The facts of this case were discussed with Assistant United States Attorney JAMES J. SULLIVAN, JR., Boston, Massachusetts, who stated that the letter is recognizable as a violation of the Extortion Statute and this threat is sufficiently spelled out in the letter. He stated he would authorize prosecution if the subject is identified.

The original letter was forwarded to the FBI Laboratory who advised that the handwriting appearing on the envelope and extortion letter was searched in the appropriate sections of the Anonymous Letter File without effecting an identification. No latent impressions of value were developed.

Inasmuch as the Victim in this case was not interviewed, no physical description is being set out.

Representative of the Veterans Administration, Boston, Massachusetts, advised that they have no record reflecting individuals who may have been veterans of the three wars noted in the extortion note. He stated that all Spanish American War Veterans are entitled to a pension. However, the names are broken down alphabetically but not according to war. He said of the opinion that the Spanish American War Veterans Society of the State House might be able to furnish additional information.

Departmental Adjutant, Department of Massachusetts, United Spanish War Veterans, Room 100, State House, Boston, Massachusetts, advised that the General Joseph F. Taylor Camp #23 covers the City of Lynn and that the Adjutant of Camp #23 is [redacted], the position of [redacted], Lynn, Massachusetts. He was unable to furnish any information which might lead to the identity of the bank. He stated that individuals belonging to the [redacted] do not necessarily live in Lynn but that Spanish American War Veterans may live in Lynn and belong to [redacted] of the other camp. He stated that Spanish American War Veterans will stay with [redacted] that he can be contacted if [redacted] even though he [redacted] in other sections of the country. He stated that Camp #23 was [redacted] [redacted] Massachusetts Whittany [redacted]

[redacted], Clerk of the Spanish American War Veterans, advised that there are some 1000 Spanish American War Veterans who are members of that organization presently living in Lynn and that the average age is approximately 70 years. She stated that there are also in the State of Massachusetts some 500 free riders and that they are individuals who are veterans but do not belong to the Veterans organization.

██████████ stated that Spanish American War Veterans receive \$96.75 per month after age 65 and \$129.00 per month if totally disabled. These checks are mailed directly out of Washington, D.C., from the Division of Veterans Claims, Veterans Administration, Washington 25, D.C.

██████████ Adjutant of Camp #15, Lynn, Massachusetts, advised that he is also Adjutant of Council #7 of the Spanish American War Veterans which covers the camps in Gloucester, Beverly, Salem, Marblehead and Lynn, which are all located in the same section north of Boston. ██████████ advised that Camp #15 presently has some 50 members and in the City of Lynn there are other veterans who are either non-members or members of camps located in other sections.

██████████ stated that he had read the letter which was published in the Boston Post and neither he nor any members of his camp recognized the writing or have any suspects. He has never heard of any anti-MCCARTHY veterans at Camp #15 or of Council #7.

██████████ advised he does not recall any individual who served in all three of the wars noted in the extortion letter. He cannot recall any individual who may have served in the armed forces as a career man and later retired in that area. He advised that the only members he can recall who were veterans of the Spanish American War and World War I are ██████████ ██████████ and ██████████. He stated ██████████ has been bedridden for over a year and is residing at ██████████ Street, N.W., Washington, D.C., and ██████████ resided at North Chatham, Maine.

██████████ advised that there are fifty active members of the camp in his Camp. However, his records are not complete and he is unable to furnish any information which would identify ██████████. He advised that Spanish American War Veterans receive \$96.75 per month except from paying full taxes.

██████████, Adjutant of ██████████, and ██████████, Superintendent of ██████████, Lynn, Massachusetts, advised there was nothing peculiar about the handwriting on the letter which might indicate from what area this letter had been mailed. They are of the belief that it was mailed during the morning of April 2, 1954 and the handwriting includes Scars, Sumner, West Lynn, and Lynn, Massachusetts.

- (2) Envelope postmarked Lynn, Massachusetts, dated March 27, 1954, addressed to [redacted] containing note with newspaper clipping attached, note beginning [redacted] Dear Sir", and ending "I wonder [redacted]".
- (3) Envelope postmarked Lynn, Massachusetts, dated April 19, 1954, addressed to "Editor Letters to McCARNEY", with writing on the reverse side with two-page note beginning "Sausapcott, Mass., Sunday, April 18, 1954", ending [redacted]

Since the writer or writers of the above notes appear to be [redacted] anti-McCARNEY and they are all postmarked Lynn, where the extortion letter in instant case was postmarked, it is requested that the handwriting of the three above letters be compared with the original extortion note previously forwarded to the Bureau, to determine if any of them are identical with the original extortion note.

The Laboratory is also requested to determine if all three of the above letters were written by the same or different individuals.

The Laboratory is requested to return the above specimens upon completion of examination.



Since the writers of the above notes appear to be somewhat anti-McCARTHY and the letters were all postmarked Lynn, it was requested that the handwriting of the above specimens be compared with the original extortion note which had been previously forwarded to the FBI Laboratory to determine if they are identical with each note. The FBI Laboratory examined the above and advised that all were prepared by the same individual and these specimens were secured from the appropriate sections of the Anonymous Letter File and specifically from Bureau File 9-24596, which contained the original extortion letter in this case, and with Bureau File 95-524, entitled, "McCarthy - Victim", and no identification was made.

Since all logical investigative leads have been covered in this case, the undersigned with the authority of the Special Agent in Charge.

Officer [redacted] of the Capitol Police, National Extension [redacted] (Senate Detail) phoned and advised that he had just received a long-distance phone call at 6:05 a.m. from Aurora, Illinois. [redacted] stated that the caller identified himself only as "Binbo" and stated "Senator McCarthy and Dewey Short's lives are in danger. I can get a man on them." The only other statement made by the caller was the effect that he was connected with the "one-world movement."

The Congressional Directory for 1954 indicates that Dewey Short is a Representative from the 7th District from Illinois. [redacted] that he was referring this matter to the Lieutenant of his detail. [redacted] who will be on duty at 7:45 a.m. Officer [redacted] of the Capitol Police, advised that Senator McCarthy and Representative Dewey Short's offices will be advised. However, he did not know whether advising the Metropolitan Police was a part of their routine. It is to be noted in the quoted portion above that this does not take the specific form of a threat but rather takes the form of a notification that a certain condition exists.

ACTION:

Corporal [redacted] Communications Officer, Metropolitan Police Department, National Extension [redacted] was advised at 6:45 of the above for his information. He was also reminded that this Bureau performs no protective functions and we were furnishing this information so that the Metropolitan Police Department would be advised.

SAC Don Hostetter, Chicago, was advised of the above at 6:55 a.m. and requested to attempt to determine the location from which instant call was made and in so doing, if possible, the identity of the calling party in Aurora. He was also requested to furnish the Bureau by phone or teletype any information contained in the Chicago Field Office regarding "Binbo" or the "one-world movement." Hostetter was advised to contact any investigation beyond the inquiry concerning the above call's origin.

ASAC Schmidt of the Chicago Division furnished information concerning the captioned matter. You will recall from my earlier memorandum to you today that an officer of the Capitol Police advised early this morning that he had received a long-distance call from an individual in Aurora, Illinois, identifying himself only as "Bimbo," who stated that the lives of Senator McCarthy and Representative Dewey Short were in danger. The only other statement made by "Bimbo" to the Capitol Police was that he was connected with the "one-world movement."

Schmidt said that it had been determined that the telephone call had been made from a public pay telephone booth at the Aurora Hotel in Aurora, Illinois, telephone number 7707. He stated that the call had been made prepaid and that it had been impossible as a result to identify the caller in any way. Schmidt added that the indices of the Chicago Division had no identifiable reference to "Bimbo," although scattered references to somewhat similar names had been located involving old cases such as interstate transportation of stolen motor vehicles, white slave traffic act and interstate transportation of stolen property involving such names as [redacted]. Schmidt said that there was nothing in the Chicago files which would indicate that any such reference might be identical with the unknown individual making the call this morning under the name of "Bimbo." Schmidt also added that the Chicago indices contained no reference to any "one-world movement."

ACTION:

No further action is required concerning the above, which is set out for your additional information. As noted in the prior memorandum to you today, Capitol Police advised the offices of Senator McCarthy and Representative Short and the Bureau also informed the Metropolitan Police Department of the information received from the Capitol Police. No violation within the Bureau's jurisdiction is apparent.

ASAC Fletcher of the Washington Field Office advised that Captain [redacted] of the Metropolitan Police Department had just called reporting information received by the police from [redacted] H. E., Washington, D. C. [redacted] pointed out that this address is [redacted] that of Senator McCarthy.

[redacted] reported that last night about dark she heard someone on the roof of her house. She said that she told Mrs. McCarthy about that this morning. This afternoon at about 2:30 p.m. an anonymous male with a "Latin" voice called [redacted] and told her to get out of the house tonight with her children, that he didn't want to hurt them and that he would drop a bomb on the place. He then added that on second thought a little of [redacted] wouldn't hurt them; that he had seen [redacted] talking to a policeman this morning. [redacted] advised that as a matter of fact she had talked to a policeman in her block this morning.

Captain [redacted] according to ASAC Fletcher, has advised Senator McCarthy of the above information and reported that neither the Senator nor his wife is disturbed regarding it. Mrs. McCarthy reported that [redacted] is inclined to exaggerate. Fletcher said that the police are putting on a "short beat" at the Senator's home tonight, which will insure police coverage. Fletcher stated that no Bureau violation was apparent and that the above was being furnished for the Bureau's information.

Although apparently unrelated, in my memoranda to you today under the caption "Unknown Subject, alias Bimbo; Senator Joseph McCarthy, Representative Dewey Short - Victims; Possible Extortion," it was reported that Capitol Police received a long-distance telephone call early this morning from an individual in Aurora, Illinois, identifying himself only as "Bimbo," who stated that the lives of Senator McCarthy and Representative Dewey Short were in danger. The Capitol Police and the Metropolitan Police Department are acquainted with the details of that call, which did not constitute any apparent violation within the Bureau's jurisdiction. It is noted that in the current information originating from [redacted] no mention was made of Representative Dewey Short.

Harry Lever, "Evening Star," telephonically advised that officers of the No. 8 Precinct, Metropolitan Police Department, were giving special attention to the 2800 block of 34th Place, Northwest, on the basis of information furnished by the FBI. Lever inquired as to whether this had anything to do with Representative Dewey Short.

You will recall in my memoranda to you today captioned as above, that the Capitol police reported the receipt of a long distance telephone call early this morning from an individual in Aurora, Illinois identifying himself as only "Bimbo," who stated that the lives of Senator McCarthy and Representative Dewey Short were in danger. This matter did not constitute any apparent violation within the Bureau's jurisdiction. Night Supervisor [redacted] Washington Field Office, advised that Representative Dewey Short resides in the 2800 block of 34th Place, Northwest.

On the Washington City News Service ticker at 10:19 p.m., January 11, 1955, there is reported an announcement to the press by Captain William Broderick, head of the Capitol police force, of this telephone call by "Bimbo". According to this news item, Broderick passed the story on to the Metropolitan Police Department who ordered special protection for the homes of Senator McCarthy and Representative Short.

ACTION TAKEN:

[redacted] of Mr. Nichols' Office was informed of the preceding inquiry and of Broderick's announcement to the newspapers. He instructed that Lever be referred to Captain Broderick, which was done.

This matter was discussed this date with SILVIO J. MOLLO, AUSA, SDNY. MOLLO declined prosecution. Stated he believed it to be a "crank" letter. Requests no investigation. On October 23, 1956, this matter was discussed with SILVIO J. MOLLO, Assistant United States Attorney, Southern District of New York. MOLLO declined prosecution stating that he believed this to be a "crank" letter. Mr. MOLLO further stated that he did not desire this matter to be referred to the postal authorities inasmuch as there is no definite information contained therein which postal authorities could check out.

P.M. on July 22, 1953, she had received an anonymous telephone call from a woman who announced that she was calling long distance from Washington and that she was the Federal Bureau of Investigation. The woman calling stated that she had a report from a [redacted] telephone [redacted] Greenfield [redacted] and that report or letter had been mailed from [redacted] Street, Milwaukee, the address of [redacted] and further stated that Senator JOSEPH MC CARTHY was to be killed on Thursday. The woman further stated that the only way to trace [redacted] was to have [redacted] call him and make an appointment to meet him at her apartment on the next morning (Thursday) at which time a man from Washington would be at her home and would take charge. [redacted] was told to call [redacted] and to indicate that she was calling from Washington and that she was with the FBI, in order to make the appointment. [redacted] stated that she could not do this. The final result of the conversation was that the calling party was to call [redacted] and make the appointment. The calling party agreed to do so, however, called back in about one minute and advised that the meeting was off inasmuch as [redacted] could not make it. The entire conversation lasted approximately one hour.

[redacted] contacted long distance at Milwaukee to ascertain if the call could be traced and was advised that the call could not be traced. [redacted] also stated that she did not recognize the voice of the calling party and states that she has no enemies among her fellow employees at the Boston Store, a Milwaukee department store, or with any of her neighbors. This information was telephonically made available to Inspector [redacted] at the Bureau who suggested that a signed statement be obtained from [redacted] and that [redacted] be located and interviewed.

The following signed statement was obtained:

"I, [redacted], make the following statement of my own free will to [redacted] and [redacted] who has identified himself to me as a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation. No threats or promises have been made to me to induce me to make this statement.

"I am a widow and live at [redacted] in Apartment 26. I am employed as a waitress at the [redacted] a department store. I have been employed for about 10 years.

"On Wednesday July 22, 1953, I went to bed about 9:30 pm. About 10:30 pm or 10:45 pm my telephone rang. My telephone number is [redacted]. Without turning on the light or getting my glasses, I answered the telephone and a woman's voice said "This is long distance from Washington" or words to this effect. I then said "wait a minute" so that I could turn on the lights and get my glasses. I also got paper and pencil. When I returned to the telephone the woman said that this is the FBI and we have a report from [redacted] and the report was sent from the address of [redacted] and the letter says that someone at that address [redacted] is going to kill Senator Mc Carthy on Thursday. The woman also stated that they were sending a man from Washington who will arrive tomorrow morning (Thursday) at [redacted].

"I wrote down the name and address of [redacted] as it was given to me over the telephone. I have given this slip of paper to [redacted]. I also told the woman that I would have no idea who might kill Senator Mc Carthy as this was an apartment building with over 200 occupants and that it was an eight story building. It seemed to me that the woman calling did not realize that I lived in an apartment building.

"To continue the woman stated that the only way we could trap [redacted] was to have me call him and tell him that I was calling from Washington and to tell him that I was the FBI and give [redacted] the information stated above. We had quite a long conversation about how this was to be said. I also told the woman that I was not the FBI and that I would not call [redacted]. She also suggested that I call the FBI and tell them about the call and to have the FBI call [redacted]. The woman said that I should not call the FBI that it was secret. I finally suggested that since the woman knew all about it, that she should call [redacted]. She finally said that was a good idea and told me to pick up my telephone and she would call me back. About [redacted] about a minute the telephone rang and I picked up the "Washington Calling" and [redacted] that she had called [redacted].

"The entire telephone call took about 45 minutes to an hour. Because the entire matter was so unrelated to anything I know about, most of the time was spent trying to figure out what it was all about and trying to get it straight what the information was and what I was supposed to be doing.

"I did not recognize the voice of the woman calling and I am unable to furnish any information as to the identity of the woman calling. I do not know and have never heard of [REDACTED]. I also have not had any trouble with any of my fellow employees or neighbors and do not know anyone who would make such a call.

"During the entire conversation very little was mentioned about killing Senator Mc Carthy. It was probably mentioned 3 times, that is, when the contents of the supposed letter was related to me, when I repeated it, and when I repeated and copied down what I was supposed to tell [REDACTED].

"After the call was completed, I called the long distance operator to try to find out if the call could be traced and I was advised that it could not be traced.

"The above statement consisting of this and one other typewritten page is a summary of my recollection of the telephone call received by me on July 22, 1953, at it is as true as I can make it.

He stated that during the entire evening the telephone rang only once and that was about 8:00 P.M. and the telephone was answered by his son FREDERICK who told him that it was a wrong number. He stated that he owns his own home and has been living at that address for approximately eight years. He stated that he does not know of any neighbors or fellow employees who would make such a telephone call and further advised that he did not know [redacted] as a matter of fact did not know anyone who lived East of the Milwaukee River between East Wisconsin Avenue and East Mason Street, which is a general area in the vicinity of [redacted]. He further stated that he does not have any domestic difficulties, that he has three children, a daughter who is studying nursing at Marquette University, a son, [redacted], age 16, and a son, [redacted], age 12. He was unable to furnish any information as to the possible identity of the person making the anonymous call to [redacted]. He stated that he was born on March 10, [redacted] Minnesota, and has lived in Milwaukee for the past 30 years, and has been employed at the [redacted].

There being no further logical leads, this case is being closed, subject to being re-opened in case additional information is obtained.

ASAC William Beck of Milwaukee, called the Bureau as a result of information received from [redacted] Street, Milwaukee, a waitress employed in the [redacted] Store who reported a phone call she received last night in which mention was made of the fact that "someone was going to kill Senator McCarthy." [redacted] said she received a telephone call at approximately 10:30 P.M., Milwaukee time, last night. The caller was a woman who first said, "This is Washington calling" and then added, "This is the FBI." [redacted] doubted that it was actually a long-distance call from Washington since the [redacted] person did all the talking and it appeared to be a long-distance operator involved.

The anonymous woman caller advised that "we" have a letter from [redacted] Milwaukee. The letter was said to have a return address of [redacted] Street (this is identical with [redacted] address). The anonymous caller stated that the letter states "Someone from that address is going to kill Senator McCarthy on Thursday." She requested that [redacted] call [redacted] and represent that she was with the FBI. [redacted] told the anonymous caller that she should call the FBI herself but the caller declined to do this and [redacted] said that she would call the FBI but was instructed not to do so. The anonymous caller then suggested that arrangements be made to have [redacted] meet with [redacted] at the [redacted] Street address. [redacted] said she would not do this but would make her residence available if necessary. The anonymous caller terminated the conversation and said she would check with [redacted] and let [redacted] know. In what appeared to be less than one minute time the same woman called back and told [redacted] "We talked to [redacted] and it's all off."

ASAC Beck stated that Bureau Agents have now interviewed [redacted] and she does not appear to be a psychopathic case. The field office indices are negative concerning both [redacted] and [redacted]

ACTION TAKEN

Case was instructed that inasmuch as there may be a violation of the Federal Espionage Statute or the Federal Sedition Statute this matter should be run out immediately until the full facts are developed. He was specifically instructed to make certain that all details are obtained from [redacted]. He was further instructed to speak with the [redacted] concerning the alleged long distance call and to interview [redacted] who is mentioned in the Milwaukee phone book and city directory as a specialist operating with the [redacted].

It is suggested that in view of the mention of the alleged threat to Senator McCarthy it may be desirable to have Mr. Nichols Office inform the Senator's Office of this threat and of the fact that it is being run out by the Bureau.
