SUMMARY OF INFORMATION.-

SUBJECT: Activity of Macek( Matchek).

A confidential source(whose information originated in Paris and which is considered fairly reliable but widely disseminated) reported the following to this Agent:

1. MACEK and the POLISH.-

a. Since September 1945, President MACEK has not received accredited representatives of Gen. ANDERS. The unidentified Polish Colonel who saw MACEK in the Autumn of 1945 presented to MACEK and "INTERMARIUM" solution of the Slav problem(Alliance of all Slav people situated between the Baltic Sea and the Mediterranean for a political block between the Orient and the Occident)

b. MACEK has not heard of any military alliance between Gen. DAMJANOVICH, Commander of the Yugoslav Forces in Italy, and Gen. ANDERS.

2. CROAT-SERB FRONTIER.-

a. MACEK is disturbed about the program which the Serbian opposition parties have agreed upon in Belgrade. The argument is that the Serb project forces Serbia to engulf the greater part of Boznia. If the frontier must be in BOZNIA, it is probable that MACEK will ask for the creation of the Federated State of BOZNIA-HERZEGOVINA.

3. THE MACEDONIAN QUESTION.-

MACEK, considering that Jugoslavia should be composed of the three states of Serbia, Croatia and Slovenia(Federation), admits that Macedonia, in spite of the minority problem, should be part of Serbia. If the Serbs insist in the creation of a Boznia-Herzegovina state which is not favorable to the Croats(since, according to MACEK Croatia should reach as far as the Drina River) MACEK shall demand in compensation the creation of a Macedonian state cut off from Serbia.

4. Mr. KRNJEVICH.

a. Mr. KRNJEVICH who is MACEK's secretary is actually

His official representatives in London. It has been noted for the first time in five months that he obtained his entry and exit visa to go from London to Paris. If KRNJEVITCH has not good contacts with the Foreign Office, that does not prevent him from being in contact with many British political personalities.
