

The following investigation was conducted by Special Agents
Thomas J. Brownfield and H. Courtenay Clinch.

At approximately 10:30 P. M. on July 23, 1946, Special Agent F. V. McGivern of the Washington Field Office telephonically advised Special Agent J. Gordon Shanklin of this office that SOL ADLER would leave Washington, D. C. at 6:25 Eastern Standard Time by Eastern Airlines plane and would arrive at LaGuardia Airport, New York at 8:05 Eastern Standard Time on July 24, 1946.

At 9:12 A. M. on July 24, 1946, the writer and Special Agent Thomas J. Brownfield observed SOL ADLER arrive aboard Eastern Airlines plane at Gate #12, LaGuardia Airport, New York.

calls at toll booths but appeared unsuccessful. He then boarded an airline bus and proceeded to the Airlines Terminal Building, 42nd Street and Park Avenue, New York City. It was observed also that ADLER used the telephone toll booths several times at the Terminal Building, but it was impossible to secure the results of same. ADLER then proceeded to Thompson's Restaurant located in the Grand Central Station, 42nd Street, New York City directly opposite the Airlines Terminal Building. After remaining in the restaurant for a short period, ADLER was observed to stop at the Information Booth at the above station and immediately thereafter to make a very hurried exit on to 42nd Street where he secured a taxi cab, which agents were unable to pursue due to prevailing traffic conditions. This occurred at approximately 11:50 A. M.

At 1:10 P. M. on July 24, 1946, SOL ADLER was observed entering the lobby of the Pennsylvania Hotel, 33rd Street and Seventh Avenue, New York City. The agents further observed that ADLER walked up and down the lobby of the hotel for a long period of time, apparently looking for someone. At 1:45 P. M., ADLER received a page over the Public Address System to answer an incoming telephone call at the Telephone Desk in the lobby. He was observed to talk not be ascertained, ADLER appeared to be relieved. After concluding the telephone conversation he did not endeavor to check the lobby of the hotel as he previously had done.

SOL ADLER then proceeded to the Train Reservation Desk in the hotel lobby where he attempted to secure sleeper accommodations for the same

evening to Washington on the Pennsylvania Railross bas his request was refused on the basis that he was not a guest of the Pennsylvania Hotel. He then requested at the same desk a time table for Albany trains. At 2:05 P. M., SOL ADLER made a very hurried exit on to Seventh Avenue where he entered a taxi cab bearing New York license plates Number 021-469. The surveilling agents followed in another taxi cab, but at 33th Street and Seventh Avenue, New York City, due to traffic conditions, the surveillance was discontinued. During the remainder of the day, checks were made at various places where it was thought ADLER could be located, but same were made with negative results.

On July 25, 1946, the Washington Field Office advised that SOL ADLER was observed at Washington, D. C. at 9 A. M. on July 25, 1946.

The following investigation concerning the activities of ARRAHGE EROTEMAN, JULES EDRCHIEW and ERSULA WASSERMAN is reported by Special Agent FRANCIS D. O'HRI. and sovers the period from July 11 to August 10, 1946.

ARAHAI BROTHIAN

Confidential Informant HYT-345, who is in According to position to know the activities of ARMEN ROTHMAN at his place of business, 114 Bast 52nd Street, ROTHMAN has been actively engaged with several projects of a very highly technical mature. The same informant savised that on July 9, 1948 JULES MORCHIEN was in esptant with a Mr (NEEDLEMAN (phonetic) of ANTORG. At that time MORCHIEN told WEEDLEMAN that he would like to have him meet ARAHAM HROTHMAN inasmich as he was involved in some work and that he wanted MEEDLEMAN to discuss this work with him. Jon July 10, 1946 the informant advised that MOTHER attempted to locate a Mr. E. N GOSSELIN in Chicago, Illinois. GOSSELIN's telephone number is listed as Saginaw 7050. GOSSELIN's business phone was given as Wabash 8893. HROTHMAN did not indicate whether he would attempt to locate GOSSELIN. On the same date the informant advised that HROTHMAN EPRINGER and told him that he, EROTHMAN, had a contrast with contacted a Mr. which he believed that 6088MIN, mentioned previously, would be interested. IROTHMAN requested SPRINGER to get in touch with GOSSELIN and have him call ABS. Informant stated that on July 10, 1946 EROTHMAN attempted to locate a Mr. ECCATUR, who was mentioned in previous reports as a business contact of ROTHMAN'S. In the absence of LECATUR, MOTHMAN talked with a Mr. AM AGG and told him that he was going to send material to POWEL (phonetic), 405 Park Square Building, Boston, Massachusetts. It is to be meted that EROTHMAN has previously gone to Boston, Massachusett to confer with a man named ROWELL who was believed to be an engineer. According to the aforementioned informant, an unknown individual held a conference with HROTHMAN on July 23, 1946 and requested figures from PROTHNAN regarding the planned preduction of plastics, This unknown man said that he had some "turks" whom he wanted ABE to meet and who are interested in plastics. The same individual asked BROTHMAN if he had submitted his report on plastics to the Russians and ROTHMAN replied in the effirmative.

On July 26, 1946 the informant advised that EROTHMAN continued to work on the projects for the Chinese and that on July 80, 1946 an individual

believed to be Dr. EDGAR SCHWARZ, a Frenchman, was interested in obtaining information regarding engineering problems from EROTHMAN. This same informant advised on August 7, 1946 that EROTHMAN was in contact with one of his employees at his Laboratory and the employee advised him that he had received a letter addressed to EROTHMAN from the Government Purchasing Commission of the Soviet Union under date of August 1. According to this employee, the letter stated that EROTHMAN's proposals concerning the vitamin plant had been sent to their clients abroad and that when they had heard from the clients they would advise EROTHMAN. The letter also sought information concerning EROTHMAN's connection with the International Industrial Corporation.

On July 28, 1946, a highly confidential source known to Special Agents
DONALD E. SHANNON, LAWRENCE W. SPILLANE, GEORGE J. SULLIVAN, THOMAS G.
SPENCER and FRANCIS D. O'ERIEN, furnished information concerning the present
projects that EROTHMAN is working on in his offices at 114 East 32nd Street.
New York City. A photograph of the plans that EROTHMAN is working upon were
furnished, copies of which were sent to the Bureau for evaluation by the Technical
Laboratory. Among the material furnished was a handwritten copy of material
entitled "Progress report on the Palestine job". This report consists of
approximately 20 pages and in the first paragraph of page one the following
statement is set forth:

"In December, 1945 this organization undertook to design a plant for the manufacture of T.N.T. for the client. Sometime after the preliminary work had been done, the extent of the project was increasing greatly and the Engineering Corporation was asked to design plants for the production of

On page three of the same report the following statement may be found. It is believed that BROTHMAN is referring to the plants which he had mentioned in the beginning.

wother plants were required to be operated jointly with the above mentioned ones to act as plausible shields for the original plants. It was also decided to add a D.D.T. plan and an Alkyd Resin plan to the program.

The last of the report is concerned primarily with the technical details, formulas and equations which will be used in the operation of the plant as well as making whatever products might be referred therein.

Another report furnished, which was typewritten, bears the following title: "Proposal for Chloral and D.D.T. plants for Ste. d'Electro Chimie et d'Electro Metallurgie et des Acienies Electriques d'Ugine." It is possible that this proposal is being submitted at the direction of Dr. EDGAR SCHWARZ, Ste. d'Electro Chimie, 10 Rue du General-Fay, Paris, France, inasmuch as a letter addressed to Dr. SCHWARZ was furnished with the above given address and it is therein that the preliminary proposal concerning Chloral and D.D.T plants was being submitted to SCHWARZ. A set of plans which was written on the stationery of AERAHAN EROTHMAN and Assistants, was furnished, but this project bears no title and contains for the most part formulas and mathematical equations which are apparently to be used in the developing of some chemicals.

Also among the material furnished was a letter directed to the Government Purchasing Commission of the Soviet Union in the V.S.A., 210 Madison Evenue, New York, Attention of Mr. V./IVERIANOVICH regarding guarantee of plant performance. The letter is unsigned and the following statements are contained therein:

"In line with the guarantee cited on page eight of our preliminary proposal of July 2, 1946 and an application thereof, we offer the following: The final payment to us of \$65,000 represents roughly 10% of our total engineering services fee. It is made conditional, upon each of the plants completing 30 days successful plant operations, during which the end products produced shall fully meet the potency standards set forth on the proposals submitted. It is to be noted that the figure of \$65,000 representing 10% of the engineering services fee, would indicate that the total engineering services fee to be paid to EROTHMAN would be approximately \$650,000.

The indices of the New York Field Division were checked against the name of V. TVERIANOVICH, to whom the above mentioned letter was addressed, and it was ascertained that TVERIANOVICH is an engineer of the Fishing Indistry Group of the Soviet Purchasing Commission, Washington, D.C. It is also to be noted that it was mentioned before that EROTHMAN was reported to be working on a vitamin plant for the Russians and it is possible that this letter refers to the vitamin plant inasmuch as the potency standards are mentioned.

Reference is made to the report of Special Agent JOHN T. HILSBOS dated July 17, 1946 entitled "GREGORY-ESPIONAGE-R" wherein certain information

is set forth concerning a telephone conversation that MROTHMAN had with 3 of his employees regarding plans for the building of plants and the manufacture of MT and DDT. It is believed that the plans, as sited above in facture of mentioned in referenced report.

In Becember, 1945 MOTHMAN met an individual in New York City. At that time EROTHNAN was under surveillance and the individual whom he met was surveilled to 510 West 112th Street, New York City. Subsequent to this time, a mail cover placed on HROTHMAN's mail indicated that he had received correspondence from a HARDE SLAVIN, 510 West 112th Street and it was believed that this individual was identical with the individual surveilled to \$10 West 112th Street, Mew Yorke Confidential Informant HIT-343 has previously reported that on several occasions BROTHMAN was in contact with one MARRY SLAVIN and it was thought that SLAVIN was working for AMTORG or conducting megotiations for MROTHMAN with METCRG. A photograph of a letter dated July 19, 1946 was furnished which was eddressed to Mr. HARRY SLAVIN, Apartment SA, 510 West 112th Street, New York City. This letter is unsigned and advised that there was a bill from STNTRON requesting \$18,60 and SLAVIN is kindly asked to forward his check so that payment could be made of it. It is possible that BROTHMAN sent this letter to SLAVIN inasmch as it was furnished by a confidential source having access to EROTHWAN'S office.

Inquiry was made at 510 West 112th Street, New York by the reporting agent and it was ascertained that the name of SIAVIN now appears on the epartment 64 at that address whereas previously there was no indication that SIAVIN resided there or was he known to the Superintendent at the time. SIAVIN resided there or was he known to the Superintendent of the Inquiry, under suitable pretext, was made of the Superintendent of the premises and it was found that apartment 64 receives mail from an organization, the name of which is inserted in the inside of the mail box which the letter earrier spens at the time he delivers the mail. However, the Superintendent did not know the name of this organization. Inquiry was made of the letter earrier who delivered mail to that address and it was found the arganization to which the mail is addressed is known as the HISTRADUTH PALESTINE CAMPAIGN. The Indices of the New York Field Division reflected information sencerning the HISTRADUTH PALESTINE CAMPAIGN which indicated that it is a fund raising empaign for the Sewish people in Palestine. No additional information sencerning the arganization was noted.

On Angust 9, 1946 efforts were made to locate SLAVIN telephonically, under a suitable pretext, and it is found that he was not presently in the city. However, information was received that SLAVIN came to the United States


about one year ago from Palestine. The records of the Immigration and Naturalization Service, New York City are to be checked. The information contained therein will be reported in the near future.

A mail cover placed against the name of AERAHAM EROTHMAN indicated that he received mail from the National Council of Soviet-American Friendship and Russian War Relief Society.

Photographs of the material mentioned previously as furnished by Confidential sources, are being retained in the files of the New York Field Division.

JULES KORCHIEN

Information concerning JULES KORCHIEN has previously been reported in this case inasmuch as KORCHIEN is an assistant of abraham brothman and is a very close friend of URSULA WASSERMAN, concerning whom considerable information has previously been reported in this case. KORCHIEN is at the present time the subject of an active investigation in New York City in a case with the character of Internal Security - C. In the future, information concerning KORCHIEN's activities will be reported in the INTERNAL SECURITY case and only information pertinent to this case will be reported here after. During the current investigation no pertinent information concerning KORCHIEN has been reported.



The following investigation extending from July 17, 1946 to the present, on RAY ELSON, is reported by Special Agent James Re-

Current investigation of the activities of RAY EISON reflect that she is maintaining her employment with the CARACUL FUR COMPANY, 227 West 29th Street, New York City and is spending her weekends at her summer home at Far Rockaway, Long Island, New York. The surveillance which had been maintained on EISON's activities since the inception of this investigation was terminated two weeks ago and spot checks are being maintained with the assistance of

advised that ELSON is maintaining her usual contacts of individuals previously reported in instant investigation.

A spot check surveillance was instituted August 5, 1946 on the activities of JACK COLDMAN to further identify his activities and relationship to EISON. At will be recalled that on May 24, 1946, following a luncheon engagement with Confidential Informant GREGORY, ELSON met GOLDMAN at the MANUFACTURERS TRUST COMPANY BANK at 14th Street and 2nd Avenue, New York, where she was loaned \$50.00 by GOLDMAN.

GOLDMAN also spent July 24th with the ELSONS at their Far Rocksway residence, leaving New York with the subject and her husband at 2:15 PaN.

the weekend of July 4th at Kinderland, New York. In this conversation, GOIDMAN related that he had visited with the Polish delegation but this particular phase of the conversation was not expounded.

told EISON that he "received her greetings" and in response to this, RISON 671 retorted, "Ch, you mean from VAGEL, (ph.)".

Following this, GOLDMAN said that he brought greetings to ELSON from FANNY. This statement, according to the informant, surprised ELSON and GOLDMAN explained that she was staying at a "nearby" resort named GROSSMANS and that he happened to see her. The FANNY referred to in this conversation undoubtedly is FANNY DAVIS, 35 Hancock Place, a report of whom is included later in this report.

The purpose of the above-mentioned conversation, however, was a request from EISON to GOLDMAN asking him if he would sign an affidavit for the EISONS verifying that their names were EISON and ISRAELSON. EISON told GOLDMAN that this was to conform with a request from the Veterans Administration to verify that the EISONS were married. GOLDMAN agreed to this, stating joshingly that he was an American citizen now and it was within his power to make such affidavits.

that on July 31, 1946 there was a luncheon date with EISON at the OLD GARDEN, 35 West 29th Street, New York City. The invitation, according to was at EISON's request. During the luncheon conversation, EISON told CREGORY that she was still working at the CARACUL FUR COMPANY and that she intends to remain there until JOE finished art school. The conversation that took place, according to Confidential Informant GREGORY, was general in nature and CREGORY made the observation that EISON has not been in contact with any of her former Russian associates.

A highly confidential informant having access to the premises of RAY ELSON reflected the name of MIKE ZOTTI to be in the address book of the ELSONS.

The employment file of the PUBLIC SERVICE CORPORATION, Newark, New Jersey, reflected that ZOTTI is married and has a son, DONALD, three years old but he did not furnish the name of his wife in making his application for employment other than to state that they were separated.

employment records showed that ZOTTI served in the United States Army from September, 1940 to October, 1941 and again from February, 1942 until September, 1945. He exhibited to the company an honorable discharge and according to the company records, his discharge number was 20220602.

Concerning his previous employment, it was stated that from October, 1941 to January, 1942, he worked as a laborer with the COULENSON FENCE COMPANY, West Orange, New Jersey and from September, 1945 to November, 1945, he worked as a laborer with the F. A. CUTTER COMPANY, Conover Terrace, Orange, New Jersey. At the present time, ZOTTI is employed as a bus driver with the PUBLIC SERVICE CORPORATION.

The Newark Field Division indices reflected that one NICOLA ZOTTI, also known as NICOLAS ZOTTI, is registered as an enemy alien. He was born on March 13, 1885 at Teresina, Beneventa, Italy. He came to the United States on May 23, 1944, entering at New York City aboard the SS PALATIA from Naples, Italy. This person resided at 30 Wilfred Street, Montclair, New Jersey and was employed by the F. A. CUTTER COMPANY at 486 Conover Terrace, Orange, New Jersey as a tree expert. In his application he gave MICHAEL ZOTTI, son, at Fort Dix, New Jersey.

JOHN A CSUCH 17 B, South Hamilton Street Poughkeepsie, New York

A highly confidential informant having access to the premises of the EISONS: apartment reflected that the above name was found in the address book of the EISONS.

Inquiry in Poughkeepsie, New York by Special Agent
Joseph E. Condon reflected that at the present time OSUCH is employed as an
automobile mechanic by BONNER MOTORS, INC., at 183 Church Street, Poughkeepsie,
New York. He receives a salary of \$20.00 a week. He was previously employed as a stock clerk and carpenter - laborer from 1923 to 1932 in the
city of Poughkeepsie. OSUCH's father is ANDREW OSUCH and he has been employed for the past thirty years at the FAIRVIEW FOUNDRY in Poughkeepsie.

A review of the Selective Service file at Local Board 319, New Market Street, Poughkeepsie, indicates that at the time of his questionnaire, December 2010,0 he was residing at 90 Union Street, Poughkeepsie and had order number 277.

It was noted from a review of the file that on September 8, 1942, CSUCH filed an affidavit to support claim for occupational deferment and, at that time, he was working for INSULATING TUBE COMPANY at 26 Cottage Street, Poughkeepsie, New York. This firm manufactures plastic materials and covering used as insulation for aircraft, tanks and armored vehicles. The salary of OSUCH at this time was \$45.00 a week.

OSUCH, since his discharge, has returned to work for his old employer, BONNER MOTORS, INC., at 183 Church Street, Poughkeepsie.

It is possible that the above two names, MIKE A. ZOTTI, and JOHN A. CSUCH, may be Army acquaintances of JOE EISON, husband of the subject.

SEYMOUR RUCK 709 West \ 69th Street New York, New York

According to ELSON made inquiry at the 62-67. telephone company regarding the telephone number of SEYMOUR RUCK and it was given to her as WAdsworth 3-5569. Inquiry ascertained that RUCK resides at 709 West 169th Street, New York and is the son of SAMUEL RUCK.

RUCK was born May 3, 1913 in Manhattan and he is 5' 11's, weighs 184 pounds, has a heavy frame, brown hair, brown eyes and a medium complexion. RUCK graduated from St. Lawrence Law School and previously attended St. Francis College and St. Johns Social Service School, both for one year.

Investigation at the Appellate Division of the Supreme Court, 25th Street and Madison Avenue, reflected that RUCK was admitted to the Bar of the State of New York in March, 1940 and, at present, is an attorney in good standing. The files indicated he attended George Washington High School from 1927 to 1929 and the Rhodes Business School from September, 1929 to November, 1929 and again from January to June, 1934.

RUCK graduated from Eron High School in June, 1933, after attendance from June, 1932. RUCK's college education showed that he attended St. Francis College from September, 1933 to June, 1934, followed by two years at St. Johns from September, 1934 to January, 1936 where he attended day classes. RUCK received an Ll. B. cum laude from the St. Lawrence Law School, which is part of Brooklyn Law School, which he attended from 1936 to graduation in June, 1939.

RUCK served his legal clerkship with ROBERT COOPER, an attorney at 1440 Broadway, New York, from 1939 to his admission to the Bar. COOPER, in his letter to the Appellate Division, said RUCK wasa faithful and energetic worker.

RUCK also worked for SCHOELDER and AUGENBRICH, 225-35 West 37th Street, New York, a dress company, as a clerk, from January, 1930 to February, 1931 from which position he voluntarily resigned. RUCK also served as a councilor at Camp Leonard, Kent, Connecticut from 1934 to 1939 with the exception of 1935. Camp Leonard is a camp for boys. RUCK also had irregular employment at Macy's Department Store from 1934 to 1939.

The Selective Service files reflect that RUCK was inducted into the Army on May 28, 1942 from the firm of WITTNER & WITTNER, 2361 Broadway. He was discharged at Fort Dix, New Jersey on May 22, 1946. His Army Serial Number was 057-9091 and he was made an officer April 16, 1943. At the time of his discharge, RUCK advised his board that he was undecided on his future employment.

Inquiry at the telephone company reflected that the above telephone number was listed to STANLET ROSS, who is believed to be identical with the STANLEY ROSS who was formerly an Associated Press correspondent and in Europe from 1943 to 1945, and a recent contributor to the "NATION" magazine.

Mrs. CATHERINE BRADY, real estate dealer, of the MORRIS REALTY COMPANY, Far Rockaway, voluntarily stated that STANLEY ROSS is a former "G. I." and is being used by individuals because of his Army status to get priorities in building in the Far Rockaway area.

Inquiry of MICHAEL GOLDE, 35 years old, operates the MICHAEL PRESS, PRINTING & MULTIGRAPHING COMPANY, 145 West 45th Street. He started this business in January, 1936 and has made moderate progess since that time. He does printing and mailing for approximately three hundred accounts and employs on an average of forty to forty-five persons. At the present time he estimates his net worth between \$15,000.00 and \$20,000.00 and he owes \$5,000.00 on a chattel mortgage to the LUDLOW TOPOGRAPHY COMPANY.

States, owns and operates the "PERSONAL DIET SERVICE" in the same building at 145 West 45th Street, as her husband, and she sells diets to physicians, hospitals and private individuals. Her husband handles the printing for his wife's firm.

He is the brother of JESSE JOSEPH HANISH, whose wife, the former EDNA/NEWMEYER, is a well known Communist and is active in the National Maritime Union. She served as secretary for several years to BLACKIE MYERS, Vice President of the National Maritime Union.

Inquiry regarding ANN CHERNIN's background to date has been negative. Indications are that she is a member of the Communist Party.


A check of the Selective Service folder of ELECHERNIN at Local Board 91 failed to reflect the name of ANN CHERNIN. He has a sister, ADELAIDE, and a sister, Mrs. SIMAMANISH, wife of MARTIN HANISH. It is believed that this latter sister may be identical with ANN.

Previously JAPPINEN had resided at 200 West 54th Street where she lived with her parents, Mr. and Mrs. LEON F. MIPTON. Mr. LIPTON is a wealthy pajama manufacturer in New York City. JAPPINEN has a sister, MARTHA ZIPTON, who is on a South American tour at the present time with the Metropolitan Opera Company.

New York, stated that RAE JAPPINEN married her husband while he was in the Army but could afford no information regarding his background or his previous address. They have a baby born in 1945 and, at the present time, the husband lives with his wife at the Jackson Heights address.

The indices of the New York Field Division reflect a letter from the Detroit Field Division to New York, dated April 13, 1942 regarding a Mrs. RAE JAPPINEN. The information afforded by JOHN WILSON, representing the United States Army Air Force and stationed at the PACKARD MOTOR COMPANY, Detroit, disclosed to the Federal Bureau of Investigation in Detroit, a letter which he received from Mrs. RAE JAPPINEN of 167 West 102nd Street on March 1, 1942. 

The following investigation relative to FANNIE DAVIS was conducted by Special Agent L. MORRIS BEST on August 1, 1946. This party, who resides at 35 Hancock Place, New York City, is a contact of RAY ELSON, a subject of instant case.

The building at 35 Hancock Place, which is located in Harlen, is a dilapidated tenament. The name of DAVIS appears on the mail box along with the names of SLARK and BROWN, and according to the mail box, these people occupy apartment 2-V.

JERRY BOGGS and ABRAHAN PERHY, both colored, are superintendents or custodians of 35 Hancock Place, and serve other buildings in the immediate vicinity. They advised that all tenants or "lodgers" at 35 Hancock Place are colored. BOGGS advised that a Mrs. DAVIS, a woman about 65 years eld, lives in Apartment 2-W. This woman, whose first name is unknown to BOGGS, does not go to business but remains home most of the time. BOGGS also spoke of a man by the name of DAVIS in apartment 2-W. He was unable to advise whether this person was the son or a relation of the elderly woman named DAVIS. He stated that this man DAVIS was "a head superintendent for the government". BOGGS does not know where DAVIS works or what type of work he does or whether he is married, nor does BOGGS know any other persons in this apartment.

At the United States Post Office, Station J. 309 West 125th Street, LEO JOHNS, colored, a carrier, advised that the notations inside the mail box at 35 Hancock Street indicated the following persons resided in the apartment:

W. DAVIS F. ADAVIS JOSEPHAGLARK A. ARROWN

JOHNS does not know any of these people. However, he stated that he would attempt to ascertain the full name of the DAVISes, their place of employment and other information concerning them.

At Local Board #34, which covers the address of 35 Hancock Place, there was no record concerning a person by the name of DAVIS who resided at 35 Hancock Place.

JERRY BOGGS advised that SOLOMON SEIGAL, 872 Columbus Avenue, owns the building at 35 Hancock Place.

The following investigation relative to FANNIE DARELICH was conducted by Special Agent L. MORRIS BEST on August 2, 1946. This person, who resides at 120 West 105th Street, has been observed in the company of RAY and JOE ELSON.

JOSEPH MAYER, superintendent, 120 West 105th Street, advised that

PANNIE GARELICH and another woman by the name of LIFSHITZ, allegedly
sisters, moved into the building in October, 1942. Observation of the mail
box in this building indicates that the name of KATZ appears on this box
along with that of GARELICH and LIFSHITZ, MAYER stated that KATZ is allegedly the maiden name of LIFSHITZ. The apartment number that they occupy is 5-8
and rents for the summer at \$50. per month. He said that at the present time
a third party, a man by the name of JEROME REICH, resides in the apartment.
He has resided at this apartment since last summer and is allegedly the husband of FANNIE GARELICH. He supposedly moved into the apartment after release from the United States Service. He allegedly was discharged with the
rank of Sgt. and saw service in the European Theater of Operations. MAYER
said that all parties in the apartment go to business or are away from the
apartment considerably.

MAYER advised that he believes the former employment of GARELICH and LIFSHITZ can be ascertained from the T&J MANAGEMENT CORPORATION, 4396 Broadway, as they had to give background information on themselves at the time they moved into the apartment.

Mr. EDWIN WHITELAW or his secretary, Miss MAY, of 4396 Broadway, furnished the following information concerning the tenants. Mr. WHITELAW classified the tenants as being undesirable as complaints had come in from other tenants. He noted them as being "cheap" as they had remembered him at only one time when they gave him the sum of \$10. He was unable to furnish any other information concerning MANNIE GARELICH, stating that he knows nothing of her philosophy of life. He did stated that GARELICH was formerly with Miss RITTER and a Miss PANITSKY, alias Miss SPANIS in Apartment 2-8 and with a Mrs. WOLKOFF in Apartment 1-9, who is or wasin the cloak business.

Observation of the mail box concerning Apartment 1-9 indicated that in addition to the name of WOLKOFF the following names were listed: GILMORE, ROSENBAUM and Dr. S. A. GLADSTONE.

Credit and criminal records on FANNIE GARELICH and JEROME REICH have been requested.





Investigation has disclosed that EURZBAND is an acquaintance of RAY and JOE ELSON.

At 325 West 83rd Street, Mrs. THEIMA MOONEY, the superintendent, was interviewed and she advised that KURZBAND has resided in the apartment for approximately five years and that he presently occupies apartment 4-B with his wife and two children, Mrs. MOONEY is of the opinion that KURZ-BAND is an art teacher and is connected with Hunter College in New York City. His wife is named DIANA, according to Mrs. MOONEY, and she is employed by the Social Service Child Guardian Section on East 57th Street, New York City. She stated that the KURZBANDs are desirable tenants and that she had no decreatory information whatsoever about them. She added that the KURZBANDs have a maid inasmuch as both of them work. Mrs. MOONEY advised that at the present time Mr. and Ars. KURZBAND are at a summer camp in Saugerties, New York. The name of this camp, in the opinion of Mrs. MOONEY, is Camp Shagebark. Mrs. MOONEY stated that she believed that the KURZBANDs moved to their present address from an unknown address on East 92nd Street, New York City.

The records of Local Draft Board 745, New York City, reflect that KURZBAND registered under the name of TOBY KAEL KURZBAND on October 16, 1940 while residing at 53 East 97th Street. The telephone number listed at that date was AT 9-8315. KURZBAND indicated his birth date and place to be January 12, 1909, Chicago, Illinois; that his wife's name is DIANA and his employer is the Board of Education, New York City. His place of employment on this date was the Bronx High School of Science.

In his questionnaire filed with the Selective Service Board, KURZ-BAND listed his education as follows: Grane Junior College - 2 years; University of Chicago from which he received a Bachelor of Philosophy - 2 years and Columbia Teachers College where he received a Master of Arts in art education. He attended Columbia part time over a period of six years.

AURZBAND indicated his present job to be that of a teacher of art and mechanical drawing, that he has had eight years of experience in this profession and his salary from July, 1940 to June, 1941 amounted to \$2538. At the time of filing this questionnaire he indicated that his employer we still the Board of Education and his place of employment still the Bron.

School of Science. He indicated that he was engaged in other work of business and such to be supervisor in a Jewish Beligious School.

KURZBAND married on August 5, 1929 in Chicago, Illinois. His feely, in addition to his wife DIANA WROLIN, are his children as follows:

PAULA - born November 5, 1935
KAREN LINDA - born December 14, 1940

VIRZBAND indicated in his questionnaire that he had never been convicted of a felony; that from July, 1940 to November, 1940, his wife, who is employed, earned the sum of \$966, but that she resigned on the latter date in order to have a baby.

Information in the Selective Service file indicates that on July 20, 1945 he informed the Local Draft Board that he was then at Camp Vestover, Bantam, Connecticut, where he was acting as head counseler. He advised that he expected to be at this camp until Labor Day,

There is a communication in the file from HAROLD RAYER, 60 East 42nd Street, identified as President of Camp Westover, Inc., who wrote the Selective Service Board on February 25, 1944 inquiring if he would be safe in hiring KURZBAND as an educational director for the coming summer at Camp Westover. BAYER's letter indicated that KURZBAND was employed as an educational director at the camp during the 1943 season.

On March 29, 1943, KURZBAND informed the Selective Service Board in writing that his wife was last employed by the Jewish Social Service on ganisation as a social worker, case supervisor, and left this job last October 31, 1942 in order to take care of her children.

There is another communication in the file which indicates that since September of 1940 KURZBAND has been supervisor in the religious school conducted by the West End Synogogue of Jevish Education Committee of 1776 Broadway.

It was noticed that on July 1/ 1941 KURZBAND notified the Board that his address would be care of A. KUBIN. Woodburne, New York, until September 1, 1941.

There is no record in the indices of the New York Field Division with reference to TOBY KAHL KURZBAND.



This report further indicated that Mrs. KURZBAND opened a personal checking account on November 4, 1938 with the Chase National Bank, 149th Street Branch. The following investigation was conducted by Special Agent WILLIAM G. O'DONNELL on July 2, 3, 8, and 10, 1946.

The Washington Field Division by letter dated June 7, 1946, advised that HENRY HOLDSHIP WARF, who formerly resided at 629 West 115th Street, New York City, and who was born August 11, 1908 in Montclair, New Jersey, was a frequent contact of Subject REMINGTON, and also a contact of JOSEPH CREGG. They also advised that his mother is ALICE WARE of 310 Riverside Drive, New York City.

The records of the Credit Bureau of Greater New York were checked with negative results, regarding HENRY HAWARE.

The indices of the New York Office revealed the following information concerning HENRY H. WARE:

A report from in a letter dated October 27, 1943, entitled "Pro-Communist Instructors at Cornell University and City College", furnished information based on articles that appeared in the New York World Telegram from October 22, 1943, by FREDERICK WOLTMAN. Among the Russian Professors list at Cornell University was "HENRY H. WARE, Economic Analyst, European Unit, Department of Commerce, student for three years at Plekhanov Institute of National Economy in Moscow; author of articles on Soviet Economics and Agriculture".

New York Field Division indices further reveal a letter from the Little Rock Field Division dated May 13, 1942, regarding HENRY H. WARE. In this letter it was stated that HENRY WARE, last known to have resided at 620 West 166th Street, New York City, may be a Communist. He speaks Russian fluently and taught for three months during the summer of 1938 at Commonwealth College, Meana, Arkansas, which until closed was considered as a Communist school. He is alleged to have spent five years in Russia studying economics. He obtained his Masters Degree in Economics from Columbia University in 1941. His mother lived with him and she is alleged to be interested in Communistic, activities, particularly in regard to obtaining equality for negroes. In this letter the Subject was described as follows:

The New York indices also revealed that as of September, 1943, the Subject was an instructor at Corhell University, teaching "Russian-American Understanding".

Investigation at 629 West 115th Street and at 620 West 116th Street, New York City, failed to reveal any information concerning Subject's present whereabouts.

S. L. FINK, Manager, "The Master" Apartments, 310 Riverside Drive New York City, furnished the following information:

MRS. ALICE WARE has been living at this address since September 1942. She moved here from 629 West 115th Street, New York City. She is in her middle fifties and has two sons. One of her sons, whose first name he did not know, had recently returned from Russia and was residing with her. started living with her about June 15th of this year. He described this son as about 33 years of age, 5'9" in height, 140 pounds in weight, having dark brown hair and a very slender build. MR. FINK was contacted on two later occasions but he was unable to obtain the name of this son. He stated that he knew this son had been in Russia for the reason that MRS. WARE had on many occasions received mail from him postmarked in Russia. He advised that MRS. WARE maintains a bank account at the Corn Exchange Bank and Trust Company, venue D and 10th Avenue, New York City.

The following information was obtained from the Registrar's Office at Columbia University concerning HENRY HOLDSHIP WARE:

He was admitted to Graduate School at Columbia University in February, 1938, where he took courses in Political Science, and at that time he gave his address as 620 West 116th Street; New York City, and gave his mother's address as 310 Riverside Drive, New York City, He was born July 11, 1908 at Montclair, New Jersey. He graduated from Pomona College, Claremont, California, in 1932, where he received his AB Degree. He attended the Plekhanov

Institute of National Economy of the Peoples Commissariate on International Trade of the U.S.S.E. of Moscow, from August, 1933 to June, 1937. He received his M.A. Degree at Columbia University in 1939, having majored in Economics, and the title of his thesis was "The Problems of the Soviet Petail Store Manager". He listed as a close relative an aunt, MRS. ALEYS UNITS, RFD 1, Rockville, Commetticut.

WARE, and the following information was obtained:

In the past she has been members of the following organizations which are either Communist controlled or under Communist influence:

"Executive Council of People's Committee. Harlem Branch";

"American Peace Mobilizers";

"New York Conference on Inalienable Rights";

"League of American Writers";

"National Council of American-Soviet Friendship, Inc.";





The indices further revealed that on November 18, 1942, she attended a dinner for the "American-Russian Institute" at the Hotel Brewwoort, New York City. She is a well-known writer and wrote "Scorched Earth", which was reviewed in the Daily Worker on March 11, 1942. The indices further revealed that she was listed as a teacher in September, 1945, at the George Washington Carver School, which is a school for negroes. MRS. WARE has been mentioned on three occasions in the Daily Worker. On August 7, 1941, this paper stated that she had spoken at a lecture sponsored by the American Council on Soviet Relations at Manhattan Center. This paper also reported on July 4, 1943, she was one of the signers of a statement attacking anti-Soviet propaganda. On April 9, 1946, this paper stated that she was one of the signers of a statement which called for the cessation of propaganda for war with Bussia.

Reference is made to the letter from the Washington Field Office dated April 16, 1946 requesting investigation pertaining to Dr. DANIEL E. SCHNEIDER, Mt. Airy Road, Croton-on-the-Hudson, New York, telephotroton 767. The following investigation was conducted by Resident Agent Morman W. Philcox.

The Westchester County telephone directory lists SCHNEIDER on Mt. Airy Road, Croton and having telephone number Croton 3495. A check was made with Mr. B. K. TIMM, Manager of Westchester Lighting Company, Peekskill, New York who advised that according to his records SCHNEIDER rents a cottage from MICHELE CIMBALO, Mt. Airy Road. He has rented this since May 18, 1946. SCHNEIDER is presently renting Cabin No. 3 for the summer and rented Cabin No. 1 last year at this same place from May 25, 1945 to September 28, 1945. SCHNEIDER's New York residence was given as 110 East 87th Street, New York City. No neighborhood investigation was advisable at his summer address inasmuch as this neighborhood is completely Communistic and CIMBALO is Chairman of the Westchester County ALP and active in union and labor activities.

The Local Board No. 44 at 155 East 88th Street, New York City, indicates the following information as obtained by Special Agent Francis J. Gallant.

The records reflected that DANIEL EDWARD SCHNEIDER was a doctor by profession and had Order Number 472, registered with that local board. In his questionnaire he states that he was born February 26, 1907 at Cleveland, Chio, giving his wife, MRS. HELEN LOUISEKSCHNEIDER, as the person always knowing his whereabouts. He states that he was educated at the Adelbert College, Western Reserve University, and also at the School of Medicine at the Western Reserve University, having attended three years obtaining a BA degree and four years obtaining his medical degree. He listed his occupation as a neuropsychiatrist and also a psychoanalyst. He stated that he had been an assistant alienist at Bellevue Hospital from 1935 to 1939, and that he was married at Fort Lee, New Jersey on October 13, 1937. He also stated in this questionnaire that he contributes to the support of his father, ALEX SCHNEIDER, who lived at 11607 Tuscora Avenue, Gleveland, Chio. Information was also given that he had a daughter born September 29, 1941 at the French Hospital, 329 West 29th Street. He listed his income as approximately \$12,000, a year. At the Medical Society of the State of New York, it was determined that the subject presently resides at 110 East 87th Street and was Diplomate of the American Board of Neurology and Psychology and had lived at one time at 267 East 7th Street and also at 144 East 24th Street and 7 Park Avenue and was connected with the Bellevue Hospital.

The files of the New York Field Division were checked and #10 reflected that in the case entitled,

DR. SCHNEIDER was a member of a group of the Bellevue Hospital psychiatric division who distributed a papehlet entitled "I-Ray Among the Psychiatry Staff" up to about June, 1939. This pamphlet urged the readers to join the Communist Party and read the DAILY WORKER. Dr. SCHNEIDER frequently addressed the Hospital Employees Union of Greater New York, and was known as one of the leaders of a group who were alleged to have railroaded out Dr. GREGORY, the former Director of the Psychiatric Division who was dismissed in 1934. This report reflects that the Bellevue Hospital, Psychiatric Division, had been known as the center of Communist activities. The files also reflected that the "X-Ray Magazine" was published by the Belevue Unit of the Communist Party.



Reference is made to the teletype of July 3, 1946 from the Mashington Field office advising that the above subject was in New York City and that he may be able to be located through the UNRRA office in New York City and also that a surveillance should be placed upon it. Efforts to locate the subject at this time were negative and on July 12, 1946 the Mashington Field office advised that they had received information that the subject was staying at 19 Commerce Street which is the residence of his sister. They also advised of a telephone number Watkins 9-6976 as being the telephone number of his sister at that address. Investigation at this address failed to determine the whereabouts of the subject, and it was determined that the above telephone number was listed to Papopper, 257 West 14th Street, New York City, which is a concern manufacturing flags and medals. By use of a pretext. an attempt was made to determine whether the subject's sister might be employed at this address, however, this was met with negative results.

Reference is made to the telephone call from the Washington Field Division on July 22, 1946 advising that the subject was on his way to New York City via the Pennsylvania Railroad in Seat No. 3, Car 700, which was to arrive in New York City at 6:50 P.M., Daylight Saving Time. The subject was being surveilled at that time by Special Agent Robert Mc Kaslin of the Washington Field Division. Upon the arrival of the above mentioned train, this surveillance was taken over by Special Agents F. D. O'Brien and F. J. Gallant who surveilled the subject from the Pennsylvania Station to 19 Commerce Street, where no further activity was noted throughout the remainder of the evening.

HENRIETTA WEIGEL (husband, JOHN &) resides at 8 Bank Street, New York City; York City (1941), and formerly lived at 380 Bleecker Street, New York City; 29 Bank Street, New York City, and 42 Bank Street, New York City, all of which are in the vicinity of loth Street, New York City. Her business address was listed as GEORGE ARENTS, 511 Fifth Avenue, New York City. HENRIETTA WEIGEL was listed as being 35 - 40 years of age in 1941, and residing with her husband at 8 Bank Street for the past two years where they are renting a two and one half room apartment on the top floor at a rental of \$55 per month. She has been in the employ of Mr. ARENTS since January, 1941, and has a position of editorial worker, editing the trade book on the tobacco industry on a salary basis. Her income from this source was not disclosed, but was believed to be in fair proportions. Mr. ARENTS is President of the Intermetal Company, Inc., and the International Cigar Machinery Company, both of which have their offices at this address in Room 804. She is employed privately by Mr. ARENTS who is interested in the publication of this book.

Her husband was known to be in the employ of Donohue and Company and is a commercial artist by profession.

The Manufacturers Trust Company, 43rd Street, reports a special checking account for this party.

In view of the above information, it would appear that HENRIETTA L. WEIBEL is identical with HENRIETTA (Mrs. JOHN) WEIGEL, 235 West 13th Street, New York City, and is apparently the peyeon who is a contact of the KRANERS.

Reference is made to the letter from the Washington Field Division dated May 22, 1946, requesting an investigation at White Plains, New York, to identify one JONATHAN GOLDMANK, a possible contact of CHARLES KRAMER.

The following investigation was conducted by Special Agent Norman W. Philcox on June 17 and 18, 1946:

The records at the Westchester Credit Bureau, 161 East Post Road, White Plains, New Fork, revealed that JONATHAN EDWARD GOLDMARK, who is married to IRMA Z. GOLDMARK, resided, as of March 8, 1946, at 3324 N. E. 24th Avenue, Portland, Oregon. GOLDMARK was formerly from White Plains, New York.

He was recently released from the United States Navy, and prior to his enlistment in the Navy worked for the OPA at Washington, D. C. He is an attorney by profession. His father, CHARLES J. GOLDMARK, now deceased, lived at 66 Quinby Avenue, White Plains. His father and mother were both born in Brooklyn, New York. GOLDMARK is a graduate of Harvard University. He has an uncle, JAMES GOLDMARK, of Greenwich, Connecticut. An aunt of GOLDMARK is Mrs. LOUIS D. BRANDEIS, widow of United States Supreme Court Justice BRANDEIS.

The records of Local Draft Board #748, White Plains, New York, revealed that GOLDMARK was born on October 7, 1917 at Scarsdale, New Yorke He is described as follows:

He is a graduate of Harvard University Law School, and subsequent to his graduation from law school was employed by the OPA at Washington, D.C. on the legal staff and resides at 1253 37th Street, Washington, D.C., in care of R. Wy STRAUSS. He enlisted in the United States Naval Reserve on January 20, 1942 and was released to inactive duty on November 15, 1945, at which time he held the rank of Lieutenant, NSN 185981. During the time he was employed at the OPA, his immediate superior was Professor MILTON KATZ, who was a former professor at Harvard University Law School.



A review of the files of the New York Field Division reflects that in a report of Special Agent W. M. BENNETT, dated at New York on June 1, 1942, entitled, "JONATHAN EDWARDS GOLDMARK; OFFICE FOR EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT, SPECIAL INQUIRY", it was reflected that GOLDMARK was employed as a tennis counsellor at Camp Menatoma, Kent Hills, Maine, during the summers of 1939 and 1940. In this investigation, no evidence of any un-American activities was ascertained.

The records of the Credit Bureau of Greater New York, and of the Police Departments of White Plains and New York City, were checked with negative results. The neighborhood investigation was satisfactory.





DUNCÂN C. LEE (THEODORE ERENSON) CONFRENTIAL

The following information concerning THEODORE BRENSON, 19 East 59th Street, New York City is reported by Special Agent FRANCIS D. O'BRIEN:

Reference is made to the letter from the Washington Field Division dated April 23, 1946 wherein certain i armation was requested concerning THECDORE ERENSON, 19 East 59th Street, who had telephonically contacted DUNCAN C. LEE on 32 occasions between August 3 and August 6, 1945. The records of the New York Field Division were checked against the name of THECDORE ERENSON and were found to be negative. The Credit Bureau of Greater New York furnished the following information concerning the subject:

ERENSON is a Professor of Art at the College of Wooster, Chio and that he is employed in the capacity of a Visiting Professor of Art and sometimes acts as head of the Department. According to the records of the College, ERENSON has been employed there since September of 1943 at a salary of \$3600. The latest information available at the Credit Bureau is that ERENSON was employed by that College on February 21, 1945. The records also reflect that ERENSON's wife was a teacher located at 22 Earls Terrace, London, England. ERENSON lives alone in his apartment at 19 East 59th Street. It is a two room apartment in a two apartment house. ERENSON holds a fine reputation for honesty and he was recommended for reasonable credit. His bank reference is given as the Bank of Manhattan where he maintains a small personal checking account. ERENSON was reported not to be a citizen of the United States.

The records of the Immigration and Naturalization Service, New York City were searched by Special Employee Investigator WADE FULLER. The records reflect that on manifest \$14030 page 10 line 4 that ERENSON arrived in the United States on January 8, 1941 aboard the SS MARQUIS de COMILIAS sailing from Lisbon, Portugal December 21, 1940. The record further reflected that THEODORE ERENSON was 48 years of age in 1941, married, was an artist, reads and writes English, French, Italian, Russian and German. His nationality was given as Latvian and his place of birth was listed as Mitavo, Latvia. His passport was issued at Marseille on October 31, 1940. His last permanent address was given as 59 Froidebaux St., Paris, France and it was his first time in the United States. He was going to a friend named ARMAND LANDECK, 268 East 8th Street, New York City. He stated that he expected to remain in the United States permanently. The following description

The following investigation was conducted by Special Agent Gerald J. Flynn on July 16, 17, 18, 23, 1946:



Mr. BYARD advised that the above individuals lived on Spook Rock Road, Suffern, New York and that they came to Suffern approximately five years ago. They were formerly accempanted by a man whose last name was DENHI, but who is no lenger with the above two individuals. Mr. BYARD advised that it was his understanding that the correct spelling of Mrs. RICHARD HEFFNER's name should be HEFFNER. Pickard Mrs.

The following individuals were contacted regarding the above background information on LESTER O. NAYLOR and Mrs. RICHARD HEFFMER with negative results:

Information was developed that the above telephone listing is that of the Pan American Grace Airways, 135 East 42nd Street.

Under suitable pretext, it was determined that QUENTIN ROOSEVEIT was employed by the Pan American Grace Airways, however, what his position was was unable to be determined.

A check of the Social Register for 1945 of New York City reflected that QUENTIN ROOSEVELT was a Major in the United States Army, and listed his wife as FRANCES B. WEBB, and that he was a graduate of narvard University, Class of 1941. It listed his address as 5431 Wyangotte Street, Kansas City, Mo. It also reflected that his parents were former Brigadier General and Mrs. THEODORE ROOSEVELT, his mother being the former ELEANCR B. ALEXANDER.

A check of the above in WHO'S WHO reflects that Brigadisr General THEODORE ROOSEVELT was the son of the former president of the United States. It also listed QUENTIN ROOSEVELT as his son and also one, Lieutenant CORNELIUS ROOSEVELT of 2500 Q Street, Washington, D. C. as another son.

In the 1946 Social Register for New York, QUENTIN ROOSEVEIT's name appears and lists his residence as Oyster Bay, Long Island, New York, which is believed to be the home of his parents. The indices of the New York Field Division failed to reflect any information pertaining to QUENTIN ROOSEVELT.

The following investigation was conducted by Special Agent Robert E. Furcolow on June 21st and August 9th, 1946, and is predicated upon a letter from the Washington Field Division dated April 29th, 1946, which requested the background of HARRIS/LEFF, 2137 Wallace Avenue, Bronx, New York, and who was believed to have telephone number Underwood 3-3088.

HARRIS LEVY was contacted at this number by ROBERT T. MILLER, III, on November 9th, 1944.

On June 21st, 1946, Special Employee Investigator Wade Fuller obtained the following information from the files of the Credit Bureau of Greater New Yorks

HARRIS LEVI and his wife, ANNA resided at 2137 Wallace Avenue, Bronx, and he is an insurance broker at 225 Broadway, New York City. He is described as being about 50 years of age in 1944, and married, and has a small family. They reside in apartment 422 and have been living there since 1941. Prior to this, and since about July, 1937, they resided at 2136 Wallace Avenue, Bronx, which is under the same management as the present building. Before that, they lived for eight years at their present address, 2137 Wallace Avenue. HARRIS LEVI is an insurance broker and office manager at the business address of A. M. FISCH, 225 Broadway, New York City, a law office in Room 2815. LEVI has been office manager at this law firm for the past 30 years, and his income from this source could not be learned.

On June 21st, 1946, the Retailers Commercial Agency, 200 West 42nd Street, advised that they had no record of subject.

On August 9th, 1946, the records of Local Board 104, Public School 96, Waring and Olinville Avenues, Bronx, reflected that subject registered April 26th, 1942, born September 15th, 1890 at Boesttetouse (?), Russia, height 5: 5½, weight 156 pounds, blue eyes, gray hair, light complexion, phone number UN 3-3088, wife ANNA, employed A. M. FISCH, 225 Broadway.

The report of Special Agent Floyd L. Jones in the instant case dated January 28th, 1946, at Washington, D. C. advises that subject is a brother of JENNY ILLER, also known as Mrs. ROBERT TALBOT MILLER, Washington, D. C., and a brother of FLO LEVY. Also, that he stayed a few days at the MILLER household around Christmas, 1945, and was referred to as Uncle HARRY. He called one ANNIE at Underwood 3-3088, New York City, on December 28th, 1945, and stated that he would be home that evening.

Inasmuch as HARRIS LEVY appears to be related to the MILLERS, no further investigation is being conducted at this time.

Reference is made to a letter from the Washington Field Division, dated April 29, 1946, requesting background information on Mrs. CASILEAR COBB, 320 East 72nd Street, New York City, telephone Rhinelander 4-6353 and an individual named HARRIET CRANE. Referenced letter indicated that MILLER telephonically contacted HARRIET CRANE on January 12 and 13, 1945 at the number Rhinelander 4-6353.

The following investigation was conducted by Special Agent THOMAS J. BROWNFIELD on July 22, 25 and 26, 1946.

Mr. H. E. WINSTON of the A. B. Ashforth Real Estate Company, 12 East 44th Street; New York City, advised that Mrs. CHASILEAR COBB, also known as ANN McGIBBON COBB executed a lease for Apartment 5A, 320 East 72nd Street, New York City, on August 9, 1939. Mrs. COBB alleged to be the widow of CHASILEAR COBB and furnished a previous address of 1045 Park Avenue, New York City. Mrs. COBB listed no business affiliations and is described as being 42 years of age, blond and approximately 5'8" in height. She gave as a reference HENRY SUTHRIE, a lawyer at 55 Wall Street, New York City. A credit check by the A. B. Ashforth Real Estate Company determined that Mrs. COBB's net worth is approximately \$100,000 and she has a \$10,000 a year income from investments made by her late husband.

Mr. C. C. ERIANT, Superintendent at 320 East 72nd Street, New York City and an officer in G-2 during World War I, advised that Mrs. COBB is believed to be a native of Westport, Connecticut. Allegedly her late husband CHASILEAR COBB owned considerable property in and around Westport and at the time of his death left investments which guaranteed Mrs. COBB a somewhat over \$10,000 a year income for life. Mr. BRIANT stated that insofar as he knows, Mrs. COBB has no business connections in New York City but he recalled that during the winter of 1941 and 1942 Mrs. COBB, with another person whose identity he did not know, opened a gown shop in Houston, Texas. Apparently this business venture was not successful because after 1942 Mrs. COBB made no further reference to her business

Mrs. ERIANT further advised that Mrs. COBB has a 17 year old daughter PATRICIA who spends most of her time at a girls school somewhere in Virginia. Mrs. COBB has a reputation of drinking rather heavily and holding numerous drinking parties in Apartment 5A.

Residing with Mrs. COBB in Apartment 5A is a man named BITTNER, who is now connected with North Eastern Airlines in New York City. Mr. BRIANT stated that BITTNER alleges to be a relative of Mrs. COBB but he thinks that this allegation is not true. BITTNER's first name is unknown to Mr. BRIANT but in 1942 he became a member of the Air Transport Command and as such was assigned to duty in Newfoundland. He returned to New York City in 1945 at which time he became affiliated with North Eastern Airlines and again assumed residence with Mrs. COBB.

Mr. BRIANT stated that Mrs. COBB has sub-leased her apartment one time, that being during the fall and winter of 1944 and the early part of 1945. Allegedly Mrs. COBB was residing alone in Apartment 5A, an 8 room apartment, and she decided to take up residence at 38 East 78th Street in a smaller apartment. Accordingly, through a broker in the A. B. Ashforth Real Estate Company, the apartment was sub-leased to a Mr. EDWARD EXCRANE of Redbank, New Jersey. Mr. ERIANT could furnish no description of Mr. or Mrs. CRANE except to state that they were middle aged couple and very good tenants.

Mrs. COBB had at one time furnished a forwarding address of 2036 West Gray Street, Houston, Texas and also c/o WILIE, Purdy Lane, Darien, Connecticut to Mr. BRIANT.

Through the records of the Credit Bureau of Great New York Special

The state of the state of the time MILLER made telephone calls to HARRIET CRANE at Rhinelander 4-6353 the apartment having this telephone had been sub-leased by Mrs. CHASILEAR COBB to EDWARD M. and MARGARET CRANE and it is likely that HARRIET CRANE is a member of this family.

The following investigation was conducted by Special Agent WILLIAN G. O'DONNELL on June 26, 27, and July 12, 1946.

The Washington Field Division by lever dated June 1, 1946, advised that JAMES R. NEWMAN on November 21, 1945, sent a telegram to DR. LEO SZILARD, King's Crown Hotel, West 116th Street, between Amsterdam Avenue and Morningside Drive, New York City, the text of this telegram reading:

*CONDON AND I DEFINITELY EXPECT YOU WASHINGTON FRIDA

MORNING.

from

JAMES NEWMAN

MR. BOND, Manager, King's Crown Hotel, 120 West 11 Ath Street, New A York City, advised that DR. SZIIARD had lived at this hotel, except for several trips to Chicago, for the past few years. He stated that DR. SZILARD is a noted scientist and was a close friend of Professor EINSTEIN. He further stated that Agents of Military Intelligence had contacted him repeatedly concerning DR. SZIIARD. and had made an extensive investigation of him.

The indices of the New York Field Division revealed that DR. LEO SZILARD is mentioned in the "Cinrad" case. The following information was obtained from this file:

On October 21, 1944, the following information was obtained

DR. LEO SZILARD, with alias, LEO/SPITZ, who is a D.S.M. metallurgist, having contractual relations with the Metallurgical Laboratory in Chicago, is presently residing at the King's Crown Hotel, 420 West 116th Street. New York City. This individual is the man who first formulated the idea and theory that is responsible for the entire D.S.M. experiments. He was born in Budapest, Hungary, but claimed German citizenship. He came to the United States in approximately 1940, when he conceived the idea upon which the D.S.M. projects are based. He contacted Professor ALBERT SINSTEIN, who was also impressed with the possibilities of his theories, and accompanied him to Washington, D. C., where he conferred with the President. This conference resulted in the beginnings of experimentation now known as the D.S.M. SZIIARD is believed to be acquainted with BORIS REGEL, who is the Subject of active investigation by the Military Intelligence Office. It was believed that SZILARD knew PRECEL in Europe but no evidence of his contact with PRECEL in the United States had been obtained.



It was also ascertained from the "Cinrad" file that in February of 19h6, DR. SZHARD was residing at 1155 East 57th Street, Chicago, Illinois. At that time he was one of the key persons of the Chicago atomic bomb project. He was investigated in connection with the security of the atomic bomb project for the reason that he had alleged that security precautions at the project slowed up the atomic bomb production. In 19h2 he wrote to BORIS PRECEL, giving a history of his part in the atomic bomb project and referring to the part played by FERMI, and he also referred to some processes. He is reported to have come from Germany to the United States via England.







The records of the West 111 Street Branch of National City Bank reflected that KLEIN opened a special checking account in June, 1942, and transferred to a regular savings account in September, 1943. The records further reflected that KLEIN joined the staff of CARAVEL FILMS, INC., in June, 1942, and formerly resided at 200 West 108 Street, New York City. He listed DR. MELVIN BRODSHAUGH, care of EPSI FILM CORPORATION, 1841 Broadway, as a reference.

The records of Local Board 35, 250 West 90 Street, reflected that ALEXANDER KLEIN bears Serial No. 1604 and Order No. 2664. He was born in Hungary, November 12, 1918 and claims he is a citizen of the United States. KLEIN attended City College of New York for five years, obtaining a B.S.S. degree and at one time was employed by the W.P.A. New Reading Materials, 500 Park Avenue. KLEIN's father, ANTON resides at 1070 Ocean Yiew Avenue, Brooklyne

ELEIN has been a free lance writer, writing children's fiction and, until recently, was employed by CARAVEL FILMS, 730 Fifth Avenue, New York City, where he was classed as a writer and director, doing research and writing scripts for, as well as, directing combat training pictures for the United States Navy and the United States Army Air Corps. He received one hundred thirty-five dollars a week at CARAVEL FILMS.

The Belective Service files contain a letter, dated February 9 1944, addressed to the Local Board from ROBERT C. McKEAN, president of CARAVEL FILMS, 750 Fifth Avenue, explaining KLEIN's duties; and evaluating the material on which KLEIN was working at the time. In substance, the letter stated that training films deal with very specific, important duties of officers and men in the Armed Forces. According to McKRAN, the films were used in training because the Army and Havy had discovered that the use of such films speed up training anywhere from twenty to sixty-five per cent. It was stated that the Havy films on which KLEIN was working were combat training films of a confidential nature which were requested by the Navy. According to the letter the subject matter of these combat films is a military secret because just knowing that films are being made on various military subjects might in itself be of use to the enemies of the United States. The letter went on to state that the films are not only used to train new men and new personnel but also to train experienced personnel in new methods, in the use of new tactics, or strategy, which is constantly developed.

Mr. GHORGE CHAMBERS, superintendent of the building at 510 West 110 Street, advised that KLEIN spends most of his time typewriting in his apartment and, according to CHAMBERS, he is known throughout the apartment building as a free lance writer.

The indices of the New York Field Division and the records of the Credit Bureau of Greater New York, Inc. were negative in the name of ALEXANDER RIZIN.

With regard to the two individuals who contacted ALLAN ROSENBERG at the Wardman Park Hotel on May 17, 1946 the following information concerning their identity is herewith set forth:

The Credit Bureau of Greater New York furnished the following information on Dr. LEO/MAYER of 1155 Park Avenue, New York City: Wis mile's name is EDITH and he formerly resided at 300 Central Park West, 147 West 79th Street and 150 West 79th Street. He maintains a bank account with the National City Bank branch at 96th Street and Park Avenue, where a satisfactory relationship exists and the account is non-borrowing. Dr. MAYER is described as age 64, and has resided at 1155 Park Avenue since October, 1937 in a 12 room apartment.

This residency was checked with the real estate agent operating the apartment, who advised that Dr. MAYER is a personal friend of the owner of the building and pays a rent in the neighborhood of \$4,000 to \$5,000 a year. He bears a good reputation, and in view of the relationship with the owners of the building, only a cursory investigation was made at this source, in view of the nature of the case.

The Credit Bureau of Greater New York further advised that prior to his present residence the subject resided for six and one-half years at 300 Central Park West, where he paid over \$6,000 a year rent. He has been a physician for over 25 years and is considered one of the best bone specialists in this country. He maintains an office at 1150 Fifth Avenue, and has done so since 1938, which office rents for \$3,000 a year. He is a graduate of Physicians and Surgical College in New York as of 1909, a member of the County and State Medical Societies, a Fellow of the American Medical Academy, a member of the Academy of Medicine, and is on the staff of New York Hospital for Joint Diseases and Post Graduate Hospital.

Investigation at his office at 1150 Fifth Avenue revealed that three additional names are listed on his office, namely H. SEIDENSTEIN, GODFRED GERMANSKY and B. KLEIGER. It was determined that the last two mentioned individu have just recently returned from the Army and are associated with him in orthoped surgery. No information was available on H. SEIDENSTEIN, except that he was formerly associated with Dr. Frances



The records of Consolidated Edison Company were checked and reflected that MAE A. OCCONNOR, 193 East 76th Street, was employed in August of 1940 as Secretary to DR. ERDWIN, 140 East 54th Street. This was all of the information available at this source.

The records of the Credit Bureau of Greater New York were also checked with negative results.

Mr. THOMAS FITZGERAID, owner of the building at 193 East 76th Street was interviewed and advised that MAEXO'CONNOR had been a tenant at this address for some time and it was his understanding that she was employed by a Dr. LEMPERT somewhere on 74th Street. He was unable to give any information as to background of MAE O'CONNOR other than that she lived in Apartment No. 7 and was an elderly lady who went to business every day.

Through a check of the New York telephone directory, it was determined that DR. JULIUS TEMPERT was located at 119 East 74th Street which was also the address of the LEMPERT INSTITUTE OF ATOLOGY. Through pretext, it was determined that MAE O'CONNOR was employed at this institute and had been employed there for the past year and a half.

A review of the files of the institute reflected no information pertaining to MAE O'CONNOR, however, it was determined that in the instant case the name of DR. FRANK/ERDWURN had been mentioned in connection with HELEN TENNEY. A check at the address of DR. ERDWURN, 156 East 52nd Street, was made under a suitable pretext and it was determined that DR. FOGGAR, CLARA FAGAN, Mrs. CLARA SALKIND FAGGEN, Mrs. HAROLD A. FAGGAN, CLAIRE SALKIND, CLARA, and GRANDMA. Her imsband is HAROLD A. FAGGEN, also known as HAROLD FOGGEN, and HAROLD.

The report of Special Agent Jerone W. Brower entitled "Labor Research Association, Inc.; Internal Security - C"dated March 2nd, 1945 at New York, advised that the Labor Research Association, Inc., 80 East 11th Street, and 799 Broadway, was founded in 1927 by ROBERT W. DUNN, ALEXANDER TRACHTENBERG, GRACE HUTCHINS, ANNA ROCHESTER and SOLON DeLEON, all connected with the Communist Party, and that

and that this association exchanges information with the Library of Social Science and the Academy of Sciences, U.S.S.R., and that it also furnishes weekly articles for the DATLY WORKER and the Jefferson School.



The following information concerning the contacts and activities of Dr. A. B. WEINSTEIN was made available through the assistance of who is in a position to supply information concerning the activities in and around the office of Dr. WEINSTEIN at 20 East 53rd Street, New York, New York.

on July 16, 1946 this informant advised that Dr. WEINSTEIN attempted to contact HERBERT MAY, who has been identified in previous reports as an individual who in the past has been in contact with Russian officials in the United States and who is himself Vice President of the Union Switch Company, Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. On this same date this informant advised that DONALD AMTER, son of ISRAEL AMTER, an official of the Communist Party in New York City, contacted the office of Dr. A. B. WEINSTEIN and made an appointment to be at the office of Dr. WEINSTEIN for dental treatment at 12:30 PM on that date. On this same date, ARTHUR STROMBERG, a friend of Dr. WEINSTEIN, contacted BETT! HEART, Secretary to Dr. WEINSTEIN, and advised her that since Dr. WEINSTEIN would be unable to make the trip to Quebec, Canada on the weekend of July 27, 1946 that he would make reservations for Dr. WEINSTEIN and his wife for the weekend of August 2nd. According to the information obtained at that time the reservations were to be made through the Colonial Airlines.

On July 19, 1946, this informant advised that ARTHUR STROMBERG contacted BETTY HEART and told her that the reservation for Dr. A. B. WEINSTEIN and his wife had been made definitely for August 2, 1946 and reservations were made at that time for the doctor and his wife to stay at the Chateau Frontenac in Quebec, Canada. At that time ARTHUR STROMBERG advised BETTY HEART that RUTH and RICHARD CONTE, the movie actor, would be present in Quebec, Canada during the visit of Dr. WEINSTEIN. This informant further advised that Dr. WEINSTEIN would be leaving with his wife LENORA from LaGuardia Airport on the 7:30 AM Eastern Standard Time plane, August 2, 1946 and would proceed to Montreal, Canada, where he would change to a plane operated by the Canadian Pacific Airline and fly direct to Quebec, Canada. This informant also stated that Dr. WEINSTEIN would return on August 5, 1946 by plane, arriving at LaGuardia Airport on the evening of that date. According to the informant the purpose of the trip was in the form of a weekend vacation for Dr. WEINSTEIN and his wife and they were to visit with RICHARD CONTE and JAMES CAGNEY, movie actors, who are engaged in making a motion picture at Quebec, Canada.



It was ascertained that the apartment house at 501 West 121st Street, New York City, is known as the Kings College Club and is owned by the trustees of Columbia University and managed by HCRACE S. EIY, 76 William Street, New York City. Mr. and Mrs. MILIARD WALTER MASTAY occupy apartment 21 at 501 West 121st Street. The management, however, had no record of Mrs. DANIELS or a Mrs. BAILESON.

The following investigation was conducted by Special Agent GEORGE J. SULLIVAN on July 3, 9, 10, and 22, 1946:

Through Mr. JOSEPH CAMPBELL, who is employed by the trustees of Columbia University, 12th floor, 76 William Street, New York City, it was ascertained that the HASTAYs have occupied apartment 21 at 501 West 121st Street since August 1, 1945. According to information available to Mr. CAMPBELL, HASTAY was employed on May 17, 1944 by Columbia University to work under a contract for the Office of Scientific Research and Development. He was classed as "a mathematical statistician performing analyses of combat and equipment problems. He was also engaged in designing proper and statistical mathematical procedures for the collection and interpretation of data. He also supervised and assisted with analyses". Mr. CAMPBELL pointed out that the branch of the Office of Scientific Research and Development at Columbia University on behalf of the applied mathematics panel, National Defense Research Committee of the Office of Scientific Research and Development, carry out for the Army and Navy certain urgent and important research directly connected with combat tactics and equipment classified as secret under the Espionage Act.

The records further reflected that HASTAY terminated his employment on December 21, 1945 but was carried on the payroll as a consultant until June 1, 1946 when he ceased duty entirely.

The World HASTAY was born on September 8, 1916 at Enid, Montana, received a B.A. Degree at Reed College, Portland, Oregon, and did graduate work in economics and statistics at Stamford Univer ity from September, 1941 to September, 1944. He was employed while at Stamford by the Office of Scientific Research and Development where he was acting instructor in economics from May, 1943 to April, 1944. Prior to that time HASTAY was employed by the Oregon State Highway Department from September, 1937 to September, 1939. From June, 1940 to September, 1940 he assisted in statistical and financial studies sponsored by the United States Bureau of Public Roads in Oregon.

HASTAY is a registrant of Local Board No. 3, Portland, Oregon, where he is classified 2-B-F, bearing Order No. 1163.

At the present time HASTAY is employed by the Lincoln School, an elementary school attached to Columbia University.

During the period that HASTAY was employed on the aforementioned project, his wife, HELEN, also worked as a clerk for Columbia University on the same project.

The personnel security questionnaire of HELEN WHEELER HASTAY reflected the following information:

MISS E. N. BAWN, auditor, Hotel Albert, furnished the following information:

fifteen years. As far as she knew, he had no regular occupation although she has seen him frequently use a typewriter which he has in his room, and for this reason she thought he might be a writer. CONFIX Street, New York, New York. He is described, according to the Selective Service resord, as 517" in height, weight 136 pounds, having wide gray eyes, gray hair, and a ruddy complexion,

HELEN McCULLOUGH, room chambermaid on the 5th floor of the Hotel Albert, where MR. BULLOCK resides in Room 510, advised that MR. BULLOCK was very quiet, that he never has any visitors with the exception of a young girl, whom she thought was his niece. He is very regular in his habits, leaving early in the morning and returning around six at night. He has a large number of books in his room and he does a considerable amount of work on his typewriter. Further investigation by this Informant at the Hotel Albert revealed that BULLOCK seldom has ever used the telephone for outside calls, and he received very little mail. He maintains a checking account at the Chase National Bank, 40 West 34th Street, New York City.

This Informant contacted MR. MEERS, Chase National Bank, 40 West 34th Street, New York City, who gave the following information:

BULLOCK has been a depositor in this bank since 1919. maintaining a normal and satisfactory account, the average balance ranging between two and four thousand dollars. He is a mechanical engineer by profession. BULLOCK had frequently given MR. MEERS pamphlets on various proposals, theories, and commentaries, subscribed to and composed by him, the latest pamphlet being entitled "Uranium and Gold". Three other pamphlets written by MR. BULLOCK, furnished to MR. MEERS, were: "A Physical Science Issue-A National Science Foundation Set-up By Legislation is Ill-advised", "Relation of Gold Cartel to Free Enterprise", and "Engineers Advise Congress". MR. MEERS advised that political theories by MR. BULLOCK tended way to the left. MR. MEERS also stated that in a column by Pearson and Allen, "The Washington Merry go-Round", which appeared in the Daily Mirror for December 10, 1938, it is stated that WILLIAM E. BUILOCK, former Assistant Secretary of the American Society of Mechanical Engineers", was the leading insurgent in a group of engineers who were objecting to the administration of the American Society of Mechanical Engineers by the then incumbents.

This Informant further advised that on October 1, 1945, BULLOCK was employed by the New York Ordnance Division of the War Assets Administration Empire State Building, at a salary of \$4,500 per year. He is a naturalised United States citizen. MR. BUILLOCK is also the writer of a book entitled "A Word of Warning to Professional Engineers", which was published in New York City in 1932
