be pointed out that in the conversation that RAY EISON had with YANK on the same day that she called him to borrow the \$50 on May 24th that reported that in the social conversation that followed the discussion of the loan, RAY EISON and YANK attempted to arrange a date for a visit between the two parties at either EISON's apartment or at her summer home in Far Rockaway. In reply to this invitation, YANK stated that his next three weekends would be taken up and that it would be impossible for

him to consider the possibility of visiting the EISON's at Far Rockaway during this period. Several days later, RAY EISON in a conversation with FANNY commented, according to about her new position and at that time stated that she had talked to JACK and that he said he would be busy for the next three weekends. To this, FANNY replied that she was sorry to hear this; that she had not seen JACK for a long time and was looking forward to a reunion. It will be recalled that on December 23, 1945, RAY EISON received a call from an unknown FANNY, saying that "JACK wants to see us" and it was believed at that time that the JACK mentioned in this conversation may be identical with the unknown JACK who allegedly was an unknown contact of RAY EISON and Confidential Informant GREGORY. From this it can be ascertained that the JACK mentioned in that conversation undoubtedly is JACK GOLDMAN, whose background is presently being investigated.

Additional investigation is being conducted to ascertain the complete background and present activity of GOLDMAN.

HATTIE CHAMP

This individual who was identified in the previous report as being a co-worker of RAY EISON at the N.F.C.L. has resigned her position with this organization and according to EISON has returned to teaching school in New York City. An investigation will be conducted to ascertain what progress she has made in attempting to reinstate herself as a teacher in the public schools.

A review of the files in the New York Field Division revealed that Mr. and Mrs. JOSEPH N. ERMOLIEFF drove Mr. and Mys. SACUL LOURIE of 316 Adelaide Drive. Santa Monica, California, to Palm Springs, California. Mrs. JOSEPH NA ERMOLIEFF is also known as VERA GAYLORD. These files further reflected that a

As a result of the mail cover placed on MICHAEL ENDELMAN at his home address, 49 West 83 Street, New York City, information was received that ENDELIAN was the recipient of several letters from LOUIS EX SPIEGLER, Southern Building, Washington, D. C. (X) (4)

A review of the files in the New York Field Division reveal that LOUIS E. SPIEGLER, alias LEWIS SPIEGLER, was the subject of an Internal Security - G investigation predicated on the fact that SPIEGLER had been noted to engage in German conversation with a number of persons who were distinctly of German nationality and who, while staying in the same hotel, but in a different room with HILDAXPISER, it was revealed, did not seem to desire to be seen in the same hotel with her and they, therefore, sent messages to each other via the bellboy. The files further reflect SPIEGLER was born in Roumania on February 15, 1892 and he became a naturalized citizen of the United States as a minor through the naturalization of his parents. SPIEGLER served in United States Government service from 1910 to 1927, resigning from a position as Internal Revenue Agent on the Income Tax Force. The file revealed that he served in the United States Army during the first World War for twelve months and he is presently a practicing attorney in Washington, D. C. SPIEGLER is very prominent in Hebrew organizations, and is presently active in the HEBREW AID SOCIETY, assisting Jewish immigrants.





Dooley, dated May 17, 1946 at New York City, information was reported regarding the results of a physical surveillance of GREGG from April 26 to April 30, 1946. The investigation was conducted to determine GREGG's contacts in the New York area during this period.

It was previously reported that GREGG stayed in Apartment 7-C at 334 West 87th Street, New York City on April 28 and 29, 1946 and the tenant in this apartment was reported as VICTOR H. KAY. Mr. DAVIES, superintendent of the building at 334 West 87th Street, New York City, advised that an unknown man, woman and two children occupied Apartment 7-C at this address. He advised that Apartment 7-C is presently occupied by MORRIS ABOGDANOFF and his wife. He advised that BOGDANOFF recently moved into this apartment, which had previously been occupied by VICTOR H. KAY and that KAY now occupies the apartment on the fifth floor that had previously been occupied by BOGDANOFF. He further stated that BOGDANOFF is a prominent real estate man who owns a large farm in the vicinity of Peekskill, New York, and that Mrs. BOGDANOFF spends a great deal of time working on Russian relief. The files of the New York Field Division reflect that MORRIS BOGDANOFF is a Director of the YORKTOWN CONSTRUCTION COMPANY, INC., 349 West 149th Street, Bronx, New York, which is the same company with which DAVID BOGDANOFF is connected.

A confidential source advised that the residents at 25 Montgomery Place, Brooklyn, New York, are listed as N. LIEBERMAN and MEYER SCHWARTZ. The files of the New York Field Division failed to reveal any information regarding these residents.

The records of the Credit Bureau of Greater New York were examined by Special Employee Investigator Wade Fuller and information was obtained that MEYER SCHWARTZ, 190 Westminster Road, Brooklyn, New York, is connected with the business of GIASS & LIEBERMAN, 5302 Fifth Avenue, Brooklyn, New York. These records further reflect that he is married to RUTH, has two children, and is the assistant manager of the aforementioned firm which deals in men's clothing.

The records of the Credit Bureau of Greater New York were examined by Special Employee Investigator Wade Fuller and it was ascertained that NATHAN KATZ, 184 Sullivan Street, New York City, is married and has been living at his present address since October 1943, where he occupies a duplex apartment on the first and second floors of a four story house. KATZ, an attorney, is about thirty years of age, and is employed by the firm of MILBANK, TWEED and HOPE, 15 Broad Street, New York City. He has been in their employ since January 1944 and prior to this time he was employed for several years by the Office of Price Administration.

An inquiry was conducted at 11,01 Avenue J, Brooklyn, New York, at the Rock-s-Bye Shop and information was obtained that the proprietors of this shop are HARRY CHERNOFF, LOUIS LIEBERBAUM and SIDNEY SHURGIN.

The records of Confidential Informant revealed that 12 HARRY CHERNOFSKY (CHERNOFF) was born in Russia, is 55 years of age, that 11 he entered the United States in 1911 and that he is a naturalized American citizen. LOUIS LIEBERBAUM was reported to be 32 years of age and he was born in the United States. SIDNEY SHURGIN was reported to be 28 years of age, his birthplace is the United States, and his wife is JEANNE SHURGIN. It was further indicated that the proprietors of this shop maintain an account at the Brooklyn Trust Company, Avenue J Branch, Brooklyn, New York.

Upon receiving information from the Washington Field Division indicating that GREGG left Washington on May 22, 1946, Special Agents George J. Sullivan, James E. Tierney, Jr., and Francis D. O'Brien observed GREGG at Pennsylvania Station at 8:30 P.M. on that date. GREGG was observed entering the Seventh Avenue subway at Pennsylvania Station and his destination was to 25 Montgomery Place, Brooklyn, New York, where he entered at 10:15 P. M.

On May 23, 1946, CREGG was observed leaving 25 Vontgomery Place, Brooklyn, New York, at 10:25 A. M. by Special Agents James P. Martin, Thomas J. Brownfield and Lawrence W. Spillane. GREGG was then observed entering the New York Times Building at Times Square, where he made several inquiries, and he then walked to another New York Times Building, 231 West 43rd Street, New York City. GREGG entered this building at 11:35 A. M. and was observed leaving at 11:48 A. M. He then proceeded to a drug store on Broadway, where he made several telephone calls and upon leaving this drug store he walked north on Broadway, at which time the surveillance was discontinued.

On May 24, 1946, GREGG was observed leaving 25 Montgomery Place, Brooklyn, New York, at 9:25 A. M., at which time he was carrying a black bag. GREGG was observed making several telephone calls in a local booth and he was overheard to say that he had to be in Washington, D. C. before Monday and that he would berrow a friend's car if he could not catch a train. GREGG then boarded the Seventh Avenue subway, destined to Pennsylvania Station, New York City. During the two week interval from May 14, 1946 to May 28, 1946, regular contact with GREGORY was maintained. During this time, the informant had some conversations with RAY ELSON, the details of which are being set out in instant report under the caption relating to ELSON. No information believed pertinent has been developed in addition to that concerning ELSON, except that informant declared that it probably would be necessary for her to travel to Montreal, Canada in connection with the business affairs of her employer, the U. On May 27, 1946, the informant advised that definite arrangements had been made for her to proceed to Montreal to the offices of the HEBREW IMMIGRATION AID SOCIETY, where she would attempt to negotiate an agency contract with Mr. SOIKIN (phonetic). It was learned that these negotiations had been instigated by HIAS and the venture appeared to be wholly legitimate and routine. By teletype to the Bureau dated May 28, 1946, the information was furnished that GREGORY was departing from New York City at 10:30 pm, Eastern Standard Time, via the Montreal Limited, having space on car #615, lower 1. This train was scheduled to arrive in Montreal at 7:30 am on May 29, 1946. It was also pointed out in that teletype that informant, after the conclusion of her business in Montreal, would proceed to the Laurentide Inn, Sainte Agathe des Montes, P. Q., and would leave Montreal for New York City on the evening of June 2, 1946.

The informant, of course, has been following the press accounts of the current prosecution in Canada of the alleged Russian spies, and noting that the trial of FRED ROSE was currently in progress in Montreal, speculated on the desirability of her attending part of the trial. Although the reporting agents did not attempt to forbid her from so attending, it was pointed out that she might possibly be recognized there and that it was felt it would be much more desirable if she did not attend the trial. After a discussion of the matter, she agreed that such a procedure would undoubtedly be wiser. It was further learned, prior to her departure, that she definitely did not plan to attempt to contact ROSE or any other acquaintances she may have in Canada.

On the informant's return to New York City on June 4, 1946, and in subsequent interviews, it was learned that her trip had been purely routine; that she had succeeded in negotiating an agency contract with MURRAY SOIKIN representing HIAS and that she had encountered none of her acquaintances in Canada.

On the afternoon of June 7, 1946, the informant telephonically advised that she had just concluded a luncheon engagement with WILLIAM BROWDER, brother of EARIA BROWDER, and during the course the reof, had learned that A. A. HELLER, well known in Communist Party circles in New York City, was planning to leave, via American Overseas Airlines, that day for Moscow, stopping enroute in London. The details of this conversation as they related to HELLER and BROWDER were immediately furnished to agents of this office handling the investigation of EARL BROWDER, and by them furnished to the Bureau by teletype under the caption of the BROWDER case. Accordingly, they are not being set out in detail in this report.

On June 10, 1946, the informant again discussed her meeting the previous Friday with WILLIAM BROWDER; considerable more information was secured on this occasion and is being reported by this office in the BROWDER case. The informant also reported that she had been in communication with RAY ELSON, and the circumstances of this contact are being set out in instant

With reference to previous New Yerk reports furnishing information that, on his forthcoming trip to Moscow, ERNEST ROPES of the United States Department of Commerce, will be accompanied by an official associate, it would appear that this individual is LESLIE L. LORWIN inasmuch as by tele-type dated June 3, 1946, the Washington Field Division advised that ROPES and LORWIN had both been granted visas by the USSR.

Reference is made to the Bureau's letter of April 9, 1946, in which it is suggested that an attempt be made to obtain additional information concerning the persons to whom and the gifts which GREGORY gave to these people during the time she was actively operating with this espionage ring. This matter has been gone over with Confidential Informant GREGORY on several occasions since the receipt of this letter. However, she is unable to furnish any information in addition to that which she originally furnished in her signed statement of November 30, 1945.

With reference to Bureau letter dated February 20, 1946, requesting that a photograph of ANGELA IDA MARGERY JUDITH CARMEL HAYDEN with aliases, be secured and exhibited to Confidential Informant GREGORY to determine whether GUEST is identical with "CATHERINE", it is noted from a review of GUEST's file, that this individual is described by her landlady as being 5'2" in height; further that the records of Immigration and Naturalization reflect that GUEST entered the United States on December 29, 1939 as an English quota visitor. In view of the great disparity in height between this person and "CATHERINE" as furnished by the informant, together with the fact that GREGORY repeatedly reiterated the fact that "CATHERINE"

There were no contacts of importance reported by Confidential Informant from May 24 through May 28, 1946.

Mrs. KORAL and a person whom she addressed as MAX stating that Mrs. KORAL told MAX that she and GIIBERT planned to go to the country (it is believed that when they state they are going to the country they are referring to the small farm which they own in the neighborhood of Bridgeton, Connecticut) for the summer and that Mr. KORAL planned to take Friday and Monday off and join them for a long weekend during each week throughout the summer.

Confidential Informant advised that there were no contacts by the KORAIS from May 30 through June 2, 1946. On June 3, 1946, the informant reported a contact between ALEYANDER KORAI and members of his own family in which he stated that he, HELEN and GHBERT had returned from the country because GHBERT's health is reacting badly to the climate and he must return again to the south. It is indicated by his conversation that he was considerably distressed over this turn of events and that KORAI is faced with a large expense to return GHBERT to Florida. HELEN KORAI indicated during the same contact that she may attempt to obtain a part time job.

As a result of a mail cover placed on AIEXANDER KORAL at 290 Empire Boulevard, Brooklyn, New York, the following names and addresses were obtained:

On May 7th a letter to Mr. ALEXANDER KORAL from Suite 21, 23 West 26th Street. The building at 23 West 26th Street is a remodeled building which houses a number of known Communist front organizations. At the time of the investigation the following pames were noted on the mail receptacles of this building: PAUL HOBESON, MAX TERGAN, FREDERICK VA FIELD and the COMMITTEE TO WIN THE PEACE. The co-chairmen of the above committee are Colonel EVANS F. CARISON and PAUL ROBESON.

There were also letters from GIIBERT KOFAL, HOTEL MARTIN, Room 435, Rochester, Minnesota; and from the Corn Exchange Bank Trust Company, 188

Montague Street, Brooklyn, New York.

The name ALEXANDER KORAL and a recent photograph of KORAL were submitted to the following Confidential National Defense Informants with negative results:

The following investigation was conducted by Special Agent William G. O'Donnell, on May 2, 3, 8 and 14, 1946, and was predicated upon a latter from the Washington Field Division, dated April 16, 1946, in which it was stated that on April 15, 1945, MAURICE HALPERIN, who is one of the subjects of instant investigation, contacted ROSALAIRE GRINSBERG, of 415 Ocean Parkway, Brooklyn, New York, while she was staying at the Hotel Belvedere, Baltimore, Maryland. It'r correct name was ascertained to be ROSALIE GRINSBERG.

Mr. O. HANSON advised that the CRINSBERG family has resided at 415 Ocean Parkway, Brooklyn, New York, for the past three years. About two years ago, Mr. CRINSBERG died, and the only members of the family at the present time are the mother, a daughter, who is a school teacher, and a son, who was recently discharged from the United States Army, and is presently practicing law. He stated that the mother was about 60 years of age, but he could not furnish any description of the son or daughter. He advised that he thought the daughter's name was ROSALIE CRINSBERG.

The records of the Credit Bureau of Greater New York, revealed the following information on Miss ROSALIE CRINSBERG, 415 Ocean Parkway, Brooklyn, New York. She is a teacher, employed by the New York City Board of Education. She is described as being 26 years of age (as of July, 1942), and is single. She resides with her parents, Mr. and Mrs. AARON (MARY) CRINSBERG. They have been residing at 415 Ocean Parkway, since June of 1942, in apartment 6-G, and occupy five rooms at an approximate rental of \$92 a month. They are well regarded as tenants. Prior to moving to this address, they resided at 2305 Avenue T, Brooklyn, New York, for ten years, where her parents were the reputed owners of a private residence of good description, located in a good section. As of December of 1936, Miss CRINSBERG was employed as a substitute teacher in the employ of the Board of Education, City of New York. Since September 1, 1931, she has been ssigned to the Central High School of Needle Trades, 225 West 24th Street, New York City. She listed as a reference, Mr. IRWIN GRINSBERG, an attorney, of 1450 Broadway, who is her brother.

The records of the Board of Education, Room 501, 131 Livingston Street, Brooklyn, New York, revealed the following information in their file #110915. MissROBALIE (RINSBERG was born on August 10, 1929 at New York City. She began teaching as a substitute teacher on October 31, 1935, and was appointed as a regular teacher of English at Bay Ridge High School on October 31, 1938. She is a graduate of Adelphi College, in Garden City, Long Island, having received her degree in June of 1929. In this file was a photostatic copy of a birth certificate #44433, showing her date of birth as August 10, 1910 at New York City. This certificate shows that both of her parents were born in Russia. This certificate is in the name of LOTIE ROSIE (RINSBERG. However, Miss GRINSBERG, and an affidavit stating that her correct name was ROSALIE GRINSBERG, and

Reference is made to the memorandum of Special Agent FRANCIS D. O'BRIEN made in instant case in the New York Field Office on April 4, 1946 wherein it is set forth that on March 27, 1946 information was received through

The New York indices reflected that one ANNA BLOCK was a member of the Communist Party, Brooklyn, New York. It has not been ascertained whether or not this individual was identical with the ANNA BLOCK who met JULES KORCHIEN.


On January 24th and 25th, 1946 MAURICE HALPERIN, a subject in this case, was under surveillance and visited Room 1448, Lincoln Building, New York City on these dates. Investigation by Special Agent FRANCIS D. O'BRIEN has indicated that Room 1448, Lincoln Building is occupied by TOM/FIZDALE, a public relations counselor.

A check of the New York Field Division indices has been made and it has been indicated there is but one reference to TOM FIZDAIE, which reflects that FIZDALE is a member of the Advisory Committee of "Stage for Action Committee, Inc.", 130 West 42nd Street, New York. It appears that "Stage For Action Committee, Inc." is a group of well known theatrical figures who produce plays. Among the names on this list was that of the aforementioned TOM FIZDALE. The list is composed of approximately 40 names of which there are 10 names of persons who are key figures in the Communist Party in New York City. Among the 10 key figures are included such prominent persons as PAUL ROBESON, FREDERICAMARCH, and Congressman CLAYTON POWELL, as well as JOHN ABT, who is possibly identical with the person in whose home the Peflo Group of instant case met at one time.

Inquiry by WADE FULLER, Special Employee Investigator of the New York Field Office at the Immigration & Naturalization Service, 70 Columbus Avenue, New York City on May 21, 1946 indicated that TOM FIZDALE of 485 Madison Avenue, New York City was issued certificate No. A-25482, dated November 5, 1941. The Immigration & Naturalization Service files indicated that a certificate of derivative citizenship was issued to TOM FIZDALE and was filed in Los Angeles, California on November 14, 1941. It was further indicated that the Immigration & Naturalization

tion Office at Los Angeles, California would have complete information on the issuance of this certificate.

Inquiry made by WADE FULIER at the Credit Bureau of Greater New York indicates that a record of that Cedit Bureau, dated December 13, 1941 reflected that TOM FIZDALE resided at 24 West 55th Street, New York City and maintained a business at 485 Madison Avenue, New York City. It was stated that FIZDALE was a single man in the middle 40s and that his legal name is TOLYAKFIZDALE but that he is known in business and private life as TOM FIZDALE.

It was further indicated that he has been a resident at 485 Madison Avenue, New York City since October 1, 1940; that he pays close to \$1500 a year for his apartment and is well regarded by the management of this large elevator apartment house. It was also indicated that he formerly resided at 2 Sutton Place South, New York City for a period of approximately 16 months.

His credit record indicated that FIZDALE is active in public relations and publicity under the firm name of Tom Fizdale, Inc.

It was indicated that he organized this firm in Chicago, Illinois in 1930 succeeding a business originally established there in 1924 by a Mr. R. T. TAPLINGER. It was indicated that he maintains an office at 485 Madison Avenue from 1939 to the date of the report (December 13, 1941). Since active in New York he has handled publicity for such figures as BENNY GOODMAN, PAUL WHITMAN, and JOAN BLONDELL.

Under date of May, 1940 he signed a long term contract to handle all of the publicity for the Class B pictures of the Paramount Pictures, Inc. of Hollywood, California. According to the May, 1940 issue of "Variety" magazine, he received a fee of \$650 per picture for the aforementioned Paramount contract.

FIZDALE had a satisfactory credit rating in the aforementioned report.

Inquiry at Local Board 20, 331 Madison Avenue, New York City by Special Agent JOHN J. DANAHY on May 7, 1946 indicated that FIZDALE registered for Selective Service on February 15, 1942 and was issued order number 11476. He indicated that his telephone numbers were CIrcle 6-9546

It was further indicated that he was born on September 9, 1904 at Nikoliev, Russia. He also stated that his wife was PHYLLIS DOBSON and that he resided with her at 24 West 55th Street. He advised his legal name was TOLYA FIZDALE.

In his Selective Service questionnaire dated June 8, 1942 \ FIZDALE gave his Social Security Number as and stated that he was suffering from no known physical ailment but was presently consulting a psychoanalysis, one Dr. BERTRAN LEWIN, 32 East 64th Street, New York City.

He stated that he had a high school education and had spent eight years in his present employment as a public relations counselor and publicity man. He also advised that he was a consultant for the Division of Information, of the Office of Emergency Management and was also engaged as a consultant for the Bureau of Public Relations of the War Department.

He advised that he had his own corporation engaged in public relations work from which he received approximately \$25,000 per year. He stated that he was last married at Alexandria, Virginia on December 1st, 1945 to PHYLLIS DOBSON. He further indicated that he also contributes to the support of a former wife, ROBERTA FIZDALE and one child, TANYA, who reside at 43-23 Van Nuys Boulevard, Sherman Oaks, California.

His file further indicated a change of address on July 20, 1944 from 24 West 55th Street to 322 East 57th Street, both New York City and a subsequent change of address notification dated November 2, 1944 at which time FIZDALE indicated that he was moving to 485 Madison Avenue, and after December 1st, 1944 could be reached at 60 East 42nd Street, his business address. This notification was mailed by S. F. TENENT, FIZDALE's secretary.

The file indicated that FIZDALE has been classified 4A since December 20, 1944.

A description of FIZDALE obtained from his Selective Service file is as follows:

This Service indicated that he was formerly a client of theres and is well known in the entertainment field. They further advised that he has been associated with NATAVIKN and Mathanson & Associates, Inc. of 60 East 42nd Street, New York City.

MAURICE HALPERIN

On Tuesday, May 28th, 1946, Special Agent R. A. Newby of the Washington Field Division telephonically advised the New York Field Division that MAURICE HALPERIN was believed to be leaving Washington, D. C. via the 9 A.M. Pennsylvania train destined for New York City. HALPERIN was expected to remain in New York City on the afternoon of May 28th and all day May 29th, returning to Washington, D. C. on May 29th. Special Agent Newby requested that a surveillance be placed on HALPERIN to ascertain his activities while in New York City. Accordingly, a physical surveillance was maintained on MAURICE HALPERIN from 1:47 P.M., May 28th, to 7:30 P.M., May 29th, by Special Agents J. R. Tierney, Roy J. Barloga, L. W. Spillane, and C. F. Lanman.

HALPERIN arrived in New York City at 1:47 P.M. on May 28th, and immediately proceeded to 38 East 51st Street, Manhattan, where he remained for a few moments after which he went to the office of GEORGE T BYE, 12th floor, 535 Fifth Avenue.

On the evening of May 28th, HALPERIN registered at the Hotel Lexington, 48th Street and Lexington Avenue, jointly with one M. ROBERT ROGERS, and was assigned to Room 515. After registering at the Hotel Lexington. HALPERIN and ROGERS went to a restaurant known as the "Steak Joint Bar & Grill", 53 Greenwich Avenue, where they met two women described as follows:

After dinner, HALPERIN, ROGERS, and the two women mentioned above left the restaurant and proceeded to the ROBO FRAME SHOP, 51 Greenwich Avenue, and by means of a key which was in the possession of one of the two women, entered this shop which had apparently been closed earlier in the evening. The two women remained in the shop for about five minutes after which they left the shop and entered an automobile, license #3N-3205. This car is a 1940 Pontiac Sedan listed to JANE CAROGERS, 56 Seventh Avenue, New York, New York.

ROGERS and HALPERIN remained in the ROBO FRAME SHOP for a few minutes and then left the shop again after which they parted.

HALPERIN went to the Stanley Theater, 7th Avenue and 42nd Street, which was showing a picture entitled "Days and Nights", a motion picture dealing with the U.S.S.R. After viewing this motion picture, HALPERIN returned to the Hotel Lexington.

On May 29th, 1946, HALPERIN left the Hotel Lexington at 9:58 A.M. and proceeded to 521 Fifth Avenue, where he went to the offices of the American-Jewish Conference Executive Committee, 14th floor. HALPERIN remained in this office all day until 4:45 P.M., leaving only for a lunch period at a restaurant in the same building. During the lunch period he was accompanied by several men apparently from the above-mentioned office. HALPERIN left 521 Fifth Avenue at 4:45 P.M. and returned to the Hotel Lexington where he and ROGERS checked out of the hotel.

They engaged a taxi cab at the hotel and proceeded in the general direction of the Pennsylvania Station. En route, the taxi cab in which the surveilling agents were riding became entangled in a traffic jam and as a result of this the taxi cab in which the subjects were riding became lost from sight. The surveillance was immediately taken up at the Pennsylvania Station in an effort to determine whether HALPERIN boarded the 5 P.W. train for Washington, D. C. However, the results of this surveillance were negative. Agents remained at the station until 7:30 P.M. in an effort to locate HALPERIN.

While at the Hotel Lexington, the following calls were made from Room 515 which was occupied by HALPERIN and ROGERS:

The Bronx directory of the New York Telephone Company was examined and it was ascertained that a SIDNEY STEIN resides at 1406 Hicks Street, Bronx, and has telephone listing Olenville 5-5005.

A check of the records of the Credit Bureau of Greater New York was made by Special Employee Wade Fuller and the following information was secured: SIDNEY and MINNIE STEIN reside at 1406 Hicks Street, Bronx, and SIDNEY STEIN is presently a partner in Carpetoleum at 8 East 30 Street, New York. They formerly resided at 345 Cypress Avenue, Bronx. The New York Times of Jammary 24, 1940, shows SIDNEY STEIN, a salesman of 1406 Hicks Street, Bronx, filed a voluntary petition in bankruptcy in the Southern District of Hew York, with liabilities of \$12,641, and assets of \$5,752. The New York Times of October 17, 1940, shows that SIDNEY STEIN was discharged in bankruptcy on that date.

At 1406 Hicks Street, Bronx, it was verified that the STEINs still reside there and have resided there for a period in excess of five years.

It will be recalled that OLGA PRAVDIN and family departed for Russia on March 11, 1946 but that their apartment 8C at 125 Riverside Drive, New York City, is still occupied by their maid, CATHERINE DUFFY.

JEAN PETERSEN, superintendent at 125 Riverside Drive, ascertained on May 31, 1946 that the rent for June was paid on the PRAVDIN apartment by the Tass News Agency. VLADILITE PRAVDIN, husband of OLGA, was employed by the Tass News Agency, located at 630 Fifth Avenue, New York City.

A highly confidential source was developed at 125 Riverside Drive by Special Agents J. J. Ryan, Lawrence W. Spillane, F. D. O'Brien, N. M. Kalmes, George J. Sullivan and Michael M. O'Rourke. The confidential source made available many pictures that were in an album in the apartment formerly occupied by OLGA PRAVDIN. These pictures are going to be shown to Informant CREGORY for the purpose of ascertaining whether they will assist in making an identification of some of the unidentified subjects in this case. The results of the display of these pictures to Informant GREGORY will be set out in a subsequent report. There were also several names and addresses that were in the apartment. It is not known whether these names and addresses belong to OLGA or to the maid, CATHERINE DUFFY; however, the names and addresses are being checked through the indices and an attempt will be made to ascertain whether the names and addresses are those of OLGA's or the maid's. Mr. J. E. DALEY, Manager of the London Terrace Apartment at 470 West 24th Street, New York City checked his records and ascertained that Apartment 2-A at this address is occupied by HERBERT J. CONHAIM and his daughter, JEAN L. CONHAIM. They have resided in this apartment for the past four months, taking occupancy on February 22, 1946. The record further reflected that he is employed by N. ERIANGER-BLUMGART COMPANY at \$56 Fourth Avenue, New York City as sales and advertising manager and executive. This company is a textile manufacturing company. It was further determined that Mr. CONHAIM has a checking account at the Public National Bank located at 24th Street and Broadway, New York City and maintains a balance in the low four figures.

Mr. DALEY contacted the doorman who advised him that Mr. CONHAIM was about fifty-five years of age, weighed 155 pounds, was 5' 8 1/2" tall, had grayish hair, and wears glasses and a hearing aid device. Mr. CONHAIM'S daughter, JEAN, is about twenty-two years of age.

The indices of the New York Field Division were checked, and it was ascertained that a Foreign Travel Control file, New York 108-2192, was maintained on a HERBERT JOSEPH CONHAIM, who is identical with the individual occupying Apartment 2-A at 470 Mest 24th Street, New York City. This file reflects that Mr. CONHAIM arrived in the United States on an ATC plane on May 8, 1945 and presented United States passport #41173 which had been issued on October 5, 1944. He was born October 15, 1887 in St. Paul, Minnesota and was a representative of UNRRA and had left the United States on business for UNRRA. All of his time outside of the United States was spent in the European theater.

ROSENBAUM, subject of New York case entitled "ADRIAN WERETNIKOVE ROSENBAUM, was., et al; ESPIONAGE

At the Credit Bureau of Greater New York, the following information concerning Mrs. LESTER M. LEVIN was secured by Special Employee Wade Fuller:

The family reside at 524 East 87th Street, New York City, which is a good class private dwelling converted into two apartments. They have lived there for over a year and are reported to be owners of this house.

Correspondence of the New York Credit Bureau reflected that since October, 1941, Mrs. LESTER W. LEVIN resided at 120 C Street, Northwest, Washington, D. C. and that she was born in 1914. She was employed while in Washington by the Office of War Information as an Associate Information Specialist, appointed in September of 1942, and formerly had been employed by the Department of Commerce Consummer's Council Division, as assistant writer from March 28, 1940. Prior to that time, she had been employed in the Advertising Department of the Raleigh Haberdashers in Washington.

Her husband was in the United States Coast Guard as a Lieutenant (j.g.) having entered the service in September of 1942 and was formerly employed by the N.L.R.B. in the Standard Oil Building as a regional attorney, having been appoints to this position, January 6, 1936.

The files of the Credit Bureau further reflect that Mrs. IEVIN's husband is an attorney by profession and is an associate attorney identified with WOIF, POPPER, ROSS & WOIF, a reputable law firm where his association commenced in January of 1946. He is reputedly in receipt of a fairly good income from his present connection and is well regarded by his law firm.

Mrs. IEVIN is a free lance writer now but in the past had been employed by the War Activities Committee of the Motion Picture Industry, where she was a publicity writer with them. At one time she was also employed as a copy writer for L. BAMBERGER & CO., Newark, New Jersey, and also for a time prior to her marriage was employed by Time Magazine in New York City. She has had considerable experience as a writer and now works on a free lance basis as a publicity writer from her residence at 524 East 87th Street.

The file also reflects that a joint checking account is maintained by LESTER M. and JANET LEVIN at the Corn Exchange Bank, York Avenue Branch, and that the balances are in the low four figure amounts. This joint checking account has been maintained since February of 1946.

The following investigation was conducted res ABRAHAM SILVERMAN, from April 26 to April 30, 1946.

On April 20, 1946 information was received from the Washington Field Division by telephone that ABRAHAN GEORGE SILVERMAN was due to arrive in New York City on Flight #310, American Airlines at 10:45 AM, Itwas stated that this individual was accompanied by one CHRISTOPHEN WAGNER. was requested that a surveillance be maintained on the activities of SILVERMAN while he was in New York City.

Pursuant to receipt of this information Special Agents William G. O'Donnell and John E. Broderick met SILVERMAN and CHRISTOPHER WAGNER as they alighted from American Airlines plane at LaGuardia Field at 10:45 AN on April 26, 1946. SILVERMAN and WAGNER proceeded from the airport by American Airlines limousine to New York City. WAGNER alighted from this limousine at 49th Street and Lexington Avenue and proceeded to the New Weston Hotel at 49th Street and Madison Avenue. ABRAHAM SILVERMAN alighted from the American Airlines limousine at the American Airlines Terminal, Park Avenue and 42nd Street. Because of traffic conditions and for security reasons the surveillance was discontinued at this point.

ABRAHAM SILVERMAN was not seen the rest of that day, April 26, 1946, but under pretext it was ascertained from the French Supply Mission, 44 Beaver Street that SILVERMAN had been in the offices of this mission all afternoon and had left at 6 PM. He was expected back at these offices the following morning on April 27, 1946.

SILVERMAN was observed entering the building occupied by the French Supply Mission, 44 Beaver Street at 10:25 AM on April 27, 1946. At 11:50 AM under pretext it was ascertained that SILVERMAN was still in the offices of the French Supply Mission. SIIWERMAN was not seen leaving the building occupied by the French Supply Mission on April 27, 1946.

The Washington Field Division advised by telephone at 11:05 AM on April 27, 1946 that ABRAHAN SILVERMAN was staying at the home of JACK W. FIELD, telephone GR 3-0476. A check was immediately made with Confidential and it was determined that this number was listed under the name of the HILITE PROCESS COMPANY, 117 East 17th Street, New York City. This company is owned and operated by JACK W. FIELD, who, it will be noted, is a friend of Mrs. GEORGE SILVERMAN and CHARLES THEIDT. FIELD is also mentioned as a contact of LUINIG ILLMAN.

A surveillance was maintained in front of 117 East 17th Street on April 28th and the morning of April 29, 1946, but ABRAHAM SILVERMAN was not seen during this period.

In accordance with a letter from the Washington Field Division dated April 22, 1946, the following investigation was conducted on May 29, 1946 and June 3, 1946 by Special Agent William A. Johnson:

On June 3, 1946, Chief of Police RAYMOND NINESLING, King's Point Police Department, King's Point, New York, was interviewed and advised that he is well acquainted with Colonel SOL ROSENBLATT and has known him well for at least the last ten years. He advised that ROSENBLATT is a lawyer, and maintains offices at 630 Fifth Avenue, New York City and maintains his residence at 421 East Shore Road, Great Neck, Long Island, New York, which is a very exclusive residential section. According to NINESLING, ROSENBLATT has maintained his residence at this address for the last eighteen or nineteen years and is well regarded and respected in the community.

During the War ROSENBLATT served as a full Colonel in the U. S. Army Air Corps as Chief of Special Advisory Group, Material and Maintenance Division and was stationed at the Pentagon Building, Washington, D. C. Chief NINESLING advised that ROSENBLATT is now out of the Army, and is again practicing law at 630 Fifth Avenue, New York City.

Chief NINESLING further advised that he had had some correspondence with ROSENBLATT a little over two years ago, at which time ROSENBLATT had tried to interest him in joining the Air Corps. In one of the letters to NINESLING, ROSENBLATT had told him that one Lt. Colonel E. K. (MERRITT, AAF) Command, Wright Field, would be the person that would aid him in getting into the Air Corps. It was NINESLING's recollection that ROSENBLATT had told him that E. K. MERRITT was a former Agent with the Federal Bureau of Investigation and that MERRITT was a very good friend of ROSENBLATT.

MINESLING further advised that although he had not seen ROSENBLATT much in the last two years, he had always considered ROSENBLATT to be one hundred percent for the United States, and had always shown a great deal of enthusiasm over his service in the Army. According to MINESLING, ROSENBLATT is presently trying to get a divorce from his wife, ELIZABETH B, ROSENBLATT. Further, ROSENBLATT has three sons, WILLIAM ARTHUR ROSENBLATT, age 21, ROBERT A. ROSENBLATT, age 18, and RICHARD L. ROSENBLATT, age 16. Chief MINESLING stated he was almost certain that ROSENBLATT was not affiliated with any un-American groups of any kind and that since he has known ROSENBLATT, the latter has not traveled out of the country as a civilian because it would have been necessary for him to get a permit to leave from MINESLING as his local Chief of Police.

The following investigation was conducted by Special Agent JOHN J. DANAHY on May 7th and 8th and June 3, 1946:

Reference is made to a letter from the Washington Field Office, dated April 11, 1946 requesting the New York Field Office to furnish available background information on John SUSMAN, 125 West 168th Street, New York City, who is a representative of the Bulova Watch Company, 650 Fifth Avenue, New York City. On March 15, 1946 the subject, SILVERMAN contacted SUSMAN at the Statler Hotel in order to have him obtain plane reservations.

A check of the New York Field Division indices indicated no reference to JOE SUSMAN.

Inquiry at Local Board 86, located at 125 B West 168th Street, Bronx, New York indicated that JOE SUSMAN registered for Selective Service on February 15, 1942 and was assigned order number 11056. He indicated that his telephone number was JErome 6-6627 and that he resided at 125 West 168th Street. He stated he was born on May 10, 1902 at Nikolaev, Russia and that his wife SADYE resided with him at the above address.

In his Selective Service questionnaire dated June 8, 1942 he stated that he holds Social Security No. And and was employed by the Bulova Watch Company, 650 Fifth Avenue, New York City where he is in charge of machine tools and equipment for war production work then being performed by the Bulova Watch Company. He stated that he had held this position for the past year and was earning \$100 per week, plus bomus.

He further indicated that he was married on June 17, 1937 at Bronx, New York and that his wife SADYE SUSMAN had earned approximately \$2,239 during the year 1941. He also stated that during that same year he had earned \$2,460.

His file indicated that on August 10, 1942 JOE SUSMAN by letter to the Local Board advised that his wife had left her position. He further stated in this letter that he paid \$45 per month rent and was not a citizen of the United States and had been issued alien registration certificate No. 3079400. He also stated that he had filed a declaration of intention at Los Angeles, California approximately 20 years ago.

SUSMAN's file also contained a letter dated June 10, 1942 from A. BULOVA, Chairman of the Board of the Bulova Watch Company, 650 Fifth Avenue, New York City wherein Mr. BULOVA stated that this individual was in charge of machine tools and equipment for the Bulova factories at Providence, Rhode Island, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania and Woodside, Sag Harbor, Long Island City, and Valley Stream, New York. The letter further stated that SUSMAN was a necessary man for war production work and was engaged in negotiating contracts at the Frankfurt Arsenal, Ordnance Department of the War Department and the War Production Board.

On June 30, 1943 SUSMAN returned a registrant's affidavit of family status and dependents which indicated that his income in the previous year amounted to \$25,000. He further stated that his mother was ZIOTTA SUSMAN of 245 North Soto Street, Los Angeles, California; that he had a brother, KARL SUSMAN of 2257 Blaine, Detroit, Michigan and a sister, SARAH GLICKMAN of 1134 North Chicago Street, Los Angeles, California.

In this affidavit SUSMAN stated that he had charge of all priorities for Government contracts and negotiations of contracts for altimeters, rate of climb indicators, navigation watches, eight day clocks, arm fuses and telescopes being manufactured by the Bulova Watch Company for the United States Air Corps and was in charge of all machine tools and equipment for this war production work.


SUSMAN's Selective Service file also indicated that on July 6, 1944 he notified his Local Board of the birth of a daughter, DIANE MAE, born June 30, 1944.

Inquiry made at the Credit Bureau of Greater New York by WADE FULLER, Special Employee Investigator on May 8, 1946 indicated no reference to SUSMAN in the files of that Bureau.

WADE FULLER on May 20, 1946 made inquiry at the Immigration & Naturalization Service, 70 Columbus Avenue, New York but found no record of SUSMAN at that Service.

The criminal files of the New York City Police Department were likewise checked with negative results.

RE: ABRAHAM GEORGE SILVERMAN ()

The following investigation concerning the activities of ABRAHAM GEORGE SILVERMAN for the period of May 9 and 10, 1946, at which time he was under surveillance in New York City, is reported by Special Agent H. Courtnay Clinchs

At 11:00 am on May 9, 1946, Special Agent Robert Newby of the Washington Field office telephonically advised Special Agent Edward W. Dooley that ABRAHAM GEORGE SILVERMAN had left Washington, D. C. at 8:00 am, Eastern Standard Time, and was due to arrive at Penn Station, New York City, at 12:30 pm on this same date; also that SILVERMAN was occupying seat #20 in car #241. Agent Newby stated that SILVERMAN was accompanied by one JOE GOULD. Newby requested that the contacts of SILVERMAN only be ascertained and that GOULD was not to be placed under surveillance. Special Agents George J. Sullivan and the reporting agent were instructed to proceed to Newark, New Jersey to take up the surveillance of SILVERMAN at that point.

The agents boarded the train at Newark, New Jersey at 1:10 pm and ascertained that SILVERMAN was in car #241. SILVERMAN was conversing with two men, one of whom was believed to have been JOE GOULD and the other not identified. At 1:30 pm, the train arrived at Penn Station, New York City, and SILVERMAN, accompanied by GOULD and the other man previously mentioned, proceeded on foot to the Hotel New Yorker, 34 Street and Eighth Avenue, New York City. At the entrance to the subway at the Hotel New Yorker, GOULD and the other individual departed from SILVERMAN, and SILVERMAN proceeded alone to the desk of the Hotel New Yorker and registered there and was assigned room #1873, to which he proceeded immediately, accompanied only by the bellboy at the Hotel.

SILVERMAN was not observed leaving the hotel during the entire evening, and at 11:40 pm, he was observed entering the hotel. He obtained his key and went directly to his room which he had engaged. At 12:30 am, the surveillance was discontinued.

It was ascertained through a confidential source that reservations for SILVERMAN had been made by the FRENCH SUPPLY MISSION, 111 Broadway, New York City. It was also ascertained that SILVERMAN had received a message from a Mr. FIELD, telephone Circle 7-5766, for SILVERMAN to call him before midnight on this date. At 11:45 pm, SILVERMAN called up and spoke to the Mr. FIELD referred to and addressed him as "JACK". The call involved a business deal which SILVERMAN stated he was attempting to put through and which would net him \$100,000. SILVERMAN also stated that he did not want JOE GOULD mentioned or mixed up in this business deal with him.

At 10:25 pm on this date, a message was left for SILVERMAN to call a Mr. SUSSMAN.(M)

It is to be noted that JACK FIELD was previously contacted by SILVERMAN while in New York City and he is believed to be JACK W. FIELD, 350 West 57 Street, New York City, telephone Circle 7-5766, which number corresponds with the number SILVERMAN made the call to on June 10, 1946.

A review of the New York Field Division indices reflects considerable information concerning JACK FIELD. It has been previously reported in instant case.

The Mr. SUSSMAN referred to herein before is believed to be identical with one JOE SUSSMAN, 125 West 168 Street, New York City, who was previously contacted by ABRAHAM GEORGE SILVERMAN, and concerning whom a letter was forwarded to the New York Field Division requesting an investigation of his background. Special Agent John J. Danahy ascertained the background of SUSSMAN and same has been reported in instant report.

On May 10, 1946, a surveillance was instituted on SILVERMAN at the Hotel New Yorker at 8:00 am, and at 9:35 am, he was observed leaving the hotel. Efforts were made to develop a confidential source of information who might obtain access to the effects of SILVERMAN, but SILVERMAN was not observed returning to the hotel, and it was subsequently determined that he had checked out of the hotel at 1:30 pm on May 10, 1946, and had left no forwarding address. It is believed that SILVERMAN returned to Washington, D. C. inasmuch as he had previously indicated to JACK FIELD that he was going to return to Washington on May 10, 1946.

The surveillance of NATHAN GREGORY SILVERMASTER was conducted by Special Agent Joseph T. Genco, James P. Martin, Thomas J. McShane, John B. Simmons, George J. Sullivan and Michael M. O'Rourke. 41

SILVERMASTER arrived at Penn Station, New York City on May 27, 1946 at 6:44 PM. He then proceeded to the Hotel New Yorker, where he was registered at Room 1056. No further activity for the day was noted.

on May 28, 1946, it was ascertained that SILVEPMASTER, after his leaving his hotel, spent the day at the offices of the War Assets Administration, located at 40 Wall Street, New York City. At 4:50 PM on the same day, SILVERMASTER entered the Hotel New Yorker and proceeded to his room, #1056. At 7:50 PM, SILVERMASTER left the Hotel New Yorker and proceeded by the IRT Subway to 59th Street and Columbus Circle from whence he walked to and entered the Hotel Pierre at 725 Fifth Avenue. He entered the hotel at 8:25 PM and proceeded to Suite 3 wherein a meeting of the New Council of American Business was being held. SILVERMASTER delivered a speech at this meeting. At 11:15 PM, SILVERMASTER left the Hotel Pierre and proceeded by taxicab to a local restaurant where he ate and from whence he proceeded to and entered the Hotel New Yorker where he went to and entered Room 1056. No further activity was noted.

A review of the files of the New York Office reflects that the New Council of American Business is the same as the Businessmen of America. The files further reflect that it was ascertained through a confidential informant that on August 21, 1944 CARL BRISTEL, Publicity Director of the Electronics Corporation of America, contacted GIJ (REEN, then an important functionary of the Communist Political Association, and told him that he was working on an important assignment and wished to consult with him on this assignment, stating that his assignment was connected with business and indicating that he was working on the establishment of a progressive chamber of commerce to compete with the on the establishment of America is presently operating under the name, the New Council of Businessmen of America is presently operating under the name, the New Council of American business, and maintains offices in Washington, D. C. CARLIBRISTEL, referred to, is the Communist Party name for S. A. BECKER, a former editor and business manager of New Masses. BRISTEL is believed to have been in contact with ARTHUP ADAMS, an important Soviet espionage agent who formerly operated in the New York area.

On May 29, 1946 at 7:45 AM, SILVERMASTER left the Hotel New Yorker, proceeded to a local restaurant where he ate breakfast and after eating breakfast, he entered the 34th Street Station of the Seventh Avenue Subway and proceeded to Wall Street from whence he walked to and entered 40 Wall Street, took the elevator to the 7th Floor and entered the offices of the War Assets Administration at 9:00 AM. At 11:10 AM, SILVEPMASTER left 40 Wall Street and accompanied by an unidentified man, described as 6' tall and weighing about 200 lbs., walked to Broadway and Wall Street where they both entered a taxicab. They proceeded in the taxicab to the B. & G. Restaurant, located at 312 Broadway where they both ate. At 12:20 PM, SILVERMASTER alone left the B. & G. Restaurant and walked south on Broadway to 40 Wall Street where he entered. At 1:05 PM, SILVERMASTER left 40 Wall Street, proceeded via the Seventh Avenue Subway to 34th Street and walked to and entered the Hotel New Yorker. At 2:35 PM, SILVERMASTER entered the lobby of the Hotel New Yorker accompanied by two unidentified men described as follows:

One was a United States Army Captain with a patch on his right shoulder containing the words "U. S. Army University Faculty". He is described as follows:

At 2:40 PM, SILVERMASTER and the two unidentified men left the Hotel New Yorker and proceeded out onto 8th Avenue where the Army Captain departed and SILVERMASTER and the other man proceeded to and entered Penn Station, where SILVERMASTER purchased a ticket to Philadelphia for the 3:00 PM train. At 3:00 PM

the unidentified man departed and SILVERMASTER boarded Pennsylvania Hail Road train for Philadelphia. SILVERMASTER was accompanied on this trip to Philadelphia by Special Agents James P. Martin and Thomas J. McShane. During the course of the trip SILVERMASTER was not observed to make any contacts. At 4:45 PM, SILVER-MASTER left the train at the Broad Street Station, Philadelphia. At this point, the surveillance was turned over to the Agents of the Philadelphia Office.

While at the Hotel New York, Special Agents N. M. Kalmes, F. D. O'Brien, D. E. Shannon and Thomas G. Spencer developed a highly confidential source at the Hotel New Yorker which made available the contents of SHVERMASTER's briefcase. A perusal of the material made available by the highly confidential source disclosed that for the most part the writing contained in the briefcase concerned itself with a discussion of the Surplus Property Act, problems of the War Assets Administration, applications for positions with the War Assets Administration and several names and addresses listed as follows:

ascertain activities in the office of Dr. WEINSTEIN at 20 East 53rd Street, NO New York City and who is also in a position to advise of the known contacts who have business with Dr. WEINSTEIN and his associates, supplied the following information regarding the above mentioned activities and contacts.

On May 6, 1946 HERBERT & MAY, a known contact of Dr. WEINSTEIN, informed Dr. WEINSTEIN that he had spent a weekend in the Dominican Republic; that he had just returned; that, further, he contemplated spending the following week in Chicago, Illinois and that for this reason he would have to postpone his dental appointment with Dr. WEINSTEIN for a future date. HERBERT MAY did inform Dr. WEINSTEIN that his son, PHILIP, would be at the office at 4:30 P. M. on the following day and that his other son, HERBERT, JR., would be at the office of Dr. WEINSTEIN on Thursday of that week.

This informant further advised that on May 9, 1946, HERBERT and PHILIP MAY were at the office of Dr. WEINSTEIN and at that time PHILIP MAY advised Dr. WEINSTEIN that his sister-in-law, Mrs. MENTAGO (phonetic) would be in the office on that day.

On May 9, 1946 Mrs. ANNE CHESTER of Woodbourne, New York, contacted the office of Dr. WEINSTEIN relative to a dental appointment. Mrs. ANNE CHESTER is the manager and owner of Chesters Zunborg Lodge at Woodbourne, New York.

ERIC HERNAY, subject of an Internal Security - R investigation, with New York as origin, is a known contact of ARTHUR ADAMS and spent four weeks of his vacation at Chesters Zunborg Lodge, owned and operated by ANNE CHESTER at Woodbourne, New York, in the Summer of 1945.

On May 14, 1946 GREGORY RATOFF, the Hollywood actor, contacted the office of Dr. WEINSTEIN and made an appointment to be at the office of Dr. WEINSTEIN at 3:30 P.M. on that afternoon.

on May 14, 1946 an unknown man, who, the informant advised, spoke with a foreign accent, contacted the office of Dr. WEINSTEIN and was advised at that time that the Doctor was not present. This, unknown man stated that he wanted to know about picking up parcels containing some material to be sent to Yugoslavia. This man said that he thought the Yugoslav Embassy made out the order to him, meaning Dr. WEINSTEIN. No further clarification of this conversation was obtained by the Confidential Informant.

On May 15, 1946 JOSEPH ELSON, husband of RAY ELSON a subject of instant investigation, contacted the office of Dr. WEINSTEIN and advised that he would be in the office of Dr. WEINSTEIN on the following Tuesday at 3:30 P. M. (U)

On May 16, 1946 Mrs. BASIE, wife of COUNT BASIE, the orchestra leader, contacted the office of Dr. WEINSTEIN and inquired about her husband's appointment for that day. She was advised that her husband could come in for a dental appointment at 11:00 A. M. on that date.

On May 17, 1946 JACK LICHTENFELD, A. B. WEINSTEIN'S accountant. contacted the Doctor and advised him that he was going to the West Coast very shortly and that he would visit the Doctor's brother, JOHN WEBER, 9192 North la Jolla Street, Hollywood, California.

NICK CONTE, a Hollywood actor, on May 18, 1946, contacted the office of Dr. WEINSTEIN and made an appointment for 3:30 P. M. on that date.

On May 20, 1946 this informant advised that CLIFFORD ODETS: secretary contacted the office of Dr. WEINSTEIN and advised that Mrs. ODETS would be in for a dental appointment at 11:30 A. W. on the following Wednesday.

Miss McAVOY stated that this woman was quite wealthy and could easily afford a \$25,000 dental fee and that the office should not hesitate to charge her accordingly.

On May 21, 1946 Dr. IEON GERBER, who is employed by Dr. WEINSTEIN, contacted Mr. POLLOCK (phonotic) at the INTERNATIONAL WORKERS ORDER. This informant stated that it was his understanding that POLLOCK was the father-in-law of IEON GERBER. In the discussion that took place between GERBER and POLLOCK they talked of a party named JOEK KUTCHER, who was described as a liberal but not a comrade. IEON GERBER stated that KUTCHER was a former classmate of his and that he was desirous of obtaining a connection with the INTERNATIONAL WORKERS ORDER.

This informant advised that on May 22, 1946 EDGAR SNOW, the writer and a known Communist sympathizer, was at the office of Dr. WEINSTEIN. (X)

On May 22, 1946 this informant advised that BETTY HEART, secretary to Dr. WEINSTEIN, placed a long-distance call to GREGORY EAUTZER at Beverly Hills, California, and at that time BAUTZER stated that he would be in New York on June 8, 1946 for his dental appointment. GREGORY BAUTZER is a well-known Hollysood playboy and he is the individual who introduced HERBERT MAY to Dr. WEINSTEIN.

This informant advised that on May 24, 1946 he was made aware of the fact that Dr. WEINSTEIN was financially embarrassed. On that date there was discussion between employees in Dr. WEINSTEIN's office of having checks signed but holding them to cash them at a later date when funds were available.

On May 24, 1946 LEON GERBER again contacted POLLOCK (phonetic) of the INTERNATIONAL WORKERS ORDER and again a discussion took place regarding the placing of a mutual friend in a job with the INTERNATIONAL WORKERS ORDER.

On May 24, 1946 GERBER contacted an individual identified only as MICKY, who is a cousin of his, and at that time GERBER advised MICKY that his father-in-law was the Treasurer and Assistant Treasurer of the IWO and that the IWO was looking for a dentist for its clinic at 80 - 5th Avenue, New York City. GERBER stated that they were to pay \$85 to \$90 a week for such a dentist. オロト

On May 27, 1946 HERBERT MAY, SR., contacted the office of Dr. WEINSTEIN and advised that he was at that time in Washington, D. C., but stated that he would be in New York the following week for several days and that he would be in to see the Doctor at that time. He remarked that his son, PHILIP, was in New York at that time, while his son, HERBERT, JR., was at present in South America.

On June 5, 1946 a telegram was sent through Western Union from the office of Dr. WEINSTEIN to Mrs. FRIEDA FABKIN, 3711 Canal Road, Northwest, Washington, D. C., which stated, May'e arranged appointment 12:30, June 12, " signed, "Dr. A.B. Weinstein."

On June 4, 1946 Dr. WEINSTEIN was in contact with Dr. HAROID AARON, subject of an Internal Security - C investigation and also the personal physician of Dr. WEINSTEIN.

On June 4. 1946 Dr. ARNOLD GEIGER, 2 East 54th Street, New York City, contacted Dr. WEINSTEIN and stated that he was talking to him on behalf of the Dentists' Committee for the passage of the Murray-Hagner-Dingle Bill and he asked Dr. WEINSTEIN for names of other progressive dentists who might be enlisted to aid in fighting for the passage of this bill. Dr. WEINSTEIN told Dr. GEIGER that most of the dentists he knew would be anti so far as this bill was concerned but he did agree to enlist his own staff and to mail a financial contribution to the Committee through Dr. GEIGER.

On June 6, 1946 BARNEY JOSEPHSON, subject of an Internal Security - C investigation and the owner and operator of the nightclub CAFE SOCIETY, DOWNTOWN in New York City, contacted Dr. WEINSTEIN and a conversation ensued pertaining to personal matters.

At that time IENORE stated she would be in to see him at his office on Wednesday of that week for a physical examination. At that time she advised that her husband, AEE, complained that he had a pain on his left side and he was worried about his heart, so that he would be in to see the Doctor on Monday. Dr. AARON advised that he and his family were living in Weston, Connecticut and that he himself was there weekends.

JOHN WEBER is a brother of Dr. A. B. WEINSTEIN and resides in Hollywood, California.

on May 25, 1946 ADEIE IEVINE, a friend of IENORE WEINSTEIN's, contacted IENORE. A discussion took place at that time concerning President Harry Truman's speech on the night before. In this conversation IENORE stated that in her opinion JOHN L. IENIS is a Fascist and is holding out on the miners she said that ABE knew the condition of the miners because he had worked with them in Chio. ADEIE stated that her husband was ready to join the Party last night he was so mad at Truman's speech.

On May 26, 1946 this informant advised that NICK CONTE, movie actor, spoke with IENCRE WEINSTEIN, stating that he hoped to see the WEINSTEINS real soon. He stated that ABE had mentioned the possibility of going to Quebec in the near future.

On this same date the informant advised that ABRAHAN B. WEINSTEIN contacted his brother, JOE WEINSTEIN, and a discussion took place concerning business. During this discussion ARE told his brother JOE that he had borrowed \$5,000 from BARNEY JOSEPHSON and that he intended to pay it back with the money JOE would get from his new partnership transaction. He also stated that JOE had recently been served with a summons for non-payment of a bill and for this reason he had to go to court.

On May 29, 1946 this informant advised that LENGRE WEINSTEIN told a friend of hers that MARJORIE CHODOROV was going to get married on the following day at the WEINSTEIN'S in Stamford, Connecticut.

This same informant advised on this date that JOSEPH ROBERTS, who is a functionary in the State Communist Party in Connecticut and who was formerly connected with the Communist Party in Brooklyn, New York, was staying at the home of Dr. WEINSTEIN and that while there he was contacted by



On June 2, 1946 LECNARD FARKER, Communist Party member from New London, Connecticut, contacted the home of Dr. A. B. WEINSTEIN and left a message with Dr. WEINSTEIN's brother, MORRIS WEINSTEIN, for him to ascertain if AEE would be free to meet with some medical students in New Haven on Thursday of that week.

On June 6, 1946 this informant advised that LENGRE WEINSTEIN sent a night letter through Western Union to JOHN WEBER, Hollywood, California, which stated, "Reminder today Mamma's birthday. Love all of you," signed, "My rris." The MORRIS who signed this letter is undoubtedly MORRIS WEINSTEIN, brother of Dr. A. B. WEINSTEIN, who resides with the Doctor at Stamford, Connecticut.
