
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
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

A reliable Government official has stated that during the hearings of the Senate Committee on Atomic Emergy on April 8 and 9, 1946, held in Washington, D. C., Byron S. Miller was present for the purpose of presenting legislation suggested by the Federation of Atomic Scientists in Washington, D. C. It was determined at this time that Miller was working under James R. Weman. Newman was also present at these hearings and appeared to be on the staff of the Committee, possibly as an associate of Dr. Edward U. Condon. The eriginal draft of legislation submitted by Miller on behalf of the Federation of Atomic Scientists contained numerous loopholes inasmuch as it restricted any violations of law to the wilful communication or transmission of secret data and based the penalty upon the degree of intent, also making the crime dependent upon the successful commission of the offense to the point where an actual advantage is secured by a foreign nation.

Byron Miller is a known acquaintance of Milliam Malter Remington, who has been identified as a Soviet espionage agent who acted on cenair of the Soviets while an employee in the United States Government from approximately 1941 to 1944. (65-56402-1166)

commonly uses the name of GEORGE SILVERMAN, had left New York via Flight 806 of the Northeast Air Lines destined for Boston. Agent POVELL furnished a description of SILVERMAN and requested that surveillance be made to ascertain his contacts while in Boston.

GEORGE SILVERMAN arrived at 12:00 noon August 3 via Northeast Air Lines and proceeded to the room of his son, RICHARD A. SILVERMAN, Lowell House, C-23, Harvard University. He was met at the airport by Special Agents JOHN LEAHY and JOHN MEHOS and was observed taking the subway to Cambridge and subsequently arrived at Lowell House. For the information of the Bureau, the Lowell House is one of the largest Harvard dormitories, housing approximately 400 students. It is a four-story brick structure which takes in an entire city block. The interior quadrangle or court can be reached through multiple entrances from the dormitory proper, or through four main gates on four different streets. RICHARD A. SILVERMAN occupied C-23, which was on the second floor overlooking the front of the building and also with one room facing the Harvard Gymnasium. RICHARD SILVERMAN is actually occupying a suite of rooms designed for two students. This includes two bedrooms, a bath, a study room and a living room with an interior hall connecting the . four rooms. In this position, SILVERMAN is capable of observing any automobiles which may be conducting a surveillance upon him.

GEORGE SILVERMAN and his son on August 3, 1946, were observed by the aforementioned agents dining at 13-A Hudson Street, Boston, Mass., which is the How Yen Hon chinese restaurant. As a matter of interest, on Sunday, July 21, 1946, SOLOMAN ADLER, whose activities in Boston were reported by Special Agent LAWRENCE G. HEALEY under date of 7/26/46, accompanied by RICHARD SILVERMAN, visited this same Chinese restaurant at 13-A Hudson Street, Boston, Mass. · According to the agents who observed the activity of ADLER at that time, it was obvious from their actions that they had not been to this restaurant before. It was noticed that they walked past the How Yen Hon and entered another restaurant, apparently to determine the location of the How Yen Hon. Agents advise that this restaurant is of very low class, apparently frequented only by the Chinese. During the hour and a half ADLER and RICHARD SILVERMAN stayed there, a Chinaman stood outside the restaurant and appeared to act as a lookout. As they emerged from the canopy-covered entrance, ADLER appeared to be shaking hands with someone. No one appeared to have sat at the table with them.

The Boston Street Directory lists 13-A Hudson street as the Yen Hon Restaurant. However, no name appears over the entrance.

On the same day, August 3, 1946, GEORGE SILVERMAN and his son vere observed calling at 1215 Blue Hill Avenue, Mattapan, Boston, which is the home of DAVID SILVERMAN. (This individual has previously been reported by special Agent BRENTON S. GORDON of Boston 6/12/46). Apparently finding no one home, GEORGE SILVERMAN proceeded on foot to 54 Westmore Road, Mattapan, which is the residence of PHILIP SLEPIAN, also identified in the report of Special Agent BRENTON S. GORDON dated 12/21/45 in the GREGORY case. They returned to Lowell House at 10:30 p.m.

Inasmuch as no instructions had been received concerning the type of surveillance to be conducted, a teletype was forwarded to the Bureau, Tashington Field, and New York City on August 4, 1946, advising that a discreet spot check surveillance was being maintained unless advised to the contrary.

On August 4, 1946, Agents LEAHY and MEHOS observed SILVERMAN and his son taking a walk at 11:30 a.m., at which time the son pointed to the building at 19 Ware Street, Cambridge, which has been previously identified as the home of LAWRENCE RICHARDSON, at which location SOLOMAN ADLER stayed over the weekend of July 20, 1946.


At 1:30 p.m. on August 4, SILVERMAN proceeded alone by street car to the home of DAVID SILVERMAN, 1215 Blue Hill Avenue, Mattapan, where he remained approximately 45 minutes. Then he proceeded to 19 Balsam Street, Mattapan, accompanied by an individual believed to be DAVID SILVERMAN. At this address, he remained for approximately one-half hour, after which he returned by subway to Lowell House at 4:45 p.m.

At 19 Balsam Street, Dorchester, there are listed five individuals in the telephone book and City Directory as follows:

PHILIP MALTZ, laborer, telephone GENeva 0746, Apartment 1. There is no record in the Boston Field Division concerning this individual.

THEODORE, SAMUELS, electrician, telephone GENeva 4593, Apartment 2; also no record.

IRVING D. LEVENSOHN, bookkeeper, telephone GENeva 6685.
Apartment 2. No record except a letter from the Boston
Office dated 4/7/41 sending an application for the position
of Special Agent (A) in answer to his request. It was
stated therein that LEVENSOHN was a graduate of the Bentles
School of Accounting and Finance.



SAMUEL DORFMAN, also spelled DORFSMAN, U. S. Army, telephone GENeva 6659, Apartment 3; no record.

HARRY SILBERT, salesman, telephone GENeva 7922, Apartment 3. There is an Internal Security - G file, 100-9377, in the Boston Office on one HARRY SILBERT, 144 Seaver Street, who may be identical. There is no derogatory information in the file.

At 5:00 p.m., Special Agents CLEMENT A. O'BRIEN and JOHN DESMOND observed SILVERMAN and his son dining at the Oxford Grille, 38 Church Street, Cambridge, Mass., returnin; to Lowell House at approximately 6:30 p.m. At 10:30 p.m., SILVERMAN and his son went for a walk to St. Clair's Restaurant in Harvard Square, returning to Lowell House at approximately 10:45 p.m.

Under date of August 5, 1946, T-1 advised reporting agent he believed GEORGE SILVERMAN had left Lowell House, and suggested T-2 be contacted for verification. However, it was ascertained T-2 would not be available for interview until the following day.

On August 6, 1946, Special Agent JOHN MEHOS and the reporting agent contacted T-2, who advised RICHARD A. SILVERMAN had told her the previous week that his father was going to stay at the Lowell House for the weekend. Agents had occasion to enter the suite of rooms occupied by RICHARD A. SILVERMAN during the course of this interview, and it was definitely ascertained that no one had slept in the extra bed the previous night. The gladstone bag of the father, GEORGE SILVERMAN, was not in this suite of rooms. T-2 advised that she was not working at Lowell House until Monday morning and had not observed GEORGE SILVERMAN. However, she had observed that the extra bed had been used over the weekend.

Accordingly, a teletype was forwarded to the New York and Washington Field Divisions advising that GEORGE SILVERMAN had probably returned home, and the surveillance at Boston was terminated.

Stops which have been placed at railroads and airlines by reporting agent on August 3, 1946, were removed.

RICHARD A. SILVERMAN

Under date of July 22, 1946, the Tashington Firld Division requested background information concerning the person in whose name is listed the telephone number ELIot 9326.

Inquiry at the local telephone company reflected that this number is assigned to a pay station at Lowell House, Harvard University, Cambridge, Mass. Special Agent JOHN A. MEHOS interviewed the superintendent of Lowell House, DENNISON SEXTON, who advised that most of the students living there have telephones available near their rooms and rarely find it necessary to use the pay station. It is the only booth in Lowell House and is located in front of the dining hall. SEXTON pointed out that when this telephone rings it cannot be heard by any of the students in their rooms. Consequently he suggested that anyone calling that number from outside would probably do call at an appointed time.

Attention is called to the report of Special Agent LAWRENCE G. HEALEY, dated July 26, 1946, at Boston, in the GREGORY case. Of possible significance is the fact that when SOLOMAN ADLER was in Cambridge, Mass., on July 20, 1946, he attempted to contact one RICHARD A. SILVERMAN at the Lowell House and it was later learned that SILVERMAN, who is a student at Harvard Umiversity, gave his residence address as 2395 Fifth Street, N. W., Washington, D. C.

Under date of August 1, 1946, Special Agent JOHN A. MEHOS checked the records office at Harvard University, which reflected that RICHARD A. SILVERMAN is taking the following subjects at Harvard University:

Physics 33, Wednesdays, 2:00 p.m., 256 Jefferson Hall Slavic 11-A, Mondays and Fridays at 11:00 a.m. and Mondays and Thursdays, 2:00 - 3:30 p.m. at Seaver A, Harvard University

During the time Agent MEHOS and reporting agent observed RICHARD SILVERMAN's suite of rooms, it was noticeable that his reading material did not include Communistic or other inflammatory reading. His entire library, which was considerable for a student, included either texts or English classics.

BESSIE WHITE BLOOM, aka Mrs. HENRY H. BLOOM

The following investigation was conducted by Special Agent WILLIAM J. McCARTHY at Boston, Mass.:

The 1946 telephone directory for Boston and Brookline lists HENRY H. BLOOM, 59 Baxter Road, Brookline, telephone LONgwood 6639.

The 1944 City Directory of Brookline lists HENRY H. BLOOM, 59 Baxter Road, Brookline, as a Commission Merchant. His wife is listed as BESSIE BLOOM. Two other individuals are also listed as residents at 59 Baxter Road, a son, DAVID ALAN BLOOM, U. S. Navy, and JOSEPHINE BLOOM, student, probably a daughter.

The 1945 Boston City Pirectory lists HENRY H. BLOOM, President of Dench & Hardy, a concern engaged in being Commission Merchants, handling fish.

The files of the Boston Field Division reflect that during the investigation of the case entitled "LOBSTER INVESTIGATION, AUTITRUST," it was established that HENRY H. BLOOM was the President of Dench & Hardy, a concern engaged as Commission Merchants handling lobster exclusively, the concern doing a gross business of above \$200,000 a year. The concern was formed in 1909. In 1945 it became a partnership between HENRY H. BLOOM and H. B. DIBBINS. It was ascertained during this investigation that HENRY H. BLOOM's son, SAMUEL H. BLOOM, was a Commission Merchant dealing in fish and lobster. He owned the concern of Crocker & Winsor.

the New Haven Field Office advised the Boston Field Office that a DAVID ALAN BLOOM, 59 Baxter Road, Brookline, Massachusetts, had filed an application for entrance to Yale University for 1943. He stated in his application that he was born December 3, 1925, in Boston, and that his father's name was HENRY HYMAN BLOOM, born in England, and entered the United States in 1892, and was a naturalized citizen. He gave his mother's name as BESSIE WHITE BLOOM, born in England, entered the United States in 1889, and was a naturalized citizen.

The records of Immigration and Naturalization Service, 73 Tremont Street, Boston, Massachusetts, were checked relative to both HEWRY HYMAN BLOOM and BESSIE WHITE BLOOM with negative results.

ABRAHAM WHITE

Reference is made to the letter from the Washington Field Division captioned "HARRY D. WHITE," requesting the listing for telephone number Wellesley, Mass., 3782. This letter further advised that on April 15, 1946, HARRY WHITE contacted an individual believed to be one A. WHITE, 41 Tepsan Road.

Reporting agent ascertained that this telephone number is listed to ABRAHAM WHITE of 41 Tennyson Road, Wellesley, Mass., which is apparently the individual in question. In this connection, there is submitted previousestigation of Special Agent JOHN F. DESMOND of the Boston Field Dias follows. This investigation was conducted at the request of the

Field Division in a letter dated April 8, 1946, which advised that Dr. ABRAHAM WOLFSON, a contact of HARRY WHITE, had contacted an unknown man at Circle 7-8000, room 1928, New York City, and that it had been ascertained that this room was assigned to ABRAHAM WHITE and wife, who were registered there as coming from Boston, Mass. WHITE was connected with Barnstead Still & Sterilizer Company of Boston.

A check of the indices of the Boston Field Office failed to disclose any information on ABRAHAM WHITE.


Confidential Informant T-3 advised that ABRAHAM WHITE resides at 41 Tennyson Road, Wellesley, Mass., and previously lived at 11 Perkins Square, Jamaica Plain, Mass., and at 42 Alexander Road, Newton Highlands, Mass. He moved to Wellesley in May, 1941. This informant further advised that WHITE is Vice President of the Barnstead Still & Sterilizer Company, Inc., 2 Lanesville Terrace, Forest Hills, Mass. He has been associated with this concern for approximately ten years and previously was President of Manhattan Stores, Inc., located at 270 Massachusetts Avenue, Cambridge, Mass.

According to this same informant, WHITE maintains a checking account with the First National Bank of Boston, Jamaica Plain Branch, which usually has a balance in three figures.

The records of the Department of Corporations and Taxation, State House, Boston, Mass., disclosed that the Barnstead Still & Sterilizer Corporation was organized in 1916 for the following purpose:

"To carry on the business as principals or agents of manufacturing, buying, selling, and dealing in water stills, sterilizers, and hospital and manufacturers' supplies and any other business which may seem calculated directly or indirectly to enhance the value of or render profitable any of the company's property or rights or to be conducive of any of the company's objects."

The balance sheet reflected a surplus of \$124,252.36, and total assets and liabilities of \$195,901.18.

The birth of ABRAHAM WHITE on December 28, 1904, at Boston was verified at the Bureau of Vital Statistics, State House, Boston, which record disclosed also that his father was JACOB WHITE, his mother, ESTEER NOVICK, both having been born in Russia. It has also been ascertained by reporting agent that JACOB WHITE was indicated as being a merchant.

Although the names of only two sons, NATHAN and SAMUEL, appear in the Everett City Directory, and only HARRY D. WHITE in the subsequent Boston City Directories, there is a strong probability that ABRAHAM WHITE and BESSIE WHITE BLOOM.

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

The Children's Book Shop sells all types of children's toys, books and novelties, and caters particularly to children from the infant stage to eleven years of age. The property is well maintained and in excellent physical condition and is assessed for \$7100.00 at the Assessor's Office of the City of Rochester, in the name of BEATRICE DeLIMA MEYLRS.

A review of the records in the County Clerk's Office, Monroe County, Rochester, under the section of Individuals Doing Business Under An Assumed Name, reflected the following information: That on October 24, 1933, the name of the Children's Book Shop, 293 Alexander Street, was registered by MADELINE SHEILBRUNN and BEATRICE DeLIMA MEYERS. 
