KAUFFER, Roger, cook at the sabotage school in Corredo, gives the following information about this school.

1. SABOTAGE SCHOOL OF CORREDO

The purpose of the school is to instruct young Italians for carrying out sabotage behind the Allied lines. The headquarters of the school was at FAI. The Italian students at the school, in the uniform of Fascist Republican soldiers, received 250 lire a day. They received 25 to 50 thousand lire for organized expeditions behind the Allied lines.

Sabotage groups are believed to have existed at Terviso, Padova, Milan, Gorizia. The headquarters of these groups was at Verona.

2. STORES OF EXPLOSIVES IN NORTH ITALY

The informant asserts that the Germans at the school of Corredo have buried metal boxes containing explosives at a depth of 1½ to 2 meters in the ground. These munitions are of Allied manufacture so that, at some time, when the saboteurs employ them, the resulting damages can be attributed to the Allies.
