





An article appeared in the Washington Evening Star on July 1, 1946, which stated that James R. Newman, Chief of the Science Division of the Office of War L'obilization and Reconversion, was one of twelve recipients of a fellowship announced on that date by the John Simon Guggenheim L'emorial Foundation in recognition of their war effort in the Armed Forces or civilian agencies. The article further stated that the award enabled him to study the "social, economic, and political implications of measures for the development and control of atomic energy."






Since the receipt of the above information, Newman has been under investigation by the Bureau. However, the above facts have not been proved or disproved to date.

According to information received from Mr. James McInerney, Criminal Division, Department of Justice, during the hearings of the Senate Committee on Atomic Energyheld in Washington, D. C., on April 8 and 9, 1946, Byron S. Miller was present for the purpose of presenting legislation suggested by the Federation of Atomic Scientists in Washington. It was determined at this time that Miller was working under James R. Newman, who was also present at these hearings and appeared to be on the staff of the Committee, possibly as an associate of Dr. Edward U. Condon. The original draft of legislation submitted by Miller on behalf of the Fr. tion of Atomic Scientists contained numerous loopholes inasmuch as it restricted any violations of law to the wilful communication or transmission of secret data and based the penalty upon the degree of intent, also making the crime dependent upon the successful commission of the offense to the point where an actual advantage is secured by a foreign nation.

Byron Killer is a known acquaintance of William Walter Remington, who has been identified as a Soviet espionage agent who acted on behalf of the Soviets while an employee of the United States Government from approximately 1941 to 1944

A search of the indices of the New York Field Division reflects that since the initiation of the case entitled "GREGORY; Espichage - R", Wew York File #65-14603, "reau File #65-56402), in November of 1945, NATHAN WITT has contacted several of the subjects in this case, and is undoubtedly acquainted with several other subjects as a result of past positions held by WITT in Washington. The purpose of this letter is to consolidate and set forth these contacts in order that NATHAN WITT's possible connections with the GREGORY Case can be evaluated. The names of the various subjects in the GREGORY Case contacted by WITT are, therefore, being set forth with a brief statement beside each as to NATHAN WITT's contact with that particular subject.

CHARLES CRAFFR, with alias, Charles Krivitsky. CHARLES CRAFER was formerly an Attorney on the National Labor Relations Board during the period when this board was headed by the subject. It was during this period that the National Embor Relations Board was alleged to contain a majority of Communists. CRAMER left the National Labor Relations Board in 1942 and subsequently became an Attorney with the Office of Price Administrative later with the Kilgore Committee, and more recently has been employed by Senstor CIAUDE PEPPER's Wartime Health and Educational Committee. CRAMEN apparently became well acquainted with NATHAN WITT during their tenure with the National Labor Relations Board. CRANER was alleged to be a member of the HAROLD WARE Group which constituted one portion of the Communist under ground movement in Washington, D. C. The subject was also a member of this group which consisted of HAROLD WARE, JOHN ABT, LEE PRESSMAN, HENRY HE COLLINS, JR., NATHAN PERLOW, ALGER HISS, and DONALD HISS-POSTE. In the Lagra-1930's and early 1940's, this group held weekly meetings usually at the home of HENRY COLLINS and were in contact with ALEXANDER STEVENS in New York City sometimes by means of courier.

Sources available to the Washington Field Office reflect that there is still occasional contact between CRANKR and the subject. The subject wrote CRANKR a letter which was postmarked December 4th, 1945, at 8 P.M. from New York City.



ALLAN R. ROSENBERG. ALLAN R. ROSENBERG has been an Attorney on the Board of Economic Warfare in recent years. He was formerly Legal Assistant to NATHAN WITT when WITT was Secretary of the National Labor Relations Board. ROSENBERG is apparently a law partner of WARREN L. SHARFMAN at the present time.

SHARFMAN was also employed as an Attorney for the National Labor Relations Board at the time when WITT was secretary of that board.

According to Washington Field Office sources, ROSENBERG saw WITT quite often while he, ROSENBERG, was in New York City early in February of, 1946. ROSENBERG's wife, ERNA, was heard to make a statement to the effect that ROSENBERG considers WITT as a client.

ALGER HISS, with alias, Eugene Hiss. ALGER HISS was employed by the State Department, Washington, D. C. He was a member of the underground group headed by HAROLD WARE, which group included the subject. The fact that HISS and the subject are both known members of this group is an indication that they are acquainted.



ALBERT E. KA W., with alias, Al Kahm. ALBERT E. KAHN is an author and journalist. According to Washington Field Office sources, on or about December 14th, 1945, KAHN was in conversation with a man by the name of GEORGE, at which time KAHN stated that he was in possession of a story involving Father COUGHLIN as a Nasi Agent. KAHN planned to send the story to GEORGE, and GEORGE was requested by KAHN to consult with NATHAN WITT upon receipt of the story in order to make certain that no libel proceedings could grow out of the publishing of the story.

HENRY HILL COLINS, JR. HENRY HILL COLLIES, JR. is the Coordinator of several Congressional Investigating Committees, and is mainly concerned with industry and labor relations. COLLINS was a member of the HAROLD WARE Branch of the Communist underground organization in Washington, D. C., and as such, COLLINS is undoubtedly acquainted with NATHAN WITT.

ELIZABETH SASSULY. ELIZABETH SASSULY is the Legislative Director of the Food, Tobacco, Agricultural, and Allied Workers Union, CIO. Her main task is lobbying in behalf of this organisation.



MRS. RAY ELSON. MRS. RAY ELSON is presently employed by the Mational Federation of Constitutional Liberties.

On April 25th, 1946, she was surveilled by agents of the New York Office to Grand Central Station where she met a group consisting of MINTON KEMNITZ, HATTIE CHAMP, and NATHAN WITT, at 10:15 P.M. This group boarded a New York Central train which left at 10:40 P.M. on that date for Detroit, Michigan. They were surveilled to Detroit where they were going for the Detroit Convention of the Civil Rights Congress.



On October 22, 1946, the Rio de Janeiro, Brazil, newspaper Tribuna Popular" published an article datelined October, 1946, Buenos Aires, Argentina (special for the "Tribuna Popular"), summarizing and analyzing "As He Saw It" ELLIOT ROOSEVELT's "Inside Story" of FRANKLIN ROOSEVELT's past and future political policies.

The article indicates that the information received is taken from a review of the book by the Buenos Aires weekly periodical "Qué Sucedió en Siete Dias". The analysis high-lights the following statements which are favorable to the present Communist political line: "the road traced by President ROOSEVELT was abandoned in a most deliberate and prejudicial manner; international unity has been disintegrating since the use of the first atomic bomb; the promises made concerning plans for peace have been broken with cynical in the promise made at the abandon."

The summary continues by pointing out that ROOSEVELT and CHURCHILL could not agree in the organization of plans Homen peace due to CHURCHILL's imperialistic viewpoint, as contrasted with that of President ROOSEVELT. Mention is also made of the fact that ELLIOT ROOSEVELT considers the present reaction of the Kremlin logical in view of the Anglo-American policy which of is destroying unity with the USSR. The article concludes by stating that "This book, without doubt the result of special consultations, coincides with the recent speech of HENRY WALLACE at Madison Square Garden. Both are against the State Department and its policy of 'getting tough with Russia'. The vacillating

attitude of President TRUMAN seems to indicate that such a policy of firmness toward Russia has provoked increasing reaction in larger circles than that of government officials.

It is believed possible that the foregoing article may have been furnished to the "Tribuna Popular" by BERNARD S. OREDMONT, a Subject of instant case, for the following reasons:

- 1. Although the "Tribuna Popular" has been reviewed daily, no special articles from a Buenos Aires correspondent have been previously noted.
- 2. REDMONT was in Rio de Janeiro from August 31, 1946, to September 14, 1946, at which time he returned to Buenos Aires.
- J. During his stay in Rio de Janeiro, it is known that this Subject had an exclusive interview with LUIZ CARLOS PRESTES which was subsequently reported in the magazine "World Report" of which he is correspondent.
- 4. REDMONT is suspected of reportorial activities outside the scope of his employment with "World Report".

Copies of the article in question are enclosed for the information of the Bureau and the Buenos Aires Office.







Reference is made to New York letter to the Bureau dated October 17, 1946 advising that HARRY P. BARRAND, 57 William Street, New York City informed an agent of the New York Field Division at the time he was being interviewed that the FHI was investigating his tenant, Dr. WEINSTEIN; for possible Russian espionage activities.

For the information of the Bureau, the subject, Dr. A BRAHAM WEINSTEIN, according to records of the Post Office Department, resided at 106 Stamford Avenue, Stamford, Connecticut until June 15, 1945, at which time he moved to 248 Stamford Avenue, where he remained until September 10, 1945, at which time he moved to the Roger Smith Hotel.

Mr. JOHN PARRY, President of the Fidelity Title & Trust Company, Stamford, Connecticut, and neighbor of Dr. WEINSTEIN, advised that Dr. WEINSTEIN purchased his present residence at 23 Ralsey Road, South, Stamford, Connecticut, in the month of October, 1945.

The records of the U. S. Post Office at Stamford, Connecticut, also reflect that on September 30, 1945 HARRY P. BARRAND and his family moved from 106 Stamford Avenue, Stamford, Connecticut, to 57 William Street, New York.

It is further to be noted that the technical coverage upon Dr. WEINSTEIN'S residence at 23 Ralsey Road, South, Stamford, Connecticut, is operated from the New Haven Field Office.

D. C., on December 20, 1945, indicated that she was thirty years of age, an editor by occupation, and resides at 1181 Christopher Street, New York City. Inspector HUMPHRIES stated he was able to determine during her short stay at the airport that she attempted to phone MAX A. EGLOFF, Director of the Office of Information in Puerto Rico, the nature of which is set out in referenced report, and also attempted to telephone JACK DELANO, and one ELLSWORTH at the Normandie Hotel. He was unable to determine whether she made phone contact with either DELANO or ELLSWORTH.

It is noted that JACK DELANO was at this time living at the Normandie Hotel in quarters furnished him through the Puerto Rican Development Company, an Insular Government agency, at the request of the Office of Information.

Division, was born December 2, 1895, at Braintree, Mass. He attended Barnard School, New York City, and thereafter received an A.B. Degree at Harvard University in 1917. His parents are JAMES DRUMMOND ELLSWORTH and MABEL SILSBEE MORRISON ELLSWORTH. He apparently lived in Bronxville, New York, at the time of his attendance at Harvard University. He entered Officers' training camp in New York in May 1917, was commissioned a Second Lieutenant, and discharged from the United States Army on January 29, 1919, with no overseas record.

He was a member of the Insular House of Representatives

close Liaison with COMMUNIST PARTY leaders. ELLSWORTH has been active in an annual Homage to Russia, November 7 Celebration commemorating the anniversary of the Russian Revolution, the immediate purpose of which was to raise funds for Russian war relief. He was rumored as liaison officer between former Governor REXFORD GUY TUGWELL of Puerto Rico and the PARTIDO POPULAR DEMOCRATICO and was given the official position as Coordinator between the Governor's Office and the Legislature in February, 1945.

According to CHARLES O'DAY, Secretary to Governor TUGWELL, ELLSWORTH aside from being coordinator, is a member of the Board of the Office of Puerto Rico (distinct from the Office of Information) in Washington, D. C., and is chairman of the Board of Directors of the Puerto Rican Agriculture Development Company. He lives at the Normandie Hotel.

The above information concerning URSULA WASSERMAN was transmitted by radiogram to Miami, Washington Field, and the New York Field Division as well as the Bureau on June 13, 1946.

Referenced radiogram from New York City dated June 14, 1946, requested information concerning the activities of JOHN FERNO in Puerto Rico.



CHARLES O'DAY advised that he had discreetly obtained information from CHARLES ROTKIN from the off e of Information that JOHN FERNO is a motion picture producer and is under an indefinite time contract with the Office of Information under MAX A. EGLOFF for the purpose of making motion pictures on and in Puerto Rico.

He said that JOHN FERNO associates with JACK DELANO and with CHARLES ROTKIN and the latter's wife, ADELE DIAMOND. He advised that CHARLES ROTKIN, an employee of the Office of Information, according to the latter's mail is registered with Local Board No. 29 at 2900 Broadway, New York City, and is apparently related to one EDA ROTKIN at 670 Riverside Drive, New York.

PABLO MATOS, General Supervisor, Puerto Rican Development Company, who operates the latter's offices and living quarters in the Hotel Normandie, stated that JOHN FERNO does not live at the Hotel Normandie but during DELANO'S residence there was in the habit of coming daily to meet DELANO.

RALPH APONTE, day clerk, Hotel Normandie, stated that JACK DELANO moved on July 19, 1946, from the Normandie Hotel to 24 Ponce de Leon, Santurce, P. R., a suburb of San Juan, P. R. He stated that on one day in the latter part of June a radiogram was sent by ELLSWORTH reading as follows:

*ROSSKAM
10 Downing Street
New York City

US GUYS WILL CALL YOU AND MARCIA TONIGHT 10.

ELLS.*

He stated this radiogram was sent on June 20, 1946, according to his records, and that that evening at ten o'clock a telephone call was made to ROSSKAM to New York City not by ELLSWORTH but by JACK DELANO. The radiogram in handprinting of ELLSWORTH is being retained as an exhibit in instant file, the original having been obtained from RALPH APONTE in view of the hotel's procedure to telephone their contents to the cable office. Hotel records reflect a sixteen minute telephone call for \$33.00 by JACK DELANO, Room 325, Hotel Normandie, to ROSSKAM.

It is noted that according to CHARLES O'DAY, ELLSWORTH left San Juan for New York City on June 8, 1946, staying several days, and left under such quiet circumstances that Governor TUGWELL was not aware of his absence for two days. O'DAY confidentially advised that ELLSWORTH'S hurried trip to New York City was the result of to do with business of the Governor's Office.

In explanation of the word MARCIA in the above telegram of June 20, 1946, it is noted that the following information was obtained of Confidential Informant T-1 herein.


In this regard RALPH A S made available the originals of two radiograms sent subsequent to ELLSWORTH'S return from New York City, both from ELLSWORTH to MARCIA CRANDALL, 10 Downing Street, New York City. One radiogram reads:

"JESUS NOW REIGNS HOORAY ELLS."

This apparently refers to the September 3, 1946, inauguration of JESUS T. PILERO as Governor of Puerto Rico. The second reads:

"ON UP THE SLOPE CHILD, THERE IS SUNLIGHT ON THE OTHER SIDE OF THE HILL."

No information has been received concerning the relationship between MARCIA CRAIDALL and the ROSSKAMS at 10 Downing Street, New York City.



Referenced report at page seven reflects a number of telephone calls made by the ROSSKAMS during their presence in Puerto Rico.

Through personal conversations with HERBERT W. JOHNSON, 24 Ponce de Leon, Telephone 2-8451, it was determined that he is acquainted with ROSSKAMS only through his position on an Insular Government Agency.

MAX RAHN, telephone 2-3025, is the husband of one Mrs. RAHN, well known as a social worker in Puerto Rico and now an instructor at the University of Columbia. The purpose of the telephone call between ROSSKAM and MAX RAHN was not determined.



On October 15, 1946, RALPH APONTE, Normandie Hotel clerk, stated that for two days beginning October 12, 1946, Miss NANCY LARRICK an elderly spinster, and Miss MILDRED CODDINGTON had stayed at the Hotel Normandie enroute to 918 18th Street N. W., Washington, D. C., from Brazil. During their presence in the hotel a letter was received by Miss NANCY LARRICK bearing the return address, ROSSKAM, 10 Downing Street, New York City, New York.

C., as well as URSULA WASSERMAN, LOUISE and EDWIN ROSSKAN and JOSEPH BERNSTEIN of New York City. MARY JANE KEFNEY is also in contact with leading Communists in the United States such as HENRIETTA EUCKMASTER. DOXEY WILKERSON and HARRIEF, EDDY.

Recently PHILIP KEENEY returned to the United States from Tokyo. Japan, where he was making a study of Japanese libraries. KEEHEY expects to remain in Washington until after the Christmas holidays, at which time he plans to return to the Orient.

Reference is made to my letter directed to the Bureau on October 4. 1946, in which it was pointed out that the KEENEYS had been in contact with a "Colonel XTHOMAS" and other individuals in 1945, which indicates the probability of an existence of still another Soviet espionage parallel.

In view of the foregoing information, it is believed that a microphone surveillance would be productive and your authorization is requested for its installation for a period not to exceed January 1, 1947.

You may recall that Mary Jane Keeney is strongly suspected of being engaged in Soviet espionage activities through her known contacts with numerous subjects in the Gregory Case, including Mr. and Mrs. Silvermaster, David R. Wahl, Philip Junaway and Larry Todd, head of the Washington bureau of Tass News Agency. Mary Jane Keeney is also a known contact of Ursula Casserman and Jules Korchein, prominent Communists in New York City.

It is known that through the Keeneys' numerous suspicious contacts in Mashington they frequently have social engagements in their apartment and it is believed that the microphone may develop interesting and pertinent results in connection with the Gregory Case.

A technical surveillance is presently in operation covering the Keeneys! telephone. The Washington Field Office is desirous of making the requested installation on November 15, 1946.

It is recommended that authorization be granted for the installation of this microphone if such installation can be made with full security.

ALEXANDER KORAL, 290 Empire Boulevard, Brooklyn, New York, was first known to this office in December of 1945, at which time he met NATPAN GREGORY SILVER ASTER in Washington, D. C., and was subsequently surveilled to New York City and identified. A surveillance was instituted on KORAL and continued for a period of six weeks. At the inception of the surveillance KORAL appeared to be very suspicious and surveillance conscious. However, after a few days had lapsed KORAL no longer appeared to be conscious of the surveillance. It was determined through the surveillance that KORAL made no contacts during the day or in the evening, and his habits consisted of primarily going to work every morning and returning home in the early evening.

A technical surveillance was instituted on January 8, 1946, and has continued up until the present time. It has been determined that neither KORAL nor his family use the telephone to any great extent and nothing productive nature has been developed through the technical surveillance

Efforts have been made to develop a confidential source to the effects of KORAL, and it was found that KORAL had placed a lock of his own on his apartment door. The superintendent of the apartment house does not have a key to the apartment. It also has been ascertained that KORAL and his family have not been away from their home for any length of time sufficient to safely conduct a confidential survey of his effects.

Confidential informants of this office have been contacted and a photograph of KORAL displayed to them, but none of them has been able to identify KORAL as being active in Communist Party circles in this area. Therefore, in view of the foregoing information, the technical surveillance telephone SLocum 6-8755, 290 Empire Boulevard, will be removed on November <5, 1946, unless advised to the contrary by the Bureau.

You may recall that according to Gregory, in September, 1944 "Bill", Gregory's Russian contact, who has to date been unidentified, indicated that he was moving from New York City to Baltimore or Washington and stated that he intended to handle the Silvermaster group personally and that Gregory was no longer to come in contact with any members of the group. Later Gregory stated he saw Silvermaster in New York City in August, 1945, and she asked him whether he had seen "Bill" lately and Silvermaster indicated he had not seen "Bill" for about two weeks but that he was still around.

Through a technical surveillance on the Silvermaster home, it was learned that at 6:08 p.m. on November 13, 1946, one Bill conversed with Mrs. Silvermaster who stated that Lud Ullman wasn't at home. Bill stated he wanted Lud and Greg, meaning Mr. Silvermaster, to be active and not just sit around the house. Mrs. Silvermaster agreed. Bill indicated he was going out for dinner and that he might call again later.

The Washington Field Office has advised that on the morning of November 14, 1946, Bill again contacted Mrs. Silvermaster, at which time it was decided that it would be undesireable for Bill to see Lud Ullman at work and tentative and indefinite arrangements were made for Bill to call upon Ullman and the Silvermasters at the Silvermaster home on the night of November 14.

The Washington Field Office has advised that coverage will be maintained on the Silvermasters' residence tonight in order to identify the unknown Bill who is expected to visit them and further, to determine if he is identical with the "Bill" mentioned hardregory 5-56402 - 1712

Gregory advised that upon returning to New York and after conferring with the firm's lawyers, she drafted a radiogram to Intourist in Moscow, which was approved by Reynolds and which was dispatched on September 30, 1946. This message announced to Intourist the intentions of the U.S. Service and Shipping Corporation to discontinue business as of October 31, 1946, unless it received a new contract containing an exclusive concession in the United States.

Oregory advised that on October 1, 1946, the was in conference with Browder, Earl Browder's brother, and she told William Browder of Reynolds decision to discontinue business unless certain conditions were forthcoming from Intourist, and in response to Browder's inquiries told him that the business grossed between \$8,000 and \$10,000 per month. When William Browder learned of the financial potentialities of the company, the fact that Reynolds was drawing \$2,000 per month salary and the present liquidating net worth of the company would be slightly over \$50,000, he became very excited and declared that the firm must not be allowed to go out of business. He stated that he and Earl Browder had in mind an individual to buy the business, and when he learned that Reynolds had sent a rather strongly worded radiogram to Intourist on September 30, 1946, he told Gregory that she should immediately attempt to have Reynolds' cable to Intourist stopped and countermand his original cable. William Browder explained that it was his plan that Reynolds should agree to the terms proposed in the Intourist draft of the contract, that Browder would arrange the sale of the company from Reynolds to this unnamed individual for \$5,000 and that the purchaser would succeed to the contractual rights held by Reynolds.

Gregory is of the definite opinion that William Browder's extreme interest is due to the possibility of great financial return from company operations rather than to any possible use of the company for espionage work. During this meeting with William Browder, Gregory advanced him the sum of \$500 which brings the total amount repaid to Browder to \$3,000, it being recalled that out of the original \$20,000 invested in the U.S. Service and Shipping Corporation when it was formed \$15,000 was made available by Earl Browder probably from Communist Party funds.

Gregory stated that she discussed William Browder's proposal with Reynolds but that Reynolds was steadfast in his determination not to have any intend to communicate with them nor to pay them any other money. It appears quested by William Browder.

Gregory informed that on October 9, 1946, she had talked with William Browder on the previous day and that they discussed the contract which the U.S. Service and Shipping Corporation had sent to Moscow and which contract was

discussed previously with Earl Browder by Gregory. It will be recalled that William Browder had previously asked Gregory to have John H. Reynolds contact Earl Browder under the name of James and at that time William Browder indicated that probably Earl could do something about having the contract of the U.S. Service and Shipping Corporation renewed. Gregory stated that William Browder did not continue in his efforts to nave Reynolos contact his brother, Earl, its course in Moscow. Gregory also stated that she had told William Browder that she was going to see Lengtarris, an outstanding Communist Party functionary quickly as possible and not to tell him too much about the contract.

Gregory stated that she talked to Lem harris on October 10, 1946, and harris requested that she and John Reynolds, President of the U.S. Service up as the working capital of the U.S. Service and Shipping Corporation. Harris told Gregory that the \$15,000 was put up by a personal friend of his who wanted to make an investment and that the money did not come from the Communist Party to produce the \$15,000 immediately since they were not certain that their contract was going to be renewed and also that they had not made any money until \$15,000. Gregory also told Harris that she was surprised to find that the \$15,000 from Communist Party funds through Earl Browder.

Gregory stated that Lem Harris is presently actively engaged in organizing a farmers group in Chicago, Illinois, and that that he spends only two days out of every two weeks in New York City. Harris urged Gregory to get of the money. Gregory said that she made no commitments about the \$15,000 to harris and made no promises as to when it would be returned or to whom it would be returned. It will be recalled that Gregory has paid out \$3,000 to Earl Browder with the knowledge of John Reynolds during the past four months.

Gregory stated that prior to Harris' departure from New York he inferred that possibly something could be "done down town" to have the contract Headquarters but she did not question him further on this since as she had Gregory stated to him she was going to let the matter take its own course. Gregory stated that she was going to make known to Reynolds Harris' demand.

On October 14, 1946, Gregory advised that on that date Jehn Reynolds had sent a cablegram to Intourist, Moscow, Russia, advising Intourist that he no longer desired consideration of the contract he had submitted to Intourist and

that he was suspending operations immediately. He desired Intourist to advise him of the company that would take over the business in the United States in order that he might settle his books and account with that company.

On November 1, 1946, Gregory advised that a cablegram was received from Intourist from Moscow that the Amalgamated Bank of New York City (which is well known as a depository for Communist Party funds) has been appointed as agent for Intourist in the United States to carry on the business formerly handled by the US Service and Shipping Corporation. The New York Office is this bank and Intourist and also who was instrumental in negotiating the contract.

ACTION:

The foregoing is for your information. Consideration is being given to having Lem Harris placed under surveillance during his two day trips to New York City in order to determine his activities and particularly to determine if he receives any money from the funds of the U.S. Service and Shipping Corporation or its predecessor the Amalgamated Bank and, if so, to determine what disposition he makes of this money, recalling that he stated the original \$15,000 was loaned to him by a friend.


KARL and BERTHA JENKINSON 6802 South Dante Avenue Chicago, Illinois

Pursuant to the request in referenced letter from the Washington Field Office, dated June 19, 1946, investigation was instituted to ascertain the identity and background information of the individuals at 6802 South Dante Avenue, whose last name was JENKINSON. Investigation in the neighborhood reflects that KARL and BERTHA JENKINSON reside at this address in an apartment on the first floor of the building.

N. R. IEVIN, Assistant Librarian, Chicago Public Library, Third Floor West, Washington Street and Michigan Avenue, Chicago, stated that KARL JENKINSON entered on duty with the Public Library System in January, 1939. He was a high school librarian and is a permanent Civil Service employee. BERTHA SCHULIAN has been employed by the Chicago Library System since November, 1923. She has been employed almost continuously since that time and is presently on maternity leave and has been since December, 1945. She presently resides at 6802 South Dante. The records reflect that she is now married to KARL JENKINSON. Mr. LEVIN, in commenting upon the records of these two employees, stated that there was nothing in the files to reflect that they were other than competent Civil Service employees, but stated "they are both pinks." When requested to elaborate on his remark, he stated that both KARL and his wife have been extremely active in organizing library employees into the State, County and Municipal Workers of America - CIO, and are commonly recognized as radicals, if not members of the Communist Party. It was LEVIN'S opinion that they were both probably Communists.



Miss SEMMES, Central Records Division, Northwestern University, Evanston, Illinois, advised on September 13, 1946 that BERTHA SABINE SCHUMANN attended the Evening School of Commerce at the Downtown School, Northwestern University, in 1929 and 1930. She enrolled from 1308 North Sixth Street, Milwaukee, Wisconsin. She also learned from the records at Northwestern that BERTHA SCHUMAN also attended the Downtown School of Social Science, and had received four teen hours credit. She graduated from Robert Waller High School in Chicago and attended West Intermediate High School in Davenport, Iowa, She

was born April 10, 1907 in Chicago. It will be noted that information contained in the employment records at the Civil Service Commission reflect her birth date as March 27, 1907. The courses she pursued at Northwestern University were: Advanced Child Psychology, two courses in Anthropology, one of which is entitled, "Races of Man," a course in Psychology of Individual Differences, and a course in Abnormal Psychology. According to Miss SEMMES, BERTHA was a decidedly above-average student, having grades of all A's and B's.

A check of Hill's Reports, Credit Bureau, and the Chicago Police Department, was made with negative results. A review of the indices of the Chicago Field Division reflects the following information concerning KARL and BERTHA JENKINSON.

It should be noted that DORchester 1628 is the telephone number of KARL and BERTPA JENKINSON. In the literature distributed by State, County and Municipal Workers of America - CIO, it appears that an executive meeting of Local 88 of this union was to be held August 29, 1944 at the home of KARL JENKINSON. 6802 Dante Avenue. A Confidential Informant 1.

Confidential Informant T 2 reported that JENKINSON was on the Executive Board of Local 2, State, County, and Municipal Workers of America as of August 21, 1945.


The Dies Committee list of former members of the American League for Peace and Democracy listed BERTHA JENKINSON, 1415 East 57th Street as a member of this organization. In an article appearing in the "Daily Calumet" dated October 16, 1945, entitled "An Open Letter from South Chicago Citizens to South Chicago", BERTHA JENKINSON, "Librarian", was listed as one of the signers of a plea for inter-racial unity and tolerance toward minority groups. It should be noted that this letter was signed by some of the outstanding CP functionaries in the Chicago Field Division. Confidential Informant T 3 reported that

In literature received in the Chicago Field Office, a copy of which is being made an enclosure with this report to the Washington Field Division, it appears that an organization was begun in Chicago, called Young America, the avowed purpose of which is to select reading material for children under a plan similar to the popularly known book-a-month clubs. This organization, the address of which is given as 4830 North Hamlin Avenue, Chicago, gives the following named persons as founders.

TOM and MARTHA IC KENNA
THA and HAPPIET KIPPIS
KARL and BERTHA JENKINSON
ROD and KATHERI AUGUSTEEN
JOSEPH and CHARLE AF FOLLINS
FRANK and BARBARA IC KENNA

TOM MC KEINA has long been a CP functionary in the Chicago Field and at one time was reparted to be Secretary of District #8, CP. His wife also has been active as a functionary. The address, 4830 North Hamlin Avenue was the address of TOM MC KENNA and his wife.

IRA KIPNIS is a former instructor at the Abraham Lincoln School and his wife is a known CP member. These two parties are close associates of ROD HOLMGREN and his wife KATHERINE, both of whom are known to be members of the CP.

CHARLEMAE ROLLINS is an instructor at the Abraham Lincoln School and is a very close friend of WILLIAM L. PATTERSON, formerly the Director of the Abraham Lincoln School, and presently Vice-Chairman of the CP, District #8 in Chicago. CHARLEMAE ROLLINS is reportedly employed in the library at 48th and South Michigan Avenue, Chicago.

FRANK MC KENNA is a brother of TOM MC KENNA. This office has definite information from a highly confidential source, that TOM MC KENNA and his wife, KIPMIS and his wife, HOLLEREN and his wife, are all card holding members of the CP in Chicago.

The literature which is submitted herewith definitely indicates the intention of this group to select the type of reading material furnished to youth who subscribe to the plane

AT WOODSTOCK, ILLINOIS

MARY JANE KEENEY

In the referenced letter from the Washington Field Division, dated July 15, 1946, this office was advised that MARY JANE KEENEY was expected to arrive in Chicago and Woodstock, Illinois sometime subsequent to July 11, 1946.

In referenced report, information is set forth on Page 4, relative to KEENEY'S mother, Mrs. RAYMOND DANIELS and certain information is set forth concerning PHILIP OF KEENEY.

Because of the fact that Woodstock is a relatively small town, it was deemed not advisable to conduct a constant surveillance of KEENEY while at Woodstock. However, Mrs. JOHN WHITWORTH, 327 South Jefferson Street, Woodstock, Illinois, Telephone 10, was a very close friend of Mrs. FRANK A. DINIELS, KEENEY'S mother, and she furnished the following information regarding KEENEY'S stay in Woodstock.



On July 22, 1946 Mrs. DANIT Jadvised Mrs. WHITWORTH that she had received a call on that morning from Chicago, from MARY JANE KEENEY, stating that she had arrived safely in Chicago by way of Cleveland, Ohio and Kalamazoo, Michigan, and would arrive in Woodstock on July 26 or 27. MARY JANE KEENEY did not reveal to her mother where she was staying, in Chicago, nor did she indicate with whom she was staying. It was later learned, however, that KEENEY was visiting with friends who were connected with the Public Library in Chicago. These same friends were alleged to have given MARY JANE a farewell party during her 1945 visit to Chicago. Mrs. DANIEIS revealed that MARY JANE would stay only two weeks rather than the six weeks indicated in the referenced letter. Mrs. WHITWORTH stated that MARY JANE had no close friends in Woodstock to her knowledge, and it was Mrs. WHITWORTH'S opinion that Mrs. DANIEIS was a very reliable person and much opposed to her daughter's actions, although she was not fully aware of her daughter's philosophy.

Mrs. WHITWORTH was re-contacted by Special Agent O. ARTHUR GRAN on August 12, 1946 at which time she advised that she had learned that MARY JANE had traveled extensively through Massachusetts prior to her coming to Woodstock. MARY JANE did not reveal the nature or purpose of this trip nor the identity of any associates.

En route to Woodstock from Washington, MARY JANE allegedly visited a cousin, ELFANORGECSWELL, or CONSWELL, a Professor of Sociology at the University of Fittsburgh. She was reputed to have given an impromptu speech of an undisclosed nature at this university. It was the informan's opinion that this cousin shares the same ideology as MARY JANE KEENEY.

Also on KEENEY'S trip to Chicago she allegedly visited some unidentified individuals in Cleveland, where she gave a scheduled lecture before some seventy-five people. According to the informant, MARY JANE did not reveal to her mother, nor to the informant, the names of the persons whom she visited.

On KEENEY'S first day in Woodstock, she received some thirty-five pieces of mail from unknown persons, with the exception of several letters from her husband, whom she referred to as ANGUS. Her husband is supposed to have stated in these letters that he was traveling in regal style in Japan, recorganizing the libraries of Japan. He was alleged to have stated that the main trouble was that because of strict censorship in Japan, the Japanese were not fully aware of what was going on in the rest of the world. He expected to return to the United States about December 1, 1945 for one month, and then return to Japan to complete his job.

KEENEY'S mother revealed to the information that MARY JANE had had a row with the State Department and had resigned her job before coming to Woodstock, but that she expected to take another job starting about October 1, 1946 in Washington, D. C. According to the informant, MARY JANE did not reveal to her mother the nature of her difficulty with the State Department, nor the location of her new job. MARY JANE is furnishing twenty dollars a month for her mother's support, however.

According to the informant, KEENEY came to Chicago on August 1, 1946 to give a speech of an undisclosed nature. The informant told KEINEY that she would like very much to accompany her to Chicago, but MARY JANE did not offer to take her along. KEENEY'S mother subsequently told the informant that her daughter had addressed the American Union of Librarians in Chicago.

In the July, 1946 issue of the "Public Worker," official publication of the United Public Workers of America — CIO, appears the following advertisement. "Hear MARY JANE KEENEY, Tuesday, August 1, 1946, UPWA Hall, 64 West Randolph Street." This meeting was held under the auspices of Amalgamated Local #2, UPWA. It appeared therefore that it was this meeting which was addressed by KEENEY.

At this time KEENEY'S mother expressed to the informant, considerable concern over MARY JANE'S radical ideas and secret activities, and requested the informant, to find out if possible, what her daughter was up to. Mrs. DANIELS remarked that "MARY surely is all for the Russians." Subsequent to her return from Chicago, MARY JANE told the informant that she had succeeded in locating a woman in Chicago whom she did not expect to see. She explained that this woman had been a librarian in Spain, to whom, "we sent money to get out of Spain."

On August 8, 1946, according to the informant, MARY JANE went alone to Watertown, Wisconsin, where she spent the day. Through Mrs. DANIEIS, the informant learned that MARY JANE visited one Mrs. GABREL. Mrs. GABREL was allegedly born in Russia and came to this country where she was adopted. She married a wealthy man who was a manufacturer of extension tables, presumably in Watertown, Wisconsin. Both Mr. and Mrs. GABREL took an extensive trip through Russia. It was reported that the GABREIS: lost most of their wealth in the stock market crash of 1929.

On August 10, 1946, MARY JANE, in the company of her mother and Mrs. FICRENCE (EARL) MERIAN, 805 Washington Street, Woodstock, Illinois, a family Irlend,

visited relatives of Mrs. HERMAN in Highland Park, Illinois. This contact was considered insignificant by the informant because Mrs. HERMAN is a close friend of Mrs. DANIEIS and is highly regarded in Woodstock. On Sunday, August 11, 1946 MARY JANE and her mother visited another family friend, Mrs. JOSIE BIGEIOW, Rogers Park, Chicago, Illinois. The informant stated that she did not believe Mrs. BIGEIOW was aligned with MARY JANE in any way.

The informant learned from Mrs. DANIEIS that MARY JANE intended to leave for Washington, D. C. via Milwaukee, Wisconsin, on Thursday, August 15, and was of the opinion that Mrs. BERTHA JENKINSON, 6802 Dante Avenue, Chicago, would accompany MARY JANE to Washington, D. C.

Special Agent O. ARTHUR GRAN recontacted the informant, Mrs. WHITWORTH on August 19, 1946, who advised that MARY JANE left by automobile August 15 for Milwaukee, Wisconsin, where she expected to pick up a woman, who is to accompany her to Washington, D. C. This time the informant stated that she had been previously misinformed as to the identity of the woman who was to accompany MARY JANE back to Washington, D. C., and stated that the woman, who was to be picked up in Milwaukee, was unknown to both Mrs. DANIEIS and the informant.

Subsequent to MARY JANE'S leaving for Milwaukee, a telegram was received by Mrs. DAMIEIS stating as follows:

*PIANNING MEETING FOR ODDON AND BROWLEY SEPTEMBER 4TH, NYC. CAN YOU MAKE IT? PLEASE WIRE REPLY.

This telegram was forwarded to MARY JANE in Washington.

Chief of Police IEWIS THAYER advised Special Agent GRAN that MARY JANE while in Woodstock had attended an outing in the company of one MARY KATHERINE WINDER, who is the daughter of the former sheriff of McHenry County. MARY JANE was seen in the company of MARY IDINGER on several other occasions. According to Chief of Police THAYER, MARY IDINGER is known as being of advanced mind and ideas, and was formerly a professor at William and Mary College. She has recently married a professor whose identity was unknown to the chief.

In referenced letter to the Bureau, dated July 11, 1946, the Bureau and auxiliary offices were advised that the residence at 138 Woodland, Winnetka, Illinois was owned by Mrs. MARY STEVENSON.

On July 16, 1946, L. P. WILLIAMS, Clerk in the Post Office, Winnetka, Illinois furnished the forwarding address of RICHARD WATT, which is 5317 Greenwood Avenue, Chicago.

HOWARD H. DICKAW, Carrier in Winnetka Post Office, advised that he had known MARY JANE WATT, who is the daughter of Mrs. MARY STEVENSON, for a number of years. She and her husband RICHARD had been residing at 138 Woodland, Winnetka, but that approximately three months ago the WATTS had moved to 5317 South Greenwood, Chicago. MARY JANE WATT had attended the University of Chicago and was employed by the government in Washington, D. C. while her husband was in service. He has recently been discharged from the service and the WATTS contemplate residing in Chicago. Mr. DICKAW advised that the WATTS visit Mrs. STEVENSON nearly every week-end.

Investigation was conducted at the Credit Bureau, Winnetka Police Department, Winnetka Chamber of Commerce, and the local draft board with negative results as to either MARY JANE or her husband RICHARD.

JOHN CHANNER, associated with the A. C. F. GEDGE Real Estate Company, 140 Greenbay Road, Wirmetka, Illinois, advised on July 16, 1946 that he had known MARY JANE WATT for a number of years. He stated that he was presently attempting to sell Mrs. STEVENSON'S home but that she could not make up her mind whether to sell or for what price. He knew nothing of the activities of RICHARD WATT or MARY JANE, nor did he know where they were presently employed.

AT CHICAGO, ILLINOIS

Mr. PETE MC GLOYN of the Frear-Delaplane Company, 5306 South Hyde Park, advised that the residence at 5317 Greenwood Avenue was owned by EDITH C. SHAMBAUGH and has been so owned for a number of years. G. E. SHAMBAUGH, husband of EDITH, is a practicing physician and is considered quite wealthy. They own considerable other property in Chicago.

Through the Commonwealth Edison Company, Chicago, Illinois, it was ascertained that the electric bill at 5317 Greenwood is in the name of GEORGE G. BOGERT, 5317 Greenwood Avenue and has been since September 1, 1926.

BOGERT'S telephone number is MIDway 1438. Nothing is known of BOGERT at this time.

Miss EVELYN NOFFKE, Office of the Registrar, University of Chicago, produced a scholastic record of MARY JANE STEVENSON reflecting the following information:

The father's name was given as JANES CASTEVENSON and he resided at 138 Woodland Avenue at the time she entered the University of Chicago November 19, 1934. MARY JANE was born March 4, 1916 in Sioux City, Iowa and she graduated from New Trier High School, Winnetka, Illinois. At the University of Chicago she pursued the following courses: Political Science, International Relations, and Social Sciences. She received an A.B. degree August 27, 1937. She attended graduate school in 1937, 1938, 1939, and 1940, and took the following courses: Collective Bargaining and Industrial Arbitration, Political Science, Personnel Administration, Administrative Iaw, and The Soviet Form of Government. There was no record of RICHARD WATT ever having attended this school.

Mail cover of the WATTS at 5317 Greenwood reflects that Mr. RICHARD WATT received two letters from the Mayflower Hotel, no room number given. He also received a letter from PATENNIKER of the State, County, and Municipal Workers of America - CIO, 64 West Randolph Street, Room 1126, Chicago, Illinois.



Reference is made to Bureau letter to the New York Field Division dated October 4, 1946, which instructed the New York Office to determine if the SS Athos II had arrived in the United States, and whether or not Theodore Baumgold was on board. This ship was due to leave Marseilles on August 22 or 25, 1946, for New York City. The New York Office was further instructed that in the event Baumgold did arrive in this country to determine his present activities and to report same immediately, especially any of his contacts with the Meinsteins bearing in mind that Baumgold is possibly a relative of Dr. Weinstein.

To date no information has been received from the New York Office and it is desired that these instructions be complied with immediately.

It is noted in the report of Special Agent John T. Hisbos, New York City, dated October 17, 1946, that Baumgold and his wife were both in contact with Dr. Weinstein on September 16, 1946. However, this is the first indication that Baumgold has arrived in this country.

The New York Office should consider the advisability of intervituing Baumgold's first wife, ars. Lydia Baumgold, 29 West 12th Street, New York City, for any information of value concerning Theodore Baumgold and possibly his connection with Dr. Weinstein. This interview should not be conducted, however, until her background has been developed to the extent that such an interview would not jeopardize the Bureau's investigation.



Special Agent Raford W. Herbert of this office has advised that he encountered one JERRY KRAMER, whom he had known as a diplomatic courier on the run between Buenos Aires, Santiago, and Miami, Florida, in 1944. During the conversation KRAMER asked him if he had ever run into a very close friend of KRAMER'S who had recently gone to Buenos Aires to work for the World Report, a new magazine put out by DAVID HAWRENCE, and KRAMER mentioned the name of REDMONT as that friend. KRAMER indicated that he had known REDMONT as a very close friend at the time REDMONT was working in the Co-ordinator's Office in Washington.

KRAMER, whose full name is JERONE KRAMER, is now employed by the advertising firm of EINSON FRED'AN, Long Island City, New York, and had been until recently employed as a Captain in the Paratroopers in the United States Army. Special Agent Herbert advised that KRAMER had told him that he knew BERNARD RED'ONT socially and regarded him very highly, and described KRAMER as 5' 9", black hair, brown eyes, 160 lbs., wooden leg, race Jewish, marital status - married. Special Agent Herbert advised that he had no specific information which would indicate that KRAMER was affiliated in any way with BERNARD REDMONT in his activities in instant case, but he thought it advisable that a record be made of KRAMER'S close association with REDMONT.

A review of the New York files reflects the name of one JERCEE KRAMER, 123 West 93rd Street, New York City, appearing on the mailing list of the German Library of Information, but it is not known whether this KRAMER is identical with the subject of instant letter. No further investigation is being conducted by the New York Office, but the Washington Field Office is requested to review their files for any mention of KRAMER, and if deemed advisable, to check the files of the State Department for any information indicating any connection by KRAMER with any of the other subjects in this case.

MARY JANE KEENEY

Reference is made to the report of Special Agent LAUBERT G. ZANDER dated October 1, 1946, at Washington, D. C., and in particular to information reported therein pertaining to PHILIP OLIN KEENEY and MARY JANE KEENEY which begins on page 46. Information reflected therein relative to "Colonel THOMAS," "JOSIE," and JOE" is believed to be of special interest.

It is to be recalled that MARY JAME KEENEY departed from the United States on November 1, 1945, for Paris and Berlin where she was attached to the Allied Staff on Reparations. Shortly after this time, PHILIP KEENEY learned he was being considered for a position with the Federal Government in Japan.

Beginning on page 46 of reference report are excerpts of letters written by PHILIP to MARY JANE during the period from November 1 to December 31, 1945. In the letter of November 20, 1945 (page 50), PHILIP wrote that BOWEN SMITH had asked him to go to Japan and had MARY JANE been in the United States, BOWEN would have urged her to go also. In the letter dated November 22, 1945, which appears on the same page, PHILIP discusses his trip to Japan and writes that their friends "including THOMAS" had made it clear that there is a job to do, that it has fallen to PHILIP's lot to do it, and that he is game to do it. Page 51 reflects PHILIP's letter dated November 24, 1945, in which he writes that he wants to go to New York City to see Colonel THOMAS among others.

On November 29, 1945, KEENEY wrote he was visiting URSULA WASSER-MAN in New York City and that he was having dinner that evening with "the LERMANS" and that he would have a "long session" after dinner with Colonel THOMAS. The LERMANS referred to here are undoubtedly LOUIS LERMAN and wife, he being the executive secretary of the Jefferson School of Social Sciences in New York City. In the same letter KEENEY writes he spent several hours

with Colonel THOMAS "which is a pass word to use in the higher circles."
THOMAS expressed the opinion that mail from Berlin would be censored, and apparently meant that MARY JANE should be careful in her correspondence.
Continuing, KEENEY said that THOMAS thinks his (KEENEY's) trip to Japan is of great importance and could not understand how the KEENEYS could leave for foreign countries "without some comment." THOMAS also said to KEENEY he would "survey the landscape ore" and hoped to find something for KEENEY before he left for Japan.

It is also noted KEENEY wrote on November 30, 1945 (page 53), that he had a long talk with JOSIE who had seen THOMAS "who is a most confusing man." JOSIE spoke with KEENEY concerning EARL BROWDER who was at that time about to visit Russia. JOSIE also seemed concerned about the Communist Party attitude and the debate going on in party circles. It is noted here that JOSIE was reportedly close to CORDELL HULL and HARRY HOPKINS.

On December 1, 1945, KEENEY wrote as reflected on page 53 he had another talk with Colonel THOMAS and that after seeing him KEENEY felt a terrible sence of responsibility and the sense of urgency hung over KEENEY.

Your attention is next directed to the letter KEENEY received from THOMAS which appears on page 56 of reference report. Several observations are apparent. THOMAS evidently is well enough acquainted with PHILIP KEENEY to address him by his nickname which is ANGUS. THOMAS knows the KEENEYS possess a dog and knows the dog's name which is MARTY. The language in this letter is rather flowery which is common among individuals of Germanic background. The signature to this letter which is affixed by pen is of the same flowery character. Attention is also directed to the comment that THOMAS makes in this letter that he is "heading for home," and therefore no letters would reach him after January 10. This would lead one to believe THOMAS was either leaving the United States on January 10 or going to a place where KEENEY could not correspond with him further.

A photographic copy of this letter is being submitted to the FBI Laboratory for examination.

KEENEY'S letter of December 24, 1945, as reflected on page 60 indicates the SILVERMASTERS were "pleased and green with envy" about the news concerning THOMAS, and that DAVE, undoubtedly DAVID WAHL, was delighted. This would indicate that NATHAN GREGORY SILVERMASTER and DAVID WAHL were acquainted with THOMAS or at least had knowledge of him through KEENEY. In this same letter KEENEY wrote that LUDWIG ULLMANN had finished four of the "prints" and that KEENEY was sending one of them to THOMAS. The prints referred to here may possibly mean photographs of PHILLIP KEENEY.

It is to be noted that in his letter of November 13, 1945 (page 49), he wrote MARY JANE KEENEY that he had no good picture.

Continuing, on December 26, 1945, as is shown on page 60, KEENEY wrote there is a chance MARY JANE may hear from THOMAS after she reaches Berlin. The ANDRES referred to in the letter of this date is TERESA/ANDRES, a librarian of Spanish origin who was active in the resistance movement in France during the past war. The details as to how MARY JANE located her are reflected in the report of Special Agent LAMBERT G. ZANDER dated August 16, 1946, at Washington, D. C., beginning on page 66.

From a review of this information relative to Colonel THOMAS, it is felt there is a strong possibility of another parallel in Soviet espionage. The identity of Colonel THOMAS is not known to the Washington Field Office. It was felt he might have been ANATOLE GROMOV, but a review of information available in the files reflects he was in Washington, D. C., on the dates that PHILIP OLIN KEENEY contacted Colonel THOMAS in New York City.

The same source which furnished the above referred to letters made available diaries maintained by MARY JANE KEENEY during the years from 1938 to 1945 excluding 1944. These diaries have been reviewed, and a comprehensive study is being made of them, the results of which will be reported soon.

The diaries reflect only one reference to Colonel THOMAS. It appears in the entry of December 13, 1945, in which MARY JANE KEENEY wrote she had received a letter from her husband, apparently the letter dated December 1, 1945. MARY JANE made the following comment: "On his trip to New York he had seen nearly everyone including JOSIE and Colonel THOMAS who seemed to have impressed on him a great sense of responsibility. This responsibility weighs on me and makes me feel most unhappy because I am doing nothing."

The JOSIE referred to is believed to be JOSEPHINE TRUSION ADAMS alias JOSIE (Bureau file 100-22337) who was the subject of a security matter - C investigation by the New York Field Office in February, 1945. At that time she was a teacher at the Jefferson School of Social Sciences of which, it will be recalled, LOUIS LEPMAN is executive secretary. It is noted that a confidential informant of the New York Field Office stated Miss ADAMS is generally known as JOSIE in communist circles.

According to the records of the Special Committee on un-American Propaganda Activities in the United States (Dies Committee), JOSEPHINE ADAMS was connected with numerous communist front organizations.

A review of MARY JANE KEENEY's diaries reflects a number of entries concerning JOSIE during 1945. They are as follows:

"March 6, 1945

"JOSIE and REGINA WILSON down. They come up to Que Street (the FEA office where MARY JANE was employed) and dress for JOE DAVIES' tea. JOSIE stays the night with us and we talk till 2:00. Her friend thinks ANGUS (PHILIP KEENEY) should make a try for IC (librarianship of the Library of Congress) so we prime JOSIE with his background."

"March 7, 1945

"Leave JOSIE in bed."

"March 17, 1945

"Letter from JOSIE saying IC matter was ——— (intelligible) and is being 'chered over. **

"April 11, 1945

"ANGUS calls JOSIE and gets word to go ahead so we have a caucus with PHYL about lining up support in Senate for IC job."

"April 15, 1945

"No word from JOSIE."

"April 21, 1945

"Find letter from JOSIE. Very sad, but says a good deal has been done about IC before FDR's death and we should go ahead."

"April 26, 1945

"Another letter from JOSIE. The contact spoken of was with E, the one with T (THOMAS?) not yet having been made."

It is to be noted that LUTHER EVANS was appointed librarian of the Library of Congress to succeed ARCHUBALD VacLEISH shortly after this time.

Attention is also directed to the references in the aforementioned correspondence relative to JOE which appear on pages 48 and 52 of reference report. It is observed that PHILIP KEENEY was unable to contact JOE in New York City. It is believed this JOE is probably JOSEPH BERNSTEIN with aliases, subject of investigation at New York City. The references to JOE, believed to be JOSEPH BERNSTEIN, which appear in MARY JANE's diaries are interesting and appear as follows:

"June 6, 1943

"Down to J's in the evening where we find JOE and give him some good advice."

"November 11, 1943

"JOE BERNSTEIN down here from New York. Long talk about Japan and then long talk about other matters which seem quite complicated."

"December 7, 1943

"JOE B. comes in at 8:30. Get to bed very late."

*December 8, 1943

"JOE encounters technical difficulties but gets off on 9:00 train."

"December 27, 1943

"JOE down."

"March 20, 1945

"JOE down."

"April 4, 1945

"JOE down in evening. Have some good talk."

"April 24, 1945

"JOE down."

"May 8, 1945

"JOE B. down."

"May 21, 1945

"JOE down."

"June 4, 1945

"JOE down fortunately bringing a copy of the paper which has been sold out here. E. B. outvoted ten to one on plenum discussion and W. Z.'s policies upheld."

This apparently refers to the change of the Communist Political Association back to the Communist Party at which time the leadership of the party was taken over by WILLIAM 2. FOSTER from EARL BROWDER.

"October 20, 1945

"In (to New York City) at 4:30. Find M. SCHLAUCH in so call them till 7:00. Then go out to URSULA'S (WASSERMAN) where we meet JULES KORCHIEN who is living in ROSSKAM's apartment. Dinner with them at which we are joined by JOE B. He and I have private confab."

It is to be noted this trip by MARY JANE KEENEY to New York City on October 20, 1945, was made just prior to her going overseas.

The New York Field Office is requested to exhaust all logical leads in attempting to establish the identity of Colonel THOMAS. It is believed he may possibly have been in the U. S. Army serving as a colonel but it appears more likely that "Colonel THOMAS" is a code name. It is requested that investigation in this matter be given vigorous attention.

Please refer to letter from the Washington Field Division to the Bureau dated October 4th, 1946 in the captioned matter setting out information concerning a "Colonel THOMAS" who is shown to be a contact of PHILIP KEENEY, MARY JANE KEENEY, and JOSIE", who is probably JOSEPHINE TRUSION ADALS.

It will be noted in the referenced letter that several references are made to one Colonel THOMAS by the KEENEYS, and it would appear from the correspondence that the name Colonel THOMAS is a code name and that there was some reason for protecting his identity. It will be noted in addition that in one of the letters made available to the Washington Field Division by a highly confidential source, Colonel THOMAS informed PHILIP KEENEY that he was "heading for home" and that no letters would reach him after January 10th (1946). It is believed that the term "heading for home" refers to Colonel THOMAS leaving the United States. Efforts are continuing in this division to effect an identification of Colonel THOMAS through a review of information available concerning his apparent acquaintances and the results of such investigation will be forwarded to the Bureau in the near future.

In addition, Confidential Informant GREGORY has recently been interrogated on the possibility that she might know of some figure in the Russian espionage organizations in the United States who might be identical with Colonel THOMAS, but has stated that she can suggest no possibility at this time, and further, remarked that to the best of her knowledge, the SILVERMASTERS had no Hungarian friends during the time she was working with them.

It is suggested that the Washington Field Division, in the light of the additional information concerning the individual in Budapest who may be identical with Colonel THOMAS, may be able to suggest some individuals known to that office as possibly identical with him. KRAETTLI and other faculty members have continuously advanced the theory that HALPERIN was one of the most intelligent language professors ever to be employed at the University.

Confidential Informant T-1 was convinced that STEPHEN SCATORI and former professor J. M. HERMANDEZ have no actual connection with any subversive activities in which HALPERIN might be engaged. He is inclined to believe that ANTONIO de la TORRE might be accused of radical tendencies. Confidential Informant T-1 has agreed to report any suspicious activities on the part of either de la TORRE or SCATORI.











