MEMORANDUM FOR THE OFFICER IN CHARGE.-

SUBJECT: Polish Consular Personnel in Milan.

Re : Investigation.

Pursuant to instructions from Supervising Agent, CIC, Milan, Zone 3, based on request by SCI/z, Milan, to investigate Subject, this Agent has compiled the following information obtained from various confidential sources including Polish 2 Corps Liaison Officers:

1. On December 3, 1945, the first group of Polish (Warsaw Government) Consular Personnel, arrived in Milan and took lodgings in an apartment at Via San Michele del Carso (now renamed Via Greppi), #4. They were escorted in Milan by KOLTONSKI, Alexander of the Polish (Warsaw) Embassy in Rome. According to information, 15,000,000 (?) lire were paid to the owner of the rented apartment. The group was composed of:

2. Since this original group arrived, several changes have been made. During the early months of 1946 a certain BANDURA, Alexander, born 21 March 1895 in Kunyarya, son of a Jan and Helena CRISSA, Ukrainian Peles, arrived in Milan. BANDURA has been signalled as an NKVD -(MGB) Agent with a mission to collect Intelligence information as well as to provide Consular Security. He is rumored to be a personal friend of President BIERUT of the Warsaw Government. He came to Italy from Sweden. Polish 2nd Corps consider him as a dangerous prepagandist, working against 2nd Corps and the British. In May 1946, a/n spent some time in Venice, where it is rumored

that he was arrested and later released. The concierge of the boarding house at #2, Corso Vercelli, where he had lodgings, informed collaborators of this Office that BANDURA left Milan for Poland. Polish 2nd Corps Officers believe that he had a mission to England with instructions to conduct agitation work against the Poles located in the U.K. and to carry on general intelligence activity. It is also reported that while in Milan, BANDURA WAS IN GOOD terms with the Soviet Military Mission and the Soviet Consulate in Milan. He is also reported to be in possession of a Soviet Identity Card. It has been also reported that he had paid informants who also work for the Soviet Military Mission.

3. ENDER, Edward, has not been seen very much in Milan. He does not do much work for the Consulate. His main mission is scientific research and reporting.

4. SEIFRIED, Kamil, is in charge of the Polish Repatriation Camps in Italy. He was seen taking pictures of Polish II Corps troops during a parade in Milan several months ago.

5. DEBOWSKI, Czeslaw alias KWIATOWSKI serves as an informant and active propagandist among Polish troops. He is an habitual drunkard and is a criminal type capable of anything.

6. RAWICZ-JARUCKI, Rafal, b. 4 July 1907 son of Edward and Lidja DOMBECICA, serves as informant and doorman at the Consulate. He is a deserter of the II Corps.

7. RIABIS, Natalia, singer, Via Giovanni BATTESINI # 16, Milan, is attempting to leave for America and desert her post. Fears that she will be discovered and returned to Poland.

8. SABATOWA, Danita, was on good terms with the Vice Consul SEIFRIED until May 1946, at which time, after a quarrel with above over the disappearance of 10,000 lire from the cash funds was recalled to Poland. It is rumored however that she may return.

9. DUBIENSKI, Josef, b. 1886, son of Adolf and Anna BLAU is seen in Milan. Lived with BANDURA at #2 Corso Vercelli. Wears American type Officer's Uniform with insignia of Polish 2nd Lt. (Warsaw). Probably the brother of MARCOVALDI, Adalgisa, living at Rapalle, Liguria. Latter was collaborator of the Germans. During the war she was trafficking in jewels taken from Jewish families in Germany, which she carried to Italy. She was on intimate terms with the Germans at Genoa and is rumored to have once been a mistress of FRANK, convicted war criminal of Nuernberg. It is rumored that DUBIENSKI's activity is directed against Polish II Corps soldiers in Italy. He was official guide for the Polish Commercial Mission to the Polish Warsaw Government in Italy in August 1946.
