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
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

B. WEINSTEIN while he was in Canada over the weekend of August 2, 1946. For the information of the Bureau the following facts have been taken into consideration by this office in regard to developing such an informant: Dr. A. B. WEINSTEIN maintains his office at 20 East 53rd Street. is a seven story building that was formerly occupied solely and exclusively by doctors and dentists. Within the past two years architects and other preional men have become tenants in this building but in the main its estill occupied by doctors and dentists. Dr. WEINSTEIN occupies the entire sixth floor of this building. He employs twenty to twenty-five employees and the NTOP DESK fact seven other dentists, who are employed by him. At the outset of this investigation the superintendent of the building at 20 East 53rd Street was contacted in an effort to develop a highly confidential source of information with access to the business office of Dr. A. B. WEINSTEIN. The superintendent was contacted under suitable pretext but it was found impossible to develop such an informant at that time. No opportunity has presented itself to develop such an informant through this superintendent Furthermore, the owner of this building, MOSESTONCKWAN, who is Russian born though a citizen of the United States, was confacted and again under suitsince that time. able pretext it was found not advisable for second the factor of develop such a confidential informant at that time or at the present time. 



Through the assistance of this technical surveillance it has been ascertained that Dr. Weinstein has been in contact with Barney Josephson, Dr. Harold Aaron, Peter Rhodes, P. Bernard Nortman, "Zero" Mostel, Stanley Fonfa, Joe Roberts, Donald West and Anna Louise Strong all of whom are subjects of Bureau investigations. Without the use of this type of coverage, it would have been impossible to ascertain the identity of these contacts. Considering the information that has been received in the past, it is requested that this type of technical coverage be continued in the future.

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



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to identification of most of ELSON's contacts, most of whom are Communists. It has assisted materially in conduct of physical surveillances. It has set forth dates and locations of meetings between ELSON and GREGORY.

On one occasion ELSON called JACK GOLDMAN, who it is believed may be identical with the unidentified "JACK" in instant investigation, and asked to borrow \$50, which transaction took place immediately following a luncheon date with GREGORY on May 24, 1946. On July 15, 1946, ELSON called GOLDMAN and asked him to sign an affidavit to certify that they, the ELSONs, are married and that their name is ELSON and that JOSEPH ELSON's real name is ISRAELSON. This was in compliance with a request from the Veterans Administration. During the same conversation, GOLDMAN, after agreeing to the affidavit, told ELSON that he had spent the weekend of July 4th at Kinderland (ph), New York, with the Polish Delegation. This may possibly be the Polish Delegation of UN.

will report a tentative date when GOLDMAN will come to EISON's for dinner. EISON also has conversations with MILTON KEMNITZ of NFCL, where EISON was formerly employed. Mrs. L. ABERNATHY, Apt. 2-A, 153 Ivanhoe Street, N.W. Washington, D. C. was interviewed under pretext and advised that she was a neighbor of JOANNE ELIZABETH ANTHONY and DANIEL S. ANTHONY. She stated that they had lived at 153 Ivanhoe Street, but had left Washington on August 8, 1946,

for Muncie, Indiana, after subletting their apartment until December. She advised that Mr. ANTHONY had only recently been given an honorable discharge from the United States Army where he had been stationed at Camp Lee, Virginia. According to ARENATHY he had secured a good position with some welfare group whose headquarters are in Washington and he is at the present time working in Muncie, Indiana. She stated that Mrs. ANTHONY is the secretary to Congressman GEORGE E. OUTLAND of California and that she has accompanied her husband to Muncie where she will stay for simile and she will then continue on to California to assist Congressman OUTLAND in his re-election campaign.

She advised that the ANTHONY's had sublet their apartment to persons whom she did not know until December. She stated, however, that the ANTHONY's might return early in the Fall.

The records of the Anacostia Post Office, at Anacostia, S. W. Washington, D. C. reflected the following change of address made on August 8, 1946, by Mr. and Mrs. DANIEL S. ANTHONY from 153 Ivanhoe Street, N.W. to 405 South Walnut Street, Muncie, Indiana, until December, 1946.

The records of the Credit Bureau at Washington contain a report dated October 6, 1944, regarding DANIEL S. ANTHONY and his wife, JOANNE ELIZABETH of 153 Ivanhoe Street, N.W. Washington, D. C.:-

She is described as being approximately 23 years of age, white, married March 1944, with no dependents. They have resided at the above address since March, 1944, renting an apartment in Bellview Gardens. Her maiden name was JOANNE ELIZABETH OTTE. She formerly resided at 1445 Ogden Street, N.W. and previously at 2006 MNW Street, N.W. She came to Washington from Antioch College, Yellow Springs, Ohio. He came to Washington from Easton, Pennsylvania, where he lived with his mother. JOANNE is employed by the Alien Property Custodian as an economist, previously employed by O.P.A. from October 22, 1942, to January 20, 1943.

She also worked four months in the Office of Lend-Lease. He is a Lieutenant in the U. S. Army on duty at Ft. Sam Houston, Texas. He entered the service in 1940 from his former employment as a salesman and personnel manager with the American Research Company of Easton, Pennsylvania. Her father is Captain F. R. OTTE on duty over-seas with the U. S. Army. Her father was born in China. Her mother is in charge of American Red Cross at Ft. Bragg, N. C.

The Metropolitan Police Department records failed to reflect any information regarding JOANNE ELIZABETH ANTHONY nee OTTE or DANIEL S. ANTHONY.

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

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JOHN DIERAES — Mrs JOHN DIERKES nee CYNTHIA TATERS SEUL

an unknown woman named ANNE on December 6, 1945, Mrs. MILLER stated when DIERKES went off last summer in June or July BOB asked him if he was going to the cold country. He said possibly, that if there were the slightest chance he would. Mrs. MILLER stated having heard that DIERKES might make this trip she called him up and asked him if he would take a pair of stockings (apparently to a friend) if he did go there, and DIERKES said yes, he would.

Mrs. MILIER continued saying the other day her husband BOB received a Christmas card addressed to the State Department with a little note that the stockings had been delivered. Mrs. MILLER then inquired of ANNE what DIEPKES' wife's name is, and ANNE said it was CYNTHIA. Mrs. MILLER advised she would call her and thank her for the favor her husband had done for Mrs. MILLER. Mrs. MILLER went on to say that her husband ascertained for Mrs. DIEPKES was from Boston, and that a brother of hers is an old friend of BOB NILLER, that they went to school together.

On December 19, 1945, advised that FILLER in a conversation with his wife stated he would call the DIERKES and invite them out to their home for an evening together.

On January 28, 1946,

tween BOB MILLER and his wife JENNY, JENNY advised BOB the "unexpected had bappened." CYNTHIA DIERKES had telephoned and she said she wanted them for dinner but JENNY told her they were going to the concert, and CYNTHIA couldn't make it Wednesday as they were invited to dinner then. As a result, JENNY said she made the engagement with CYNTHIA for today and they will go after 7:30 p.m. BOB stated this suited him.

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reported on March 1, 1946, BARNEY (LEROY 1) ad-

vised he is going to play golf wi JIERKES and BOB MILLER.

On March 28, 1946, advised JOHN DIERKES contacted HOYT HADDOCK, and DIERKES stated he was an old friend of JOS CURRAN. He went on to say the last time he saw CURRAN that JOE stayed at his (DIERKES) home in Berlin. DIERKES wanted the name of the Maritime union representative in Buffalo, New York. HADDOCK gave him the name of MIKE KERNS, 323 Main Street, Buffalo. DIERKES described himself as being red-headed.

On April 27, 1916, advised JOHN DIEZES spoke to CREGORY SILVERNASTER and told him he wanted to contact LUDITO TILVANN, and he told SILVERNASTER he would be around to see LUDITG at 10 a.m. on april 28, 1946.

advised on April 3, 1946, JOHN and CYNTHIA DIERKES planned to go to BOB MILLER's party on April 5, 1946.

advised on June 27, 1946, in a discussion between OLYALAR-COLIN and JENNY MILLER, JENNY said in answer to OLYA's question the person she knew who was working for the National Committee for Atomic Information was CYNTHIA DIERKES but CYNTHIA is pregnant and is going away for the summer in about a week.

In a letter from the New York Field Office to the Washington Field Office dated March 7, 1946, in instant case, it was pointed out the names of JOHN and CYNTHIA DIERKES were contained in an address book belonging to URSUIA MASSERVAN.

Information previously furnished concerning the personal history background of JOHN DIERKES appears in the report of Special Agent LAIGHRT G. ZANDER, Washington, D. C., dated July 8, 1946, in the CREGORY Case.

The records of the personnel division of UNRRA were reviewed by Special Agent V. W. HUGHES, and the following information was obtained therefrom concerning DIERKES.

After listing personal history, 'ata including date and place, of birth, etc., which has been previously reported, he listed his education as follows:

Attended Brown University from 1926 to 1928 majoring in philosophy University of Cincinnati from 1928 to 1930, majoring in philosophy Chicago University, 1937 and 1938, philosophy.

He also attended Rhode Island School of Design from 1926 to 1928. No degrees were listed as having been received from any of these schools.

He listed his former places of employment as follows:

1934 - he worked for the William E. Mackelfresh Company at Cincinnati, Ohio, as a salesman and advertising specialist.


1934-1937 - he worked for the Kroger Grocery and Baking Company, Cincinnati, Ohio, doing advertising and sales work.

1937-1939 - worked for the A. C. Gilbert Company, New Haven, Connecticut, as assistant sales director.

1939-1940 - he worked for the Ross Federal Research Corporation, New York City, as manager of their Milwaukee office.

1940-1942 - he listed himself as half owner of the Pacific Research Company, Baker, Oregon. He described this company as a public opinion research outfit.

During the course of the investigation of DIERKES by the personnel office of UNRRA, one informant described him as "a zealot on the Negro question and could possibly cause embarrassment because of it." Another informant stated his ability to get along with Negroes was his outstanding characteristic. Another informant advised that DIERKES is a great humanitarian. However, he should not be given a desk job in any sense as he has very little concern for detail.



The records of the American Red Cross also reflected that CYNTHIA MATERS, who subsequently became <u>lrs. JOHN DIERKES</u>, was employed by the Red Cross from September 14, 1942, and resigned on July 15, 1944. In her personal history statement, the former Liss WATERS stated she was born January 6, 1912, at Boston, Massachusetts. Her home address was listed as 1717 20th Street, N. W., at that time. She is a member of the Protestant faith. Her father is BERTRAM G. TATERS born in Boston, Massachusetts, and her mother was HELEN K. SHAM born at Astoria, Long Island, New York. Both her paternal grandmother and grandfather were born in the United States. Her maternal grandfather was born in England, and her maternal grandmother was born in the United States.

Her education was listed as follows:

The May School, Boston, 1924 to 1930. She received a diploma.

Bryant and Stratton See School, Boston, 1933.

Sorbonne University, Paris, France, 1932-1933.

Miss WATERS stated she spoke French and Italian. Her employment was listed as follows:

Worked for the Boston Globe, 1934-1935; Boston Transcript from 1936-1938; Ladies' Home Journal, dates not stated; Philadelphia Record, 1940-1942; Air Transport Command, 1942.


Most of Miss WATERS' work with the newspapers was in connection with the woman's page. In her application, it was further shown she was a member of the American Newspaper Guild, Philadelphia Unit. She stated prior to going to work for the newspapers from 1930-1931 she worked in the social service department of the Boston Dispensary as a volunteer, and she has also had experience as a camp councilor. She has studied sculpturing and modeling and her favorite sports are tennis and riding.

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Hiss WATERS stated she had lived outside the United State at the following places:

England and Scotland, July, 1932; France, September, 1932 to May, 1933; Italy, December, 1932, to January, 1933.

While in the Red Cross, Miss WATERS served overseas in Great Britain and it is believed the first time she met Mr. DIERKES was in Great Britain while they were both working for an American Red Cross Negro Soldiers Club.



The records of the Credit Bureau reflect in a report dated January 4, 1946, the following pertinent information concerning DIERRES and hiswife.

DIERKES is listed as white and lives with his wife and fourteenmonths old child at 476 N Street, where they have been residing for about one year renting an apartment from DAMTEL MELCHER at the same address. They formerly resided at 76 MacDougal Street, New York City, and 1640 Rhode Island Avenue, N. W. He formerly lived here for several months in 1942 and returned here alone in February, 1944. She also lived here a short time. The address 1640 Rhode Island Avenue is listed as the Admiral Club and both DIERKES and wife were well regarded there.

From April, 1942, to September, 1942, he lived at 1708 New Hampshire Avenue, N. W. This is the International Students House which, except for a few instances, provides residences for foreign students only. DIERKES left here in good standing, and his nationality or foreign connections are not known there at present from the records they still maintain. (In the Washington Field Office file entitled "International Students House," an informant stated communism is taught at the International Students House, and that Negroes and whites dance together. It is owned and operated by the American Friends Service Committee of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, a Quaker organization, which operates the house to provide room and board for foreign students residing in Washington.

He is employed at the Treasury Department, Foreign Funds Division, and was appointed March 23, 1945, as a commercial specialist. His salary is \$7,175 per annum.

A clipping from the Washington Fost dated April 30, 1944, contained in the records of the Credit Bureau is quoted hereafter:

April 22, 1944, have returned to Washington which is their temporary home. The bride is the former CYNTHIA WATERS, daughter of Mrs. BERTRAM C. WATERS of Brookline, Massachusetts. She recently returned from Europe where her first assignment with the Red Cross was at the London headquarters of the ARC Commission to Great Britain. She helped organize a British-American Club in Worcester, England, which served 15,000 meals a week and cared for 200 soldiers nightly. She also helped establish 20 small service clubs for the Red Cross in Northern Ireland.

"Before joining the American Red Cross, Mrs. DIERKES was with the Air Transport Command in Washington. She is a member of the Vincent Club and the Junior League of Boston. Mr. DIERKES is the son of the late Mr. and Mrs. J. H. DIERKES of Cincinnati, Ohio. The wedding took place at the home of the bride's uncle and aunt, Mr. and Mrs. RICHARD P. WATERS, with the Reverend THEODORE FERRIS of Trinity Church, Boston, officiating."

Photographs of both Mr. and Mrs. DIERKES have been obtained and are available in the files.

The following information concerning subject's activities from . June 16 to 30, 1946, was furnished by

On June 17, 1946, an unidentified woman believed to be ELIZABETH FRAZIER contacted REBECCA FITZCERALD at which time REBECCA mentioned she intended to leave for Philadelphia on the 3 p.m. train the following day. ELIZABETH mentioned she was also returning the next day to Philadelphia and would try to make the same train. In case she was unable to do so she asked REBECCA to contact her in Philadelphia at Chestnut Hill 3343.

On June 19, 1946, REBECCA FITZGERALD contacted her husband EDWARD and advised him she was staying at the Bellevue-Strafford and stated she was not going to see ELIZABETH in town because her mother was not well, and they were getting ready to go to the country. REBECCA mentioned that BETTY CRAHAE was in Philadelphia as a delegate from Westchester. EDTARD told REBECCA that KAPPY (IRVING KAPLAN) and HARRY MAGDOFF were coming over to his house where they were going to do some work.

On June 21, 1946, HARRY MACDOFF contacted ED FITZCERALD at which time they discussed their work at the Commerce Department. HARRY mentioned he had cut off six appointments to write seven pages of the report MAGDOFF and FITZŒRAID are preparing, an annual report dealing with the activities of the Commerce Department. HARRY said the "guys" were sore at him because he had put them off once before. Ed wanted to see PHIL WUSER to get his opinion and made arrangements for HARRY and IRVING KAPIAN to come out to FITZCERALD's the following evening.

LESLIE KISH, who is presently staying at the FITZGER_LD home, also was in contact with HARRY MAGDOFF and advised him he had secured an efficiency apartment at 15th and N Streets. They then discussed a projected trip by automobile with a couple in LESLIE's office to a point beyond New York City for some week-end. They agreed to discuss the details later.

On June 21, 1946, ED FITZGERALD was in contact with an individual known to informant as JIM who was residing with his mother in New York and is believed to be ED's brother. During the conversation ED mentioned he was changing jobs, probably for the better, as he was going to the secretary's office (Secretary of Commerce HENRY A. WALIACE). He said he didn't know whether it was better or not with the kind of a secretary that he had.

On June 22, 1946, HARRY MAGDOFF asked REBECCA FITZCERALD if it would meet with her approval for him and IRVING KAPIAN to come over to her house on the following afternoon. REBECCA agreed to this but stated they would have to leave at 4:30 p.m.

On June 22, 1946, LESLIE KISH advised ED FITZGERALD he had moved into his new house.

On June 25, 1946, EDWARD FITZCERALD contacted Dr. FINKELSTEIN of New York to inquire as to his father's health. ED was advised his father had been taken to the hospital and was in a coma. FITZCERALD stated he would be up as soon as he could get there.

On the same date FITZGERALD advised his wife REBECCA he was leaving immediately for New York. REBECCA stated she might spend the night with HERBIE FUCHS.

On June 26, 1946, EDWARD FITZGERALD contacted his wife stating his father was still quite ill. He wanted to know if REBECCA had contacted HARRY and what he had said. REBECCA told EDWARD HARRY said he would take care of PHIL HAUSER and there had not been any new developments.

On June 27, 1946, FRANK CAMERON of Harrisburg, Pennsylvania contacted REBECCA FITZCERALD and stated he had just put his wife TRUDY on the train and asked REBECCA to check the train upon its arrival.

On the same date FITZGERALD was in contact with his wife and during the conversation REBECCA stated that GEORGE and SARA SILVERMAN were going to take her to the station to meet TRUDY. EDWARD stated he might stay in New York over Sunday.

The following information was furnished by concerning FITZ-CERALD's activities from June 16 to 30, 1946.

On June 22, 1946, HARRY MAGDOFF contacted IRVING KAPLAN and advised him he would be at KAPLAN's home at 1:30 p.m. to take him to ED FITZGER ID's home on the following day.

On June 30, 1946, ED FITZGERALD contacted HARRY MAGDOFF and apvised he had just returned from New York di regarding hospital a messurb said his father was dying at any moment.

A check of the Washington Field Office indices reflected numerous references pertaining to FRANK KINGDON from whom EDNARD FITZGERALD received a letter on June 18, 1946. One file entitled, "FRANK KINGDON, Office of .

Emergency Management, Special Inquiry" reflected in April, 1942, KINGDON was employed by the New York Office of the Office of Emergency Management. The file further reflected KINGDON was born February 27, 1894, in England and was naturalized on February 11, 1918. KINGDON, according to the Dies list, was a member of the John Reed Club and signer of the statement published in the New York Times in protest of the "red scare." He was a member of the executive committee of the American Committee for Democratic and Intellectual Freedom, was a signer of a petition to discontinue the Dies Committee, and chairman of the panel at the conference of Greater New York Emergency Conference on Inalienable rights.

At one time KINCDON was president of the Newark University and educational director of the Citizenship Educational Service, 122 East 42nd Street, New York City. He is an active member of the Committee to Defend America by Aiding the Allies. He was a member of the Federal Union and was a writer for the magazine "Nation." According to informants, although he was not a Communist, he was thought to be a left-winger. He was also reported to be associated with an organization which was allegedly bringing Communists to the United States.

Physical Surveillance

On June 23, 1946, HARRY HAGDOFF and IRVING KAPIAN were observed by Special Agent H. DUDLEY PAYNE to arrive at the FITZGERALD home, 2209 Observatory Place, and were escorted into FITZGERALD's home by EDTARD FITZGERALD at 2:10 p.m. No other individuals were observed to enter the FITZGERALD residence from 1 p.m. through 4 p.m. on this date.

By letter dated June 21, the Newark Field Division furnished the following information regarding Dr. SEIMAN WAKSMAN of Rutgers University, New Brunswick, New Jersey, which was obtained from a reliable confidential source known to that office:


Dr. WAKSMAN is a professor at Rutgers University in the College of Agriculture. He was graduated from Rutgers in 1915 and subsequently received both his Master and Doctor Degrees from that school. He has been connected with the college since that time with the exception of two years in 1919 and 19


when he was employed by the TAKAMINE LABORATORY. It was reported that Dr. WAKSMAN was the individual who had discovered the streptomycin serum. The informant advised that in the August 18 1945, issue of Colliers Magazine there was a lengthy article concerning "Magic Germ Killer" which dealt with Dr. WAKSMAN'S activity in discovering this drug. It was also reported that Dr. WAKSMAN had frequently worked with Army and Navy authorities on various scientific projects.

The informant was unable to recall many of these inasmuch as he stated from his recollection that there were men from these Departments visiting WAKSMAN "at least once a week." He did recall that at one time he was working with the Navy in research concerning the elimination of plant fungi which destroyed ship bottoms. On another occasion he recalled Dr. WAKSMAN having worked with Army authorities on tropical deterioration.

The informant stated that Dr. WAKSMAN has been invited to go to Moscow and that it was his opinion that WAKSMAN had two reasons for accepting this invitation. The first reason was WAKSMAN'S desire to further American-Soviet relations and the second reason was to visit his relatives in Russia.

The informant stated that he had no information which would lead him to question Dr. WAKSMAN'S loyalty and patriotism, however, he stated Dr. WAKSMAN was very liberal in his thinking. He also advised that WAKSMAN was in very poor health, having a particularly bad heart condition and there had been speculation among faculty members at Rutgers that he will not survive this trip.





The Newark Field Division advised that in the 1944-45 issue of "Whose Who in America" the following information was obtained:

His full name is SEIMAN ABRAHAM WAKSMAN. He is a professor at the New Jersey State Agricultural Experimental Station, New Brunswick, New Jersey. He was born July 2, 1888, in Priluka, Russia. His father's name was JACOB and his mother's name FRODIA LONDON. He came to the United States in 1910 and was naturalized in 1915. On August 5, 1916 he married BERTHA D. MITNIK. They have one son BYRON H. WAKSMAN. He attended Rutgers University receiving a Bachelor of Science Degree in 1915 and Master of Science Degree in 1916 and a Doctor of Philosophy Degree in 1918. He specialized in the field of Soil Microbiology. From 1915 to 1916 he was Assistant Soil Microbiologist at Rutgers and since 1918 has been Microbiologist at Rutgers. From 1918 to 1924 he was a lecturer in Soil Microbiology at Rutgers and became an associate professor in 1924. In 1930 he became a full professor.

The book "American Men of Science" published by the Science Press, Lancaster, Permsylvania, in 1944, contained the following additional information regarding Dr. WAKSMAN:

In the year 1917 and 1918 he was a Research Biochemist at the Cutter Laboratories and from 1919 to 1920 Bacteriologist at Takamine Laboratories. Since 1931 he has been connected with the Woods Hole Oceanographic Institute as a Marine Bacteriologist. He has also been connected with several scientific publications and is a member of many scientific organizations. Among these it




is noted that he is an honorary member of the Leningrad Microbiological Society.

The indices of the Newark Field Di Ision reveal that Dr. MARSMAN was one of several individuals who was invited to a Science Jubilee in Moscow by Soviet Embassy in 1945. These indices also reveal that Professor WAKSMAN was a member of the Executive Committee of the Science Committee of the National Council of American Soviet Friendship. Inc. as of June 27, 1944.

The Newark files also contain a reference to Dr. WAKSMAN in a case concerning RALPH JOHNSTON HERVEY, also known as RALPH JOHNSTON HERVEY. This is a Hatch Act case on this individual, who was an employee of the United States Department of Agriculture in 1942. Information was developed by the Salt Lake City Field Division that HERVEY was considered radical and very interested in the Russian form of government. It was also ascertained that HERVEY had allegedly lost his position under Dr. S. A. WAKSMAN, Rutgers University, New Brunswick, New Jersey, due to radical tendencies. Dr. WAKSMAN was interviewed by an Agent of the Newark office on July 31, 1942, concerning HERVEY and he stated at that time that HERVEY had worked and studied as a student assistant to him in Marine Bacteriology from 1937 to 1938.

WAKSMAN stated that he could not question HERVEY'S American loyalty and added that HERVEY was a great talker, idealist and a sort of "homespun philosopher" but, according to WAKSMAN, he knew of no radical or Communist connections on thepart of HERVEY. He added that HERVEY was dismissed because he was not a capable scientist and for no other reason.

The nature of his business was given as confidential.

There will be no activities noted for this period inasmuch as the subjects are presently vacationing at Echo Point Cottage, Meredith Center, Laconia, New Hampshire.

Brief background information is being set forth concerning contacts of BELA and SONIA GOLD.

BOBAUSTIN: BELA COLD was contacted on January 1, 1946 by one BILL LEVITT./ IEVITT mentioned in his conversation with GOLD that he had met BOB AUSTIN at Camp Riley, Kansas. He identified BOB AUSTIN as being a "former Government Union guy." The indices of the Washington Field Division were checked concerning BOB AUSTIN with negative results.

MANNINGACLAGETT: On March 16, 1946, a party by the name of SUE, last name unknown, contacted Mrs. GOLD. This party advised that she and HENRY were spending the evening at the CLAGETTS'. SUE was congratulated by Mrs. GOLD on her fine radio program. The indices of the Washington Field Division were checked concerning MANNING CLAGETT with negative regulate.

Information reflected that HUNT's personal telephone was TEmple 0776. Inquiry was made at this telephone number, TEmple 0776, and a party answered by the name of Mrs. KEITH HUNT, who advised that Mr. HUNT could be contacted later at this same telephone exchange. The telephone directory for Alexandria, Virginia reflects that the telephone number TEmple 0776 is listed to one JOHN P. SAUL.

The indices of the Mashington Field Division were checked relative to Mr. KEITH HUNT with negative results.

BILL LEVITT: LEVITT called BELA GOLD on March 9, 1946 and inquired if he might have a bed for the evening. He stated that he had just come in from Camp Pickett, Virginia, and that he is still in the army. During the conversation, LEVITT made inquiry concerning LESLIE KISH, whom GOLD stated

was back in town in the same Division, perhaps meaning the Department of Agriculture. IEVITT also asked for KAY STEVART and REUSIS LIKERT, head of the Division of Program Surveys, Agriculture Department. IEVITT inquired as to the whereabouts of HAROLD H. KOUNG, solicitor for the Department of Commerce. After making these inquiries, LEVITT then drifted into a conversation in which he stated to GOLD, "You realize we are going to have another war with Russia."

The indices of the Jashington Field Division reflect that BILL LEVITT was employed by the Department of Agriculture as a Social ience Analyst from May 16, 1941 to July 2, 1942.

Background information on LEVITT reflects that he was born in New York City February 18, 1914; that he is married and has a child who would be five years old at this time. Other information concerning LEVITT reflects that he was employed as Educational Director of the International UAW-CIO. It further reflected that he was employed by the NPA in Raleigh, North Carolina, and that while in that employment was a subscriber to the Daily Worker and a Communist Party sympathizer.

Background on the subject indicates that his father, SAM M. NEVITT, resides at 13314 Gulf Blvd., Maderia Beach, St. Petersburg, Florida; that he is the owner and operator of the Goodwear Knitted Sportswear Company, 1225 Broadway, New York City. LEVITT's wife was the former Miss ELIZABETH AYSCUE of Buies Creek, N. C. Her father was reported to be a minister and stationed at Campbell College located at Buies Creek.

HERMAN MEYERS: BELA COLD asked MEYERS for information on agricultural action, credit and labr, for a book which he, BELA, was writing. BELA mationed that he no longer would be able to get this information, inasmuch as he was no longer with the Government. A second request was made by BELA of MEYERS, in which he asked for reports from 1941 to 1945 from the Agriculture Department and from the War-Food Administration.

The indices of the Washington Field Division are negative concerning ROS TIBERG.

MAX ROSENBLOOM: On June 13, 1946, BELA GOLD requested his wife call ROSENBLOOM. (No reason was given as to why he wished to speak to ROSENBLOOM, and neither is there any indication that ROSENBLOOM was contacted. The indices of the Washington Field Division concerning ROSENBLOOM are negative.

HARCLE ROWE: Information reflected in the file concerning GOLD would indicate that HAROLD RO E was perhaps a proof reader and assisted GOLD with some of his work.



The indices of the Washington Field Division reflect that RO'E was with the Advisory Commission to the Council of National Defense. is further reflected in the background information concerning ROWE that he was born September 18, 1900 at Iowa County, Iowa; that he was employed by the Department of Agriculture and various I rm management organizations on and off from 1924 to 1940. ROWE's present address is reflected as being 412 Highland Drive, Chevy Chase, Maryland. Background information as obtained from a neighborhood on RO'E indicates that he has an excellent reputation and no indication on his part of ever being engaged in any un-American tendencies.

As reported previously, the GOLDS are vacationing at Echo Point Cottage, Meredith Center, New Hampshire, and, from the information at hand, it is indicated that they will remain at that address until October 15, 1946.

"34 Bonair Ave. New Rochelle, N. Y. June 13, 1945

"Dear Joe:

"I finally got into some money, and, since I have been waiting for the opportunity, this letter and check can travel together. It is only coincidental that it fits right into the ten day period mentioned in your last letter..however, I hope it will be helpful.

"Nothing new here about a car, although I must admit to having been too busy to do much chasing. It might be a good idea, if it is a second hand car you are looking for to chase one up here rather than in the Washington area, and, with that in mind, suppose I contact some of the dealers around New Rochelle. Let me know if you want me to work on that angle. There is one dealer in particular I might have some luck with, but, since with commodities you have to be ready to buy when you see, it would be best to know definitely before I look.

"Your last letter was particularly welcome in its reference to Edna and myself. I knew when I last wrote you that there was nothing to fear from you and Leffie, but it helps getting the added assurance and knowing the friendship.

"Is there any way you know of getting time to move much faster and of getting things set into what you pretty well know they will be set later? As a kid, I used to be afraid of what might happen, since I felt so little control. Now, Isort of have to keep my pants on tight for fear of running out of them in the eagerness to hurry things along. All of which sounds a bit stupid, I'm sure, but we're getting close to the time of moving into the new house, and it has me, at the moment, just a trifle ragged. But no fear; the shirt will stay on, except for a short layoff for laundering now and then.

"Call us as soon as you hit town. We would like to know just what is happening with all of you and how the opportunities are shaping up.

Mrs. CRECG to send the clothes and articles which she has been keeping for
BESSIE FRANKLIN to the above street address.

It will be noted that under postmark of January 5, 1946, JOSEPH GREGG received a letter from Suite 406, 13 Astor Place, New York, New York. By report of Special Agent JOHN T. HIISBOS dated New York, New York, June 14, 1946, in captioned matter, it is indicated that Suite 406 is occurred by the veterans of the Abraham Lincoln Briga's, the Federated Press and the individuals listed in this suite are MIRIAM COLKIN and MARO STONE.

There is being set out below a summarization of the data supplied by during the period of June 16, 1946, to

June 28, 1946, inclusive.

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Jung 16, 1946

An unidentified man named MARSHALL conferred with JOSEPH GREGG at which time he stated that he had been talking to ENRIQUE (ph). He stated that he (MARSHALL) is leaving town on Tuesday morning on a trip to New York City, before he goes to Williamstown (Mass.). He further stated that he has been invited to dinner at HRUCE WAYBUR'S. GREGG and MARSHALL discussed the publication of a book which MARSHALL has prepared and the fact that the publishers are skeptical about it inasmuch as it is written in dialogue. MARSHALL further explained that one character becomes a mouthpiece for LOZAR DISMO (ph).

June 17, 1946 \(\mathcal{U}\)

JOSEPH GREGG contacted the Fiscal Section of the State Department to advise that his temporary address in Washington, D. C. will be 941 I Street, N. W. care of WOOD (MINTER WOOD of the State Department).

June 18, 1946

JOSEPH GREGG contacted MAURICE HALPERIN at which time HALPERIN supplied the following data about his new position with the AMERICAN JEWISH CONFERENCE. He stated the Conference was set up two or three years ago and contains independent organizations and groups of "almost any color." It acts as a coordinating head for these groups and represents most of the important Jewish organizations in the United States. He stated that the one exception to this representation is the AMERICAN JEWISH COMMITTEE, which is a group that thinks of Jews purely on a religious angle. According to HALPERIN Judge SAM ROSENMAN and the ROSENWALDS are the leading figures in the AMERICAN JEWISH COMMITTEE. HALPERIN continues by relating that his organization contains everything from Zionists to unions and is a "clearing house" or "National front" with the 'object of speaking for all its member organizations on foreign relations and international affairs. HALPERIN stated his job will be "secretary for United Nations affairs", the performance of which will consist of lobbying in the commissions, conferences, etc. HALPERIN will also draft material. He stated the New York Office has a staff of fifteen individuals including secretaries. This staff releases monthly and weekly bulletins. The head of the Executive Committee of the American Jewish Conference is LOUIS LIPSKY (ph), whereas the Executive Secretary is KENAN, who has been with the organization for approximately a year and a half. He described KENAN as being a Cleveland newspaperman and stated there are three co-chairment of the conference, namely Rabbi WISE, MUNSKY (ph), the head of B'Nai Brith, and he believes Rabbi SILVER. GRECG inquired as to whether Rabbi WISE'S son, J. WATERMAN, was mixed up with the organization to which inquiry HALPERIN replied in the negative.

HALPERIN stated the problems of the organization are mostly elementary and "we can work together in this pretty well." GREGG maintains there is never a dull moment in this business as "If it gets a little dull BEVIN comes out with a brilliant remark."

HALPERIN said he will give GRECG the full details about his job when he sees him later in New York City. GRECG advised that there in nothing new in connection with his job-hunting project, but he has "those guys sizzling in the pan on the radio deal" (Metropolitan Broadcasting Company, Washington, D. C.). HALPERIN advised that after he has gotten settled in his job for about six months he will attempt to see if he can't give GRECG an opportunity to prove his purity. GRECG doubts that this would work out inasmuch as they might look in his background too fat and find out that an Arab got mixed up with a Jew way back in his family.

HALPERIN believes he will get a house at Croton-on-the-Hudson, we York, as there is a little colony of friends there, including the BODKINS.

JOSEPH GRECG conferred with ED BRECHER of the Metropolitan Broadcasting Company. BRECHER informed him that CARL GREEN has been hired as the publicity man for the Radio Company.

WRECG made an appointment for lunch at the Press Club at 1:00 P. M. with HARRY MURKIAND of New York City, who is registered at the Shoreham Hotel inWashington.

CRECG informed ROHERT MILLER, a subject of instant case, that he will leave Washington, D. C. the following week. MILLER edvised that FRANK JELLINECK has gotten in touch with DUNCAN AIKMAN, but he did not buy the list (Hemisphere Club mailing list). JELLINECK has returned to Mexico City and MILLER is glad to forget the whole thing. MILLER further advised his ceramics business is not amounting to much (probably CAROL JANEWAY'S products). MILLER and GRECG agreed to get together for lunch.

June 20, 1946

JOSEPH CREGG contacted his wife who was temporarily visiting the office of ROBERT MILLER. They discussed personal matters. Subsequent to the above JOSEPH CREGG informed his wife that he is having lunch with ROBERT MIKLER

ROSE CHECG engaged in a social conversation with MARGARET TAIRLEY, wife LINCOLN FAIRLEY, whom she advised that they expect to leave Washington the next week. She stated that they will spend the summer in Canada to not expect to return to Washington, D. C. MARGARET FAIRLEY advised that COLLINS and JOHNNY COLLINS (HENRY'S son) are staying with them for about two weeks.

In connection with the above it will be noted that HENRY COLLINS is a Captain or a Major in the United States Army detailed from the War Department to the State Department, where he occupies room 67 of the main building. The current address listed to HENRY COLLINS in the State Department is "White Pines", Crandall Road, Lanham, Maryland, telephone Warfield 1499. A pretent call was placed to this telephone number and it was ascertained that Mr. HENRY COLLINS is not in residence at "White Pines", but will move there in approximately ten days. At this time it was determined that COLLINS could be reached after working hours at ORdway 3916. This telephone number is listed to LINCOLN FAIRLEY, 6205 33rd Street, N. W.,/Washington, D. Collins

ROSE GREGG in talking to HELEN MAKIE of 816 Hemlock Court, N. W., Washington, D. C., a social contact, mentioned that the GREGGS have been invited to a wedding the coming Sunday (wedding of ALBERT PRAGO and RUTH SCHWARTZ).)

June 21, 1946

ROSE CREGG conferred with MINTER WOOD of the State Department concerning various social matters. WOOD advised that he and JOSEPH CREGG had made a tentative dinner date for Saturday night.

June 22, 1946

MARGARET FAIRLEY discussed the possibility of securing the GREGG'S maid, whose name was given as CLAIR PROVITOR, who can be reached through her daughter, MARY WALL, at WARField 9873:

ALBERT PRAGO of Ne ork City contacted ROSE GREGG who advised kin that they were in the process of moving away from Washington, D. C. PRAGO stated that JOSEPH GREGG told him he expected to quit and he thinks it was the smartest thing to do under the circumstances. Mrs. GREGG replied, "Sure, because it would come sooner or later so we just took the plunge."

Upon being asked whether JOSEPH has anything in mind, Mrs. OREGG stated he has several feelers for a position. PRAGO is glad that the GREGGS may possibly settle in New York City at a later date as "This is bad business seeing each other this way."

that JESS NATHAN is going to Dallas, Texas, with some new outfit which has to
do with Relations. Mrs. GREGG stated that JOSEPH GREGG had been thinking of
opening a children's specialty store, but finally decided against it.

ROSE GREGG informed THEODORE HALPERIN that the GREGGS would like to spend the night at the HALPERIN'S home.

June 27, 1946

ROSE CREGG, while residing at the residence of MAURICE HALPERIN, conferred with MARGARET FAIRLEY. Mrs. FAIRLEY stated that there has been a very difficult and upsetting neighborhood situation which she wants to take up with ROSE CREGG. She added that she is thrilled about the nursery school now meeting in the school instead of in the Baptist Church. PHYSICAL SURVEILLANCE

June 16, 1946

At 5:05 P. M. the GREGG family visited the home of CHARLES and RUTH SEEGAR at 7 Kirk Street, Chevy Chase, Maryland. A number of individuals were observed eating a picnic supper in the yard.

June 17, 1946

Around 12:10 P. M. Mr. and Mrs. GREGG were observed to enter the small store called "The Play Center." Immediately thereafter they emerged accompanied by a man approximately 45 years of age, weighing 230 pounds, hair black and wavy, receding at temples and bald on top, height 6' 3", mustache, wore glasses, large shoulders, walked erect. The party proceeded to the Cafe Parisenne where they had lunch. At 2:10 P. M. they left the restaurant and returned to 1819 M Street, N.W., where the unidentified man separated from the GREGGS.

The address name telephone directory for Washington, D. C. reveals that PAUL R. KEILY, telephone number REpublic 1745, operates "The Play Center" at 1819 M. Street, N. W.

At approximately 2:30 o'clock Mr. and Mrs. GREGG entered a house located at 1527 Farragut Street, N. W. At 3:00 P. M. the GREGGS left the house and returned home.

ALBERT H. PLATT, telephone number RAndolph 0155 resides at 1527 Farragut Street, N. W.

June 18, 1946

At 1:35 P. M. JOSEPH GREGG was observed at the National Press Club, 14th and F Streets, N. W., Washington, D. C., having lunch with a man later

identified as HARRY MURKLAND. CRECG and MURKLAND departed from the National Press Club at 305 P. M. at which time MURKLAND was surveilled to the Shoreham Hotel. The records of the Shoreham Hotel reveal that HARRY B. MURKLAD of 433 East 51st Street, New York City, was assigned to Room 304B. He are red on June 17, 1946, and checked out on June 19, 1946. He is a frequent guest of the Shoreham Hotel and a former address in New York City is listed as 156 West 42nd Street.

It is possible that MURKLAND is an acquaintance of FELIX SOLURI, a permanent guest at the Shoreham Hotel inasmuch as surveilling agents observed him obtain the key to Room 403 G, which is occupied by ELLA and PAULA SOMARY, sisters of FELIX SOMARY. FELIX SOMARY himself occupies a suite of rooms known as Room 100 B. SOMARY is described as short, elderly, white hair, closely cut, and possessing a chunky build.

June 19, 1946

At approximately 11:50 A. M. CRECG visited the Medical Building at 19th and I Streets, N. W., where he entered Room 315. LYLE M. MASON, ALAN J. CHEVERY and A. H. BENSON, all Mds, occupy this suite.

Tune 20, 1946

At 1:05 P. M. JOSEPH GRECG entered the ROGER SMITH HOTEL at the corner of 19th and Pennsylvania Avenue, N.W., where he met ROBERT T. MILLER. At 1:10 P. M. these individuals left the hotel and walked to the MILLER and CRECG left the restaurant at 2:50 P. M. and walked to 18th and I Streets, N. W., where they talked for approximately ten minutes before separating. ROBERT MILLER then entered his office in the Otis Building at 18th and I Streets, N. W.

June 21, 1946

At 4:10 P. M. a car bearing U. S. Government Tags Number 139, arrived at the CREGG residence with a colored chauffeur and a white man as passenger. This individual entered the CREGG home and at 4:45 P. M. departed therefrom with a small table and box. Upon his departure he was observed talking to JOSEPH and ROSE CREGG on the front porch. This car was surveilled to the main Department of Labor Building at 14th and Constitution Avenue, where it was parked in the basement. The white man was identified as being RONALD HOUGHTON, an assistant conciliator of the Department of Labor, who has his office in Room 3412. He is described as age 30 to 33, height 5' 10", weight 160 to 175 pounds, medium build, coarse complexion, blue eyes, light brown bushy unkept hair.

It should be noted that possibly no significance can be attached to this contact inasmuch as numerous individuals called at the GRECG home to look over furniture and household goods advertised for sale in the newspapers.

June 22, 1946

It was ascertained that JOSEPH GREGG made arrangements for the Railway Express Agency to pick up a trunk and a box at his home to him care of WILLIAM LAFF, Saint Thomas, Ontario, Canada.

A highly confidential source made the contents of the trunk and box available to Epecial Agents. The search resulted negatively.

June 23, 1946

At 2:45 P. M. GREGG, his wife and two children left their residence and drove to 3147 16th Street, N. W., which is the home of the Jewish War Veterans. It was ascertained that a wedding was taking place between RUTH SCHWARTZ and a man named PRAGO. The GREGGS returned home at 6:20 P. M.

June 24, 1946

At 7:30 P. M. two unidentified men driving a 1946 Green Pontiac Coupe bearing Maryland license 561-510 parked in front of the GREGG residence. One of these men entered the house and emerged with JOSEPH GREGG at 7:40 P. M. The three men drove to the vicinity of Georgia Avenue and Rittenhouse Street where they parked and at 7:50 P. M. GREGG and one of the men entered Apartment 102 of 1000 Georgia Avenue, N. W. This apartment is occupied by Miss EISIE M. SHAWEN and Miss OLIVE SHAWEN, telephone number RAndolph 4186. GREGG and the unidentified man departed from the apartment house at 8:00 P. M. They drove to GREGG'S residence and GREGG entered his home. The automobile bearing Maryland Tag 561-510 is listed to WILLIAM MALIGRAF, 2116 Forest Glen Road, Forest Glen, Maryland.

June 25, 1946

At 8:35 A. M. JOSEPH GREGG left his home and drive his new Nash automobile to the District of Columbia Official Inspection Station. The following data was obtained from the records of the Inspection Station:

JOSEPH GREGG'S driver's permit is Number 538,358, Serial Number A 220945, and it expires on April 15, 1949. It describes him as age 36, race white, hair black, eyes brown. The title of the automobile is numbered X 194722. The title was issued to VICTOR D. CARISON, 6829 Piney Branch Road, N. W., Washington, D. C. The car is described as a 1946 four door used Nash Sedan, Serial Number K 89514, Motor Number 1089514. The title reflected the car was sold to JOSEPH CREGG on June 24, 1946.

GREGG, having returned home, left again at 1:40 P. M. and proceeded to the Takoma Park Branch Post Office where he mailed two parcel post packages addressed to Mrs. VIOIA SHAW, 4930 30th Street, Bouth, Fairlington, Virginia, and BESSIE FRANKLIN, care of R. RIVERS, 216 West 140th Street,

New York, New York, respectively.

Through a highly confidential source it was ascertained these packages contained clothing and papers of no value to this investigation.

June 26, 1946

At 8:10 P. M. JOSEPH GREGG and his family left his residence and drove to the home of MAURICE HALPERIN at 9956 Georgia Avenue, Silver Spring, Maryland. They all entered the residence at 8:40 P. M.

June 27, 1946

It was noted that CREGG and his family spent the night at the home of MAURICE HALPERIN, 9956 Georgia Avenue, Silver Spring, Maryland.

At 2:40 P. M. GREGG and his family went to the home of Mrs.

HETEN MAKIE, 816 Hemlock Court, Washington, D. C. They remained ten minutes
and returned home.

June 28, 1946

At 5:45 P. M. JOSEPH GREGG proceeded to the 2200 block of California Street, N. W., where he parked his automobile. He is believed to have entered the apartment house located at 2231 California Street, N. W., for the purpose of visiting INEZ MUNOZ, a resident of this building. GREGG remained approximately 1 hour and the proceeded back to the residence of MAURICE HALPERIN.

At 7:00 P. M. GREGG drive his wife and daughter to the home of RUTH SEEGAR, 7 West Kirk Street, Chevy Chase, Maryland, at which time they entered the house. GREGG and his sone then proceeded to the President Apartments, 2141 I Street, N. W. He and his son entered the apartment house and went to apartment 214 which is occupied by MINTER WOOD.

at 8:15 P. M. JOSEPH GREGG, his son, and Mr. and Mrs. MINTER WOOD proceeded to the LITTLE VIENNA RESTAURANT, 2122 Pennsylvania Avenue, N. W., where they had dinner, returning to the President Apartments at 9:30 P. M.

June 29, 1946

At 9:00 A. M. JOSEPH GREGG and his son drove to 7 West Kirk Street, Chevy Chase, Maryland, where he picked up his wife and daughter. They departed Washington, D. C. via automobile at 10:00 A. M. and drove straight to New York, arriving at the home of <u>DAVID ROGDANOFF</u>, 24 Bonair Avenue, New Rochelle, New York, at 6:45 P. M. At 8:00 P. M. the New York Field Division took over the surveilliance of the GREGG family.

Re: MAURICE HALPERIN

It will be noted that MAURICE HALPLRIN departed from Washington, D. Ci with his family on June 20, 1946. By teletype of June 24, 1946 the Boston Field Division advised that HALPERIN and his family arrived in Lynn, Massachusetts, June 21, where they spent the nights of June 21 and 22 with their parents. The June 21, where they spent the nights of June 23 to attend a wedding in HALPERIN family departed Lynn, Massachusetts on June 23 to attend a wedding in Fall River, Massachusetts. They subsequently proceeded to New York City where the subject was expected to register at the Hotel 14, 14 East 60th Street, New York City, on the evening of June 23.

Information obtained from as of June 24, 1946 HALPERIN was expected to assume his new position as Secretary for United Nations Affairs under the sponsorship of the American Jewish Conference. HALPERIN's new office is reportedly located on the fourteenth floor of an office building located at 43rd Street and Fifth Avenue, New York City.

Reference is made to previous notations concerning meetings between MAURICE HALPERIN and Dr. LUIS QUINTAMILIA. In this connection, attention is invited to the June 1, 1946 issue of "Corps Diplomatique". This periodical contains a picture of QUINTAMILIA, on page six. He was born in Paris, QUINTAMILIA as a delegate to the Pan-American Union. He was born in Paris, as the Mexican delegate to the San Francisco conference where in a historic as the Mexican delegate to the San Francisco conference where in a historic speech he introduced his government's resolution to bar Franco Spain from the United Nations. In 1943, following a short tour as envoy extraordinary to Russia, United Nations. In 1943, following a short tour as envoy extraordinary to Russia, the was named Mexico's ambassador to Russia becoming the first envoy of top diplomatic rank to be accredited to the USSR from a Latin American republic.

A diplomat for twenty-four years, QUINTANTILA has held a score of posts in the Mexican foreign service commencing his career as third secretary of the Mexican Embassy in Washington, D. C. His assignments have included tours of duty in Guatemala, Brazil, France, and the United States. In 1945 he was appointed ambassador to Columbia, which post he resigned to take his present position. In 1932 he was general secretary of the Mexican delegation to the League of Nations. In 1941 he was technical advisor with Mexico's representatives in the International Labor Office Conference in New York.

GUINTANILLA was educated at the Sorborne in Paris. He has a PH degree from John Hopkins University (political science). He was a professor of English for two years in the University of Mexico in Mexico City and from 1937 to 1941



he was an associate in Romance Languages at Georgi Mashington University in Washington, D. C. He has addressed the rotaries in the District of Columbia, and Baltimore. He has lectured at Williams, Bucknell, Wellesley, and Gettys directlesses. In 1923 and 1924 he published poems in Spanish. The Washington Post newspaper carried a series of his articles in 1935. He published a book in New York entitled "A Latin American Speaks".

Briefly, QUINTANILLA is described as follows:



DOROTHY ROSENBAUM SCHEIDT was born in Dallas, Texas, March 18, 1916. She married PAUL SCHEIDT on august 14, 1939 at Dallas, Texas. She is the daughter of a wealthy Jewish insurance family. She attended Commonwealth College and the University of Iowa. She spent five years in New York and engaged in little theatre activities in Dallas, Texas. Both SCHMIDT and his wife are



highly regarded by local, state, and Communist leaders in Texas. They have a son named JOSEPH PAUL SCHEIDT who was born January 17, 1941. The SCHEIDTS arrived in Oklahoma City on August 22, 1939 at which time they were driving an automobile belonging to a local Communist leader. They worked on the distribution of literature against the repeal of the Neutrality Statutes. PAUL SCHNIDT was active in the radical group at the Oklahoma University. that MAURICE HALPERIN was a professor at this university during the period SCHEIDT was in Oklahoma). DOROTHY SCHEIDT seized control of the municipal drama association of Oklahoma City and renamed it "Red Dust Players", which later proved to be an effective medium of propaganda among labor unions, radical organizations, and the general public. The SCHLIDTS were arrested at Guthrie, Oklahoma on October 15, 1939 for the violation of a city ordinance in that they distributed Communist literature without a peddler's license. Their home was raided by the Oklahoma City Police Department on October 24, 1940 and they were served with a Dies Committee subpoena on October 24, 1940. They fled Oklahoma City to Dallas on October 25, 1940. PAUL SCHNIDT registered for Selective Service at Local Draft Board 5, Oklahoma City on October 16, 1940 and was

The hereinbefore mentioned Dallas Field Division letter July 2, 1946 reveals that SCHIDT was inducted into the United States Army on January 19, 1944, ASN 36900747. It is further stated that since DOROTHY ROSENBAUM SCHIDT returned to live the her parents in Dallas at 5100 Live Oak, she has been in contact with LOUIS FROWN, the Communist Party organizer of Dallas, Texas.



Also, letter to ALGER HISS, 3210 P Street, N. W., postmarked Louisville, Kentucky, June 18, 1946, sender Lt. Comdr. L. C. ENGLISH, 1712 South 3d Street, Louisville 8, Kentucky.

has furnished the following information concerning HISS! activities from June 15th through June 30th, 1946, inclusive:

The informant advised on June 15, 1946 that HISS wished to speak to DEAN ACHESON, of the State Department. It was determined that Mr. ACHESON was busy at the time, but that he could be contacted later at extension 2941 of the State Department. According to the informant, HERBERT and JO ABRAHAM visited the HISS family on the night of June 18, 1946. On June 19, 1946, the informant advised that PRISCILLA HISS had indicated that she was to attend a cocktail rty at 5:00 p. m. that date at the home of Mrs. STOKES.

The informant advised on June 20, 1946 that CECELIA/MCGEE of 2406 Kalorama Road invited PRISCILIA and AIGER HISS to dinner for the evening of June 28, 1946. It was reported that Mrs. HISS indicated that they would be unable to accept this invitation, inasmuch as AIGER would be on the Eastern shore on the 22d for a wedding, and that she, Mrs. HISS, and son, TONY, would probably be in Chesterton, Maryland. Mrs. HISS advised Mrs. McGEE at that time that she and TONY will be in Vermont throughout August but that her husband, AIGER, was only taking one month off.

The informant advised that ALGER HISS contacted one "DONNIE", believed to be DONALD HISS, and advised that he, ALGER, had received a letter that would indicate that a young lawyer who had just graduated from Harvard Law School, by the name of J. C. DOUGHERTY (phonetic) was planning to contact him, ALGER, and "DONNIE." ALGER stated that DOUGHERTY was interested in Inter-American Law. ISABELLE mentioned in the conversation with PRISCILLA that she had just flown in from Boston, and that she spoke to the series sitting next to her who was a ccurier with a diplomatic pouch the from Paris. PRISCILLA invited ISABELLE and LESLIE to visit HISS' in Vermont during July.

According to the informant, BETTY REYNOLDS contacted PRISCILLA HISS. From the conversation, it was gathered that BETTY was looking for a house in the Georgetown area of Mashington. BETTY REYNOLDS inquired of Mrs. HISS concerning grade school text books. Informant mentioned that ALGER HISS was in contact with J. KELLOGG SHITH at Chestertown, Maryland on June 28, 1946, and advised that they, his family, would arrive at Chestertown that afternoon.

The informant advised that SANDY _______, at the State Department, was in contact with ALGER HISS. SANDY advised ALGER that he wished to discuss a few things with him before he, ALCER, left for his vacation. SANDY stated that he had spoken to BILD SAUNDERS (phonetic) and MIKE ______, and that these two parties requested that he, SANDY, speak to HESS. SANDY mentioned that they were in general agreement on all except a few points. It was mentioned that JACK THOPPSON was of the opinion that instead of having a Deputy Secretary General in Washington, the administration work should be done by CAL NICKEL (phonetic), which was in agreement with HISS. SANDY asked HISS for a personal assistant for BILL, perhaps meaning BILL SAUNDERS, but HISS would not agree to this. SANDY stated that HARRY would be a good assistant for BILL, but HISS said HARRY would probably go with AEA soon. HISS then stated that making JOHN HALDERMAN the Executive Officer of the League of Nations Committee, gives him menough face."

Background information concerning BLAISDELL indicated he was born August 12, 1899 at Chautauqua, New York, and is an American citizen; it is reflected that BLAISDELL attended High School in Michigan and received a BS degree from Pennsylvania State College in 1920, and a Master's and Doctor's degree from Columbia University. BLAISDELL's employment is reflected as being in private industry in Villiamsport, Pennsylvania as an instructor at Robert College, Istanbul, Turkey, 1922 to 1925, as an instructor at Columbia University, 1928 to 1930, and as an instructor at Villiams College, Villiamstown, Massachusetts, from 1930 to 1935.

In 1935, it was reflected that BLAISDELL was connected with the Carnegie Endowment for International Peace. BLAISDELL's name appeared on the photostatic copy of a typewritten list in possession of the Dies Committee entitled Washington Committee for Democratic Action. At that time, BLAISDELL was employed as Principal Divisional Assistant, Division of Commercial Treaties and Agreements with the Department of State.

In a signed statement, dated March 23, 1942, BLAISDELL denied membership in the Washington Committee for Demogratic Action.

It is further reflected from a review of this file that no administrative action was taken concerning BLAISDELL as a result of the investigation conducted. BLAISDELL's residence is reflected as 3901 Connecticut Ave., N. W., Washington, D. C.

"If UP A gets a Federal blast it is going to be tough.

We don't want anything to disturb the disturbing status quo. Hence the F.B.I. et al may undertake anything. The C.S. (Civil Service) for the moment seems somewhat out of the picture, but not J. EDGAR."

On May 28, 1946, KEENEY wrote the following:

"The clippings you sent were greatly enjoyed and gave me a view of things I can get in no other way. I thought what SIMON (?) had to say about our present loan policy was very well said. That we have been doing is so obvious! Todays paper announces some hitch with French loan. Maybe we want to wait until the very eve of the election. In Italy the Pope had certainly been sounding off. The USSR has certainly taken a lot of dirt. The welcome of the Polish general is just carrying coals to Newcastle, and the Thompson stink in defense of TICHAIIOVICH means more coal. This all seems part of a sturdied policy and it is a pleasure to see that the Soviet press is taking up cudgels against such overt bad taste. Whatever the Soviet journalists did to change the temper of things seems to be dying of malnutrition."

In a communication dated May 29, 1946, KEENEY related the following:

It is obvious that our 'offensive for peace' tends to be an 'offensive against the USSR.' The defeat of the CP in the German area controlled by us is not surprising. The Catholics seem to be in the saddle and this does not sound like Democracy.

Reference is made to the report in instant case dated June 14, 1946, wherein it was set forth that subject's checking account maintained at the Washington Loan and Trust Company, 17th and G Street, N. W., reflected that on May 2, 1946, a check in the amount of \$37.50 was paid to the War Agencies Protective Association. It has been ascertained that this agency handles Government protective insurance for Government personnel going abroad.

Reference is made to a report in this case dated June 5, 1946, in which information was set forth that subject had telephonically contacted E. B. BOWLES, telephone #8103, Hastings, Florida. In a letter dated June 17, 1946, from the SAC at Miami, the following information was set forth regarding the background of E. B. BOWLES.

J. H. SHEPHERD, Sheriff of St. Johns County, Florida, where Hastings, Florida, is located, advised that E. B. BONLES of Hastings was well known in that community and was a good citizen, owned a farm orange grove and several pieces of business property there worth approximately \$150,000. He stated that Mr. BONLES came from Tennessee some thirty years ago and he knew nothing derogatory regarding him or his family. Mr. SHEPHERD stated that BONLES had several children but he did not know them.

Mrs. ADIN MALTBY, Hastings, Florida, who is residing during the summer months at Anastasia, Florida, a suburb of St. Augustine, Florida, advised that she was well acquainted with the E. B. BOVIES family and she knew nothing derogatory about any of them. She stated that one of Mr. BOTLES daughters, REBECCA BOWLES, had married a Washington, D. C. lawyer, HERBERT STHON KARKS, both of whom were employed as Attorneys with the War Production Board in Washington and that Mr. MARKS had gone to Europe with Mr. KRUG when he was head of the War Production Board. She stated that Mr. MARKS had visited in the BOWIES home in Hastings, and was a very nice appearing man. She advised that RESECCA BOTTES had divorced her first husband after her graduation from the law school University, of Florida, and she had met MARKS while both were employed with the TVA and WPB in Washington. OPPENHEIMER dated May 24, 1946, in the amount of \$50 is significant, because of the fact that OPPENHEIMER is the subject of a Bureau case in the Los Angeles Field Division and it is also noted that OPPENHEIMER is employed in the same office of the State Department with the subject.

In a letter dated June 3, 1946, addressed to this office by Mr. B. F. GREEN-STREET, Superintendent of the Goorgetown Station, U. S. Post Office, Washington, D. C., it was ascertained that HERBERT S. MARKS, of 1518 26th Street, N. J., had requested that his mail be forwarded to Room 202, State Department, from June 25, 1946 until further notice.

From a confidential source, known to Special Agent E. H. MOSSBURG of this office, it was ascertained that subject had in his possession the following magazines, letters, papers, bulletins, etc. Issues No. 4, 6, 8, 10, 11, 12 of Volume 1, of the bulletin of the Atomic Scientists, who have offices at 1126 E. 59th Street, Chicago, 37, Illinois. The editors of this publication are H. H. GOLDSHITH and E. RABINOWITCH. The indices of this office contain no information concerning GOLDSMITH or RABINOVITCH. A circular contained in one of these bulletins was a request for new subscribers, and explanation that the bulletin is a publication issued on the first and fifteenth of each month. It features authoritative articles by some of the most prominent atomic scientists, social scientists and others interested in the problem of atomic energy. In addition, it provides authoritative up-to-date news on significant aspects of the educational policy, legislative and organizational activities of the scientists. It is noted that DR. J. ROBERT OPPENHEINER and DR. EDWARD U. CONDON have written articles for this bulletin, OPPENHEINER on June 1, 1946, an article entitled "International Control of Atomic Energy", and CONDON an article entitled "International Cooperation in Science"

The informant also furnished Agent MOSSBURG with an envelope addressed to subject, dated June 20, 1946, on which was the return address, "F. F., Supreme Court of the United States". BROWN is a private in the U. S. Army and enlisted in October, 1942 in the Reserves. He was formerly employed by the War Production Board for four months. Prior to this he was employed by the law firm of Gennessey, Cook, Mitchell, Letchworth and Bass, Buffalo, N. Y. The records of the Letropolitan Police Department and the indices of the Washington Field Office were checked on BROWN with negative results.

Lt. Commr. and Mrs. WILLIAM T. GOLDEN, 2918 Olive Avenue, Washington, D. C. In the report in this case dated June 17, 1946, information was set forth that subject had contacted ...ILLIAN T. GOIDEN, Woodward, Alabama, by telegram, and it was subsequently ascertained that Mr. GOIDEN was only recently discharged from the U.S. Navy as a Lieutenant Commander and that he had been stationed in Washington during the war. The following additional ininformation is set forth concerning GOIDEN. The records of the Navy Department in Washington, D. C. reflect that WILLIAM THEODORE GOIDEN was born October 25, 1942 at New York City; that he lived in New York until September. 1941 when he came to the District of Columbia. He graduated from the University of Pennsylvania with a B. A. Degree. He studied a year at Harvard. and studied law .at Fordham and Hunter College. He gave his address in Washington as 2918 Olive Avenue, N. W. His wife's name is SYRIL COLDEN. His mother, REBECCA H. GOLDEN, lives at the Croydon, 12 East 86th Street, New York City. GOIDEN was detached from the U. S. Navy on December 15, 1945 and was granted two months leave. On February 15, 1946 he was released from all active duty with the rank of Lt. Commander.

A report dated March 4, 1942 at Stone's Mercantile Agency, Washington, D. C., reflects that WILLIAM T. GOLDEN, wife - SYRIL, was employed at the Navy Department from September 22, 1941 as a contract employee, salary estimated at approximately \$6,000 a year. He originally came from New York City. He maintained an account with the Riggs National Bank. A New York City credit report dated October 7, 1941 sets forth that GOLDEN was employed by Carl M. Loeb Rhodes & Company, large brokerage firm of the New York Stock and Curb Exchange. He has been employed by this firm since September, 1935 and holds a responsible position as a statistician, and is well regarded. Local banks in New York report accounts in GOLDEN's and his wife's name since 1938 as satisfactory. GOLDEN maintained residence at 245 E. 72nd Street, New York City. In the past he resided at 1233 Park Avenue and 1120 Park Avenue, New York City. This report also reflects that WILLIAM T. GOLDEN



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maintained a satisfactory account since 1935 with the Public National Bank in New York City. A report dated December 11, 1941 at the Credit Bureau, Washington, D. C., contains similar information to that set forth above, plus the fact that GOLDEN and his wife lived at the Wardman Park Hotel for a short time when they first came to Washington in 1941. The report also states that GOLDEN was employed in the Navy Department Planning and Progress Section, Bureau of Ordnance, in the Council Department.

The records of the Metropolitan Police Department and the indices of the ashington Field Office were checked regarding GOLDEN and his wife with negative results.

At 6.15 PM a surveillance was begun at the subject's residence and he was observed at a grocery store on P Street, one block from his home. He left the store, entered his car, and drove to his residence, parked his car, and entered at 6.19 PM. At 6.22 PM the subject and his wife and son left their home and entered the home of Dr. F. SERGEANT CHEEVER at 1514 26th Street, NT, which is the residence nextdoor to the subject's home. At 7.05 PM the subject's son was observed to leave Dr. CHEEVER's house and play on the sidewalk in front. At 7.20 PM the subject came out of Dr. CHEEVER's house, retrieved his son and entered the Dr's house. At 7.30 PM the subject and his wife, and an unidentified woman, described as 50 years of age, tall, slender, dark hair, came out of the Dr's house and entered the subject's house. This woman was identified to be Piss RITA McP/RLIND.

at 7.35 PM the subject and his son left their residence and entered the subject's car and drove to the Oriental Restaurant on isconsin evenue. The subject placed a take-out order for Chow Mein and sat with his son and waited for it. At 7.50 PM as the subject returned to his residence he stopped at a mail box on the corner of 26th and Q Street, Normal and mail done, letter. The subject and his son entered their residence at 7.54 PM.

It 8 PM the United States Mail truck was observed to stop to collect the mail at 26th and Street, N. It was ascertained that the subject had mailed a letter for his wife to the Park National Bank, Knoxville, Tennessee with the return address of RESECCL B. MIRKS, 26th Street, N. At 9.15 PM the subject and RITA MCPURLAND left the subject's residence and drove to 2527 Q Street, N. where they entered apartment 104. The subject was carrying that appeared to be a bag of groceries for her. On the mail box of the apartment house located at 2527 It was ascertained that Miss RITA MCPURLAND



resided in apartment 10h. At 9.20 PM the subject left Miss McP.RLAND's apartment alone, entered his car and returned to his residence and entered at 10 PM the surveillance was discontinued.

On June 24, 1946 the following surveillance was conducted of the subject. From 5 PM to 6.15 PM surveillance of the main entrance of the State Department and the North Entrance of the State Department failed to reveal the subject. At 6.25 PM the surveillance was taken up at the subject's residence whe lit was observed that the windows and shades were down, the paper was on the door step and the subject's car was not parked on the street. No activity or lights were observed in the subject's house up until 10.30 PM at which time the surveillance was discontinued.

On June 25, 1946 a surveillance was conducted of the subject and it began at the subject's residence at 8.40 AM and it was noted that all the windows were closed and all blinds were drawn. It was noted that last night's paper was still on the subject's doorstep. A pretext telephone call to the subject's office revealed that he had left town for two weeks.

On July 2, 1946 a spot check of the subject's residence was made at 9 PM and it was observed that although the subject and his femily had left on their vacation the house was occupied and the lights were on. The persons observed in the subject's house were not the subject's wife or child.

On July 3, 1946 a pretext call to the subject's office reflected the subject was still in California with Dr. J. ROBERT OPPENHEIMER and would return at approximately one week. Note: Information obtained from a confidential source known to Special agent E. HYATT MOSSBURG of this office reflected that the subject's wife had sublet their residence for the months of July, August and September and October of 1946.

A newspaper clipping of the Mashington Post dated July 7, 1942 reflected the recent marriage of Lt. FRANCIS 'S. CHEEVER, USNR and Miss JULIA HITVEY MARTIN, Redfield, Connecticut, the prior is the daughter of Ir. and Mrs. GEORGE W. MARTIN of New York and Lt. CHEEVER is the son of Dr. DAVID SHEEVER of Boston. Miss AGNES W. MARTIN is the sister of the bride. DAVID CHEEVER was the best man and DANIEL CHEEVER, an usher. The bride is the grand-daughter of E. S. MARTIN, former editor of the Life Magazine. She attended Bryn Mayr College and Lt. CHEEVER is a graduate of Harvard.

The Credit Bureau of Ashington, D.C. and the Metropolitan Police Department Records of Ashington were checked with negative results. The files of this office failed to reflect any information concerning any of the above named persons.

JEINIE took reservations numbers 10, 11, 12, and 13 on Flight 522 on July 5. Immediately thereafter, JENNIE MILLER reserved four seats on the American Airline flight to Providence, Rhode Island, for Saturday, July 6, leaving Washington at 9:25 A.M., arriving in New York at 10:35 A.M., where they would change planes and would arrive in Providence at 12:49 P.M. JENNIE advised the American Airlines that two of the four passengers would be children. Immediately thereafter, JENNIE MILLER reserved drawing room AP-104 on the 10:00 P.M. train, Pennsylvania Railrond, to Providence, Rhode Island, for July 4 for four people, including two five-year-old children.

On the same day, subject MILLER contacted JENNIE and during the conversation it was determined that the MILLERS were expecting to leave Washington on Thursday and were planning to be away a whole month. The exact destinations of the MILLERS is not known at this time.

Physical Surveillance

The following surveillance was conducted by Special Agents ORVILLE TALBURTT and WILLIAM R. CORVELISON on subject MILLER on June 24, 1946.


At 11:30 A.M., subject was observed leaving the German Embassy and walked to 810 18th Street, where he entered at 11:55 A.M. This address is the office building of the State Department which was MILLER'S office before he was transferred to the German Embassy.



At 12:50 P.M., MILLER was observed leaving 810 18th Street, and walking to the Roger Smith Hotel, where he met an unknown man (later identified as Lieutenant (j.g.) JOHN K. TIBBY) and had lunch in the dining room of the Roger Smith Hotel.

At 2:10 P.M., MILLER and TIBBY came out of the Roger Smith Hotel and TIBBY proceeded to the War Department building on 21st Street and was observed entering room 2164. The tab on this room reflects that it is the office of the Central Intelligence Group of the War Department.

The surveillance on MILLER was discontinued when he and TIRBY separated at the Roger Smith Hotel. TIBBY is described as being 35 years of age; 5 feet 10 inches; has black hair, graying, parts hair on right side; sharp features; complexion fair; wears black horn rimmed glasses; neat dresser, wearing at the time a straw hat, blue shirt, and a pattern tie.



The following surveillance was conducted on June 25, 1946, by Special Agents TALBURTT and CORNELISON.

At 9:30 A.M., MILLER, his wife JENVIE and son ROBIN were observed leaving their residence and driving to 3327 Rittenhouse Street, where they picked up an unknown women and small boy about nine years of age. The unknown women was later identified as Mrs. RUSSELL, the wife of Colonel PAUL F. RUSSELL.

After several stops, MILLER and the above-mentioned persons were observed entering Union Station at 10:45 A.M., and MILLER assisted his wife, son, and Mrs. RUSSELL and son on board the Pennsylvania train.

At 11:05 A.M., MILLER left Union Station and drove to 18th and I Streets, where he parked his automobile and was later observed entering 810 18th Street, Northwest, at 11:25 A.M.

The following surveillance was conducted on June 28, 1946, by Special Agents TALBURTT and CORTELISON on subject MILLER.

At 11:50 A.M., MILLER was observed leaving his office at the German Embassy on Massachusetts Avenue, accompanied by an unknown woman. MILLER and the unknown woman were both carrying a quantity of office supplies and materials. MILLER drove to 810 18th Street, Northwest. It was later determined through a confidential informant that MILLER is no longer located at the German Embassy and that he had moved his office and equipment back to his old office building, 810 18th Street, Northwest.

As previously reported, on June 6, 1946, JENGIE KILLER received a call from ED ____, who advised her that he could be contacted at the Roosevelt Hotel, room 311. Subsequent inquiry at the Roosevelt Hotel reflects that the occupants of this room were ANDRZEJ SOLTAN, home address 82 Kilinski, Lodz, Polend; MICHAL HOFMAN, Picrackiego 11 Warsaw, Poland; and STEFAN PIENKOWSKI, Hoza 69, Warsaw, Poland, and that they had registered at the Roosevelt Hotel at 11:13 P.M., June 4, 1946.

Major NEAL S. ALLEN, nanager of the Roosevelt Hotel, advised that the three individuals were checking out of room 311 on June 8, 1946, and that the forwarding addresses for PIELKOUSKK and SOLTAN were care of USS PARAMINT, Fleet Post Office, San Francisco, Galifornia; and HOFMAN, care of the USS APPALACHIAN, Fleet Post Office, San Francisco. The individuals advised the desk clerk at the hotel that they were leaving for California and that they were going to witness the atomic explosion in the South Pacific,



During the time the individuals were registered at the hotel, they received the following calls:

On June 6, 1946, at 8:00 P.M., Mr. PIEIKOWSKI received word that a Mr. MALINOWSKI would call him at 9:00 or 10:00 that evening.

On June 7, 1946, at 11:45 A.M., PIENKONSKI received a call from Professor HALICKI in New York City stating, "I received your letter. Sorry I will not be able to see you since you are leaving tomorrow. Will see you on your return trip. Wish you success."



The Washington Field Office files reflect that on November 10, 1944 CHARLES RECHT, acting attorney for FALKOWSKI and former employee of the GPU and present legal advisor of the USSE Consul in New York, filed registration papers for FALKOWSKI as an Agent of the Polish Press News Agency, Polpress News. FALKOWSKI is reported to have received \$10,000 from the Polish Provisional Government from September 1944 to January 1945.

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FAIKOUSKI is a friend of subject MILLER end has visited at his hone several times.

An article appearing in the "Times Herald" dated June 21, 1946, reflects that Poland would be represented at the atom bomb test by Professors STEFAN PIE KOWSKI and ANDRZEJ SOLTAN, scientific advisors to their AEC delegation.

Reference is made to a report in this case dated May 17, 1946 in which information was set forth that the subject had telephonically contacted JERO'E EIDMAN and RICHARD L. SIMON at NO 4-6070 Newfield Avenue, Stamford, Connecticut on November 15, 1945 and December 27, 1945.

In a letter dated June 24, 1946 the New Haven Field Division furnished the following information concerning the above two persons:

Credit Information available at Stamford, Connecticut, reflected that RICHARD I. SIMON and his wife ANDREA L. SIMON, resided at Newfield Avenue, Stamford, Connecticut and also at 133 est 11th Street, New York City. RICHARD L. SIMON had been born at New York City, March 6, 1899, the son of LEO L. and ANNA MAYER SIMON. SI ON was stated to have been a resident at New York all his life. His wife was the former ANDREA LOUISE HEINEMANN of Philadelphia. Two daughters have been born of their marriage.

It was stated that SD ON owned a large home at Stamford, Connecticut where he resided during the summer months. This home was assessed at 419,960. He is well regarded and is a well known book publisher, having, together with MAX L. SCHUSTER, established the SD ON & SCHUSTER BOOK PUBLISHING CO. at 1320 Sixth Avenue, New York City. It was stated that SIMON formerly worked for the ASLIMA PIANO CO. of New York, also, the firm of LIVERIGHT at New York City. He graduated from Columbia University in 1920 with a B.A. Degree, having majored in literature. He was a Second Lieutenant in the Infantry of the United States during World War I and maintained a bank account at New York. A newspaper item contained in a Stamford newspaper dated May 8, 1913, reflected that SIMON resided during the summer in Stamford, Connecticut, at his home which was 150 years old. It was stated that SIMON's first job was as a salesman on Tall Street, New York, and later the AEOLIAN CO., where he sold pianos. It was stated that he lived all his life at New York City and that his daughters were JOANNA and LUCY.

Credit report reflected letters received from the Bankers Trust Co., 57th Street at ladison Avenus, New York City, indicating that SIFON had had an account at that bank since October, 1944, and was Chairman of the Board at SIFON & SCHUSTER PUBLISHING CO. Further, that since 1931, he had banked at the Fanufacturers Trust Co., 386 Fourth Street, New York City, and had two accounts in the low five figures.

PETER PHANCES, rural carrier at the Stamford, Connecticut, Post Office, covering Newfield Avenue, advised that RICHARD L. SIMON had until about one month ago resided on his estate located north of the Merritt Parkway on Newfield Avenue, Stamford, Connecticut. At that time, according to PHANCES, SILON had moved to the estate formerly known as the TILLIAN T. HUNTER estate, located on Newfield Avenue, just south of the Merritt Parkway, Stamford, Connecticut.

PHANOES stated that SIMON and his family resided at Stamford during the summer but during the winter resided at New York City.

According to PHANOES, an individual named JEROME WEIDMAN had commenced residence with RICHARD L. SILON on Newfield Avenue, Stamford, Connecticut, about September of 1915. PHANOES stated that on January 11, 1916, he had received a change of address for JEROME WEIDMAN to RD #1, anlieton, New York.

It was PHINOES' recollection that mail received by TEIDMAN had indicated that his previous address had been in Larchmont, New York. Further, that TEIDMAN had been observed in an American army uniform, and was described as being -

Hair - black

Appearance - Jewish

Connecticut, advised that to the best of his knowledge, RICHARD L. SIMON had never been affiliated with any subversive groups or individuals in the b7c Stamford, Connecticut, area. was unable to furnish any information b1f concerning JERONE EIDMAN. It should be noted that is generally familiar with the activities of the Communist groups and the foreign organizations in the Stamford area.

The indices of the New Haven Field Division and the Stamford Police Department were negative concerning RICHARD L. SIMON and JEROFE TEIDMAN.

On December 26, 1923 a certificate of corporation was filed in New York County by GREENELUM, "OLF and ERNST, attorneys for ARCOS-America, Incorporated. It was formed for the same purpose as the Products Exchange Corporation and one of its three directors had been actively engaged in Soviet activities. On May 27, 1924, according to the records of the Clerk of the Court, New York County, New York, a certificate was filed consolidating the Products Exchange Corporation and ARCOS-America Corporation under the name of the Amtorg Trading Corporation.

The report of Special agent JOHN T. HILSE'S dated July 2, 1946 at New York City in the instant case reflects that the former GENERAL EDTARD S. GREENBAUM of the Tar Department is a prominent New York lawyer a leading figure in the american Jewish Committee and an extremely close friend of the subject. It is also noted that General EDTARD S. GREENBAUM, United States army is listed as a reference by the subject at the time he secured employment with the Board of Economic Tarfare in Tashington, D.C. (It is possible that former General EDTARD S. GREENPAUM is associated with the legal firm of GREENBAUM and ERMST.)

The informant was furnished several letters written by the subject to his mother prior to her death in which there is some background information of significance which is being set forth below.

An article appearing in the Mashington Evening Star on June 23, 1946, reflected that DONALD ROTHENBERG of 2138 F Street, N. W., had been elected chairman of the American Veterans Committee Chapter composed of George Washington University students. Other officers elected were ROBERT WILLIAMSON, vice chairman; HAROLD BORGER, secretary; and MELVIN BURRS, treasurer. The article reflected ROTHENBERG, WILLIAMSON, and ROBERT PHILLIPS were delegates to the recent AVC convention at Des Moines, Iowa.

Reference is made to the report of Special Agent LAMBERT G. ZANDER dated April 15, 1946, in this case under the heading BERNARD S. REDMONT in which a mail cover reflects mail received from Mrs. HUGH BUTLER (teacher), 1559 44th Street, N. W. The records of the Credit Bureau in Washington, D. C., reflect that HUGH D. BUTLER is white, middle aged, and has two children and has resided at 1559 44th Street, N. W., since July, 1937. BUTLER was a colonel in the U. S. Army Specialist Reserve on duty in the Air Corps and has been in this status since January 1, 1941. From March, 1936, until entering the Army, BUTLER was employed as a senior analyst with the Social Security Board. Mrs. BUTLER was mentioned as having been a private teacher of public speaking in 1938 and as maintaining a studio at home in Washington for three years.

An article appearing in the Washington Evening Star on May 20, 1946, showed a photograph of Mrs. CHARLES W. TILLETT, vice chairman of the Democratic National Committee, and Mrs. HUCH BUTLER, special instructor, and carried an article which reflected that Mrs. HUCH BUTLER was an instructor in speaking for a "Speakers School which the Women's Division of the Democratic National Committee is Sponsoring," in order to help women help their husbands and other candidates in the 1946 congressional elections. This school was held in the Democratic National Committee Headquarters at the Mayflower Hotel. (It was noted in the article that Mrs. HUCH BUTLER is not related to the Republican Senator HUCH BUTLER from Nebraska.)

Information has been developed on numerous previous occasions in this case reflecting that SHIRLEY RUDNICK has been a contact of the REDMONTS and of HELEN SCOTT. The records of Stone's Mercantile Agency in a report dated June 21, 1944, reflect that RUDNICK's residence address was 1618 C Street, N. E., as of May, 1944, and that she was born July 17, 1918. 

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



From June 16 to 30, 1946, furnished the following information concerning subject's activities.

On June 17, 1946, an individual known to the informant only as LESLIE contacted ŒORŒ SILVERMAN and advised him a man by the name of FRAZENCHIC (phonetic), who is economic adviser for the secretary of the treasurer of Yugoslavia, would like to talk with SILVERMAN and HARRY THITE. SILVERMAN agreed to take FRAZENCHIC to see HARRY WHITE, and ŒORŒ made an appointment with LESLIE to meet him for lunch the following day at the Duet Restaurant. According to LESLIE, FRAZENCHIC's mission here was to find out first what are private trade prospects, second what are the ropes for taking practical steps for arranging projects on credit loans from private companies. ŒORŒ mentioned he would like to take a retainer and become FRAZENCHIC's adviser. However, LESLIE did not think much of this idea.

On the same date CHRIS WAGNER contacted SILVERMAN and mentioned he and his wife FIORENCE had become very angry over a deal that JOE GOULD had been discussing with CHARLOTTE SLAVITT. Apparently the WAGNERS were mad because they were not consulted on this deal.

On June 20, 1946, JOE SILVERMAN contacted his brother ŒORŒ at which time ŒORŒ mentioned he had been up to HARRY WHITE's office that day. They then discussed the stock market. JOE mentioned having heard from home and agreed to get together on the following Sunday.

advised Mrs. HELEN SILVERMASTER was in receipt of a communication from V. WITTE, Detroit, Michigan, which was in the Russian language and which was translated by Special Agent JOHN MINNO and is set out herein in the translated form in detail:

"4-24-46

"Dear ELENA (HELEN) TETROVNA,

"Right from the start you will probably not believe that this letter is from me! I almost never write by hand, but my typewriter is being repaired and consequently I have to scribble with a pen. First of all many many thanks for the beautiful scarf. In the second place, for what reasor did you send it to me? Now I feel very much embarrassed. I didn't even send you a greeting at Easter. But to tell the truth I simply forgot about its being a holiday. I spent that Sunday doing various things about the house. I washed, ironed, etc. During the last few years I have not celebrated holidays with anything special. It's easier that way when all the days are the same.

"Did you go to the seashore? How did you pass the time? How is everybody in general? I have nothing to boast about. The last three weeks I have been feeling miserably. I think my blood pressure has gone up again. At work I have to rush around so, and it's hard for me

to take it. I don't know how I can work for a year or for two or for five when I alrealy notice now that I don't have the strength. The thing that kills me is haste. I just cannot hurry.

"They continue to invite me to go to Shanghai. Probably I'll make up my mind and go in August. I have begun to take steps to obtain a passport. Things are very bad in China, but what can you do—there is no solution. It is not easy here alone, at times even very difficult.

"Did I write for or didn't I that SERGEI 'made the newspapers'?

I was very much surprised to come upon his psysiognomy in the local
'Detroit News.' It appears that he was 'rewarded' a medal for his work
in China in restoring the mines. His picture was quite bad, and I
cannot understand how that notice got into the newspapers (2). SERGEI
didn't write me about that.

"SHURA is still hanging around Berlin, and it seems that he is not so bad off there. It may be that he will stay there for a few more months. SLRCEI, it seems, is going to transfer to UNRRA. I don't know yet for sure. That's all the news I have.

"I still have to write two letters to Senators about CPA. We were all very much concerned about Congress' behavior. It's simply beyond comprehension the things that are being done. I hope it won't be too difficult for you to make something out of my scribbling.

MAgain I want to thank you for the scarf. It goes very well with my new black coat! I just renovated it today. But you spend money uselessly. Until next time,

was in receipt of a communication from P. WOOG, 128 East Annaheim, Wilmington, California, which was in the Russian language and was translated by
Special Agent JOHN MINNO. The translated copy of this communication is
herein set out in detail:

"Dear Helen,

"I received your letter and also had a good laugh. But I have not seen MASHA (MARIA) yet. She managed a honeymoon; ARKAOY told me they went to Palm Springs. ANNA is indignant, of course, but I cannot understand why. I don't know where she lives, and I want to go with ARKAOY. No, I have nothing against her, and it's better perhaps that

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way. I would willingly get married myself if only to get away from here. Between us, I am so sick and tired of those Tasems—you have no idea. They are fine people, but I have nothing in common with them. When I see Mme. The TM (you know those people who came to you by mistake), she talks about nothing but herself or about her family or about mine—you cannot imagine how it bores me. In my opinion they know more about my family than I do. HUGO is leaving his job on Feb. 10 (i.e., in their store). He wants to go to San Francisco to see someone and perhaps start to do something else. We are stagnating in this hole, and have got to get out quickly. But we'll keep the hotel for the time being until something comes up. ZHAKA (perhaps nickname for JACQUELINE) left her job, wants to go to Mexico for awhile. I would be very glad to have her go. The atmosphere is not very good for her here in this little city. She ought to see entirely different people.

Wyes, my dear, I have to take a lot. I never thought that this would happen in America. I don't know when I'll ever find peace. HUGO cut off a piece of his finger the other day. Thank God it is healing now, but he will not get the piece back. Well, enough about myself. How are things with you? How is GREG? Thank God he feels better. How I would like to see ANATOLI and hear him play! It is obvious how capable and talented he is if he can play that way in such a short time.

The following information was obtained from regarding the activities of the subject from June 16 to 30, 1946.

On June 16, 1946, DICK SASULY was in contact with HELIN SILVER-MASTER and LUDWIG ULLMANN. He was advised that HELEN SILVERMASTER and ULLMANN enjoyed a very nice week-end at the beach (Harvey Cedars, New Jersey). They had returned from there on that day. DICK SASULY agreed to meet LUDWIG ULLMANN at ULLMANN's office on the following day in order to discuss a few recent problems regarding his book.

On June 17, 1946, informant advised CRECORY SILVERPASTER was in contact with his wife HELEN at which time he advised he was enjoying his stay in Arizona and anticipated returning to Washington soon, but before doing so, he would go to San Francisco by way of Los Angeles.

On June 18, 1946, HELEN SILVERMASTER conversed with GILDA FPANK and informant advised GILDA FPANK, an employee in GREGORY SILVERMASTER's office, is from Milmington, Delaware. HELEN SILVERMASTER and GILDA FRANK mentioned ISADORE SALKIND who is from the same city.

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On June 18, 1916, an individual identified only as VASICH CURAKOFF contacted HELEN SILVERMASTER and advised he was now out of the Army and has been traveling on the east coast but expects to return to New York shortly. HELEN SILVERMASTER expressed some concern at his wishing to live in this country and not planning on goin, ack." She further expressed an opinion that perhaps it would be better since he is now a citizen. The BORIS WITTES were discussed, and it is apparent that VASICH BURAKOFF is well acquainted with them. HELEN advised BORIS WITTE returned here from Alaska because his wife EVA could not stand the climate. There is some further indication that BORIS WITTE married EVA about a year and a half ago shortly after he divorced VERA. VERA intends to go to China in August to work for UNRRA.

HELEN also mentioned SERGE is in China and is doing a very good job with UNRRA. BURAKOFF in reply to HELEN's query as to the well being of his partner ISAACS indicated they are making a good living and are now doing business as the "Boris Sign Company," that they intend buying a place in New York City.

On June 19, 1946, MARGARET HATFIELD contacted HELEN SILVERIASTER which time she indicated she was attempting to dispose of her home, that the is very interested in purchasing a house on Long Beach Island where the SILVERIASTERS have been spending their week-ends.

Reference is made to the report of Special Agent LAPBERT G. ZANDER in this case dated July 8, 1946, at page 153 where it was noted one MARCARET HATFIEID contacted HELEN SILVERMASTER on June 9, 1946. The indices of the Mashington Field Office indicate that a MARCARET HATFIELD, also known as Mrs. ALBERT C. SHIRE, who is probably identical with the individual who contacted HELEN SILVERMASTER on these occasions, is an alleged member of communist front organizations and is listed in the membership files of the Washington Committee for Democratic Action and League of Women Shoppers. She is also listed as an active member of the Washington Bookshop Association.

On June 19, 1946, LUTHIG ULLIAM contacted HELEN SILVERWASTER and inquired whether she has SETH's address (JOSEPH GAER). HELEN advised she did not, that SETH had recently moved whereupon ULLMANN stated he has obtained the material from LARRY LEONARD that SETH wanted and wished to send it to him. HELEN advised she would obtain the address but they probably would see SETH shortly in any event.

On June 26, 1946, LUDWIG ULLMANN contacted HELEN SILVERNASTER and advised HENRIETTA, apparently HENRIETTA KLOTZ, had just advised him her mother had died, and that HERMAN'S (KLOTZ) mother is also very ill. HENRIETTA expressed a desire to join the SILVERNASTERS at their beach home soon.

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There is some indication at this time that ANATOLE COLKOV, HELEN'S son, together with some friends of his from Chapel Hill, is attending the PAC school at the Willard Hotel.

On June 26, 1946, MARY JANE KEENEY contacted HELEN SILVERNASTER and advised she was unable to call upon her it evening as had been previously arranged, as she had a caller who delayed her, that she would arrange to see her at an early date.

On June 28, 1946, HELEN SILVERIASTER contacted CYNTHIA DIERKES, and arrangements were completed for CYNTHIA and her husband JOHN to spent sometime at the SILVERIASTER beach home.

By letter dated June 18, 1946, the Phoenix Field Office furnished the following information regarding subject NATHAN GREGORY SILVER! ASTER.

Investigation by that office reflected SILVERMASTER registered at the Westward Ho Hotel, Phoenix, Arizona, at 1:46 a.m., June 15, 1946. One WENDELL T. WEESNER registered at the Testward Ho Hotel at the same time as subject and apparently they arrived in Phoenix in a 1942 Chevrolet Sedan. This car is a four-door model, black in color, bearing U. S. Government license 49527. On each of the front doors of this automobile are U. S. Government shields approximately three inches high containing the notations "For Official Use." At the rear of the right front fender skirt of this automobile the number 417 appears in white paint.

A discreet surveillance of this subject on June 15, 1946, reflected he left his room at the Westward Ho Hotel, which was No. 1012, and had several drinks with WENDELL W. WEESNER in WEESNER's room, No. 1033.

On that date the subject tried unsuccessfully on several occasions to call Phoenix telephone 4-5355 which is listed to Mrs. ROBERT K. OSHER. The files of the Phoenix Field Office reflect no information regarding Mrs. MOSHER. However, Phoenix files indicate one ROBERT KEELER MOSHER was a conscientious objector employed at the Ordnance Depot, Bellemont, Arizona, during 1942. There is no indication as to whether ROBERT KEELER MOSHER is connected with the individual the subject attempted to call.

On Saturday evening, June 15, 1946, an unidentified man telephoned room 1033 and talked to an individual, presumably TENDELL 7. TEESMER, who was registered in that room. The former individual asked TEESMER how he was getting along with "Doc." It is believed the individual referred to as "Doc" is subject NATHAN CREGORY SILVERMASTER. The caller asked several other questions to which WEESMER would give only yes and no answers. With regard to how he was getting along with "Doc," the caller finally said, "O. K., if you don't want to talk, enswer me one question yes or no. Is it to

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my best interest?" WEESNER replied, "It's for your interest." EESNER then told the caller in response to a question that the caller was not to come up to see "Doc." The caller indicated that WEESNER would know where to reach the former if desired.

On June 16, 1916, in the late afternoon a telephone call was received from a Mr. STEWART (phonetic) from outside the hotel to TEESNER's room. Mr. STEWART talked to WEESNER at which time he inquired as to whether he would see WEESNER and "Doc" in the office in the morning. WEESNER replied that they would be seeing him then. Inasmuch as the reservation for subject SILVERWASTER was made by one L. L. STEWART at the Westward Ho Hotel, it is considered likely that the STEWART above referred to is the same individual.

On June 16, 1946, SILVERMASTER went sightseeing in the automobile referred to above. He was accompanied by WENDELL W. WEESNER.

On June 17, 1946, SILVERMASTER and MEESNER proceeded to the old aluminum plant which is located on West Van Buren Street, Phoenix, Arizona. Offices of the War Assets Administration are located at that place at the present time.

On the afternoon of June 17, 1946, SILVERMASTER and JESNER visited the Rivers War Relocation Authority Project, Rivers, Arizona, which formerly housed a number of Japanese during the war.

At 5:30 p.m., SILVERMASTER placed a long distance telephone call to Washington, D. C., telephone Emerson 6720, and talked with a woman, apparently his wife. He spoke of being out to see the project on the desert, apparently referring to his trip to the Rivers War Relocation Authority apparently referring to his trip to the Rivers War Relocation Authority apparently referring to his trip to the Rivers War Relocation Authority apparently referring to his cold was somewhat better and he would Project, Rivers, Arizona. He said his cold was somewhat better and he would like to stay a few days more but had to go on to Los Angeles or San Diego. He made some comment about something costing too much but it was not learned to what he had reference. He stated that he would come back to Washington, D. C., soon and if his cold got worse he would go outside somewhere close by. The woman talking wanted to know whether she should call JOE and he told her that he would call JOE at 9 in the morning.

In connection with the above reported conversation, it may be noted that SILVERMASTER at no time while he was under observation displayed any evidence of having a cold. It may be further noted other telephone conversations subject had with individuals the topic of health and the cold was also discussed.

About 5:45 p.m., June 17, 1946, SILVERMASTER from his room, 1012, in the Testward Ho Hotel called Room 702 which was occupied by Mr. and Mrs.

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M. D. TEINER, 1709 West 8th Street, Los Angeles, California. Mrs. WEINER answered the telephone and said that Mr. WEINER was in the lobby; that if SILVERMASTER wanted to see him he had best see WEINER alone as WEINER would not want to discuss his business in front of her. With regard to WEINER, on June 18, 1946, at 3:06 p.m., he received a telegram at room 702 as follows:

"HAVE ORDERS FOR ALL BEER BUT WILL SHIP ONE CAR IF ACCOMMODATION TO YOU HOWEVER OUR COST AT BREWERY IS 4.30 INCLUDING 25 CENTS EACH US THIS MAKES BEER INCLUDING BOTTLES COST ABOUT 5.30 PHOENIX WE CAN ONLY HANDLE IF BUYER APPOINTS US HIS PURCHASING ACENT SUPPLIES FUNDS FOR US TO DISBURSE-

"FRANK P. DOW CO."

Also on the evening of June 17, 1946, subject from room 1012 tried to call room 533 in which a Mr. R. D. BARTLETT of Phoenix, Arizona, is registered. Being unable to get any response to the phone in room 533, SILVERNASTER then called room 733 which is occupied by Mrs. B. P. BARTLETT, the mother of R. D. BARTLETT.

It was learned that Mrs. BARTLETT and her son have recently given a Phoenix residence of long standing and are temporarily residing at the Westward Ho. The BARTLETTS are Phoenix, Arizona, people and BARTLETT is considered a drinking companion whom subject SILVERMASTER met at the Westward Ho Bar.

On Saturday, June 15, 1946, subject and WENDELL W. WEESNER were first seen with a Miss NETTA BRUMER, 121 Williams Avenue, Brooklyn, New York, who had checked into the Westward Ho Hotel at 11:25 p.m., June 14, 1946, some two hours ahead of subject and WEESNER. Miss BRUMER was first assigned room 1022. On June 15, 1946, Miss NETTA BRUMER changed from room 1022 to room 1034 which adjoined the room occupied by WENDELL W. WEESNER (1033). It may be noted that both of these rooms have a common hallway and an outer door which may be closed off and the two rooms can be converted into a suite. It is known from telephone calls made to room service that at times WEESNER was in room 1034 and at other times NETTA BRUMER was in room 1033.

It may be further noted that on the night of June 15, 1946, TEESNER and subject walked to the San Carlos Hotel where they had dinner, and at the time the pair were under the influence of liquor. On Sunday night, SILVERMASTER accompanied by ALLSNER and Miss NETTA BRUMER drove in the government car to the Mexican Cafe located in the 1700 block on East

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Van Buren where they had dinner and then returned to the Westward Ho Hotel and continued drinking in the bar of the Westward Ho Hotel. On Monday evening, June 17, 1946, the same trio again in the government car ate dinn at the Steak House located on North Central Avenue and returned to the hotel about 11:30 p.m.

On June 18, 1946, the subject and WEESNER drove to the offices of the War Assets Administration, Phoenix, Arizona, about 8:40 a.m. They remained there for two hours after which WEESNER drove SILVERWASTER to the offices of the Southern Pacific Railroad Company. SILVERWASTER then obtained accommodations leaving Phoenix at 8:40 p.m., June 18, 1946, on train No. 43 of the Southern Pacific in lower 5, Car No. 437, to Los Angetrain No. 43 of the Southern Pacific in lower 5, Car No. 437, to Los Angetes, California. He will leave Los Angeles, California, at 9 p.m., June 19, 1946, via train No. 75, Car No. 754, bedroom I, with destination San Francisco, California.

On the evening of June 18, 1946, WENDELL W. TEESMER checked out of room 1033, Westward Ho Hotel, at approximately 6 p.m. and made several efforts to secure plane reservations on American Airlines to Los Angeles but was unsuccessful. WEESNER remained in the hotel the majority of the evening in company with Miss NETTA BRUNER. Subject also remained at the hotel but he had previously made arrangements to hold his room until an hour hotel but he checking out hour in view of his contemplated departure by train at 8:40 p.m.

At 7:45 p.m., SILVERMASTER checked out of his room and his bags were brought to the first floor. However, he did not leave the hotel until 10:45 p.m. inasmuch as the train he was taking from Phoenix was reported late in arriving.

During the evening MENDEIL . WEESNER made inquiry at the lichener Carage, right across from the Westward Ho Hotel, in an effort to secure a ride to Los Angeles stating he had to be to work the next morning. He was unsuccessful in securing such a ride.

At 10:45 p.m., subject, accompanied by WENDELL W. WEESMER, proceeded to the Union Station, Phoenix, Arizona, in Yellow Cab No. 84. Subject and WEESNER continued in earnest conversation from the time of their arrival at the depot and the train departure at 11:40 p.m. WEESNER, who had no reservation up until the time he arrived at the depot, boarded the train as it departed from Phoenix, and he was observed standing in the vestibule of Car No. 437 which was the car occupied by subject SILVERWASTER.

By letter dated June 25, 1946, the San Francisco Field Office advised subject SILVERMASTER arrived at San Francisco on June 20, 1946.

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While in San Francisco, he made business contacts with the War Assets Administration officials and in addition thereto had social contacts, several of whom are suspected of communist affiliations. SILVERMASTER held reservations to leave Oakland, California, on June 25, 1946, on the Southern Pacific Railroad,







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The following information was obtained from a confidential source known to Special ...gent BERT H. HELCOCK.

HENRY BOWEN SMITH prepared a personal history on October 29, 1942, reflecting that he was born on June 17, 1905 at New London, Connecticut. His mother, ANNA ESTELLE ASKET SMITH, is deceased. His wife, Mrs. CLAYTON CRANCELL SMITH, was born in Waynesboro, Pennsylvania August 1, 1908. Subject has two children, HILARY and HILDRETH SMITH, five years of age. The members of his family in the Government service are set forths Captain EDWARD C. SMITH, brother, in army Air Corps, Washington, D. C.; Captain JOHN P. CRANCELL, U. S. Army, Military Intelligence, Washington, D. C.

SMITH has resided at the following addresses during the past years: 1937 to 1940 at 1425 Park Avenue, Baltimore; landlord was WILLIA INGLE, 1717 Park Avenue, Baltimore. 1940 to 1941 resided at Corbett, P. O., Baltimore City, Md. 1941 to October 1942, resided at 2818 N Street, N. W., Washington, D. C.

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Information was obtained from the maid at subject's residence, 2818 N Street, N. W., that subject was now on a vacation until next October, his address being New Ocean House, Swampscott, Massachusetts.

on January 9, 1946 that NEB
SCHARFMAN contacted ALLEN HOSENBERG, at which time ROSENBERG mentioned that
SULNER MARCUS wanted to get out of the Army and go to Japan. ROSENBERG said
he contacted BOMEN SHITH, who sends "these missions" to Japan and he had told
SMITH To have MARCUS approach him. On this same date MARCUS contacted ROSENBERG said he had contacted SMITH, who was very interested, and that SMITH
schools like the man he had been looking for. SMITH was willing to check in
various offices for the various people whom MARCUS should see. ROSENBERG
trated he thought BOHEN SMITH was probably the best guy in the entire Government on getting anybody to Japan in civilian clothing.

On February 3, 1946, advised that ERNA ROSENBERG invited the BOTEN SMITHS to a dinner on this date. Also the GLASSERS were to be present and maybe DAVE NAHL.

This informant also advised that BO.EN SMITH contacted PETE NNDER. OOD on February 3, 1946, at which time SMITH said that he was not going to Japan for the present, as he had been given no assurance that he could take his family with him. SMITH mentioned that he was now assistant to the head of State's new Research and Planning Division of Economic Security Policy.

advised on February 4, 1946, that EMILY SCHARFMAN and ALLEN ROSENBERG were discussing a friend, Captain PINKERTON. EMILY remarked that PINKERTON was a member of the Communist Party because he told EMILY this without making any bones about it. ALLEN said PINKERTON got awfully drunk last night and stayed at BOJEN SMITH's house.

Also on this date ERMA ROSENBERG and ENLLY SCHARFMAN contacted each other and ERNA stated that the GERTLERS were at the party and Mr. GERTLER is from Canada and works for FEA under BOLEN SMITH.

Later in the day ERNA ROSENBERG was conversing with one BEATRICE and mentioned that she had been to a party given by the BOWEN SMITHS on Saturday night for the Progressive School. This was a pay party and she spent too much money.

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It was also learned from this informant that FAYE GIASSER remarked to LUCIEILE EZEKIEL that BOJEN SMITH was transferred from the FEA to the State Department.

It was learned on February 8, 1946 from BOB TRIEST (phonetic) contacted Mrs. SILVERMASTER, at which time BOB stated that he is from ... fornia and that he spoke with HELEN LIMB last evening and that she had said the SILVERIESTERS were going to be at her place this evening after dinner, and BOB wanted to know if she and GREG could go over to the BOWEN SMITHS: instead of the LAMBS, inasmuch as the LAMBS were going Mrs. SILVERMASTER said she knew nothing to be at the BOTEN SHITHS! also. about the above engagement with HELEN LAIB and that GREG had probably forgotten to tell her about it. She says she hopes they can make it. BOB said that the address is 2818 N Street. He also said that he would enjoy seeing the SILVERMUSTERS and that he is only going to be here today. BOB said he is in business in Los Angeles and that he came east for a convention and thought he would stop at Washington for a day to see his friends. He told Mrs. SILVERMASTER that he thought 8:30 was a good time to get the BOTEN SMITHS. C

The name of HENRY BOWEN SMITH was checked against the records of Stone's Mercantile Agency and the Credit Bureau and the Criminal Records Division of the Metropolitan Police Department, with negative results.


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

During the period of this report June 16-30, 1946, inclusive, the 62 following information concerning the activities of HEIEN TENNEY was obtained 670 from CONF. INFT.

JOHN HOVELL was coming to Washington to start business with the State Department. BEATRICE said she would visit RUTH CHERIN. (The telephone directory indicates that WILLIAM B. CHERIN, presumably the husband of RUTH, resides at 1519 35th Street, N. W.)

Later on this same day, BEATRICE HOTELL told HELEN TENNEY she had in touch with her brother JOHN. Apparently he and his wife were staying at the Roger Smith Hotel in Washington.

BEATRICE HOWELL also got in touch with one OTTO who has a wife named ANN. He spoke with a distinct accent, possibly German or Austrian. BEATRICE broke a dinner engagement she had with OTTO owing to the arrival of her brother and his family in Washington.

indicated that RUTH CHERIN was moving from her home, and that her husband was confined to the hospital owing to a nervous condition.

BEATRICE HOTELL and HELEN TENNEY offered to assist RUTH in transferring her luggage. Indicated that JOHN HOTELL and his wife ELEANOR arrived by boat from Casablanca docking at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, the day before with their children. deemed it possible that ELEANOR and the children would go to visit BEATRICE HOWELL's mother in Connecticut.

On June 23, 1946, BEATRICE HOWELL told HELEN TENNEY that WILLIAM CHERIN would be coming home from the hospital that day.

In a conversation with HELEN TENNEY, RUTH CHERIN stated she had tried to get in touch with Mrs. ALTMAN (phonetic) in order to get her to call HELEN. RUTH CHERIN promised to call Mrs. ALTMAN and to tell her all about HELEN TENNEY. She would then have Mrs. ALTMAN get in touch with HELEN. HELEN observed even her own office did not know she was leaving her position at the State Department.

This conversation indicated that RUTH would not move that week-end since WILLIAM her husband would be coming home from Emergency Hospital. RUTH mentioned her family doctor was Dr. LEON GORDON.

indicated that WILLIAM CHERIN was connected with the State Department since RUTH spoke of his unsettled circumstances in New-York and his possible transfer to Australia.

On the same day, HELEN TENNEY spoke to an unknown woman who told her SCOTT would be at her place for a little while that afternoon. It is believed this SCOTT referred to is SCOTT IOCKTOOD of whom HELEN TENNEY has professed to be enamored.

On this same day HELEN TENNEY spoke to a Mrs. NESIEY (phonetic), apparently a fellow employee. HELEN indicated on the following day she would refuse to accept a lower grade and would resign her position with OSS.

HEIEN was also in conversation with INEZ, an elderly woman. She promised to bring her an eggplant after which she would go to Arlington and would finally return to INEZ's about 6:30 p.m. for supper.

On June 26, 1946, HELEN TENNEY spoke to her mother about the sending of some pictures, vases, and a suitcase of clothing to HELEN. HELEN said she was not sure she would be in Washington, that she was "in a constant turmoil. It's incredible like all cases, you have to find out for yourself every regulation as nobody seems to know." HELEN wanted her mother to send a copy of the Martinique study which she did for the Rockefeller office as she is dickering with the Public Health Authority, an information and public relations job, and needs to produce examples of her work for this woman. HELEN said she planned to go to New York on the following Saturday morning, obtain samples of her work, mail them back, and stay in New York on the following week. HELLN said SCOTT had not returned home yet. GRAHAN ERDJURN would come to Washington on the following day to "take the girl up and start her for Wisconsin on Friday."

On June 28, 1946, a man believed to be JIN DUMER told HELEN he was in the process of doing "those things" for Mrs. LAURA McCULLAUGH. He was using HELEN's typewriter.

On June 29, 1946, HELEN TENNEY spoke to an unknown woman believed to be BEATRICE HOTELL. She stated she would go to the office for awhile and would leave for New York City by Tuesday evening, July 2, at the latest and will stay there over the week-end.

On June 30, 1946, HELEN spoke to JEAN LETINSON, wife of FAUL LETINSON. HELEN asked the name of a man who worked for PAUL. JEAN said it was PHILIP BOWER (phonetic). HELEN said a relative of BEATRICE HOWELL had just returned from Casablanca where he had been with the State Department, and he wanted to meet someone from TVA as he had formerly worked there. FHILIP BOWER's brother HARRY BOWER was formerly with TVA and is now an assistant librarian at the University of Oregon at Portland, Oregon. HARRY would be in Washington soon on a vacation. JEAN and PAUL LETINSON promised to visit HELEN at her apartment on the following night.

Physical Surveillance

On the evening of June 20, 1946, Special Agent GEORGE G. McKENNA conducted a surveillance of HELEN TENNEY. At 5:15 p.m., her blue Plymouth sedan was observed parked at its usual place at 26th and Water Streets outside her place of employment. At 5:38 p.m., HELEN TENNEY, JIN DUMMER, and a girl came out of Temporary Building 2 and got into the car.

HELEN drove to her home at 2038 I Street, N. W. The girl, apparently a co-worker of HELEN, who received a lift to the bus stop walked from I Street some few yards to Pennsylvania Avenue. HELEN TENNEY entered her house and JIM DUMMER went down Pennsylvania Avenue.

At 6:58 p.m., HELEN TENNEY and another woman left HELEN's house, walked a block to the Little Vienna Restaurant on Pennsylvania Avenue and 21st Street where they had dinner. At 7:50 p.m., they left the Little Vienna, boarded a streetcar, and rode to 14th and F Streets. Agent McKENNA boarded this streetcar also and had an excellent opportunity to observe the other closely. HELEN's companion was described as follows:

This woman answers the description of BEATRICE HOTELL. As HELEN TENNEY has been described in detail in previous reports, she is not being described here. It may be stated, however, she wore a navy blue suit and a plain dark blue brimmed hat.

The agent followed HELEN and BEATRICE to the National Theater where "Voice of the Turtle" was being performed. They entered at 8:15 p.m.

On June 23, 1946, Agent McKENNA conducted a spot surveillance of the subject. At 2:05 p.m., he observed her Plymouth parked outside her house at 2038 I Street, N. W. At 2:50 p.m., HELEN TENNEY and JIM DUMBER left the house and got into the car. DUMBER, apparently having forgotten something, returned to the house for three minutes. HELEN then drove with him to 2232 California Street, N. W., which is an apartment house. While JIM DUMBER waited outside in the car, HELEN went in.

(In apartment 109 of 2231 California Street, N. W., lives INEX Unquestionably HELEN visited this apartment for had advised by the HELEN TENNEY intended to bring one INES an eggplant on that day. INES UNOZ was a reference given by HELEN TENNEY in applying for her position. It is interesting to know that JOSEPH CREGG, another subject in instant case, visited INES MUNOZ on the evening of June 12, 1946, and stated he enjoyed talking to her very much. CREGG, who recently left Washington, made arrangements before his departure to receive his mail at the address of INES MUNOZ.)

At 3:15 p.m., HELEN after remaining in the apartment house about five minutes returned to the car and drove to Rock Creek Park where she let JIM DUMER out. DUMER took off his shirt and reclined on the grass while HELEN drove off.

At 3;45 p.m., she arrived at Fark Fairfax, Virginia, parked the car, and entered the house at 1611 Mount Eagle Place. This is the home of BUTCH; that is, Mrs. EUGENE PORTER MUSSETT. At 4:10 p.m., the surveillance was discontinued.


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

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Reference is made to a report of this case dated July 8, 1946, wherein mention was made of HALPERIN A. FIERST. Further investigation reflects that HALPERIN ABNER FIERST was born in New York, July 29, 1914, is six feet tall, has blue eyes and light brown hair. His father is HARRY FIERST, born Lithuanian, address 162 Sheridan Avenue, Mount Vernon, New York. HERHERT FIERST resided in Palestine, Egypt from June 1927 to September, 1927 and traveled and studied in Great Britian, France, Switzerland, Italy, Austria, Palestine, USSR and Scandinavia.

Reference is made to report of this case dated June 5, 1946, wherein mention was made of one NATHAN ENGLEMAN.

By letter dated June 27, 1946, the Cleveland Field Division advised that NATHAN ENGLEMAN was the subject of a closed case in that office and that his residence is 2643 Euclid Heights Boulevard, Cleveland Heights, Ohio. ENGLEMAN was born April 6, 1874 at Shebes, Austria-Hungary, and entered the United States about 1874, becoming a citizen through his father, SOLOMON ENGLEMAN, who was naturalized at Zanesville, Ohio, on October 13, 1879. NATHAN ENGLEMAN is a retired agent for the Casualty Life Assurancd Company being employed by that company for about thirty years. NATHAN ENGLEMAN is reported to have held employees book number 55612 at the Cleveland Heights Branch of the Communist Political Association in 1944. He was on the mailing list of the joint Anti-Facist Refugee Committee and was interested in the American Soviet Friendship Group and has aided the Communist Party in Cleveland by soliciting and collecting contributions for it. He was the subject of security index card until September 1945 at which time he was removed from the security index list inasmuch as he was no longer classified as potentially dangerous. NATHAN ENGLEMAN is married to FANNIE MIRSCH of Akron, Chie,



RE: HENRY HOLDSHIP WARE

Reference is made to reports of Special agent Lambert C. Zander dated May 17, 1946 and June 5, 1946, which set forth that on April 20, 1946, MADELINA WEIR (ph) contacted ANN REMINGTON and invited them to dinner. At the WEIR residence at 1024 North Montana Street, Arlington, Virginia, further investigation reflected that MADELIE WEIR'S correct name was NAMETTE WARE and her hu and is HENRY HOLDSHIP WARE.

HENRY WIRE obtained a military furlough from the Department of Commerce October 2, 1943 and on October 15, 1945, he was discharged from the Army with the rank of Captain.

From an article dated October 14, 1943, taken from the Washington Evening Star and on file at the Stone Mercantile Agency, Washington, D. C. was the following: "Called to active duty a few days ago was Captain HENRY HOLDSHIP WARE, 1731 New Hampshire Avenue Northwest. He had been in the European Division of the Department of Commerce for the past year and the European WARE is a graduate of Pamona College in California. He captain WARE is a graduate of Pamona College in California. He is a native of Mont Claire, New Jersey."

The credit bureau's records of November 3, 1945 on HENRY H. WARE reflected the following: Residued at 1724 - 17th Street Northwest, No. 3, for two years, formerly lived at 1731 New hampshire Avenue Northwest for one and one-half years. Mrs. ALICE WARE, mother, lives at 310 Riverside Drive, New York, New York. Temporarily employed at Department of Commerce, commencing December 3, 1941. Appointed as Assistant Ecomonic Analyst March 17, 1942. Military leave of one and one-half years. Discharged ten days ago and will return to the Commerce Department in a few days. Purchased home in Westover, Virginia, address 1024 North Montana Street, Westover, Virginia.

HENRY WIRE received a call from ANN REWINGTON on extension 20307 at the Commerce Department and enswered "Russian Unit". Telephone information at the Commerce Department was contacted and advised that HENRY HOURE is in the Russian Unit, room 2311 in the main Commerce building.

RE: HENRY HOLDSHIP WARE

The Newark Field Division indices were checked for the time of HENRY HOLDSHIP WIRE with the following results: In tertember of 943, 1r. F. J. SCHLINK of the Consumers Research, Incorporated, Washington, New Jersey, advised the Newark office that there was being conducted at Cornell, New Jersey, a summer school program which included a class in Russian-American understanding. Mr. SCHLINK had listed a number of outstanding professors who were known to have Communistic tendencies. According to Mr. SCHLINK, the class began only 5, 1943 and continued until October 23, 1943. He stated that the class was opened to special qualified students and required a tuition of 1200, although some scholarships were given. Pr. SCHLINK got a list with background information concerning it. This list was transmitted to the Bureau by latter from the Newark office dated September 18, 1943. Included on this list was the name of HENRY H.

WIRE, described by Mr. SCHLINK as follows: "Economic Analyst, European Unit, Department of Commerce. Studied at Plekhanov Institution of National Ecomony in Moscow for three years".

Mr. SCHLINK was contacted on June 14, 1946 by Special Agent C. E. Kleinkauf of the Newark Office and at the time, advised that he had no further information to furnish concerning HENRY WARE. He was unable to state the source of information he had previously furnished, although it was believed these facts were derived from a review of publications furnished to him. Mr. SCHLINK recalled that both the Army and Navy Intelligence Service had contacted him concerning HENRY HOLDSHIP WARE.

District of Columbia directory was examined and found to contain information that one HENRY H. WIRE was a analyst with the Burcau of Foreign and Domestic Commerce, Washington, D. C. It is believed that the individual appearing in the Newark Field Division indices under the name of HENRY H. WIRE is identical with HENRY HOLDSHIP WIRE inasmuch as he allegedly is employed in the Department of Commerce. It is noted that information appearing in the files concerning this individual in the "Gwark Office, reflects that in the spring of 1945, WILLIM WILTER REMINCTON had gone to England as an Assistant to the American Minister of Economics in that country. According to Mrs. GARTRELL, 246 Mountain Avenue, Ridgewood, New Jersey, a neighbor of the REMINGTONs, it is possible that REMINGTON became acquainted with WIRE during this employment.

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Reference is made to a letter dated June 20, 1946 from the Newark Field Division captioned as above which sets forth the following information on WARE: In an effort to ascertain the identity of WARE, contact was had with Mrs. WINSLOW, Dean of Women, at the Montclair High School, Montclair, New Jersey. She advised from her records that one HENRY HOLDSHIP WARE was a student at this high school for one year in 1922, From these records she stated that this person was born July 11, 1909, place not given. He was described as an American citizen; his father's name was furnished as E. T. WARE. She reported that this individual's marks for the one year were below average. These records reflected that WARE'S address at the time was 26 Fairfield street, Montclair, New Jersey.

At the Board of Health, Montclair, New Jersey, the record for the birth of HENRY HOLDSHIP WARE was examined. This record stated that this person was born July 11, 1908 in Montclair, New Jersey. His father's name was EDWARD TIRCHELL WARE, 90 Porter Place, Montclair, who was born in Atlanta, Georgia. His mother's name was given as ALICE HOLDSHIP WARE, same address and was born in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. His father was 34 years of age at the time and the mother was then 35 years old. The father's occupation was listed as minister and Henry was the second child for this family.

At the Newark Public Library, Newark, New Jersey, the city directories for Montclair were examined for 1908 on. It was determined that the first mention of this individual or his father was in the directory of 1920. In this directory, Rev. EDWARD WARE was listed as living at 26 Draper Terrace at Montclair, New Jersey, Residing with him at this address was Mrs. HENRY HOLDSHIP. The 1923 directory reflects that Rev. EDWARD T. WARE then lived at 26 Fairfield Street, Montclair, New Jersey. Living with him was Mrs. MARIA HOLDSHIP, All subsequent directories until 1927 contained this identical information. The 1927 directory stated that WARE had removed to California and that Mrs. MARIA HOLDSHIP had died on March 22, 1926 at the age of 89.

The above man is presumably one SINON, as one BILLY SINON talked with his father at subject VINITE's home mentioning they were going to Atlantic City Saturday and Sunday, returning Monday in order to take BILLY out to his summer camp.

On the same morning, WHITE contacted one GEORGE, who indicated he had been away the previous week. WHITE stated he would be out to see him about 11:30. It is believed GEORGE may be subject GEORGE SILVER WAN, as this individual was in New York early the previous week.

On this date, ANNE WHITE was contacted by one BLANCA, who spoke English with difficulty. BLANCA indicated she had not contacted ANNE because she has a visitor from Mexico. She mentioned they would have five in their party Wednesday. Apparently BLANCA is one of a group of persons from the Mexicon Embassy.

June 17, 1946

On the morning of June 17, 1946, AIME WHITE spoke with HELEN, her maid, concerning five guests for dinner Wednesday night, stating they were young people from the Embassy.

On the same date, FRANCES EDELSTEIN contacted ANNE, who stated Colonel GIMP COHEN is staying with the THITES and he has returned from Germany. She described him as a doctor, short and stocky in appearance. They also mentioned one WEISBURG (phonetic) from Florida who is also short and stocky. ANNE mentioned that her brother had been in Washington Friday through Sunday. FRANCES mentioned a poem by SAMUEL BUTLER to ANNE during the conversation.

June 18, 1946

On the morning of this date, GIIF COHEN told ANNE WHITE he had gotten a room for his son, who is attending college in North Carolina, with a family having the surname COHEN. ANNE mentioned her two daughters will go to Barnard College.

At 2:30 P. !!. on this date, Operator 67 in New York endeavored to contact COHEN, who was not available. Subsequently, WHITE advised his wife that the Colonel had to fly to Boston, as his mother is ill.

On the evening of June 18, CANILLE GUTT contacted WHITE, stating he learned this morning that IIONEL ROBBINS was not in the running. WHITE commented this simplified CANILLE's problem. GUTT said he had BERNSTEIN coming to see him and that BERNSTEIN had made three requests: First, that he be placed on probation for a few months and then be appointed Head of Research, which request he dropped; then, that he receive \$14,000 instead of

\$12,000; and that instead of being Assistant Head of Research and Acting Head that he be designated simply as Acting Head. GUTT stated he did not mind the salary and was quite ready to present this to the Board as BERNSTEIN had occupied a high position in the Treasury Department. This reference is undoubtedly to Colonel BERNARD BERNSTEIN. GUTT stated he was concerned about BERNSTEIN's being Acting Head without also being designated as Assistant Head. WHITE said that whatever the Board desired he would support. WHITE commented that after all BERNSTEIN was not an old man and had not held top positions.

This concerned a position also apparently, the name NETZKY or MERKSON (phonetic) being mentioned with some controversy of salary of \$12,000 instead of \$10,000. WHITE indicated he would support CAMILLE on any position the latter took. GUTT indicated he would contact "LOUIE", presumably OSMANSKY, the following morning. GUTT also stated that the COHEN matter was settled and he would take up duties the next day. He mentioned he had informed HORNE, who was saddened upon hearing the news. June 27, 1946

On the morning of this date, Miss SHANAHAN, secretary, contacted WHITE advising Mrs. LIPPNAM had reported for work in the office of BERMSTEIN and the latter had stated WHITE had the material for her to work on. WHITE stated she did not know what he wanted and he would have to talk with her. He then instructed her to take the Senate and House hearings on his desk and go through them ascertaining what statements are asked and whether there are any questions dealing with whether or not member countries can buy currency—

Thave the right to buy, that the fund has taken the stand that the right is qualified one and members can purchase currency on good behaviour; secondly, questions concerning what is equilibrium or fundamental equilibrium

On the same date, WHITE endeavored to contact Mr. ROSS unsuccessfully.

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Reference is made to the results obtained from mail cover on this subject.

On April 5, 1946, Mrs. HARRY D. WHITE received a communication from the Women's City Club, 1733 Eye Street, N. 7. Vashington, D. C. Inquiry disclosed this is a civic organization embodying social gatherings of prominent Washington society matrons. The executive secretary is Mrs. FANNIE E. DEBROT, 736 Jackson Place, N. W. The name of ANNE WHITE apparently does not appear as an active or past member on the rolls of the organization. Pretext interview indicated members' activity include luncheons, bridge parties and activities in Red Cross drives and other civic organizations.

Mail cover disclosed AINE WHITE received a communication April 17, 1946, from Washington Committee, American Society for Russian Relief, Incorporated. Inquiry disclosed that this organization is the local chapter of Russian Var Relief. No further inquiry was made at this time.

Under date of April 17, 1946, Mr. and Mrs. HARRY D. WHITE received a communication from Grape and Company, 1105 Connecticut Avenue, Washington, D. C. Investigation developed that a jewelry business known as the Jewel Shop is located at this address, which is operated by THEODORE S. GRAPE, 3351 Mt. Pleasant Street, N. ., who was born April 24, 1889, is married to one CRACE CRAPE and was divorced from ELLA B. GRAPE. He deals in wholesale and retail jewelry. No further investigation is being made concerning this firm.

Mail cover disclosed about May 1, 1946, WHITE received a communication from China-America Council of Commerce and Industry, Incorporated, 30 Rockefeller Plaza, New York City. Reference to the file entitled "PERCY JOSEPH CHEN; INTERNAL SECURITY - R," New York origin, disclosed that the files of the Credit Bureau in Lashington indicated this is a trade membership organization incorporated under the laws of New York September 21, 1943, as a non-profit organization without capital stock. The officers were identified as prominent business executives. The organization was established to promote and insure good trade relations between the U. S. and the Republic of China and was functioning as a fact-finding body with the view of promoting relations after the war. The local office of this organization at 1604 K Street, N. "., Washington, D. C., was under the direction of Miss A. VIOLA SHITH, 2440 16th Street, N. ... Apartment 516, described as white, 50 years of age, single, no dependents. The credit record indicates she is an attorney by profession and spent about every second week in New York. The records in the Washington Field Office indicate she was a social contact of Madame V. PETROVA, secretary to the Russian Ambassador in 1942,


