
THERE'S been a worrying rise in 'green' crime in East London according to a local newspaper, the East London Advertiser.

In August four green thugs were found guilty at the Old Bailey for gunning down Jadie Brissett in London Fields, firing a hail of bullets at the 18 year-old from a convoy of cars.

An insider at the *East London Advertiser* believes there are going to be more reports like this in the paper. "Reporting crime in East London has become a minefield", she told *Freedom*.

"One sub-editor likened a recent issue of the paper to "something the BNP would put out" and a colleague of mine said that when people had finished reading the paper, they must sometimes feel like 'writing off to join the British National Party'.

"The changing face of East London is naturally reflected in 'East London


