The following investigation was conducted by Special Agent W. RAYMOND WANNALL:

On August 1, 1946, Special Agents ROBERT W. McCASLIN and VINCENT W. HUGHES conducted a surveillance on ADLER. He was observed leaving the Hotel Washington, where he was then residing, at 6:40 p.m. with a man driving a car registered to LEONARD E.X.CKERMAN, previously identified in this investigation. ADLER and the driver, apparently ACKERMAN, rode to 2912 Dunbarton Street, N. W., the occupants of which address have previously been identified as Miss GENE (IRISH, an employee of the Naval Ordnance Laboratories, Miss MARJORIE MICHTENBERG, an employee of the Treasury Department, and Miss MARJAN GORE, an employee of the State Department. Both men entered this house. At 7:25 p.m. they left accompanied by an unidentified woman described as being about 30 years old, 5'7" tall, and weighing 130 pounds. She was of medium build having dark hair and wearing eyoglasses. All three individuals had dinner together at Hall's Restaurant, 7th and K Streets, S. W. They subsequently returned to 2912 Dunbarton Street.

At 10:45 p.m. DLER and his companion, believed to be ACKERMAN, left the house carrying a wooden box, which measured approximately two feet square, and returned to the Hotel Washington. ADLER took the box to his room and the driver rode off in the car.

From a highly confidential source at the Hotel Washington, Special Agents GEORGE E. DLVIS, VINCENT W. HUGHES, and W. RLYMOND WANNALL, learned on August 2, 1946, that this box contained some used pieces of electrical equipment, including an iron, a percolator and some foodstuffs.

Special agents BERT H. HELCOCK and JOSEPH J. KEECH on august 2, 1946, observed DLER leaving the Treasury Department at 6:03 p.m. with an unknown man and an unknown woman. The man appeared to be between 32 and 36 years old, 5'8" tall, and weighing 165 pounds. He had a fair complexion, blue eyes, medium brown hair, and his teeth were large and stained. He had a cut scar on the right side of his face near his chin. He was wearing brown rimmed glasses, and appeared to be clean-cut and not Jewish. The woman appeared to be between 26 and 30 years old, 5'3" tall, 125 pounds in weight, light skin, blue eyes, and dark brown hair which she wore in an upsweep, She was wearing glasses with colorless rims and appeared to be of the Jewish race.

The unknown man was carrying a cardboard box which LDLER took to his hotel room in the Washington Hotel. From the above mentioned confidential

source it was learned that the box contained canned foodstuffs. In the Eld man and woman proceeded by streetcar and taxi to 8425 Woodclift Road, Silver Spring, Maryland, which appeared to be the residence of the man and woman. IDLER spent the entire evening at this address. He was observed by surveilling agents having dinner and drinks with the unknown man and woman.

On August 14, 1946, the writer learned that Chesapeake & Potomac Telephone Company Number SLigo 4447 is listed to ARTHUR W. STULRT, 8425 Wood-clift Road. Background information concerning STULRT will be obtained and set forth in a subsequent report.

The following physical surveillance was conducted by Special Agents EARL L. FUOSS and AUBREY S. BRENT on August 3, 1946:

at 10 a.m. ADLER and a Naval Officer, later identified as Lieutenant Commander HARAID W. JACOBSON, had breakfast together in the Skyroom of the Hotel Washington. They Yeft the Skyroom at 11:30 a.m. ADLER returned to his room and JACOBSON proceeded to the Carey Winston Realty Company, 739 - 15th Street, N. W., where he entered the office and paid rent on the apartment which it was learned he occupies at 2017 O Street, N. W. Surveilling agents were able to determine that JACOBSON rented this apartment July 1, 1946, and that his previous was the Hotel Washington. An effort will be made to secure background ormation on JACOBSON to be included in the next report.

At 12:50 p.m. surveilling agents observed LDLER enter a phone booth in the lobby of the Hotel Mashington and overheard him place a call to DOROTHY KAPLAN, the wife of IRVING KAPLAN, a subject in this case. LDLER arranged to meet DOROTHY KAPLAN at the F Street exit of the Hotel Washington, at 7 p.m. the same day, in order that he might take her to dinner and then meet her husband who was arriving by plane at the Mashington Lirport that evening.

It 12:55 p.m. iDLER met a man of Chinese nationality (believed to be S. C. WONG of the China Supply Commission) in the lobby of the hotel and had lunch with this individual at the Occidental Hotel on Pennsylvania Avenue between 14th and 15th Streets, N. W. Thereafter iDLER returned to his hotel room. It 2:30 p.m. iDLER was observed to leave the hotel and proceed by streetcar to 5410 Cathedral Avenue, the residence of HiROLD GLASSER, a subject in this case. Thereafter he was observed talking with a woman believed to be Mrs. GLASSER, and a young girl on the porch of this residence. He remained there until 6:20 p.m. at which time he returned to his hotel.

Special Agents KENNERLY R. CORBETT and EDGLR L. C.RTER continued this surveillance on August 3, 1946, with the following results:

at 7:03 p.m. ADLER left the hotel and entered a car driven by Mrs.

IRVING KAPLAN. Mrs. KAPLAN and ADLER proceeded to the National Arport, where they had dinner together in the airport restaurant. It 8:15 p.m. IRVING KAPLAN and an individual later identified to be MURRAY A MATTIMER, a subject in this case, arrived by plane and joined ADLER and Mrs. KAPLAN. The four individuals left the airport in KAPLAN'S car and at 8:45 p.m. the individual determined to be LATIMER left the car at the Export-Import Bank on 15th Street. A surveillance on ADLER was then dropped in order to establish the identity of LATIMER. It had been previously reported by Confidential Informant that ADLER was planning to spend an evening with the KAPLANS as soon as IRVING KAPLAN arrived back in town.

On August 4, 1946, Special agents O. R. Talburtt and John T. Flynn observed ADLER leave the Hotel Mashington at 2:20 p.m. with an individual later determined to be SOLLISCHINSKY, a subject in this case. ADLER and LISCHINSKY proceeded on foot to a maroon Pontiac sedan belonging to LISCHINSKY, which was parked on Pennsylvania avenue, and in which three men and two women were waiting. The party then proceeded to the arlington City Hot Shoppe Restaurant across the 14th Street bridge, where they had dinner. After dinner they drove around Haines Point, finally parking on the inbound side where they were observed playing cards on the grass.

Agents DONALD CHASE and ROBERT W. McCASLIN, who relieved agents
TALBURTT and FLYNN on this surveillance, noted that ADLER and his companions
left Haines Point at 4:40 p.m. and drove in LISCHINSKY'S car to 11th and F
Streets, N. W., in Washington. ADLER left the party here and boarded a Falls
Church, Virginia, bus in order to get to arlington, Virginia, where he entered
the house at 1918 North Roosevelt Street. At 5:50 p.m. ADLER was observed in
and around this house until 11:30 p.m. when the surveillance was discontinued.
It was noted that the lights in the lower part of the house went out at 11 p.m.
and it appeared that ADLER was planning to spend the night there.

The writer on August 15, 1946, ascertained from Mr. ROBERT COPELIND, Postmaster, Preston King Station, Arlington, Virginia, that FLINK COE, a Government employee, is the occupant at 1918 North Roosevelt Street. The report in this case by Special agent LAMBERT G. ZANDER dated august 16, 1946, reflects that on July 19, 1946, ADLER entered rooms 902-903 at 1818 H Street, N. W., which had the name "Mr. COE" on the door. It is believed that FRANK COE of 1918 North Roosevelt Street, Arlington, Virginia, is identical with this person. COE is being investigated as a separate subject in this case and the results of this investigation will be reported at a later date.

On August 5, 1946, the writer observed ADLER leave his hotel at 8:40 a.m. and proceed to the Public Health Service, 4th and C Streets, S. H., where he received an injection in his arm.

On the same day Special agents H. DUDLEY PAYME and AUBREY S. BRENT

learned from issistant Manager Hirdling of the Hotel Mashington that a pan of Chinese extraction and by the name of KTING asked Mr. Hirdling for permission to send some packages to the hotel and take them directly to Mr. idler's room rather than leave them at the desk. It approximately 5:45 p.m. Special igent VINCENT W. HUGHES ascertained that these packages had just been delivered. He learned that they consisted of one large manila envelope and one small white envelope. One envelope was addressed to the Chinese Communications Office, Nanking, China, and bore the return address of "ChuyChinyMang, Chinese Supply Commission." The other was addressed to Mrs. Liuring Micker, U. S. Embassy, Manking, China, and bore the return address of "O'CONNELL, 8320 - 16th Street, Silver Spring, Maryland."
No information is presently available concerning Mrs. Liuring Maryland."

During the evening of Lugust 5, 1946, aDLER was surveilled by agents PAYNE and BRENT with the following results:

At 5:55 p.m. LDLER and an unknown man were observed emerging from the Treasury Euilding and proceeding to the Hotel washington. It was noted that the unknown man walked up and down in the lobby apparently observing the individuals sitting therein before taking the elevator to ADLER'S room. At 8:30 p.m. DIER, SOL LISCHINSKY, and the same unknown man emerged from the elevator in the Hotel Hashington and proceeded on foot to O'Donnell's Restaurant at 12th and E Streets. The three individuals had dinner there. They left at 9:15 p.m. and walked to a parking lot in the neighborhood, where they entered LISCHINSKY'S automobile. They then proceeded to the Farmers Market, 11th and E Streets, where they purchased a watermelon. Next they proceeded to 2716 - 29th Street, S. E., where ADLER and LISCHINSKY entered the apartment building at that address and remained there for several minutes; returning to the car, they then drove to 2022 Ft. Davis Street, S.E., the residence of LISCHINSKY, where they ate the watermelon. Immediately upon their arrival at HISCHINSKY'S house ADLER was overheard by surveilling agents to make a telephone call, during which he stated that he was leaving the following morning at about 7 a.m. ADLER was heard to request the individual to whom he was speaking to thank GEORGE for everything. It was later ascertained that ADLER was talking to SARAH SILVERNAN and apparently wanted her to thank GEORGE as GEORGE was then out of town.

Lt 12:10 a.m. LDLER, LISCHINSKY and the unknown man together with LISCHINSKY'S wife left the house and proceeded by car to the Hotel Washington, where ADLER and the unknown man got out. The unknown man, upon leaving the car, walked from the 15th Street entrance of the hotel to the corner of 15th and F Streets. He then returned to the vicinity of the car and then walked immediately back to the corner of 15th and F Streets, where he stood around the corner of the hotel in a position where he could not be seen from the 15th Street entrance. When a Friendship Heights trolley made its appearance on 15th Street he ran to the platform and boarded the streetcar and sat in one of the extreme rear seats of the vehicle. He left the car at 25th and Pennsylvania Lvenue, N. ... and was



observed entering the apartment building at 2500 K Street, N. W. at 12:50 a.m.

On August 15, 1946, in an effort to identify the unknown man mentioned above agents PLYNE and BRENT surveilled him from the apartment house located at 2500 K Street, N. W. to a streetcar which was proceeding to 17th and Pennsylvania avenue, S. E. Aboard the car, Special Agents CHARLES D. CHAPMAN and WILLIAM E. CLARK took over the surveillance. Later agents observed the unknown man enter the National Metropolitan Bank, after he had looked around and observed the people outside the bank. Inside the bank he made a deposit. Agent CLARK learned from R. E. WOODYLRD, the teller to whom the deposit had been made, that the unknown man was JOSEPH SILVERMAN, 2500 K Street, N. W. WOODYLRD advised SILVERMAN deposited \$110 in new ten dollar bills and a U. S. Treasury check in the amount of \$148.80. The bank record of SILVERMAN gave his address as 1740 P Street, N.W. and his occupation as economist, U. S. Treasury Department. SILVERMAN reported that he was a citizen of the United States at the time he opened his account on October 11, 1943. The account was closed June 30, 1945, and when it was subsequently reopened (date not indicated) a new address was snown as 2500 K Street, N. W. The report of Special Agent LABERT G. ZANDER dated June 17, 1946, in this investigation, sets forth on Page 165 information reflecting that GEORGE SILVERMAN, a subject in this case, has a brother named JOE SILVERMAN. An effort will be made to determine if the JOSEPH SILVERIAN identified above is identical with JON SILVERMAN, GEORGE SILVERMAN'S brother.

On August 6, 1946, Special Agents EARL L. FUOSS and W. RAYMOND WANNALL conducted the following physical surveillance:



CHAPPIN which reflected the following information:

Foreign report from The Credit Bureau of Greater New York, Inc., dated April 9, 1945 reflected that DUNAMAY is presently residing at 2607 Forest Glen, Forest Glen, Maryland. He formerly resided from 1939 at 345 West 12th Street, New York City, from 1937 to 1939 at 27 East 11th Street, New York City, and prior to that time at Minneapolis, Minnesota. The records of November 22, 1939 indicate he employed by the Senate Committee on Interstate Commerce, 45 Broadway, New York City, since 1938. He held the position of information specialist at a salary of \$3200 and was highly regarded. This committee is no longer in existence.

Local credit report indicated that DUNATAY was born in 1911 and resides in Forest Glen, Maryland. He held the rank of master sergeant in the U. S. Army and was assigned to the Pentagon Building. His wife, LILLIAN, is employed by the Board of Education, Montgomery County, Maryland, as a teacher in the Montgomery High School and is receiving a salary of \$2100.

The following is a summarization of the data supplied by Confidential Informant during the period from December 15, 1945 to June 30, 1946. This information is being set out to indicate the contacts of DUNAWAY with other known subjects in the case.

On December 15, 1945 Mrs. HAIPERIN contacted PHILIP DUNAWAY whom she advised she is desirous of borrowing a cot inasmuch as her parents are coming to town. She mentioned that she could borrow one from DAVID WAHL but if she could get one from DUNAWAY it would be closer home.

On December 19, 1945 LILIIII DUNINAY and Mrs. HALPERIN engaged in social chatter during the course of which Mrs. DUNAWAY mentioned that she was at a meeting on the previous night where she met the leader of the Danish Underground who is now in charge of a Danish newspaper.

On December 26, 1945 it was ascertained from the informant that MAURICE HAIPERIN advised PHILIP DUNAWAY that DAVID WHIL will be over at 10:30 that evening, consequently, the wants DUNAWAY to come over there for a "little conversation".

On December 28, 1945 MAURICE HALPERIN invited DAVID WAHL and PHILIP DUWAMY to his home that evening. WAHL could not make it so

it was agreed that the HALPERINS would call on the DUNAMAYS

On December 30, 1945 MAURICE HAIPERIN conferred with PHILIP DUNAWAY concerning international matters in O.S.S. HAIPERIN asked if the orders had been issued yet and who had notified about this. DUNAWAY noted that UNILIAM LANGER might, however, JUST (phonetic) or MANAWAY (phonetic) are not aware of the situation. HAIPERIN believes the delay is significant but the orders may come through on Monday. DUNAWAY replied that the whole thing has been placed before the "big boss" and there is a choice of five features ranging from utter centralization to utter decentralization. MAURICE HAIPERIN later contacted DAVID WALL whom he advised he will call on tonight. They both regretted that the DUNAWAYS could not both be present.

On December 31, 1945 MAURICE HAIPERIN again conferred with PHILIP DUNAWAY. They discussed various matters with reference to 0.5.5. and in particular to various proposals with what appeared to be reorganization. HALPERIN, DUNAWAY, and possibly DAVID WAHL will get together that night.

On March 22, 1946 HAIPERIN informed PHILIP DUNAWAY that ROGERS, TERRY SOROCCA, and himself will come over to DUNAWAY home again away.

On March 23, 1946 an unidentified woman informed Mrs. HAL-PERIN that MARY JANE (KEENEY) would be over that afternoon, consequently, she would like Mrs. HAIPERIN to stop in for a little while. Mrs. HAIPERIN explained that she had been invited to the DUNAWAY home whereupon the unidentified woman remarked that she had talked with PHILIP DUNAWAY who had mentioned something about MARY JANE being there.

which time she inquired as to whether Mrs. HAPERIN knows ELLEN ROSENBERG. Mrs. HAPERIN does not know Mr. ROSENBERG so Mrs. DUNKWAY advised that her husband was going to Baltimore, Maryland with ROSENBERG and other men on the following day.

PHILIP LUNAMLY invited MAURICE HAIPERIN to his home on May 21, 1946 to meet ROBERT LAND and CARL GREEN, both of the CIO offices in Washington.

On May 22, 1946 LILLIAN DUNAWAY informed Mrs. HALPERIN that she and her husband are going to act as baby sitters for the DAVID WARLS

inasmuch as they are attending a banquet on that night (banquet of Southern Conference on Human Welfare).

On May 23, 1946 PHILIP DIMAMAY conferred with THEODORE HAIPERIN. HAIPERIN advised he is looking for a job.in journalism and towards this end he has contacted RUSSANIXON, EUGENE COTTON, SETH LEVINE, LEM OFFICIAL AS Well as DECAUX! assistant, HENRY C. FLEISHER. HAIPERIN further related that FLEISHER sent him to see TRAVISANDRICK of Federated Press and HELER FULLER. PHILIP DUNAWAY mentioned IZZIE STONE of "The Nation" and PM Newspaper. DUNAWAY advised that a friend of his by the name of ERUCE WAYVER is working for RUSS NIXON and that this individual will work in the government to him, DUNAWAY, and to BERNIE BERNSTEIN in Europe. WAYVER is with the Washington Office of the United Electrical Workers and according to DUNAWAY is a "very nice fellow". DUNAWAY told HAIPERIN that PARMEBER is the head of the PAC in New York, his address being 205 East 42nd Street, New York City, telephone Murray Hill 3-5580. DUNAWAY described this person as being an old friend of his as well as CARL GREEN and BOBYLANG

On May 25, 1946 LYNN RYAN visited the home of MAURICE HAL-PERIN. HAIPERIN and RYAN then visited the DUNAMAYS

It was learned on May 27, 1946 that MAURICE HALPERIN informed DAVID WAHL that his friends, CARL GREEN, MAYNARD GERTLER, and Mrs.) OFFICER, had arrived, and it was agreed that MAHL and PHILIP DUNAMAY WILL be over shortly.

On May 31, 1946 MAURICE HALPERIN conferred with PHILIP and LILLIAN DUNAWAY. He mentioned the fact that MILIAN PPLEBAUM was in town and invited the DUNAWAYS to his home. She stated that BOR ROGERS and MOOD-ROW BORAH will also be present.

On June 2, 1946 MAURICE HAIPERIN inquired of PHILIP DUNAWAY concerning their projected trip to New York. DUNAWAY advised that he will go to New York on Tuesday and requested that HAIPERIN get in touch with him through a friend, Mr. DEISS, or his secretary, Miss DIAMOND, at Murray Hill 5-0811.

On June 3, 1946 PHILIP DUNAWAY contacted MAURICE HAIPERIN during which time they discussed three important Supreme Court decisions, the ban on racial segregation on interstate buses and trains, the announcement was unconstitutional on the act of Congress which denied employment

to three former employees of the Government, and the Civil Rights case wherein the Miami Herald was upheld in its criticism of the Court. H/L-PEPIN stated "we have a very fine court here".

JOSEPH GREGG contacted MAURICE HALPERIN on June 11, 1946 for the purpose of advising him about the FM radio station deal. In this connection it was stated that ED BRICKER is connected with a corporation. HALPERIN mentioned that PHILIP DUNAMAY is acquainted with BRICKER and that he will have DUNAMAY put in a good work for GREGG and see what the prospects might be for a job.

On June 17, 1946 HILLIAN DUNAWAY advised EDITH HALPERIN that MARY JANE KEENEY would be at her house that evening.

On June 18, 1946 MAURICE HAIPERTH informed PHILIP DUNAWAY concerning his trip to New York City. DUNAWAY stated that he did not know whether he would remain in Washington, D. C. but said that he would keep "the tring" open in New York.

DAVID WAIL, a visitor at the HAIPERINS, conferred with OSCAR and operations of various people in the American Jewish Conference. WAIL mentioned that he is interested in seeing that the committee on the American Jewish Conference obtain several live wire members. He recommended PHILIP DUNAWAY whom he described as having been in charge of all the reports and operations for the research and analysis branch of O.S.S.

On June 27, 1946 during a conversation between LILLIAN DUNA-WAY and THEODORE HALPERIN; LILLIAN stated that they expected to go to MAY-NARD GERTLER'S farm for the week-end and stated a friend of MAURICE HALPER-IN, namely, JOSEPHOJOSEPHS, was visiting them and had just left.

The following investigation was conducted by Special Agent H. DUDLEY PAYNE.

During the period from August 1 through August 15, 1946, the mail cover placed on the subject was not productive.

Confidential Informant furnished the following information concerning FITZGERALD's activities from August 1st through August 15th

On August 1, 1946, V. LEVIS BASSIE was in contact with REBECCAH and EDVARD FITZGERALD, at which time REBECCAH stated that she was leaving the following morning. BASSIE, who is employed in the office of Secretary MALLACE, discussed with FITZGERALD various Governmental departments and petroleum. FITZGERALD mentioned he was having a meeting at 10 Ali the following morning with a man from Secretary KRUG's office; regarding a letter which was to be checked prior to being sent to Secretary WALLACE's office

On August 5, 1946, EDWARD FITZGERAID advised his maid SARAH that he was leaving on Friday, August 9th, and would be gone for approximately 3 weeks.

On August 6, 1946, FITZGERALD made arrangements to borrow a suitcase from his maid, SARAH, as he wanted to take some "books and things" with him

August 7, 1946, EDWARD FITZGERALD contacted lies. HUTCHINSON, who is bette take REBECCAH's check to the Limsey Trust Company for deposit

On August 8, 1946, FITZGERALD's made, SARAH, advised him she was preparing his clothes for his departure the following morning.

Under pretext, it was ascertained that FITZGERALD left Washington on the morning of August 9th, and would not return until the day after Labor Day. While FITZGERALD is away from Washington, it was reported he could be reached c/o F. LEROY SMITH, 25 Central Avenue, Wellsboro, Pennsylvania. F. LEROY SMITH is the stepfather of REBECCAH FITZGERALD.

The Washington Field Office files reflected that BERTHA BLAIR, who has previously been in contact with REBECCAH FITZGERALD, was a subject of a Hatch Act investigation by this office in 1942, at which time she was employed as an economist at the Railroad Retirement Board, Washington, D. C. This investigation indicated that BERTHA BLAIR was listed by the Dies Committee as a member of the Washington Committee for Democratic Action, and that her name appeared in the active indices for this committee. Her name is also A

Liberties, American Peace Mobilization, and a member representing the Washington Council for the National Negro Congress. During the interview, BERTHA BLAIR stated she was not a member of the Communist Party, but refused to state what organizations in which she was a member. She is reportedly presently residing at 2221 Observatory Place, N. W.

The following information has been obtained concerning NALPH and HABEL WHEATON, who have been in frequent contact with the FITZGEPALDS. Records of Stone's Kercantile Agency reflect in a report dated October 1, 1940 that RALPH HAWHEATON resides at 3612 Macomb Street, N. W.; his wife, HABELWHEATON, resides with him, and both were said to be unemployed. Mrs. WHEATON's mother, JULIA EXWOLFE, also lives with them. According to this report, they had recently returned to Washington from Asheville, North Carolina, where they had spent several years.

The Credit Bureau files reflect that RALPH THEATON is approximately 43 years of age, and that he was formerly connected with the National Cash Register Company for 25 years, was with the local office for six months, and was released due to ill health.

The mail cover placed on above-captioned subject from August 1 through August 15, 1946, produced negative results

On July 6, 1946, Lr. and Lrs. HAROLD GLASSER received a letter from EZEKIEL, East Blue Hill, Maine, and subsequent investigation conducted by Special Agent DARREL B. CURRIE, Boston Field Division, on July 30, 1946, disclosed the following information:

There was only one family named EZEKIEL in the East Blue Hill, Maine, area and that was the family of Ir. MORDECAI EZEKIAI who were living at what is known as the LINEAR Cottage in East Blue Hill. Hrs. LUCILLE EZEKIAL and her three young children arrived at the cottage about June 13,-1946, and lived there alone until Ir. EZEKIAL arrived on July 30, 1946. It is believed that he is connected with UNRRA and had just arrived from Athens, Greece, by way of London. This is the first time the family has visited the Blue Hill area. Their home address is 5000 Allandale-Road, Friendship Post Office, Washington, D. C. They rented the cottage for the summer through Ir. L. HARVEY POE, 1005 East Marshall Street, Richmond, Virginia. He is an agent for the owner, The National Metropolitan Bank of Washington, D. C. It is believed that the property has since been sold, however.

A sister of lrs. EZEKILL has been coming to East Blue Hill for several summers and it is believed that she influenced the EZEKIALS to come there this year. Her name is MAXIMEXFINSTERTALD and her address is 242 west 11th Street, New York City. She claims to be a free-lance writer and uses the pen name, MAXIMEXILOD. She wrote a play while visiting there last summer.

BARRO, whose address is the Abraham Lincoln School, 30 Lest ashington Street, Chicago, Illinois. It is believed that both these persons have been active in the Russian War Relief program. Both of them receive the "Daily Worker" and the "New Masses" regularly.

Since the above information concerns the only EZEKIAL family known at East Blue Hill, Maine, it is believed this is the one referred to in the reference letter.

It will be noted that the EZEKIAIS described above are intimate friends of the GLASSERS and this association has been indicated in previous reports.

In a letter dated August 8, 1946, to the Washington Field Division, the Bureau advised that the President had approved the United States Delegation to the Fifth Session of the Council of the United Nations Relief and Rehabilitation Administration which is scheduled to convene at Geneva, Switzerland, on August 5, 1946. The major items on the agenda of the Fifth Session are food, displaced persons, UNRRA finances, UNRRA's relations with the General Assembly of the United Nations, the Chinese program, and the future of UNRRA.

HAROLD GLASSER, Associate Director, Division of Monetary Research, Treasury Department, was listed as one of the advisors to the Council member, WILLIAM L. CLAYTON, Assistant Secretary of State.

A discreet inquiry at UIRRA failed to confirm this information. However, an appropriate pretext call to the office of HAROLD GLASSER revealed that the subject had departed for the UNRRA Convention at Geneva, Switzerland, the first week of August, 1946, and was expected to return to Washington around August 25, 1946.

On August 15, 1946, Fr. JOHN E. ELLIOTT, Assistant Superintendent, Friendship Heights Post Office, advised that Mrs. FAY GLASSER had submitted a temporary change of address card on August 13 which indicated that for seven days her address would be Vinda Bona Hotel, Braddock Heights, Maryland.

A physical surveillance of the GIASSER residence confirmed the fact that it was unoccupied.

Confidential informants of this office have furnished no further information regarding the activities of HAROLD GLASSER.

Information was received from J. E. ELLIOT, Assistant Superintendent, the Friendship Heights Station of the United States Post Office, that MICHAEL GREENBERG had given his change of address as 20 East 80th Street, New York City. Mr. EILIOT stated that this change of address was given approximately August 1, 1946.

On August 15, 1946, it was learned through pretext from Mr. M. F. DAY, who resides at 4884 MacArthur Boulevard, Apartment 108, that the subject had moved but he was unable to say where he had gone. He further advised that the present occupant of Apartment 107, where GREENBERG formerly lived, is HOWARD DANTEL. Mr. DAY was unable to furnish further information concerning CREENBERG.

On August 16, 1946, EDITH BARBOUR, who resides at 4884 MacArthur Boulevard, NW, Apartment 106, advised, when contacted under pretext, that she knew MICHAEL GREENBERG but was unable to say where he had moved, however, she did say that she knew he had moved from Washington on or about the first of August, 1946.

Reference is made to the letter from the Baltimore Field Office to the Washington Field Office dated August 9, 1946, requesting background information on HORACE W. BYERS, 1719 O'Sullivan Building, who on April 8, 1946, mailed a letter to MICHAEL GREENBERG, Apartment 107, 4884 MacArthur Boulevara, Washington, D. C. The following information is set forth in the above mentioned letter:

Observation at 1719 O'Sullivan Building reflected that the occupant was "MOODY'S INVESTORS SERVICE, HORACE W. EYERS, Representative."

The Baltimore City Telephone Directory reflected one HORACE W. BYERS as a physician residing at 509 Woodlawn Road. The records of the Credit Bureau of Baltimore, Inc. reflected HORACE W. BYERS, wife SALLIEYBYERS, was SERVICE and had resided at the local representative for MOODY'S INVESTORS 509 Woodlawn Road since the Spring of 1927. BYERS was indicated to be 56 to 57 years of age, the son of the late JAMES WELLINGTON BYERS of Charlotte,

North Carolina, and that he had been connected with MOODY'S INVESTEES SERVICE as local representative since 1930.

The report further indicated that BYERS had formerly been a physician, having graduated from the University of Maryland in the class of 1914, and practiced his profession with offices located in the Medical Arts Building until about 1930. The subject's credit record appeared to be in good standing and there was no explanation as to why he had given up the practice in the medical profession.

Iocal Selecting Service Board Number 11 in Baltimore shows a record of one HORACE BYERS indicating that an enlistment notice had been received by the Board at the time he had gone into service with the Maryland National Guard.



Mr. CHARLES LORD of the firm BAKER, WATTS & COMPANY, Investment Securities, advised that HORAJE W. BYERS, the local representative for MOODY'S INVESTORS. SERVICE, had been furnishing this servie to BAKER, WATTS & COMPANY over a long period of time and was well regarded by the entire firm. Mr. LORD advised, however, that aside from satisfactory business deals with him nothing was known concerning BYERS personally by himself or the members of his firm.

Dr. HENRY CULLENBERG, Secretary of the Maryland State Board of Medical Examiners, made available the records of that Board, which reflect that HORACE W. BYERS, who was originally from Charlotte, North Carolina, had attended Hampton Sidney College of Virginia and the University of Maryland Medical School. He was admitted to the practice of medicine in July, 1914. The records indicated that Mr. BYERS is still authorized to practice medicine in the State of Maryland, however, it was noted that he had not become a member of the Medical Association in recent years. Dr. CULLENBERG stated he himself was not familiar with this individual, although he had been Secretary of the Board of Medical Examiners since 1918. He stated that it is rather unusual for a man to cease practice in medicine, especially after having engaged in practice over a period of several years, but added there was no indication that BYERS had in any way been forced to give up practicing because of any unethical practices, or because of any type of derogatory information concerning him.

In the fall of 1941 the Washington Field Division was office of origin in an investigation entitled "JOHN HAZZARD, aka John Newbold Hazzard - Information Concerning," the results of which are set forth as follows:

Investigation reflected that HAZZARD received an AB degree from Yale 1926-1930, and an ILB degree from Harvard, 1931-1934. He received a Certificate in Soviet Law from the Moscow Juridical Institute in Moscow, 1935-1937, and a JSD degree from the University of Chicago, 1938-1939.

The following information was made available by Miss MLRY O. JONES, Personnel Office, Office of Emergency Management, in September, 1941; this information was contained in an application which HLZZLRD filed:

HAZZLRD was born January 5, 1909, and his residence at that time was 205 East 78th Street, New York City. He was employed from September, 1934, to December, 1937, with the Institute of Current World Affairs as an associate delegate to the USSR to study Soviet law. From January, 1938, to March, 1939, he followed the same course of employment jointly with the University of Chicago at Chicago and received a remuneration from continued institute payments and also fees as a lecturer on the Soviet form of government. From July, 1939, to 1941 he was employed by Baldwin, Todd and Young as an attorney at 120 Broadway, New York City. The background of applicant's family is as follows:

applicant was born in the United States in Syracuse County, arandago, New York. His wife was born in Cambridge, Massachusetts. His father was born at Peace Dale, Rhode Island, and his mother at Frederick, Maryland. Contained in the application is a statement by applicant that his experience had taught him the Russian language and customs and given him a thorough knowledge of the Soviet government and Soviet law, which he felt would be advantageous in dealing with the Soviet government and Soviet corporation. He stated that the experience had added to his education qualifications and had also given him administrative experience in dealing with the administration of various university departments. The experience familiarized him with practical problems in the practice of law, while practicing and acting as a specialist in Soviet law. He stated that he had made numerous contacts with Soviet officials, attorneys and commercial representatives. He stated further that he had been a lecturer at Columbia University on Soviet political institutions. Chion & XHazard

He gave his wife's name as SUSAN LY HAZZARD, address, 205 East 78th Street, New York City. The personnel record of the Office of Emergency Management showed that applicant in September, 1941, was then employed as a principal liaison officer, grade C.F-13, and stated that he handled all relations with Russia as to Defense iid Reports in connection with procurement and furnishing of defense materials to Russia under Lend-Lease, and also had charge of the examination, approval and disapproval of the request of the USSR to make direct purchases, and the handling and expediting of the solution of all problems arising therein. He was reported to be the liaison man with the diplomatic representatives and Purchasing Commission of the USSR and the Lmtorg.

Investigation by auxiliary offices verified HAZZARD'S education and employment and failed to develop any derogatory information concerning his loyalty, integrity and discretion. This investigation reflected that HEZZLRD was the author of numerous books and articles dealing primarily with various phases of Soviet law.

The New Haven Field Division in a report of Special agent J. C. PORTE dated October 3, 1941, set forth information which HAZZARD furnished the Yale Llumni Lssociation concerning himself for use in compiling a bicennial class book. L letter which he wrote on the back of his questionnaire dated September 8, 1939, reads as follows:



"Left since graduation. Expect one continuous series of surprises and pleasantly unusual experiences. Nothing was ever as hard as the three years in Law School in Harvard, but nothing was ever as unusual or enjoyable as the three years in Moscow Law School, I find that I have become so thoroughly familiar with the theories of Communist writers and the goals they set, that life in the mid 20th Century takes on a good deal more meaning than otherwise might have been the case, since one of the important forces working in our society is not any longer to me some queer sort of movement about win I could learn nothing. I have developed considerable tolerance of late years. I do not get riled at Father Devine or Franklin D. Roosevelt. I thank God I am an American as I think an American has the most likelihood of leading the world out of the mess it is in and I shall be a part of that movement. I suspect that none of us would ever want to go back to the old days of what has been called the conservative way of life. We all seem to approve of liberalism and differ only on the extent and the speed of the movement along the path it represents.

"The most strikingly clear of all my impressions of the past years 'in the world' is that our college education should present economic theories so that we may leave college halls with something better than prejudice as a basis on which to do our own independent thinking on burning problems of today. The American colleges should, in my opinion, teach Fascism, Communistic and Democratic theories so that we may know what they are. We should not limit our study of these political theories to reading columns by Hugh Johnson and Dorothy Thompson as good as they may be, for the entertainment of the person who has done his background reading in text books; so here's to the College which presents fearlessly all the 'isms' for the delectation of its students, and builds thereby better men, capable, independent thinkers, to carry on American political and economic life."

On July 13, 1946, a letter from the Bureau was received by the Washington Field Office, which set forth the following information:

The Bureau directed the Washington Field Office to conduct an immediate and discreet investigation in order to determine the activities of handRD individually and as far as possible. It was suggested that consideration be given to the possibility of using confidential sources in order to develop the desired information concerning him, Investigation by the Washington Field Office at the Cleveland Park Post Office reflected that HAZARD submitted a change of address card to that Post Office disclosing that his future permanent mailing address would be Post Office Box 32, Skaneateles, New York. A pretext telephone call to the State Department, Division of Commercial Policies, Office of the Chief, reflected that HAZARD had resigned his position with the State Department as of August 1, 1946, and it was believed that he is presently staying at his residence in Skaneateles, New York.

Institute, reflects that JOHN NAME LARD is a member of the staff of that university as a professor of Public Laws. Among the subjects which HAZARD will teach during the coming term are Russian Political Institutions and the Revolution, Political Institutions in the Soviet Union, and Soviet Jurisprudence.

In view of the fact that HAZARD is no longer employed at the State Department, the Bureau has been advised that the investigation requested in its letter of July 13, 1946, is not being continued.





EUGENE 1. KULISCHER

KULISCHER first came to attention in this case when advised that on August 29, 1945 Mrs KULISCHER, wafe of Doctor KULISCHER, contacted Mrs. MILLER (wife of subject ROBERT NELLER) at which time they discussed the health of each other and their husbands. Mrs. MILLER suggested a Russian doctor for DR. KULISCHER who was having some kind of urinary trouble. The doctor recommended was Doctor HELFGOTT, 1306 Rhode Island Avenue, N.W. MILLER stated Doctor KULISCHER could speak Russian with HELFGOTT

On August 30, 1945, Doctor HELFGOTT called Mrs. NILLER to thank her for the patient (KULISHCER). HELFGOTT stated that he and KULISCHER know a lot of friends in common in Russia. Mrs. MILLER invited all of them, the KULISCHERS and HELFGOTTS, over next weekend.

On February 22, 1946, subject MILLER contacted Doctor KULLSCHER by telephone which was not entirely coherent to the informant but which he believed to pertain to population movements in certain parts of Europe and the personalities in the State Department who handled that type of work. The following names were mentioned in connection therewith: WARREN; RUHEN; KINDELBERGER; LANDERS; BECKNER; and HILLER or VILLER. Some mention was made of OSS doing that type of work. HILL R stated he would call KULISCHER later

On February 26, 1946, ROBERT MILLER called his wife JENNIX and told her to call KULISCHER and tell him absolutely nothing developed on "that". KINDELBERGER said just nothing doing. On the same date, JENNIE called KULISCHER and told him "it doesn't look so good according to KINDELBERGER". She asked who he called to see and he said BECKNER. JENNIE said it seems even BECKNER will not be there long according to BOB.

On April 23rd, Mrs. KULISCHER called JENNIE/MILLER and said that DR. KULISCHER was in New York and that he was going to return soon and teach at American University on "his problem on population". Mrs. KULISCHER is taking a course in Government in an Americanization school. Mrs. KULISCHER said she applied for a job at the Library of Congress, as she heard they were working on an interesting Slavic project. She gave JENTIE'S name as reference

At 8:15 P. M. on December 2, 1945 subject MILIER and wife were observed to leave their home by an agent of this office driving MILIER'S car to 1611 31st Street, N.W. and enter apartment number 101. This is the apartment of Doctor KULISCHER. They remained until 11:50 P. M. and then returned home.

The Philadelphia Field Division was requested to obtain any information available at the Office of Immigration and Naturalization on Doctor KULISCHER.

By letter dated August 12, 1946, the following information was received from the Fhiladelphia Field Division:

"EUGENE MICHAEL KULISCHER was born in Kiev, Russia, August 22, 1881. He married OLGAN ARGOLIN at Rostov, Russia, December 29, 1915. A daughter, NELLY NATALIE KULISCHER, was born at Kiev, Russia, on November 3, 1919. In his application for an immigration visa on November 3, 1949. In his application for an immigration visa (quota), dated June 4, 1941, at Marseille, France, he indicated that since reaching the age of 14 he had resided at the following places as indicated:

St. Petersburg, Russia - 1918 Kiev, Russia - 1918 - 1920 Berlin, Germany - 1920 - 1935 Copenhagen, Denmark - 1935 - 1936 Boulogne, France - 1936 - 1941

"He further indicated that he speaks, reads, and writes Russian, French, German, and English and that he is a research scientist by occupation. In this application he stated that he intended joining his father-in-law, Mr. ARNOLD HARGOLIN, Transportation Building, Washington, D. C., and that he intended to remain permanently in the United States. The application revealed that his parents were deceased. Their names were not set out.

ware h. *KULISCHER filled out an Alien Registration Form on June 5, 1941, in which he gave as his citizenship, "Russian refugee". He specified that he had been a research scientist for the past five years and proposed to be a research scientist in the United States. In answer to a question whether in the past five years he had been affiliated with or active as a member, official, or worker in any organization devoted in whole or in part to influencing or furthering in the United States the political activities, public relations, or public polity of any other Government, he replied, *Constitutional Democratic Farty of Russia'. In filling out an Alien Registration Form on May 7, 1943, in answering the question last mentioned above, he stated, 'I have not'. In the last-mentioned Alien Registration Form he stated that he was a citizen of no country, "last of Russia". In Item 10 of the form he stated that in the last five years he engaged in research work for the French National Center of Scientific Research, Paris, France, and in research work for the International Labor Office, Montreal, Canada. He indicated that he had no Military or Naval service; that he was living in the United States with his wife and daughter; and that he had never been convicted of a crime. He received Alien Registration No. 7615614.

New York, New York, on April 7, 1942. His Declaration reflects that his last place of foreign residence was Faris, France, and that he emigrated from Lisbon, Portugal, entering the United States at New York, New York, June 30, 1941, on the SS EXETER. In connection with the arrival, there was noted a teletype, dated June 25, 1941, to Ellis Island, New York Harbor, from JOSEPH SAVORETTI, Deputy Commissioner, Immigration and Naturalization Service, Washington, D. C. The teletype read in effect that EUGENEYKULISCHER and wife, OLG., arrived on the SS EXLTER June 24, 1941, and were being held for a hearing Friday. 'Teletype particulars in case and reason for delay in holding hearing. A notation in the Immigration and Naturalization Service file indicates that the teletype was sent at the request of Mr. MARRINGTON of the State Department, who states OIGA KULISCHER! S father is well known in the State Department. Mr. HARRINGTON states his Department will appreciate it if the hearing is speeded up.

On June 25, 1941, Commissioner SAVORETTI teletyped Ellis Island to parole EUGENE and OLGA KULISCHER pending the hearing; and a second notation in the file, dated June 25, 1941, is to the effect that Mr. HAMRINGTON was advised of the particulars in the case and that Ellis Island was being directed to parole the KULISCHERS.

Russia. She resided in Germany from 1930 until July 1, 1935, and in Demark from July 1, 1935, until August, 1935, at which time she filed an application for an immigration visa (quota) to enter the United States. In her application she indicated that she speaks, reads, and writes Russian, French, English, and German. She first arrived in the United States October 31, 1935. She stated that her mother is LISA LIUBON ARGOLIN; that her father is ARNOLD MARGOLIN; and that she has a sister, LIEBON MINSEN, in Denmark. She stated that she intended going to the United States to live permanently and that her husband, EUGENE, resided in Berlin, Germany. In her Alien Registration Form, dated July 31, 1941, she revealed that she last arrived in the United States at New York, New York, June 24, 1941, on the SS EXETER of the American Export Lines. She also stated in this form that she had never been arrested. She received Alien Registration No. 5891058.

"OIGA applied for a re-entry permit February 26, 1936. She departed from New York on the SS MANHATTEN April 22, 1936. In her application she stated that she intended to visit her husband for one year in Copenhagen, Denmark. She received Re-entry Permit No. 1073198, issued at Washington, D. C., March 4, 1936, to expire March 4, 1937. She filed an application to extend this re-entry permit on August 2, 1937, giving as her reason that she was visiting her husband and intended returning to the United States probably in February of 1938. She indicated that she had visited Germany, Denmark, and France. She gave as her foreign address, 93 Avenue des Moulineaux, Boulogne i/Seine, France. She applied for a further extension January 4, 1938, because of 'personal business, visiting husband.' She apparently returned to the United States, for in an application dated April 5, 1939, to extend Re-entry Permit No. 1205015 dated May 24, 1938, she revealed that she last departed from the United States June 15, 1938, from New York, New York, on the AQUATANIA. In this application she indicated that she desired 'to stay with my husband, who has a scientific work in Paris'. She filed another application October 4, 1939, because she cannot leave my husband, who has a scientific work in Faris'. The permit was extended by the Immigration and Naturalization Service to May 24, 1940. She filed a







third application to renew the last permit on February 26, 1940, stating, 'I am waiting on my husband, who is finishing a scientific work in Paris'. The permit was extended by Immigration and Naturalization Service to November 24, 1940. In a fourth application, dated September 23, 1940, she gave as her reason, 'Being Russian born and without nationality, the Fortugal Consulate refused for the moment to grant a visa on my Certificate of Identity.' A further extension was granted to May 24, 1941. A final application for an extension was filed by her on April 11, 1941. She gave as her reason that 'The German authorities do not grant a permit to leave this country, but I will make every effort to arrive in the United States before the expiration of this permit extension.'

"On February 21, 1942, OLGA requested an Alien Registration Card from Immigration and Naturalization Service, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. On April 18, 1942, in separate letters, both EUGENE and OIGA advised that they had failed to receive registration cards. They stated that their first address in the United States was 318 Jest 102nd Street, New York, New York. On April 25, 1942, they sent a similar letter jointly. By form letter dated July 31, 1942, the Immigration and Naturalization Service, Philadelphia, advised OLGA that a Receipt Card, Alien Registration No. 5891058, had been issued and that an application for a new Receipt Card was enclosed. EUGENE filed an application for a copy of an Alien Registration Receipt Card in lieu of one lost or destroyed on August 22, 1942, in which he stated that since the date of registration he had been absent from the United States for three days, having last entered the United States at New York, New York, March 20, 1942. It did not indicate what foreign country he had visited.

"In a letter dated June 11, 1946, from ARNOLD DA MARGOLIN, attorney-at-law, Transportation Building, Washington, D. C., to the Honorable UGO CARUSI, Immigration and Naturalization Commissioner, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, Mr. MARGOLIN refers to their last meeting in Washington and informs Mr. CARUSI that his daughter, OIGA KULISCHER and her husband, Dr. EUGENE M. KULISCHER, both residing at 1611 - 31st Street, Northwest, had filed 'today' their applications for citizenship. The letter stated that during the war Dr. KULISCHER had been affiliated with Office of Strategic Services in his capacity of Population Expert and that at the present time KULISCHER has a very good chance to become affiliated with one of the Government's Departments in Washington in his capacity of Population Expert, but has to become an American citizen as a prerequisite for such an appointment. The letter further stated that Mrs. KULISCHER, who has a temporary position at the Library of Congress, will also have a good chance to be promoted to a permanent position as see as she will become a citizen.

The letter concluded that in view of this fact, it is most important for Dr. and Mrs. KULISCHER to become citizens at the earliest date possible.

CONNECTION TITH RABINOTITCH CASE

CONHIDENTIAL

GERVISNA RABINOWITCH, with aliases, has been identified in Bureau case as a Soviet Agent who received \$10,000 from PAVEL INCHAILOV, Secretary General of USSR Consulate, New York City, and forwarded same by means of an unidentified firm to another Soviet Agent in Geneva, Switzerland. RABINOWITCH at time was employed by the International Labor Office, Montreal, and was previously attached to the same organization in Geneva. She was closely connected with important Swiss organization of Red Army Intelligence. During the course of the investigation of RABINOVITCH, the records of the Immigration and Naturalization Service showed that RABINOWITCH had filed a form entitled "Application For a Certificate of Arrival" and preliminary form for "Petition of Naturalization". This was dated February 28, 1946 and reflected that RABINO ITCH was residing at 749 lest End Avenue, c/o of L. P. CARLTON, New York City. Subject also listed the same address when she registered for the Alien Registration Account. (It will be observed that in the information received from the Philadelphia Field Division that Doctor KULISCHER listed his address from December 9, 1943 to August 6, 1944 as 749 West End Avenue, New York City).

#100-17721 on subject RABINOVITCH, it was stated that LECNARD CARLTON, 749 West End Avenue, New York City, had been supplied by RABINOVITCH to the Immigration and Naturalization Service as the person to whom all mail for her should be addressed. A check of the New York telephone directory first reflected that CARLTON'S full name was LEONARD and that one EUGENE KULISCHER also had the same telephone number CARLTON had at this address. Subject RABINOVITCH was eventually interviewed and stated that he made frequent visits to New York City for the purpose of establishing a residence here so that she could meet the residence requirements for United States citizenship. For this reason she made trips to New York at least once every six months. She further advised she also maintained her residence at 749 West End Avenue in care of LEONAFD CARLTON, who she stated was a friend of hers.

The records of the Federal Statistics Bureau for Manhattan reflect that on July 1, 1944 a marriage license number 17616 was issued to LEONARD CARLTON, New York City, and NATASHA KULISCHER, of 749 sest End Avenue, New York City. In the personal history form required by CARLTON to fill out, he stated his father was LUDWIG LORE.

The following information was given concerning CARLTON'S bride to be:

The New York Field Division ascertained that LEONARD CARLTON is a former employee of the Office of Tar Information and that his real name is KARLYLORT and that he is the son of the deceased LUDWIG LORE. Informant of the Tar York Field Office, advised that he had information that LEONARD CARLTON was against the Communist System of Government and he also submitted information that CARLTON expressed a willingness to assist the MTKHAILOVICH Committee.

Concerning the background of CARLTON'S father, a review of the files of the Dies Committee reflect that LUDWIG LOFE was a member of the Central Executive Committee of the Workers Party (Communist) elected at the convention of 1923-1924. The Dies files indicate that at one time LORE was a prominent Communist but that he eventually fell away from their radical ideas and was considered the leader of the right wing in the Communist Party. From a speech by C. E. RUTHENBERG, who was also a member of the Central Committee of the Workers Party, he referred to the fact that LORE had been shalled from the Farty.

From an inquiry made at the office of the Knepper Management Company in New York, which organization controls the apartment dwelling at 749 West End Avenue, it was learned that Apartment QW was in the name of EUGENE KULISCHER and it was reflected LEONARD CARLTON was his son-in-law.

a member of the Russian Economic Institute which claimed to be a voluntary, non-partisan and non-profitable organization undertaking individual and cooperative research subjects; the firing and analyzing of specific problems or issues centering in Russian-Eurasian territories. The organization is reported to be affiliated with the latin Russian Institute, the Institute For Social Research and the Socres Corporation. It was stated that certain officials of the Russian Economic Institute were reported to be liberal but not necessarily Communist. The file further reflected that KULISCHER was on the Research Staff of the Institute which as made up of a number of individuals including OSCARYLANGE. It was noted that KULISCHER in 1941 was listed as a member of the Research Staff and in the Manhattan 1944 telephone





directory was residing at 749 West End Avenue. The files also reflected that KULISCHER was a member of the Russian Cultural Society. AIEXIS GOLDENWEISER was listed by subject RABINOWITCH as a reference on her application of intention to become a citizen of the United States. This organization was also known as the "Circle of Russian Culture" and was organized on April 1942 by former Russian lawyers, judges and professors of law. The membership was comprised of 57 in 1942 and was governed by the following board of individuals:

It was ascertained from a confidential source that EUGENE KULISCHER was Special Assistant to the Director of radio programs at the Office of Mar Information as of March 17, 1943 on which date he had telephone service installed at his residence address - 749 rest End Avenue.

On April 14, 1946, subject RABINOTITCH mailed a letter in New York which was addressed to Mrs. EXTOYTINSKY, 5036 Massachusetts Avenue, N.Y., W. shington, D. C. This letter had the return address of G. RABINOTITCH, 536 West 112th Street, New York City. It will be noted that VLADIMIR WOYTINSKY, Chief Economist, Social Security Board, is listed as a reference by Mrs. KULISCHER in application for her job at the Library of Congress. The District of Columbia Gity Directory lists a WLADIMIR S. WOYTINSKY, 5036 Massachusetts Avenue, N.W. (It seems apparent that the WOYTINSKY who was the addressee is the wife of the WOYTINSKY who was a reference on Mrs. KULISCHER'S application at the Library of Congress).

In summing up the interesting connections of RAB'NOWITCH and KULISCHER, it is pointed out that: 1. KULISCHER lived in the same house - 749 West End Avenue - as that which subject RABINOTICH used as her address and claimed she visited regularly

2. RABINOWITCH had her mail received by KULISCHER'S son-in-law, LEONARD CARLTON.

- 3. Both RABING ITCH and KULISCHER are members of the International Labor Office.
- 4. Both RABINOWITCH and KULISCHER apparently are friends of VLADIMIR WOYTINSKY.



Cathedral Avenue, Washington, D. C., who was born in Kiev, Russia in
1877 and was naturalized as a United States citizen in December 1927.
MARGOLIN is a local lawyer and has held government positions. He
attended the law faculty of the University of St. Vladimir, Kiev,
Russia, from 1895 to 1900 receiving the diploma of Jurist, First Degree;
also attended Universities of Leipzig and Lyons. MARGOLI. .eld various
jobs in Russia both in private enterprise and as an employee of the
Covernment up until the year 1919. He claims to have been a justice of the
Supreme Court of Appeals of Ukraine.

From an employee investigation conducted by the Washington Field Office in case number 77-11567, no derogatory information was learned concerning MARGOLIN and the file reflects he was a friend of the late Justice BRANDEIS and FELIX FRANKFURTER.



The files of the ashington Field Division reflect that in the case entitled "Tashington Committee For Democratic Action", Mrs. W. S. (ELMA) OYTINSKY, 5036 Massachusetts Avenue, N.W., and WIADIMIR S. WOYTINSKY, at the same address, Research Staff, Com. on Soc. Sec., were listed as members of the above listed organization.

In the file entitled "League of Women Shoppers", the name of Mrs. W. S. WOYTINSKY, 5036 Massachusetts Avenue, is listed as a member.

In the file entitled "Capital City Forum", the indices of that organization reflect the names of K. and Irs. S. S. COYTINSKY with the notation that they "might do some work after January 1, 1939, contact through ELSIE GLUCK". There was also a notation next to their names "League of Industrial Democracy Contact List".

This WOYTINSKY apparently is the same individual mentioned in connection with the RABINOWITCH case.

The files of the Washington Field Division reflect that the name of LAZAR VOI IN appears in the active indices of the Capital City Forum, the District of Columbia Cooperative League, and the United








MURRAY WEBB LATIMER

The following investigation was conducted by Special Age CLYDE D. NICOLL:

MURRAN LATIMER, whose name first appeared in a report dated March 11, 1946, in instant case, is the subject of a case entitled, "MURRAY WEBB LATIMER, Chairman of the Railroad Retirement Board, Internal Security - Hatch Act," according to a report of Special Agent OSCAR J. KEEP dated April 1, 1942, at Washington, D. C. His name appeared in the active indices of the American Peoples Mobilization, known since the German invasion of Russia in 1941 as the American Peace Mobilization. His wife's name, EDITH LATIMER, also appears on this list and on that of the Washington Committee for Democratic Action.



He was interviewed in March 1942 by Special Agents, and stated that he lived at 2911 Albermarle Street, Northwest, and that his legal residence is New York City. He denied membership in the American Peace Mobilization and in the Washington Committee for Democratic Action.

On May 27, 1946, Confidential Informant furnished the following information:

JOE SILVERMAN, brother of GEORGE, contacted SARAH SILVERMAN and advised her that JRVING KAPLAN had left the Treasury Department and had gone to work for MURRAY LATIMER on the annual wage study. SARAH mentioned that GEORGE is going to be out of a job soon and he has been offered a position with the Government, but does not want it. SILVERMAN reportedly can also go to work with LATIMER.

On February 11, 1946, Confidential Informant furnished the profession of Conversation between GEORGE SILVERMAN and MUTRAY LATIMER: LATIMER is reportedly a CIO backed candidate to succeed LUBIN in the position of Commissioner of Labor Statistics in the Labor Department. Informants have reported that LATIMER is "very liberal, pink, socialist and Communist," although no evidence of Communist Party activity was developed.

A check of the records of the Credit Bureau, 1221 G Street, Forth west, revealed the following record of LATIMER as of October 1, 1941:

He is approximately 45 years of age, white, married, and has three children. He was married on May 18, 1928, to EDITH SOMN of New York City. In 1936 he purchased his home at 2911 Albermarle Street, Northwest. Prior to that time he resided at 15 Yest Bradley Lane, Chevy Chase, Maryland. From 1936 to 1933 he was an expert with the Industrial Relations Council, Inc., New York City; 1933 to 1935 he was on the supervisory committee of the Labor Department; October 1935 appointed chairman of the Railread Retirement Board at a salary of \$10,000 a year, a Presidential appointment. He has been a member of various Presidential committees since 1933. From 1936 to 1946 he was chairman of the Social Security Board; was a member of the Technical Board to the Presidential Committee on Economic Security and testified as an expert before Congress. He has written various books on "Distribution and Pension System."





DOROTHY agreed to call these individuals. The same informant advised that DOROTHY KAPLAN immediately after the foregoing talk attempted to contact SOLOMON LISCHINSKY at his residence in Fairfax Village without success.

In connection with a physical surveillance on SOLOMON ADLER on August 4, 1946, it was noticed that on this afternoon ADLER and an unidentified individual left the Washington Hotel, where ADLER was staying, and walked to a Pontiac Secan parked on Pennsylvania Avenue and bearing D. Two letters were from Dr. I. M. ALPHER, MD, 900 17th Street, NW., Washington, 6, D. C.; IRVIN GOLDSTEIN, Suite 717 National Press Building, Washington, 4, D. C., and The League 2 Women Voters, 726 Jackson Place, Washington 6, D. C., however, no postmark appears on any of the three letters nor does the information available advise to whom the letters were addressed.

Previous reports in this case reflect that IRVIN GOLDSTEIN is an attorney in Washington, D. C. and has been in contact with BEATTIF MAGDOFF in regard to some claim involving a railroad.

Inasmuch as the MAGDOFFS have been vacationing in Peekskill New York, Confidential Informant has been unable to report any information regarding their activities in Washington, D. C.

It has been previously reported in the Silvermaster case that HARRY MAGDOFF has been in contact with PERRY R. TAYLOR, who is employed in Room 239 of the State Department Building. A check of the Washington Field Office indices reflects in the case entitled "PERRY R. TAYLOR, SPECIAL INQUIRY, ADVISORY COMMISSION TO THE COUNCIL OF NATIONAL DEFENSE" that one PERRY R. TAYLOR was employed November 12, 1940, as Special Advisor on a dollar-a-year basis. The personnel files of the Advisory Commission reflect that TAYLOR was born in Corydon, Pennsylvania, March 20, 1897. He graduated from high school in Oil City, Pennsylvania, in 1913. He attended the United States National Academy in 1917 and received an MS Degree in June, 1921, from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology. He pursued a course in business at Alexander Hamilton Institute. TAYLOR was employed by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania from 1923 to 1924 and from 1932 to 1934 as Statistician and Office Director of the Bureau of Safety respectively. He served as Executive Secretary, Water Planning Commission, National Resources Board, 1933 to 1935; Business Manager and Budget Officer, Rural Electrification Administration, 1935 to 1938, both in Washington, D. J.

Since August, 1938, he was employed by the Good Will Fund,
New York City as administrat. Group Health Association and later as
Management Consultant on Operation of Medical Service Plans. It is not
know whether PERRY R. TAYLOR concerned in the Special Inquiry investigation
is identical with the PERRY R. TAYLOR who has been in contact with HARBY
MAGDOFF.



The following investigation was conducted by Special Employee NICHOLAS MANFREDA on August 14, 1946 and is being reported by Special Agent JOSEPH J. KEECH:

CATHERINE STONE, also known as Mrs. HAROLD A STONE, and her husband first came to the attention of the Washington Field Office by reason of their contacts with HARRY MACDOFF, a subject of the GREGORY case.

The records of the Stone's Mercantile Agency, 1419 H Street, N. W., which were examined by Special Employee MANFREDA, reflected in a report dated December 5, 1940 that HAROID A. STONE and his wife, CATHERINE, were at that time residing at 1051 South 26th Road, Arlington, Virginia. HAROID STONE was born on March 29, 1898, and the STONES had one child dependent, as of December 5, 1940. Their home in Arlington had an estimated value of \$16,000 in the year 1940. The record further disclosed that prior to 1940, CATHERINE STONE had resided at 4426 Garfield Street, N. W. in Washington. From September 5, 1939 until the date of this credit report HAROID A. STONE was employed by the Department of Agriculture as a Principal Administrative Officer at a salary of approximately \$5,600 a year, and was reportedly very well regarded.

The records of the Credit Bureau in Washington, D. C. in a report dated January 27, 1942 listed the following previous addresses for HAROLD A. and CATHERINE STONE: 4426 Garfield Street, N. W., Washington, D. C., from August 18, 1939 to December 5, 1940. It was noted in the report of the Credit Bureau that this home belonged to HAROLD STONE's brother, DONALD; 5616 Kibark Street, Chicago, Illinois; and 6014 Pitt Street, New Orleans, Louisiana. It was noted in the credit report that the STONES had resided in Chicago for slightly over one year.

AIFRED J. and BEATRICE VAN TASSEL, with whom HARRY MACDOFF has likewise been in contact, are presently residing at 1622 Mt. Eagle's Place in Alexandria, Virginia.

The records of the Stone's Mercantile Agency, 1419 H Street, N. W., in a report dated October 6, 1942 reflected that ALFRED VAN TASSEL was born on August 9, 1910. His wife's name is BEATRICE, and on June 6, 1942, he was employed by the War Production Board as a Senior Industrial Analyst at a salary of approximately \$4,600 per year. This report further reflected that he was formerly employed as a Research Director of the United Mine Workers of America. On May 19, 1942, BEATRICE VAN TASSEL was employed by

the American Red Cross at 17th and D Streets, N. W. in Washington es a correspondent. The record disclosed that she refused to accept a salary for the duties she performed. Further, the report reflected that the VAN TASSEIS had two dependent children and had come to Washington, D. C. from Philadelphia, Pennsylvania in about 1940. In Washington, they have resided at 5623 Sherrier Place, N. W. They maintained a satisfactory savings account at a branch of the Lincoln National Bank, 318 7th Street, N. W.

The records of the Credit Bureau in a report dated September 17, 1943 reflected that the VAN TASSELS were renting a house at 5111 41st St., N. W., and that ALFRED VAN TASSEL was employed by the War Production Board as a Principal Industrial Specialist at a salary of \$5600 per year.

EDMUND J. STONE and his wife, JANE, who presently reside at 2921 Argyle Drive, Alexandria, Virginia, have likewise been contacts of HARRY MACDOFF.

The records of the Stone's Mercantile Agency, 1419 H Street, N. W., in a report dated September 28, 1942, reflected that STONE and his wife jointly own the property mentioned above in Alexandria, Virginia. His birth date was given as January 21, 1911, and it was reflected that he had been employed by the War Production Board as Assistant Division Chief since September 5, 1940. His salary was given as \$6,500 per year, and his employment was rated satisfactory. In regard to his background, the report reflected that EDMUND J. STONE was originally from Farmville, Virginia and had come to Washington about September, 1940. Sometime prior to 1940, he had resided at 203 M and Bristol Street, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. It was noted that he had also resided at one time at 4831 Reservoir Road, N. W. in Washington. The record further disclosed that he maintained a satisfactory account at the Hamilton National Bank in Washington.

The records of the Credit Bureau, in a report dated August 17, 1944, reflected that EDMUND J. and JANE STONE had three dependent children, ages two, three and five, at that time. Previous addresses for these individuals were listed as follows: 1907 N Street, N. W.; 900 19th St., N. W., Apt. 804; and 57 Waterman Street, Providence, Rhode Island. In regard to employment, the Credit Bureau records reflected that on December 10, 1943, EDMUND J. STONE was appointed to a position of Economist in the Foreign Economic Administration. It was noted that he was transferred to this position from the War Production Board. The record also noted that he had formerly been employed for several years by the WPA in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. Finally, in regard to employment, the Credit Bureau record

reflected that EDMUND J. STONE had formerly been employed by the Brookings Institute, 722 Jackson Place, N. W., in Washington, D. C.

Other information in the file reflected that STONE had received a fellowship from Brown University, Providence, Rhode Island, which was effective from October, 1935 to June, 1936 at a salary of \$1,000 per year.

In regard to JANE STONE, the Credit Bureau report reflected that as of August 17, 1944, she was unemployed, but stated that she had formerly been employed as a stenographer at the British Purchasing Commission, Willard Hotel, Washington, D. C., from October 8, 1940 until her resignation from that position on November 22, 1941. She was likewise at one time employed by the Department of Labor under the name of JANE S. STONE. All credit information regarding both EDMUND J. and JANE STONE was reported good.

On October 2, 1940, information was received from the Credit Bureau in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania that EDMUND J. STONE and his wife had moved from Philadelphia to Washington, D. C. on September 20, 1940 after having resided at 232 So. Quince Street, Philadelphia, for one and one-half years. While in Philadelphia, EDMUND J. STONE was employed by the WPA, 12 So. 12th Street in Philadelphia as a Statistical Economist. No salary for this employment was given. His credit record while in Philadelphia was rated as satisfactory.

An additional undated credit report received from Providence, Rhode Island reflected that EDMUND J. STONE was born somewhere in Virginia and had come to Providence, Rhode Island in 1933 to enter Brown University after having been awarded a scholarship. While in Providence, his residence was listed as 57 Waterman Street. In 1934, he was appointed an Assistant Instructor in Economics at Brown University. He served in this capacity for approximately one year and resigned in June of 1935. It was noted in the report that STONE had a good record at the University and was known to be very studious and competent.

Confidential Informant whose identity is known to the Burcau, furnished the following information:

On July 15, 1946, RAYHOND S XDROOKS contacted the subject and advised him that he was now "working in our old territory, Oak Ridge, Tennessee, outside of Knoxville. The CIO is making the organization of the atom plants its major southern project in the new drive and I was asked to come over temporarily and start their weekly newspaper. I did about May 1st and I am enclosing a recent issue. (Informant did not advise the contents of this paper). It won't take any prizes in journalism contests but it was a splendid form of contact between the organization and the people in the plants. It meant working fifteen hours a day because I did all the work myself but it was interesting - even when the Woods Committee came down and investigated. I left their July 1st when the Washington man who does most of the editorial work for the Gas, Coke and Chemical Workers could clean things up enough to come down and take over. Thanks very much for your note of May in reference to the Billings, Montana, job with Interior. I have never heard another word from them. I sent issistant Commissioner alarm a note early in June asking him what was doing and he has never replied.

At the time of this contact BROOKS indicated that he might write a letter directly to the secretary because he wanted to hear something and he believed "they" owed him a letter.

Reference is made to the report in this case dated May 17, 1946, in which Confidential Informant whose identity is known to the Bureau, had advised that Marks had made numerous contacts. The Baltimore Field Division advised on august 7, 1946, in regard to the contacts made by Marks as furnished by Confidential Informant and this information is as follows

Baltimore telephone number Lafayette 3442 was determined to be listed to Mrs. JONAS S FRIEDENMALD, 1212 Eutaw Place. Lafayette 2390 was determined to be listed to Doctor HARRY FRIEDENMALD, 1212 Eutaw Place. Liberty 3152 was determined to be listed to Doctor HARRY FRIEDENMALD, 2412 West Rogers Avenue.

The records of the Credit Bureau of Baltimore reflected that Doctor HIRRY FRIEDEN. ALD, home address 2412 west Rogers Avenue, with offices at 1212 Eutaw Place, had been born in 1864 and has resided at his present address since 1920, sharing the property with his son, Doctor JONAS FRIEDERMALD. It was stated that he was a widower of BIRDIE STEIN FRIEDEWALD, who died November 30, 1941, and was indicated to have been the son of the late LLRON FRIEDEN.LLD, who had been a well-known Baltimore physician and a graduate of the University of Maryland. The credit report indicated that Doctor FRIEDENWLLD is understood to have an exceptionally large practice and for thirty-seven years has been a surgeon on the staff of the Baltimore Eye, Ear, and Throat Hospital. He had been graduated from the College of Physicians and Surgeons in 1886 and from 1887 to 1889 had served as Assistant Professor at Hierschberg's Eye Hospital in Berlin, Germany. From 1894 until 1902, he was Associate Professor at the College of Physicians and Surgeons; and from 1902 to 1916, he was a full professor. His professorship was retained after the merger of this institution with the University of Maryland until 1930, when Dr. FRIEDEN. LLD became Professor Emeritus.

A credit report on Doctor JONAS S FRIEDENALD reflected that he was engaged in professional practice with his father at 1212 Eutaw Place, that he was approximately 40 to 42 years of age, and that his wife's name was MARIE LOUISE. The report indicated that Doctor JONAS FRIEDENALD and his wife reside at 1212 Eutaw Place and that the Doctor is a graduate of Johns Hopkins Medical School, served his internship at Johns Hopkins, and has been practicing since 1922, specializing in treatment of the eyes, ears, and throat.

Dr. HERRY CULLENBERG of the Maryland State Board of Medical Examiners made available the Board's files which reflected that HARRY FRIEDENMALD was licensed as a physician on May 16, 1894, having graduated from the College of Physicians and Surgeons in 1886, and that he is Professor Emeritus of Ophthal-mology at the University of Maryland. Doctor CULLENBERG stated that he is somewhat familiar with Doctor FRIEDENMALD and knows him to be an eye specialist and added that the Doctor was quite aged. The records of the Board of Medical Examiners likewise reflected that Doctor JOHAS STEIN FRIEDENMALD, a graduate of Johns Hopkins College in 1916, and later of the Medical School, had been licensed to practice medicine on December 29, 1921. There was no derogatory information in the file concerning either of these individuals and Doctor CULLENBERG stated

that he, himself, knew nothing derogatory concerning them.

a check of the files of the Baltimore Field Division reflected that an informant had advised that the name LOUIS S. (FRIEDENWALD, 1212 Eutaw Place (apparently given incorrectly for JONAS S. FRIEDENWALD) appeared on a list of contacts prepared at Communist Party headquarters for the disposition of tickets for an american-Soviet Friendship Rally November 14 through November 21, 1944.

The files of the Baltimore Field Division further reflected that Mrs. JONAS FRIEDENTALD had furnished a non-specific complaint regarding a book review in a Spanish newspaper which appeared to be anti-semitic; that Doctor JONAS FRIEDENTALD had furnished a complaint regarding apparently contradictory newspaper articles in the Baltimore Sun and New York Times, it being his impression that the New York Times version was so colored as to instill anti-British feelings in the readers. The files further reflect that Mrs. JONAS S. FRIEDENTALD had signed a petition requesting that all citizens be permitted to shop in Baltimore stores without discrimination because of race or color. The files also reflect that one E. I. SCHLARTZ, a Communist Party functionary, had received a letter bearing it and address 1212 Eutaw Street; that Doctor MARRY FRIEDENTALD had requested the National Broadcasting Company in New York to furnish him with a the program, "America Calling all People," which was deemed by National

not reflected in the files of the Baltimore Field Division. It is further reflected in the Baltimore files that Doctor HARRY FRIEDENALD, 1212 Eutaw Place, has been a contributor to the Workers Defense League, having been a member since 1941, and that in December, 1942, one ELIZABETH GILLAN forwarded to the New York headquarters of this organization a check for five dollars issued by Doctor FRIEDENALD.



The records of the Credit Bureau of Baltimore, Inc. Callected Poctor LLAN C. 100DS, age 52 to 54, was the son of a Doctor HIRAN 100DS, who had served as a Captain in the Medical Corps in Torld Mar I. The credit records further reflected that Doctor 100DS is a specialist in eye ailments, maintaining head-quarters at the Johns Hopkins Hospital, having been appointed Acting Director of the Tilmer Eye Clinic on Ipril 10, 1934. This petition, it was indicated, foresaw an Atomic armament race as a result of an effort to maintain superiority in atomic weapons and endorsed the recommendation of Mr. TRUMAN, Mr. ATTLEE, and Mr. KING that a special committee of the United Nations Organization to be created in order to set up an enforceable safeguard against the use of Atomic energy for destructive purposes and that specialized information regarding the practical application of Atomic energy be made freely available as soon as the safeguards are established

Her former residences are 5100 Roland avenue, where she lived with her children for about eight years; 715 Despdene Road; and 5024 Roland avenue. Mrs. BREESKIN during her married life lived in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. Since 1930 she has been in the employ of the Baltimore Museum of art, Charles and 31st Streets. Previous to that time she was with the Metropolitan Museum of art, New York City, for about six years.

In an article by LEY GREIF entitled "Baltimore Show Women of LT" in the Baltimore Sun dated February 3, 1945, appeared a biography of LDELYN BREESKIN. It that time her position was listed as acting Director of the Baltimore Museum of Art since 1942. Her first position with the Baltimore Museum of Art in 1930 was listed as "curator of prints and drawings." Among her duties has been that of securing exhibits from artists and collectors.

It as decided to have this exhibition turned over to the "National Gallery" in Mashington, D. C., and it therefore was not shown in Baltimore. The museum does not have a truck with which to pick up paintings and drawings donated from people to the museum, and Mrs. BREESKIN therefore must on occasion take long trips to various parts of the country in order to pick up gifts and exhibits for the museum.

While Mrs. BREESKIN was curator of prints at the Metropolitan Museum in New York City she met ELLIS BREESKIN, conductor of the Pittsburgh Symphony Orche tra and married him. She toured the world with her husband during his concert trips.



This investigation was conducted by Special Agent VINCENT W. HUGHES.

Miss MUNOZ first came to attention in this case through Informant who advised that on November 25, 1945, in a conversation between JOSEPF GREGO and OLYA MARGOLIN, OLYA asked how Miss MUNOZ was and whether or not she was being transferred with the whole division (CIAA). JOE replied that Miss MUNOZ was being transferred and her future did not look very secure because she is not a citizen, and that is the "whole business". JOE stated he would hate to see her start out on a new job because she is not a little girl any more. OLYA said she seemes to have gone down quite a bit in the last six months. JOE said he had been trying to persuade her not to try to look for a full time job, but to get something else.

On January 8, 1946, Liss LUNOZ contacted GREGG, telling him she had been offerred a part time temporary job at Pan-American Union and asked if she could not leave "with dignity" the job she now has. He said she surely could and there would be nothing said of it. She said she was going to see PAU tomorrow at 4 PM, and was then going to Connecticut for the weekend. He told her not to resign without first talking it over with him. She said she would check with him after talking with PAU.

On January 9, 1946, MINOZ again contacted GREGG and told him that the job about which she had inquired is very vague, so she decided nothing about it for the time being. GREGG suggested she see the man in the State Department who had said he would recommend her to some professors in New York if he liked her work.

On June 12, 1946, ROSE GREGO, wife of JOSEPH GREGO, called Miss MUNOZ to ask her to take any calls which came for JOE. She stated JOE would be in about one.

On June 13, 1946, ROSE GREGG again called Hiss MUNOZ and stated JOE had told her how much he had enjoyed his visit with MUIOZ the previous night. He said he felt like he had been back in Hadrid after talking with her. ROSE said, "He will just have to go back there some day", and INIZ replied, "It doesn't look very good though." ROSE stated, "I know it," and INEZ replied, "It is those people up there in New York". INEZ requested ROSE to advise JOE that there had been no messages for him.

On October 20, 1942, the Washington Field Office received a letter from the Bureau, requesting an employee investigation of liss MUNOZ, who was being considered for employment at the OEH. The Bureau's letter listed Miss MUNOZ address at that time as 3418 Brown Street, N. W., Mashington, D. C. The position for which she was being considered was Senior Bi-lingual Clerk - OEli. The letter further stated that Miss MUNOZ was born at Madrid, Spain, November 17. 1879; that she is single and has taken out her first citizenship papers. Miss MINOZ listed as a reference, Mrs. FRANCIS BIDDLE, 1669 31st Street, N. W., (ex-Attorney General's wife).

Under previous employment applicant stated she was employed by the Hemisphere Corporation (operating under contract to CIAA), Washington, D. O., as Assistant Librarian to J. B. GREGG, from April to August, 1942, salary 2300 per annum; as translator under ROBERT T. HILLER in New York City. (The GREGG and MILLER referred to in the above sentence are subjects GREGG and ROBERT T. HILLER, III, in this case.)

Applicant stated she was employed by the Spanish Refugee Committee, 381 4th Avenue, New York City, as Translator, from February, 1939 to February, 1940, salary \$15 a week, and that she had done private tutoring and three months with Editorial Techica Unida, King Street, Brooklyn, New York, as proofreader and translator from August, 1941 to April, 1942. Applicant stated she had also been employed by the Society for Organizing Charity, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, from October, 1910 to April, 1913, salary 150 per month; French "Orphelinat des Armes", U. S. Branch, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, as secretary from October, 1918 to Harch, 1919, salary 150 per month.

The Bureau letter also stated that iNNOZ was included in the list of writers of the Federated Press. (The Federated Press, according to the files of the Washington Field Office, serves 170 labor periodicals and publications outside the labor field, including Socialist, Communist and Union organs, presently operates three bureaus, Washington, Detroit and New York City; maintains about 50 correspondents in key cities throughout the U.S., working without

compensation; extreme left-wing writers predominate among correspondents, many being Communist Party members or Fellow Travellers.)

On August 23, 1946, the Bureau directed a memorandum to the Washington Field Office containing a compilation of information in the Bureau's file on Miss MUNOZ, which follows.

MReference is made to information received from a highly confidential source on August 19, 1946, to the effect that one HARJORIE THOLDSON, while contacting Mrs. JENNIE HILLER, wife of ROBERT TALBOTT HILLER, III, advised that she, HARJORIE, is employed with the American Institute of Foreign Trade at Phoenix, Arizona. Miss THOLPSON stated that she had an applicant by the name of INEZ MUNOZ who had applied for a job teaching Spanish. JENNIE referred to her as a wonderful person who is energetic and lively and who in her opinion would be an asset to the organization. It was mentioned that the teaching job would be at Fhoenix, Arizona. Mrs. MILLER said she knew her husband would be glad to furnish a reference. Miss THOLPSON said that INEZ would be teaching Spanish to men who intended to have Latin American business connections.

From Washington Field Office File 101-1806, entitled "ETTA HIRSCHFIEID", it appears that the name of INEZ MINOZ, Pinelands, Center Harbor, New Hampshire, was contained in the list of names and addresses maintained in a book by subject HIRSCHFIEID. HIRSCHFIEID was reported by many informants as a notorious communist.

Mrs. WILLIAM W. ANDERSON, Resident Manager of the William Penn Apartments, 2231 California Street, N. W., was interviewed, and she advised that Miss INEZ MUNDZ had been living in Apartment 109 of her building for several years. Mrs. ANDERSON stated MUNDZ frequently visited her but that their discussions always pertained to personal matters. Mrs. ANDERSON advised that MUNDZ is exceedingly pleasant and apparently has no outside interests other than her work, and has a very small circle of friends who visit with her. Mrs. ANDERSON recalled that on one creasion Miss MUNDZ stated that if FRANCO were ousted from Spain, she would return to that country, which is her home.

Mrs. ANDERSON stated that HUNOZ resigned from her position, which she believes was with the State Department, some time in July, and at the present time she apparently is doing translation work on her own, in her apartment. Two of IUNOZ' best friends, according to irs. ANDERSON, are Miss ALIX REUTHER, who according to Mrs. ANDERSON has a very good job in the State Department, and according to Mrs. ANDERSON stated that through the intercession of Mrs. HANDA SANDVIG. Mrs. ANDERSON stated that through the intercession of MUNOZ, apartments were obtained in the William Penn Apartments for both REUTHER and SANDVIG.

X"Madge" had advised that all arrangements had been made for NEWMAN'S vacation in Milford. She also mentioned that NEWMAN should send her mail in care of LEVY, Box #307, Ridgefield, Connecticut. On August 13, 1946, the New Haven Office furnished the following information regarding LEVY, Post Office Box #307, Ridgefield, Connecticut:

It was ascertained that P. O. Box #307 at Ridgefield, Connecticut, Post Office was rented by a Mr. B. E.XLEVY, who resided at Barracks Hill Road, Ridgefield, Connecticut. A discreet neighborhood investigation reflected that BENJAMIN E. LEVY and his wife, REGINALLEVY, resided at Barracks Hill Road, Ridgefield, Connecticut, and were well regarded locally having resided in this section since 1939. Kr. and Mrs. LEVY both of French-Jewish ancestry, and he was formerly connected with the Coty Perfume Company. It was stated that he was presently retired from business, but believed to maintain a suite of rooms in the Sherry Netherland Hotel, New York City, and to maintain a bank account at the Fifth Avenue Bank, New York City. REGINA LEVY is active in social work in Ridgefield, acting as Secretary-Treasurer of the local Girl Scouts group, and having been active in the Red Cross, Office of Price Administration Ration Board, and War Bond drives in this area during the war. It was determined that regularly REGINA LEVY ships packages to France and it was ascertained that she recently shipped two packages to Madame JEAN ARON and WILLY MARTETTE at 115 Avenue Victor Hugo, Pari France.

Both Mr. and Mrs. BENJANI LEVY were stated to enjoy an excellent reputation in the community and had not been associated with any un-American or subversive groups although it is noted that under date of June 29, 1944, the New Canaan Connecticut advertiser newspaper reflected that a branch of the Russian War Relief had been organized at Ridgefield, Connecticut, and among the persons who had expressed a desire to prepare a clothing kit for this organization was Mrs. BENJAHIN EXEVY.


BENJALIN E. LEVY acted as sponsor for HELENE LEVY, ROSE OUTNAJER and CHUYL GUTNAJER, French refugees, who arrived at Baltimore, Maryland, on the SS



NYASSA during July of 1942. At that time BENJAMIN E. LEVY and this ville LEVY were interviewed and advised that these French refugeed that quaintances of theirs and they vouched for their character, stating that they were opposed to Communism and Fascism. Information obtained at this time was that BENJAMIN LEVY had been born at Rheims, France, in 1878 of French parents, FELLI and HENRIET ALEVY. BENJAMIN LEVY and his family entered the United States in 1897 and resided at New York City until 1939. LEVY was naturalized at New York City in 1910, and had been chairman of the Board of Directors of Coty, Inc., a perfume company in New York City, although he was now retired. However, he still maintains offices at Room 2 E, Ritz Carlton Hotel, New York City.

REGINA LEVY advised at that time that she had come to the United States at the age of six months with her parents in the year 1882. Her parents were ADOLPH and SAR \$01010N who were French citizens residing at Lille, France. REGINA LEVY'S father was naturalized in 1895 at New York City and she lived with her parents and husband at New York City until 1939 and then her husband purchase an estate at Ridgefield, Connecticut. REGINA S. LEVY advised that they owned a winter home at 90 Rue de Courcelles, Paris, and mintered at this address from 19% to 1939.

Reference is made to the report in this case dated July 19, 1946, in which information was set forth that a confidential informant had furnished a letter dated May 10, 1943, written by Colonel D. W. Mainhouse, Aus, to Professor J. LABRIERLY. Oxford, England, introducing the subject to BRIERLY.

The following investigation was conducted by Special Agent H. TUDLEY PAYNE.

From August 1, 1946 to August 15, 1946, the mail cover placed on subject was not productive

Confidential Informant furnished the following information concerning PRAZICH'S activities from August 1 through August 15, 1946

On August 7, 1946, DOROTHY WAPLAN was in contact with AFELIA PERAZICH, during which conversation AFELIA remarked that her husband, GEORGE, was getting ready to go to Belgrade again. He was supposed to go about seven months ago but for some reason the trip was delayed. She said that GEORGE had been swamped with requests from friends to take things, such as money, clothing, and scarce articles to the starving people in Belgrade. According to AFELIA, GEORGE would go to Geneva, then to London, Paris and Belgrade. He would probably be gone for a period of two to two and a half months.

On August 13, 1946, AMELIA PERAZICH advised DOROTHY KAPLAN that GEORGE had not left yet, however, he was supposed to leave on Friday but his passport expires on Saturday.

AMELIA told DOROTHY that CARL CRISE! had visited them recently and asked about her. AMELIA had accidentally met GREEN on the street car as a result of which she invited him out to their house. According to AMELIA, GREEN had been in the hospital for some time and was now working with the Metropolitan Radio Station.

DOROTHY and AMELIA made arrangements for the KAPLANS to go to the PERAZICH's house for dinner on the following Thursday

On August 15th, DOROTHY KAPLAN advised AMELIA PERAZICH that she would see AMELIA at her house about 3:30 PM

It was ascertained from the Pan-American Airkines that GEORGE M. PERAZICH had a reservation on Flight 100, scheduled to leave LaGuardia Field, New York, on August 10, 1946 at 2 PH, for London

It was ascertained from a confidential source that PERAZICH's reservation on this flight was cancelled due to the State Department's refusing PERAZICH a passport

The Washington Field Office files reflect the following information concerning CAPL GREEN, who was mentioned in a conversation between AMELIA PERAZICH and DOROTHY KAPLAN on August 13th. In the report of Special Agent LAMBERT G. ZANDER dated June 5, 1946, it is reflected that Mrs. ALLAN ROSEMBERG had the following guests for dinner on February 3, 1946; the BOWEN SMITHS, the GERTLERS, CARL GREEN, the GLASSERS and DAVID WAHL. In the report of Agent ZANDER on June 17, 1946, it was indicated that PHIL DULAWAY invited LAURICE HALPERIN to his home to meet ROBERT LAMB and CARL GREEN, both of whom were employed by the CIO in Washington. This report further reflected that on May 27th, CARL GREEN was in contact with FAURICE HALPERIN, who said he should submit a synopsis of his background to MAYNARD GERTLER. The report of Agent ZANDER dated July 19th reflected that on June 18th, ELEBRECHER of the Letropolitan Broadcasting Company advised JOSEPH GREGG that CARL GREEN had been hired as the publicity director for that radio company.

On August 10, 1946, the informant advised that FANNIE informed MEL (ph) that VICTOR and ELLENGERLO were going to Baltimore that day

On August 11, 1946, VICTOR PERIO was in contact with LOWELL KILGORE (ph). The informant advised that apparently KILGORE and PERIO both have children in camps in the vicinity of Saint Michael on the Eastern Shore of Maryland, inasmuch as VICTOR informed KILGORE that they visited CATHY, PERIO'S daughter, now in camp at Saint Michaels (1)

The informant advised that on August 14, 1946, HUGH contacted ELLEN PERLO to pay his semi-annual respects and to advise her that he was working for the National Research Council on Constitution Avenue. He had been in New York over the week end and rem across GEORGE MOSS, who is leaving Columbia Records and is going with Keynote Records, which is an outgrowth of HARRY BERNAY'S "Music Room". According to HUGH, BERNAY is President of it and PAUL ROBESON is on the board and one of the stockholders. HUGH informed ELLEN that GEORGE would be in charge of all art and advertising and will get a good salary. ELLEN stated that art was her original field.

ELLEN informed HUCH that her father, NICHOLAS MENAKER, was up to camp over the July 4th week end and the latest is that PETE had 128 boys and had to build two new cabins. HUCH inquired if her father mentioned CHARLES and BLANCHE SHANNON and HUCH mentioned that they were to come here on their way to Maine as CHARLES is to do work with HENRY BRONHAM POOR (ph) up in Maine this summer.

ELLEN asked HUGH if he had seen the article in Colliers magazine that mentioned CHARLIE (SHANNON?). The article was written by RANKIN. ELLEN will give it to HUGH. HUGH informed her that his boss is in Connecticut and is due back tomorrow night and they will be working hard for about ten days. HUGH will return the magazine in person.

ELLEN informed HUGH that her birthday is Saturday. He informed her that he is moving next door to his present address and will now be at 1627 P Street, NW. He advised her that if his boss, Dr. BAUMER (ph) did not come back Saturday he would visit the PERLOS.

On August 14th informant advised that an unidentified man contacted VICTOR PERIO on that date and they agreed to meet at 1:00 P. M. at the Lee Sheraton Hotel in Washington, D. C.

Reference is made to the report of Special Agent ZANDER in the Silvermaster Case uated July 8, 1946, which reflects under the data pertaining to VICTOR PERIO that HUGH, residing at 1627 P Street, NW., telephone HOBART 1653, who has previously been in contact with the PERIOS is HUGH SAMSON.

A check of the records of The Credit Bureau and those of Stein Mercantile Agency by Special Agent O. M. SMASAL was made with negative results, however, the records of The Credit Bureau reflect a record of one HUGH BY SAMPSON living at 4623 Morgan Drive, Chevy Chase, Maryland, who it appeared is not identical with HUGH SAMSON.

Inquiry at the Civil Service Commission revealed no present, past or examination record of the employment of one HUGH SAMSON with the United States Government and Special Agent SMASAL checked the criminal records of the Metropolitan Police Department with negative results.

In regard to the information obtained by <u>Confidential Informant</u> on August 14th regarding arrangements made between VICTOR PERLO and an unidentified man to meet at the Lee Sheraton Hotel, it is to be noted that PERLO met a man at 1:00 P. M. in the lobby of the Lee Sheraton Hotel on August 15th and they had lunch in the Georgian Room of the hotel. This man has been identified as JOHN ABT.

The following information was received on August 14, 1946, from the office of Miss RIFKIN through a pretext telephone call. Her office reported that the subject had left Washington at noon enroute to New York for the remainder of the week. She left the address and phone number where she could be reached, which was 19 East 98th Street, New York, telephone AT-9746. It is noted that this address is that of the subject's father in New York. They further advised that the subject would return to Washington on Monday, the 19th of August, 1946.

On August 19, 1946, it was learned from a review of RIFKIN'S personnel file at UNKRA, 1320 Connecticut Avenue, NW, that the subject had received a promotion dated August 16, 1946, effective September 16, 1946, with a salary increase from \$3500.00 per annum to \$3,680.00 per annum. The promotion is from Administrative Assistant in the office of the Director of the Bureau or Office of Accounts and Finance to Administrative Assistant in the Office of the Chief in the Bureau or Office of Accounts and Finance. It was further ascertained that the subject is presently located with UNRRA in the LaSalle Building, Room 301, telephone DEcatur 7300, Extension 455, at 1034 Connecticut Avenue, NW.

A check was made by the Reporting Agent at the office at 1034 Connecticut Avenue on August 19, 1946, and the subject was observed seated at her desk.

There has been no further information furnished by informants of the Washington Field Office regarding the subject.

The following investigation is reported by Special Agent ŒORŒ G. McKENNA for the period August 1 to 15, 1946.

On August 1, 1946, WARREN SHARFMAN spoke to ALLAN ROSENBERG. He told ALIAN he had received a letter from VERNON WILKERSON (phonetic) to the effect that their case had been consolidated by the Commission (the Federal Communications Commission is probably referred to.) with a special hearing because of the possibility of electrical interference. WARREN said he would write WILKERSON a letter bringing him up to date and reminding him that he had not yet paid the minimum fee of \$400. This conversation apparently refers to an attempt on the part of one of ROSENBERG's clients to obtain a radio outlet in the Los Angeles area.

1946, concerning the activities of the ROSENBERGS in view of the fact that they departed from Washington on August 1, 1946, for a two-week vacation.

On August 14, 1946, CARL GREEN got in touch with ERNA ROSENBERG who told him they had spent their vacation with ALIAN's sister on Cape Cod. CARL GREEN said MAYNARD GERTLER and his wife, the DAVID WAHLS, and the BOWEN SMITHS had returned from their vacations. CARL said he was still working at 1822 Jefferson Place, N. W. (where the offices of ROSENBERG and SMARFIAN located). He thought the chances of his getting out of this town were slimmer. CARL said ED and RUTH RECHER had not gone on a vacation.

MARLES DOUGLAS. SHIRLEY'S husband's name is apparently BERNIER COLLAND

CARL stated TACK (phonetic) was destined for Europe on a special mission for President TRUMAN. MACK would act as special legal counsel to General LUCIUS CIAY. He would leave the United States in about a week and would be gone for about a month. CARL GREEN said, "Your husband saw him and will give you a full report on that. He is taking just one or two people, but he wants them like (ALIAN) ROSENBERG." CARL stated although it has not yet been published officially, HAROLD GIASSER (a subject of instant case) is going to be director of Monetary Research. CARL said that BILLY TAYLOR who is acting director told him this.

CARL mentioned the (BOJEN?) SMITHS had got a beautiful house in Georgetown and had sold their farm. He said "your friend" JOE (ITZCERALD is now unemployed and at the present time is on annual leave. He stated DAVE WAHL had vacationed in New Milford but had kept returning to New York and Washington. CARL mentioned he had not seen PHIL DUNAWAY because he (DUNAWAY?) was having a great deal of dental work done. CARL mentioned WAY —— was in Washington for August 14 and 15 1966.

Physical Surveillance

No physical surveillance was conducted on subject ALIAN ROSENBERG during the period of this report.

Apart from the information furnished by it should be mentioned that a highly confidential and reliable informant furnished considerable information regarding the activities and contacts of AIIAN ROSENBERG. This information is being analyzed and assembled and will be set out in a future report.

In the Washington report in instant case dated July 8, 1946, it is set forth a red Plymouth sedan bearing Maryland 1946 license plate 141-872 was observed parked outside the home of BOWEN SMITH, 2818 N Street, N. W., during the course of a party which the occupants of this car were observed to attend.


By letter dated August 8, 1946, the Baltimore Field Office advised that the registration division of the Maryland Bureau of Motor Vehicles reflected these tags were issued to one CRACE PHILLIPS CRANWELL, 1622 Park Avenue, Baltimore, for a Plymouth sedan, which in 1943 was indicated to have been a used car. The records further reflected these tags had been forwarded to 2818 N Street, N. W., Washington, D. C.

A check of the Baltimore City Directory reflected that CRACE P. CRANNELL, widow of JAMES H. CRANNELL, JOHN R. CRANNELL (U. S. Army), and MARTHA T. CRANNELL reside at 1622 Park Avenue.

A search of the Baltimore Field Office indices reflected on October 3, 1939, JOHN PHILLIPS CRANWELL, who at that time was a lieutenant in the Military Intelligence Reserve, had furnished a non-specific complaint regarding several individuals he suspected of belonging to pro-German or communistic organizations. This same individual furnished a second non-specific complaint regarding a suspected pro-Nazi on May 1, 1940.

The records of the Credit Bureau of Baltimore reflected Mrs. CRACE PHILLIPS CRANWELL, age 60-62, widow of JAMES H. CRANWELL, had been residing at 1622 Park Avenue since 1921. This report further indicated she had a son, one JOHN PHILLIPS CRANWELL, a lieutenant colonel in the U. S. Army, believed to be residing at 1532 16th Street, N. W., Washington, D. C. The report indicated Mrs. CRANWELL had been left an estate valued at 130,051 by her husband who died in May, 1940.

A review of the file in this case revealed that many of the subjects in the case had been in contact with one HERBERT SCHIMMEL. Among those who had contacted him at various times were CHARLES KRAMER, SOLOMON LESCHINSKY, HARRY S. MAGDOFF and GEORGE PRAZICH.

Reference is made to report of Special Agent L. G. ZANDER dated June 17, 1946, Serial 2330, Page 86, in which a conversation between SCHIMMEL and HARRY SAMUEL MAGDOFF was reported and in which SCHIMMEL and MAGDOFF discussed openly the coat strikes and the labor situation. SCHIMMEL gave MAGDOFF information as to what Senator KHIGORE was going to do in connection with the labor legislation and further disclosed SCHIMMEL'S viewpoint on the pending legislation. SCHIMMEL in these conversations asked MAGDOFF for his opinion on the recommendations of HAROLL WEIN for Assistant Research Director to WICKERT of the United Auto Workers, CIO

BACKGROUND

•

A check at The Credit Bureau, 1221 G Street, NW, Washington, D. C. on August 8, 1946, revealed that the subject is 35 years old, white, married, and has a wife and two children dependent upon him. His residence was listed as Greenway Apartments and he had been there since August, 1941. He came to Washington from 1727 Vine Street, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. His father was listed as Mr. SCHIMMEL, residing at 2301 North Park Avenue, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.

These records further showed that he was employed as of February 19, 1946, by the United States Government as a consultant with the KIIGORE Subcommittee on Military Affairs and that he had formerly been employed by the National Research Project, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. It is to be noted that the Philadelphia division of the Credit Bureau was unable to locate any information on the National Research Project.

From a highly confidential source known to Special Agent COURTLAND J. JONES of this office it was ascertained that the subject was born in New York City on September 12, 1909, and that he is married and has two children. From 1923 to 1924 he attended the Philadelphia High Schools. From 1924 to 1927 he attended the Haifa Secondary School and Technical Institute in Palestine. From 1927 to 1937 he attended the

University of Pennsylvania and received a BA Degree in Mathematics and an MS and a Ph. Degree in Physics.

While attending school at the University of Pennsylvania SCHIMMEL from 1927 to 1932 worked part time with the Sales Service, SCHIMMEL ETECTRIC SUPPLY COMPANY, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, in which job his work included development and maintenance of sales control records and sales engineering installation and repair of domestic and commercial refrigeration.

From 1932 to 1934 he was employed by the University of Pennsylvania as a Research Physicist and conducted experimental research in X-ray and in spectrographic work.

In the latter part of 1934 he was employed by the refrigeration service, TRILLING AND MONTAGUE COMPANY, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. He was employed as an investigator for the Pennsylvania Department of Public Assistance, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, in 1934 and 1935. He was employed as an Engineer Economist for the National Research Project, Philadelphia, from 1936 until 1941. His supervisor in this capacity was DAVID WEINTRAUB, who is now acting Deputy Director of UNKRA. In this capacity he collected data and prepared studies on the effects of technological developments on labor productivity, industrial growth and productive potential. These studies covered the major American industries, manufacturing, transportation, communication and power, and agriculture as well as a number of highly specialized studies in specific industries.

From 1941 to 1942 he was employed as an economist and technical consultant for the House Committee investigating National Defense Migration (TOLAN Committee, Washington, D. C.). His supervisor in this job was Dr. ROBERT K TAMB, who is now legislative representative of the United Steel Workers, CIO. In this capacity he made investigations and prepared reports on war production problems particularly on the conversion of peacetime industries to military output. During the last six months with this Committee he was detailed to Senators KIIGORE, PEPPER and MURRAY, assisting them in studies of war mobilization and small business problems.

From 1943 to the present time he has been employed as Chief of Investigations and Hearings, Senate Committee on War Mobilization (KIIGORE Committee at Washington, D. C.). He is in charge of the staff making investigations, preparing hearings and writing reports on war mobilization and reconversion problems.

During the time in which he was employed between August of 1941 to December of 1942, making investigations and writings for the House Committee investigating National Defense Migration, he spent his time from August, 1941, to March of 1942 serving as a staff liaison with Federal Agencies and preparing legal background for the hearings: September, 1941, at Detroit, Michigan on conversion of the automobile industry; November, 1941, Hastings and Omaha,

Nebraska, and St. Louis on use of capacity and labor supply of the life midwest communities. He further assisted in organizing and preparing hearings of October, 1941, and December, 1941, on need and methods for all-out conversion of American Industry to war effort.

He was co-author of the Committee's second interim report "Recommendation on Full Utilization of America's Industrial Capacity and Labor Supply in the War Effort" and he was author of the Committee's third interim report on the "Need for Single Procurement Agency to Effect All-out War Production."

From February, 1942, to May of 1942, his work concerned the evacuation or enemy aliens and others from prohibited military zones. In connection with this he served as staff liaison with Washington Federal Agencies in preparation of West Coast Japanese hearings of February and March of 1942, and also participated in drafting the Committee's report on this subject in May of 1942.

From June, 1942, to September, 1942, he was active in the mobilization of manpower and in this capacity joined in organizing and preparing Committee hearings on the subject. He stated that he had formulated and drafted the PEPPER-KILGORE-TOLAN War Mobilization Bill and jointly with ROBERT K. LAMB and PAIMER WEBER organized and prepared hearings for Senator PEPPER'S Subcommittee on the PEPPER-GILGORE-TOLAN Bill.

From August, 1942, to date SCHIMMEL has been engaged as the Clerk for the investigations and writings for senate Mobilization Committee (KIIGORE Committee) and as such made studies of the mobilization of scientific and technical resources in preparation for the formulation of the Science Mobilization Bill which had extensive hearings in both the 77th and 78th Congress. In this connection he also made studies for a postwar National Science Foundation.

From March of 1943 to October of 1943 his interests were centered in the mobilization of the Nation's shipping resources. His staff studies leading to Committee Report Number 3 in October, 1943, absolved the current falacy that shipping facilities constituted a bottleneck to the opening of a full scaled United States Military Operation in Europe.

In November of 1943 and to date extensive hearings and staff studies have been conducted on the effects of monopolies and cartels. These hearings and investigations have been guided by SCHIMMEL and the Committee Report Number 4 was issued on this matter in November of 1944. This report developed a program for expanding world trade through international economic agreements and their substitution for private cartels. It also formulated an economic program with respect to Germany which had the distinction of embodying many of the points agreed on by the "Big Three" at the Crimean Conference.



SCHIMMEL was also a leading figure in the studies or idequire in full employment which led to the formulation of the KIIGORE Reconversion Bill which was introduced in March of 1944. This bill was revised and reported out by the Senate Military Affairs Committee and was eventually defeated and an emasculated version substituted for it by Senator GEORGE.

The informant further made available a list of selected writings and publications for the National Research Project which SCHIMMEL had made while employed with that organization from November, 1936, to July, 1941. This listing is set forth hereinafter:

1. The Characteristics and Role of Modern Industrial Techniques.

(Part of Fine Report of the National Research Project, in publication.) - Author

- 5. Mechanization in the Cement Industry, December 1939, co-author.
- 6. Industrial Research and Changing Technology, January 1939, consultant and contributor.
- 7. Industrial Change and Employment Opportunity A selected Bibliography, July 1939, consultant and contributor.



INVESTIGATION AND PHYSICAL SURVEILLANCE

On July 31, 1946, the Newark Field Division and the Philadelphia Field Division were advised that HERBERT SCHIMMEL had left Washington several days previously and had left the following forwarding liresses with the Subcommittee on Scientific Research for the Senate Military Affairs Committee where he is employed as a Clerk:

1419 North Mershall Street 305 East Levender Street Philadelphia, Pennsylvania Wildwood Crest, New Jersey.

Descriptions of SCHIMMEL and his wife and family were furnished to the above offices.

Both the Newark and Philadelphia Field Divisions were requested to immediately attempt to locate SCHIMMEL and notify this office of his whereabouts in order that this of ice could undertake to perform a highly confidential investigation in connection with SCHIMMEL.

By memorandum dated August 2, 1946, the Philadelphia Field Division advised that a surveillance of 1419 North Marshall Street was instituted on July 31, 1946, at 7:45 P. M. and at 10:45 P. M. Special Agent L. H. HEIDINGER telephoned from the Newark Field Office to advise that SCHIMMEL, his wife and two children had left Wildwood Crest, New Jersey, at 10:00 P. M. in a blue sedan bearing Washington, D. C. License Tegs Number 108-251. SCHIMMEL told his landlord at Wildwood Crest that he was going to Philadelphia for a few days.

At 12:10 A. M., August 1, 1946, SCHIMMEL and his family arrived at 1419 North Marshall Street in the above mentioned car and at 1:05 A. M. all all lights in the North Marshall Street address were extinguished. The car was parked in the street all night and at 7:30 A. M. a woman, presumed to be Mrs. J. ZUKIN, left 1419 North Marshall Street carrying a shopping bag. She was approximately sixty years of age.

At 10:15 A. M. SCHIMMEL and his two children left 1419 North Marshall Street in the above described Chevrolet car and proceeded to Logan Square, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, on a sightseeing tour. They visited Fels Planatarium, the natural history museum and the free public library, returning to 1419 North Marshall Street at 1:30 P. M.

MADELIN BLITZSTEIN is a member of the professional section of the Communist Party and is very active in pro-Russian activities in this area. KORSTEAD was active in Philadelphia as a representative of the National CIO Committee in support of all strikers and worked out of Washington, D. C. He is presently Business Agent for the Food, Tobacco, Agricultural and Allied Workers Union, CIO, in Tennessee.

JANE HODES is a member of the Communist Party and taught at the Philadelphia school referred to above.

It was ascertained that a J. VZUKIN resided at 1419 North Marshall Street. In this connection

On August 7, 1946, IYNN E. MOTE, a former Agent of this Bureau, who is now employed by Senator EUGENE D. MILLIKIN K), Colorado, was interviewed by the writer and at this time he stated that SCHIMMEL had come to the attention of Senator WHERRY from Nebraska who had introduced a resolution to the effect that all names and salaries of personnel on loan from other Agencies be published and further that all such employees be returned to their own Agency by the close of the 79th Congress. MOTE stated that Senator WHERRY had become very much disturbed by the activities of SCHIMMEL on the floor of the Senate and in the cloak rooms of the Senate Office Building. MOTE said that WHERRY had denounced him on the floor and had complained of him approaching other Senators on the floor of the Senate and in the cloak rooms in an attempt to influence them on legislation.

MOTE further disclosed that Senator WHEKKY had caught SCHIMMEL on various occasions eavesdropping on conversations between members of the Senate.

CONTENTAL

As a result of this discovery by Senator WHERRY he had a private privational conducted by GEORGE E. W. SMITH for the House Minority Group into the lack-ground of HERBERT SCHIMMEL.

MOTE stated that SCHIMMEL lives in the same apartment building as he does and that he had seen him in association with both CHARLES KRAMER and SOLOMON A. LESCHINSKY who are subjects in this case. NOTE gave the following description of HERBERT SCHIMMEL:


On August 15, 1946, the subject was observed by the writer to leave his home at 9:35 A. M., driving the aforementioned Chevrolet Coach and accompanied by a woman who could be described as being 5' 4" tall, 145 pounds, black graying hair worn high on her head, round faced, double chin and wearing glasses. This woman was dressed in a pale green dress, white hat, shoes, gloves and purse. This woman was later identified as being the chief telephone operator in the House Office Building, Room 211 Sub-basement, and her name was ascertained to be Mrs. NENA PHOMAS, who resides in the Greenway Apartments on 119 Anacostia Road, Apartment 102. On this date SCHIMMEL drove to a point between First and Second Street on B Street and parked opposite the Congressional Shoe Repair Shop, 135 B Street. The subject and Mrs. THOMAS had a long conversation after which she walked to the New House Office Building and went into the sub-basement, Room 211, where she began her daily work.

SCHIMMEL was observed to take several pairs of shoes from the car and leave them in the Congressional Shoe Repair Shop owned by OSDWALD FABRIZIO, after which he proceeded to his office in the Senate Office Building. All other physical surveillance conducted on instant subject has been unproductive.

During the period from August 1 through August 15, 1946, Confidential Infurnished the following information concerning subject's activities.

On August 1, 1946, CHRISTAGNER was in contact with GEORGE SILVERIAN. CHRIS mentioned that O'DWYER, apparently Mayor O'DWYER of New York, had been awfully nice to his wife, FLORENCE, and that O'DIVER had made very complimentary remarks about GEORGE. GEORGE was going to New York that weekend to spend several days with his son, DICK.

On this same date JEROME DHRBACK attempted to get in touch with GEORGE SILVERHAN and was advised by SARAH that GEORGE had taken the APhi train to New York, and was going to stay at the Pennsylvania Hotel

On August 2, 1946, FRANK CONNOLLY attempted to contact GEORGE SILVERMAN but was advised by SARAH that GEORGE was in New York and expected to go from New York to Boston to visit with DICK. FRANK wanted to know what GEORGE intended to do. SARAH replied she did not know but thought that was one of the reasons he went to New York.

On the same date an individual known only to the informant az GENE, is believed to be a friend of DICK's. GENE contacted SARAH, SILVERMAN and wanted to know if she or GEORGE had seen the book he is selling, called "The Great Conspiracy Against Russia". SARAH had not read this book, nor had she heard of it. GENE agreed to bring her and GEORGE a copy.

On August 2, 1946, JOE SILVERMAN conferred with SARAH, at which time SARAH advised she intended to go to Boston about August 31st for one week. JOE asked SARAH what had happened to their friend DAVE EINTRAUB. SARAH was unable to answer, but did state that LaGUARDIA gave him three months pay

and he had two months leave. Therefore he would be paid for five months. She did say that DAVE had told GEORGE he had been offered any number of jobs.

On August 5, 1946, SOL ADLER contacted SARAH SILVERMAN and advised her he was leaving Washington the following morning, and wanted to thank her and GEORGE for "everything".

On August 8, 1946, GEORGE SILVERIAN cancelled a luncheon engagement with FRANK, CONNOLLY that day, but made arrangements to see him over the following weekend.

On this same date CHRIS WAGNER conferred with GEORGE SILVERMAN concerning some surplus property, in which they were dealing, and during the conversation WAGNER mentioned he was having lunch with FRANK (believed to be FFANK CONNOLLY), the following day, whereupon SILVERMAN launched a denunciation of FRANK, saying his word was no good and he did not live up to any of his promises. From this conversation it appeared that FRANK CONNOLLY was assisting WAGNER in his surplus property deals by advising him in advance as to what property would be declared surplus. WAGNER mentioned that CONNOLLY was LITTLEJOHN's deputy

On August 9, 1946, GEORGE SILVERIAN was in contact with DAVID WHITE, at which time they di cussed a deal concerning a large quantity of barbed wire

On August 12th, GEORGE SILVERHAN advised CHRIS WAGNER that he will officially be working for the French for another week, but actually he has not done anything for a couple of months. GEORGE also stated he was going to New York the following day.

On August 13th, SILVERHAN contacted his wife, SARAH, and advised her he had seen BILL O'DEYER who wanted him to go down the Hudson River with him to talk over certain "problems". He also wanted him to come to New York and would give him some sort of a job which would pay around \$7500. He also mentioned that JERRY had offered him a job for about \$7500 but he was not going to take any job unless he could have time off to take care of his own business ()

On August 14, 1946, SILVERHAN had a long conversation with CHRIS WAGNER. This time they discussed various surplus property deals and SILVERHAN also told WAGNER about his meeting with O'DWYER, who was very anxious to have SILVERHAN's services. According to SILVERHAN, O'DWYER wanted to start a



The following information was obtained from regarding activities of subject from August 1 to 15, 1946.

On August 2, 1946, informant advised that Madame/LUGUET, presently a house guest of the SILVER/ASTERS, was planning to sail for France on the "Indo-Chinois." Madame LUGUET is the widow of General CHARLES LUGUET, former military attache at the French Embassy who died in December, 1945. It is apparent the informant advises that Ers. LUGUET is returning to France with her furniture and automobile at the expense of the French government.

On August 6, 1946, confidential informant advised LUDVIG ULLIANN attempted to contact Dr. ISADORF ALTER on several occasions without success.

On the same date LUDVIG ULLWANN contacted the Naval Medical Center requesting information regarding the admittance of a naval dischargee for treatment in an emergency case involving undulant fever. Informant suggested it is possible ULLWANN was making inquiries regarding the admittance of AMATOLE VOLKOV to the Naval Hospital inasmuch as it had been previously ascertained that ANATOLE VOLKOV was subjected to an attack of undulant fever while at the beach cottage of the SILVERMASTERS at Harvey Cedars, New Jersey.

On August 7, 1946, HELEN SILVERMASTER contacted GREGORY SILVERMASTER at his office advising she had just arrived home with ANATOLE and that ULL-MANN had agreed to take ANATOLE to the hospital on that evening. HELEN SILVERMASTER then contacted LUDWIG ULLMANN and congratulated him on getting a place for ANATOLE at the Naval Hospital.

In a subsequent contact with DICK SASULY, HELEN SILVERIASTER advised him that ANATOLE may have both undulant fever and tuberculosis. DICK advised HELEN he may have his book completed this week. HELEN extended an invitation to SASULY to accompany them to the beach on the following weekend and if necessary he may complete his book at the beach and still take it to New York on the following Monday or Tuesday. SASULY indicated he had had several talks with ELIZABETH, his wife, in California and she is working very hard and likes it there very much.

On August 9, 1946, informant advised apparently ANATOLE VOLKOV was not receiving proper attention at the Naval Hospital and LUDVIG ULLMANN advised HELEN SILVERMASTER that TAX KLOTZ talked with Undersecretary of the Navy SULLIVAN and atting the lest said he would call the hospital and

ask for a report on ANATOLE and advise her. She was under the impression this expression of interest ought to get some action.

Or the same date DICK SASULY advised HELEN SILVERMASTER that ISADORE SALKIND is going to marry ELEANOR DRIESEN, former wife of DANNY DRIESEN.

Informant advised HELEN SILVERMASTER contacted JENNY MILIER, wife of subject ROBERT MILIER, on August 10, 1946, and explained in great detail ANATOLE's illness and his treatment at the Bethesda Medical Center. She also expressed displeasure at the behavior of JOHN and CYNTHIA DIERKES during their visit to the SILVERMASTER beach cottage, particularly their neglect an contributing to the expenses and upkeep of the establishment. She also entioned CRECORY SILVERMASTER is not feeling too well and has been quite unhappy these days.

Subsequently however, LUDVIG ULLIANN contacted HELEN SILVERIASTER and advised her JOHN DIERKES gave him an envelope with \$200 in it, apparently a contribution to the maintenance of the beach home during their extended visit there.

POLYA HABICHT contacted HELEN SILVERMASTER on August 13, 1946, and advised she was unable to keep her appointment fora visit to the SILVERHASTERS that evening.







It is to be noted the above mentioned Colonel HERNARD BERNSTEIN, 407 Battery Lane, has figured prominently in this investigation.

In connection with JOSIAH E. DU BOIS, 1023 Woodside Parkway,
Silver Spring, Maryland, Confidential Informant advised on December 17, 194
that an individual believed to be Colonel HERNARD BERNSTEIN conferred with
HARRY WHITE. At that time HERNSTEIN asked WHITE if he knew JOE DU BOIS (ph)
was back. HERNSTEIN said JOE asked about Treasury. It is further to be noted
that in DREW PEARSON'S column of April 4, 1946, mention was made of Postmaster
General HANAGAN'S group of young braintrusters known as "HANAGAN'S Task Forces"

Concerning MAYNARD GERTLER, previously mentioned, Confidential, Informant on February 1, 1946, advised that ALLEN ROSENHERG suggested to ERNA ROSENHERG that she call the GERTLERS and WAHLS and the DUNAWAYS. ERNA remarked that this would make the ROSENHERGS, the GERTLERS, the RUBENSTEINS, CARL, the DUNAWAYS and the WAHLS.

This same informant on February 3, 1946, indicated that ERNA ROSENBERG intended to have the CERTLERS, the GLASSERS, DAVID WAHL and others to dinner on February 3, 1946. This informant further stated on February 4, 1946, that in a conversation between ERNA ROSENBERG and EMILY SHARFMAN, ERNA spoke of a party at her home. She said a nice couple was there by the name of CERTLER and she expected to see a lot of them. She said Mr. GERTLER is from Canada and he works for the FEA under BOWEN SMITH and is terribly wealthy. His wife is a member of the R. H MACY STRAUSS family, has lots of money and dresses crazily. She said Mrs. GERTLER is very nice and very intellectual.

Confidential Informant, on May 27, 1946, stated that CARL GREEN told MAURICE HALPERIN that he heard through BOB that MAURICE wanted to neet a fellow who made a broadcast about a week or so ago. GREEN said the GERTLERS would be the means of contact and that MAYNARD GERTLER said it was possible and he would like to meet HALPERIN. This same informant on May 27, 1946, stated that PHIL DUNAWAY contacted MAURICE HALPERIN. MAURICE told PHIL that CARL GREEN was bringing MAYNARD GERTLER to his house and WAHL also was going to be there.

Confidential Informant stated that on May 28, 1946, Mrs. HALPERIN in a conversation with TERRY SORACCO said she met MAYNARD GERTLER and his wife on a previous evening and was very favorably impressed by them

Confidential Informant advised that LILLIAN DUNAWAY told the HALPERINS on July 19th and August 1st that she expected to go to MAYNARD GERTLER'S farm f r the weekend.

It is to be noted the above ANSEL F. LUXFORD, 3908 Huntington Street, NW., who was phoned by TAYLOR is the assistant to the Secretary of the Treasury

With regard to EMANUEL E. MINSKOFF, 3916 Kinsbury Drive, Silver Spring, Maryland, Confidential Informant furnished the following information. On February 20, 1945, MINSKOFF contacted ELEANOR DRIESEN at the CIO Maritime Committee and they conferred regarding the obtaining of a copy of a decision of the Immigration Board of Appeals reversing the vopinion of Judge SEARS. (Reference is probably made to the HARRY MRIIGES case.)

On February 23, 1945, Mr. MINSKOFF of the Treasury Department called ELEANOR DRIESEN and discussed the advisability of obtaining the services of a law firm to draw up a brief in the HARRY BRIDGES case. MINSKOFF said he would consult LEE PRESSMAN and then would call ELEANOR.

On February 26, 1945, ELEANOR KAHN, CIO Maritime Committee, contacted E. E. MINSKOFF, Extension 2595 at the Treasury Department. (This extension is in the General Counsel's office.) During this contact these two individuals discussed the HARRY BRIDGES case in detail. They conversed regarding the drawing up of a brief for the ERILGES case to be presented to President ROOSEVELT through the Secretary

The above informant further stated that MINSKOFF contacted ELEANOR DRIESEN on March 19, 1945, at which time she stated she had something for MINSKOFF and would drop by to give it to him.

Regarding ARTHUR W./STUART, the subscriber to a phone number called by TAYLOR, it is to be noted that this office conducted a Hatch Act investigation on one ARTHUR WATERS STUART who was a Senior Agricural Economist, Bureau of Agricultural Economics, Department of Agriculture, who may be identical with ARTHUR W. STUART. It is to be noted the STUART who was the subject of the Hatch Act Investigation on March 19, 1942, stated he was residing at 8418 Woodcliff Court, Silver Spring, Maryland. A review of the file in the Hatch Act Investigation in 1942 reveals that ARTHUR WATERS STUART was born September 27, 1908, at Palo Alto, California, and by virtue thereof is an American citizen. Mr. STUART was connected with the University of California from November, 1933, to June, 1934, as a Research Assistant working under the Giannini Foundation. He was employed as an Agricultural Economist by the State Emergency Relief Administration, California, from June, 1934 to May, 1935. Prior to STUART'S connection with the State of California he was employed by the Systems Sales Division of Remington-Rand, Inc., San Francisco, Columnia, from July, 1930 to July, 1932. He began his employment with the sa States Department of Agriculture on May 7, 1935, in the Division of Rehabilitation Resettlement.

ETUART resigned this position September 30, 1937, to accept a fellowship in the Graduate School of Public Administration, Hartford University returning to the Department of Agriculture on July 1, 1939, as a collaborator in the Division of State and Local Planning. As of March, 1942, STUART held the position of Senior Agricultural Economist, Bureau of Agricultural Economics at \$4600.00 per annum.






