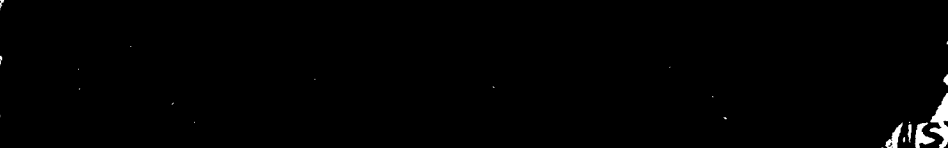

It will be noted above that ADLER is presently in Nanking, China, and not Chungking, China, as previously shown. This is due to the fact that the government of China has been moved from Chungking to Nanking.

The following investigation was conducted by Special Agent W. RAYMOND WANKALL.

On August 21, 1946, the office of the Air Transport Command furnished information reflecting that ADLER had not disembarked from the plane on which he left this country at Shanghai, China, on August 15, 1946, as previously reported, but at Nanking, China. He boarded the plane August 21, 1946, and flew on it to Shanghai for a few days thereafter returning to Nanking. On August 28, 1946, the plane again flew from Nanking to Shanghai but ADLER this time was not aboard. It was subsequently learned that the plane returned to Washington, D. C., on September 7, 1946. ADLER was not aboard at that time having last disembarked at Nanking, China.

Mr. JOEL E. BAUGH, executive assistant manager, Hotel Washington, made available a list of telephone numbers called by ADLER during his stay at the hotel. There is set forth below a list of these numbers and the subscribers thereto, together with any information concerning such subscribers contained in the Washington Field Office files. The date on which the telephone call was placed has been indicated in parenthesis following the telephone number.

This individual has been mentioned previously in this investigation as having been in contact with ABRAHAM GEORGE SILVERMAN. It has been noted he was reported to the Washington Field Office in February, 1942, as being a communist and having attended several communist meetings. However, investigation conducted by the Metropolitan Police Department failed to bear out the allegations.

It was noted WHITE was born September 13, 1903, at Boston, Massachusetts, of Jewish parents and was married and working for the Treasury Department as an administrative assistant in the Monetary Research Department at \$3800 per year.

In the report of Special Agent LAMBERT G. ZANDER dated June 17, 1946, information is set out on pages 14 and 15 concerning the Intercontinental Corporation, 1822 Jefferson Place, N. W., Washington, D. C., exporters and importers. It is noted DAVID WHITE, age 42 in 1945, married, and formerly an administrative assistant to HARRY DEXTER WHITE in the Treasury Department, was reported to be secretary and manager of this corporation. Other officers of the firm included SERGE RIPS.

ROSENBERG, a subject of this investigation; and one MORRIS GLASSER who may be a relative of HAROLD GLASSER, a subject of this investigation.

According to the record maintained at the Hotel Washington ADLER talked to MARY at this number on August 1, 1946, who said

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she would "be there Sunday," and who gave her address as 403 Timber Lane, Falls Church, Virginia.

In the report of Special Agent LAMBERT G. ZANDER dated August 29, 1946, it was related that ADLER, SOL LISCHINSKY, three unidentified men, and two unidentified women had dinner together, then spent the afternoon at Haines Point on Sunday, August 4, 1946. ADLER spent the evening of that day at the residence of FRANK COE, 1918 North Roosevelt Street, Arlington, Virginia. A pretext telephone call placed to Falls Church 2676R reflected there is no such number, but the telephone number Falls Church 2676 is listed to RICHARD S. HATKEY, address unknown.

Information contained in the Washington Field Office files in the Amerasia Case reflects JOHN CARTER VINCENT is chief of the Chinese Section of the Far Eastern Division, State Department. A review of the Bureau files discloses the following information relative to the name of JOHN CARTER VINCENT, apparently identical.

WALTER ROBERT ROEMER, a passenger arriving on the SS Gripsholm from the Far East in 1942, had the name JOHN VINCENT in his address book. When ROEMER was questioned he stated JOHN VINCENT was a Harvard graduate who went to China and became enamored with the East. He later married a girl in Shanghai and took her to Manila. He left Manila a short time thereafter leaving his wife in that city. Upon his return to China, he was employed as a clerk in the U. S. Consulate and according to ROEMER lived in constant fear that his wife would join him.

JOHN CARTER VINCENT accompanied former Vice President HENRY WALLACE on his trip to China during the summer of 1944. WALLACE's other associate was OWEN LATTIMORE who has been closely associated with groups and organizations subject to considerable communist influence.

One JOHN CARTER VINCENT was appointed as acting special assistant to the administrator of the Foreign Economic Administration in November of 1943.

According to an article which appeared in the Times Herald May 21, 1944, JOHN CARTER VINCENT, the chief of the Division of Chinese Affairs, State Department, was scheduled to accompany Vice President HENRY WALLACE on his trip to China and Siberia.

Special Agent FLOYD W. BROWN on December 14, 1945, reported in a speech by the Honorable CARL T. CARTER of Nebraska on November 28, 1945, it was suggested that certain federal employees should be investigated by the FBI (Appendix Congressional Record for 28 of November, page A-5537). One of those named was JOHN CARTER VINCENT. From a highly confidential source, it was determined by Agent BROWN that a JOHN CARTER VINCENT was employed in the office of LEO T. CROWLEY in January, 1941. It was believed this person may be identical with the VINCENT mentioned in CARTER's speech. (u)

It should be further noted that the report of Special Agent LAMBERT G. ZANDER in the Gregory Case dated August 16, 1946, at Washington, D. C., set forth information furnished by [redacted] to the effect that VERA WITTE, divorced wife of BORIS WITTE, brother of HELEN SILVERMASTER, one of the subjects in this case, sent a letter to HELEN PETROVNA in which she requested HELEN to send her the address of one JOHN CARTER VINCENT, as well as his title. She stated she did not know where he was employed but it seemed to her it was in the State Department. VERA advised HELEN further GREG or LUD would know the address and she would be very grateful if HELEN would write her at once about it. She explained she was too lazy at that time to relate why she needed his address. b2 b7D

On August 2, 1946, a Mr. JENKINS of Executive 6400 listed to the U. S. Treasury Department left a message at the hotel for ADLER to call him. There has been no previous mention of a Mr. JENKINS of the Treasury Department during the course of this investigation.

During his stay at the Hotel Washington, ADLER placed three telephone calls to TR O-7874, Cambridge, Massachusetts. [redacted] refer

On August 2, 1946, a highly confidential source at the Hotel Washington made available information from the personal papers and effects

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of ADLER which were in ADLER's room at that time. Material of possible value to this investigation is being set forth below. Whenever mention is made in this material of an individual's name, the Washington Field Office files have been checked under such name and information contained therein set forth.

[A sealed envelope addressed to Mrs. LAURA WALKER, USS Embassy, Nanking, China, bearing return address "O'CONNELL, 8320 16th Street, Silver Spring, Maryland." on March 1, 1946, furnished information reflecting that O'CONNELL, whose full name is JOSEPH J. O'CONNELL, is general counsel of the Treasury Department, and he was handling matters concerning the English loan for that department at the time. No information is available in the Washington Field Office concerning Mrs. LAURA WALKER.]

Memorandum to Mr. SOL ADLER dated July 29, 1946, and indicated as having been sent from Mr. O'CONNELL. This memo reads as follows:

"BOB CHAMBERS, chief counsel of Customs, said to stop at the port where you leave and get a certificate of registration No. 4,655. (It cannot be filled out here in Washington.) If you can prevail upon them to give you an extra copy, you might give the extra copy to Mrs. WALKER for use when she enters the country, although she should not need it as the camera has on it that it was made in the United States."

Telegram addressed to SAUL ADLER at the Washington Hotel and signed ANNE COPELAND. The telegram advises that ANNE COPELAND had already sent dresses to girls in Washington from Altman's, and that she hoped ADLER would catch up with them. There is no record in the field office concerning ANNE COPELAND.

Envelope addressed to Mr. S. ADLER bearing return address S. C. WANG, Chinese Supply, 2311 Massachusetts Avenue, N. W., Washington, D. C., and containing a letter dated July 26, 1946, reading as follows:

"Dear Sol:

"I am leaving with you three letters that I wish you would take to China for me. Enclosed in two of them are two of those novelty pens.

"There is a third pen in a box which I wish to present to you with my compliments. Best wishes.

Sincerely yours,

S. C. WANG"

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There is no record concerning S. C. WANG in the Washington Field Office. This name was also checked under the name of ~~SHOU CHIN WANG~~ which is believed to be the full and correct name of Mr. WANG. SECRET

A box containing an Eversharp C. A. repeater pen and a calling card of Dr. ~~SHOU CHIN WANG~~ which had written on it in ink the name of Ir. S. ADLER, 416, Hotel Washington. It is believed this is the gift pen mentioned by Dr. WANG.

Statement of the Riggs National Bank of Washington, D. C., for the account of Mr. SOLOMON ADLER for the period June 24 to July 22, 1946. This statement showed a balance on the opening date of \$11,289.60. A balance on closing was \$8,620.80. Two deposits were made during the month, each for \$217.10. Checks and withdrawals were made in the amounts of \$2,000, \$500, and three withdrawals of \$300 each.

A letter in a sealed envelope addressed to A. S. ~~CHASE~~, Esq., care of American Consulate General, Mukden, and containing no return address. In connection with this letter and others carried by ADLER, it should be noted it has been previously reported that ADLER was designated in December, 1944, as an official courier for the U. S. Government.

A letter in a sealed envelope addressed to Mr. and Mrs. LAUREN ~~CASADY~~, U. S. Treasury representative, U. S. Treasury Office, Shanghai, China, and bearing return address ~~ROFLICH~~, 8428 Piney Branch Court, Silver Spring, Maryland. The envelope contained a notation "Kindness of SOL ADLER."

Through a check of the telephone directory, it was determined that the addressor's full name is H. J. ~~ROFLICH~~. There is no record on this individual in the Washington Field Office. The report of Special Agent FLOYD L. JONES in this case dated at Washington, D. C., on January 11, 1946, sets forth the following information on pages 119 and 120 concerning LAUREN ~~V. CASADY~~:

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"GREGORY SILVERMASTER was stated to be an acquaintance of LAUREN W. CASADY, a reported member of the Washington Committee for Democratic Action, and it was stated by Miss DOROTHY M. ~~X~~WELLS, director of research of the U. S. Maritime Labor Board, that CASADY appeared to be a protege of GREGORY SILVERMASTER and LOUIS ~~X~~BLOCH of California. It is noted that CASADY was reported by the same source to be a contact of both HARRY ~~X~~BRIDGES and THOMAS ~~X~~RAY. CASADY was an analyst in the Division of Monetary Research, U. S. Treasury Department, and in February, 1942, was assigned to the U. S. Embassy, London, England."

A letter in a sealed envelope addressed to Mrs. L. ~~X~~CASADY bearing no return address. This letter was likewise noted, "Courtesy Mr. ADLER."

Letter in a sealed envelope addressed to FULTON ~~X~~FREEMAN, Esq., American Consul, Peiping China, bearing return address Foreign Service of U. S. of America and notation "By Fouch."

A slip of paper bearing the name "CIGBE ~~X~~COE, D. C. Attorney," concerning whom there is no record in the Washington Field Office files.

Letter in a sealed envelope addressed to PHILIP D. ~~X~~SPROUSE, Esq., American Embassy, Nanking, China, bearing return address J. K. ~~X~~FENFIELD, F. E., Department of State, Washington 25, D. C.

On April 12, 1946, as has been previously reported in this case, furnished the following information concerning one JAMES K. ~~X~~FENFIELD, possibly identical with J. K. FENFIELD mentioned on this envelope. *e u*

HELEN SILVERMASTER contacted Mrs. CLIFFORD ~~X~~MacAVOY who stated her husband was starting on PAC work for the UE and had extensive district organization work to do. Some inquiry was made as to the background of JAMES K. FENFIELD. Mrs. MacAVOY indicated ROBERT LAMB spoke highly of him in connection with some activities of the Tolson Committee. FENFIELD apparently had recently become engaged to Mrs. MacAVOY's cousin, and she wondered if her cousin ought to have gotten herself engaged to someone who was just remotely liberal. There was some question whether FENFIELD was remotely liberal or was "good old solid State Department." *e u*

investigation by the Washington Field Office at that time reflected the Institute was organized to promote better relations between countries bordering on the Pacific, and that SUMNER WELLES, then Undersecretary of State, addressed an Institute meeting in Washington in April, 1943, and [REDACTED]

Special Agent HARRIS H. HUSTON reported ROSE YARDUMIAN had dinner on April 10, 1945, at the La Salle du Bois Restaurant with Lieutenant and Mrs. ANDREW E. ROTH, and Mr. and Mrs. DAVID KARR. She was reported to live at 2615 University Place, N. W., telephone Decatur 5938, with one RUTH DAVIDSON and CATHERINE PORTER. It is to be noted Lieutenant ANDREW E. ROTH at that time was under investigation as a subject of the Amerasia Case.

On August 23, 1946, Agent WANNALL checked the marriage license records in the Municipal Building under docket 604, page 414. It was found application for license No. 279,914 was filed by DOROTHY FOX RICHARDSON on April 23, 1945, indicating she and SOL ADLER planned to get married. DOROTHY FOX RICHARDSON reported she was 26 years old, had not been married before, and her residence was in Cambridge, Massachusetts. A return was made on the application indicating that she and ADLER had been married by Honorable GEORGE D. NEILSON on April 27, 1945, at the Municipal Court.

The following information concerning subject ADLER was furnished by the highly confidential source, previously referred to, on August 2, 1946.

ADLER was issued diplomatic passport 6,946 which was attested November 10, 1942, and which stated ADLER was Treasury attache to the Embassy of the U. S. of America at Chungking, China. The passport described ADLER as being six feet, having light brown hair, gray eyes, and as having been born in England August 6, 1909. The passport originally expired May 10, 1945. On July 10, 1945, it was extended to July 10, 1946, and on July 5, 1946, it was extended to July 5, 1948.

A review of information furnished by [REDACTED] reflects on March 9, 1946, informant reported NORTON E. LONG, at that time the newly appointed assistant administrator in charge of program requirements, National Housing Administration, told HARRY MAGDOFF, a subject in this investigation, that he knew SCHLOMER ADLER in New York in 1936 when ADLER first came to the United States and was working under the WPA. LONG said ADLER tells jokes to CHLING KAI-SHEK and the latter loves them. LONG said he himself thought SOL was wonderful and he was all for him. Informant said MAGDOFF stated SOL was another one of those guys who might not be good in an operating job

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but was a terrific "think" guy. ^{to 6} LONG remarked he didn't know whether or not ADLER had any general position any more as "the fire that was there back in 1936 doesn't seem to burn quite so strongly now." MAGDOFF said it did. He explained ADLER was quite bitter when he came back (from China) the first time.

During the period July 14 to August 6, 1946, while ADLER was in Washington he was in contact with Lieutenant Commander HAROLD W. JACOBSON, 2017 O Street, N. W.; he was at the home of FRANK COE, 1918 North Roosevelt Street, Arlington, Virginia, during an evening when an automobile owned by ALBERT C. SEIRE, 3215 Macomb Street, N. W., was parked in the driveway; he was in contact with ARTHUR W. STUART of 8425 Woodcliff Court, Silver Spring, Maryland, and in contact with JOSEPH SILVERMAN, 2500 K Street, N. W. The nature of these contacts has been set forth in the reports of Special Agent LAMBERT G. ZANDER at Washington, D. C., in this matter dated August 16, 1946, and August 29, 1946. Information developed concerning these four individuals is set forth below under the contact's name.

ALBERT C. SHIRE

The report of Special Agent W. D. CRONIN dated at Washington, D. C., April 1, 1942, entitled "ALBERT C. SHIRE, Director, Technical Division, U. S. Housing Authority, Federal Works Agency; Internal Security, Hatch Act" sets forth the following information.

SHIRE's name was included in the Dies list of government employees allegedly engaged in un-American activities as a member of the Washington Committee for Democratic Action. [REDACTED] b7D

[REDACTED] Investigation failed to disclose any subversive or un-American activities. On interview, SHIRE refused to answer questions concerning his membership in the Washington Committee for Democratic Action. Investigation reflected SHIRE was born August 28, 1896, at Atlantic City, New Jersey. His legal residence was listed as 16th Congressional District, New York. He attended Stevens Institute of Technology from 1914 to 1918 receiving an M. E. degree. His previous employment was shown as follows:

STUART is SL 4447. However, in view of the similarity in names and telephone numbers, it is believed the notation appearing in the address book may apply to ARTHUR W. STUART, 8425 Woodcliff Road, Silver Spring, Maryland.

On August 17, 1946, [REDACTED] reported that a person identifying himself as TIMMY COLLINS invited ALGER, PRISCILLA, and TONY HISS to have dinner at his place on Sunday, August 18, 1946. The HISSES agreed to drive to his house in the morning, stay for dinner, and leave in the mid-afternoon. TIMMY, in giving directions how to get to his place, advised PRISCILLA to drive out the Defense Highway from Bladensburg, Maryland, Peace Cross 4 and 3/4 miles to the Lanham sign, turn left at sign, and take middle gravel fork to the end of the road, his house being the last one on the right side. It should be noted these directions are the same as the directions to reach the house of HENRY HILL COLLINS, Jr., except a right turn must be made at the Lanham sign instead of a left turn since it is not possible to make a left turn at the sign. It is believed TIMMY gave wrong information as to this turn, and that it was actually someone from subject COLLINS' house who invited the HISSES to dinner. The identity of TIMMY COLLINS is not yet known.

Under date of August 13, 1946, the Bureau furnished the following information concerning HENRY HILL COLLINS, Jr.

This office was advised that HENRY COLLINS presently occupies room 37 at the State Department building with a number of other individuals, and he was brought to the State Department from the War Department by General HILLDRING. COLLINS and his group are working in connection with administration of American occupied areas in Europe. It was further advised that in the course of his official duties HENRY COLLINS has access to information concerning the control and repatriation measures in the handling of displaced persons in Europe. It has been observed that COLLINS has been asking for reports, records, telegrams, etc., which are not directly connected with his work but which concern the use of force employed by the U. S. Government for the return of Soviet nationals who are under American jurisdiction in Europe. COLLINS has asked for other information concerning the relations

of the United States with Soviet Russia which does not directly concern his work but which information would be of extreme use to anyone concerned with the problem of American Soviet relations. It was pointed out although HENRY COLLINS is not an employee of the State Department, being apparently a War Department officer, he does occupy an office in the State Department building and has access to State Department information. He is the husband of SUSAN B. ANTHONY, III.

In connection with SUSAN B. ANTHONY, III, it is recalled that when JOHN RICHARD LINDSAY, chief of the broadcasting unit of the Office of International Information and Cultural Affairs, State Department, was arrested on June 13, 1946, while attending a rally at the Watergate in Washington, Mrs. SUSAN B. ANTHONY, according to information received by the Washington Field Office through a confidential source, [REDACTED]

Mrs. L. ABERNATHY, Apt. 2-A, 153 Ivanhoe Street, S.W., Washington, D.C. was interviewed under pretext and advised that she was a neighbor of JOANNE ELIZABETH ANTHONY and DANIEL S. ANTHONY. She stated that they had lived at 153 Ivanhoe Street, but had left Washington on August 8, 1946, for Muncie Indiana, after subletting their apartment until December. She advised that Mr. ANTHONY had only recently been given an honorable discharge from the United States Army where he had been stationed at Camp Lee, Virginia. According to Mrs. ABERNATHY he had secured a good position with some welfare group whose headquarters are in Washington and he is at the present time working in Muncie, Indiana. She stated that Mrs. ANTHONY is the secretary to Congressman GEORGE E. OUTLAND of California and that she had accompanied her husband to Muncie where she will stay for awhile and she will then continue on to California to assist Congressman OUTLAND in his re-election campaign.

She advised that the ANTHONY'S had sublet their apartment to persons whom she did not know until December. She stated, however, that the ANTHONY'S might return early in the fall.

The records of the Anacostia Post Office at Anacostia, District of Columbia, reflected the following change of address made on August 8, 1946 by Mr. and Mrs. DANIEL S. ANTHONY from 153 Ivanhoe Street, S.W. to 405 South Walnut Street, Muncie, Indiana, until December, 1946.

She came to Washington from Antioch College, Yellow Springs, Ohio. He came to Washington from Easton, Pennsylvania, where he lived with his mother. JOANNE is employed by the Alien Property Custodian as an economist, previously employed by O.P.A. from October 22, 1942 to January 20, 1943.

She also worked four months in the office of Lend Lease. He is a lieutenant in the U. S. Army on duty at Ft. Sam Houston, Texas. He entered the service in 1940 from his former employment as a salesman and personnel manager with the American Research Company of Easton, Pennsylvania. Her father is Captain F. R. OTTE on duty overseas with the U. S. Army. Her father was born in China. Her mother is in charge of the American Red Cross at Ft. Bragg, N.C.

The Metropolitan Police Department records failed to reflect any information regarding JOANNE ELIZABETH ANTHONY nee OTTE or DANIEL S. ANTHONY.

A pretext call made to the office of Congressman OUTLAND in the House Office Building, revealed that DANIEL S. ANTHONY is now in Muncie, Indiana, and that his wife, JOANNE ELIZABETH, who is a secretary to Congressman OUTLAND is with him. He is employed by the Southern Conference for Human Welfare, whose main office is in Washington, D.C.

Reference is made to the report of Special Agent LALBERT G. ZANDER dated August 16, 1946 which reflects that according to [REDACTED] a letter was addressed to F. GARANIN b2 b7D from STEPHEN H. FRITCHEAN, The Christian Register, 25 Beacon St., Boston, Massachusetts.

The Boston Field Division has advised that FRITCHEAN is editor of the Christian Register and director of American Unitarian Youth. He resides at 56 Hancock St., Boston and maintains an office at 25 Beacon St., Boston, Mass. He is reported to be continually identified with pro-Soviet and communist activities.

On April 1, 1945, he spoke on the subject, "Who Are

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"The Enemies of American Soviet Friendship." His wife FRANCES has contacted ANNA BURLAK of the communist party of Massachusetts regarding the contemplated suit against the Hearst Newspapers in Boston at which time Mrs. FRITCHEAN agreed to solicit financial backing for this suit.

Since January, 1944, he served in the United States Army and now holds the rank of Corporal. He maintains a banking account at the Hamilton National Bank, 14th and G Streets, N. W. He rents an apartment at 3721 39th Street from McLean Gardens. His wife is reported to be employed by Senator KILGORE in the United States Capitol at Washington, D. C.; however, her name does not appear on the rolls in Senator KILGORE's office. KILGORE's personal secretary advised the credit agency that she knew of no one by that name. The report reflected that he came to Washington from 540 West 123rd Street, New York City and has since resided at the above address. He was employed by F.E.A. from February 13, 1943, as an Economic Analyst at \$3200 per annum until he was drafted into the Armed Forces in January, 1944.

Original Source

The records of the Credit Bureau, Washington, D. C., contained a credit report dated December 20, 1945, which reflects that MAYNARD GERTLER and his wife, ANN, reside at the same address as set forth above. They formerly resided at 1950 Calvert Street, N. W., from February, 1943, renting a room in the home of Mrs. H. M. BYERLY. He was in the United States Army for two years. He owns a farm in Washington, Virginia. His nearest relative is Mr. H. GERTLER, 4850 Rosslyn Avenue, Montreal, Canada. He is employed by the Interim Intelligence Division in the State Department and was formerly with the Office of Strategic Services as an Economist. He was appointed to the State Department on November 8, 1945. Prior to going into the Armed Forces, he was employed by the Board of Economic Warfare, having been appointed on May 5, 1942. His wife is employed by the Sub-Committee on War Mobilization under Senator KILGORE, at the Senate Office Building and was appointed September 19, 1943. She receives \$2980 per annum and formerly was a student at Columbia University, New York City.

The following investigation was conducted by Special Agent ROBERT W. McCASLIN:

The mail cover on Mr. ALGER HISS, 3210 P Street, N.W., for the period of August 1st to 30, 1946 was negative.

~~_____~~ b2. b7D advised that FRISCILLA HISS, wife of HISS, was in contact with Mrs. ROBERT BOWIE on August 1, 1946. Mrs. HISS invited Mrs. BOWIE to the HISS home on August 2, 1946.

Mrs. HISS was in contact with MELINDA HALL and in their discussion commented about a book on child psychology. MELINDA suggested that FRISCILLA could obtain this book from White's Book Store and there-by patronize PHOEBE. FRISCILLA'S comment was that "She didn't realize that she would be doing the family any good by going there" but added, "that it is always fun to go in there anyway."

On August 7, 1946, HELEN PROVINSE, wife of JOHN H. PROVINSE, 215 Spring Street, Chevy Chase, telephone Wisconsin 9003, contacted Mrs. HISS and inquired if Mrs. HISS belonged to the League of Women Voters. Mrs. HISS stated that she did not but that she always has been a "well wisher". HELEN then advised that she was going to be Chairman of the Minority Committee this fall and that she wanted FRISCILLA to work on this Committee this year. FRISCILLA advised that she would if she had time; that she had a part-time job at the Potomac School where her son TONY would be enrolled. HELEN mentioned that she was particularly interested in having FRISCILLA or a steering committee of about eight people.

On this date, Mr. ALGER HISS advised Mr. SCOTTY RUSTON of the New York Times about the basic ideas of the United National Charter and the developments since the organization went into operation.

It was determined through the informant on August 9, 1946 that the HISS' had enrolled TONY in the MARJORIE WEBSTER Junior College at 16th and Columbia Road, N.W.

It was further determined by the informant that Mr. HEYWOOD EASTER WOODS of Baltimore, Maryland was in contact with ALGER HISS and that he advised ALGER he was going to the Philippine Islands for the War Department as an Administrative Officer of Property and Supply in the Ordnance Department working in Manila and the West Pacific. WOODS mentioned that he wished to have a passport and that he might get to China if he had any time off. WOODS said that he had been

cleared through the Overseas Branch of the Secretary of War's Office by a fellow named HAROLD E. ~~HEATH~~, who is a Senior Recruitment Officer in the Secretary of War's Office. WOODS said he told ~~HEATH~~ if he ever needed a friend to call on ALGER HISS.

On August 10, 1946, the informant advised that ~~ALI~~ ~~RESUR~~ (phonetic) contacted ALGER HISS and advised ALGER that he was in Washington for a few days and was staying at the Shoreham Hotel. They arranged to have a luncheon engagement at the Metropolitan Club on 17th and H Streets, N.W. on August 16, 1946. ALI mentioned that his wife and baby are in California and that he had been spending the winter between London, Damascus, Arabia, and Cairo.

The informant advised that ~~PRISCILLA~~ HISS called on DONALD ~~HISS~~ on August 12, 1946 and invited him to dinner on that date.

On August 14, 1946, according to the informant, ~~SIGMUND~~ ~~TIMBERG~~, 2215 42nd Street, N.W., contacted PRISCILLA HISS and advised that on her husband's insistence he was calling her. ~~TIMBERG~~ stated he would call Mrs. HISS after he returned from New York. The informant also stated that at a later hour on this date, ~~MARC~~ ~~MOORE~~ called upon Mrs. HISS and advised that the ~~MOORES~~ would be at the HISS' for dinner at approximately 7 P. M. that evening.

Stephenson HISS []
On August 15, 1946, the informant advised that Mr. ~~ADLEY~~ ~~STEPHENSON~~ (phonetic) was in contact with ALGER HISS. ~~STEPHENSON~~ (phonetic) mentioned that he was in town to see Mr. ~~WENDELL~~ ~~BERGE~~ of the Department of Justice concerning an anti-trust suit. HISS and ~~STEPHENSON~~ agreed to have a luncheon engagement the following day.

Informant stated that on August 17, 1946, ~~TIMMY~~ ~~COLLINS~~ contacted Mrs. HISS and invited her and the family to the ~~COLLINS'~~ for the following day. ~~TIMMY~~ stated that his home was four and three fourths miles out on Defense Highway from Bladensburg Peace Cross.

Informant advised that on August 30, 1946, ~~FRANK~~ ~~WENDIRCK~~ (phonetic) contacted PRISCILLA HISS. In their conversation they mentioned ~~DON~~ ~~RANNELLS~~, who, according to PRISCILLA, was on his way from Okinawa to the Harvard Graduate School and that he was to stop off at the HISS' on August 21, 1946.

On August 21, 1946, according to the informant, FERDINAND KEIN (phonetic) of the Washington Post contacted ALGER HISS and sought help on a story that the former was preparing on the United Nations about the United States ultimatum to the Yugoslavian Government.

The informant also stated that on this date, DAVE ROPER, who was connected with the United Nations Assembly, was in contact with ALGER HISS and that they discussed the Yugoslav matter and the substance of what should be released to the press, particularly procedural rules. On August 23, 1946, informant advised that HERSCHEL JOHNSON, United Nations Assembly, contacted ALGER HISS and requested ALGER HISS to prevail upon EASTON ROTHWELL (phonetic) not to resign from the Assembly until it is completed.

On August 24, 1946, WILDER FOOTE, of the United Nations Assembly, contacted ALGER HISS and discussed with him the Ukrainian complaint against Greece. FOOTE advised HISS that he would receive a complete text of the complaint later.

The informant advised on August 24, 1946 that HERSCHEL JOHNSON contacted ALGER HISS. They discussed the Yugoslav matter and both agreed that it looked favorable. JOHNSON then tells HISS that he thinks the Russians are more realistic than they are credited with being sometimes, although he thinks they are quite unscrupulous in attaining their own political ends. JOHNSON also expresses sympathy for Greece and thinks that they have undergone cruel injustices. HISS agrees. JOHNSON inquired of HISS if he had been able to persuade EASTON ROTHWELL (phonetic) to refrain from resigning. HISS stated that ROTHWELL said he would be guided by their arguments if his remaining on with the Assembly was really necessary. JOHNSON then asked HISS what has been done about the European Liaison Officers to which HISS replied that CHARLES YOST (phonetic), who had just returned from Siam, had been appointed political officer at the Assembly. JOHNSON agreed that YOST was an excellent man.

The informant advised that several people endeavored to contact HISS and family who were absent from their home on the 28th, 29th and 30th.

Informant advised on August 2, 1946, DOROTHY KAPLAN, wife of IRVING, spent most of the day contacting senators on behalf of the Southern Conference for Human Welfare in connection with the memorial funeral services which were being held at Lincoln Memorial for the four negroes killed the preceding week at Monroe, Georgia. DOROTHY KAPLAN was seeking telegrams from several senators which she wished to be read at the service. Among the senators whom DOROTHY contacted were Senator MURRAY of Montana, Senator TAYLOR of Idaho, Senator KILGORE of West Virginia, Senator WALSH of Massachusetts, Senator WAGNER of New York, Senator GUFFEY of Pennsylvania, and Senator TUNNEL. *qu*

Informant also mentioned later that date DOROTHY KAPLAN contacted Mrs. BELLAY RODMAN at the Southern Conference for Human Welfare and made available to Mrs. RODMAN the list of senators whom she had contacted. *qu*

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DOROTHY stated she was unable to call the rest of the senators and congressmen who were on the list that was given her, and at that time DOROTHY was put in contact with ~~ETHEL~~ MACHINIC who took over the task of calling the remaining senators and congressmen. *qu*

The informant advised on August 3, 1946, DOROTHY KAPLAN endeavored to contact SOL LISCHINSKY at Fairfax Village and SOL ADLER at the Hotel Washington. According to the informant, DOROTHY desired to invite ADLER and LISCHINSKY to her home that evening for dinner. DOROTHY did not locate LISCHINSKY but she did locate ADLER and she and ADLER had dinner together that evening. *qu*

On August 7, 1946, informant advised that BEADIE VAN TASSEL contacted DOROTHY KAPLAN at her home and in conversation with DOROTHY mentioned she spent the preceding night at "headquarters" in connection with counting ballots. She told DOROTHY, "You know, we won in Alexandria." *qu*

DOROTHY KAPLAN contacted AMELIA PERAZICH later that date, according to informant, who advised in their discussion it was learned that AMELIA's husband GEORGE who is with UNRRA was getting ready to go to Belgrade. Informant stated AMELIA advised DOROTHY that GEORGE was supposed to have gone to Belgrade seven months ago but for some unknown reason was delayed. AMELIA is reported to have told DOROTHY that GEORGE will go to Geneva, then to London, Paris, and on to Belgrade, and he will be gone for two and a half months. *qu*

On August 8, 1946, the informant advised ED FITZGERALD contacted DOROTHY KAPLAN and advised he was leaving on vacation, that he would be gone until after Labor Day. He further stated to DOROTHY that REBECCA had left on the second of August. *qu*

On August 10, 1946, the informant mentioned determining that DOROTHY KAPLAN had arranged with a floral company in Sauk City, Wisconsin, to place red roses on the grave of HARVEL KELIER, Prairie du Sac, Wisconsin. The informant stated that DOROTHY KAPLAN desired the same type wreath as ED FITZGERALD had placed on Miss KELIER's grave the preceding year. *qu*

Informant advised on August 16, 1946, IRVING KAPLAN contacted Dr. GEORGE SILVERMAN and during this contact they discussed KAPLAN's recent trip through the Midwest. KAPLAN stated he had been in Chicago, Minneapolis, Iowa, and Detroit, and he had been gone about ten days. KAPLAN further stated he had been to Detroit once before and that was enough. He said, "There is going to be hell popping. The automobile industry is looking for a showdown and they are preparing for it pretty hot and heavy." KAPLAN then advised that is what puts them behind the eightball. SILVERMAN invited KAPLAN to his home the following day but KAPLAN did not reply that he would be able to make the engagement. *qu*

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On August 17, 1946, in a conversation between DOROTHY KAPLAN and BEADIE VAN TASSEL, it was determined that LOU GOLDBLATT was visiting the KAPLANS. *du*

Later that same date informant advised that BEA NORMAN of Baltimore, Maryland, called upon DOROTHY KAPLAN. DOROTHY told BEA that they were entertaining LOU GOLDBLATT who was in from California, and they had spent the preceding night listening to all the news that he had to tell. *du*

It was further determined through informant that LOU GOLDBLATT desired to contact the CIO Maritime Commission in Washington, and he made this contact after leaving the KAPLANS. *du*

On August 26, 1946, informant advised a discussion took place between IRVING KAPLAN and his wife DOROTHY. IRVING mentioned he had been in Minneapolis and Wisconsin Rapids. DOROTHY, upon hearing these names, asked IRVING if he had seen ORVILLE, and IRVING stated he had. *du*

On August 27, 1946, the informant advised Miss FRIEDLAND, KAPLAN's secretary, contacted KAPLAN's wife DOROTHY relative to KAPLAN's return from Detroit. DOROTHY stated she did not know where her husband could be reached. The informant related Miss FRIEDLAND again contacted DOROTHY KAPLAN and stated Mr. NATIMER of KAPLAN's office had talked to KAPLAN by phone and learned that KAPLAN was coming home by plane that evening. *du*

Informant advised on August 28, 1946, DOROTHY KAPLAN contacted BEADIE VAN TASSEL and discussed with BEADIE her husband's trip through the Midwest. She commented that KAPLAN had met her (DOROTHY's) old boss ARNOLD (phonetic) and ARNOLD stated he wished DOROTHY to come to Minneapolis and help him elect a senator. DOROTHY and BEADIE did not elaborate further on this matter. Their contact was terminated upon DOROTHY's invitation to the VAN TASSELS to come to her home that evening. *du*

The following information is set forth concerning the contacts of KAPLAN. *du*

PAULA FRIEDLAND. Confidential informant advised PAULA FRIEDLAND, 5529 Hawthorne Place, N. W., has been in frequent contact with DOROTHY and IRVING KAPLAN. *du*

From a review of the files of the Washington Field Office, it has been determined that PAULA FRIEDLAND is the secretary of IRVING KAPLAN. It appears from the numerous contacts between Miss FRIEDLAND and the KAPLANS that there has been nothing discussed other than of a business nature. Therefore, it is felt unnecessary at this time to conduct further background investigation on Miss FRIEDLAND. *du*

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Miss MARVEL KELLER. Informant advised on August 10, 1946, DOROTHY KAPLAN requested that a wreath of roses be placed on the grave of MARVEL KELLER at Prairie du Sac, Wisconsin. *qu*

The files of the Washington Field Office were reviewed relative to MARVEL KELLER, and it was determined Miss MARVEL KELLER was applicant of a Special Inquiry investigation for the Office of Emergency Management in February, 1942. From this investigation, it was determined that Miss KELLER was born in Prairie du Sac, Wisconsin. Background developed on Miss KELLER at the time of this investigation reflected her name appeared on the list which was furnished the Attorney General by the Special Committee on un-American Activities and also on the Washington Committee for Democratic Action as well as the American Peace Mobilization, the Washington Bookshop, the Washington Committee for Spanish Refugee Aid, and the District of Columbia Cooperative League.

In view of the background of Miss KELLER, it is felt she is likely to be the party for whom DOROTHY KAPLAN was having the floral wreath purchased in Prairie du Sac. *qu*

BOB WEINSTEIN. Informant advised BOB WEINSTEIN accompanied IRVING KAPLAN, the VAN TASSELS, and the CHESSES (phonetic) on a fishing trip on September 1, 1946. *qu*

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The files of the Washington Field Office were reviewed relative to BOB WEINSTEIN and it was determined he was a member of the National Federation for Constitutional Liberties and in this capacity served as a committee member at the organizational meeting on June 17, 1941, at Los Angeles, California.

A check of the telephone directory in Washington revealed BOB WEINSTEIN resides at 1335 Saratoga Avenue, N. E., that his telephone number is Dupont 3590.

Physical Surveillance

On August 29, 1946, a surveillance was instituted on IRVING KAPLAN and GEORGE SILVERMAN, and it was determined they had a luncheon engagement at Delmonico's Restaurant from 12:30 p.m. to 1:30 p.m.

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[REDACTED] has made available certain correspondence of MARY JANE KEENEY. A review of this correspondence reflects certain items of interest and excerpts from this correspondence is being set forth below.

[REDACTED] has advised that WILLIAM OLIN KEENEY, presently stationed in Tokyo, Japan with the War Department in a civilian capacity, corresponds frequently with his wife MARY JANE and the following comments by KEENEY written to her are deemed of interest.

In a letter dated July 6, 1946 KEENEY wrote the following: "I wanted you to know this: Late this afternoon Col. ^{Colonel} ORR came to my desk and asked me how I was doing. I knew this was a foolish question because he gets weekly reports and conference reports from me. He asked if I had time to rearrange the files because last week he was asked to produce data that were not forthcoming. I said I would be delighted provided I got in no one's hair. He has promised to arrange that and will give me two assistants who will follow my lead. He also said he had OK'd my trip next weekend to Wakayama, so I will get it unless it is held up higher up. This reworking of the files will occupy my time when I have just been waiting like Mr. McCRAWLER for something to turn up, so I am really very glad. It will also strengthen my position. ORR was very apologetic about it, but I rose to the bait with alacrity and pointed out that I knew the state of the files and would be glad to perform this service in my spare time. I also had a chance to point up a few of the things I had on the tates and got a very friendly response. It is a poor rule that does not work both ways, and a good job on the files may mean more in the long run, n'est ce pas."

In the same communication KEENEY discusses MARY and EDWARD REEVE of Missoula, Montana who are old acquaintances of theirs. Concerning MARY FREEMAN, KEENEY wrote the following: "Your letter of June 23, 1946 suddenly turned up today throwing a light on MARY and her dislike of action. I hope you did her a modicum of good on this score. Perhaps we should see that EDWARD gets the necessary publications including the Soviet Bulletin."

In a letter dated July 6, 1946 KEENEY wrote the following to MARY JANE: "This morning I talked with a chap who wants Soviet troops brought to Japan so that they will be contaminated by the fruits of Capitalism which can be bought in any PX. He says that the troops (USSR) in Germany soon become contaminated and are sent to Siberia and that the Russians in the Dai Iti gobbled up every day all that can be purchased at the PX. This leads them to dislike their own economy and so on ad infinitum. My tongue was well tied during this lesson".

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Under date of July 9, 1946 KEENEY wrote as follows: "Today's press is sniping away at the USSR. MOLOTOV etc. are not complete duffers, but all of the emphasis indicates his solid recalcitrance and refusal to be a fine Anglo-American. The paper is full of the enormous number of Soviet troops throughout Europe. Then, too, it is reported that the Paris Conference is on the verge of a total collapse.

"The Bikini tests were a great success and not so great according to the accounts. You pay your money and take your choice depending on how you feel and wonder why perfect peace does not prevail. I am glad EMILCE has sent Ropes to the USSR. This is a bitter augury than many of our recent moves".

In a letter dated July 10, 1946 KEENEY discusses one of his fellow workers by the name of CY. Concerning him he wrote the following: "CY thinks his section is making a little progress on the present Japanese cabinet. It has been discovered that the draft of the constitution that the Japanese Cabinet is trying to ram through the Diet is very different from the English translation and the J.C.P's (Japanese Communist Party) are busy as bees picking out the jokers. COLEGROVE told CY yesterday that though he hated and despised (SANZO) NOZAKI (the head of the Communist Party of Japan) he, COLEGROVE, had to admit NOZAKI was the bravest man he had ever met in Japan. I told CY that NOZAKI had the necessary training".

Concerning MICHAEL GREENBERG and T. BERNARD NORTON who are both subjects of this investigation, KEENEY had the following to write: "I know how you feel about MIKE but his situation is vastly different from ours. He may win by aiming high, but he may find a job in the hand is worth several in the imagination. I am glad BERNIE hooked on because he has hostages to take care of. We need the right kind of hostages in this struggling new world. BERNIE has many good ideas but he is no stable quantity."

By letter dated July 18, 1946 KEENEY wrote the following to his wife: "According to Time BROOKS ATKINSON has just run three articles in New York Times on his interpretation of the USSR. Time praises them highly but the excerpts quoted are mighty bilious reading according to my lights. I hear that (former ambassador to Russia) BULLITT's latest explosion in book form is dynamite. It seems that the ship's paper where the two Soviet Bikini scientists are carried a front page account on BULLITT's book and the scientists may withdraw from the second expedition. This is carrying American hospitality to exceeding lengths.

In his letter dated July 19, 1946 KEENEY wrote the following: "I enjoyed the batch of clippings you mailed on July 1. Alsop and Alsop use the

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poison pen on every occasion. I have made a selection to pass along. Manford's wit in the N.R. (New Republic) hits very close to the truth. From the N.R. editorial the press has fired shot and shell against the USSR's part in UN (United Nations). The American press wants only the right to go anywhere in the world and write as it pleases. This is freedom with a capital F and sounds to the USSR like folly.

"Today's press reports Surf's victory which means that the company will fight him tooth and toenail in the election. Maybe we ought to send him a donation though HUGH ~~DE~~ L. CEY will need everything he can scrape together. R's (Lt. NICOLAI G. ~~REDIN~~) acquittal was also good news. I found myself breakfasting with a major who thought that news was the worst possible. This will be the general "brass" attitude in these parts. I am really quite surprised by the jury's action - 7 men and 5 women.

"I read with great interest the statement about E.B. (EARL BROWDER) I must say it leaves me a bit up in the air, but probably no more so than many other things. I shall reexamine that my leisure.

"It begins to look as if China was about to stage an all out Civil War. There seems to be no other solution to settle this long drawn out affair and it will mean a bloody conflict, but the CCP (Chinese Communist Party) is in a much better position than in 1927. A great deal depends on the outside support of the warring armies. I think Marshall has worked hard to solve a very tough problem but his earlier return to report came at a most inopportune time. It is becoming clearer why Korea, north of the 38th parallel, has remained in Soviet hands. This area occupies a strategic spot, if a full blown Civil war eventuates."

By letter dated July 19, 1946 KEENEY wrote the following: "I must tell you about a recent happening with my allied chess opponent. A couple of mornings ago he found me at breakfast and again this morning after the major had left with curses about R (REDIN). As my ally had a couple of papers, I pointed to this news about R and he read it and we smiled and I left. Tonight, I found him alone at a table and I joined him. We had quite a long conversation about the troubled world and both agreed that the Chinese situation was full of poison and that it behooved U.S. and USSR to play ball together. This they would do if England accepted her new place in the world. After dinner we played chess and for the first time in our playing I beat him twice and drew once. He also got the clippings because I knew they were passed on to him. In the course of dinner he said he wanted to return home, because it was a good land to return to. He was very sweet about it and I sympathized with his feeling. I feel that some rapport was built up and considerable understanding. What will eventuate lies on the lap of the gods and far be it from me to push things. My opponent spoke highly of the friend who gets the clippings as did I. It was really a most

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enjoyable evening and I told him that his people and ours should meet more often. He was very much pleased when I joined him. Many of the people in the hotel know we play chess frequently, hence my act could not have been particularly untoward." SKM

In a letter dated July 26, 1946 KEENEY wrote the following: This morning I was eating breakfast with a G-2 Lt. Col. who often sits down at my table. We were about half through when we were joined by my allied chess opponent. As there were empty tables about, I was a trifle surprised. I managed to outstay the Lt. Col. and succeeded in passing the time of day with my friend. It was all a bit off the beam."

By letter dated July 28, 1946 KEENEY enclosed a newspaper article concerning SANZO NOZAKI who is a leader of the Communist Party of Japan. This article is not being set forth inasmuch as the Bureau has been furnished with the background of NOZAKI.

In his letter to MARY JANE KEENEY dated July 29, 1946, KEENEY had the following to say: "It looks as if the USSR was in for more hard sledding. ATTLEE may be less intransigent than BEVIE, but the Anglo-American bloc and "friends" will be solid in the pinches, I am afraid."

By letter dated August 3, 1946 KEENEY wrote the following: "I was asked to play chess last night by a Commander ~~XXXXX~~. We went to his room where he lives with a young Chinese member of I.P.S. I was there with a young Lt. ~~XXXXX~~. I lost one game and drew one, but my ears were busy listening to the conversation of the young guys, the Chinese sticking a sword into the USSR on all occasions and the Lt. trying to put up a weak defense.It would have been a bilious evening if I hadn't known the score."

On August 6, 1946 KEENEY wrote the following: "I learned this morning that all of the foreign nationals have left the hotel who could set up house-keeping for themselves. Quarters were supplied by SCAP, but the foreigners have to supply their own food. It is said the Soviet contingent regrets the change very much and is not faring nearly as well in their new abode. I don't suppose they have any more PX privileges which they used to patronize quite lavishly. I shall miss my chess opponent."

KEENEY wrote the following to MARY JANE under date of August 10, 1946: "Newsweek reports that the DW (Daily Worker) had a successful money-raising campaign and is increasing size and staff. This may be a good augury. I also saw that Truman will issue a statement about new C.S. (Civil Service) policy

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which will prevent any 'bad' people from government jobs. This is following the general tough position.....URSULA (WASSERMAN) introduced me to JESUS (PINERO) (new governor of Puerto Rico) when she was in Washington once. We had quite a little party and he seemed like a real guy. I hope he has not gone sour, for his appointment ought to be a great advance for Puerto Rico. ED LOUISE (ROSSCINI), and MAX (WEISSMAN) ought to make some real hay down there under JESUS."

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[redacted] has also advised that MARY JANE KEENEY has been in receipt of a letter from HARRY and JESSICA (SCHIFF), 171 Marguerite Street, Mill Valley, California. It is to be noted that HARRY (SCHIFF) is employed by the People's World newspaper in San Francisco. This letter is of a general social nature and the SCHIFFs inquire if MARY JANE desires that her subscription to the People's World be resumed.

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[redacted] has also advised that MARY JANE KEENEY is a recipient of a letter dated July 10, 1946 from the National Council of American Soviet Friendship Inc. of New York City. This letter states that CORLISS (LIMONT) has been cited for contempt by the House Committee on un-American Activities. The letter requests that MARY JANE contribute whatever donation that she is able to carry on the fight in behalf of LIMONT.

MARY JANE is also the recipient of a letter from MAX (WEISSMAN), 574 West 8 Avenue, New York 24, New York. In this letter WEISSMAN states that he expected to leave for Puerto Rico on July 24, 1946. Apparently he is going to be a professor at some college in that country for he writes "My knees knock a little at the thought of question periods after my lectures but my Marxism should get me by". He also writes that he had recently been to the west coast and while there he saw DAVE (JENKINS), ELINOR (KAHN) (who is employed by HARRY BRIDGES' International Longshoremen and Warehousemen's Union). WEISSMAN stated that he had some wonderful evenings and that "next to Moscow and Paris, San Francisco is the place to settle."

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[redacted] has advised that MARY JANE KEENEY has received two letters from HARRETT G. (EDDY) who is a well known figure in Communist circles in the San Francisco area. Miss EDDY writes that she had learned from JUAN that TERESA (ANDRES) (whom MARY JANE KEENEY located in Paris) is ill and that she is in dire need of the necessities of life.

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In a letter dated July 23, 1946 Miss EDDY advised MARY JANE she had learned that TERESA ANDRES died on July 6, 1946.

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[redacted] has made available a letter directed to MARY JANE KEENEY by HENRIETTA BUCKMASTER of Sharon, Connecticut. BUCKMASTER is a well known Communist of New England. In this letter BUCKMASTER compliments MARY JANE on her forthcoming position in radio with the Metropolitan Broadcasting Company of Washington, D. C. She writes as follows:

"As for me, life is very charming and something of a trap. We live in the midst of such beauty, and I am so engrossed in finishing my 1830 book, that the wrack and turmoil of these days becomes remote. Too remote - but perhaps that's a salvation, for if I thought too much about the betrayal - (and tell me I am using too strong a word!) of our wonderful if anonymous friends in Europe by this noblest of democracies, or of the tenth-rate minds which are guiding us these days, I would be immobilized by rage. I will emerge from my angry trance and from my book, and then, I hope, become really active with the Congress of American Women - which also needs you badly. We have of course gotten more than our share of red-baiting and made many blunders ourselves, but I hope we will get our little barque steady soon.

"MURIEL DRAPER was here for the weekend a short time ago, and told me of the death of TERESA ANDRES. I felt as badly as though I had known her. I have not seen GENE SELTFISH since her return from Paris and feel that I am missing a lot.

"It has been wonderful having the (JIM?) DIESESSES up here this summer. Just a few minutes ago we heard from the Conclins that they will be appearing tomorrow to distribute themselves between Diess and Stephens, and these incoming sources are our principal means of getting news.

"Have you heard from your friend in Germany? I am keeping very tightly in the front of my mind my intention of returning as soon as possible. I do not know how or when, but it will be accomplished in some manner.

"We all send our love, and do write when you have a chance."

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It is to be noted that MARY JANE KEENEY departed from Washington, D. C. on July 11, 1946 in her personally owned automobile for a vacation at the home of her mother, Mrs. F. A. DANIELS, Woodstock, Illinois. The Chicago Field Division was advised of KEENEY's plans and asked to conduct appropriate investigation to determine her activities. In a letter dated August 8, 1946 the Chicago Field Division advised the following:

"On July 22, 1946, Mrs. JOHN WHITWORTH, 327 South Jefferson Street, Woodstock, Illinois, advised that she had visited Mrs. FRANK A. DANIELS, 348 South Madison Street, Woodstock, mother of MARY JANE KEENEY that day. Mrs. DANIELS told her that Mrs. KEENEY had called that morning from Chicago to say that she had arrived safely by way of Cleveland and Kalamazoo, Michigan, and that she would come out to Woodstock Friday or Saturday, June 26 or 27, 1946. Mrs. KEENEY did not tell her mother why she had remained in Chicago or where she had stayed while there but Mrs. WHITWORTH was of the opinion that she visited friends at the public library in Chicago in that these people had given her a farewell party during her 1945 visit to Illinois.

"Mrs. DANIELS told Mrs. WHITWORTH that Mrs. KEENEY would remain for only two weeks and part of the time they planned to visit relatives in Rockford, Illinois, including a brother of Mrs. DANIELS and a JOHN CHAPEL, a wealthy farmer near Rockford. According to Mrs. WHITWORTH, Mrs. KEENEY apparently has no close friends in Woodstock. She has a brother, LUCIAN DANIELS, who reportedly is a famous physician in Denver, Colorado. Mrs. WHITWORTH believed that Mrs. DANIELS is much opposed to her daughter's actions although not fully aware of the latter's philosophies. Recently Mrs. KEENEY has been sending her mother \$20 a month.

"On July 25, 1946, Mrs. WHITWORTH advised that she had again conversed with Mrs. DANIELS, who said that Mrs. KEENEY would probably arrive in Woodstock Friday evening or Saturday morning, July 26, or 27, and that they were leaving immediately for Rockford. Mrs. WHITWORTH has always taken Mrs. KEENEY to dinner when she visits Woodstock and advised that she would do so this time."

In a letter dated August 16, 1946 the Chicago Field Division advised the following:

"On August 12, 1946, Mrs. JOHN WHITWORTH, 327 South Jefferson Street, Woodstock, Illinois, furnished additional information regarding KEENEY's activities. The letter told the informant that prior to coming to Woodstock, she had traveled extensively through Massachusetts in company with unidentified people. The purpose of this trip was not disclosed.

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"En route from Washington to Woodstock she visited a cousin, ELLENOR COCKERILL, a professor, possibly of sociology, at the University of Pittsburgh. Reportedly KEENEY delivered an impromptu speech of an undisclosed nature at the University, leading the informant to believe that Professor COCKERILL may have ideas similar to those of Mrs. KEENEY. Also, en route to Woodstock she visited some unidentified individuals in Cleveland, Ohio, and delivered a scheduled lecture before an audience of 75 persons.

"On the day KEENEY arrived in Woodstock she received about 35 pieces of mail of unknown origin except for several letters from her husband in Japan who was referred to by KEENEY as MAGUS. He stated that he was traveling in a regal style through Japan reorganizing libraries and felt that the main trouble in Japan was the strict censorship resulting in the fact that the Japanese were not aware of what was going on in the rest of the world. Mr. KEENEY expects to return to the United States about September 1, 1946, for one month, after which he will return to Japan where he will complete his job.

"KEENEY's mother, Mrs. F. M. DANIELS, advised the informant that subject KEENEY had a row with the State Department and had resigned her job, but that she has another job starting October 1, 1946, presumably in Washington. She did not disclose to her mother the cause of her trouble with the State Department nor the location of her new job.

"Following KEENEY's arrival in Woodstock she and her mother visited relatives in Rockford, Illinois, but remained only one day rather than a week as previously planned. On Thursday, August 1, KEENEY left alone for Chicago to deliver a speech, the nature of which she did not disclose. Although informant suggested she would like to hear the talk, KEENEY did not invite her to Chicago.

"She returned to Woodstock August 4 and her mother later disclosed that the speech was delivered for the American Union of Librarians. At this same time Mrs. DANIELS expressed concern to Mrs. WELFORTH about her daughter's radical ideas and secret activities and remarked that 'MAY surely is all for the Russians.'

"Upon returning from Chicago, KEENEY told the informant that she had succeeded in locating a woman in Chicago who had been a librarian in Spain and to whom 'we' sent money in order that she might leave Spain. The identity of this person was not disclosed.

"On August 8 KEENEY went to Watertown, Wisconsin, where she visited one Mrs. GABREL (Phonetic) who allegedly was born in Russia and who reportedly is married to a wealthy manufacturer of extension tables. Both Mr. and Mrs. GABREL had visited Russia.

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"Mrs. DANIELS advised informant that KEENEY planned to leave for Washington, D. C., via Milwaukee on Thursday, August 15, 1946, and that she possibly would be accompanied by one Mrs. ~~JENKINSON~~, who will return to Washington with her. It is believed that this person may be Mrs. ~~BERTH JENKINSON~~, relative to whom investigation is presently being conducted in the Chicago Field Division in connection with the instant matter."

Concerning ~~E. COCKERILL~~ of 4915 Forbes Street, Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, who has been a correspondent of ~~MARY JANE KEENEY~~, the Pittsburgh Field Division has advised as follows:

"A review of the telephone and city directories disclosed that one ~~ELEANOR E. COCKERILL~~, who resides at 4915 Forbes Street, is an Associate Professor of the University of Pittsburgh. Inasmuch as the names are similar and the address is identical, it is believed that this individual is the subject of your inquiry.

"Information obtained from the Credit Bureau, Inc. and confidentially furnished by ~~_____~~ concerning ~~ELEANOR E. COCKERILL~~ is as follows:

"Miss ~~ELEANOR E. COCKERILL~~, who is unmarried, was born in Chicago, Illinois in 1902. Her father is a Methodist Minister. Miss ~~COCKERILL~~ attended the Sumner County High School, Wellington, Kansas, and after her graduation attended the University of Denver from 1920 to 1924, where she received an A.B. degree. She thereafter attended Smith College, School for Social Work, from 1936 to 1938, graduating after two years with a Master's degree of Social Science.

"Miss ~~COCKERILL~~ was employed as a case worker for the Family Welfare Society, Tulsa, Oklahoma, for two years immediately after her graduation from the University of Denver. She was thereafter employed as follows: Medical Social Worker, Barnard Free Skin and Cancer Hospital, St. Louis, Missouri, 7 years; Director of Social Service, Cancer Commission of Missouri, 1 year; Director of Social Service, Long Island Medical College Hospital, 1939 to 1942; Associate Professor in Social Science, University of Pittsburgh, September 1942 to date. Miss ~~COCKERILL~~ is presently serving as one of five advisers to the Social Service Department of the Veterans' Administration facility. In this connection she is serving as a Special Consultant to the Medical Director of the Veterans' Administration Bureau in Washington with regard to social work. During the past year Miss ~~COCKERILL~~ was offered a full professorship at the University of Chicago involving an increase in salary of approximately \$1500, but she refused this offer. Miss ~~COCKERILL~~ is also serving as a lecturer of the New York School of

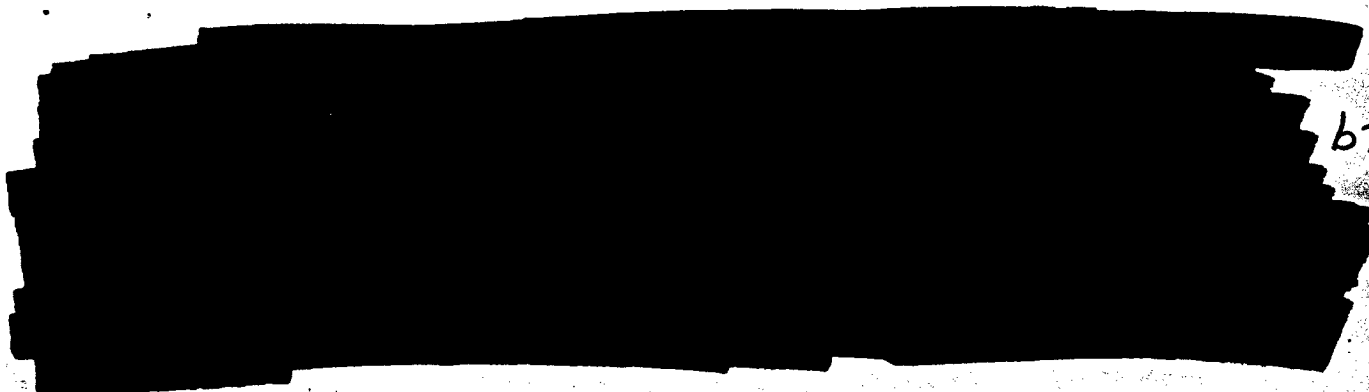
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Social Work, Columbia University; lecturer for the Pennsylvania School of Social Work, University of Pennsylvania, Philadelphia, Pa., and is on the Smith College Advisory Committee. She is also serving as co-chairman on a committee of outstanding doctors and social workers performing research work in the social medicine field. These doctors are members of the Association of American Medical Colleges and the social workers are members of the American Association of Medical Social Workers. The objective of this group is to introduce greater social training in the medical field.

"Miss COCKERILL has published a number of articles dealing with social work. The most outstanding such articles are as follows:

1. 'The Intake Process in a Department of Medical Social Sciences'. This article was published in a periodical entitled THE FAMILY, Volume 21, Number 6, pp. 188-194.
2. 'Adventures in Understanding' published in THE FAMILY, Volume 20, Number 5, pp. 155-160.
3. 'The Use of Current Case Work Concepts Where There is Physical Illness' published in THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE NATIONAL CONFERENCE FOR SOCIAL WORK in 1939.
4. 'The Preparation of the Medical Student in the Recognition of the Social Component of Disease'. This was published in the HOSPITAL PROGRESS, November 1941.



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"Prior to September 1942 Miss COCKERILL resided at 12 Clark Street, Brooklyn, New York. At that time she was engaged as a Director in the Social Service Department of the Long Island Medical College Hospital located at City

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and Henry Streets, Brooklyn, New York, where she was reportedly appointed in June 1939. Miss COCKERILL had also previously resided at 25 Pierrepont Street in Brooklyn, New York, where she lived approximately two years before moving to 12 Clark Street in Brooklyn.

"The indices of the Pittsburgh Field Office are negative with regard to the names of ~~W. KOCHERELL~~ and ELEANOR E. COCKERILL."

Another correspondent of MARY JANE KEENEY is AZEL W. MICK of Cambridge, Massachusetts. The Boston Field Division conducted an investigation to determine the identity of this individual and ascertained he lives at 40 St. Paul Street, Brookline, Massachusetts, a suburb of Boston. As of 1941 MICK was employed by the Hart Products Company and prior to that time he had been employed for eight years as general manager of the Armored Tube Company, 72 Charles Street, Malden, Massachusetts. He was born July 4, 1894 at Boston and listed JOHN H. MICK, 415 Lakeland Avenue, Grosse Point, Massachusetts, as the person who would always know his address in his relation with the Selective Service act. There was no derogatory information pertaining to MICK in the files of the Washington Field Office.

Other correspondents and associates of the KEENEYS are Mrs. EDMUND FREEMAN of Missoula, Montana and Mrs. BARBARA HEWITT of Missoula. The Butte Field Division conducted an investigation pertaining to these individuals and the results thereof are being set forth as follows:

"Concerning Mrs. EDMUND ~~FREEMAN~~, inquiries through very reliable sources of information reveal the following background information:

"Mrs. EDMUND FREEMAN was born January 28, 1896 at Chillicothe, Ohio, and she is the wife of Professor EDMUND FREEMAN in the English Department at the present time at Montana State University. She is also known as Mrs. MARY B. FREEMAN. She attended Missouri Wesleyan from 1917 through 1919 and then attended Northwestern University near Chicago from 1920 to 1921, receiving a Bachelor of Arts degree at this institution in 1921. Following this, Mrs. FREEMAN instructed English at Chillicothe High School for a short period of time. (Dates unknown) Following this, she was married to EDMUND FREEMAN and became inactive in the teaching field but stayed in the field of education in that she was Secretary for the Board of Sunday Schools of the Methodist Church in Chicago. A review of her husband's record at this time reveals that he was in session at Northwestern University. Later Mrs. FREEMAN made a trip to London, England and here took a position as Secretary to Reverend WILLIAM C. POOLE of the Christ Church in London, England. It is noted that Professor FREEMAN was at this time

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at Cambridge University in England during 1922 and 1923, so it is presumed that Mrs. FREEMAN served as full secretary during this time. Following Mrs. FREEMAN's return to Chicago and Northwestern University they eventually came to Montana University, where Mr. FREEMAN has been a professor in the English Department since 1930. Mrs. FREEMAN has been very active in Parent-Teachers Association activities and records show that she, at the present time is President of the Faculty Women's Club at Montana State University.

^{Edward} Mr. FREEMAN was born at Cameron, Missouri on May 10, 1893, attended Missouri Wesleyan from 1911 to 1915, then matriculated to Northwestern University as an instructor and also worked on his Master's Degree, which he received, according to records, in 1924. From 1917 to 1919 FREEMAN was with the British Y.M.C.A. in England and also with the United States Aviation Service in France. Following this, FREEMAN returned to the United States and instructed in English in several universities, returning to Cambridge to study further in the English Department in 1922 and 1923, again returning to the United States as an English professor at Northwestern University and eventually to Montana University, where he has been a professor in the English Department for approximately twenty years.

Both of the FREEMANS locally have an excellent reputation and are considered loyal American citizens. Mr. FREEMAN is considered a very liberal thinker and a firm believer in academic freedom. Mrs. FREEMAN is considered one of the most intelligent and best liked members of the faculty group at the University of Montana. Professor FREEMAN is an extremely popular speaker at social and club functions in Western Montana. Professor FREEMAN studies and does much research work on the writer FRANCIS L. LON. The FREEMANS have two children - DAVID, 10 and PATRICIA, 13.

"Concerning Mrs. BERNARD ~~HEWITT~~, information in Missoula, Montana, is limited. She is the wife of Mr. BERNARD ~~HEWITT~~, who from the years 1933 to 1936 was an assistant professor at the University of Montana in the English Department as a drama instructor.

"Professor ~~HEWITT~~'s record reveals that he attended Cornell University from 1924 to 1928, receiving a B.A. Degree in 1928, then returning to Cornell in 1929 to work for a Master's Degree. The records also show that he was an assistant professor at Cornell in 1932. Following this, he was an assistant professor at the University of Montana from 1933 to 1936, and in 1936 he resigned his position in Missoula to take a professor's position at Iowa State College, Ames, Iowa. The records further show that following his professorship at Iowa State College, Professor ~~HEWITT~~ transferred his teaching ability to the Brooklyn College at New York City, and this is his permanent position at the present time.

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"Mr. and Mrs. BARNARD HEWITT are, at the present time, in Missoula, Montana, where Professor HEWITT has accepted a temporary position as a teacher in dramatics during the summer school session. The Hewitts plan to return to Brooklyn College, New York City, this fall. Professor HEWITT has two publications - the 'Quarterly Journal of Speech Published in June, 1932' and the 'Stanislavsky System for Actors with Aristides DiAngelo.'

"The HEWITTS have one girl who is twelve years old.

"According to former associates, while the HEWITTS were at Montana State University, they were known as very excellent, loyal American citizens, and were firm believers in academic freedom.

"Concerning the HEWITT and FREEMAN association with the KEENEY family, it is to be noted that all of these persons were at the University of Montana at the same time and were in the same English Department as instructors and they also all belonged to the same social clubs in Missoula, Montana.

"The HEWITTS and the FREEMANS were never considered close friends of KEENEYS, but they were thrown together because of similarity of positions and contact in Missoula.

"The general consensus of opinion on the KEENEYS was that they were radical in thought and some actions while at the University of Montana and eventual pressure was brought about so that Mr. P. S. KEENEY had to resign his position. The FREEMANS and HEWITTS were believers in academic freedom and the HEWITTS left Montana only for a higher paying and better position. Inasmuch as the HEWITTS have been gone from Missoula, Montana since 1936, it is being suggested that should more background information be necessary, inquiries should be directed to Iowa State College at Ames, Iowa and the Brooklyn College of New York in New York City for more recent background information.

"The indices of the Butte Field Division reveal that in the reference report of WALTER W. PERISH dated February 4, 1942, on the Communist Activities in the State of Montana, Internal Security - C, Butte File #100-721 that GEORGE F. SIMONS, ex-President of the University of Montana, who was president at the time the FREEMANS, the HEWITTS and the KEENEYS were in tenure at the University, SIMONS related concerning EDMUND FREEMAN that FREEMAN 'always wanted more than his ability has been able to earn for him and is somewhat dissatisfied.' He believes that our kind of civilization is all wrong. He writes letters to alumni in labor organizations in Montana and elsewhere in an effort to get them to attack the Governor, State Board of Education and the University Administration.

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Mr. FREEMAN, according to SIMONS, sponsored the Post Office Box here for the League for Peace and Democracy, signed the application for the post office box and is a Union Man. FREEMAN left the faculty of the University three years ago in an effort to try to break down the IOFC unit here. He is a strong pacifist and he at one time wanted to write a thesis on "The Causes of War."

Another correspondent of MARY JANE KEENEY is Mrs. L. E. DANIELS, 1321 East 10th Avenue, Apartment #9, Denver, Colorado. The Denver Field Division ascertained the identity of Mrs. DANIELS and it was determined that she is the wife of LUDWIG DANIELS (brother of MARY JANE). [REDACTED] b2, b7D of the Denver Field Division advised on April 6, 1945 that a Mrs. DANIELS telephonically informed ED McMULLEN at the Auditorium Book Store, which is a Communist book store, that she, Mrs. DANIELS, had received an invitation to the luncheon for mother ELLA REEVES FLOOR at the Albany Hotel in Denver but that she could not attend. There was no information in the files of the Denver Field Division to show whether this Mrs. DANIELS is identical with Mrs. L. E. DANIELS. CU

MARY JANE KEENEY has also received mail from Post Office Box 2451, Denver, Colorado. It was ascertained by the Denver Field Division that this box is held by the Federal Postal Employees Association Group Insurance, 931 West 8th Avenue, Denver.

KEENEY has also been in correspondence with a J. A. EATON, 50 Ohio Avenue, Elmira, New York. The Buffalo Field Division ascertained that WEBSTER WRIGHT EATON of 58 Ohio Street, Elmira, is identical with this individual. He is the manager of the United States Employment Service at Elmira and has held this position since 1941. Inquiries of reliable sources reflect that EATON has an excellent reputation and that he came to Elmira from Binghamton, New York about 1931. EATON is married to WINIFRED M. BRIDGES EATON and they have two children, VIRGINIA and THEODORE, ages 8 and 13 respectively. There was no derogatory information in the files of the Buffalo Field Division concerning EATON.

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[REDACTED] of the Washington Field Office has furnished considerable information pertaining to MARY JANE KEENEY since her return to Washington, D. C. on August 18, 1946. It is to be recalled that MARY JANE KEENEY spent a vacation at the home of her mother, Mrs. F. L. DANIELS, Woodstock, Illinois.

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The following information hereinafter reported was received from [REDACTED], unless otherwise advised.

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On August 19, 1946 MARY JANE KEENEY contacted HELEN SILVERMASTER at which time they discussed ANATOLE SILVERMASTER's uncle [REDACTED] ever. Mrs. SILVERMASTER related that her son is confined to the Bethesda Naval Hospital but that he is not progressing very well. MARY JANE suggested Mrs. SILVERMASTER contact one Dean BURKE who is a cancer research specialist at the Bethesda Hospital. MARY JANE advised that BURKE resides at 3980 Langley Court, N.W., and his telephone number is Emerson 6279.

On the same date, MARY JANE KEENEY had a conversation with Mrs. HILDA FLYNN. MARY JANE stated that she had just returned to Washington and made an inquiry concerning Mrs. FLYNN's baby daughter, BARBARA. MARY JANE expressed a desire to visit with Mrs. FLYNN in the future.

MARY JANE also had a conversation with Mrs. HERMAN CABOT in which she, MARY JANE, stated she expected to go with the Metropolitan Broadcasting Company about September 1, 1946. Mrs. CABOT stated that she is moving from 806 Taylor Street to the Meridian Hill Hotel.

MARY JANE KEENEY was quite busy on August 19 and she next contacted DAVID WHEL. She stated she knows he has been very busy in the past few months due to the Palestine situation. She related she had brought him some newspaper clippings from the Chicago Daily News. WHEL said that he had arranged it so that MIX could go to Germany, ostensibly to be the Legal Counsel to General CLAY who is in charge of the restoration of Jewish property.

MARY JANE next contacted BOWEN SMITH who advised he has a new home at 1421 33rd Street, N.W. but no job at the present time, although he hopes to get one with the Department of Interior in the near future. He asked MARY JANE KEENEY to visit him that evening, August 19, 1946, and she accepted the invitation.

MARY JANE KEENEY had a conversation with CARL GREEN of the Metropolitan Broadcasting Company. She told him she had seen a lot of their friends in Chicago and that they all sent CARL their best regards. They discussed the difficulty of getting the Metropolitan Broadcasting Company underway and GREEN stated that they hoped to open up about October 1, 1946. They then discussed some of their mutual friends, namely BOWEN SMITH who is leaving his job soon, and MIX who is going to Germany. MARY JANE said it was a fine thing that MIX was going to Germany and added that unless they got someone in "there soon the whole thing would blow up".

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MARY JANE KEENEY then conversed with EDWARD RICHIER of the Metropolitan Broadcasting Company and he asked her if HUGH DE LACEY's office had been able to get in touch with her. MARY JANE replied she had been out of town and unable to see DE LACEY.

On August 19, 1946 MARY JANE KEENEY also contacted CLAYTON SMITH, wife of BOWEN SMITH. CLAYTON definitely invited MARY JANE out to her home for the evening and MARY JANE agreed to drop out about 9:00 p.m. Following the contact with CLAYTON SMITH, MARY JANE conversed with MARTIN T. BENNETT. MARTIN stated that he had recently returned from a trip around the world and that he had seen PHILIP OLIN KEENEY, alias ANGUS, in Tokyo, Japan. MARY JANE stated that she would like to see MARTIN and he asked her out for dinner at 6:00 p.m. on August 20, 1946. The invitation was accepted.

MARY JANE then had a conversation with P. BERNARD KORTEN, telephone Falls Church 25037. BERNIE, as he is known to his friends, advised MARY JANE that he can now be reached at the Department of State, telephone REpublic 5600, extension 3839. BERNIE related he is very much concerned about BOWEN SMITH inasmuch as he is unemployed. MARY JANE answered that she is not concerned because she feels sure he will find something in the near future. She related that she had seen CARL GREEN that afternoon and he told her that EDWARD GENTLER had been on administrative leave. BERNIE and MARY JANE discussed a luncheon date and it was finally decided MARY JANE would call in at his office at which time they would set a definite date. He asked MARY JANE about MARTIN BENNETT and had the following comment to make: "I am mad at him. His whole concern is for himself. I know why he quit now. He didn't get that appointment as delegate to the Reparations Council in Japan." MARY JANE asked BERNIE about AL and BERNIE said that AL is vice president of the Virgin Islands Corporation connected with the Department of Interior.

Position

On August 20, 1946 MARY JANE had a conversation with BOWEN SMITH. They discussed a possible opening for MARY JANE in the Independent Citizens Committee for Arts, Professions, and Sciences. BOWEN said he was offered the position as General Secretary some time ago but at that time he was in a mess and could not take it. He continued that the ICC is still looking for someone and that he has suggested MARY JANE be the General Secretary. He also said there has been a great deal of confidential talk about a merger of the Independent Citizens Committee of Arts, Professions, and Sciences with the CIO-PAC. MARY JANE said that she would look into the possibility of securing a position with that organization the next time she is in New York. She also said she knows Mrs. FREDERICK MARCH very well. BOWEN also told MARY JANE that she should talk with CARL (GREEN ?) about this job as he knows someone who has the big job now and who is supposed to be leaving or is being discharged. BOWEN continued that

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there is an individual who is very active in the Independent Citizens Committee for Arts, Professions, and Sciences by the name of EDITH HALPERIN who is a Russian blond girl and who was very active in the Russian War Relief at the beginning of the war. He continued that another individual active in this organization is WYNN MATHEWSON (PH). BOWEN expressed the opinion that the organization is a very good one to work for inasmuch as it has a great deal of funds.

On August 21, 1946 MARY JANE KEENEY had a conversation with BEATRICE SCHWARTZ (?). BEATRICE said that her husband, BOB, is still working for the Treasury Department but is looking for another job. BEATRICE said that BOB had purchased some stock in the Metropolitan Broadcasting Company and that she, BEATRICE, is expecting a baby soon.

Following the above mentioned conversation with BEATRICE, MARY JANE contacted T. BERNARD WORTMAN and they made plans to have lunch the following afternoon and MARY JANE agreed to meet him at 1818 H Street at 12:30 p.m.

On August 22, 1946 MARY JANE contacted EDITH FAHL, wife of DAVID FAHL. MARY JANE said that she had spoken to DAVID and that he and EDITH had been on a holiday. MARY JANE asked EDITH if she had seen IRLIM on her trip to New York and EDITH answered in the affirmative saying that IRLIM isn't too happy with her house. MARY JANE continued by saying that she had stopped by DAVE's office and that she desired him to know that she is thrilled at the statements made by BARTLEY CRUM (member of the Anglo-American Commission in Palestine and subject of an Internal Security - R investigation by the San Francisco Field Division).

MARY JANE next had a conversation with ALEX REUTHER, having been able to reach her at Adams 4456. They discussed the Metropolitan Broadcasting Company and MARY JANE stated that the company in all probability would not be able to go on the air until the first of December of the first of 1947. MARY JANE stated that she would like to be occupied between now and the date that the Metropolitan Broadcasting Company goes on the air and that she believes that she would like to work on the political campaigns, particularly in the state of New York because the primaries show that search work is necessary.

REUTHER invited MARY JANE over for dinner on August 23, 1946 and MARY JANE accepted the invitation. REUTHER stated that she gets home from the Pentagon about 7:00 p.m. and that her address is now Apartment 107, 2231 Calif. Street. MARY JANE asked ALEX if he had any news of MIKE GREENBERG. ALEX stated MIKE and MARION left town two weeks ago and are spending their vacation

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in New Hampshire before going to New York City. MARY JANE said that BOWEN SMITH told her that MIKE had another disappointment inasmuch as he had hoped to go to Europe but that the job fell through. MARY JANE also said that she expected to go to New York City over Labor Day weekend and that she would speak before the Congress of American Women, speaking on the subject of the "German Womens Union". MARY JANE stated that she could not speak on this subject as long as she was connected with "you know what" (Department of State).

MARY JANE also had a conversation on August 22, 1946 with PHILIP DUNNLEY. She told him that while she was in the Midwest on her vacation she spoke before several groups on the Resistance Movement in Europe and always ended her talks with the desire that some of the listeners become active in "precinct work". MARY JANE stated she hoped to have a party soon and she desired that PHILIP and LILLIAN DUNNLEY attend. She said that she is also going to invite BENEDICT ALPER, and it was decided that the party should be held on Wednesday, August 23, at about 5:00 p.m.

Following the conversation with PHILIP DUNNLEY, MARY JANE then had a conversation with JACK MERSLICK. JACK stated he was having a stag party that night and that he had just had a conversation with CARL GREEN concerning MARY JANE. MARY JANE requested JACK call her on the following day in order that they might get together before JACK left Washington.

According to [redacted] MARY JANE also contacted ALICE McLENN JONES, on August 22. MARY JANE related she had left a package for ALICE on ALICE's door the preceding Sunday night, August 18, 1946. MARY JANE added that the package had been lying around her apartment for the past six weeks. MARY JANE also stated that she had seen LARRY MORRIS (PH) at the Blue and Gray Restaurant that day. ALICE said that her husband, TOM, still had not secured a job as yet but had a good line on one as an information specialist at the Department of Interior. ALICE stated that she could be reached at REpublic 5600, extension 3309, which is her office.

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[redacted] has also stated that MARY JANE contacted HERMAN C. BOT on August 22, 1946. HERMAN stated that he and his wife, S.R.I., had been discussing the Yugoslav situation and that they feel very depressed. MARY JANE then said "Well, the rattling of sabers shows how bankrupt our foreign policy is". HERMAN said that he is quite busy with the Cabot-Kaiser Institute and that someone called him on August 22 from radio station WJIX to make a speech on spasmodic paralysis. HERMAN continued that his talk will be transcribed and it will be broadcast on the following Tuesday. MARY JANE commented that S. KUDISH (PH) has expressed a delight at the formation of the Cabot-Kaiser Institute. MARY JANE

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invited the CABOTS over to her apartment on Saturday night, August 24, for dinner at approximately 7:00 p.m. MARY JANE said that BENEDICT LEITER may possibly be there also. The invitation was accepted by HERMAN and SARA CABOT.

On August 23, 1946 MARY JANE KEENEY attempted to locate WILLIAM LUDWIG ULLMAN. He was not available at his office and word was left that he should contact MARY JANE at her residence at 4:30 p.m. Subsequently, ULLMAN contacted MARY JANE and she stated she had been at the Library that day and that there was a great deal on "that subject" and that she made out a lot of call slips and would send the slips to him.

Following the conversation with ULLMAN, LEONARD GERTLER contacted MARY JANE. She inquired about ANN and she was advised ANN was getting along very well. MARY JANE continued that BEAUCHE FORTMAN and CARL GREEN had told her about him (GERTLER). MARY JANE said that GREEN had advised her that GERTLER had been offered a position but that GERTLER did not desire to "go there". GERTLER asked MARY JANE if she had seen MARTIN (BENNETT) yet and she replied in the affirmative, stating that she would tell GERTLER what MARTIN said when she saw GERTLER next. MARY JANE then said that she was going up to New York City to make a speech before the Congress of American Women but that she did not want to make this speech until her resignation with the Department of State was effective.

On August 24, 1946 MARY JANE contacted BOB LEWIS (PH). She introduced herself by saying "I met you a long time ago, this is MARY JANE KEENEY". After establishing her identity in such a fashion she asked if LEWIS were still going abroad. He replied that he is and that he expects to leave in October. MARY JANE invited him for brunch on August 25 but LEWIS was unable to accept. MARY JANE closed the conversation by saying that she is going to see MURIEL (DRAPER) in New York City in a couple of weeks.

Following the above conversation, MARY JANE conversed with TERRY and invited TERRY (female) and WOODROW for brunch on August 25. TERRY said that she would have WOODROW contact MARY JANE later as to the time they can appear for brunch. MARY JANE also said that she is going to invite RUTH and ERIC BEECROFT for brunch.

MARY JANE then invited RUTH and ERIC BEECROFT for brunch on August 25 at 10:30 a.m. The invitation was accepted. WOODROW contacted MARY JANE KEENEY later and confirmed the brunch appointment which he and TERRY had with MARY JANE the following morning. WOODROW said he and TERRY had just returned from New Hampshire, that he had been fired from the State Department but he had forced the Department of State to retract the firing. WOODROW said he had

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received his dismissal notice on the basis of "retention proceedings" and that he immediately notified the Department of State that he desired it be retracted or else he would make an appeal to the Civil Service Commission. WOODROW expressed the opinion ALLEN EVANS (FH) and the old FBI were the cause of his dismissal.

On August 24, 1946 an individual who identified himself as WOODY contacted MARY JANE and said he was out of money and his automobile had run out of gas. MARY JANE offered to make him a loan of \$1.00 which was accepted.

On August 26, 1946 LILLIAN DUNNWAY conversed with MARY JANE stating that she would be unable to keep her dinner date with MARY JANE the forthcoming Wednesday night inasmuch as she, LILLIAN, had an opportunity to go to New York for several days before school started. LILLIAN DUNNWAY related HARRIET was coming over for the evening on August 27 and that they would like MARY JANE to join them. It was agreed that MARY JANE would visit the DUNNWAYS at that time.

[redacted] has advised that on August 28, 1946 MARY JANE KEENEY had a conversation with Mrs. MURIEL DRAPER at Longacre 3-6742, New York City. MARY JANE asked if the meeting was going to be held, apparently meaning the meeting of the Congress of American Women, and she received an affirmative reply. DRAPER stated that it would be held at MORI FINCKELSTEIN's 68 East 86th Street at 8:00 p.m. MURIEL asked MARY JANE how she wished to be introduced and MARY JANE stated she should be announced as having formerly been associated with the U. S. Department of State, an economic analyst with the Foreign Economic Administration from 1942-46, and an economist on the staff of the U. S. Representatives to the Allied Committee on Reparations which met in Paris during the winter of 1945-46. MARY JANE said that she planned to go to New York on Tuesday, September 3, but that she did not know where she would stay. b2 b7D

On August 28, 1946 MARY JANE had a conversation with JACK MRS. LKA who asked her if she were going to attend the meeting at the Unitarian Church in order to hear DAVID S. POSS speak who had just returned from Germany. MARY JANE replied that she was not going and that she considered S. POSS no good and furthermore, that her opinion of S. POSS could not be expressed in polite company. MRS. LKA said that he expected to leave Washington soon but that he was having difficulty renting his house. They decided to meet the following day at 1:00 p.m. at the Henderson Grill located on the corner of 14th and New York Avenue.

On August 30, 1946 PHILIP OLIN KEENEY, who is affectionately referred to by MARY JANE as ANGUS, contacted her from Tokyo, Japan. ANGUS contacted

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her from Tokyo, Japan, thinking that their wedding anniversary was August 29, however, he was informed by MARY JANE that it was actually August 31. MARY JANE requested ANGUS return to the United States on October 1, 1946 if at all possible inasmuch as the Metropolitan Broadcasting Company expects to begin operation on December 1, 1946. KEENEY said that he would be unable to leave Tokyo by that time but that he would make an effort to leave by November 1, 1946. They discussed a library conference that ANGUS had attended in Japan and also some presents that ANGUS had mailed MARY JANE from Tokyo. ANGUS also stated that he had signed up for one more year in Japan.

After the conversation with ANGUS, MARY JANE immediately contacted BENEDICT ALPER and advised him that she had just conversed with ANGUS. ALPER said he had been over to visit with HULDA FLYNN and JOHN FLYNN and that JOHN is very much upset over the Polish situation. MARY JANE said that she, MARY JANE, is also afraid of the implications but that HULDA has been very happy with her baby. BENEDICT interrupted MARY JANE and said that JOHN had indicated to him that in the event of hostilities that he, JOHN, would not tell HULDA anything and that he might "have to turn her in". BENEDICT cautioned MARY JANE not to repeat that information concerning HULDA and JOHN and said that he only intended to mention it to his wife, ETHEL MECHANIC and MARY JANE. ALPER continued by saying "I can't understand it. My country right or wrong, yes, but not my wife." MARY JANE then said that she was leaving for New York City on the following day and that she intended to stop over and visit with the MORTONS at Easton, Pennsylvania. ALPER again turned the conversation back to HULDA FLYNN and JOHN FLYNN and said that he was very much concerned about JOHN; that JOHN knows what his wife's friends are like and that if he, JOHN, can't resist that and would turn all of them in he, ALPER, would be inclined to say "to hell with him".

On August 30, 1946 PHILIP DUNAWAY contacted MARY JANE and said that he understood they were both invited to the home of DAVID WAHL that evening and that he, DUNAWAY, desired a ride with MARY JANE. She agreed and stated she would pick him up some time between 5:00 and 6:00 p.m.

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MARY JANE KEENEY returned to Washington as has been previously reported on or about August 8, 1946 and a surveillance was maintained on her by Special Agent J. J. CANAVAN and Special Agent WILLIAM E. CLARK on August 19, 1946. No activity of any interest was observed until 9:30 p.m. at which time the surveillance was taken over by Special Agents JOHN B. BUSCHER and COURTLAND J. JONES

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At this time MARY JANE was observed to leave her apartment, 215 B Street, N.E., Washington, D. C., accompanied by her French poodle dog and to travel in her automobile to 1421 33rd Street, N.W. She was observed to enter the residence located at this number which is the home of BOWEN SMITH.

On August 20, 1946 Special Agents COURTLAND J. JONES and WILLIAM E. CLARK conducted a surveillance on MARY JANE KEENEY and at 6:30 p.m. she was observed to leave her apartment and to proceed to the residence of MARTIN T. EBBETT, 27 Woodmount Road, Alexandria, Virginia. She arrived there at 6:50 p.m. and the surveillance was discontinued at 7:00 p.m.

On August 22, 1946 Special Agents LUDWIG W. OBENDORF and COURTLAND J. JONES conducted a surveillance on MARY JANE KEENEY and she was observed to meet EDWARD NORTON at 12:50 p.m. at 1818 H Street, N.W. They walked to the Blue and Gray Cafeteria, 722 18th Street, N.W., for lunch. At 1:25 p.m. they were observed to leave the cafeteria where they walked to the Walker Johnson Building at 18th and New York Avenue where NORTON entered Room 116. They remained there about ten minutes and then left the Walker Johnson Building. NORTON was kept under surveillance and it was ascertained that he returned to 1818 H Street and entered Room 1231.

On August 29, 1946 Special Agents COURTLAND J. JONES, EARL FUOSS, WILLIAM E. CLARK and R. K. McJEEB observed MARY JANE KEENEY meeting JACK MARSALKI at the Henderson Grill, 14th and New York Avenue. They had a conversation for approximately ten minutes and at the conclusion MARSALKI went to the Lafayette Hotel for lunch and MARY JANE went into the Treasury Department.

On August 30, 1946 Special Agents COURTLAND J. JONES and WILLIAM DEECE observed MARY JANE KEENEY at the residence of DAVID MAHL, 3 Lexington Street, Kensington, Maryland. The surveillance was instituted at 6:00 p.m. and discontinued at 10:00 p.m. During this period MARY JANE remained at the MAHL residence.

On August 31, 1946 Special Agent COURTLAND J. JONES instituted a surveillance at the residence of MARY JANE KEENEY at 8:30 a.m. At 11:15 a.m. MARY JANE and her dog were observed to depart from the building and to enter her automobile and drive out the Baltimore Highway. Information had previously been received that MARY JANE intended to travel to Easton, Pennsylvania and visit the HORTONS over Labor Day weekend. Special Agent JOSEPH R. McFADDEN of the Philadelphia Field Division was telephonically contacted and was advised of MARY JANE KEENEY's departure from Washington and of her plans to visit with . . .

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THEODORE ELI ~~X~~MORTON and his family, 136 Wayne Avenue, Easton, Pennsylvania.
KENEY was travelling in her personally owned 1940 gray four door DeSota
Sedan, bearing D. C. license 128-379.

The following investigative activity is reported by Special Agent GEORGE G. McKENNA.

At 2:45 P.M. on August 27, 1946, Special Agent W. T. MARSHESSAULT, of the New York Field Division, advised the Washington Field Office by telephone that JULES KORCHIEN had departed from New York City at 1:30 P.M. that day and was due to arrive in Washington at 5:30 P.M. via the Pennsylvania Railroad. KORCHIEN was described as follows:

The New York Field Division requested that the Washington Office ascertain [redacted]

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It is recalled that JULES KORCHIEN, according to the report of Special Agent, EDWARD V. DOOLEY, New York City, dated March 22, 1946, in the instant case, was a member of the Communist Party holding a 1943 Communist Party of the USA membership book #9262. KORCHIEN was said to reside at the apartment of URSULA MASSERIAN at 110 Christopher Street, New York City.

Pursuant to the request of the New York Field Division, Special Agents GEORGE G. MCKENNA and JOSEPH J. KEECH met train #175, the Colonial Express, of the Pennsylvania Railroad. The train arrived at 6:10 P.M. JULES KORCHIEN was observed to get off this train. He was still carrying the brown leather briefcase. He went to a telephone booth, made a call, left the booth to consult the Washington, D. C., telephone directory. He turned to the page at which "Unique-United" was the heading. It is possible that he was consulting the telephone number of some government agency. After checking this page he went to another telephone booth and made a call. He then took a taxicab to 810 Greenwood Avenue, Tacoma Park, Maryland, and entered the apartment of Mrs. LOUIS SENTIAN which is the lefthand top floor apartment at this address. Here Mrs. SENTIAN lives with her 17 year old daughter, JANE. KORCHIEN was observed to be greeted by Mrs. SENTIAN and her daughter. He stayed in their apartment from 7:07 P.M. to 8:30 P.M. At 8:30 P.M. KORCHIEN and Mrs. LOUIS SENTIAN took a bus as far as Sherman and Irving Streets, Northwest. This involved one bus change. At Sherman and Irving Streets, Northwest, Washington, D. C., the subject bade goodbye to Mrs. SENTIAN. The Agents noticed that his attitude toward Mrs. SENTIAN was of a rather affectionate nature.

After leaving Mrs. SENTIAN, KORCHIEN took a cab to the Washington House, 2120 16th Street, Northwest, Washington, D. C., where he was observed in apartment #702. He remained in this apartment from 9:00 P.M. until 12:30 A.M. It was observed from the street that he had shed his coat. Apartment 702 at the Washington House is occupied by CHARLES H. BERNHARD and his wife. A woman believed to be Mrs. BERNHARD was observed by the Agents in apartment 702, as the Agents watched the apartment from the street. A man believed to be CHARLES BERNHARD was also observed in the apartment with KORCHIEN.

At 12:30 A.M. JULES KORCHIEN left the Washington House, walked to 14th Street, and took a car to 14th Street and Kennedy. Here he took a bus and got off at the Tacoma Park taxistand where he took a cab to 810 Greenwood Avenue, Tacoma Park. He arrived here at 1:10 A.M. At 1:30 A.M. lights being out in Mrs. SENTIAN's apartment, the surveillance was discontinued.

Surveillance was again resumed at 7:30 A.M. but it was ascertained that no one was in the house at this time except JANE SENTIAN who was observed by Special Agents MCKENNA and KEECH as she left 810 Greenwood Avenue and boarded a bus. She had shut all the windows of the apartment.

A New York teletype received on August 29, 1946, indicated that KORCHIEN was in New York. It is believed, therefore, that he took a very early train to New York on August 28, 1946.

Mrs. E. E. VAUGHN, who occupies the apartment below Mrs. SENTMAN at 810 Greenwood Avenue, stated that the SENTMAN women had lived there for several months during which time Mrs. VAUGHN had never seen Mr. SENTMAN.

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In connection with JULES KORCHIEN the following background information is set out. According to the records of the Washington, D. C., Metropolitan Police Department, in October, 1940, JULES KORCHIEN was listed as being employed by the United States Housing Authority, Department of Interior, as an architect compensated at \$4,000 per annum. He was listed in the 1939 City Directory as living at 4113 North Henderson Road, Arlington, Virginia. His name was not listed in the 1940 City Directory.

The police files disclosed that JULES KORCHIEN, National Secretary of the Federation of Architects, Engineers, Chemists and Technicians, took part in the National Congress for Unemployment and Social Insurance held in Washington, D. C., on January 5, 6, and 7, 1935. This conference was alleged to be attended largely by , and to be in control of a radical element.

By letter dated November 14, 1941, the Bureau advised the New York and Washington Field Divisions that JULES KORCHIEN was employed by the New York newspaper, P.M., and that according to a confidential informant the Congressional Record printed a speech of Congressman MARTIN DIES made on March 21, 1941, in which he stated regarding JULES KORCHIEN in connection with FAECT that he was the secretary of the organization; that he was a member of the Provisional Committee for the Washington Committee for Democratic Rights; that he was consulting architect for the Soviet Government in Washington, and more recently housing expert for PNO and the Federal Housing Authority; that he was a member of the Board of Directors of the Inter-Professional Association.

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By letter dated December 26, 1941, the Bureau advised that information had been received from the New York Field Office to the effect that KORCHIEN had severed his connection with the newspaper, P.M., during February, 1941. At that time he was known to reside at 310 West 97th Street.

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In addition information was received from [REDACTED] of the Washington Field Office of November 7, 1941, to the effect that [REDACTED]

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By letter dated February 10, 1942, the New York Field Division advised the Bureau that KORCHIEN, in an application for a lease of an apartment at 233 East 34th Street, indicated that he was employed by the WHITE CONSTRUCTION COMPANY, 95 Madison Avenue, New York City. A letter from his wife, LILLIAN JACOBS KORCHIEN on the letterhead of the Columbia Broadcasting System indicated that she was employed in the office of Mr. GILBERT SELDES, Television Studio.

At the office of the WHITE CONSTRUCTION COMPANY, it was learned that KORCHIEN was employed as a draftsman by the WHITE CONSTRUCTION COMPANY, Incorporated; UNDERPINNING AND FOUNDATION COMPANY, INC., RIGGS, DISTLER AND COMPANY, INC., as joint venture contractors for expansion of facilities at the Naval Air Station, Floyd Bennett Field, Brooklyn, New York.

By letter dated June 17, 1946, the Bureau advised the New York and Washington Field Offices that confidential advice had been received to the effect that JULES KORCHIEN was at present controlling the influence of BENJAMIN COHEN, Counselor of the State Department, and was instrumental in shaping some of the labor policies and attitudes which later became State Department policy through the handling of BENJAMIN COHEN. Among other things this letter recalled that when URSULA LASSEMIAN, believed to be JULES KORCHIEN's mistress, departed for Buenos Aires, examination of her address book revealed that it contained the names of a number of known and strongly suspected Soviet Agents as well as names of a number of individuals active in Communist affairs. One of these names was ARTHUR ALEXANDROVICH ADAMS, a known Soviet espionage agent. The letter recalled that when MARY JANE KEENEY, another subject in the GREGORY case, returned to the United States from France on March 9, 1946, she was met at the boat by JULES KORCHIEN and subsequently KEENEY was observed to deliver a package under suspicious circumstances to JOSEPH BERNSTEIN, strongly suspected of being a Soviet agent, who in turn delivered it to ALEXANDER TRACHTENBERG, a prominent Communist functionary in New York City. This package was believed to have contained the political testament of a deceased French political leader. TRACHTENBERG was known to have commented that he had been trying to obtain this testament more than a year.

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In connection with the SENTMANS whom KORCHIEN visited on August 27, the following information is set forth:

According to a report of Special Agent S. W. REYNOLDS dated March 2, 1942, at Washington, D. C., the case entitled ROBERT NIFFLIN SENTMAN, Assistant to the Regional Director, Director's Office, Region V, United States Housing Authority, Federal Works Agency, Internal Security, Hatch Act, ROBERT NIFFLIN SENTMAN was employed at the Federal Works Agency from November 21, 1938. His name appeared on the Dies list as a member of the Washington Committee for Democratic Action. Information was also received that the name of ROBERT H. SENTMAN appeared on the active indices of the National Federation for Constitutional Liberties and on the active indices of the American Peace Mobilization, later known as the American People's Mobilization. Fellow employees of SENTMAN advised that he associated with a group in the local union of the United Federal Workers of America at the USHA which followed the Communist Party line.

[REDACTED]

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Special Agent REYNOLDS' report indicated that information had been received to the effect that Mr. and Mrs. ROBERT H. SENTMAN, when they lived at 1826 Harvard Street, Northwest, received JULES KORCHIEN's mail. It was also indicated that ROBERT H. SENTMAN received mail from JULES KORCHIEN of 310 West 97th Street, New York City.

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Further information was received to the effect that an alleged Communist corresponded with SENTMAN concerning a school which might have been a Communist training school.

Interviewed by Special Agents of the FBI, SENTMAN denied membership in any organizations advocating the overthrow of the Federal Government. He refused to answer questions as to his membership in the Washington Committee for Democratic Action and he refused to sign a statement.

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CONNOLLY dated December 17, 1941, entitled "Communist Party Activities, Washington, D. C."

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In the case entitled, "Mrs. ROBERT SENTMAN, WA, Lois Sentman; INTERNAL SECURITY - C," it is noted in a memorandum that

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(C) It should be noted that in the report of Special Agent S. W. REYNOLDS entitled, ROBERT EFFLIN SENTMAN, "already referred to, the name of ROBERT SENTMAN's wife, LOIS, appeared on the letterhead of the Washington Peace Mobilization, later known as the Washington People's Mobilization. Her name also appeared on the active indices of the Washington Committee for Democratic Action and of the National Federation for Constitutional Liberties.

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(C) In connection with CHARLES H. BERNHARD of 2126 16th Street, Northwest, who was visited by JULES KORCHIEN at his apartment for more than three hours on the night of August 27, as previously set out, the indices of the Washington Field Office reflected no information. However, it was noted that the New York report in the "Gregory" case dated August 16, 1946, reflected that [REDACTED] subject of instant case.

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CHARLES KRAMER

The following investigative activities are reported by Special Agent George G. McKenna.

The mail cover at CHARLES KRAMER'S home address of 4621 South 34th Street, Arlington, Virginia, indicated that he received the following mail:

On August 7, 1946, HEURT SER VASS contacted DUNCAN LEE and requested DICK's phone number, which is Rector 2-4100, New York City, at No. 2 Wall Street, 15th Floor, care of Dobau, Leisure, Newton, Lombard, Iroine Law Firm. (Dick Heppner is the individual referred to).

On August 15, 1946, DUNCAN LEE contacted Miss ANNABELLE ANDES in New York City at Eldorado 5-2335.

On August 18, 1946, JACK SCULLEY (phonetic) contacted DUNCAN LEE and said that he was at his sister's in Belle Haven and would like for DUNCAN and his wife to come over. DUNCAN then received instructions for getting to Belle Haven, the address being 30 Edgewood, Belle Haven, Virginia.

On August 20, 1946, DUNCAN LEE contacted Mrs. BECKETT, phonetic, who was apparently at GUY MARTIN's. Mrs. BECKETT said that she would like DUNCAN to meet Mrs. GOULD.

On August 23, MARJORIE ECKER contacted ISHBEL LEE and stated that she lived in Cleveland Park, 3309 Highland Place, and invited ISHBEL over for dinner.

On the same date ISHBEL LEE contacted DUNCAN LEE's secretary and desired to know if there was a letter there for DUNCAN from an individual by the name of FISHER HOWE from Colorado.

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On August 26, 1946, MARY PRICE contacted ISHBEL LEE and said that she was going through on her way to New York. She offered her automobile for DUNCAN and ISHBEL to use while she was in New York as she was going up by train. *RU*

On August 28, 1946, DUNCAN LEE contacted ISHBEL LEE and was informed that MARGARET and HENRY ECKER will be at their home that evening. ISHBEL stated that MARY PRICE left her car with them to use while she was in New York. *RU*

It was confidentially ascertained that on August 20th, an individual, believed to be QUINN SHAUGHNESSY, contacted DUNCAN LEE, requesting him to prepare a Power of Attorney for CLAIRE CHENNAULT for DOROTHY MARY LOMBORG to be broad in power and not to describe DOROTHY or insert her address and that it was not to have the usual Army and Navy provisions, and requested the Power of Attorney to be in his possession on the following morning. *RU*

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[REDACTED] on August 17, 1946 related that SOLOMON LISCHINSKY contacted HARRY MAGDOFF and mentioned Manitoba as one of the places he had been to since being away on his trip. SOL told HARRY that HERB (SCHIMMEL) had just left him and HARRY answered that HERB was going to drop around to see him. LISCHINSKY inquired what HERB was going to do at Commerce or wondered if he was going over to the "Hill". HARRY said that he and HERB were going to work that out. They talked about DAVE (WEINTRAUB) who had been relieved of his duties with UMRA. SOL said he played chess with HERB (GOLDHAMMER) (phonetic) at Palo Alto, California and while there saw PAUL and FREDA. In addition, SOL played chess with SLOVO (phonetic) and WILLE (CAROSEL) (phonetic).

PHYSICAL SURVEILLANCE

On August 16, 1946 while Agent F. H. GREEN was having lunch at the Department of Commerce Cafeteria, he recognized MELVA LISCHINSKY, wife of the above captioned subject. On this occasion, she was not wearing a hat or wearing a coat, indicating that perhaps she is now

employed in the Department of Commerce. Agent GREEN believed that MELVA recognized him inasmuch as they are neighbors at Fairfax Village. MELVA LISCHINSKY was joined by a man whom she appeared to know very well and whom she seemed very glad to see. He was described as age forty-five, height 5' 4"; eyes dark, hair blond in front, dark brown or black in back of head, build short and chunky, very dark heavy eyebrows and round face. This man and MELVA LISCHINSKY engaged in earnest conversation for an hour after which time she left. When this man arose to leave he was surveilled to Room 7856 in the Department of Commerce Building where he entered and is apparently employed.

Special Agent F. H. GREEN on Sunday, August 18th at 1:30 A.M. noticed a couple leaving the LISCHINSKY home and LISCHINSKY was overheard asking the man of the couple to remember him to "BEADIE". The man who responded had a voice recognized to be that of HARRY MAGDOFF.

The writer on August 23, 1946 at 9:05 A. M. observed LISCHINSKY leave his home at 2002 B Fort Davis Drive, Southeast and enter his Pontiac Automobile, license number 55-726. It is to be noted that subject's faded 1935 Pontiac Sedan has been painted and is now a glossy dark green color. LISCHINSKY drove to the corner of 29th and Erie Streets, Southeast where he picked up a young woman and they proceeded to the Hotel GRAFTON, Connecticut and DeSales Street, N.W. which houses the Bureau of Supplies for UMRRA. The girl left the automobile at this point and entered the Hotel GRAFTON where she was observed entering Room 418. The name plate on this room is listed to "E. K. TUCKERMAN, Requirements Branch".

On August 29th, the writer commenced a surveillance at 8:30 A. M. near the corner of 29th Street and Erie Street, Southeast in an effort to identify the person LISCHINSKY picked up on August 23rd at this point and took to work. At 8:50 A. M., this same woman emerged from the apartment building at 2716 29th Street, Southeast and walked to the corner of 29th and Erie Streets, Southeast where she waited. At 9:05 A. M., LISCHINSKY arrived at this place in his car and the woman after entering road away with LISCHINSKY.

The writer made a check of the names on the mail boxes serving the apartment dwellers at 2716 29th Street, Southeast. It was noted that on the box used for Apartment A-192 the following names were indicated:

It is known that LISCHINSKY has a sister ~~PEARL~~ MANDEL who works at UNRRA and was taken to work by SOL when she lived at his home in Fairfax Village. It is further to be noted that PEARL MANDEL is listed in the UNRRA Headquarters telephone directory as being employed in Room 418 at the Hotel GRAFTON.

At 12:15 P. M. on August 29, 1946, LISCHINSKY left the Hotel GRAFTON and met an unidentified man in front of the building described as age thirty-eight, height five feet six inches, weight one hundred fiftyfive pounds, complexion dark, hair - completely bald on top of head with dark hair interspersed with gray on side; peculiarities - concave nose with wide nostrils, mole on left cheek near nose, large dimples. While leaving, these individuals walked to the FHA Building, Connecticut and Rhode Island Avenue, N.W., which they entered and were observed at lunch together in the cafeteria. They left the cafeteria at 12:45 P. M. and walked about the streets in the neighborhood. Suddenly they walked to SOL'S car parked opposite the FHA Building on M Street, N.W. and drove away.

The only mail received at the MAGDOFF residence since the last report in this matter was a letter from 1211 South 25th Street, Arlington, Virginia, to H. PLAGDOFF. The letter was dated August 17, 1946. It is to be noted that 1211 South 25th Street is the present address of PERRY R. TAYLOR, who has been in contact with MAGDOFF in the past regarding the Beverly Hills Pre-School. *Xu*

The following information was furnished by [REDACTED] for the period of August 14 to August 31, 1946, inclusive. *Xu* b2

The informant advised that on August 14th HARRY MAGDOFF contacted his mother-in-law and advised her that he arrived home at 11 PM, August 13, 1946. He further informed her that he had attended a meeting in the Secretary's office, where JIM CAREY (phonetic), of the CIO, was down to tell them about the trip to Russia. HARRY learned from his mother-in-law that STANLEY was home and was at Bryn Mawr, Pennsylvania. HARRY informed her that he would come up a week from Friday for the weekend. She informed HARRY that NATHAN expects HARRY to contact him about a job. *Xu*

On the same date the informant advised BEATTIE MAGDOFF contacted HARRY, who informed her of the meeting in the Secretary's office. He informed her that he stopped off in Baltimore, and sent her four books, one of the books is for her mother. The book is by the author of "All Brides are Beautiful". HARRY informed BEATTIE that he had a lot of work in the office as V. LEWIS BASSIE was leaving on Friday. *Xu*

Informant advised that on August 17th, SOL LISCHINSKY contacted HARRY MAGDOFF. SOL invited HARRY for dinner that day but HARRY declined, saying he had a lot of work to do for the nursery, and that HERB SCHILMEL was going to drop around. HARRY was supposed to teach a course at Agriculture next year. HARRY does not know what HERB SCHILMEL will do at Commerce. According to SOL DAVE WEINTRAUB had been offered a lot of jobs and expects a South American job on UNESCO. *Xu*

SOL informed HARRY that they had a little send-off for DAVE day before yesterday and the response to DAVE has been terrific in all parts of the world, wherever UNRRA is. HARRY informed SOL that he had talked with GUSTAV GUNDENBAZIN about WEINTRAUB leaving UNRRA, but had not talked with anyone at UNRRA. *Xu*

According to SOL, WEINTRAUB explained there was no reason for his resignation except that LaGUARDIA got sick of having a wise guy like DAVE around who was always right and he, LaGUARDIA, always wrong. The reason LaGUARDIA left the State Department, who called to find out why WEINTRAUB resigned, was that WEINTRAUB was building an empire for himself. MAGDOFF believed that LaGUARDIA thinks he's the biggest man on earth. SOL advised that LaGUARDIA said that DAVE WEINTRAUB kept his counsel but did not know what was going on in the Bureau of Supplies. *xy*

SOL informed HARRY that he played chess with HERB GOLDHAMMER (phonetic) at Palo Alto, and further stated that he saw PAUL and FRIEDA WALLIN in Palo Alto. He further informed MAGDOFF that he played a game of chess with SLOVO (phonetic, who is believed to be SOLOMON ADLER). SOL advised HARRY that SLOVO is in Washington but went away last Tuesday. SLOVO came here for a check-up on his ulcers. SOL explained that he spent quite a bit of time with SLOVO but did not get a chance to talk with him because JOEY SILVERMAN was always around. SOL stated he played a few hands with WILLY CAROSEL (phonetic). HARRY agrees to visit LISCHINSKY that evening. *xy*

In regard to SLOVO, it is believed that he is identical with SOLOMON ADLER, because during the recent surveillance of ADLER in Washington, it was ascertained that he was in frequent contact with SOL LISCHINSKY and JOEY SILVERMAN. Further, the surveillance revealed that ADLER was fond of chess and that ADLER left Washington on Tuesday, August 6th. *xy*

The informant further advised on August 17th that HERB SCHIMMEL was in touch with HARRY MAGDOFF on that date. At this time, HARRY informed HERB that he was going to see SOL LISCHINSKY that evening. They discussed arrangements to meet in town that day, and HERB advised the only three places to meet that he could mention were the park, the house, or his office. They made arrangements to meet in HERB's office, Room 103, at 5 PM. Later that day the informant advised HERB SCHIMMEL invited HARRY for dinner at his home that evening, but HARRY at first declined, and then stated he would discuss it later with SCHIMMEL. *xy*

The informant advised that on August 18th, HARRY MAGDOFF informed BEATTIE that he went to "that dinner" Thursday, but was home on Friday. *xy*

On the same date the informant ascertained that HARRY MAGDOFF accepted a dinner invitation from an unidentified man who resides at Apartment 102, 2500 Q Street, Washington, D. C. *xy*

On the same date one FRANK informed HARRY that he had AL BLACK out there from about noon until 10:30 PM yesterday. HARRY knows BLACK and was supposed to meet BLACK Friday, but HARRY could not get away from the office. FRANK *xy*

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advised he knew quite a bit about ^{al}BLACK. He stated BLACK is a midwest agricultural economist who came with the Department with the "3-A" and ran the corn-hog program and was then made Chief of the Bureau of Agriculture Economy. BLACK then headed the Farm Credit Administration and then quit and went with the "Hills Power Commission" (phonetic) to Iran for a couple of years. HARRY inquired if BLACK had any idea of the political situation in Iran. FRANK stated that they did not discuss that, but had discussed Russia quite a bit and BLACK evidently saw a number of things there locally that bothered him as BLACK went over there with a favorable attitude, but the things he saw in Iran, their method of operating, etc., may have changed BLACK's opinion. *ku*

FRANK thinks that BLACK is experiencing the kind of questioning that millions of people have in this country for the last six or eight months. HARRY related that this was interesting, and that he would like to talk to BLACK about it. It appears that BLACK will probably be "tied up" with HARRY's office. HARRY informed FRANK that SALI was terribly disappointed about the job because he was being considered but Secretary WALLACE wanted BLACK for the position. HARRY agreed to visit FRANK that day at 1:30 PM. FRANK instructed him to follow South Glebe Road past Buckingham, to Military Road, turn on Military Road to 37th Street, turn on 37th street and go on up the hill to FRANK's residence. *ku*

The informant advised that on August 18th, ADELIA PERAZICH invited HARRY MAGDOFF for dinner that day, because GEORGE wanted to talk to HARRY. HARRY accepted GEORGE's invitation for dinner Thursday at 7 PM at the PERAZICH residence, 3207 Oliver, N. W. GEORGE told HARRY that he wanted to get together with him to discuss something. *ku*

HARRY informed GEORGE that BASSIE went on vacation and he, HARRY, is the only one in the office. GEORGE stated "you fellows are having a lot of fun out there", and HARRY agreed. GEORGE related that he also understands FITZGERALD is working with HARRY in the same group, and GEORGE inquired if it wasn't because he couldn't get along with MIKE. He was treasurer of Local #118, United Federal Workers of America, CIO in Philadelphia. He lived in the same building with notorious Communists in the Philadelphia Area and associated with these individuals. His wife, BEATRICE is associated with the State, County and Municipal Workers of America and served as Secretary of Local #46 in Philadelphia.

CARL REEVE, a CP Worker in Philadelphia lived in the Carl Mackley Apartments with the VAN TASSELS. This apartment building was located at W and Bristol Streets.

[REDACTED] advised that on March 18, 1946 ^{b2 b7D} BEATRICE MAGDOFF in conversation with CAROLINE PLANK who apparently handles publicity for the various groups of the League of Women Voters advised PLANK of the Atomic Energy Meeting to be held on March 25, 1946 at St. Mary's Episcopal Church, 26th and Glebe Road, Alexandria, Virginia. According to MAGDOFF there would be three principal speakers whom she identified as follows: (1) DR. J. H. RUSH, whom she described as an Oakridge Atomic Scientist; (2) BRICE TCQL, a lawyer specializing in foreign law and employed by the Justice Department; (3) Congressman CHET HOLIFIELD. MAGDOFF stated that HOLIFIELD had accepted an invitation to deliver an address on "Domestic Legislation on the Control of Atomic Energy" but had later declined. MAGDOFF stated that CATHERINE STONE would probably deliver this speech. *Au*

On August 23, 1946 a physical surveillance was conducted in front of the home of HAROLD ALFRED and CATHERINE STONE at 1051 26th Road, South Arlington, Virginia. At this time it was noted that a 1940 Oldsmobile bearing 1946 DC tags #355 was parked in front of the address. It was ascertained that this license number was issued to DONALD C. STONE, 4921 Tilden Avenue, NT, Washington, D.C. According to a credit report which was recently received this DONALD C. STONE is a brother to HAROLD ALFRED STONE.

On September 4, 1946 it was ascertained that on that date HAROLD ALFRED STONE was employed by the Department of Agriculture Office of Budget and Finance Division of Fiscal Management. His name appears on the door of Room #149E which is in the east wing of the administration building of the Department of Agriculture. His telephone extension is 3183.

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SECRETHERBERT SIMON MARKS

Reference is made to the report in the instant case dated July 19, 1946 in which information was set forth as obtained from a confidential source that numerous individuals had been correspondents of the subject in 1944.

On August 22, 1946 the Albany Field Division advised that WILLIAM A. LYONS who is believed to be identical with the BILL LYONS with whom the subject was in communication in 1944 lives with his wife FERN, 11 Davis Street, Binghamton, New York.

Fern Lyons

LYONS has a twenty year background in the electrical industry and from September 1942 to June 9, 1944 was on loan by the New York, Pennsylvania and New Jersey Utilities Company to the Office of War Utilities, War Production Board, serving as Chief of the Fuel and Allocation Branch.

LYONS entered the electrical industry in 1924 with the Consolidated Edison Company of New York, remaining in the Accounting Department for five years. For the next fifteen years he served in various finance, accounting, and management capacities, Associated Gas and Electric Systems. From October 1, 1941 until he went with the War Production Board, he was comptroller of the New York, Pennsylvania and New Jersey Utilities Company, 61 Broadway, New York City. From June 1944 until the present LYONS has been assistant to the president of the New York State Electric and Gas Corporation, Binghamton, New York. He was thirty-eight years of age in 1944. His previous addresses were 1819-37th Street, Northwest, Washington, D.C., 315 Warwick Avenue, West Englewood, New Jersey, 1200 Emerson Avenue, West Englewood, New Jersey, 622 Warwick Avenue, Teaneck, New Jersey.

Police records in the Binghamton area were checked with negative results.

In a letter dated August 8, 1946 to the Director from the Buffalo Field Division the following information was set forth concerning another of the individuals who corresponded with the subject in 1944.

Investigation in the neighborhood of 28 Kepple Street, Buffalo, New York reflected that THEO MARJORIA ADAMS had been visiting her aunt, Mrs. HENRY BENSON in March of 1946 at which time she had just been discharged from the WAVES. THEO MARJORIA ADAMS is now employed by the United States Government in Washington, D.C., Bureau or branch unknown. Her mother, MARJORIA ADAMS, is now in the WACS and has recently returned to Germany after a furlough where she is to be discharged from the WACS and receive a civilian position in Germany.

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THEO MAJORA ADAMS was employed at Eastman Kodak Company in Rochester, New York from September 19, 1942 to November 9, 1943 at which time she left to join the WAVES. The information appearing upon her application is as follows:

Investigation did not reveal anything detrimental to the reputation of THEO ADAMS.

On August 29, 1946 the Knoxville Field Division furnished the following information concerning individuals who had communicated with the subject in 1944:

It has been determined that MILDRED HENRY was born August 19, 1910 at Buffalo, Alabama, where she attended the Chambers High School and later the Wheeler Business College, graduating February, 1929. She has been employed by the Tennessee Valley Authority as Junior typist since February 18, 1935.

It was further determined that PAUL and MILDRED HENRY formerly resided at 2866 Kingston Pike, Knoxville, Tennessee, but left that address approximately one year ago and are now residing in Atlanta, Georgia, address unknown. The records of the Retail Credit Association, Knoxville Police Department, Knox County Sheriff's Office as well as the indices of the Knoxville Field Division were checked which resulted negatively concerning PAUL and MILDRED HENRY.

FRANCES SHIRLEY - Records of the Retail Credit Association Knoxville reflect that FRANCES SHIRLEY presently resides at 210 Haynes Place, and is employed by the Tennessee Valley Authority.

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Records of the Knoxville Police Department, Sheriff's Office and the indices of the Knoxville Field Division were checked, and no further background information concerning FRANCES SHIRLEY was available.

LILLIAN and ELEANOR TRIMBLE - It has been determined that LILLIAN S. TRIMBLE and his wife ELEANOR JOSEPHINE HACKER TRIMBLE reside on Cherokee Drive, Knoxville, Tennessee. TRIMBLE is the owner and operator of the William S. Trimble Steel Company, 623 Atchley Street, Knoxville. He is thirty-nine years of age, and is the son of Mrs. SIDIE C. TRIMBLE, 1401 Fatherland Street, Nashville, Tennessee.

The records of the Retail Credit Association reflected that he has been a resident of Knoxville for years and is of good character and standing. Records of the Knoxville Police Department, Sheriff's Office and files of the Knoxville Field Division were checked with negative results.



The records of the Knoxville Police Department, Sheriff's Office, Retail Credit Association and the indices of this office were checked, but failed to reveal anything further concerning LILLIAN and MARGARET L. CHERWIN.

HARRY JAMES MITCHING - It was determined that HARRY JAMES MITCHING is a member of the law firm Miller, Miller, and Martin in Chattanooga, Tennessee, which is an old reputable firm. The file at the credit bureau in Chattanooga contained the following information concerning HARRY JAMES MITCHING:

He is a native of New York City and a graduate of Columbia University Law School. He is married to the former VIRGINIA LILLIAN EYER and they have two children. The file indicated MITCHING was transferred to Chattanooga in 1937 as the personnel attorney for the local Tennessee Valley Authority Office and that his salary at that time was approximately eight thousand dollars per year. MITCHING, according to the file, was highly regarded personally and his credit rating was satisfactory. It was indicated he purchased a home on Lookout Mountain in 1939, estimated to be worth ten thousand dollars.

The file further reflected MITCHING was a member of the Temporary Coast Guard Reserve. It was further indicated that he was formerly at 60 Wall Street, New York City; that he resided 37 Belair Road, Staten Island, and was formerly at 109 West 61st Street, New York City and also at 931 Rahway, Westfield, New Jersey. He was listed as a partner in the law firm

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of Hitching and Drake. The file at the credit bureau further reflected that in school HITCHING was selected as Kent scholar for highest grades. He served as chief advisor of the Campbell Club and was a member of Alpha Chi Delta legal fraternity. While in Chattanooga he is listed as a member of the Fairyland Club, the Junior Chamber of Commerce and many TVA organizations. It was indicated he was appointed to be assistant general counsel at Chattanooga for the TVA to replace HENRY H. FOLTER who accepted the post of general counsel for the LaFollette Civil Liberties Committee.

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A check of the Identification Division of the Chattanooga Police Department failed to reflect a record for HITCHING.

Reference is made to the report of BERT L. ZANDER dated July 19, 1946 in the instant case in which information was set forth that as a result of a physical surveillance ^{it} was ascertained that the subject had mailed a letter for his wife addressed to the Park National Bank, Knoxville, Tennessee. In a letter dated August 29, 1946 the Knoxville Field Division advised that PAUL J. HENDERSON, Assistant Vice President of the Park National Bank advised that

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their records reflected that ~~REBECCA~~ ~~WORKS~~ maintains a checking account of \$500 and resides at 1528 28th Street, N.W., Washington, D.C. Mr. ~~HENDERSON~~ advised that this account was opened September 4, 1942 at which time \$76.75 was deposited and very little activity is indicated other than a deposit of \$31.41 in June of 1946.

In the same report in the instant case it was revealed that the subject and his wife had received a wedding invitation announcing the marriage of ~~LOUISE~~ ~~DINE~~ who was married to ~~FRANCIS~~ ~~O'BRIEN~~ on July 5, 1946 at Washington, D.C. In a letter dated August 29, 1946 the Knoxville Field Division furnished the following information concerning ~~LOUISE~~ ~~DINE~~, also known as ~~LOUISE~~ ~~D.~~ ~~NOURSE~~.

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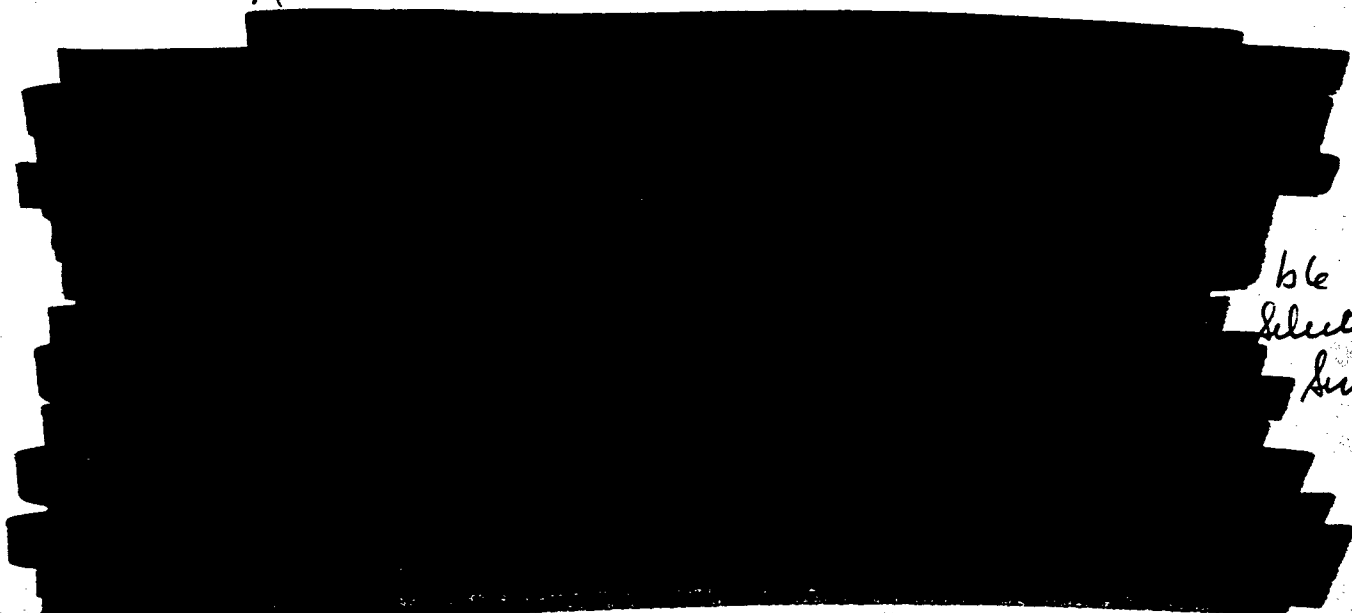
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Reference is again made to the above mentioned report in which information was set forth that subject had been contacted in 1944 by LOTTIE and IRA LICHTERMAN and Mrs. O. K. MARTIN of Memphis, Tennessee. In a letter dated August 23, 1946 the Memphis Field Division furnished the following information concerning these individuals:

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With regard to IRA and LOTTIE LICHTERMAN it has been ascertained that they are man and wife presently residing on the Lake Crest Farm, Park Avenue, Memphis, having phone number 48-5276. This is an exclusive neighborhood of Memphis and it has also been ascertained that LICHTERMAN has, for the past six or seven years, been a Commissioner of the Memphis Light, Gas, and Water Division, a municipally owned public utility. In view of his position listed above, LICHTERMAN is very close to the city administration of Memphis, Tennessee, the leadership of which is under the direction of EDWARD H. CRUMP.

In addition, IRA J. LICHTERMAN is President and Owner of the Southern Leather Company located at 274 Monroe Avenue, Memphis, and the Secretary-Treasurer of this organization is his brother-in-law, WILLIAM A. LOEWENBERG, whose wife is RUTH LOEWENBERG. They live at 69 St. Albans Fairway.



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In view of LICHTERMAN's high position in the City Administration of Memphis, no further background investigation is being made concerning him at the present time due to the possible adverse political implications which might be involved. However, if additional background investigation is desired it is requested that the Washington Field Division please furnish pertinent background information concerning HERBERT SIMON LARNS in order to facilitate any additional investigation necessary.

With regard to Mrs. O. K. MARTIN, 209 East Street, who is listed as a correspondent of HERBERT STON WORKS, it has been ascertained that her maiden name is WILLIE PIERCE CUNNINGHAM and that her husband was Mr. O. K. MARTIN, a former merchant at McKenzie, Tennessee, who died there approximately four or five years ago. Following Mr. MARTIN's death WILLIE PIERCE MARTIN came to Memphis, Tennessee, where she took up residence with her sister, Mrs. MYRTLE CUNNINGHAM, 209 East Street, also a widow. It has been ascertained that she lived with Mrs. CUNNINGHAM at 209 East Street until December 13, 1945, at which time the two of them moved to 36 North Cleveland Street, Memphis. On June 24, 1946, Mrs. MARTIN and Mrs. CUNNINGHAM left a Change of Address indicating that they were moving to 1564 Eastmoreland Street, Memphis, where they are still residing. Mrs. MARTIN was employed about two years ago for a short period of time as a laborer at William L. Webster Company, a manufacturing chemist located at 224 East Street, but since that time has terminated that employment voluntarily. She has one son, WYOM MARTIN, who is a registrant of Local Board 9, Memphis, and who entered the United States Navy on April 14, 1944, and was discharged on June 4, 1946, where he had Navy serial number 9710130. It is understood that recently he married a girl from Texas, name unknown, and is presently residing at 230 Sixth Street, Tomar, Mississippi. Mrs. MARTIN also has a son, KENNETH TIMOTHY MARTIN, a farmer located at Huntingdon, Tennessee. Mrs. MARTIN has no credit rating in Memphis and has no criminal record at the Memphis Police Department.

Inquiries in Memphis have developed no information to indicate that Mrs. MARTIN has ever been engaged in any subversive activities or has ever been suspected of being engaged in such activities.

Reference is again made to the report dated July 19, 1946 in which information was set forth that the subject had received a communication from CHARLES ELMER KOHLHEPP, 1820 East Hampton Road, E. Milwaukee, Wisconsin. In a letter dated August 16, 1946 the Milwaukee Field Division furnished the following information regarding Mr. and Mrs. KOHLHEPP:

You are advised that CHARLES ELMER KOHLHEPP of 1820 East Hampton Road was the subject of an employee investigation from the Office of Emergency Management by the Milwaukee Field Division which investigation is reflected in the report of HAROLD V. LANCLOIS dated February 4, 1943. This investigation reflects KOHLHEPP as an applicant for a position of "Chief of Reg. Nat. Redist. Section" of Office for Emergency Management as a dollar-a-year man.

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He was born September 15, 1896 in Baltimore, Maryland, was a veteran of the first World War and arrived in Milwaukee from Baltimore in 1921. He has been employed by the Wisconsin Public Service Corporation for twenty-one years and is vice-president with a salary of \$18,000 a year.

The investigation reflected no derogatory information indicating that KOHLHEPP and his family are considered loyal, patriotic Americans of excellent reputation. It was noted that the Bureau letter instituting investigation in that matter was directed to the Washington field Division with a request for a Dies Committee index check.

The indices of the Milwaukee Field Division have not subsequently reflected any derogatory information concerning KOHLHEPP or his wife,

Reference is made to the report in the instant case dated June 17, 1946 in which information was set forth that the subject had addressed a communication on March 11, 1946 to WILLIAM T. GOLDEN at Woodward, Alabama. In a letter dated August 27, 1946 the New York Field Division furnished the following information concerning WILLIAM T. GOLDEN. (It is noted that considerable background information has already been set forth in previous reports concerning Mr. GOLDEN.)

At 61 Broadway, New York City, the name of WILLIAM T. GOLDEN, 31st Floor, appears on the lobby information board. However, a check of the realtors handling this building reflects that GOLDEN did at one time occupy office space in the Carl W. Loeb, Rhoades and Company.

A check of the Credit Bureau of Greater New York and Dun & Bradstreet was negative.

At the New York Public Library a check of Poors Directors and Executives reflects that WILLIAM T. GOLDEN was born at New York City in 1909; attended the University of Pennsylvania, class of 1930 and Harvard Business School, class of 1931; and was employed at the Carl W. Loeb, Rhoades and Company. It was further reflected that he was a director of the Woodward Iron Company, Woodward, Alabama and the Iefler Patent Company, New York City. His residence is listed as 2918 Olive Avenue, N.W., Washington, D.C.

It was ascertained by pretext that GOLDEN left the Carl W. Loeb, Rhoades and Company two years ago and has not as yet returned with them, where he was employed as a customers man.

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Reference is made to the report dated August 1, 1946 in instant case in which information was set forth that on July 17, 1946 subject had contacted Mr. J. F. ~~PENHEIMER~~ of New York City (Mur-2-0100, NYC). In a letter dated August 29, 1946 the New York Field Division furnished the following information concerning a Mr. ~~PENHEIMER~~:

It was established that this telephone number, Murray Hill 2-0100 is assigned to the Hotel Algonquin, 59 West 14th Street, New York City.

At the Hotel Algonquin, Mr. ~~MARTIN~~, Resident Manager, informed that he was unable to find any record of the subject as having stayed at the hotel at any time and with particular reference to the date of July 17, 1946.

A review of the "New York Times" indices, New York City directories and the indices of the New York Field Division was negative.

Mr. ~~MARTIN~~ explained that it was entirely possible that ~~PENHEIMER~~ dropped into the hotel and received a call and that no record whatsoever was kept of it.

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In a letter dated August 29, 1946 the New York Field Division furnished the following information concerning Mrs. R. FAGIN:

The Credit Bureau of Greater New York listed one RICHARD A. and MARCELLA FAGIN of the Savoy Plaza at 29th Street and Fifth Avenue, New York City. Their previous address was shown as 7505 Teasdale Street, Hollywood, California and 1845 Oakwood Avenue, Glendale, California. RICHARD was listed as an Assistant Chief Pilot with the American Air Lines having been employed by that company since May 2nd, 1930. Previous New York addresses were shown as 262 Chapel Road, Manhasset, Long Island and 10 Lynn Road, Fort Washington, Long Island.

At the American Air Lines office, 100 West 42nd Street, Miss G. ~~MILES~~ advised that their personnel record of RICHARD FAGIN reflected only the following information regarding Mrs. FAGIN.

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Mrs. FAGIN's maiden name was PARCELLA SALLEY, the daughter of R. R. and MAE SALLEY and she married RICHARD FAGIN in 1932.

Miss HERS stated that RICHARD FAGIN had a very favorable record with American Air Lines. She was unable to furnish the present address of Mr. and Mrs. FAGIN.

Mr. JOHN BROWN, General Manager of the Hotel Roosevelt advised that he had known Mr. and Mrs. FAGIN since 1938, having met them in El Paso, Texas. He stated that Mrs. FAGIN, known to him as SALLY FAGIN, had attended high school in El Paso and that she had married RICHARD FAGIN in that city. He continued that RICHARD FAGIN was presently with a corporation known as CRUISAIRO (ph), a new air line opened up between Brazil and Miami, which he believed is sponsored by American Air Lines. At the present time he believed FAGIN to be on leave of absence from American Air Lines and is residing in South America.

However, Mrs. FAGIN obtained an apartment in Washington, D.C. through one of the hotel men in that city.

Reference is made to the report in the instant case dated August 1, 1946 in which information was set forth that the subject telephonically communicated on July 17, 1946 with an unidentified individual at telephone number 6054, Oakland, California. By letter dated August 20, 1946 the San Francisco Field Division furnished the following information concerning that contact.

This number was ascertained to be Ashberry 6054, listed to J. ROBERT OPPENHEIMER, 41 Eagle Hill Road, Berkeley, California, who is one of the foremost scientists in atomic research and is presently an advisor to the Senate Committee on Atomic Energy.

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CONF. INFO [redacted] was able to advise that one HERB MARKS called Ashberry 6054 at approximately 6.00 PM, July 17, 1946, from the Union Station, Washington, D.C. and spoke with ANNE WILSON, secretary to HERB MARKS and a temporary guest in the Oppenheimer home. The informant states this conversation was mostly personal and affectionate, and that MARKS said he tried to get in touch with J. ROBERT OPPENHEIMER at the Algonquin Hotel that evening without success and that he, MARKS, was going to move in with the FERGUSONS in Georgetown.

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[redacted] whose identity is known to the Bureau advised that the subject carried a group life insurance policy with the War Agencies Employee Protective Association, Washington, D.C. Informant also advised that subject had received a communication from MORRIS A. BELMONT which was an advertisement seeking subscription to a publication known as 1946 Union of the Washington Squirrel Cage published and distributed exclusively by the Columbia Publishing Company, 501-03 Atlantic Building, Washington, D.C.

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On July 29, 1946 the subject and his wife received a communication announcing the birth of a child to ELIZABETH and JOHN LYONN, Box 837, Route 10, Takoma, Washington.

As a result of a mail cover placed on the subject at the residence of Mr. JOHN FERGUSON, 3405 O Street, NW, it was ascertained that the subject had received the following communications: on 8-6-46 from 420 Lexington Avenue, New York City.

8-19-46 from Dr. ALLEN BERNSTEIN, 1109 N. Calvert Street, Baltimore, Maryland.

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The following bank records of the subject and REBECCA B. WELLS maintained at the Washington Loan and Trust Company, 17th and G Street, NW for the month of July and August, 1946 are set forth below:

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JOHN PAUL MILAN MARSALKA

MARSALKA alias JACK MARSALKA, JOHN M. MARSALKA and Dr. MARSALKA first came to the attention of the Washington Field Office in this case in November 1945 as a contact of ROBERT TALCOTT MILLER, III, a subject.

MARSALKA, however, is no stranger to the indices of the Washington Field Office. The fruits of previous Washington Field Office and other Bureau investigations of MARSALKA will be set out below.

The occasion of MILLER's contact with MARSALKA was a party at the latter's home on November 24, 1945. MILLER's car was observed near MARSALKA's residence, 3317 R Street, N. W., Washington, D. C., as was the car of PHILIP O. KEENEY, 215 B Street, N. E., Washington, D. C. (KEENEY and his wife, MARY JANE KEENEY likewise are subjects of instant case.)

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Interest in MARSALKA heightened even more when his physical description was compared with that of "Jack", an unidentified contact of GREGORY. GREGORY's description of "Jack" was as follows:

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It is noted that the two descriptions afford striking instances of similarity as well as certain discrepancies. An effort is now being made to obtain pictures of MARSALKA to be exhibited to GREGORY.

The results of a file review and preliminary investigation of subject follow. Because his wife is of foreign origin and of possible interest, she has been included.

General Background

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of Special Agent J. E. WALLACE dated at Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, November 20, 1940, in the case entitled, "JOHN PAUL MIKLAN MARSALKA, Department Applicant, Immigration and Naturalization Service, Translator and Interpreter." (Report)

Subject's education and employment are dealt with in detail under the respective subheadings below.

Father MICHAEL P. KAUSHNER, New Kensington, Pennsylvania, advised Special Agent WALLACE that subject and his father were former members of the Catholic Church but that neither had attended in recent years. The father was under the son's influence and the son was a Communist in Father KAUSHNER's opinion. The father was a member of the I.W.O. in New Kensington, Father KAUSHNER stated, as well as of the National Slovak Sokal Organization which according to Father KAUSHNER favored the Benes Government in Czechoslovakia.

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It should be noted here that a report on MARSALKA by Special Agent E. L. BARTON dated January 27, 1942, at Washington, D. C., in case entitled, "JOHN PAUL MILAN MARSALKA, was, John P. M. Marsalka - Internal Security - C", disclosed that in applying for a Civil Service job, subject gave his wife's maiden name as MILADA FRIEDLOVA and said he had married her August 30, 1929, at Oakland, Maryland.)

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A neighborhood investigation conducted by Special Agent WALLACE in New Kensington in 1940 developed some evidence that subject and MILADA lived together before their marriage.

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Special Agent WALLACE's investigation indicated subject had met MILADA when he was a student at the University of Pittsburgh and a member of the JOHN KOLAR Club, an organization named after the Slovak poet, KOLAR, who believed that all Slovaks should stick together. When MILADA first came to the United States in 1926 from Prague, Czechoslovakia, to attend a coal conference at Carnegie Tech, she remained to work as a coal chemist in Pittsburgh. The Kolar Club entertained her at a reception and subject met her then. In general, Special Agent WALLACE's investigation developed no evidence of Communist activities on subject's part although WALLACE's contacts were quick to point out that their associations with subject antedated his residence in Russia which began in 1934 and that they did not know how his stay in Russia might have effected him.

Mrs. RUTH CRAWFORD MITCHELL, advisor of Nationality rooms, University of Pittsburgh, gave WALLACE the following information based on her contacts with subject while he was a university student as well as subsequently while he was abroad and after he had returned from Russia.

While on an exchange scholarship at Charles IV University in Prague, from 1930 to 1933, subject spent part of his time living in the village of Suca, Czechoslovakia, in order to study peasant life and compare it with rural conditions in the United States. One thing Mrs. MITCHELL remembered that seemed to intrigue subject was that under capitalism in Czechoslovakia, many of the peasants had to go without adequate health care

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and that of those who could afford luxuries like vaccinations, many were too superstitious to take advantage of it. In Russia, on the other hand, the Communist State provided hospitalization and other health benefits and required the people to submit to health-giving measures. Subject seemed to think this was a better system than the capitalistic system in Czechoslovakia.

Mrs. MITCHELL concluded that subject possessed no radical or Communistic tendencies "unless one looked on Communism as an international danger instead of an economic change." She also advised that subject was on leave from the American Embassy in Moscow before the Munich Appeasement Conference and after Munich, decided to return to America. Subject's wife came to the United States from Russia by way of Manchuria. It should be noted that subject states he has had C.M.T.C. and R.O.T.C. training and obtained a commission as Second Lieutenant, Coast Artillery Corps, Third Corps Area, in 1928, but in 1930 transferred to the Military Intelligence Department. (Report of Special Agent E. L. BARTON at Washington, D. C., dated January 27, 1942, cited above.)

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Mrs. MITCHELL, referred to above, told Special Agent J. E. WALLACE (report cited above) that the Czechoslovakian Government offered five exchange scholarships in 1930 to American students and that subject applied for one at the University of Pittsburgh but the University refused to sponsor him because of his poor scholarship. Believing his low grades attributable to the fact that he had to work his way through school, she

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gave subject a high character recommendation and he won the scholarship. Subject's ambition while at the University of Pittsburgh apparently was to become a teacher of European History. No radical tendencies on his part were noted by instructors there although he did seem to have been under the influence of Dr. RALPH E. TURNER, History Professor, later dismissed as undesirable because of bombastic radicalism.

UNRRA, apparently as Instructor in UNRRA School conducted at the University of Maryland, College Park, Maryland.

An application for a government job first brought subject to the Bureau's full investigative attention. A Bureau letter to the Washington Field Office dated November 6, 1940, requested investigation of JOHN PAUL MILAN MARSALKA, Departmental Applicant; Immigration and Naturalization Service - Translator and Research Assistant -. This letter cited references to the subject in the Bureau's file and mentioned that one, Dr. MARSALKA, was connected with the Progressive Librarians Council, an allegedly radical organization (see subheading, Organizational Affiliations below.) This Bureau letter also stated that a report of Special Agent ROBERT E. MENBY dated June 20, 1940, at Washington, D. C., in case entitled, "ANTHONY JOSEPH BARRETT, was; HARRY CLEMENTS LANGE, Espionage" quoted a source in the State Department as advising that J. P. MARSALKA was closely associated with BARRETT and LANGE and possessed very radical views. There was no indication, however, that MARSALKA was actually engaged in espionage.

Special Agent W. L. OBLINGER's report dated at Washington, D. C., November 15, 1940, in case entitled, "JOHN PAUL MILAN MARSALKA, was, Departmental Applicant; Immigration and Naturalization Service - Translator and Research Assistant -", disclosed that subject was hired as a messenger (later a clerk) by the American Embassy in Moscow in May, 1934, because he spoke Russian. He later brought his wife to Moscow. He stayed with the Embassy until August, 1939, when he was fired for inefficiency and a lack of the following qualities:

Ability to concentrate, judgment, force, energy, discretion, initiative and alertness. Besides all this, subject was considered pro-Soviet and anti-United States Embassy to such an extent that he could not be trusted with confidential work. Subject's superiors also observed that he was somewhat emotional concerning Czechoslovakia.

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Washington credit records indicated that WARSALKA returned to the United States from Russia about August 1939, residing since then in New York City; at the Harrington Hotel in Washington, D. C. and after perhaps late 1939 at 3317 R Street, N. W., Washington, D. C.

It is interesting to note that subject may have been accompanied on his return to the United States from Russia by Mrs. GERTRUDE RIENT GANGADAREN, was., Truda Rient, Trude Gangadaran.

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Agent RICHARD N. PRANKE dated March 6, 1943, at New York City in the case entitled, "ALEXANDER SELENOVICH FOLINE, was., et al, Espionage - R". As of the summer of 1943, the woman was working in New York City for the British Secretary Corps Coordinator.

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Subject next appeared in Government Service on February 7, 1940, when he was appointed as a Minor Librarian's Assistant in the Periodical Division of the Library of Congress at \$1260 per annum. EDGAR F. ROGERS, Personnel Director of the Library, advised Special Agent OBLINGER (report cited above) that he believed WARSALKA came to the Library upon recommendation of the former Ambassador to Russia, WILLIAM BULLITT.

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At the Library, MARSALKA headed the United Federal Workers of America, Local 28, C. I. O. (See subheading, Organizational Affiliations, below.) The Union's publication, "L. C. News Letter" criticized MACLEISH for not establishing a clear-cut promotions-from-within-the-organization policy. A subsequent article in the publication denied that this criticism was meant in any but a constructive sense.

In any event, subject grew impatient waiting for a better job to open in the Library and advised the Library on November 7, 1940, that he would be working there no longer because he had obtained a job in the Department of Justice.

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Special Agent OBLINGER's neighborhood investigation in Washington, D. C., revealed nothing derogatory to the subject and his wife in a political or any other sense. It was stated that subject's wife had been doing a great deal of "relief work" in Washington, D. C., since March, 1940; that the MARSALKAS were supporting a Mrs. XTABB and her child, refugees from England, who arrived in Washington, D. C., in the summer of 1940 to reside with the MARSALKAS.

Before leaving OBLINGER's report, it is noted that this report contains information that MARSALKA had appeared at the State Department to inquire what efforts were being made by the Department to protect his friend, TYLER KENT, then in custody of British authorities. MARSALKA indicated that he intended to confer with KENT's mother relative to helping KENT. TYLER KENT, it may be added, eventually was deported to this country by the British, avoiding through his American citizenship a treason trial, it is believed in connection with leakage of official information.

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Special Agent ROY M. STELLE's report dated August 29, 1944, at Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, in the same case describes at some length an interview with Dr. JOHN GEISE, Head of the History Department at the University of Pittsburgh, concerning MARSALKA who worked in GEISE's Department upon joining the University in the summer of 1943. GEISE said subject came to the University to teach in the Army Specialized Training Program (ASTP) and the Civilian Affairs Training School after having been commissioned at Charlottesville, Virginia, as an Army officer and detailed to the University. He wore civilian clothes however. Apparently, his instructorship was in languages.

When the ASTP was discontinued, subject was asked to aid the management of Russian War Relief, MARSALKA consulted Dr. GEISE as to whether he should accept this part-time management and GEISE told him he saw no reason why not.

GEISE had known subject for twenty years and regarded him as essentially conservative although subject did not realize he was conservative. GEISE said that subject admires the results the Russians have achieved but not necessarily the means by which they achieved such results. GEISE advised that (Dr. MORTIMER GRAVES, Executive Secretary of the American Council of Learned Societies, Washington, D. C., speaks highly of MARSALKA

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does RALPH TURNER of the Division of Educational Science in Cultural Relations of the State Department. (It may be noted that Special Agent J. E. WALLACE's report cited above refers to subject's university association with Dr. RALPH E. TURNER, who after his dismissal was said to have obtained a position with the Social Security Board in Washington, D. C., as economic historian.

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In connection with ~~subject's~~ ^{subject's} Russian War Relief activities, it should be reported that through

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[REDACTED] (report of Special Agent CHARLES F. BULLARD dated June 24, 1944, at Washington, D. C. in the case entitled, "JOHN PAUL MILAN MARSALKA - Internal Security - R.")

It is also of interest that an investigation of subject's b account at the First National Bank, Pittsburgh, reflected he received a number of checks from Russian War Relief. An interesting withdrawal subject made from his account was a check written on August 26, 1944, signed by him and payable to Mrs. JAMES LEWIS. This check was endorsed by Mrs. JAMES LEWIS and H. R. SCHIPIS. (Report of Special Agent ALEX C. DAVIDSON, JR., dated January 24, 1945, at Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, in the same case.)

It is to be noted that the name, Mrs. JAMES LEWIS is the married name of SHURA LEWIS, subject of an investigation in the Washington Field Office.

To return to Dr. GEISE, GEISE advised that MARSALKA was to report to the Army Industrial College, Washington, D. C., on February 1, 1944, for assignment.

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. Subject was not hired.

The same report shows that subject took an appeal to the Civil Service Commission on August 19, 1944. He was turned down by the Board of Appeals for appointment to a position with the Army although the door was left open for possible appointment later to the position.

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Special Agent BULLARD's review of the relevant Civil Service investigation of this case discloses that HERMAN R. HABICHT described as definitely pro-Soviet was a close friend of the subject in Moscow. (HABICHT has been under investigation by the Washington Field Office.)

The same report quotes DONALD H. NICHOLS, Vice-Consul, Addis Ababa, Ethiopia, who knew subject at Moscow, as saying subject was a "parlor pink", outspokenly pro-Soviet although NICHOLS considered him loyal to the United States.

Further investigation reflected in Special Agent BULLARD's report in this case dated November 13, 1944, at Washington, D. C., included the check of records at

Special Agent BULLARD's report dated November 21, 1944, at Washington, D. C., in this case, entitled, "JOHN PAUL MILAN MARSALKA, Internal Security - R", shows that subject was appointed to a job with UNRRA on August 28, 1944, but that his services were terminated on October 27, 1944,

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reason not stated. He had been recommended for employment by Dr. FRANK LUNK who was in charge of UNRRA's Educational Division at the University of Maryland, College Park, Maryland. It is known that previous to this, MARSALKA had been considered for a position on an UNRRA mission to Russia.

According to Special Agent BULLARD's report dated November 3, 1944, at Washington, D. C., same case,

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By memorandum dated September 7, 1945, the Bureau advised the Washington Field Office that subject had applied for a job with the Foreign Economic Administration as an economic analyst. Special Agent JOHN A. SWARTZ in a report dated October 12, 1945, at Washington, D. C., in case entitled, "JOHN PAUL MILAN MARSALKA - Internal Security - R", advised that the subject had not made such an application and was not employed by the F. E. A. Same report mentions information from [REDACTED] on April 23, 1945, that Mrs. JOHN MARSALKA advised Mrs. ROBERT MILLER (wife of subject MILLER) that she and subject were acquainted with SAM and BELLA RODMAN, Tauximont, Virginia. BELLA RODMAN is an alleged member of the White Collar Branch of the Communist Party in the District of Columbia.

[REDACTED] advised that in a contact with subject MILLER on December 1, 1945, MARSALKA told MILLER that the Army requested him to go to Tokyo for a job with the Civil Affairs Staff and that he had applied for a passport. Subject explained the job involved general economic and social research with the aim of eliminating feudalism and fascism in Japan. Subject said he would be leaving in about a month to be gone nine months or a year. X4

What happened to this prospective employment is not known.

It has come to the attention of the Washington Field Office that subject has obtained a position to teach at Yale University, New Haven, Connecticut, beginning in September.

Prior to his departure to New Haven, subject evidently is missing no chances to propagandize for the Russians. Special Agent LORENZO WILDMAN of this office heard a forum-type broadcast over Washington Radio Station WJFK on August 30, 1946, in which Dr. MARSALKA and FREDERICK KUHN, Foreign Affairs writer of the Washington Post, discussed the possibilities of

improving American-Russian relations. The announcer referred to MARSALKA as a Yale Professor and former resident of Russia.

According to Special Agent WILDEAN, MARSALKA took the characteristic pro-Soviet line opposing the new American "get tough" foreign policy and pretending there is no "iron curtain" except on the American side. MARSALKA applauded the idea of America's releasing figures regarding its troop dispositions abroad as requested recently by Russia inasmuch as this action would tend to penetrate the American "iron curtain" which is harming American-Soviet relations.

Some mention should be made of the employment history of subject's wife.


Special Agent J. E. WALLACE in a report referred to in subheading, "General Background", above stated that records of the Kopper's Company, Kopper's Building, Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, showed she had been employed by the Kopper's Company on December 31, 1928, as laboratory chemist at \$135 per month. Her salary was raised to \$150 per month on April 1, 1930. She resigned September 30, 1930, to return to Czechoslovakia. These records gave her birth date as December 17, 1904, and her previous employer as the State Fuel Research, Prague, Czechoslovakia, (1923-1928). She was employed under the name, MILADA FRIEDIOVA.

The report of Special Agent ROY M. STELLE dated August 29, 1944, at Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, in the case entitled, "JOHN PAUL MILAN MARSALKA - Internal Security - R", quotes Dr. JOHN GEISE, Head of the University of Pittsburgh's History Department, as stating Mrs. MARSALKA is a monitor for the Federal Communications Division in Washington, D. C., and that she speaks twenty-two languages.

A check of the files at the Washington Field Office shows that her employment was terminated by the Federal Communications Commission in 1941 and that she received a special hearing by the Civil Service Appeals Board on November 5, 1941. On July 14, 1942, the Board of Appeals reversed the decision and she was considered eligible for employment. The F. C. C. was advised on September 25, 1942, that she was eligible for reinstatement. At the hearing she was represented by EDWARD FRUCHTMAN, Attorney, and who is a member of the Washington Committee for Democratic Action and American League for Peace and Democracy and a candidate for delegate to the National Convention of the National Lawyers' Guild.

Mrs. MARSALKA appears to have been an officer of one of the U. F. W. A. locals. On a questionnaire filled out for another government

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agency, she admitted having held office for a number of years in the Czechoslovakian-American National Alliance which has been referred to in hearings before the House Committee on Un-American Activities. [There is further reference to Mrs. MARSALKA in a report of Special Agent JAMES F. CASTERLINE dated June 25, 1943, at Newark, New Jersey, in the case entitled, ]


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Organizational Affiliations

A file review connects subject with a diversity of organizations, generally Communist dominated. For example, report of Special Agent T. HAWTHORNE PHILLIP dated November 26, 1943, at the Washington Field Division, identifies subject with the American Youth Congress and the United American-Spanish Relief Committee and terms him a distributor of Communist literature.

Report of Special Agent W. L. OBLINGER dated November 15, 1940, at Washington, D. C., in the case entitled, "JOHN PAUL MILAN MARSALKA, alias Jack Marsalka, Departmental Applicant, Immigration and Naturalization Service", quotes information from 

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In addition a Bureau letter of November 6, 1940, quotes a memorandum in the Bureau files stating that the Progressive Librarians Council had met in subject's home and identifies the Council's membership as largely identical with that of Local 28, U. F. W. A.

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A memorandum by Special Agent F. H. GREEN of the Washington Field Office concerning the subject dated December 6, 1945, also mentions WARSALKA as an alleged member of the Washington Bookshop Association.

It appears elsewhere in this report subject was District Manager of Russian War Relief in Pittsburgh in 1943-1944. It is believed to have been in behalf of Russian War Relief that subject attended a meeting of the Slovak Congress in the Pittsburgh area and of the Citizens' Coordinating Committee of Pittsburgh which is Communist controlled. (Report of Special Agent ROY L. STELLE, at Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, dated August 29, 1944, case entitled, "JOHN PAUL MILAN WARSALKA - Internal Security - R".)

Credit record examinations noted in the file review reflected no adverse information. No criminal record was located on subject.

Physical Surveillance

Physical Surveillance of subject was first undertaken on the evening of August 22, 1946, when he gave a stag party in his home, 3317 R Street, Washington, D. C.

Special Agents participating were: M. A. TAYLOR, KENNEDY R. CORBETT, COURTLAND J. JONES, JOHN F. BUSCHER, R. K. MCQUEEN, E. L. GRAMPP, HOWELL WEBB and WILLIAM E. CLARK.

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The guests numbered approximately thirty including Captains N. ~~DOROKHOV~~ and A. F. ~~BELIKOV~~, Assistant Russian Naval Attaches; subject, ~~LILLER~~; ~~DAVID R. WAHL~~; ~~LAURENCE TODD~~ of Tass News Agency. These men were all identified by agents who saw them. The same is true of ~~ARTHUR ISAAC SAUL~~, employe of the United States Department of Commerce.

The other guests have almost all been identified on the basis of surveillances of them when they left the party or by means of their automobile license plates. The guests so identified follow:

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(A) [redacted] subject and an unknown male companion walked to a nearby building housing among other tenants, the American Council of Learned Societies. They then walked to the National Educational Association and from there to the Statler Hotel. At the Statler, they engaged in earnest conversation in an obscure corner, shuffling a briefcase full of papers. Subject put his friend on a streetcar bound for the Library of Congress and then entered an office building on F Street where the newspaper, "PM", has its Washington Office. He emerged shortly afterward and went to an office building at 1420 New York Avenue, N. W. He then met subject, MARY JANE KEENEY, as though for lunch at Henderson's Grill, 14th Street and New York Avenue, N. W. They did not eat, however, leaving after a brief conversation for the State Department, Mrs. KEENEY entered the State Department. Subject proceeded to the Lafayette Hotel, 16th and I Streets, N. W. He ate in the hotel dining room with three unknown individuals. With two of them, he returned to the office building at 1420 New York Avenue, N. W., and the three were observed to enter Room 710, the Law Offices of GREGORY HANKIN CALLAWAY & REED & JOHN H. TODD. According to the lettering on the door of Room 711, also occupied by the same tenants apparently, the National Cotton Compress and Cotton Warehouse Association has space in Room 711. JRU

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Later one of subject's two companions left the building and entered a car with D. C. License Plate 69-940 which proved to have been issued to GREGORY HANKIN, 2009 Park Road, N. W., Washington, D. C.

Meanwhile the third of subject's companions at the Lafayette dining room who had left the group between the Lafayette and 1420 New York Avenue, was followed by Special Agent ORVILLE R. TALBURTT to the Kellogg Building, 1416 F Street, N. W., Room 209, the PM newspaper office. It was positively ascertained by Special Agent TALBURTT that this individual was ~~IZZY~~ STONE, Washington Representative of PM.

This was the extent of the surveillance conducted on August 29, 1946. No surveillance was conducted during the period of this report.

The following information was obtained from Confidential Informant [redacted] during the period August 1 through August 31, 1946: *144*

On August 2, 1946, JACK MARSILKA contacted FLO LEVY, whereupon FLO advised him that the MILLERS were coming back to town on Monday morning. JACK advised that he had been in and out of town for the last several weeks and was in the process of packing and sending things to New Haven inasmuch as he had bought a place up there. He also stated that his classes begin the 25th of September and he would be there most of the time in September. He added that his wife had gone to Czechoslovakia last Friday and that she expects to remain there until the end of October. FLO advised JACK that HERMAN HLBICHT had called that morning and that he was coming to town on Monday and that he would probably stop at the MILLERS' residence. JACK left a message with FLO to have HERMAN get in touch with him. He also advised FLO that he was arranging a luncheon with the MILLERS, BOB SPAULDING, and a few other people and that he would like to have HLBICHT join them. *24*

On August 5, 1946, JACK MARSILKA contacted JENNIE MILLER and advised her he had been in summer school at Columbia during most of the summer. JACK asked JENNIE for BOB'S extension, whereupon JENNIE gave him BOB'S number at the State Department. JACK also asked JENNIE if BOB knew SILVERMASTER, and JENNIE replied, "Well, ah just very slightly." MARSILKA advised JENNIE that he was having lunch with SILVERMASTER and that he thought he would take BOB along if BOB had not already made a luncheon engagement. JACK also advised JENNIE that he had bought a house near airport in East Haven, which is only five miles from the university and that he paid \$10,000 for it completely furnished. He added that he bought the house from a professor at Yale who had gotten a job on the atomic project in New Jersey. On the same date HERMAN HLBICHT contacted JENNIE MILLER and advised her that he was presently at the Pentagon Building and wanted to know if JENNIE could give him a room while he was staying in Washington. HERMAN advised JENNIE that he had spent a weekend at Rehoboth Beach. He also told her that he had been working very hard in Berlin and that he was in need of an extended rest. During the conversation he said that he would not return to Germany until the middle of September and he expects to go back by ship. *24*

On the same date ¹²BOB MILLER contacted JENNIE and advised her that JACK MARSILKA and HERMAN HLBICHT had called him and JENNIE advised BOB that HERMAN *24*

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was coming for supper. JENNIE and BOB agreed that they would not go to Rehoboth Beach with the HEBICHTS saying that they had too much to do around the house and that BOB has too many people to contact. X4

On August 6, 1946, PEARL FLES contacted JENNIE MILLER, and inquired as to whether HERMAN HEBICHT or JACK MARSALKA was there and when advised that neither was there PEARL stated she would probably see JENNIE later that evening. On the same date Mr. BURGERS of the Netherlands Embassy contacted the MILLER residence and requested to speak to Miss FLES. However, he was advised she was not there but was expected later in the evening. Mr. BURGERS left word to have PEARL FLES contact him at his home, telephone Michigan 6565. X4

On August 7, 1946, JENNIE MILLER contacted Mademoiselle LUGET, who advised her that HELEN SILVERMASTER is at the beach in New Jersey but was expected home today. Mlle. LUGET told JENNIE that GREG is at the office now. On the same date JENNIE MILLER contacted BOB MILLER and advised him that she had thought about getting GREG SILVERMASTER and LUD ULLMANN for tonight. She said she would call LUD at the Treasury Department and ask him to dinner and if he could not come maybe they could all come after dinner. Subsequently JENNIE contacted LUD ULLMANN at the Treasury Department and LUD advised JENNIE that HELEN SILVERMASTER was bringing ANATOLE back that evening and they thought ANATOLE might have undulant fever and that LUD would not be able to come to the MILLERS that night because of HELEN and ANATOLE coming back. However, they would try to get together next week. He said he had a room reserved for ANATOLE at Emergency Hospital and he was trying to get him in at the Bethesda Naval Hospital inasmuch as he thought ANATOLE had contracted the fever in the Navy and it has just now effected him. X4

On August 7, 1946, MIDDY _____ contacted BOB MILLER and advised BOB that a friend of his, PHILIP CUSTER, who is a director of one of the Pathological Departments in a hospital in Philadelphia had contacted him the previous night and they discussed a man whose name was given as Professor FRANZ JOSEF LANG, who was director of the Pathological & Atomic Institute at the University of Innsbruck. He told BOB that LANG had been having a rough time and that in 1938 he was pushed around by the Nazis and almost lost his job because of his anti-Nazi outspoken statements. Somehow a friend of LANG had smoothed his outspoken statements over and had managed to get LANG a medical appointment in either the SS or SA troops, which has for the present gotten him in "dutch." MIDDY advised that LANG was now being held in Germany and was due to be called before the Council of Senators in Vienna for a hearing on September 1st. BOB inquired as to a hearing on what, and MIDDY stated it was apparently the anti-Nazi business. X4

During a long conversation it was ascertained that PHILIP CUSTER had contacted MIDDY to see if there was any way of intervening for FRANZ JOSEF LANG inasmuch as he did not think that LANG had taken part in any activity against the allies during the war but was compelled to take a job in the medical department to escape the Nazis. BOB advised MIDDY that he did not think there was X4

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anything he could do in the State Department inasmuch as LANG had become a member of the SS or SA troops in Germany. However, MILLER told MIDDY that he would see what he could do and would advise him later. X u

On August 9, 1946, an unknown woman contacted JENNIE MILLER and advised JENNIE that she had called for two reasons. One was that she had a very, very interesting woman she wanted JENNIE to meet and added that she had introduced her to BOB MILLER one day at the Statler. She gave her name as ALIX REUTHER, and stated that she is a Jewish anti-Nazi from Berlin now working in the Pentagon. The second reason this unknown woman called JENNIE was concerning the selling of a piece of property in New Hampshire. X u

V. J. Finner
On the same date ALICE R. LINE contacted JENNIE MILLER and advised that she and her husband PHILIP had returned to Washington on August 3rd and that they had been advised by the BOWMANS that the MILLERS were on a vacation. ALICE advised JENNIE that PHILIPS is doing a play on a Paraguayan book and is also doing one on Latin-America, a fictional biography. ALICE advised JENNIE that they just got back from Florida and that it is so terrible in Florida - just like going to Germany in 1934 and 1935. She added that the people in Florida are very reactionary and in fact it is more or less that way all over the south. She also told JENNIE that PHILIP is going back to work at the State Department the following week. X u

On August 10, 1946, HELEN SILVERMASTER contacted JENNIE MILLER and advised her that ANATOLE was sick and that he was in the Bethesda Medical Hospital in Ward #107. HELEN told JENNIE that the DERKIES acted like crooks at the SILVERMASTER'S summer place and that they didn't pay a cent towards the expense while they stayed there. She added that GREG is working today and will probably work tomorrow and that he is not feeling well and is very unhappy. X u

On August 12, 1946, JENNIE MILLER contacted HELEN SILVERMASTER and they discussed the condition of ANATOLE. HELEN advised that the reason he isn't getting any more attention at the Naval Hospital is that he is not an Admiral but merely a radio technician. She further stated that she doesn't like it and if she doesn't get some action soon she is taking him to Philadelphia to see Dr. S. BERLAND, who was on the Harvard Medical staff for three years. X u

On August 13, 1946, PEARL FLES contacted JENNIE MILLER and they discussed the housing situation in Washington and PEARL stated that "I spent my life at these damn Embassies but do I ever get anywhere. I pick up passports, visas, etc. for the Swiss, French, and" whereupon JENNIE said that she thought they were helping her to get an apartment. PEARL advised JENNIE that they were going to pick up ANN RIMEL, who is PEARL'S sister, over the weekend. X u

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On August 18, 1946, BARNEY LEROY contacted JENNIE MILLER and advised her that he had found a place in New York that has a print of the picture the MILLERS want. She advised BARNEY that BOB wants the picture and would like to have a frame made for it like BARNEY has on his. BARNEY advised JENNIE that he is going to New York probably tomorrow morning for a week and will inquire about the picture. He added that ELEANOR is not going to New York with him. He said he had dinner with RANDY and ANN FELTUS on a recent date. *KU*

Eleanor Thomsen
 On August 19, 1946, JACK MARSHALL contacted JENNIE MILLER and he advised he had just returned to Washington from a trip to Skyline Drive, where he went with Dr. KELLER and Dr. RODEK. JENNIE invited JACK to dinner that evening and he advised her that he had already made a date for dinner with the BARKERS. However, he would leave the BARKERS around 9:30 inasmuch as he wanted to talk of several things with BOB. JACK advised JENNIE that he had been trying to get in touch with Judge MADDEN (Judge J. WARREN MADDEN, U. S. Court of Claims) and would have lunch over at the house on Wednesday. JACK also inquired of JENNIE as to when she would be free for a shopping tour and she asked him what he had to buy. JACK said nothing, but that the remark that had been made by JENNIE about Mrs. CONDON gave him an idea that they might do the latter, Mrs. CONDON, some good. JACK said that she is rather touchy on several subjects with him and he thought that one of these days he might accidentally be down town with Mrs. CONDON, and they might accidentally run into JENNIE in Garfinckel's and JENNIE could give him some idea as to how to get Mrs. CONDON fixed up. JACK said Mrs. CONDON thinks she is in Pittsburgh somewhere, where she has to economize and it just makes him sick. JENNIE advised JACK that she thought Mrs. CONDON is a born economizer. JACK said, "Well, she is just one of these Czechs who holds on to every nickel." JENNIE advised JACK that any time in the afternoon is all right with her and JACK told JENNIE that "we will give her the works. \$200 and she'll think I cleaned the town." *KU*

Ellis Bonnet
 The Mrs. CONDON referred to above is probably Mrs. EDWARD UHLER CONDON, wife of the Director of the National Bureau of Standards, Washington, D. C. Mrs. CONDON is a Czechoslovakian and also recently resided in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. *KU*

Ellis Bonnet
 On August 19, 1946, MAY THOMPSON contacted JENNIE MILLER and requested to speak to BOB, advising that she, MAY, is with the American Institute of Foreign Trade, and that she had an applicant by the name of INEZ MUNOZ applying for a job to teach Spanish. JENNIE advised MAY that BOB was not in. However, she stated that MUNOZ was a wonderful person, full of energy, and very lively and would be an asset to the organization. Mrs. THOMPSON advised that the job would be in Phoenix, Arizona. *KU*

On August 20, 1946, JENNIE MILLER contacted the State Department and asked where she might be able to get in touch with ELLIS BONNET, who had just returned from Trinidad. *KU*

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On August 22, 1946, JENNIE MILLER contacted HELEN SILVERMASTER and they discussed the physical condition of ANATOLE. During the conversation HELEN remarked that her "visitor" who was Mademoiselle LUGET, had just left Washington and had gone to New York, where she is still at the Ritz Carleton Hotel. *ku*

On August 23, 1946, JENNIE MILLER contacted ALICE RAINE and invited her to her home for that evening, stating that NATHANIEL WYLE and his wife would be there. Subsequently JENNIE contacted BOB MILLER and advised him that the RAINES were coming that evening and she had also contacted EDITH HALPERIN and asked BOB if he would like to invite DAVID WAHL, the fellow he met last night. *ku*

On August 26, 1946, Dr. EUGENE KULISHER contacted MILLER and advised him that his naturalization would take place next week. KULISHER asked for advice of MILLER regarding the offer of two jobs which he may have. KULISHER is not very enthusiastic about either of them. One is with the former War Assets and is work on the population of the Russian section of Europe. KULISHER advised BOB that the organization is on a low scale and he does not think he would be smart to accept. He added that the name of the organization is Research on Europe and the chief of it is HUGHES. (Probably the grandson of former Chief Justice HUGHES, according to KULISHER). *ku*

KULISHER stated that he would like to be introduced to HUGHES, who is now in Geneva for a couple of weeks rather than talk to the Russian section people and try to persuade HUGHES to organize a project for the whole of Europe's population. KULISHER wanted to know if MILLER was acquainted with HUGHES or anyone in the organization. MILLER said he was not but he would be glad to arrange an introduction between KULISHER and HUGHES. KULISHER advised MILLER that he could get MILLIKIN to make the introduction. However, MILLIKIN wanted to employ KULISHER himself. KULISHER stated that he would actually prefer the job with MILLIKIN. However, the job with MILLIKIN has not been definitely offered. KULISHER said that he might be able to file an application with the State Department. However, MILLER advised him against this because it would cause complications and probably embarrassment. MILLER asked KULISHER what had happened to his job with the American University and KULISHER said it did not succeed because there was no money. *ku*

On the same date JACK MARSALKA contacted BOB MILLER and they discussed the difficulty that PAULIA is having in getting her son GEORGE into George Washington University, and he added that they only want GEORGE to go to George Washington for two years and then they intend to send him to MIT. JACK advised MILLER that he has been to see the American Council people several times and that unfortunately GRAVES and MELAND have been out of town and then the big let down after the Labor Day Holiday. MILLER commented to MARSALKA on the good party that MARSALKA had held and added that he thought WILLIAM DREVO was a very nice person. *ku*

DR. EUGENE KULISHER

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and DREVO was characterized by MILLER as being a tall architect who lives on 29th Street. (The telephone directory lists WILLIAM L. DREVO, 6125 29th Street, N.W.) MARSALKA advised MILLER that his brother was coming to town on Friday and stated that he, along with MARSALKA, was going to Yale University and MARSALKA expects to introduce his brother around the Metallurgy Department inasmuch as there are vacancies in this department since so many of the professors left to go on the atomic project at a much higher salary. MILLER remarked that it would certainly be something if JACK and his brother both secured jobs at Yale, and if so they could take the University over. *cu*

MARSALKA asked MILLER if he knew GREGORY HINKIN, a lawyer in Washington and MILLER advised that he did not. MARSALKA remarked that "I'll have something interesting to talk to you about one of these days. I have been doing some work with him and I am going to use him as my lawyer if and when I get this 'Henderson' thing running." *cu*

On August 27, 1946, SYLVIA HERSCHEMAN contacted JENNIE MILLER and inquired as to when ANN RIMEL was coming back to town and JENNIE advised her that it would be on Tuesday, September 3, 1946. *cu*

On August 30, 1946, JENNIE MILLER contacted HELEN SILVERMASTER and HELEN advised JENNIE that she was moving ANTOLE, her son, from the Naval Hospital and was going to put him in the care of Dr. CARL FRIEDLAND, who is on the staff at the University of Pennsylvania. On the same date JENNIE MILLER contacted BARNEY LEROY and advised him that BOB had forgotten to send a check. During the conversation JENNIE asked about BARNEY'S wife, ELEANOR, and they agreed to meet each other next week. BARNEY advised JENNIE that he is going to New York next weekend and will see RANDY and BEN. RANDY is probably RANDY FELTUS. *cu*

On the same date PEARL FLES contacted JENNIE MILLER and during the conversation she stated that she is going to New York to take her son JOHNNY to visit ANN RIMEL, her sister, who is staying with old friends, LILLIAN DUNSWORTH, whom she knew 14 years ago while they were both members of the "left wing theater group." PEARL added that the DUNSWORTHS were connected with the New York Times. *cu*

On August 31, 1946, RANDY FELTUS contacted MILLER from New York and invited the MILLERS up for the weekend, giving his address as 30 West 70th Street. MILLER advised RANDY that perhaps he would come up inasmuch as he was going to be in New York next week anyway and that he would probably leave on the noon train. *cu*

Reference is made to the report of Special Agent LAMBERT G. ZANDER dated June 5, 1946, in instant case, in which was reported that 1945 Maryland license #489-668 was observed parked in front of the MILLER residence. The following information was submitted by the Baltimore Office regarding the registrant of the above license number:

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Special Agent J. CARLTON GARTNER ascertained at the Maryland Motor Vehicle Bureau that License #489-668 (Maryland) was issued to LEO BYRON SCHULTON, 314 West Montgomery Avenue, Rockville, Maryland, for a Plymouth sedan, first titled in 1944.

The 1945 telephone directory for Rockville reflects one L. B. SCHULTON, Captain, U. S. Navy, residing at 1019 Paul Drive, Rockville, telephone 475-M. This individual not listed in the 1946 directory.

The indices of the Baltimore Field Division were checked with negative results under the name LEO BYRON SCHULTON.

The following investigation was conducted by Special Agent LEROY W. GREEN:

Mr. THOMAS O. O'DONNOGHUE, Chief Linesman, Chesapeake and Potomac Telephone Company, Hyattsville, Maryland, advised that Rockville 475-M was formerly listed to Captain SCHULTON, who was stationed at the Navy Medical Center, Bethesda, Maryland. He informed that SCHULTON had formerly resided at 1029 Paul Drive, Rockville, where he had lived approximately two months. He had moved from there during January, 1946. Their records reflected that subject was presently residing at 3224 North Hampton Street, N. W., Washington, D. C., and his telephone listing was Ordway 4638.

Mrs. ERTTER, Local Board #1, Montgomery County, Rockville, advised that a check of their Selective Service records on LEO BYRON SCHULTON (and SCHULTEN) was made with negative results.

The writer telephonically contacted the U. S. Naval Medical Center, Bethesda, and was informed by the Information Clerk that Captain LEO BYRON SCHULTON was at that time a patient on the 16th floor at the hospital.

Corporal WILLIAM WADDELL, Montgomery County Police, Takoma Park, Maryland, advised he had recently moved to 314 West Montgomery Avenue, Rockville. He was not acquainted with Captain SCHULTON, who apparently had formerly resided at that address. Corporal WADDELL mentioned he could possibly obtain some information regarding him. He subsequently advised that Captain SCHULTON was born December 14, 1896, in Montana. He enlisted in the U. S. Navy on June 10, 1916, and was made an Ensign during 1919. SCHULTON was married and has one child. Corporal WADDELL understood Captain SCHULTON had been before the Naval Retirement Board during June, 1946. He remarked that he had received information that Captain SCHULTON was married to a niece of a Mrs. YOUNGERMAN, 109 Forrest Avenue, Rockville, Maryland. He continued that SCHULTON had resided at 314 West Montgomery Avenue during 1944; had moved to 109 Forrest Avenue, the home of Mrs. YOUNGERMAN in September, 1945. He understood that SCHULTON presently resided at 3224 North

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Hampton Street, N. W., Washington, D. C.

Detective Corporals EARL STERN and GASSAWAY LINTHICUM, Montgomery County Police, Rockville, Maryland, were not acquainted with Captain SCHULTON. LINTHICUM remarked that he was slightly acquainted with the YOUNGERMAN family in Rockville. He remarked he knew nothing against Mrs. YOUNGERMAN herself.

Corporal LINTHICUM advised that a check of their criminal records on Captain SCHULTON had been made with negative results.

Miss EVELYN MOORE, Prince Georges County Credit Bureau, Hyattsville, Maryland, advised that a search of their records had been made, but no record pertaining to SCHULTON had been located.

It should be noted there is no credit information available in Montgomery County, Maryland.

(M) On May 25, 1946, subject MILLER contacted an individual believed to be a person by the name of AUSTIN, at Capon Springs, telephone number Virginia 200. The following is information developed regarding AUSTIN, telephone number Virginia 200, as submitted by the Pittsburgh Field Division:

Telephone number Capon Springs 200 is the listing for the Capon Springs Hotel, Capon Springs, Hampshire County, West Virginia, which is managed by LOUIS L. AUSTIN.

Mrs. CLARA BRILL, Assistant Postmaster, Capon Springs, West Virginia, interviewed under suitable pretext, advised that LOUIS L. AUSTIN, Jewish, about 48 years old, has been managing the Capon Springs Hotel for the past ten years; that his winter home is in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania; that the hotel opens in May of each year and closes in October; that AUSTIN is the manager and part owner of the hotel; that AUSTIN'S family, consisting of VIRGINIA AUSTIN, wife, PORTER L. AUSTIN, son, TED AUSTIN, son, VIRGINIA LOU AUSTIN, daughter, and CLARA K. AUSTIN, daughter, also live at the hotel and that PORTER and TED AUSTIN were recently discharged from the United States Army.

Mrs. BRILL stated that Capon Springs Hotel has a very exclusive clientele since it is very expensive; that many diplomats and other notables from Washington, D. C. come there for a vacation and that at present there are quite a few doctors from John Hopkins, Baltimore, Maryland, spending their vacation there.

Mrs. BRILL stated that the hotel is noted for their Capon Springs water which attracts most of the people there and that AUSTIN has an office in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, which sends the water to all parts of the country.

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Mrs. BRILL stated that AUSTIN enjoys an excellent reputation in the community and as far as she knows is a patriotic, loyal, American citizen.

The following investigation was conducted by Special Agent JOHN P. BUSCHER.

By letter of August 11, 1946, the Richmond Field Office advised attempts to locate LOUISE VON HOGENDORP, whose address was alleged to be Tory Land, South Woodstock, Virginia, had been negative and indicated there is no South Woodstock, Virginia, though there is a Woodstock, Virginia. A copy of this letter was furnished the Boston Field Office in order that appropriate inquiry could be made at South Woodstock, Vermont, and also Woodstock, Vermont, since mail often comes to Woodstock, Virginia, that is intended for Vermont.

With reference to Washington Field Office lead to the Cincinnati Field Office requesting that office to check the records of the Deshler Hotel for a record of ELIZABETH McELROY and Mrs. ROBERT T. MORSE immediately prior to June 22, 1946, the Cincinnati Field Office by letter of August 13, 1946, advised there is no record in the Deshler-Wallick Hotel at Columbus, Ohio, of the above registrations.

This investigation was conducted by Special Agent V. W. HUGHES.

NEAL first came to attention in this case when [REDACTED] reported there were numerous contacts between Mr. and Mrs. NEAL and BILL and ANN REMLINGTON, BILL REMLINGTON being a subject in the GREGORY Case. (u) (u) b2 b7D

[REDACTED] reported that on January 2, 1946, VIRGINIA NEAL called ANN REMLINGTON and advised her that she was expecting FRED to call from Seattle momentarily. When he comes back they may go to Florida. (u) (u)

On January 7, 1946, VIRGINIA NEAL invited BILL and ANN REMLINGTON to supper on Sunday Evening, on the occasion of FRED's arrival back in Washington. VIRGINIA made reference to the Institute or School for Russian Studies. She said that PEGGY and OLLIE WEBB are going to the Institute. (u) (u)

On January 12, 1946, ANN REMLINGTON called VIRGINIA NEAL and ascertained that FRED has finally arrived home. VIRGINIA said that she was expecting a big crowd for her dinner that evening and that everything was all set. BING REMLINGTON stated that the LEHMANS are back. VIRGINIA said that FRED had a rough trip in a small boat which was almost sunk by a mine. (u) (u)

[REDACTED] stated that on January 12th, an unknown woman called ANN REMLINGTON and advised that she and her husband will pick up the REMLINGTONS that evening in order to go to the NEALS dinner. [REDACTED] stated that the unknown woman is probably Mrs. WAGNUSSON. (u) (u) b2 b7D

On January 22, BILL REMLINGTON called for FRED NEAL, but he was advised that NEAL left for Florida the previous day and would be gone for two weeks. (u) (u)

On February 24th, FRED NEAL spoke to BILL REMLINGTON and stated he is now located at 409 North Thomas Street, Buckingham, telephone Chestnut 7696. FRED said he expects to get out of the Navy early next week. He doesn't have a job yet. BILL asked if FRED was going to Moscow when he gets out of the Navy and FRED stated that looks pretty remote now, adding, "I had a conversation in Russian this afternoon with some Russians I know down there. First long detailed conversation since I got back, and I find I get rusty awfully fast." FRED said if he did work for the Government, he would like to work somewhere where he could do something with Russian economics. (u) (u)

On March 18th, ANN REMLINGTON spoke to VIRGINIA NEAL and said she was sorry to have missed VIRGINIA at the BARNES' the other night. VIRGINIA said FRED may go to Moscow with the Government. They will decide this week. She stated that the Bureau of the Budget interests FRED also. (u) (u)

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On March 26th, ANN REMINGTON spoke to VIRGINIA NEAL to confirm their date. VIRGINIA asked ANN to make it about 7:30, and added that SONIA and BOB KLEINFAN were coming. ANN said, "Laybe we can talk some Russky". (u)

On April 28th, [REDACTED] advised that a person whom he believed to be TISH LEHMAN, called ANN REMINGTON, and TISH said FRED and VIRGINIA NEAL got in. FRED had been out with the Russians, interpreting for them, and he and his wife went to a party at the Russian Embassy. TISH said FRED was going to work at the State Department. (u)

On May 27th, VIRGINIA NEAL advised ANN REMINGTON that she had not heard from FRED and that he is still "tied up out there". VIRGINIA told ANN that the Ladies Home Journal called and asked her to take an assignment and consequently, she won't be able to see ANN when planned. (u)

On June 29th, VIRGINIA NEAL called ANN REMINGTON, who said it will be ok with them for Wednesday, if they can bring her brother CARL, who will be here. VIRGINIA agreed and said that KILPATRICKS and the SHARPS are coming. (u)

It was stated that it is attended by such persons as HENRY WALLACE, Major GEORGE FIELDING ELIOT, ALLEN W. DODS, and CHARLES TAFT, some of the former President. There was no derogatory information concerning this committee in the above mentioned file.)

FRED WARNER NEAL and his wife have moved from 409 North Thomas Street, Buckingham, to 240 Pine Ridge, Fairfax, Virginia, where they have recently bought a home.

HANLEY O. HUDSON is listed as a radical in ELIZABETH DILLING's book entitled "Red Network".

Professor W. LEONTIEF is a Russian who came to the United States in 1939, and presently works for the Library of Congress.

ISIDOR LUBIN is listed as a member of the Washington Spanish Refugee Relief Committee, Washington Book Shop; and the Dies Committee file indicate there is an index card on an ISIDOR LUBIN with the notation thereafter "Communist", 1930. It stated he was a speaker at a meeting of the F. S. U. in Washington.

EUGENE DUFFIELD -- no derogatory information on Mr. DUFFIELD, however, his wife is listed as a member of the Washington Committee for Democratic Action and the League of Women Shoppers.

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[Informant T-1] advised that Mr. NEAL is temporarily appointed by the Office of International Information and Cultural Affairs to escort the Soviet correspondents on their tour of the United States. He entered on duty April 24, 1946, in the grade of P-7, at a salary of \$7,175 per annum. His office is located in the War Manpower Building, 1778 Pennsylvania Avenue, Room 540, telephone Republic 5600, Ext. 3430. NEAL is still being carried in a temporary status with the State Department, pending a final approval. His position is that of Consultant (Russian).

T-1 advised that on April 2, 1946, Mr. HAROLD SMITH, Director of the Budget, called on Mr. WILLIAM BENTON and stated that he had known FRED NEAL at the University of Michigan, and describes him as a "very rare bird". He said NEAL had been offered a job by DAVID LAURENCE on his new magazine, and by a New York Bank at more money than the Government can pay, yet he wants to come to work at the State Department. HAROLD SMITH wants to employ him for the budget but doesn't want to take him away from the State Department if they want him, because NEAL's interest lies with the State Department. SMITH requested that the State Department give him an answer as to their decision reasonably soon.

T-1 advised that while the Russian correspondents were here, the main job of NEAL was to act as interpreter for them, and the two correspondents with whom he worked during their visit were KONSTANTIN SHONOV, who is a member of the Supreme Soviet, having been elected to that body from the Smolensk Region, and the other individual was ILYA FIRENBERG, who is considered Russia's outstanding correspondent and author.

The following information concerning FRED WARNER NEAL was obtained through investigation and confidential sources.

Ann Arbor, Michigan

NEAL entered the University of Michigan, Ann Arbor, Michigan, in 1933, from the Northville High School, Northville, Michigan. In September, 1935, his field of specialization was Journalism, but on September 25, 1936, he changed to Political Science. Initially, his curriculum included Military Science, but in 1934, he was discharged from the R.O.T.C. He graduated in June, 1937 with an A. B. degree and was better than a "C plus" student. On June 22, 1945, a transcript of his record was sent to the Ninth Naval District.

FRED WARNER NEAL did not attend the Graduate School of the University of Michigan. He was not, therefore, a candidate for a Masters degree at Ann Arbor. There is a possibility, according to the files of the University of Michigan, that he may have received a degree from Harvard University in 1943.

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While at the University of Michigan, subject was identified with the Michigan Daily, college newspaper. His memberships and dates of initiation, included: Alpha, May 16, 1934; Sphinx, May 23, 1935; Sigma Delta Chi, May 29, 1935; Kappa Tau Alpha; Michigamua, November 25, 1936; and, Honor Guard, June 1937. All are campus societies. In 1935 and 1936 he appears to have been identified with the National Youth Administration (N.Y.A.)

Subject graduated from the Northville High School fourth from the top of a class of thirty-nine students. He gave the occupation of his mother as "Postmaster," and indicated that his father, FRANK NEAL, "editor, legislator, and Postmaster", was deceased. Last information available at the University was that he married VIRGINIA HILAY and that he was an Ensign in the U. S. Navy.

On August 20, 1943, Mr. NEAL wrote to the University to the effect that he was on leave from the Wall Street Journal, National Press Building, Washington, D. C. and was working for the Office of Strategic Services. He expected a commission before leaving for abroad.

NEAL has no police record at Ann Arbor, Michigan. Neither does his name appear in the subversive files of local authorities.

Cambridge, Massachusetts

Records of the Nieman Fellowship Office indicate subject was born August 5, 1915 at Northville, Michigan; received his A. B. degree in June, 1937 from the University of Michigan; attended Harvard from September 1942 until June, 1943 studying and taking courses and received neither marks or credits toward any degree. The Nieman Fellowship is given to journalists for one year and the recipient to take any courses or studies that he desires.

Mrs. DOROTHY ERSKINE of the Nieman Fellowship office advised that she remembers NEAL very well and that his character and reputation are fine and that she has never heard anything but good concerning him.

Professor W. LEONTIEF, Harvard University, Cambridge, Massachusetts, advised that he has known NEAL for several years and considers him to be very intelligent, perfectly reliable, knows nothing derogatory about him, his loyalty to the United States could not be questioned, of excellent moral character and reputation and that he would be an ideal man, and can recommend him highly. Professor LEONTIEF advised that he was Head of Russian Economic Section for the OSS and that he tried unsuccessfully to get subject assigned by the U. S. Navy to his section to work under him.

NEAL has no police record in Massachusetts.

Mr. HANLEY O. HUDSON, Professor, Harvard University, Cambridge, Mass., has advised that he has known FRED HANLEY NEAL for about six years; that his character, habits, health, ability and loyalty to the U. S. are A-1 in respect. He also stated NEAL was married to his niece.

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Omaha, Nebraska

Records in the office of the World Herald, Omaha, Nebraska, confirm that subject was employed from November 21, 1938 to September 23, 1939 as a Cub Reporter at a salary of \$30.00 per week. The record also confirmed that he was born August 5, 1915 and indicated that his father's name was FRANK S. NEAL.

Mr. W. E. CHRISTIANSON, Assistant Editor and Vice President, World Herald, Omaha, Nebraska and Mr. BEN F. SYLVESTER, retired City Editor, World Herald, residence 417 N. 38th Avenue, Omaha, Nebraska, advised they remembered the subject as being a promising young man of good morals, character, reputation and trustworthiness. Subject's father was a newspaper publisher for approximately 40 years in Wisconsin. Subject is believed to have been employed with United Press and the Wall Street Journal in Washington, D. C. prior to receiving a commission in the Navy. Mr. SYLVESTER stated that the subject worked under his supervision while employed at the World Herald; that his services had been satisfactory; that he last saw the subject over one year ago at which time he was going through Omaha, Nebraska, having graduated from a Navy language school at Boulder, Colorado. Although Mr. CHRISTIANSON and Mr. SYLVESTER did not know much concerning the subject's activities since 1939, nothing derogatory concerning him was known prior to that time.

Files of the Police Department, Omaha, Nebraska, were searched for the name of the subject with negative results.

New York, New York

Personnel records of the Wall Street Journal, 44 Broad Street, New York City, validated subject's employment there from January 1, 1941 until September 19, 1942 at which time he resigned to go into the Armed Forces. His work was that of a correspondent in the Washington branch of this organization, which position he handled efficiently as a result of which frequent salary increases were given to him. No prejudice existed at any time as a result of which the association here was entirely amicable.

Personnel records of the United Press Association, 220 West 42nd Street, New York City, reveal that subject started work there in September, 1939 and resigned in January, 1941. His position was that of a correspondent in the Washington branch of the organization, which work was done in a thoroughly efficient manner, leaving a favorable impression. No prejudice existed against him in this employment.

Mr. EUGENE DUFFIELD, Mc-Graw Hill Publishing Company, New York City, stated that he has known subject for several years, part of which was of a recent period when NEAL was in the Navy. Mr. DUFFIELD expressed absolute faith in NEAL's ability, stating that he is very efficient, conscientious to a degree of

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scruples, has a fine moral character, is thoroughly loyal to the United States, ambitions, makes a good appearance and is in good health. As an afterthought Mr. DUFFIELD stated there was an occasion while NEAL was in the Navy in which his superior a Lieut. Commander, whose name he could not recall, was supposedly "riding the subject, who was ambitious to achieve a higher rank. Mr. DUFFIELD stated emphatically that NEAL was in no way deserving of such ill treatment and he, Mr. DUFFIELD, who according to his statement was in the Office of the Secretary of the Navy, feels that a situation of this kind should not have been so involved. In closing, Mr. DUFFIELD expressed his feeling of unreserved recommendation for NEAL.

The files of the New York City Police have no record of NEAL's name.

Washington, D. C.

[REDACTED] refer

NEAL's employment as Reporter for the Wall Street Journal was verified by Mr. W. A. GRAHAM, who stated that the dates of his employment and the salary mentioned were approximately correct. He recalled NEAL's fine record as a Reporter on finance covering the Treasury Department. Mr. GRAHAM stated that he would vouch for his loyalty and patriotism.

Mr. JULIUS FRAIDSEN, Washington Manager of the United Press, verified the dates of NEAL's employment as a Reporter for that news service, and said that the salary figure mentioned was approximately correct. Mr. FRAIDSEN stated that his recollection of subject was very favorable; that he was aggressive in manner, and was rated a good Reporter; that he was undoubtedly loyal and patriotic.

Mr. HAROLD SMITH, Director of the Budget, has known subject for many years, and has been in the position of advisor to him in his efforts to decide on several fields of endeavor. NEAL has had attractive offers in the financial and newspaper fields, as well as the Government. He was offered a position in the Information Service of the Bureau of the Budget, but seems to favor a career in the Department of State because of his deep interest of International Affairs. He was described by the Director of the Budget as a person deserving of a very high mark in every respect. He is highly intelligent, a good writer, a good student, and the possessor of extraordinary powers of judgment. His character, integrity, and loyalty are beyond reproach.

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Mr. ALFRED F. FLYNN, Publicity Director, Pan-American Airlines, has been well acquainted with subject for twelve years, and holds him in high regard. He vouched for NEAL's loyalty, and stated he was thoroughly reliable. His character and integrity are of the finest, and Mr. FLYNN said that he and his wife make an unusually smart couple — both of them have been very able newspaper people.

It was brought out that subject had the signal honor of being the recipient of the Nieman Fellowship of Harvard University, an award given to promising young newsmen in recognition of their outstanding work in the newspaper field.

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taught the Russian Language at the Navy Language School, Boulder, Colorado, during the war and advised he had known the subject for six months while he was in attendance at the school as an Ensign or Lieutenant (j.g.) 1944-1945. Professor SOLOVEITCHIK stated that he had last seen or heard from the subject in May, 1945, at which time he graduated from the Language School. (Later during this interview, Professor SOLOVEITCHIK referred to an address book in which he had the subject's name and address, RFD, Arlington, Virginia.)

Professor SOLOVEITCHIK advised that the subject was one of his best students in the Russian Language class; that he had ability to read, understand and write (with some errors) the Russian language; that he did not believe he could give a speech or a lecture in Russian, but that for conversational purposes he could make himself understood. Also, that he believed the subject had a knowledge of the German language.

Professor SOLOVEITCHIK advised that he knew nothing of subject's family background; that he had met subject's wife, who he believed could speak French, and had been born in the United States; that subject's wife was pregnant at the time he was attending the Navy Language School at Boulder; that a daughter was later born to subject and his wife in Washington, D. C.

Professor SOLOVEITCHIK further advised that he had heard that subject had been sent to Kamchagka in eastern Siberia where he was the only American attached to a meteorological station. During this interview Professor SOLOVEITCHIK recalled that the subject had been at his home in Boulder, Colorado, at a time when Mr. KALINSKY (?), former Prime Minister of Russia, had visited him, stating that the subject had previously met Mr. KALINSKY while working as a journalist in Detroit, Michigan.

Professor SOLOVEITCHIK stated subject was well educated, well read, and an intelligent young man; that he did not believe there was any question as to his morals, character, general reputation or trustworthiness; that he would recommend him without reservation.

Agent contacted Mr. GEORGE BRYANT, who is the manager of the Washington Bureau of the Wall Street Journal. BRYANT stated that NEAL formerly worked for him and that while he found him to be a good fellow and a competent reporter, he was sort of a "scatter brain", but he did not believe he was a Communist. BRYANT stated that NEAL's interest in Russia springs from NEAL's own ambitions and desires to make a mark in the world. He added that back in 1941 and 1942, NEAL foresaw that Russia would develop as one of the great states, and that since persons who speak Russian and who had a knowledge of Russia in this country were at a premium, he regarded it as an excellent opportunity for the future, if he were to learn all he could about Russia. BRYANT added that NEAL has a tremendous acquaintanceship here in

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which includes Secretary of Commerce WALLACE, HAROLD SMITH of the Budget Bureau, and others. After NEAL's tour with the Russian correspondents, BRYANT had occasion to speak with NEAL and he was advised that NEAL got along well with everyone in the group, with the exception of EHREMBERG, whom NEAL considered overbearing, egotistical and "intellectually dishonest".

At the Credit Bureau, 1221 G Street, N. W., Washington, D. C., the records show that NEAL has resided at 409 North Thomas Street since May, 1946, renting his apartment at \$48.50 per month, payments satisfactory. His wife formerly lived at 3935 Livingston Street, N. W., from 1941 to 1943. NEAL formerly lived at 18 Fairmont Street, Fairfax, Virginia, and his wife stayed at that address while he was in the Navy during the war.

Information from the Bureau reflects that FRED NEAL is married to VIRGINIA HILAY of Washington, D. C., the daughter of CHARLES V. HILAY, a Washington lawyer of ability and integrity. His wife is also the niece of HANLEY O. HUDSON, a U. S. representative on the World Court, and on the faculty of Harvard University.

In Washington Field Office File 100-16,450, entitled ARVID TERNER JACOBSON, INTERNAL SECURITY - R", it appears that this individual was born in Covington, Michigan, and attended the University of Michigan, and taught at the Northville, Michigan High School from 1928 to 1932. In 1933 he went to Finland, where he was arrested as a Russian spy and sentenced to six years imprisonment. In 1936, he was granted a release by the President of Finland and was returned to the United States. Prior to 1933, he was known to be an active Communist

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in Covington, and Detroit, Michigan. At the time of his arrest in Finland, his wife was with him, and she, too, was temporarily imprisoned, however, she was released after interrogation.

In connection with the arrest of JACOBSON in Finland, the following letter was written by FRED WARNER NEAL to Congressman W. FRANK JAMES, and is quoted here-with. The letter is dated March 15, 1934, at Northville, Michigan,

"Though you probably do not know me, you were well acquainted with my father, FRANK S. NEAL. Mother has often spoke of you, and I am taking this liberty to write you.

"I am writing you concerning a matter with which you are, I believe, already acquainted; namely the case of ARVID V. JACOBSON, who is now held in Helsingfors, Finland, on charges of espionage. Mr. JACOBSON is a close friend of mine, and Mrs. JACOBSON, his wife, has written me from South Range, up in your Baraga County district, asking a letter of recommendation to you.

"I have known JACOBSON for several years and he is a fine, honest gentleman, a man of great intellect. He had, I admit, communistic sympathies. But his communism was more of a political ideal, than a party affiliation. He was radical only in theory. I am convinced that he was tricked into doing these things which got him into trouble. His belief was that he was to do research work for the Communistic party at European universities. Naturally he jumped at what he thought was a fine opportunity. When confronted with the fact that he was supposed to engage in espionage activities, he strenuously objected. He was promised a release from his task, but before that release came, he was arrested as an accomplice for something he really did not do, and was only innocently connected with. Now, alone, imprisoned in a foreign land, he feels that his country has deserted him.

"I know the affairs of international diplomacy are intricate. Perhaps there is absolutely no way in which you can aid him. But if there is, I personally would appreciate it, and I am sure you would win the undying gratitude of Mrs. JACOBSON and of JACOBSON's many friends, both in Northville and in the Upper Peninsula, if you would do so.

"I am dropping a line on this matter to our local representative, GEORGE A. DONDERO. Perhaps he can be of some aid to you. I also plan to get in touch with Senator VANDENBURG, another friend of my father.

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"I apologize for taking up your time with what to you may seem a small and irrelevant matter. But believe me, to Mrs. JACOBSON and to JACOBSON's many friends, it is a most serious matter.

"With the best of personal regards from both mother and me, I remain —"

The following investigation is reported by Special Agent ORVILLE R. TALBURTT.

For the period of the last thirty days NORTMAN has received only two communications, both of which are not deemed significant. According to a confidential source, NORTMAN receives very little correspondence at his residence in Falls Church, Virginia. (A)4

According to [REDACTED], NORTMAN was in contact with BILL REMINGTON, a subject in this case, on August 19, 1946. NORTMAN indicated to REMINGTON that he was now employed in the Economic Security Policy Section, Financial Development Division, State Department, and his work entailed working on loans to foreign countries. According to NORTMAN, his boss at the present time is in London working with LUBIN who is attached to a subcommittee of the United Nations Conference. NORTMAN also mentioned that TOM PLAISDALE had been appointed a deputy associate to this subcommittee of the United Nations Conference. REMINGTON wanted to know if NORTMAN would be interested in accepting a teaching job with a salary of \$3500 for two terms, and NORTMAN advised due to his financial status he would be unable to accept such an appointment. It was apparent that NORTMAN and REMINGTON are friendly with MAYNARD GERTLER, also a subject in this case. According to NORTMAN, GERTLER is unemployed at the present time and "is one of the few people who have not been placed." MAYNARD GERTLER's wife ANNE GERTLER is employed in Washington in the Department of Interior. REMINGTON also inquired as to JOSEPH PHILLIPS. NORTMAN stated he would ascertain PHILLIPS' whereabouts and let REMINGTON know how he could contact him. b2 b7D

On August 19, 1946, [REDACTED] advised that MARY JANE KEENEY contacted NORTMAN and inquired as to the whereabouts of BOWEN SMITH. KEENEY mentioned CARL GREEN, MAYNARD GERTLER, and one MARTIN BENNETT. According to KEENEY, BENNETT was unable to get an appointment as delegate to the reparations council in Japan and that a person named MAXWELL, an oil man, from the West who was associated with EDWIN PAULEY, was appointed to this position. KEENEY mentioned that BENNETT was more concerned with himself than some of the more general problems that he should be concerned with. KEENEY and NORTMAN agreed to meet at a later date. b2 b7D

Physical Surveillance

The following surveillance was conducted by Special Agents L. T. OBERNDORF and COURTLAND J. JONES on August 22, 1946.

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At 12:50 p.m., MARY JANE KEENEY was observed to meet NORTMAN at his office, 1818 H Street, N. W.; they were seen walking into the Blue and Gray Cafeteria at 1722 18th Street, N. W., where they had lunch. At 1:25 p.m., NORTMAN left this cafeteria and walked to the Walker-Johnson Building with MARY JANE KEENEY where they both entered room 116. It was ascertained this room is occupied by Mr. SCHINDELL. At 1:35 p.m., MARY JANE KEENEY and NORTMAN left the Walker-Johnson Building and returned to 1818 H Street where NORTMAN entered room 1231. At 2 p.m. NORTMAN left 1818 H Street and proceeded to the Social Security Building at Independence Avenue. At this building NORTMAN went from the first floor to the second, then back to the first floor, and then entered the basement. NORTMAN then went from the basement to the first floor and from the first floor again to the second floor. It was apparent that NORTMAN was extremely surveillance conscious and therefore the surveillance was dropped. At 3 p.m. NORTMAN entered his office at 1818 H Street, N. W.

On August 28, 1946, a surveillance was conducted by Special Agent ORVILLE R. TALBURTT.

At 12:20 p.m., NORTMAN left 1818 H Street and proceeded to the Federal Reserve Building at Constitution Avenue and 20th Street where he had lunch with ALEXANDER GERSCHENKRON. GERSCHENKRON is an employee of the Federal Reserve in the research and statistical section and maintains an office in room 3218. At 2:10 p.m., NORTMAN left the Federal Reserve Building and returned to his office at 1818 H Street. It should be mentioned that ALEXANDER GERSCHENKRON is the subject in a Washington Field Office case which reflects information was received from

W. BANNER, Route 1, Box 480, Orange, California. Both letters were addressed to VICTOR PERLO. *du*

Information regarding R. ROMANA, who resides at 1109 East 4th Street, Mishawaka, Indiana, has been reported under the material regarding VICTOR PERLO in the report of Special Agent LAMBERT G. ZANDER, dated August 1, 1946, at Washington, D. C. *du*

The following information was furnished by Confidential Informant [REDACTED] *du b2 b7D*

On August 16th, NIEL informed ELLEN PERLO that he was leaving in a few minutes for the weekend in New York. At this time, ELLEN advised that the PERLOS were planning to ask him to drive out to see KATHY, their child, on Sunday. *du*

On August 24th, SOL (believed to be SOL LISCHINSKY) endeavored to contact VICTOR PERLO, and ELLEN informed he was playing chess that night. SOL has been away and just returned two weeks ago. He advised ELLEN PERLO that NOVA (phonetic), just got back a week ago. SOL said that NOVA had been out west and up to Canada, where he had met her. SOL wanted to play tennis with VICTOR tomorrow morning. ELLEN will tell VICTOR in case he is interested. SOL suggested that they get together soon. *du*

The informant learned on August 26th that KATHY, VICTOR PERLO'S daughter by his first marriage, had arrived in Washington at 3:15 PM that day by bus. *du*

On August 28th, VICTOR PERLO contacted ANNIE STEIN, wife of ARTHUR STEIN, and discussed TEX SINGLETON and RUBIN in connection with chess. *du*

On August 31st, VICTOR PERLO declined an invitation to play tennis, extended by BILL. *du*

Reference is made to the material concerning VICTOR PERLO in the report of Special Agent LAMBERT G. ZANDER in this case, dated August 29, 1946. It is to be noted that this material reflects that VICTOR PERLO had lunch at the Lee Sheraton Hotel with a man subsequently identified as JOHN ABT. *du*

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The surveillance of ABT on August 15th by Special Agents JOHN FLYNN and C. D. CHAPMAN, revealed that ABT was stopping at the Carlton Hotel. Inquiry at the hotel by Agent CHAPMAN revealed that ABT registered there on August 13, 1946, and that he checked out of the hotel at 3:22 PM, August 15th. It is to be noted that servant GREGORY first met subjects VICTOR FERLO, CHARLIE KRAMER, HARRY MAGDOFF and EDWARD FITZGERALD in the apartment of JOHN ABT in New York City.

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PLENN stated that on August 29, 1946, subject PLENN contacted CATHERINE HURLEY and stated that it would be impossible for him and Mrs. PLENN to go to the beach on that day. PLENN said that the friend of his from a foreign country was in town and he desired to know some good places of entertainment. CATHERINE HURLEY suggested the "Club Bali"; however, she stated that she did not know whether whites were allowed in this club. Mrs. HURLEY mentioned that she would have to entertain some friends of hers from Chicago and indicated that these friends were Negroes. Subject PLENN stated that he had never been to Chicago but had been invited to go there in a month to speak on Spain and that he would probably be gone two days. Background information concerning CATHERINE HURLEY has been set forth in the report of Special Agent LAURET ZANDER dated August 16, 1946. *K u*

On August 7, 1946, Special Agents KENNEDY R. CORBETT and AUBREY BRENT advised that at 8:00 P.M. they observed subject PLENN and an unidentified woman leave the Library of Congress and walk to the drug store luncheonette at 1st and P Streets, S. E. They entered the luncheonette and ate dinner at which time it was observed that subject and the unidentified woman were discussing various papers which PLENN had been carrying in his brief case. The Agents informed that this woman was apparently making suggestions concerning the rewriting of these papers. This unknown woman was observed by Special Agent CORBETT at 1:00 P.M. August 8, 1946, entering the west entrance of 499 Pennsylvania Avenue, N. W. He furnished the following description of her:

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Reference is made to the report of Special Agent LALBERT ZAMIER dated August 16, 1946, in which information concerning a letter received by subject from C. A. GAULD, Rio de Janeiro, Brazil was set forth. The Laboratory advised on August 26, 1946, that a cryptographic analysis of the letter indicated no presence of code or cipher in instant letter. The referenced report also reflects that subject had received a letter postmarked July 25, 1946, from H. T. PERKINS, Jr., 4115 Wise Avenue. Investigations reflect that PERKINS was employed by the Veterans Administration, Medical Division, in 1925, and is presently employed by them and assigned to a Veterans Hospital in Washington, D. C. This individual served as a Captain in the Medical Corps in the U. S. Army Reserves and was recently released to inactive duty and again joined the staff of the Veterans Administration.

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It is believed that this individual is identical with the HEPPER who was residing at 2702 30th Street, S. E., on July 17, 1946.

The following information was obtained through [redacted] concerning the activities of subject REMINGTON from August 1 through August 31, 1946, inclusive: b2 b7D

On August 1, 1946, ANN REMINGTON contacted JANE WELLEMAYER and invited her to dinner on the same date, advising her that BURR SMITH was there. ANN advised JANE that SMITH just returned from Japan and she thinks JANE'S husband, FLETCHER, had met SMITH while the two were in Japan. (u)

On August 2, 1946, BURR SMITH, whose full name is RUFUS BURR SMITH, contacted a government agency and talked to a person by the name of ED, and SMITH asked ED if there had been any developments on the rush job at the State Department whereupon ED informed him that there had not been. Later on the same date SMITH contacted the National Housing Agency and requested the extension of ADOLF GOLDEN-THALL. (u)

On August 2, 1946, BILL REMINGTON contacted his wife and they discussed a party which is to be held at the D. VENPORTS the following night and ANN asked BILL if there was not some way they could get out of going inasmuch as there will (u)

be some old "fogies" there and she named MARCUS GOLDMAN and the WARRENS. BILL advised ANN that he wanted to see ED WARREN so that they will go to the party. On the same date BURR SMITH contacted Colonel ANDREWS of the Veterans Administration and advised ANDREWS that he was going to work in the State Department under CLAYTON, the branch on repatriations. (u) 84

On August 3, 1946, BURR SMITH contacted "Mom" at Floral Park, Long Island, New York, #3565, and advised her that he was running into difficulties regarding the purchase of a house. He also told her that he had been offered quite a big job at the State Department and advised her that it would be the preparation of repatriation instructions for the U. S. Delegate on the Commission and that he will be on top of the committee with the Far Eastern Commission. (u)

On August 4, 1946, ARTHUR BROWN contacted BILL REMINGTON'S home regarding REMINGTONS' square dance party which was to be held that evening and BROWN told BILL that inasmuch as he had to read a discussion on international control of atomic energy in Washington on Tuesday, that he would not be able to attend the party but his wife, MARGARET, would be over. (u)

On August 5, 1946, BURR SMITH advised his wife, JANE, that he had the choice of two jobs, one with the State Department and the other the housing job which would be under ADOLF GOLDSFROUT (ph). He added that if he accepts the State Department job it would be subject to investigation and that it will take three or four weeks to complete the investigation. However, he stated that both jobs pay about the same and that the State Department job would give him more public notoriety. SMITH'S wife inquired as to what ADOLF'S job was and SMITH said ADOLF was head of the program determination and added that he, SMITH, would be one of his major chiefs. SMITH'S wife told him not to be swayed against the State Department because of the four weeks delay. SMITH said that he was going to talk to SIM LIPKOWITZ about it, whereupon his wife also suggested that he see BOB KERR. However, SMITH said that he would not contact KERR. (BOB KERR is probably Governor KERR of Oklahoma). (u)

On the same date ANN REMINGTON contacted several people introducing herself as ANN REMINGTON of the League of Women Voters and urged people contacted to go to the polls tomorrow and she referred to the people contacted that they had paid their poll tax, which indicated that she might have had access to the poll tax list. (u)

On August 11, 1946, BOB LEHMAN contacted BILL REMINGTON and advised that ELISSA, his wife, had just returned from Pennsylvania. He also stated that GOLDEN-THALL, War Assets Administration, had contacted him on Sunday. BOB advised BILL that he had a chance for a job in the State Department in the Public Liaison Division, adding that they wanted an economist to write their economic stuff for magazines, the radio, speeches, etc. He also stated that apparently WILCOX'S boys (u)

had been griping because there was no one in the State Department to write their stuff and make it come out the way they intended it to. They further discussed the dissension in the ranks of the War Assets Administration and the security of a permanent Civil Service status at the State Department and came to the conclusion that the State Department would be the best place for BOB. (u)

On August 14, 1946, MERVIN TOBIAS contacted BILL REMINGTON and advised BILL that he had received a letter from TED BLAISDELL and thought BILL would like to know about it. He stated that TED is getting tired of his work in Europe, that he wants to come back home. He added that TED'S analysis of the situation in Europe is that any positive work that the N.E.A. could have done in the way of working out international economic relations in Europe is stymied by the fact that the prevailing thought in the State Department is along the lines of the international trade organization, therefore they are doing nothing waiting for the organization to meet and discuss ways of wishing away trade barriers. BILL advised TED that he would start looking around for a job for TED but he didn't think it would be anything at present that would interest him. (u)

TOBIAS and REMINGTON then went into a long discussion about TOBIAS' job which indicated that TOBIAS is going to have a hearing before the Civil Service Commission regarding his Communistic leanings. It seems that TOBIAS has had Senator TAYLOR from Idaho contact MITCHELL, who is head of the Commission, and JACKSON of Washington also called MITCHELL regarding TOBIAS. REMINGTON advised TOBIAS that he would intervene for him with WYATT when WYATT returns to town. (u)

On August 20, 1946, TOBIAS again contacted REMINGTON and advised BILL not to mention him to WYATT inasmuch as SEEVY had discussed this matter already with WYATT and TOBIAS figured that it would be best to drop it there and wait until PHIL COOMBS gets back. In a further discussion between TOBIAS and REMINGTON TOBIAS advised BILL that he did not see any reason why the agency could not go the whole way because WYATT is no more incriminated in sending a representative of his in keeping TOBIAS on the payroll than he would be if he actually assigned a lawyer to TOBIAS. TOBIAS advised that if he loses the case WYATT is really incriminated because he has had a "red" fired from his payroll. TOBIAS' hearing is to be on September 6, 1946. BILL advised TOBIAS that he "for example had been investigated by every agency in town and he just nicked by by the skin of my teeth. I think I'm all right but I don't know where I stand now." (u)

They discussed BOB SCHER and advised that BOB had had his difficulties and the latest one was when he went over with Lend-Lease and that "Stettinius had to get him out of that one." (u)

On August 15, 1946, when ANN REMINGTON contacted subject, ANN was advised by BILL that he had a date with IRVING SWERDLOW that evening at 9:30 p.m., advising her that IRVING is leaving possibly Sunday or Monday for London and that (u)

he had promised to carry a camera to TED BLAISDELL (u) (u)

On August 19, 1946, BILL REMINGTON contacted BERNIE NORTMAN at Falls Church 2508-W. BERNIE advised REMINGTON that he was now at the State Department and that he has a very nice job in the Economic Development doing work consisting of financial development on loans to foreign countries. BERNIE asked BILL if he knew VAN CLEVELAND and BILL replied that he did not. BERNIE advised BILL that his boss was in London with LUBIN on the subcommittee of the United Nations and advised that TOM had been appointed deputy associate on it and he thought that this might interest him. The TOM referred to is probably TOM BLAISDELL. BILL asked BERNIE if he wanted to apply for a teaching job at Williams College and BERNIE inquired as to the salary and when advised that it was \$3500 for two terms BERNIE said that he could not possibly live on that. BILL asked BERNIE if he knew where MYNARD GERTLER was at the present time. BERNIE said he did not know but he had heard that he was in desperate need of a job and added that he is one of the few people who have not been placed. BERNIE also stated that MYNARD'S wife works at the Department of Interior and that her name is ANN GERTLER. (u) (u)

On August 20, 1946, BILL REMINGTON contacted FRED NEAL and advised him that MIKE BOTTAKIS was in town from Bulgaria and that he was one of the three American representatives on the control commission for the last seven or eight months. He added that MIKE is full of stories that are "more gruesome than yours in Siberia." REMINGTON made a date with FRED for lunch on August 21, 1946. (u) (u)

On August 26, 1946, ANN REMINGTON contacted BILL REMINGTON to advise him that BURE SMITH was coming tonight and asked BILL to come home early if possible. They also discussed JOHN RUSSELL (son of BERTRAM D. RUSSELL) and SUSAN LINDSAY. On the same date ANN REMINGTON contacted the Washington Post and inquired as to how she could reach JOHN RUSSELL and SUE LINDSAY, and the City Editor suggested that she call the British Embassy for JOHN RUSSELL. On the same date ANN REMINGTON contacted the British Embassy and asked for the telephone number of JOHN RUSSELL, who is a Sub-Lieutenant in the British Admiralty Delegation, and she was advised he could be reached at Republic 7400, Extension 63174. (u) (u)

On August 27, 1946, FRANCIS HOLTG contacted BILL REMINGTON and advised that he, HOLTG, was DON MILLER'S brother-in-law and that DONALD and KALHN were going to be in Washington over the weekend and that they were going to have a party at 2721 N Street, N. W. on Saturday at 8:30 p.m. and invited the REMINGTONS over, whereupon BILL agreed to come. However, on August 30, 1946, REMINGTON contacted DON MILLER and advised him that he would not be able to attend the party on Saturday night but would come to see DON on Friday evening. Enroute to 2721 N Street, N. W. REMINGTON became lost and called MILLER, and MILLER advised him that they were right around the corner from BLAISDELL and "you will see our car parked out front with New Jersey license plates." A surveillance reflects that the car bearing New Jersey license plates FB-68-H N J was parked in front of 2721 N Street, N.W. on August 31, 1946. (u) (u)

On August 20, 1946, EMILY SHARFMAN, wife of WARREN SHARFMAN, ALLAN
ROSENBERG's law partner, told ERNA ROSENBERG, subject's wife, that she and DOT
KRUGER were collaborating on a book for children dealing with the friendship
of a colored child and a white child. EMILY said that DOT KRUGER's husband
was PAUL KRUGER of the Federal Housing Authority.

On August 21, 1946, ERNA ROSENBERG told her husband that one, LENA
(or perhaps Cohen or Rowena) had invited her to dinner on the following
Wednesday evening along with CLIFTS and BEN and OLYA MARGOLIN. ALLAN
mentioned that he was having lunch that day with WOODROW WILSON BORAH, whom
he has been helping for the last week. (probably in connection with his
efforts to retain his position at the State Department.)

On August 26, 1946, ALLAN told his wife, ERNA, that he would get
in touch with HAYNARD GERTLER and tell him they, the ROSENBERGS, would try
to picnic with him on Saturday morning.

On August 27, 1946, ALLAN ROSENBERG told ERNA that he would write
a letter of congratulations to HOWARD and CHARLOTTE WASSU (PH) and he would
include a check. (The reason for the congratulations was not indicated.)
He said he would send the letter to 9 Hamilton Road (no city mentioned).
ALLAN and ERNA discussed the adoption papers for JOHNNY, the baby whom they
intend to adopt.

On August 28, 1946, EMILY SHARFMAN and ERNA ROSENBERG discussed
their husbands' law business. Their conversation indicated that a decision
would be made whether to close the law offices or not in 30 to 60 days after
a talk with WARREN SHARFMAN's father and others. ERNA said that ALLAN's
Yugoslavian contacts were a bore and Greece was a "dead duck" as far as
ALLAN was concerned. EMILY said that her husband did not wish to go into
debt anymore and was thinking of taking up another occupation. He wrote
a sad letter to "SAM", a friend of his in California, asking him to help
them out. ERNA said they placed their cards before IAC (probably Max Lowenthal).
ERNA said that they would probably place their cards before BILL KOPLOVITZ,
although they wanted BILL to think they were doing well. EMILY said BOWEN
SMITH should not be told because he could not send them any business. ERNA
mentioned that HANK FOX wanted to send ALLAN and WARREN some business, but
did not know of anything important enough to send them. ERNA suggested that
LOU HARRIS might be able to send them something but he was in a bad situation.

himself in New York. EMILY mentioned that WARREN and ALLAN had talked to TOMMY SORCORAN (of the old Roosevelt "brain trust") who turned out to be too friendly and was giving his excess business to JOE LAUGH. ERNA stated that EDDIE LAMPIN (PH) in Boston, who used to be ALLAN's best friend, had not sent them any cases. WARREN SHARFMAN, EMILY said, was contemplating a trip to Chicago to see some personal friends about the matter. ERNA said that WEIS "that Boston person" gave the law firm a little something, amounting to a couple of hundred dollars each month. ERNA said that ALLAN did not think to a couple of hundred dollars each month. ERNA said that ALLAN did not think to send some labor business down. ERNA mentioned that NICK HELLMAN (PH) had one radio station and his partner had the SAC business. She explained that this was the Hollywood radio station and was in one of those stations that tried to make money, such as those which LUCIAN and BILL KOPLOVITZ have. EMILY SHARFMAN mentioned how good their husbands had been to the ED BRECKER business, yet MONROE OPPENHEIMER got the business. They recalled, however, that their husbands were not practicing law when MONROE OPPENHEIMER was hired. They hoped that the business might be switched to their husbands. They discussed the fact that they might cut down on some of their psycho-analysis visits in order to save money.

On the same day an unidentified woman invited ALLAN and ERNA ROSENBERG to a party sometime over the weekend. The woman stated that LONA WOOD and her husband, who was in Portugal during the war, would attend the party, and so would the TAYLORS. (LONA WOOD is the wife of FRANK ROBERT WOOD who was financial attache in Lisbon, Portugal, in a dual capacity from April, 1943, until recent date. He headed the Secret Intelligence Unit of the Office of Strategic Services, and was a Treasury representative.) The ROSENBERGS declined this invitation because they had promised to visit the WAYNARD GERTLERS in Virginia for the weekend.

On August 30, 1946, FAYE GLASSER, wife of HAROLD GLASSER, subject of instant case, told ERNA ROSENBERG that she was having a buffet supper for eight people including the WARDS, TAYLORS and the BROOKS. Probably it is believed that FAYE GLASSER referred to WILLIAM TAYLOR and his wife, DOROTHY Taylor of the Treasury Department.

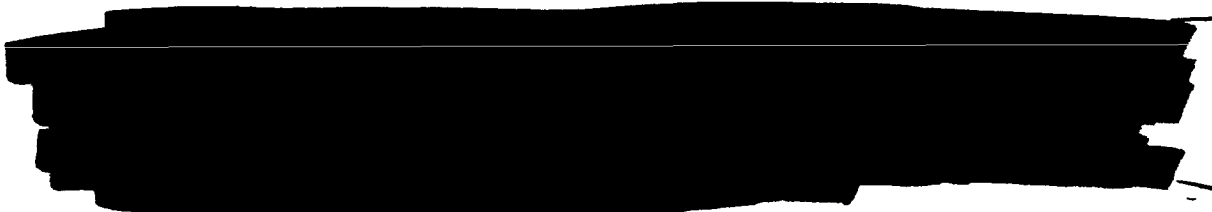

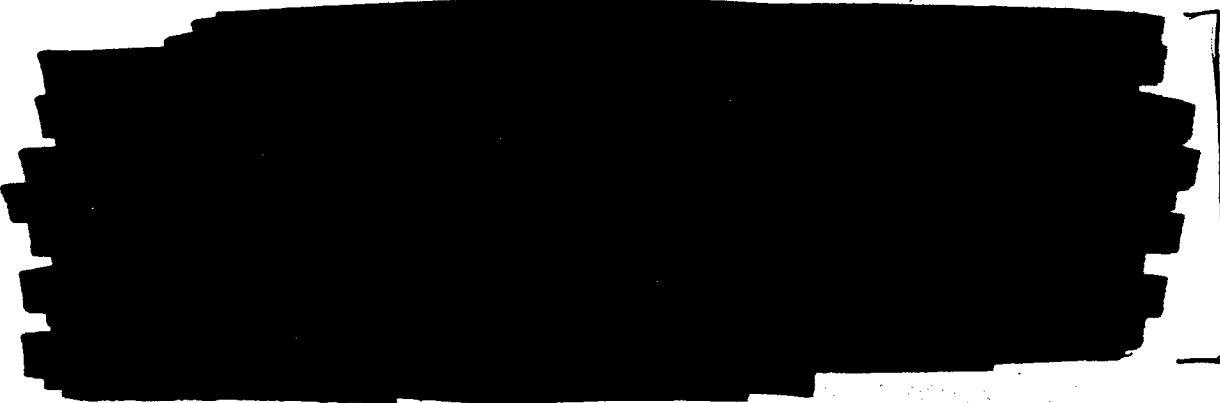

The following investigative information is being reported by Special Agent EARL L. FUOSS for the period August 1st through August 31st, 1946.

During the above period, no information of value to this investigation has been received from the mail cover maintained on WAHL's address, 1706 G Street, N. W., Washington, D. C.

On August 19, 1946, [redacted] advised that DAVE WAHL contacted MARY JANE KEENEY. KEENEY stated that she realized how busy WAHL was on the Palestine situation, and that she had brought him some clippings from the Chicago Daily News, which, she says, is in some ways worse than the Tribune. WAHL stated that he has arranged it so that MAX (LOWENTHAL) can go to Germany "ostensibly to be Legal Counsel to General CLAY in charge of restoration of Jewish property, but the swath will be cut much wider than that." b2 b7D

On August 22, 1946, MARY JANE KEENEY contacted EDITH WAHL, and stated that she had stopped by DAVE's office, and that she wanted him to know how thrilled she was at BARTLEY CRUM's statement, and that she was particularly thrilled at the mentioning of names in the statement.

On August 16, 1946, [redacted] advised that EDITH WAHL contacted EDITH HALPERIN, and, after some personal chatter, DAVE WAHL talked with MAURICE HALPERIN. DAVE stated that he is trying to catch up with his mail, and that last thing he came to was a cute little business HALPERIN had between GILBER (phonetic) and LOURY. Both agreed that it was funny. MAURICE stated, "I have seen a lot of your friends, by the way, or several of them, recently, and again it is a slow season, but I have been making the proper contacts." DAVE asked if that fellow got back from Europe yet. MAURICE stated, "Not yet." DAVE asked MAURICE if he had heard where he had been and what he has been doing. MAURICE stated that he had, vaguely. DAVE asked if MEYER had said anything about DAVE. MAURICE said that he had just mentioned that DAVE was busy with CRUM day and night. DAVE said that he had been with CRUM literally day and night, and "I think the operation we pulled is one of the biggest things that ever happened in Washington." DAVE said, "Not only on the Palestine situation, but it had ramifications on the whole national situation. It touched every important individual on the top level in Government, and it has gotten into the 'rapprochement' with another country that I was interested in." b2 b7D

On August 14, 1946, [REDACTED] b2 b7D advised that CARL GREEN contacted ERNA ROSENBERG. CARL said that MAINARD GERTLER and his wife, the DAVID WAHLS, and the SMITHS are back from their vacations. CARL said that MAX is going to Europe for TRUMAN on a special mission, Special Legal Counsel, on a special problem to General LUCIUS CLAY, and that he was leaving in about a week and will be gone for about a month. CARL stated that ALLEN ROSENBERG had seen MAX and would give ERNA a full report on that. CARL stated that MAX was taking one or two people along, but that he wanted them like ALLEN ROSENBERG.

It was confidentially ascertained that on August 22d JACK MARSALKA held a stag party at his place, and, through a physical surveillance maintained on the MARSALKA party, the following guests were identified: Captains A. F. BELIKOV and M. N. DOROKHOV, Russian Naval Attache's office, LARRY TODD, Chief, Tass Agency, and subjects ROBERT T. MILLER, DAVID WAHL, CARL GREEN, ARTHUR ISAAC SAUL, Commerce Department, EUGENE HOLMES, colored, Communist. (u)

On August 23d, JENNY MILLER indicated she had invited PHILIP and ALICE RAINE and NATHANIEL WEYL over, and she inquired of BOB about inviting the man he met the previous evening, and MILLER stated that that was satisfactory. The man they were referring to was DAVID WAHL. (u)

At 1:25 WAHL entered the Cosmos Club, H Street and Madison Place, and had lunch with a man and woman who were later identified as MAX LOWENTHAL and wife. Through investigation, it was ascertained that LOWENTHAL intended to leave by airplane that evening at 8:30. Surveillance was maintained at the ATC Airlines, and at 6:30 WAHL, LOWENTHAL and his wife, and a man identified as ERNEST FIERST arrived in WAHL's car. They were later joined by a man and woman who arrived in a car bearing D. C. plates No. 3886, this car being assigned to one EDWARD COOPER, 3526 Quebec Street, N. W. (u)

At 8:45, the plane departed and the party of FIERST, WAHL, COOPER, and the two woman departed for Washington. LOWENTHAL's travel orders show "MAX LOWENTHAL, Adviser on problems of internal restitution, sequestration and disposal of Jewish property, P-8, \$9,975, directed to proceed by air on or about August 26, 1946 from Washington, D. C. to Paris, France on temporary duty for approximately five days, thence to proceed to Berlin, Germany on permanent duty." (u)

In the Department of State bulletin dated August 4, 1946, listed under the United States delegation to the 5th session of the Council of UNRRA, scheduled to convene at Geneva, Switzerland, August 5, 1946, which was approved by the President, and was announced by the Secretary of State on July 26th, listed HERBERT A. FIERST, Special Assistant to the Secretary of State, and HOWARD GLASSER, Associate Director, Division of Monetary Research, Treasury Department, along with others, as advisers to the Council member. The major items on the agenda of the fifth session are food, displaced persons, UNRRA finances, UNRRA's relations with the general assembly of the United Nations, the Chinese Program, and the future of UNRRA.

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DONALD NIVEN WHEELER

The following investigation was conducted by Special Agent JOHN P. BUSCHER.

DONALD NIVEN WHEELER and his family have not as yet returned from their extended trip to the West Coast, and it is anticipated that he will return to Washington, D. C., in the early part of September, 1946. Thereafter information covering his activities will be reported in this report as previously.

By letter dated July 11, 1946, the Chicago Field Office advised with regard to the contemplated trip of subject WHEELER and his family to visit Mr. and Mrs. RICHARD WATT, 138 Woodland, Winnetka, Illinois, a review of the indices of the Chicago Field Office failed to develop any information concerning the WATTS, and investigation by that office has been negative. The Woodland Street address is a two-story house owned by Mrs. MARY STEVENSON who still resides there. She is a widow and has two daughters KATHLEEN and MARY JANE, both of whom are married and reside elsewhere. Investigation produced no trace of a RICHARD WATT in Winnetka, Illinois.

The Chicago Field Office requested the Bureau and New York Field Office to search their indices for any information concerning RICHARD WATT since it would appear that WATT has only recently moved to Winnetka if he is there at all.

By letter of August 21, 1946, the San Francisco Field Office advised that informants of that office had furnished no information concerning DONALD NIVEN WHEELER's arrival at San Francisco, and there is no information available concerning any contacts with Communist Party members in that area.

Dr. ABE ~~WOLFSON~~ advised WHITE received a letter from ~~WOLFSON~~ dated Sunday, July 14, 1946, at Hulett's Landing, New York. ~~WOLFSON~~ said they were on vacation and made last minute changes and came to Hulett's Landing because ANNE did not feel safe in coming here without MARTIN. Apparently this reference is to ANNE and MARTIN ~~TANGH~~. ~~WOLFSON~~ stated she, the two children, and nurse came a couple of days earlier.

He advised WHITE that he and SALLY had entertained SAM and EVELYN, presumably SAM and EVELYN ~~MILLER~~, and also ~~LEE~~ and ~~BEN~~. LEE is the older sister of SALLY. ~~WOLFSON~~ advised WHITE he had run across an interesting estate which WHITE might consider purchasing owned by Mrs. FRANCES ~~LADD~~, Wadhams, New York, who is the widow of a Dr. LADD who once taught philosophy at Harvard and Yale and spent a lot of time in Japan. ~~WOLFSON~~ suggested WHITE may have known him and suggested perhaps it was ANNE who knew a HELEN ~~LADD~~.

~~WOLFSON~~ also advised that WHITE received a communication from ANNE ~~WHITE~~ dated July 17, 1946, and postmarked East Jeffrey, New Hampshire, where she was vacationing. With this letter she enclosed a page from the Boston American dated July 15, 1946, containing a column by WESTBROOK ~~FOULER~~ presenting Dr. HARRY D. WHITE in very unfavorable light in connection with his character as co-author of the Bretton Woods Plan for an international

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bank and monetary fund and mentioned that this was "what a denouement to your telegram." She also mentioned the FEGLER article as being on the same page "with that wonderful editorial yet." The editorial referred to is entitled "The Robbery at Paris" and concludes by suggesting that this country discontinue business with the Russians, tell them off, and have done with them. The significance of ANNE's reference to a telegram by WHITE is not known at present. In the letter ANNE WHITE mentioned FRANCES was a grand addition to their household. Presumably this reference is to FRANCES WEISSBERG who is vacationing with ANNE WHITE.

[REDACTED] further advised that WHITE received a letter dated July 17, 1946, at Miami, Florida, and written on stationery of S. D. WEISSBUCH, Langford Building, Miami. This letter bore the handwritten signature "S." The letter enclosed a copy of the article by WESTBROOK FEGLER from the Miami Herald of the day before and expressed congratulations to WHITE to the effect that he had arrived as an attack by FEGLER has come to be looked upon as a mark of distinction. b2 b7D

The writer, presumably WEISSBUCH, stated that unfortunately in his desire to gain favor with the masses FEGLER is grossly dishonest from the intellectual standpoint. He mentioned in next to the last paragraph of his article FEGLER intimates by enactment of the proposed legislation WHITE's financial position would be greatly improved, etc., which is a colossal non sequitur. The writer concluded by stating he knew WHITE would not dignify FEGLER's article by making a reply.

Concerning WEISSBUCH, reference is made to the report of the writer dated May 2, 1946, reflecting investigation of the Miami Division at room 705, Langford Building, occupied by four individuals including SAMUEL D. WEISSBUCH and T. NEILL WEISSBUCH, who reside at 119 Southeast 15th Road, Miami, Florida.

There is set forth hereafter information furnished by [REDACTED] for the period from August 1 to 31, 1946. It is noted during the early portion of this period ANNE WHITE was away on vacation and subject WHITE joined her for two weeks during early August. b2 b7D

EVELYN MILLER contacted WHITE advising SAM, who is employed by War Assets Corporation, had gone to Kansas City unexpectedly for ten days and from there would go directly to Providence, Rhode Island, where EVELYN would join him for vacation. WHITE stated he was leaving the next day for two weeks' vacation to join his family. *qu*

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[August 19] *du*

WHITE advised his wife he was going with CLAYTON to meet some South Africans and would not be home until about 7 p.m. The identity of the CLAYTON referred to is not known. It could possibly be WILLIAM L. CLAYTON, Assistant Secretary of State. *du*

[August 24] *du*

On this date Mrs. PATTERSON, International Monetary Fund, advised WHITE an individual in New York City was endeavoring to reach him, and she did not know whether to furnish WHITE's number to the individual whom she identified as DAVID WEINCOP (phonetic). WHITE stated it was satisfactory to furnish WEINCOP his number. *du*

WHITE was contacted by an individual having an accent who indicated he could not reach "them," and there were too many out of town for a meeting. They agreed to have a meeting the following Sunday. WHITE contacted IRVING and MARGARET FURST, Richmond, Virginia. WHITE indicated he had secured a new Mercury automobile and wondered if FURST would like WHITE's old car. FURST indicated he would like to purchase the car. *du*

On this date ANNE WHITE endeavored to locate one MARY JANE HOOPER, Pleasant 8707, unsuccessfully. *du*

On this same date ANNE endeavored to contact Dr. CLIFFORD RODLIN, Medical Center, without success. *du*

On this date ANNE WHITE was contacted by an unidentified man who appeared to be an old friend. He stated he had come to Washington to work in the Surgeon General's Office, Room 267B. He indicated he would stay at the Washington Hotel four nights a week and go home to New York for weekends. He mentioned having two sons, one of whom is in North Carolina University, thanks to HARRY, and the other in the Army although expecting discharge in February. The man stated he expected to be in Washington for a year, and did not plan to bring his wife down from New York. This individual may be identical with GIMP KOHEN referred to in the report of the writer dated July 19, 1946, under WHITE. *du*

ANNE WHITE was contacted by BERNICE BERNSTEIN who stated BERNICE BERNSTEIN is in Europe and has been in Germany. ANNE made reference an article in PM about the Jews by I. F. STONE who stated the Jews of the world should organize and buy ships to haul Jews out of DP camps in Europe to Palestine and they should run the blockade.

August 31

WHITE endeavored to locate SAM MILLER unsuccessfully. It is noted MILLER resides at Alban Towers, Apartment 209, phone Ordway 2991.

On the same date WHITE contacted JOEL FISHER who stated he meant to write WHITE a note while he was away and mentioned that letter was very, very impressive. FISHER stated, "HARRY, wait until you see the September 12 speech he is giving in New York." WHITE inquired before whom the speech would be given, and FISHER replied the NCPAC in Madison Square Garden. FISHER indicated the speech would take the line from there and goes further even, talking about what he thinks of the British. He stated for example it says that sure it was a good idea to loan the British two and a quarter billion dollars because that was important in terms of stopping their imperialistic practices of building up sterling blocks and things like that. FISHER insisted that the speech would be terrific and as soon as he could get a copy he would bring it over to WHITE. He mentioned, "He is down in Mexico now." The reference to the individual planning his speech in Madison Square Garden, New York City, is obviously to Secretary of Commerce HENRY WALLACE.

In connection with the above conversation, it is noted WHITE contacted FISHER to invite him to play volleyball on the following morning. However, FISHER declined as he was going out of town on the following day which was Sunday.

Mail cover placed on subject WHITE disclosed a letter addressed to Mrs. HARRY D. WHITE postmarked San Francisco April 20, 1946, bearing return address 610 San Bruno Avenue, San Francisco, California.

By letter dated August 21, 1946, the San Francisco Office advised LANCELOT J. BLOCK and his wife GLADYS CHRISTENSON BLOCK have resided at this address for the past three and a half years. They formerly resided at 366 Arkansas, 651 Utah, 258 Connecticut, and 255 Oak Street, all San Francisco. BLOCK is employed as foreman at the lumber terminal, 2000 Evans Street, San Francisco, having worked there for the past eight and a half years and is well regarded by his employers. The BLOCKS were married August 20, 1937. Mrs. BLOCK formerly was employed as secretary for W. R. AMES and Company, 150 Hooper Street, San Francisco. The office indices were negative concerning the BLOCKS.

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This investigation is receiving continuous attention in this field office. Leads are being set out by teletype and letter to other offices!
