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
Survey Process & Demographics

Online survey conducted 2/17/15 – 3/16/15 67 respondents

47 male (70.15%), 18 female (26.87%), 2 prefer not to state (2.99%)

Survey Process & Demographics

33 currently receive services through the VA (62.26%)

35 MMJ patients w/ PTSD as primary qualifying condition (53.03%)

24 MMJ patients w/ another primary qualifying condition (36.36%)

7 are not currently MMJ patients (10.61%)

40 are military-service-related disabled (60.61%)


33 currently receive services through the VA (62.26%)

Answered: 43 Skipped: 24






Data: Symptom Relief

Answered: 44 Skipped: 23






Data: Health Risks/Problems

Q11 Left untreated, how does your PTSD manifest? (Check all that apply.)


Answered: 43 Skipped: 24

Answered: 41 Skipped: 26






Data: Barriers to Access

Answered: 24 Skipped: 43






Data: Barriers to Access

Answered: 23 Skipped: 44






Data: Barriers to Access

In Their Own Words

"Had to sign a narcotics contract... I am now unable to get any Oxycodone (previously prescribed, never abused) for breakthrough pain. However, medical cannabis does help with fibromyalgia."

"They cut me off of all of my controlled medications to include all of my pain management drugs and sleeping pills. One of the best decisions I have made in years."



In Their Own Words

"I was told I could no longer have [ADHD and pain meds]. I was on pain killers and was told I could no longer have them if this was my choice... I would never give up the life I have now. It has helped me in so many ways. I feel like I'm living again. I feel again. I have empathy and compassion. Yes, I did the work, but medical marijuana played a huge role in that work and I will never deny that."
