Responding to a Mission Area Analysis, the DoD Non-lethal Policy, and MCMP, etc.

1996 Mission Need Statement (MNS) for an Operational Capability in Military Operations Other Than War (MOOTW)

#### **CINC** Priorities

Clear Facilities, Structures and Areas of Personnel

Incapacitate Individual (s) or group (s)

Control Crowds

Deny an area to personnel

Deny an area to vehicles, vessels, aircraft and equipment

Disable/neutralize vehicles, vessels, aircraft and equipment

Disable/neutralize facilities and systems Deny use of weapons of mass destruction

### Concept for the Future

No longer a focus on limited missions such as Humanitarian Relief/OOTW

NLW is one of many tools available to the commander that are effective in the full spectrum of warfare
