POULTRY HOUSES.

Those who contemplate building a poultry house should observe the following chief requirements:

For economy's sake, the walls should not be carried up too high from the ground. The inside of a fowl house need not be over seven or eight feet high at the eaves, on either side, with a "one-third pitch" above this for the roof. If the building has only a "shed" roof, or one slant of covering, the back wall may be three to five feet high, and the front seven or eight feet from the sills. In all cases look well to the means of having the building thoroughly ventilated, when desired. An opening in the ridge for this purpose, or one at both sides of the house under the eaves, is best. Have a screen trap-door or slide, inside, that may be raised or shut at will, conveniently. Nothing is more surely conducive to good health in your poultry, continuously, than affording them pure air to breathe. In confined premises where there is no opportunity for the rapidly accumulating foul air within to escape, chickens or adult birds cannot thrive. The breathing over and over of this impure atmosphere generates disease inevitably; and the careless or inexperienced breeder discovers "roup," "sniffles," "swelled head," "pip," and a score of other so-called fowl diseases among his stock, most of which are fairly chargeable for their origin to this neglect regarding proper ventilation. Fresh air, clean water, varied food, and all the range you can give the birds in good weather, are chief requirements to their health and thrift. Of these pure breathing air may be counted as among the very first important requisites. The principal requisitions for a among the very first important requisites. The principal requisitions for a house are: Protection from draughts, yet well ventilated; and the conveniences of hen life, such as good roosts, nests, and dust-bath.





A FAMOUS POULTRY FARM.

From the Newburgh Daily Press.

MR. EDITOR: A pleasant drive of nine or ten miles west of this city, leading to the picturesque village of Walden, brought us to one of the most widely known farms in our county. It has gained its notoriety, not from its extended acres, or its superiority over other farms of like dimensions, but solely from the dissemination of the thorough bred fowls that have made it famous, both in this and foreign lands. We write of the Rural Poultry Farm, the home of William C. Hart.

Previous to entering upon mercantile pursuits, the writer enjoyed out-door life upon the ancestral homestead, and grew to manhood amid all the happy associations of farm life. In those days farm poultry had no particular care. In most cases the roosting place was the trees or an old dilapidated shed. How

they must have suffered during the rigors of our northern winters!

We remember that, during the summer and autumn months, the good housewife of these bygone days, was abundantly supplied with the products of the poultry. Eggs, in the most liberal allowance, were prepared in various ways and were one of the great stand-bys for those days. Chickens, from that tender broiler, up through all the various stages of growth and ages, were placed in the most appetizing dishes before the family, and if a friend or neighbor dropped in, he was bid a cordial welcome, and good cheer prevailed. However, at the approach of winter, the egg supply suddenly ceased, and the chickens, from cold and exposure, grew thin and lean in flesh, while only those possessing the more hardy constitutions passed through the rigors of the winter.

With the progress made in all branches of industry the care of farm poultry

has not been overlooked.

We found, on our arrival at Rural Poultry Farm, large commodious buildings for the comfortable accommodation of the fowls during the winter—houses warmly built, thoroughly ventilated, and with ample southern exposure of glass to invite the warmth of the sun. The buildings were divided into suitable compartments for properly handling the stock, whose every want is anticipated during the fall months. The floors are covered with dry earth and gravel, with an abundance of lime, and when all without is frost-bound, the fowls enjoy a May temperature transplanted to mid-winter, and are happy and contented in their quarters. The result is no loss from exposure and a constant supply of eggs through the severest days of winter.

To inspect a stock of several hundred pure bred fowls is at all times a pleasure. When only Barred and White Plymouth Rocks compose such flocks, the interest is greatly increased, especially when they are of one origin, one blood, one breed, only differing in plumage, the Barred Plymouth Rocks in dress of somber gray, the White Plymouth Rocks in robes of purest white. In size many turn the scales from 8 to 12½ pounds. In a roomy compartment we were especially pleased with some fifty cockerels reserved for filling orders received from patrons of this establishment. In size, beauty of plumage, and

vigor of constitution we never saw their equal.

For the past four years the entire output of eggs from January to July has been utilized for hatching purposes. In the season of 1889 orders were declined


for three thousand eggs on account of inability to meet the demand.

The result of our visit proved satisfactory. Of the profits connected with the industry we cannot state, as no figures were obtained in that line, but from mature deliberation we believe that poultry culture should commend itself to all classes who have room for keeping fowls, that only pure bred varieties should be selected and that the income from such selection and investment would add greatly to the financial condition of many households.

In conclusion we will state that poultry culture is only one of the many industries pursued at the Rural Poultry Farm. All the ordinary farm products are produced as found on the adjoining farms, and it is evident from what we saw during our brief call that the proprietor of the establishment has an eye for the attractive and beautiful in nature and an earnest appreciation for the new and better fruits adapted to his locality.

PERMANENT POULTRY HOUSE.

It is 100 feet long and 10 feet wide, 8 feet high. The foundation on which the building stands is a single brick wall with a trench underneath filled with broken stone. The floor is of earth, well packed, and covered with sand, to the depth of three inches; making a very dry floor for the fowls, and when grain is scattered in this, the hens will work nearly all day. The frame is constructed of 2x4 scantling. The outside of the building is boarded up and down with one inch pine siding and battened. The inside is also sheeted with the same, and covered with tarred paper This gives a four inch air space between the walls, making it warm in winter and cool in summer. The building is divided into breeding pens.






WHEAT

The Best Poultry Food.

With proper care and feed egg production can be largely increased. Hens cannot lay eggs unless their food contains the elements of which the egg is composed, they require a large share of albuminous or egg producing elements in addition to the quantity of albumen required in the organism of the fowl. The laying ben requires an extra amount, for the white of the egg. It being 12 per cent, albumeu, and this must be furnished in her food. Chemists tell us that wheat contains a larger amount of albumen than any other graiu. Therefore it is the best grain to make the base for egg producing food.

Cracked wheat for little chickeus, is unsurpassed as a food that makes rapid growth, it should be scalded or soaked in sweet milk. While wheat cannot be too strongly recommended, other grains should be used. A liberal allowance of corn and buckwheat during the winter months and oats for spring and summer.




